1. The State is now divided into three administrative Divisions as against four in 1931. The High Range Division of 1931 has been amalgamated with the Northern Division and one Taluk (Sherthala) has been transferred from the Northern to the Contral Division.

2. No change has been made in the boundaries of the three Natural Divisions.

3. A slight increase (37 sq. miles) has been noted in the area of the State, over that given in 1931 due to the inclusion of the area of certain unsurveyed hills in the Highland Division. The present figure (7662) however corresponds with the area of the State according to the Survey of India.

4. Only inhabited villages (karas) have been included in the number of villages (karas) given in the Table. They number 3906.

5. There are three small tracts under British administration within Travancore. They are Anjengo, Tangasseri and Thumbolipattom. The population of these tracts has not been included in the Table.

6. The figures for area, number of houses, total population, distribution by communities and the number of literate persons for each Taluk are given in Provincial Tables 1 and 11. •.
