This grant is likely to be exceeded by Rs. 7,50,000. The increase is accounted for mainly by an increase of Rs. 5,97,000 under Abstract R—Payments to Retrenched Personnel. The balance of the supplementary grant asked for, Rs. 1,53,000, is the net result of the increases and decreases expected to occur under several heads, which are due, on the one hand, to an increase in business and repairs of damage by the earthquake of 1934 and, on the other, to economies it was possible to secure. The earthquake of January 1934 has caused extensive damage to the buildings of the Imperial Institute of Agricultural Research at Pusa. Rather than sink more money in repairs on an in-accessible and ill-adapted place like Pusa it is proposed to transfer the Institute to a site near Delhi. The proposal involves a total non-recurring expenditure of Rs. 36 lakhs which will be met from loan funds. The expenditure during the current financial year is estimated at Rs. 7 lakhs. The proposal has been approved by the Standing Finance Committee at its meeting held on the 25th August, 1934.
