An Officer on Special Duty was appointed in the Commerce Department in September 1934 in connection with the revision of Company Law and Insurance Law. The Special Officer's reports on the Laws were examined by the Government of India, but before undertaking legislation, they decided to consult commercial opinion on the matter and for this purpose two informal committees were appointed, one on Company Law in 1935-36 and the other on Insurance Law in 1936-37. A sum of Rs. 41,99,000 was voted by the Legislative Assembly in March 1936 under Demand No. 91-Capital Outlay on Indian Posts and Telegraphs (Not charged to Revenue) for the year 1936-37. This grant was arrived at by deducting an anticipated credit of Rs. 14,09,400 on account of sale of a portion of the Central Telegraph Office Building in Bombay, including a portion of the land on which it is situated, to the Reserve Bank of India. The Reserve Bank subsequently cancelled the negotiations with the Posts and Telegraphs Department for the purchase of the said property as a result of which the original grant will be exceeded by Rs. 14,09,400. A supplementary grant of the above mentioned amount is therefore necessary.
