INTRODUCTORY NOTE.

The Budget for 1960-61 is prepared for the composite Bombay State as usual. A Vote on Account under Article 206(1) (a) of the Constitution will be obtained in the current session of the Legislature to cover the requirements of the present State till reorganisation, and of the residuary Bombay State for a part of the year after reorganisation. The necessary expenditure for the State of Gujerat will be authorised by the Governor under the provisions of the Bombay State Reorganisation Bill.

2. The annual estimates for 1960-61 as presented to the Legislature show a nominal surplus of Rs. 7 lakhs on Revenue account. The estimates of receipts and expenditure are as follows:—

The receipt estimates include Rs. 31.09 crores being the share of this State in Union Excise Duties, Income-Tax, Estate Duty and Taxes on Railway Fares. This estimate is based on the intimation received from the Cental Government in this behalf. Some of the other large items of revenue are Rs. 12.35 crores under Land Revenue, Rs. 6.50 crores under Stamps, Rs. 6.74 crores under Forest, Rs. 6.75 crores under Taxes on Vehicles, Rs. 36.5 crores under Sales Tax and Rs. 10.93 crores under Other Taxes and Duties.

3. The expenditure estimates include Rs. 17.24 crores for debt charges, Rs. 27.74 crores for General Administration, Administration of Justice, Jails and Police.

The expenditure under development heads includes Rs. 26.58 crores for Education, Rs. 11.65 crores for Medical and Public Health and Rs. 5.13 crores for Agriculture and Animal Husbandry. A provision of Rs. 1.25 crores for award of scholarships to scheduled tribes, scheduled castes and other backward classes and free studentships to economically backward classes and of Rs. 73 lakhs (inclusive of Centre's share of expenditure) for the schemes of training of craftsmen are also made under "Miscellaneous Departments". The provision under "57-Miscellaneous" includes Rs. 1.07 crores for granting subsidy to Municipal Corporations for slum clearance scheme and Rs. 3.36 crores for village panchayats. An amount of Rs. 5.88 crores is also made for Community Development Projects, National Extension Service and Local Development Works.

4. The gross expenditure in the Capital section excluding the outlay on State Trading Schemes and capital expenditure transferred to the Revenue Section equivalent to Central grants therefor comes to Rs. 47.55 crores. The expenditure includes Rs. 20.70 crores for Irrigation Works. Some of the important irrigation works provided for are Khadakwasla Project (Rs. 1.29 crores), Purna Project (Rs. 1.11 crores), Vir Dam Project and Kakrapara Weir Scheme (Rs. 92 lakhs each), Banas Valley and Mahi Canal Projects (Rs. 90 lakhs each), Girna Project (Rs. 80 lakhs), Ukai Project (Rs. 77 lakhs), Ghod Storage and Canal Scheme (Rs. 70 lakhs) and Mula River Project (Rs. 58 lakhs). A provision of Rs. 1.96 crores is made for Water Supply and Drainage Schemes, Rs. 1.07 crores for capital contribution to the Road Transport Bodies, Rs. 2 crores for expansion of Agricultural Credit and capital contribution to the service co-operatives, Rs. 1.6 crores for development of ports, Rs. 9.76 crores for Roads and Buildings and Rs. 7.50 crores for the Koyna Hydro-Electric Project.

In addition to the above provisions an amount of Rs. 30.87 crores is also provided for granting loans and advances and Rs. 6.04 crores for expenditure on roads under the State Road Fund. Some of the important provisions under Loans and Advances are Rs. 10.43 crores for loans to the State Electricity Board, Rs. 3.77 crores for loans to the Housing Boards under the various Housing Schemes, Rs. 2.10 crores for Soil Conservation schemes, Rs. 78 lakhs for Wells and Pumping Sets Schemes, Rs. 2.54 crores for Community Development Projects and Rs. 2.6 crores for tagai advances.

5. The resources for meeting the above capital expenditure are loans from the Government of India for approved schemes inclusive of State's share in Small Savings collections, Employees State Insurance Corporation and the Reserve Bank of India. Other resources include Open Market borrowing, withdrawal from State Reserve Funds such as State Road Fund, Ports, Milk and Sugarcane Cess Funds and recoveries on capital account.


6. Out of the targetted expenditure of Rs. 350 28 crores for the Second Five-Year Plan Schemes an expenditure of about Rs. 248 35 crores is expected to be incurred till the end of the current year. The yearwise break-up of this outlay is as follows:—

The next year's budget provides for an outlay of Rs. 101.46 crores which brings the Plan performance almost equal to the targetted outlay. The above provision includes Rs. 35.34 crores for Irrigation and Power Schemes, Rs. 29.27 crores for Agriculture and Community Development, Rs. 24.86 crores for Social Services, such as Education, Health, Housing. The balance of Rs. 11.99 crores is for Industries and Mining, Transport and Communications and other miscellaneous developments schemes.

A NOTE ON THE PROCEDURE OF PRESENTING GROSS DEMANDS TO THE VOTE OF THE LEGISLATURE.

In the year 1939, the Auditor General raised the question of the procedure to be followed in presenting to the Legislature a demand for grant in which the expenditure was more than counterbalanced by recoveries and the net result was, therefore, a minus demand. In a case like this the alternative courses available were (i) to make a token demand or (ii) to obtain a vote for the gross expenditure. The former course was open to the objection that it set no limit to actual expenditure provided the actual receipts were such that the net result did not exceed the amount of the sanctioned grant. At the same time the latter course might imply that the same demand was once voted 'gross' one year (when the net result was minus) and 'net' another year (when the net result was plus). The Auditor General pointed out that the real object to be secured was that positive expenditure should be expressly authorised in some way and further directed that the matter should be settled by the State Government in consultation with the State Legislature. The question was considered and it was decided to adopt the second alternative, viz. that of obtaining the vote of the Legislature for the gross expenditure. This is in line with the procedure followed by the Government of India.

- 2. With a view to exhibiting separately the details of gross estimates and recoveries taken in reduction of expenditure in the Civil Budget Estimates each major head of expenditure in Recurring and Capital sections is divided into 3 parts. Part I gives the gross figures by minor heads, recoveries under each minor head and the net figures of the major head; Part II gives the details of gross estimates and Part III gives the details of recoveries adjusted in the accounts in reduction of expenditure. The figures in Statements at pages 10 to 17 in this publication are, however, shown net.
- 3. A Schedule of Demands showing gross amounts of demands put to the vote of the Legislative Assembly is given on pages 21 to 25. The recoveries excluded from the amounts of demands are shown in column 6 thereof.
