SUBJECT :—*Memoranda on Census Tabulation (Forms and Procedure) and Indian Census Economic Classification Scheme.*

I enclose a copy each of the Memoranda on Census Tabulation* (Forms and Procedure) and of the Indian ^{Census} Economic† Classification Scheme. These are now in the final form. I wanted to send you the Memorandum on Tabulation* (Forms and Procedure) also in print but I find that it will take some time to get printed copies. I shall send you copies of both the Memoranda bound together for your use in tabulation. These papers you can study now.

2. Both the Memoranda were discussed at a meeting of the Population Advisory Committee and the Committee has approved‡ the plan set out in the Memoranda. A few amendments were suggested in the table forms which I have incorporated in the forms. The Committee suggested that the Age and Civil condition table should be prepared separately for cities. This should be done and separate tables for cities should be prepared wherever this was the case in the past. The Committee also suggested that the method of making a random selection of households (para. I of the note on the preparation of census abstract of sample households) might be improved upon. I shall deal with this later in subsidiary instructions.
