P R E F A C E

The Government used to compile and publish District Manuals for each district prior to 1905. The manuals became obsolete within a few years of their publication, containing as they did not only matter of a more or less permanent character such as physical characteristics, history, religion and ethnography, but also statistical matters which soon became out of date. The Government decided to replace the District Manuals by another publication known as the District Gazetteer, consisting of two volumes, A and B. The A volume contained descriptive matter and such general figures, as might be necessary to explain the text, and the B volume contained detailed statistics. They also decided that the B volume should be brought out periodically, especially after each decennial census. Between 1905 and 1927 A volumes for thirteen districts were published. In 1927 they were discontinued. B volumes for all the districts were published between 1906 and 1915. They were continued to be published even after the 1931 census. They were not published after the 1941 census.

Village Statistics, containing the results of the census for every village in the State, were first compiled and published in 1872, at the instance of Mr. C. E. Gover, who was then the Census Officer in Madras. His successor, in 1882, considered that this publication led to needless expenditure and trouble in printing the tables villagewar, but the Government decided that the Village Statistics should continue to be published. The practice of issuing Village Statistics at every census was followed subsequently. The Village Statistics merely showed the number of occupied houses and population of each village and town by religions.

The idea of preparing the present volume, viz., the District Census Handbook for each district was put forward by Sri R. A. Gopaldaswami, I.C.S., Registrar-General, India, and ex-officio Census Commissioner of India, as part of a plan intended to secure an effective method of preserving the census records prepared for areas below the district level. He proposed that all the district census tables and census abstracts prepared during the process of sorting and compilation should be bound together in a single manuscript volume, called the District Census Handbook, and suggested to the State Governments that the handbook (with or without the addition of other useful information relating to the district) should be printed and published, at their own cost, in the same manner as the Village Statistics in the past. In accepting this suggestion, the Government of Madras decided to print and publish the more important portion of statistical data relating to the district and to preserve the rest of the records in a manuscript volume for any future use, to which they may be put.

2. The statistical data embodied in the District Census Handbook have to be understood from the background of the changes introduced in the 1951 census. The most important and fundamental change introduced in the 1951 census consists in the substitution of an economic classification of the people for the classification based on Religion and Communities

adopted in the past. The people were divided into two broad livelihood categories, the Agricultural and the Non-Agricultural. Four agricultural classes and four non-agricultural classes were prescribed as shown below :—

Agricultural Classes—

- I. Cultivators of land, wholly or mainly owned, and their dependants.
- II. Cultivators of land, wholly or mainly unowned, and their dependants;
- III. Cultivating labourers and their dependants,
- IV. Non-cultivating owners of land, agricultural rent receivers and their dependants.

Non-Agricultural Classes—

Persons (including their dependants) who derive their principal means of livelihood from—

- V. Production other than cultivation,
- VI. Commerce,
- VII. Transport, and
- VIII. Other services and miscellaneous sources.

Each of the above eight livelihood classes were divided into three sub-classes with reference to their economic status as below :—

- (i) Self-supporting persons,
- (ii) Non-earning dependants, and
- (iii) Earning dependants.

These livelihood sub-classes have been defined in detail in the fly-leaf notes attached to Economic Table B-I included in this Handbook.

All non-earning dependants are economically passive, all earning dependants are economically semi-active. All self-supporting persons are ordinarily economically active but the classes and groups specified below constitute an exception to this rule—

- (1) Self-supporting persons of Agricultural Class IV,
- (2) Self-supporting persons of Livelihood Class VIII, who derive their principal means of livelihood from any source other than through economic activity, viz.—
 - (a) Non-working owners of non-agricultural property ;
 - (b) Pensioners and remittance holders ;
 - (c) Persons living on charity and other persons with unproductive occupations ;
 and
 - (d) Inmates of penal institutions and asylums.

Economically active persons engaged in cultivation are either cultivators or cultivating labourers. Economic Table B-I gives particulars of the population classified according to the eight livelihood classes and the three sub-classes mentioned above.

Economically active persons engaged in industries and services have been classified with reference to the nature of the commodity produced or service performed. They are further divided into three sections, viz., Employers, Employees and Independent Workers.

Economic Table B-III gives particulars of the economically active persons classified under the divisions and subdivisions of industries and services of the Indian Census Economic Classification Scheme.

Table C-I, included in this Handbook covers the population of sample households and Tables C-II and C-IV cover a 10 per cent sample population. The method adopted for extracting these samples has been described in detail in the fly-leaf notes attached to the relevant tables.

3. *Scheme of the Census Handbook.*—The Handbook has been divided into two parts: Part I consists of three sections, namely, Section (i) containing the General Population Tables (A-series), the Economic Tables (B-series), Summary figures for the district by Taluks (Table E), Tables I, II and III relating to Small-scale Industrial Establishments and Table L showing the Incidence of Leprosy, Section (ii) containing the Rural Statistics, and Section (iii) containing the Urban Statistics, and Part II containing the Household (size) Table C-I, and Tables showing Livelihood Classes and Literacy by Age-groups (C-II and C-IV), the Social and Cultural Tables (D-series) and an abstract of non-agricultural occupations in the district. Among the tables included in the Handbook, Table A-IV—Towns classified by population with variations since 1901, Economic Table B-II—Secondary means of Livelihood under each livelihood class and Table C-II—Livelihood classes by age-groups furnish information at the district level. The other population tables in the A-series, the summary figures by taluks (Table E) and the infirmity Table (L) showing the incidence of leprosy furnish information for each taluk in the district with a district total. The rural statistics in Part I—Section (ii) furnish basic information in respect of every village and town arranged according to census tracts. In addition to the total population of the villages, and its distribution among the eight livelihood classes, information regarding the number of literates, the cultivated area, the number of small-scale industrial establishments under categories, textile and non-textile and the number of leprosy cases and doubtful cases has been included.

The urban statistics in Part I—Section (iii) furnish similar information except that relating to cultivated area in respect of every unit classified as city or census town in the district with ward-wise data. All other tables included in the Handbook provide information for units called census tracts with totals for the district.

4. *Census Tracts.*—A distinctive feature of the census statistics is its rural/urban break-up designed with a view to compare the conditions and characteristics of the rural and urban population. The rural areas of each district were therefore kept distinct from the urban areas. For facilitating tabulation these areas were divided into a number of rural and urban tracts. As far as possible, the rural area in each taluk was constituted into a single rural tract. In a few cases however where the taluks were small in size with reference to their population, the rural areas of more than one taluk were taken together as a single rural tract. The urban tracts have been formed out of areas declared as cities and census towns in each district. Every city was treated as a separate tract. Towns other than cities were grouped together to form non-city urban tracts. Wherever possible, the towns in each taluk were constituted into a single non-city urban tract. In cases where the towns in a taluk had a population of less than 50,000 the towns in more than one taluk were grouped

together to form a non-city urban tract. All the rural tracts in the State have been assigned numbers in one series, the non-city urban tracts in another series and the city tracts in a third series. In all the tables where the data have been furnished for tracts, the tracts have been denoted by numbers that have been assigned to them. A list of tracts into which the district has been divided and the areas comprised in each is furnished in the fly-leaf note to Economic Table B-I relating to the district.

The districts, taluks and villages mentioned in the Tables and Abstracts have been shown along with the census location code numbers assigned to them for purposes of census operations.

The numbers given to the Tables in this publication correspond to those given in the State Census Report.

Elaborate notes explaining the scheme of each Table have been introduced in the fly-leaf attached to each with a view to enable the reader to get a precise idea of the data furnished in the Table.

5. *Tables relating to Small-scale Industries.*—In the year 1950 a census of Small-scale Industries was instituted under the orders of the Government. The object was to get some idea about small industries such as cottage and home industries, small establishments, workshops, etc., where articles were produced, repaired or otherwise treated for sale, use or disposal and small mines. The enquiry was confined to establishments to which the Factories Act was not applicable. Individuals who worked on their own and did not employ other people were left out of account. From the data collected three Tables were prepared and they have been included in the Handbook. Information giving village-wise and ward-wise information for Small-scale Industries have been incorporated in the rural and urban statistics. The details collected and embodied in the Tables are not to be considered accurate or exhaustive, as the enumeration staff employed had not been trained for the purpose and some cases of under-enumeration were noticed. However, the figures given in the Tables may be sufficient to give an insight into the nature of the industries prevalent in the different parts of the district.

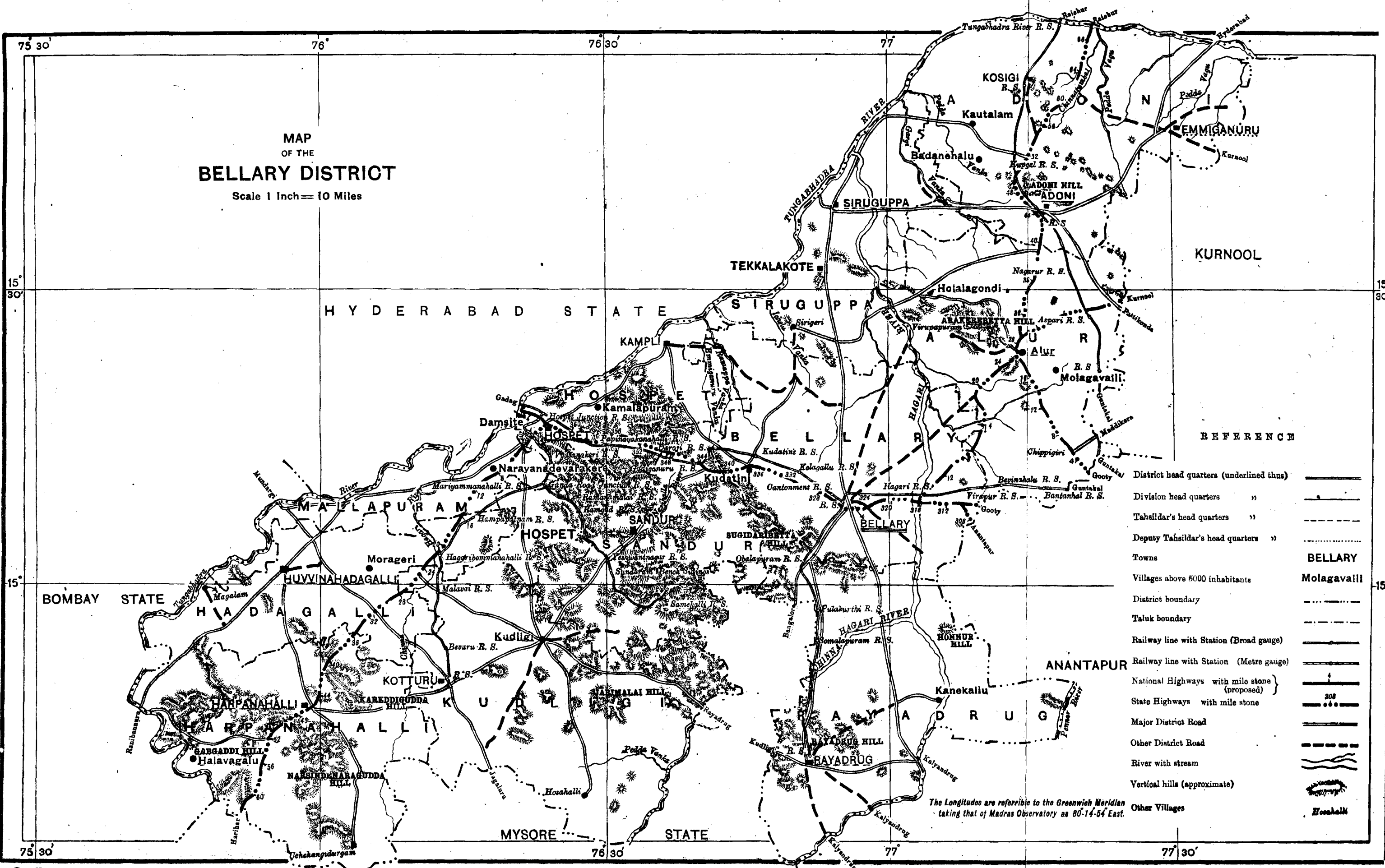
6. Opportunity has been taken to put in a short introductory note detailing the salient points connected with the district, such as the physical features, climate, rainfall, irrigation and drainage facilities, roads and other communications, crop statistics, education, industries and other matters of general interest. The information contained in the introductory note is based on the materials furnished by Collectors of districts and Departments of Government. The District Gazetteer was also freely referred to. The relevant paragraph of the 1951 Census Report discussing the growth of population in the district has also been incorporated in the proper place.

A district map showing taluk boundaries, physical features, important roads and places with a population exceeding 5,000 is also attached.

It is hoped that this Handbook will serve as a book of reference on matters relating to the district and that it will be found useful both by Departments of Government and the public.

INTRODUCTION

TO

BELLARY DISTRICT

I. (a) *Situation and physical characteristics.*— Bellary is the westernmost of the four Ceded Districts of the Madras State. It is situated between 14° 30' and 16° of the northern latitude and 75° 35' and 76° 40' of the eastern longitude. The district is flanked on the south by the Mysore State and on the west by the Bombay State, and on the north by the Hyderabad State. The districts of Kurnool and Anantapur lie on the east. The district consists of the following ten taluks comprised in two Revenue Divisions as shown below:—

The villages of Jodikasinayakanahalli, Gowripura, Jodibommanahalli, Bommagatta, Sarvainam, Obalapuram and Devarabuddenahalli villages of Mysore State were absorbed in this district under the Absorption of Enclaves Order, 1950. The district is elongated from south-west to north-east. The Rayadrug taluk is wedged between Mysore State and the district of Anantapur.

The level of the district falls gently from south to north towards the river Tungabhadra which covers its entire northern boundary. A small area in the extreme east of Alur and Adoni taluks and an even smaller portion of Rayadrug taluk slope down towards the east.

The district is divided into two natural regions by the Sandur hills running right across the middle of the district from north-west to south-east. The eastern portion consisting of the taluks of Adoni, Siruguppa, Alur, Bellary and Rayadrug and the eastern portion of Hospet taluk is a flat treeless expanse of black cotton soil diversified here and there by rocky hills characteristic of the Deccan. The western portion comprising Hadagalli, Harpanahalli, Kudligi and

Sandur taluks and the western portions of Hospet taluk is of mixed soil and the terrain is broken up by a succession of tiers of wild and rugged hills lying at a greater elevation than in the eastern portion.

The Sandur hills already mentioned, begin in the north at Mallapuram in Hospet taluk on the bank of the Tungabhadra river and run south-east for over 30 miles right across the district separating it into two divisions with only one break through which the Narihalla river crosses their main axis at right angles. The highest point in the Sandur hills is in the south and is 3,400 feet above the sea. Ramanamalai overlooking the hill station of Ramandrug in the centre is 3,256 feet in altitude and the Jambunath peak in the extreme north is 2,980 feet in elevation.

The other ranges of hills in the district also run from north-west to south-east roughly parallel to the Sandur hills.

The most prominent is the Copper Mountain Hill which rising near Daroji tank in Hospet taluk runs along the borders of Hospet and Bellary taluks in the north and along the borders of Rayadrug and Bellary taluks on the south to within four miles of the Hagari river. Its highest point, the Copper Mountain, is 3,285 feet above the sea.

Some 30 miles south-west of the Sandur hills in the Hadagalli and Harpanahalli taluks and close to the Tungabhadra near Honnuru the Mallappan Gudda range runs south-east for some 25 miles and is broken by the Valley of the Chikka Hagari. It starts again 7 miles farther on and extends into the Mysore territory. The chief peak, Mallappan Betta, is 3,177 feet in height.

Further south-west about 8 to 10 miles from the Mallappan Gudda range are the Kalla Halli Gudda hills. Starting in Hadagalli taluk, they run for about nine miles from north-west to south-east and entering the Harpanahalli taluk join the group of hills south of Harpanahalli town which run up to Huchangidurgam.

In Kudligi taluk a line of hills starting at Anekallu Gudda (2,387 feet high) at the trijunction of Hospet, Kudligi and Hadagalli taluks run south-east wards passing to the north and east of Kudligi town and terminating near Taramalidrug, 2,743 feet high.

Another range starts at Chorhanuru in Sandur taluk and passing through Gudekota in the eastern portion of Kudligi taluk and through the Mysore State between Rayadrug and Kudligi taluks terminates at Rayadrug.

The Alur hills consist of a number of hills too detached to be called ranges; the Kenchanaguddam hill on the banks of the Tungabhadra, the cluster of hills near Halekota, the Kanchagara-Bellagalluridge, all in Siruguppa taluk, the hills near Holalagondi, and the confused group north-west of Alur town, and the isolated peaks of Hattibellagalu, Ramadurgam and Chippigiri form the Alur hills

In Adoni taluk a number of isolated hills and clusters of hills commencing at Kosigi run south. They include the Kamanghat peak, the Adoni Cluster and the lesser hills to the south-east of Adoni.

In Hospet taluk a rugged group of hills called the Daroji hills extend from Daroji tank up to Hospet. The Kampli hills to the north of the Daroji hills is another cluster.

Another cluster worth mention is that at Kurugodu in Bellary taluk, 14 miles north, north-west of Bellary town. The Bellary Rock is 1,976 feet in altitude.

(b) *Rivers.*—The chief river of the district is the Tungabhadra flowing along the district's entire western and northern boundary for just over 200 miles. The river is formed by the junction in Mysore of two rivers, the Tunga and the Bhadra, which have their source in the Varahaparvata hills high up in the Western Ghats, on the frontier between the Mysore State and the South Kanara district. The river's course lies on the western boundary of Harpanahalli and Hadagalli taluks and thence in a north-easterly direction on the northern boundary of Hadagalli, Hospet, Siruguppa and Adoni taluks. There are small islands here and there on the river bed. The chief tributaries of the Tungabhadra are the Chikkahagari and the Hagari.

The Chikkahagari rises in the Mysore State and flowing through the taluks of Harpanahalli, Kudligi and Hadagalli joins the Tungabhadra near Kittanuru.

The Hagari, like the Tungabhadra, is formed by the junction of two streams known as the Veda and the Avati which rise and unite in Mysore State. The river flows in a northerly direction in the taluks of Rayadrug, Bellary and Siruguppa, touching a part of the western boundary of the Alur taluk. The tributaries of the Hagari are (1) the Chinnahagari which also rises in the Mysore State and joins the Hagari in Rayadrug taluk and (2) the Pedda Vanka which rises in the Copper Mountains and flows across Bellary and Siruguppa taluks.

There are several minor streams flowing into the Tungabhadra. The chief of them are (1) the Hagaranurunnalla rising near Harpanahalli, (2) the Hampasagara nulla flowing north across Hadagalli taluk and joining the Tungabhadra at Hampasagaram, (3) the Bellahunishinulla flowing north across the eastern part of Hadagalli taluk, (4) the Gowripuram nulla flowing

north on the western part of Hospet taluk, west of Sandur hills, (5) the Narihalla river which rises in Kudligi taluk, cuts the Sandur hills and flows across Daroji tank in Sandur taluk and (6) the Harivanam nulla flowing between the Adoni and Alur hills into Siruguppa taluk.

(c) *Forests.*—The area of the forests in the district is 682.21 square miles consisting of 564.21 square miles of reserve forests and 118 square miles of estate forests taken over. The particulars of the area of forests in each taluk are given hereunder:—

The forests consist of thorny scrub, deciduous species and soft wood species as well as bamboo and grass. In the Sandur hills there is some teak and sandalwood.

(d) *Climate and rainfall.*—From March to May the thermometer keeps unpleasantly high. The dryness of the air, however, makes the temperature more bearable than in the damp coastal districts. The period from May to October is noticeably cool. From November to February the district enjoys a genuine cold weather, the days being delightful and the temperature at night getting very cold. The western taluks of Hadagalli, Harpanahalli and Hospet from their higher altitude are the coolest. Thus for 9 months in the year the climate is pleasant. The district has low rainfall. A considerable portion of it is had during the South-West Monsoon.

The particulars of the average annual rainfall and the average number of rainy days in a year in the taluks of the district are given below:—

The black soil is considered to be good and the mixed soil equally good and in some cases superior. The red soil varies from rich red loams to hard and stony gravel.

(f) *Irrigation and drainage facilities and liability to famine.*—The river Tungabhadra is a perennial source irrigating about 21,200 acres in the district, through channels mainly in Hospet, Siruguppa and Adoni taluks. The Tungabhadra river although flowing between high banks, when it enters the district takes a deep bed lower down. Hence it has not been widely used for irrigation so far. A project for impounding the waters of this river by means of a dam is under execution. The dam which is three miles west of Hospet has been completed. Headworks are going on. The project is expected to command nearly two million acres. There are some minor tanks and channels chiefly in Rayadrug, Kudligi and Hospet taluks. The area irrigated by wells is small and many of the wells fail during severe drought. All the tanks except Kamalapuram tank in Hospet taluk, which is fed by the Raza channel from the Tungabhadra anicut and the Kanekal and Veparalla tanks in the Hagari basin are rainfed. The tanks do not have a

good catchment area and the rainfall is deficient. Some of the tanks are also silted up. There are spring channels in Rayadrug taluk dug from the Hagari river.

Adoni taluk.—The streams in the taluk are not useful for irrigation. An extent of about 1,000 acres in the taluk is irrigated by minor irrigation sources and 888 acres from the channels of the Tungabhadra. The rest of the taluk is solely dependant on rainfall. Failure of rains is common and the taluk has suffered from several famines, the recent ones being those of 1921–22, 1924, 1937–38 and 1942–43.

After the completion of the Tubgabhadra Project an area of about 77,475 acres is likely to be brought under irrigation.

Siruguppa taluk.—There are a few irrigation channels taken from the Tungabhadra to serve about 2,655 acres. In addition to the river channels there are two irrigation tanks which are precarious sources depending upon rain. The taluk was partially affected by the famines of 1942 and 1945. Scanty rainfall brings the taluk under famine conditions. On completion of the Tungabhadra Project an extent of 93,007 acres is likely to be brought under irrigation.

Hospet taluk.—An extent of 11,075 acres is irrigated with the aid of Tungabhadra waters obtained by a dam across the river about three miles to the west of Hospet. The Kamalapuram tank receives water supply from the Tungabhadra channels. An additional area of 8,006 acres will be brought under cultivation after the completion of the Tungabhadra Project. The taluk is not generally affected by famine though it suffered to a small extent in the famine of 1942.

Sandur taluk.—The Dāroji tank receiving supply from the Narihalli river irrigates an area of 1,200 acres. There are 21 rainfed tanks irrigating about 1,090 acres and there are a number of wells under which garden crops are raised. The taluk is not affected by famine. It suffered only during the State-wide famine of 1877.

Alur taluk.—There are 14 rainfed tanks in the taluk, the area irrigated by which is not appreciable. Failure of rainfall is common. The taluk suffered from the famines of 1921–22, 1932, 1934–35, 1937–38, 1942–43 and 1952. After the completion of the Tungabhadra Project an area of 13,832 acres is likely to be brought under irrigation.

Bellary taluk.—Except for a few spring and river channels serving negligible areas, the taluk has few irrigation facilities. The taluk suffered from the famines of 1921–22, 1924, 1932, 1934–35, 1942–43, 1945 and 1952. The Tungabhadra Project, when completed is expected to irrigate an area of 32,150 acres. The Mallapanakeri tank of Kurugodu which was repaired under the Grow More Food Scheme was expected to irrigate about 200 acres, but at present it gives supply for only about 50 acres.

Hadagalli taluk.—There are about 10 rainfed tanks. About 350 acres is irrigated under the Hagari channels, about 400 acres under the Tungabhadra channels and 1,350 acres under tanks. The taluk has not suffered much from bad seasonal conditions.

Harpanahalli taluk.—The taluk contains wells and tanks irrigating an extent of about 2,300 acres. The tanks are rainfed. There is fair rainfall as it is situated in the neighbourhood of the Western Ghats. The taluk was rarely affected by famine. Only a small portion of it was affected by the famine of 1946.

Kudligi taluk.—The taluk has considerable area under tanks. It has also a good number of wells and spring channels. Being in a hilly tract, the taluk gets a fair amount of rainfall. Part of the taluk suffered in 1945 on account of failure of rains. The great State-wide famine of 1877 also affected the taluk.

Rayadrug taluk.—The taluk contains a large number of tanks, wells and spring channels. Spring channels dug annually from the Hagari river irrigate a few villages on the eastern border of the taluk. There are 6 big tanks in the taluk, the most important of which is the Kanekal tank which is fed by water from the Hagari river. The Veparalla and Nagireddipalli tanks are also river fed. The rest are rainfed. After completion of the Bairvan Thippa Project an additional area of about 4,000 acres is expected to be irrigated in the taluk. The taluk suffered from the famine of 1934–35, 1942, 1945 and 1952.

(g) *Area cultivated with food and commercial crops.*—Paddy and ragi are grown on limited extents. Chulam, cumbu and korra are the food crops widely cultivated. Horsegram is also widely cultivated. Cotton and groundnut are the main commercial crops. The particulars of the area cultivated with food crops, pulses and commercial crops in the taluks of the district in 1949–50 which is the last normal year for the district are furnished in *Annexure I*.

(h) *Communications.*—(i) *Roads.*—A road leads to Mysore State from Harpanahalli taluk and another road from Kudligi taluk leads into Mysore State. A road from Bellary leads to Bangalore and several roads from Rayadrug taluk and Alur taluk lead to the adjoining districts. Two roads from Adoni taluk lead to the Hyderabad State. There are 1,278 miles of roads in the district consisting of 221 miles of Provincial Highways, 618 miles of major district roads, 197 miles of other district roads, 133 miles of village roads and 109 miles of municipal roads. The general condition of the roads is good except in the case of village roads.

The communications so far as village parts are concerned are not adequate. Provision for connecting important villages with the main road is being made in the Five-year Programme for the improvement of village roads.

(ii) *Railways*.—The district has 50 miles of Broad Gauge Railway and 171½ miles of Metre Gauge Railway of the Southern Railway. The Madras-Bombay Broad Gauge line from Guntakal in Anantapur district traverses the eastern part of Alur and Adoni taluks and proceeds to Raichur in a northerly direction. A metre gauge line connects Guntakal in Anantapur district with Bellary and Hospet traversing the southern parts of Alur and Bellary taluks, and part of Hospet taluk. A branch line from Bellary proceeds to Rayadrug. A metre gauge line from Hospet runs south and branches off into two at Gunda Road, one proceeding to Samehalli in the north-eastern portion of Kudligi taluk passing through the western part of Sandur taluk and another to Kotturu in the western portion of Kudligi taluk traversing also the extreme eastern portion of Hadagalli taluk.

The district headquarters as well as the taluk headquarters of Bellary, Adoni, Rayadrug and Hospet alone are connected by railway.

(iii) *Posts and Telegraphs*.—The district has one departmental telegraph office and a non-combined head office, at Bellary. There are 16 sub-post and telegraph offices, 6 non-combined sub-post offices and 132 branch post offices in the district. Their talukwise distribution is furnished below:—

“The district increase is 16.4 per cent. This jump from 8.5 in the previous decade is largely due to Hospet and Bellary taluks which have registered an increase of 62.8 per cent and 22.1 percent respectively. The variations in the taluk populations range from 6.1 in Sandur to 62.8 in Hospet. The spectacular increase in the Hospet taluk is of course due to the large labour population from other districts attracted by the Tungabhadra Project Works, the dam-site being close to Hospet town. Many families who had their homes in the submersible areas of Hadagalli taluk have shifted their permanent residence to Hospet taluk. There has also been some immigration into this taluk owing to the Razakar trouble in Hyderabad State just across the Tungabhadra river. The large growth in Bellary taluk is due to Bellary town which is the district headquarters and has all modern amenities including educational and medical facilities and it is one of the two important trade centres in the district, the other centre being Adoni.

At the other end is Sandur taluk which has the lowest growth rate in the district, viz., 6.1 per cent. This is a newly formed taluk comprising the entire ‘merged’ area of Sandur State and some adjoining firkas of Hospet and Kudligi taluks. This is a backward, interior taluk, and there is a large area under hills and forests and it is malarious. The manganese mines in this taluk have not attracted any large population and the taluk is handicapped by inadequate internal road communications.”

(ii) *Vital statistics*.—A statement showing the number of births and deaths and deaths due to various causes in the district for the decennium, 1941–50 is furnished in *Annexure II*.

The average birth rate was 35.5 per mille during the decade under review and compares favourably with the average rate of 31.7 for the State. The average death rate of 25.1 per mille was high when compared to the average rate of 21.2 for the State. However, the annual rates have shown a steady decline except in 1947. The average death rate of 73 per mille from fever is higher than the rate for the State by 28 per cent. There was a very severe epidemic of cholera in 1942–43 and it accounts for over 85 per cent of the total mortality from cholera during the decade. The district experienced a very severe epidemic of plague in 1941 and 1943, and reported cases of plague in all the other years except 1944. The death rates from other principal diseases were about normal.

(b) *Medical relief arrangements.*—All the taluk headquarters Stations are provided with hospitals. A list of hospitals and dispensaries in the district with the bed strength is furnished below :—

The Government Headquarters hospital at Bellary provides treatment for leprosy. There is a Major X-ray set at the Government Headquarters hospital at Bellary and a minor set at the Government T.B. Sanatorium at Bellary. There is a private T.B. Sanatorium called the 'Goodwill' T.B. Sanatorium at Bellary.

V. *Items of general importance.*—The district Headquarters is at Bellary. Bellary, Adoni and Hospet are the municipalities in the district.

The dam across the Tungabhadra constructed recently is one of the biggest in South India. The dam site about 3 miles from Hospet and its adjoining colony of workers has grown into a township. The height of the dam above deep bed is 160 feet, while the length is 8,000 feet. The ultimate capacity of the reservoir is 132,700 million c.ft., or 3.05 million acre feet. The project is expected to command a total area of 2 million acres. The power that is to be generated from the Hydro-Power Stations on the two canals will give a great fillip to Irrigation and Industries.

9. BELLARY DISTRICT.

The Jumma Masjid in Adoni town is famous for its architectural decorations. Within the mosque there are two doorways carved out of black stone containing paintings of pictorial scenes from the Holy Quoran.

The temple at Manchala on the banks of the Tungabhadra river contains the tomb of Sri Raghavendraswamy which attracts pilgrims from all over Madras and the adjoining States. A festival is celebrated in August with great pomp accompanied by poor feeding.

There are historic monuments in Bellary fort which are preserved by the Archæological Department.

The Hampi ruins covering an area of nine square miles in Hospet taluk are the relics of the old Vijayanagar Kingdom. Among several temples scattered all over the ruins the temple of Sri Anjaneyaswami is pre-eminent in workmanship. The small shrine of Sri Rama and the desolate Hampi bazaar present picturesque scenes. An annual festival is celebrated and the place is visited by people from all over the Ceded Districts and the neighbouring States.

9. BELLARY DISTRICT.

A-II—Variation in Population during fifty years.

The data contained in this table have been given for each taluk in the district.

2. The areas shown in column (2) of the table for the district and the taluk "total" are the latest figures furnished by the Central Survey Office, Madras. The areas given for "urban" are those furnished by the District Officers. The areas for "rural" have been obtained by deducting the figures for "urban" from those for district and taluk "total".

3. The district area furnished by the Surveyor-General, India, which has been shown in Table A-I, could not be adopted in this table as talukwise figures have not been furnished by him. The district areas given by the Surveyor-General differ in varying degrees from those furnished by the Central Survey Office, Madras.

4. Previous census figures of population have been adjusted with reference to the merger of States, transfer of enclaves, and inter-district transfers. The rural and urban population figures have been taken as they were at the 1941 and 1931 Censuses and as they are at the present Census, regardless of the changes of rural areas into urban areas and *vice versa* from Census to Census, for the purpose of calculating percentage variation between 1931 and 1941 and between 1941 and 1951. For calculating density for 'rural' and 'urban' for 1941, the areas of the towns newly formed at the present Census rounded to the nearest square mile have been deducted from the areas given for urban in column (2) for 1951 and added to the areas given for 'rural' in the districts and taluks where new towns have been recognized.

5. In respect of Alur taluk which has no urban areas, the figures represent the total alone.

3. The livelihood classification is based on the principal means of livelihood of the self-supporting persons, the principal means of livelihood for earning and non-earning dependants being the same as that of the self-supporting persons on whom they are dependant.

4. “The principal means of livelihood” is the means of livelihood which provides the largest or the major part of the income in the case of self-supporting persons who have more than one means of livelihood. In the case of other self-supporting persons, it is the only means of livelihood.

5. A person has been regarded as “Self-supporting” if the income secured by the person is sufficient at least for his (or her) own maintenance at the level of living adopted by him (or her) at the time or the Census. The income secured may be in cash or kind. Anyone who is not a “Self-supporting” person in this sense has been regarded as a dependant. An ‘earning’ dependant is a person who secures an income which is not sufficient to support him (or her). A person who does not secure any income either in cash or kind, is a ‘non-earning dependant.’

6. The non-earning dependants include persons performing housework or other domestic or personal services for other members of the same family household, but do not include “unpaid family workers” or persons who take part along with the members of the family household in carrying on cultivation or a home industry as a family enterprise. These latter persons have been classed as either self-supporting or earning dependants according to the share of income attributable to them.

7. The self-supporting persons shown in Livelihood Class VIII include also persons who derive their income otherwise than through productive activity, i.e., persons coming under the following groups, details for which are given in the fly-leaf to Economic Table B-III:—

(1) Persons living principally on income from non-agricultural property;

(2) persons living principally on pensions, remittances, scholarships and funds;

(3) inmates of jails, asylums, alms house and recipients of doles;

(4) beggars and vagrants and

(5) all other persons living principally on income derived from non-productive activity.

9. BELLARY DISTRICT.

B-III—Employers, Employees and Independent workers in Industries and Services by Divisions and Subdivisions.

This table gives figures for each Census tract in the district. The areas comprised in each Census tract denoted by its number in column (1) have been specified in the fly-leaf to Table B-I. In this table the self-supporting persons in the four Non-agricultural Classes given in Economic Table B-I are distributed in the various divisions and subdivisions of Industries and Services under the Indian Census Economic Classification Scheme, according to their secondary Economic Status, namely, Employer, Employee and Independent worker.

2. (An) Employer (is) a person who employs other persons in order to carry on the business from which he secures his livelihood and pays them a salary of wage in cash or kind.

3. (An) Employee (is) a person who ordinarily works for some other person for a salary or a wage, in cash or kind in order to earn his livelihood.

4. (An) Independent worker (is) a person who works on his own without being employed by anyone for a salary or wage and who does not also employ anyone else in order to earn his livelihood.

5. Under the New Indian Census Economic Classification Scheme all Employers and Independent workers have been classified with reference to the commodity produced or services performed by them individually. As regards Employees, all persons engaged in Production, Commerce, or Transport (and not being domestic servants) have been classified with reference to their own activity and without reference to that of their employer. Domestic servants have been classified in one subdivision without reference to the nature of their work. All other Employees (including all managerial and supervisory employees, clerical services, messengers, watchmen and unskilled labour of every description) have been classified with reference to the commodity produced or services rendered by their Employers.

The reconciliation will be effected by adding the figures given in the next paragraph.

C-II—Livelihood Classes by Age-groups.

This table shows the livelihood distribution by age-groups for Rural, Urban and District totals in respect of a sample population based on a ten per cent sample taken out when the enumeration slips were initially sorted. The ten per cent sample was taken out as follows:—

Each enumeration pad which consisted generally of 100 enumeration slips was broken and the slips relating to displaced persons which had been noticed during the process of the preliminary scrutiny were removed from the pack of slips for being dealt with separately. The pack was then "cut" as in a card-game. The lower portion was placed above the upper portion and the slips were dealt into two pigeon-holes one marked "G" and the other marked "S" as follows:—

The first five slips were placed in the pigeon hole "G", then one slip was placed in the pigeon-hole "S". Thereafter for every nine slips placed in the pigeon-hole "G", one slip was placed in the pigeon-hole "S" until the total number of slips left was less than 9 and these residuary slips were all put into hole "G". All the slips contained in the pigeon-hole marked "S" were taken out, counted and marked as 'Sample' slips.

No smoothing formula has been adopted in preparing the table as in previous Censuses and the figures have been tabulated as actually returned in suitable age-groups.

The figures under age 'O' represent infants below one year.
