ANNUAL REPORT, 1929-30.

During the year under review expenditure on engineering works was again **Introductory.** restricted but further progress was made with the construction of the Eastern Avenue, the section immediately to the north of Byculla Bridge being completed while that portion which lies to the south of Masjid Bundar Road was continued through to Carnac Road for half its width. It is now possible to drive on an asphalt surfaced road from Sion to Crawford Market, a total distance of nearly ten miles. The demolition of the buildings standing on the eastern portion of the road was taken in hand and the full width of the road between Masjid Bundar Road and Carnac Road will be completed in 1930-31.

Industrial unrest continued during the first six months of the year and in February a strike broke out on the G. I. P. Railway and continued until the end of the year. This affected the revenue from chawls but as the estimate had been prepared on conservative lines the actual amount of rent collected was slightly in excess of that budgetted for.

The health of the occupants of the chawls was satisfactory. The total population of these chawls as at the end of December amounted to 36,088.

The demand for land continued to be below the average but the Board's lessees continued building and on the Dadar-Matunga Estate in particular a considerable number of residencies were erected. The south eastern portion of this estate is now nearing completion and a start has again been made with the erection of buildings on the western portion immediately to the north of Tilak Bridge.

With a view to affording facilities for persons of moderate means desiring to erect their own homes the Board requested Government to amend the Act so as to permit of the Trustees advancing money for this purpose to those who desired to build on the Trust estates. In order to expedite matters Mr. Hoosenally M. Rahimtoola obtained permission to introduce a private bill in the Legislative Council but unfortunately it was thrown out by a narrow majority. Had this bill become law the Trust would have been able to dispose of a large area of land and while the Board would have gained financially a considerable number of people would have been enabled to live in comfort with great advantage to themselves and their families; full particulars of this scheme are given in Appendix (O).

2. The usual appendices giving a synopsis of the Trust's work up-to-date **Statistics of Trust's work to date.** under different heads are appended to this Report. They are summarized below :—

Appendix A.—A synopsis of the Trust's capital account transactions showing how Rs. 18,02 lakhs have been spent on the city, viz., Rs. 124 lakhs on the development of building estates on certain Government and Municipal lands temporarily vested in the Trust and Rs. 16,78 on the acquisition and development of the Trust's own estates.

Appendix B.—A synopsis of the Trust's general account transactions showing the total of interest and sinking fund as compared with the total receipts.

Appendix D.—A list of Trust's estates as at the end of 1929-30 showing how they have been developed. Total developed area 49,40 lakhs square yards, valued at Rs. 10,79 lakhs; undeveloped area 74,91 lakhs square yards acquired at a cost of Rs. 3,07.4 lakhs. The original grants of land under Schedules C and D are also shown.

Appendix E.—A list of the schemes undertaken by the Board showing the expenditure already incurred in respect of each scheme, the progress made in 1929-30, the further work to be done and the estimated cost thereof; aggregate estimated cost 20,89 lakhs, of which 17,56 lakhs had been spent to end of 1929-30.

Appendix F.—A tabular statement showing the area acquired in each scheme with actual cost of acquisition to date and estimate of future cost. Total 118.33 lakhs square yards acquired for nearly Rs. 943.45 lakhs; 1.84 lakhs square yards yet to be acquired at a probable cost of Rs. 14 lakhs.

Appendix G.—A tabular statement showing the progress in leasing building sites on the Trust's developed estates. Total 1,644 sites covering 23.59 lakhs square yards leased at annual rental aggregating nearly Rs. 26.87 lakhs, leaving 930 plots covering 15.21 lakhs square yards with rental aggregating Rs. 24.29 lakhs yet to be leased.

Appendix H.—A list of Police Accommodation Schemes undertaken by the Trust, showing that in completed schemes accommodation for 138 officers and 2,571 men with their families has been provided on sites aggregating 1.40 lakhs square yards in area.

Appendix I.—A list of chawls constructed by the Trust for the poorer and working classes, showing that in completed chawls, accommodation for 45,100 adults has been provided on sites aggregating 2.08 lakhs square yards in area at a capital cost of Rs. 147.17 lakhs. Annual rents (from Rs. 4-9-0 to Rs. 56-8 for one to three room tenements per month) aggregating Rs. 9.80 lakhs per annum; capital cost per adult accommodated Rs. 327.

Appendix J.—A list of roads constructed by the Trust. Total roads all completely drained, sewered and lighted aggregating 47.53 miles in length and 12.82 lakhs square yards in area handed over to the Municipality. Others complete and incomplete aggregating 13.6 miles in length and 3.33 lakhs square yards in area, yet to be handed over; cost of roads to date Rs. 211 lakhs for construction (excluding cost of land.)

3. The office of the Land Acquisition Officer for the City of Bombay was held by Mr. G. C. Rowe, F.S.I., F.I. Arb., throughout the year. Acquisition of land. (L. A. O.'s Cases.)

The total number of cases brought to the file was 850 which included 841 outstanding cases of the previous year.

Out of the total number of 850 cases 202 embracing an aggregate area of 85,655 square yards (17.70 acres) were disposed of and compensation amounting to Rs. 8,49,467 including Rs. 55,646 [under Section 48 (2)] of the Land Acquisition Act in withdrawn cases, was awarded, 35 cases were withdrawn from acquisition. Thus at the end of the year there remained 613 cases outstanding.

At the end of the year 1928-29 a total area of 2,58,629 square yards (53.44 acres) had remained to be acquired. The Acquisition effected in the year under review comprising 85,655 square yards (17.70 acres) represents nearly 33 per cent. of the balance brought over from the previous year.

The total area acquired included 1,450 square yards of foot tracks passages and such other lands for which a nominal compensation of Rs. 3 was paid.

If the foregoing area aggregating to 1,450 square yards be excluded from the total acquired area 85,655 and Rs. 7,93,818 awarded for all the cases be spread over the balance of 84,205 square yards the amount awarded gives to the land a rate of Rs. 9.43 per square yard an all over price which is lower than the rate of Rs. 15.97 at which land was acquired in the preceding year 1928-29.

Details of acquisition by contest as also by settlement are given for each Scheme separately in Appendix F. They are briefly summarized as under:—

The foregoing table shows that out of 202 cases acquired two were settled which represents 1 per cent. of the total number of cases disposed of. The aggregate amount of awards in these settled cases works out to Rs. 1,000 which is equivalent to 0.12 per cent. of the total amount of Rs. 7,93,821 awarded for all cases.

Most of the lands acquired were in Worli, Dharavi, Sewri-Wadala and Sewri-Koliwada Street Schemes. None of them had any distinctive features that call for any remarks or comments.

4. During the year under review three references were brought over from the preceding year and 14 fresh references were brought on the file. High Court References.

5. There were two appeals pending during the year, one against the decision of Tribunal of Appeal and the other against the Decree of the Hon'ble Court, of these the second one was dismissed with costs. High Court Appeals.

The Trust Counsels and Solicitors' charges for compensation references and appeals amounted to Rs. 13,957.

Works.

6. The Engineering Department has been chiefly concerned in carrying out the undermentioned works which represent the bulk of the expenditure debited to Capital Account.

Quarries.

Sewri Quarry.—Quarry operations on the hill situated in Case No. 110 and the surrounding land comprised of uncut ridges were begun in November 1929 and were continued till the end of the year under report and about 760 solid brass of stone was quarried during the year. The expenditure during the year was Rs. 40,060-10-11 and the total receipts from the sale of materials Rs. 40,250-1-1, thus showing a profit of Rs. 189-6-2.

Nowroji Hill Quarry.—With the reduction in stocks of quarry materials which amounted to Rs. 35,823-6-6 as on 1st April 1928 to Rs. 18,734-11-7 as on 1st April 1929, it was considered advisable to restart quarrying operations at the commencement of the year. The riots in the city during the beginning of the year disorganized labour to some extent and also affected the sales.

Quarrying and crushing was carried out throughout the year and approximately 23,500 tons of materials were quarried. The expenditure during the year under report including book adjustments was Rs. 52,293-11-9 and the total receipts from the sale of materials produced Rs. 68,640-1-6 including the value of stock on hand, showing a profit of Rs. 16,346-5-9; as only 3,500 solid brass were quarried during the year, the rate of profit per brass works out to Rs. 4-10-9.

During the year under review, the sale of quarry materials to the Public was proportionately much higher than the sale to the Trust Schemes owing to the curtailment in the programme of work. The higher rates secured from the Public sales account for the higher rate of royalty realized.

Another point of interest was the proposal of the Government Mining Inspector to bring this quarry under the operations of the Mining Act. The Government representative inspected the quarry during February 1930 and the arguments in favour of exemption from the Act were explained to him. Nothing further has been heard from him.

General Account.—Rs. 3,58,035 were spent against this account of which Rs. 11,046 were spent on maintenance of Schedule lands, Rs. 85,886 on repairs to acquired buildings, Rs. 1,24,667 on repairs to Trust Chawls and S. P. Sheds and Rs. 1,36,436 on the maintenance of Streets.

Maintenance Branch.—Maintenance of the Trust's acquired properties as well as permanent chawls, semi-permanent sheds, Administrative offices in Fort and Matunga was looked after efficiently by the Architectural Branch of the Engineer's Department and the necessary repairs were executed to the buildings to keep them in a sound condition.

At the commencement of the year there were 986 acquired buildings in charge of the Department. During the year 162 additional buildings were acquired and 44 demolished leaving 1,104 standing at the close of the year.

Works in Schemes.

NORTHERN DIVISION.

7. *Scheme No. 5, Dadar-Matunga.*—During the year, 1,388 square yards of carriageway at the junction of Tilak Road and Kingsway were surfaced with sheet asphalt and 2,550 R.ft. of carriageway of different widths totalling 6,782 square yards, were handed over to the Municipality.

The work of lighting different roads was continued and gas lamps were provided on a portion of Matunga-Wadala Road between Sewri Cross Road and Tilak Road.

The widening of the old Matunga-Wadala Road between the Tilak and Sewri Cross Roads was taken in hand and 640 R. ft. of carriageway, 36 ft. in width, was completed with kerbs including 560 R. ft. of storm-water drains and 590 R. ft. of sewer.

Paving the footpaths opposite completed buildings was continued and about 5,200 square yards of pavement including Shahabad slabs, Tar strips and carriage entrances were completed. Repairs to footpaths completed in the previous year were carried out prior to handing over to the Municipality as a result of which 8,990 R. ft. of footpaths of different widths, totalling 9,631 square yards, were handed over to the Municipality.

The planting of roadside trees was continued and during the year 300 trees were newly planted on different roads.

The preparation of recreation grounds and gardens in the Scheme was continued and 2 additional gardens admeasuring 12,000 square yards, were completed in all respects. 2,170 R. ft. of railing around two additional grass plots was completed. Six gardens admeasuring 13,167 square yards, were handed over to the Municipality. The garden laid out by the Trustees of Mr. N. P. Wadia was also handed over by them to the Municipality for maintenance.

At the request of the Secretary of Mansukh Club, the two Tennis Courts in the playground near Vincent Square, Dadar, at the south end of Scheme 5, which were originally constructed with murrum and metal, were re-made and completed with Porbandar stone metal.

The chlorination of the sewage at Matunga Pumping Station was continued with good results.

Scheme No. 6, Sion-Matunga.—Repairs to the pavement of footpaths were completed prior to handing over to the Municipality and 2,560 R. ft. of footpaths of different widths, totalling 3,490 square yards, were handed over.

The provision of electric lights in the staff quarters (two-room tenements and Workmen's Cottages) including open spaces, staircases, etc., was taken in hand and completed during the year.

Scheme No. 31, Parel Estate.—500 ft. of 8" pipe sewer under King Edward Road was completed. 400 ft. of 50 ft. carriageway was completed including asphalt surfacing, tree plantation and lighting arrangement as also the Northern footpath of King Edward Road admeasuring 2,040 square yards, were completed and handed over to the Municipality at the time of reporting.

The central reservation of Suparibag Road between Lalbaug and Poibawdi was metalled and the surface treated with mexphalte and an area of 10,620 square yards handed over to the Municipality.

Repairs to the Eastern footpath and the Eastern carriageway of Suparibag Road were completed during the year and the road was handed over to the Municipality.

1,290 Square yards of other footpaths in the scheme were paved and handed over to the Municipality.

Two recreation grounds admeasuring 8,400 square yards and 2,850 square yards of carriageway of portion of Government Gate Road between Parel Back Road and King Edward Road which were completed during the previous year were handed over to the Municipality.

Scheme No. 47, Parel Road (Northern).—Work on about 800 ft. of the remaining portion of 120 ft. Eastern Avenue in this Scheme between Byculla Bridge and Byculla Station was started and completed during the year including drainage arrangements and lighting. A portion of the Western carriageway in front of the Maruti Temple could not be done as the site was not acquired.

3,050 sq. yards of footpath pavement in this scheme was completed during the year.

Scheme No. 56, Dharavi.—The work of constructing roads to give access to the plots let out for buffalo stables was continued during the year. An additional length of 1,140 R.ft. of storm-water drain, 220 R.ft. of pipe sewer and 440 R.ft. of carriageway was completed during the year.

Two wells were filled up to meet with the requirements of the Municipal Health Department.

Scheme No. 57, Sewri-Wadala.—The Municipal Commissioner in pursuance of the policy to combat Malaria called upon the Trust to fill in several wells in this Scheme. Accordingly seven wells were completely filled in, the quantity of spoil dumped being 630 brass.

1,755 cubic brass of spoil was dumped in various pits, ditches and quarry pits on requisitions from the Municipal Health Officer.

110 ft. of 9" pipe sewer was laid under road No. 52 Sewree Cross Road.

No progress could be made on the construction of Road No. 18 as the site of the Preventive Officer's quarters was not acquired.

Scheme No. 60, Naigaum.—120 ft. of 30 ft. carriageway of 50 ft. Road No. 15 was completed without surfacing. Further progress could not be made as the buildings were not demolished.

670 square yards of footpaths were paved during the year.

The playground enclosed by Roads 16, 15 and 9 was completely laid out. It comprises an area of 7,050 square yards; a set of swings, benches and water connection were provided and the whole handed over to the Municipality.

Scheme No. 69, Byculla Bridge.—1,330 square yards of the remaining portion of the Eastern Avenue at the north end of this scheme was completed together with 210 square yards of footpath pavement on the west and the same handed over to the Municipality.

SOUTHERN DIVISION.

Scheme No. 2.—The X.P.M. railings for the verandah of all the blocks of Chandanwadi Chawls were filled in with cement concrete to stop the practice of tenants hanging dirty screens over these railings to secure privacy, the old wrought iron weather shades on the southern face of blocks Nos. 1 and 2 were replaced by Mangalore tiled ones.

Scheme No. 3, Sandhurst Road.—Footpaths admeasuring 1,141 square yards along Sandhurst Road between the Dongri Street and Elphinstone Bridge were paved and handed over to the Municipality. Thus all the footpaths on this Estate have been handed over to the Municipality except the one abutting on the Dongri Market which is used by vegetable squatters. Service passages between plots Nos. 32 and 81 on Imamwada Road and behind plots Nos. 3 and 4 on Second Pathan Street and behind plot No. 5 in Paper Mill Lane were metalled and spramexed.

Scheme No. 11, West Agripada.—A passage (measuring 4,600 square feet) leading to the Motor Lorry Garage from Lamington Road was constructed.

Scheme No. 27, Mathew Road.—Footpath admeasuring 277 square yards in front of the open plot at the north-east junction of the old and new Queen's Road was constructed and handed over to the Municipality. All the footpaths in this Scheme are now paved and handed over.

Scheme No. 29, Nowroji Hill Roads.—Footpaths of Dongri Street and Flank Roads Nos. 1 and 2 opposite plots Nos. 30 and 40, of Jail Road East opposite plot No. 13 and of Roads Nos. 4 and 5 along the recreation ground were paved during the year.

Road No. 4 to the east of its junction with Road No. 21 admeasuring 1,638 square yards was completed with 3" asphalt macadam and provided with gas lights, and handed over to the Municipality.

A Vent-shaft was attached to the building on plot No. 138 from the head of the sewer in Road No. 2.

The recreation ground between roads Nos. 4 and 5 was handed over to the Municipality early in April.

Scheme No. 32, East Agripada.—The 20' carriageway in DeLisle Road Cross Lane was spramexed and provided with gas lights, and its northern 10' footpath was paved, and both carriageway and the footpath admeasuring 1,086 square yards and 522 square yards, respectively, were handed over to the Municipality.

Cross Roads Nos. 6S and 7S in continuation of Municipal roads between Sankli and New Souter Streets were constructed with 10" rubble packing, metalling, kerbing, 9" water tables, with 2 rows of set-stones, etc., including water entrances and branch connections, but without surfacing and lighting.

The service passage by the side of plot No. 6 (South Estate) was metalled and spramexed and that between plots Nos. 14 and 15 (South Estate) was metalled.

Scheme No. 37, Sydenham Road.—The Recreation Ground on Plots Nos. 17 and 18 was constructed with turfing, pipe railings, swings, sand pit, etc., and kept ready for being handed over to the Municipality early in April 1930.

During the year under review the Municipality completed the laying of the Ovoid Sewer from the junction of Parel Road and Sydenham Road to the junction of the 120' Eastern Avenue with Sandhurst Road.

Pavement of footpaths with Shahabad stone slabs was completed along plots Nos. 1, 51, 54B and 56A.

On the Western carriageway, from case No. 234 to Carnac Road, the work of laying 6" R.I.F. cement concrete foundations with the underground drainage arrangements for a length of 875 R. ft. and of surfacing with 3" sheet asphalt and electric lighting for a length of 1,188 R. ft. was completed. The entire length of the western carriageway from Bhendy Bazar to Carnac Road was opened to traffic early in December 1929.

Cement concrete foundations with the underground drainage arrangements were laid for the tram tracks for a length of 1,105 ft. from Case No. 234 to Carnac Road.

Cement concrete foundations with the underground drainage arrangements were laid for a length of 164 ft. for the eastern carriageway south of Janjekar Street. The unsightly latrines and urinals at the junction of Carnac Road and Sydenham Road (for the reinstatement of which the Trust paid the Municipality), were removed and the work of adding the set-back on Palton Road along Crawford Market, was almost completed at the end of the year with blue stone pavement for the footpath and 10" rubble packing, metalling, kerbing, etc., for the carriageway.

The service passage between plot Nos. 54B and 55 was metalled and spramexed.

Scheme No. 43, Parel Road (Central).—Pavement of the Western footpath for a length of 303 ft. opposite case No. 40 and of the Eastern footpath for a length of 85 ft. at the junction of Parel and Nesbit Roads was completed, and the same along with the footpaths already paved at Clare Road junction admeasuring 1,051 square yards in all were handed over to the Municipality.

Scheme No. 50, Mazgaon Chawls.—The Central passages between the several blocks of chawls having been fouled by the tenants an area of over 9,300 sq. ft. was surfaced with spramex.

Scheme No. 52, Worli Street.—(1) Repairs to pitching of seawall wherever necessary were carried out ;

(2) Levelling plots wherever there were hollows, was completed as per Health Officer's requirements ;

(3) Filling in wells in Cases Nos. 390, 527 and 639A was completed ;

(4) Vent-shafts—Two Nos. on Road No. 12 and two Nos. on Road No. 13 were erected.

Scheme No. 53, Foras Road.—Footpaths abutting on the Bellasis Road Chawls and the footpath of the 40' Road off Foras Road admeasuring 3,367 square yards were completed partly with spramex surfacing and partly with Shahabad pavement and handed over to the Bombay Municipality.

Scheme No. 54, Kolbhatwadi.—Pavement of footpath opposite plot No. 15 and metalling the service passage behind the same plot was completed.

Scheme No. 58, Worli Extension.—The work of filling in of wells in Cases Nos. 10 and 24 and covering of well in Case No. 33 was completed.

Scheme No. 71, West Chowpatty.—(1) Footpath opposite Plot No. 34, admeasuring 39 square yards was paved with Shahabad stones, including carriage entrance.

(2) Garden admeasuring 1,250 square yards between Municipal Garden and 15' passage on the western boundary of the Scheme was completed.

Administration.

Trust Programme. 8. No new scheme was undertaken during the year. The question of the improvement of the Kamathipura District was again considered and abandoned on financial grounds. It was decided to suggest to the Corporation that they should obtain power to deal with slums without the necessity of wholesale acquisition and demolition.

SCHEME 62—LOVE LANE CHAWLS.

(a) The Board sanctioned the fixing of wire gauze to all windows of the rooms on the ground floor of Block No. 2 and the construction of a compound wall between two chawls with four outlets, at an estimated cost of Rs. 1,016.

(b) The rents of each of the shops was reduced by Rs. 5 per month.

SCHEME 57—SEWRI-WADALA—CASE NO. 45.

(a) The owner of this property being anxious to retain the liquor licence attached to it was permitted to give to the Trust, free of cost, 177 sq. yds. of land for widening the road and to demolish and reconstruct his building on a new site which consisted partly of his own land and partly (*i.e.*, to the extent of 378 sq. yds.) of the Board's land. No other compensation was made.

(b) The right of tapping date trees in Case 415 was auctioned and a bid was accepted on condition that no toddy should be sold on the Trust land. This condition was subsequently cancelled and the general question of allowing the creation of tree-foot booths was referred to a Sub-Committee for consideration and report. On the recommendation of the Sub-Committee, the Committee decided that there was no objection to the letting of the trees for tapping and of sites for the erection of tree-foot booths in the case of old tenancies.

SCHEME 56—DHARAVI.

(6) An unfilled area of about 32,500 sq. yds. was set aside as a site for a future playground, in the meantime the tenants of the milch cattle stables are to be permitted to dump clean litter on it.

(a) The Scheme was altered by the exclusion of 30 properties admeasuring about 41,546 sq. yds., and the alteration was sanctioned by Government and the properties were withdrawn from acquisition.

The exclusion of the above properties together with the exclusion of 186 properties in 1927, resulted in the denotification of all the Kolis' houses originally included in the Scheme.

SCHEME 53—BELLASIS ROAD CHAWLS.

The Board sanctioned the reduction of the rent of the shops from Rs. 50, 35, 30, 30, 30 and 30 to Rs. 45, 30, 30, 25, 20 and 20 per month.

Blocks 15 and 16 were allotted to the Commissioner of Police for housing the Police at a monthly rental of Rs. 600 per block.

SCHEME 37—SYDENHAM ROAD.

The Bombay Electric Supply & Tramways Co., Ltd., were granted permission to extend their tracks along Sydenham Road and Paltan Road, thus linking up Bhandi Bazar with Hornby Road. The work will be taken in hand as soon as Government have accorded sanction.

A supplementary grant of Rs. 1,200 was sanctioned by the Board in connection with the construction of the recreation ground on plots 17 and 18. The additional cost involved was due to—

- (1) the inclusion in the recreation ground of a larger area,
- (2) the removal of certain old masonry foundations, and
- (3) the provision of fencing to keep the ground clear of undesirable persons.

AGRIPADA CHAWLS.

The rent of the shops in Block No. 1 facing Morland Road was reduced as the present rent was found to be excessive.

The central reservation was mexphalted and eight seats were provided at convenient places.

SCHEME 6—SION-MATUNGA.

The two-room tenements and the Old and New Ground floor cottages were provided with electric lights at an estimated cost of Rs. 8,460. The tenants were charged extra Rs. 1-8-0 per room per month to cover interest and sinking fund charges the cost of energy consumed being borne by the tenants.

The Trust again supported a representation by the Matunga Residents' Association asking the G. I. P. Railway administration to provide a station on the Railway near King's Circle.

The Local Advisory Committee of the Railway considered the development of the district insufficient to justify the outlay.

The Bombay Electric Supply and Tramways Co. was permitted to erect 50 poles for aerial mains on the usual conditions.

SCHEME 5—DADAR-MATUNGA.

The Municipality were permitted to join the sewers laid under Vatsraj and Laxmi Narayan lanes with the Trust sewers. The Trust undertook to treat the sewage at their outfall works on condition that the Municipality made no charge for water consumed at the sewage disposal works.

The Board sanctioned the carrying out of certain alterations to the Tennis Courts in Vincent Square at an estimated cost of Rs. 2,000 and to charge interest at 6 per cent. per annum only in the shape of rent.

SCHEME 2—PRINCESS STREET.

The Board sanctioned the payment of the Trust's share of the cost of leveling, etc., Charni Wadi Lane off Lohar Street by the Municipality.

At the end of 1929-30 out of a total area of 2,910 Acres vested in or acquired by the Trust, it will be seen that about $\frac{1}{2}$ remained to be developed; of the developed area $\frac{3}{10}$ ths remained to be leased. The average value of the leased plots is Rs. 19 per square yard; that of those which remain to be leased is estimated at about Rs. 29 per square yard.

10. Further progress was made during the year in working out in detail, the development of those portions of the various estates which are likely to be first in demand. The plans of certain areas were also revised to meet changes in demand. The development of the Southern portion of Scheme 37 was proceeded with.

Progress of Development.

11. Upto the beginning of the year 1929-30, Completion Certificates had been granted for 1,028 buildings on the Trust Estates (exclusive of Police and Trust Chawls), and taking into consideration the buildings which had been occupied with permission without Completion Certificates, the accommodation that had been made available by private enterprise was as follows :—

3,498 shops, 668 godowns, 1 shoeing forge, 3 soda water factories, 1 rope factory, 3 soap factories, (one having 1 store room, 1 packing room, 2 offices and 1 hall), 1 tin smith shop, 1 iron foundry, 1 church, 4 theatres, 1 cinema house, 6 temples, 13 showrooms, 15 work-shops, 9 houses for clubs and other associations, 16 schools (one having 7 class rooms and 2 dormitories and another having 1 hall, 5 class-rooms, 1 tiffin room and 1 store), 2 class rooms, 1 music school, 5 hospitals, 3 office buildings, 16 electric sub-stations with 4 offices, 8 offices, 3 jamatkhanas, 5 hotels, 2 hostels, 332 motor garages, 32 coach-houses and stalls, 4 motor work-shops and a show-room, 2 printing presses, 2 lecture halls, 1 foundling home accommodating 300 inmates, 1 paper sorting work-shop, 1 silk school, 1 silk factory, 1 weavers' shed for 50 looms and a rope factory, 1 photographic studio, 1 lying-in-hospital for 22 beds, 3 post and telegraph offices, 1 telephone Auto exchange building, 1 building for hospital and school purposes, 1 building for marriage ceremonial purposes, 1 ceremonial hall for dead, 1 stable for 10 bullocks, 16 milch cattle stables for 4,275 animals, 1 cabinet work-shop, 1 sanitary institute, 2 stables, 3 sheds for Tramway Company's work-shop, 1 hall, 1 library, 1 office and 1 godown, 2 cow-sheds, 178 store rooms, 3 bakeries, 1 sick room, 1 orphanage, 1 rescue home (having 1 work room, 1 reception room, 1 store room, 2 dormitories and 1 sick room), 2 mosques, 1 prayer hall, 1 Technical Institute (having 1 power house, 2 work-shops, 1 Textile department, 13 office rooms, 1 chemistry department, 9 lecture rooms, 10 store rooms, 1 foundry and smithy, 1 machinery fitting department, 1 electrical department, 1 library, 2 Physics heat and Physics general, 1 machinery testing laboratory, 1 principal's and Board's room, 1 drawing and examination hall), 1 dharamsala, 1 New Lines for His Excellency the Governor's Body Guard, 1 workmen's Institute, 1 Technological laboratory (having experimental spinning plant and Testing room, 1 office and 1 store), 1 seminary for Training Parsi Priests, 2 religious rooms, 1 billiard room, 8 tiffin rooms, 1 police guard room, 1 strong room, 1 market (having 45 vegetable stalls, 16 mutton stalls, 55 fish stalls, 1 fowl house, 1 cold storage, 1 engine room and 1 office), 1 Public hall, 1 memorial hall, 1 loom factory, 1 American Mission House (having a dispensary with waiting room, 1 lecture hall, 1 school with 2 class rooms, 1 games room and 1 office), 18,028 tenements for families (8,986 of which are one room tenements, 2,718 two rooms tenements, 4,358 larger tenements and 1,966 servants' quarters.)

In 1929-30, Completion Certificates were granted in respect of 38 new buildings and in addition permission was given to occupy 21 buildings. The following further accommodation was thus made available by private enterprise :—

81 shops, 10 godowns, 1 Agiary, 1 school (having 19 class rooms and 2 tiffin rooms), 1 soda fountain, 1 dental hospital, 1 extension to the hospital, 16 motor garages, 15 store rooms, 430 tenements for families (148 of which are one-room tenements, 47 two-room tenements, 230 larger tenements and 5 servants' quarters).

In the case of the Trust Post-War chawls a number of rooms remained unlet during the year. The pre-war Chawls were however fully occupied. During the year, 45 acquired buildings on the Trust Estates were demolished containing 215 tenements of which 182 were of one room each. The new residential accommodation made available in the Trust Estates during the year (neglecting shops and other non-residential quarters) amounted to 430 tenements and these were all provided in houses erected by lessees.

It will be seen from Appendices N-1 and N-2 that the total number of tenements provided upto date in all the Trust Estates including those erected by the Development Department and the several Mill Companies exceeds the total number of tenements demolished by 15,332 as shown below :—

Disposal of Lands.

12. The number of plots let during the year was 25 having a total area of **Long leases.** 25,356 square yards (5 Acres) and valued at Rs. 6,32,631. In addition 5 plots having an area of 1,310 square yards were sold outright for Rs. 16,727. Deducting 7 plots which were resumed during the year the total number of plots disposed of upto end of 1929-30 is 1,649 measuring 23,60,510 square yards (488 Acres) valued at Rs. 6,34,77,727 and having an annual rental of Rs. 26,86,900. The rate at which ground rents are capitalized in the various tables in this Report is at 22½ years' purchase for plots let before the 23rd November 1920 and at 18 years' purchase thereafter.

Taking 6 per cent on the amount receivable on account of sales and premia as the equivalent of annual rent, the figures indicating the progress in the disposal of the Board's lands in the year stand as follows : —

In point of number, area, value and rent the result shows a material decrease when compared with the previous year. The reason is partly found in the fact that 7 plots having an area of 10,886 square yards (2 Acres) valued at Rs. 2,23,479 were relinquished to the Board but is chiefly due to the depressed state of the land market and of trade generally. It may be observed however that the resumed plots which were originally let at rents calculated on the 4½ per cent basis will be re-let on a basis of 6 per cent.

Short leases.

13. There were 952 acquired buildings in charge of the Trust at the commencement of the year, whilst 150 were acquired during the year and 45 were demolished.

At the end of the year the Trust had 1,057 such buildings, containing 8,003 tenements.

Health and Sanitation in Board's Chawls.

The health and sanitation in Board's chawls were good as is evidenced from the fact that the death-rate during the year was as low as 5.82 as against 20.4 for the whole City.

Every effort is being made to keep the chawls and the surroundings clean. There is, however, still room for improvement if only lower class of tenants will co-operate with the staff by ridding themselves of the dirty and objectionable habit of throwing refuse, etc., in the passage.

The full letting value of the 10,074 rooms including shops, godowns and 214 looms in the Trust Chawls was Rs. 9,80,267 (*vide* Appendix I²) and Note at the foot thereof. The Revenue actually collected amounted to Rs. 8,83,897 or 71.76 per cent. of the total recoverable, *i.e.*, Rs. 12,31,617 for the year including previous arrears of Rs. 3,26,214.

The total rental for the year 1929-1930 of the 1,650 rooms including looms in weavers' sheds in Trust Semi-permanent sheds was Rs. 65,027-5-0. The revenue actually collected amounted to Rs. 54,054 or 48.14 per cent. of the total recoverable, *i.e.*, Rs. 1,12,270 for the year including the previous arrears of Rs. 54,593.

The rents charged by the Board for their permanent chawls range from Rs. 4-9-0 to Rs. 56-8-0 for living rooms for one to three-room tenements.

annual rental of Rs. 9,80,267, *i.e.*, full letting value of the Chawls and the total outgoings at 48.78 per cent. The net annual income of the permanent chawls, works out to Rs. 5,02,093 or 3.41 per cent. on the cost of Chawls Rs. 147.17 lakhs including value of the land (*vide* Appendix I¹). The Board have to pay interest and sinking fund charges on their cost at Rs. 4.61 per cent. per annum on the Capital expenditure prior to 1919-20 and at an average rate of 6.35 per cent. per annum on the expenditure since incurred.

This would amount to Rs. 8.60 lakhs per annum or an excess of 3.58 lakhs over and above the net annual income and represents a loss of nearly Rs. 35.5 per room per annum on an average.

The average population at the chawls during 1929-30 was 32,109 against 30,261 and 29,563 in 1928-29 and 1927-28 respectively whilst the corresponding figures for Semi-Permanent Sheds were 3,979, 3,585 and 3,886 respectively.

Finance.

15. The Trust's programme for 1929-30 necessitated the raising of a loan of Rs. 25 lakhs on the following terms, viz. :—

(i) rate of interest $5\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. per annum ;

(ii) period sixty years the Board undertaking to repurchase the debentures at the end of 15 years.

(iii) sinking fund at the rate of 4 per cent. per annum.

In view of the conditions prevailing at the time of issue it was decided that the required amount should be met by a cash credit for Rs. 25 lakhs for one year from 4th November 1929. Quotations were therefore invited from the approved banks and the offers made by the Central Bank of India and the Bank of India being most favourable were accepted. They were as follows :—

Central Bank of India Rs. $12\frac{1}{2}$ lakhs at Bank rate the money being paid and withdrawn from time to time.

Bank of India Rs. $12\frac{1}{2}$ lakhs at $6\frac{1}{4}$ per cent., the money being paid and withdrawn from time to time.

This brings the Trust's total borrowings up-to-date to Rs. 16.19 lakhs (Rs. 14.84 lakhs in India and £8,99,600 in England) involving interest and Sinking Fund charges of nearly Rs. 92 lakhs.

During the year Government decided to reduce the rate of interest payable by the Trust on the balance of the advance taken from Government in 1922-23, viz., Rs. 152.98 lakhs out of the loan of Rs. 172 lakhs from $6\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. to $5\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. resulting in a saving of over $1\frac{1}{2}$ lakhs.

By the close of 1929-30, the Board had raised Rs. 16,19 lakhs by loans and their total capital receipts (including the Grant of Rs. 54 lakhs received from Government) amounted to Rs. 18,34 lakhs out of which they spent Rs. 1,24 lakhs on the improvement of Government and Municipal lands temporarily vested in them and Rs. 16,77 on their acquired estates and office buildings.

The method of distributing cost of management and establishment and the incidental expenses has been fully explained in the annual report for 1912-13. Cost of Management & Establishment.

The actual charges for the year amounted to Rs. 9.91 lakhs, of which Rs. 4.50 lakhs were charged to Capital Account, Rs. 5.13 lakhs to General Account and the rest to Miscellaneous Accounts. The normal percentage calculations for the year had to be increased by 133.63 per cent. on account of the lower actual cost of acquisition and works.

In addition to the amount of Rs. 20.98 lakhs collected under temporary revenue shown in the above statement, Rs. 4,695 were realized by the Trust Engineer being proceeds of the sale of flowers, plant, &c., from the gardens.

The collection of permanent revenue is under the control of the Chief Accountant whilst the temporary revenue is collected by the Estate Agent. Outstandings of permanent revenue at the end of the year were 8.9 per cent. of the total demand and under temporary revenue the percentage was 27.

In connection with the temporary revenue, 1,283 suits were filed for arrears aggregating Rs. 36,674 of which Rs. 13,684 still remain to be recovered. As regards permanent revenue, there were 26 cases of default which involved the taking of legal action during the official year.

The number of rent bills issued in the year for temporary revenue was 2,40,400, the corresponding figure for the previous year being 2,33,200. No rent bills were issued for permanent revenue.

On the 30th April 1929, Dr. Moreshwar Chintaman Javle was elected as Chairman for the year.

Dewan Bahadur A. K. Pai died on 18th February 1930.

The Executive Engineer, Presidency Division, was appointed on the Improvements Committee in place of the Director of Development resigned from 1st March 1930.

Mr. B. G. Horniman resigned from 25th March 1930.

Principal officers.

Mr. R. H. A. Delves, C.I.E., F.S.I., Chief Officer, was re-appointed for a further period of three years from 5th May 1929. Mr. Delves was on leave from 1st June 1929 to 19th September 1929.

Mr. A. K. Dadachanji, L.C.E., Acting Estate Agent, was appointed to act as Chief Officer but he had to proceed on leave from 10th June 1929 due to illness which resulted in his death on 28th June 1929. The Board placed on record their sense of the heavy loss sustained by the Trust at his death.

Mr. N. D. Mehta, B.A., (then) Retrenchment and Reforms Adviser to the Corporation, acted as Chief Officer from 1st July 1929 to 19th September 1929. On the relinquishment of his acting appointment, Mr. Mehta's services were appreciated by the Board.

Mr. C. P. Gorwalla, B.A., Secretary, was on leave from 3rd to 20th April 1929.

Mr. A. K. Dadachanji, L.C.E., Acting Estate Agent, (in the place of Mr. J. T. Burge, F.S.I., Estate Agent on leave prior to retirement) was on leave from 29th January 1929 to 25th May 1929. On Mr. Dadachanji's appointment as Acting Chief Officer the work of the Estate Agent was distributed between Messrs. H. G. Mhatre, L.C.E., A.M.I.E., (then) Deputy Estate Agent, and K. P. Pavri, Senior Assistant Estate Agent. Mr. H. G. Mhatre has since been appointed to act as Estate Agent from 9th August 1929, during the remaining portion of Mr. Burge's leave.

Due to reduction in the expenditure on works Mr. T. R. S. Kynnersley, M.I.C.E., Acting Engineer, applied for all the leave prior to retirement, which was granted. Mr. Kynnersley retired from 29th December 1929. The Committee placed on record their high appreciation of the work done by him. The work of the Engineer has been distributed between Messrs. D. N. Baria, L.C.E., and H. M. Abhyankar, L.C.E., Senior Assistant Engineers.

Establishment.

The Board were pleased to grant a holiday on full pay to the non-scheduled Staff on His Majesty the King-Emperor's Birthday.

The Engineer's Office was shifted from Matunga to the Head Offices in the Fort.

The scale of conveyance allowances paid to the Staff was reduced with effect from 1st March 1929.

The total saving on account of the cuts effected during the year amounted to Rs. 43,440 per annum.

There were 33 Committee meetings during the period, the figures for the previous years being 32 for 1928-29 and 41 for 1927-28. The average attendance was 12.21 out of 18 Members.

There were 59 Meetings of the various Sub-Committees during the period, the figure for the previous year being 67 and the average attendance was 4.93 out of 7 Members.

Other matters of interest.

REGISTRATION OF TITLE.

25. Government, having forwarded a copy of a report by Mr. Kirke-Smith, Solicitor to Government, on the working of the Land Transfer system in England and on the feasibility of its application to the Town and Island of Bombay for the opinion of the Board, were informed that while the Committee were of opinion that the introduction of a system of registration of title was desirable they realized that many practical difficulties would have to be overcome and a considerable amount of legislation undertaken and further that in their opinion Government would be well advised to appoint a Committee (on which conveyancing lawyers should be represented) to consider and report on the whole subject.

FILLING OF WELLS.

The Board sanctioned a grant of Rs. 16,133 for filling in 16 wells and for covering 4 wells with concrete and providing them with pumps, if necessary, in their Parel, Sewri-Wadala, Worli, Worli-Koliwada and Dharavi Schemes.

EXTENT OF GOVERNMENT AUDIT.

The audit conducted by the Government Auditors being a test audit and not a complete audit, a question was raised whether it would not be possible for the Examiner to carry out a complete audit. The Examiner on being interviewed by the Finance Sub-Committee informed the Sub-Committee that if a complete audit was required, the Trust would have to pay about Rs. 40,000 a year. The Examiner was, however, of opinion that a complete audit was not necessary, in view of the fact that the pre-audit carried out by the Chief Accountant was satisfactory and whenever any irregularity was discovered it was immediately reported

to the Committee. It was therefore decided that no change in the method of audit was necessary, especially in view of the pending amalgamation of the Trust with the Municipality.

To facilitate disposal of some of the smaller plots on the outlying estates more particularly, Dadar-Matunga and Sion-Matunga, a scheme was sanctioned by the Board whereby the Trust would advance money to persons of moderate means to enable them to build houses mainly for residential purposes and Government was requested to amend the Act accordingly. Before Government could take action in the matter a private Bill was introduced by Mr. Hoosenally M. Rahimtoola for the purpose. Government referred Mr. Hoosenally's Bill to the Board for their views. After considering the matter carefully and consulting the Trust Solicitors, the Board amended the Bill and returned it to Government. The Bill was, however, thrown out in the Legislative Council.

APPENDIX O.

Excerpt from the Proceedings of a meeting of the Improvements Committee held on 23rd April 1929.

Re: Resolution No. 1, dated 12th April 1929, of the Special Sub-Committee appointed under C. R. No. 342 of 1928, re: sale of plots.

Considered excerpt from the proceedings of the meeting of the Special Sub-Committee appointed under Committee's Resolution No. 342 of 1928, re: sale of plots, held on 12th April 1929 :—

“ Considered Chief Officer's note, dated 28th March 1929 :—

‘ I have for some time been considering whether in order to facilitate the disposal of some of the smaller plots on our outlying estates, more particularly Dadar-Matunga and Sion-Matunga, it would not be advisable to work out a scheme whereby the Trust could advance money to persons of moderate means to enable them to build. The Board have no power to do this under the present Act but provision could no doubt be made by a suitable amendment or, if in view of the proposed amalgamation of the Trust with the Municipality that is not thought desirable by legislation in connection with the amalgamation.

2. In my opinion the power of granting advances of this nature should be limited and loans should only be made to persons who desire to erect small houses to be used mainly for residential purposes. I believe that if the Board obtained this power they would succeed in disposing of a considerable number of plots to persons who although possessed of a certain amount of money are not sufficiently well off to erect their own family houses. Exactly what limit should be placed on individual advances must be a matter of opinion but I am in favour of making the maximum Rs. 20,000 with a condition that the borrower should provide 35 per cent. of the cost of the building and works.

3. The scheme would be worked somewhat as follows :—

- (a) The person to whom an advance was to be made would take a plot on an agreement for a building lease in the usual way and subject to the ordinary conditions.
- (b) When applying for the plot he would indicate his desire to take an advance and would mention the probable amount which should not exceed 65% of the cost of the building and works. He would also produce satisfactory evidence that he is possessed of the remaining 35%.
- (c) The advance would be made by instalments and on a certificate of the Engineer and only after 35% of the cost had been met by the tenant.
- (d) On completion of the building the tenant would be granted a lease as usual. He would then execute a mortgage in favour of the Board as security for the advance.
- (e) The mortgage would provide for the repayment of the advance and for payment of interest.

4. Repayment would be spread over a period of years to be agreed upon but which in my opinion should in no case exceed twenty. It could be made either by equated instalments of principal and interest or by instalments of principal, the interest being calculated on the amount outstanding. Payments would be made monthly and would be in addition to the ground rent.

5. The rate of interest charged would have to be slightly higher than that at which the money was raised by the Board in order to cover expenses.

6. If we charged interest at $5\frac{1}{2}\%$ and calculated the sinking fund on the 4% table a borrower would have to pay 8.86% per annum on the amount of the loan for a period of 20 years after which he would be liable for the ground rent only. If he repaid in 15 years he would have to pay 10.49% and if in 10 years 13.83%.

7. The members of the Sub-Committee are aware that Government have been advancing loans for the purchase of plots and the erection of buildings on their suburban estates. On enquiry Mr. Bell informs me that the scheme has been of very great assistance in disposing of plots at Danda, Khar, Chapel Road and Chembur.

In course of discussion Mr. Tairsee observed that the margin of 35% recommended in the note was on the high side and he enquired whether it would not be reasonable to reduce it.

The Chief Officer stated that trustees could lend money on mortgage up to 66 per cent. and as under his scheme a sum would be repaid each year he would have no objection to varying the margin as follows :—

When repayment is to be made in 10 years—Margin 25%.

“ ” ” 15 ” ” 30%.

“ ” ” 20 ” ” 35%.

This was generally agreed to.

Resolved.—“ That the Sub-Committee approve of the proposals in principle but
No. 1. consider that the margin of 35% might safely be reduced to 25% when repayment is to be made in 10 years and to 30% when it is to be made in 15 years.

2. A copy of the Chief Officer's note and of para 1 of this Resolution should be forwarded to the Committee with a recommendation that the Board should be requested to ask the Municipal Corporation to suggest to Government that they should be given power to raise money for the purpose of granting such loans when the amalgamation of the Trust and the Municipality takes place.’ ”

Resolved.—“ That the proceedings of the Special Sub-Committee be
No. 50. forwarded to the Board with the intimation that the Committee approve of the suggestions made by the Sub-Committee and recommend that—

(a) the same be approved in principle,

(b) the President be requested to approach Government regarding the necessary amendment of the Act, and

(c) the Municipal Corporation be requested to consider the desirability of obtaining similar powers when the Trust is amalgamated with the Municipality.”

EXCERPT from the proceedings of a meeting of the Improvements Committee, held on 17th December 1929 :—

Re : *Board's Resolution No. 65, dated 9th December 1929, re : Government Letter, G. D. No. 512 A., dated 20th September 1929, forwarding for the expression of the Board's views a Bill for the amendment of the City of Bombay Improvement Trust Transfer Act, 1925, introduced in the Legislative Council by Mr. Hoosenally M. Rahimtoola, B.A., M.L.C., to enable the Board to advance loans to purchasers of plots for the purpose of constructing building thereon.*

Considered :—

(a) Board's Resolution No. 65, dated 9th December 1929 :—

“ Considered the following Letter No. 512-A, dated 20th September 1929, from the Under-Secretary to Government, General Department, forwarding for the views of the Board a Bill for the amendment of the City of Bombay Improvement Trust Transfer Act, 1925, introduced in the Legislative Council by Mr. Rahimtoola, B.A., M.L.C., so as to enable the Board to advance loans to persons purchasing their plots for the purpose of constructing building thereon :—

“ I am directed by the Government of Bombay (Transferred Department) to forward for favour of an expression of the views of the Trustees on it, a draft Bill further to amend the City of Bombay Improvement Trust Transfer Act, 1925, which is proposed to be introduced by Mr. H. M. Rahimtoola, M.L.C., during the next session of the Legislative Council. I am to request that as the next session commences on 30th September 1929, the opinion of the Trustees may be communicated to Government as soon as possible.”

Copy of Draft Bill referred to above :—

A Bill further to amend the City of Bombay Improvement Trust Transfer Act, 1925.

“ Whereas it is expedient further to amend the City of Bombay Improvement Trust Transfer Act, 1925, in manner hereinafter appearing it is hereby enacted as follows :

1. This Act may be called The City of Bombay Improvement Trust Transfer (Amendment) Act of 19 .

2. In Section 68 of the City of Bombay Improvement Trust Transfer Act, 1925, hereinafter called the said Act, the following words shall be inserted after the words “ or the City of Bombay Improvement Act, 1898” :

“ or for the purpose of making advances to lessees of the Trust for erecting buildings on Trust land.”

3. In Sub-Section (2) of Section 81 of the said Act, the following shall be inserted as clause (bb) after clause (b) :

“ (bb) to make advances to lessees of Trust plots for the purpose of erecting buildings on Trust lands subject to such conditions as may be determined by the Board on the recommendation of the Committee.”

4. In Section 87 of the said Act, the following words shall be inserted after the words “ Capital Account ” where they occur for the first time :

“ Building Advance Account.”

5. In Section 88 of the said Act, the following shall be inserted as Sub-Clause (5) :

“(5) advancing monies to lessees of Trust plots for the purpose of erecting buildings on Trust lands.”

6. After Section 90 of the said Act, the following Section shall be inserted, namely—

“ 90A.—There shall be credited to the Building Advance Account—

- (1) all moneys received on account of loans taken for building advances,
- (2) instalments towards the payment of principal.

“ 90B.—The moneys credited to the Building Advance Account shall be applied as follows :—

- (1) The loan moneys, for making advances to lessees for building purposes ;
- (2) The instalments towards the payment of principal, for either making advances to lessees for building purposes or for repayment of the loan moneys.”

7. In Section 91 of the said Act, after Sub-Section (1) the following shall be inserted as Sub-Section (1A).

“(1A) Interest recovered from the lessees on the advance granted to them for building purposes.”

Statement of objects and reasons.

In view of the continued trade depression and of the consequent depressed state of the land market in the City of Bombay the disposal of the Improvement Trust plots is much hampered and therefore a number of plots are lying idle on the hands of the Trust especially in the north of the Island. Applications are being made to the Trust and specially by their staff to grant them facilities by way of Building Loans. The object of the Bill is to enable the Trust to provide facilities by way of advances to persons of moderate means who desire to take up land for the erection of small buildings mainly for residential purposes. The advance will be made by the Trust in accordance with the Rules to be framed by the Committee and approved by the Board.

The Government of Bombay have accepted and applied this principle of granting Building Loans to the purchasers of their land in the Suburbs of Bombay and especially in the Khar Scheme. This has helped them to sell a large number of plots.

(b) Chief Officer’s note, dated 13th December 1929 :—

“ It is perhaps desirable in the first instance to call attention to the main principles underlying the scheme detailed in my note dated 28th of March 1929. In para 2 of that note, I observed that the power of granting advances of this nature should be limited and that loans should only be made to persons who desire to erect small houses to be used mainly for residential purpose. I further observed that exactly what limit should be placed .

on individual advances must be a matter of opinion and that I was in favour of making the maximum Rs. 20,000. In para 3, I suggested that on completion of the building the tenant (*i.e.*, the borrower) would execute a mortgage in favour of the Board as security for the advance and in para 4, I expressed the opinion that the repayment should be spread over a period of years which should in no case exceed 20.

In Mr. Hoosenally's Bill, power is sought to make advances for the purpose of erecting buildings. It will be noticed that the word 'buildings' would include structures to be used for any purpose. It is true that in clause 3 of the Draft Bill, the power to make advances would be subject to such conditions as may be determined by the Board on the recommendation of the Committee, but, in my opinion, it is desirable that the power should be limited to making advances for the purpose of erecting structures to be used mainly for residential purpose.

The Draft Bill does not provide that the amount advanced should be limited to any specific sum or that security should be obtained and repayment made within a definite period. I think it would be better to provide for these matters.

Before I went on leave in June last, I had drafted a Section to be inserted after Section 55 and this draft runs as follows :—

“ Any person desiring to erect a building on the Board's land to be used mainly for residential purposes may apply to the Committee for a loan to be advanced by way of mortgage on the security of the intended building and the Committee, after such enquiry as they may deem necessary and subject to rules to be framed by them and approved by the Board, may make such loans provided always that no loan made on the security of any one building or group of buildings shall exceed in amount the sum of Rs. 20,000 and provided that the term fixed for repayment shall in no case exceed 20 years from the date of the first occupation of the building.”

Coming now to the details of Mr. Hoosenally's Bill, I suggest that the proposed addition to Section 68 would require re-drafting. The word 'lessees' is a technical term indicating persons who hold land under leases and would not include those who are tenants under agreements to lease. Our practice is that persons taking up land for the purpose of building first enter into an agreement to lease and then, when the building is completed, into the lease. It would, therefore, be better to refer to 'building tenants' and to define the term. The word 'Trust' should be deleted and 'Board' inserted I have already referred to the question of 'buildings.'

Clause 3, 'Lessees of Trust plots' should be deleted and the words 'Building Tenants of the Board's lands' inserted. The word 'Trust' where it occurs for the second time may be deleted and the word 'such' inserted. The same remarks apply to wording of Clause 5.”

EXCERPT from the proceedings of a meeting of the Improvements Committee, held on 17th December 1929 :—

Re : *Board's Resolution No. 66, dated 9th December 1929, re : Government Letter, General Department No. 512A, dated 28th September 1929, regarding legislation empowering the Trustees to advance money to provide individuals for constructing dwellings on Trust Estates.*

Considered :—

(a) Board's Resolution No. 66, dated 9th December 1929 :—

“ Considered the following letter No. 512-A, dated 28th September 1929, from the Under-Secretary to Government, General Department, re : legislation empowering the Trustees to advance money to private individuals for constructing dwellings on Trust Estate :—

‘ I am directed to refer to your letter No. Mis. 956/27, dated the 4th June 1929, requesting Government to undertake legislation empowering the Trustees to advance money to private individuals who take up land on their estates for the erection of buildings to be used mainly for residential purposes. The Trustees request that they may be allowed to advance money to their lessees subject to the following restrictions :—

If repayment is made in 10 years the advance to be upto 75 per cent. of the cost of building.

If repayment is made in 15 years the advance to be upto 70 per cent. of the cost of building.

If repayment is made in 20 years the advance to be upto 65 per cent. of the cost of building.

Their proposals include the charging of interest at 5½ per cent. on the loan and the repayment of the capital calculated on the 4 per cent. table. The annual instalment on the amount of the loan works to 8·86 per cent., 10·49 per cent. and 13·83 per cent. for repayment in 20, 15 and 10 years, respectively.

2. Government are inclined to agree in principle that, if the Bombay Municipal Corporation approve, the Improvement Trust should be empowered to grant loans on mortgage for the purposes indicated. But before any legislation is undertaken on the lines suggested, they desire to satisfy themselves about the soundness of the proposed scheme.

3. Government give state-aid to the intending purchasers of plots in the Development Department Suburban schemes to the extent of ¾ths value of land and half the cost of building provided the land is built upon in one year and recovers the total amount in 15 years at 6 per cent. provided the building is completed in a year. Any purchaser who does not want a building advance is allowed to purchase the plot by paying ¼th purchase price thereof and the balance of ¾ths within 3 years with interest at 7 per cent. and he is then allowed to build thereon whenever he likes. Thus if a purchaser defaults in his payments after a few years the Development Department has in hand the large amount which he has paid for the land in addition to his payments for the buildings. The Improvement Trust will only have the latter. Besides this, the Improvement Trust proposes to charge only 5½ per cent. interest and to advance 70 per cent. of the cost if the payments are spread over 15 years. From the statements A and B therewith attached it will be seen that the risk which the Improvement Trust proposes to take is much greater than that which is at present taken in such cases by Government in the Development Department. Moreover, the Improvement Trust does not sell their land but leases it and will not therefore receive any amount towards the purchase price of the plot. Also no special means of recovery except through the slow and expensive process of a Civil Court are provided while Government have the powers of the summary recovery under the Bombay Land Revenue Code. In the present state of the money market, Government are doubtful if the proposed rate of interest at 5½ per cent. is adequate.

4. In these circumstances, Government consider that the margin of safety in the scheme proposed by the Trust does not provide absolute security specially at a time when the property market is in a very depressed condition. In their opinion, the margin of safety should be enhanced. The risk undertaken by the Trust should not be greater than that in the case of advances made by Government. I am, therefore, to request that you will be so good as to ask the Trustees to reconsider their proposals in the light of the remarks made above so that they will not at any time carry more risk than that incurred by Government in similar circumstances.”

(b) Chief Officer's note, date 13th December 1929 :—

“ Government state they are inclined to agree in principle that if the Corporation approve, the Trustees should be empowered to grant loans on mortgage for the purpose of enabling persons of moderate means to erect buildings on the Board's estates but they desire to satisfy themselves as to the soundness of the proposed scheme.

2. In para 3 of their letter, Government compare the practice of the Development Department with the Trust's proposals and come to the conclusion that the risk run by the Trust will be greater than that incurred by the Department, and they ask the Trustees to reconsider their proposals in the light of the remarks made by Government.

3. The Development Department advance money—

- (a) for the purchase of the site and the erection of the building, or
- (b) for the purchase of the site only.

The Trust is not concerned with (b) and need not consider the Government practice so far as it relates to it.

In case (a), the amount of the advance is limited to 75% of the value of the site and to 50% of the cost of the building. The building has to be erected within one year and the total advance repaid at six per cent. within a period of 15 years.

4. Government point out that the security in the case of the Development Department would be greater than in the case of the Trust because the Department sells the site and receives 25 per cent. of its value whereas the Trust grants leases and would receive nothing towards the payment of the site. This is so but the Trust's building tenant would have to deposit two years' ground rent as security for fulfilment of his obligations and would not receive his lease until after he had completed the erection of the building. Until then, he would be a tenant-at-will and the Trust would run no more risk as regards the site than they do when they grant an agreement to lease in accordance with their present practice.

5. The second point raised by Government is that the Trust proposes to advance 70 per cent. of the cost of the building as against 50% advanced by the Department. The Trust proposal is that they should advance—

75% when repayment is to be made in 10 years.
70% Do. do. 15 „ and
65% when it is to be made in 20 years.

It must be admitted that there is more risk attached to this part of the scheme but the Special Sub-Committee considered that it would be justifiable especially as where the risk is greatest at first it will be very much reduced after two or three years.

6. Government also point out that, whereas the Development Department have powers of summary recovery under the Bombay Land Revenue Code, the Trust in case of default would have to proceed through a Civil Court. This is not so as the scheme provides that the advance will be secured in favour of the Trust by means of a mortgage and the Trust would therefore be in the position of an ordinary mortgagee and be able to enter into possession and recover the rents.

7. Government assume that the Trust proposes to charge only 5½ per cent. interest on the advances. This is not so as it is stated in para 5 of my note, dated 23rd April 1929, that the rate charged would have to be slightly higher than that at which the money was raised

raised by the Board in order to cover expenses. It is true that in working out instances a rate of 5½ per cent. was assumed but that was merely by way of example.”

EXCERPT from the Proceedings of a Meeting of the Improvements Committee, held on 22nd January 1930 :—

Re : *Report No. 1, dated 14th January 1930, of the Special Sub-Committee re : Mr. Hoosenally's Bill to amend the City of Bombay Improvement Trust Transfer Act, 1925.*

“ The Special Sub-Committee appointed under C. R. No. 415, dated 17th December 1929, to consider Mr. Hoosenally's Bill to amend the City of Bombay Improvement Trust Transfer Act, 1925, so as to enable the Board to advance loans to persons purchasing their plots for the purpose of constructing buildings thereon beg to report as follows.

2. The Sub-Committee have considered the Bill very carefully after taking legal opinion and have made several changes in it.

3. *Clause 2 of the Bill.*—The Chief Officer was of opinion that under Section 68 the Board could borrow money for the purposes of the Act and if a Section were added to Chapter III of the Act, it would not be necessary to amend Section 68 as proposed. The opinion of the Trust Solicitors was therefore obtained as to whether it would be preferable to add a Section to Chapter III of the Act or to amend Section 68. The Solicitors stated that it would be preferable to amend Section 68, as Chapter III deals with the main purposes and objects of the Act *viz.*, carrying out Improvements Schemes but advancing money to building tenant can hardly be said to fall within this category and is rather an auxiliary power for carrying out the existing purposes and objects.

4. The word “ lessees ” is a technical term indicating persons who hold land under leases and would not include those who are tenants under agreements to lease. The words “ Building Tenant ” have therefore been substituted for the word “ lessees ” wherever it occurs in the Bill.

5. The proposed amendment in Section 68 has accordingly been altered and the term “ Building Tenant ” defined.

6. *Clause 3 of the Bill.*—The Sub-Committee have considered the question as to the best method of specifying terms and conditions under which advances can be made *i.e.* whether by a specific provision under the Act or Bylaws made under Section 113 (d) or by a resolution passed by the Board. The Sub-Committee are not in favour of specifying terms and conditions in the Act as it would take a long time to amend the Act, if the conditions were to be altered in any case. The Sub-Committee have taken legal opinion and recommend that the terms and conditions should be laid down by Bylaws. It is also recommended that it should be stated in the Act that the Bylaws to be made should specify the purposes for which the buildings should be used and a maximum limit of the advance permissible for any building and the outhouses connected therewith and provide that the amount to be advanced should in no case exceed 65 per cent. of the cost of buildings and works. This clause has accordingly been altered.

7. *Clause 4 of the Bill.*—The Sub-Committee do not see any necessity for amending Section 87 so as to enable the Board to keep a Building Advance Account, as separate accounts are kept of each Scheme under Section 90.

8. *Clause 5 of the Bill.*—The wording has been altered.

9. *Clause 6 of the Bill.*—The Sub-Committee do not see any necessity for the proposed Sections 90A and 90B but would suggest an addition to Section 90 of a new clause “(d) Building Advance Account.”

10. *Clause 7 of the Bill.*—The Sub-Committee consider that the proposed Sub-Section (1-A) in Section 91 is not necessary, as the crediting of interest to the General Account is sufficiently covered by the existing Sub-Sections (1) and (6). It is however suggested that the following words should be inserted after the words “on the Board’s investments” in Sub-Section (1) to make the meaning clear “including advances to Building Tenants.”

A Bill further to amend the City of Bombay Improvement Trust Transfer Act, 1925.

Whereas it is expedient further to amend the City of Bombay Improvement Trust Transfer Act, 1925, in manner hereinafter appearing, it is hereby enacted as follows :—

1. This Act may be called The City of Bombay Improvement Trust Transfer (Amendment) Act of 19

2. To Section 5 of the City of Bombay Improvement Trust Transfer Act, 1925, hereinafter called the Said Act, the following new paragraph shall be added, namely :—

“ ‘ Building Tenant’ means any person who has entered into an agreement with the Board to erect a building or buildings on land belonging to the Board upon terms that when the building has been completed he shall be granted a lease of the land together with the building or buildings.”

3. In Section 68 of the ~~City of Bombay Improvement Trust Transfer Act, 1925, hereinafter called the Said Act,~~ the following words shall be inserted after the words “ or the City of Bombay Improvement Act, 1898 ” :—

“ or for the purpose of making advances to ~~lessees~~ Building Tenants of the ~~Trust Board~~ for erecting buildings ~~on upon the Trust Board’s land lands.~~”

4. In Sub-Section (2) of Section 81 of the Said Act, the following shall be inserted as clause (bb) after clause (b) :—

“ (bb) to make advances to ~~lessees~~ Building Tenants of the ~~Trust plots~~ Board’s lands for the purpose of erecting buildings on ~~Trust~~ such lands subject to such terms and conditions as may be determined laid down by the Board on the recommendation of the Committee in Bylaws made by the Committee under clause (d) of Section 113. Such Bylaws shall

(i) specify the purposes for which such buildings shall be used

(ii) provide that the amount to be so advanced shall in no case exceed sixty-five per centum of the cost of the buildings and works.

(iii) specify a maximum limit of the advance permissible for any building and the outhouses connected therewith.

"Building Advance Account."

5. In Section 88 of the Said Act, the following shall be inserted as Sub-clause (5) :—

"(5) advancing moneys to lessees Building Tenants of Trust plots the Board's lands for the purpose of erecting buildings on Trust such lands pursuant to clause (bb) in Sub-Section (2) of Section 81."

6. After Section 90 of the Said Act, the following Sections shall be inserted, namely :—

"90 A. There shall be credited to the Building Advance Account—

(1) all moneys received on account of loans taken for building advances.

(2) instalments towards the payment of principal.

"90 B. The moneys credited to the Building Advance Account shall be applied as follows :—

(1) The loan moneys, for making advances to lessees for building purposes.

(2) The instalments towards the payment of principal, for either making advances to lessees for building purposes or for repayment of the loan moneys."

6. In Section 90 of the said Act, the following shall be inserted as Sub-clause (d) :—

"(d) Building Advance Account."

7. In Sub-section (1) of Section 91 of the Said Act, after Sub-Section (1) the following words shall be inserted as Sub-Section (1 A).

"(1 A) Interest recovered from the lessees on the advance granted to them for building purposes" after the words "on the Board's investments" :—

"including advances to Building Tenants."

Re: Report No. 1, dated 14th January 1930, of the Special Sub-Committee, regarding legislation empowering the Trustees to advance money to private individuals for constructing dwellings on Trust's Estates.

"The Special Sub-Committee appointed under C. R. 416, dated 17th December 1929, beg to report as follows.

2. Government point out that the security in the case of the Development Department would be greater than in the case of the Trust, as the Development Department sells

the land and receives 25 per cent. of its value whereas the Trust grants leases and would receive nothing towards the payment of the site. The Sub-Committee are, however, of opinion that so far as the land is concerned, the Board would run no more risk than they do at present, as the building tenant will have to deposit two years' ground rent as security and will not receive his lease until after he has completed the building.

3. Government assume that the Trust proposes to charge only $5\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. interest on the advances. This is not correct. The rate to be charged will be slightly higher than that at which the money is raised by the Board in order to cover expenses.

4. The last point raised by Government is that the Development Department advances only 50 per cent. of the cost of the building while the Trust propose to advance :—

- (a) 75 per cent. when repayment is to be made in 10 years.
- (b) 70 per cent. when the repayment is to be made in 15 years.
- (c) 65 per cent. when the repayment is to be made in 20 years.

The Sub-Committee have considered this matter very carefully and are of opinion that the amount to be advanced should not exceed 65 per cent. of the cost of buildings and works, irrespective of the period of repayment. Regarding the maximum limit of the advance, the Sub-Committee consider that it is not necessary to fix it in the Act, but that it should be fixed in the By-laws specifying the terms and conditions on which advances can be granted."

After Dr. Batliwala had replied to the debate, the *Amendment* was put to the vote and *lost* by a large majority.

The *Original Proposition* was then put to the vote and *carried* by a large majority.

Considered Committee Resolution No. 445, dated 22nd January 1930, adopting Report No. 1, dated 14th January 1930, of the Special Sub-Committee appointed under Committee Resolution No. 416, dated 17th December 1929, regarding legislation empowering the Trustees to advance money to private individuals for constructing dwellings on Trust estates.

Proposed by the Chairman of the Improvements Committee, seconded by Dr. Batliwalla :—

“That the Report of the Special Sub-Committee be approved and No. 70. adopted and the President be requested to address Government in terms thereof with reference to their letter, General Department, No. 512A, dated 28th September 1929.”
