### ' No. 1.

Letter from Major-General P. J. Maitland, C.B., Secretary to the Govern of India, Military Department, to the Quartermaster General in Ind (No. 5465-D., "Sanitary-Cantonment Hospitals,"-dated Simla 20th November 1897).

In the Despatch No. 25,\* dated 26th March 1897, from the Secreta State, regarding the prevalence of venereal disease in the British Army in I it is stated that Her Majesty's Government cannot acquiesce in the continu of the present state of things which has led to a disastrous increase in ver disease among the British troops in India, and requires the immediate ado of remedial measures.

2. In pursuance of the recommendations of the Secretary of State, a set of rules has been issued under the Cantonments Act, 1889, superseding rules issued in G. G. O. No. 460, dated 3rd May 1895, and making fu provision for dealing with contagious and infectious diseases, and for enforcement of public order and decency in cantonments.

3. To give full effect to these Rules, Act V of 1895 has been repeale Act XV of 1897, and it therefore becomes desirable to state explicitly policy of the Government of India with respect to the future treatment of ver disease in cantonments.

4. The Governor-General in Council is of opinion that venereal dis should, as far as possible, be dealt with on the same lines as other infect and contagious diseases. It must be expressly understood that the new do not in any way revive the system which was in force up to 1888. do not authorise the provision of prostitutes for the troops, or the comput examination of prostitutes, or any scheme of registration and licensing for purpose of prostitution. If a prostitute is suspected of being diseased and of

rce of danger to other person efuses to be examined, she i ed to be examined, and if uit the cantonment. Her

I to be examined will entail no other penalty, and no prostitute, therefore, e examined against her will. If she is found to be diseased, and submits eatment, any further examination that may be necessary will be determined e medical requirements of the case, and will depend on considerations similar ose which would apply in the case of any other infectious or contagious e.

Although there is to be no compulsory examination of women, medical s may make arrangements to carry out from time to time the examination of n who voluntarily present themselves.

. The Governor-General in Council desires to impress on those concerned the success of the measures now adopted will depend very much on the er in which the new rules are put in force.

cule 9 empowers the medical officer in charge of a Cantonment Hospital, has  $prim\hat{a}$  facie grounds for believing that any person living in the ment is suffering from an infectious or contagious disorder, to require, by in writing, that such person shall attend at the hospital or dispensary me to be specified in the notice and not to quit it without his permission; and until he is satisfied, by examination if necessary, that such person is fact suffering, or is no longer suffering, from such disorder.

tule 10 empowers the Commanding Officer of a cantonment, if the medical in charge of a hospital or dispensary reports in writing that any person received a notice as provided for in rule 9 has refused or omitted to attend hospital or dispensary, or that such person having attended at the hospital pensary, has quitted it without his permission, to direct by order in writing, thinks it expedient, such person to remove from the cantonment within urs and prohibit such person from remaining longer in, or re-entering, hout his written permission.

It should be carefully borne in mind by those concerned that the powers red by these rules are *permissive*, and that if a medical officer should have facie grounds for believing that any person living in the cantonment is ng from an infectious or contagious disorder, he should, in order to prevent. as possible, the infliction of hardships on the more respectable inhabitants cantonment, personally satisfy himself regarding the condition and general nment and circumstances of the sick person, in order to ascertain whether se does not admit of the exercise of the discretion conferred on him by to give such other directions in the matter, apart from attendance at, or ion in, the hospital or dispensary, as may seem to him most expedient for rpose of preventing the spread of the disorder. The powers conferred be exercised with discretion. It is not the intention of the Government hey should be exercised in the cases of respectable persons, who can e for private medical attendance, and who are willing to take any necessary tions to prevent the spread of the disease. It is the danger of the spread disease to others that justifies the interference of the medical officer.

His Excellency in Council trusts that the measures which will now come ree may alike tend to remove temptation from young soldiers, and to sh the prevalence of this terrible disease. These measures will also alleviate terings of the women who have contracted venereal disorders, by providing rith medical care and treatment which would not be denied to them in the any other infectious or contagious disease.

In conclusion I am to ask that, under the orders of His Excellency the inder-in-Chief, the necessary steps may be taken for making known the of the Government of India on this question to all military officers ed.

### Circular Memo. from Major-General A. R. Badcock, C.B., C.S.I., Quartermast General in India, to the Lieutenant-Generals Commanding the Forces. (No. 1, dated Simla, the 3rd January 1898).

The Quartermaster-General is directed by the Commander-in-Chief to forwa \* No. 5465 D., dated 20th November copies of the Military Department letter 1897. copies of the Military Department letter policy of the Government of India for dealing with infectious and contagiod disorders, and for the enforcement of public order and decency in cantonment † Military Department Notification Copies of Act XV of 1897 and of the No. 1148, dated 15th October 1897. new Rules†‡ issued by the Government of India (in supersession of the Rules published in G. G. O. No. 460, date 3rd May 1895) are also forwarded. It will be observed that Act XV 1897, besides repealing the Cantonments Act Amendment Act (V of 1897 also amends section 31 of the Cantonments Act (XIII of 1889) in such a wi as to extend to officers generally the protection hitherto afforded by th section to Cantonment Authorities, Cantonment Mag'strates, and Commandin Officers.

2. Copies of (i) this circular, of (ii) Act XV of 1897<sup>‡</sup> and of (iii) the ner Rules, are to be furnished to every corps, both British and Native, as well a

to every Cantonment Authority in the  $\frac{Dengal}{Madras}$  Command.

3. The Commander-in-Chief directs that the new rules be strictly complie with by all concerned, both in the spirit and in the letter. Further, that copie of the rules, both in English and in the vernacular of the district, be posted u in such public place or places as the Cantonment Magistrate may think bes for giving publicity thereto. Local Governments and Administrations hav been requested to furnish Cantonment Magistrates with vernacular copies d the rules.

4. This Office Circular No. 12, dated 29th May 1895, is hereby cancelled and His Excellency requests that General Officers Commanding Districts ma be instructed to withdraw from circulation all copies of that circular, togethe with its enclosures. The same course should be followed as regards the verna cular copies of the Act and Rules of 1895, furnished by Local Governments an Administrations.

5. Reports to the effect that the above instructions have been carried ou should be submitted by General Officers Commanding Districts for transmissio collectively to this office.

6. The Commander-in-Chief further directs that the special attention of a concerned be drawn to the definition, in Rule 1, clause (b) of the new Rules, the expression "regimental bazar"; also to Rule 12 prohibiting the residence any public prostitute within the limits of any regimental bazar. Officers allowin this Rule to be infringed will be held personally responsible.

7. Special care should also be exercised by Commanding Officers of Britis Corps in the selection of the non-commissioned officers and men they recon mend to be specially authorised by the Commanding Officer of the Cantonmer for the purposes of the Rule 13. A form of authorisation is attached at should be used in all cases. nuary and 1st July (for submission to Government) to the effect (1) that new Rules have been carried out by all concerned both in the spirit and letter, and (2) that copies thereof and of this circular have been furnished all corps and detachments on arrival from beyond the limits of their respective nmands. They are also requested to at once check and bring to notice any ure to give the fullest effect to these orders.
