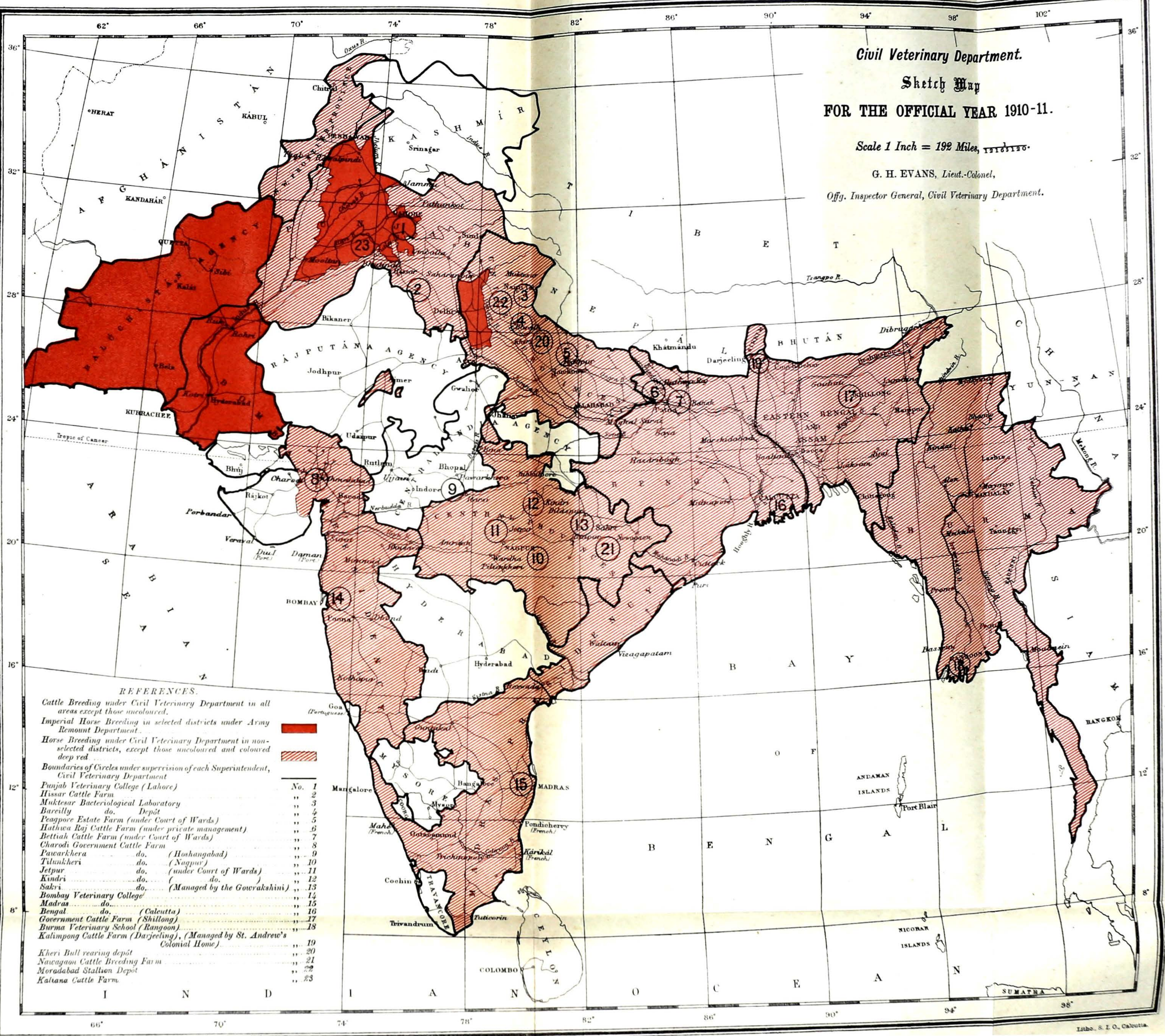

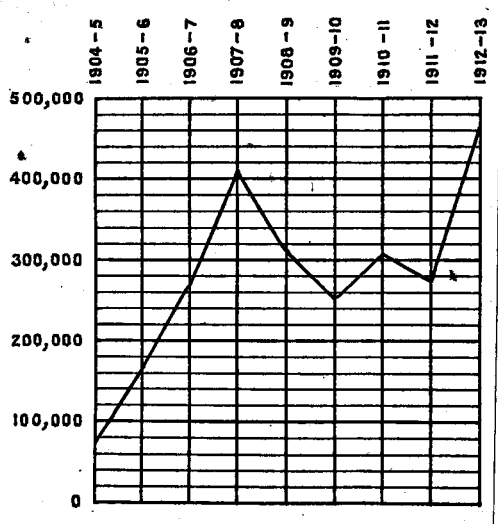

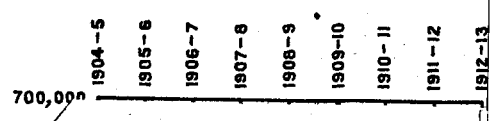

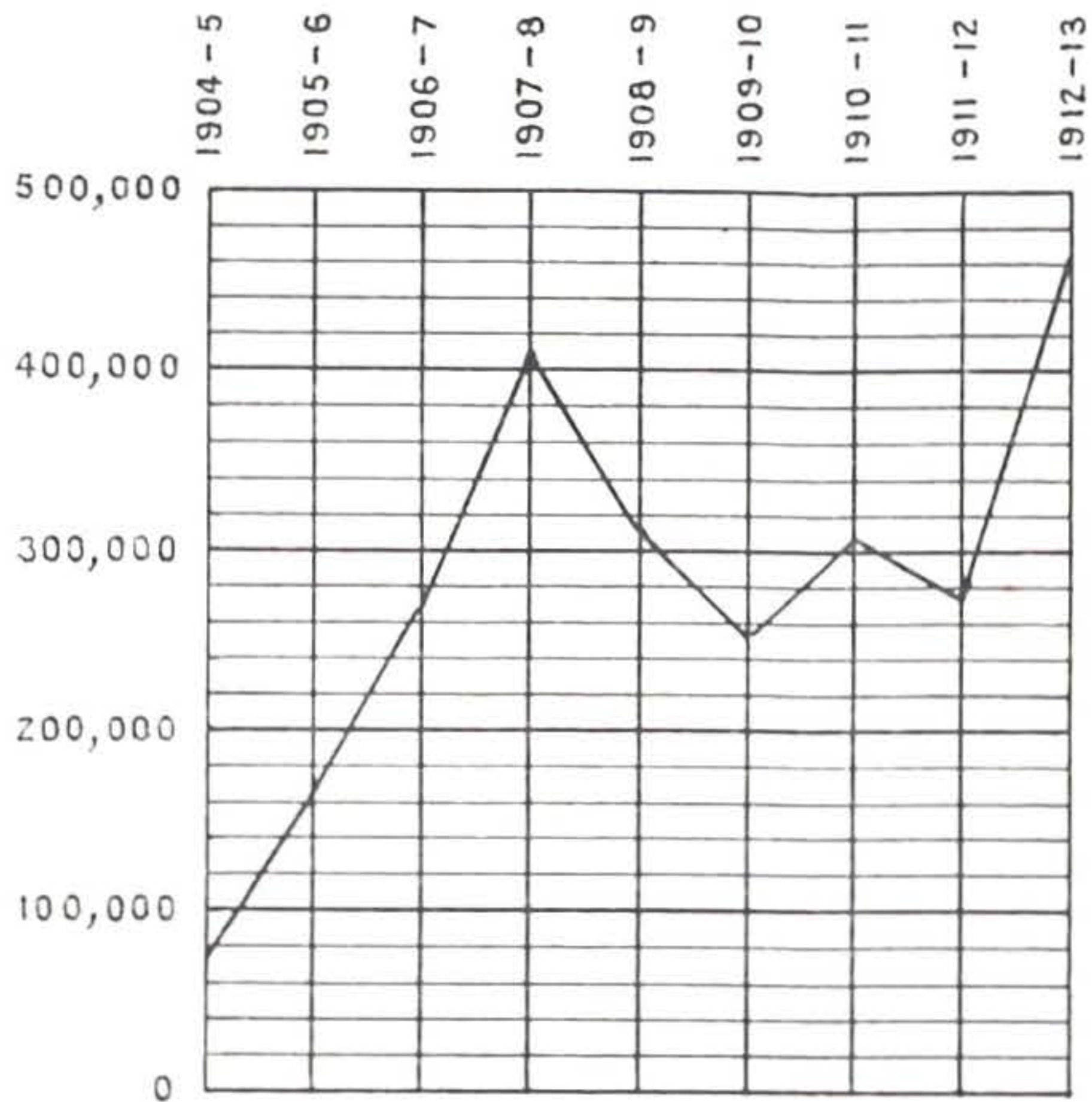

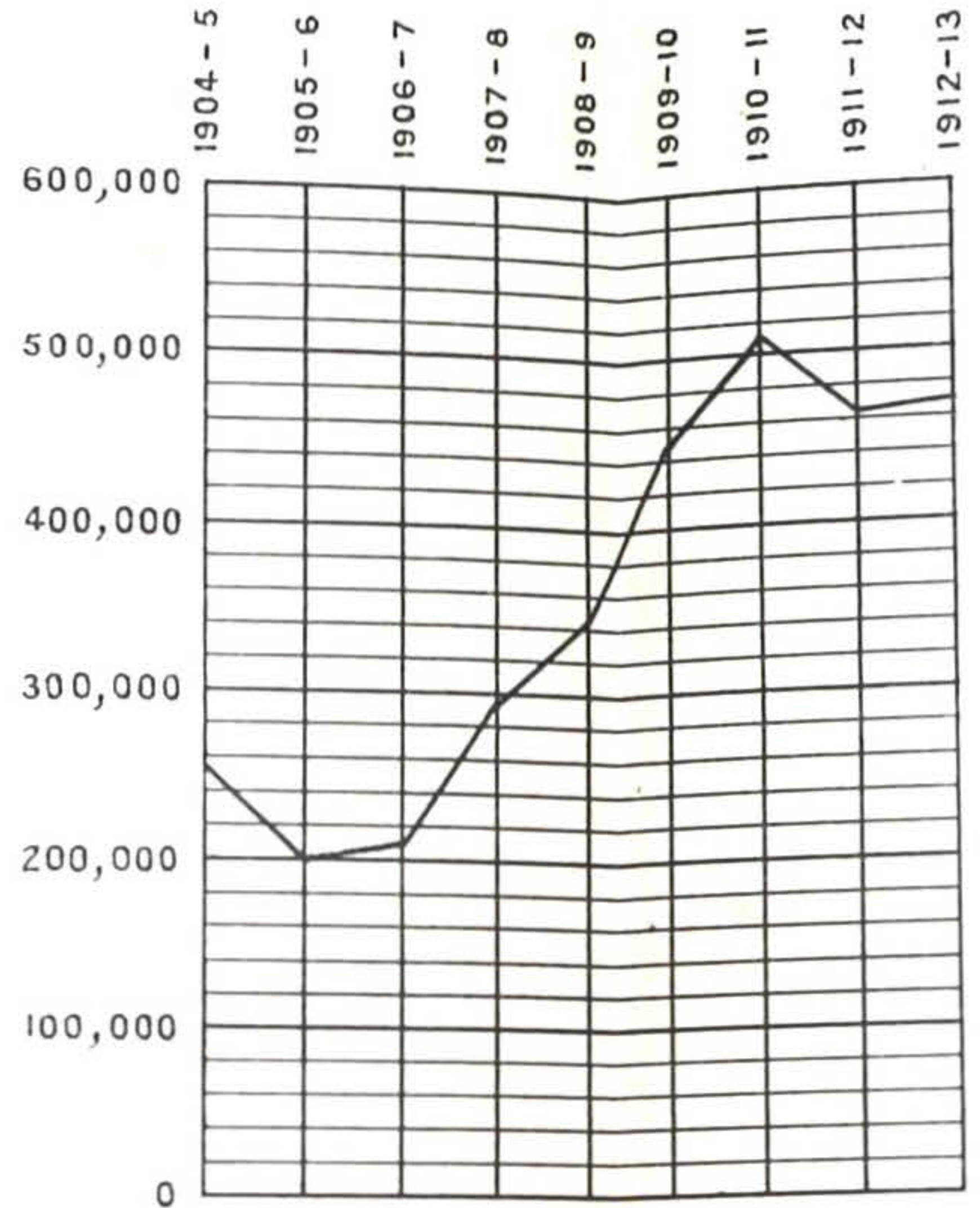

TOTAL NUMBER OF INOCULATIONS.



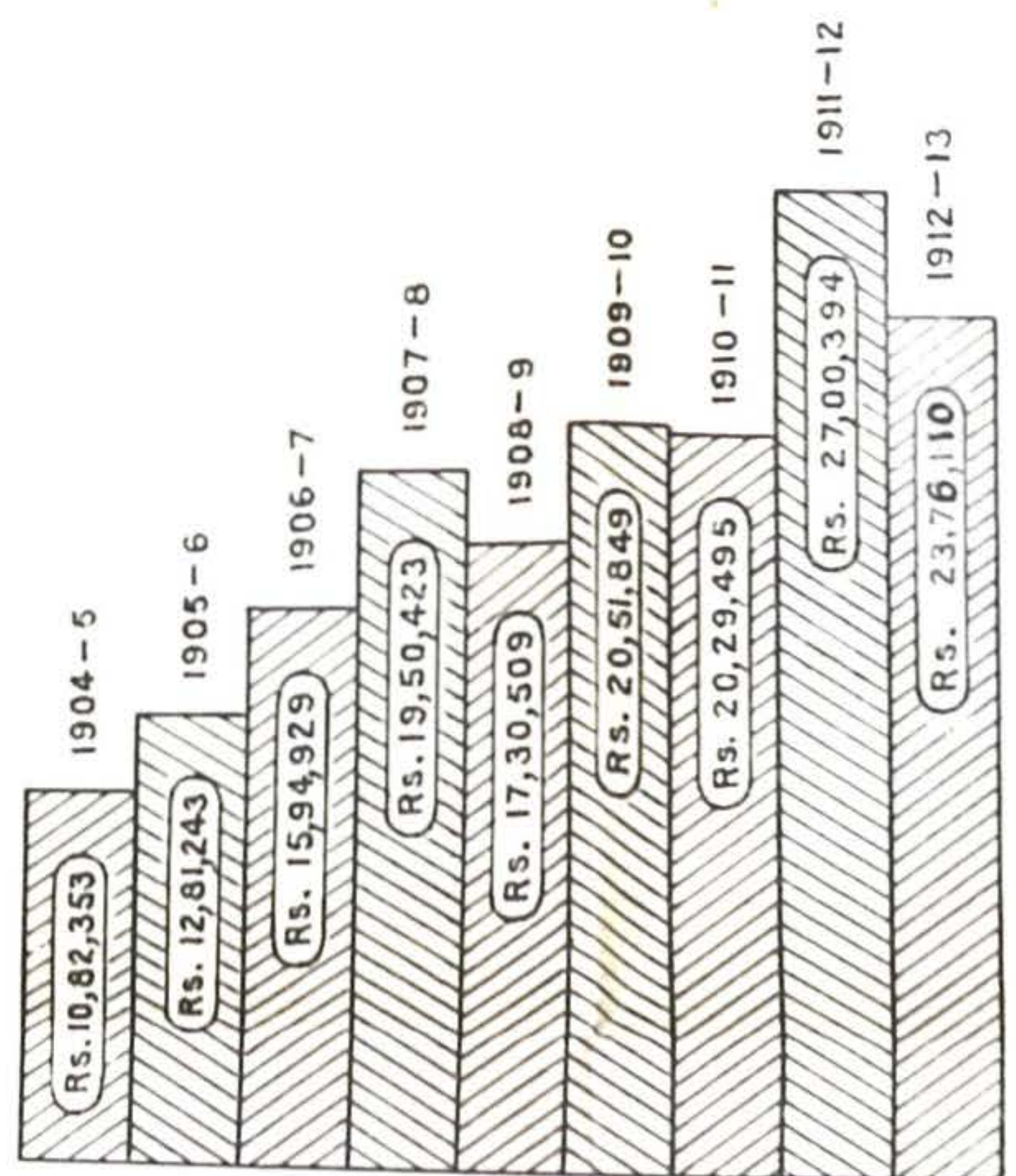
NUMBER OF ANIMALS TREATED AND CASTRATIONS PERFORMED BY VETERINARY ASSISTANTS.



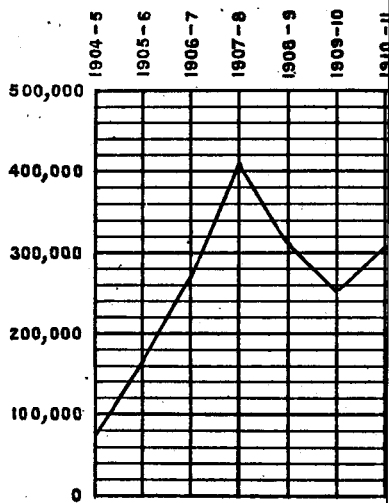
NUMBER OF ANIMALS TREATED AT VETERINARY DISPENSARIES.



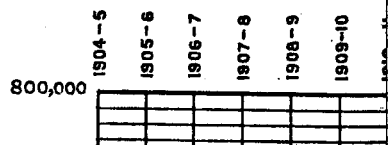
COST OF DEPARTMENT.

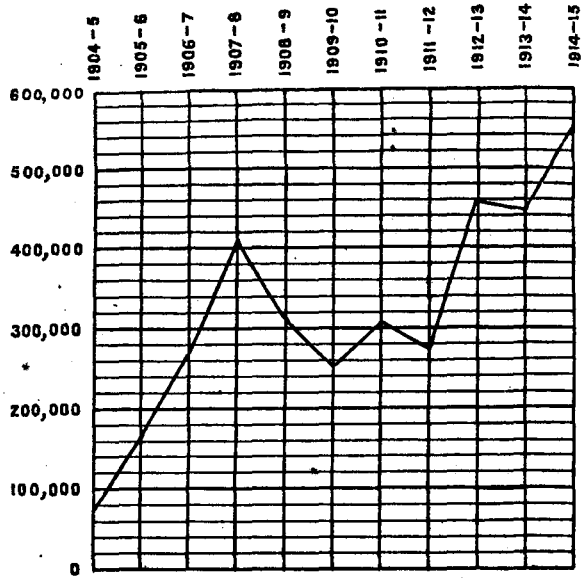

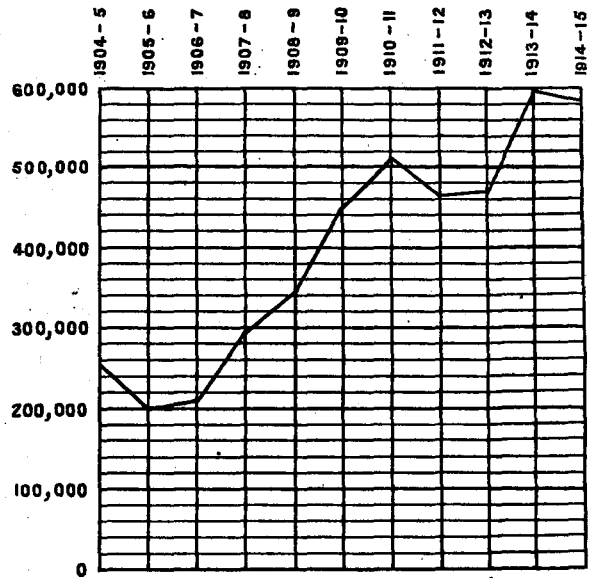

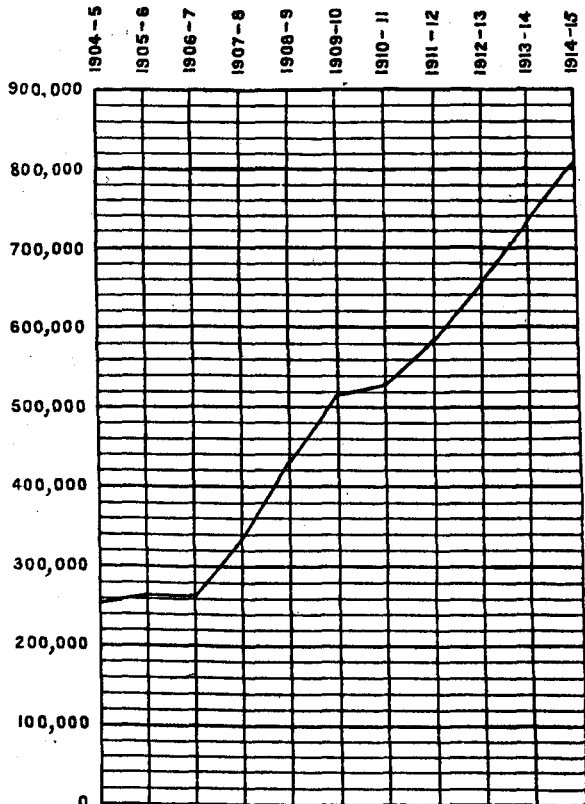
TOTAL NUMBER OF INOCULATIONS.

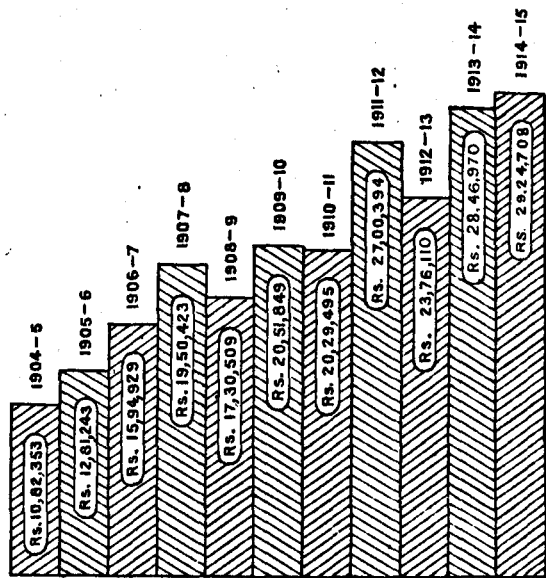

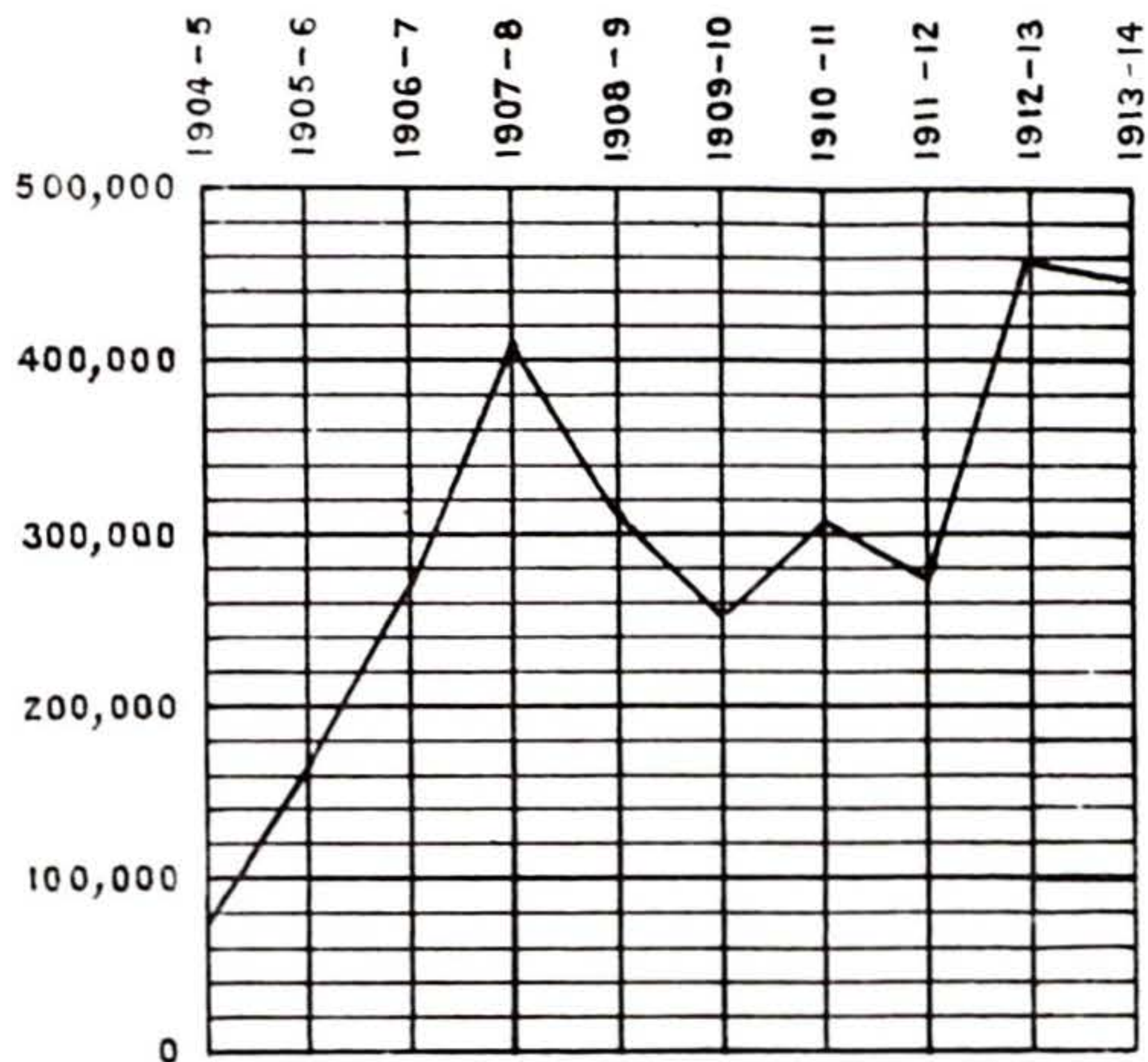

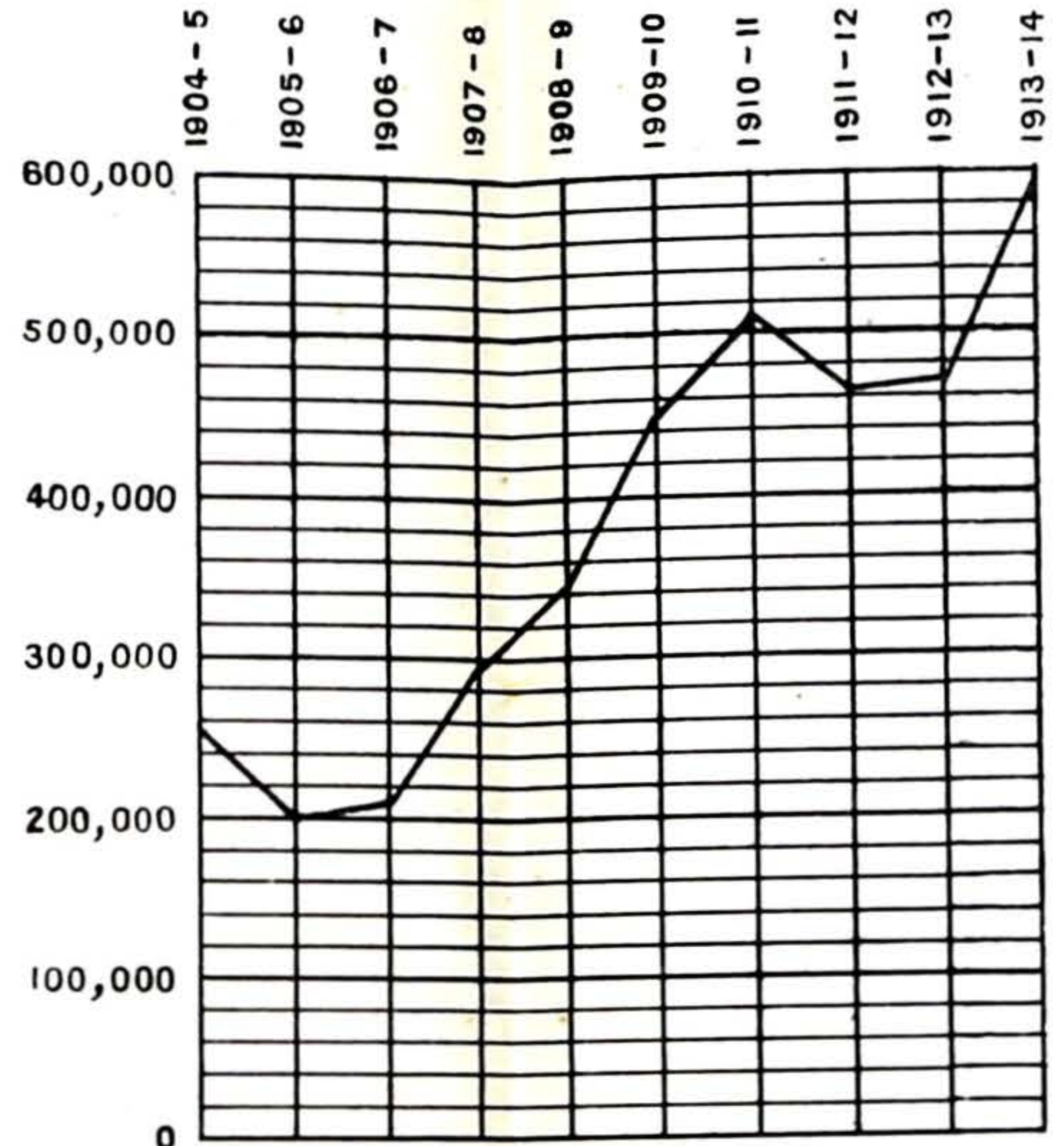

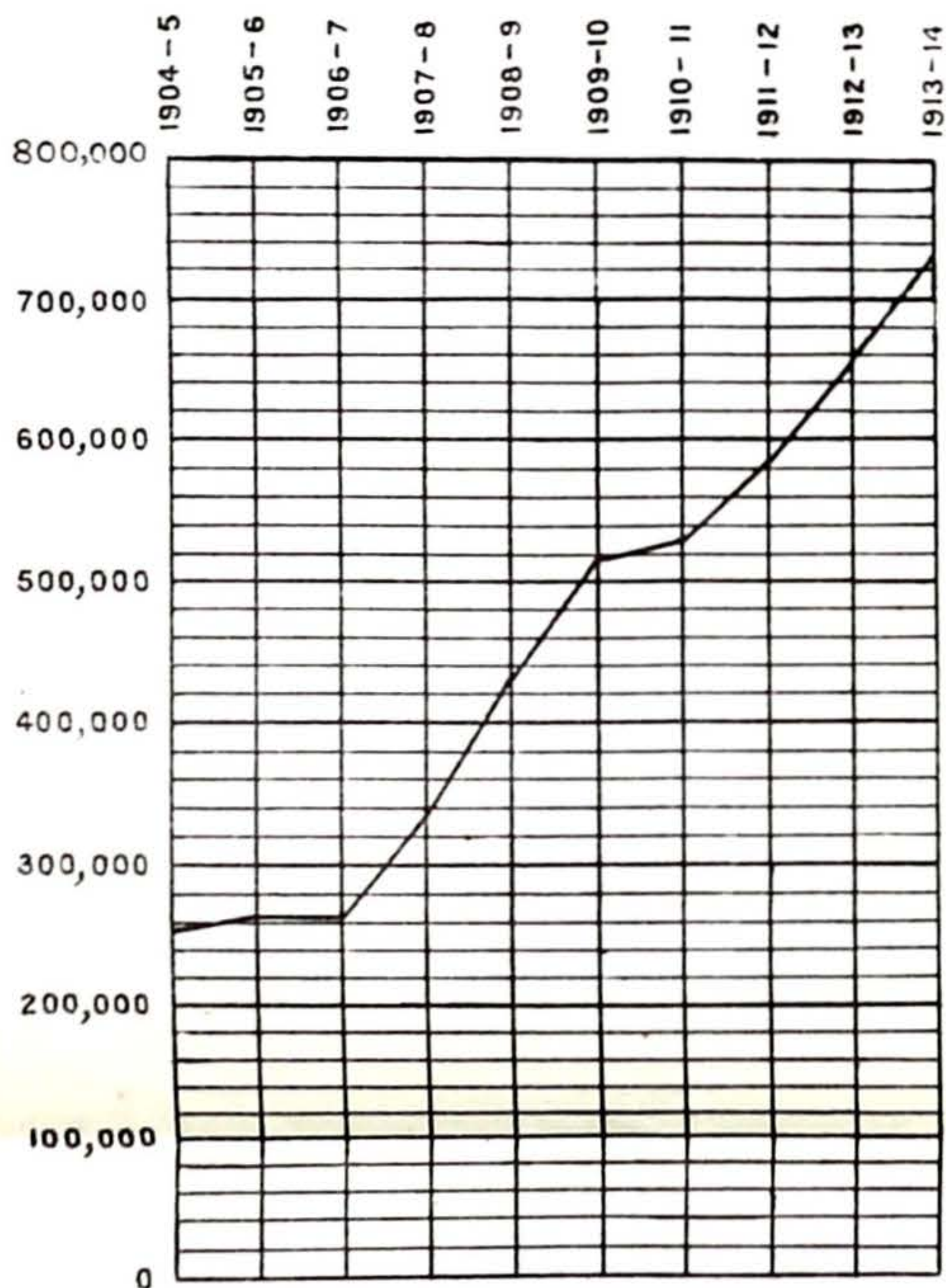
TOTAL NUMBER OF INOCULATIONS.



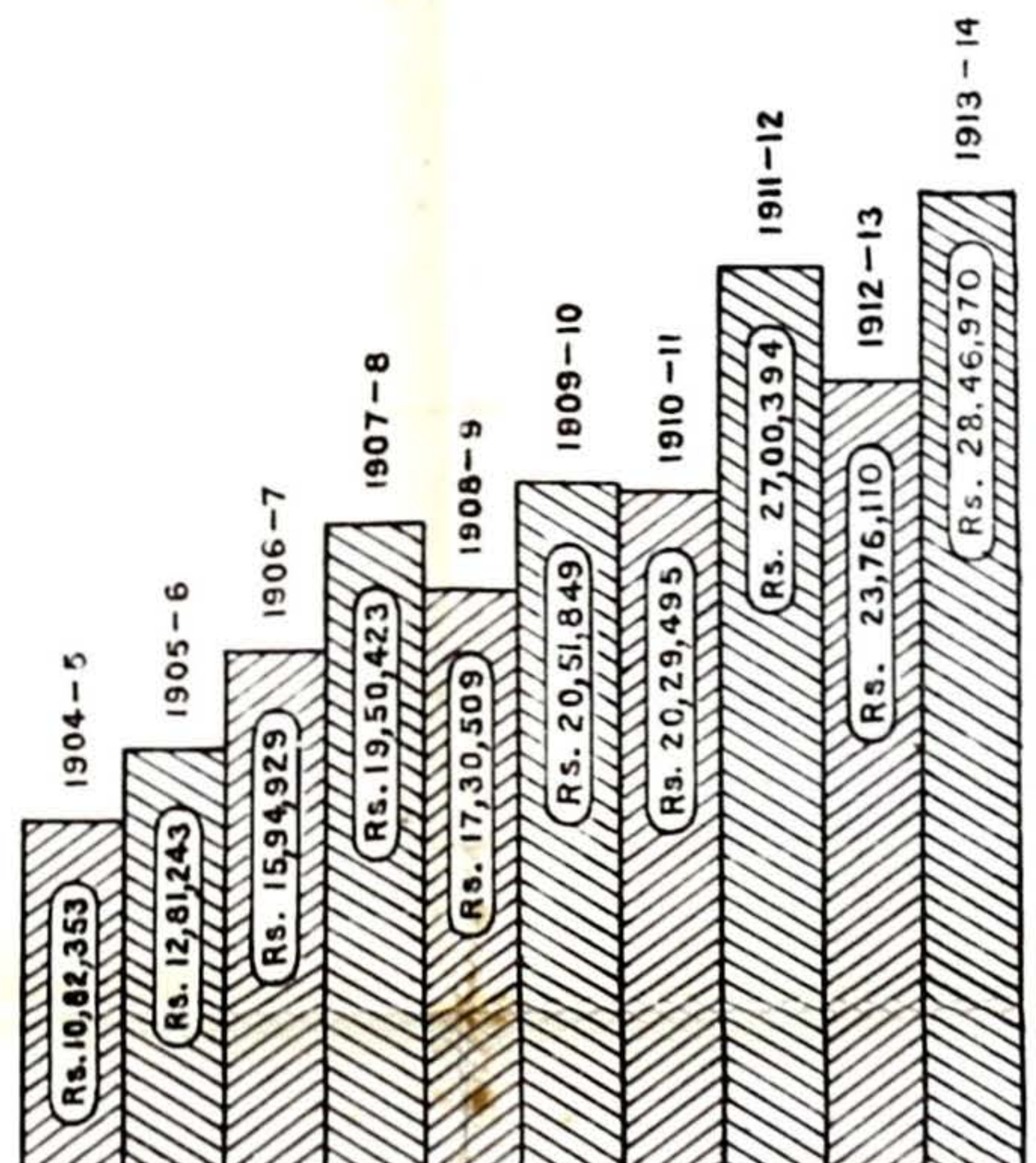
NUMBER OF ANIMALS TREATED AND CASTRATIONS PERFORMED BY VETERINARY ASSISTANTS.

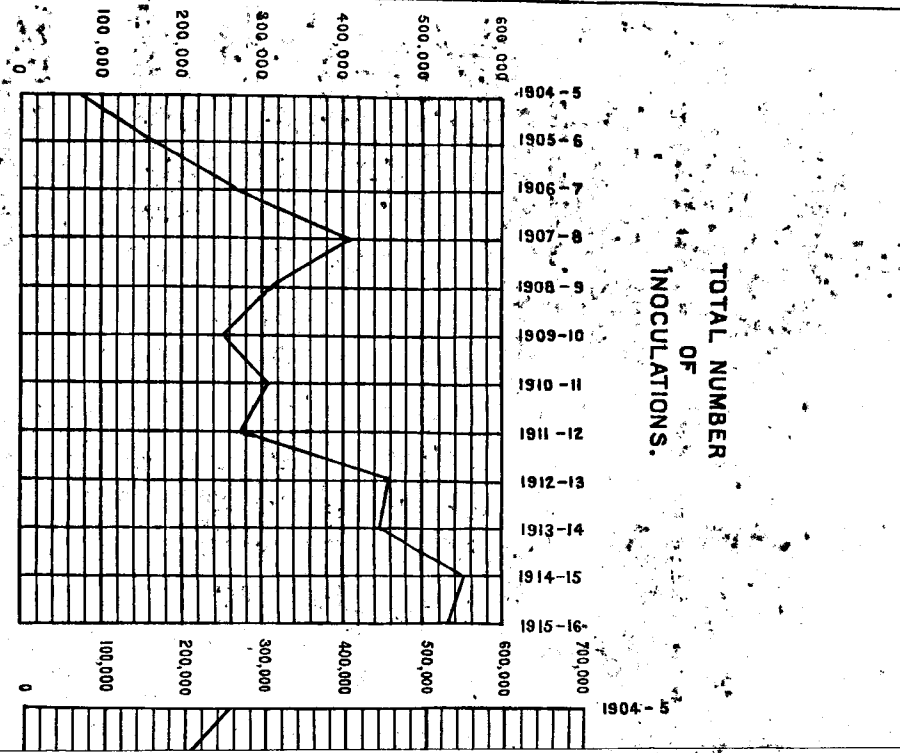
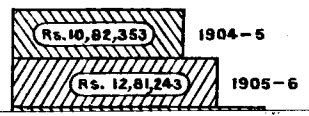
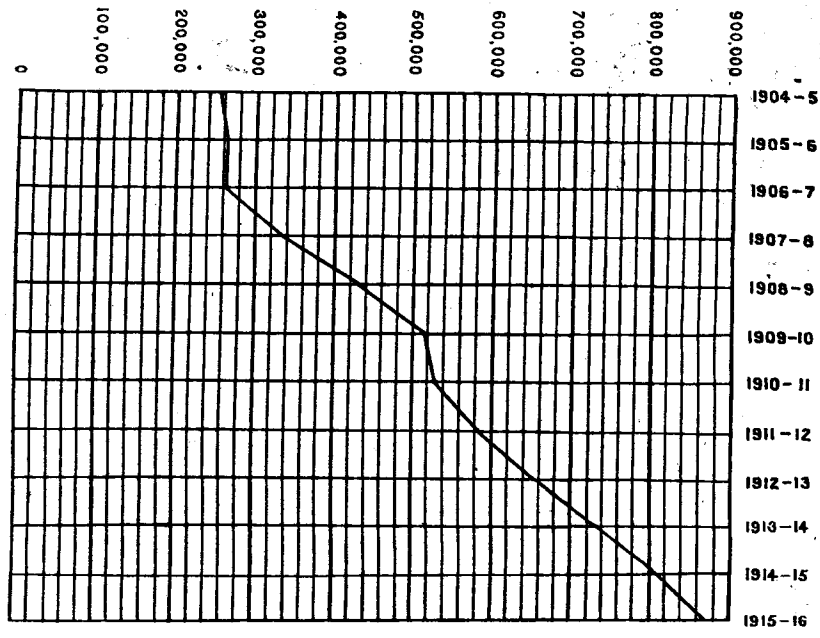


NUMBER OF ANIMALS TREATED AT VETERINARY DISPENSARIES.

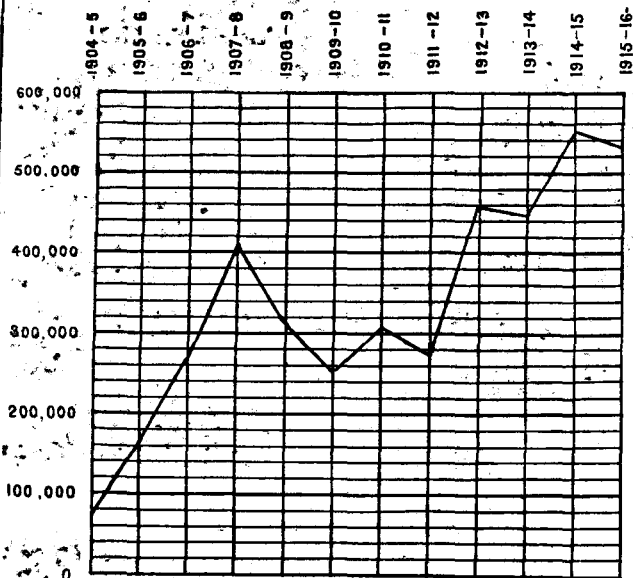

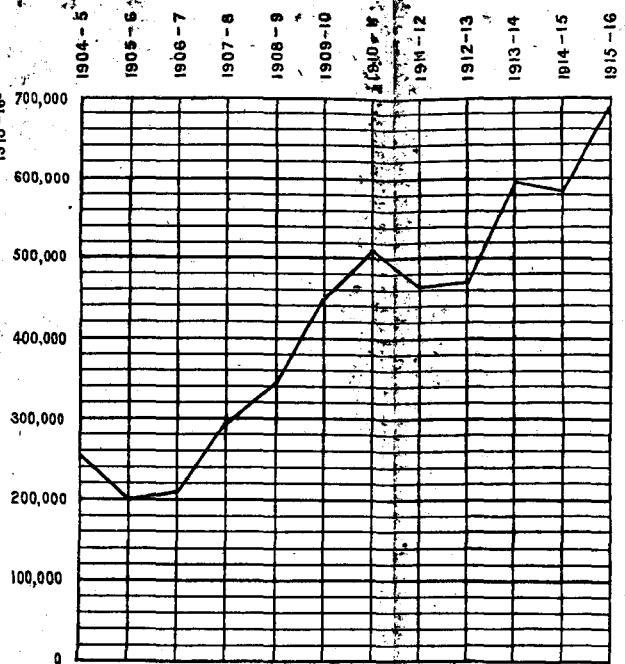

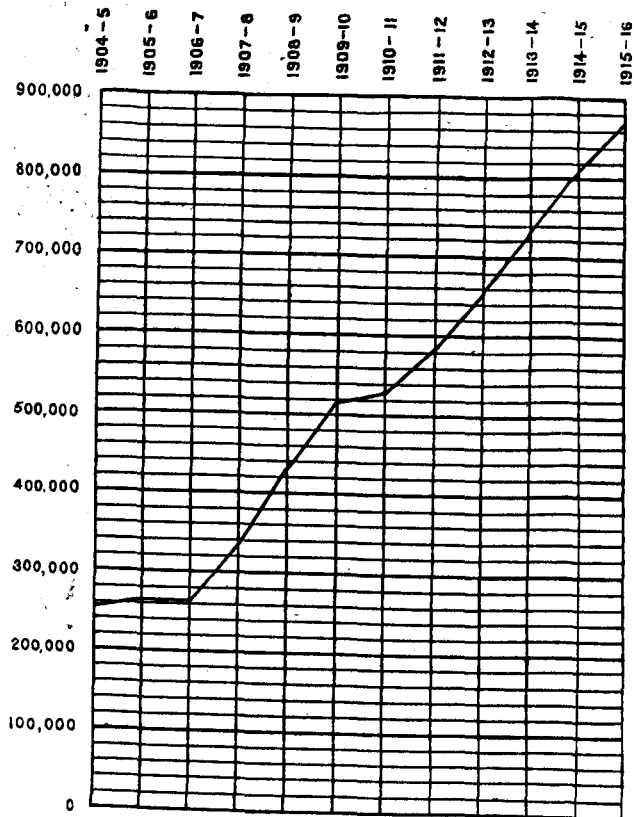
TOTAL NUMBER OF INOCULATIONS.

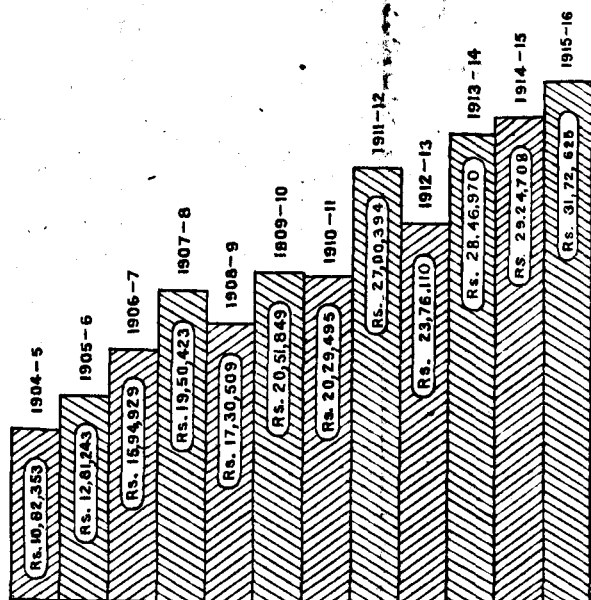

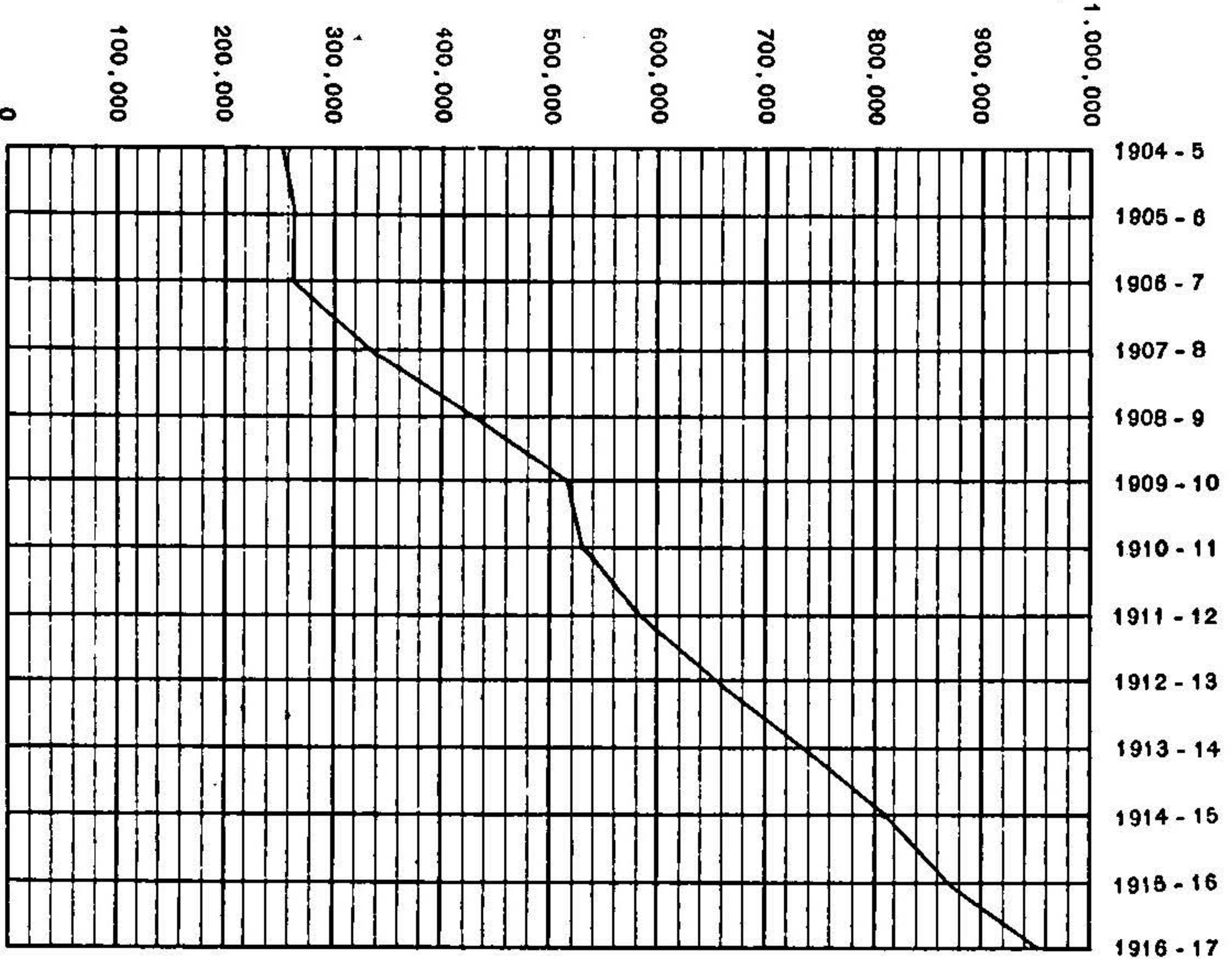

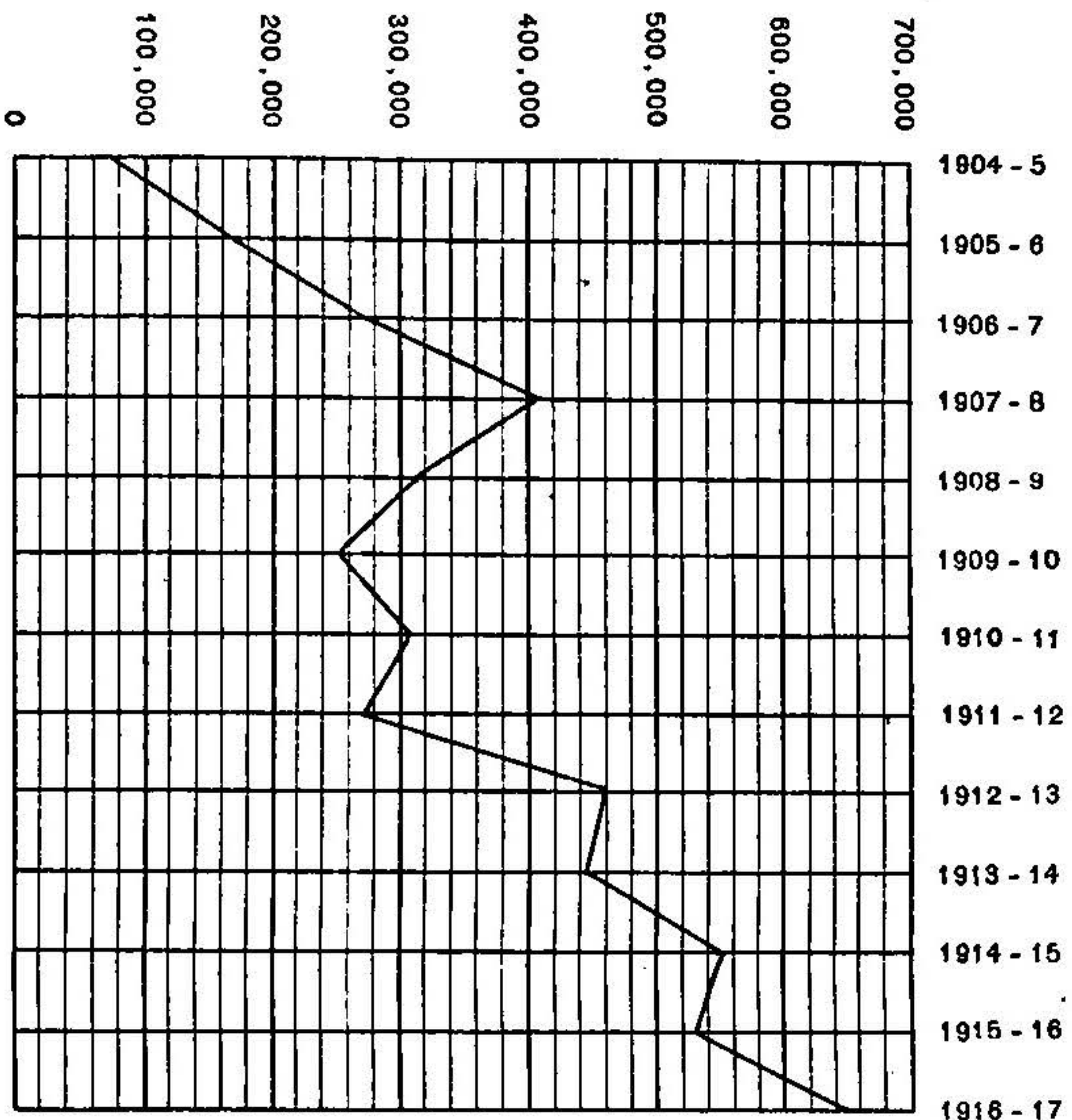

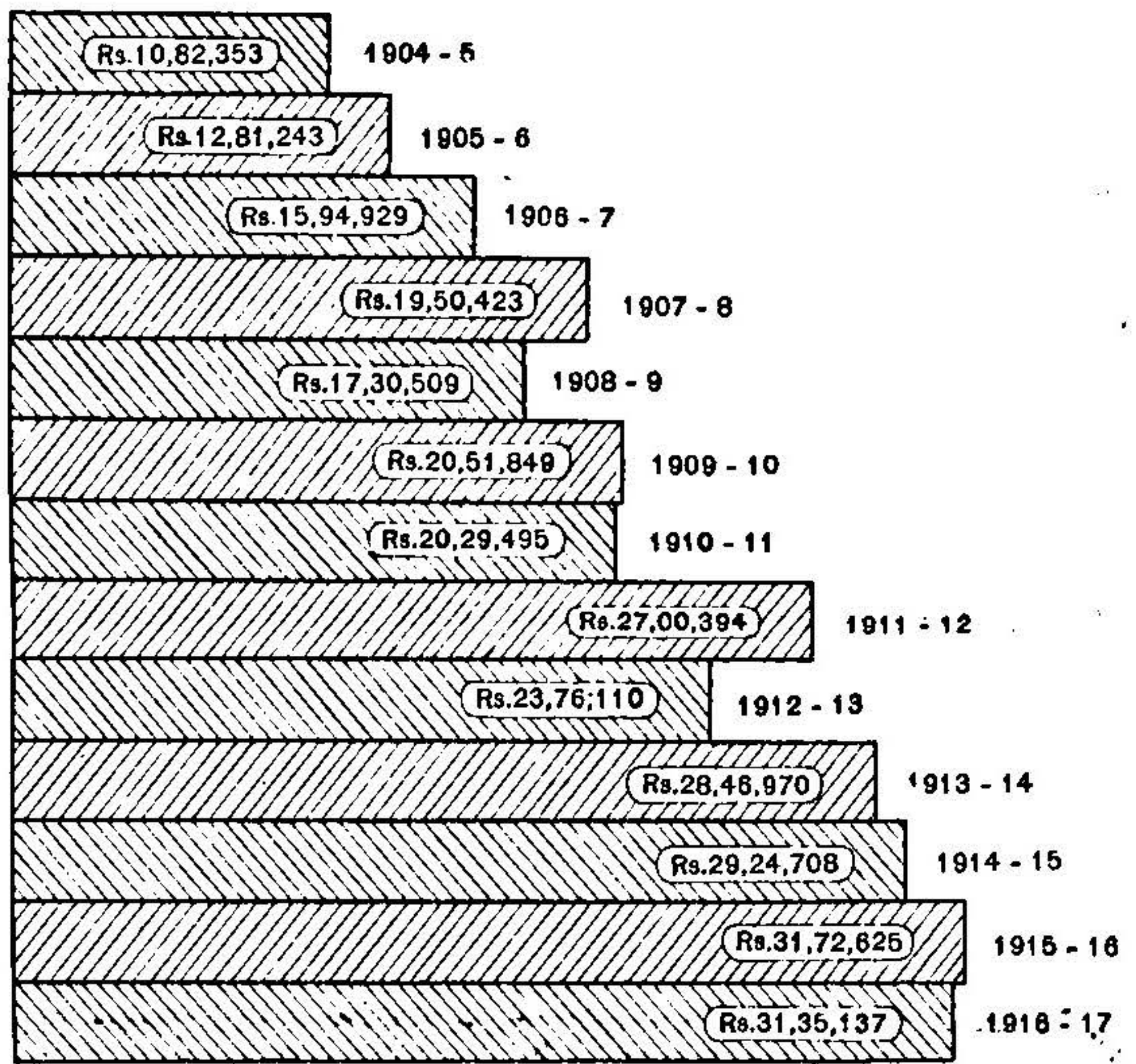
Comparative statement showing the working of the Civil Veterinary Department since the year 1904-05.



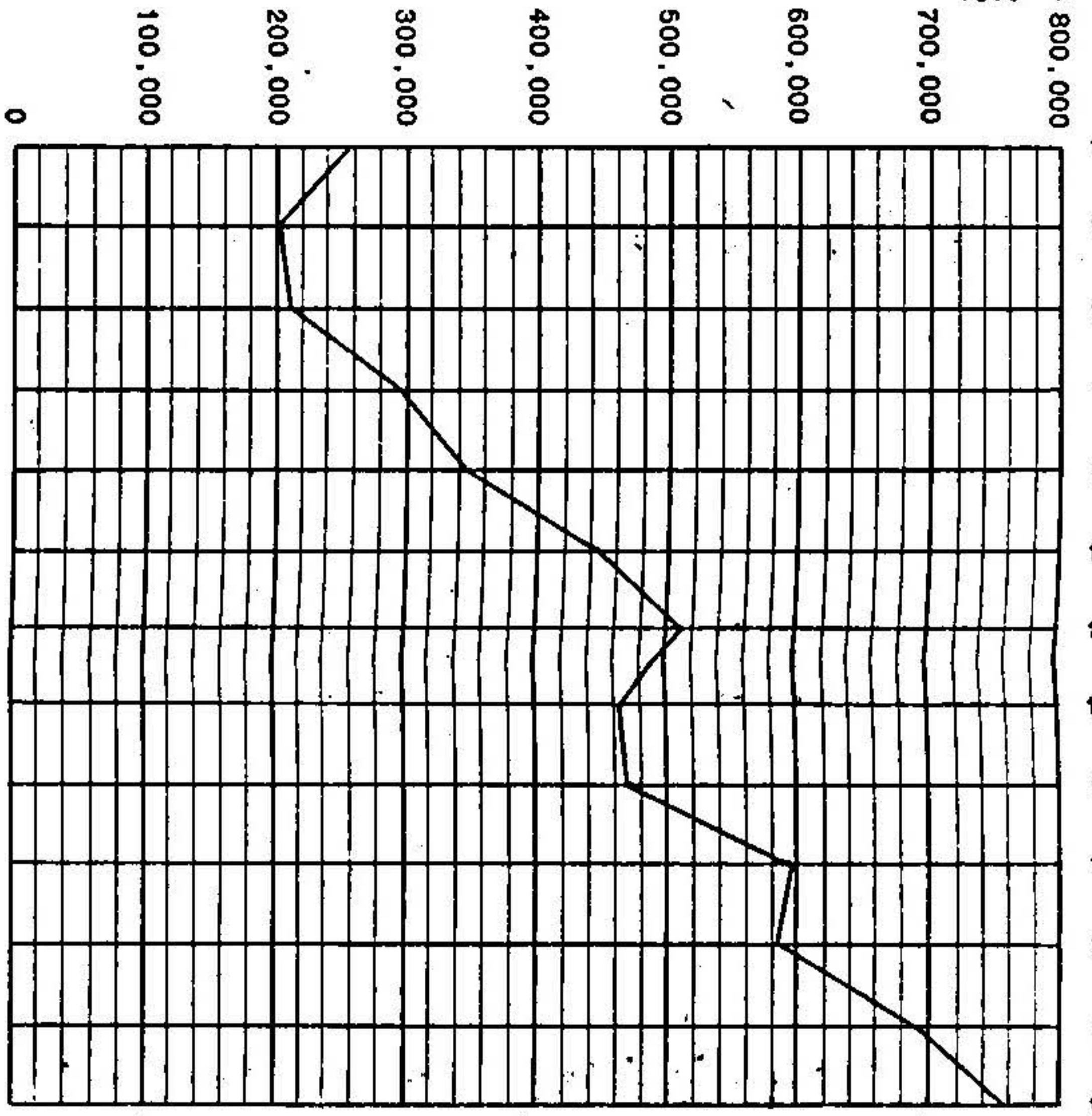
NUMBER OF ANIMALS TREATED AT VETERINARY DISPENSARIES



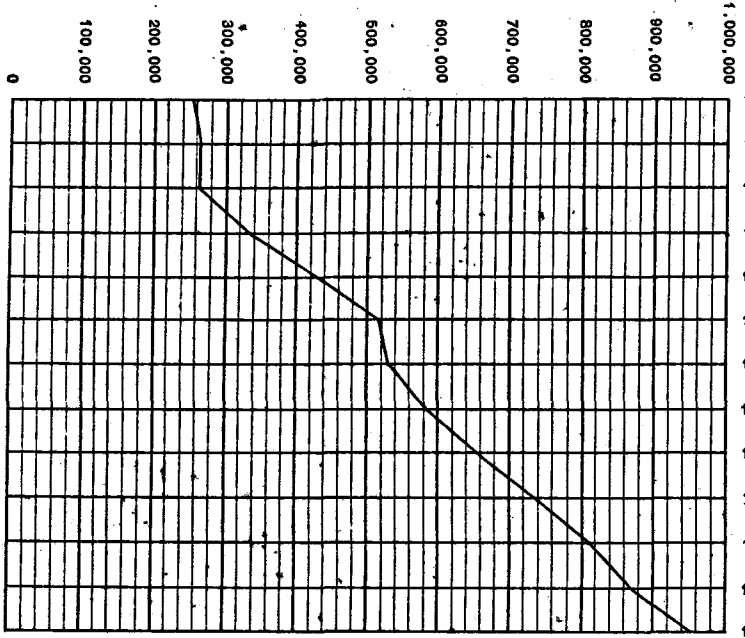
TOTAL NUMBER OF INOCULATIONS.



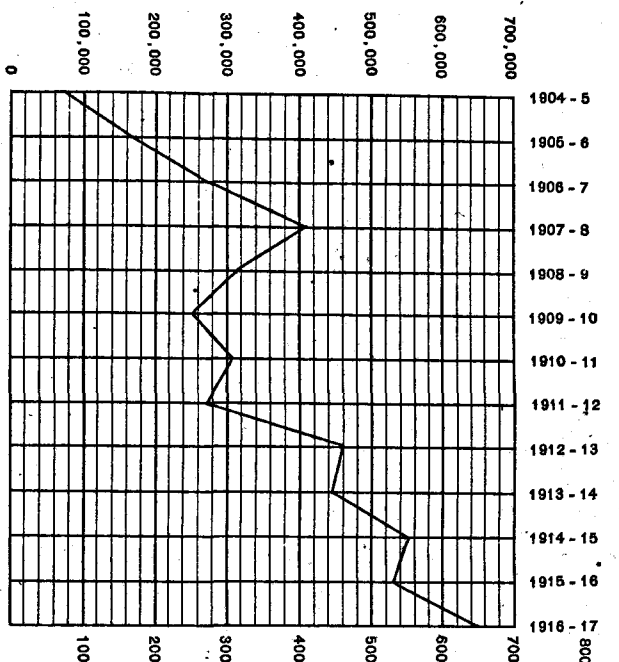
COST OF DEPARTMENT.

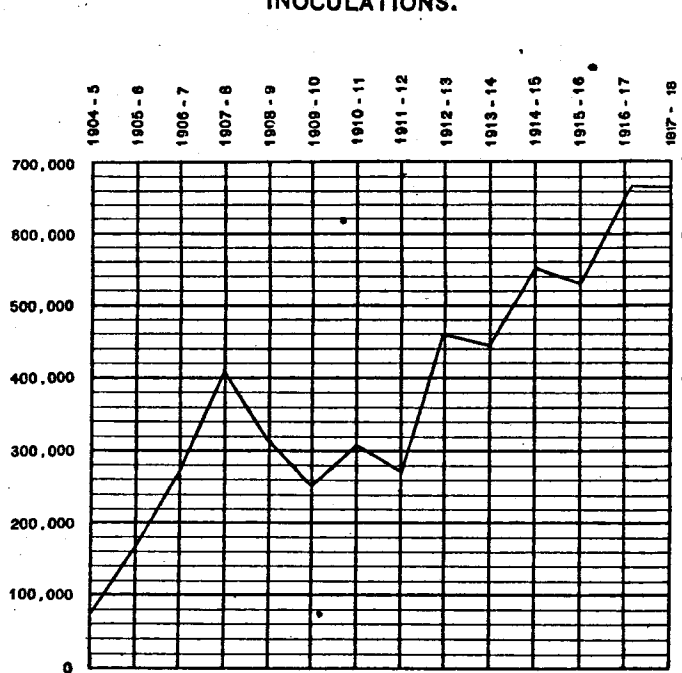

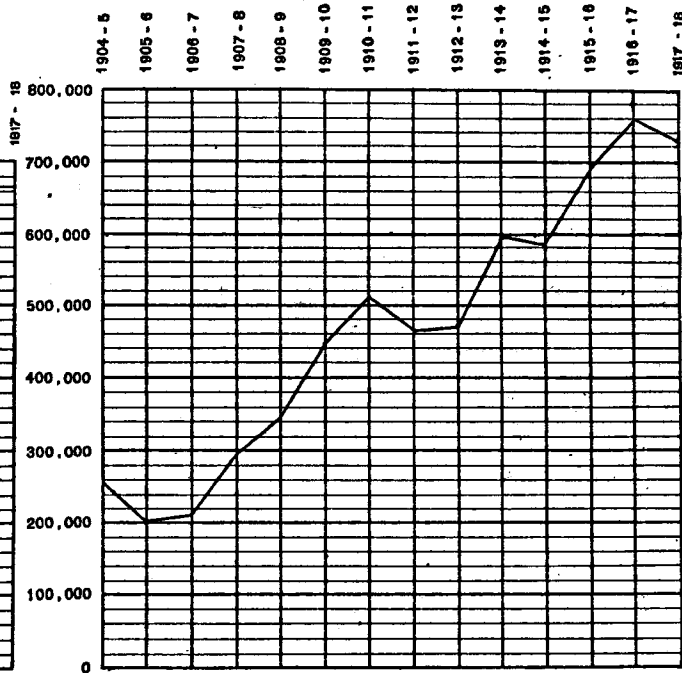

VETERINARY DISPENSARIES**

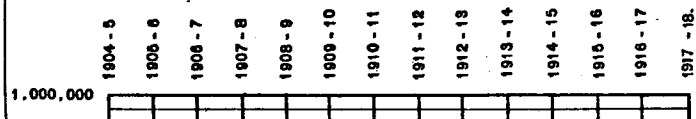

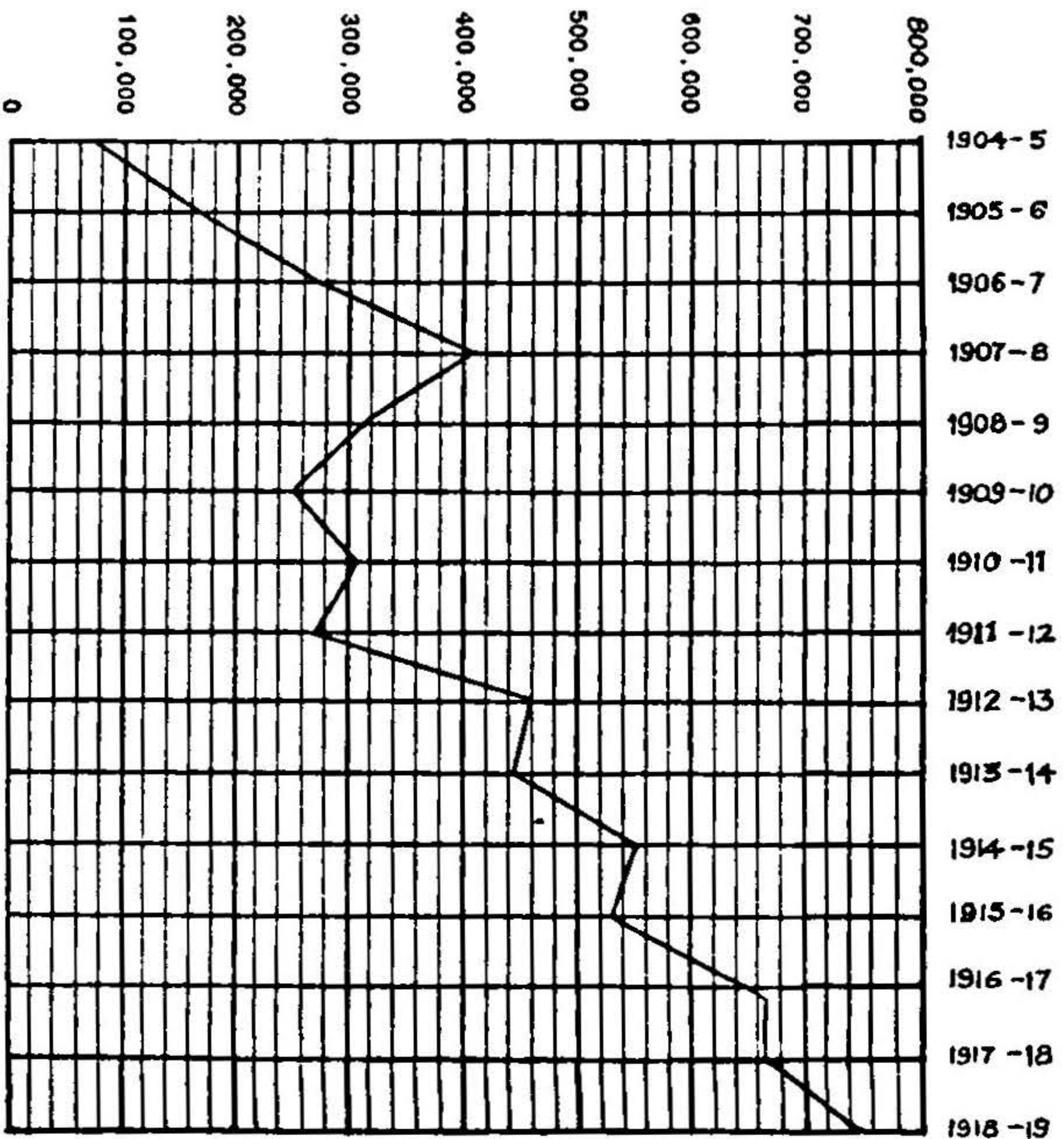

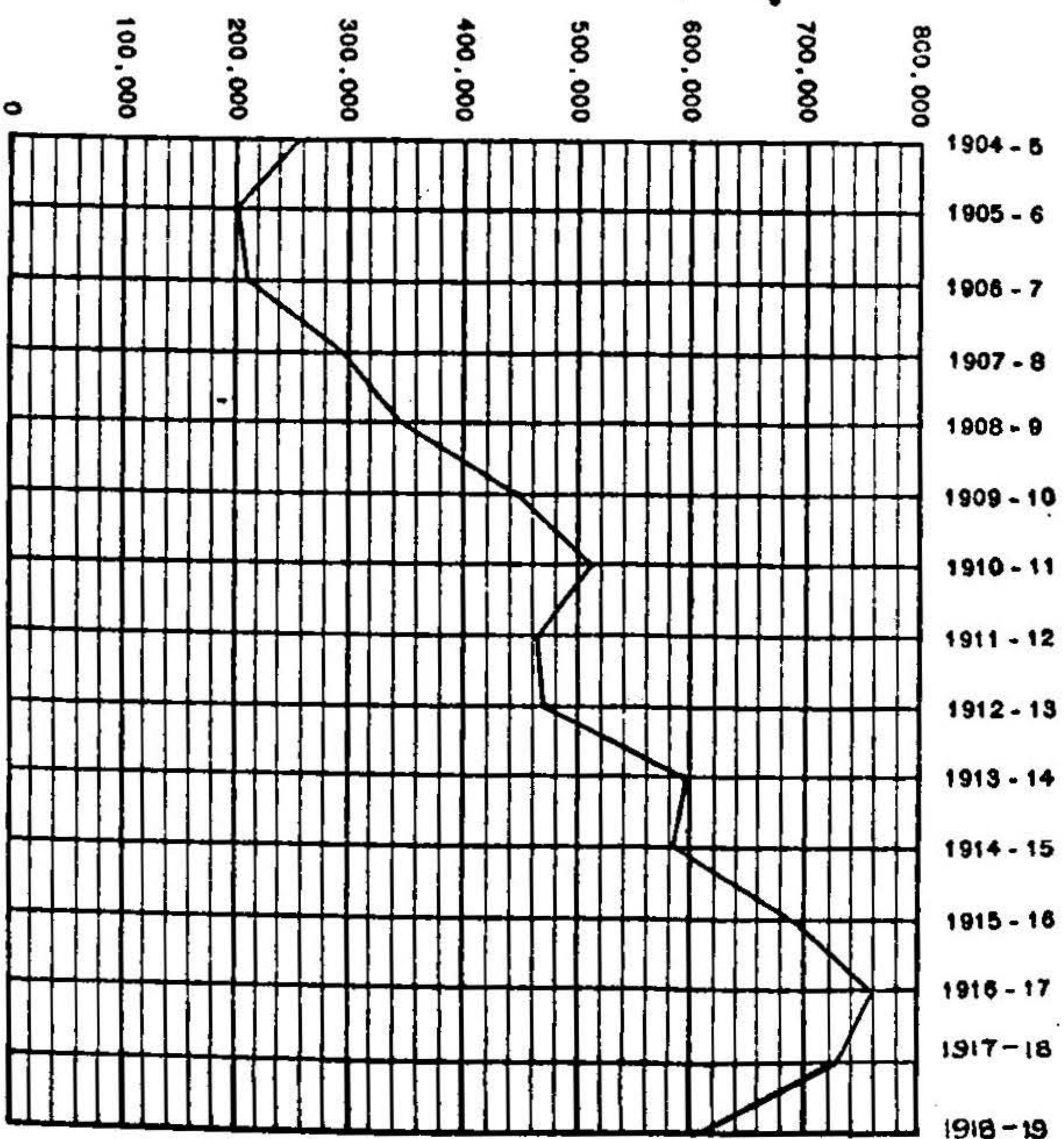

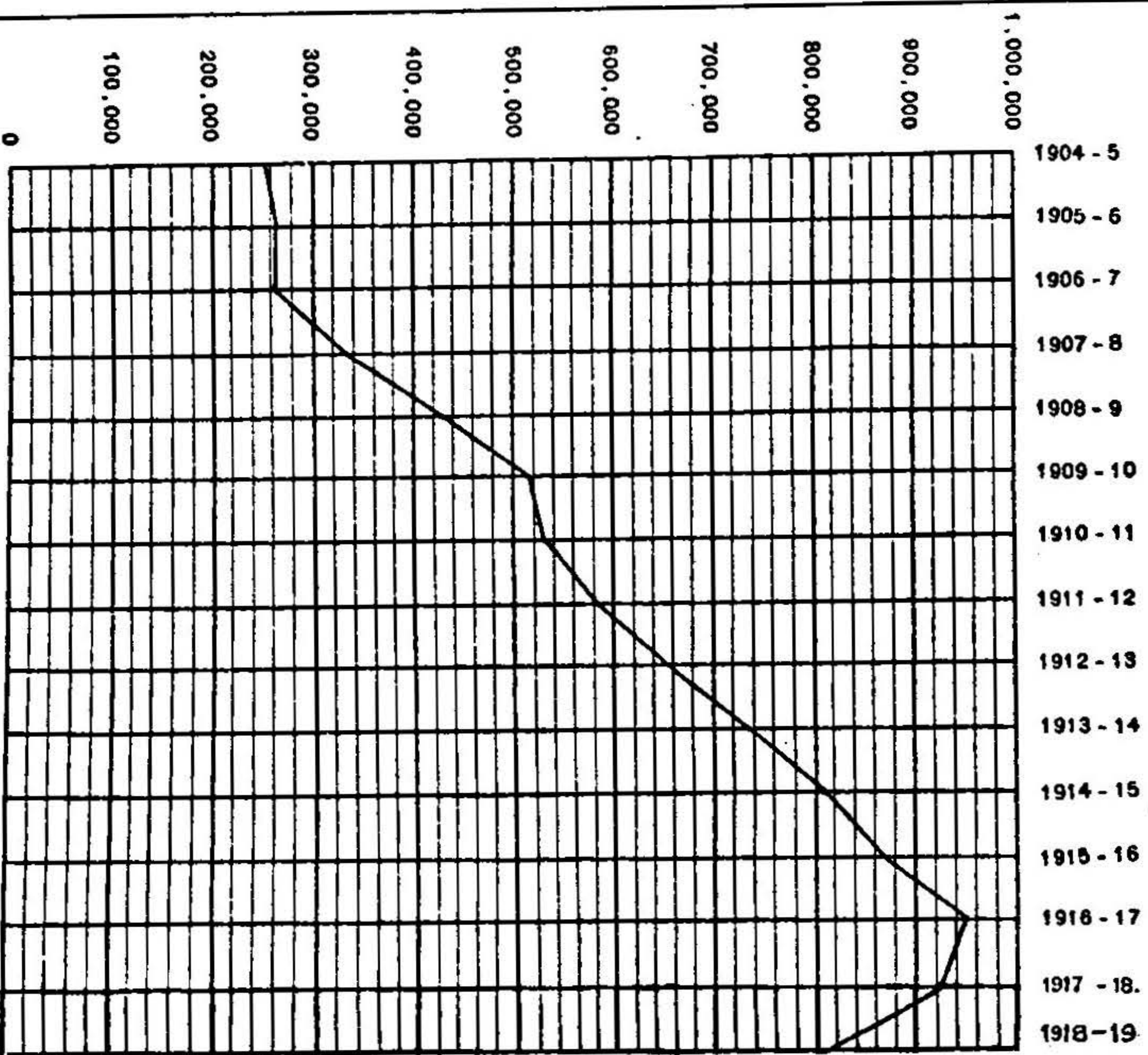
TOTAL NUMBER OF INOCULATIONS.



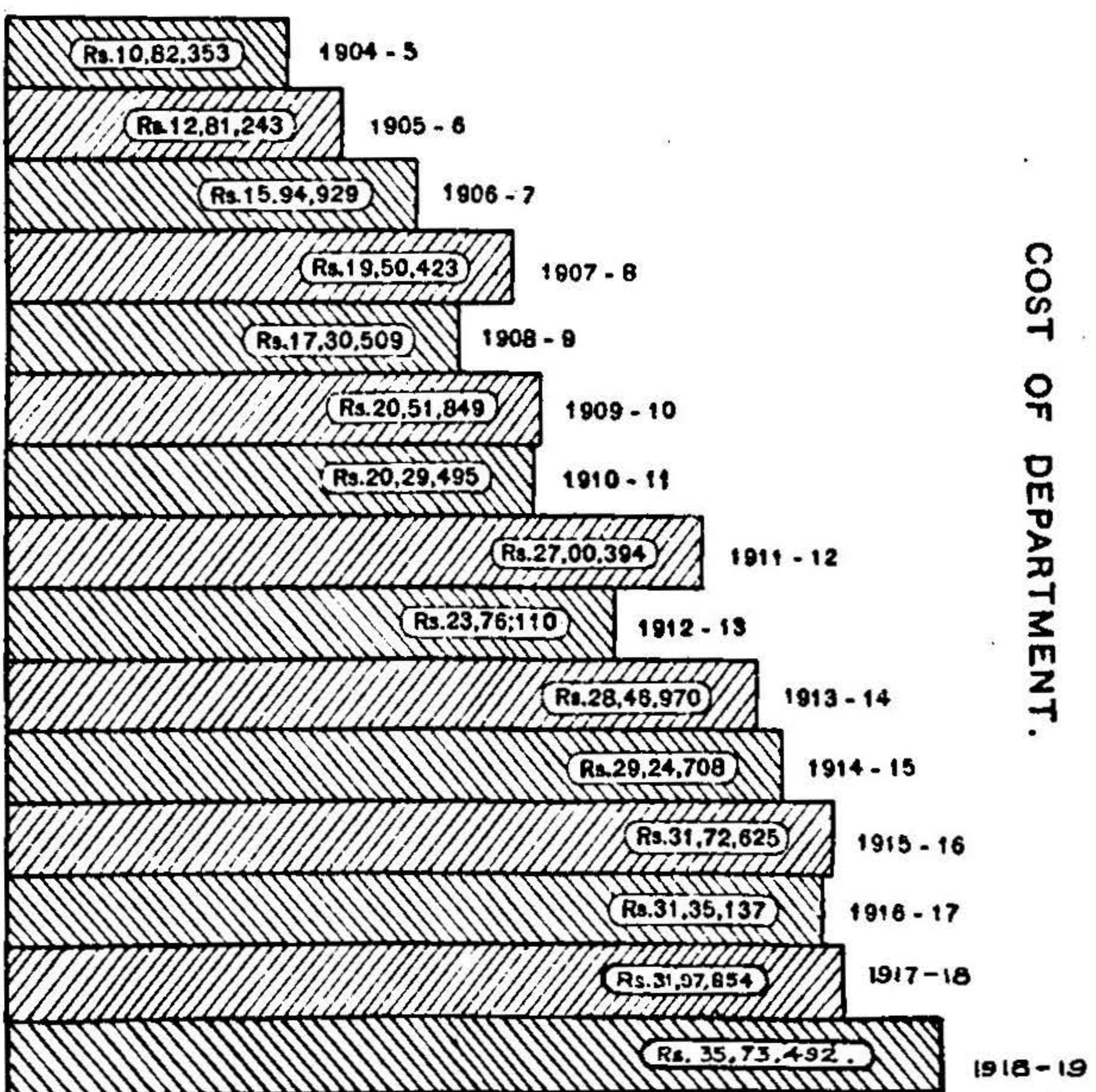
NUMBER OF ANIMALS TREATED AND CASTRATIONS PERFORMED BY VETERINARY ASSISTANTS.



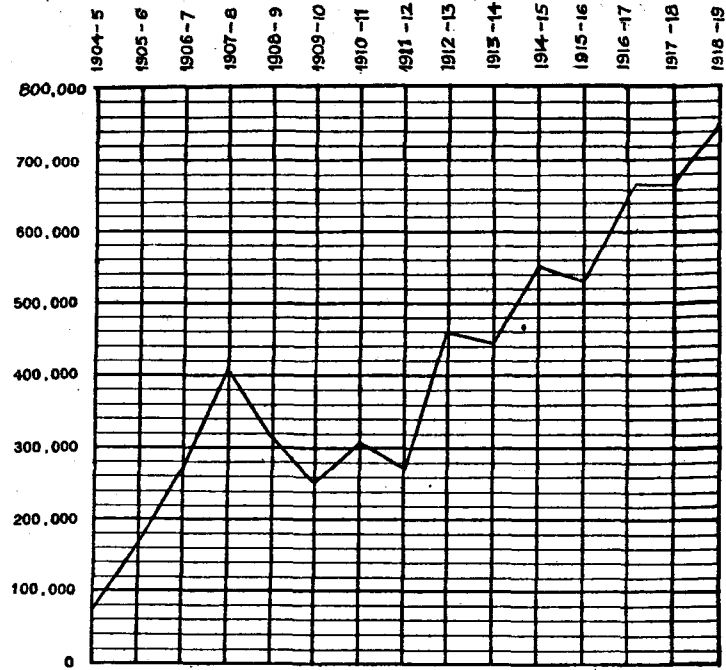
NUMBER OF ANIMALS TREATED AT VETERINARY DISPENSARIES.



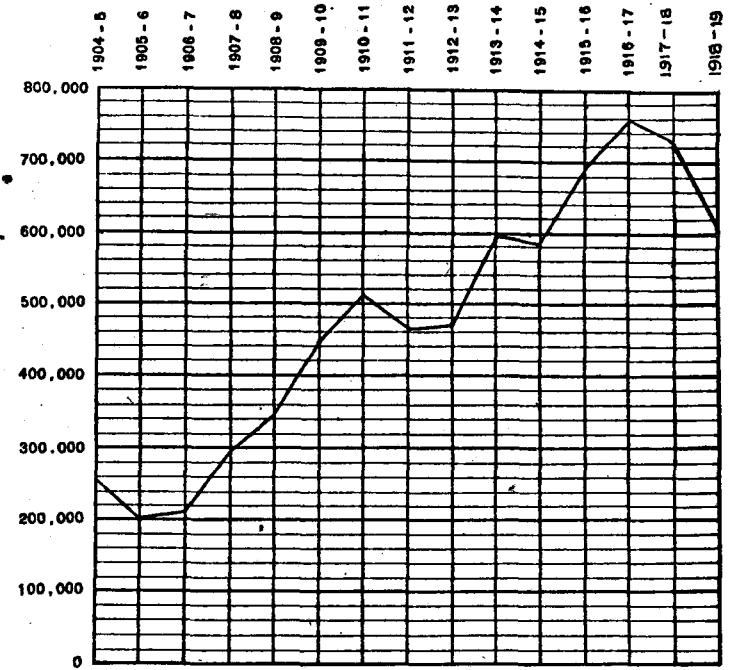
