FOREWORD

In the year 1964, Jayakwadi Project Report was submitted to Central Water and Power Commission and Planning Commission. This Project report envisaged :-

- a) A dam near Paithan in Aurangabad District of Maharashtra State on Godavari river.
- b) Paithan Left Bank Canal to irrigate 1,41,637 Ha - (3,50,000 acres) in Aurangabad and Parbhani Districts.
- c) Paithan Right Bank Canal to irrigate 41,682 Ha (1,03,000 acres) in Aurangabad, Ahmednagar and Bhir Districts.
- d) A dam near Majalgaon in Bhir District of Maharashtra State on Sindphana river.
- e) Majalgaon Right Bank Canal to irrigate 93,885 Ha (2,32,000 acres) in Bhir, Parbhani and Nanded Districts.

Central Water and Power Commission scrutinised the report and suggested that the Paithan Dam with its Left Bank Canal only should be taken up as Jayakwadi Project Stage-I and the remaining components of the Project should be covered by a separate report as Jayakwadi Project Stage-II.

Accordingly Stage-I of the Project was cleared by Planning Commission under their letter No.III-2 (23)/64-I. & P.Dated 3-2-1965.

On clearance, the work of Stage-I was taken up immediately and is now in full swing. The earthen dam is completed and Masonry dam (without gates) will be ready by June 1974 when irrigation potential of about 16,000 Ha will also have been created. The

installation of gates will be completed by June 1976 and entire canal and distribution system is programmed to be completed by 1979-80.

The Paithan dam will impound a live storage of  $1965.90 \text{ Mm}^3$ , out of which  $750 \text{ Mm}^3$ , (26.5 T.M.C.) net is meant for utilisation on Paithan Right Bank Canal and Majalgaon Right Bank Canal.

During the unprecedent drought of 1972-73 experienced in Maharashtra, the work of Paithan Right Bank Canal was started as scarcity work and nearly Rs. 125.00 lakhs have been spent so far on this work. The work is still in progress.

In view of the facts that the entire water potential required under the Paithan Right Bank Canal will have been impounded at Paithan in 1976, it is imperative that the Paithan Right Bank Canal should be completed on priority so that area of 41,682 Ha in Aurangabad, Ahmednagar and Bhir Districts can be brought under irrigation before the end of the Fifth Five Year Plan. This will help us not only to achieve the badly needed irrigation facility in the above mentioned districts, but will also ensure that the expenditure already incurred on Paithan Right Bank Canal does not become infructuous. Simultaneously a start will also have to be made on the construction of Majalgaon dam and Majalgaon Right Bank Canal, so that an area of 93,885 Ha from Bhir, Parbhani and Nanded Districts (commanded by Majalgaon Right Bank Canal) can be brought under irrigation by about 1980-81.

Jayakwadi Project Circle, Aurangabad is a fully established organisation and can immediately take up the works of Stage-II. Jayakwadi Canal Circle, Aurangabad can also be gradually entrusted with the work of Majalgaon Right Bank Canal as the work of Paithan Left Bank Canal will go on diminishing year after year. Thus the entire trained and established organisation of Jayakwadi Project Stage-I can be switched over for the construction of Stage-II.

It is with the above back-ground that this report on Jayakwadi Project Stage-II is being submitted to Central Water and Power Commission and Planning Commission for immediate clearance thereto. An early clearance will ensure continued employment for the technical and non-technical, skilled and un-skilled personnel now employed on Jayakwadi Project Stage-I and will also enable the State to create the much needed irrigation potential of the order of 1,35,567 Ha in the Marathwada region of the State which has been badly hit during the three successive drought years of 1970-71, 1971-72 and 1972-73.

## CHAPTER - I

### HISTORY AND GENERAL FEATURES OF JAYAKWADI PROJECT

#### 1.0 RIVER GODAVARI

Godavari river is one of the important rivers in Southern India. The basin of this river extends over an area of 3,12,812 Square Kms. which is nearly 10% of total geographical area of India. The basin lies between East longitudes  $73^{\circ} - 26'$  and  $83^{\circ} - 7'$  and North latitudes  $16^{\circ} - 16'$  and  $22^{\circ} - 36'$ . The Godavari rises in the Nasik District of Maharashtra about 80 Kms. from the Arabian Sea at an elevation of about 1067 Metres - above mean sea level and after flowing for about 1465 Kms. in a generally south east direction falls into the Bay of Bengal about 96 Kms. below Rajahmundry. The Pravara, Purna, the Manjra, the Pranhita, the Indravati and the Sabri are Godavari's principal tributaries. The distribution of the Godavari basin in various States is as - under :-

1.1     REGIONAL ECONOMY

On the basis of 1971 Census and the percentage of the area of each District within the basin to the District as a whole, the total population in the basin works out to about 35.46 Million. More than 50% of this population resides in Maharashtra.

The economy of the basin at the present largely depends on agriculture which in view of the uneven incidents of the rainfall provides a low level of subsistence except for small parts of the basin where irrigation has been provided. These areas are also the seat of industries based on agricultural produce.

For these reasons there is a keen demand in the basin for the development of water resources. Though the major drainage area as well as precipitation in Godavari basin is from Maharashtra the total use of Godavari water for irrigation happens to be very low. Percentage of net area irrigated to net area sown is only 7.4%. Out of this area only 1.17% area gets benefits from Tanks, Wells etc. This project viz : the Jayakwadi Project is conceived to extend irrigation benefits to chronically scarcity affected areas of Ahmednagar and Bhir Districts.

1.2     SCARCITY CONDITIONS

The central part of the Godavari basin from Aurangabad, Ahmednagar and Bhir Districts is very prone to be affected by scarcity conditions. Specially the Majalgaon and Gevrai Talukas in Bhir District have

been often affected by scarcity and revenue was required to be suspended in these areas. The continued drought conditions during the years 1970-71, 1971-72 and 1972-73 have highlighted the need for irrigation protection in this area. During 1972-73 this area has faced the worst drought and various scarcity relief works were required to be provided in this area. In Majalgaon Taluka and Gevrai Taluka more than 2,000 scarcity works were required to be taken up as a relief measure for employing about 1,00,000 famine stricken population. In order to utilise this scarcity labour for productive purposes the work of Paithan Right Bank Canal has also been taken up throughout the length. These scarcity conditions have focussed sharply the attention of the people in Marathwada Region on this Project, which is designed to play an important part in ameliorating their conditions to a great extent.

### 1.3 JAYAKWADI PROJECT

Jayakwadi Project has been planned for irrigation by harnessing the Godavari waters for irrigation. In addition to the main Godavari waters upto Paithan, the resources of Sindphana river are also proposed to be utilised. Sindphana is one of the tributaries of Godavari on the right bank. The Sindphana generally flows in a west - east direction for about 104 Kms. ( 65 Miles ) before joining Godavari river near village Manjrath in Majalgaon Taluka of Bhir District. The Sindphana river has three main tributaries namely Bendsura, Tukur and Kundalika rivers. Whole of the catchment area lies between the rainfall zone of about 800 mms.

1.4 HISTORY:

The investigations of this scheme were in progress since a long time before the re-organisation of States, when this region was a part of the old Hyderabad State. During 1965 after studying various proposals the Project has been finalised as under :-

The Project consists of :

- 1) A reservoir on the Godavari river above Paithan Town with the live storage capacity of 1965.9 Mm<sup>3</sup> ( 73.00 T.M.C. ).
- 2) A reservoir on the Sindphana river, tributary of the Godavari near Majalgaon Town with the live storage capacity of 311.3 Mm<sup>3</sup> ( 11.00 T.M.C. ).
- 3) Left Bank Canal starting from the Paithan dam to command the gross and the net irrigable area of 2,03,958 Ha ( 5,04,000 acres) and 1,41,637 Ha (3,50,000 acres) respectively.
- 4) Right Bank Canal starting from the Paithan dam to command the gross and net irrigable area of 59,892 Ha ( 1,48,000 acres ) and 41,682 Ha (1,03,000 acres) respectively.
- 5) Right Bank Canal starting from the Majalgaon dam to command the gross and net irrigable area of 1,31,520 Ha ( 3,25,000 acres ) and 93,835 Ha ( 2,32,000 acres ) respectively.

1.5 STAGING OF THE PROJECT

The construction of the Project has been proposed in two stages based on construction facilities and financial resources as under :-

STAGE - I

- 1) The reservoir on Godavari river near Paithan Town.
- 2) Paithan Left Bank Canal starting from Paithan Dam to irrigate 1,41,637 Ha ( 3,50,000 acres ).

STAGE - II

- 1) The reservoir on Sindphana river near Majalgaon Town.
- 2) Right Bank Canal starting from the Paithan dam to irrigate 41,682 Ha ( 1,03,000 acres ).
- 3) Right Bank Canal from Majalgaon dam to irrigate 93,885 Ha ( 2,32,000 acres ).

The reservoir near Paithan for the storage requirement of Stage-I and Stage-II has been taken up and nearing completion. Since the proposed staging was based merely on construction facility and financial resources; the Hydrology and water planning for the whole Project was incorporated in the report for Stage-I only. The details of estimates, financial planning etc. were, however, given for the components in the Stage-I. The Project accordingly was accepted by Planning Commission under Government of India letter No. III-2(23)/64, I&P: dated the 3rd Feb. 1965.

Investigations and survey of the components proposed in Stage-II were, however, further carried out. As the Hydrology, water planning of the comprehensive Project were already finalised at the time of approval of the Stage-I, the present project report pertaining to

Stage-II includes the details regarding the structural designs, estimates, financial planning, benefit cost ratio etc. pertaining to the components of Stage-II.

The Project pays an interest of 2.06% after 10 years from construction. The benefit cost ratio for

Stage-II works out to 2.55 .

The Jayakwadi Project has the pride of being the biggest among the irrigation schemes in the Maharashtra State and it benefits a comparatively large area with the available water resources.

The construction of Stage-I works is in an advanced stage. Earth work of Paithan dam is completed while masonry dam work ( about 70% already completed ) is expected to be over by 1976 as scheduled. Thus the Paithan storage will be available by this time.

It is thus necessary to take up Stage-II works of the Project immediately as a ~~natural~~ follow up action. The continued drought conditions, as highlighted in para No. 1.2 further justify the importance of this action.

If Stage-II works are taken up immediately, benefits would start flowing in immediately as Paithan Right Bank Canal works get completed bit by bit. The gestation period of this stage would thus prove to be shortest one.

## CHAPTER - II

### HYDROLOGY, WATER PLANNING, COMMAND AREA AND CROP PATTERN

#### 1.0 SOURCES OF SUPPLIES

For the irrigation requirement under Jayakwadi Project Stage-II, water resources proposed to be harnessed are as under :-

(1) Godavari river at Paithan Dam.

(2) Sindphana river after Majalgaon Dam.

#### 1.1 GODAVARI RIVER

Godavari river upto Paithan Dam site gets replenishment in addition to its own from main tributaries namely Darna, Kadwa, Pravara with Mula and Shivna. The total catchment area of Godavari at Paithan is 21,404 Sq. Kms. (8400 Sq. miles).

The run-off available at Paithan Dam site has been worked out and full details are given in the Report of Stage-I of the Project.

#### 1.2 SINDPHANA RIVER

The total catchment area of this river upto Majalgaon site is 3840 Sq. Kms. (1500 Sq. miles). The details of run-off series etc. are also given in the Report of Stage-I.

#### 2.0 THE COMBINATION OF PAITHAN & MAJALGAON SERIES.

In the planning of the Jayakwadi Project dealt with in Stage-I report combined series of utilisable run-off of Godavari at Paithan and Sindphana at Majalgaon

are worked out. As per this planning 75% dependable flow for this Project has been worked out to  $2832.83 \text{ Mm}^3$  -

### 4.0 COMMAND AND CROP PATTERN

The canal system proposed in the Stage-II of this Project is already out-lined in the para No. 1.4 of - Chapter I .

The details of the command area in respect of the two canals i.e. Paithan Right Bank Canal and Majalgaon Right Bank Canal are worked out separately. The gross command area of these two canals is computed from the contour maps after excluding the high spots compared to the canal bed levels.

The cultivable area is 90% of the gross command. It has been observed from the village Statistics collected for the planning of the distribution system of Paithan Left Bank Canal that this percentage of cultivable area to gross command area varies from 90% to 95%. It is also confirmed from the village Statistics collected for the command area ( vide Appendix No. 2.1 ) . The cultivable command area is the area excluding the uncultivable part of the command such as village Gaothans, Roads, Nallas etc. and is worked out on the basis of Revenue Records available.

As the tracts adjoining the Godavari river are flat, it is possible to realise 75% to 80% intensity for irrigation. For the planning it is assumed as 77%. The net irrigable area will be that part of the cultivable area, which will get the irrigation benefits after the complete distribution system is complete. It excludes that part of cultivable area worked out as above which may be utilised for construction of channels higher patches of ground near the take-off of field channels, area under field tracks, contour bunds, farm houses etc. The index plan to the scale of 1 Cm. = 20 Kms. showing the alignment of the canal and the command area is given in plate No. II . According to the comprehensive planning.

#### 5.0 CHARACTERISTICS OF COMMAND AREA

In case of Paithan Right Bank Canal the entire command area is bounded by Godavari river on one side and the ridge between Godavari river and Sindphana river on the other side while in case of Majalgaon Right Bank Canal it has Godavari river on one side and ridge between Godavari river and Manjra river on the other side. The whole command area lies between ~~Longitude~~  $75^{\circ} - 20'$  to  $77^{\circ} - 10'(\text{E})$  and ~~Latitude~~  $18^{\circ} - 55'$  to  $19^{\circ} - 30'(\text{N})$ . The irrigable area lying within various talukas and Districts is as under :-

6.0 TOPOGRAPHY

The general features of topography for the command area are the same as for the whole Godavari Valley.

It consists mainly of rolling and undulating country with the series of ridges and valleys interspersed with low hills. Its elevation varies from 457 M. (1500 ft.) to 325 M. (1100 ft.) above the mean sea level from west to east.

7.0 SOILS

The area in question consists of undulating lands having alternate ridges and valleys subjected to serious erosion by rain. Hence the soils are generally shallow where they have been formed in situ near the ridges. Deep soils are, however, met with in the vicinity of river bank as a result of deposition of the eroded material brought by river in floods. The soils consist of shallow, medium, deep black varieties. The shallow soils generally found near the hills, ridges and slopes, are light in colour having murum as sub-soil. Deeper soils are developed as alluvial material along the banks of the river. They are darker, deep and richer.

The soil survey of the whole command is completed. From the soil survey carried out for the entire command area the soil classification of the area for the two canals is as under :-

It is also found that the infiltration rate of the soil is considerably high. Internal drainage is much influenced by the character of under-lying murum. This appears to be relatively pervious although its permeability is variable at places. Where the murum layer has free discharge to a nearby Nala or a river it functions effectively as a drain. In areas of very flat surface slopes, lateral drainage via murum layer by ditches will

be necessary. Alternatively effective vertical drainage may occur through the underlying Basalt. Substantial surface gradient from the irrigation area to the river, the occurrence of murum layer and the planned low intensity of irrigation are favourable factors which would minimise the extent of drainage problems. However, the observations regarding ground water level the salinity and alkalinity would be continuously taken through-out the area after the irrigation commences so that timely measures can be taken if and where adverse drainage conditions become apparent.

#### 8.0      RAINFALL

The annual average rainfall from the command area varies from 648 mms. ( 25.5 inches ) at Paithan Dam site to 1003 mms. ( 32.5 inches ) near Nanded, the end of Majalgaon Right Bank Canal. However, the actual monthly as well as annual rainfall is subjected to wide range of variation, many times resulting in dry and wet droughts.

The crop pattern proposed for the Jayakwadi Project is as under :-

## 2.0. SILT STORAGE

The provision of silt storage was discussed with C.W. & P.C. at the time of finalisation of Stage-I report. Accordingly it was decided that the provision for silt storage upto head regulator silt must be atleast at the rate of 0.1579 Hectares M/Sq.Km. (0.5 acre ft. per Sq.Mile) of catchment area. 4.0 LIVE STORAGE

The main component of the live storage is the fair weather requirements of the crops. The contribution from rainfall in fair weather being negligible, all the crops are required to be grown on the stored water. In the case of Jayakwadi Project Stage - II the fair weather requirement of the command under Paithan Right Bank Canal is completely met with by the storage in Paithan Reservoir while the requirement of Majalgaon Right Bank Canal is met with from the supplies from Paithan Reservoir and from the live storage of Majalgaon Reservoir. The working of the storage at Paithan and Majalgaon on the above basis is already dealt with in detail in the storage planning of the comprehensive scheme. The salient details of Majalgaon Reservoir are reproduced for reference.

## CHAPTER - IV

### HEAD WORKS

#### 1.0 SELECTION OF DAM SITE

In the 1964 project report, a dam site just upstream of Majalgaon town was proposed and explored. During the last decade, Majalgaon town, which is a Taluka town has grown considerably. The old site near the town would pose considerable difficulties in construction, land acquisition and rehabilitation.

To utilise the water potential to the maximum extent the dam site is proposed to cover the maximum catchment area of the river. One of the major tributaries namely Kundalika joins Sindphana river at a distance of about 7 Kms. upstream of Majalgaon Town. Thus the selection of the dam site has to be in between the confluence of Kundalika and Sindphana rivers and Majalgaon Town. Any proposal down-stream of Majalgaon town would not be economical and hence infeasible. Thus the selection of the dam site is restricted within this reach of the river i.e. between confluence with Kundalika river and Majalgaon Town.

Under these circumstances the alternative dam site about 2 Kms. upstream of Majalgaon Town (Lat.  $19^{\circ}10'$ , Long.  $75^{\circ}10'$ ) has been investigated. This site is found to be feasible both technically and economically.

#### 2.0 GEOLOGY

The original site near Majalgaon Town was inspected by the Officers of Geological Survey of India and they had approved the proposal for the construction. (A copy of their report is enclosed vide Appendix 4.1). The

Geological Survey of the present site is being carried out by them. However, as the present proposed site is within a distance of 2000 Metres from the old proposed site no major difference in Geological formation is expected at the present proposed site.

The formation at this site is Deccan Trap through which the river has cut a valley and created flood banks on either side. Results of bores and trial pits taken at site indicate that the Right Bank has deep alluvium deposits maximum depth being about 25 Metres. The left flank is firm; the hard rock being met with at a higher level.

Thus the Geological formation of both the banks appears to be of different characteristics. The top layer of the formation of Right Flank consists of black soil 1.5 m. to 3 m. thick. Soil below this strata is yellowish mixed with sand layers and lime kankar etc. Below this layer, massive rock appears to be available at the same level continuously for a length of 1500 Metres which indicates the erosion of the ground to the hard stratum by the river. Alluvial deposits are met with on the left flank for a short portion. The river bed level is 404.550 Metres and hard rock is available in river portion at a depth of 4 Metres dipping downwards towards the Right Flank. The intermediate layers consist of amygdaloidal rock. Hard rock, however is comparatively at higher level on Left Flank.

The general formation of the left flank is hard murum having a thin layer of black cotton soil, on the top. Below hard murum layers hard rock is available at a depth of about 11 Metres. The boulder formation is being met within the intermediate portion.

### 3.0 LAY-OUT OF HEAD WORKS

After studying the nature of the valley and the details available from the foundation exploration it is now proposed to provide the spillway in the river gorge extending on the left flank of the river. This will facilitate the construction of the dam and will avoid the problems of tail channel retrogression. The layout proposed has earthen embankment on the left and right flank with a central spillway. Divide wall type junction on left bank and partial envelope cum divide wall junction on the right bank are proposed. The out-let is proposed to be located at Ch:172 on the right bank through earth dam. The details of head works are as follows.

- (1) 1002 metres Earthen dam on left bank.
- (2) 468 metres masonry dam including spillway
- (3) 5550 metres earthen dam on right bank.

The L-Section and plan of the Majalgaon dam are given in Plate No.3 (i) while the bore results are shown in Plate No. 3(ii).

#### 3.1 EARTHEN DAM

On the Right Flank the earthen dam will be 5550 Metres in length from Ch:49.00 to 234.00. The maximum height of the embankment on Right Flank is 22 Metres. The embankment on the left bank between Ch: 0 to Ch:33.4 is 1002 Metres long having maximum height of 15 Metres.

Through the top layers on Right Flank consist of blank cotton soil and yellowish soil which are comparatively impervious, the underlying sandy layer is expected to pose

some problems. It is proposed to provide a positive cut off trench upto hard rock level as done in case of Paithan dam. The maximum depth of cutoff trench is thus expected to be 30 Metres. The conditions met with at this site are more or less similar to the conditions of Paithan Dam site on Godavari River.

In view of the fact that characteristics of the soils at this site appear to be similar to those at Paithan Dam the section of earthen embankment decided on the basis of the detailed studies for Paithan Dam is proposed in this case also for Right Flank. Similarly, left flank section of Paithan Dam is also proposed here for the left flank embankment. Typical cross section of Earthen Dam are given in the Plate No. 4.

Total quantity of earth work is estimated to be as under.

3.2 MASONRY DAM

The spillway would be in the river gorge extending on the left flank of the river for a length of 468 Metres between Ch. 33.40 to Ch. 49.00. The spillway 417 Metres long includes 28 Gates of 12 x 5 Metres size. The width of the piers is 3 Metres. On left flank due to shallow depth of earthen embankment, the junction is proposed to be of a retaining wall type while on the right flank an envelope type junction is proposed.

In view of availability of suitable foundation, spillway portion is proposed to be located between Ch. 33.4 to Ch. 49.00. As good rock is available at higher elevation on the left flank, the masonry dam is proposed to be founded at two different levels. The dam between Ch. 33.40 to Ch. 42.00 is proposed to be founded at R.L. 408.425 while that between Ch. 42.00 to Ch. 49.00 at R.L. 399.196. The two bays are proposed to be separated by providing a divide wall. For the spillway, 28 Nos. of gates (12 m x 5m) are proposed to be provided. Out of these 28 Gates, 11 will be located in the river gorge and remaining 17 gates on the left flank. The layout of the masonry dam is given in Plate No.5. This arrangement is also advantageous in the flood routing. The maximum observed flood at the dam site is 3600 Cumecs only. The floods occurring more frequently upto this limit can be negotiated through 11 gates on the right side. When the flood exceeds this limit, the gates on the left bay can be operated. The right side gates will thus be operated first. Slotted buckets are proposed in this bay. In the left bay, however sloping apron is proposed for energy dissipation. The details about the

surplussing arrangements are given in Appendix No.4.2. The profiles of spillway in the above two bays are given in plate No.6 and 7. The profile of spillway and other details, energy dissipation arrangements, operation of spillway gates will however be finalised on the basis of model studies.

The total work involved in the work of masonry dam is given below.

3.3 FREE BOARD

The maximum length of the uninterrupted fetch of the lake is about 15.9 Kms. ( 11.8 m.). Assuming the maximum velocity of wind at 80 Km.p.h. (50 m.p.h.) the wave height as per different formulae are tabulated below:-

However free board of 3.40 m. has been provided.

#### 4.0 SURPLUSSING ARRANGEMENT

The river gauging station for Sindphana river at Majalgaon has been established by CW & PC since 1964. The data regarding maximum floods occurred is studied from the details available from the above records. It is found that the maximum flood discharge at the site is 3600 Cumecs on 26.8.1971. However as the data available is only for 9 years, it is inadequate to determine the maximum expected floods at the site for designing the surplussing arrangements. As a safe measure the maximum flood inflow for the surplussing arrangements is taken to be 1.25 times of Inglis flood

which works out to 9480 Cumecs. It is proposed to dispose off this flood by 25 gates of 12 m. x 5 m. Three additional gates are provided as standby. At F.R.L. the maximum outgoing discharge would equal to 6625 Cumecs. The designed flood inflow of 1.25 times Inglis flood can be accommodated at M.W.L. i.e. R.L. 431.70 M.

#### 5.0 HEAD REGULATOR

The head regulator for the proposed Majalgaon Right Bank Canal is proposed at Ch. 172.00 on Right Flank.

#### 6.0 APPROACH AND TAIL CHANNEL

As the spillway portion is just on the left flank, approach channel is not required for the spillway operation. However, for the proper junction with the river course from the spillway a tail channel would be required at the downstream of the dam.

An approach channel has also been proposed for the Head Regulator on Right Flank.

#### 7.0 MATERIAL FOR CONSTRUCTION

##### 7.1 Earthen Dam

###### 7.11 Residual Soil

Residual soil is obtained over the murum on the right bank with the maximum thickness of 1.22 M. (4ft.). The colour of the soil is black. On the left Bank, reddish residual soil is obtained over the murum, but its thickness is very insignificant. The soil on the right bank is comparatively more clayey. As compared to the total requirements of the embankment, this soil, though suitable

for impervious hearting or cut-off trench filling, will form a small portion.

7.12 Jet Black Alluvial Soil ( CH - Type )

This is obtained on the right bank and is different from the black soil obtained over murum. This soil varies in thickness from 1.52 M. ( 5 ft.) to 3.05 M. (10 ft.). It is expected to be useful especially for C.O.T. filling. Its presence on the up-stream side will have a blanketing effect, which is advantageous.

7.13 Dark Brown Alluvial Soil ( CH - MH Type )

This soil forms the major bulk of the alluvial deposits on the right bank. It will be suitable for impervious zone of the embankment.

7.14 Yellow Alluvial Soil ( SM - SC Type )

The yellow soil on the Right Flank though broadly grouped in one , will have to be further divided into sub-groups, depending upon the predominance of silt, fine sand, lime nodules, etc. All these varieties will be useful for hearting and semi-pervious zone of the embankment and will have better strength characteristics as compared to the dark brown soil.

7.15 Brownish Silt ( MH - Type )

The brownish silt on the left bank is of recent origin. In view of its very limited extent no use is being planned for this material.

7.16 Murum ( GP - GW Type )

The usual variation from soft to hard varieties is obtained but in general the murum on the left bank is of a harder variety and the particles are bigger and more cubical in shape. It has the usual yellowish or reddish colour. The murum on the right bank is greenish and brownish in colour. The particles are smaller and flaky in shape. Both varieties will, however, be suitable as a casing material.

Thus in short the material required for cut-off trench filling, hearting and semi-pervious zone is available on the Right Flank on the river while the casing material is to be used from the left side of the river.

7.2 MASONRY DAM

The entire masonry dam is proposed to be constructed in cement surkhi mortar. Stone and sand are available in sufficient quantity. Stone is available at the quarries within a lead of 20 Kms. from the work site while good sand is available in the Sindphana river down stream of the dam site at a lead of 4 Km. The cement required for the construction is available from the cement factories in Maharashtra as well as in nearby states namely Andhra Pradesh, Mysore and Madhya Pradesh. The nearest stations for cement transportation are Jalna and Manwat on Manmad Kacheguda line and Parli Vaijnath on Central Railway. The lead for cement is expected to be 150 Km. by roads from these stations.

8.00 COMMUNICATIONS

The dam site is approachable on left flank from Jalna Bhir Road which is a portion of state Highway. This road takes off at a distance of 25 Kms. from Bhir. Majalgaon Dam site is .51 Kms. away from this bifurcation point. At present this branch road is metalled one and is expected to be black-topped very soon. On right bank the dam site is approachable from Bhir-Parli road.

## CHAPTER - V

### C A N A L S

1.0 As already stated in the earlier Chapters, Jayakwadi Project Stage-II includes the construction of two main canals:-

- a) Paithan Right Bank Canal from Paithan Reservoir.
- b) Majalgaon Right Bank Canal from Majalgaon Reservoir.

#### 1.1 PAITHAN RIGHT BANK CANAL:

In addition to irrigating the command area from Paithan reservoir to Majalgaon reservoir on the right bank of Godavari river, Paithan right bank canal serves the purpose of carrying additional quantum of water for feeding Majalgaon right bank canal.

#### 1.2 MAJALGAON RIGHT BANK CANAL:

Majalgaon right bank canal is designed to irrigate command area from Majalgaon Dam on the right bank of Godavari.

## 2.0 DISCHARGE CAPACITY

2.1 The maximum-discharging capacity of Paithan right bank canal has been worked out by AI/DC method for the direct command under it. In addition to this capacity, additional capacity of 26.88 m<sup>3</sup>/sec. for feeding the Majalgaon right bank canal is provided therein. The canal losses are taken to be 0.6082 Cumec/Msm. ( 2 Cusecs per Msft.) for arriving at maximum discharging capacity of the canal.

As regards Majalgaon right bank canal the maximum discharging capacity has been worked out by AI/DC method for the area directly under its command.

## 2.2 ALIGNMENT

The alignment of Paithan right bank canal has been completely surveyed while that of Majalgaon right bank canal has been surveyed upto a length of 120 Kms. from Majalgaon dam. The actual surveyed length of Paithan right bank canal has been found to be 132.56 Kms. The length of Majalgaon right bank canal is 165 Kms. The maximum capacity at head, the length of canal and starting canal bed levels of the canals are given below:

Both the canals are aligned as falling contour canals. In order to minimise transit losses and achieve resultant economy, it is proposed to line both the canals. The nature of lining proposed is 50 mms. thick P.C.C. slabs ( 1:3:6 ) for the sides and 70 mms. thick ( 1:4:8 ) cement concrete in the bed. This type of

lining has been successfully done in the case of Paithan Left Bank Canal; hence the same is proposed to be adopted in these two canals also. The condensed L - Sections of these canals are given in the Plate Nos. 8 to 12 and 13 to 17 respectively.

#### 2.3 REACHES OF CANAL AND DISCHARGING CAPACITY

As the length of the canal increases from the starting point, the command area decreases gradually. The canal sections can thus be suitably reduced commensurate with the discharging capacity. In order to effect this reduction in the canal section, the command area is divided into suitable reaches. While working out the section of the reach, the section of each reach has been designed to carry water to serve the area not only directly under its command but also the entire area of the succeeding reaches. The statement showing discharging capacities in the various reaches of canal, also the aggregate area to which they have to carry water is given in Appendix 5.1.

#### 2.4 DESIGN OF CANAL SECTIONS

The dimensions for the section of various reaches are designed with the help of Manning's formulae. The detailed sections about various reaches are given in Appendix 5.2.

For determining the section the following formulae are adopted:-

$$1) V = \frac{1.486}{N} m^{2/3} \times i^{\frac{1}{2}} \quad (\text{Manning's formula})$$

Value of 'N' is taken to be 0.018 for lined canal.

The side slopes would vary according to soils, being  $\frac{1}{2} : 1$  in hard rock,  $1\frac{1}{2} : 1$  in murum and 2 to 1 in soil. However, the sections given in Appendix - 5.2 referred to above correspond to 2 : 1 side slopes. The typical cross sections of canal in cutting, banking as well as in partial banking are given in Plate No.18.

### 3.0 CROSS DRAINAGE WORKS

As both the canals are proposed as falling contour canals, various rivers, streams and nallas cross the proposed canal alignment. The types of cross drainage works to be provided along these natural drains mainly depend upon the catchment area of the nalla and position of C.B.L. in relation to nalla bed level at the crossing. The cross drainage works are divided into following types.

#### 3.1 AQUEDUCTS

In case of the stream having catchment area more than 10 Sq.Kms., it has been found that the aqueducts with R.C.C. trough are economical. These troughs are continuous to earthen embankment section of the canal at banks of the nalla. Such type of structures, however, involve some loss of head due to reduction in waterway.

#### 3.2 SLAB CULVERTS

In case of streams having catchment area less than 10 Sq.Kms., it becomes economical to continue the

earthen canal section over the nallas, with the help of R.C.C. slab at base. In such cases there would not be any loss of head.

### 3.3 HUME PIPE CULVERTS

For small local nallas, adequate waterway can be provided through the hume pipes below the canal bed level in the earthen canal section. In such cases of C.D.Works also, there is no loss of head.

### 3.4 SYPHONS AND SUPER-PASSAGES

In cases where the C.B.L. is lower than Nalla bed level, the canals are taken below the nallas by means of siphons while in cases where nalla levels are much higher and are above F.S.L. of canal, the super-passages are proposed.

### 3.5 DESIGN OF AQUEDUCTS

The maximum discharge to be allowed in the stream is obtained by the following formula and checked for flood according to Inglis' formula.

$$Q : \frac{4000 A}{A + 4}$$

Where Q : Discharge in cusecs.

A : Catchment area in Sq.Miles.

Dividing the discharge by suitable velocity, the area of waterway for the stream is determined. Then assuming suitable depth consistent with the H.F.L., net length of waterway is calculated. Safe margin between the H.F.L. and the bottom of deck slab is generally allowed.

The section for the trough of the aqueduct is so designed that the canal discharge could pass through it with suitable velocity say 3.05 m/Sec. (10' per second).

Total loss of head in such structures is the sum of loss at entry, loss at exit and frictional losses.

### 3.6 DESIGN OF CULVERTS

In cases where the C.A. of the nalla is less than 10 Sq.Kms. culverts are economical. The waterway of the stream is obtained as in the case of aqueducts described in the preceding para. In case of culverts however, the whole canal earthen section is taken over the bottom slabs of the culverts.

### 3.7 DESIGN OF H.P.CULVERTS

In case of nalla where the drainage area is below 2.56 Sq.Kms. the following formulae by Marryat given in the Maharashtra P.W.D. Hand Book are adopted:-

If 'X' be catchment area in acres.

a) for area upto 100 acres the waterway

would be  $\frac{X}{2.5}$  Sq.ft.

b) for area from 100 to 700 acres.

$$A = 0.225 X + 17.5$$

Designs of various aqueducts are finalised in details in case of Paithan Left Bank Canal now under construction. Losses of heads arrived at in these cases are adopted in present case also.

4.0 BRIDGES

The proposed canals cross the State Highways, M.D.Rs, O.D.Rs and village Cart Tracks at various places. To allow the traffic on these roads uninterrupted, bridges to the standards of the roads are proposed at the crossings. In addition to these crossings, crossings to allow the traffic of cattle, carts etc. from the villages on one side of the canal to the other side are also provided. It is generally seen that atleast one bridge in every mile of canal length is proposed. In case of Majalgaon Right Bank Canal provision for Parli-Parbhani railway crossings is also made.

Loss of head in case of such bridges has been worked out to be 0.015 Cms. on the basis of designs for Paithan Left Bank Canal.

5.0 CROSS REGULATORS. ESCAPES AND S.W.F.

In order to control the flow in the main canal especially near zones of heavy embankment, cross regulators are provided on downstream of escapes in the main canal at following places :-

The standing wave flumes are proposed for measuring the canal discharges and for controlling the water flow in the distributaries. One standing wave flume at head is proposed for each canal.

## CHAPTER - VI

### MACHINERY AND LABOUR

#### I.O MACHINERY

The main items of construction in this Project are ( i ) Earthen Dam (ii) Masonry Dam (iii) Paithan Right Bank Canal and ( iv ) Majalgaon Right Bank Canal. The quantities for various items for which machinery will be required are given below :-

Major component of earth work will be carried out by heavy earth-moving machinery. Quarrying equipment, transportation equipment will be required for masonry dam. Similarly ancillary equipment for canal excavation and masonry works thereon will be necessary.

The entire construction is proposed to be done in a period of about 5 years. Based on the construction schedule and taking into consideration the outputs of various machineries, the requirement of the machineries are worked out as detailed in Appendix No. 6.1. This machinery will be available partly from Central Pool of machinery and balance purchased for this Project.

#### 2.40 LABOUR

Labour of various classes will be required for construction of dam and canal works. Important classes are as under :-

- (1) Operators for Tractors, Scrapers, Shovels etc.
- (2) Mechanics and fitters for maintenance and repairs of various types of Machinery.
- (3) Skilled labour such as masons, Carpenters Blacksmiths etc.
- (4) Unskilled labour.

In view of the formation of central pool for heavy earth-moving machinery trained Operators, Fitters and Mechanics are available with that Organisation who have ample experience on similar works on other Projects.

Skilled labour such as Masons, Carpenters etc. are available from nearby cities and towns.

Unskilled labour required for dam, canal and distribution system is available from the surrounding area. During the scarcity relief works, it is observed

that the labour for such type of works is available in plenty.

Details of quantities of various items and labour units required for them have been given in Appendix No. 6.2 .

## CHAPTER - VII

### LAND ACQUISITION AND REHABILITATION

#### 1.0 SUBMERGENCE OF LAND

F.R.L. of Majalgaon reservoir is estimated to be R.L. 431.44 M. ( 1415.5 ft. ) . The submergence area is worked out to be 7982 Ha ( 19,620 Acres ) ( gross ) at F.R.L. 431.44 M. ( 1,415.5 ft. ). Out of this total area 7982 Ha ( 19,620 Acres ), culturable area to the extent of 7184 Ha ( 17,658 Acres ) owned by the cultivators would be submerged. The compensation towards the acquisition of this culturable area is proposed in the estimates. The land would be acquired well in time so as to allow the land owners to make arrangements for purchasing alternate land.

Fortunately neither important forests nor any big town is affected by the water spread of the reservoir . Regarding the acquisition of properties, the villages and structures which will be affected at M.W.L. + 1.2 M ( 4 Ft. ) vertical or 60 M ( 200 ft. ) horizontal whichever is less are proposed to be acquired. Accordingly 17 villages ( 2 Villages being deserted ) will have to be rehabilitated. All these villages are from the Majalgaon Taluka of Bhir District. The details of the villages alongwith the number of houses and population to be rehabilitated is given in Appendix 7.1. No major road or Railway are affected by the water spread of the reservoir. The provision towards the compensation of structures from the above villages is also made in the project estimate. The expenditure towards the acquisition of alternate plots for residential houses of the

affected persons, public amenities such as providing water supply to new gaonthans, Chawadis, Schools etc. would be provided at project cost. The provision towards those items is also made in the estimate.

2.0     REHABILITATION

In order to assure proper rehabilitation of project affected persons, Government of Maharashtra has appointed a separate Directorate for rehabilitation. The Collectors of the concerned Districts are appointed as Deputy Directors Rehabilitation ( Land ) while the Chief Executive officers of the concerned Zilla Parishad are appointed as Deputy Directors Rehabilitation ( Development ). These two officers are assisted by Special Land Acquisition Officers and Rehabilitation Officers for proper rehabilitation of the project affected persons.

A Resettlement Advisory Committee consisting of non-official members from the affected area and concerned officers is also formed to advise Government for taking necessary steps in connection with the proper rehabilitation of the persons.

3.0     LAND FOR CONSTRUCTION

In addition to the submergence area under Majalgaon reservoir, land for the construction of the head - works and canals will have to be acquired. It includes the land under seat of dam, borrow areas, quarries, colonies and area for construction of channels. This area is also included in the estimate. This acquisition will not likely to create any rehabilitation problem.

## CHAPTER - VIII

### ESTIMATES

#### 1.0 GENERAL OUTLINE

The total cost of the whole project has been worked out on the basis of detailed estimates framed for various components. The cost of the project is worked out under two major heads:

- 1) Direct charges and
- 2) Indirect charges.

The direct charges are the total cost of various components which is required to be incurred for the construction of the project till its completion.

The indirect charges are worked out as capitalised amount for the land revenue to be lost due to the submergence of land.

#### 2.0 DIRECT CHARGES

The total expenditure of direct charges for the project is again sub divided into four parts, I - Works, II - Establishment, III - Ordinary Tools and Plant and IV - Suspense. Further the minor head, I - Works indicated above is again divided into three main sub heads namely I - Head Works, II - Main Canal and Branches, III - Distributaries.

2.01 The total expenditure required to be incurred for the construction of head works i.e. Earthen Dam, Masonry Dam and Canal Head Regulator etc. is incorporated under the Sub-Head I - Head Works.

The Sub-head II - Main Canal and branches, includes the expenditure of those components required for constructing the main canal and the branches thereof.

The cost of distribution system is incorporated under the sub head of III - Distributaries.

For facility of maintaining accounts as well as overall control on the total expenditure, the above sub head, namely, I - Head works, II - Main Canal and Branches and III - Distributaries are again sub-divided into Departmental sub heads.

The details of various components under these Departmental sub heads of I - Head works and II - Main Canal and Branches are given below. The cost of distributaries is however estimated on the basis of cost per acre of G.C.A. arrived at for the distribution system for the Stage I works for which detail estimates have been sanctioned. ( Vide statement No. 8.23 ).

The general abstract for the whole project including direct & indirect charges amounting to Rs. 7825.00 lakhs is given in statement No. 8.01.

The rates adopted for the estimates are based on the rates obtaining in the construction of Jayakwadi Project Stage-I during 1973-74 and are very realistic.

### 3.00 I - HEAD WORKS

The classified abstract amounting to Rs. 1825.00 in respect of Majalgaon Reservoir is given

in statement No. 8.02. The provision made under various sub heads is as under:

3.1     A - PRELIMINARY

The provision in this item includes the expenditure incurred for the survey and investigations for preparing the project. In addition to this, the amount required for further detailed surveys for preparing the designs, plans and estimates of various works is incorporated in this sub head. The provision is Rs. 16.50 lakhs roughly amounts 0.90 percent of the amount of works. The detailed estimate is incorporated in this report in statement 8.03.

3.02     B - LAND

This Departmental sub head includes the cost of lands to be acquired for the construction of dam, colonies as well as submergence area as far as I - Head works is concerned. It also includes the cost of structures, rehabilitation of villages including civic amenities to be provided in the alternate Gaonthans and revenue establishment required for this particular purpose. The provision under this sub-head is Rs. 517.06 lakhs. The detailed estimate is incorporated in this report in statement No.8.04

3.03     C - WORKS

Under this sub head the provision of following items has been made (1) Earthan Dam; ( Rs.554.25 lakhs ) (2) Masonry Dam with spillway including the cost of gates and bridge ( Rs. 497.58 lakhs )

(3) A low level causeway to facilitate the construction of dam ( Rs. 3.25 lakhs ). The total provision for these items as estimated work out to Rs. 1055.08. The abstracts are given in statement 8.05 (1) and 8.05 (ii)

3.04 D - REGULATOR

There will be only one Head Regulator for the Majalgaon Right Bank Canal. A lump sum provision of Rs. 35.00 lakhs has been made in this estimate on the basis of costs arrived at elsewhere.

3.5 K - BUILDING

For construction of the project residential and non residential buildings will have to be provided to house the supervisory staff during the construction period. Moreover after construction also there will be permanent staff for maintaining the irrigation system. The permanent buildings which will be required during the maintenance could be constructed and utilised for housing the supervisory staff during the construction. However as these permanent buildings will not be sufficient, additional temporary quarters and offices, are proposed to be constructed.

The total provision for these buildings is Rs. 63.50 lakhs. The details are given in statement no. 8.06 .

3.06 M - PLANT/TION

Lump sum provision of Rs. 5 lakhs is made for this sub head.

3.07 Q - MISCELLANEOUS

The provision of Rs. 38.70 lakhs has been made for the Miscellaneous items. The details are given in statement no. 8.07 .

3.08 P - MAINTENANCE

A provision of Rs. 12.00 lakhs has been allowed for maintaining the structures during the period of construction being about 0.65 percent of amount of works. The details are incorporated in this report in statement no. 8.08 .

3.09 Q - SPECIAL TOOLS AND PLANTS

A provision of Rs. 72.16 lakhs has been made under this sub head for purchase of rated and non-rated equipment. This however does not include the earth moving machinery required for the project . A Central pool for heavy earthmoving machinery is created by Govt. of Maharashtra under the control of Mechanical Organization. The work carried out by this organisation is charged on the basis of no profit no loss. The hire charges for various machines are finalised every year by Govt. on the above basis. This Central Pool machinery will be used on the construction work of this project and pertinent hire charges will be debited to the work. The provision in this sub head includes the machinery which is required in addition to the heavy machinery in the central pool. The details of such machinery are incorporated under statement No. 8.09.

3.10 R - COMMUNICATION

The provision under this sub head has been made amounting to Rs. 10.00 lakhs. This cost includes the quarry roads as well as approach roads to dam site from the State Highways Bhir - Aurangabad, Bhir Pandli and Bhir - Pimpalner Majalgaon road which at present are not in good condition for heavy traffic of the project.

4.00 II - MAIN CANAL AND BRANCHES

The estimates in respect of the two main canals, namely Paithan Right Bank Canal and Majalgaon Right Bank Canal are framed in details. The total costs of these canals are worked out to Rs. 2087.54 lakhs and Rs. 2892.18 lakhs respectively. The classified abstract is given at statement no. 8.10.

4.01 A - PRELIMINARY

Provision in this item includes the expenditure for the survey and investigations for preparing the project. Moreover, in addition to this the amount required for further detailed survey and estimates to prepare the designs and estimates of various works is incorporated in this sub head.

The provisions under this sub head for Paithan Right Bank Canal and Majalgaon Right Bank Canal are Rs. 15.70 lakhs and Rs. 18.70 lakhs respectively. It works out to about 0.7% of cost of works. The details are given in statement no. 8.11.

4.02 B - LANDS

This sub head includes the cost of land to be acquired for the Main Canal, borrow areas and colonies required along the main canal and special land acquisition establishment. The provisions for Paithan Right Bank Canal and Majalgaon Right Bank Canal are worked out to Rs. 114.10 lakhs and Rs. 148.00 lakhs respectively. The estimates are given in the statement no. 8.12 .

4.03 D - REGULATOR

Provision for Regulators at the heads of various distributaries taking off from main canal is made under this sub head. The standing wave flumes in the main canal are proposed to be provided for measuring the flow at various places. Similarly to control the canal flow, cross regulators are proposed at suitable places in the main canal. The total provisions under this sub head for Paithan Right Bank Canal and Majalgaon Right Bank Canal are Rs. 69.50 lakhs and Rs. 89.75 lakhs respectively. The estimates are given in statement no. 8.13

4.04 F - C.D.WORKS

The cost of cross drainage works namely aqueducts, culverts and hume pipe drains proposed on various rivers, nallas and streams coming across the main canal is incorporated in this sub head. The provision for various structures is based on the cost curves prepared for similar structures on Paithan Left Bank Canal which is at present under construction.

The cost curves for Aqueducts and culverts are appended in this report. The total estimated cost for these items for Paithan Right Bank Canal and Majalgaon Right Bank Canal are workedout to Rs. 373.50 lakhs and Rs.458.15 lakhs respectively. The details of these provisions are given in statement No. 8.14, 8.14 (i), 8.14 (ii), 8.14 (iii) and 8.14 (iv).

#### 4.05 G - BRIDGES

Various existing and proposed roads of different standards i.e. State Highway, M.D.R., O.D.R., and village roads cross the proposed Paithan Right Bank Canal and Majalgaon Right Bank Canal. In view of the facilities for easy transportation and communications systems, the provisions for bridges across the proposed canals on these roads are made in this sub head. Provisions for the Paithan Right Bank Canal and Majalgaon Right Bank Canal are workedout to Rs. 65.70 lakhs and Rs. 93.40lakhs respectively. The details are given in the statement no. 8.15 .

#### 4.06 H - ESCAPES

Escapes have been provided at suitable places along the main canals. The provisions of these escapes made under this sub head for Paithan Right Bank Canal and Majalgaon Right Bank Canal are Rs. 15.00 lakhs and Rs. 17.50 lakhs respectively. The details are furnished in statement no. 8.16

#### 4.07 K - BUILDINGS

The buildings will have to be provided for the

supervisory staff on the main canal during the construction period. After completion of the project also, there will be permanent staff for maintaining the irrigation system. The permanent buildings which will be required during the maintenance would be constructed and utilised during the construction period also. However as these permanent buildings would not be sufficient, additional temporary quarters and offices would be required. The total provisions of buildings for Paithan Right Bank Canal and Majalgaon Right Bank Canal are worked out to Rs. 99.30 lakhs and Rs. 160.40 lakhs respectively. The details are given in the statement no. 8.17.

#### **4.08    L - EARTHWORK**

The alignment of Paithan Right Bank Canal as well as major portion of Majalgaon Right Bank Canal is surveyed in detail. The cost of earthwork as well as lining of the canals has been worked out and given in the statement No. 8.18. The provisions for Paithan Right Bank Canal and Majalgaon Right Bank Canal under this sub head have been worked out to Rs. 1061.33 lakhs and Rs. 1556.27 lakhs respectively. Typical estimate for a reach of canal is enclosed at statement no. 8.19.

#### **4.09    M - PLANTATION**

A provision of Rs. 10 lakhs has been made for the plantation proposed along the main canal and the colonies along the canal. This includes provision for both the main canals.

4.10 O - MISCELLANEOUS

A provision of Rs. 108.10 and Rs.146.90 lakhs has been made for Paithan Right Bank Canal and Majalgaon Right Bank Canal respectively for miscellaneous items.

The details of this item are given in the statement no. 8.20 .

4.11 P - MAINTENANCE

A provision of Rs. 19.40 and 25.35 for Paithan Right Bank Canal and Majalgaon Right Bank Canal respectively has been allowed for maintaining the structures during the period of construction being about 0.8 percent of amount of works. The details are given in statement no. 8.21 .

4.12 Q - SPECIAL TOOLS AND PLANT

A provision of Rs. 133.30 and 164.30 for Paithan Right Bank Canal and Majalgaon Right Bank Canal respectively has been made towards the purchase of special tools and plants required for the construction of main canal. The details of equipment required for this purposes and the estimated cost are furnished in the statement no. 8.22 .

4.13 R - COMMUNICATIONS

As the communication system along the Paithan Right Bank Canal and Majalgaon Right Bank Canal is not developed, some approaches from the colonies to the work site will have to be constructed. Lumpsum provision of Rs. 10.0 lakhs each are kept for such approach roads as well as quarry roads for Paithan Right Bank Canal and Majalgaon Right Bank Canal.

5.00 ESTABLISHMENT

The charges towards establishment amounting to Rs.460.60 lakhs are workedout at 7.5% of the cost of works. This includes the establishment for construction works, audit charges, pensionary charges etc.

6.00 ORDINARY T&P

A provision of Rs. 112.20 lakhs is made towards ordinary tools and plants at 1.5% of the total cost of works as per experience on the other projects.

7.00 SUSPENSE - LOSSES ON STOCK

A provision of Rs. 37.40 lakhs has been made to meet the losses on stock. It is 0.5% of the total cost of the work.

8.00 RECEIPTS AND RECOVERIES

About 75% of the cost on special T&P in respect of rated items and the salvage value in respect of the ordinary T&P arrived at 25% of its original cost are expected to be returned back. Similarly salvage value of about 15% of the cost of temporary bildings is also expected to be received back after the construction is over. The details of such receipts and recoveries expected are workedout to Rs.371.15 lakhs and are given in statement no. 8.24.

9.00 INDIRECT CHARGES

The indirect charges would be due to loss of revenue from the land that would be submerged and acquired for construction purposes. The capitalised value on the basis of this annual revenue loss workedout to be Rs.11.29 lakhs is taken to be indirect charges and added into the cost of project. The details are given in statement no. 8.25.

## CHAPTER - IX

### CONSTRUCTION PROGRAMME AND ORGANISATION

1.0 . While finalising the construction programme it is to be borne in mind that Stage-II consists of three main components : (i) Paithan Right Bank Canal (ii) Majalgaon Dam - (iii) Majalgaon Right Bank Canal which can be taken up and progressed simultaneously. Following objectives have to be achieved in scheduling these three components (a) By the time the work of Paithan Right Bank Canal is completed, Majalgaon Reservoir should be completed so as to receive the flows of Godavari through Paithan Right Bank Canal - (b) the work of Majalgaon Right Bank Canal alongwith the distribution system should be in readiness for utilising the flows available from Paithan storage and utilisable storage of ungated reservoir at Majalgaon and run of the Sindphana river (c) By the time crest gates are fixed at Majalgaon Dam, the remaining canal system should be ready. Regarding the Paithan Right Bank Canal the work of excavation in the deep cuts has already been taken up during the scarcity relief programme of 1971-72 and 1972-73. In view of the availability of storage by 1976 at Paithan reservoir the completion of Paithan Right Bank Canal with the distribution system has to be proposed on top priority so that the available storage at Paithan could be utilised immediately. On the basis of above consideration , the construction programme is finalised. Paithan Right Bank Canal would be taken up by January 1974 and completed by June 1978. The work of Majalgaon dam and Majalgaon Right Bank Canal would also be taken up by January 1974 and completed by June 1978 and June 1980 respectively.

1.1 PAITHAN RIGHT BANK CANAL.

The total length of the Paithan Right Bank Canal is 132.65 Kms. Under this canal the distribution system is to be provided for 41,682 Ha ( 1,03,000 acres ) . Yearwise programme of expenditure for the canal is given in statement No. 9.1. Main canal including C.D.-Works etc. for the whole length is planned to be completed by June 1978 when Majalgaon dam would be ready for receiving the water from Paithan reservoir. It is planned to complete the distribution system for 20,000 Ha by June 1978 and additional balance 21,682 Ha by June 1980.

1.2 MAJALGAON DAM:

The total earthwork of Majalgaon dam is 71.30 lakhs Cu.m. The work will be taken up during J~~a~~ June 1974 and is proposed to be completed by June 1978. The annual earth work programme will be 25.20 Lakhs Cu.m. , 24.40 lakhs Cu.m., 29.30 lakhs Cu.m. 2020 lakhs Cu.m. prospectively Cu.m. The details are given in Appendix No. 9.2 .

The execution of the masonry dam as well as excavation of tail channel is interlinked with the construction of earth dam in the river gorge. During 1976-77 the gorge filling is expected to be over. Thus the masonry dam level will be maintained at R.L. 420.000 in this year. During 1977-78 the work upto crest of Ogee will be finished completion of piers, deck slabs and erection of gates is planned during 1978-79 and 1979-80. Thus it is proposed to complete the whole of the masonry dam in  $6\frac{1}{2}$  working seasons. The physical programme of the Earthen dam and masonry dam work is given in Statement No. 9.2.

The expenditure programme of all the items of Majalgaon dam is given in Appendix No. 9.3 .

### 1.3 MAJALGAON RIGHT BANK CANAL

The total length of the Majalgaon Right Bank Canal is 165 Kms. It covers the command area of 93,885 Ha ( 2,32,000 Acres ). It is proposed to complete the main canal for a length of 90 Kms. including distribution system thereunder by June 1978 covering irrigable area of 53,000 Ha, so as to utilise the available flows from Majalgaon reservoir without gates and Paithan diversion flow. The balance canal and distribution system for - irrigable area of 40,885 Ha will be completed by next two years i.e. by June 1980. The expenditure programme proposed for Majalgaon Right Bank Canal including the distribution system is given in Appendix No. 9.4 .

### 2.0 PHASING OF TOTAL OUTLAY

The total annual expenditure programme of the whole project is given in Appendix No. 8.5. The annual expenditure increases from Rs. 163.35 lakhs to Rs. 2005.94 lakhs the maximum being 83.54% above the average. The present construction programme has been proposed keeping in view the quick utilisation of Paithan storage(which will be available by 1976) as early as possible.

The summary of the programme on the basis of expenditure for the important items is given below to give brief idea of construction sequences at a glance.

3.00 ORGANISATION:

The work in Stage-I of this Project is already in progress. Two Circles with 11 Divisions are at present engaged in this activity; one Circle incharge of Head-works, while the other for canal works. The work of Head Works is now in advanced stage - Earthen dam being completed except few appurtenant items, while masonry dam also completed to the extent of about 70%; and is scheduled to be completed

by June 1976. Thus the Organisation already established and experienced for the work of Stage-I will be available for Stage-II works. As a matter of fact, balance can be maintained between the reduction in the work-load of Stage-I and increasing work-load of Stage-II. This will avoid the unpleasant retrenchment of construction staff and equipment. It is expected that this work will require the following establishment at its peak. :-

In addition to this Civil Engineering establishment, one Mechanical Division with 5 Sub-Divisions will be necessary for handling the machinery.

The provision for the residential and non-residential buildings required for this Organisation is already made in the estimate in the Project. After completion of the Project also there will be some permanent staff for maintaining the irrigation system. The permanent buildings which will be required during the maintenance would be constructed and utilised during the construction period also. The balance requirement will be met with by constructing temporary buildings. For maintaining irrigation system of 1,35,567 Ha it is estimated that three Divisions with eleven Sub-Divisions and thirty one Sections will be required.

CHAPTER - X  
FINANCIAL FORECAST

1.0 DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

According to the construction programme given in Chapter 8, Paithan Right Bank Canal would be completed by end of June 1978. The distribution system of this canal would also be completed during year 1980. Since the storage of Paithan Dam would be built up by October 1976 actual Irrigation from Paithan Right Bank Canal would be started immediately as and when the distribution system is ready. The irrigation potential from Paithan Right Bank Canal according to construction programme would be built up as given below :-

Regarding Majalgaon Right Bank Canal as per construction programme the water will be available for irrigation immediately after the dam work is completed to the level of crest of ogee. Through the full storage capacity of Majalgaon Reservoir will not be available at this stage, the water from Paithan Reservoir would be available through the Paithan Right Bank Canal. The balance water potential would be available when the gates of Majalgaon

Reservoir are erected. Thus the irrigation potential under Majalgaon Right Bank Canal would be built up as given below.

Though the irrigation potential would be created as indicated in the foregoing papers full development is assumed to be achieved within 10 years at the rate given below.

The development programme for the whole scheme on the above basis with cropwise break up is given in Appendix No. 10.1.

3.0      GROSS AND NET REVENUE

3.1      GROSS REVENUE

On the basis of above water rates the revenue which would be available from the project is worked out in Appendix No. 10.2

3.2      NET REVENUE

The working expenses during the maintenance of the project are expected to be Rs. 12.5/Ha. The net revenue for each year after allowing the working expenses is given in the Appendix No. 10.3

4.0      BETTERMENT LEVY

Betterment levy is assessed at Rs. 500/- per acre and Rs. 150/- per acre for perennials and seasonals respectively. These charges are due for collection when in a particular year the area is ready for irrigation as a result of completion of distribution system. The cultivators are however allowed to pay these charges in 10 equal annual instalments. The instalments are worked out on the basis of compound interest at the rate of 5%. Ten equal annual deferred instalments for the compound interest at 5% are expected to be recovered as betterment levy. A statement showing the collection of betterment levy in conformity with the development programme is given in Appendix No. 10.4

The betterment levy that would be collected every year is adjusted by reducing the capital outlay of the project.

5.0      FINANCIAL FORECAST

On the basis of total expected expenditure of the project as per construction programme, and expected betterment levy and the revenue from the project, annual returns are worked out.

The details are given in Appendix No. 10.5 Accordingly the project pays interest of 2.06% after 10 years of completion.

The cost per hectare for the mixed crops is  
Rs. 5772.

6.0      BENEFIT COST RATIO

The benefit cost ratio for the Stage II of the project has been worked out as 2.55. The details are worked out with the help of Stage Agricultural Department and given in Appendix No. 10.6.

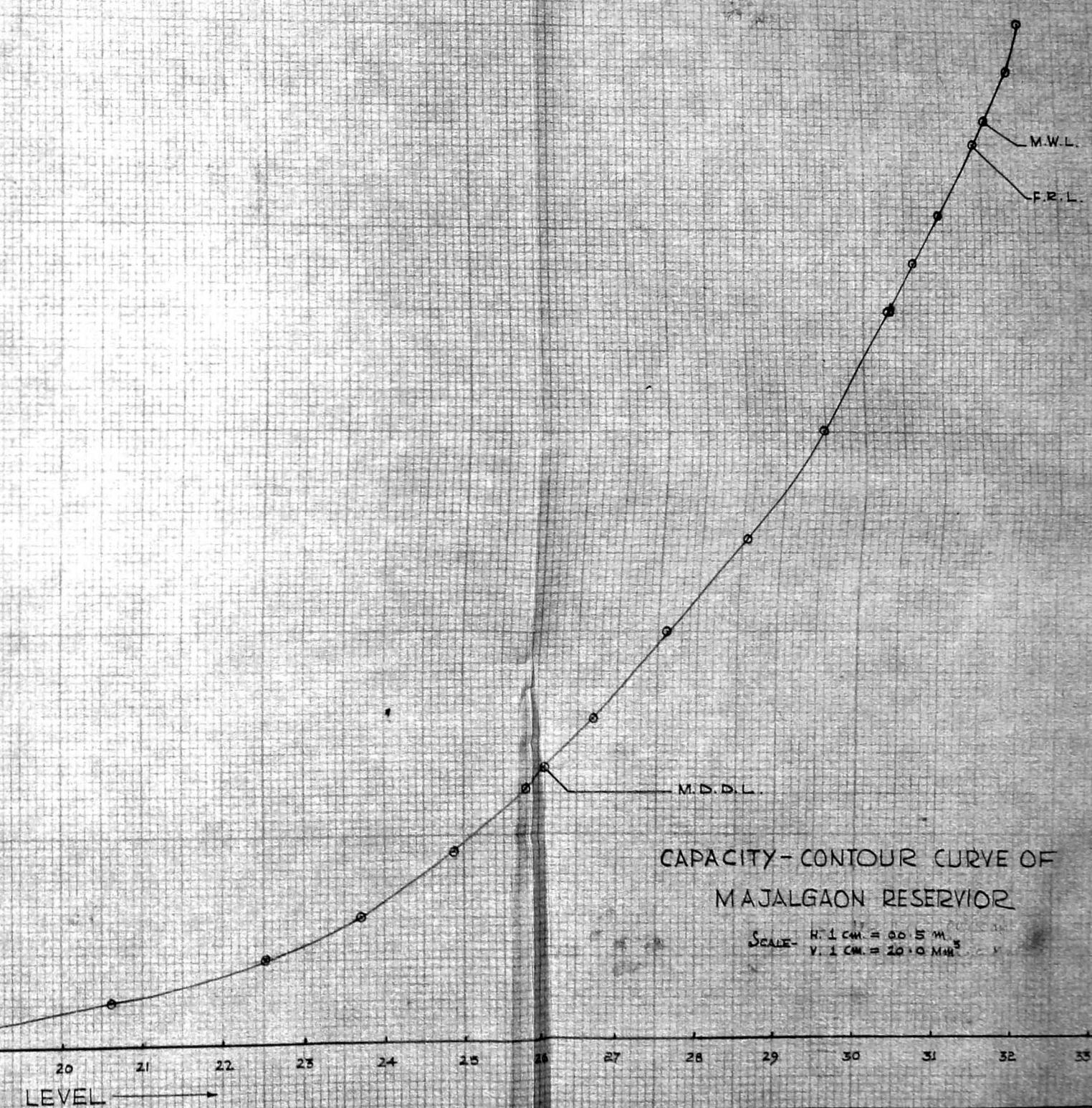

GEOLOGICAL NOTE ON JAYAKWADI PROJECT PHASE-I  
DAM ACROSS SINDPHANA RIVER NEAR MAJALGAON -  
BHIR DISTRICT : MAHARASHTRA

A B S T R A C T

The geological investigations for Jayakwadi Project Phase-I , across Sindphana river near Majalgaon village, Bhir District, Maharashtra, have been reviewed in the following paragraphs. The 110 feet high ( 33.528 m. ) earth dam with masonry spillway on the left bank is meant for irrigating parts of Bhir District. The country rock consists of mainly dark grey, massive to porphyritic fine-grained basalts, greyish green amygdaloidal basalts with red and green bole beds.

27 bore holes with a total footage of 930 feet - (283.46 m. ) have been logged. From the study of the surface and sub-surface geology, the general suitability of the dam site is indicated. The foundation grade in the masonry waste weir section has been indicated. It is recommended that the cut-off can be had on an impervious layer in the over-burden. The depth of the cut-off should be decided after conducting analysis of the physical properties of the samples.

INTRODUCTION

1. At the request of the Maharashtra Government and at the special request of the Executive Engineer, the Geological investigation of the Jayakwadi Project was taken up by us between the 17th and 18th of May 1963.
2. It is proposed to construct a 110' feet high (33.528 m.) earthen dam across the river Sindphana, a tributary to Godavari near Majalgaon ( $19^{\circ} - 9' : 76^{\circ} - 12' 12'' - 30''$ , 56 A/SW) Bhir District, Maharashtra, with a masonry spillway on the left bank. This forms phase-I of the proposed Jayakwadi Project across Godavari. This refers to item No. 5 on page 101 of the Field Season Programme of the Geological Survey of India for the year 1962-63.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

3. Our thanks are due to Sarvashri N.R. Cherekar, Executive Engineer and N.R. Joshi, Assistant Engineer for the help rendered to us in the furtherance of out-work.

ACCESSIBILITY:

4. The nearest railway Station is Jalna, which is about 98 miles (157.715 Kms.) from the dam site and is connected by a bitumen road upto Gevrai from where there is a metalled road to Majalgaon.

PHYSIOGRAPHY

5. The area presents a flat terrain. The general elevation of this place is about R.L. 1400 feet whereas the river bed elevation is R.L. 1315 feet. The area is covered by the low shrubs and thin vegetation. The major

drainage in this area is by the Sindphana river generally flows in a westerly direction but takes a northerly bend near Majalgaon and drains into the Godavari. The tributaries are flowing both from north and south.

#### GEOLOGY OF THE AREA

7. The area near the dam site comprises Deccan trap formation consisting mostly dark grey, massive porphyritic, fine-grained basalt, greyish green to reddish brown amygdaloidal basalt with red and green clay or bole beds.

8. The alignment of the dam at the place where it crosses the river in N  $75^{\circ} 30'$  W S  $75^{\circ} 30'$  E. The left bank of the river is gentler in slope than the right bank and the latter is covered by black cotton soil.

9. The flow in the river is close to the right bank. The depth of the water in the channel is 8 feet (2.435 m.) in the non-monsoon period.

10. On the left bank, 900 feet ( 274.3 m. ) down-stream of the dam, reddish brown amygdaloidal basalt is exposed. The thickness of this amygdaloidal basalt as measured is 37 feet ( 11.278 m. ) and is overlain by 14 feet ( 4.267 m. ) thick massive basalt.

11. The basalt is jointed and the major joint trends are as follows :-

12. On the left bank there is a thin soil cover of 1 to 2 feet ( 0.305 - 0.610 m. ) underlain by massive basalt whereas on the right bank it is of the order of 10 to 15 feet ( 3.040 to 4.560 m. ).

13. The waste weir is proposed on the left bank between Ch. 0.00 and 59.00. At this place dark grey massive basalt is exposed under a soil cover of 1 to 2 feet ( 0.305 to 0.610 m. ). The rock is usually fine-grained but occasionally porphyritic. It is slightly weathered and jointed. The massive basalt is underlain by amygdaloidal basalt.

14. Along the proposed tail channel, amygdaloidal basalts have been exposed.

15. There is considerable variation among the individual massive and amygdaloidal flows which grade imperceptably into ~~with~~ each other and as such it is difficult to trace the continuity of the flows.

#### SUBSURFACE EXPLORATIONS

16. 27 Bore holes of total running feet of 930 (283.46 m. ), drilled at the dam site were logged. The rock types encountered in the bore-holes are massive and amygdaloidal basalts.

17. From the study of the bore-hole data along the waste weir section, it is inferred that foundation grade rock will be met with at a depth of 4 to 7 feet ( 2.134 - 6.096 from the G.L. or between R.Ls. 1385 - 1407 ).

18. The 7 trial pits excavated along the waste weir

jointed massive basalt under a soil cover of 1 to 2 feet (0.305 to 0.610 m.) . In addition, 2 more trial pits (wells) have been dug, one in the colony site and the other near the Idgah, the logs of which are given below :-

CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

19. (a) It is proposed to construct a 110 feet high (32.53 m.) earth dam across Sindphana river, a tributary to Godavari, near Majalgaon, Bhir District, Maharashtra, as phase-I of the Jayakwadi Project.

(b) The rocks that are exposed at the dam-site are dark grey, massive, fine-grained, to porphyritic basalt, reddish brown to greyish green amygdaloidal basalts with infillings of secondary minerals.

(c) From the investigations conducted, the Project site is suitable for the proposed dam.

(d) Along the proposed waste weir section on the left bank under a soil cover of 1 to 2' feet ( 0.305 to 0.610 m.) weathered jointed, massive, fine-grained to porphyritic basalt is encountered in the trial pits. As the height of the structure over the ground level will range between 2 to 5 feet ( 0.610 m 1.5 m. )• The foundation grade in this reach may be between 4 to 7 feet ( 2.134 - 7.096 m. ) or between R.Ls. 1398 and 1408. As the rocks are weathered and soft, it would be necessary to provide a masonry or concrete blanket to prevent erosion in the rear of the weir.

(e) In the earth section excepting the river channel, the overburden consists of soil and alluvium. Depth to cut-off can only be determined after determining the permeability characteristics.

(f) In the river bed a positive cut-off is recommended, the depth of which may be about 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> feet ( 9.12 m. ) below the bed level.

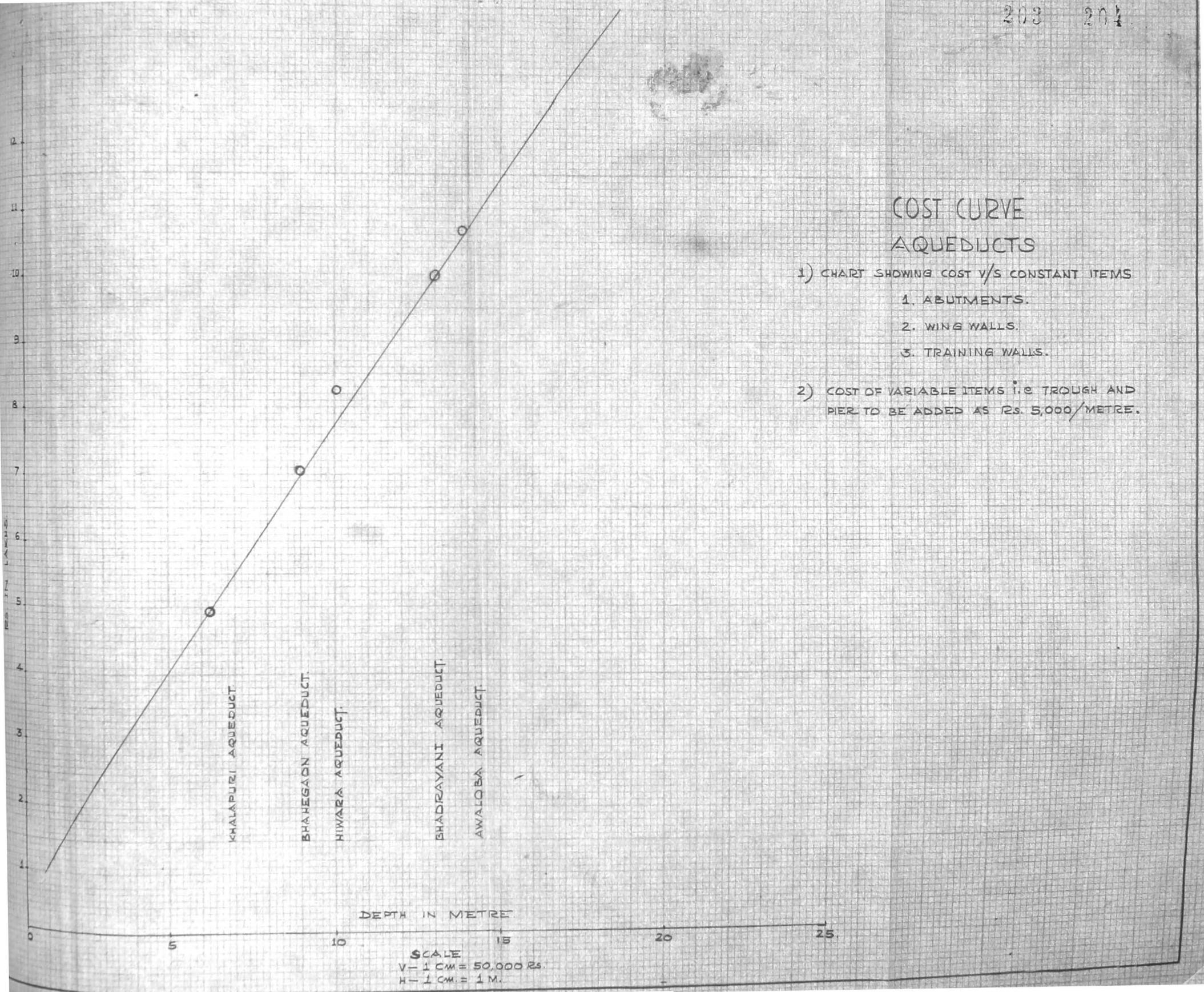

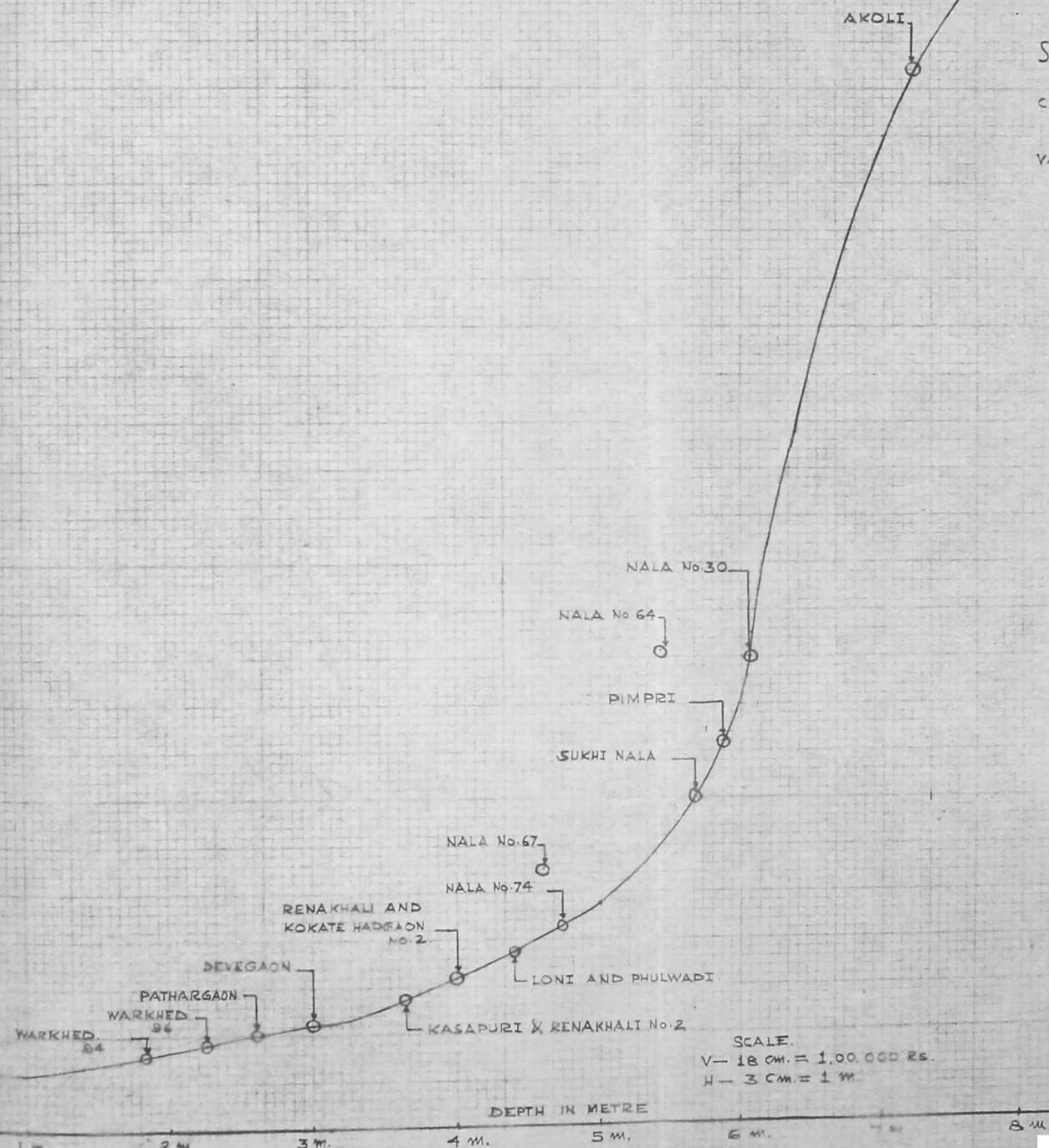

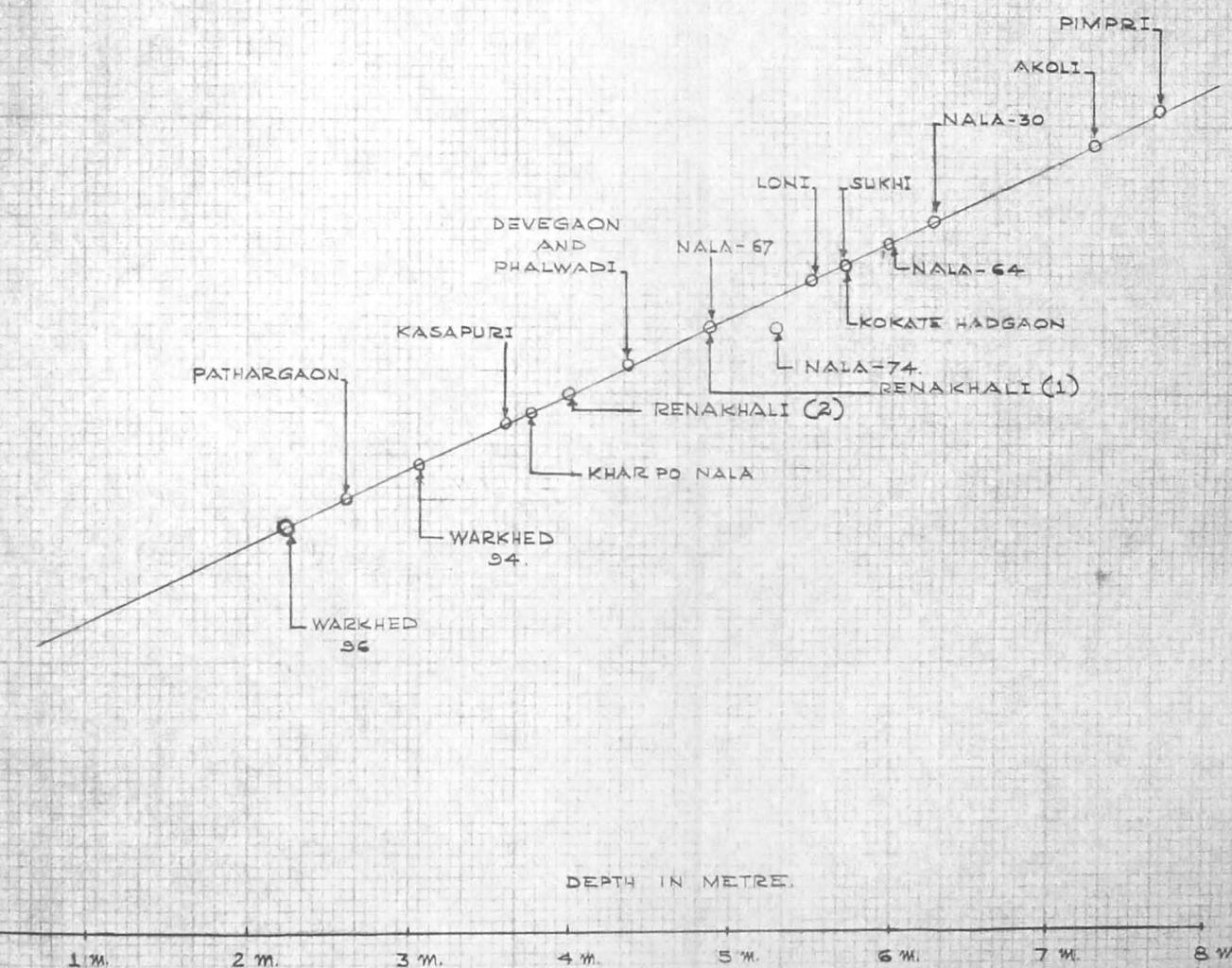

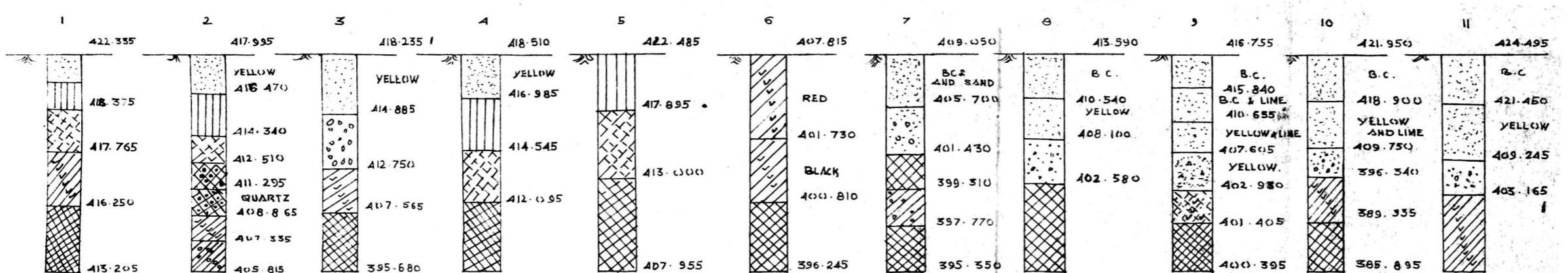
