

## BIBLIOGRAPHY

THERE is as yet no collected edition of Marx's writings; the following, in chronological order, is a list of his principal works: *The Holy Family* (1845) (with Engels); *The Misery of Philosophy* (1847); *The Communist Manifesto* (1848) (with Engels); *The Eighteenth Brumaire* (1852); *Palmerston, what has he done?* (1855); *Critique of Political Economy* (1859); *Herr Vogt* (1860); *Capital*, Vol. I (1867) (the sole volume published in Marx's lifetime; Vols. II and III were published after his death by Engels); *Letters on the Gotha Programme* (1875); *The Civil War in France* (1891); *Class-Struggles in France; 1848-50* (1895); *Revolution and Counter Revolution* (1896); *The Eastern Question* (1897); *Wages, Labour and Capital* (1908); *Value, Price and Profit* (1908).

Material of great value will be found in two German collections: (1) *Aus dem literarischen Nachlass von Karl Marx und Fr. Engels*, 1841-50, ed. Mehring, 2 vols.; (2) *Der Briefwechsel Zwischen Fr. Engels und Karl Marx*, ed. Bebel and Bernstein, 4 vols. The standard life of Marx is by F. Mehring (Berlin, 1915); in English the best biography is that of M. Beer. Fr. Tönnies, *Marx, Leben und Lehre*, 1921, is also good. Two useful bibliographies are by Drahn-Marx-Bibliographis. Vol. I, *Leben und Schriften* (1923) (Vol. II has not yet been published). An admirable critical edition of the *Communist Manifesto* has been published, with an historical introduction, by Charles Andler (Paris, Fr. Rieder). A complete French translation of all Marx's works, to be contained in 32 volumes, was begun in 1924.
