

AVERAGE PRICE AT PIT'S MOUTH


(per ton)



PRODUCTION, EXPORTS AND IMPORTS OF COAL FROM 1936 TO 1945.


PRODUCTION

Indian Coal Statistics, 1945.

PART I.—REPORT.

1.—SCOPE AND SOURCES OF THE STATISTICS.

THE statistical tables embodied in this report show in detail the available statistics relating to India's coal production, imports, exports, consumption, prices, and freights, and also the capital and labour employed in the coal-mining industry in India. The report generally deals with the coal industry up to the end of the year 1945, but in some cases later information is also given.

Returns of production in the case of mines under the Indian Mines Act, IV of 1923, are sent direct by the managing agents of mines to the Chief Inspector of Mines who forwards them to this Department. The Director, Geological Survey of India, supplements them by the returns sent to him by Provincial Governments and Political Officers in respect of Indian States; in the case of the Bikaner State the information is received by him direct from the Durbar. In the case of mines outside the Mines Act, Provincial Governments obtain returns from District Officers, who collect statistics from the mine-owners. Information regarding the imports and exports of coal has been taken from the sea-borne trade returns furnished by the Collectors of Customs. Data relating to consumption of coal have been specially obtained from the Railway Board, the Indian Jute Mills Association, the Steamship Companies, the Port Trusts, and certain mills and factory owners. Information relating to foreign countries has been specially obtained from the Statistics Branch, Ministry of Fuel and Power, United Kingdom, London, and from the Principal Collector, H. M. Customs, Ceylon. Unless otherwise stated, the ton referred to in this report is the English statute ton of 2,240 lbs.

2.—COAL PRODUCTION.

The quantity of coal produced in each province in India from 1878 to 1945 is given in Table 1 (pages 16-17) in Part II. The total production in 1945 amounted to 29,167,162 tons, that is, 3,040,476 tons or 11·6 per cent more than in 1944. To this may be added about 800,000 tons roughly estimated to have been taken out from the mines by miners for their own use. The total production in 1945 would thus come to about 29,967,000 tons, but for purposes of comparison the figure 29,167,000 tons should be adopted. There was a general increase in the output of coal during the year under review, the increase being chiefly in the Jharia fields in Bihar, the Raniganj fields in Bihar and Bengal, in the field in the Korea State under the Eastern States Agency, the Kothagundium and Sasti fields in the Hyderabad States and in the fields of the Rewah State. There was however some decrease in the fields of Yeotmal and Pench Valley in the Central Provinces.

Coal-fields.

The coal-fields which have been worked in recent years are classified below with the quantity produced in 1945, according as they belong geologically

to the Gondwana system of strata, chiefly composed of sandstones and shales deposited in fresh water and by rivers, or to Tertiary (or Cretaceous) beds :—

It will be seen that about 98 per cent of Indian coal is obtained from the Gondwana coal-fields and a little over 2 per cent from Tertiary beds.

In Table 2 (pages 18-65) are shown the location of each mine, the names (so far as it has been possible to ascertain) of the owners or proprietors, and the output during the last three years.

3.—COAL PRICES.

The value of coal produced in India is reported annually by mine-owners. It represents the actual or estimated wholesale price of coal at the pit's mouth. The average value per ton of coal produced in each province and State in India from 1936 is given in Table 4 (page 67). The average pit's mouth value per ton for India, as a whole, was Rs. 11.4 in the year under report, as against Rs. 10.7 in 1944. During the year under review there was a heavy demand for coal in order to meet the increased needs resulting from the war situation. The prices, as fixed by the Coal Control Board, remained steady during the year. Labour shortage was not as acute as in the preceding year. The concessions offered to labours under the Young Plan continued to operate. Prices of essential materials, machinery and plant remained high and were not available to the extent required. The wagon position did not show any appreciable improvement. Foodgrains, cloth and consumer goods continued to be supplied by the Joint Food Supply Pool operating under the auspices of the Indian Colliery Owners' Association and Indian Mining Federation. The table below compares the average value at the pit's mouth of Indian coal with the declared export value per ton in each of the last five years. The total estimated value at the pit's mouth of the output in 1945 was Rs. 32.81 lakhs, as compared with Rs. 27.24 lakhs in 1944:—

The comparative average prices per ton of Bengal coal (Desherghur) at Calcutta, of Indian, Welsh and Natal coal at Bombay and Karachi, from 1937 to 1946, are shown in Table 5 (page 68) as far as available.

4.—FREIGHTS.

In order to arrive at comparative prices of Bengal coal at the principal industrial centres of India, the freight has to be added to the f.o.r. prices. The table below shows the rates of freight (including terminal charges) per ton of coal by rail for full wagon loads at owners' risk (owners to load and unload) from the Raniganj and Jharia fields in 1944 and 1945 :—

From the 1st October, 1944 a Coal Production Fund Cess Charge of Re. 1-4 per ton and from the 1st December, 1944 a Labour Department Central Cess of 6 annas and 2½ pies per ton are also leviable in addition to these rates.

5.—PERSONS EMPLOYED IN THE COAL-MINING INDUSTRY.

Table 6 (page 69) shows the average number of men, women and children employed daily in the coal mines in India from 1936. This number represents the "average daily attendance" during the year and is obtained by dividing the total number of individual attendance by the number of working days in each year. Coal-mining employs more labour than any other *mining* industry in India. In the year under review the average number of persons employed daily was 334,445, or 49,017 persons or 17·2 per cent more than that, *viz.*, 285,428 in 1944—the increase occurring mainly in the case of Bihar, Bengal, Central India (Rewah State), Hyderabad State and Eastern States Agency. Details by provinces for 1945 are given below :—

It will be seen from figures in Table 6 that female labour was employed underground in British India during 1945 which was permitted as a temporary war measure to augment coal raisings.

6.—OUTPUT PER HEAD EMPLOYED.

The *per capita* output of coal in India in 1945 is compared below with the results of the preceding four years. There has been a considerable decrease in *per capita* output during the year:—

The total number of coal cutting machines worked by electricity during the year was 232, as compared with 210 in 1944. Coal-cutting machines were in use in 76 mines, as in 1944. The total quantity of coal cut by coal-cutting machines was 2,393,979 tons. The number of coal mines using electrical energy during the year was 163 as compared with 153, in 1944. The aggregate horse-power of electrical plant used in these mines increased from 117,253 to 122,833 during the year, i.e., an increase of about 4·7 per cent. This increase was mainly due to the increased horse-power of the electrical plant in the coal mines in Bengal and Bihar. During the year electrical plant was installed and brought into use in twelve additional coal mines. Electrical plant was withdrawn from one coal mine, two coal mines were amalgamated and formed one mine.

The total number of deaths by accidents in coal mines during 1945 was 344 giving a death rate of 1·02 per 1,000 persons employed, as against the corresponding figure of 1·41 in 1944.

7.—IMPORTS AND EXPORTS OF COAL.

Imports.

The quantities of foreign coal imported into British India from the principal countries during the past fifty-five years are given in Table 7 (pages 70-71). In 1945, the imports of coal rose considerably in quantity from 423 tons to 1,157 tons and in value from Rs. 18,000 to 2,44,000 as compared with the preceding year. Madras with 74 per cent was the largest importer and was followed by Bombay which accounted for 26 per cent,

There were no imports into Sind while imports into Bengal were negligible. The principal suppliers during 1945 were the United States of America, the United Kingdom and Australia. There were no imports of coal no Government account in 1945 (*vide* Table 9, page 73).

Exports.

The total quantity of Indian coal (including coke) exported from British India and the share of each of the principal importing countries during the past fifty-five years are shown in Table 8 (page 72). Exports during the calendar year 1945, recorded a further decline as compared with the previous years, total shipments amounting to 54,000 tons only, as against 109,000 tons in 1944 and 264,000 tons in 1943. Almost the entire quantity of coal shipped from British India during 1945 was exported from Calcutta. The principal countries of final destination in order of importance in 1945 were Ceylon, the United Kingdom, Burma and British East Africa. There was no export of coal on Government account in 1945, as against 8,700 tons exported in the previous year (*vide* Table 9, page 73).

Shipments of bunker coal from Indian ports from 1936 to 1945 are shown in Table 10 (page 73).

The quantities of coal imported both on Government and private accounts from the principal supplying countries and entered for home consumption in Ceylon in each of the last ten years are given in Table 15 (pages 88-89). This table, therefore, illustrates the extent to which the requirements of that country were met from India as compared with other sources of supplies.

8.—COAL CONSUMPTION.

In Table 11 (page 74) is shown the quantity of coal (Indian and foreign) available for consumption in India, which is arrived at by adding imports (*minus* re-exports) to the total production and subtracting exports therefrom. Figures for Government stores and carry-over have not been taken into account in the calculation. In 1945 the figure relating to consumption in India stood at about 29,114,000 tons, as compared with 26,018,000 tons in 1944. On the basis of the above calculation, the estimated consumption of coal per head of population comes to .07 ton or 1.4 cwt. a year. (See also Table 3, page 66.)

In the statement appended below, an attempt has been made, as usual, to indicate the consumption of coal (Indian and foreign) by different industries during 1945 although, owing to the abnormal situation arising out of the war, the task has been rendered more difficult than ever. The figures stated below, which do not lay claim to a high degree of accuracy, should therefore be regarded as only approximate and very rough estimates under some of the heads :—

Consumption on railways.—Table 13 (page 76) shows the total quantity of Indian and foreign coal and of wood and oil fuel consumed on all the railways in India during the last eighteen years, as reported by the Railway Board. In 1945-46 the total consumption of coal amounted to about 11 million tons, or 36 per cent of the total production and with the exception of 1,955 tons, all were Indian coal. The quantity of wood consumed was 14,000 tons which may be taken as equivalent to about 6,000 tons of coal, taking $2\frac{1}{2}$ tons of wood as equivalent to one ton of coal. Wood was used chiefly on the South Indian Railway. Besides coal and wood, 97,000 tons of oil fuel were used on Indian Railways in 1945-46 which is roughly equivalent to 177,000 tons of coal, taking 0·55 ton of oil fuel as equal to 1 ton of coal. Oil fuel was used chiefly on the North Western Railway.

Consumption on Admiralty, Royal Indian Navy and Director of Sea Transport accounts.—The consumption in 1945 was reported to be 447,000 tons by the Chief Mining Engineer, Railway Board and the Principal Sea Transport Officer, India.

*Bunker coal.**—Statistics relating to the shipment of bunker coal, which have been obtained from the different Custom Houses, are shown in table No. 10 (page 73). The total shipments from British India in 1945 amounted to 574,000 tons. The details are:—Calcutta 320,000 tons, Bombay 174,000 tons, Karachi 52,000 tons and Madras 28,000 tons.

Cotton and jute mills.—Statistics of consumption in cotton mills have been obtained from the office of the Textile Commissioner, Bombay. For jute mills, the data were mainly furnished by the Indian Jute Mills Association.

Iron, steel and brass foundries (including engineering workshops).—The total reported figure comes to 2,782,000 tons. In the case of works which did not furnish returns, estimates have been made on the basis of the number of persons employed.

Steam Electric Utilities.—Statistics of consumption in Steam Electric Utilities have been obtained from the office of the Electrical Commissioner with the Govt. of India, Simla.

Port Trusts.—Statistics of consumption in the workshops, ferry steamers etc., at the principal ports have been obtained from the different Port authorities.

Inland steamers.—The total reported figure comes to 442,000 tons. There are some smaller companies from which no returns were received and whose consumption has been estimated.

Brick and tile manufacture.—The quantity of coal used in the brick and tile industry has been roughly estimated to be 1,818,000 tons.

Tea gardens.—Estimates have been framed on the basis of data furnished by most of the important tea companies. In many tea estates, wood is the only or chief fuel used.

Paper mills.—The consumption in 1945 was estimated at 327,000 tons on the basis of the reports furnished by millowners.

Consumption at collieries and wastage.—A little over 8½ per cent of the total production has been taken for consumption at collieries and wastage.

Balance available for consumption in other industries and for domestic consumption.—A considerable portion of the balance of about 3 million tons must also be debited to industrial consumption, for, besides the important classes of industries stated above, there are numerous other classes of establishments and factories which are worked by steam, the principal amongst which are cotton gins and presses, jute presses, flour and rice mills, oil mills, water works, tramway works, gold mines, sugar factories, gas works, breweries and distilleries, petroleum refineries, ice, mineral and aerated water factories, mints, municipal work-shops, stone works, woollen mills, mining works (other than coal), chemical works, dye works, indigo and lac factories, glass works and rope works. A certain amount of soft coke is used for domestic consumption and its use is now gaining popularity owing to the growing scarcity of wood fuel.

The total amount of capital employed in the coal-mining industry cannot be correctly stated, as reports relating to the capital employed by private individuals and syndicates are not available. There were 280 Joint-Stock Coal Companies at work in Bengal and Bihar on the 31st March, 1946. A list of these, together with the amount of their authorised, subscribed and paid-up capital and the debentures issued, is given in Table 14 (pages 77-87). The collieries worked by Joint-Stock Companies (including railway Companies) accounted for 78·1 per cent of the total output of the Bengal and Bihar coal-fields in 1945. Outside Bengal and Bihar there were only 27th Joint-Stock Companies at work during the year. Twenty-one of the Coal Companies at work on the 31st March, 1946, had a paid-up capital (exclusive of debentures) of more than Rs. 15,00,000 as shown below :—

There were seventeen others, each of which had a paid-up capital of Rs. 7,60,000 or above but less than Rs. 15,00,000.

Out of 55' coal companies mentioned in the Calcutta Stock and Share List* with an aggregate paid-up capital of Rs. 6,64 lakhs, 14 declared no dividends. One company gave a dividend of $47\frac{1}{2}$ per cent, one $42\frac{6}{7}$ per cent, two 40 per cent, one 36 per cent, one 35 per cent and two 30 per cent, while the remainder declared dividends ranging from $3\frac{3}{4}$ to 25 per cent.

10.—COMPARATIVE STATISTICS.

British Empire and Foreign countries.

Tables Nos. 16—20 (pages 90—97) give available statistics of the production, value, and consumption of coal, and the labour employed in the coal-mining industry in different parts of the British Empire and in principal

foreign countries for recent years. In 1945 the United States produced 565 million tons, Great Britain 183 million tons and Germany 35 million tons. The latest available figures of production in the other principal countries are as follows (in million tons) :—Russia (Union of Soviet Socialist Republics) 168 (in 1941), France 33 (in 1945), Japan 22 (in 1945), Belgium 16 (in 1945), India 29 (in 1945), Canada 13 (in 1945), and Australia 13 (in 1945). India's production is, therefore, the largest in British Empire excepting Great Britain.

As in the case of production, the consumption of coal in 1945 was highest in the United States (534 million tons), followed by Great Britain (177 million tons).

Although the United States produces the largest quantity of coal, the number of persons employed in the industry is the largest in Great Britain (709,000 in 1945), followed by the United States (456,000 in 1945), Germany (474,000 in 1937), India (334,000 in 1945), France (251,000 in 1945), Japan (198,000 in 1936) and Belgium (158,000 in 1945).

11.—STATISTICS RELATING TO THE PRESENT POSITION OF THE COAL INDUSTRY.

It may be convenient to bring together some of the statistics relating to the position of the coal industry in India.

Raisings of coal in British India, under the Indian Mines Act, and despatches from the mines in each month of the calendar year, 1946, are shown below with comparative figures for the three preceding years and the average of three years ending 1942 :—

12.—GENERAL:

* The total quantity of coal handled at the Port of Calcutta during the year 1945-46 amounted to 1,898,940 tons. Of this quantity 1,392,062 tons were shipped as cargo and 506,878 tons as bunkers by sea-going vessels. This includes 415,766 tons of coal shipped during the year for the use of Indian Railways. As compared with the last year, there was an increase of 215,619 tons in the shipment of cargo coal. Shipment of bunker coal showed an increase of 217,322 tons.

* The Indian Coal Grading Board granted shipment certificates for 1,392,980 tons during the year 1945-46, as against 1,158,093 tons during the previous year. The quality of export coal was satisfactory.

* The Soft Coke Cess Committee continued the work in the same line as in previous years. 565,756 tons of Soft Coke were despatched from the Bengal and Bihar Coal-Fields during the year 1945-46, as compared with 487,148 tons during the previous year.

The Coal Mines Stowing Board was constituted on the 1st November, 1939, under the Coal Mines Safety (Stowing) Act (No. XIX of 1939). The principal function of the Board is to administer the Coal Mines Stowing Fund, financed from the proceeds of an excise duty levied on all coal and coke raised and despatched from collieries in the whole of British India excepting the Punjab and Assam. The excise duty, which began to be collected from the 1st December, 1939, is levied at the rate of annas two per ton on coal and soft coke and at annas three per ton on hard coke. The Board is authorised to make grants from the Coal Mines Stowing Fund for the following purposes:—

(a) For stowing or other protective measures which are required to be undertaken by an order issued by the Mines Department under Section 9(3) of the Coal Mines Safety (Stowing) Act, (b) for any protective measures essential for the effective prevention of the spread of fire to, or the inundation by water of, any coal mine from an area adjacent to it, (c) for stowing operations voluntarily undertaken in the interests of safety, and (d) for research connected with safety in mines.

The Board has been carrying out since July 1940, large scale protective works in the Jharia and Karjore fire areas to prevent the spread of fires. These measures and various other protective works carried out in the Jharia and Ranigunge fields have resulted in saving several million tons of valuable coal from destruction. Assistance has been given since 1941-42 for stowing operations (a) voluntarily undertaken by collieries and (b) ordered under Section 9(3) of the Act. During 1944-45, 39 collieries received assistance for voluntary stowing and 3 for compulsory stowing—the total quantity of material stowed being 3,850,909 tons as compared with 3,081,546 in 1943-44.
