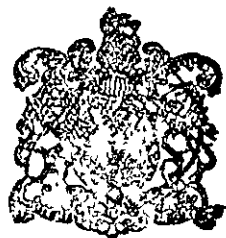

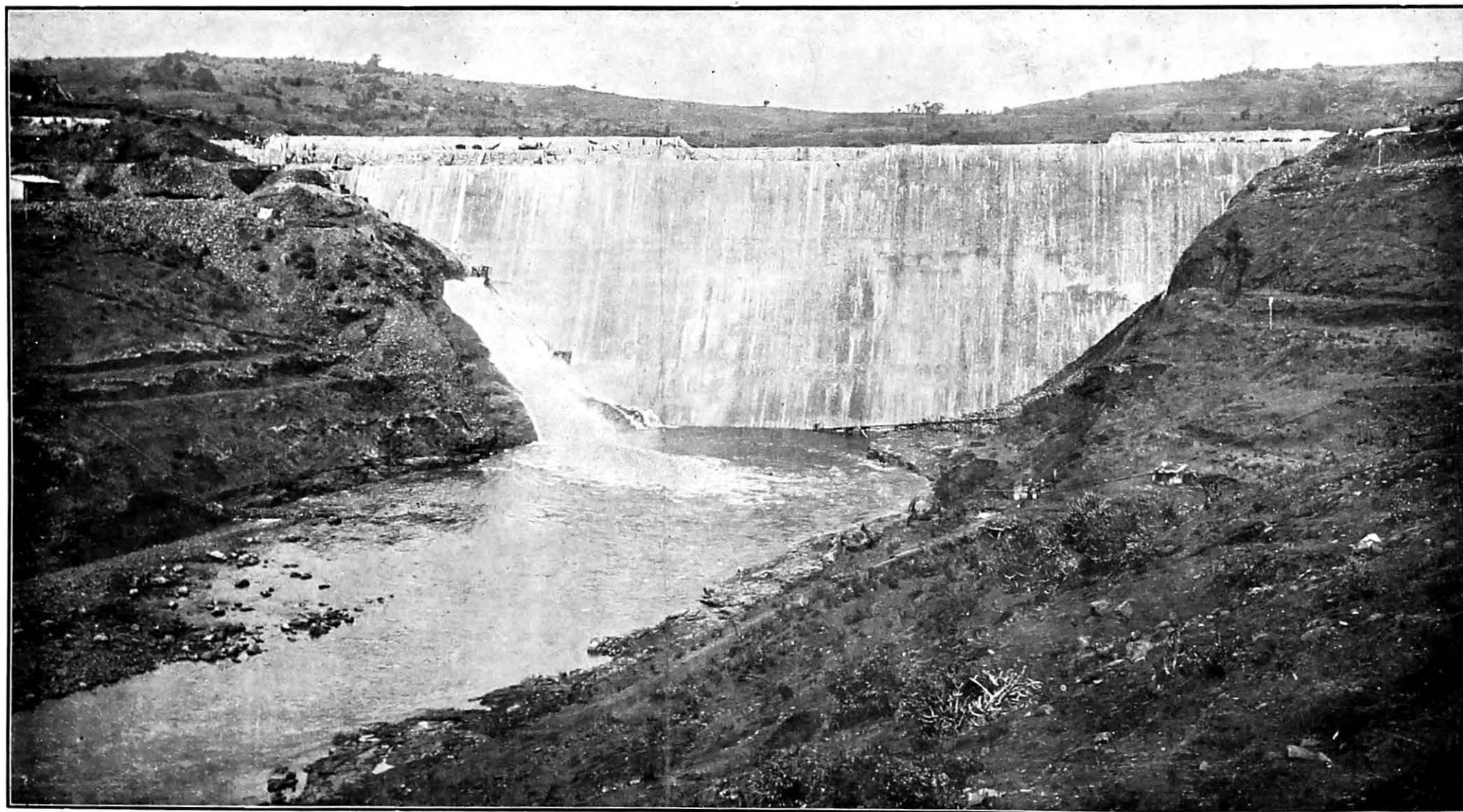

ADMINISTRATION REPORT

OF

IRRIGATION WORKS IN THE BOMBAY PRESIDENCY FOR 1919-20.

I—GENERAL.

A—DETAILS OF DIRECT EXPENDITURE.

In the year 1919-20 the direct expenditure (excluding collection charges) on all the Irrigation Works throughout the Presidency amounted to Rs. 100½ lakhs compared with Rs. 76 lakhs in the previous year, and Rs. 73 lakhs, the average of the last three years, the total is classified and divided between the Presidency proper and Sind as follows :—

C.—FIGURES FOR OTHER THAN CAPITAL WORKS.

5. These may be works for which only Revenue Accounts are kept, or works for which neither Capital nor Revenue Accounts are kept. The former are termed Second Class Irrigation Works in the Presidency (excluding Sind). The receipts on these works are principally in the form of a share of the Land Revenue and are termed "Indirect" and as such are book credits, so that figures of revenue appearing in the Finance Accounts, as distinguished from the Statistical Statements, accompanying the Irrigation Administration Report, are very small, being for direct revenue only, viz., proceeds from sale of water, etc. The area of irrigation on these very numerous works is always large,

but it fluctuates to some extent with the seasons. The following statements give a comparison of this year's and the average of the last three years' figures :—

D.—REVIEW OF IRRIGATION.

6. The conditions of cultivation in Sind are entirely different from those in the Deccan and Gujarát. In Sind the rainfall is usually negligible and the cultivation depends almost entirely on canal irrigation which is dependent on the inundation of the river Indus. Description of Irrigation.

7. The inundation of 1919 was excellent. The rainfall was irregular; it caused very great damage to crops where it was excessive, but proved to be beneficial to them where it was moderate. Inundation and rainfall in Sind.

8. In the Deccan and Gujarát the cultivation depends upon rainfall and the tanks and canals are useful for the purpose of growing more valuable crops or to counteract, if necessary, the evil effects of a deficient rainfall. The irrigation schemes in this part of the country involve the construction of storage reservoirs and are costly in comparison with those in Sind. The rainfall of the year was generally satisfactory and well distributed. Irrigation and rainfall in the Deccan and Gujarát.

9. The area irrigated in Sind during the year was nearly 3½ million acres as against 2½ million acres of the previous year and the gross revenue amounted to Rs. 86½ lakhs against Rs. 64½ lakhs of the previous year. Area irrigated and gross revenue.

10. The total area irrigated in the Deccan and Gujarát was over 4 lakhs of acres against 3½ lakhs of acres of the previous year and the gross revenue from all sources was about 24½ lakhs of rupees which showed an increase of nearly 7½ lakhs over that of the previous year.

II —SIND.

I—NATURE OF INUNDATION AND RAINFALL.

Character of the inundation.

11. The inundation of 1919 was one of the best on record, except that the river dropped rather suddenly early in September, and was in marked contrast to that of 1918, which was the lowest on record.

12. The river began to rise in the beginning of June and continued to do so, with slight fluctuations, till it reached the level of 13 feet at Bukkur on the 23rd July. This level was maintained for a period of 30 days while it was never reached in 1918. On the Kotri gauge the "fair irrigating level" of 17 feet was first registered on the 28th June. This level was maintained for 81 days as against 39 days in 1918, 73 days in 1917 and 66 days, the average of the previous 3 years.

13. The highest readings for the year were 14.7 feet on the Bukkur gauge on the 15th August, and 22.4 feet on the Kotri gauge on the 21st August, as compared with 11.8 feet and 19.5 feet on the Bukkur and Kotri gauges respectively in 1918, and the recorded maximum readings on these two gauges of 17.9 feet and 23.8 feet respectively.

Rainfall.

14. The rainfall for the year was irregular. It was moderate in some places, where it was beneficial to crops, while in others, such as the Karachi Canals District, it was very excessive and caused very great damage.

2—INDUS RIGHT BANK DIVISION.

(i)—WORKS FOR WHICH CAPITAL AND REVENUE ACCOUNTS ARE KEPT.

Desert Canal.

15. The Desert canal was opened on the 11th February 1919, over 3½ months earlier than usual, as the head of the channel leading to the original head of the canal was in a favourable condition and as there was a large demand for water for growing cattle fodder and the adhava crop. The head of the channel, however, silted up badly late in the season and the canal ceased to flow on the 13th October, which was much earlier than usual, with the result that the rabi water supply was very much less than that in the previous few years. The length of the channel from the river to the original mouth of the canal is now 16 miles.

16. The full supply gauge reading of 10 feet and over was obtained for 43 days, and the designed discharge for 63 days, which is exceptionally good. Had it not been for the sudden silting of the connecting channel the season would have been a record one for the canal. Even at the tail of the canal the normal full supply level was exceeded for many weeks which is unusual.

17. The continual increase in the area of rice and rabi cultivation on this canal denotes a marked appreciation of the good supply which, owing to a good system of regulation, is made excellent use of.

18. The Adiwah was opened on the 11th June with 3.1 feet on the gauge at the head and ceased to flow on 12th September.

19. Hitherto this high level canal has seldom worked well and, in order to improve the supply, its bed level was lowered during the previous working season, by 1 foot below its original bed, and the sill of the head regulator was also lowered by 1.44 feet. As this work proved very satisfactory and there was no sign of extra silting, the bed will be lowered still further.

20. Generally speaking, the supply was better and steadier than usual, and the land at the tail received a greatly improved supply, though the water level never reached the full supply level.

Unharwah.

21. The Unharwah was opened on 24th May and ceased to flow on 27th October. In the previous cold weather improvements were made to the feeder channel with the object of diverting the flow along the most favourable alignment, and the canal worked well during the whole season. The supply fell off somewhat in the last week of September and rotations had to be resorted to till the canal stopped flowing.

22. The full supply gauge reading of 10 feet was registered for 29 days and the designed discharge of 1,675 cusecs and over was obtained on 65 days. The construction of an inlet and outlet sluice in the bund compartment above the Tori stop gates proved most successful and this reservoir water proved to be of great use for rabi cultivation.

23. A few breaches occurred during the season but caused no damage to public or private property.

Begari Canal.

24. The Begari canal was opened on 25th May 1919 with an initial gauge reading of 3 feet and ceased to flow on 19th February 1920.

25. There was little demand for water in June, but full supply was maintained in July and August at all regulators. Rabi rotations were started on 15th September and full supply was given by rotations to the off-takes above the 6th and 19th mile regulators.

This level could not however be maintained at the 38th mile regulator and the Nurwah did not therefore get a good supply in September. Deficiency was, as usual, felt in the Eden and Sir canals owing to increased rice cultivation in the higher reaches.

26. Erosion of the banks occurred at miles 4/7 and 33/2 and steps were immediately taken to remedy this.

27. The favourable and late supply was, to a great extent, due to groyning work in the supply channel from the river to the old head regulator which was kept to a uniform bed-width by this means with the result that these miles were absolutely clear of silt.

28. The supply in the Choi branch was very good, even after the fall of the river in September. Improvements have been carried out in this branch which is gradually getting into better working order.

29. The Mahiwah was opened on 3rd June 1919 with all its branches and distributaries and worked very well throughout the season. Mahiwah.

30. The effect of the river cutting into the Gudu Dhand, mentioned in the last year's report, resulted in a very good supply at a higher level.

31. The combined effects of the above change and improvements recently made would have shown a marked increase in the area under cultivation, but, as a result of the last year's low inundation, the cultivators did not attempt to bring under cultivation large areas till it was too late. It is anticipated that many cultivators who have left the Deharwah area will gradually return to their old fields.

32. The Sehar Canal Remodelling Project has been sanctioned by the Government of India, but work cannot be commenced until a "close" contour survey is completed and the alignment of the branches is finally settled. Sehar Canal.

33. The Sukkur canal was opened on 4th June and worked very satisfactorily throughout the season. Sukkur Canal.

34. The Dhoro which supplies the Rahuja head of the Sukkur canal ceased flowing early in the previous season owing to the usual silting at the head of the "Dhand". A feeder channel running close to the "pucca" bank was cleared but not to sufficient depth and breadth with the result that extra water had to be given to the Rahuja head from the old downstream head of the Dhoro which was opened on 13th June. From this date onwards throughout the season the supply was very good.

35. The gauge at the Shikarpur road bridge (3/6 mile of the canal) read one foot above full supply level, i.e., 18 feet, for 20 days, the previous maximum admitted being 17.5 feet only. This improvement was the result of the recent raising and strengthening of the canal banks.

36. On the 16th August the embankment at the lower end of the old head of the canal was washed away owing to a sudden rise in the river and owing to the displacement of some of the needles in the old head regulator. The water at the Shikarpur road bridge rose to a level of over 20 feet for a few hours. No damage was, however, caused except a few breaches which were promptly closed.

37. Owing to the previous year's drought the canal was allowed to flow throughout the rabi season and was closed for repairs on 8th April 1920.

38. In the Kur Khairo and Kur Biro full supply was maintained throughout the season. There was a deficiency, however, at their tails, as usual, owing to their insufficient gradient, and also to the heavy draw-off in the upper reaches where the water courses have no masonry sluices. Steps are gradually being taken to remedy these defects.

39. The Ghar canal was opened on 10th May 1919, i.e., a fortnight earlier than usual, as there was a great demand for an early supply owing to the previous season's drought. Ghar Canal.

40. During the season the gauge at head rose to 12.7 feet, which was a record reading, the previous maximum being 12.6 feet. The gauge at Larkana registered 16.8 feet or half a foot higher than the previous record. The surplus water on this unregulated canal was allowed to escape through a cut on the left bank of the canal in mile 3/1 and was passed into forest and waste land.

41. The canal worked most satisfactorily and ceased to flow on the 9th January 1920.

42. Owing to the big bund constructed 3 years ago in the Ghar Dhand below the Ghar canal head the level of water in the canal has been very appreciably raised relative to the same readings on the Bukkur gauge. This bund has also caused the Ghar canal, in its upper reaches, to gradually scour out its bed and thus improve the supply with a lower river.

43. The Fordwah, a feeder to the Ghar canal entering at about the middle of its length, was opened on 28th May 1919 but had to be partially closed practically throughout the season, owing to the improvement in the supply entering the main canal.

44. The Ghar canal at the tail bifurcates into the Naurangwah and the Nurwah, which commenced flowing on the 12th May 1919. The maximum reading of the gauge at their heads was 13.10 feet which had not been recorded during the last 10 years. The Naurang ceased to flow on 2nd November and the Nurwah on 25th October.

45. The Nasrat ex Ghar, which was formerly a branch of the Ghar canal, now takes off from the Ghar Dhand. It was opened on 1st May and ceased to flow on 4th October 1919. The canal worked satisfactorily throughout. The cross regulator at the 9th mile was kept partially closed for the benefit of the high lands in the first 9 miles, and to save flooding at its tail. With a view to utilizing its surplus water, the canal is being extended to feed the Kurshah, a branch of the Ghar system, which suffers from chronic deficiency. This extension will also serve as an escape for the tails of the Mirwah and Hirawah and will protect the town of Mirokhan from being flooded.

Sattah Canal.

46. The Sattah canal takes off from the Sattah Naro which is fed direct from the river Indus on the left bank. This canal commenced flowing on the 23rd May 1919 and worked very well.

(ii) WORKS FOR WHICH ONLY REVENUE ACCOUNTS ARE KEPT.

47. The principal canals under this head are the Sind, Western Nara, Pritohard, Pinyari, Kalri and Baghar canals.

Sind Canal.

48. The old Sind canal, was opened on 20th May 1919. It worked satisfactorily and flowed with its full supply depth of 8.5 feet for 74 days. It ceased to flow on 12th September 1919 owing to silting at the head due to erosion in the river above it. The kharif and dry crops were good. Much land was flooded for rabi. Colonel Fife's channel also worked very satisfactorily. A full supply level of eleven feet was available for 73 days. The banks of the canal are gradually being strengthened to take a depth of 12.5 feet so as to make use of the available supply when required.

Western Nara.

49. The canal was opened on 1st May 1919 with the Bukkur gauge reading 6.4 feet. The regulator at its head was gradually opened to avoid any chance of breaches in the Mehar Sub-division and remained fully opened from 28th May to 20th July 1919 when the supply was regulated according to requirements. Only 11.5 feet to 12 feet of water was allowed at the head from 28th July to 11th August. After this date the full supply level, 12.8 feet was maintained upto 24th August when it was again cut off until the gauge registered 10.0 feet on the downstream side on 31st August 1919.

50. The canal worked most satisfactorily during the season and stopped flowing on 2nd January 1920 when the gauge at Bukkur recorded 1.1 foot. Improvements to the feeder to Gharo B costing Rs. 50,000 were undertaken and these contributed to a large extent to the satisfactory results. A large bund in the Fordwah Dhand, similar to the Bund constructed in recent years in the Ghar Dhand, rendered it possible to keep the Fordwah and Western Nara supplies separate. Surplus water from the Ford Dhand now enters the Gharo B by over-topping its sides instead of by means of the escape Dhand. Formerly the Fordwah back-water silted the Gharo B, but since the bund was constructed, Gharo B has scoured instead of silted and the Fordwah Dhand feeder is also working very well.

51. The New Feeder takes off from Kambrani Dhand ex river Indus and joins the Western Nara at mile 33/0. This Feeder was opened on 10th June to supplement the supply in the Western Nara, with a view to make up for the volume taken away by the Dhamrao canal. It remained wholly opened until 21st July, after which date the regulator was practically closed upto 12th September to avoid the danger of breaches, thereafter it was fully opened. The Feeder ceased to flow on 29th September 1919.

Pritohard Canal.

52. The Pritohard Canal, which is the second feeder of the Western Nara was opened on 22nd May and worked very satisfactorily. It began flowing with the gauge reading only 2.5 feet less than Bukkur. Owing to the excellent supply in the river the head regulator had to be partially closed on June 26th and was not again fully opened until September 17th, a period of 2 months and 21 days. During this time the maximum difference between the upstream and downstream gauges was 6.9 feet on 7th August, the gauge reading being 15.4 feet and 8.5 feet. The previous maximum gauge reading was 15.6 feet in 1908. There were several breaches above the regulator, on both sides which were allowed to act as escapes.

53. Erosion going on at Channa above the mouth produced a heavy deposit of silt in the canal to a depth of 4 to 5 feet which threatened to curtail the supply at the end of the season. Fortunately, the river remained high and the accumulated silt was scoured out.

54. The canal ceased to flow on 3rd December 1919 when the gauge at Bukkur recorded 2.4 feet.

55. The Pinyari canal is 67 miles long and is the chief source of supply in the Pinyari, Sujawal and Shahbunder Sub-divisions. It began to flow on the 6th February 1919. On the 15th of May there was 8 feet water at the head which was sufficient to allow of the opening of the Mahmudawah, the most important branch canal of the Pinyari. The usual rotations at Darro and Shorwah regulators were enforced while the Pinyari was flowing below full supply level. These rotations proved most beneficial.

56. The crops were excellent and abundant except in those areas which were flooded by the abnormal rains and also by flood water from the serious Belo Bund breach.

57. A head regulator for the Mahmudawah has been sanctioned and a project for cutting a new escape drain from the Gungro Chandan to the sea, so as to give a good tail to the whole of the Mahmudawah system, has also been sanctioned.

58. The Kalri canal takes off from the river on the right bank near Luka and runs south-west through the interior of Tatta Taluka and tails into the Mirpur Sakro Taluka.

59. The canal began flowing on 14th June 1919. The removal of two large bends last year resulted in a higher level of water at the tail. During the early part of the season, owing to the late rise of the river, there was some deficiency in the supply, but later on conditions were greatly improved.

60. The Baghar canal is one of the Deltaic mouths of the river Indus taking off from the right bank of the river near Tatta. It runs through the Baghar Sub-division and tails into the sea through the Sheikha creek. It began flowing as early as 1st April when Kotri read 10.2 feet, and ceased to flow on 10th November 1919.

61. The following are the principal works, under the head "works for which only revenue accounts are kept," which were either in progress or completed during the year under report:—

3.—INDUS LEFT BANK DIVISION.

(i) WORKS FOR WHICH CAPITAL AND REVENUE ACCOUNTS ARE KEPT.

62. The canals in the Left Bank Division fall under two groups, viz., (a) the Eastern Nara system and (b) canals taking off direct from the Indus.

63. Under (a) are the Nara River, the Jamrao, Mithrao, Khipro, Thar and Hiral canals all of which, except the Khipro which flows during the inundation only, are

semi-perennial. The Thar canal, though classed as perennial, is closed on or about the 1st December each year with a view to save the land under command from becoming water-logged.

64. Under (b) are the Dad, Nasrat, Fuleli, Hasanali and a large number of smaller canals. All these are classed as inundation canals though the Fuleli receives a fair supply in the rabi season.

(a) *The Eastern Nara System.*

Nara Supply
Channel

65. The Nara Supply Channel taking off from the river Indus on its left bank above Rohri is an artificial channel, 12 miles in length, forming the mouth of the Nara, an ancient course of the Indus. This channel is capable of carrying 20,000 cusecs during a high inundation, but when the discharge exceeds about 5,000 cusecs, water overtops the banks of the Nara below the tail of the Supply Channel and spreads upto the Flood Diversion Bund on the east and the hills on the west.

66. The head regulator of the Nara Supply Channel was kept fully open during the whole of the inundation season. The maximum water level during the year was recorded on the 16th August when it was 22.6 feet on the down stream of the head regulator and 27.2 feet at the 12th mile against 26.5 feet of last year. The Supply Channel worked well during the kharif season. In the rabi season it had silted up to some extent in December owing to active erosion just above its mouth. This combined with a deficient supply of seepage water caused some anxiety for some time regarding the supply to the Jamrao and Mithrao, but the situation steadily improved after December and the clearance of the channel became unnecessary. The necessary repairs, consisting of stone-pitching and groyning in miles 8 to 10, were carried out during the year. An expenditure of about half a lakh of rupees was incurred during the year on the Flood Diversion Bund bringing up the total expenditure on this work to nearly 4½ lakhs rupees.

The Nara

67. The length of the Nara from the end of the Nara Supply Channel to the Jamrao Head works is about 96 miles and from the Jamrao to the Thar weir about 100 miles. It commands over 500,000 acres of cultivable land. The area cultivated during the year on the Nara in the Eastern Nara District was about 64,500 acres as against 25,648 acres in 1918-19 and 34,386 acres, the average of the previous three years.

68. The Nara bed is in fairly good condition. Most of the silt deposited below the Makhi Regulator has been scoured away by the construction of an inner line of Bunds which are approaching completion. The Moorad and Bagdad Sang sluices were fully opened from 28th July to 15th September 1919 and a good quantity of water was thus stored in the Makhi Dhand which forms a reservoir for supplementing the rabi supply to the Mithrao. This storage proved most useful.

Jamrao Canal

69. The capital expenditure on the Jamrao canal during the year amounted to about Rs. 14,000 and was incurred mainly on (1) constructing a regulator at 73rd mile, (2) extending the Bhitaro Minor, (3) constructing a 2nd regulator on the Jamsahib Minor and (4) constructing a distributary near mile 113 of the Jamrao canal. The recoveries from colonists during the year amounted to Rs. 7,415. The canal and its minors were maintained in good order throughout the year.

70. The area cultivated during the year was about 284,000 acres as compared with 231,336 acres last year and 236,389 acres, the average of the previous three years. The area under cotton was about 128,000 acres as compared with 110,855 acres in the last year and 98,670 acres, the average of the previous triennium. Owing to inadequate supply in the rabi season a rotation of four days had to be adopted in December and continued till the end of the season. Wheat which was sown early was damaged by frost in February.

71. On this canal grants of new land to the extent of 8,479 acres were made to cultivators during the year.

Mithrao Canal.

72. In the beginning of the kharif season, the water supply in the Mithrao canal was insufficient from mile 9 to the tail, but the rainfall at the end of July and the judicious distribution of the supply available improved the situation considerably. The canal and its branches worked well on the whole, the only exception being the 30th mile Left Bank Distributary where, as usual, there was difficulty in supplying water to the tail karias.

73. Owing to the construction of the Makhi Left Bank Distributary, no supply was drawn from the first 9 miles of the left bank of the main canal. This distributary with its minor has proved a success but requires certain modifications which will be carried out in 1920-21.

74. The capital expenditure of the year amounted to nearly Rs. 39,000 and was incurred on completing the Makhi Distributaries Right and Left.

75. The area cultivated during the year under report was about 108,600 acres as compared with 106,379 acres in the last year and 116,741 acres, the average of the previous three years.

76. The Hiral canal was opened on 25th April and worked satisfactorily. Al- Hiral Canal. though the supply was good, rotations had to be resorted to with a view to maintain a proper distribution. Rice cultivation, temporarily allowed in the Hiral tract, still continues.

77. The cultivation during the year was about 16,400 acres as compared with 12,432 acres in the last year and 13,401 acres, the average of the previous three years.

78. The capital expenditure of the year was about Rs. 14,000 and was incurred on constructing the Head Distributary *ex* Hiral canal.

79. Grants of land to the extent of 1,841 acres were made to cultivators on this canal during the year under report.

80. The Thar canal with its branches worked fairly well during the year. The Thar Canal. canal was opened on 15th May and closed on 1st December. For the proper distribution of water rotations had to be resorted to at all the regulators.

81. The cultivation on the canal during the year was about 51,700 acres against 52,721 acres in the last year and 54,362 acres, the average of the previous three years.

82. The capital expenditure during the year was nearly Rs. 33,000 and was incurred in completing 3rd and 7th mile Distributaries. These distributaries proved a success on the whole though there is deficiency at the tail in both cases, to remedy which steps will have to be taken to regulate the supply by adjusting the sluices to ensure an equitable distribution.

83. The Khipro canal takes off the right bank of the Nara at mile 66. It was Khipro Canal. flowing from the 1st June to 4th October. As usual the supply was unsatisfactory.

84. The cultivation during the year was about 2,600 acres against 2,419 acres in the last year and 3,281 acres, the average of the previous three years.

(b) Canals taking off direct from the Indus.

85. The supply received by the Nasrat canal during the year under report was the Nasrat Canal. most satisfactory that has been obtained during the last 10 years. The Lundi Dhand gave cause for anxiety at the height of inundation when it began to silt in its first 17 takis, but the measures adopted to scour out the silt were successful. The groynes in the Dhand which had been damaged near the mouth, were thoroughly repaired during the year.

86. The banks of the Nasrat canal, which usually breach in miles 14 to 16, where the canal passes through Dhoros, were raised and strengthened during the year so that water can now be headed up safely up to 12' upstream of Lakha Regulator thereby relieving the pressure to a certain extent on the head regulator at a time when spill water enters the Lundi Dhand. The construction of a new head to Madad and Lundowahs was in progress. This work will convert a large area of lift land into flow and also bring most of the waste and fallow lands under cultivation.

87. The cultivation during the year on this canal was about 60,200 acres against 59,536 acres in the last year and 79,631 acres, the average cultivation of the three previous years.

88. The total expenditure on the construction of karias and kasis up to the end of the year on the canal amounted to about Rs. 2,89,000.

89. Grants of new land to the extent of 1,170 acres were made to cultivators on this canal during the year under report.

90. The Dad canal was opened on the 19th May and it had a very good supply Dad Canal. throughout the season. The usual flooding at the tail was stopped by opening an escape into the Yarowah and thence into the Ahbhar Kario. There was a deficiency in the tail of the Mubarakwah and also between miles 59 and 72 of the main canal. In the former case it was mainly due to the increase in the area of rice cultivation in the head reaches of that canal and masonry sluices are being gradually constructed to enable a fair distribution of water to be made. In the latter case the deficiency was due to the raising of the pavement of the 50th mile regulator and the construction of bed groynes. These defects will be totally removed when the Lower Dad Canal Remodelling Project is undertaken and completed.

91. The cultivation during the year on this canal was about 81,500 acres against 77,810 acres in the last year and 99,890 acres, the average of the three previous years.

92. The total expenditure on the construction of karias and kasis to the end of the year under report was about Rs. 1,32,600.

93. New land to the extent of 200 acres was allotted during the year.

94. The Ren Distributary which takes off from the Dad canal worked satisfactorily during the year under report. The total expenditure on this project to end of the year was Rs. 2,11,750, the outlay of the year being *minus* Rs. 2,069, which represents recoveries from colonists.

95. New land to the extent of 1,474 acres was allotted during the year on this canal.

Fuleli Canal.

96. The Fuleli canal and its branches worked satisfactorily. During the year the supply was very good but crops in the low lands suffered on account of heavy rainfall which caused flooding. The excess of water after the rain in July caused breaches in the Fuleli Escape which were closed by reducing the water level at the Alpur Regulator.

97. The Jamshora head gave no trouble. Owing to heavy rainfall in Badin Taluka and consequent flooding of water-logged areas, it was necessary to reduce the supply at the head regulator for many days in the season. Great difficulty is experienced in regulating the supply with the vertical needles which are quite unsuitable for this large regulator and to overcome this the construction of a new regulator with gates is under consideration. The head of the old Fuleli was in very good condition and the supply was on the whole satisfactory. The groynes constructed last year in the very wide section of the canal below Nareja Regulator prevented the bed from silting.

98. The cultivation on this canal during the year was about 380,000 acres against 361,448 acres in the last year and 397,683 acres, the average of the previous three years.

Hasanali Canal.

99. The main Hasanali canal worked satisfactorily, but the tail reach, which is an old and tortuous channel, suffered from deficiency. To remedy this, proposals for the regulation of the excessive discharge drawn by outlets in the upper reaches are under consideration. Owing to the construction last year of masonry sluices for the karias watering rice lands on the Rajwah branch the canal had a good supply at the tail and did not silt.

100. The area under cultivation during the year under report was about 20,000 acres against 17,361 acres cultivated in the last year and 18,733 acres, the average of the three previous years.

Canals in the
Hyderabad Canals
District.

101. All the canals in this District worked satisfactorily. There were very few breaches in the banks of the Great Marakh, and these that did occur were closed promptly. The Jakhri Dhand, which supplies the Sarfrazwah, was eroded by the river in the first half mile. The Great Marakh regulator was completed, the expenditure incurred thereon during the year being about Rs. 65,500. The construction of a regulator at the head of the Albahar Kacheri is also in progress and a sum of about 11,000 rupees was spent on it during the year.

102. The cultivation in the whole of the Hyderabad Canals District for the year was about 258,500 acres against 234,950 acres in the last year and 272,552 acres, the average of the previous three years.

(ii) WORKS FOR WHICH ONLY REVENUE ACCOUNTS ARE KEPT.

103. The principal canals under this head are Naulakhi, Mehrab and Dambhro in the Nasrat Canals District and Ren, Gharo Mahmudo, Kari Shumali and Nasir in the Hyderabad Canals District. With the exception of some of the branches of the Naulakhi, the supply in all the canals under this head in both the Districts was satisfactory.

4.—PROTECTIVE EMBANKMENTS.

104. In the southern (first) section of the Kashmor bund the flood water touched the whole of the front bund, 1896 loop, Tori Bund and Haibat loop upto mile 16/3, while in the second and third sections the flood water did not touch the bund at all.

105. In the month of June erosion took place above the Begari mouth, but the erosion stopped in the first week of July and left just the rear slope of the bund standing in mile 3/5. This section has since been eroded and the 1896 loop will therefore become the first line of defence. Attempts are being made to thoroughly wet the Ghospur loop by trench water.

106. Erosion also occurred at ordinates 4/6 to 5/7 but was not serious.

107. There were no breaches during the season.

108. The Haibat and Ghospur bunds were all wetted by the trench system. Unharwah loop was not wetted, as the bund in front of it was very strong.

109. Due to kalar soil, leaks in Ghospur wetting trench were innumerable.

110. All the bunds in the Shikarpur Canals District stood well throughout the Abkalani season. The trenching bund of the Bichanjee loop bund gave trouble and need further strengthening and more sand trenches at bad places. Erosion was fairly active again opposite Loi Regulator and this regulator and the Loi Bungalow are now in danger of being eroded away unless the river changes its course.

111. The River being far away, the bunds in the Ghar Canals District were not severely taxed; a few leaks occurred but were promptly stopped.

112. The Western Nara Bunds were raised and strengthened in certain lengths during the year at a cost of Rs. 6,619. During the year under report water touched the Bunds throughout almost their whole length, and there was great pressure of water at many places. Owing, however, to very careful patrolling and the great care taken the bund withstood the high pressure and no breaches occurred. Many leaks, however, occurred but they were immediately detected and closed. The good work done under very trying conditions during the Abkalam season on these bunds by the Executive Engineer, and by the Sub-divisional officers of the Labdaria, Pritchard and Dadu Sub-divisions was greatly appreciated and the cultivation protected was a record in quantity and quality.

113. In the Karachi Canals District the new Belo Loop, 8 miles long and of an average height of 18 feet, which had been completed on 31st May 1919 was breached on 27th July 1919. A length of 6 miles had been soaked, when the water level rose very rapidly against the whole length owing to the rapid rise of the river which caused a breach in the small emergency loop that had been constructed with a view to keeping out the river water during construction.

114. A length of two miles remained to be wetted when, owing to the breach in the emergency bund, an underground leak occurred which it was found impossible to locate. The bund collapsed suddenly over the site of the leak and a serious breach occurred. Owing to very heavy rains at this time, very cold violent winds, and to the scarcity of labour it was found impossible to prevent the breach from widening and all the available labour had to be used in preventing the remaining $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles of the bund from being eroded by wave action.

115. Over twenty serious leaks were successfully closed.

116. The water from the breach, together with the abnormal floods, due to the excessive rain which commenced on the 29th July, flooded a vast area in the Sujawal, Shahbunder and Jati Talukas. A great amount of kharif cultivation was destroyed but the flood water, when it subsided, enabled a good amount of extra rabi to be grown.

117. Erosion had been very active in mile $5\frac{7}{8}$ to $8\frac{1}{4}$ of the Baghar Uchito Bund on the right bank and near Belo on the left bank (mile 34 of the Mulchand Shah Bunder Bund). On account of the former an emergency loop has been constructed and a retired loop is under construction. The Belo Loop constructed last year has been completely repaired and is sufficiently retired for the present. In mile 19—20 of the Mulchand Shahbunder Bund, the shortest length of the ordinate on the 7th May 1919 was only 563 feet. A short loop between miles $18\frac{5}{8}$ and $19\frac{7}{8}$ is under construction.

118. In the Nasrat Canals District, the Naulakhi Bhorti Bund had water against it in the whole of its length of nine miles, the maximum depth being 4'6" at mile 2. The front loop of compartment No. 3 breached on 30th July, but the breach was promptly closed. Water also touched the whole length of 3 miles of Mikaro and Tirchi Bunds but both stood the pressure well. The river spilled over its left bank between Dambro and Dad Heads and flooded a large tract in Naushahro and Moro Talukas. Spill water also flooded the tract below Doulatpur and breached into and crossed the Suhagan and Hebert branches of the Dad canal. The consideration of the proposal to construct a spur bund to shut out spill water from this area, mentioned in last year's report, is postponed as the scheme is very costly and would be unnecessary when the new Dad branch in connection with the proposed Rohri Canal, is constructed.

119. The Ren bund in the Hyderabad Canals District stood well during the year under report.

120. The Hajipur bund in the Fuleli Canals District suffered from wave wash in the 3rd, 13th and 14th miles and repairs were carried out during the year where the slope was cut away by wave action. The Gidu Bund in this District was in danger of being eroded by the current of the river which was deflected by the construction of a stone groyne. This work, which was carried out in the height of inundation with very great difficulty, was a complete success.

5.—INDUS RIVER COMMISSIONS.

121. The expenditure on works and surveys was, as usual, charged to "43—Irriga- Indus River Com-
tion Minor Works and Navigation—Agricultural Works—Works for which neither mission Works and
Capital nor Revenue Accounts are kept." their classification.

122. The usual topographical surveys, aggregating 2,073 miles in length, of the Surveys of the
Indus, dhands, bunds, etc., were carried out. Besides this, the taluka boundaries in the Indus.
Larkana, Nawabshah, Hyderabad and Karachi Districts were also surveyed as far as
possible. The total length of the river course from Rojhan in the Punjab to the point
of its bifurcation was 541 miles. The whole of this length together with about 25 miles
of the Haidri river and 6 miles of the Ochito below the bifurcation point were surveyed
and plotted.

Khairpur Boundary rails.

123. The Khairpur Boundary rails were inspected as usual and a traverse survey of 38 miles was executed in connection with the refixing of some "Dhurries" which were pointed out by the state authorities through the Collector of Sukkur.

River gauges.

124. Gauge readings of the river were taken daily at 11 stations, twice a week at four stations and weekly at six stations. The maintenance of all these gauges is necessary for the purpose of fixing the High Flood Levels for the river embankments, for recording the changes in and level of supply at canal mouths and for observing any permanent change in the level of the river.

Scientific works and discharges of the Indus

125. Discharge and other special observations were continued at Sukkur and Kotri as usual. The results will be published in the Indus River Commission Records. The total monthly discharge at Sukkur during the inundation season and the minimum, maximum and average discharges of the year, compared with the results of the previous four years, are as follows:—

127. The large amount sanctioned for works in the Karachi Canals District was required for the construction of Marho and Thahimani Gulel Loops and raising and strengthening of the Mulchand Shahbunder and Baghar Uchito Bunds. In the Fuleli Canals District as the Gidu Bund was threatened with erosion, a stone groyne was constructed to divert the current and the bank was generally strengthened by pitching wherever it was necessary to do so.

Maintenance and repairs.

128. The total expenditure under this head on the several works under the direct control of the Indus River Commission was Rs. 13,148 of which Rs. 1,880 were spent on the river gauges establishment at Sukkur, Kotri, Jerruck and the Indus Delta.

129. The total expenditure incurred and accounted for by the Indus River Commission was :—

130. Heavy erosion occurred at mile 31/4 of Sukkur Begari Bund and mile 99/0 of Western Nara Bund, the maximum rate of erosion being 600 feet and 1,966 feet per week respectively. The erosion between miles 5/4 and 6/4 of Baghar Uchito Bund necessitated the construction of Marho and Thahimani Gulel Loops, the maximum rate of erosion per week being 164 feet which was observed opposite miles 6/1 during the week ending 26th July 1919. For lower Sind this erosion is considered heavy.

131. The plans and estimates for the Sukkur Barrage were completed during the year. The whole project, including the Barrage and canals, has since been submitted to the Government of India for obtaining the sanction of the Secretary of State. This project comprises the following works: (i) a Barrage about a mile in length, across the river Indus, below the gorge at Sukkur, (ii) two large perennial canal systems taking off from above the Barrage — one on the left bank of the river running south from Rohri to Hyderabad and the other on the right bank of the river superseding the whole of the existing inundation canals between the Rahuja head of the Sukkur Canal and Shehwan and (iii) a large new supply channel, which is also to take off immediately above the Barrage, to feed the Eastern Nara River, the remodelling and general improvement of the whole of the Canal systems dependent on the Eastern Nara for their supplies and the construction of a new canal to be called the Khipra Canal. Provision has also been made in the project for the construction of a Flood Protective Bank, 105 miles long, from Makhi to Navkot which will entirely exclude the Ghotki floods. The proposed new works will undoubtedly be a great boon to the cultivators. In place of an irregular and uncertain supply depending entirely on the natural level of the Indus, there will be a certain and regular supply during all seasons of the year and when irrigation on all the new canal systems has reached its maximum, a total area of over 5½ million acres will be watered in place of the existing area of about 2 million acres in the tract commanded. The whole project is estimated to cost 16 crores of rupees.

132. No work was carried out by the Survey Department for the Indus River Commission during the year in connection with levelling operations in Sind. Work done by the Survey Department.

6.—MISCELLANEOUS.

133. Existing plantations on canals and bunds in the Left Bank Division were cared for. New trees were also planted in all Districts and they are thriving well. Plantations

III.—DECCAN AND GUJARAT.

1.—NORTHERN DIVISION.

135. The rainfall was generally satisfactory and well distributed, but in the Khari canal area it failed in the latter part of the season. Sufficient water was therefore not available to supply the last watering required by the large area of rice grown under the Khari Cut Canals. Cotton cultivation is rapidly progressing in the Kalol Taluka and Halol Mahal and has also made much progress in the Kaira District to the detriment of irrigation, as the people do not generally take water for this crop. General remark

(i)—FIRST CLASS IRRIGATION WORKS.

Hathmati and Khari
Cut Canals.

136. The rainfall gauged at Ahmedabad and Prantij during 1919-20 was 29·96" and 30·35" against an average of 29·57" and 30·50" respectively for the last 30 years, including the year under report. The monsoon broke as usual in the middle of June, more than one inch of rain fell on the 16th and 17th and the rainfall continued, with intermissions, until the middle of September.

137. Due to the favourable rains, there was a limited demand for kharif irrigation on the Hathmati canal and the rabi area amounted to 2,798 acres only or 32 acres per cusec.

138. In the area served by the Khari Cut canal the rainfall, though about average, was not well distributed. It was heavy between 15th July and 15th September 1919 but ceased altogether thereafter, with the exception of a few drizzles in November, after the rice came to maturity. A large area was planted with rice and it was therefore not possible to give the last necessary watering to the whole of that area. As, however, there was no demand for water on the Hathmati, due to favourable rain in the area, water therefrom, as well as from the Bokh, was utilized to save the rice under the Khari Cut canal. Some remissions had, however, to be made. The kharif irrigation amounted to 10,672 acres or 111 acres per cusec. Only 63 acres of rabi were irrigated, as the land was dry, there being no rain after 15th September, and the cultivators did not expect to obtain sufficient water and did not make use of the amount that was available.

139. The total area irrigated and the gross assessed revenue on the Hathmati and Khari Cut canals during the year were about 14,000 acres and Rs. 73,900 respectively against 8,400 acres and Rs. 46,200, the averages for the previous triennium.

Tanks in the Kaira
Collectorate.

140. The areas irrigated by and the gross assessment from the Wangroli, Tranza, Nagrama, Savli and Saiat tanks compare with the averages of the previous triennium as shown below:—

141. The Wangroli, Savli and Saiat tanks were full and the Tranza Nagrama tank was empty. The water in the former was utilised in irrigating the kharif and rabi crops, mainly rice, wheat and gram.

142. All these tanks were maintained in good condition at a cost of Rs. 12,139. The works of Extensions and Improvements to Saiat Tank and of constructing 2 bridges on Tranza Nagrama Tank were completed at a total cost of Rs. 497 and Rs. 1,795 respectively.

Futelao Tank.

143. For the first time the tank filled and its waste weir overflowed. Only 49 acres were irrigated in the rabi season yielding a gross revenue of about Rs. 150. The tank was maintained in good and working order at a cost of Rs. 780. Irrigation from this tank has not yet developed.

(ii)—SECOND CLASS IRRIGATION WORKS AND AGRICULTURAL WORKS.

Khari Sluices.

144. The Khari river water itself being insufficient, after 15th September 1919, for the crops on the Khari Sluices, water from the Bokh Reservoir was utilised for their protection. As there was no rain in the latter part of the months of September and October much of the water let down from the Bokh was absorbed in the Khari river bed, even the 50 cusecs let down at the Rapur weir was absorbed and did not reach the Kanera Sluice.

Muwalia Tank.

145. The tank is the largest in the Panch Mahals; the capacity at the Full Supply Level being 237 million cubic feet. The rainfall gauged at Muwalia was 37·94" and it was well distributed throughout the season. Due to the previous famine year the Bhils resorted to Maize cultivation early in the season and there was very little Kharif irrigation. Again, as the rainfall was favourable and some showers fell in January, there was not much demand for rabi irrigation. The area irrigated was 6 acres in the hot season, 16 in the kharif and 341 in the rabi season and the total revenue amounted to Rs. 1,076. The miscellaneous receipts derived from the cultivation, etc., in the tank bed were Rs. 751 against Rs. 289 of the last year. The tank and the canals were maintained in good condition at a cost of about Rs. 3,600.

Old Tanks.

146. Improvements on 49 and repairs to 50 small irrigation tanks in the Gujarat Irrigation District and repairs to 16 tanks in the Surat and Broach Districts were executed at a total cost of about Rs. 63,000.

147. The following important works were in progress during the year :— Works in progress.

- (1) The Timba Tank at Harsol, Taluka Prantij, Ahmedabad District (Nearly completed).
- (2) The Matewal Tank at Salun and Nanodra Villages, Taluka Thasra, Kaira District.
- (3) The Fudsar Tank at Lasundra, Taluka Kapadwanj, Kaira District.
- (4) The Bodedra-Bujrag Tank
and
- (5) The tank at Dangaria, Taluka Godhra, Panch Mahals.

148. The drainage channels in the Surat and Broach District and Gujarat Irrigation Drainage channels. District were maintained at a cost of about Rs. 12,600 and the protective and reclamation works in the former district cost nearly Rs. 6,000.

149. Year by year the tides from the Gulf of Cambay have been steadily advancing inland eastward and spoiling the culturable lands of the villages of Gandhar, Mular, etc. Gandhar Bund in Wagra Taluka of the Broach District. To prevent this inroad of the sea the construction of a Protective Bund has been undertaken. The Bund is to be 2½ miles in length and to cost about Rs. 15,000.

2—CENTRAL DIVISION.

150. There are very few Irrigation works of importance in the charge of the Superintending Engineer, Central Division.

151. During the year under report the rainfall was good and consequently there was no great demand for water.

(i)—FIRST CLASS IRRIGATION WORKS.

152. During the year a larger area was brought under irrigation owing to the Ekruk Tank. extension of irrigation from the 11th mile of the perennial canal upto the 19th mile and to the issue of rabi water to irrigators on the high level canals. The area irrigated under this tank was 4,377 acres against 2,872 acres, the average of the previous three years, and the gross assessed revenue amounted to Rs. 1,34,747 showing an increase of Rs. 32,518 over the average of the the past three years. The increase in revenue was due partly to the large consumption of water by the Sholapur Mills, to an increase in the Town Water Supply and also partly to increase in sales of canal produce.

153. There was not sufficient storage available to meet the full demand for water for sugarcane on this tank, about 5 acres only being grown as an experimental measure. The results will be noted in future reports.

154. The eight months' rabi leases which were introduced as an experiment for a Jamda Canals. period of six years ending 14th June 1922 on this canal showed a marked increase last year; but, owing to the seasonable rainfall no cultivators came forward to take up additional leases. In the leased area, only 151 acres were actually irrigated from canal water out of a total leased area of 591 acres.

155. The total area irrigated by these canals during the year was 1,595 acres against an average of 2,900 acres for the previous triennium. This once again emphasizes the fact that in a large cotton-growing District like Khandesh, the cultivators are not at all keen for water for irrigation when the rainfall is sufficient and seasonable. The cultivators on the Jamda canals have not sufficient confidence in the adequacy of the water supply without an independent storage reservoir. At present the Girna River discharge at the Jamda Bandhara is supplemented by a supply of water from the Chankapur Tank in the Nasik District, but the latter cannot be depended on permanently owing to the large area of irrigation which it has to provide for.

156. On all the remaining works, except the Bhatodi and Ashti tanks, the area Other works. irrigated shows a falling off from the average area for the previous triennium, but this decrease was counterbalanced by the increased irrigation on the above mentioned two tanks.

157. The total area irrigated on the first class irrigation works was 15,916 acres and the gross assessed revenue Rs. 2,15,815, the average of the previous triennium being 14,874 acres and Rs. 1,80,714 respectively.

158. Although the area shows an increase over the average of the last triennium it is less than the last year's area by 7,039 acres. The decrease is due to the seasonable rainfall and consequently less demand for water.

159. Almost all irrigators on the Ekruk, Ashti, Koregaon and Pathri tanks in the Sholapur District have entered into six years' leases from 15th February 1919.

(ii)—SECOND CLASS IRRIGATION WORKS.

160. The total expenditure on "Extensions and Improvements" and "Maintenance and Repairs" to the Bandharas in the East and West Khandesh Districts was Rs. 5,643 and the area irrigated thereon was 2,315 acres.

8.—DECCAN IRRIGATION DIVISION.

(1) FIRST CLASS IRRIGATION WORKS.

(a) Works in existence.

Protective Works.

Nira Left Bank Canal and Shetphal Tank 161. One of the oldest and so far the largest irrigation work in the Deccan is the Nira Left Bank canal, which was completed in 1898-99. This canal is fed by the Lake Whiting reservoir, on the Yelvandi River at Bhatghar in the Bhor State. The existing masonry dam is 127 feet high and 3,000 feet long and the storage capacity of the lake is 5,300 millions of cubic feet. An entirely new dam is under construction at Bhatghar just below the old dam to provide a combined supply for the Nira Left Bank canal and the new Nira Right Bank canal. The storage capacity will be raised to 24,000 millions of cubic feet when the work is completed. The additional supply will be utilized by the new Nira Right Bank canal which is under construction. The Nira Left Bank canal is 100 miles long and irrigates a large portion of the Poona District.

162. The Shetphal Tank is a comparatively small tank, constructed near the tail of the Left Bank canal, from which it receives its supply during the monsoon for irrigating lands under its command.

163. During the year under report this system irrigated about 83,000 acres of land and earned a gross revenue of about Rs. 5,65,000. Deducting the working expenses, the net revenue comes to about 4½ lakhs of rupees. This shows a slight increase over the average figures of irrigation and revenue for the previous three years and is accounted for mainly by a greater demand for canal water due to a defective monsoon.

Mhaswad Tank. 164. This irrigation work consisting of a tank formed by means of an earthen dam on the Man River, with a storage capacity of about 3,000 million cubic feet, lies in the eastern borders of the Satara District and irrigates lands in the Sholapur District. The area irrigated during the year was 8,600 acres, the gross revenue about Rs. 52,000, working expenses about Rs. 18,000 and probable net revenue Rs. 34,000.

Godavari Canals. 165. This is the first of the large irrigation works of recent construction in the central Deccan for the protection of areas liable to famine. It was completed in 1915-16. The system comprises a storage reservoir, called Lake Beale, on the Darna River which is a tributary of the Godavari, a pick-up weir at Nandur-Madhmeshwar on the Godavari River, and two canals, the Godavari Right and Left Bank canals, taking off from this pick-up weir.

166. The Darna Dam is 4,434 feet long and has a maximum height of 92 feet and a capacity of 8,818 million cubic feet.

167. The pick-up weir at Nandur-Madhmeshwar is 3,620 feet long and 30 feet high. Hitherto the storage capacity above the weir was 1,053 million cubic feet, but by the addition of a crest wall 3 feet high, which was completed during the year, the storage has been increased by 475 million cubic feet.

168. The Godavari Right Bank canal, which is the more important of the two canals, is 70 miles long and serves the northern tracts of the Ahmednagar District. The Left Bank canal is 48 miles long and irrigates lands in the south of the Nasik District and north of the Ahmednagar District.

169. Irrigation has not yet had time to develop fully on this system, but is progressing according to expectations. Considerable trouble is caused by the enormous growth of weeds which greatly reduces the flow in the canals and measures are under consideration for remedying this defect.

170. Sugarcane cultivation has made a great advance on these new canals, the total area irrigated during the year being about 4,000 acres.

171. The total area irrigated in the year by these two canals was over 32,000 acres, yielding a gross revenue of about 3 lakhs of rupees which gives a return of 231 per cent. on the capital invested. The working expenses were equal to half of this revenue and thus the net revenue was about Rs. 1½ lakhs.

Productive Works.

Mutha Canals and Matoba Tank. 172. This irrigation scheme was completed in 1896-97. There are two canals, the Right and Left Bank Mutha canals, of which the former is 70 miles and the latter 18 miles long. Both the canals take off from Lake Fife, a storage reservoir formed by a masonry dam, 3,431 feet long with a maximum height of 107 feet, on the Mutha River at Khadakvasla, about 10 miles south-west of Poona.

173. The lake supplies 3,953 million cubic feet of water annually.

174. The average of the last 3 years' cultivation included 5,221 acres of sugarcane, 1,429 acres of fruits and vegetables, 1,265 acres of fodder crops, 1,064 acres of jowari, and 1,307 acres of bajri. A small sugar factory has been established at Phursangi.

175. The Matoba Tank, a small irrigation work, receives its main supply from the Mutha Right Bank canal, and is therefore incorporated in the system.

176. The total area irrigated under this system during the year was 24,600 acres with a gross revenue of Rs. 2,82,000. After paying the working expenses the canal earned a net revenue of about one lakh of rupees.

177. While there is an increase in the total area irrigated over the average of 13,814 acres due to the larger demand for water and more extensive irrigation of cold weather crops owing to unfavourable rains, the revenue has fallen to some extent in consequence of curtailment of sugarcane for want of an adequate supply.

178. The Poona Water Supply, which hitherto was managed by the Executive Engineer, Poona Irrigation District, was formed into a separate charge under the Sanitary Engineer to Government, the function of the Irrigation Department being limited to the delivery of water to the Water Works and receiving payment for the quantity thus supplied in bulk. The amount charged to the Water Works for the supply of water during the year since their separation from the Mutha canals was Rs. 18,529.

179. The Waghad Tank is the main feature of this small scheme and it feeds the Palkhed, Ojhar-Tambhat and Wadali canals. The only event of importance to record is a slip in the embankment which occurred towards the end of April 1919, in a length of about 300 feet on the up-stream face. The necessary repairs were carried out before the monsoon at a cost of about Rs. 20,000 and have stood well. Kadwa River Works.

(b) Works under construction.

Protective Works.

180. This system, which is still under construction, comprises (i) a storage reservoir, called Lake Arthur Hill, on the Pravara River at Bbandardara (near the foot of Mount Kalsubai), 29 miles by road from Igatpuri, (ii) a pick-up weir at Ojhar, 50 miles down the river, and (iii) two canals, one on each bank of the river, named the Pravara Right and Left Bank canals, 33 miles and 48 miles long respectively. Pravara River Works.

181. The masonry dam on completion will be 270 feet high and about 1,600 feet long. The work was started in 1911 and has now reached a maximum height of about 200 feet. A photograph showing the general view of the dam has been bound as a frontispiece to this report. When fully completed the storage will amount to 12,894 million cubic feet and will irrigate some of the lands most affected by famine in the Ahmednagar Collectorate, the culturable land under command of the canals being 182,976 acres, of which 75,000 acres are expected to be irrigated annually.

182. Water from storage is already available and a large sugar factory owned by the Belapur Company has started operations near Belapur Railway Station. This concern will eventually bring 2,000 acres under sugarcane cultivation every year out of an area of 6,000 acres which the Company have acquired.

183. Twelve lakhs of cubic feet of masonry were added to the dam during the year which constitutes a record.

184. The progress of work on the canals is keeping pace with that on the dam and it is anticipated that the scheme will be completed in 1922 or 1923. In the meanwhile as the work progresses irrigation is being gradually extended.

185. The estimated cost of the scheme is Rs. 1,27,04,607 but this will be increased by about 10 to 12 per cent., due to the rise in prices. The expenditure during the year was about Rs. 7 lakhs and the total amount spent on these works up to date is about 88 lakhs of rupees.

186. This is a comparatively small irrigation system, comprising a storage reservoir, called the Chankapur Tank in the Nasik Collectorate, and the Girna Left Bank canal which, when the extension is completed, will be about 19 miles long. The total culturable area commanded by the canal is 25,300 acres. The Chankapur Tank Masonry dam has a maximum height of 140 feet, and supplies, in addition, the Jamda Canals in the East Khandesh Collectorate, some 80 miles away, as well as a few small irrigation works *en route*. Girna River Works.

187. The area irrigated during the year was nearly 4,000 acres and the gross revenue about Rs. 19,200 which did not cover the working expenses amounting to about Rs. 20,000.

188. This irrigation system will, when completed, be the largest in the Deccan and, depending for its supply upon storage at Bhatghar, about 30 miles from Poona, and passing through the northern tracts of Satara Collectorate and Phaltan State it will mainly benefit the western portion of the Sholapur Collectorate which is very liable to famine. New Masonry Dam at Bhatghar and Nira Right Bank Canal.

189. The project comprises the construction of a larger dam at Bhatghar to replace the existing one, as stated in the paragraph regarding the Nira Left Bank canal, so as to increase the storage from 5,300 to about 24,000 million cubic feet, with a view to provide a supply to both the old Left Bank and the new Right Bank canals. The new canal starts from the pick-up weir at Vir and ends at Piliv in the Sholapur Collectorate. The total length is 88 miles, or, when extended as proposed, nearly 108 miles.

190. A revised scheme for fully developing the irrigation of the lands in the Nira Valley (300,000 to 400,000 acres) is under consideration.

191. The Nira Right Bank canal works were started in 1912. The progress on the works in the past has been rather slow, due mainly to conditions arising out of the war, but recently an improvement has taken place and endeavours are being made to commence irrigation in the year 1923.

192. The previously estimated cost of the project, as sanctioned by the Secretary of State, amounts to Rs. 2,57,72,499, but as this estimate is likely to be exceeded a revised project is now under preparation. The expenditure incurred on these works during the year amounted to about Rs. 18,86,000, bringing the total outlay up to date to Rs. 161½ lakhs.

193. The storage at Bhatghar provides sufficient head and discharge to produce electrical energy of over 3,000 Horse Power at the foot of the dam. Part of this energy is now being utilized for driving all the machinery used for construction, such as mortar mills, stone crushers, workshop plant, etc., and for lighting and other purposes. The installation consists of 4 units of 256 K. W. each, the voltage being 2,000.

(ii) SECOND CLASS IRRIGATION WORKS.

194. These include numerous old *bandharas* or weirs built across small streams to raise the level of the water sufficiently high to enable it to command the lands to be irrigated. In all there are about 300 of these small works in the Nasik and West Khandesh Collectorates.

195. The outlay on repairs and improvements amounted to about Rs. 16,000 during the year.

4.—SOUTHERN DIVISION.

(i) FIRST CLASS IRRIGATION WORKS.

196. The first class irrigation works in the Southern Division irrigated an area of nearly 30,000 acres with a gross assessment of Rs. 1,33,500. This shows an increase of about 3 per cent. only in the area irrigated, while the assessed revenue shows a decrease of about 24 per cent. when compared with the averages of the previous three years.

197. The small increase in the irrigated area is due to a greater area of monsoon low rated crops having been irrigated during the kharif season owing to the failure of early rains and the falling off in the assessed revenue is due to a decrease in the area of high rated crops such as sugarcane, etc.

Krishna Canal. 198. The Krishna canal, which is the only major work in this Division, is 36 miles long and takes off from the left bank of the Krishna River from a weir near the village of Khodsi in the Karad Taluka of the Satara District.

199. The work of removing silt, which was in progress from last year, was completed during the year at a total cost of Rs. 2,123. An arboricultural nursery was maintained at Shenoli and transplanting operations were carried out at a cost of Rs. 473. The canal irrigated 5,500 acres of land and yielded a gross revenue of Rs. 33,400.

Gokak Canal. 200. The most important of the first class minor works in this Division is the Gokak canal. This irrigation system consists of a masonry weir across the Ghataprabha River at Dhupdal in the Belgaum District and a short length of canal taking off from the reservoir formed by the weir.

201. The weir crest (2,985 feet in length) was as usual temporarily raised by two feet at a cost of Rs. 1,346 with a view to increase the storage of water for the rabi season and to meet the demands of the mills at Gokak. The additional storage of 256 millions c. ft. of water thus obtained was found to be very useful for the irrigation of rabi crops.

202. The cotton mills at Gokak are supplied with water at the rate of 146 cusecs for 13 hours a day (78 hours a week, except Sundays and holidays) for which the mills pay to Government Rs. 14,313 per year. In the year under report, however, a decreased discharge was given to the mills, according to the request of the Mill Manager, up to 26th May 1919 as the water level of the reservoir was rapidly going down on account of the scanty rainfall during the previous year.

203. The total rainfall of the year was more than the average, but the greater portion of it fell at a time when it was not required and thus somewhat damaged the kharif crops instead of being useful to them.

204. The water level of the Dhupdal Reservoir on 1st April 1919 was 14.67 feet and the lowest level of 9.32 feet above the sill of the sluices was reached on the 12th May 1919. Thereafter the reservoir began to fill gradually and overflowed on the 20th June 1919. The highest flood of the year occurred on the 30th July 1919 when the water reached a level of 2.04 feet above the permanent crest of the weir.

205. There was no expenditure on Capital Account during the year but minor improvements were carried out at a cost of Rs. 856.

Revari and Chikhli Canals. 206. The only two works taking off direct from rivers without storage reservoirs are the Revari and Chikhli canals, in the Satara District. The Revari canal is about 6 miles in length and takes off from above an ancient bandhara, situated on the river Vasna in the Koregaon Taluka. The Chikhli is a small irrigation canal, only 6½ miles in length, and has its origin from the weir built in the Nandni River in the Khanapur Taluka.

The work of removing silt from the Revari canal was done during the year at a cost of Rs. 442. These works irrigated an area of about 1,100 acres.

207. The work of improvements to the Dharma canal was completed during the year at a total cost of Rs. 77,737. Dharma Canal.

208. The monsoon, during the year under report, was a favourable one for sowing operations. The distribution of water was well managed without any complaints from the irrigators and the crops were good. The canal yielded during the year by direct irrigation a gross revenue of Rs. 4,634 against Rs. 83 of the previous year.

209. Of the canals furnished with storage works the three most important are in the Satara District. The first of them known as the "Yerla River Irrigation Works" consists of the Nehr Tank, having a canal $8\frac{1}{2}$ miles in length, starting from the right bank of the river Yerla at the Nehr Tank, and two other canals, viz., the Yerla Right Bank, $15\frac{1}{2}$ miles in length, and Yerla Left Bank, $8\frac{1}{2}$ miles long, starting from a pick-up weir across the Yerla River at Khatgun. Yerla River Irrigation Works.

210. Owing to the scanty supply of water in the tank at the beginning of the hot season and for want of timely rainfall in the monsoon there was considerable decrease in the kharif area and assessment. This deficiency was partly made good in the rabi season when the area irrigated and the assessed revenue were about 50 per cent. more than the average figures of the last three years.

211. The repairs to the portions of the canal damaged by heavy rain were carried out at a cost of Rs. 1,990.

212. The Maini Tank and canal, the second system, derives its supply from a large nalla which falls into the river Yerla in the southern portion of the Khatav Taluka. The canal is $9\frac{1}{2}$ miles in length and irrigates lands in both Khatav and Khanapur Talukas. It irrigated about 2,600 acres of land and yielded a gross revenue of Rs. 9,500. Maini Tank.

213. The Upper Man River works is the third system referred to and consists of a tank at Pingli which supplies the Right Bank canal, 4 miles in length, and also a distributary on the left side, viz., Dahiwadi canal, $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles in length. Both of these tail into the Gondavala canal (7 miles in length) which has an independent origin above a weir across the Man River. Lower down the river the Londavada canal, which is $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles long, derives a supply. Upper Man River Works.

214. The Pingli, Dahiwadi and Gondavala canals were damaged by rain and repairs were carried out at an expenditure of Rs. 2,000. This system irrigated an area of about 1,500 acres and yielded a gross revenue of Rs. 5,500.

215. The remaining works are all small tanks mostly in the Dharwar District, irrigating from 50 to 600 acres each. Other Works.

(ii) SECOND CLASS IRRIGATION WORKS.

216. Most of the second class irrigation works are in the Dharwar District and the cultivation dependent on them is almost entirely rice and garden crops. During the year repairs to 45 tanks were carried out at a total cost of Rs. 39,000; the average expenditure on such repairs during the previous triennium was about Rs. 41,000.

217. The total area irrigated by these small works was about 74,700 acres and the irrigation share of the assessed consolidated revenue amounted to Rs. 1,98,300.

5.—SCIENTIFIC WORKS.

(a) ENGINEERING QUESTIONS THAT HAVE ARISEN.

218. Observations to ascertain losses by evaporation and absorption were made by means of iron tanks placed in certain reservoirs and the results are published in the "Annual Report of supplies of water available for irrigation works, etc." for 1919.

(b) SPECIAL IRRIGATION DISTRICT.

219. This charge was formed a few years ago for scientific investigations connected with irrigation; what specially gave rise to its formation was the water-logging and salt-efflorescence evil due to heavy watering in the sugarcane areas under the Deccan canals. Much useful work has been done towards combating this evil and the experiments carried out near Baramati have proved that the worst affected lands can be regenerated at a comparatively small cost. On the principle that prevention is better than cure, the question of protecting land from deterioration due to causes arising from canal irrigation is receiving serious attention.

220. Thus, while in old canal-irrigated areas the work consists of reclamation, in the new areas it takes mainly the form of preventive measures based on lessons learnt from reclamation work. The work, therefore, spreads itself over the Nira Left Bank and Right Bank, Mutha, Godavari and Pravara canals, which are either completed or under construction.

221. The conclusions arrived at are mainly that, except where good natural subsoil drainage exists, artificial means must be resorted to to maintain the subsoil water level at not less than 4 feet below the surface. Open drains are constructed where surface

water due to rain has to be dealt with in addition to the subsoil water, but underground pipe drains are used for all subsidiary drainages and are far more effective and permanent than open drains. The difficulty is to find the best location for these drains, and for this purpose a subsoil survey of the whole area is in progress.

222. It is only when the land is drained that the real reclamation work can be taken in hand, and this consists of removing the salts which have risen to the surface along with the subsoil water and in restoring the texture of the soil. The former is done by driving the salts downwards into the drains by means of repeated floodings of the land or by surface washing; the latter method is of doubtful benefit, unless continued for a very long time. The physical condition of the soil is improved by suitable initial plantations, such as babul, shevri, etc.

223. The water-logging was so bad in places that water showed on the surface of the land and it is very satisfactory to be able to record that in the area so far reclaimed the sugarcane crop appears to be superior to that in ordinary land; rice and jowar have also done well.

224. In addition to the regeneration of agricultural lands, the Executive Engineer, Special Irrigation, has been carrying out various experiments connected with irrigation, and of these may be mentioned the use of sewage effluent for the manuring of crops. The question as to how best to dispose of the effluent from the Poona City septic tanks resulted in the establishment of a farm on which experiments are being conducted and in addition an area of 664 acres is actually being irrigated with the diluted effluent. The results have been very successful and the people are appreciating the value of this valuable manure.

(c) RIVER GAUGING.

225. All the rivers in the Presidency proper which can be suitably developed for irrigation and power purposes are being gauged and the discharges measured. The results are published in the "Annual Report of supplies of water available for irrigation works, etc." for the year 1919.

226. Several special rain gauges were also maintained as usual during the year by the Executive Engineers concerned.
