# ANNUAL IRRIGATION REVENUE REPORT, INDUS LEFT BANK DIVISION, SIND, 1917-18.

The inundation of 1917-18 was on the whole a poor one. The chief features of the period were the low level of the river throughout the months of June and July, its very satisfactory and steady level throughout August and its abnormal height throughout the whole of September combined with abnormal rainfall.

The diagram accompanying this report compares the inundation of 1917 with the two previous years and with the 10 years' average.

The total cultivation shows a decrease of 138,893 acres as compared with 1916-17 and of 83,063 acres when compared with the average of the previous three years. The area under kharif was less by 160,015 and 65,477 acres, respectively, while that under rabi was 21,122 acres more as compared with the previous year and 17,586 acres less than the average of the previous three years.

3. The area of 'dubari' or twice cropped land, which is not included in statement A, was 39,392 acres of which 4,829

were 'watered dubari' in the Thar and Parkar

district. The dubari figures for the previous year and the average of the previous triennium were 30,104 and 36,879 acres, while those of 'watered dubari' were 4,541 and 7,876 acres respectively.

The balance outstanding at the end of the year is Rs. 29,319 more than in the previous year and Rs. 59,384 less than the average balance of the previous three years. The total outstanding balance at the end of the year on the Jamrao Canal under both Government and Jagir lands was Rs. 13,187 against Rs. 12,766 at the end of the last year and Rs. 81,946 the average outstanding balance of the previous three years.

**7.** The remissions granted during the year on Government land amounted to Rs. 1,18,477 against Rs. 55,518 remitted last year and Rs. 83,855 the average remissions of the previous three years. The remissions on the kharif crop amounted to Rs. 1,06,341, while those on the rabi crop were Rs. 12,136.

8. The difference between the 'Hakabo' or water rate assessed on Jagir cultivation and the assessment at full rates on these areas amounted to Rs. 3,51,474 which represents the loss of canal revenue during the year owing to the low rates charged to Jagirdars.

Establishment charged to 'Works' amounted to Rs. 1,93,645 and is included in the expenditure for 'Works,' while the net expenditure on 'Works' (clearance and repairs) was Rs. 7,82,808. Compared with the previous year and with the average of the previous three years, the net expenditure on clearance and repairs shows an increase of Rs. 1,60,418 and Rs. 1,16,563, respectively. The charges on account of Establishment and tools and plant also show an increase of Rs. 48,432 and Rs. 79,148, respectively.

Expenditure on maintenance and repairs separately for canals and river embankments.

10. Of the total charges shown in the preceding paragraph, Rs. 15,52,640 were spent on canals and Rs. 55,601 on river embankments.

Under "Major Works"—Capital—Rs. 66,001 represent the 'works' expenditure, of which Rs. 51,397 were spent on the Jamrao Canal (Ghotki Flood Diversion Bund in the Shikarpur Canals district) and Rs. 20,822 on constructing Right and Left Bank Makhi Distributaries and Head Distributary on the Hiralwah in the Eastern Nara district. The expenditure against the Revenue Account pertains mainly to the Eastern Nara district.

Under "Minor Works"—Capital—Rs. 45,798 represents the 'works' expenditure, of which Rs. 20,123 were spent on the Hyderabad canals on constructing a head regulator over the Great Marakh Canal, Rs. 25,675 on constructing a new mouth to the Dokiaawah in mile 45/3 of the Fuleli above the Alipur Regulator.

12. The regular establishment charges, as shown below, amounted to Regular establishment charges. Rs. 4,59,356, which is Rs. 33,234 and Rs. 62,658 more than the previous year and the average of the previous three years:—

The total working expenses including expenditure on agricultural works comes to Ra. 1.27 per acre of total area irrigated compared with 1.04 per acre of area irrigated in the previous year and Rs. 1.06 per acre of the average area irrigated during the past three years.

14. There were 1,029 miles of main canals and 3,052 miles of branch canals—total 4,081 miles—in operation during the year against the previous year's total mileage of 4,076 miles (main canals 1,024 miles and branch canals 3,052 miles). The increase in total mileage is explained at the bottom of Table VI accompanying this report. The total length of river embankments was 373 miles. The increase of 2 miles against the previous year's mileage of 370 was due to the construction of a new bund between Dhadko and Mulchand canals in the Fuleli Canals district.

As compared with the last year and the average of the previous three years, there is a decrease of 160,018 and 65,373 acres under kharif. Under rabi there is an increase of 30,410 acres as compared with last year and a decrease of 15,017 as compared with the average of the last three years. With the exception of cotton under kharif and "other crops" under rabi, there is a decrease under all crops as compared with the average of the previous three years; while comparison with the last year shows a decrease under all crops except cotton under kharif and an increase in all crops under rabi.

16. The proportions of kharif and rabi out of the total area irrigated in the Division were 80 and 20 against 83 and 17 of the last year. The highest kharif percentage

of 89 was in the Fuleli Canals District and the lowest 64 was in the Jamrao Canals District, while Hyderabad Canals, Eastern Nara and Nasrat Canals Districts had respectively 85, 80 and 76 per cent. The Fuleli Canals and Eastern Nara Districts had as usual the largest rice areas, with 272,819 and 111,955 acres, respectively, out of the total rice cultivation for the Division of 408,658 acres. The largest areas under bajri were in the Hyderabad and Fuleli Canals Districts, viz., 146,191 and 77,009 acres. The largest area under jowari was as usual in the Nasrat Canals District with 89,154 acres. Of the total area of 253,926 acres under cotton in the Division the area under this crop on the Jamrao was 96,661 acres and in the Hyderabad Canals District 75,709 acres.

Of the rabi crops, wheat was most largely grown, as last year, on the Jamrao and the Eastern Nara Districts, the Jamrao accounting for 75,584 acres

and the Eastern Nara for 33,679 acres out of a total for the whole Division of 170,086 acres. The smallest area cultivated in wheat was in the Hyderabad Canals District, *viz.*, 12,806 acres. The areas under oilseeds were 31,441 acres in the Nasrat Canals District, 12,550 acres in the Fuleli Canals District and 11,111 acres in the Hyderabad Canals District out of the total for the Division of 60,913 acres.

Out of the total area cultivated during the year 36 per cent. was watered by lift and 64 per cent. by flow against 37 per cent. and 63 per cent., respectively, during the previous year.

**17. The duties and deltas of canals in the Division show the usual fluctuations of values.** The kharif duty and delta on the *Jamrao* were 68 and 3·4 as compared with 76 and 4·4 of the previous year. The rabi duty has fallen from 59 to 52 and the delta has risen from 5·6 to 7. The decrease in duty under kharif is due to an increase in discharge and a decrease in the area irrigated. The decrease in duty and increase in delta under rabi are due to increase in the discharge and the increase in the number of days the canal flowed. The average discharge measured for the 299 days the canal flowed was 1,910 cusecs and as the total area brought to maturity was 235,787 acres, each cusec irrigated 123 acres against 140 in the previous year.

On the *Dad* Canal the duty and delta were 48 and 4·9, respectively, against 44 and 4·7 in the previous year. The increase in duty is due to the decrease in the average discharge, more judicious distribution of water by internal rotations and the heavy rainfall during the year.

On the *Nasrat* Canal the duty and delta were 62 and 3·8, respectively, against 52 and 3·8 in the previous year. The increase in duty is due to the same reasons as are given above for the *Dad* canal. The reason why there is no corresponding decrease in delta is due to the increase in the number of days the canal was flowing.

On the *Mithrao*, the kharif duty and delta were 52 and 6·5 against the last year's figures of 63 and 6·3. The decrease in duty and increase in delta are due to increase in discharge, decrease in the area irrigated and heavy rainfall. The rabi duty and delta on this canal were 23 and 7·5 against the previous year's figures of 46 and 7·1. The decrease in duty and increase in delta are due to the heavy rainfall and consequent reduction in the rabi area owing to excessive growth of weeds.

On the *Hiral* Canal the kharif duty and delta were 67 and 6·1 against 90 and 4 in the previous year. As only 'Bosi' rabi is now cultivated on the canal, the kharif period is taken upto the closure of the canal. The same reasons given for the *Mithrao* Canal are applicable here for the decrease and increase in duty and delta of this canal.

On the *Thar* Canal the duty and delta were 60 and 6·8 as compared with the previous year's figures of 52 and 7·4. The increase in duty and decrease in delta are due to better distribution and heavy rainfall.

On the *Khipro* Canal the duty and delta were 58 and 5·3 as compared with 42 and 5·3 in the previous year. The increase in duty is due to better distribution and heavy rainfall.

On the *Fuleli* Canal the kharif duty and delta were 56 and 6·5 against the previous year's figures of 64 and 5·7 while the rabi duty and delta were 42 and 8·7 against the last year's figures of 45 and 8·1. The decrease in duty and increase in delta during kharif are due to decrease in the area irrigated, and similar conditions in rabi are due to the accident to the Alipur Regulator which reduced the rabi cultivation as the *Fuleli* had to be partially closed.

On the *Hassanali*, the duty and delta were 26 and 9·1 against 35 and 9·0 in the previous year. The decrease in duty and increase in delta are due to increased discharge, decline in the area irrigated and heavy rainfall.

18. On "Major Works" the incidence of working expenses on assessed revenue and per acre irrigated were 55·26 per cent. and Rs. 1·64 per acre as compared with 42·97 per cent. and Rs. 1·24 per acre in the previous year.

Incidence of working expenses on the assessed revenue.

Under "Minor Works" the figures were 35·39 per cent. and Rs. 0·86 per acre as compared with 32·41 per cent. and Rs. 0·80 per acre in the previous year.

19. The total value of crops grown on the irrigated area of 1,485,446 acres was estimated by the Revenue authorities at Rs. 3,34,83,553 which gives an average of Rs. 22 per acre.

Value of each kind of crop irrigated.

20. The agricultural and other conditions of the year as affecting the areas irrigated by the principal works, the nature of seasons, the state of demand and supply are given in the following paragraph.

21. The principal irrigation works in the Division are the Eastern Nara System, the Jamrao, the Dad, the Nasrat, the Fuleli, the Hassanali, the Alibhar Kacheri, the Great Marakh and the Sarfraz.

The Eastern Nara system comprises the Nara, Mithrao, Hiral, Thar and Khipro canals; the first two are perennial, the third and fourth could be perennial but are given no rabi supply, while the last, the Khipro, flows only during the inundation. The Jamrao has also perennial supply. The Eastern Nara system and the Jamrao are both fed by the Nara Supply Channel taking off the Indus at Robri. All the other canals are inundation canals, getting their supply direct from the river; the Fuleli, though not perennial, flows nearly throughout the year and gets a rabi supply.

The inundation of 1917 was remarkable for the low level of the river throughout the month of July, its good and steady level throughout August and its abnormal height throughout the month of September.

The river commenced to rise at the beginning of June, but did not reach the fair irrigating level of 13 feet on the Bukkur gauge till the 9th of August 1917. It continued above this level for a period of 30 days as compared with 9 days in the last year, none in the year 1915 and 18 days, the average of previous triennium.

The fair irrigating level of 17 feet on the Kotri gauge was first registered on the 1st August 1917. The river remained above this level from 1st August to 12th October, a period of 73 days as compared with 86 in the previous year, 66 in the year 1915 and 84 days, the average of the previous three years.

The highest readings for the year were 15·8 feet on the Bukkur gauge on the 16th August and 23 feet on the Kotri gauge on the 6th September as compared with 13·6 and 22·1 on the Bukkur and Kotri gauges, respectively, in 1916, and as compared with the recorded maximum readings on these two gauges of 17·9 feet and 23·8 feet, respectively.

The rainfall during the season was abnormal throughout Sind and did a great deal of damage to cultivation and property. It caused some breaches in canals in the Nasrat and Hyderabad Canals Districts but these were closed without serious damage. The season owing to the very late rise of the river and to abnormal rainfall was a very bad one for dry crop cultivation. On the Jamrao owing to the heavy rains and the consequent dense growth of weeds the outturn of cotton per acre was below the normal but this was compensated for by the very high market price obtainable for the cotton.

The areas irrigated in the whole Division under different crops are given in Statement F, paragraph 15 above.

22. The following paragraphs give details of different works or groups of works and a comparison of the agricultural and financial results of the year 1917-18 with the previous year and the average of the previous triennium and the main causes of any important differences in results.

### I.—MAJOR WORKS.

#### PRODUCTIVE PUBLIC WORKS.

##### A.—Eastern Nara District.

23. An expenditure of Rs. 20,822 was incurred under this head during the year under report on the construction of the Capital Makhi Distributaries, Right and Left and Head Distributary, Hirai Canal.

A sum of Rs. 24,468 was spent during the year mainly on extending the Extensions and improvements inner Right and Left Bank bunds along the Nara below the Makhi Regulator, constructing Clerks' quarters at Samaro and Kanhar and constructing masonry profiles on karias *ex* 30th mile distributary left *ex* Mithrao Canal.

All the canals in the District were maintained in good order at a cost of Maintenance and repair. Rs. 1,15,570 including 'Works establishment.'

The area irrigated during the year was 232,059 acres of which 186,934 acres were under kharif and 46,125 acres under rabi, as compared with 263,438 acres (kharif 210,253 acres and rabi 53,185 acres) in the last year and with 261,852 acres (kharif 202,174 acres and rabi 59,678 acres) the average of the previous three years.

The gross revenue amounted to Rs. 6,14,961 as compared with last year's Financial results. revenue of Rs. 6,82,503 and Rs. 6,84,230 the average revenue of the previous three years. Deducting working expenses Rs. 2,55,619 and share due to old irrigation Rs. 3,100, the net revenue during the year due to improvements was Rs. 3,56,242, or 5.06 on the capital outlay to end of the year as compared with 6.35 per cent. in the last year and 6.50 the average of the previous three years.

The remissions granted during the year amounted to Rs. 8,431 against General remarks. Rs. 4,040 remitted last year and Rs. 10,605 the average remissions of the previous three years. The year's remissions were mostly due to deficiency of water at the beginning of the season and to floods caused by the abnormal rainfall at the end.

and the value of the whole outturn is estimated at Rs. 66,23,629 or Rs. 22 per acre.

*B.—Jamrao Canal.*

24. The net expenditure during the year was Rs. 51,397 after deducting recoveries from Colonists and this amount was spent on completing the Ghotki Flood Diversion Capital Bund (29 miles) mentioned in the previous year's report.

A sum of Rs. 1,619 was spent during the year on 'Works' in substituting screw gates for needles at 3 regulators and Extensions and improvements. in extending the Murid distributary.

The canal and its branches were maintained in good order at a cost of Maintenance and repairs. Rs. 3,03,167 including 'Works establishment.'

Regrading and clearance of minors was done where necessary. The canal was completely closed for special clearance in the first 13 miles from 15th March to 25th May 1917. The necessity for special clearance was urgent as the kharif discharge had fallen considerably below the designed discharge. This most important and arduous work was successfully completed within the period fixed for the closure of the canal. The whole work amounted to Rs. 1,34,780.

The total area irrigated during the year was 238,406 acres (kharif 152,163 acres and rabi 86,243 acres) compared with Irrigation. 239,426 acres (kharif 163,477 acres and rabi 75,919 acres) in the last year and with 259,039 acres (kharif 158,082 acres and rabi 100,957 acres) the average cultivation of the previous three years.

The gross revenue of the year amounted to Rs. 8,28,379 compared with Financial results. Rs. 7,98,104 in the last year and Rs. 8,23,292 the average revenue of the previous three years. Deducting working expenses Rs. 5,18,633, the net revenue during the year was Rs. 3,09,746 or 3·48 per cent. on the capital outlay to end of year as compared with 4·90 per cent. of the last year and 5·36 the average of the previous three years.

The amount remitted during the year was Rs. 8,774 against Rs. 11,212 General remarks. remitted last year and Rs. 25,191 the average remissions of the previous three years. This year's remissions were mainly due to deficiency of water and later to damage by rain.

*C.—Dad Canal.*

25. No expenditure was incurred under this head. A sum of Rs. 2,578 Capital. was, however, recovered from Colonists during the year.

A sum of Rs. 7,409 was spent under this head during the year on 'Works' Extensions and improvements. mainly on constructing a 2nd class Inspection Bungalow with outhouses at Kazi Ahmed.

The canal and its branches (including Ren distributary ex Dad) were maintained in good order at a cost of Rs. 82,509 Maintenance and repairs. including 'Works establishment.'

The total area irrigated during the year was 121,439 acres of which 85,931 acres were under kharif and 35,508 under rabi Irrigation. as compared with 125,169 acres (kharif 105,375 acres and rabi 19,794) in the last year. No comparison of this year's figures with those of the previous triennium can be made as the Renu distributary *ex* Dad, the figures of which have since 1916-17 been included in those for the Dad, under orders of Government, worked for the first time in 1915.

The gross revenue for the year amounted to Rs. 2,75,181 as compared with Rs. 2,94,618 in the last year and Rs. 2,60,353 the average of the previous three years. Deducting working expenses Rs. 1,47,697 and share due to old irrigation Rs. 38,699, the net revenue due to improvements was Rs. 88,785 or 3.33 per cent. on the capital outlay to end of the year as compared with 4.46 in the last year and 2.72 per cent. the average of the previous three years.

The remissions granted during the year amounted to Rs. 13,045 against Rs. 10,074 remitted in the last year and Rs. 8,772 the average remissions of the previous three years. The year's remissions were due to deficiency of water in the early part of the season and to breaches caused by heavy rainfall at the end of the season.

26. No expenditure was incurred under this head. A sum of Rs. 3,637 Capital was, however, recovered from Colonists during the year.

Extensions and improvements. A sum of Rs. 4,793 was spent under this head during the year on 'Works' only.

The canal and its branches were maintained in good order at a cost of Maintenance and repairs. Rs. 89,605 including 'Works' establishments.

The area irrigated during the year was 77,878 acres (kharif 66,401 acres Irrigation. and rabi 11,477) as compared with 101,480 acres (kharif 94,885 acres and rabi 6,595 acres) in the previous year and with 91,026 acres (kharif 84,076 acres and rabi 6,950 acres) the average of the previous three years.

The gross revenue amounted to Rs. 1,96,290 as compared with Rs. 2,90,410 Financial results. of the previous year and Rs. 2,58,464, the average of the previous three years. Deducting working expenses Rs. 1,45,811 and share due to old irrigation Rs. 53,046, the net revenue due to improvements was Rs. 2,567 or 0.14 per cent. on the capital outlay to end of the year as compared with 4.48 in the last year and 4.01 per cent. the average of the previous three years.

The remissions granted during the year amounted to Rs. 33,595 against General remarks. Rs. 12,766 remitted last year and Rs. 13,337 the average remissions of the previous three years.

A sum of Rs. 38,131 was spent on works mainly on completing the Extensions and improvements. Inspection bungalow with outhouses at Rajo Khanani and Tando Kaisar, excavating the Shadiwah distributary and constructing masonry sluices to karias taking off from this distributary, constructing sluices to karias ex Mithnawah and Wangiwah, and a regulator over Chandan Canal ex Fuleli.

The canal and its branches were maintained in good order at a cost of Maintenance and repairs. Rs. 1,70,766 inclusive of 'Works establishment'.

The area irrigated during the year was 356,780 acres (karif 341,935 acres Irrigation. and rabi 44,845 acres) compared with 444,821 acres (karif 390,153 acres and rabi 54,668 acres) irrigated in the previous year and with 420,055 acres (karif 353,796 acres and rabi 66,259 acres) the average of the previous three years.

The gross revenue amounted to Rs. 9,29,400 against Rs. 11,04,131 Financial results. realized last year and Rs. 10,23,190 the average of the previous three years. Deducting working expenses Rs. 3,41,909 and share due to old irrigation Rs. 1,28,188 the net revenue due to improvements was Rs. 4,59,303 or 22·64 per cent. on the capital outlay to end of the year compared with 30·78 in the last year and with 28·20 per cent., the average of the previous three years.

The remissions granted during the year amounted to Rs. 30,905 against General remarks. Rs. 9,491 remitted last year and Rs. 7,201 the average remissions of the previous three years. The year's remissions were mainly due to damage by rats.

The canal and its branches were maintained in good order at a cost of *Maintenance and repairs.* Rs. 10,267 inclusive of 'Works establishment.'

The area irrigated during the year was 18,955 acres (kharif 18,043 acres Irrigation. and rabi 912 acres) compared with 20,003 acres (kharif 19,586 acres and rabi 417 acres) in the previous year and with 18,726 acres (kharif 18,195 and rabi 531 acres) the average of the previous three years.

The gross revenue amounted to Rs. 48,178 compared with Rs. 54,843 *Financial results.* realized in the previous year and Rs. 50,524 the average realizations of the previous three years.

Deducting working expenses Rs. 17,999 and share due to old irrigation Rs. 2,458, the net revenue due to improvements was Rs. 27,721 or 9.09 per cent. on the capital outlay to end of the year against 8.85 per cent. in the last year and 7.60 the average of the previous three years.

*General remarks.* The remissions of the year amounted to Rs. 3,976 against none remitted last year and Rs. 84 the average remissions of the previous three years. The year's remissions were mainly due to damage by rats.

29. The canal and its branches were maintained in good order at a cost *Maintenance and repairs.* of Rs. 6,467 including 'Works establishment.'

The area irrigated during the year was 17,330 acres (kharif 12,647 acres Irrigation. and rabi 4,683 acres) against last year's area of 16,208 acres (kharif 12,861 acres and rabi 3,347 acres) and 16,015 (kharif 12,492 acres and rabi 3,523 acres) the average of the previous three years.

The gross revenue amounted to Rs. 33,400 against Rs. 33,496 in the last *Financial results.* year and Rs. 34,251 the average of the previous three years. Deducting working expenses 12,656 and share due to old irrigation Rs. 8,239, the net revenue due to improvements was Rs. 12,505 or 52.28 per cent. on the capital outlay to the end of the year against 72.79 per cent. in the last year and 78.88 the average of the previous three years.

*General remarks.* The sum remitted during the year was Rs. 1,935 against Rs. 476 remitted last year and Rs. 478 the average remissions of the last three years.

The canal and its branches were maintained in good order at a cost of Maintenance and repairs Rs. 28,715 including 'Works establishment.'

The area irrigated during the year was 79,791 acres (kharif 66,330 acres Irrigation. and rabi 13,461 acres) against 85,321 acres (kharif 71,424 acres and rabi 13,897 acres) irrigated in the last year and 78,182 acres (kharif 65,441 acres and rabi 12,742 acres) the average of the previous three years.

The gross revenue amounted to Rs. 1,90,410 against Rs. 2,00,487 in the Financial results. last year and Rs. 1,85,405 the average revenue of the previous three years. Deducting working expenses Rs. 57,968 and share due to old irrigation Rs. 36,032, the net revenue due to improvements was Rs. 96,410 or 40·01 per cent. on the capital outlay to end of the year as compared with 51·87 per cent. in the previous year and 45·35 per cent. the average of the previous three years.

The sum remitted during the year was Rs. 4,481 against Rs. 4,169 remitted last year and Rs. 3,032 the average General remarks. remissions of the previous three years. The year's remissions were mainly due to breaches in canal banks caused by the heavy rainfall.

The principal crops grown were bajri 34,604 acres and cotton 24,337 acres and the value of the whole outturn was estimated at Rs. 23,69,152 or Rs. 28 per acre.

#### 5.—Sarfraz.

31. A sum of Rs. 878 was spent during Extensions and improvements. the year under this head on 'Works' only.

The canal and its branches were maintained in good order at a cost of Maintenance and repairs Rs. 8,560 including 'Works establishment.'

The area irrigated during the year was 30,027 acres (kharif 27,751 acres Irrigation. and rabi 2,276 acres) against 31,960 acres (kharif 28,994 acres and rabi 2,966 acres) irrigated in the last year and 29,042 acres (kharif 26,925 acres and rabi 2,117 acres) the average of the previous three years.

The gross revenue amounted to Rs. 66,612 against Rs. 64,637 in the last Financial results. year and Rs. 58,950 the average revenue of the previous three years. Deducting working expenses Rs. 19,071 and share due to old irrigation Rs. 10,985, the net revenue due to improvements was Rs. 36,556 or 29·32 per cent. on the capital outlay to end of the year as compared with 24·91 per cent. in the last year and 19·61 the average of the previous three years.

The sum remitted during the year was Rs. 16 against Rs. 74 remitted last General remarks. year and Rs. 158 the average remissions of the previous three years.

The principal crops grown were bajri 18,357 acres and cotton 6,483 acres and the value of the whole outturn was estimated at Rs. 6,31,092 or Rs. 21 per acre.

B.—WORKS FOR WHICH ONLY REVENUE ACCOUNTS ARE KEPT.

1.—*Nasrat Canals District.*

32. The principal canals under this classification are the Mehrab, the Naulakhi and Dambro.

*Extensions and improvements.*

A sum of Rs. 8,662 was spent during the year on 'Works' only.

All the canals under this head were maintained in good order at a cost of *Maintenance and repairs.* Rs. 40,791 including 'Works establishment.'

The total area irrigated during the year was 91,647 acres (kharif 67,226 acres and rabi 24,421 acres) against last year's area of 92,432 acres (kharif 79,993 acres and rabi 12,439 acres) and the three year's average area of 92,226 acres (kharif 77,191 acres and rabi 15,035).

The total canal revenue amounted to Rs. 2,43,472 and the total revenue charges were 69,338 which represents 28·5 per cent. on revenue and Rs. 8 per acre irrigated against last year's figures of 34·4 per cent. and Rs. 1·0 per acre. The corresponding figures for the previous three years averaged 43·5 per cent. and Rs. 1·1 per acre.

The remissions granted during the year amounted to Rs. 6,018 against *General remarks.* Rs. 420 remitted last year and Rs. 9,743 the average remissions in the previous three years.

The principal corps grown were—

2.—*Hyderabad Canals District.*

33. The principal canals under this head are the Ren, Gharo Mahmudo, Kari Shumali and Nasir.

*Extensions and improvements.*

A sum of Rs. 5,904 was spent during the year on 'Works' only.

*Maintenance and repairs.*

All the canals and branches were maintained in good order at a cost of Rs. 56,389 including 'Works establishment.'

The total area irrigated was 160,679 acres (kharif 136,916 acres and rabi 23,763 acres) against last year's area of 161,390 acres (kharif 140,472 acres and rabi 20,918 acres) and 156,766 acres (kharif 137,008 acres and rabi 19,758 acres) the average area irrigated during the previous three years.

The total canal revenue amounted to Rs. 3,31,293 and the revenue charges *Financial results.* were Rs. 1,00,957 being 30·5 per cent. on the revenue and Rs. 0·6 per acre irrigated against last year's figures of 33·7 per cent. and Rs. 0·7 per acre irrigated. The corresponding figures for the previous three years were 35·5 per cent. and 0·7 per acre irrigated.

The year's remissions amounted to Rs. 3,310 against Rs. 1,584 remitted last year and Rs. 3,374 the average remissions of the previous three years.

**General remarks.** The principal crops grown were bajri 85,136 acres and cotton 41,724 acres and the estimated value of the whole outturn was Rs. 43,68,435 or Rs. 27 per acre.

### 3.—Fuleli Canals district.

34. There are only a few small canals under this head taking off direct from the Indus.

A sum of Rs. 17,224 was spent during the year on constructing two road bridges over the Dhadko and Mulchand Canals into regulators, and on the diversion of the Joyawah.

**Maintenances and repairs.** All the canals were maintained in good order at a cost of Rs. 18,224 inclusive of 'Works establishment.'

**Irrigation.** The total area irrigated during the year was 30,455 acres (kharif 26,117 acres and rabi 4,338 acres) compared with 33,406 acres (kharif 29,939 acres and rabi 8,467 acre) in the previous year and with 30,182 acres (kharif 25,828 acres and rabi 4,354 acres) the average of the previous three years.

**Financial results.** The total canal revenue amounted to Rs. 71,582 and the revenue charges were Rs. 27,864 representing 38·7 per cent., on the revenue and Rs. 0·9 per acre irrigated against last year's figures of 35·6 per cent., on the revenue and Rs. 0·9 per acre irrigated. The corresponding figures for the previous three years averaged 41·5 per cent., and Rs. 1·1 per acre.

**General remarks.** A sum of Rs. 3,911 was remitted during the year against Rs. 1,218 remitted last year and Rs. 1,830 the average remissions of the previous three years.

The principal crops grown were rice 16,109 acres and bajri 8,169 acres and the value of the whole outturn was estimated at Rs. 6,00,972 or Rs. 20 per acre.

### C. WORKS—FOR WHICH NEITHER CAPITAL NOR REVENUE ACCOUNTS ARE KEPT

#### *Agricultural Works.*

35. A sum of Rs. 14,747 was spent on 'Works' only of which Rs. 14,738 were spent in the Fuleli Canals District on construting a bund between Dhadko and Mulchand, a paca well on the bank of Nurwah for the Katiar bungalow and a sluice and a supply channel in mile 14 of the Hajipur Bund.

**Maintenances and repairs.** All the bunds in the Division were maintained in good order at a cost of Rs. 45,423 inclusive of 'Work establishment.' Of this sum Rs. 37,767 were spent in the Fuleli Canals District, Rs. 5,228 in the Nasrat Canals District and Rs. 2,428 in the Hyderabad Canals District.

**General remarks.** All the river bunds in the Division were subjected to a severe test during the inundation season as water stood high against all of them.

In the Nasrat Canals District, the Naulakhi Nasrat Bund which was partially eroded in 1916 was not repaired as the land behind it is high and the zamindars are anxious to have it flooded. As only about two feet of water is likely to overtop the land behind the bund, the banks of two karias were strengthened to act as a bund in case of necessity.

The Ren bund in the Hyderabad Canals District stood well though there was water against it for nearly the whole of its length, the maximum depth being 5·5 feet.

The bunds in the Fuleli Canals District were subjected to high water levels but, with the exception of two leaks in the Hajipur bund, gave no trouble.

36. The expenditure on and receipts from gardens during the year are compared below with the three years' expenditure and receipts:—

There is an increase in receipts from gardens in the Division of Rs. 251 and 139, respectively, as compared with the receipts of the last year and the average of the previous three years.

37. During the year about 20,400 new young trees of various kinds, other than babul, were planted along canals and in gardens and nurseries. Of about 17,500 trees of various kinds planted along canals, about 16,100 trees were alive at the end of the year. Besides these about 3,000 babul trees were also planted along canal banks and river embankments.

38. The Division was in charge of Mr. R. T. Harrison throughout the year.

# ANNUAL IRRIGATION REVENUE REPORT, INDUS RIGHT BANK DIVISION, SIND.

1917-18.

The inundation of 1917, as described in the Irrigation Administration Character of inundation. Report for 1917-18, and under paragraph 21 of this Report, was unusually late but unusually prolonged.

The diagram sent in advance of this report compares the inundation of 1917 with the two previous years and with the 10 years' average.

Foreign and Jagir cultivation and the assessment at full rates on these areas amounted to Rs. 2,97,422 which represents the loss of canal revenue during the year owing to low rates charged to jagirdars and to zamindars in Khelat.

Compared with the previous year and the average of the previous three years, the net expenditure on clearance and repairs shows an increase of Rs. 1,45,964 and a decrease of Rs. 13,310, respectively.

The total working expenses, including expenditure on agricultural works, comes to Rs. 1.34 per acre of total area irrigated compared with Rs. 1.08 per acre of area irrigated in the previous year and Rs. 1.34 per acre of the average area irrigated during the past three years.

14. There were 1,371 miles of main canals and 1,969 of branch canals—total 3,340 miles—in operation during the year against the previous year's total of miles 3,351 (main 1,376 and branch canals 1,975).

The total length of the river embankment was 562.5 miles against 563 miles of the last year. The causes of decrease of 5 miles in main canals and 6 in branch canal and decrease of .5 miles in river embankments are explained at the bottom of Table VI, accompanying this report.

As compared with the last year and the average of the previous triennium there was a decrease of 245,387 and 115,637 acres, respectively, under kharif and an increase of 62,488 and 52,684 acres, respectively, under rabi, resulting in a net decrease of 182,899 and 62,953 acres, respectively.

16. The proportions of kharif and rabi, of the total area irrigated in this Division were 58 and 42 against 64 and 36 of the last year and against 62 and 38 of the past 3 years. The highest percentage, viz., 86 of kharif was in the Karachi Canals District and the lowest was 50 in the Shikarpur Canals District, while the Begari, Ghar and Western Nara Districts had respectively 51, 58 and 56. The Karachi Canals, the Ghar Canals and the Western Nara Districts had as usual, the largest rice areas with 219, 661, 218, 054 and 150,079 acres, respectively, out of the total rice cultivation of the Division of 740,009. The largest areas under juari were in the Begari Canals District and the Western Nara District, viz., 108,839 and 60,684 acres, while the largest under bajri 92,601 acres were in the Begari Canals District and under cotton 610 in the Shikarpur Canals District.

Of the rabi crops wheat was largely grown in the Begari, Western Nara, Shikarpur and the Ghar Canals Districts and oil-seeds in the Begari Canals, the Ghar Canals and the Western Nara Districts.

17. The duties and deltas of canals in this Division this year indicate a decided improvement with a few exceptions (particularly in the Western Nara District where much cultivation was flooded by hill torrents).

BEGARI CANALS DISTRICT.

Desert Canal.

The duty and delta for the year were 125 and 2.1, respectively, as compared with 101 and 4.3 of the previous year. The increase in duty and decrease in delta is due to good regulation, to heavy rain during August and September, the reduced number of days in which the canal flowed and to the high proportion of rabi cultivation.

*Unsharwah.*

The duty and delta were 83 and 2.8 as compared with 62 and 4.9 respectively in the previous year. The favourable results are due to better distribution, heavy rains in August and September, the reduced number of days in which the canal flowed and to the high proportion of rabi cultivation.

*Begari Canal.*

The duty and delta were 74 and 3.8 as compared with 108 and 3.7, respectively, in the previous year. The lower duty is due to the increased average discharge, the decrease in kharif cultivation and the big remissions necessary owing to crops flooded by hill torrents and rain water.

SHIKARPUR CANALS DISTRICT.

The duties and deltas in the canals in Rohri, the Chitti, the Rajib, the Garang and the Sind Canal show a uniform improvement due to a reduction in rice cultivation, heavy rains and high late river which tended to increase the area brought under rabi cultivation and judicious regulation.

*Mahiwah.*

The duty and delta for the year were 50 and 4.4 as compared with 37 and 5.2, respectively, in the previous year. The favourable results are due to decrease in rice cultivation, heavy rains and high late river which helped to increase the area brought under rabi cultivation and the judicious regulation of the canal.

GHAR CANALS DISTRICT.*Sukkur Canal.*

The kharif and rabi duties were 36 and 164 as compared with 34 and 82, respectively, in the previous year. The deltas were 6.2 and 1.1 as compared with 6.7 and 1.1. The slight improvement in the kharif duty and delta is due to timely rains and decrease in rice owing to the low inundation in the first half of the season. The increase in the rabi duty is due to the heavy rainfall and high inundation in the latter half of the season which flooded the land sufficiently for rabi cultivation.

*Ghar Canal.*

The duty and delta were 87 and 4.3 as compared with 99 and 3.3, respectively, in the previous year. The unfavourable results are due to less kharif cultivation owing to low early inundation exclusion of about 20,000 acres due to remissions owing to flooding by hill torrents and no corresponding increase in rabi cultivation due to the state of the country damaged by floods.

KARACHI CANALS DISTRICT.*Saitah Canal.*

The duty and delta were 18 and 11.9 as compared with 10 and 21.4, respectively, in the previous year. The very low duty and high delta are due to overwatering of the crops and dearth of rabi cultivation.

*Baghar.*

The very low duty and an excessive delta are due to a big volume of water running to waste into the sea.

*Pinyari Canal.*

The duty and delta were 32 and 6.7 the same as in the previous year. The canal would have shown better results owing to increase in rabi cultivation had not large areas come under remission.

*Kalri Canal.*

The duty and delta were 33 and 6.5 as compared with 22 and 9.7, respectively, in the previous year. The favourable results obtained notwithstanding heavy kharif remissions are due to the low supply in the first half of the season and to increase in area under rabi.

WESTERN NARA DISTRICT.*Western Nara including the new feeder and the Pritchard Canal.*

The duty and delta were 46 and 6.3 as compared with 67 and 4.2, respectively, in the previous year. The decrease in duty and increase in delta are due to heavy remissions on over 80,000 acres of kharif area, due to hill floods and to decrease in rabi cultivation owing to the deserted and flooded country.

*Mariwah.*

The duty and delta were 45 and 6.5 as compared with 39 and 5.5, respectively, in the previous year. The increase in duty is due to an increase in rabi cultivation and that in delta to the increased number of days the canal flowed without corresponding results in the end of the season.

*Dadu Canals.*

The duty and delta were 219 and 1.4 as compared with 57 and 4.4, respectively, in the previous year. These results are due, notwithstanding heavy kharif remissions, to the very low supply in the first half of the season, almost complete cut off at head in the latter half of the season, decrease of kharif cultivation and increase in rabi area.

*Phitta Canal.*

The duty and delta were 226 and 1.22 as compared with 18 and 3.1, respectively, in the previous year. These favourable results are due to the same causes given for the Dadu Canals.

*Chario Wahur including the Munchur lake.*

The duty and delta were 11 and 29.72. No comparison with last year's results can be made as the discharge observations in that year were incomplete. The very low duty and high delta are due to water running into the Munchur Lake. Instead of a marked increase in rabi cultivation there is a decrease owing to rabi areas remaining flooded for want of an independent and efficient drainage channel from the Munchur areas to the river.

*Canals north of Kotri.*

The duty and delta were 49 and 3.35 as compared with 36 and 5.5, respectively, in the previous year. The favourable results are due, notwithstanding heavy kharif remission, to a reduction, in the number of days the canal flowed as also to the very low discharge in the first half of the season, decrease of kharif cultivation and increase in rabi area.

*Wahurwah.*

The duty and delta were 11.7 and 1.47. No comparison with last year's results is possible as the latter were incomplete as remarked in that year's report.

18. On 'Major Works' the figures were 28.70 per cent. and Rs. 0.72 Incidence of working expenses per acre as compared with 28.19 per cent. and Rs. 0.67 on the assessed revenue per acre in the previous year. Under 'Minor Works' the figures were 22.69 per cent. and Rs. 1.77 per acre as compared with 27.00 per cent. and Rs. 1.00 per acre last year.

19. The total value of crops grown on the irrigated area of 2,021,921 acres Value of each kind of crop was estimated by the Revenue authorities at irrigated. Rs. 5,02,70,614 which gives an average of 25 per acre.

20. The agricultural and other conditions of the year under review, as affecting the areas irrigated by the principal works, such as the nature of the seasons, the state of demand and supply, &c., are given in the following paragraph.

21. The principal irrigation works in this Division are the Desert Canal, the Unharwah, the Begari, the Mahiwah, the Sukkur Canal, the Ghar and the Satnah.

The first four are 'Major Works' and the remaining three 'Minor Works' for which both Capital and Revenue accounts are kept. There are also other irrigation systems, viz., the Sind Canal, the Western Nara, the Baghar, the Kalri and the Pinyari. These, however, with a number of small canals taking off direct from the river, are classed as "Works for which only Revenue Accounts are kept." All the canals are inundation canals.

The inundation of 1917 was remarkable for the lowness of the river throughout the month of July, its good and steady level throughout August and its abnormal height throughout the whole of September.

The river commenced to rise at the beginning of June, but did not reach the fair irrigating level of 13 feet on the Bukkur gauge till the 9th of August 1917. It continued above this level for a period of 30 days as compared with 9 days in the last year, none in the year 1915 and 18 days the average of previous triennium.

The fair irrigating level of 17 feet on the Kotri gauge was first registered on the 1st August 1917. The river remained above this level from 1st August to 12th October, a period of 73 days, as compared with 86 in the previous year, 66 in the year 1915 and 84 days the average of the previous three years.

The highest readings for the year were 15.8 feet on the Bukkur gauge on the 16th August and 23.0 feet on the Kotri gauge on the 6th September. As compared with 13.6 and 22.1 on the Bukkur and Kotri gauges, respectively, in 1916, and as compared with the recorded maximum readings on these two gauges of 17.9 feet and 23.8 feet, respectively.

The rainfall during the season was abnormal throughout Sind and did a great deal of damage to cultivation and property. The season, owing to the very late rise of the river and to abnormal rainfall, was a very bad one for dry crop cultivation. As regards rice, the seedlings withered in July and had to be resown in many places and a good deal of the rice cultivation in low lands was flooded. The season was a poor one except for rabi cultivation on high lands.

The areas irrigated in the whole division under different crops are given in Statement F, paragraph 15, above. There was a decrease of 182,899 and 62,953 acres as compared with the previous year and the average of the previous triennium, respectively.

22. The following paragraphs give details of different works or groups of works and a comparison of the agricultural and financial results of the year 1917-18 with the previous year and the average of the previous triennium and the main causes of any important differences in results.

### I.—MAJOR WORKS.

#### PRODUCTIVE WORKS.

##### A.—Desert Canal.

23. An expenditure of Rs. 482 was incurred during the year on lowering Capital. pavement of Adiowah Bund Regulator taking off the the Desert Canal.

A sum of Rs. 5,775 was spent during the year on (1) constructing a store room at Jacobabad, (2) providing furniture in Extensions and Improvements. Public Works Department inspection bungalows and (3) constructing a baulkshed at mile 7 of the Desert Canal.

Maintenance and repairs. The main canal and its branches were maintained in good order at a cost of Rs. 60,692 including 'Work Establishment.'

The total area irrigated, including dubari, during the year was 206,279 acres Irrigation. out of which 91,130 acres were under kharif and 115,149 acres under rabi, against 240,347 acres in the previous year and 203,386 acres the average of the previous triennium. The decrease is due to less cultivation of kharif owing to low level of river in the beginning of the season and a large decrease in kharif in Nasirabad Tahsil (Khelat territory) is due to less cultivation of the crop owing to (1) the appearance of "tid" at the time of sowing of kharif crops, (2) adoption of rotations due to insufficiency of water in canal, and (3) to heavy rains and floods.

The gross revenue from all sources amounted to Rs. 4,52,182 compared Financial results. with Rs. 4,80,321 of the last year and Rs. 4,17,536 the average of the previous triennium. Deducting working expenses Rs. 1,19,872 the net revenue during the year was Rs. 3,32,310 or Rs. 12.21 per cent. on the capital outlay to end of the year as compared with 13.07 of the last year and 10.77 the average of the previous triennium. The decrease in revenue as compared with last year is due to the same causes as given above under cultivation paragraph.

The remissions granted during the year amounted to Rs. 38,934 against General remarks. Rs. 65,721 of the last year. The increase in the last year's remission was due to revised settlement in Thul, Kandhkot and Kashmor talukas.

##### B.—Unharioah.

Capital. 24. No expenditure was incurred under this head during the year under report.

A sum of Rs 11,265 was spent under this head on (1) providing furniture in Public Works Department Inspection bungalows along Unharwah, (2) making additions and alterations to Public Works Department Inspection bungalow at Tangwani, (3) constructing Public Works Department Inspection bungalow, class II, at Thul, and (4) excavating karia Dadwah.

The main canal and its branches were maintained in good order at a cost of Rs. 32,131 including 'Works Establishment.'

The total area cultivated during the year was 89,922 acres out of which 45,576 acres were under kharif and 44,346 acres under rabi, as compared with 81,262 acres of the average of the previous triennium and 85,241 acres of the past year. The increase in total cultivation is due to increase in rabi cultivation owing to high level of the river during August and September and heavy rains.

The gross revenue amounted to Rs. 2,09,867 as compared with Rs. 1,87,930 of the last year and Rs. 1,78,090 the average of the previous triennium. Financial results. Deducting working expenses Rs. 72,624, the net revenue during the year was Rs. 1,37,243 or 17·40 per cent. on the capital outlay to the end of the year as compared with 15·83 per cent. of the last year and 15·37 per cent. of the average of the previous triennium. The increase in net revenue is due to the same cause as given above in cultivation paragraph.

The remissions granted amounted to Rs. 13,001 against Rs. 23,234 of the previous year. General remarks. The increase of the last year's remissions was due to the revised settlement.

The principal crops grown were—

### C.—Begari Canal.

Capital. 25. No expenditure was incurred under this head.

A sum of Rs. 5,324 was spent under this head on (1) providing furniture in Public Works Department Inspection bungalows, Extensions and improvements. (2) constructing Darogas' landhis at 19 and 67 miles and (3) constructing head sluice over distributary No. 1, Right Bank, Choi Branch.

The main canal and its branches were maintained in good order at a cost of Rs. 80,822 including 'Works establishment,' against Rs. 87,240 spent during the last year.

The total area cultivated during the year was 331,016 acres out of which 183,632 acres were under kharif and 147,334 acres under rabi, as compared with 327,559 acres the average of the previous triennium and with 361,455 acres of the previous year. The decrease in cultivation as compared with the last year 1916-17 is due to the same causes as are given under same heading of the Desert Canal.

The gross revenue of the year amounted to Rs. 6,48,022 as compared with Financial results. Rs. 7,34,73 of the last year and Rs. 6,63,221 the average of the previous triennium. Deducting working expenses Rs. 1,63,416 and share due to old irrigation Rs. 24,854, the net revenue during the year due to improvements was Rs. 4,59,753 or Rs. 18·84 per cent. on the capital outlay to end of the year as compared with 21·77 per cent. in the last year and 18·71 per cent. the average of the previous triennium.

General remarks. The remissions during the year amounted to Rs. 46,890 against Rs. 19,488 of the previous year. The remissions were chiefly due to wire worms and insects, &c.

The principal crops grown were—

#### D.—Mahiwah.

26. No expenditure was incurred under this head.

A sum of Rs. 1,227 was spent during the year on making certain minor Extensions and improvements. additions and alterations to a few Public Works bungalows and providing furniture.

Maintenance and repairs.

The canal and its branches were maintained in good order at a cost of Rs. 66,862; including 'Works establishment.'

The total area irrigated was 66,792 acres of which 30,171 acres were under Irrigation. kharif and 36,621 acres under rabi. When compared with the average of the previous triennium 68,672 acres and 74,434 acres of the last year, the total cultivation shows a decrease of 1,880 and 7,642 acres, respectively. The decrease in cultivation was due to low kharif inundation.

The gross revenue amounted to Rs. 1,73,801 as compared with Rs. 1,89,108 Financial results. of the last year and Rs. 1,69,401 the average of the previous triennium. Deducting working expenses Rs. 86,377 and share due to old irrigation Rs. 89,217 the net revenue during the year due to improvements is Rs. 1,793.

General remarks. The remissions granted amounted to Rs. 5,525. of which Rs. 3,055 were on account of kharif and Rs. 2,470 for rabi.

A sum of Rs. 3,107 was expended under this head during the year on  
*Extensions and improvements.* (1) completing the construction of a well in the compound of Public Works Inspection bungalow at Ruk, (2) constructing a sluice over Karia Shah at 0-0-483, Left Bank, Sind Sanhri on the Sukkur Canal, (3) constructing a tube well in the compound of 2nd class Inspection bungalow at Sanjharbhati, (4) providing additional furniture in Public Works Department Inspection bungalows, Sukkur Canal, (5) additions and alterations to 2nd class Inspection bungalow at Sanjharbhati, (6) additions and alterations to and laying water pipe  $\frac{3}{4}$ " diameter in the Public Works Inspection bungalow, class I at Sukkur and (7) additions and alterations to Public Works Inspection bungalow at Ruk.

The main canal and branches were maintained in good order at a cost of  
*Maintenance and repairs.* Rs. 42,257 including 'Works establishment' against Rs. 47,930 of the last year.

The total cultivation was 129,143 acres of which 68,364 acres were under Irrigation. kharif and 60,779 acres were under rabi as compared with 115,490 acres the average of the previous triennium and 126,260 acres of the previous year. The increase of 12,161 acres in rabi as compared with that of the previous triennium was due to the very good inundation in the latter half of the season and to the encouragement given for the extension of the wheat cultivation during the year. The decrease in kharif is due to the late inundation.

The gross revenue realized during the year amounted to Rs. 2,99,878 as compared with Rs. 3,07,712 of the last year and Rs. 2,86,599 the average of the previous triennium. Deducting working expenses Rs. 80,654 and share due to old irrigation Rs. 71,444 the net revenue due to improvement was Rs. 1,47,780 giving a return of 10.36 per cent. on the capital outlay against 10.82 per cent. of the last year and 8.47 the average of the previous triennium. The decrease in net revenue notwithstanding the increase in total cultivation as compared with the last year and the average of the previous triennium is due to large remissions owing to submersion of kharif crop due to hill torrents and extraordinary heavy rain.

*General remarks.* Remissions granted during the year amounted to Rs. 20,227 against Rs. 2,696 in the previous year.

#### II.—Ghar Canal.

28. No expenditure was incurred under this head during the year.

A sum of Rs. 5,894 was spent under this head during the year, on constructing four new wells at Inspection bungalows, on completion of nine open type sluices and on some other petty works.

**Maintenance and repairs.**

A total expenditure during the year was Rs. 94,919 against Rs. 1,46,453 in the previous year including 'Works establishment.'

The total cultivation was 342,210 acres of which 226,396 acres were under kharif and 135,814 acres under rabi against 356,312 acres in the previous year and 348,400 acres the average of the previous triennium. As compared with the average of the previous triennium the decrease of 3,410 acres in kharif was due to unfavourable inundation in the first half of the season and of 2,780 acres in rabi due to many lands being flooded and not drying up in time for cultivation.

The gross revenue amounted to Rs. 9,08,560 as compared with Rs. 9,79,676 of the last year and Rs. 9,55,689 the average of the previous triennium.

Deducting the working expenses Rs. 1,92,248 and share due to old irrigation Rs. 1,16,671, the net revenue during the year due to improvements was Rs. 5,99,641, which represents a return of 103.52 per cent. on the capital outlay against 104.99 per cent. of the last year and 104.98 per cent. the average of the past three years. The decrease in net revenue is due to large remissions for the same reasons as given under similar heading for Sukkur Canal.

**General remarks.**

The remissions granted during the year amounted to Rs. 93,014 against Rs. 6,978 in the previous year.

The total area irrigated including dubari in 1917-18 was 17,026 acres of which 16,080 were under kharif and 946 under rabi against 12,419 acres of the last year and 12,681 acres the average of the previous triennium. Increase in cultivation is due to good water.

The gross revenue amounted to Rs. 44,873 against Rs. 21,565 of the last year and Rs. 23,681 the average of the past triennium.

**Financial results.**

Deducting working expenses Rs. 12,362 and share due to old irrigation Rs. 6,927 the net revenue during the year due to improvements was Rs. 25,584 which represents a return of 14.21 per cent. on the capital outlay.

**General remarks.**

The remissions granted during the year amounted to Rs. 2,374 against Rs. 2,826 in the previous year.

The principal crops grown were—

B—WORKS FOR WHICH ONLY REVENUE ACCOUNTS ARE KEPT.

*I.—Canals in the Shikarpur Canals District.*

30. The principal canals are the Sind Canal, the Rajib, the Chitti and the Garang on the right bank of the river and the canals in the Rohri Division on the left bank.

A sum of Rs. 16,534 was spent during the year on (1) additions and Extensions and improvements. alterations to the existing Bichanji Regulator over Chitti Canal, (2) constructing Daroga's landhi, &c., at Head Regulator over Colonel Fife's Channel, (3) additions and alterations to Public Works Inspection bungalows at Loi, Shikarpur, Miani, Sahta, Thahrio Sherkot and Shahpur, (4) sinking a paccia well in the compound of subordinate's quarters at Kassim on Chitti Canal and (5) additions and alterations to the regulator at Chiman at mile 5/5 of the old Sind Canal and other small works.

Maintenance and repairs. The expenditure incurred under this head was Rs. 1,00,756 against Rs. 1,02,763 in the previous year.

The total area irrigated under this head was 179,630 acres of which Irrigation. 95,121 acres were under kharif and 4,509 acres under rabi as compared with 190,928 acres of the last year and 189,720 acres the average of the previous triennium. When compared with the average it shows a decrease of 10,090 acres.

The total canal revenue realized was Rs. 5,42,833 and maintenance and Financial results. revenue collection charges Rs. 1,34,508 which amounts to 24.8 per cent. of the revenue and Rs. 0.9 per acre of the area irrigated excluding dubari. The corresponding figures for the previous triennium averaged 27.5 per cent. and Rs. 0.9, respectively.

General remarks. The remissions granted during the year amounted to Rs. 3,127 against Rs. 741 of the previous year.

The principal crops grown were—

*II.—Canals in the Western Nara District.*

31. The district comprises the following main canals which take off direct from the river :—

The Western Nara with its two feeders (the new feeder and the Pritchand canal), the Marvi, the Phitta, the Chario Wahur with Aral and the Dunster, the Dadu canals and the canals north of Kotri.

The Mancher lake is fed by the river through Chario Wahur by means of the Aral and the Dunster, also by the Western Nara and by rain water from the hills; it is drained for rabi cultivation through the Aral, the Dunster and the Chariowah when the river falls.

A sum of Rs. 37,805 was spent under this head on (1) constructing head Extensions and improvements. regulators over Chario Wahur Canal and Shah Panjo Canal, (2) constructing Daroga's landhi at Bahawalpur, (3) additions and alterations to Inspection Bungalow at Mehar, (4) widening left berm of Western Nara, (5) constructing a baulkshed at Head Regulator of Phitta Canal, (6) additions and alterations to the Public Works Department Sub-Divisional office at Mehar, (7) reconstructing portion of compound wall of Public Works Department Inspection bungalow at Tharri and (8) making chowki furniture for bungalows in the District.

The total expenditure under this head including special repairs amounted to Rs. 1,93,653 and was incurred on ordinary clearance of canals and on the special repairs such as (1) new cut to Phitta Canal, (2) special clearance to Dhoro B feeding the Upper Nurwah, (3) new head for the Kolab Sial and (4) special repairs to Executive Engineer's bungalow at Larkana and other miscellaneous items.

The total area irrigated was 386,662 acres of which 217,995 acres were under kharif and 168,667 acres under rabi as compared with the total area of 444,060 acres of the past triennium, of which 243,206 acres were under kharif and 200,854 under rabi. The decrease of 25,211 acres under kharif and 34,187 under rabi was due to the very low inundation at the beginning and the exceptional heavy rains and hill floods late in the season, which submerged much of the kharif crops and did not allow the rabi lands to be exposed and sufficiently dried to cultivate rabi crops.

The total canal revenue was Rs. 7,40,567 as compared with Rs. 10,63,444 the average of the past triennium. The revenue and collection charges during the year were Rs. 2,56,887 being 34·7 per cent. of the revenue and Rs. '8 per acre of the area irrigated excluding dubari; the average corresponding figures of the previous triennium being 25·9 and '8, respectively. The decrease in the revenue is due to the same causes as given above for cultivation.

*General remarks.*

The remissions granted during the year amounted to Rs. 3,82,639 against Rs. 1,92,587 of the last year.

### *III.—Canals in the Karachi Canals District.*

32. The principal canals are the Kalri, the Baghar and the Pinyari with a number of small canals taking off direct from the river.

*Extensions and improvements.*

The expenditure under this head was Rs. 4,536 against Rs. 7,662 of the last year.

*Maintenance and repairs.*

The expenditure incurred under this head, including 'Works establishment,' was Rs. 1,33,068 against Rs. 1,11,490 of the previous year.

The total area irrigated was 238,268 acres of which 203,560 were under kharif and 34,708 under rabi as compared with 260,371 of the previous year and 240,535 the average of the previous triennium. As compared with the average kharif of 106,734 acres and rabi of 33,801 acres of the last triennium, the decrease in kharif of 3,174 acres is due to early seedlings, having withered for want of water during the early part of the season and the increase of 907 acres under rabi was due to late supply being available in the canals.

The total canal revenue realized was Rs. 4,56,322 and maintenance and revenue charges amounted to Rs. 1,82,164 which amounts to 39·9 per cent. of the revenue and Rs. 0·8 per acre on the area irrigated excluding dubari, the corresponding figures for the previous and the average of the previous triennium being 33·8 per cent. and Rs. 0·8 per acre and Rs. 46·2 per cent. and Rs. 0·9 per acre, respectively. The decrease in revenue as compared with the last year is partly due to large remissions and partly to less kharif cultivation for the reasons given under heading "Irrigation" above.

**General remarks.** The remissions granted during the year amounted to Rs. 1,00,540 against Rs. 41,325.

33. The principal bunds in this division on the right bank of the river are the Kashmor, the Sukkur-Begari, the Ghar, the Nara, the bunds north of Kotri, and the right bank bunds in the Karachi Canals District, and on the left bank, the Kassimpur bund in the Shikarpur Canals District and the left bank bunds in the Karachi Canals District.

The sum of Rs. 1,91,197 was spent against Rs. 1,40,306 of the last year.

**Extensions and improvements.** The works carried out were (1) constructing a sluice in mile 24/3 of the Abad loop of the Sukkur-Begari Bund and other works in the Shikarpur Canals District, (2) constructing a forest sluice through the Jhalli bund mile 22/1, (3) constructing a well with baulkshed and bath place at Ayo-jo-Goth and other works in the Ghar Canals District, (4) extension of Western Nara bund from Phitta head to Sekwan Rs. 63,893, (5) raising and strengthening Nara bunds in Dadu and Pritchard Canal sub-divisions Rs. 48,998 and other works in the Western Nara District, (6) raising and strengthening of the bunds on the right and left banks and (7) construction of new bund sluices in the bund on both sides in the Karachi Canals District.

**Maintenance and repairs.** The expenditure of maintenance and repairs and special repairs to river embankment, including establishment and tools and plant charges was Rs. 6,31,631.

**Irrigation and financial results.** The cultivation during 1917-18 on the canals *ex* Kashmor Bund, on the bunds in the Shikarpur Canals District, the Ghar Canals, the Western Nara and the Karachi Canals Districts, was 5,147, 12,002, 548, 4,148 and, 13,128 acres, respectively and the revenue Rs. 13,331, 27,848, 5,559, 12,033 and 21,536, respectively.

**General remarks.** The remissions granted during the year under report under this head were Rs. 8,400. A sum of Rs. 6,382 was spent on the Mathematical Instrument Depot on Establishment and Tools and Plant.

A total sum of Rs. 1,19,696 was spent by the Chief Engineer, Indus River Commission, of which Rs. 22,827 were spent on Extensions and Improvements (1) Rs. 22,602 on making surveys on the Indus and (2) Rs. 225 on demarcating boundary between Sind and Bahawalpur State; Rs. 12,507 on Maintenance and Repairs of which Rs. 11,742 were spent on maintenance of steamers, gauges, and snagging the river Indus and Rs. 765 on maintenance of other works, Rs. 81,271 under regular establishment and Rs. 3,091 under Tools and Plant.

Expenditure on, and receipts from, gardens.

34. The expenditure on, and receipts from, gardens during the year are compared below with the three previous years' expenditure and receipts:—




