Under Bye-law 34 of the Bye-laws of the Imperial Council of Agricultural Research, I have the honour to forward herewith a copy of the Annual Report of the Accountant General, Central Revenues on the accounts of the Council for the year 1936-37 together with a copy of the audited accounts for submission to the Governing Body of the Council and to the Government of India.

Report on the accounts of the Imperial Council of Agricultural Research for the year 1936-37.

The accounts of the Imperial Council of Agricultural Research for the year ending 31st March 1937, were audited at Simla by Mr. P. C. Chakravarti, Accountant, Outside Audit Department, Office of the Accountant General, Central Revenues, New Delhi, from the 17th to the 22nd of May 1937. The accounts for the months of June 1936, August 1936, and December 1936, were selected for a detailed examination. The audit fee for a party of one accountant and one clerk for 5 days at Rs. 70 (Rupees seventy) per day amounts to Rs. 350 (Rupees three hundred and fifty) and may kindly be credited to Government under the head "XLV1—Miscellaneous Fees for Government Audit—Central" and intimation of credit sent to this office as usual.

- 2. A certified copy of the annual accounts of Receipts and Payments for the year 1936-37, relating to the grant for research purposes, together with a statement showing the particulars of advances, securities, and cash balance as on the 31st March 1937, is appended.
- 3. The total amounts of receipts and payments during 1936-37 (excluding investments and re-investments) are given below:—

- (a) The original contracts were reported to have been filed in the office of the Sugar Technologist at Cawnpore. They were called for by the council but did not arrive by the date of the close of audit. It is requested that the same may kindly be made available in connection with the scrutiny of the bills at the next inspection.
- (b) The buildings referred to at items (i) and (iii) above were apparently completed in December 1935, but the final bills of the contractor had not been received for payment by the date of the close of audit.

No information was available as to when the work referred to at item (ii) above was actually begun and completed. The final bill of the contractor in respect of this work also had not been received for payment by the time of the close of audit.

Steps may kindly be taken to expedite the submission of the final bills.

Replies to the Points raised in the Reports of the Inspection of the accounts of the Imperial Council of Agricultural Research for 1936-37.

The matter is still under consideration and the file was seen by the A. G., C. R. on 13th July 1937.

The Director, Imperial Institute of Sugar Technology has been requested to record a certificate of Physical Verification of the Stock in hand.

The original contracts will be produced to audit at the next inspection.

Under the terms of the contract final bills were not to be paid until a certificate to the effect that the work had been carried out in accordance with the terms of the contract in all respects was received from an Engineer to be nominated by the Vice-Chairman of the Council. This certificate was received in May 1937 and the Director has already been requested to expedite submission of the final bills. The bills will be produced at the next inspection together with information as to the dates of commencement and completion of the factory buildings.

LETTER FROM THE SECRETARY, IMPERIAL COUNCIL OF AGRICULTURAL RESEARCH, TO THE DIRECTOR, IMPERIAL INSTITUTE OF SUGAR TECHNOLOGY, CAWNPORE, No. F. 82 (1)/37-G., DATED THE 21ST JULY 1937.

I am directed to bring to your notice the following comments on the accounts of the Imperial Council of Agricultural Research for 1936-37:—

- (i) The register of stock account of the Sugar Standard sets does not contain a certificate regarding the physical verification and correctness of the stock in hand.
- (ii) Considerable delay occurs between the date of receipt of cheques in the Director's office and the date of their transmission to this Department. In order to comply with the requirements of audit, I am now to request that (i) a certificate be recorded by you in the Stock Account of Sugar Standard Sets as to the opening balance in hand at the time the register was started. In case the balance of the stock in hand was nil, the certificate should be modified accordingly.
- (iii) Delays in the transmission of the cheques, etc., realised on behalf of the Council should be carefully avoided in future.


