### P R E F A C E .

Government having ordered that the reports and correspondence relating to the revision by me, in the revenue year 1849-50, of the assessment of the Ráhuri Táluka, in the Ahmednagar Collectorate, be prepared for the press under my supervision, I have, with their approval, extracted, from the official records of the time, all papers bearing on the subject that appear to be of any importance, and have arranged them in their proper order. Those selected are given without material alteration, and, in addition, a diagram has been appended, showing the financial results of the settlement up to 1865-66, the latest year for which I am in possession of complete returns. A few villages formerly included in the táluka were, subsequently to 1849-50, transferred to other districts; but the information given in the diagram has been prepared from the accounts of the several villages of which the táluka was made up at the time of settlement, and which form the subject of the correspondence now published.

## APPENDIX.

## MEMORANDUM No. 499 OF 1870.

The accompanying diagram, prepared from information supplied by the Collector of Ahmednagar, may be considered of interest as exhibiting the financial results of the settlement in the 101 villages formerly comprised in the Ráhuri Táluka to which the preceding papers refer. It shows the revenue collections from 1849-50 to 1865-66, the last year for which I am in possession of returns, as contrasted with those of the former system under British rule, from 1818-19 to 1847-48.

2. The survey rental on arable land, as indicated by the height of the blue column of the diagram, is Rs. 1,27,848, the corrected amount given in my report No. 133 of 22nd November 1850.

3. The diagram affords very satisfactory evidence of the financial success of the settlement, and shows that, although the district, as anticipated by me, was some time in recovering completely from its former state of depression and from the effects of the high collections of 1847-48, its progress, especially of late years, has been sure and steady. No doubt the rise in prices, during the period embraced in the last three or four years entered in the diagram, has materially aided in bringing about such satisfactory results, and has caused my anticipations to be more than realised; but, before prices rose to any great extent, and notwithstanding its previous impoverished condition and some unfavourable seasons at the outset, the district was from the first making a rapid advance towards prosperity. This can be easily perceived from an inspection of the diagram, the annual collections and cultivation shown in it having, with very slight exceptions, a strong and permanent upward tendency; whilst those of the former system, as exhibited in the diagram of my original report, are marked by extreme downward as well as upward fluctuations. The average annual realizations of land revenue have also risen from about Rs. 60,000 under the old system to about Rs. 95,000 under the new, a difference of 58 per cent. in favour of the latter. Moreover, the realizations in 1865-66, the last year entered in the diagram, amounted, in round numbers, to Rs. 1,22,000, being an increase of 103 per cent. on the former average. The remissions have also fallen from an average annual sum of about Rs. 23,000 under the old system to Rs. 2,400 under the new, a decrease of nearly nine-tenths, and for the last ten years of those entered in the diagram the remissions have been so slight as hardly to deserve notice. The cultivation has, at the same time, increased from an annual average of about 61,000 acres under the old system to one of 148,000 acres under the new, an increase of about 142 per cent. This indicates a very large addition to the farming stock of the district, and shows that even inferior lands can be cultivated at a profit; the poor soils, and they appear to have been nearly all taken up for cultivation, being the last to be brought under the plough. It may further be mentioned that I have been informed by the local officers that, so far as could be easily ascertained, about 132 new wells have been constructed since the time of settlement, and that "the rayat class in Ráhuri is better off than formerly."

4. Even more favourable prospects may be looked for in future years; and should the rise in prices be permanent, which appears probable, there can be no doubt that the district will be able to bear, without the slightest inconvenience or injury, a considerably enhanced assessment when the time comes for revising the rates at the expiry of the present settlement, about ten years hence.
