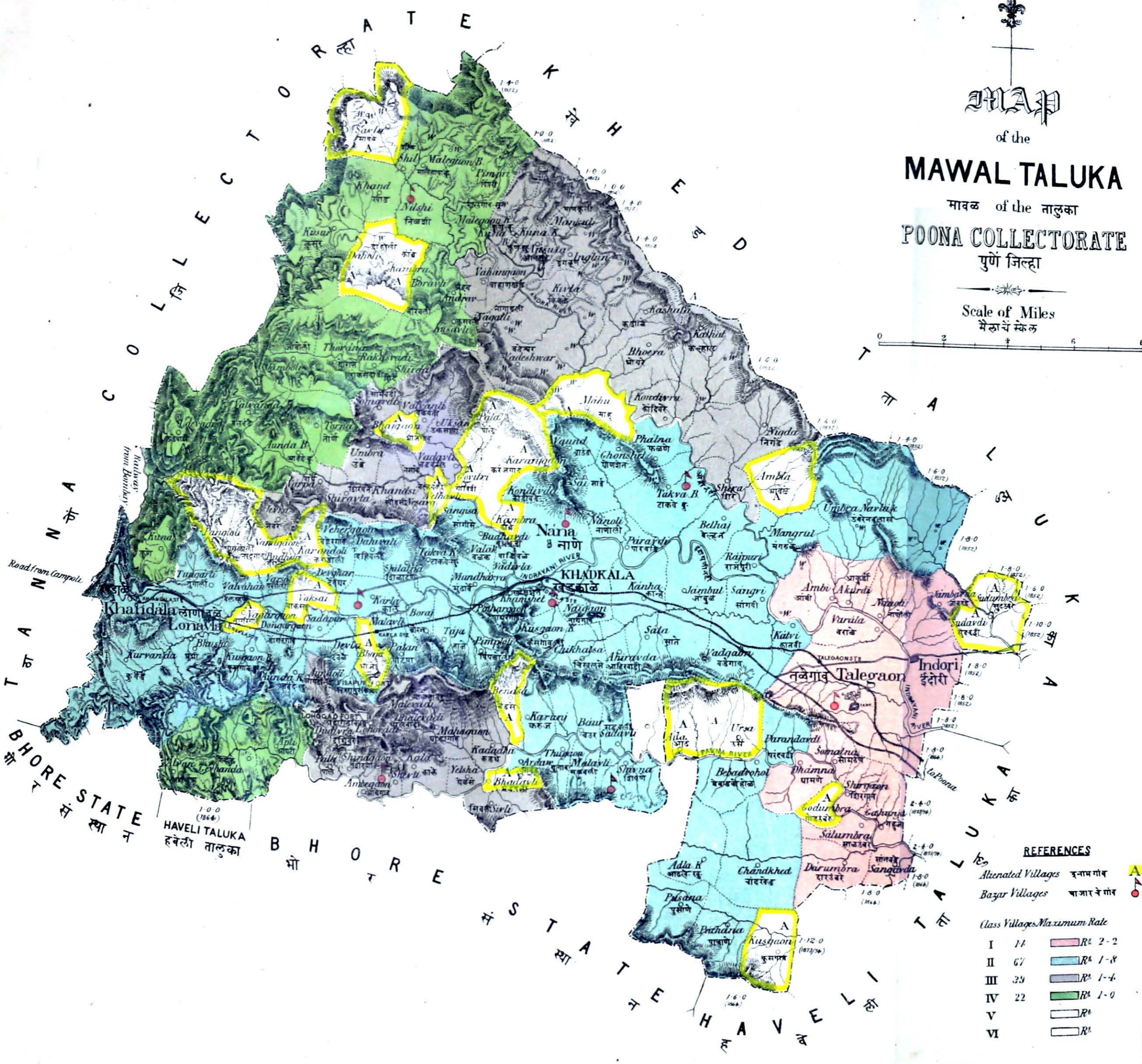
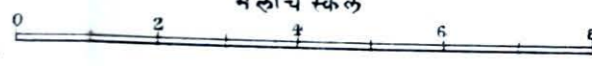

Sir,

I do myself the honour to submit, for the consideration of Government, proposals for the revision settlement of the Mával Táluka, which now comprises 168 villages, 142 being Government and 26 Inám.

2. In 1852-53, the year previous to the original settlement, the táluka contained in all 206 villages, which were subsequently augmented by 46 transferred at different times from the Khed and Haveli tálukas, while the transfer of 84 villages to the Haveli táluka in 1866-67 reduced the number to that mentioned in the last para. at which the strength of the táluka now stands. This report has to deal with the 142 Government villages only; the Inám villages will as usual subsequently take the rates which may be sanctioned for the Government villages which adjoin them.

3. The settlements now in force in the 142 Government villages, were made in the years and under the authorities shown below:—

4. The Mával Táluka was one of those originally measured and assessed by Mr. Pringle, and in preparing the survey record on which the settlement of 1853, now to be revised, was based, much of the old rough work of Mr. Pringle's field measurement was confirmed by the then Survey Officers and incorporated in the record. As the thirty years' lease approached maturity and the scheme of survey operations for the present revision began to be considered, it became a question how far it would be possible to utilise the original work in preparing a new and final record, which should be suitable for all future requirements. After weighing the arguments on both sides Government decided\* that an entire re-measurement and re-classification were indispensable.

5. The revision survey operations therefore, recently brought to a close, have been carried out *de novo* in all respects (except in the 7 villages revised in 1873-74, the measurement work of which has been retained). As the result of these operations—by which all existing Khátas have been separately measured and demarcated, Government land separated from Inám, holdings of excessive size broken up into smaller fields, and a record prepared correct in all respects according to present conditions,—the 17,241 old Survey Numbers have become 30,919 Revision Survey Nos. and Pot Nos.

6. The differences found in individual numbers between the old and new measurement are summarised below :—

The internal measurements therefore of the old work have been found to be very inaccurate, for in 48 per cent. of the total numbers the error exceeded 5 per cent., while in 31 per cent. of the old numbers it exceeded 10 per cent. The apparent causes of the differences exceeding 15 per cent. are given below :—

7. But an entire re-classification was desirable for strong reasons over and above the inaccuracy of the old measurement work.

Re-classification. It appears from a perusal of the original settlement papers that the method of classification adopted for the rice lands was a new one then devised for the first time; and though the main principle on which it was founded was correct, and has been followed in our subsequent classification, still the methods of application were imperfect and open to much improvement. The dry-crop classification, too, had been done in the first instance on a somewhat

done in 1873 in these villages on to the same plane with the rest of the taluka.

different scale, and much of the Mál'land, being then unoccupied and cultivated only at uncertain intervals, was not classed at all in the original survey. The entire re-classification, however, which was thus necessary in the great bulk of the villages, was not of course extended to the 7 villages revised in 1873-74. In these it was only necessary to examine the irrigated lands and arrange for any extension found to have taken place in their area; the rice classification also which had been done on the old system was revised, and the anna valuation of the dry-crop classification\* adjusted according to the revision scale. Very little time and expenditure was needed, therefore, to bring the work

The difference on the total area between the result of the two surveys is therefore insignificant, although as seen above (para. 6) there is little correspondence in the detail measurements. There has been a large extension (31·0 per cent.) in rice area, which has been brought about, we must suppose, mainly by the conversion of favourably situated dry-crop land into rice; the unassessed head has no doubt suffered diminution from encroachments, which have partly made up to the dry-crop head for the area converted from dry-crop into rice; but the garden area though increased remains insignificant in extent, as might be expected from the conformation and climate of the tract under report.

9. The Mával Táluka, which forms the South-Western corner of Poona District and comprises most of the country visible from the railway between Poona and the crest of the Ghát, is well known to many who are not officially concerned with its administration. It is bounded on the North and West by the Khed and Haveli Tálukas of Poona, on the South it marches with the territory of the Pant Sachiv of Bhor, and its Western boundary lies along the slopes of the Gháts, sometimes as much as a mile or two below the crest, sometimes actually along the crest itself. The general aspect of the district is hilly and bold; the surface of the valleys is particularly flat, but the streams, after the first 8 or 10 miles from their source at the Ghát crest, flow in deep beds or ravines which they have cut out for themselves through the débris of the rain-washed hills. The hills have been stripped of their forest growth and show at best but stunted brushwood even in the Forest Reserves. The Ráis, or scred groves, form the one exception where trees have been allowed to flourish, and in some instances even these are not respected.

10. Five spurs from the Gháts, the Northern and Southern of which pierce the district through to its Eastern border, divide the face of the country into five valleys, which differ much from each other in size and character. The Indráni and its tributary streams drain all but the Southernmost valley; this last is watered by the Páwana, which through part of its course forms the Southern boundary of the táluka. The valley of the Indráni itself, usually spoken of as the Náne-Mával, is at once the widest and most level, and also the most important, being traversed from end to end by the railway, side by side with which runs the old made-road between Bombay and Poona. The Southernmost valley watered by the river Páwana ranks next in size and accessibility, and next to it the Andar Mával, or valley of the Andar in the North of the district. The two short valleys, which lie intermediate between those of the Andar and Indráni, contain comparatively little level ground and are difficult of access to wheels.

11. In the Eastern valleys, especially along the banks of the Páwana, there is much excellent black soil, and soil of the same colour is found all up the valley of the Indráni to within 5 or 6 miles of the Ghát crest. The prevailing dry-crop land, however, is reddish or grey, and poor in depth and quality, but easily tilled, and capable with

heavy rainfall of yielding fine crops of the kinds of produce usually grown in hill districts. The soil of the rice-lands is mostly black in the Eastern valleys, but red and yellow become commoner the further we go West; the best description is of a fine yellow colour and has a peculiarly smooth texture.

12. In a district so situated the range of climate is necessarily great; in the Eastern extremity the climate of the plains meets that of the hills, and the most valuable kinds of dry-crop can flourish side by side with rice; while in most of the furthest Western villages the excessive rainfall forbids all dry-crop cultivation but that of the coarse hill grains. Between these two extremes the climate and cultivation vary somewhat irregularly, the characteristics of the plain country penetrating further or less far towards the West in proportion as the valleys are open and level, or narrower and more rough. In Appendix A will be found the average rainfall gauged during the last 11 years at three different towns, one on the Ghát crest, one near the Eastern border, and one intermediate between the two; the different variations of climate are therefore well represented.

The most remarkable feature in the statement is the large proportion of land (44·7 per cent.) under grass or fallow. Much of this area is no doubt hill land of poor quality, either permanently kept uncultivated for the sake of the grass which is used as ráb, or cultivated at short intervals with the coarse hill grains; there are many good kurans however included in this area, which furnish grass to the Poona market and are among the most profitable lands in the district. Of the cultivated produce rice covers the largest area, and is the most valuable and important. Mr. Whitcombe, who supervised the classification of the whole of the táluka, mentions that 17 kinds of rice are regularly grown: among the early varieties, Jog-ambemohor, Garwa-ambemohor, and Káli-sál are the most valuable, while of the late varieties, which are much more numerous, Matharwádi, Ghod-ambemohor, Halwa-ambemohor, and Kokanhál are the best. The rice of the Mával Táluka has a great name for excellence through all the Deccan, and in the district itself the villages named in the margin are said to produce rice of peculiarly good aroma and excellence, which commands by its reputation a special price in the market. Next in importance to rice comes wheat, which grows well as far West as Kárla, about 5 miles from the Gháts; the quality however appears to deteriorate the further West it is grown, and the grain of the most Western villages is generally soft and bellied (potya). Nágli or Náchni, though not valuable for exportation, is the staple food-grain of the

district, and is a very hardy robust crop; it covers 10 per cent. of the cultivated area but is grown chiefly in the light hill lands. Among the pulses gram is the most grown, but it should be noted that the return does not show the area of rice land sown with pulses as a second crop; if this could be included, their area would appear far larger. Khorásni (gingelly seed) is largely raised on the hill-sides, and will flourish in the poorest soils and on almost precipitous slopes.

14. The agriculture of the district demands but little comment, as its general nature and methods are well known and differ in no way from those of similarly situated tálukás.

**Agriculture.** The denudation of the hill-slopes is the feature which strikes one as most serious in this connection. Steep hill-sides, which are capable only without deterioration of kumri cultivation with fallow periods of 18 or 20 years, have been cultivated at shorter and shorter intervals, until one or two years' fallow only has become common; the inevitable result is apparent in the bare rock which now shows itself in large areas on every hill, and warns us that after a few years more of the present system the remaining soil will have been washed down into the plains. As a great portion of the land so situated is in private occupancy it is difficult to apply a remedy, but some scheme which would put a stop to the frequent loosening of the soil seems imperatively needed. I am aware that the matter has attracted the notice of the Forest Settlement Officer, and as it will doubtless be more fittingly dealt with by Government on his representation than on a settlement report, I make no special proposals on the subject.

**Communications.**

15. The valley of the Indráni and the Khandála Ghát have always formed the main line of communication between the Deccan and Bombay, and the made-road which now traverses the route was already in existence when the Mával Táluka was settled thirty-three years ago. That road however has since been superseded by the railway, which has now four stations in the district, [besides 3 minor stopping places,] and practically monopolises the seaward traffic. Eastwards to the

Poona market some kinds of produce are still carried by cart, and this traffic is considerable, averaging it appears from the toll returns about 40 laden carts daily during the months of April, May and June; while the average amount for which the Khadkála Toll Gate has been farmed for the last 5 years is Rs. 7,927. A heavy traffic is brought from the Khed and Junnar Tálukas to the Talegaon Station by a road which comes through Indori from Chákau on the old

Násik Road, and a bridge now in course of construction over the Indráni at Indori will soon replace the ferry and still further facilitate transit. The only other made-road in the táluka (if we except such small feeders as those from Talegaon and Kárla to their respective Railway Stations) is the one lately made

of joining communication with the Paud valley. But though carts can now traverse the whole distance with some little difficulty, the line has not been completed, and it would be made much more useful if connected also with the valley of the Páwana, close by the head of which it passes. Up the whole length of the valley just mentioned runs an old road made by the Peshwás, and still much used by carts as a fair-weather track: it connected the market

villages of Ambegaon and Shivna with Poona on the one side and Khandála on the other, and crossed into the valley of the Indráni by a pass near the fort of Lohagad, which is too difficult to be now worth making practicable. If, however, this old road were improved and connected with that across the Sákurpatár, the fertile valley of the Páwana would be opened up, and the expenditure would be usefully incurred. There is a pass\* too across the

hill between Shiwna (above mentioned) and the station at Khadkála, which could be made practicable for carts at little cost, and which would be a great convenience to traffic. Each of the three Northern valleys is accessible to carts to within a mile or two of the

Ghát crest, but the tracks are very rough and but little used, and lead to no markets. From the head of the Andar-Mával, however, laden bullocks make their way to and from the Konkan by a path which bears the name of the Nilshi Ghát, but the traffic is merely local and is confined to small quantities of salt, groceries, &c.

16. Talegaon is the largest market in the district, and owes its importance to the position it holds as the depôt of the trade between the Khed and Junnar Tálukas and Bombay. Potatoes, wheat, bájri, oil-seeds and chillies form the main staples of the coastward traffic, while cocoanuts, cotton cloth of sorts, salt, &c., come up from Bombay. The only other market of much importance is at Lánoli, where there is a large permanent population of European and Eurasian Railway employés, and a daily bázár is held, said to average sales to the amount of Rs. 350. Ambegaon in the Páwana valley, formerly the Mámlatdár's station, is a market of some local importance, and with Shiwna, Kárla, Takva Budruk, Nána and other villages, is the head-quarters of a few traders, who collect the produce of the adjacent country. There are weekly bázárs held also at several other small villages in different parts of the táluka.

17. A great deal of firewood, collected chiefly from the two small valleys which drain into the Indráini, North of Khadkála, is brought to that station and thence sent into Poona by rail. The amount which reached the railway daily during the hot months of last year was often as much as hundred cart-loads, and from the appearance of the wood it was evident that it came in great proportion from young and half grown trees of mango and jámbul, as well of less valuable sorts. The wood was cut, no doubt, almost entirely on lands in private occupancy, and it is to be regretted that no means are available to put a check on this export, which bids fair to strip the country of the little timber now remaining to it, in the course of the next year or two at most. A good deal of charcoal is also made for export, but this, though no less regrettable, is less open to observation, because the manufacture goes on in remote spots, and the charcoal is usually transported in carts, not more than two or three perhaps at a time.

18. The population may be said to be entirely agricultural, and there is no local industry calling for mention as such, though the expression of oil from the Khorásni grown in the district is carried on to some extent, and there are in all 168 mills, of the ordinary rough construction, employed on this work in different villages. Hardly any weaving is done, either of cotton or woollen fabrics, and the total number of looms in the district for such purpose is only 2 and 6 respectively.

19. The appendices which contain the statistical information for the táluka have been compiled separately for villages which have been settled for approximately equal periods, but in the following précis the main batch only of 133 villages is dealt with. The figures for the time of original settlement are taken from the old survey records, and are unfortunately imperfect under some heads; those for the current year are the result of a special census taken by the Revenue Department in July last:—

20. Population is shown to have increased in the proportion of 42.3 per cent. during the course of the expiring settlement, and now represents a density of 153\* to the square mile; about 34 per cent., however, of the total area of the district is comprised in hills, forest and unassessed waste, and in the absence of any large towns or seats of industry, the incidence per

square mile is rather high than otherwise. Houses of all descriptions are more numerous by 19·3 per cent. than at the original settlement, and appear therefore not to have increased in quite the same ratio as population: with regard to houses, however, it is never possible to ascertain whether precisely the same definition of a house obtained at each census, and there is no basis therefore for a close comparison. The increase in the better description of houses is satisfactory and indicates an advance in the standard of comfort.

21. The number of agricultural cattle has increased by 8·7 per cent. and it is plain that the number now kept is sufficient for the area under cultivation, as the proportion is one pair of oxen to 9 acres of cultivated land. This proportion is less than what existed at the commencement of the lease; but the explanation is easily found in the great curtailment of available grazing, which has resulted from the expansion of cultivation, and other causes which have been in operation during the course of the settlement.

22. The record of the old survey census is incomplete under the heads mentioned in the margin, but shows that in the matter of carts there has been a moderate increase (75·6 per cent). Situated as it were in the mouth of the funnel through which the trade of the Deccan pours down on to the coast, this district was early furnished with carts in numbers comparatively great for that time; and now that the trade to the coast has been monopolised by the railway, it is natural that the increase under this head should seem small compared with many talukas situated in the eastern plains, where carts were formerly a rarity.

23. The subjoined statement gives the same statistics as have been commented on above, re-compiled under heads of the 4 groups\* of villages, into which, later on in this report, it is proposed to divide the taluka for purposes of assessment. In these figures the whole 142 villages are brought together for completeness sake although 9 of these were settled comparatively recently:—

The improvement in the circumstances of the population during the currency of the lease is here seen to have been spread nearly evenly over the whole district. Population has increased faster in the plain villages and in the broad valley of the Indráni than in the hill villages of the 3rd and 4th groups, and this of course is natural. It is satisfactory to observe that in all the groups there has been an improvement in the class of dwellings, and in this connection the occasional use of corrugated iron roofing noticeable in many villages is worth mention. However much the artist may regret this unpicturesque sign of advancement, it is not to be wondered at if in this country of frequent fires and copious rainfall, the security of an iron roof should be appreciated. Working cattle have increased in numbers in each group, and in each are found to be in satisfactory proportion to the occupied area. The excessive increase under this head in the first group is due to the villages of Talegaon and Indori, in the first of which a great demand for carriage has arisen through the importance of its position as a depôt of railway traffic; while in Indori the old census returns are wanting, and the present figures appear as an absolute increase. There are more carts now than formerly in each group, but the increase in the hill villages is very noteworthy.

24. In Appendix H. will be found figures furnished for Government schools by the Educational Department, and for private ones collected by the classing establishment. There are, it appears, 14 Government boys' schools with an average attendance of 436 boys; one girls' school which numbers 19 girls, and three private schools with an average attendance of 69 boys. In all, therefore, 524 is the number under instruction, which is equal only to 1·0 per cent. on the total population. The proportion of the male population recorded as able to read is low also, being only 7·2 per cent., and the explanation is no doubt to be found in the comparatively wild state in which a large portion of the district still remains.

25. It appears from the figures given in Appendix I. that about 81 per cent. of the total numbers are cultivated by the Khátedárs alone or in partnership with others, about 9 per cent. are sublet for money rents, and nearly 6 per cent. for a share of the produce in kind. I do not attach much importance to these figures as they are necessarily compiled from the entries in the village papers, which, it is well known, show in very many instances the names of holders, whose interest in the soil has long ceased.

26. The three appendices noted in the margin are an abstract of the sub-registrar's records for the past three years, and will give a general idea of the value of land in this taluka, but great allowance must of course be made for circumstances affecting the price which may not have found mention in the registered deeds. Six hundred and seventy-seven deeds of mortgage have been registered in the 3 years (1883-84 to 1885-86), and a précis of the conditions of each is given in Appendix M. The amounts raised are in the majority of cases trifling, though the proportion borne to the area and assessment of the land is usually high. The conditions most common are that the land remains in possession of the mortgagee, who meanwhile pays the Government assessment until the loan is paid off. Sales and leases are also very numerous, and are no doubt

as a rule more often free from the influence of past money transactions than are mortgages. They show a high value is attached to the land, but afford in my opinion no useful basis for exact calculations on the subject.

27. In the original settlement report, the then Superintendent, Captain Francis, states that the rayats of the villages along the Poona road were much involved in debt to the numerous Márwádis settled on that line. From what I can learn this is not now the case to the same extent, and the condition of the rayats generally appears to me to be favourable. They are well clothed and well housed, and have a great resource, during the slack seasons of agricultural labour, in the employment which the workshops and maintenance establishment of the railway afford, both for skilled and unskilled labour. The neighbourhood too of such a large market as Poona, where fodder especially, and all kinds of bulky produce find remunerative sale, gives profitable employment to carts and oxen when they are not wanted in the fields; and on the whole it cannot be doubted that in this táluka the labour and produce of the rayat both fetch a very high value, and his condition is favourable in proportion.

28. The course of prices in the markets of Máwal and of Poona, which latter of course has always had a predominant influence, is shown in detail from the year 1844 downwards in the appendix. The subjoined table is a précis of the information there given for the Poona market:—

In this table are shown the average prices of the three most representative grains, for which information is available, for the first year of settlement and during three periods which together comprise the whole course of the expiring lease. During the first period of 10 years there was no very material fluctuation of prices. The second decade includes the years of the American War, which effected a great temporary rise in prices, and gave to exports an impulse, the influence of which has proved a lasting benefit to the whole country; and in the concluding period of 14 years are included the famine and its succeeding years of high prices, together with the years of depression which followed. The figures show that the average prices of the two latter periods are almost identical, and are roughly speaking 100 per cent. in advance of those ruling when the settlement was introduced, while they are about 75 per cent. higher than the average prices of the first decade after settlement.

29. The first two of the statements under the head Revenue History contain the figures for 29 and 100 villages respectively, and together include therefore the bulk of the villages now for settlement, in which the old lease has been running for 30 years and upwards. In all these villages, it will be seen from columns 2 and 3 of the statements, the waste land was taken up for cultivation rapidly during the first 10 years, and this movement continued, rather more slowly, until the immediate influence of the American War prices passed away, *i. e.* about the year 1870-71. Turning to the figures of the waste land available for cultivation it will be seen that this head was largely augmented in 1870-71 by an area of nearly 4,000 acres then thrown out of forest; as for some time past there has been a prohibition against giving out land for cultivation

until the arrangements connected with the forest settlement can be completed, we may surmise that a portion, at all events, of the area now shown as assessed waste would have passed into cultivation, but for the circumstance just mentioned. On the whole it may be said that from the year 1863-64,—the point, that is, when all the land ordinarily re-paying occupation had been taken up,—the occupied area and revenue have, with a few unimportant fluctuations, remained steady until the present time; and in this it will be seen the course of cultivation has coincided generally with that of prices. Remissions, it should be noted, have been practically unknown, and outstandings there have been none.

30. The small pressure which has been necessary to collect the revenue is illustrated by the subjoined table, the figures for which are furnished by the Mámlatdár :—

It will be seen that in no cases during the last 3 years has recourse been had to distraint.

31. Looking back over the whole period of the expiring settlement by the light of the information which has been commented on in detail above, it will be readily admitted that there is every sign of that advance in prosperity, which the improvement in the circumstances of the district would lead us to expect. Prices are now, and have been on the average for the last 24 years, about 75 per cent. in advance of those which ruled during the first ten years of the settlement, the period, be it observed, during which the bulk of the available waste was absorbed into occupation. The line of made-road which was formerly the sole means of external communication has been supplemented by a main line of railway, which now passes through the heart of the district and gives remunerative employment of different kinds to a large body of men; and the popularity of Lánoli and Khandaála as sanitaría has produced a demand for all kinds of produce in a part of the district formerly remote from markets. As the counterpart of these changes, the occupied area and revenue demand are found to have increased by 70 and 25 per cent. respectively, while the increase in population has been accompanied by an increase in all that constitutes their wealth. There seems no reason therefore why Government should not, on introducing the new settlement, increase its demand to the moderate extent which is allowed by the regulations, and with this end the rates of assessment now to be explained are submitted for approval.

32. The climate, which varies much as has been seen above, was the most important factor in differentiating the old rates of assessment; the main line of communication existing at that time, *viz.*, the Poona-Bombay road, was also of course taken into account, but as the railway has followed the same route it will not necessitate much alteration in the grouping.

Proposed rates.

*Fourteen villages* in the Eastern extremity of the táluka where the most favourable climate and best communications are combined. This group contains the Railway Station and town of Talegaon, and has a climate most favourable

for dry crops. The old rate was Rs. 2 in the 7 villages settled in 1873-74; and in the remainder Rs. 1-8-0, except in Nánoli, where it was Rs. 1-6-0. The last-mentioned village is specially benefited by the new road and bridge at Indori, and belongs naturally by situation to the group in which it is now included.

*Sixty-seven villages*, which may be described as including the open country at the mouth of the Indráini valley, together with the villages which lie on each side of the railway and the Bombay road as far westwards as the Gháts. In this group also are included 13 villages which lie across the hills to the South in the valley of the Páwna; these from their greater proximity to Poona and their dryer climate, might perhaps have found place in the first group were it not that their communications are a good deal cramped, and wheeled traffic impossible, almost, in the monsoon; they are therefore retained in the class to which they originally belonged. The old maximum rate for all the villages of this group was Rs. 1-6-0 except for 11 villages at the Western end of the Indráini valley, where, on

account of the very moist climate, the old rates were somewhat lower:\* this disadvantage exists still, but is compensated by the vicinity of the hill-stations of Lánoli and Khandála, which have become known and frequented since the first settlement. The village of Kurvanda, formerly inaccessible from the main valley, is now approached by the new road to Sakurpathár and Paud, and thus now comes into this group, as does also the village of Umbra-Navlakh, formerly rated at

Rs. 1-4-0 on account of comparative inaccessibility, but which now gains easy access to the Talegaon Station by the new made-road with a bridge at Indori. Besides those just mentioned 3 other† villages had a Rs. 1-4-0 rate, the reason for which is not given in the old report and is not now apparent; they are now therefore rated on a par with those surrounding them.

*Thirty-nine villages* which lie in the remoter parts of the valley of the Indráini, and in the Andar-Mával along the Northern border of the táluka, with a few also in the middle of the Páwna valley. These villages have much the same climate as the 2nd group but have further to go to the railway, and, though they can use carts to some extent, are badly off for roads and tracks. therefore proposed. Five villages in this group were formerly rated at Rs. 1-6-0 for reasons not specially explained; they are not now, however, on a par with the villages of the 2nd group, and must take the rate of that in which they naturally fall. The same re-

mark applies, *mutatis mutandis*, to three villages which were formerly rated at Re. 1-0-0 but which properly belong to this group, viz. Malewadi, Umbra, and Warpa.

*Twenty-two villages* stretching along the crest of the Gháts and in some cases extending down the Western slopes. The climate here is excessively moist and wheeled traffic almost unknown. The old maximum for these villages was the same as that now proposed.

34. The total area of rice by the old survey record was 13,227 acres, of which 10,915 acres were Government and assessed at Rs. 23,705, or an average of Rs. 2-2-9 per acre. There are now in all 17,407 acres, of which the Government area is 14,786 acres, bearing a proposed assessment of Rs. 37,652, or Rs. 2-8-9 per acre. The new rice land, which is generally of good quality, and in situations which command much natural moisture, will be assessed in all cases within the dry-crop rate for land with similar advantages. The garden area formerly recorded was in all 26 acres, the whole of which were Government land, and were assessed at an average of Rs. 11-1-10 per acre, or Rs. 289 in all. There are now found to be 258 acres in all; of these 186 acres are Government land assessed under the proposed rates at Rs. 4-1, and consist of Pátasthal and Motasthal irrigation as below given:—

35. The orders of Government have been strictly followed in assessing the garden area, and no assessment whatever on account of irrigation has been placed on land under wells sunk during the lease, while land under wells which paid assessment formerly has now been assessed within the dry-crop rate.

36. The estimated result of the proposed rates is given in the subjoined table, which is a précis of Appendix Q. :—

The total increase amounts therefore to Rs. 20,377, which is equal to 31.2 per cent, and is distributed nearly equally over the different groups. As there are shown to be nearly 8,000 acres more under the Government occupied head than paid assessment under the former settlement, the increase is in reality somewhat less than it appears.

37. It will be observed from column 34 of the detailed Appendix Q. that the increase given by the new rates varies very considerably in different villages. This is due to the imperfections of the former classification, especially that of the rice land as explained in paragraph 32 above, and proves the necessity which existed for a re-classification. In three villages the increase rises slightly above the limit of 66 per cent. In each this is due to the old rice classification having been abnormally low. The increase on the assessment of the dry-crop land in the two first-named villages is trifling, while in the third the occupied area shows an increase of 22 per cent,

40. In conclusion I have the honour to recommend that the new rates, if sanctioned, be guaranteed for 30 years: where the increase on individual Khátas may exceed 25 per cent. the new assessment will be introduced gradually in the \*manner sanctioned in recent settlements.

SIR,

I have the honour to forward herewith the proposals of Mr. Fletcher, Superintendent of Survey, for the revision at the expiry of the 30 years' term of the 142 Government villages of the Mával Táluka. This number dates from the year 1866-67; at the time of the previous survey there were 206, the change being caused by sundry re-adjustments with neighbouring tálukas.

2. Only 7 of these villages transferred from the Háveli Táluka have already undergone revision (1873-74); the remainder were settled for the first time, most of them many years since, and it is to these latter that the labours of the Survey Officers have been mainly directed. An entire remeasurement and reclassification was decided by Government to be necessary and the results detailed by the Superintendent fully evince the wisdom of the measure. The number of survey numbers has been very largely increased, in fact nearly doubled, and in a large percentage of cases errors in measurement, some of them of considerable magnitude, have been corrected. Owing to reasons detailed by the Superintendent, among which is conspicuous the rough and tentative nature of the old work, which omitted all notice of the poorer hill lands, reclassification had to be thorough and resulted in the addition of a tenth class to the nine formed at the original survey. The changes made in the 7 villages already revised were much less and only such as were necessary to incorporate them in the general plan of the táluka. The net result of the remeasurement is an addition of 411 acres only to its total recognized area—a very insignificant percentage. Rice land shows an increase of one-half and dry-crop land a diminution, not however proportionate. The Mával Táluka is not favourably circumstanced for garden cultivation and the amount now, as at the time of the previous survey, is insignificant.

3. Mr. Fletcher's paragraphs 9 to 13 contain a well written and accurate description of the Mával Táluka (the Háveli Táluka is, however, its eastern and not its western boundary). He has not exaggerated the regrettable denudation of the hills of their natural forests which, to judge from their remains, must, at least, for a few miles from the Gháts, have been unusually high and dense except in the shallowest soils. To reclothe the hills, however, would be a work of many years and involve a general interference with private rights of ownership impossible in the existing state of the law.

4. The communications of the táluka, though excellent as far as they go, are almost confined to the main road to Bombay and the G. I. P. Railway. To these must be added a newly constructed Ghát road, not carrying any large amount of traffic from Lonávli *viá* Sakar Patar (the suggested sanitarium) to Ambowna. This paucity is due partly to the hilly nature of the táluka and partly to the poverty of the Táluka Local Board, whose revenue is only Rs. 5,852 a year. Heavy outlay, upwards of Rs. 80,000, is now being incurred on loan on the bridge over the Indráyani at Indori.

5. Paragraph 9 of the report shows a large increase in population, a considerable increase in carts, and a moderate one in houses and agricultural cattle. The comparatively small increase in dwellings may perhaps be due to the cause assigned by the Superintendent, or the increase in population be less real than apparent owing to less careful enumeration at the first settlement. Taking the figures as they stand, it would seem that at the first census the

inmates of a house averaged rather more than 5 (the normal number), whilst now they are rather more than 6. My observation tends to confirm the Superintendent's opinion as to the generally favourable condition of the people. If the land is in places of inferior quality and the rainfall in parts excessive, they are at least never threatened with failure of crops owing to insufficient rainfall. Their markets are near and sure, and surplus labour is always able to find remunerative employment. I have not noticed indications of the excessive indebtedness found to exist at the time of the first settlement, and agree with the Superintendent that the people are not in this respect worse off than the rayats in other talukas of the district. This improvement may fairly be attributed to the remarkable rise in prices during the first two decades since the previous settlement, which has not materially abated in the third.

6. That the present assessment has pressed very lightly on the people is shown by the uniform ease with which it has been paid. I think, taking all circumstances into consideration, there is no reason why Government should not, as proposed by the Survey Superintendent, derive from this revision the full benefit allowable by standing orders.

7. In his paragraph 33 Mr. Fletcher has explained the division of the taluka into groups according to natural and artificial advantages. It is instructive to note from Appendix Q. the actual results of the application of the rates as regards Government occupied land.

9. From this it appears that the increase in rice land assessment is both actually and relatively far beyond that on dry-crops, amounting in the former case to 60 per cent. on the original assessment and in the latter to 15 per cent. only. The latter increase is so moderate, considering all the circumstances, that no objection, I think, can be taken to it; the former is mainly caused by an extension of rice cultivation to the extent of little short of 36 per cent. of the original area. The average increase of assessment from Rs. 2-2-9 to Rs. 2-8-9, as shown by the Superintendent, amounts to 18 per cent. only.

11. In conclusion, I have nothing to urge against the adoption of the Superintendent's proposals as a whole. In their detailed application to individual cases modifications may prove necessary, but to judge from the careful and systematic way in which the revision appears to have been carried out these will apparently not be numerous.

12. As regards the grouping of the villages Mr. Fletcher was good enough to consult me, and I am of opinion that it will be found as equitable and convenient as circumstances permit.

SIR,

The papers which I have now the honour to submit to Government through the Divisional Commissioner contain detailed proposals for the revision of the rates of assessment in the Mával Táluka of Poona together with an estimate of the financial results anticipated.

2. The Mával Táluka is made up as follows (inám villages being excluded):—

(1) 29 villages which have been transferred from the Khed Táluka and which were first settled with other villages of that táluka in 1852-53.

(2) 100 villages of old Mával settled in 1853-54.

(3) 7 villages of the Haveli Táluka originally settled in 1841-42 and subjected to revision settlement in 1873-74 with the rest of the Haveli Táluka. The remaining 6 villages were alienated at the time of the settlement of the Government villages adjacent to them and have been settled from time to time as they came under direct management of Government. They include the important villages of Talegaon and Indori which formerly belonged to the Dábháde family.

3. The current leases have expired and revision is overdue. The delay is fully accounted for by the necessity for complete re-measurement and re-classification except in the case of the villages before revised in 1873-74. The old measurement has been found unusually faulty and the results given in Mr. Fletcher's 6th paragraph prove that any attempt to confirm the old work would have resulted in a similarly incorrect field record as that left by the survey in 1853-54.

Several circumstances combined to necessitate complete re-classification which may be enumerated :—

- (1) Former incorrect measurement.
- (2) The adoption in 1877 by the Poona and Násik Survey of the Southern Marátha Country Survey scale for the valuation of rice land.
- (3) The incorrectness of the method of classing rice land before 1853-54.
- (4) The omission by the former survey, on the score of cost, to class the then unoccupied hill lands.
- (5) Alterations in the scale for the valuation of dry-crop lands with the object of keeping down the classification rate of the poorest qualities.
- (6) And lastly, the superiority of the present system in all respects over that formerly in operation.

4. It will be seen that the revised rates raise the Government demand by just over 31 per cent. The Collector has summarized the results for each group of villages and for each class of land. Of the total increase Rs. 6,278 fall on dry-crop, Rs. 13,947 on rice land, Rs. 323 on garden. These increases do not fall solely on the area formerly assessed. There is an increase in area of

3,799 acres of dry-crop land.

The following table will show not only these details, but also the average incidence on each variety of land and the variation in each assessment group. I have, for reasons which will be given further on, sub-divided the groups to show the results for the old Khed and Haveli villages separately from those of old Mával. I omit the details of garden land, for it is insignificant, but the percentage increases include the garden assessment :—

The chief feature exhibited by this table is the unevenness of the increases in the groups and sub-groups, an unevenness which will be illustrated by the following abstract from Appendix Q to Mr. Fletcher's report:—

In 2 of the 14 villages showing increases below 10 per cent. the revised demand is less than the former total. Of the increases over 60 per cent. 4 are below 63 per cent. and 3 are 68, 75 and 76 per cent. respectively.

5. Before I make any further remark on the general results thus obtained it will be better to state shortly the general principles on which the maximum rates and grouping are based. In the first place, Mr. Fletcher argues that the great rise in the prices of food grains justifies an increase to the full extent allowed by the Government Resolution of the 29th October 1874. The dry-crop maximum rates are regulated by the distance from the Poona market modified in details, *e. g.*, the batch of villages around Lonávla is raised for reasons given to the group above which simple consideration of distance from market would fix. Minor modifications are made also in favour of villages whose communications are particularly cramped. The rice maxima increase, though very slightly, in inverse ratio to the improvement of the climate and soil for rice. In other words, the distance from market and cramped communications of the best rice tracts are considered to overbalance the advantages of rainfall. I think that these principles are sound.

6. I cannot improve on Mr. Fletcher's description of the táluka, but I think that he has over-estimated the benefit accruing to the cultivating classes from the advent of the railway. The railway does, it is true, give much employment to the labouring classes and has established a small demand for agricultural produce in the neighbourhood of Lonávla, which demand is increased by the resort to Lonávla and Khandála of visitors from Bombay and elsewhere. But the gain is counterbalanced, because the consequent rise in the wages of labour

has decreased agricultural profits in so far as the cultivator is dependent on hired labour. Again, the railway has brought the produce of distant markets into competition with that of tracts such as Mával, already within easy reach by cart from Poona, the market of the Deccan. The railway does not cheapen the cost of transport to market of surplus produce, for it is still not used by the Mával cultivator for that purpose. It is cheaper for him to cart his produce from the most distant villages the whole way to Poona, and further the surplus produce which he has to sell is not in demand at any other market than Poona, if exception is made for the very small export of wheat to Bombay. The railway has made Talegaon a trade centre of some importance, but the benefit thus accruing is practically confined to Talegaon itself and Indori which is on the high road of the trade from Junnar and Khed. The carrying trade with these tálukás is not even in the hands of the people of Mával.

7. Mával does not enjoy cheaper imports by reason of the railway. The imports from the Konkan of salt, cocoanuts and condiments come now, as they used to come, by cart. The railway has failed to secure the monopoly of this traffic though an attempt to do so was made in 1876 when the double charge for the 14 miles of Ghát which had been put on in 1868 was removed. As a proof of this it may be stated that numerous carts still ply from the coast ports up the Ghát. Some statistical proof is also at hand. The receipts at the toll-bar at Khadkála may be said to be entirely derived from this cart traffic. The annual bids from 1868 to 1876 averaged Rs. 11,000. The famine in the Deccan and the temporary disturbance caused by the action of the railway brought about such fluctuations in the bids up to 1880 that these years may be eliminated from the comparison. But from 1880 the annual receipts from the toll-bar have been about Rs. 8,000. These figures indicate, then, only a very moderate success resulting from the abolition of the Ghát rate. The imports from the Deccan into Mával do come by rail, but they chiefly consist of food grains and do not affect the Mával cultivator, except injuriously by competing with and cheapening his own surplus produce. Putting aside the railway, I do not think that there has been any improvement in communications which has tended to benefit agriculture in the Mával Táluka. The made road from Khed and the fine bridge at Indori benefit Junnar and Khed, but not Mával. The Sakharpáthar road is mentioned, but as an improvement in communications benefiting agriculture its mention is not deserved.

On the whole then, as far as communications go, the changes which have occurred since the original settlements have only slightly favoured the agricultural condition of the táluka.

8. The next subject for general discussion is climate. Mával is not a tract liable to severe distress from failure of the rainfall. Such failure is unknown. But from an agricultural point of view the climate merits careful consideration, for the character of the rainfall imperatively demands the assistance of ráb for rice cultivation in the major portion of the táluka and also for nágli where that dry crop replaces wheat and bájri. In facilities for obtaining ráb the táluka has lost considerable ground in the currency of the expiring leases, first by the stricter conservation of all land available for inclusion in forests, and secondly by the denudation of hill sides by over-cultivation and by the destruction of tree and brushwood growth under pressure of the largely increased home demand for ráb and firewood and by the immensely increased demand for the latter from Poona. Forest conservation is the only way of checking denudation and eventually improving the local firewood supply and in some respects too the ráb supply, but it cannot be expected that the increased revenue otherwise due can be demanded from tracts where ráb is essential, in the face of an undoubted diminution both in the quality and quantity of ráb material, for such diminution directly raises the cost of cultivation, or else lowers greatly the margin of profit from the land.

9. The rapid diminution of the rainfall as the Gháts are succeeded by the level plains causes the disappearance of the ráb cultivation of rice, and ráb is no longer required for dry crops when wheat and bájri succeed nágli. The area under rice rapidly diminishes with the decreased rainfall, till in the eastern villages of the táluka rice can only be grown in unusually moist spots or where tank irrigation is available to supplement the rainfall. As far as I know, Talegaon

is about the only village where tank irrigation is available and the conditions thus are unlike those of Belgaum recently reported on, where tanks are numerous in the tracts where ráb is not practised.

10. Some general information is available which bears on the general improvement in the condition of the cultivating classes. The opinion of the Collector is worthy of great respect and his opinion coincides with that of the Superintendent of the Survey. The indebtedness which Captain Francis remarked on in his report, submitting proposals for the first settlement, is not now so marked as it was. It may be taken then as proved that the moderation of the existing rates has effected the improvement in the condition of the people which it was designed to effect. The revenue history is favourable and there is much to show that the existing settlements are a light burden on the cultivators.

The increase in carts is considerable. The absolute increase is from 40 to 50 per village in the first group and from 8 to 12 in the second. Even the third and fourth groups can now claim an average of 2 carts per village. This increase in carts is a proof of progress and especially of the profits made in the carrying trade, for a great many of the cultivators in slack seasons add to their means of subsistence by joining in the Ghát traffic from the coast.

As regards improvement in houses, the figures are not trustworthy and as given by Mr. Fletcher are irreconcilable. I lay no stress whatever on this point and do not desire to notice it further.

In agricultural cattle the increase has hardly kept pace with the increase of cultivation, but it would be rash to base any deductions on the recorded figures. The value of land is undoubted, but the large number of mortgages and private sales, though they tend to prove increased value of land, show also the steady transfer of the land to money-lenders and the like. Private sales recorded by the registration offices are at best very doubtful evidence of the value of land. But the sales by decree of the Civil Court indicate a high value. The record of leases given in Appendix L. corroborates the deductions drawn from sales. No less than 677 mortgages are recorded for the past three years. It is very hard to credit in the face of these figures the record that has been collected by the classers that 81 per cent. of the survey numbers are still cultivated by the occupants themselves or in partnership with others.

11. I now turn from these subjects to the most important question of all, and that is whether the rise in prices of agricultural produce can be considered so far to override the conclusions adverse to enhancing the demand as to call for an increase of 31 per cent.

*Prices.*—The principle that guides the assessment fixed at revision of existing settlements is that “enhancements are made on the general advance of prices between the first and second settlement.” No question is more anxiously considered than the past rise and fall and the probable future of prices. The Government demand is required in cash. It is therefore of vital importance that the assessments should be so regulated that the cultivator should not be compelled to part with an undue proportion of his surplus produce to provide the required sum. Our imperfect knowledge of the profits of cultivation, added to the known great fluctuations in those profits, which vary with the size of the holdings, the skill and condition of the cultivator, and above all with the season as it affects the various crops of any particular tract, make it futile to hope to fix an assessment which will fall with equal incidence on each of the thousands of tenants in a Rayatwári district. An inordinate expenditure of time and money would result, even if the attempt were made to adjust the maximum rate to the peculiar conditions of each village. We are compelled to group the villages, with the full knowledge that no grouping, however careful, can precisely meet the needs and claims of each member of the group. For these reasons it is a fully recognized principle that moderation must be the guide even though it is known that some villages will benefit unduly. It is better that they should so benefit at the expense of Government than at that of their neighbours. A wide margin must be left and enhancements cannot be regulated by the rise in prices alone.

12. It will be remembered that in 1874, shortly after the introduction of revision settlements into the major portion of the Poona and Sholapur Districts, a remarkable fall in prices of food-grains was noticed. The explanation of the fall was not clear. There was indeed at the time the settlements were sanctioned great reason to believe that the high prices which had ruled from 1850 would be maintained and that the future course of prices would be characterized merely by gradual equalization, the natural result of extension of railways and the opening out of isolated tracts by improved communications with the railway. But the principles alluded to above carried the day. Not only were the already sanctioned settlements reviewed and the enhanced demand largely reduced, but limits to the enhancements in future revisions prescribed in the now famous Resolution No. 5739, dated 29th October 1874. These limits are scrupulously observed. An independent observer, Mr. Frederick Chambers, the Meteorological Reporter for Western India, an officer with large scientific attainments, has lately, for scientific purposes, studied prices with much care. His scientific purpose was however directed to the practical object of ascertaining how far prices are affected by the periodicity of solar phenomena. His study of prices has proved that the records on which the consideration of prices must be based are far more accurate and trustworthy than was generally supposed. I quote extracts from his valuable report :—

“A very great rise of prices took place in all districts between 1850 and 1865, and since the latter year the general level of prices has remained nearly stationary. In every district the rise was more than 100 per cent. of the average money price for the period 1840 to 1850; the mean rise for all districts was 153 per cent.”

He then proceeds :

“To illustrate the use that may be made of such calculations as these, it may be mentioned that the facts disclosed by them completely disprove the contentions which frequently appear in the newspapers to the effect that the impoverishment of the rayats is due to the last enhancement of the land revenue assessments, for it is admitted even by those who make these assertions that the enhancement made was far less than 100 per cent. of the previous assessments. The average enhancement was, in fact, only about 30 per cent. Similarly the contention that the agricultural improvements made by the rayats have been taxed by the last enhancement is also disproved by the facts. Again, in 1874, reductions were made in the revenue assessments of some of the Deccan districts, in the belief that the high prices prevailing when the re-assessments were made would not be maintained; and acting on the same belief, the policy of limiting future enhancements to 33 per cent. of the current assessments was laid down for future guidance. The curves show, however, (although it is of course easy to be wise after the event), that those high average prices have been maintained. There may, of course, be other better grounds for the adoption of such a policy, but later events have shown that the chief reason then given in favour of it was a mistaken one.”

“It would be very interesting if the causes of the great rise of prices from about 1850 to 1865 and of the subsequent steadiness could be traced with any certainty. It has been suggested, with great probability of truth, that the great and sudden influx of silver which took place soon after the mutiny, and again about the time of the American War, was one cause, if not the sole cause, of the rise; and Mr. Robert Giffen, in one of his essays on finance, has predicted a further general rise of prices in consequence of the fall in the gold price of silver. It is a remarkable fact, however, that the average prices of the staple food-grains have been nearly stationary since 1865, that is to say, throughout the whole of the time during which the price of silver has been falling. Probably the explanation of this apparent anomaly is that although the fall in the price of silver has not caused any further actual rise of prices since 1865, it has prevented the permanent fall which would otherwise have taken place on the collapse of the inflation caused by the American War, and it has also prevented a further permanent fall like that which took place between the beginning and the middle of the century—a fall which has been explained by Mr. Pedder as a result of the heavier ‘duty’ thrown upon a limited circulating medium by the general increase of prosperity. If this be the true explanation of the great steadiness of average prices during the last twenty years, the fall in the price of silver explains how it is that the anticipation of the Bombay Government of a permanent fall of average prices after 1865 has not been realized. But however this may be, the important fact remains that in the Presidency generally, average money prices are now about 150 per cent. higher than they were between thirty and forty years ago.”

“The explanations already offered do not cover the whole of the facts, for they do not explain how it is that the rise of prices has been so much greater in some districts than in others. Some light is thrown on this point by the facts that the greatest rise has occurred in those districts where the average money price of the staple food-grain is

lowest, the least rise in those where it is highest, and by the further fact that food is cheapest where the means of transport are least available, dearest where communication with surrounding districts can be carried on with the greatest ease. The less complete isolation of the more backward districts in recent years, as compared with their condition in the decade ending with 1850, may, therefore, be the reason for the greater increase of prices in those districts. Freer communication has probably tended to displace the old systems of barter and has led to the circulation of a much larger stock of money than that which was in use in former years."

13. I now turn to a consideration of the prices which affect the Mával settlement. Mr. Fletcher has given all the information available, though it is to be regretted that the prices of nágli, one of the staples of the táluka, are obtainable only for a few years. Rice is the crop on which the rayat depends for his cash requirements. Price figures for rice are available and the close analogy in fluctuations which rice prices show with those of bájri and jowári makes it safe to neglect the consideration of nágli. I now divide prices into periods indicated by Mr. Chambers' investigations and the course of prices in Poona. I pay no attention to Mával prices, for the Poona market rules them and such differences as exist are those which are occasioned by the operation of the law stated by Mr. Chambers that freer communications have acted more strongly on out-markets.

The periods and the fluctuations are thus shown :—

14. These calculations tally in a remarkable manner with the generalizations of Mr. Chambers though the 4th period shows a falling off which is worthy of special attention. If the average prices for the 3rd and 4th periods be taken together a rise of 100 per cent. over the first and of about 66 per cent. over the second period is proved. Mr. Fletcher says 75 per cent., but he took the prices of 1852, which were unusually low, instead of the average of several years up to 1852 and he did not eliminate the famine years. In other words, the prices which have ruled during the last 20 years considered alone justify an enhancement of assessment fully up to the limit fixed by the Resolution of 1874 and indeed a larger enhancement if it were safe to regulate the new assessment by these considerations alone. But in my opinion, based on the study which I have made of the papers of the old settlement and on my knowledge of the táluka and its cultivation and on the special study which I have lately been engaged in as regards the necessity of ráb, the proposed increase is higher than the principle of moderation demands. I do not think that the revised demand should much exceed 20 per cent. I shall now proceed in detail to show the modifications which I feel bound to urge on the attention of Government.

*Mr. Fletcher's 1st Group.*

15. First, as regards the Haveli villages settled in 1873-74. These have already been revised. The increases now proposed, added to those made at the revision, are as follows :—

Colonel W. Waddington in 1872 proposed a dry-crop maximum of Rs. 2-8-0 and a rice maximum of Rs. 6. Colonel Francis, then Survey Commissioner, who had settled the Mával Táluka in 1853-54 and who had had great experience in the Konkan just below the Gháts, considered the rice rate proposed too high and reduced it to Rs. 5 on the ground that these villages do not receive a sufficiently sure and heavy rainfall to grow rice continuously with certainty. He reduced the dry-crop maximum to Rs. 2-4-0. Later on a further reduction to Rs. 2 was made in accordance with the Government Resolution of 29th October 1874 and the increase was still further reduced by the lowering of rates on poor soils classed at 6 annas and under. Regarding the rice maximum Colonel Francis said: "I am inclined to think it will be better to have a rate of Rs. 5 only. A maximum of Rs. 4-8-0 was fixed by myself for the contiguous villages of the Mával Táluka in 1852-53." I find that this statement is incorrect. The highest rice maximum in Mával (excluding the Petha) was Rs. 4, not Rs. 4-8-0. Mr. Fletcher now proposes a maximum of Rs. 8. The difference is not so great as it appears to be. The old Rs. 5 maximum was based on the scale of the Poona-Thána survey. The Rs. 8 maximum is based on the Southern Marátha Country survey scale. Mr. Stewart, in paragraph 15 of his report on the Igatpuri revision (Government Selection No. CLXVIII) has indicated the difference. Further elucidation, if required, may be found in paragraphs 53 to 57 of Colonel Anderson's report on the Bankápur revision. The Southern Marátha Country scale was prepared for dealing with rice in tank districts. The two highest water classes can never be found where irrigation from tanks or streams is not available. Practically, then, the proposed Rs. 8 maximum applied by the Southern Marátha Country scale is not higher than the Rs. 5 maximum applied by the Poona-Thána scale, under which in such districts as Mával first class water is often found. With this explanation the proposed rice maximum rates for the Haveli villages as well as for the rest of the táluka need not again be referred to. To return to the Haveli villages: Since the settlement of 1873-74 prices have not risen. Carts have not increased in proportion with the increase in other villages of Mr. Fletcher's first group. The enhancement due to the assimilation of the classification with that of the rest of the táluka

is considerable. On these grounds there is certainly no support for the proposed increase of the maximum rate. It should be retained at Rs. 2, the rate fixed in 1873-74. There are two villages of this group, Talegaon and Indori, which merit separate treatment. With their exception all the villages of the first group should, I consider, receive the maximum dry-crop rate just recommended for the Haveli villages. Even with this reduction the increase is high, but it is quite reasonable. The dry crop is good and position favourable.

Talegaon and Indori should be kept with a dry-crop maximum of Rs. 2-2-0 as proposed. They have lately become khálsa and a long revenue history is not available. They have enormously benefited by the traffic which has arisen between Bombay and the Khed and Junnar Tálukás. Indori is on the high road of the Khed and Junnar traffic and Talegaon contains one of the principal halting places for the Konkan carts. The profits from sale of grass are considerable and the Poona market is close, connected by metalled roads.

*Mr. Fletcher's Group No. 2.*

16. This is the principal group. Its old dry-crop maximum was Rs. 1-6-0 with the exceptions named in Mr. Fletcher's 33rd paragraph. The group shows every variety of climate and of cultivation known in the táluka. The increases proposed vary very greatly. In some cases faulty work of the old survey can be the only reason, but looking at the extremes of climate and bearing in mind the arguments which I have adduced above, I am constrained to make considerable modifications. I would divide the group into 3 classes.

In the first place I find it impossible to support the proposal for a maximum rate of Rs. 1-8-0, because, where re-classification enters into the revision, the enhancements due to it cannot be considered apart from the maximum rate. These three classes I propose to rate at Rs. 1-6-0, Rs. 1-4-0 and Rs. 1-2-0 respectively.

17. In the lowest class I think that the group of villages around Lonávla should come excepting No. 71, Devghar, which was Appendix Q., Nos. 72-81. wrongly included in this batch at the former survey. The benefit due to the popularity of Lonávla and Khandála as hot-weather resorts has been over-estimated. I have shown that this fact, as well as the existence of a railway colony and workshop at Lonávla, tend to raise labour wages and to diminish rather than increase agricultural profits. This batch of villages suffers from a decreased ráb supply and the climate will only permit the growth of the inferior dry-crops. With these villages I urge that a few others shown in the margin should be classed. The first two and the last two are

further east than the Lonávla batch, but they border on the rocky spur projecting to the east. They are cut off by the railway line from the high road and their assessments are very largely enhanced. The other four also border on the villages of Mr. Fletcher's third group. They are partially enclosed in hills. But, as with the others, I propose them for inclusion with the Lonávla batch, chiefly because of the large enhancements due to re-classification. It is better, I think, thus to deal with cases which exhibit abnormal increases, when it is not clear that the increases are due altogether to old faulty work.

18. In the next highest group (rated at Rs. 1-4-0) I think that the marginally-named villages should go. These are isolated by the long spur above noticed. Their communications are particularly cramped and they adjoin the south batch of Mr. Fletcher's 3rd group in the Pavna valley. Further, the enhancements are large.

With these a small group in the fork of the Indráyani and Andar rivers may be classed. It is clear that the old rating of Rs. 1-4-0 for Nos. 57 and 58 was due to their position thus between the two rivers. The increases in Nos. 59 and 60 are not large, but the same circumstances exist and the four villages which adjoin Nos. 53 to 56 (see last para.) should be grouped together.

A few words are required as to the remaining villages of Mr. Fletcher's large 2nd group, for which I propose to retain the old rate of Rs. 1-6-0. The villages around Chandkhed are near Poona, directly to the west of the 7 Haveli villages. The reduction I propose in the maximum rate is designed to meet the large increases shown in the margin.

19. If Appendix Q. is studied in the light of the abstracts given above (para. 4) it will be seen that the enhancement recommended for the whole taluka falls heavily on these groups which are the ráb tracts of the taluka. Further, if the sub-groups are examined it will be evident that the Khed villages receive an increase of 36 and 41·7 per cent. respectively in the two groups. This difference between the Khed and Mával villages is due to the incorrectness of the former classification in 1852-53, for it has been ascertained beyond doubt that the water element, which is the most important factor for rice, was altogether left out of count. The old classification of the Mával villages of these groups was better. I do not believe that the rice land has been over-assessed in these groups, but the dry-crop rates are too high. Mr. Fletcher has noticed the large percentage of occupied fallow (44 per cent. in the taluka taken as a whole). In the plain villages about Talegaon this fallow is very profitable to the rayat. It grows good grass and the grass fetches a ready and remunerative sale. But in the hills the case is quite different. The grass is poor in quality and is unsaleable. It is required as a ráb material. The occupied fallow then in the groups now under consideration is in great part an adjunct to rice land just as the *sindadi* portion of the *varkas* is in the Konkan. By the latest rules framed to deal with ráb tracts the scale for dry-crop lands is divided into four classes. The last class is specially intended for *sindad* lands. But the scale applied to Mával gives a classification value in its lowest grade of 1 anna. With the rupee maximum proposed for the 4th group, this means an assessment of 1 anna on the poorest land. A considerable area of hill land left unclassified at the former survey is now included. It has practically till now been enjoyed rent-free.

20. Any relaxation on dry-crop rates in ráb tracts directly affects the rice land. I prefer then to propose a reduction on the dry crop. It is wise to keep the rice rates high and the dry-crop rates low. It is a means of preventing too great land hunger on the part of the money-lender. Further, even when dry-crop is in these tracts cultivated it needs long rest between each course of cropping.

The best method, I think, of dealing with these two groups is to lower the dry-crop maximum considerably. I propose that it be Re. 1 for Group III. and 12 annas for Group IV. A large difference between the dry-crop maxima of ráb and non-ráb tracts is a feature of the Belgaum revision settlement proposals lately submitted. I fully approve of it and think it applies equally to Mával.

21. To sum up my recommendations :

22. The absolute enhancement proposed is Rs. 14,953 as compared with Rs. 20,377 according to the Superintendent's proposals. The reduction is not very great, but the distribution is on the whole more even. The unevenness in the increases of individual villages cannot of course be greatly diminished, for it



is due to unevenness of the work of the former survey. But increases over 40 per cent. occur now in only 18 villages as against 42. There are still three villages with abnormal increases over 55 per cent. These are the ones named Sai from 75.1 to 65.9. in Mr. Fletcher's 37th paragraph and the explanation Kuna Khurd ,, 68.1 to 58.9. given is satisfactory. The increases are, however, Lohovádi ,, 76.7 to 55.5. somewhat toned down.

23. The increases in the new classes 6 and 7 may seem large when considered with the arguments I have adduced in favour of the lenient treatment of denuded ráb tracts. But this is due to the already noticed incorrectness of the rice classification in the Khed villages. If the Khed and Mával villages are separated this will be readily perceived:—

Further reduction is not called for. The differences only indicate the requisite assimilation of the Khed villages to those adjoining of old Mával. The increase in Class V. is apparently large, but this is due to the inclusion in it of 6 villages properly belonging to a higher class but lowered on account of excessive increases.

24. Mr. Fletcher has (8th para.) shown the large increase in the area of rice land. The net increase is 4,127 acres. It may be added that nearly 1,000 acres of land classed as rice at the old survey now no longer is treated as such. The area of new rice therefore is really 5,022 acres. This area will receive the benefit of a reduced rate according to the caution enjoined on the Survey Department to avoid the risk of taxing what may be considered improvements by private capital. New rice has been dealt with according to the principles laid down in the Bankápur settlement report which have invariably met with the approval of Government.

25. The notification required by Government Resolution No. 7447 dated 21st October 1886, para. 1, was sent to the Collector on the 8th March last. It is feared that it will be almost impracticable that the settlement should be introduced during the current season. But there is time if the period for receiving resignations is extended to the latest date—5th July, and I trust that the fulness of the reports now submitted will enable Government to pass early orders.

26. No complaint has been received against the grouping or the maximum rates. I made a special addition to the letter of the Resolution directing this notification which I must report for approval. Noticing that the mere notification of the old and present dry-crop maxima which was hardly altered would give very little indication of the increase proposed, I requested Mr. Fletcher to superadd in the notification the present and proposed average rates per acre on rice land. But even with this addition the rayats have not yet expressed any dissatisfaction.

2. The present Mával Táluka comprises 142 Government villages and is made up of the bulk of the old Mával Táluka and fractions added from the Khed and Haveli Tálukas. The revision settlement proposals relate to Government villages alone.

3. These proposals have long been overdue. But the delay is accounted for by the necessity of carrying out a complete re-measurement and re-classification of the soils. What may at first, therefore, appear to be a loss of revenue has doubtless been more than compensated for by the soundness and accuracy of the results that have now been secured.

4. The characteristics of the táluka in respect of soil and climate may be broadly described as half Konkan, half Dekkan, the western portion near the gháts having all the characteristics of the "Konkan" and the eastern gradually blending into the "Desh Dekkan" or plain country.

5. The chief products of the táluka are rice in the west, wheat and bájri in the east. The rainfall is regular and ample, and as in Konkan and Gujarát drought or total failure of crops is unknown.

6. The statistics regarding population, houses and cattle furnished by Mr. Fletcher indicate a steady if slow improvement in the condition of the people. Mr. East adds the weight of his own experience to the statement made by Mr. Fletcher in para. 27 of his report with regard to the pecuniary position of most of the rayats. Their great indebtedness was specially noticed at the original settlement, and it is gratifying to learn that there is much improvement in this respect at the present time.

7. The G. I. P. Railway line which traverses the táluka from west to east has undoubtedly been an immense boon to this táluka as to all the district, but I so far agree with Mr. Ozanne that it has by no means superseded the old Bombay road. As a matter of fact, I believe the road is more used than the road for all goods going from Bársi westward, and thousands of the poorer classes of labourers walk parallel with the line from Poona to Campolie.

8. The grouping of the villages proposed by Mr. Fletcher has been carefully considered by Mr. Ozanne and the revised proposals submitted by him are well calculated to tone down the unevenness of the original assessments and render them more acceptable to the rayats.

9. Mr. Ozanne's observations respecting the value of "Prices" as a factor in the determination of the maximum rates seem to me to be correct, and I agree

with him that in the case of the Mával Táluka the prices ruling in Poona may fairly be adopted as the basis of calculations.

10. The net result of Mr. Ozanne's re-adjustment of the rates proposed by Mr. Fletcher is to reduce the enhancement from Rs. 20,377 to Rs. 14,953. The reasons which have induced Mr. Ozanne to make the reduction are in my opinion very sound, and weight should be attached to the conclusions he has drawn during his close personal observation of the condition of the people when Assistant Collector in Poona.

11. It is important that the revised rates should be introduced from next year, and I lose no time in submitting these papers to Government recommending that the original proposals of Mr. Fletcher, as modified by Mr. Ozanne, may receive the early sanction of Government.

**RESOLUTION.**—These papers contain proposals for the revision survey settlement of the Mával Táluka of the Poona District; but though early orders are asked for and are evidently required, the differences in opinions of the officers whose reports are before Government render close consideration of the proposals especially necessary.

2. The Survey Superintendent has given a very clear and interesting account of this táluka which contains 142 Government and 26 alienated villages. The bulk of the former, which have always belonged to Mával Táluka, were originally settled in 1853-54: 6 villages of the same táluka, formerly alienated, were settled from time to time as they lapsed to Government: 29 villages, formerly part of Khed, were settled in 1852-53: and the remaining 7, which belonged to Haveli, came under revision settlement in 1873-74. For the Haveli villages partial, and for the rest entire, remeasurement and reclassification were found necessary at the survey just completed.

3. In considering whether an increase in the present rates is justified, the point that claims foremost attention is the change in general prices since the original settlement: and as regards these prices all the officers whose reports are before Government are agreed that a large rise has taken place. Mr. Fletcher

son, it is clear that the general rise of prices, considered by itself, fully justifies an enhancement of assessment up to the maximum limit allowed by Government Resolution No. 5739 of 29th October 1874.

4. As to whether there are any other considerations calling for reduction of enhancement below that maximum, the Collector of Poona and the Survey Superintendent are agreed in thinking that there are none. The former bears testimony to an improvement in the condition of the people during the term of the expiring settlement, and the latter shows that an increase in population has been accompanied by an increase, perceptible though not large, in all that constitutes agricultural wealth. It appears, moreover, that during the term of the settlement, the course of cultivation has coincided generally with that of prices, that all land ordinarily repaying occupation was taken up by 1863-64,

estimates the rise since the first decade of the settlement at 75 per cent.; but even if the figures (quoted in the margin) given by Mr. Ozaune, who has taken special pains to avoid making an excessive estimate, are assumed to be more suitable for purposes of comparison,

and since then the occupied area and the revenue have fluctuated very little. Remissions have been practically unknown: little pressure has been used in the collection of the revenue: recourse has been had to distraint in no case during the last three years: and during the whole term of the settlement there have been no outstanding balances. Finally, the old made road has been supplemented by the railway and the towns of Louávla, Khandála and Talegaon have risen to importance.

5. In the opinion of the Governor in Council a more complete justification for the proposed increase in assessment of 31·2 per cent. could hardly be found than that disclosed by the facts stated in the last two paragraphs. Mr. Ozanne thinks otherwise and would limit the increase to 22·9 per cent. Apart, however, from his special reasons—applicable merely to individual villages—it is not clear that he lays stress on any argument except one as a set off against the general reasons adduced by Mr. Fletcher for his proposed increase. That argument, connected with the ráb supply, is only applicable to a portion of the tract of country under consideration, and it does not necessarily warrant a limitation of the enhancement justified by the rise in prices. He alleges that facilities for obtaining ráb have been lessened by the stricter conservation of all land available for inclusion in forests, and by the denudation of hill-sides brought about either by over-cultivation or by the destruction of trees owing to the demand for ráb and firewood for local consumption, and the demand for the latter for export. He has not, however, shown that any lands now included in forests were recently used to supply ráb for lands now under cultivation: and this fact, to prove which most detailed inquiries would be necessary, cannot be lightly assumed. On the other hand, Government cannot accept the argument that cultivators who have denuded their own occupied lands on the hill-sides by either over-cultivation or by excessive ráb or firewood cutting, have any just claim to a reduction in the assessment which they would otherwise be called upon to pay. Their improvident action in making a profit of one kind ought not to entitle them to a profit of another kind at the expense of Government.

6. Mr. Fletcher estimates that his proposals will increase the revenue on Government occupied land from Rs. 65,250 to Rs. 85,627, the increase being distributed over rice, dry-crop and garden land as shown in the margin,\* and being partially due to an increase in the areas of the three descriptions of land amounting to 3,871, 3,799 and 160 acres respectively. He divides the táluka into four groups and proposes for them the following rates:—

7. It is not easy to compare the rice rates now proposed with those under the settlement just expired, as the former are calculated according to the Southern Marátha Survey scale, while the latter were based on the old Poona-Thána scale; but the increase is apparently moderate and as all the officers whose reports are before Government are agreed in recommending them for sanction there is no reason to doubt their suitability. As regards the dry-crop rates, however, Mr. Ozanne's proposals differ greatly from those of Mr. Fletcher and it will be necessary to examine them in some detail.

8. With respect to Mr. Fletcher's first group Mr. Ozanne points out that it contains 7 villages of the Haveli Táluka which underwent *revision* survey in 1873-74 since which time no rise in prices has taken place, nor has there been any improvement in the condition of the cultivators sufficient by itself to warrant an increase of rates. But though actual prices have not risen since the settlement of 1873-74 the average of prices upon which that settlement was based has risen. Moreover the sketch given in paragraph 15 of Mr. Ozanne's letter

shows that the dry-crop rate originally proposed at that settlement for these villages was Rs. 2-8-0, and the rate sanctioned by Government on Colonel Francis' recommendation was Rs. 2-4-0. Its subsequent reduction to Rs. 2 was made solely in consequence of the Resolution No. 5739 of 29th October 1874 limiting enhancements, and not for reasons which affect the present question. His Excellency the Governor in Council is of opinion that the rate of Rs. 2-2-0 now proposed by Mr. Fletcher, being 2 annas lower than was approved and sanctioned in 1873-74, cannot now be said to be excessive. Mr. Ozanne also proposes that of the 7 villages in this group formerly attached to Khed Taluka, all except Talegaon and Indori should be rated at Rs. 2 instead of Rs. 2-2-0, but he has given no special reasons for his proposed reduction, and His Excellency the Governor in Council thinks that the arguments he uses to support a rate of Rs. 2-2-0 for Talegaon and Indori apply equally to the other villages.

9. As regards Mr. Fletcher's second group containing 67 villages, for which a rate of Rs. 1-8-0 is recommended, it appears from that officer's report that one village (Kurvanda) has hitherto been assessed at Re. 1, fourteen at Rs. 1-4-0 and the remainder at Rs. 1-6-0. The circumstances of Kurvanda and the 14 villages assessed at Rs. 1-4-0 owing to improved communications, or to the vicinity of the now important stations of Lonávla and Khandála, are believed by him to have become equal to those of the villages assessed at Rs. 1-6-0; and the increase in the general rate for the group from Rs. 1-6-0 to Rs. 1-8-0 is based on the facts referred to in paragraphs 3 and 4 above.

10. Mr. Ozanne, however, not only objects to any increase in the rate from Rs. 1-6-0 to Rs. 1-8-0,

but would even lower the present rate in the case of 26 villages, and would form three groups constituted as shown in the margin. His principal reason appears to be that large enhancements are found to have resulted from reclassification (he should

have added *remeasurement*) alone, and ought to be counterbalanced by either lowering, or refraining from raising, the maximum rate. Such an argument is obviously opposed to all principles of a survey settlement, which aims at equalizing the assessment of soils equally valuable; and to act upon it would result in leaving villages which have hitherto failed, owing to incorrect classification, to pay a fair assessment in a better position than adjoining and similar ones, which were fully assessed, and thus less leniently treated, in the beginning. He further urges that in the villages near Lonávla and Khandála (1) the ráb supply has diminished, and (2) the vicinity of these hill stations tends to raise wages and therefore to diminish agricultural profits. The former argument has been referred to above, and as regards the latter the Governor in Council is not prepared to alter the opinion on which he has already repeatedly acted, that the vicinity of towns in which there is a demand for both agricultural produce and labour is on the whole a distinct gain to cultivators. He cannot think that Mr. Ozanne has shown sufficient reason either for lowering in 26 villages rates which have been paid with ease for thirty years, or for refraining from taking advantage of the large rise in prices since 1853-54 to increase the maximum rate for the group from Rs. 1-6-0 to Rs. 1-8-0. The circumstances of the 67 villages appear to be sufficiently alike to render the formation of extra groups unnecessary, more especially as the Survey and Settlement Commissioner admits in the concluding paragraph of his forwarding letter that no complaints against the grouping or maximum rates have been received, although especial pains were taken to make them clearly known to the cultivators. On the whole the Governor in Council is satisfied that Mr. Fletcher's proposals for his second group of villages may be safely accepted.

11. For his third and fourth groups Mr. Fletcher proposes to keep the old rates which the experience of thirty years has shown to be suitable, and the Governor in Council cannot concur in the opinion expressed by Mr. Ozanne that they should be lowered. With the rupee maximum proposed by Mr. Fletcher for the fourth group, the assessment on the poorest soils will, it is admitted by Mr. Ozanne, be only 1 anna per acre, and if it cannot be profitably occupied, whether used for "Sindad" or for cultivation, at a rate so low as this, to encourage its occupation does not seem desirable, and it would evidently, being situated in "ghát" villages, be more profitably included in the forest area.

12. Mr. Fletcher's proposals may be sanctioned without alteration. The new rates should be introduced in the current season, but the date up to which resignations of land may be received should be extended to the 15th July.

13. With reference to paragraph 26 of Mr. Ozanne's report, the Acting Survey and Settlement Commissioner should be asked to explain why the present and proposed rice and garden *maxima* rates were not notified *with* the present and proposed *average* rates. The particular attention of that officer is drawn to the necessity for avoiding the smallest enhancements of assessment in excess of the prescribed limits.
