

**REPORT ON THE ADMINISTRATION OF MUNICIPALITIES.
IN THE NORTHERN DIVISION FOR THE YEAR 1939-40.**

PART I.

1. Number and Area of Municipalities and Notified Areas.

The total number of Municipalities in the Northern Division remained the same as in the previous year, viz., 33. Of these, the Municipalities of Ahmedabad, Nadiad, Broach, Surat, Thana, Baudra and Kurla were governed by the Bombay Municipal Boroughs Act, 1925, and the rest by the Bombay District Municipal Act, 1901. Of the latter, two, viz., Viramgam and Godhra, were City Municipalities constituted under section 181 of the Bombay District Municipal Act. The number of notified areas (exclusive of those which merely exist for the purpose of enforcing building regulations and do not levy taxes) were five in the Bombay Suburban District and one in Thana District.

There was no change in the area of any of the Municipalities in the Division.

2. Change in the Population and Boundaries.

The total population resident within the Municipal areas was 11,09,083. There was no change in the boundaries of any Municipality.

3. Constitution of Municipalities.

The Kurla Municipality which was under supersession from 1st November 1934 and the affairs of which were managed by the Administrator appointed by the Commissioner under section 219(2)(b) of the Bombay Municipal Boroughs Act, 1925, was restored with effect from 1st July 1939 with 28 members—all elected—on the general Board.

The constitutions of the following Municipalities which were revised in the year under report in accordance with the policy of Government as embodied in Act IX of 1938 are now on a purely elective basis with reservation of seats for women and minorities such as Indian Christians, Harijans and Backward Tribes, the Muslims being given separate seats :—

- (1) Borsad, (2) Mehmedabad, (3) Kaira, (4) Nadiad, (5) Dakor, (6) Anand, (7) Umreth, (8) Kurla, (9) Ghatkoper-Kirol.

All the Municipalities in the Division have now elected non-official presidents.

The Municipalities of Godhra and Kalyan were converted into Boroughs with effect from 1st April 1940.

Triennial elections were held in the following six Municipalities :—

- (1) Borsad, (2) Mehmedabad, (3) Kaira, (4) Nadiad, (5) Kurla and (6) Ghatkoper-Kirol.

A consolidated statement showing the number of voters who exercised the franchise at the elections is appended.

4. Attendance at Municipal Meetings.

The number of meetings held during the year was 984 as against 1,222 in the previous year. Of these 122 proved abortive for want of quorum and 316 were adjourned. The previous year's figures were 146 and 431. The average percentage of attendance of members at the meetings was 65.03. The corresponding percentage in the previous year was 62.99. No case has been reported of adjournments on wholly inadequate grounds of the kind mentioned in Government Resolution, General Department, No. 1689, dated 7th May 1937.

5. Change in the System of Taxation.

(a) *Property Taxes.*—The Ahmedabad Municipality widened the application of special water rate rule No. 340 so as to include shops where aerated waters or any other drink or eatable is served for consumption in order that special water rate can be charged at a higher percentage prescribed in the rule. The Dohad Municipality revised the house-tax Schedule. Properties used for public gymnasia were exempted from the House and Property Tax by the Surat Municipality.

(b) *Octroi.*—The Dohad Municipality introduced the levy of octroi from 1st July 1939 for the first time as the levy of terminal tax on export of certain commodities was abolished being *ab-initio* void.

(c) *Terminal Tax.*—The levy of terminal tax on the export of goods was discontinued by the Umreth Municipality from 1st May 1939. Certain Municipalities desired to add to the terminal tax schedule but were not permitted to do so in view of section 143 of the Government of India Act.

(d) *Sanitary Cess.*—The Dholka Municipality adopted a sliding scale on a valuation basis instead of a flat rate of Re. 1 per house in respect of the General Sanitary Cess. The effect to the sanctioned rules was however given from 1st April 1940. The Rander Municipality revised the rates of special sanitary cess from Rs. 2 to Rs. 3-8-0 in order to make the special sanitary services self-supporting.

(e) *Conveyance Tax and Toll.*—The Ahmedabad Municipality reduced the rate of conveyance tax from Rs. 18 to Rs. 13 per quarter on motor cars belonging to the residents of the Ahmedabad Cantonment who pay conveyance tax to the Cantonment authorities also. Conveyances maintained by agriculturists for personal use were exempted from this tax. The Kapadvanj Municipality reduced the rate of this tax on hand lorries from Rs. 12 to Rs. 6 per annum. The Dohad Municipality imposed a wheel tax of Re. 1 on cycles. It also raised the rate of toll tax from one to two annas and extended its application to unladen vehicles. The Ghatkoper-Kirol Municipality has framed rules for the levy of conveyance tax on motor vehicles. Juhu commenced the levy of this tax on motor cars in accordance with the rules sanctioned last year.

(f) *Miscellaneous Taxes.*—The rates of shop tax were revised by the Kalyan Municipality. The Juhu Municipality revised the rates and rules for the levy of special tax on temporary huts, sheds and tents.

The taxation proposals of the Surat Municipality which included the levy of (i) octroi on many additional articles, (ii) general water rate and (iii) Drainage tax and the revision of rules for private water connections were sanctioned during the year for financing the proposed comprehensive Drainage Scheme for the City. They have not however been put into effect as the requisite loan for the Drainage Scheme was not floated on account of the fluctuating and unfavourable conditions of the money market due to the war.

6. Municipal Income.

The aggregate gross income of the Municipalities in the division excluding the opening balance increased from Rs. 2,15,27,407 to Rs. 2,36,15,857. Deducting receipts under "Extraordinary and Debt", the net income amounted to Rs. 1,00,01,138 as against Rs. 1,04,87,649 in the preceding year. The net decrease of Rs. 4,86,511 is accounted for under the following general heads :—

The main causes affecting the figures given above are given below :—

(d) Octroi and Terminal Tax receipts—

(i) *Octroi*.—There was a net decrease of Rs. 7,226 under this head. Although Dohad (which levied octroi from the year under report) and Bassein showed increases of Rs. 11,169 and Rs. 2,457, the increases were set off by a large decrease of Rs. 21,236 in Surat due to less imports.

(ii) *Terminal Tax*.—The receipts under this head also showed a decrease of Rs. 2,05,391 which was mainly shared by Ahmedabad to the extent of Rs. 1,83,366, Broach Rs. 12,623 and Jambusar Rs. 6,758. On the other hand, Thana showed an increase of Rs. 9,888 in the terminal tax receipts owing to increased imports.

The decrease at Ahmedabad is due to loss of income from imports of cloth from Mills which were included within the extended limits of the Municipality. The decreases shown by Broach and Jambusar were the result of less imports of grain, etc., and the early cotton season in the preceding year. The opening of two ginning factories near by was also responsible for the reduction of the quantity of cotton brought to Jambusar for ginning.

(b) Taxes on Houses and Lands—

The total receipts under this head increased from Rs. 10,75,740 to Rs. 11,72,536, a net increase of Rs. 96,796. The Municipalities in which the increase was most notable are Nadiad (Rs. 15,392), Dohad (Rs. 17,747), Bandra (Rs. 18,448) and Parle-Andheri (Rs. 44,940). The increase is due mainly to better recoveries especially of arrears in Nadiad and Dohad.

(c) Tax on Animals and Vehicles—

Receipts under this head showed an increase of Rs. 33,069 in the division towards which Ahmedabad mainly contributed by increased receipts of Rs. 24,666 due to recovery of taxes from out-city buses. Juhu had an income of Rs. 4,373 for the first time under this head.

(d) *Water Rate*.—The total receipts under this head declined from Rs. 25,86,921 to Rs. 25,49,503 in the year under report, showing a net decrease of Rs. 37,418. Ahmedabad showed a large decrease of Rs. 64,901 in the receipts under this head and this has been said to be due to the fact that the quadrennial revision of valuation came into force in the year under report and some objection petitions received from the Mills were not disposed of in time. This large decrease was set off by increases in Bandra and Kurla to the extent of Rs. 20,065 and Rs. 3,607 respectively.

(e) Sanitary Cesses—

(i) *General Sanitary Cess*.—The net increase of Rs. 4,513 under this head calls for no special remarks.

(ii) *Special Sanitary Cess*.—Receipts under this head showed a decrease of Rs. 1,240 during the year under report. Though Ahmedabad showed a large decrease of Rs. 44,051 on account of non-disposal of objection petitions, the decrease was set off by corresponding increases in Surat, Bandra and Parle-Andheri to the extent of Rs. 21,461, Rs. 13,520 and Rs. 8,334 respectively due to the improved system of collections of the cess from landlords instead of from tenants at Surat and increase in demands and better collections at Bandra and Parle-Andheri.

(f) Revenue derived from Municipal Property—

Income under this head rose from Rs. 10,48,499 to Rs. 11,13,924, a net increase of Rs. 65,425, Ahmedabad and Surat being mainly

responsible. In Ahmedabad, the increase of Rs. 24,283 was due to more income realised from the sale of land and increased receipts from the sewage farm and fines under the Municipal and other Acts. The Surat Municipality had notable increases of Rs. 14,770 and Rs. 10,209 in the receipts from rents of lands etc., and from fines under the Municipal and other Acts.

(g) Grants and Contributions for General and Special purposes—

Receipts under this head which mainly consist of grants in aid to Municipalities for the entertainment of health officers and sanitary inspectors and for medical and educational purposes showed a decrease of Rs. 4,81,167. The large decrease is due to the fact that during the previous year the Ahmedabad Municipality received arrears of Primary Education grant to the extent of Rs. 5,45,846 in addition to the usual annual grant. Excluding this item, the Municipality received in the year under report a larger annual grant owing to increased expenditure on Primary Education.

The Bandra Municipality also showed a decrease of Rs. 25,814 under this head which was mainly due to the fact that no donation was received from any one as was received in the last year for medical purposes.

7. Nature of Income and Incidence per head of Population.

Out of the total income of the Municipalities in the Division amounting to Rs. 1,00,01,138, Rs. 79,85,512 were realised from municipal rates and taxes as compared with Rs. 80,32,641, in the preceding year. Direct taxation yielded Rs. 56,58,265 or 70.8 per cent. of the total and indirect taxation Rs. 23,27,247 or 29.2 per cent.

The following table shows the average incidence of taxation and income per head of population during the year as compared with the previous year in the division as a whole and in each of the six districts:—

8. Recovery of Municipal Dues.

With few exceptions the collection of taxes continued to be unsatisfactory.

The total amount of arrears of taxes and dues in all the Municipalities in the division at the end of the year amounted to Rs. 12.21 lakhs as against Rs. 10.45 lakhs in the previous year.

Arrears have substantially increased in all the Borough Municipalities except Nadiad and Surat. In Surat, however, the reduction was the result of a wholesale writing off of Rs. 70,636 of which Rs. 53,567 pertained to previous years. In Ahmedabad, the large amount of Rs. 5,02,904 was due to the fact that objection petition against the valuation and assessment of certain Mills.

and Factories and from some of the wards were decided late and the bills amounting to Rs. 2,95,800 were issued only in March, 1940. It also included a sum of Rs. 60,851 in dispute with the Bombay, Baroda and Central India Railway.

Bandra maintained the same standard as in the previous year because with the increase in the demand, there was a corresponding increase in arrears also. The case of Kurla is worth mentioning. While in charge of the Administrator the percentage of arrears was reduced to 13.26 in 1938-39. The present increase to 17 per cent. represents a marked deterioration. It may be stated that its large arrears were mainly responsible for its supersession in 1934.

The record of minor municipalities in the collection of arrears was also not encouraging. Though some of the municipalities like Modasa, Umreth, Borsad, Dohad, Kalyan and Bassein, showed improvement, Dhandhuka, Dakor, Kapadvanj, Kaira, Godhra, Bhiwandi and Ghatkoper-Kirol, showed deterioration.

In Juhu, though the arrears were reduced, the percentage was 36.62. The Municipality has thus an uphill task before it to bring the arrears to anything like a reasonable figure.

9. Working of Octroi and Terminal Tax system.

The number of municipalities levying octroi was five viz., Dholka, Viramgam, Ranpur, Surat and Bassein in the previous year. To these Dohad was added in the year under report. This Municipality had been levying terminal tax on the export of goods for the last 15 years, but had to discontinue the levy from 1st January 1938 as it was found to be illegal. In consequence the Municipality introduced from 1st July 1939 octroi on goods entering the Municipal limits for consumption, use or sale therein.

There was no change in the number of municipalities levying terminal taxes which was 17. The levy of terminal tax on exports was discontinued by the Umreth Municipality from 1st May 1939.

The remaining 10 Municipalities levied neither octroi nor terminal tax.

Out of the gross collections of Rs. 4,78,533 from octroi, a sum of Rs. 1,34,846 was refunded on account of the re-export of goods as against Rs. 1,33,333 in the preceding year, the Surat Municipality alone being responsible for a refund of Rs. 1,34,185.

The total receipts from terminal tax were Rs. 19,83,560 as against Rs. 21,88,951 in the preceding year. Ahmedabad was mainly responsible for the large fall of Rs. 1,83,366 owing to the inclusion of certain Mills within the Municipality.

10. Expenditure.

The total expenditure of the Municipalities in the Northern Division amounted to Rs. 2,30,48,941 as against Rs. 2,22,54,202 in the preceding year. Deducting the disbursements under "Extraordinary and Debt", the net expenditure amounted to Rs. 98,87,056 as against Rs. 1,02,53,242 in the preceding year, a net decrease of Rs. 3,66,186.

Variations under the important heads are detailed below.

(a) *Administration and collection charges.*—Expenditure under this head increased from Rs. 10,45,643 to Rs. 10,66,500 or a net increase of Rs. 20,857. Ahmedabad showed a large increase of Rs. 47,817 due to increase in establishment, re-organisation of the audit department, opening of a separate department for land acquisition and the additional Magistrate's pay. Surat, Ghatkoper, Kirol and Parle Andheri also showed increases of Rs. 7,043, 2,264 and 4,381

owing to the grant of cycle allowance to all inspectors in the Direct Tax department, increase in establishment and payment of periodical increments. Against this, Ahmedabad spent less towards pension and gratuities by Rs. 24,002 and Kurla Rs. 14,426 due to saving of pay, etc., of the Administrator on the restoration of the Municipality.

(b) *Water supply*.—Expenditure under this head rose by Rs. 99,252 as under :—

Surat was mainly responsible for the increase in capital outlay to the extent of Rs. 78,987 being the cost of replacement of the gravitation main from Varachha Head Water Works to Murda Gate. Against this, Bandra showed a decrease of Rs. 22,898 as there was no major capital expenditure during the year like the laying of a 10" main in the Khar Scheme in the previous year.

The increase of Rs. 40,719 in the Establishment and Repairs etc. charges was mainly showed by Ahmedabad and Bandra due to increase in electric energy charges on tube wells put into operation for the supply of water in the suburbs at Ahmedabad and payment of water bills to the Public Works Department by the Bandra Municipalit.

(c) *Drainage*.—Expenditure increased by Rs. 3,42,825 as detailed below :—

Ahmedabad, Bandra and Kurla were responsible as in all these three Municipalities drainage works are in progress.

(d) *Conservancy*.—Expenditure under this head which represents money spent on road cleaning and watering and on public latrines but excludes expenditure on special sanitary services increased by Rs. 51,001 chiefly because more sweepers were engaged in Ahmedabad on account of the extension of its limits and new motor lorries and trucks were purchased by the Municipalities of Ahmedabad, Ghatkoper-Kirol and Parle Andheri.

The following Municipalities failed to observe the principle that proceeds from special sanitary cess should not be less than the cost of the special private service rendered by the Municipality.

Dakor, Godhra, Rander, Bulsar, Kalyan and Parle Andheri.

(e) *Hospital and Dispensaries*.—Expenditure decreased by Rs. 48,242 during the year. The Municipalities of Bandra and Kurla were mainly responsible for the decrease of Rs. 23,690 and 30,054 over the last year's figures. Bandra's decrease was due to the fact that a storey over the Hospital was completed in the previous year at a cost Rs. 25,405 and no such expenditure was incurred during the year. So also in Kurla no Hospital building had to be paid for as in the previous year. Against this, the Municipalities in Kaira District spent Rs. 8,622 more under this head.

The following Municipalities failed to spend on medical relief 4 per cent. of their expenditure, the minimum laid down by Government.

Kaira, Godhra, Surat, Bandra, Parle Andheri and Juhu.

It appears that on account of the existence of a Civil Hospital in the first three towns which are headquarter towns these Municipalities continue to consider that it is not incumbent upon them to fulfil their obligation in this connection to the full extent.

(f) *Road expenditure.*—With expenditure amounting to Rs. 7,54,229, there was a net increase of Rs. 34,707 compare with the past year's figure. The most notable increase was Rs. 1,09,901 in Ahmedabad due to greater expenditure on remodelling, road repairs, maintenance of road rollers, etc., Rs. 10,121 in Viramgam on account of the asphaltting of two main roads and Rs. 16,044 in Kalyan where a cement concrete road of the length of about 2,400' x 20' was constructed. Against this expenditure under this head was substantially reduced in Broach, Surat and Thana to the extent of Rs. 15,581, 55,123 and 13,844 respectively.

The following Municipalities failed to observe the principle that the proceeds from wheel-tax and road-toll should be devoted solely to road repairs and construction :—

(1) Modasa, (2) Dhandhuka, (3) Dohad, (4) Rander, (5) Bulsar, (6) Thana, (7) Bandra, (8) Kurla and (9) Juhu.

(g) *Public instruction.*—Total expenditure under this head declined from Rs. 31,44,431 to Rs. 19,52,482 showing a net decrease of Rs. 11,91,949 for which Ahmedabad was mainly responsible. In Ahmedabad the large sum of Rs. 11,45,846 was set apart for school buildings during the preceding year but none during the year under report. Most Municipalities recorded decreases under this head on account of smaller contributions to the District Local Boards. Surat showed a large decrease of Rs. 18,525 owing to lesser grant to the School Board which had a surplus balance at the beginning of the year.

11. Closing Balance.

The aggregate closing balance of all the Municipalities in the Division amounted to Rs. 16,59,492 as against Rs. 10,92,576, a net increase of Rs. 5,66,916. The increase was specially noticeable in Ahmedabad, Kapadwanj, Nadiad, Surat and Bandra.

12. The Financial Working of Water Supply Installations.

The revenue of the Ahmedabad Municipality from water rate decreased from Rs. 18,91,571 to Rs. 18,26,670, a decrease of Rs. 64,901. The reasons for the decrease have been explained in paragraph 6 (d) above.

On the other hand, expenditure increase from Rs. 2,86,356 to Rs. 3,12,249, a net increase of Rs. 25,893. This was due to increase in electric energy charges on the tube wells put into operation for the supply of water in the suburbs and to greater expenditure on establishment and contingencies.

In the case of Kapadwanj receipts and expenditure on account of water installation were Rs. 25,030 and Rs. 19,924 as against Rs. 24,832 and 18,648 in the preceding year, a net profit of Rs. 5,106. Sixty-three new private water connections and 95 drainage connections were given while 23 water connections were discontinued. The Municipality deposited Rs. 7,000 to the Depreciation Fund during the year making the total balance to Rs. 49,269.

The working of the water supply installation at Surat produced a profit of Rs. 1,13,118 as against Rs. 1,94,497 in the preceding year, the income being Rs. 2,83,150 and expenditure including capital outlay and depreciation and collection charges Rs. 1,70,032. An Amoniator plant was installed at the water works for counteracting the smell and taste of chlorine and the result was found satisfactory. The Municipality has commenced the work of enlarging the mains from Varachha Head Water works to the Murda Gate.

The water supply accounts of Rander (which has a joint water supply with Surat), Thana and Bhiwandi showed the following result :—

Both Bandra and Kurla in the Bombay Suburban District obtain their water from the Bombay Municipality through Government in the Public Works Department.

Bandra and Kurla increased their income during the year by Rs. 20,065 and 3,607 respectively due to better collections and the increased number of private water connections.

13. Audit of Accounts.

The principal defects that were revealed in the audit of the accounts of the Municipalities by the Local Audit Department were :—

- (1) Unsatisfactory finance.
- (2) Heavy arrears.
- (3) Delay in the disposal of audit notes.
- (4) Lax supervision over the work of subordinates.
- (5) Entertainment of establishment in anticipation of sanction.
- (6) Non-observance of rules and standing orders for the adequate safeguard of Municipal revenue.
- (7) Failure to revise the assessments in time.
- (8) Councillors being themselves in arrears.

These defects are being pointed out year after year but there has been practically no improvement. The working of the Rander Municipality was found far from satisfactory. The audit note of the Bhiwandi Municipality for 1938-39 disclosed a lamentable state of affairs. In view of the serious defects in its general and financial administration pointed out by the Examiner, Government have warned the Municipality to improve the administration by appointing a Government servant as its Chief Executive Officer. The Municipality has accepted this advice.

A misappropriation of Rs. 742 by the cashier of the Parle-Audheri Municipality came to light. Though the amount has been made good, a criminal prosecution has been launched against him and the result is awaited.

A defalcation to the extent of Rs. 5,000 committed by the Accountant of the Kurla Municipality pertaining to the year under report came to light just after the close of the year when the Examiner took in hand the work of auditing the accounts of the Municipality. The defalcation is all the more unfortunate as the culprit happens to be a qualified Government Accountant attached to the Treasury Office, Thana, who was on deputation on foreign service to Kurla Municipality. The result of the prosecution is awaited.

14. Grant for Sanitary and Town Improvement Scheme.

No grant or assistance was given by Government to any Municipality for sanitary or town improvement schemes.

15. Notified Areas.

Government have decided to abolish the remaining notified areas by substituting either Village Panchayats or Municipalities. With the passing of the Bombay Finance Amendment Act, 1939, the question of abolishing the Bhayandar Notified Area in Thana District was postponed with a view to levy Urban Immoveable Property Tax in the area. The abolition of the Notified Area Committees of Mulund and Chembur and their replacement by Village Panchayats have not yet been carried out nor has the conversion of the notified areas of Malad and Kandivli into one Municipality and of Borivli into another Municipality.

The total income of the six notified area committees exclusive of the opening balance and extraordinary items amounted to Rs. 99,427 of which Rs. 89,251 were derived from taxes and Rs. 10,176 from other sources. The corresponding figures for the previous year were Rs. 9,083 and Rs. 6,930. There was thus an improvement in the total income of the committees. The total disbursement rose from Rs. 1,11,061 to Rs. 1,43,057.

The Notified Area Committee of Kandivli recorded the highest incidence of taxation (Rs. 7-3-8) and of income (Rs. 7-8-1) as against Rs. 4-2-10 and Rs. 4-6-8 in the preceding year; the lowest was recorded in Ambernath, the respective figures being Re. 0-15-9 and Re. 1-0-0.

PART II.

16. Remarks regarding more important Municipalities.

(1) Ahmedabad Municipality.

The financial position of the Ahmedabad Municipality continued to be sound. The Municipality raised a loan of Rs. 9,30,000 for the Kalupur Relief Road Scheme and Rs. 1,49,500 for the Suburban Drainage Scheme, making the total outstanding loan debt Rs. 58,19,500. The balance of the general and loan funds at the close of the year amounted to Rs. 9,20,533.

In the Jamalpur Town Planning Scheme which is the first scheme undertaken by the Municipality, certain unfavourable features retarded the development of the area. Plots reserved for certain objectionable purposes had to be taken to other and better uses and to regularise this, the original scheme is proposed to be varied suitably. The work of construction of buildings in private plots was making good progress in the Kankaria Scheme. The Ellis Bridge Town Planning Scheme has passed the stage of Arbitration and the final scheme is being drawn up by the Arbitrator.

The work of acquisition of land for the Kalapur Relief Road Scheme has progressed considerably. The Joint Judge specially appointed for the purpose disposed of all the references against awards of properties in Sections I, II and V. By the close of the year, acquisitions of properties in these sections were completed. The work of demolition of the acquired properties in Section I was nearly completed by the end of the year. Similar work for sections II and V was also in progress.

Water Supply and Drainage.—The Municipality is doing its best to meet the increased demand for water. The river current was diverted to the eastern side by putting a bund across it after the monsoon and feeder channels were dug and maintained efficiently. Additional tube well stations were completed for improvement of water supply in the suburbs. For the adequate supply of water to the high level area from the Madhav Baug elevated tank, auxiliary rising mains carrying water directly to the highest point and then discharging water to the area were laid. Two Booster sets of one lac of gallons per hour capacity were replaced by two pumping sets of four lacs of gallons per hour capacity each. The system of supply of water for longer periods during the morning and evening hours was also continued.

The Suburban Drainage Scheme has made considerable progress in its second stage. All the main lines included in the scheme were completed during the year. The Main Pumping Station, sump pit, Grit Chamber, Interstage pumping stations at Gomatipur and Dariapur were completed. The construction of smaller Interstage pumping stations for the Shahibagh area was also commenced. A large portion of the branch sewers was also executed during the year under report.

Disposal of Sewage.—The question of satisfactory disposal of the city sewage is receiving the attention of the Municipality.

The area under old filtration was 186 acres. To this, additional land measuring 188 acres is being added for the filtration of the new suburban sewage.

Out of the area of 534 acres acquired during the previous year for the disposal of the suburban sewage, the Municipality started the work of turning 150 acres of land into filter beds during the year.

Owing to the addition of 350 acres of land to the cultivated area of the farm, more of the sewage is now consumed in irrigation leaving about one-third for filtration. Fodder was raised in this cultivated area for the relief of cattle during the famine.

Public health was on the whole good and no epidemic visited the city in a serious form. The birth rate during the year was 50.78 as against 42.14 per thousand during the preceding year. The death rate per thousand of population rose from 35.96 to 39.57. The construction of the new Infectious Diseases Hospital outside Jamalpur Gate was completed. It is being equipped and will be taken in use shortly. The Municipality has accepted an offer of a donation of Rs. 90,000 from the Ahmedabad District King Emperor's Anti-Tuberculosis Fund and has undertaken to build and equip two Anti-Tuberculosis Clinics and to maintain them permanently. Steps are being taken for the acquisition of land for the purpose.

The programme of enforcing the removal of sand privies and hand cleansed privies and converting them into water closets was continued during the year but could not be accelerated for want of adequate pressure of water in the mains in several localities.

The Jamalpur High Level Bridge was completed and opened for traffic. All the spans except one of the Shahpur High Level Bridge were completed during the year. The work of both the bridges was carried out under the supervision of Dr. Nicholas, the Bridge Engineer of the Bombay, Baroda and Central India Railway.

Asphalt treatment of one kind or other was given to 23 roads and the Municipality has now got a length of about 62½ miles of dustless and

permanent roads. The work of paving the *pols* was also continued during the year and Rs. 1,81,403 were spent thereon.

With the object of improving and extending housing accommodation for the working classes and the poor, the work of providing upper floors on the Harijan and labour quarters was undertaken and completed during the year. The Municipality has now 174 storeyed tenements which are allocated to the poorer classes including labourers and 116 storeyed tenements for its Harijan employees. In order to provide amenities to the Harijan localities, the Municipality constructed some five new roads, gave asphalt treatment to one, paved certain *pols* and constructed storm water drains in two localities.

The administration of the Ahmedabad Municipality is notable for its all-round efficiency.

(2) *Surat Municipality.*

The financial position of the Municipality was on the whole satisfactory. The figures of income and expenditure were Rs. 12,45,747 and Rs. 11,30,234 as against Rs. 12,20,239 and Rs. 11,20,523 in the preceding year. There was no loan to be repaid and no debt to redeem. The year closed with a balance of Rs. 2,39,855. The arrears of taxes decreased from Rs. 1,33,515 to Rs. 65,259 which result was however only achieved by writing off of Rs. 53,563 of the old arrears.

The work of enlarging the Gravitation mains from Varaoaha Head Water Works to Murda Gate was in progress.

For the execution of the city drainage scheme, Government sanctioned the raising of a loan of Rs. 50 lacs in the open market, but before the Municipality could actually float the first instalment of the loan, the war broke out and the Municipality had to wait for the stabilisation on the money market. The fulfilment of the most vital need of the city was thus delayed for an indefinite period. The taxation proposals which were sanctioned by Government to finance the Drainage Scheme were therefore not put into force.

The Municipality did not spend any appreciable amount on roads as it was thought that the Drainage Scheme would be initiated during the year, and it was of no use to waste money on roads which would have to be dug up.

A new primary school building costing about Rs. 26,721 was completed during the year. It was named "Shrimati Maniben Khandeshwala" school building. The construction of a Swimming Pool was also completed at a cost of Rs. 12,000. The Municipality engaged four special swimmers, 2 boats and boatmen, six fire brigade laskars and provided other life saving materials for local rescue service during the monsoon in co-operation with the Customs and Police authorities.

PART III.

17. Administration of Municipalities in General.

The year as will be seen from the foregoing paragraphs was devoid of any special event. The constitution of nine Municipalities were revised and put on a completely elective basis. The normal administration of Kurla Municipality was restored from 1st July 1939 when the Administrator handed over the administration to the newly elected general board of the Municipality.

With a few notable exceptions the administration of the Municipalities cannot be said to have improved. Petty jealousies and the lack of broad outlook, well defined policies and civic sense of duty on the part of councillors of many of the boards were responsible for this. In Godhra owing to party factions, the appointment of a chief executive officer became necessary and after the conversion of the Municipality into a Borough, the Municipality had to be forced to take on loan the services of a Government servant as Chief Officer. The affairs of the Bhiwandi Municipality also so deteriorated that it was also forced to appoint a Government servant as its chief executive

officer for a period of two years to improve the financial position. In Kurla, many a dispute among the newly elected members on personal grounds of ill-feeling and about the powers of the Chairmen of different committees were referred to the Collector for decision. On one occasion the Collector was obliged to warn the Municipality that if such squabbles among the Councillors continued, he would have to move Government to resume charge of the Municipality.

Another reason for want of progress and improvement in the general administration is stated to be want of funds to meet the evergrowing demands of the public for modern amenities. This is in part due to slackness in the collection of arrears of taxes and in part to reluctance on the part of the municipal bodies to impose additional taxes even where they can be borne without difficulty.

One more disappointing feature which characterises the Municipal administration in general was the absence of co-ordination between the majority and the minority parties on the boards with the result that minority members were at some places systematically excluded from the executive and other committees.

18. Financial Position.

The financial position of many of the Municipalities cannot be said to be satisfactory. It is true that they have limited sources of income but it appears that these sources are not being fully availed of by many and the Councillors are averse to the imposition of new taxes, although they demand expenditure. No energetic steps are taken to reduce the large percentage of arrears.

19. Co-operation or otherwise with Government.

The relations between Municipalities and Government officials were on the whole cordial and smooth during the year and there is nothing special to mention.

20. Health and Medicine.

No serious epidemic appeared during the year and the general public health remained good except for the usual out-breaks of small-pox, malaria and typhoid which the Municipalities concerned promptly and successfully controlled.

21. Facilities to Harijan Servants.

Equal facilities were accorded to the Harijans in matters of education, water supply and other amenities obtaining in municipal areas. No instance of disregard of the rights of these classes has been brought to notice. The Municipalities are generally alive, but not to the full extent as desired by Government to the wants of their Harijan employees in the matter of permanency of service, benefits of leave, provident fund etc. Major Municipalities are beginning to provide housing accommodation for this class of their employees.

22. Appreciation of services of Municipal Presidents, Officers and Councillors.

The Collector of Ahmedabad has commended the progressive activities of the Ahmedabad Municipality and remarks that special praise is due to Mr. Manilal Chaturbhai Shah, the energetic President, and to Mr. Bhagat, the Chief Officer. The Collector of Thana has also commended the work of Mr. M. V. Hegde, the ex-president of the Municipality who took keen interest in the management of Municipal affairs.

**REPORT ON THE ADMINISTRATION OF MUNICIPALITIES
IN THE CENTRAL DIVISION FOR THE YEAR 1939-40.**

PART I.

1. Number and Area.

The total number of Municipalities at the end of the year remained the same as in the previous year, viz. 58. Of these 15 were governed by the Bombay Municipal Boroughs Act, 1925, and 43 by the District Municipal Act, 1901. Of the latter Yeola is a city municipality constituted under section 181 of the District Municipal Act.

The number of notified areas (exclusive of those which merely exist for the purpose of enforcing building regulations and do not levy taxes) was two—one in Poona District and the other in Satara District.

2. Change in the Population and Boundaries.

The total population resident within the municipal areas was 10,31,210. There was no change in the boundaries of any of the Municipalities during the year under report.

3. Constitution of Municipalities.

During the year under report 18 municipalities were reconstituted on elective basis in accordance with the provisions of the Bombay District Municipal and Municipal Boroughs (Amendment) Act IX of 1938. 23 municipalities were so reconstituted during the preceding year. The proposals for the reconstitution of the remaining 17 municipalities have also been sanctioned by Government and will be brought into force after the expiry of the present terms of these bodies.

The Pandharpur Municipality was superseded by Government Resolution, General Department, No. 3046/33, dated June 19th, 1939, with effect from June 20th, 1939 and a Committee of Management was appointed to manage its affairs. The Sangamner Municipality which was superseded during the preceding year continued to be managed by an Administrator of the rank of a Mamlatdar. The Ashta Municipality which was superseded by Government Resolutions, General Department, No. 2425/33, dated March 31st, 1938 and October 10th, 1938 was re-established with effect from November 16th, 1939.

Elections.

Triennial elections were held in the case of 17 municipalities and by-elections were held in the case of 15 municipalities. A statement showing the number of voters who exercised the franchise at the general elections is appended.

4. Attendance at Municipal Meetings.

The number of meetings held during the year was 1296 as against 1467 in the previous year. 186 meetings proved to be abortive for want of a quorum and 429 were adjourned. The average percentage of attendance of members at the meetings was 68.34 as against 61.96 in the preceding year.

5. Changes in the System of Taxation.

(a) *Property tax.*—The Barsi Municipality exempted agricultural huts and sheds from payment of this tax.

(b) *Octroi.*—The Dhond Municipality began to levy octroi during this year.

(c) *Terminal tax.*—No change.

(d) *Water rates.*—The Ashta Municipality levied general water rate for the first time. The Barsi Municipality exempted from payment of general water rate residential buildings connected with mills and factories.

(e) *Sanitary cesses.*—The Ashta Municipality began to levy general sanitary cess. The revised rates of general sanitary cess framed by the Dhulia Municipality were sanctioned during the year and brought into force from April 1st, 1940.

(f) *Conveyance tax and toll.*—The wheel tax rules of the Jalgaon Municipality were revised.

(g) *Other Miscellaneous taxes.*—The Shirpur Municipality began to levy tax on cotton pressed and cotton ginned at the rate of As. 4 per bale and As. 2 per docra respectively. The proposal of the Raver Municipality to levy tax on pressed cotton was approved during the year and the tax was levied from April 1st, 1940.

6. Municipal Income.

The aggregate gross income of the Municipalities fell from Rs. 94,12,676 to Rs. 93,57,225. Deducting the receipts under "extraordinary and debt" the net income amounted to Rs. 72,75,610 as against Rs. 71,56,131 in the preceding year. The important variations are set out in the following paragraphs:—

(a) *Octroi and terminal tax.*—There was an increase of Rs. 21,485 under the head octroi and a decrease of Rs. 26,735 under the head terminal tax. The former was mainly shared by the Sholapur and Nandurbar Municipalities and the latter by the Dhulia and Ahmednagar Municipalities. The most notable change was a decrease of Rs. 22,893 in the octroi receipts of Barsi due to the poor agricultural season.

(b) *Taxes on houses and land.*—The increase of Rs. 45,251 was shared by all Districts except Ahmednagar. It was mainly due to collection of past arrears by many municipalities. It is particularly marked in East Khandesh District where the collections increased in the case of 11 out of the 12 municipalities due to the repeated pressure brought upon them by the Collector.

(c) *Tolls and conveyance taxes.*—The decrease of Rs. 33,372 is contributed by all the districts except West Khandesh. Nasik Municipality showed a decrease of Rs. 6,737 as the Government grant in lieu of toll under the Motor Vehicles Tax Act was not received by it during the year. Ahmednagar Municipality also showed a decrease of Rs. 7,610 as last year it received arrears of such grant while there were no such receipts during the year. The decrease in East Khandesh is due to the reduction of the rates of toll by the Jalgaon, Amalner and Yawal Municipalities.

(d) *Water rates.*—The increase of Rs. 48,142 was due to the levy of the rate at Junnar for the first time, the levy of enhanced rates at Dhulia, the new connections at Sholapur, Poona City and Lonavla and the recovery of past arrears by Nandurbar, Karad, Satara City, Barsi and other Municipalities.

(e) *Special and general sanitary cesses.*—There were small increases and decreases in individual cases and on the whole there was an increase of Rs. 27,779. It was partly due to the recovery of past arrears.

(f) *Pilgrim tax.*—The decrease of Rs. 16,777 was due to the decrease in the number of pilgrims visiting Pandharpur and Alandi.

(g) *Revenue derived from municipal property.*—The receipts showed an increase of Rs. 63,129 mainly due to greater income in Poona City and Sholapur on account of sale of lands.

(h) *Grants and contributions for general and special purposes.*—
The receipts under this head consist mainly of grants-in-aid from Government for general, educational and medical purposes which amount to Rs. 6,42,820 as against Rs. 6,33,545 in the preceding year. The increase is small and calls for no remarks.

7. Nature of Income and Incidence per head of Population.

Out of the total income of the Municipalities amounting to Rs. 72,75,610, Rs. 52,13,349 were realised from municipal rates and taxes as compared with Rs. 51,40,913 in the previous year direct taxation yielding Rs. 30,86,923 or 59.2 per cent. and indirect taxation Rs. 21,26,426 or 40.8 per cent.

The following table shows the average incidence of taxation and income per head of population during the year under report as compared with the previous year, for the whole division as well as for each of the seven districts :—

8. Recovery of Dues.

Of the total demand of Rs. 38,27,883 on account of the four important taxes, viz. house tax, conservancy cesses, wheel tax and water rates, the arrears outstanding at the end of the year amounted to Rs. 10,52,909 as against Rs. 10,20,297 in the preceding year. At Taloda, Amalner, Erandol and Sholapur the collection work was satisfactory. Sangamner, Mahableshwar, Rahimatpur, Satara Suburban, Tasgaon, Vita and Wai showed improvement in recovery work. At all other places the work continued to be unsatisfactory and most of them have allowed heavy arrears to accumulate. The arrears were particularly heavy at Chopda, Faizpur and Yawal.

9. Working of Octroi and Terminal Tax systems.

The octroi system was in force in 37 municipalities and the terminal tax in 9 municipalities. Dhond levied octroi for the first time. The gross receipts on account of octroi amounted to Rs. 17,20,055 the net income being Rs. 16,31,257. The percentage of refunds in respect of re-exported goods was 5.16 as against 5.02 in the previous year.

Owing to the diversion of goods traffic from rail to road the income from terminal tax is declining. It decreased from Rs. 2,08,785 to Rs. 1,82,050 during the year mainly for this reason.

10. Expenditure.

The total expenditure of the Municipalities was Rs. 93,22,205 as against Rs. 92,90,873 in the previous year. Excluding the items of "extraordinary and debt" the expenditure amounted to Rs. 73,17,266 as against Rs. 73,74,804 in the preceding year.

The variations under the main heads were as follows :—

(a) *Administration*.—The increase of Rs. 34,121 was mainly due to greater expenditure on pensions and gratuities in Sholapur and on leave salary in Poona City, entertainment of Wheel tax establishment at Mahableshwar and the Administrator at Sangamner.

(b) *Water Supply*.—The expenditure increased by Rs. 1,42,762 chiefly owing to the construction of a reservoir at Sholapur, the improvement of water supply at Dhulia, the improvement of Kasba water supply at Barsi and the payment of outstanding bills by the Karad and Sholapur Municipalities.

(c) *Drainage*.—The expenditure increased in Sholapur by Rs. 30,830 owing to the construction of Sadar Bazar Nala Sewer and part of internal drainage works. It fell in Poona City by Rs. 1,05,272 as the works under construction were completed during the preceding year and no new works were undertaken during the year under report. There were small increases and decreases in other municipalities and on the whole there was a decrease of Rs. 80,735 under this head.

(d) *Conservancy*.—The expenditure rose from Rs. 9,83,832 to Rs. 10,13,796. The notable changes were an increase of Rs. 16,387 in Nasik, an increase of Rs. 14,620 in Poona Suburban and a decrease of Rs. 14,736 in Sholapur. The increase in Poona Suburban was due to the purchase of a new motor lorry. The decrease in Sholapur was due to the fact that no new motor lorries were purchased and no new latrines were constructed by the Municipality during the year under report as in the preceding year.

The following six municipalities failed to observe the principle that the proceeds of the special sanitary cess should not be less than the cost of the special private services rendered by the municipalities :—

In order to make the special sanitary service self-supporting the Nasik Municipality has recently raised the rates of special sanitary cess. The Bhagur Municipality has also resolved to do so and its proposals have been provisionally approved. The Manmad Municipality has promised to make efforts in this direction.

(e) *Hospitals and Dispensaries*.—The increase is small, viz. Rs. 9,143 only and calls for no remarks.

The following eight municipalities failed to spend on medical relief the minimum of 4 per cent. of their expenditure as enjoined by Government :—

(f) *Roads*.—The expenditure fell from Rs. 8,12,223 to Rs. 7,20,555 mainly owing to the decrease of Rs. 1,69,332 in Poona City due to the asphaltting of fewer roads during the year. The expenditure increased at Dhulia by Rs. 17,856, at Lonavla by Rs. 9,665 and at Alandi by Rs. 23,804 on account of the construction of asphalt roads at the first two places and the extension of the bridge over the river Indrayani at the last named place. Jalgaon, Bhusawal and Amalner Municipalities also showed an increase of Rs. 24,194, Rs. 3,799 and Rs. 6,155 respectively under this head during the year.

The following 20 municipalities failed to observe the principle of devoting the whole of the proceeds of wheel tax and tolls to the construction and maintenance of roads :—

(g) *Public Instruction*.—The expenditure rose from Rs. 16,61,904 to Rs. 16,71,205. The notable increase of Rs. 37,233 in Poona City was due to the transfer to that body of the control of primary schools in Poona Suburban Municipality and that of Rs. 13,299 in Shirpur was due to the construction of a new school building.

11. Closing Balance.

The aggregate closing balance of the Municipalities amounted to Rs. 14,29,553 as against Rs. 13,94,533 in the previous year. The increase of Rs. 35,020 occurred in the districts of Ahmednagar, Nasik, Poona and Sholapur.

12. Financial working of Water Supply Installations.

The water works at Dhulia, Nasik, Trimbak and Vita yielded a profit while those at Ahmednagar, Nandurbar, Junnar, Sirur, Karad, Satara City and Barsi showed a loss. At Jalgaon there are two systems of water supply—the Girna Water Works and the Mebrun Tank Supply. The former worked at a loss while the latter showed a profit.

The income of water works at Dhulia rose from Rs. 32,177 in the preceding year to Rs. 42,098 during the year under report due to the levy of enhanced water rates. The project of water supply improvements entrusted to the Public Works Department for execution is in progress at that place.*

13. Audit of Accounts.

The accounts of almost all the Municipalities in the Division were audited during the year under report. The principal defects noticed were :—

- (1) Unsatisfactory finances ;
- (2) Heavy arrears ;
- (3) Inadequate supervision over the administration of public funds ;
- (4) Want of strict observance of rules, bye-laws and standing orders for safeguarding the municipal revenue ;
- (5) Delay in the disposal of audit notes ; and
- (6) Non-payment of municipal dues even by the councillors in time.

The following cases of misappropriation were brought to light :—

Dhond.—The Secretary of the Municipality misappropriated an amount of Rs. 1,045. A criminal case has been lodged against him and the result is awaited.

Trimbak.—A scrutiny of the pilgrim tickets issued during the year 1937-38 disclosed a short credit of Rs. 507-12-0. The Police are investigating the offence.

Yawal.—Temporary misappropriations by the collecting clerk were found. He was suspended for 2½ months and reinstated after administering an admonition. The Collector has pointed out to the Municipality that the action taken was inadequate.

Faizpur.—The Municipality had taken action for embezzlements in the octroi receipts of the years 1936-37 and 1937-38 referred to in the last year's report. One peon was dismissed and two clerks and three peons were fined.

14. Grants from Government for sanitary and town improvement schemes.

The following grants (by way of remission of establishment, tools and plant charges) were made by Government for sanitary and town improvement schemes :—

15. Notified Areas.

There were three notified area committees in the Division: Talegaon-Dabhade in Poona District, Lonand in Satara District and Gokulwadi in Ahmednagar District. The last did not levy taxes. Government have approved the proposal of abolition of the first two committees, and village panchayats will be established in their places soon. The third committee is to be replaced by a District Municipality and proposals in respect thereof are under the consideration of Government.

PART II.

16. Remarks regarding more important Municipalities in the Division.

(a) Poona City Municipality.

(i) *Income, Expenditure and Collection of municipal dues.*—Exclusive of the opening balance and receipts under the heads "Extraordinary" and "Debt" the income of the Municipality amounted to Rs. 19,30,007 as against that of Rs. 19,34,524 of the previous year. Continued slackness in the collection of arrears which stood at Rs. 1,64,383 at the close of the year under report as against Rs. 1,60,701 of the previous year is one of the reasons for the decrease of Rs. 4,517 in the municipal income. During the year under report the Municipality shows a net decrease of Rs. 2,40,480 against the previous year's expenditure amounting to Rs. 29,25,642, the result of reduced expenditure on water-supply, drainage and buildings and roads. The Municipality's closing balance was Rs. 1,27,381 as against Rs. 30,682 in the previous year.

The work of recovering municipal dues is far from satisfactory as is evidenced by the increased accumulation of arrears. The Municipality must implement to the fullest extent the coercive remedies provided by the statute and wipe off the arrears as speedily as possible.

(ii) *Public Health.*—An outbreak of small-pox occurred in the municipal district during the year under report, the number of attacks and deaths being 170 and 156 respectively. Vigorous preventive remedies checked the spread of the epidemic. Infant and child mortality was 2,052 against 6,376 births, the corresponding figures of the previous year being 2,102 and 5,612 respectively. The expenditure on medical relief amounted to Rs. 73,233 as against Rs. 71,876 in the previous year.

(iii) *Disposal of Audit Notes.*—Audit Notes were not promptly attended to. The Audit Note for the year 1937-38 received in June 1939 was disposed of on 26th October 1939, but that for the year 1938-39 received in May 1940 till remains unattended to. Promptness in the disposal of audit notes is desirable.

(b) *Sholapur Municipality.*

This is the soundest Municipality in the Division from the financial point of view and has a very low percentage (9.3 of the demand) in arrears. It is creditable to the body to have maintained a satisfactory standard of efficiency consistently from year to year.

The zeal shown by the Municipality in increasing scope and efficiency of the civic amenities to the public also deserves commendation. The Municipality has financed Town Planning Schemes Nos. I and II from its general revenues. Draft Town Planning Scheme No. III submitted to Government awaits sanction. Unsteady market conditions have prevented generous subscriptions to the Municipality's loan of Rs. 7,75,000 for Water Supply and Drainage Schemes to be raised in the open market, the subscriptions during the year under report being Rs. 1,81,000. The Municipality is contemplating measures to make the conditions of the loan more attractive.

Suitable and sanitary housing accommodation for the Scheduled Classes in different parts of the municipal area is a scheme which specially deserves to be noted. The example furnished by this Municipality is worthy of emulation by other bodies with sound finances. An area of 38 acres has been acquired by the Municipality for the above scheme and steps to provide civic amenities to the Harijan areas are being taken.

PART III.

17. General Remarks.

(a) *Administration of the municipalities as a whole.*

1. *Ahmednagar District.*—Except for the work of recovering the municipal dues, the administration of the Ahmednagar Municipality during the year under report was good. Reluctance to implement the coercive remedies provided by law hampered speedy recovery of dues. Though this Municipality has progressive ideas about the civic welfare of the town, it is seriously handicapped in achieving them partly by the heaviness of arrears and partly by a refusal to increase its resources by new sources of taxation. The Municipality chiefly relies upon the General Revenues for meeting liabilities incurred on account of two loans, one for the Filter Beds Scheme and the other for the Drainage Scheme. The sanction to float a loan in respect of the Drainage Scheme is held in abeyance until the Municipality agrees to draft a Government Officer to speed up its recoveries and adequately improve its finances so as to be in a position to meet the liabilities arising from the loans. Unless the Municipality taps new sources of taxation and adopts vigorous and speedy recovery measures with the aid of a Government officer it will not be possible for the body to discharge the responsibilities newly undertaken.

The financial position of the Sangamner Municipality has considerably improved under the efficient management of the official Administrator. The recovery of taxes has been satisfactory. The Administrator is now directing his attention to much needed schemes of public utility such as the Drainage and Water Supply Scheme, the Maternity Home and Women's and Children's Dispensary, etc. Supersession of the Municipality did not completely suppress the intriguing spirit of the rival parties of the town and the party bickerings still affect the municipal administration to some extent.

3. *East Khandesh District.*—The administration in all municipalities of this district was normal. Factions continued but did not seriously affect the normal run of the administration.

4. *West Khandesh District.*—Most of the municipalities in this District are financially unsound bodies. Party factions continue to hamper the smooth and efficient working of the Municipalities especially at Taloda and Nundurbar. Almost all bodies persist in slackness in enforcing rules and bylaws and the coercive provisions of the Municipal Act in recovering municipal dues. Failure

to perform the fundamental functions prescribed by law is a common feature. Despite the Government's warning there is no appreciable improvement in the standard of municipal administration and the finances of the Betawad Municipality.

5. *Nasik District.*—The year under report was on the whole unsatisfactory and this has now come to be the normal. Party bickerings and personal enmities which still figure largely in the local administration of almost all Municipalities reached their climax at Yeola and resulted in the supersession of the Municipality from June 1st, 1940. The new municipal board which has commenced functioning in May 1940 has promised to improve the financial position and to raise the general standard of efficiency of the Trimbak Municipality. Whether the new Board fulfils its commitments and promises or leads the body to the supersession which the recent elections only saved it from remains to be seen. Party squabbles characterise the working of the Municipality at Malegaon and it is regrettable that there was continued disagreement between the Chief Officer and the majority party.

6. The Chakratirth Water Supply Scheme at Nasik is yet in the stage of planning and estimating. The dispute between the Nasik Municipality and the local Electric Supply Company has come to a head and has deprived the town of the facility of electric lighting. It is high time for the contending parties to reach a compromise in the interest of public safety and convenience.

7. *Poona District.*—The Junnar, Jejuri and Talegaon Dabhade Municipalities suffer from party intrigue and financial embarrassment. The Administration at Lonavla has improved with the coming into office of the new Municipal Board. The Poona Suburban Municipality showed inordinate delay in the disposal of routine correspondence.

8. *Satara District.*—The finances and efficiency of the administration have deteriorated in Karad and Islampur Municipalities to an extent which leaves no ground for hope beyond supersession. The Ashta Municipality which was restored on November 16th, 1939, after supersession is confronted with heavy arrears. The finances of the Mhaswad Municipality are precarious and unless prompt measures to relieve the body therefrom are adopted the municipal administration will soon be completely paralysed. The Municipality had to encroach upon the Provident Fund accumulations to adjust the deficits in the general revenue. The administration of Satara Suburban, Wai and Mahabaleshwar Municipalities was satisfactory.

9. *Sholapur District.*—Owing to party intrigues of a serious nature which paralysed the administration at Pandharpur, the Municipality had to be superseded from June 1939. The Barsi Municipality is faced with increasing financial difficulties. Its administration is slow and sometimes appears apathetic, but it is refreshingly free from factiousness or malpractices. The Municipalities of Karmala and Sangola are thoroughly inefficient bodies. Though both of these bodies stand in need of a reliable water supply scheme, they are financially unable to undertake them.

10. The Commissioner has to repeat that very little improvement was noticeable in the administration of Municipalities in the Central Division as a whole. With the exception of the Municipal Boroughs of Poona City and Sholapur the standard of efficiency of the municipal administration is far from satisfactory. Party bickerings and personal hatred still continue to influence the routine administration. Personalities rather than principles continue to dominate majorities in the municipal Boards and the party in power systematically makes it impossible for the minority to play its legitimate part in the local Self-Government. The administration naturally tends to become one-party rule, the minority remaining consistently in a passive attitude until their turn comes. A wider consciousness of the civic responsibilities among the councillors and a closer co-operation between the party in power and the one in opposition will alone improve the efficiency of the Municipal Boards.

The financial aspect of the municipal administration is discouraging. A majority of the Municipalities and especially the minor ones continue in financial trouble. A deep rooted objection to resort freely to coercive remedies

for accelerating the recovery of dues and interference in the legitimate duties of the Executive on the one hand and a reluctance to improve resources by tapping new sources of legitimate revenue and increasing the existing taxation proportionate to the scope of the amenities provided on the other have made the situation of most of the bodies to the on-looker a matter almost of despair. Councillors not infrequently figure as defaulters and continue enjoying their councillorships immune from disabilities for their default owing to failure of the Municipalities to enforce the penal provisions of the Municipal Act. Irregular expenditure without the Commissioner's previous sanction where necessary and misapplication of the municipal funds to unauthorised purposes are common blemishes in the administration.

As a result of the dwindling finances several of the bodies are compelled to encroach upon special funds such as the Road Fund, Depreciation Fund and Provident Fund. Fundamental functions like sanitation and public health, adequate street lighting, pure and sufficient water supply, maintenance of roads, medical relief, etc., are very often neglected and considerable expenditure is in many cases unnecessarily incurred on discretionary duties like secondary education, public libraries, etc.

The staff entertained by some of the minor municipalities is inefficient while in others it is inadequate, and in many there are good grounds for suspecting corruption. Rahimatpur Municipality is working without a Secretary. In Nandgaon a proposal was made to interchange posts of peons with those of clerks on grounds of similarity in salaries and the nature of duties performed. Radical overhaul in the methods of recruitment of staff appears necessary.

(b) *Financial position of Municipalities generally and especially those which have raised loans from Government or in the open market.*

1. *Ahmednagar District.*—The financial position of the Ahmednagar Municipality continues unsatisfactory due to its continuing slackness in effecting prompt recoveries of municipal dues. The closing balance of the body declines from year to year, the figure of the balance for the year under report standing at Rs. 6,832 as against Rs. 8,823 of the previous year. The Municipality is contemplating costly schemes of public utility such as filter beds, under-ground Drainage and construction of a School Building. The Municipality's liabilities to Government on account of loans amount to Rs. 9,52,378-3-3 inclusive of interest. It is proposed to finance the above schemes by fresh loans which it is intended to repay from the existing general revenues. Unless the Municipality adopts measures to tap fresh sources of income from taxation and takes more energetic action towards reducing the heavy accumulation of arrears of taxes there is a great likelihood of the municipal administration being seriously embarrassed.

2. The financial position of the Sangamner Municipality has considerably improved due to the efforts of the official Administrator.

3. *East Khandesh District.*—The Municipalities of Jalgaon and Amalner which have raised loans continue in a sound financial position. The finances of the Bhusawal Municipality are satisfactory and it has had to postpone the consideration of an independent water supply scheme.

4. Municipalities in general had to face a steadily deteriorating financial position and urgent attention to the necessity of building up reserves is called for. The finances of Yawal, Chopda, Faizpur, Savda and Parola Municipalities are particularly unsatisfactory.

5. *West Khandesh District.*—The financial position of all Municipalities except the Dhulia Municipality continues to be unsatisfactory.

6. *Nasik District.*—Due to lack of method in the system of tax collection the financial position in all Municipalities has deteriorated. The Nasik Municipality has not yet repaid the loan borrowed from the Water Works

Depreciation Fund. It had to be compelled to invest its Provident Fund accumulations in a separate Fund. The situation at Trimbak continues unsatisfactory though the new Municipal Board has promised to improve the finances by implementing the suggestions of the Collector and the Examiner.

7. *Poona District.*—The Poona City Municipality which has raised loans from Government was regular in the payment of instalments of repayment. It is financially sound. The Municipalities of Jejuri, Junnar and Talegaon Dabhade suffer from financial embarrassment.

8. *Satara District.*—The financial position of the Satara City Municipality and Vita Municipality, which have raised loans in the open market and from Government respectively is fairly good, while that of Ashta, Karad, Mhaswad, Rahimatpur and Islampur Municipalities is far from satisfactory. Drastic measures are necessary in the case of Karad and Islampur Municipalities.

9. *Sholapur District.*—With the exception of the Sholapur Municipality which has sound finances most of the other Municipalities suffered from financial unsoundness. The Pandharpur Municipality had to be superseded for the financial mess it had got into and inefficient administration.

(c) *Co-operation or otherwise with Government.*

Relations between Municipalities and Government Officers continue on the whole to be cordial. Experience shows that minor municipalities neglect or ignore official advice especially on financial questions.

(d) *Health and Sanitary conditions in Municipal areas and steps taken to combat epidemics if any.*

Ahmednagar.—There was an outbreak of cholera in a mild form in Ahmednagar. Prompt preventive and curative measures by the Health Department of the Ahmednagar Municipality prevented the spread of the epidemic. The public health of the Municipal Districts was fair.

East Khandesh District.—The small-pox of last year continued during the year under report in Bhusawal, Amalner, Raver, Savda, Erandol, Parola, Chopda and Dharangaon Municipalities. A vigorous campaign of vaccination helped considerably to keep the epidemic under control.

Cholera of a virulent type broke out at Amalner. At Bhusawal the epidemic was milder. Both the Municipalities adopted immediate and effective preventive measures to check the spread of the infection. Over 12,000 persons were inoculated in Amalner. In both the infected areas wells were disinfected, and drains, gutters etc., were washed with phenyl and pastrine.

West Khandesh District.—Dhulia was affected by Cholera and small-pox but inoculations on an extensive scale prevented the spread of infection. At Nandurbar the spread of cholera was checked by anti-cholera medicines.

Nasik District.—The out-break of small-pox which threatened Nasik during the former half of the year under report was prevented by the adoption of preventive measures. Cholera of a mild type occurred at Malegaon. Small-pox of a virulent type also visited the place the number of attacks and deaths being 623 and 265 respectively. Both the epidemics were brought under control by energetic preventive measures and extensive inoculation.

Satara District.—The municipal areas of Wai, Rahimatpur, Mhaswad, Mahableshwar and Karad were affected by a small-pox epidemic of a mild type. Prompt preventive measures by the Municipalities concerned checked the spread of the epidemic.

Poona District.—Out-break of small-pox at Poona (City) and Indapur was suppressed by mass vaccinations.

Sholapur District.—All municipal areas were free from epidemics during the year under report except in the town of Barsi in which the plague epidemic took a heavy toll.

(e) *Provision of equal facilities to the Depressed Classes.*

All municipalities continued to extend equal facilities to the members of the Scheduled Classes in the use of wells and other sources of water supply, Dharmashalas, dispensaries and schools. All Municipalities in East Khandesh have extended to Harijan municipal servants the benefits of permanent servants as advised by Government.

(f) *Appreciation of services of Presidents, Councillors and Officers.*

Messrs. P. S. Marwadi, G. D. Chaudhari, R. G. Soman, S. M. Batha, of Erandol, Faizpur (in East Khandesh), Satara City and Panchgani (in Satara District) Municipalities, respectively, deserve special commendations for their efforts during their service as Presidents of the respective municipalities.

**REPORT ON THE ADMINISTRATION OF MUNICIPALITIES
IN THE SOUTHERN DIVISION FOR THE YEAR 1939-40.**

PART I.

1. Number and Area.

The number of municipalities in the division at the end of the year was 38 as in the previous year; of these (1) Belgaum, (2) Bijapur, (3) Dharwar, (4) Hubli, (5) Gadag-Betgeri, and (6) Ratnagiri are municipal boroughs governed by the Bombay Municipal Boroughs Act, XVIII of 1925; and the rest district municipalities governed by the Bombay District Municipal Act, III of 1901. The latter category includes two city municipalities constituted under section 181 of the Act—(1) Bagalkot and (2) Guledgud.

There are also 5 notified area committees, one in Bijapur, one in Dharwar and three in Ratnagiri district.

There was no change in the areas of any of these bodies.

2. Change in the Population and Boundaries.

Nil.

3. Constitution of the Municipalities.

The supersession of the Hubli Municipal Borough which was due to expire on 5th January 1940 was extended by one year under Government Resolution, General Department, No. 2846/33, dated 5th September 1939.

The constitution of the municipalities of (1) Saundatti-Yellamma, (2) Nargund, (3) Byadgi, (4) Ratnagiri, (5) Malwan, (6) Vengurla, (7) Mathe-ran and (8) Uran was revised. The elimination of nominated members and the reservation of seats for women and important minorities are the important features of the revised constitutions. The periodical municipality of Guddagud-dapur (Dharwar district) was managed, as hitherto, by the neighbouring municipality of Ranebennur.

General elections were held in (1) Ratnagiri and (2) Saundatti-Yellamma. The elections were well contested. Appendix "A" shows the proportion of voters who exercised their franchise.

By-elections were held in 5 municipalities.

4. Attendance at Municipal Meetings.

Seven hundred and eighty-four meetings were held against 867 in the previous year. One hundred and twenty-two meetings proved abortive and 235 were adjourned against 136 and 297 respectively. The average attendance at meetings rose from 62.3 to 63.1.

Athni and Mahad had the least satisfactory record in this respect. Dharwar continued to make a somewhat poor showing.

5. Changes in the System of Taxation.

(a) *Property tax.*—Kumta amended rule 3 of its house-tax rules and completed its general revision of house-tax. Haliyal also revised its house-tax.

(b) *Octroi and terminal tax.*—Gokak and Ilkal revised their octroi schedules and Mahad amended its terminal tax schedule.

(c) *Conveyance tax and toll.*—The schedules of wheel-tax of Hubli, Dharwar and Ilkal and the toll tax schedule of Dharwar were revised. Saundatti-Yellamma began levying wheel-tax on motors; Bagalkot and Gadag-Betgeri introduced a tax on bicycles. Bail-Hongal reduced its rate of wheel-tax on bicycles from Rs. 3 to Re. 1 and Belgaum exempted hand-carts used and owned by coolies from the tax. Chiplun stopped levying toll on "dolis". Panvel introduced toll on unladen carts and granted the concession of paying the wheel-tax by quarterly and half yearly instalments.

(d) *Sanitary cess.*—Gokak and Ilkal revised their rates of sanitary cess; Bail-Hongal raised its rate of special sanitary cess from Rs. 3 to Rs. 6.

(e) *Water rate.*—The exemption from water rate enjoyed by "charitable" buildings was withdrawn by the Panvel municipality.

6. Municipal Income.

The aggregate gross income of the municipalities rose from Rs. 30,44,000 of last year to Rs. 33,61,000; the net income, i.e. after exclusion of receipts under "extraordinary and debt" from Rs. 27,64,000 to Rs. 29,67,000. All districts except Ratnagiri, where there was a slight fall, shared in the increase.

(a) *Octroi and terminal-tax receipts.*—The increase here was in Belgaum (15,000), Bijapur (39,000) and Dharwar (38,000). In Kolaba and Ratnagiri there was a fall of Rs. 19,000.

The municipalities in which the increase was most noticeable were Bijapur (18,000), Bagalkot (20,000), Dharwar (8,000), Hubli (12,000) and Gadag-Betgeri (14,000). The principal cause of the increase was good crops with better prices in the rabi tract.

Chiplun and Malwan showed falls of Rs. 8,000 and Rs. 3,000, the cause being dislocation of the import trade by restrictions on the coastal steamer services. There was also a fall in the Kolaba district which may probably be partly attributed to the same cause, though the main cause was probably poor crops.

(b) *Taxes on houses and lands.*—The increase was mainly in Dharwar (26,000) and Hubli (22,000) where it was due to effective collection of arrears.

(c) *Water rates.*—The increase was in Dharwar (41,000) and Kolaba (2,000). In Belgaum and Bijapur there were falls of Rs. 3,000 and Rs. 3,000. Dharwar and Hubli municipalities were mainly responsible for the increase. The decrease in Bijapur was due to exceptional recovery of arrears last year.

(d) *Special and general sanitary cesses.*—The chief contributor to the increase is Dharwar (22,000).

(e) *Tolls and conveyance taxes.*—The increase was in Belgaum (2,000), Bijapur (4,000), Dharwar (3,000) and Kolaba (2,000). In Kanara and Ratnagiri there were falls of Rs. 1,000 and Rs. 1,000.

(f) *Pilgrim tax.*—This tax is levied by the Saundatti-Yellamma, Guddaguddapur, Gokarn and Ulvi municipalities. The increase was in the first two.

(g) *Revenue from municipal property.*—There were increases in Bijapur, Kanara, Kolaba and Ratnagiri of Rs. 8,000, Rs. 5,000, Rs. 5,000 and Rs. 3,000 and decreases in Belgaum and Dharwar of Rs. 4,000 and Rs. 10,000. The increase is accounted for by (1) the recovery of past arrears by Bijapur, Kumta and Vengurla municipalities, (2) the levy of rent by Sirsi municipality on municipal buildings used for primary schools, (3) the sale of more sites by Bijapur municipality and of a municipal building by the Mahad municipality for Rs. 2,350 and (4) the increased receipts under "Interest on investments" derived by Chiplun and Malwan municipalities. The decrease at Dharwar occurred in the receipts of the Hubli municipality under "sale proceeds of lands" and "market and slaughter house fees". The fall of income at Belgaum is due to the receipt of Rs. 7,000 by the Bail-Hongal municipality last year on account of sale proceeds of a plot of land.

(h) *Grants and contributions for general and special purposes.*—The receipts consisted mainly of grants-in-aid from Government of Rs. 1,90,000, Rs. 26,000 and Rs. 13,000 respectively for educational, medical and general purposes and contributions of Rs. 1,300, Rs. 11,000 and Rs. 3,800, respectively, from district local boards.

The main reasons for the decrease are (1) the reduction in the grant-in-aid for educational purposes for the Nipani and Bijapur municipalities and (2) the stoppage of the grant-in-aid to the Bagalkot, Chiplun and Vengurla municipalities following the transfer of the control of primary education to the district local boards.

7. Nature of Income and Incidence per head of Population.

Rs. 22,71,962 was derived from rates and taxes out of the aggregate total of Rs. 29,66,909 as against Rs. 20,56,085 in the previous year. Direct taxation yielded Rs. 10,30,269 and indirect Rs. 12,41,693, i.e., 45.34 and 54.66 per cent. respectively of the total receipts under rates and taxes as against 43.2 and 56.8 per cent. in the preceding year.

The worst offenders are Honavar, Athni, Guledgud, Nipani, Kumta, Navalgund and Nargund.

9. Working of Octroi and Terminal Tax systems.

Twenty-two municipalities levied octroi, 13 terminal tax and 3 neither. Octroi receipts were Rs. 6,89,006, of which Rs. 22,524 was refunded on re-export. The percentage of refunds was 3.26 as against 3.59 last year. Refunds were heavy at Nipani, Alibag, Panvel, Pen, Uran and Ratnagiri. They amounted to 18, 14, 13, 17, 23 and 12 per cent. of receipts respectively.

Panvel disposed of 191 refund applications out of 446 received (including 328 of the previous year). The slow disposal here calls for notice.

Terminal tax yielded Rs. 4,30,522 against Rs. 4,20,683 last year.

(a) Administration.—All districts except Kanara share in the increase, the largest increase of Rs. 9,000 in Dharwar district being due to the overhauling of the establishment at Dharwar and Hubli.

(b) *Water supply.*—Belgaum, Dharwar, Kanara, Kolaba and Ratnagiri districts spent Rs. 2,000, Rs. 76,000, Rs. 1,000, Rs. 9,000 and Rs. 4,000, respectively, more than last year. Bijapur spent Rs. 3,000 less. The increase is chiefly in capital outlay. The municipalities of Dharwar and Hubli spent large sums on oil engines and Panvel on a booster pump to improve the distribution of water.

The present water supply at Dharwar is precarious and is inadequate. Many parts of the town suffer from shortage of water. The need of improving the source of supply is great. The municipality has bought new engines and also pipes to replace the rising main. The municipality has consulted the Public Health Engineer but is unfortunately showing hesitation in accepting his advice. Meanwhile the rate-payers suffer much inconvenience.

Investigation of a new water works by the Hubli municipality to provide all localities with an all-day water supply of 30 to 40 gallons per head of population is in progress.

A resurvey of the Belgaum scheme is also under consideration but, here again it is not quite clear that the municipality appreciates the importance and urgency of a pure piped water supply.

(c) *Drainage.*—The fluctuation is small. Belgaum leads all in the construction of surface drains. Dharwar is one of the most backward in this respect.

(d) *Conservancy.*—(1) Belgaum, (2) Athni, (3) Gokak, (4) Bail-Hongal, (5) Gadag-Betgeri, (6) Mahad and (7) Panvel again failed to make their services self-supporting; Malwan must also now be added to this category.

(e) *Hospitals and Dispensaries.*—Expenditure increased in Belgaum by Rs. 13,000, in Bijapur by Rs. 4,000, in Kanara by Rs. 1,000 and in Kolaba by Rs. 1,000. There were, however, falls in Dharwar (3,000) and Ratnagiri (2,000) districts.

(1) Bijapur, (2) Dharwar and (3) Ratnagiri failed again and Guddaguddapur for the first time to spend the prescribed minimum of 4 per cent. of their expenditure on medical relief.

(f) *Road.*—The expenditure in Belgaum, Bijapur, Dharwar and Kolaba districts rose by Rs. 79,000, Rs. 13,000, Rs. 10,000 and Rs. 2,000, respectively. In Kanara and Ratnagiri there were decreases of Rs. 1,000 and Rs. 4,000.

Alibag and Chiplun were new offenders in this respect.

(g) *Public Instruction.*—The increase occurred in Belgaum (3,000), Bijapur (10,000), Dharwar (21,000) and Kanara (1,000). In Kolaba and Ratnagiri there were decreases of Rs. 11,000 and Rs. 6,000, respectively. Alibag spent Rs. 6,000 last year in buying a plot for a school building and this is the cause of the decrease in Kolaba. The transfer of primary schools in Chiplun and Vengurla to the District Local Board was the principal cause of decrease at Ratnagiri.

11. Closing Balance.

The aggregate closing balance of all the municipalities in the division amounted to Rs. 10,69,000 against Rs. 9,93,994 last year.

12. Financial Working of Water Supply Installations.

The water works at (1) Hubli, (2) Matheran, (3) Pen, (4) Panvel and (5) Roha-Ashtami worked at a profit. Those at (1) Nipani, (2) Bijapur and (3) Dharwar incurred deficits of Rs. 444, Rs. 23,706 and Rs. 26,633 respectively. The loss at Nipani was small. Though about 1/3rd of the loss at Bijapur was due to expenditure on repairs and new parts for engines the considerable recurring deficit cannot be reviewed with complacency.

13. Audit of Accounts.

The accounts of all municipalities were audited. The principal defects noticed were, as usual, (i) unsatisfactory finances, (ii) heavy arrears and (iii) incomplete maintenance of demand and assessment registers.

Two cases of alleged embezzlement, viz., (1) by a tax inspector and (2) by a collection clerk occurred in Dharwar; both persons concerned were prosecuted and one has been convicted.

14. Grants from Government for Sanitary and Town Improvement Schemes.

No grants were received by any of the municipalities for such schemes.

15. Notified Areas.

The income of the Notified Area Committees, exclusive of opening balance and extraordinary items, rose from Rs. 63,502 of last year to Rs. 64,816. Taxes and rates yielded Rs. 55,131 and other sources Rs. 9,185, the corresponding figures of last year being Rs. 56,046 and Rs. 7,456.

Expenditure was Rs. 69,445 as against Rs. 61,223.

As in the past, the Notified Area Committees at Khed and Annigeri recorded respectively the highest and the lowest incidence of taxation and income, the figures for Khed being Rs. 6-0-11 and Rs. 6-5-0 and for Annigeri being Re. 0-5-8 and 0-6-7.

The Notified Area Committees at Rajapur and Khed were replaced by municipalities with effect from 1st April 1940. It has been decided to replace the Notified Area Committees at Hungund and Annigeri by village panchayats.

PART II.

16. Remarks regarding more important Municipalities.

Dharwar municipality has shown commendable energy under its President Mr. G. R. Nalvadi, M.L.A.

Government orders were received on the special inquiry officer's report on the financial and general administration of Bijapur municipality. The inquiry officer's recommendations about financial matters were endorsed by Government. The municipality was asked to carry them out within six months from the appointment of the chief officer. It has not done so. It has not yet appointed a permanent chief officer or engineer. It is therefore not doing satisfactory work. It has also failed to submit its annual administration report to the Collector.

The period of supersession of the Hubli municipal borough was extended up to 5th January 1941. The borough under its present administration has done considerable good work, especially in modernising roads. It has its scheme of water supply improvement, drainage, slum clearance and development nearly ready.

PART III.

17. Administration of municipalities in general.

Many of the municipalities hardly rose above the routine discharge of their duties and showed little imagination and energy in the conduct of their affairs. Such municipalities have done nothing in the direction of drainage, water supply, slum clearance and the rehabilitation of their finances. A number of municipalities run high schools, the maintenance of which means taxing the poor for the benefit of the well-to-do and starving their public health and other basic responsibilities. Several presidents and members have shown a greater regard for their own position than for the welfare of their municipalities. In fact, it seems uncommon for a president to resign as soon as he ceases to command a majority. In flouting the wishes of the majority he soon comes into conflict with the law. The law reacts slowly and meanwhile administration falls into disorder. The electorate, with whom the remedy lies, unfortunately tolerates such exhibitions of bad taste and bad citizenship.

The improved recovery of arrears is partly due to individuals and partly to the supersession of Hubli municipality where people of standing do not scruple to speak of the strict collections of municipal arrears as a grievance. It can hardly be taken as evidence of improved administration but is of course welcome as far as it goes.

18. Financial position.

On the whole a very welcome degree of attention is being paid to the improvement of finances, but of course the results are slow. There is, however, no sign, except among individuals, of a greater readiness to increase direct taxation.

19. General Remarks.

The relations between the municipalities and Government officers were everywhere excellent.

20. Health and Medicine.

The health of most municipal towns was fairly satisfactory, but this in most cases was due more to luck than care. Karwar still suffered from plague and did a great deal to stamp it out but could not bring itself to submit to the additional taxation necessary to provide the funds for a real "clean up". There was plague also at Belgaum, Nipani and Bail-Hongal; small-pox at Athni and Ratnagiri; cholera at Bagalkot and of course malaria almost everywhere. It is amazing that towns like Belgaum and Dharwar should not have health officers. On the whole, whatever sanitary conscience the Southern Division may have is seldom strong enough to open purses.

21. Facilities to Harijans.

In matters touching education, medical relief, water supply, sanitation, etc., all municipalities endeavoured to provide equal facilities to Harijans.

22. Conclusion.

The most encouraging feature of municipal administration was, as usual, the readiness of many presidents and office-bearers to devote long hours to honorary public work. The staff of municipal offices doubtless work long for small pay but they are seldom well recruited and the loan of the services of a selected Government servant usually produces immediate improvement.
