

**REPORT ON THE ADMINISTRATION OF MUNICIPALITIES IN
THE NORTHERN DIVISION FOR THE YEAR 1940-41.**

PART I.

1. Number and area of municipalities and notified areas.

The total number of municipalities in the Northern Division remained the same as in the previous year, viz., 33. Of these, the municipalities of Ahmedabad, Nadiad, Broach, Godhra, Surat, Thana, Kalyan, Bandra and Kurla were governed by the Bombay Municipal Boroughs Act, 1925, and the rest by the Bombay District Municipal Act, 1901. Of the latter, Viramgam was a City municipality constituted under section 181 of the Bombay District Municipal Act. Kalyan and Godhra municipalities were converted into borough municipalities from 1st April 1940.

The number of notified areas (exclusive of those which exist merely for the purpose of enforcing building regulations and do not levy taxes) were five in the Bombay Suburban District and two in the Thana District. The Bhayandar notified area committee for the first time levied property tax.

There was no change in the area of any of the municipalities in the Division.

2. Change in the population and boundaries.

The total population resident within the municipal areas was 1,109,083. There was no change in the boundaries of any municipality.

3. Constitution of municipalities.

The constitutions of the following municipalities which were revised in the year under report in accordance with the policy of Government as embodied in Act IX of 1938 are now on a purely elective basis with reservation of seats for women and minorities such as Indian Christians, Harijans and Backward Tribes, the Muslims being given separate seats:—

(1) Ahmedabad, (2) Ranpur, (3) Broach, (4) Dohad, (5) Surat, and (6) Bhiwandi.

Triennial elections were held in the following eight municipalities:—

(1) Ahmedabad, (2) Ranpur, (3) Umreth, (4) Anand, (5) Dakor, (6) Dohad, (7) Surat, (8) Bhiwandi.

A consolidated statement showing the number of voters who exercised the franchise at the elections is appended (Appendix A).

4. Attendance at municipal meetings.

The total number of meetings held during the year was 1,166 as against 984 in the previous year. Of these 169 proved abortive for want of quorum and 449 were adjourned. The previous year's figures were 122 and 316 respectively. The average percentage of attendance of members at the meetings was 62.9 as against 65.03 in the previous year. No case has been reported of adjournments on wholly inadequate grounds of the kind mentioned in Government Resolution, General Department, No. 1689, dated 7th May 1937.

5. Change in the system of taxation.

(a) *Property Taxes.*—The Dohad municipality amended the schedule of house tax by which the municipality is now able to increase its revenue by about Rs. 3,000 per annum.

(b) *Octroi*.—The Bassein municipality revised its octroi schedule with effect from 15th September 1940.

(c) *Terminal Tax*.—A clause has been added in Rule 387-B of the Ahmedabad municipality requiring persons keeping ledger accounts with the Railway Company to prefer their claims for refund of Terminal Tax within 10 days from the date of taking delivery of the consignment.

(d) *Sanitary Cess*.—The Ahmedabad municipality revised its Rules for the levy of Special Sanitary Cess so as to provide for the levy of the tax in the case of latrines attached to stalls, booths, tents, etc., erected on private or Government land for the purpose of exhibitions, shows, etc.

The Rander municipality increased the rate of special sanitary cess from Rs. 2 to Rs. 3-8.

(e) *Conveyance Tax and Toll*.—The Ghatkoper-Kirol municipality introduced wheel tax for the first time from 1st April 1940.

(f) *Miscellaneous Taxes*.—The proposal of the Viramgam municipality for the levy of Lighting Tax has been sanctioned by Government and the tax will be levied from the year 1941-42.

Rules for the levy of water rate in the Borsad municipal area have been sanctioned but the actual levy will commence from the year 1941-42.

The Kurla municipality introduced a tax on dogs with effect from 1st July 1939.

6. Municipal income.

The aggregate gross income of the municipalities in the division excluding the opening balance decreased from Rs. 2,36,15,857 to Rs. 2,35,86,485. Deducting receipts under "Extraordinary and Debt", the net income amounted to Rs. 1,00,53,717 as against Rs. 1,00,01,138 in the preceding year. The net increase of Rs. 52,579 is accounted for under the following general heads:—

The main causes affecting the figures given above are given below:—

(a) *Octroi and Terminal Tax Receipts*—(i) *Octroi*.—There was a net increase of Rs. 47,292 under this head which was mainly contributed by Surat to the extent of Rs. 40,523 and Bassein Rs. 3,695.

The increase in Surat is due to heavy imports of grain, sugar and cloth while that in Bassein is due to the revision of the octroi schedule increasing the number of dutiable articles from 27 to 41.

(ii) *Terminal Tax*.—The receipts under this head showed a net decrease of Rs. 19,964. Although Thana, Kalyan and Godhra showed increases of Rs. 18,899, 9,377 and 6,921 respectively, the increases were set off by a large decrease of Rs. 43,143 in Ahmedabad and of Rs. 5,800, 3,985 and 10,078 in Broach, Ankleshwar and Jambusar. The decrease is due to less imports.

(b) *Taxes on houses and lands.*—The total receipts under this head decreased from Rs. 11,72,536 to Rs. 11,24,397, a net decrease of Rs. 48,139. The municipalities in which the decrease was most notable are Bandra (Rs. 21,588) and Parle Andheri (Rs. 14,168). The decrease in Bandra is due to less recovery and that in Parle Andheri is mainly due to the revival of the practice of allowing 10 per cent. deduction from annual letting value of buildings.

(c) *Tax on animals and vehicles.*—Receipts under this head showed a decrease of Rs. 6,049 in the Division which was mainly shared by Surat, Broach, Nadiad and Borsad.

(d) *Water rate.*—The total receipts under this head declined from Rs. 25,49,503 to Rs. 25,41,904 in the year under report showing a net decrease of Rs. 7,599. Ahmedabad showed a decrease of Rs. 32,876 in the receipts under this head due to less recovery of taxes including past year's dues, as objection petitions against the quadrennial revision of valuation from Mills could not be disposed of till the end of the year. This decrease was set off by increases in Thana and Kurla to the extent of Rs. 7,409 and 13,259 respectively.

(e) *Sanitary Cesses*—(i) *General Sanitary Cess.*—The net decrease of Rs. 9,622 under this head which was mainly contributed by Dholka (Rs. 4,827) and Kurla (Rs. 4,733).

The decrease in Dholka is due to the fact that the municipality could not recover the tax as the revised procedure for the levy of the cess on a sliding scale could not be completed in time. The decrease in Kurla is due to its having had less arrears for recovery.

(ii) *Special Sanitary Cess.*—The receipts under this head showed an increase of Rs. 39,657 which was mainly contributed by Ahmedabad (Rs. 29,884) and Bandra (Rs. 7,018).

The increase in Ahmedabad is due to the extension of the limits of the municipality during the year 1940-41 and recovery of the full year's tax, while that in Bandra is mainly due to increase in the cess in cases where privies were converted to the newly constructed drains.

(f) *Revenue derived from municipal property.*—The income under this head rose from Rs. 11,13,924 to Rs. 13,25,351, a net increase of Rs. 2,11,427, Ahmedabad, Prantij and Surat being mainly responsible.

In Ahmedabad, the increase of Rs. 1,28,682 is due to (1) adjustment of accounts in respect of rent for school buildings owned by the municipality which was not being credited, (2) adjustment of the amount of sale proceeds of land, etc., and (3) interest realised in raising the Pole pavement loan. The increase of Rs. 20,198 in Prantij is mainly due to the amount of Rs. 18,000 received as donation for the municipal high school. In Surat, the increase of Rs. 31,806 is mainly due to the receipt of the accumulated balances of the municipal share in the revenue raised by Government in the previous years under "rents of land, houses, etc."

(g) *Grants and Contributions for general and special purposes.*—The receipts under this head consist mainly of grants-in-aid from Government for general, educational and medical purposes which amount to Rs. 5,75,053 as against Rs. 7,05,295 in the preceding year. There was a notable decrease of Rs. 1,49,440 in Ahmedabad which is mainly due to reduction in the grant from Government for Primary Education.

7. Nature of income and incidence per head of population.

Out of the total income of the municipalities in the Division amounting to Rs. 1,00,53,717, Rs. 79,38,353 were realised from municipal rates and taxes as compared with Rs. 79,85,512 in the preceding year. Direct taxation yielded Rs. 55,53,778 or 70.3 per cent. of the total and indirect taxation Rs. 23,54,575 or 29.6 per cent.

The following table shows the average incidence of taxation and income per head of population during the year as compared with the previous year in the Division as a whole and in each of the six districts:—

8. Recovery of municipal dues.

The total amount of arrears of taxes and dues in all the municipalities in the Division at the end of the year amounted to Rs. 13.05 lakhs as against Rs. 12.21 lakhs in the previous year.

Arrears substantially increased in Ahmedabad, Prantij, Borsad, Broach, Godhra, Dohad, Kalyan, Bassein, Bhiwandi-Nizampur, Kurla and Juhu. In Ahmedabad, as in the previous year, the large amount of Rs. 5,24,854 was due to the fact that objection petitions against the valuation of assessment of certain mills and factories were decided late. Kurla has shown a further deterioration. The percentage of arrears to total demand has increased from 17 per cent. in the previous year to 22.6 per cent. in the year under report.

The collection work of Dholka, Dhandhuka, Kapadvanj, Mehmedabad, Nadiad and Parle Andheri showed improvement.

On the whole the collection of taxes continued to be unsatisfactory which is due to slackness in resorting to the coercive measures provided in the Acts.

9. Working of octroi and terminal tax system.

The number of municipalities levying octroi was six, viz. Dholka, Virangam, Ranpur, Dohad, Surat and Bassein.*

There was no change in the number of municipalities levying terminal taxes which was 17. The remaining ten municipalities levied neither octroi nor terminal tax.

Out of the gross collections of Rs. 5,10,246 from octroi, a sum of Rs. 1,19,267 was refunded on account of the re-export of goods as against Rs. 1,34,846 in the preceding year, the Surat municipality alone being responsible for a refund of Rs. 1,16,209.

The total receipts from terminal tax were Rs. 19,63,596 as against Rs. 19,83,560 in the preceding year.

10. Expenditure.

The total expenditure of the municipalities in the Northern Division amounted to Rs. 2,30,44,021 as against Rs. 2,30,43,941 in the preceding year. Deducting the disbursements under "Extraordinary and Debt", the net expenditure amounted to Rs. 1,00,87,832 as against Rs. 98,87,056 in the preceding year, a net increase of Rs. 2,00,776.

Variations under the important heads are detailed below :—

(a) *Administration and collection charges*.—Expenditure under this head increased from Rs. 10,66,500 to Rs. 11,08,195, a net increase of Rs. 41,695. Ahmedabad showed a large increase of Rs. 45,872 partly due to the adjustment of the amount of establishment charges of the city survey office for the past years and partly due to normal increase in the contribution to Provident Fund.

(b) *Water Supply*.—Expenditure under this head decreased by Rs. 62,367 as under :—

Surat was mainly responsible for the decrease in capital outlay to the extent of Rs. 80,576 due to the fact that in the preceding year the municipality had provided for the replacement of gravitation mains from the Varachha Head water works to Murda Gate and no such expenditure was incurred during the year under report.

The increase in establishment, repairs, etc. charges was mainly in Kurla due to the payment of water rate bills to Government for the previous year.

(c) *Drainage*.—Expenditure under this head decreased by Rs. 11,211 as detailed below :—

Bandra was mainly responsible for the decrease in capital outlay to the extent of Rs. 1,17,058 which is due to the fact that in the preceding year a large amount of Rs. 2,57,666 was spent by the municipality on capital works as against Rs. 1,40,608 only during the year under report. Against this decrease Kurla showed a substantial increase of Rs. 71,428.

The increase in establishment, repairs etc. charges was chiefly shared by Ahmedabad, Bandra and Surat. The increase in Ahmedabad is due to the increase in establishment charges and new connections while that in Surat is due to more expenditure on side drains.

(d) *Conservancy*.—Expenditure under this head which represents money spent on road cleaning and watering and on public latrines but excludes expenditure on special sanitary services increased by Rs. 83,781 chiefly because of the extension of municipal limits of Ahmedabad and increased expenditure on motor lorries by Ahmedabad and Surat municipalities.

(1) Godhra, (2) Rander, (3) Bulsar, (4) Kalyan and (5) Parle Andheri again failed to make their special sanitary services self-supporting. Bassein must also now be added to this category.

(e) *Hospitals and Dispensaries*.—There was an increase of Rs. 28,203 under this head which was chiefly contributed by Ahmedabad and Surat.

The increase of Rs. 16,843 in Ahmedabad is mainly due to the payment of increased grant to the Vadilal Sarabhai General Hospital while that of Rs. 11,249 in Surat is due to the extension of the C. F. Parekh Hospital Building.

The following municipalities failed to spend on medical relief 4 per cent. of their expenditure, the minimum laid down by Government :—

(1) Kaira, (2) Godhra, (3) Thana, (4) Bandra, (5) Kurla, (6) Parle Andheri and (7) Juhu.

(f) *Road Expenditure*.—The total expenditure under this head decreased by Rs. 11,760.

Nadiad, Mehmedabad, Surat, Rander, Thana and Kurla showed increases of Rs. 8,018, 6,408, 55,173, 9,950, 5,540, and 45,079 respectively. Against this increase Ahmedabad and Parle Andheri showed decreases of Rs. 1,33,450 and 17,127 respectively. The increases were mainly due to construction of new roads and extensive repairs.

The following municipalities failed to observe the principle that the proceeds from wheel tax and road toll should be devoted solely to road repairs and construction :—

(1) Dholka, (2) Dhanduka, (3) Dohad, (4) Bulsar, (5) Thana, (6) Bandra, (7) Parle Andheri and (8) Juhu.

(g) *Public Instruction*.—Expenditure under this head showed an increase of Rs. 1,84,596, for which Ahmedabad, Godhra, Surat and Thana are mainly responsible. The notable increase of Rs. 1,16,048 in Ahmedabad is due to increase in the number of schools and teachers. The increase of Rs. 11,466, 39,806 and 22,214 in Godhra, Surat and Thana, respectively, were chiefly due to the payment of arrears of contribution to school boards.

11. Closing balance.

The aggregate closing balance of all the municipalities in the Division amounted to Rs. 22,01,725 as against Rs. 16,59,492 in the preceding year, a net increase of Rs. 5,42,233.

12. The Financial working of water supply installations.

The revenue of the Ahmedabad municipality from water rate decreased from Rs. 18,26,670 to Rs. 17,93,794, a decrease of Rs. 32,876. The reasons for the decrease have been explained in paragraph 6 (d) above. The sum of Rs. 17,93,794 was made up as under :—

On the other hand, expenditure decreased from Rs. 3,12,249 to Rs. 2,99,941, a net decrease of Rs. 12,308. This was due to less expenditure on repairs to wells and reservoirs.

In the case of Kapadvanj receipts and expenditure on account of water installations were Rs. 27,055 and 22,906 as against Rs. 25,030 and 19,924 in the preceding year, a net profit of Rs. 4,149. The municipality has set apart Rs. 7,000 towards the depreciation fund during the year making the total balance of Rs. 56,994. Out of this balance the municipality proposes to spend Rs. 30,000 for the construction of two settling tanks, a pure water tank and pumping machinery.

The working of the water supply installation at Surat resulted in a net profit of Rs. 1,99,356 as against Rs. 1,13,118 in the preceding year. Repairs and renewals of tubes and mud drums to the boilers were carried out at a cost of Rs. 3,713 during the year and the work of enlarging the gravitation main from Varachha to Murda Gate with the object of obtaining increased water supply with better pressure was in progress.

The result of water supply accounts of Rander (which has a joint water supply with Surat), Thana and Bhiwandi was as shown below. :—

Both Bandra and Kurla in the Bombay Suburban District obtain their water from the Bombay municipality through Government in the Public Works Department.

Bandra had a small increase of Rs. 817 in its income while Kurla had an increase of Rs. 13,259 due to the increased number of private water connections.

13. Audit of accounts.

The principal defects noticed in the audit of accounts were :—

- (1) Unsatisfactory finance.
- (2) Heavy arrears.
- (3) Delay in attending to Audit Notes.
- (4) Lax supervision over the work of subordinates.
- (5) Entertainment of establishment in anticipation of or without sanction and non-observance of rules and standing orders.
- (6) Failure to revise the assessment lists in time.
- (7) Councillors being themselves in arrears.

The finances of a majority of the municipalities are far from satisfactory. Slackness of recovery of the municipal dues and unwillingness of the municipal boards to adopt the ways and means suggested by the Examiner, Local Fund Accounts, for improving the finances by levying fresh taxes and revising the old ones are the main causes for this.

The accounts of Kurla were specially audited on account of the defalcation committed by the Accountant of the municipality to the extent of Rs. 5,200. The culprit who was a Government servant on deputation to the municipal service was convicted and sentenced to 9 months' imprisonment. He has also been dismissed from Government service. Slackness of supervision facilitated the defalcation.

But for the usual discrepancies, and irregularities, there is nothing special to note or comment upon.

14. Grants for sanitary and town improvement schemes.

No grant or assistance was given by Government to any municipality for sanitary or town improvement schemes.

15. Notified areas.

Government have decided to substitute village panchayats or municipalities for notified area committees but for one reason or another village panchayats did not come into existence in Ambernath and Bhayandar till 31st March 1941. The abolition of the notified area committees of Mulund and Chembur and their replacement by village panchayats have not yet been carried out, nor has the conversion of the notified area committee of Malad and Borivli into two municipalities, each absorbing a portion of the

Kandivli notified area committee, taken place. The triennium of the Mulund notified area committee has been extended pending the constitution of a village panchayat.

The Bhayandar notified area committee for the first time levied and collected property tax in addition to the Urban Immoveable Property Tax of Government.

The total income of the seven notified area committees, exclusive of the opening balance and extraordinary items, amounted to Rs. 1,02,270 of which Rs. 92,869, were derived from taxes and Rs. 9,401, from other sources. The total disbursement decreased from Rs. 1,43,057 to Rs. 1,10,085.

The notified area committee of Kandivli recorded the highest incidence of taxation (Rs. 7-10-6) and of income (Rs. 8-0-0) as against Rs. 7-3-8 and Rs. 7-8-1 in the preceding year, the lowest was recorded by Bhayandar, the respective figures being Re. 0-6-10 and Re. 0-6-10.

PART II.

16. Remarks regarding more important municipalities.

(1) Ahmedabad Municipality.

The state of the finances of the Ahmedabad municipality gives ground for disquietude. The opening balance in the general fund fell from Rs. 5,10,000 at the beginning of the year 1940-41 to Rs. 48,000 at the beginning of the year 1941-42. The loan charge is increased with the extensive borrowings of the year. The financial position is being examined by the Senior Auditor now.

The municipality raised a total loan of Rs. 29,50,500 during the year as under:—

The total outstanding loan debt at the close of the year was Rs. 87,70,000 as against Rs. 58,19,500 at the close of the previous year. The balance of the general and loan funds at the close of the year amounted to Rs. 13,70,693.

Town Planning Schemes.—In the Jamalpur Town Planning Scheme which is the first scheme undertaken by the municipality, certain unfavourable features retarded the development of the area. Plots reserved for certain objectionable purposes had to be taken to other and better uses. To regularise such uses, the original scheme is proposed to be varied suitably. In the Kankaria Scheme, the work of construction of buildings in private plots was in progress. The sanction of Government to the final Ellis Bridge Town Planning Scheme is awaited. To the draft city wall Town Planning Scheme, Government have suggested certain modifications and the matter is under consideration of the municipality.

The work of acquisition of land in five out of seven sections in the Kalupur Relief Road Scheme has been completed and that in the remaining two sections has progressed considerably. The Joint Judge specially appointed for the purpose disposed of all the references against the awards of properties in Sections VII, VI and III. The work of road construction in Sections I, II, and V was taken on hand and completed except asphalt surfacing and foot paths. The question regarding the levy of Government share of assessment in the case of sale of plots formed out of surplus land acquired by the municipality for the formation of street is pending before Government for final orders.

Water Supply and drainage.—The municipality continued its efforts to meet the increased demand for water with the steady increase in population of the city. Several works were undertaken to maintain the supply at its present level, as there was scanty rainfall during the last monsoon. The system of supply of water for longer periods during the morning and evening hours was also continued. Special supply to the mill area between 12 midnight and 3 p.m. was maintained throughout the year and no difficulty was experienced in maintaining the uniform pressure.

The Suburban Drainage Scheme was in progress. The work of main and branch sewers and interstage pumping stations at Dariapur and Goutipur were completed during the year. Small interchange pumping station at the M. R. Hostel, Shahi Bagh and near Sheth Jamnabhai's bungalow were also completed. The work of giving connections to mills and tenements in suburban areas has been commenced.

The acquisition of 2,000 Acres of additional land for the disposal of sewage has been proposed by the municipality. The work of making filter beds in 150 Acres for the suburban drainage is completed and of kundis will be completed in the next year.

Disposal of sewage.—The sewage farm having an area of 1,136 acres assessed at Rs. 5,520 was maintained. Out of this area, 617 acres were leased for cultivation. The total revenue and expenditure were Rs. 47,165 and Rs. 35,224 a net profit of Rs. 11,941.

Public Health was on the whole good and no epidemic visited the city in a serious form. The birth rate during the year was 50.00 as against 50.78 per thousand during the preceding year. The death rate per thousand of population fell from 39.57 to 38.53. The programme of enforcing the removal of sand privies and hand cleaned privies and converting them into water closets was continued in the year, but could not be accelerated on account of a rise in the prices of materials owing to the war.

The new Infectious Diseases Hospital was fully equipped and opened on 28th July 1940. The question of construction of buildings for two anti-tuberculosis clinics out of the sum of Rs. 90,000 promised by the Ahmedabad Anti-Tuberculosis Association is under the consideration of the municipality. The municipality maintains two maternity homes and the opening of a third one is under contemplation. There are 10 municipal dispensaries to serve the needs of the poorer classes and two more will be opened shortly.

Asphalt treatment of one kind or another was given to 25 roads. The municipality has now a length of about 74 miles of dustless and permanent roads. The work of pole paving was continued in the year and Rs. 20,360 were spent thereon.

The work of constructing additional houses for the working classes and the poor was held up pending the acquisition of more land for the purpose. The municipality has constructed 383 tenements for its Harijan staff. Asphalt roads were constructed in two Harijan localities. Electric lights were also provided in some of the Harijan quarters.

The Ahmedabad municipality has continued its progressive activities.

(2) *Surat Municipality.*

The financial position of the municipality is sound except for its arrears. The figures of income and expenditure were Rs. 13,27,239 and Rs. 11,79,960 as against Rs. 12,45,747 and Rs. 11,30,234 in the preceding year. There was no loan to be repaid and no debt to redeem. The year closed with a balance of Rs. 1,62,025. The arrears of taxes rose from Rs. 65,259 to Rs. 65,850.

A new building for an Urdu School costing Rs. 18,400 was under construction. Four handsome offers of donations amounting to Rs. 79,500 in all for school buildings were accepted by the municipality.

A Public Health Laboratory has been newly set up during the year. Besides this the municipality spent during the year substantial amounts on the following works of public utility :—

The municipality is keen to see that the crying need of the city—the comprehensive Drainage Scheme—is satisfied as early as possible, but with the outbreak of the War, it could not take up the floating of the first instalment of the loan sanctioned by Government for the purpose owing to the fluctuations in the money market and the rise in prices of materials.

PART III.

17. Administration of municipalities in general.

The foregoing paragraphs do not reveal much beyond the normal routine of municipal administration.

With a few exceptions the general standard of administration cannot be regarded as deserving any special commendation. The municipalities are in general guided more by community and sectional considerations and by party-politics than a sense of civic responsibility. There were cases of party-factions and petty jealousies amongst councillors and office-bearers. The rate-payers' money was wasted in some cases in inviting unnecessary disputes. The main reasons for the inefficiency of municipal administration are unbusiness-like money dealings, failure to take coercive measures for effecting recovery of municipal rates and taxes, party intrigues and factions, inadequate supervision of the subordinate staff and the reluctance of the Boards to find new sources of income or to impose new taxes.

Owing to party-factions, the affairs of the Godhra municipality have deteriorated to such an extent that it has become necessary for Government to appoint an officer under section 217 of the Bombay Municipal Boroughs Act, 1925, to inquire into all matters connected with the administration of the municipality.

The administration of the Bhiwandi-Nizampur municipality showed no improvement though a Government servant of the grade of Aval Karkun was appointed as its Chief Executive Officer because the municipality did not give full support to that officer in carrying out his duties. The municipality has now nominally offered its support but the conditions of work are so unpleasant that no Aval Karkun is ready to serve under the municipality. The Collector however offered a non-Aval Karkun whom he found to be suitable for the post, but the municipality did not accept the offer. The arrears of taxes have increased considerably and the financial position of the Municipality has become precarious.

The President of the Umreth municipality, Mr. M. M. Parikh, had to be removed by Government under section 23 (7) of the Bombay District Municipal Act, 1901, for misconduct and neglect of statutory duties.

Government have ordered the making of an inquiry under section 34-A of the Bombay Municipal Boroughs Act, 1925, in the matter of the Broach municipality's resolution for vetoing the appointment of its present Chief Officer, Mr. B. A. Patel, on several charges levelled against him. The inquiry by the Collector of Broach and Panch Mahals is in progress.

18. Financial position.

The financial position of the municipalities generally does not show any improvement. The main causes for this are the haphazard and unbusiness-like methods of collection. The municipalities generally lack the quality of firmness in dealing with defaulters some of whom are as usual municipal Councillors setting a bad example to other tax-payers.

19. Co-operation or otherwise with Government.

The relations between the municipalities and Government officials continued to be smooth and cordial and there is nothing special to mention.

20. Health and medicine.

No serious epidemic appeared during the year and the general public health remained good except for the usual outbreak of small-pox, measles, malaria and typhoid which were successfully controlled by the municipalities concerned.

21. Facilities to Harijan servants.

All municipalities endeavoured to provide equal facilities to Harijans in matters touching education, medical relief, water-supply, sanitation, etc. No instances of disregard of the rights of these classes were brought to notice. The municipalities are generally alive to the necessity for providing permanency of service, benefits of leave, Provident Fund, etc.

22. Appreciation of services of municipal Presidents, Officers and Councillors.

The Collector of Ahmedabad has commended the Ahmedabad municipality for its continued progressive activities and remarks that special praise is due to Mr. Manilal Chaturbhai Shah, the energetic President, and to Mr. Patel, the Municipal Engineer.

The Collector of Kaira has commended the work of Mr. Ramanlal Motilal Gandhi, the ex-President of the Mehmedabad municipality under whom the municipality showed good progress in various aspects. The Collector of Broach and Panch Mahals also has appreciated the keen interest taken by Rao Saheb A. S. Barot, President, Dohad Municipality, and Mr. Narharilal B. Thakore, President, Ankleshwar municipality, in the municipal affairs.

**REPORT ON THE ADMINISTRATION OF MUNICIPALITIES
IN THE CENTRAL DIVISION FOR THE YEAR 1940-41.**

PART I.

1. Number and area.

The total number of municipalities at the end of the year remained the same as in the previous year, viz. 58. Of these 15 were governed by the Bombay Municipal Boroughs Act, 1925, and 43 by the District Municipal Act, 1901. Of the latter Yeola is a city municipality constituted under section 181 of the District Municipal Act.

The two notified areas viz., Talegaon-Dabhade (Railway Station) in the Poona District and Lonand in the Satara District, were abolished during the year and village panchayats established in their place. Now there is only one notified area of Gokulwadi (Belapur Road Railway Station) in the Ahmednagar District which merely exists for the purpose of enforcing building regulations and does not levy taxes. Proposals to convert it into a Municipality or in the alternative into a village panchayat are under consideration.

2. Change in the population and boundaries.

The total population resident within the municipal areas was 1,031,210. As the fresh census operations were carried out towards the end of the year the latest figures of population are not reported in this report. They will be taken into account in the next year's report. There was no change in the boundaries of any of the municipalities except the Ashta municipality in the Satara District, whose boundaries were altered by Government Notification, General Department, No. 1478/33, dated 18th September 1940.

3. Constitution of municipalities.

During the year under report 11 municipalities were reconstituted on an elective basis in accordance with the provisions of the Bombay District Municipal and Municipal Boroughs (Amendment) Act IX of 1938. 41 municipalities were so reconstituted during the past two years and three more will be so reconstituted in 1941. The proposals for the reconstitution of the remaining three municipalities viz. Yeola, Sangamner and Pandharpur which are under supersession have been sanctioned by Government and they will be brought into force when the municipalities will be re-established.

During the preceding year the Pandharpur municipality was superseded with effect from June 20th, 1939, for a period of one year and a Committee of Management was appointed to manage its affairs. By Government Resolution, General Department, No. 3046/33, dated 17th May 1940, the period of supersession was extended by two years and the Committee of Management was replaced by an Administrator of Deputy Collector's rank from 20th June 1940. The Sangamner municipality which was superseded in 1938-39 continued to be managed by an Administrator of the rank of Mamlatdar. Three more municipalities were superseded during the year, viz., (1) Yeola, by Government Resolution, General Department, No. 3466/33, dated 1st June 1940, (2) Karad by Government Resolution, General Department, No. 4295/33, dated 19th December 1940, and (3) Islampur by Government Resolution, General Department, No. 4327/33, dated 9th January 1941. All these are superseded for a period of two years from the dates of the above Government Resolutions. The first two are managed by Administrators of Mamlatdar's rank and the last one by an Administrator of an Aval Karkun's grade.

3A. Elections.

Triennial elections were held in the case of 10 municipalities and by-elections were held in the case of 19 municipalities. A statement showing the number of voters who exercised the franchise at the general elections is appended.

4. Attendance at municipal meetings.

The number of meetings held during the year was 1,415 as against 1,296 in the preceding year. 230 meetings proved to be abortive for want of a quorum and 542 were adjourned. The average percentage of attendance of members at the meetings was 63.13 as against 68.34 in the previous year.

5. Changes in the system of taxation.

(a) *Property tax.*—No change.

(b) *Octroi.*—The Junnar, Shirpur and Sangamner municipalities revised their octroi rules and by-laws.

(c) *Terminal tax.*—No change.

(d) *Water rate.*—The revised water rates of the Dhulia municipality sanctioned in Government Resolution, General Department, No. S. 91 (49), dated 29th March 1940 came into force from 1st July 1940.

(e) *Sanitary cesses.*—The Dhulia municipality brought into force with effect from 1st April 1940, the revised rates of general sanitary cess sanctioned by Government in the preceding year.

(f) *Conveyance tax and toll tax.*—The revised wheel rules of the Bhusawal municipality were sanctioned in Government Resolution, General Department, No. S. 91(38), dated 6th November 1940. They were brought into force after the close of the year from 1st April 1941.

(g) *Other Miscellaneous taxes.*—The Mhaswad municipality began to levy pilgrim tax from the commencement of the year under report.

6. Municipal income.

The aggregate gross income of the municipalities rose from Rs. 93,57,225 to Rs. 95,32,085. Deducting the receipts under "extraordinary and debt" the net income amounted to Rs. 78,26,042 as against Rs. 72,75,610 in the preceding year. The important variations are set out in the following paragraphs:—

(a) *Octroi and terminal tax.*—There was an abnormal increase of Rs. 3,03,831 under the head "octroi" which is shared by many municipalities. The notable increases were Rs. 2,18,852 in Poona City and Poona Suburban due to materials imported by military contractors and Rs. 22,112 in Sholapur owing to larger imports of cloth, piece goods etc. The increase of Rs. 32,190 in terminal tax was mainly secured by the Ahmednagar municipality which received Rs. 27,113 more this year owing to large imports of building material for military works.

(b) *Taxes on houses and land.*—The increase of Rs. 39,074 was mainly shared by the Poona Suburban, Sirur and Dhond municipalities in the Poona District and by the Pandharpur and Sholapur municipalities in the Sholapur District and was due to recovery of past arrears. There is marked decrease in the case of Poona City, Lonavla and Chalisgaon municipalities the decrease being Rs. 3,550, Rs. 1,325 and Rs. 4,684, respectively.

(c) *Tolls and conveyance taxes.*—There was an increase of Rs. 32,474 on the whole. The notable increase was of Rs. 15,126 in the toll tax receipts of the Nasik municipality partly due to the receipt of Government grant for two years under the Motor Vehicles Tax Act and partly to increased vehicular traffic.

(d) *Water rates.*—This increase of Rs. 69,625 was shared by Sholapur, Pandharpur, Poona City, Sirur, Ahmednagar, Jalgaon, Nandurbar and Nasik municipalities. The large increase of Rs. 29,312 in Poona City was due to an increase in the water rates. At all other places it was due to recovery of past arrears.

(e) *Sanitary Cesses*—(i) *General Sanitary Cess*.—The net increase of Rs. 7,613 under this head calls for no special remarks.

(ii) *Special Sanitary Cess*.—The receipts showed an increase of Rs. 19,934. Nasik alone is responsible for Rs. 5,525 due to increase in rates. The remaining amount is made up of small increases in individual cases partly due to recovery of arrears.

(f) *Pilgrim tax*.—The increase of Rs. 34,106 was due to the increase in the number of pilgrims visiting Trimbak, Alandi, Jejuri and Pandharpur and to the imposition of this tax by the Mhaswad municipality for the first time.

(g) *Revenue derived from municipal property*.—There was a big decrease of Rs. 33,856 in Poona City due to reduced income on account of sale of plots during the year. However on the whole there was an increase of Rs. 14,928 mainly shared by Sholapur, Pandharpur, Malegaon, Nasik, Yeola and Satara city municipalities. Sholapur received Rs. 12,209 more on account of the license fees on dangerous and offensive trades and Pandharpur recovered past arrears due in respect of electric poles and vegetable markets amounting to Rs. 8,511.

(h) *Grants for general and special purposes*.—The receipts under this head consist mainly of grants-in-aid from Government for general, education and medical purposes which amount to Rs. 55,404, Rs. 5,21,060 and Rs. 36,594, respectively, as against Rs. 58,327, Rs. 5,49,387 and Rs. 35,106 in the preceding year. The decreases in grants for general and medical purposes are small and call for no special remarks. The decrease of Rs. 28,327 in the grant for educational purposes is shared by Amalner, Nasik, Malegaon, Poona City and Satara City municipalities. The Jalgaon, Ahmednagar and Sholapur municipalities received more during the year under this head. The increase of Rs. 13,334 in Sholapur was due to a non-recurring grant on primary education.

There was also a decrease of Rs. 26,898 in the grants made by the District Local Boards for educational purposes. Sholapur, Satara and Poona Districts were responsible for this decrease.

7. Nature of income and incidence per head of population.

Out of the total income of the municipalities amounting to Rs. 78,26,042, Rs. 57,81,639 were realised from municipal rates and taxes as compared with Rs. 52,13,349 in the previous year direct taxation yielding Rs. 32,55,139 or 56.3 per cent. and indirect taxation Rs. 25,26,500 or 43.7 per cent.

The following table shows the average incidence of taxation and income per head of population during the year under report as compared with the previous year, for the whole division as well as for each of the seven districts:—

8. Recovery of dues.

Of the total demand of Rs. 36,89,014 on account of the four important taxes, viz. house tax, conservancy cesses, wheel tax and water rates, the arrears outstanding at the end of the year amounted to Rs. 10,23,911 as against Rs. 10,52,909 in the preceding year. At Alandi, Amalner, Erandol, Sholapur and Taloda the collection work continued to be satisfactory. At Pandharpur it is improving under the Administrator. At Chopda, Dharangaon and Nasik the arrears were slightly reduced. The municipalities of Mahableshwar, Mhaswad, Rahimatpur, Satara Suburban, Tasgaon, Vita and Wai showed definite improvement in recovery of past arrears. Good recoveries were made by the Revenue officers deputed to Baramati, Dhond and Sirur municipalities. But the percentage of arrears during the year under report was 27.7 as against 27.5 during the preceding year and so on the whole the collection of taxes continued to be unsatisfactory.

9. Working of octroi and terminal tax systems.

The octroi system was in force in 37 municipalities and the terminal tax in nine municipalities. Karad levies terminal tax as well as octroi. The gross receipts on account of octroi amounted to Rs. 20,29,075 the net income being Rs. 19,35,088 as against Rs. 16,31,257 in the preceding year. The percentage of refund in respect of re-exported goods was 4.63 as against 5.16 in the previous year.

The octroi cordon of the Poona municipality comprises the limits of the Poona City municipality, the Poona Suburban municipality and the Cantonments of Poona and Kirkee. The Savda and Faizpur municipalities continued to levy the octroi jointly. The levy of terminal tax at Ahmednagar is a joint concern of the Ahmednagar municipality and Ahmednagar Cantonment.

Both the octroi and terminal tax systems are working satisfactorily. The total income from terminal tax rose from Rs. 1,82,050 in the previous year to Rs. 2,14,240. There was a fall of Rs. 1,023 in the income of the Dhulia municipality from this tax owing to the diversion of traffic from rail to road.

10. Expenditure.

The total expenditure of the municipalities was Rs. 92,96,526 as against Rs. 93,22,205 in the previous year. Excluding the items of "extraordinary and debt" the expenditure amounted to Rs. 73,05,180 as against Rs. 73,17,266 in the preceding year.

The variations under the main heads were as follows:—

(a) *Administration*.—The increase of Rs. 56,591 was shared by all Districts. It was mainly due to—

(1) Greater payments on account of gratuities in Sholapur, Barsi, Dhulia and Ahmednagar municipalities.

(2) Revision of scales of pay and rates of travelling allowance by Dhulia municipality.

(3) Entertainment of an Administrator and an office Superintendent at Pandharpur, Recovery Officers at Ahmednagar and Nandurbar and a qualified secretary at Rahimatpur;

(4) Expenditure on city survey at Islampur;

(5) Payment of arrears of increments to peons in Poona city;

(6) Purchase of a weighing machine at Sangamner; and

(7) Entertainment of a Census staff by the Poona Suburban municipality.

(b) *Water Supply*.—The expenditure under "capital outlay" decreased by Rs. 60,136. Dhulia and Poona City spent Rs. 31,181 and Rs. 41,678 respectively more during the year. But there was less capital

expenditure at Sholapur and Barsi than in the last year and hence the decrease. The expenditure under "establishment, repairs, etc." showed an increase of Rs. 46,477 which was shared by Sholapur, Nasik and Jalgaon municipalities.

(c) *Drainage*.—The increase of Rs. 3,788 is small and calls for no remarks. The Ahmednagar, Sangamner, Lonavla, Alandi and Sholapur municipalities are chiefly responsible for this increase. The Ahmednagar municipality repaired and constructed gutters while the other four municipalities constructed new drains.

(d) *Conservancy*.—The expenditure rose from Rs. 10,13,796 to Rs. 10,28,552. The notable increases were Rs. 13,869 in Poona City owing to increased expenditure on road cleaning and latrines, Rs. 3,914 in Pandharpur due to payment of war allowance and Rs. 3,393 in Dhulia owing to revision of scales of pay of sweepers.

The following eight municipalities failed to observe the principle that the proceeds of the special sanitary cess should not be less than the cost of the special private services rendered by the municipalities :—

Sangamner, Igatpuri, Manmad, Sinnar, Trimbak, Bhagur, Nandgaon and Satara City.

The proposal of the Bhagur municipality to increase the special sanitary cess in order to make special sanitary services self-supporting was sanctioned in April 1941. The Sangamner municipality proposes to follow suit.

(e) *Hospitals and Dispensaries*.—The increase is small viz. Rs. 10,025 and calls for no special remarks.

The following nine municipalities failed to spend on medical relief the minimum of 4 per cent. of their expenditure as enjoined by Government :—

Ahmednagar, Jalgaon, Betawad, Poona City, Dhond, Nasik, Manmad, Bhagur and Satara Suburban.

(f) *Roads*.—The expenditure fell from Rs. 7,20,555 to Rs. 4,33,904. The Poona City alone is responsible for a decrease of Rs. 2,10,881 and the remainder is shared by Jalgaon, Dhulia, Sholapur and Nasik municipalities. Satara City, Ahmednagar and many district municipalities spent more on roads during the year.

The following 27 municipalities failed to observe the principle of devoting the whole of the proceeds of wheel tax and tolls to the construction and maintenance of roads :—

Sangamner, Jalgaon, Parola, Nandurbar, Taloda, Poona Suburban, Saswad, Baramati, Indapur, Sirur, Talegaon-Dabhade, Alandi, Junnar, Vita, Mhaswad, Islampur, Mahableshwar, Pandharpur, Barsi, Sangola, Karmala, Malegaon, Manmad, Sinnar, Trimbak, Bhagur and Nandgaon.

(g) *Public Instruction*.—There was an increase of Rs. 72,440 shared by all districts except West Khandesh and was due to payment of arrears of contribution on account of primary education to the district school boards by many non-local authority municipalities and to the increased current demand of the Boards on that account. The increase of Rs. 4,679 in Poona City was due to payment of duty pay and war allowance to teachers. The Dhond municipality in the Poona District did not incur any expenditure on this account.

11. Closing balance.

The aggregate closing balance of the municipalities amounted to Rs. 16,73,212 as against Rs. 14,29,553 in the previous year. The increase of Rs. 2,43,659 occurred in all Districts except West Khandesh.

12. Financial working of water supply installations.

The water works at Dhulia, Satara City, Vita, Sirur, Nasik, Trimbak, Ahmednagar and Barsi yielded a profit while those at Karad, Junnar and Nandurbar showed a loss. At Jalgaon there are two systems of water supply—the Girna water works and the Mehrun Tank supply. The former worked at a loss while the latter showed a profit.

The new scheme of water supply improvements at Dhulia which is being executed by the Public Works Department is in progress. It is being financed by raising a loan of Rs. 2,50,000 out of which only Rs. 1,58,000 have been raised and the balance yet remains to be raised. The first part of the water supply improvement scheme at Nasik has been approved by the Board of Public Health Works and the application of the municipality for a loan to carry it out is under the consideration of Government.

13. Audit of accounts.

The principal defects that were found in the audit of the accounts of the municipalities by the Local Audit Department were as follows:—

- (1) Unsatisfactory financial system ;
- (2) Heavy arrears ;
- (3) Incomplete maintenance of demand and assessment registers ;
- (4) Lax supervision over the work of subordinates ;
- (5) Illegal and unjustifiable remission of taxes ;
- (6) Delay in the disposal of audit notes ; and
- (7) Non-payment of municipal dues by the Councillors, Chief Officer and Municipal staff.

Compliance with audit notes was far from satisfactory.

Three cases of misappropriations of small amounts by its Market clerk, Naka clerk and Collection clerk, have been reported in the audit note of the Ahmednagar Municipality. In two cases the offenders were let off with fine. The action taken is inadequate and the municipality has been asked to investigate the matter further and to take effective steps in all the three cases.

14. Grants from Government for sanitary and town improvement schemes.

A grant of Rs. 1,560 was made by Government to the Alandi municipality.

15. Notified areas.

Of the three notified areas two, i.e., the Talegaon-Dabhade Railway Station in Poona District and Lonand in Satara District, were abolished and replaced by village panchayats during the year. The third one of Gokulwadi (Belapur Road Railway Station) in the Ahmednagar District did not levy taxes. The proposals to replace it by a district municipality or a village panchayat are under consideration.

PART II.

16. Remarks regarding more important municipalities in the Division.

(a) Poona City municipality.

(i) *Income, Expenditure and Collection of municipal dues.*—The income during the year under report excluding the opening balance and receipts under the head "Extraordinary and Debt" was Rs. 21,39,012 as against Rs. 19,30,007 in the previous year. The increase was mainly due to the increased income from octroi. The total expenditure fell from Rs. 26,85,162

in the previous year to Rs. 24,45,882 in the year under report. The decrease of Rs. 2,39,280 was due to less expenditure under the item of "Public Health and convenience." The closing balance was Rs. 1,33,308 as against Rs. 1,27,381 in the previous year.

The arrears of taxes at the end of the year were Rs. 1,86,434 as against Rs. 1,64,383, at the end of previous year which shows that the progress in recovery is not satisfactory. The municipality must pay special attention to this work and adopt more stringent measures.

(ii) *Public Health.*—There was an outbreak of plague in the year under report. As soon as the first case was detected, vigorous measures were taken by the municipality to suppress the epidemic. The total infant and child mortality was 2,297 against 5,928 births. The corresponding figures for 1939-40 were 2,052 and 6,376 respectively.

The municipality's expenditure on medical relief was Rs. 69,694 as against Rs. 73,233 in the previous year.

(iii) *General.*—The Bombay Shops and Establishments Act, 1939, was made applicable to the Poona City with effect from 15th November 1940.

(b) *Sholapur municipality.*

This is one of the soundest municipalities in this Division from the financial point of view. However it suffers from shortage of funds required for financing capital works. It has a very low percentage (9.5 of demand) in arrears. The municipality has done very well in every respect such as collection of taxes, routine duties, etc.

This municipality financed Town Planning Schemes Nos. I and II from its general revenues. Scheme No. I is practically complete. Scheme No. II is in progress. Scheme No. III will be taken up after the conversion of the plots on cantonment tenure lying within its area into rayatwari tenure. In 1938 Government allowed the Municipality to raise a loan of Rs. 7,75,000 for financing the schemes of water supply and drainage. Out of this amount only Rs. 2,15,000 were subscribed till the end of March 1941. The period of raising the loan has therefore been extended till March 31st, 1942.

The Bombay Shops and Establishments Act, 1939, was made applicable to Sholapur City with effect from November 15th, 1940.

The municipality proposes to provide sanitary houses for the Scheduled classes and for that purpose has acquired lands in different parts of the City.

PART III—GENERAL REMARKS.

17. Administration of municipalities in general.

Ahmednagar District.—Barring the unsatisfactory work of collection of taxes and the slack supervision of the Chief Officer over the staff the working of the Ahmednagar municipality may be said to be satisfactory on the whole. The Executive requires to be strengthened. The administration was not hampered by any parties.

East Khandesh District.—Most of the municipalities functioned fairly well during the year. There was serious trouble at Yawal where the President fell out with the majority of the councillors but persisted in clinging to office. A similar position has since developed at Faizpur. At two other places the Presidents had not sufficient backing to carry on a vigorous administration. Faction is always latent and breaks out as soon as any energetic policy is put in force.

West Khandesh District.—Party factions were noticed in the case of Nandurbar and Taloda municipalities which affected their administration and smooth working. A proposal to abolish the Betawad municipality is under consideration as that body failed to improve the extremely low standard of its administration.

Nasik District.—Party factions and personal feuds still figure in municipal politics prominently and particularly so at Manmad and Malegaon. At Manmad a deadlock was reached and the municipality was superseded after the close of the year. At Malegaon the state of affairs is going from bad to worse. As result of the antagonism of the majority party to the minority party the municipality went to the length of discarding the advice of Government in connection with the restoration of the appointments of seven teachers and the Commissioner had to restore the appointments by taking action under section 218 of the Bombay Municipal Boroughs Act, 1925. The delay in framing rules under section 58 of the Act regulating the appointment and conduct of business of the Standing Committee is another clear result of the hostile spirit between the parties. A notice has been issued to the municipality to put its house in order. The affairs of the Nasik municipality are also in a chaotic condition. In view of the very unsatisfactory financial condition and affairs of these two municipalities Government have appointed a special officer to make enquiry into their affairs under section 217 of the Act and the result of his enquiry is awaited. The Trimbak municipality whose financial position had much deteriorated was given a year's time to improve its affairs. The new board has shown some tendency towards improvement.

Poona District.—The Poona Suburban municipality showed progress over last year in the disposal of correspondences. Its working is smooth. Party politics in Junnar have hampered its progress. The Alandi municipality is free from party politics and its recovery of dues is an example to other municipalities. On the whole the progress made by it is commendable. Inordinate delays in the disposal of correspondences are frequently noticed in the case of the Baramati municipality. The Lonavla municipality is functioning smoothly.

Satara District.—The standard of efficiency of all municipalities except Mahableshwar and Satara Suburban continued to be unsatisfactory.

Sholapur District.—The administration of municipalities was on the whole satisfactory with the exception of the collection of taxes. The Pandharpur municipality has made some progress in the work of collection of taxes since the appointment of the Administrator. Karmala stands in immediate need of a reliable water supply scheme. Both Karmala and Sangola municipalities are torn with factions and are inefficient bodies.

The Commissioner has again to repeat that very little improvement was noticeable in the administration of municipalities in the Central Division as a whole. With the exception of the municipal borough of Sholapur the standard of efficiency of the municipal administration is far from satisfactory. The reasons for this which are repeated in the previous administration reports are the general absence of a sense of civic responsibility among the municipal councillors, the dissipation of energy in factious feuds based on personalities and above all the tendency to look upon the membership of the board merely as a personal distinction and not as an opportunity of rendering disinterested service to the local community. As remarked in the last year's report a wider consciousness of the civic responsibilities among the councillors and a closer co-operation between the party in power and the one in opposition will alone improve the efficiency of municipal boards. But there are no signs of any progress in this direction. The Poona City municipality postponed meeting after meeting which were held for the election of the President obviously on personal grounds. As a result of the party factions the urgent repairs to the Nasik pumping station were not carried out in time and part of the city was practically without water for some days. At Malegaon the administration has left little ground for hope and at Manmad the municipality had to be superseded as the affairs there had come to a deadlock as a result of disagreement between the President and the party in opposition.

The financial aspect of the municipalities continues to be discouraging and most of the municipalities and especially the minor ones remain in financial trouble. Some municipalities are unable to take up public health schemes such as water and drainage works on that account. Reluctance to resort to automatic coercive measures for the recovery of arrears and to

increase taxation continues. Coupled with this is the tendency in many municipalities to increase expenditure on discretionary duties. Running a High School is one of such objects. The underlying motive in starting such secondary schools is unfortunately often selfish and their subsequent administration affected by favouritism. Such municipal High Schools are maintained at the cost of more urgent obligatory duties and the education there in suffers from this bad administration.

The several cases of embezzlements reported in the audit notes show the necessity of better recruitment of municipal staff which at present is unduly affected by favouritism. There is also continued interference by the councillors with the day to day internal administration which makes the path of a straightforward and efficient Executive Officer difficult. The experience of the several superseded municipalities shows that the same subordinate municipal staff works efficiently under an able and impartial Administrator. This experience leads to the conclusion that with a more independent staff for the responsible executive posts the inefficiency would be considerably reduced.

18. Financial position of municipalities generally and especially those which have raised loans from Government or in the open market.

Amalner, Jalgaon, Dhulia, Nandurbar, Ahmednagar, Poona City, Satara City, Vita, Sholapur and Barsi municipalities in this Division have raised loans. The following remarks about the financial position of these and other municipalities are offered :—

Ahmednagar District.—The Ahmednagar municipality has liabilities of nearly Rs. 5,00,000 on account of loans taken from Government for water supply and Town Planning and a fresh loan of Rs. 1,50,000 raised in the open market for Filter Bed Scheme. It also desired to raise a further loan in the open market of Rs. 1,75,000 for a drainage scheme, but sanction was refused by Government as the finances of the municipality as revealed by the Examiner were not capable of discharging the burden of the additional liabilities. The municipality has been advised to improve its financial position by imposing new taxes and by taking energetic measures to collect the arrears of taxes.

The financial position of the Sangamner municipality has improved appreciably since its supersession. At present it runs its administration with an annual surplus of about Rs. 9,000. However this surplus will have to be utilised in the near future for the two schemes under consideration, viz. water supply and drainage for the town.

East Khandesh District.—Of the borough municipalities, Amalner, Chalisgaon and Bhusawal can be regarded as financially sound. Jalgaon has a disturbingly small balance of Rs. 6,305 only, about 2 per cent. of the annual expenditure. This is a dangerous position, which can only be mended by recovery of arrears (Rs. 67,000 on 1st April 1941).

Of the district municipalities, Faizpur is in a thoroughly unsatisfactory position with a balance of Rs. 871. Yawal and Parola are also dangerously near the margin. The others are reasonably sound. In the case of the Yawal municipality the appointment of a Special Recovery Officer has failed to effect any improvement.

West Khandesh District.—The financial position of most of the municipalities is far from satisfactory and no serious attempt is being made to improve it and to augment the income by increased taxation. Although most of the municipalities have heavy arrears, they are reluctant to enforce the normal coercive provisions of the Municipal Acts in recovering the municipal dues.

Nasik District.—There was no appreciable improvement in the financial position of any of the municipalities in the district. This is primarily due to lack of method in the collection of taxes.

Poona District.—The Poona City municipality was regular in the payment of Government dues. The financial position of the Junnar, Jejuri, Indapur and Talegaon-Dabhade municipalities is not satisfactory. They have been

directed to take serious steps to improve their finances by increasing their taxes and effecting economy in their expenditure. The case of Alandi in this district deserves special mention. It is in the enviable and exemplary position of having had no arrears for four years.

Satara District.—The Satara City municipality neither levies adequate taxes nor does it collect them punctually. The result is that its financial position is unsatisfactory.

The Wai municipality has been steadily spending about Rs. 3,000 in excess of income for the last three years and there is now a balance of Rs. 924 only against the outstanding liabilities of Rs. 5,000 on account of contribution for primary education payable to the District School Board and of Rs. 6,025 due to the Road Fund. The municipality is being expedited to levy a lighting tax and to revise its octroi schedule.

Karad municipality has paid up more than Rs. 15,000 of its liabilities during the year under report. The only debt now due is a sum of Rs. 38,740 from the Toll Fund which the municipality appropriated and utilised for general purposes. The Administrator has reduced the past arrears by nearly Rs. 19,000.

The financial position of the Panchgani municipality is also steadily deteriorating.

Sholapur District.—None of the municipalities except Sholapur is in a satisfactory financial position.

Under the Administrator there is a steady improvement in the financial position of the Pandharpur municipality.

Barasi's financial position is still precarious and the municipality cannot undertake any new schemes for improving the amenities of the town. The municipality is taking steps to impose new taxes and this should improve its financial position to some extent. But the work of recovering arrears of taxes is not satisfactory, and the municipality has been warned to take prompt steps in this respect.

The financial position of the Karmala municipality is not sound and it was advised to improve its position by recovering the arrears of taxes and by increasing or imposing new taxes but it has so far taken no steps in the matter.

19. Co-operation or otherwise with Government.

Relations between municipalities and Government officers were cordial on the whole. But there is a general tendency to ignore official advice to improve the financial position. Sub-paragraphs (d), (e) and (f) of paragraph 10 above show how some municipalities also ignore the policy laid down by Government with regard to the levy of special sanitary cess, expenditure on medical relief and application of the whole proceeds from the wheel and toll taxes towards construction and maintenance of roads.

20. Health and sanitary conditions in municipal areas and steps taken to combat epidemics, if any.

During the year under report no epidemic of a virulent type visited the municipal towns in this Division. The following epidemics however visited some towns in a mild form :—

Plague.—There was an outbreak of plague in Poona City municipality and Sholapur. The Poona City municipality checked the epidemic by carrying on extensive inoculation and rat-trapping campaigns.

Cholera.—There was a mild outbreak of cholera at Dhulia, Malegaon, Nasik, Indapur, Rahimatpur and Sholapur. All the municipalities adopted effective and immediate preventive measures and checked the spread of infection.

Small-Pox.—This epidemic in a mild form visited Sangamner, Dharangaon, Dhulia, Taloda, Rahimatpur, Satara City, Satara Suburban, Vita and Wai municipalities. Prompt steps to suppress the epidemic were taken by the municipalites.

21. Provision of equal facilities to the Scheduled Classes.

All the municipalities continued to extend equal facilities to the members of the Scheduled Classes in the case of wells and other sources of water supply, Dharmashalas, dispensaries and schools.

22. Appreciation of services of Presidents, Councillors and Officers.

From among many Presidents who have come to favourable notice special mention should be made of—

(1) Mr. Maganlal Nagindas, M.L.A., President of the Chopda municipality, who made determined efforts to reduce the arrears with considerable success. Had the effort been kept up unremittingly the position would have been further improved.

(2) Mr. L. S. Jadhav and Mr. G. N. Dixit who have been trying hard to get their corporations at Nasik and Trimbak in order. It still remains to be seen—in fact it is unfortunately more than doubtful—if things have not already gone much too far for normal methods to be sufficient.

(3) Mr. M. V. Gore, the present President of the Ahmednagar municipality who deserves special commendation for his sincerity and zeal in attending to the pressing problems of the municipality.

REPORT ON THE ADMINISTRATION OF MUNICIPALITIES
IN THE SOUTHERN DIVISION FOR 1940-41.

PART I.

1. Number and area.

The number of municipalities in the division at the end of the year was 40 as against 38 in the previous year. Belgaum, Bijapur, Dharwar, Hubli, Gadag-Betgeri and Ratnagiri are municipal boroughs governed by the *Bombay Municipal Boroughs Act, XVIII* of 1925. The rest are district municipalities governed by the *Bombay District Municipal Act, III* of 1901, and include two city municipalities—Bagalkot and Guledgud—constituted under Section 181 of the Act.

There are also 3 notified area committees — one in Bijapur, one in Dharwar and one in Ratnagiri district. Last year there were five, but Khed and Rajapur were converted into municipalities with effect from 1st April 1940 under Government Notifications, General Department 3388/33 dated 14th October 1939 and 2305/33 dated 30th June 1939 respectively.

The area of the Hubli Municipal Borough was increased from 3.11 square miles to 3.83 square miles; and that of Ratnagiri Borough from 2.09 square miles to 3 square miles. There were no other changes of area.

2. Change in the population and boundaries.

The boundaries of the municipal boroughs of Hubli and Ratnagiri were extended under Government Notifications, General Department 3951/33 dated 27th August 1940 and 3997/33 dated 3rd January 1941 respectively.

The population within municipal areas in Ratnagiri district increased from 54,156 to 66,567 owing to the addition of the two newly constituted municipalities of Khed and Rajapur.

3. Constitution of the municipalities.

The supersession of the Hubli municipal borough which was due to expire on 5th January, 1941 was extended upto the end of June 1942 under Government Resolution, General Department 2846/33 dated 4th November 1940.

All the municipalities have been reconstituted in accordance with the provisions of the *Bombay District and Boroughs Municipal Amendment Act IX of 1938*. The municipalities of Nipani, Athni, Bailhongal, Bijapur, Matheran and Uran, however, continued to function under their old constitutions during the year under report.

The periodical municipality of Guddaguddapur (Dharwar District) was managed, as hitherto, by the neighbouring municipality of Ranebennur.

General elections were held in 18 municipalities, see appendix A. By-elections were held in 3 municipalities.

4. Attendance at municipal meetings.

Eight hundred and fifty nine meetings were held. One hundred and twenty meetings proved abortive and two hundred and ninety one were adjourned against 122 and 235 respectively in the previous year. The average attendance at meetings rose from 63.1 to 63.9.

Uran where average attendance fell from 58.6 to 8.7 per cent. had the least satisfactory record in this respect. The attendance at Athni, Bagalkot, Dharwar and Honavar was also poor.

5. Changes in the system of taxation.

(a) *Property tax*.—Dharwar brought into force revised house-tax rules.

(b) *Octroi and terminal tax*.—Ilkal revised its octroi schedule in a downward direction because of complaints about the effect of octroi on the cost of living. Sirsi introduced octroi on petrol, engine oil and grease. Panvel revised its octroi rates in an upward direction and enlarged its schedule in order to provide additional funds for the comprehensive improvements which it is undertaking to its water supply, drainage etc. Kumta exempted, with effect from 1st December 1940, coir and articles of coir manufactured at the All India Village Industries Association, Honavar from terminal tax.

(c) *Conveyance tax and toll*.—Dharwar revised its wheel-tax rules. Ilkal levied wheel-tax on bicycles. Hubli brought into force new rules for the levy of taxes on vehicles and animals. Sirsi amended its wheel tax rules.

(d) *Sanitary cess*.—Gokak brought into force revised rates of general and special sanitary cesses; Ilkal imposed a special sanitary cess on theatres and circuses. Government sanctioned the Bagalkot municipality's proposals for the levy of a special sanitary cess on theatres, cinemas and bidi shops.

(e) *Miscellaneous taxes*.—Ilkal imposed licence fees on hotels and on tea, coffee and soda water shops. Gadag-Betgeri brought into force amended rules for the levy of fees on offensive trades; and Belgaum introduced motor stand fees from 1st May 1940. Panvel increased its annual water rate from Rs. 18 to Rs. 24.

6. Municipal income.

The aggregate gross income of the municipalities rose from Rs. 33,61,000 of last year to Rs. 35,35,000; the net income, that is the income exclusive of receipts under "extraordinary and debt" rose from Rs. 29,67,000 to Rs. 31,40,000. All districts except Belgaum and Kolaba, which record a slight fall, shared in the increase.

(a) *Octroi and terminal tax receipts*.—The increase was in Belgaum (Rs. 19,000), Dharwar (Rs. 36,000), Kanara (Rs. 3,000), Kolaba (Rs. 5,000) and Ratnagiri (Rs. 45,000) districts. In Bijapur district there was a fall of Rs. 2,000. The municipalities in which the increase was most noticeable were Belgaum (Rs. 15,000), Bailhongal (Rs. 9,000), Dharwar (Rs. 16,000), Hubli (Rs. 17,000), and Chiplun (Rs. 8,000). The increase is generally due to better prices, but this improvement may be short lived because most of the municipalities have had to grant dearness allowances. The increase in Bailhongal is attributed

especially to a good cotton season. The large increase in Dharwar and Hubli is due very largely to better supervision and greater efficiency generally. The Administrator of the Hubli Municipal Borough made 26 prosecutions of which 16 ended in convictions for evasion of tax. The large increase in Ratnagiri district is due to the establishment during the year of the two new municipalities of Khed and Rajapur which together account for Rs. 31,000 under this head.

(b) *Taxes on houses and lands.*—The decrease of Rs. 30,000 is shared by all districts except Kanara and Ratnagiri. The increase of Rs. 3,000 in Kanara is due to a revision of rates in Karwar and the collection of past year's arrears in Kumta. The increase of Rs. 3,000 in Ratnagiri represents the receipts of the new municipalities of Khed and Rajapur. The largest decrease which was in Dharwar municipality was not a true decrease, because the figures of last year included a large amount of arrears collected during that year.

(c) *Water rate.*—The decrease was mainly in the districts of Dharwar (Rs. 25,000) and Bijapur (Rs. 2,000). In Belgaum, Kolaba and Ratnagiri districts there were increases of Rs. 3,000, Rs. 5,000 and Rs. 3,000 respectively. The greater part of the large fall in the receipts of the Dharwar municipality is due to the remission of water rate for three months which had to be given because the source of the municipal water supply, Kelgri tank, ran dry. The fall of revenue in Bijapur municipality is due to poor recoveries. The increase in Ratnagiri district represents the receipts of the two new municipalities of Khed and Rajapur.

(d) *Special and general sanitary cesses.*—The Dharwar municipality alone is responsible for a decrease of about Rs. 12,000 owing to poor recoveries.

(e) *Tolls and conveyance taxes.*—The increase occurred in the districts of Belgaum (Rs. 2,000), Bijapur (Rs. 3,000), Dharwar (Rs. 14,000), Kanara (Rs. 1,000) and Ratnagiri (Rs. 3,000). Receipt of grants-in-aid under the Motor Vehicles Taxation Act in lieu of toll by Belgaum, Sirsi and Malwan municipalities, the effective recovery of arrears by Bijapur municipality, larger imports of cotton in Gadag-Betgeri and Hubli, the introduction of a tax on bicycles in Gadag-Betgeri and additional receipts during the year due to the establishment of the two new municipalities of Khed and Rajapur contributed to the increase.

(f) *Pilgrim tax.*—This tax is levied by Saundatti-Yellama, Gudda guddapur, Gokarn and Ulvi municipalities. Almost the whole of the decrease was in Saundatti-Yellama.

(g) *Revenue from municipal property.*—In Belgaum, Dharwar, Kanara and Ratnagiri districts there were increases of Rs. 3,000, Rs. 50,000, Rs. 2,000 and Rs. 4,000 respectively; while in Bijapur and Kolaba districts there were decreases of Rs. 1,000 and Rs. 2,000 respectively. The substantial increase in Dharwar district was due to the sale of 7 plots in the market for about Rs. 22,000 by the Dharwar municipality and the high premia received for leases of fruit stalls by Hubli municipality. Other causes for the increase were larger receipts of rents on lands and fees from the high school and the maternity home in Nipani, the recovery of cotton market rents of previous years and the sale of plots in Gadag-Betgeri, the collection of arrears of ground rent and sale proceeds of road-side trees in Karwar and the receipt of rent of school buildings for previous years from the District Local Board by Chiplun and Vengurla municipalities. The newly established municipalities of Khed and Rajapur also account for part of the increase in Ratnagiri district. The fall in Bijapur is attributed to reduction of rents decreed by the civil court and in Kolaba to the fact that during last year Mahad municipality disposed of some landed property.

One of the reasons given in last year's report for the increase of receipts under this head last year was "the levy of rent by Sirsi municipality on municipal buildings used for primary schools". This should have read "levy of rent on municipal buildings used for the high school."

(h) *Grants and contributions for general and special purposes.*—The receipts consisted mainly of grants-in-aid from Government of Rs. 2,20,000, Rs. 26,000 and Rs. 17,000 respectively for educational, medical and general purposes and contributions of Rs. 1,200, Rs. 12,200 and Rs. 3,600 respectively from district-local boards.

The main reasons for the increase are a donation of Rs. 4,550 to the Bailhongal municipality by Seth Purushottandas Mulji for providing water to the people and cattle on bazaar days, an increase of about Rs. 11,800 in the Government grant to Bijapur municipality for educational purposes, the receipt of a Government grant of Rs. 7,920 by Dharwar municipality for a school building, the receipt by Hubli municipality of the arrears of Government subsidy on account of the health staff amounting to Rs. 5,202, the receipt by Chiplun municipality of Rs. 500 on account of the arrears of educational grant and an increase of Rs. 600 in its grant for medical purposes and the receipts of Khed and Rajapur municipalities which were newly established during the year.

7. Nature of income and incidence per head of population.

Of the aggregate income of Rs. 31,40,294, Rs. 23,36,897 was derived from rates and taxes as against Rs. 22,71,962 last year. Of the receipts under rates and taxes direct taxation yielded Rs. 9,66,615 and indirect taxation Rs. 13,70,222 i.e. 41.36 and 58.64 per cent. respectively as against 45.34 and 54.66 in the previous year.

The average incidence of taxation and income per head of population is:—

Honavar, Athni, Guledgud and Nargund continued to be the bad offenders as in the previous year. To this category must be added this year Haveri, Rajapur and Ilkal. The effective recovery of arrears made by Khed, Ulvi, Mahad and Hubli is commendable.

9. Working of octroi and terminal tax systems.

23 Municipalities levied octroi, 14 terminal tax and three neither. Octroi receipts were Rs. 7,31,388 of which Rs. 21,220 was refunded on re-export. The percentage of refunds was 2.90 as against 3.26 last year. Refunds were heavy at Uran, Nipani, Alibag, Pen and Panvel being 20, 16, 13, 13 and 13 per cent. of the receipts, respectively. Panvel continues to be dilatory in the disposal of refund applications—it disposed of only 255 applications out of 491 received (including 255 of last year).

Terminal tax yielded Rs. 4,89,164 against Rs. 4,30,522 last year.

(a) *Administration.*—All districts share in the increase, the largest increase of Rs. 24,000 occurring in Dharwar district where it was shared by the municipalities of Dharwar (Rs. 3,000), Hubli (Rs. 16,000), Gadag-Betgeri (Rs. 3,000) and Navalgund (Rs. 1,000). In Dharwar, an increase occurred in the payment of pensions and gratuities; in Hubli it was due to the survey of lands newly included in the municipal limits, the numbering of houses, extraordinary legal items including Rs. 3,000 paid to Mr. S. S. Patil, the ex-chief officer, in pursuance of a court decree and the employment of additional staff; in Gadag-Betgeri, to the appointment of a special officer for the revision of house-tax; and in Navalgund to the payment of gratuity and special repairs to the municipal office. Among the chief causes of increase in other districts are the payment of gratuities, dearness allowance and the restoration of cuts in salaries.

(b) *Water Supply*.—Belgaum and Bijapur districts spent Rs. 8,000 and Rs. 11,000 more and Dharwar, Kolaba and Ratnagiri Rs. 56,000, Rs. 3,000 and Rs. 5,000 less than last year. The heavy expenditure of about Rs. 60,000 incurred last year by Dharwar municipality on cast iron pipes for the new rising main explains the large decrease this year. The increase in Belgaum and Bijapur districts is due to the laying of under-ground pipes by Bailhongal municipality and the purchase of oil engines by Bijapur municipality.

(c) *Drainage*.—The chief contributors to the decrease are Belgaum (Rs. 17,000) and Dharwar (Rs. 13,000), in both of which districts fewer drains were constructed than last year.

(d) *Conservancy*.—The largest increase, Rs. 35,000 in Dharwar district, is due to the construction of latrines and urinals by Hubli municipality and the purchase of a new night soil lorry by Gadag-Betgeri municipality.

Belgaum, Athni, Karwar, Kumta, Mahad, Matheran, Panvel, Pen, Uran, Ratnagiri, Rajapur and Malwan failed to make their special sanitary services self-supporting.

(e) *Hospitals and dispensaries*.—Expenditure decreased in the districts of Belgaum by Rs. 1,000, Dharwar by Rs. 8,000 and Kanara by Rs. 1,000, but increased in the districts of Kolaba and Ratnagiri by Rs. 2,000 and Rs. 9,000 respectively. The decrease in Dharwar is due to the fact that last year Gadag-Betgeri built a compound wall and a well for its dispensary and Dharwar paid arrears of contribution. Haveri is said to have spent less under this head on account of the evacuation of the town following an outbreak of plague and the dead-lock created by the tension between the President and the councillors. The increase in Ratnagiri district is mainly due to the expenditure of the new municipalities of Khed and Rajapur. Bijapur, Dharwar, Ratnagiri, Guddaguddapur and Haveri failed to spend the prescribed minimum of 4 per cent. of their expenditure on medical relief. Of these the first four offended in this respect last year.

(f) *Roads*.—Expenditure rose in the districts of Dharwar, Kanara, Kolaba and Ratnagiri by Rs. 39,000, Rs. 2,000, Rs. 10,000 and Rs. 8,000 respectively, while in Belgaum and Bijapur it fell by Rs. 61,000 and Rs. 2,000 respectively. The large increase in Dharwar district is mainly due to the modernisation of important roads and acquisition of land for road-widening at Hubli. Dharwar also spent this year considerably more on re-surfacing roads. The marked fall in Belgaum is on account of the heavy expenditure of about Rs. 71,000 incurred last year by Belgaum municipality in modernising certain roads.

The first ten are old offenders in this respect.

(g) *Public Instruction.*—There are increases in the districts of Belgaum (Rs. 9,000), Dharwar (Rs. 38,000), Kolaba (Rs. 4,000) and Ratnagiri (Rs. 9,000). In Bijapur district there is a decrease of Rs. 7,000. The increase in Belgaum district is due mainly to Nipani municipality having extended its High School building and employed two additional teachers. Dharwar municipality spent Rs. 24,000 on additional teaching staff in basic schools. It also increased the number of its schools and spent more on repairs. Hubli made liberal grants to libraries and also spent more on primary education and the Lamington High School. Gadag-Betgeri spent Rs. 8,500 on the construction of an extension to the High School building and the installation of a radio. The increase in Ratnagiri district is partly accounted for by expenditure in the new municipalities of Khed and Rajapur and partly by the payment of arrears of contribution towards primary education to the District Local Board by the Vengurla municipality. Guledgud in Bijapur district failed for lack of funds to pay its contribution to the District Board towards primary education and also the salaries of its A. V. School staff for two months and this mainly accounts for the fall in expenditure in the Bijapur district.

11. Closing balance.

The aggregate closing balance of all the municipalities in the division amounted to Rs. 9,07,707 as against Rs. 10,69,000 last year.

12. Financial working of water supply installations.

The water works at Nipani, Hubli, Matheran, Panvel, Pen and Roha-Ashtami worked at a profit. Those at Bijapur, Dharwar and Alibag incurred deficits of Rs. 17,894, Rs. 215 and Rs. 391 respectively. Though the installation of oil engines has reduced the loss at Bijapur from Rs. 23,706 of last year to Rs. 17,894, the loss recurring year after year presents a serious problem which the municipality would do well to tackle.

13. Audit of accounts.

The accounts of all the municipalities for 1939-40 except Dharwar were audited. The principal defects noticed were as usual (i) unsatisfactory finances and (ii) heavy arrears.

No cases of embezzlement or serious irregularity came to light.

14. Grants from Government for sanitary and town improvement schemes.

No grants were received by any of the municipalities for such schemes.

15. Notified areas.

With the conversion of the Notified Area Committees at Khed and Rajapur into municipalities, the number of such committees was reduced to 3 and the income, exclusive of opening balance and extraordinary items, fell from Rs. 64,316 of last year to Rs. 16,188. Taxes and rates yielded Rs. 11,369 and other sources Rs. 4,819. The corresponding figures for last year were Rs. 55,131 and Rs. 9,185.

Expenditure was Rs. 22,581 against Rs. 69,445 last year. The incidence of taxation and income were Rs. 2-4-9 and Rs. 3-12-6 for Dapoli and Re. 0-5-3 and Re. 0-6-5 for Annigerri.

The Notified Area Committee at Hungund was replaced by a Village Panchayat towards the end of the year and those at Annigerri and Dapoli some time after the close of the year.

PART II.

16. Remarks regarding more important municipalities.

Bijapur municipality partly carried out the special inquiry officer's recommendations which were endorsed by Government. The improvements effected include the installation of oil engines at the water works, and the revision of the house-tax and the pay of the staff. On the whole, however, the work of this municipality continues to be disappointing.

Dharwar municipality built some useful drains in places which were notoriously insanitary but has still to solve its water problem which has become particularly acute during the last two years. This year the piped supply of water had to be stopped for three months while Kelgeri tank remained completely dry. The municipality has however taken a definite step towards the improvement of its water supply by sanctioning Rs. 5,645 for the survey of new storage works. Meanwhile typhoid is rampant in the town.

Despite repeated advice, Dharwar municipality has not yet appointed a health officer.

Default on the part of this municipal borough in dealing with vacant plots and encroachments is reported to have resulted in a considerable loss of revenue. It is hoped that the municipality will some day realise its responsibilities in this respect. Unfortunately however the municipality does not appear to be keeping up the general improvement in its administration which was noticed last year.

Rao Sahab Benni continued to administer Hubli effectively. Of the many miscellaneous improvements effected the modernisation of the roads was the most noticeable. A large number of plots were made available for the poor. The scheme for the water works, drainage scheme, the electrification of the town, the reconstruction of the Market and the shifting of the Cotton Market—all these projects have matured without yet having been translated into fact.

Belgaum Municipality appears to have taken up the scheme of piped water supply in a determined manner. It is long overdue. Meanwhile the town suffers from typhoid and other diseases which are aggravated by the congestion forced upon it by the absence of piped water. Like Dharwar, Belgaum has no health officer though it has several times appeared to be on the point of deciding to have one.

17. Administration of municipalities in general.

Although it would be impossible to suggest that there has been any great advance in the standard of municipal administration the general tenor of municipal administration appears to be on the upward grade. Certainly the general attitude towards municipal inefficiency and corruption, where it exists, seems to be hardening. There are still far too many instances of presidents putting their own influence above the interests of their towns. Two presidents were removed from their office by Government order during the year principally for their failure to honour requisitions for special general meetings to discuss their own highhandedness and one or two others were perhaps lucky to escape a similar fate. In some cases at any rate these antics produced a strong and healthy reaction and it may be hoped that the days of such presidents are nearly done. The local press shows a generally healthy interest in municipal administration which cannot fail to have a good effect in the long run.

18. Financial position.

Some of the smaller municipalities are carrying out a valiant fight to make their small resources go as far as possible. A special tribute is due to Khed in Ratnagiri district which is doing everything possible to meet the new

burden of municipal administration. Panvel has put through a programme of new taxation designed to enable it to improve its water works and drainage which is most praiseworthy. Ratnagiri and Vengurla are among those which can be considered distinctly promising. The larger municipalities continue to be somewhat disappointing. With their large membership, their conflicting interests, their incessant interference with the executive and their continual changes of president they seem to have received a larger dose of democracy than they are able for the present to digest. The collection of arrears continues bad. Public opinion generally respects the tactful and considerate rather than the efficient tax collector.

19. General remarks.

The relations between the municipalities and Government officers were everywhere excellent.

20. Health and medicine.

The health of most municipal towns was unsatisfactory. Plague broke out in Nipani, Bijapur, Bagalkot, Guledgud, Ilkal, Dharwar, Haveri, Karwar, Bhatkal and Ratnagiri. There is reason to believe that the skilful plague preventive work of the Health Officer in Bijapur saved numerous lives and expenditure far greater than his pay. Bhatkal seems to have been lucky in escaping a major outbreak, for it did little to stem the disease. Ilkal and Haveri seemed to bungle matters because of their unfortunate internal dissensions. The Karwar municipality again failed to exterminate the plague infection in its midst which spread to the neighbouring villages. Recently however there has been renewed activity which seems to have met with greater success. Small-pox prevailed in Belgaum, Athni, Ratnagiri and Malwan. Belgaum and Dharwar were especially afflicted with typhoid. Very little was done to combat malaria which should have the most unremitting attention from the municipalities. Bijapur and Hubli are the only municipalities which have employed Health Officers: the folly of other large municipalities in failing to follow in their wake cannot be too strongly condemned.

21. Facilities to Harijans.

In matters touching education, medical relief, water supply, sanitation, etc. all municipalities continued their endeavours to provide equal facilities to Harijans.
