PREFACE

Object and scope of the study:

Among the 289 urban areas in Maharashtra as defined in the 1971 Census, there are 222 municipal towns, 5 corporation towns and 62 non-municipal towns. Out of the 222 municipal councils, 20 are 'A' Class Municipal Councils, 34 are 'B' Class and 168 are 'C' Class Municipal Councils.

These towns are at different levels of develop-They differ from one another in several respects. Their regional settings and climatological features are different, their functional importances are different and so are also the levels of infrastructural development or per capita incomes. While the census publications provide a lot of useful information about the demographic features of these towns and the Municipal Year Books furnish details of incomes and expenditures of the Municipal Councils, there is no publication which provides consolidated information about the levels of physical and social infra-structural development of the various towns, their planning achievements or planning deficiencies and level of social facilities etc. Development Plans of all these Municipal towns have been prepared which contain a fund of information on several socio-economic and physical aspects of the towns based on surveys carried out at the time of preparation of the Development Plans. This information is however not available any where in a consolidated and concise form. It was felt that a publication containing information on all aspects of the towns in Maharashtra i.e. demographic, economic, physical and social would be useful not only to town planners but also to other social Scientists and administrators as well.

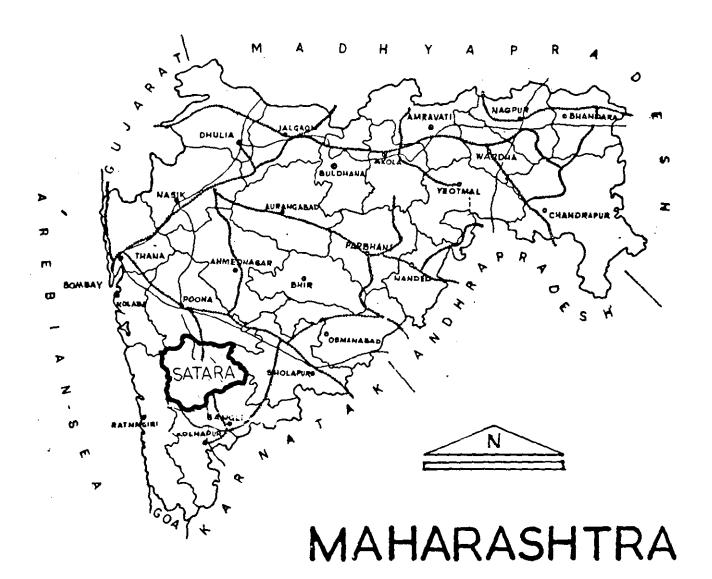
This Town Directory is an attempt in that direction. Information compiled and presented in this

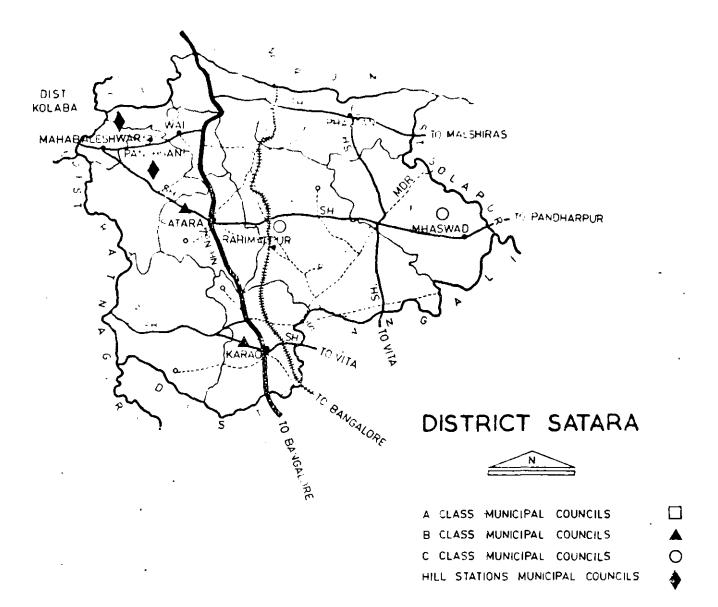
Town Directory has been collected mainly through secondary sources viz. census publications, Municipal Year Books published by the Bureau of Economics, District Gazetteers and Development Plan Reports. The information from the Development Plan Reports has been up-dated where necessary. Some information such as relating to water supply and drainage was also collected through correspondence with the concerned Departments/Municipal Councils. The response from the Municipal Councils was quite good as 142 Municipal Councils out of 222 i.e. nearly 64% supplied the information as asked for in the formats as prescribed.

To assess the increase in the facilities and the level of service during the time progression, all Municipal Councils were requested to supply information as at two time stages, viz. 1970-71 and 1975-76. However, unfortunately such information for the two time stages has not been properly supplied by many municipal councils and as such it has not been possible to throw any light on the increase in the facilities or the level of service during the time progression.

To be really useful, the Town Directory will have to be updated periodically. If the idea and attempt to compile and present such a Town Directory is appreciated and found useful, we would certainly undertake such periodical updating.

The present volume relates to Satara District and would be followed by similar volumes of other Districts.

On the whole climate is pleasant and the wind direction in general is from south-west to North-East during major part of the year. Growth trend of the town is towards south of town.

4. Brief History

Town Karad is situated on the confluence of two rivers Krishna and Koyana. This confluence is known by a famous name 'Preetisangam'. In Maratha regime Karad was the headquarter of 'Panth Pratinidhi' of Raja of Aundh. The Panth Pratinidhi was residing in the fort known as 'Bhuikot Killa' which is on the banks of rivers Krishna and Koyana. At present the Bhuikot Killa is in delapidated conditions. There are many temples in the town. In the heart of the town, there are two minerates like Chimany about 106' in height which are visible from all sides of the town. There are beautiful ghats sloping towards the river.

The Municipal Council was established in 1855.

MAHABALESHWAR (Hill Station)

- 1. Name of Town
- : Mahabaleshwar
- 2. Geographical location and Administrative Function.
- : Latitude 17° 51' N Longitude - 73° 30' E

Mahabaleshwar town is a famous Hill Station in Jawali Tahasil in Sahyadri ranges and is situated about 53 kms. north-west of Satara and 120 kms. south-west of Pune. Mahabaleshwar links with Pune-Mahad State Highway.

- 3. Geography and physical features.
- : Mahabaleshwar is the Chief Sanitorium of Maharashtra situated on one of the Sahyadri spurs. It is situated at an average altitude of 4500' and at Sindola ridge the highest point reaches 4710'. Most of the surface area is covered with evergreen trees; interpersed with homesteads buried in the midst of the groves and green trees. Renowned hill station. Most persons probably think it best in October as the scenery is best in these days along with flowers while in April, May the climate is cool and many people come to spend summer here. In October immediately after the cessation of the south-west monsoon, many spots are carpeted with flowers, every paths in the hills are decorated with the natural flowers and green leaves and every bank and stone the rugged clifts of the hills themselves are dazzlingly green with moss and grass. In the morning, the ravines are filled which fleegyroll of mist or with a wealth of dark blue shadow. In the evening great clouds gather and impart endless variety of light and shade to the landscape and of glorious colour to the rays of the setting sun. The climate is bracing and healthy suiting most constitutions. Bee-keeping and Honey collection at Mahabaleshwar is a famous industry. Mahabaleshwar trap is often columnar and accompanied by crystallised quartz, apophyllite, stilbite and scolecite found in cavities. The iron clay contains a variable proportion of peroxide

of iron which used to be extracted by a class of men.

4. Brief History

: The discoveror and first visitor of the Mahabaleshwar hills, was the late General P.Lodwick. Mahabaleshwar was ceded in 1828 by the Satara Raja in exchange for the village of Khandala in Wai and in 1848 was incorporated in the Satara Collectorate on the lapse of the Satara State to the British Government. From 1827 to 1866, the management of the station was carried on by a Committee. There are many points worth seeing important of them are i) Arthur seat ii) Lodwick Point iii) Bombay Point iv) Wilson Point v) Lingmala falls vi) Yenna Lake. Five rivers Krishna, Venna, Koyna, Savitri and Gayatri originate from Mahabaleshwar hills.

b) Water Supply

Water supply to the town provided by the Municipal Council at present is from Bishap tank, Elphinston tank and 21 Municipal wells. Water of Bishap tank and all the Municipal wells is far away from the residential areas. Water from Elphinston tank is pumped in a Reservoir having capacity of 5000 gallons and then distributed through pipe lines to surrounding bungalows. At present the waste and storm water from the town is drained out in open gutters and then disposed off to existing nallas leading to valleys. Underground drainage length - 2285 mt. which covers 1.5 sq.kms.area.

The Maharashtra State Electricity Board supply electric power to the city from the grid.

rainy season, there is much
vehicular traffic of cars

and heavily loaded trucks etc.
Satara-Mahabaleshwar road is not
as important as Pune-Mahad road.
In addition to above roads, there
are number of other subsidiary
roads and road links.

<u>Internal</u> - The Main street runs from east to west and is the nost important and busiest road in the town. Masjid road is another east-west road which is more important from the traffic point of view. Southern road running parallel to the Main Street is old Mahabaleshwar road which joins Bus - Station to old Mahabaleshwar. Other important roads are one leading to Bombay and Lodwick points and other to Babington point. These provide access to many bungalows. The total length of the internal roads is 128.11 kms. out of which Asphalt roads are 23.90 kms. The length of water bound macadam and unsurfaced roads is 44.67 and 59.54 kms. respectively.

- Mhasvad was the home of 'Mane' family who were its Deshmukhs. The Manes were distingwished shiledars under the Bijapur Government but nearly as notorious for their revengful character as the Shirkes. The 'Temple' of 'Shidhanath' usually called 'Nath' is most famous in the Man Tahasil. A yearly fair is held with a large gathering on the bright first of Margshish or November-December. When the masks of the images are driven in a carriage. 10 kms. south-east of Mhasvad at Rajevadi in the Atpadi territory is the great Mhasvad irrigation lake which when full covers an area of 16 sq.kms.

The Nimbalkars continued to remain as rulers of Phaltan and they were attached to the Chhatrapati of Satara. the extinction of the Maratha rule, the State passed under the protection of the British, until it was finally merged with the Indian Union in 1947.

Between 90 B.C. and 300 A.D. some copper inscriptions indicate that upto 1200 A.D., the fort was under the control of Chalukyas and Rashtrakuts. The fort remained with Audhrabhrutya kings. It is

also stated that the fort was built by King Boja, the second of Shilahar family of Kolhapur. There is a temple of 'Saptarishi' on the fort and hence some believe that the name 'Satara' derived by the town is by transformation of 'Saptarishi'. The fort passed on from one to another King. 1489 Devgiries Bahamani ruled over the fort. Then Bijapur's Adilshahi. In 1659 Maratha captured the Fort. In 1690 Ramchandrapant Amatya declared Satara as Capital town. Ajimshah of Aurangjeb congurred the fort in 1700 and named as Ajimtara which was then known as Ajinkyatara. Subsequently Chhatrapati Shahu captured this town in 1708 and made this as his Capital town. Ultimately fort merged with British territory in 1848. Places of great historical importance include Ajinkyatara fort, Palace, Adalat Rangamahal, Jalmandir, Range Bapuji Math etc.
