

#### PREFACE

#### Object and scope of the study :

Among the 289 urban areas in Maharashtra as defined in the 1971 Census, there are 222 municipal towns, 5 corporation towns and 62 non-municipal towns. Out of the 222 municipal councils, 20 are 'A' Class Municipal Councils, 34 are 'B' Class and 168 are 'C' Class Municipal Councils.

These towns are at different levels of develop-They differ from one another in several respects. ment. Their regional settings and climatological features are different, their functional importances are different and so are also the levels of infrastructural development or per capita incomes. While the census publications provide a lot of useful information about the demographic features of these towns and the Municipal Year Books furnish details of incomes and expenditures of the Municipal Councils, there is no publication which provides consolidated information about the levels of physical and social infra-structural development of the various towns, their planning achievements or planning deficiencies and level of social facilities etc. Development Plans of all these Municipal towns have been prepared which contain a fund of information on several socio-economic and physical aspects of the towns based on surveys carried out at the time of preparation of the Development Plans. This information is however not available any where in a consolidated and concise form. It was felt that a publication containing information on all aspects of the towns in Maharashtra i.e. demographic, economic, physical and social would be useful not only to town planners but also to other social Scientists and administrators as well.

This Town Directory is an attempt in that direction. Information compiled and presented in this

Town Directory has been collected mainly through secondary sources viz. census publications, Municipal Year Books published by the Bureau of Economics, District Gazetteers and Development Plan Reports. The information from the Development Plan Reports has been up-dated where necessary. Some information such as relating to water supply and drainage was also collected through correspondence with the concerned Departments/Municipal Councils. The response from the Municipal Councils was quite good as 142 Municipal Councils out of 222 i.e. nearly 64% supplied the information as asked for in the formats as prescribed.


To assess the increase in the facilities and the level of service during the time progression, all Municipal Councils were requested to supply information as at two time stages, viz. 1970-71 and 1975-76. However, unfortunately such information for the two time stages has not been properly supplied by many municipal councils and as such it has not been possible to throw any light on the increase in the facilities or the level of service during the time progression.

To be really useful, the Town Directory will have to be updated periodically. If the idea and attempt to compile and present such a Town Directory is appreciated and found useful, we would certainly undertake such periodical updating.

The present volume relates to Pune District and would be followed by similar volumes of other Districts.



4. Brief History

Latitude - 18° 40' N Longitude - 73° 53' E

'C' Class Municipal Town from Khed Tahsil. 21 kms. to north of Pune and about 19 kms.(12 miles) from Khed, the Tahsil Headquarter.

: Situated on the left bank of Indrayani river and is in the midst of Bajari, Jawar and Groundnut growing area. Indrayani river divides the town area in two parts. Main part of the town is in Khed Tahsil while remaining area is in Haveli Tahsil. Altitude - 1840' above M.S.L. Mean [ Maximum - 36.6° c temperature [ Minimum - 17.8° c Rainfall average - 71 cm. (25")

Climate in general is healthy and pleasant.

The traces of Alandi can be : found in history in the middle age era. The town is a place of `Hindu pilgrimage where 2 big fairs are held in a year, one in 'Aashad' and other in 'Kartik' month. For fair in 'Kartik' nearly 2 lac people assemble here. There is<sup>a</sup>Samadhi (tomb) and temple of the Great Saint Dnyaneshwar who belonged to this place. The famous masonry wall which is believed to have borne Dnyaneshwar to a distance at his orders, is in the town. It was a place of many Sadhu & Saints in ancient time. The town was known by 'Varuna', 'Alaka', 'Kanika', 'Anandvan' etc. at that time. At the time of Shivaji's rule, this town was<sup>a</sup>part of Chakan Prant. Prior to Dnyaneshwar, there was a famous temple of Sidheshwar and because of this temple, town was named as Shidheshwar. This is a famous religious place. The other

: temples are of Vishnu, Rama, Gopalkrishna, Saint Goroba and Pundalik. The temple of Pundalika is in the river bed.

The Municipal Council was established in 1869.

#### BARAMATI

1. Name of Town

: Baramati

2. <u>Geographical</u> <u>location and</u> <u>Administrative</u> Function. : Latitude - 18° 9' N Longitude - 74° 34' E

'C' Class Municipal Council and headquarter of Baramati Tahsil. Situated at a distance of about 109 kms. south-east of Pune. A Railway junction on south Central Kailway (Dhond-Baramati) narrow gauge line. It is at a distance of 120 kms. from Pune by rail and 43 kms. from Dhond. Baramati is also interlinked with important towns in the State by Pune-Indapur State Highway (S.H.No.37), Phaltan-Shigwan State Highway (S.H.No.14A) and 3 major district roads.

Situated on both the banks of : river Karha flowing from north to south. The old gaothan is situated on right bank while the new one is situated on the left bank of the river. A low level bridge across the river connects the old and new gaothans. Southern part of Baramati is under the irrigation command of Nira Left Bank Canal and as such it forms major commercial centre of sugar farming area. Soil is good for cotton, sugarcane and vegetable crops. A good Market place. The town has a general slope towards south and west. The climate in general is dry and experiences extreme temperature during summer and winter. The predominant wind direction throughout the year is from west to east. AJ.titude - 546 metres (1791') above M.S.L.

4. Brief History

: This town was included in the empire of Yadwas of Devgiri. Then it was a part of Bahamani Rajya. In the period of Adilshahi, it was under the control of Sardar Malojirao Bhosale. It became independent 'Pargana' at the time of Shahaji Bhosale. Shri Babuji Naik had constructed a big fort on the bank of Karha river. The famous Marathi Poet Moropant belonged to this town. After Nira left bank canal was commissioned, Baramati town flourished rapidly and became a market centre of cotton, Gur and grains. The famous temple of "Kashi Vishweshwar" on the bank of river 'Karha' has been constructed in the 7th Century.

The Municipal Council was established in 1865 A.D.

'C' Class Municipal Council. Headquarter of Bhor Tahsil. Situated 60 kms. away from District headquarter Pune on south. Mahad-Pandharpur State Highway runs along the southern boundary of the town.

3. <u>Geography and</u> <u>physical</u> <u>features</u>.

The town is situated on the bank : of Nira river and has a general slope from south to north-east. Major portion of the town area is under Agricultural use where paddy crops are grown. Fertility of land goes on reducing while one passes on to west as well as south side of the town. The town is also traversed by 2/3 nallas which ultimately meet Nira river. Beautiful ghats have been built along the river side. The town is a centre of commerce. Altitude - 601.6 metres above M.S.L. Mean Maximum - 37.9°c Temperature Minimum - 12.0°c Rainfall average -955 mm. Trend of new development in the town is on the southern side. The climate in general is temperate and pleasant. The direction of wind in general is from south-west to north-east.

4. Brief History

: The town was the capital of erst-while 'Bhor State' under the rule of Pant Sachiv, one of the 'Ashta Pradhan' of Chhatrapati Shivaji. The State merged with Indian union in 1949. The renowned temple of 'Shiv' named as 'Bhoreshwar' temple is in the town.



4. <u>Brief History</u> : After the establishment of Hindustan Antibiotics Factory (Ltd.) at Pimpri in 1956, the area around the villages of Pimpri, Chinchwad, Akurdi, Bhosari experienced rapid industrial development. The industries

started locating mostly along the communication routes, especially near the Railway track and on the Bombay-Pune National Highway. Colony for rehabilitation of refugees after Independance was also established at Pimpri. The Maharashtra Industrial Development Corporation also started its activity in this area from 1961-62. The Authorities like Maharashtra Industrial Development Corporation, the village Panchayats and the Collector of Pune had control over their respective jurisdiction; and no single authority was responsible for entire area. In absence of a single civic body, there was no uniformity in building bye-laws and regulations to control the development activities and the growth was rapid and many unauthorised constructions have grown up with the paucity of basic amenities required for Healthy civic condition. So the Pimpri-Chinchwad New Township was established in 1970 of villages Bhosari, Pimpri, Chinchwad, Akurdi and some part of Nigadi, Moshi, Ravet and Chikhali. Chinchwad is famous for the temples and Samadhis of Moraya Gosavi(Moraba) the founder of the Ganapatya Cult.
