PREFACE

The Education Commission has taken up, for detailed examination, the problem of grant-in-aid to educational institutions in India. The object of this study is to ascertain the present practice of giving grant-in-aid to different types of educational institutions in the States and Union Territories and, on a comparison of these, to formulate recommendations for future action.

2. The study is divided into five parts:
- (1) Grant-in-aid to pre-primary institutions;
 - (2) Grant-in-aid to primary schools;
 - (3) Grant-in-aid to secondary schools;
 - (4) Grant-in-aid to Colleges of Arts and Science; and
 - (5) Grant-in-aid to Universities.

These areas were selected for study because, it is in them that private enterprise plays a very large and significant role.

3. I take this opportunity to thank Shri M.P. Balakrishnan, Research Officer of the Education Commission, for carrying out this study. I also would like to convey the gratitude of the Education Commission to the State Governments and Administrations of Union Territories who were kind enough to supply the basic data required.

Summary of Grant-in-Aid Rules to
Pre-Primary Institutions in India -1965

(Pages 1-10 give Statewise details)

Name of the State	Rules regarding grant-in-aid by the State Government
1. Andhra Pradesh	$\frac{1}{2}$ approved expenditure or deficit whichever is less.
2. Assam	Ad hoc basis.
3. Bihar	Ad hoc
4. Gujarat	Subject to availability of funds and to the discretion of the Department. 25% of the admissible expenditure incurred in the previous year.
5. Jammu & Kashmir	No grant-in-aid.
6. Kerala	Recurring and non-recurring grant each not to exceed Rs. 1000/-. Admission to be open to children of all castes/creeds and no fees for children of poor parents.
7. Madhya Pradesh	75% of admissible expenditure or net deficit whichever is less.
8. Madras	Director to give grant treating the institutions as special schools for purpose. No rigid ceiling for the quantum of grant.
9. Maharashtra	25% of admissible expenditure of previous year or actual deficit whichever is less for preprimary schools and 50% maintenance grant, Dearness allowance/and Equipment grant for pre-primary training colleges.
10. Mysore	No uniform rules - 50% of authorised maintenance expenditure in <u>ex-Mysore area</u> with proviso to reserve a third of seats for free education for children of poor parents - Adhoc in Hyderabad Karnatak area - fixed grants in Coorg District and 25% of the net admissible expenditure in Bombay Karnatak area.

11. Orissa Ad hoc grants out of savings.
12. Nagaland No private pre-primary institutions.
13. Punjab No grant given.
14. Rajasthan Non-recurring grants @ 50% and recurring grants between 50-90% as approved by the Grant-in-aid Committee. Recurring grant not to exceed difference between total approved expenditure and income.

15. West Bengal Non-recurring grants:
 Building grant - Rs. 11,000
 Equipment grant - Rs. 4,800
 Recurring grants:
 Salary grants and contingencies on approved scales.
16. Uttar Pradesh Annual grant no to exceed the difference between the approved annual maintenance cost and income or half the maintenance cost whichever is less.
17. Dadra Nagar Haveli. such No/private institutions.
18. Delhi No grant-in-aid by the Directorate and Municipal Corporation.
19. Goa 2/3rd of the admissible expenditure in the first year and half in subsequent years.
20. Laccadives & Minicoy Islands such No/private institutions.
21. Manipur No aided pre-primary institutions.
22. Pondicherry Non-recurring grant of Rs. 400 and recurring grant of Rs. 600 per year.
23. Tripura No grant-in-aid.
