CHAPTER - I

:- INTRODUCTION :-

1.1 LOCATION :-

The Satara district is located between 17° 5' and 18° 11' North latitude and 73° 33' and 74° 54' East longitude. It is situated on the west of Deccan Plateau. It is bound by Sholapur district on the east, Sangli district on the south, Kolaba and Ratnagiri districts on the west and Poona district on the north.

The district has an area of 10437 Sq.Km. with a population of 14.30 Lakh according to 1961 census.

The Satara district comprises of eleven tehsils. The district headquarter is at Satara. Satara city is connected by Poona-Bengalore National Highway, with nearest rail connection at Koregaon and Satara Road, on the South-Central Railway.

1.2 TOPOGRAPHY :-

(1) SOIL :-

The soils of the district are observed to be of varied textures. In the west the soil in Mahabaleshwar, Wai, Jaoli and Patan is formed from the red laterite of the ghats. It is thin and poor on the hill slopes but gets richer where natural or artificial terracing has accumulated soil with vegetable matter drained by rain waters. Rich black soil is found in the low lands of the valleys of Krishna, Venna, Kudali, Koyana and Kole rivers in Wai, Jaoli and Patan tehsils.

In the central part of the district medium to deep black alluvial soils are found. The soil in the Krishna valley bed is very black, alluvial and is highly retentive of moisture. It is very fertile in Satara and Karad tehsils.

The soils in Khandala, Man and Phaltan tehsils are poor in quality, although these are good stripes of black soil along the Nira river and its tributaries. In the eastern part of Khandala tehsil the soil is poor, shallow and whitish but is capable of growing wheat if adequate water is available.

Towards the east, the soil is poor with the exception of wide stretches of good black soil along the numerous streams and rivers in Koregaon tehsil.

In the farthest east of the district, that is in Khatav and Man tehsils the soil is extremely poor and shallow.

Considering the district as a whole, the percentage of rich soil is very small. The soil in general is of poor quality, excepting in the river vally beds in the central part.

ii) RIVERS :-

Krishna is the principal river of Satara district. It rises in the eastern brow of Mahabaleshwar Plateau, with its source at about 1371 metre above mean sea level. Several streams which flow from the vallies formed by the main hill ranges in the district make up the head waters of the Krishna river. The drainage system of Krishna river includes, besides the drainage

of central system, the drainage of seven feeders, namely Kudali, Venna, Urmodi, Tarali and Koyana, on the right and Vasana and Yerala on the left. From the source, Krishna flows for nearly 160 Km. through Satara district: which later enters into Sangli district.

The other rivers of importance are Koyana, Venna, Nira, Kudali, Urmodi, Vasana Yerala and Tarali. Koyana is the largest feeder of Krishna river in this district. It rises in the Mahabaleshwar Plateau, runs south upto Helwak in Patan tehsil where the famous Koyana Dam has been built. Here it changes its course of flow and flows to east falls in to Krishna at Karad.

The chief tributaries of Bhima river, Nira and Manganga flow through this district in the north. Nira enters in to Satara district from Bhor tehsil of Poona district. It flows east to north of Wai and Phaltan tehsils. It later enters into Sholapur district and falls into Bhima. The river Man flows a length of about 64 Km. in Satara district and later enters in to Sangli district and Sholapur district where it falls into Bhima. ~~These rivers go~~ dry during summer.

iii) HILL RANGES :

There are two main systems of hills in Satara district. The Sahyadri range and its off-shoots and Mahadco range and its off-shoots. The main range of Sahyadri with a length of 96 Km. from north to south forms the western boundry of this

district. The Mahadeo range starts about 16 Km. north of Mahabaleshwar and stretches east and southeast across the whole breadth of the district. From this range three spurs stretch to the south in the district. The hills in Satara district are very low, barren and rugged except near Mahabaleshwar and Koyana valley. The highest point in Satara district is Mahabaleshwar which is 1436 metre above mean Sea level.

iv) MINERALS :-

Except for building stone, lime stone and little iron deposits in about 20 Villages of Jaoli tehsil and 30 villages of Patan tehsil deposits of important minerals such as coal, boxite, manganese, silica are not known to have occurred in any part of the district. Building stone, sand of good quality and lime stone is found to be available all over the district. Good clay for bricks and tiles is found on all river banks.

1.3 CLIMATE

1) RAINFALL :-

The rainfall in Satara district starts by middle of June and lasts till the end of September. The intensity of rainfall is maximum in July each year.

Rainfall is not uniform all over the district. It is very heavy in the western region and it goes on receding towards eastern parts. The extreme western part gets over 5000 mm. rainfall while the eastern part of the Sahyadri Zone gets the rainfall between 1200 to 2000 mm. The normal rainfall recorded at Mahabaleshwar centre is above 6226 mm. while that

at Panchgani it is 1866 mm. at Medha, 1723 mm. at Fatan 1831 mm.

The central Zone gets rainfall between 600 mm. to 1200 mm. Satara centre has normal rainfall of 1025 mm., Koregaon 706 mm, Khandala 503 mm. Wai- 710 mm and Karad 713 mm.

In the eastern Zone rainfall averages below 600 annually. e.g. Phalten- 473 mm. Dahiwadi- 463 mm. Mhaswad- 472 mm. and Vaduj- 512 mm.

The Rainfall data at Mahabaleshwar, Koregaon and Dahiwadi during 1968 and 1969 are given below along with normal rainfall.

It will be seen that though rainfall in western zone was less during 1968 and 1969 as compared to normal rainfall, it was more in the central and eastern zone of the district during these two years.

ii) TEMPERATURE :-

Monthly temperature data is available only for one station - Mahabalshwar in Satara district. Mahabaleshwar is located at an altitude of

1219 metre above mean sea level and as such the temperature data of Mahabaleshwar cannot be considered as representing the data for the whole of Satara district.

The temperature at Mahabaleshwar falls down to as low as 13° centigrade in January and rises at the most to 31.5° centigrade in April. The average temperature for the year in general stands at round about 20.5° centigrade at Mahabaleshwar.

Speaking of the district in general, the following observations can be made. In the western zone the climate is cool and healthy in the hot season but gets chilly during rainy season. The plains of Wai tehsil, however have temperate climate throughout the year. The warmth increases from west to east. In the central zone there is considerable heat during hot months. During winter, the days are warm and nights cool. The eastern zone experiences wide range of temperature. These are large variations in temperature in different seasons in this zone and the climate of this part is akin to that experienced in Sholapur district.

1.4 NATURAL ZONES :-

The Satara district can be broadly divided into three natural zones. The western the central and the eastern zones. The western zone, bordering the Sahyadri ranges receives rainfall between 1200 mm. to 5000 mm. This zone comprises of Patan, Jaoli, Mahabaleshwar tehsils and part of Satara and Wai tehsils. The soils in this zone is

thin and poor on the hill slopes. The agricultural pursuits of this zone are similar to those of Konkan tract to the west. Rice, Jawar are the main crops of this zone.

The central zone comprises of Koregaon, Karad tehsils and eastern parts of Satara and Wai tehsils. The area is flat and soil and rainfall are very congenial to better agricultural productions. The rainfall varies between 600 mm. to 1200 mm. per year. The soil is deep alluvial and very fertile. Jowar, Bajara, Groundnuts, are the principal crops of this zone.

The eastern zone comprises of Phaltan, Khatav, Man and eastern part of Khandala tehsils. The soil is poor and shallow the rainfall is not certain and the annual average rainfall received by this zone is less than 600 mm. This area is prone to scarcity conditions as what ever rainfall it receives is not assured. Bajari, jowar are the main crops of this zone.

1.5 TERRITORIAL CHANGES :-

Satara district was formed in 1848. It was then called a province and had following eleven sub-divisions. Bijapur (now in Mysore State), Jaoli, Karad, Khedpur, Khatav, Koregaon, Pandharpur, Satara, Targaon, Valva and Wai. A number of territorial changes took place in the subsequent decades. Consequent upon the merger of former princely States in to the Indian Union parts of Phaltan, Jamkhindi, Akkalkot, Bhor, Aundh and Sangli states and one village from

Poona district were added to Satara district. A new Tehsil of Phaltan was created, and four tehsils Khanapur, Tasgaon, Valva and Shirala were transferred to the newly formed Sangli district (then named as South Satara district) with head quarters at Sangli in 1949. Satara district (then known as North Satara district) has since then the present set up of 11 tehsils. In 1958 village Shangaon from Khanapur tehsil of Sangli district was transferred to Karad tehsil of Satara district. The name of the district was changed from North Satara district to Satara district in 1960.

1.6 DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION :-

1) STATE ADMINISTRATION :-

Until May 1962 the administrative set up of the district was under the unitary control of the district collector. After passing of the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities Act in 1962, the administrative set up became dual. Excepting for a few safeguards, the developmental functions and administrative functions excluding matters relating to law and order, judicial functions and developmental functions involving high technical skill have been devolved on Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities, with the Chief Executive Officer as their executive head. Under Government Sector, the Collector continues to act as the district head and also as coordinating authority. The Collector who is also the District Magistrate to maintain law and order, is in charge of general administration, treasury, land revenue

and civil supply. He is assisted by a Resident Deputy Collector and three Deputy Collectors, who hold charge of the three revenue divisions and have their head-quarters at Satara, Phaltan and Mahabaleshwar. The district is divided into eleven tehsils and they are in charge of the Tehsildars stationed at the tehsil head-quarters.

The Superintendent of Police heads the district police force. He is assisted by the two Deputy Superintendents, stationed at Satara and Karad, below them the sub-Inspectors are posted at tehsil head quarters. Various branches such as crime, local intelligence, Anticorruption have been evolved for efficient maintenance of law and order in the district.

On the judicial side the District and the Sessions judge is the head of judicial department in the district. He is assisted by two Assistant Judges and Additional Sessions Judge. For convenience of administration of justice and for the public convenience, civil judges are posted at tehsil level. They deal with both civil and criminal suits at tehsil level.

The Executive Engineer B. and C. Department, Satara is in charge of all Roads and buildings in Government Sector. The Executive Engineer (Irrigation) is in charge of all State sector irrigation projects in the district. Besides him, there are special Executive Engineers for Irrigation and Power Projects such as Koyana Dam project, Dhoni Dam project, Vir Dam project, Borkhal project and Pathakal project.

The office of the Dy. Registrar of ~~Coop-~~erative Societies is at Satara. The Deputy Registrar is assisted by three Assistant Registrars having different territorial jurisdictions. The Zilla Parishad also has one officer to promote cooperative movement in the district.

The Divisional Forest Officer, Satara has his headquarters at Satara. The other State sector offices located at Satara are of Divisional Soil Conservation Officer, Consolidation Officer, Sales Tax Officer, District Employment Officer, District Industries Officer, District Statistical Officer, Publicity Officer, Superintendent of Prohibition and Excise, Civil Surgeon, District Marketing Officer, District Prison Superintendent, Principal I.T. I. Poultry Project Officer.

ii) CENTRAL GOVT. ADMINISTRATION:-

The Offices of Income Tax Officer, Superintendent of Central Excise and the Superintendent of Post Offices are located at Satara.

iii) LOCAL BODIES :-

Under the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities Act Satara Zilla Parishad and eleven Panchayat Samities have been established in 1962. The area under the jurisdiction of the Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities corresponds to the district and tehsil boundaries respectively excepting the Municipal areas which are under the control of municipal councils. 97.12 percent of the district area and 89.46 percent of population of the Satara district is covered under the Zilla Parishad and the Panchayat

Samities. They have replaced the erstwhile statutory bodies known as District Local Board, District Panchayat Mandal and District School Board.

The Zilla Parishad is headed by the elected President from among the elected members. To carry out the administrative and executive work an officer in the senior scale of I.A.S. works as the Chief Executive Officer of the Zilla Parishad. He is assisted by various departmental heads. The various departmental heads are. The Agricultural Developmental Officer, the District Health Officer, the District Animal Husbandry Officer, the Administrative Officer for village panchayats, the Education Officer, the Executive Engineer, the Chief Accounts and Finance Officer and the Dy. Chief Executive Officer.

At the tehsil level, the Panchayat Samities have all elected chairman. The Block Development Officer works as Secretary to the Panchayat Samiti. He is the administrative and executive head at tehsil level, under Zilla Parishad.

The State Govt. Officers continue to exercise technical supervision and give necessary guidance to the Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities. The State Govt. have powers to issue directions to the Zilla Parishad in respect of any works and schemes in the interest of National and State developmental plans. The other local bodies functioning in the district are the Municipal Councils of the 8 urban areas - Satara, Karad, Phaltan, Wai, Panchagani, Mahabaleshwar, Rahimatpur & Mhaswad

and the village Panchayats at village level. The total number of village Panchayats functioning at the end of March 1970 was 1000 covering all the villages in Satara district.

The other statutory bodies functioning in the district are the Maharashtra State Electricity Board, The Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation and the Life Insurance Corporation. The offices of all these corporate bodies are located at Satara.

State Farming Corporation has an Estate at Sakharwadi, Phalten tehsil.

Maharashtra Warehousing Corporation has established an office at Karad in Satara district.

DEMOGRAPHY :-

1) GENERAL :-

According to 1961 census the human population of Satara district is 14,30,105. It was 11,77,016 in 1951. During the decade 51-61 the population increase by more than 2.53 lakh i.e. at the rate of 21.5 per cent.

The 1961 population has increased by more than 68 per cent during 1901 to 1961.

The Satara district ranks 13th in population and 16th in area among the 26 districts of the Maharashtra State. The area of the district is 10437 Sq.Km. and its Population in 1961 is 14,30,105.

ii) DENSITY :-

The population density of Satara district is 137 per Sq.Km. as per 1961 census. This is higher than the State density of 129 persons per Sq.Km.

Within the district, great variations are observed in the tehsilwise population densities. The density is low in the hilly tracts of western zone and also in the scarcity affected areas in the eastern zone. The density is 232 persons per Sq.Km. in Karad tehsil while it is 69 persons per Sq.Km. in Man tehsil. The central zone consists of rich soil and has high proportion of net sown area to geographical area and as such it has the highest density of population.

iii) LITERACY

The percentage of literacy increased substantially from 20.60 per cent in 1951 to 33.98 per cent in 1961 in Satara district. The female literacy rose from 6.30 per cent in 1951 to 21.16 per cent in 1961. The male literacy rose from 33.50 per cent in 1951 to 47.41 per cent in 1961.

As per 1961 census the percentages of literacy for Poona Division are :-

There has been substantial increase in the literacy in the decade 1951-61 in Satara district. The progress of female literacy particularly is a note-worthy achievement. The percentages are higher in Satara district than in Poona division. The Mass literacy campaign the scheme of compulsory primary education and the facilities extended by the well-known. Rayat Shikshan Sanstha of Satara have contributed to this achievement in the field of literacy.

iv) SIZE OF HOUSEHOLDS :-

On the basis of 20 per cent Sample Study the following observations regarding size of households are made.

Households with family size 4 to 6 are more common both in rural and urban areas. The single and two to three member households are more (39.58 per cent) in urban areas than in rural areas (31.60 per cent). The average size of the household is 5.1 in rural areas and 4.8 in urban areas in Satara district. There are 2,76,957 households in the district as per 1961 census - 2,45,043 in rural areas and 31,914 in urban areas. A little more than $\frac{1}{10}$ th of the households (11.5 per cent) are in urban areas and the rest $\frac{9}{10}$ th (i.e.88.5 per cent) stay in rural areas.

v) LIVELIHOOD CLASSIFICATION :-

Of the total population of the district 48.42 per cent population is engaged in work. Remaining 51.58 per cent population is non working or dependant. population 80.65 per cent of the working pe-

population (i.e. 4/5 the of the working population) derives its livelihood from Agricultural pursuits while the remaining from nonagricultural activities such as construction, industry, trade and commerce transport, communication and other services. The proportion of workers dependent on agriculture in Satara district is higher than the state proportion of 72.07 per cent.

The ratio of workers engaged as agricultural labourers to cultivators in the Maharashtra State is 1:2 while it is 1:7 in Satara district.

The proportion of working population dependent on non agricultural activities for the state is 27.93 per cent. Compared to this the population (19.35) for Satara district is very low; indicating the heavy load of population in the district on agriculture.

There is a marked difference in the distribution pattern for non-workers among males and females 42.88 per cent of the male non workers are full time students while the corresponding proportion for females is 15.31. In urban areas this proportion is higher than in rural areas. The percentage of females engaged in household duties is also higher in urban areas than in rural areas. The proportion of dependents, infants and disabled is more in rural areas than in urban areas.

ON SOURCES AND LIMITATIONS OF STATISTICS PRESENTED
IN THE DISTRICT STATISTICAL ABSTRACT
1968-69 AND 1969-70 COMBINED ISSUE.

2.1 PURPOSE:-

This is the 9th issue of The District Statistical Abstract prepared by this office since 1957-58. The purpose of the issue is to provide statistical data on as many topics as possible so that the Abstract may prove useful not only as an official reference book but also for research, planning and further socio-economic studies. Generally, the data is given separately for each tehsil for providing between tehsil comparison. In exceptional cases, where tehsilwise data is not available, the data is presented for the district as a whole.

To cover up the time lag, the present issue is brought out as a combined issue for two years 1968-69 and 1969-70.

The sources of the material presented in this abstract are shown at the bottom of each table.

Concepts, sources, and limitations of the data in the tables of the Abstract are discussed in short in the following paragraphs.

2.2 District At a Glance :-

In this table general information is given for Satara district and for Poona Division. Data on

location, area, population, numbers of villages, towns total workers and non workers, literacy percentages is presented here. Important indicators in the fields of agriculture, animal husbandry, industry, cooperation, electricity, planning, education, transport and communication etc. are also depicted in this table. The reference years are given for all items.

2.3 CLIMATE :-

Table No.1 gives information about monthly rainfall; no. of rainy days and the normal rainfall for the years 1967, 1968 and 1969 for 15 raingauge stations in Satara district. The data is obtained from all the Tehsildars in the district and the Statistician, dept. of Agriculture, Poona.

Normal rainfall is based on the actuals of 30 to 40 years. A day is construed as rainy day if the raingauge records a minimum of 2.5 mm. rainfall during the 24 hours of the day.

Table No.2 shows the mean-maximum mean-minimum and average temperature of the Mahabaleshwar Station for the years 1967, 1968 and 1969. The mean maximum and the mean-minimum are the averages of maximum & minimum temperatures observed daily during a month. The mean temperature is the average of mean-maximum and mean-minimum temperatures. The data for this table is collected from the Directorate of the Indian Meteorological Dept. Bombay.

2.4 AREA AND POPULATION :-

The data on area and population, presented in tables Nos. 3 to 8 is reproduced from the 1961 district census hand book, published by the Superintendent

of Census operations, Maharashtra State, Bombay. Table No. 3 shows salient features of population, sexwise population, density of population and percentage variation over 1951 Census population. The data is given separately for rural and urban areas and for Total for each tehsil. It is shown in hundreds. Table No. 4 depicts tehsilwise classification of inhabited villages according to population ranges. Table No. 6 presents data on number of workers in each tehsil classified by livelihood classes- such as cultivators, agricultural labourers, household industry workers, those engaged in construction activity, trade, commerce and so on and the number of non-workers also. Data is shown separately for rural and urban areas. Table No. 7 presents distribution of district population according to age groups, mother tongue and according to religion separately for rural and urban areas. Details of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes population in the district is shown in Table No. 8 tehsilwise and for rural and urban areas separately.

2.5 AGRICULTURE :-

The Table Nos. 9 to 19 grouped under this head present statistics on Land use, crop pattern, outturn of crops, yield rates, area under irrigation crops irrigated and their areas; statistics on no. of wells, minor irrigation works, major and medium irrigation projects, agricultural wage rates, implements and data on scarcity and famine conditions.

Data in tables 9 to 14 is collected from the Statistician, Department of Agriculture and from Season and Crop reports available at district level. The data are provisional as they are not to be finalized and con-

are provisional as they are yet to be finalised and confirmed by the Agricultural Department. Data on Minor Irrigation Works is obtained from The Zilla Parishad, Satara and all Panchayat Samities at tehsil level in this district, while that Major and Medium projects is obtained from the concerned Executive Engineers of the projects. Data on wage rates are reproduced from the reports received in the District Statistical Office from the selected Panchayat Samities. Data on agricultural implements is reproduced from the Livestock Census 1966 - report of the Bureau of Economics and Statistics, Bombay. The Sources for Table on Famines Scarcity is Collectorate, Satara.

The differences between the area figures according to The Surveyer General and according to the village returns prepared by village officials for revenue purpose arise because the revenue authorities add up village totals to give tehsil and then district figures, while the area figures of Surveyer General is calculated in blocks.

Under 'Forests' are included all areas actually forested and lands classed or administered as forests under any legal enactment dealing with forests, whether state owned or private. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural use, that portion is shown under appropriate head of cultivated or uncultivated land.

Land put to non-agricultural uses stand for all lands occupied by buildings roads, railways or under water e.g. rivers, canals, and other land put to uses other than agriculture.

Barren and unculturable land cover all barren and unculturable lands like mountains, deserts, etc. land which cannot be brought under cultivation, unless at a very high cost is classed as unculturable-whether such land is in isolated blocks or is with in cultivated holdings.

Pastures, Meadows, village Commons and grazing lands within forest areas are shown under the head 'Permanent Pastures and other grazing lands'. While under 'Miscellaneous tree crops and groves' are covered all cultivable lands which is not included under net area sown but is put to some agricultural use. e.g. lands under casurina trees thatching grass, bamboo bushes and other groves for fuel (not included under orchards).

Culturable waste includes all lands available for cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up once but not cultivated during current year and last five years or more in succession. Such lands may be either fallow or covered with shrubs and Jungles which are not put to any use.

'Current fallow' lands comprise cropped areas which are kept fallow during current year. If any seedling area is not cropped again in the same year it is also treated as current fallow. 'Other Fallow' lands include all lands which were taken up for cultivation but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and not more than five years.

The net area sown consists of area sown with crops and orchards, area sown more than once in a year being counted only once. The gross cropped area represented the sum total of area under all crops in

a year. The area sown more than once accounts for the difference between the net and gross cropped area.

2.6 : ANIMAL HUSBANDRY, FORESTS AND FISHERIES

Table No.20 presents data of Livestock Census conducted in 1966. The data is given talukawise. Table No.21 shows tehsilwise no.of veterinary dispensaries, hospitals, aid centres etc. and statistics on animals treated as also the data on artificial insemination. The data is collected from the District Animal Husbandry Officer of the Zilla Parishad. Diseasewise livestock mortality is indicated in Table No.22. No. of attacks and deaths are shown for the years under reference. This data is also collected from District Animal Husbandry Officer. Statistics regarding recognised slaughter houses and animals slaughtered in the district are presented in Table No.23 and this data is obtained from the Zilla Parishad and Municipal Councils in the district.

Forest Statistics is presented in Table No.24 (A) and 24(B). The source is the Statistician, Deptt. of Forests, Poona and Divisional Forest Officer, Satara. Data on forest area is given in Table No.24(A) while data on major and minor forests products and value is shown in Table No.24 (B).

2.7 EMPLOYMENT, INDUSTRY, MINING AND ELECTRICITY :-

Factory statistics is presented in Table Nos. 25,26 and 27. The data is obtained from the Chief Inspector of Factories, Bombay. Data regarding average daily employment according to type of Industry is shown in Table No.25. The data is based on the returns

submitted by the factories. No. of factories not submitting returns and no. of worker there in are also shown. The distribution of factories according to the type and working strength is shown in Table No.26; while distribution according to number of days worked is shown in Table No.27.

Data for Table No.28,29 and 30 are obtained from the District Employment Officer, Satara. Table no. 28 gives monthwise figures of registration, vacancies notified, placements done and data on live register at the end of each month. Table No.29 shows the distribution of candidates registered at the Employment Exchange and their placement according to the national classification of occupations. In table No.30, volume of employment according to types of industry is shown, separately for public and private sectors. Table No.31 and 32 deal with data on Govt. Employees. The data is based on the facts collected by the Bureau of Economics and Statistics in 1966. The data on

Table No.33 and 34 present statistics on Electricity. Data on Generation and consumption is shown in Table No. 33. While population coverage is shown in Table No.34. The data are collected from The Maharashtra State Electricity Board and other private Electric Supply companies in the district.

2.8 CO-OPERATION :-

The data on co-operative field is given in this section. The data is collected from District Dy. Registrar, Co-operative Societies and Agricultural produce market committees. Table No.35 gives informa-

information regarding total no. of each type of co-operative societies in the district. Table No. 36 gives the information regarding co-operative banks in the district. Data pertains to no. of branches, no. of members, capital structure etc. Table No. 37 gives tehsilwise position regarding primary agricultural credit societies, members, capital structure, loan advanced, loan recovered etc. in the district. Table No. 38 gives information regarding other co-operative Societies of different types other than agricultural credit societies. Table No. 39 gives data on agricultural, marketing societies. Tehsilwise information on value of purchase, value of sales of agricultural produce and agricultural requisites is shown. Table No. 40 shows the achievements of important activities of agricultural marketing, processing, sugar factories, handloom societies etc. Table No. 41 shows the arrivals of important agricultural commodities and their value at different regulated markets in the district. The table No. 42 gives the information regarding money lenders and their loan activities in the district.

Table No. 43 shows the data on medical facilities.

2.9 MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH :-

The data on medical facilities available to the people in the district and other information regarding births, deaths, inoculation etc. is displayed in this section. Table No. 43 shows medical facilities available in the district. It shows the number of hospitals, dispensaries, maternity homes, primary health centres, doctors, beds available, indoor and outdoor patients treated. The data presented here

includes Govt. hospitals, Zilla Parishad dispensaries, primary health centres, municipal dispensaries and private aided institutions only. Table No. 44 shows data about births, deaths and infant deaths. Table No. 45 gives information regarding deaths due to important causes in the district. Table No. 46 shows the tehsilwise number of primary vaccination, revaccination and inoculations in the district. The data is collected from the Civil Surgeon the District Health Officer-Zilla Parishad and Assistant Director of Public Health (Vital statistics), Poonna and local bodies.

2.10 :- EDUCATION :-

The literacy, education in urban and Rural areas as per 1961 census and the progress of education in different tehsils of the district is presented in this section.

Table No. 47 gives the number of literates sexwise for rural and urban areas separately. In table No. 48, the total number of literates and illiterates with different level of education of rural population only is shown. Table No. 49 gives information regarding literates with different levels of education (technical and non-technical) in urban areas of the district. Table No. 50 shows the number of different types of institutions, pupils and teachers for each type in the district. Table No. 51 gives information regarding total number of beneficiaries (backward classes) at each level of education. Table No. 52 shows total number of students who are taking benefits under the scheme of E.B.C. and the total value of such concession for all the educational levels for the district as a

whole. Table No.53 gives information regarding grants given by Government to Zilla Parishad and municipal councils for primary education in the district. Table No.54 shows tehsilwise total number of villages having primary schools and those without primary schools. Villages without primary schools is given in different population ranges also. Data is obtained from the Parishad Education Officer and the Director of Education, Maharashtra State and 1961 Census publication.

2.11 TRANSPORT & COMMUNICATIONS :-

Statistical information regarding various modes of transport and other related subjects is shown in this section. Table No.55 gives information on length of railway route in the district. There is only meter gauge in the district. Table No.56 displays data on road length as at the end of each year. The figures relate to extra-municipal roads maintained by the Building and communications department and the Zilla Parishad, Municipal roads are given separately. Table No.57 presents data about motor vehicles in Poona region. Districtwise information is not available. The table No.58 relates to Nationalised Road Transport. The information on number of routes, route distance, average daily earnings etc. is given Satara S.T. division consists of whole Satara District and part of Sangli District. Table No.59 displays the data of road traffic census wherein information regarding no. of vehicles, light motor vehicles, total traffic intensity is given. Table No.60 gives some important Statistics regarding post and telegraphs offices, telephones etc. in the district. In table No.612.

information regarding number of radio-sets and villages where radio sets are installed is given. Also population of villages having receiving sets is given. The data are collected from various sources such as M.S. R.T.C.; Executive Engineer, B. and C., Executive Engineer, Zilla Parishad, Supdt. of Posts and Telegraphs, S.D.O. Telephone, R.T.C. etc.

2.12:- LOCAL BODIES :-

In this section, data regarding income and expenditure of village Panchayats, Municipalities and Zilla Parishad is shown, Table No.62 presents material on income and expenditure of village panchayats Zilla Parishad and Municipalities. In table No.63 the information on income and expenditure of village panchayats is given. The information for each Panchayat Samiti is given separately. Total income and expenditure is further shown under the major heads taxes, fees, donations, contributions while expenditure under administration, public works, sanitation etc. is shown. The table No.64-A and 64 B shows income and expenditure of Setara Zilla Parishad. The receipts are sub-divided into self-raised resources, Govt. grants for agency scheme and ^{depit} section. The expenditure is likewise shown under heads of development. In table No.65 information on income from & expenditure on different sub-heads in respect of municipalities is shown. Under income information is shown separately under grants, taxes and other income. Under expenditure, further break-up into general administration, public safety, public works etc. is shown.

Data is collected from the Zilla Parishad and Municipal Councils in the district.

2.13 :- PLAN AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT :-

Table No.66 shows progress of expenditure on various annual plan schemes implemented in Satara district; while physical achievements are shown in the following table No.67. In the statement for expenditure data is presented for State and local sectors schemes separately. The data is given for two years 1968-69 and 1969-70 and is based on the quarterly reports received from various implementing officers, by the Bureau of Economics and Statistics.

Table No.68 shows Stagewise C.P.A. Pattern C.D. Blocks, as at the end of the financial year 1969-70 and the area no. of villages and population covered by them. Tehsilwise expenditure incurred in blocks in different stage is shown in Table No.69, while their physical achievements are shown in Table No.70. The data in Table Nos.69 and 70 are shown tehsilwise.

2.14 :- PRICES :-

The Table No.72 shows monthly average prices of certain important commodities sold at District headquarters at Satara. The data is collected by the District Statistical Office on every Friday from selected shops for given specifications of the selected commodities. Though the data cannot be considered as fully representative they show a broad trend of price variation over a period of time.

The consumer price Index Nos. for working class of Sholapur centre are applicable to Satara district as well. They are given in Table No.72. The

monthly indices are compiled by the office of Commissioner of Labour, Bombay. The major groups in the Index are 1) Food 2) Pan Supari Tobacco intoxicants, 3) Fuels and light 4) Housing 5) Clothing bedding foot wear and 6) Miscellaneous.

2.15 :- MISCELLANEOUS :-

Under this group statistics on subjects of varied interests such as police, crime, court cases, theatres, joint stock companies, life Insurance, Small savings, and others are presented in tables Nos.73 to 84.

Table No.73 shows police force in the district. Table No.74 gives break up of crime statistics. Table No.75 deals with cases decided by courts in the district. The data shown here is exclusive of cases decided by the district Magistrate and Executive Magistrates. Table No.76 shows tehsilwise data on no. of permanent and touring talkies and their seating capacities. Table No. 77 gives data on types of banking offices and population covered by them while, Table No. 78 represents data on ^{joint} stock companies. No. of insurance policies issued and amount insured is given in Table No.79. Table 80 shows gross collection, Net collection withdrawals under various scripts of small savings.

The tehsilwise land revenue statistics arrears, demand and collection is shown in Table No. 81. The amount of remission is taken as reduction in demand and suspension is taken as additions to arrears. Table No.82 gives information of no. of voters no. of voters who voted, their percentage and partywise votes polled are given both for Parliamentary and

Assembly seats. The Walwa and Shirala tehsils of Sangli district are included in Karad Parliamentary constituency.

Table No. 64 shows important indicators in the fields of developments such as agriculture, live-stock, industry, electricity cooperation, health, transport and Communications and community Development etc. The indicators are given for important years. These indicators provide a handy tool of comparison of progress over years and between areas. Besides these tehsilwise indicators are appended at the end for comparative study.

CHAPTER - III

AN ANALYTICAL REVIEW OF SECTORIAL TRENDS

1968 - 70

3.1 Though in Part II of this volume statistical data available from the various fields is presented, it would be very interesting to review the trends of development over various periods so that the study may bring forth the significant achievements or lapses in various economic fields of development. It is therefore an attempt to visualise and analyse facts and figures in various developmental sectors such as agriculture, livestock and poultry, employment, electricity, education, communication and public health. A series of indicators has been worked out and shown at the end of Part II of this volume while reviewing progress tehsilwise reference is also made to the district and divisional figures wherever such data could be made available.

3.2 Years 1960-61, 65-66, and 69-70 have been considered for analytical review. However in case of agricultural developments, where data is generally received rather late, the years of reference are 1960-61, 1965-66 and 1968-69.

3.3 Agricultural development over a period of time can best be judged from 3 main indicators. They are 1) Percentage of gross area sown to net area sown 2) Percentage of net area irrigated to net area sown. 3) Productivity of important crops. In the following paras the tehsilwise indices are discussed.

Percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown in Satara District in the years 1960-61, 1965-66 and 1968-69.

3.5 The above table will reveal that the percentage of gross cropped area to net cropped area was more (108) in 1960-61 as compared to the figures in 1965-66 and 1968-69. The position in Poona division in general is comparable to that prevailing in this district. The Tehsilwise comparison over these years also represent almost the same trend except in case of Jaoli Man, and Karad and Patan tehsils where this percentage has declined in 1968-69 below the one prevailing in 65-66.

3.6 In 1960-61 gross cropped area was 7.35 lakh hectare; it was 7.32 lakh hectare in 1965-66 and 7.43 lakh hectare in 1968-69. It will thus be seen that there is little addition to gross cropped area over all these 8 years period. Khatav, Koregaon, Man, Phaltan and Wai Tehsils show increase in gross cropped area in 1968-69 over that in 1960-61.

3.7 The range of percentage of gross cropped area to net cropped area for tehsils in Satara district is 102 to 115. It is maximum in Khandala tehsil (115%) and minimum in Karad Tehsil (102%). Phaltan, Wai, Jaoli, Koregaon, Khatav and Patan tehsils have this percentage over 107 the district percentage.

3.8 Comparison of area under different crops in 1965-66 and 1968-69 indicate that in 1968-69 gross area under food crops has declined and that under non-food crops increased. The increase is prominent in case of Bajara, Sugarcane, Cotton, Pulses and misc. non-food crops. The gross cropped area does not show a big rise owing to the fact that there is a tendency to shift to cash crops when irrigation facilities are made available.

3.9 The gross irrigated area has increased from 1.01 lakh hectare in 1960-61 to 1.06 lakh hectare in 1968-69. In 1965-66 however the irrigated area declined to 0.91 lakh hectare. There is 4.5 percent rise in the gross irrigated area in 68-69 over that of 1960-61.

3.10 The change in area irrigated by different sources is shown below.

3.11 Irrigation by wells has shown substantial increase in 1968-69. The number of wells in use has increased from 34340 in 65-66 to 36837 in 1968-69.

The increase in no. of wells is prominently seen in Wai tehsil.

3.12 The net irrigated area figures and the net area sown figures during the three reference years are as under.

The percentages of net area irrigated to net area sown come to 11.70, 10.20, 11.80 in the years 1960-61, 65-66 and 68-69. The increase in the percentage is very little over a span of 8 years. However this percentage in Satara district compares favourably

with the corresponding figures for Poona Division which read 10.00, 10.37 and 10.70 during 1960-61, 1965-66 and 1968-69 respectively.

3.13 Productivity of important Crops.

The principal crops of Satara district are jowar, bajara, rice wheat, gram, tur, groundnut, sugar-cane and cotton. The yield rates of these crops are given below:

3.14 The yield rates in 1968-69 compare favourably with those in 1965-66. The year 1965-66 experienced scarcity conditions, as such yield rates in this year are very low. However, it will be seen that though yield rates in 1968-69 are better than those in 65-66, they do not reach the levels of productivity of the corresponding crops in the year 1960-61 except in case of

CROPS AND CULTIVATION, THE DEMO PLACING IN AREA CROPS
 Poona Division as a whole is reviewed. Here yield rates (68-69) of wheat and Groundnut have exceeded the rates in 1960-61, and that of Bajara is almost same. The yield rates of other crops have declined in 68-69. The yield rates of crops Jowar, Bajara Wheat, Gram, Tur, Groundnut and Cotton are more in Satara district than for the Poona division as a whole during 1968-69. The yield rates of rice and sugarcane are better for the Poona Division than for the Satara district.

3.15 Changes in cropping pattern

The following table will broadly indicate the trend of changing cropping pattern in this district.

3.16 The percentage of area under food crops show a declining trend which in other words means there is increase in the percentage of area under non food crops. More than 4 percent of the cropped area has been shifted from growing food crops to non food crops. Under the subhead food crops, it will be seen that there is reduction in this percentage in 1968-69 over 1960-61 in respect of both cereals and pulses. A sharp decline is noticed in case of Jowar crop.

3.17 Considering the percentages of area under irrigated crops to gross irrigated area it will be seen that the percentage of total food crops has decreased from 93.56 in 1960-61 to 92.35 in 1965-66 and to 90.71 in 1968-69; and that of non food crops increased from 6.44 to 7.65 to 9.25 in the corresponding years. Rice Bajara, other pulses, Sugarcane and Cotton show higher percentage of (irrigated) area under them to total gross irrigated area. For details, the following table has been designed.

3.18 Agricultural Credit :-

The cooperative societies have been playing a very important role in the field of agricultural development by extending credit facilities on an extensive scale. The credit facilities through the agricultural credit societies and Land Development Bank have been considered here. The table below will reveal the position in a nut shell.

3.19 Wage Rates :-

The data on agricultural wage rates in rural areas commenced to be collected since the year 1963-64. The three centres selected for this purpose are Kale, Koregaon and Limb and the data is collected from certain selected cultivators ever fortnight.

3.20 The wage rates have been found to vary in different selected places. Kale centre is very close to Karad town and as such wage rates are found to be always higher than other centres.

3.21 The male field labours are found to get wage rates between Rs. 2.50 to Rs. 3.50 at Kale, centre while the female labourer is paid at Rs. 1.50 to Rs.

3.00 The corresponding rates for males and females in the other two centres viz. Koregaon and Limb have been found Rs. 2.00 to Rs. 3.50 and Rs. 1.50 to Rs. 3.00 respectively. No child labour has been found to be employed during the year.

3.22 Skilled workers such as Carpenters, Blacksmiths, Cobblers whose services are required occasionally for agricultural purposes are paid in cash. Carpenters, Blacksmiths are paid Rs. 4.00 to Rs. 5.00 at

Koregaon and Rs.5.00 to/7.00 at Limb centre per day res-
-pectively.

Livestock and Poultry :-

3.23 Animal Husbandry makes a substantial contri-
-bution to the economy by providing income to farmers,
-subsidiary food to human population and resources of
-employment to landless labourers. A quinquennial census
-of Livestock, poultry and agricultural implements is
-taken all over the country. The 10th such census was
-done in 1966. From the data available through the cen-
-sus it will be seen that only 35 percent of the total
-cattle population is economically useful. Apart from
-the lower productivity of cattle, the quality of drau-
-ght cattle is also poor with rapid increase in urbani-
-sation of rural population and migration of labour to
-industries, the rearing and developing of livestock
-assumes greater importance from the point of view of
-agricultural development.

3.24 The following data will depict tehsilwise
-details of livestock per 100 hectares.

3.25 It will be seen from the above table that the indicator in Jaoli tehsil is very low. It is also below district average in Mahabaleshwar, Koregaon, Khatav, Satara and Patan tehsils. As against this Khanda, Wai, Man and Karad have a fairly high number of livestock per 100 hectare. The district average and average of Ihaltan tehsil is the same.

3.26 The number of livestock per 100 hectare for Poona Division as a whole is 116. The indicator 131 for Satara District compares favourably with that of the Division.

3.27 The total poultry in 1966 was 7,76,198 as against 6,57,771 in 1961. The human population according to 1961 census for Satara District is 14,30,105. The count of poultry birds per 100 population was 460 in 1961 and 543 in 1966. The comparative ratios for Poona Division are 344 for 1961 and 394 for 1966. The rate of increase in poultry per 1000 human population in Satara District is 18 percent as against 14 in Poona Division during 1961-66.

3.28 The above comparison is based with the assumption that human population is same in two years under reference.

Consumption of Electricity :-

3.29 In 1960-61 the per capita consumption of electricity was 4.53 kwh in Satara. This rose to 25.41 in 1967-68, and in 1969-70 the per capita consumption was 33.56. For the Poona division the per capita consumption of electricity was 53.61 in 1967-68 which rose to 88.03 in 1969-70. Thus it will be seen that the per capita consumption in the Satara district is far

behind the per capita consumption in the Poona division, thereby it can be concluded that industrial growth, for which electricity is a prerequisite in Satara district is far behind that in the Poona Division.

3.30 All the urban areas in the district have been electrified. In the rural sector, there are 1000 Grampanchayats. In 1960-61 only 30 villages were electrified, in 1965-66 the number of such villages was 186

However during the next three years i.e. by March 69 438 villages were electrified. The number of villages new electrified are 445 by the end of March 1970. This work out to 44.5 percent of total villages in the district.

3.31 Enrollment at Employment Exchange and Vacancies notified.

The statistics available with the District Employment exchange on this subject throw some light on the gravity of unemployment situation in general. There is a large slice of unemployed labour force which has not availed the services of the employment exchanges. This comprises mostly of uneducated masses and unskilled agricultural labour, who are either not at all employed throughout the year or are under employed or seasonally employed. Statistics of such unemployment is not reflected in the data of the Employment Exchange. The data available with the Employment Exchange, Satara is thrown open in the following table.

3.32 Enrollment of candidates at the Employment exchange is 14 percent higher in 1969-70 than in 65-66. However the percentage of notification of vacancies during 1969-70 has increased only by 11 percent over that in 1965-66. The notification in 1969-70 is only 71 percent of the notification in 1960-61. This shows that either vacancies are not being notified to the exchange or the rate of increase in employment avenues has declined. Both the possibilities may be operative in reality.

3.33 With the opening of new establishments of Irrigation and Power dept for pre construction work of Dhon project there are found to be some new openings for employment opportunities in the public Sector. However in the private Sector, the recession in manufacturing industries has marred the prospects of additional employment.

3.34 The percentage of employed women both in public and private sector was 7.6 in 1968-69 which rose to ^{7.7} percent at the end of the year 1969-70.

In the public sector a large number of woman were employed in educational institutions under Zilla Parishad and State Govt. Hospitals.

3.35 As regards man power shortages and surpluses it is reported that persona for following occupation are short Medical Officers, Electrical instructors, professors and lecturers for all engineering branches, Laboratory Assistants, librarians, store keepers, Leprosy Technicians, Compcunders, Agricultural Assistants, Stenographers, Artists, Boring Operators, Boiler attendants, Turners, Electricians, Automobile Medical Engineers, Composeters, Winders Pipe fitters, Mescons, Crane Operators etc. while surplus continued to exist in fresh S.S.C. and fresh graduates and under graduates and unskilled workers.

Increase in Indoor and out-door Patients treated.

3.36 The medical facilities are being availed of by increasing numbers of patients year after year through public and public aided bodies in this district. The following Table will show the increasing trend.

3.37 The medical facilities have been availed by over 217 percent patients in 1969 when compared to those in 1961. The indoor patients have increased over 10 times in 1969 than in 1961. While out door patients increased by 1.79 times during the same period.

3.38 The percentage increase in male female and child patients during 1969 over 1968 is as below.

Male 19%. Female 26%. child 25 % .

3.39 Increase in number of students in different categories.

There has been increase in no. of students, teachers at all levels of education in Satara district during 1968-69, when compared to the position in the earlier year.

3.40 In the case of Primary education there has been an addition of 6 schools in the district in 68-69. The percentage increase in the number of students is 2.37 in 68-69 over the previous year. The increase is more in case of girls than in case of boys. Their respective percentage increases are 5.09 and 0.74. The number of Primary School teachers increased by 2.67 percent in 68-69 over the previous year. The ratio of students to teachers which was 37.64 : 1 in 1967-68 slightly declined to 37.53 : 1 in 68-69. This indicates improvement in the Teacher Students ratio.

3.41 In case of secondary education there has been no change in the number of institutions in 68-69. The number of students increased only by a marginal rise of 0.66 percent in 1968-69 over the previous year. In case of girls this rise is more. It is 2.93 % while the increase in no. of boys is only 0.66 percent.

The Teacher student ratio which was 1 : 25.00 in 1967-68 has declined to 1 : 24.21 in 1968-69 showing same improvement in the ratio.

3.42 In case of higher education there has been all round increase in the no. of institutes, no. of students and teachers as well. The no. of institutions rose to 14 in 68-69 from 12 in the earlier year. There is an increase of 15.26 % in the number of College going boys while the increase in no. of college going girls has increased by 11.56 % during 1968-69 over the previous year. The increase in the teaching staff is 12.83 percent during the same period.

3.43 Looking to the data of the Poona Division for 1967-68, it is observed that the Teacher Student ratio for primary education was 1:33.63 and for secondary education 1 : 26.65 Compared to these the ratios in Satara district are found to be on the better side.

3.44 Increase in banking facilities :-

The total number of banking offices was 61 at the beginning of 1968 in this district. This figure rose to 68 at the beginning of 1969. The per lakh population ratio of banking offices rose from 4.26 in 1968 to 4.75 in 1969.

3.45 The number of scheduled banking offices rose from 33 to 35 during the reference year. It will thus be seen that the scheduled commercial banks are now taking more and more interest in opening branches in rural areas to cater the needs of agriculturists and small traders and small scale industries.

3.46 Increase in road length

Total rail length in Satara district has not under gone any change during 1969-69 and 1969-70. The metre gauge length is 120 km. in the district. There will be change in type and length of railway route after the conversion of metre gauge to broad gauge is completed. This will be some time in 1971-72. The impact of the change in Type rather than length will be very much on the rural economy.

3.47 At the end of March 68, the total road length of all types of roads excluding municipal roads was 3174.69 km. This length increased to 3665.75 km. at the end of March 1970. Thus the road length per 100 Sq.Km. increase from 30.42 to 35.13 during the span of two years. In the Poona Division the road length increased from 28.37 at the end of March 67 to 30.88 at the end of March 70. The road length per 100 Sq.Km. in Satara district (35.13) compares favourably with the corresponding data for the Division as a whole.

3.48 Prices :-

A glance at the consumer price index for working class (Sholapur centre) will show that the general price level in 1969-70 shot up by 76 percent over the base year 1960 equal to 100. The major groups which contributed to this increase in price level are food, fuel and light, clothing and pan, supari, intoxicants. The food group items recorded 90 percent increase during this period, while fuel and light group recorded 67 percent increase. Clothing and foot wear and Pan Su-pari, intoxicant groups show 56 percent rise.

Miscellaneous group items however showed only 53 percent rise i.e. 28 percent in 1969-70 over the base year 1960. 3.49 Since November 1962 prices of important commodities have been collected by the District Statistical Organisation at each of the district head quarters. The modal prices of certain important commodities prevailing in 1962, 1965 and 1969 at district Head Quarter, Satara are given below.

3.50 It will be seen that almost all commodities listed above have recorded sharp rise in prices in 1969. Groundnut Oil shot up by 150 percent rise. Gram dal show a rise over 120 percent; while the rise in prices of Wheat, Arhardal , Vanaspati, Gur, Potato is ranging between 51 to 100 percent . Dry Chillies, Tea, Kerosene Oil shirting Cigarettes and Washing Soap recorded less than 50 percent rise in the price level in 1969. When compared to base year 1960.

CHAPTER - IV

ANNUAL PLAN 1968-69 AND 1969-70

1) INTRODUCTORY :-

4.1 General :-

After implementation of successive three Five Year Plans upto the year 1966, a series of Annual Plans have been executed in Satara district as elsewhere in Maharashtra State. Fourth Five Year Plan was to be commenced immediately after 1966 but due to shortage of adequate financial resources, non availability of foreign exchange, fourth plan could not be finalised. However, the Annual Plans were implemented since then every year without deviation from the basic concepts of Five Year Planning viz. welfare of community at large in all the spheres. The scheme in Annual Plans were implemented practically on the lines of Third Plan in Satara district in the State and local sectors of development.

The Annual Plans implemented during the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 of this review are the third and fourth in the series in Satara district.

4.2 :- Progress of the Annual Plans of the reference years can better be reviewed on the background of assesment of Third Plan and Annual Plans of the earliers years in this district. During the Third Plan period in Satara district an amount of Rs.7.22 crores was spent whereas Rs.2.78 crores and Rs.3.14 crores were spent in the years 1966-67 and 1967-68 respectively on all the major heads of development and in the State and local sector together.

As against this in the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 Rs.3.69 crores and Rs.2.68 crores respectively were spent in the district on the implementation of district level plan schemes. The pace of expenditure incurred in all the above years has been satisfactory as almost full grants placed at the disposal were utilised every year in both the sectors. Annual plans was near to double and more in the first two Annual Plans when compared with average Annual expenditure of Third plan period. The percentage was 271 in 1968-69 and 186 in 1969-70 when compared to the average annual expenditure of III Five Year Plan. Though less expenditure was registered in the year 1969-70 the allotted grants were practically utilised in full in the district in the year, implementing the district level Annual plan in Satara district.

4.3 :- Study of the above table will indicate that comparatively less amount was utilised in the year 1969-70 than in the earlier year viz. 69 per-cent on all major heads together. Expenditure incurred under the major head Agril. Programmes, and Transport and Communication showed percentage increase of 113% and 149% resp. in the year 1969-70 as compared to 1968-69. However under Co-operation and Community Development, Irrigation and Power Industry and Mining Social Services and Miscellaneous only 57, 13 97 and 55 and 21 percent expenditure was booked in the year 1969-70 when compared with the previous years expenditure. The decrease in expenditure under Irrigation and Power- Rural electrification is significant as this expenditure related to normal development only and the special programme taken up on large scale with the assistance of Agriculture Finance Corporation is not included in the district plan. Also relatively less emphasis was given on the programmes of coop. and C.D. and Social services.

The annual per capita expenditure in Third Plan was Rs. 10 and the same was increased to Rs. 19 and 22 during the Annual Plans of 1966-67 and 1967-68 resp. This per capita further rose to Rs. 27 in the year 1968-69 but declined to Rs. 19 in the subsequent year.

4.4 In the Annual Plan 1968-69 in all 100 schemes were implemented in both the State (61) and Local sector (39) of development in Satara district whereas in the year 1969-70, 52 schemes were implemented in the State sector, 27 in the local sector and thus in all 79 schemes were executed in Satara district. The no. of schemes implemented in the year 1968-69 but not implemented in 1969-70 are as follows. 14 under Agril. Programme, 2 under Coop. and C.D. 2 under Transport and 3 under social services. The following schemes were operated in both the state and local sectors.

- a) Integrated area development Small holders Scheme.
- b) Minor Irrigation Works.
- c) Financial Assistance to Industrial Societies of Handicraft workers.
- d) District Roads.
- e) Roads in hilly and backward areas.
- f) Rural Water supply.

In the state sector the following schemes were executed by more than one officer.

- 1) Minor Irrigation Works.
- 2) Contour bunding.
- 3) Reclamation of Saline and Alkaline lands.
- 4) Municipal Water Supply.

The centrally sponsored plan scheme of 1) Pulpwood species implemented in earlier years was not implemented in 1969-70. Other central sponsored schemes viz. Coop. farming, Coop. consumer's stores and family planning were included in the State plan during the year 1969-70.

4.5 :- Perusal of the above table further reveals that within the major heads and during the year 1968-69, 34 percent of the total expenditure related to Agril. Programmes, 28 percent under Social services, 28 percent under Irrigation and Power, whereas percentage of expenditure under Transport, Coop. and C.D. programme and Industry and Mining was 6, 4 and 3 respectively to the total expenditure. So also, in the year 1969-70, 55 percent of the total expenditure pertained to Agril. Programmes, 22 percent to the Social Services, 13 percent to Transport and Communications. No significant expenditure was made under Irrigation and Power (5 percent) Coop. and C.D. (3 Percent) and Industry and Mining (less than one percent). It can further be said that during the Annual Plans under review bulk expenditure was concentrated on Agril. Programmes, Rural electrification and Social Services, whereas less stress is given on coop. and C.D. and Industry and Mining schemes. This is on account of the fact that more emphasis was given on C.D. in the earlier plans and comparatively more amount is spent on division and State level schemes under Co-operation Industry etc.

4.6 In the following para's assesment of financial and physical progress achieved in the above period under the various schemes according to the sub-heads of development is attempted.

4.7 I Agril. Programmes

1) Agril. Production :- Under this sub-heads during 1968-69, 9 schemes were implemented in the State sector and 5 schemes in the local sector whereas only 5 schemes were executed 4 each in each sector in the

subsequent year. Expenditure of Rs.11.64 lakhs and Rs.13.54 lakhs was made in the reference years respectively of the above expenditure. Rs.9.92 lakhs and Rs.12.79 lakhs were incurred in 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively in the local sector and the remaining in the state sector. By implementing the schemes during the year 1968-69 1194 Qtl. of various types of improved seeds, 8287 Tons of chemical fertilisers, 699 improved implements were distributed, 247 acres brought under fruits, 20746 Tons of compost prepared and area of 352 acres was covered by green manuring. So also during 1969-70 1914 Qtl. of improved seeds of different types 8202 Tons of fertilisers were distributed and 15893 Tons of town compost prepared and 730 acres brought under green manuring and 429 acres of additional area was brought under fruits. Progress of the schemes i) Hybrid seed production. ii) Town Compost iii) Consolidation of holdings in the state sector in 1968-69 was good as all the budget grants were spent. So also in the local sector the scheme i) General Horticultural Development ii) Intensive Cultivation of food crops iii) Small holders schemes showed good progress. There was saving in expenditure in respect of the schemes of Taluka seed farms(S), Sann seed (L), Expansion of Agril. workshop (S) and crop campaign in 1968-69. This was on account of lengthy departmental procedure of payments, less demand for and response from the cultivators for sann seed etc.

During the year 1969-70, progress of all the schemes implemented under this sub head was satisfactory except the scheme of Taluka seed farms(S)

in that all the provision was utilised. The scheme of Integrated area development (Small holders scheme) was jointly operated in both the sectors in the selected areas of Karad tehsil wherein 21 Community Wells, 19 Budki wells were constructed and 175 animals were purchased.

2) Minor Irrigation :-

Three schemes in the state and 2 in the local sector were implemented under the sub head during the reference period. Progress of the schemes of i) Coop. Lift Irrigation (S) ii) Minor Irrigation Works (S & L) was good, whereas there was some balance to be spent for the schemes wells and Pump Scheme subsidy in 1968-69 due to non receipt of cases from the Land Development Bank for adjustment of subsidy amount During 1969-70. however full expenditure was spent was on all the schemes in both the sectors. During 1968-69 305 new wells were constructed, 303 pumps sets installed and 18 Bandharas were constructed due to which 700 acres of additional land was brought under irrigation in Satara district. So also in 69-70, 820 wells were constructed, 233 pumps installed and 46 bandharas constructed thus bringing 1870 acres of area under irrigation Under Coop. Lift Irrigation Schemes assistance was given to 12 societies in 1968-69 and to 18 societies in 1969-70 Expenditure of Rs.55.27 lakhs and Rs.54.59 lakhs was made in 68-69 and 69-70 respectively on the above schemes.

3) Soil Conservation :-

All the schemes executed under this programme related to the State sector. About 45 percent of the total expenditure to this Major head Agril.

Programme was incurred under the sub-head in 68-69 and more than 50 percent in 69-70. Area of 34026 and 42130 acres was bunded, 2467 and 2814 acres terraced in the period under review in Satara district. Also 11 acres of area was covered under the scheme of "Reclamation of Saline and Alkaline Lands" in Phaltan division of Satara district. However there was no scope for this scheme in Satara division as suitable compact blocks are not available and as such the allotment was surrendered. Though full financial targets were achieved for all the schemes, physical progress was slow due to non availability of typical skilled labour in the areas of Satara district for bunding and terracing. However in 1969-70 better physical progress was achieved for these schemes as compared to the year 1968-69.

4) Animal Husbandry :-

All the schemes under this sub-head pertained to the local sector. The number of schemes was reduced from 6 in 68-69 to 2 in 69-70. Progress of expenditure and physical achievements was as per schedule. During the year 68-69 62 premium bulls were supplied, 11 cattle shows and rallies held and loan was given to 8 persons for poultry in Satara district. Rs.1.67 lakhs were spent in 68-69 on the above activities and Rs.1.15 lakhs in 69-70 for construction of 4 dispensary buildings in the district and maintaining 2 veterinary aid centres already established.

5) Dairy Development :-

All the 3 schemes implemented belong to the state sector and amount of Rs.2.40 lakh and Rs.1.82 lakhs was utilised during 68-69 and 69-70 respectively. For

Govt. Milk Supply scheme Mahabaleshwar 3000 litres of Milk per day and 1250 litres was procured in the above years. The budget earmarked for purchase of vehicle was to be surrendered in 68-69 for want of certain administrative bottlenecks. Financial assistance to 21 and 35 societies and Milk federations was given in the years 68-69 and 69-70 respectively. Loans amounting to Rs. 2.00 lakhs and Rs. 1.50 lakhs were advanced in the above period to Satara and Karad Dudh Furavatha Sangh for purchase of 140 milch cattle.

6) Forests :-

All the 5 schemes were operated in the State sector. In 68-69 additional scheme of pulp wood species was implemented in this district as Central sponsored plan. Expenditure on all the schemes together was less than 30 percent in 69-70 as compared to the year 1968-69. Due to execution of various schemes respectively, 1235 acres and 175 acres of area was brought into afforestation in the above period. In 68-69, 1772 acres of land was covered under plantation of valuable trees viz. Nilgiri, Bamboo timber etc. in Satara district. Progress of all the scheme was on schedule in both the years, excepting for pulpwood species (CSP) in 68-69 and farm forestry in 69-70. The slow progress was due to non availability of new areas in Koyana catchment area in 68-69 and in 69-70 material for barbed wire fencing was not available for "farm forestry" and hence the balance was surrendered.

7) Fisheries.

Four schemes are operated under this activity in Satara district. All the grants which were insignificant were expended in both the years on all the

schemes. During 68-69 and 69-70, 1.00 and 3.43 lakhs fingerlings were stocked and 900 and 27100 Kgs of netting of fish was done. There is no much scope for the schemes of Development of Coop. fisheries and grant of loans to fishermen as there are no such institutes.

8) Warehousing and Marketing :-

Financial assistance to 6 market committees in 68-69 and to 5 A.F.M.C. in 69-70 by incurring Rs.0.07 lakhs and Rs.0.05 lakhs in the above periods respectively in the State sector.

II Cooperation and Community Development :-

1. Cooperation :-

Under this sub head during the year 68-69 all the ⁷ schemes were implemented in the state sector, whereas the no. was reduced to 6 in 69-70. As compared to the year 1968-69 the expenditure on the schemes was reduced from Rs. 4.19 lakhs to Rs. 3.78 lakhs in the year 69-70. Progress of all the schemes was satisfactory in both the years under the review as all the budget was completely exhausted. During the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 resp. ^{actively} 1 and 3 Agril. credit socys were formed and 2085 and 2100 members were added. Further, 6 new Coop. Lift Irrigation Societies were formed during 1969-70 with 175 members. During the year 68-69 the Agril. credit societies advanced Rs.3.88 crores short term, Rs.1.59 crores long term credit and medium term Rs.27 lakhs and during 69-70 Rs. 4.07 crores short term credit, Rs.1.68 crores long term credit and Rs.30 lakhs as medium term loans were advanced in Satara district. During the year 68-69 one branch of L.D.Bank was opened, assistance to 8 marketing, 10 coop farming and 6

consumers stores was given. So also in 69-70, 2 branches of Central coop. Bank, 2 branches of L.D. Bank were opened and assistance to 1 marketing ^{Society} ~~Coop.~~, 2 godowns, 3 coop. farming socys, 3 ^{Co-operative} stores and 4 labour contract societies was given.

2) Community Development :-

Under this programme in 68-69 all the 3 schemes were implemented in the local sector whereas only 2 schemes were executed in the year 69-70. As compared to the year 68-69 only more than 50 percent expenditure was made in 69-70 on these schemes. Full allotment was utilised in both years for all the schemes. All the area in the district has already been brought under C. D. programme is extended to Karad and Khatav blocks of this district. Longback, Applied Nutrition Programme is extended to Karad and Khatav blocks of this district in 10 villages each. In 68-69 Rural works programme was in execution in seven blocks of Satara district and 44 bundharas and 69 miles of roads were completed. The scheme is not taken up in the year 69-70.

III. Irrigation and Power :-

Under this programme the scheme of Rural Electrification was executed by M.S.E.B. Only 10 percent of expenditure was made in 69-70 as compared to that of the year 68-69. During the above two years period 119 and 8 villages were resp. ^{actively} electrified and 1762 and 251 Agril. pumps were energised. In the year 69-70 large scale programme is under-taken by Agril. Finance corporation, wherein 1157 Agril. pumps were energised in Satara district.

IV) Industry and Mining Development of

Small Scale Industries :-

During the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 under this sub-head one scheme was implemented in the Satate

sector and two schemes in the local sector in Satara district. The scheme of "Financial Assistance to the Industrial Coop. Societies including coop^{eratives} of handicraft workers" is executed in both the sectors. During the above period resp^{ective} Rs. 1.05 lakhs and Rs. 1.02 lakhs were spent under the programme. During 68-69 assistance to 2 weavers' societies, 98 Industrial Societies was rendered and loans were advanced to 29 persons under the scheme of "State Aid to Industries Rules". So also in 69-70 assistance was given to one weavers' society, 6 industrial cooperatives and 55 loanees under the S.A.I. rules; by utilising all the allotted grants.

v) Transport and Communications:-

About 150 percent of expenditure was made on the schemes of Road development during 69-70 when compared to the expenditure of 1968-69. The schemes of "District Roads" and "Roads in hilly and backward areas" were implemented in both the sectors whereas the schemes of "Village Roads" and "Railway safety works" in the local sector, During the period under review resp^{ectively} 23 and 34 miles of new roads were constructed, 2 bridges built in 68-69 and 85 and 58 miles of rural roads were constructed. Progress of all the schemes was as per schedule in both the years. However the schemes of "Railway safety works" could not be implemented for want of requisite details from the Railway authorities regarding construction of manned quarters at railway crossings.

VI) Social Services :-

1) General Education :-

In Satara district under this sub-head during 1968-69 7 schemes were executed (2 in State and 5 in

local sector) Only 40 percent of the expenditure booked in 68-69 was incurred 69-70. During 1968-69 progress of expenditure was very good as the same was in excess of the sanctioned grants in respect of a few schemes (Expansion of Primary education and Development of non Govt. Secondary schools in local sector), where a little saving was there for the schemes of "Free education to sons and daughters of primary teachers" and "Educational concessions to E.B.C. pupils" 671 primary teachers and one A.A.D.E.I. were appointed during 68-69, 623 teachers trained for basic education by giving loans stipends etc. 10 secondary schools were developed and building grants to 8 institutes were given Benefit of free education to Primary teachers sons' was taken by 1330 students and E.B.C. 630 students in the district. Assistance to 3 technical high schools were given. During 69-70 also excess expenditure was registered and the physical progress was satisfactory. During the year 245 teachers and one A.D.E.I. were appointed, 56 teachers trained for basic education and resp. ^{effectively} 13.00 and 550 individuals took benefit of the schemes of E.B.C. and free education 5 non Govt. secondary schools were assisted and building grants was given to 2 institutes and for 3 technical high schools in Satara district assistance was given. 115 school rooms were constructed. The scheme to eradicate illiteracy was executed in the district and 84000 adults were made literate. During the period of review resp. ^{effectively} 6 and 8 new primary schools, 6 and 7 secondary schools were started and 6240 and 5230 pupils were increased in primary and 2637 and 3239 in the secondary schools.

2) Technical Education :-

Only two schemes viz. Development of Govt. Polytechnic at Karad and const^{uction} of hostel buildings at Karad was implemented in Satara district in both the years. As compared to the expenditure spent in 68-69 only 20 percent ^{of} the expenditure was incurred in 69-70. Financial and physical progress was as per schedule.

3) Health and Family Planning :-

Under this programme, in both the years 2 schemes were implemented in the State sector and 3 in the local sector. About 25 percent more expenditure was made in 69-70 when compared to that of the year 1968-69. Progress of all the schemes was on the schedule except for the schemes of P.H. Centres, National Small pox eradication and family planning wherein full grants could not be utilised in 68-69 and 69-70 also excess expenditure was made in respect of National Malaria eradication scheme. 5786 and 10368 operations were performed in the reference period. So work of T.B. clinic in General Hospital Satara, electrification and const^{uction} of primary health sub centres was in progress. During the above period resp^{ectively} 5 and 9 Doctors and 10 and 12 nurses were appointed.

4) Water Supply and Drainage :-

Under this sub-head of development the schemes of "Govt. Municipal and Rural Water Supply" was executed in Satara district in both the years. Rural water supply scheme is operated in both the sectors; and on these schemes amount of Rs. 22.12 lakhs in 68-69 and Rs. 14.11 in 69-70 was spent. 2 Govt. water supply schemes

and 2 Municipal schemes are practically completed and two new works are taken up ^{of} scheme ^{of} underground drainage at Karad is in progress. As regards Rural Water Supply schemes in the State sector works of Lonar Patanr schemes is completed and new work taken up at Umbraj. In the local sector, the scheme is operated in two parts viz. well scheme and Piped Water Supply. During the years 68-69 and 69-70, 180 and 82 well works and 21 and 9 Piped Water Supply works were completed, and respectively 112 and 126 villages in Satara district were benefited.

5) Housing :-

During 68-69, 3 schemes were implemented in state and one in local sector, whereas in 69-70 only 3 schemes were operated in the State sector and village housing projects scheme was dropped. About 50 percent of expenditure was made in 69-70 in comparison to the year 68-69. Work of 192 tenements at Satara Road is completed and that for 296 tenements at Karad is in progress under "Subsidised Industrial Housing" scheme. Under V.H. Projects 169 houses were completed in 68-69 and under gaathan extension scheme, work is undertaken in 7 villa-
covering
-ges ^{of} 56 acres. In 69-70, however only one scheme "Subsidised Industrial Housing" was operated.

6) Urban Development :-

Only one scheme "Implementation of Development Plans by local bodies" was implemented in the State sector in both the years by expending Rs.0.06 lakhs and Rs. 0.63 lakhs resp. ^{ectively} Assistance to Karad and Satara municipal councils was given under the scheme.

7) Backward class Welfare :-

Under this programme during the year 68-69 3 schemes were undertaken in the State and 9 in the local sector, whereas only one scheme in the State and 8 schemes in the local sector were executed in the year 69-70 in Satara district. Even less than 10 percent of expenditure was made in 69-70 as compared to the earlier year on these schemes. All the grants were fully used in both the years. During 68-69, 1624 individuals took the benefit of tuition fees etc. to B.C.S. and O.B.Cs., grants given to 24 B.C. hostels and 200 compolitan hostels, 2 Balwadies, building grants to 2 B.C. hostels and education concessions given to Vimukt Jatis for 62 students. During 69-70 360 individuals took benefit of scheme of Tuition fees to B.C.S. and O.B.Cs., 25 individuals benefited for Development of land to B.C.S. and 41 students under concessions to V.Js. 10 societies were assisted for share capital contribution to mixed coop. of SC/ST/OBC, 8 irrigation wells were constructed and 2 V.Ps. were assisted for purchase of wheels, harrows etc.

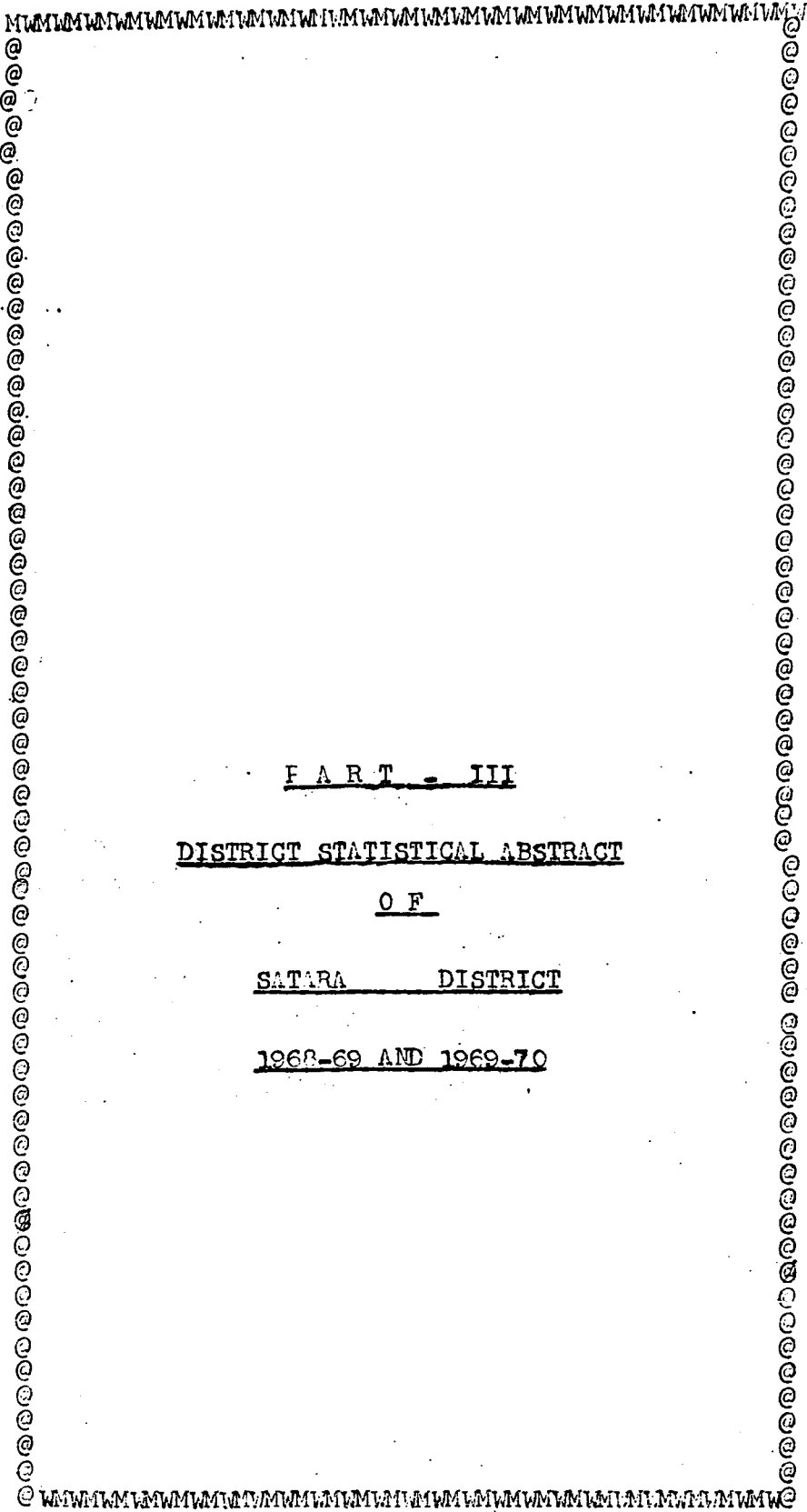
8) Labour and Labour Welfare :-

Under this scheme of Technical and vocation training was implemented in the Industrial Training Institute at Karad and Satara with the intake capacity of 440 and 448 seats resp^{ectively}. In 69-70 only 25 percent of expenditure as compared to that of 68-69 was booked for this scheme for purchase of equipment etc. and constructional activities of Additional workshop at Karad and Satara. This was due to the fact that the budget provision for the year 69-70 was less when compared with the year 68-69 and that was spent in excess.

9) Rural Broadcasting :-

This scheme was implemented in the State sector in the reference period of the review and amount of Rs. 0.61 lakhs and Rs. 0.13 lakhs was spent in the years 68-69 and 69-70 resp^{ectively} for installing 121 and 200 radio sets in the district. Progress of the scheme was slow due to non availability of adequate staff and vehicle in 68-69. The progress in 69-70 is on the schedule

From the foregoing narration of financial and physical progress of the district level plan schemes implemented in the state and local sector of Satara district in the Annual Plans of 68-69 and 69-70, it can be summarised in general that practically full allotted provisions were utilised in both the sectors and assigned physical targets were achieved. If the progress of the three years 67-68, 68-69 and 69-70 is reviewed relatively more expenditure was incurred in the year 68-69 and in 69-70. However, the pace of expenditure declined to some extent in 69-70. Moreover the allotment in 69-70 was also less.
