CHAPTER - I

I N T R O D U C T I O N .

1.1 Ratnagiri District is a part of Konkan strip running north to south of the Western coast of India and lies between $15^{\circ} - 36'$ and $18^{\circ} - 50'$ north latitudes and $73^{\circ} - 50'$ and $74 - 36'$ east long longitude. The ranges of Sahyadri in the east and the Arabian sea on the west dominate the make up of this district. The district has a north south length of about 288 k.m. It has an average east west extension of about 64 k.m. except in its extremities. It has a coast line of about 320 k.m. The streams which flow from the Sahyadri towards the sea have formed basins at places between the hill ranges and the coastal plains.

The district is surrounded by Kolaba district at Sahyadri hills and beyond Sahyadri, the north, Satara and Kolhapur districts in the east, Goa in the south, and Arabian Sea towards the west. Sawantwadi Taluk of Ratnagiri district forms the last tip of Maharashtra, beyond which, Union territory of Goa starts.

Ratnagiri is bestowed with the vast unbounded sea with its swinging waves on the one side and the high, tough and grand mountains of Sahyadri with its deep green vallies and thick forest on the other side, In between, the picturesque Ratnagiri, with its tall and majestic betle nut and coconut trees, groves of mango orchards and cashewnut

plantation, green rice fields and vast meadows looks like Kashmir of Maharashtra.

1.2 AREA, POPULATION AND ADMINISTRATIVE SET UP:

This is a lengthwise district, the area of which comes to 12,905 sq. k.m. and its total population as per 1961 census is 18,27,203. The midterm population estimate as per the Census Hand Book of the district is 19.66 lakhs. In Bombay division excluding greater Bombay this district ranks second in terms of population and area. In Maharashtra State as a whole Ratnagiri district ranks ninth by size and fourth by population. In terms of percentage, this district accounts for 4.2 percent of area and 4.6 percent of population of the State. Ratnagiri district contains the largest number of Tahasils in the whole of Maharashtra. Formerly there were 4 Mahals and 11 Tahasils. But, recently these 4 Mahals namely Lanja, Kankawali, Kudal and Vengurla have been upgraded to Tahasils and therefore, now there are in all 15 Tahasils. There are 1,516 inhabited villages and 13 urban towns out of which only 7 have Municipal Councils at Khed, Chiplun, Ratnagiri, Rajapur, Malwan, Vengurla and Sawantwadi. There are no territorial changes in the district during the years under report.

1.3 GENERAL SOCIO ECONOMIC FEATURES:

With a view to promote development of democratic institutions and to secure greater measure of participation by the people in Development plans and in local and Governmental affairs by decentralisation of powers and functions, a Zilla Parishad and 15 Panchayat Samities have been established in the district in the year 1962 under the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities Act

of 1962. The areas under the jurisdiction of the Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities correspond to the district and Tahasils boundaries except in the case of Municipal towns which are not covered by them. Six towns, viz. Dapoli camp, Dabhol, Harnai, Pophali Nate and Redi which do not have municipalities but which are treated as towns in the 1961 Census are, however, included under the jurisdiction of the Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samitis concerned. The Zilla Parishad headed by its President is responsible for rural development at the district level. At the Tahasil level, the 15 Panchayat Samitis with 15 elected Chairmen with the Secretarial assistance of the Block Development Officer, preside over the working of the 15 Panchayat Samitis. The number of villages, no. of non-municipal towns and population included in Zilla Parishad as per 1961 Census is as below:-

114 TOPOGRAPHY:

By topographic conditions the district can be divided into three main parts 'i) The eastern hilly areas of the Sahyadris and its offshoots, (ii) the plateau surfaces which are used for cereal crops like rice and ragi, and (iii) the coastal plains where coconut and betelnuts gardens and fishing are the main feature. Over 85% of the land surface is hilly. The main range of the Sahyadris forms the eastern boundary of the district. There are the steep and forbidding scraps of the main Sahyadris. In the centre are the transversal chains of small hills which project from the main range and develop higher elevation in the middle portions, where they are parallel to each other. On the slopes of these hills are situated the rice and varkas lands. In the basins of the rivers are located garden soils. The coastal alluvium strips are deep sandy loams. The inundation of the sea has created salty lands in many places..

1.5 HILLS, RIVER SYSTEM AND SOIL :

Generally, the eastern part of the District is hilly. The drainage of the District is mostly parallel. The major rivers receive their waters from the Sahyadrian main range and flow westwards to the Arabian sea, through deep well cut channels. In the length they seldom exceed forty miles. Each of them however, has a small drainage area and hence they are of small size and volume. Their intensely seasonal regime is yet another limitation to their economic use.

Out of the 22 rivers flowing through the district seven are major and navigable in some parts of the district during fair season. Parts of these rivers are tidal. The Socio Economic Review and district Statistical Abstract of 1962-64 contains detail information of the rivers in the district.

SOILS:

The predominant soils in the district are laterite soils. They vary in colour from bright red to brownish red owing to the preponderance of hydrated iron oxides. They are always acidic and lime is deficient or almost absent. They are fairly well supplied with nitrogen and organic matter, their texture is loamy and depth varies from one foot to three feet. They are porous and not retentive of moisture and are found all over the district except in Mandagand Tahasil. These soils are found in several grades, some of special significance are given below:-

(i) Rice soils and (ii) Warkas Soils:- These are situated on the slopes of the hills and are partly eroded, yellowish red and poor in fertility. They are shallow in depth and coarse in texture. Ragi (Nagli) is the principal crop in these soils. Cashewnut grows in plenty in this area. It is

grown. iii) Garden soils: They are located in the basins at the bottom of hill ranges and are fairly fertile. Arecanut and coconut gardens thrive well in these soils.

iv) Coastal Alluviums: The coastal strips in Dapoli, Guhagar, Ratnagiri and Rajapur Tahasils are deep sandy loams and coconut gardens and arecanut gardens thrive well in them.

v) Salty lands:- Due to the inundation of the sea, a part of coastal soils has become salty. They are locally known as 'Khar' or 'Khajan'. In Deogad, Malwan and Vengurla Tahasils the entire western strips are salty while in other coastal Tahasils only salt patches are to be noticed.

1.6. CLIMATE, TEMPERATURE AND RAINFALL:

Ratnagiri, being a coastal district, it has a temperate climate. The temperature does not vary in day and night and even from season to season, unlike the districts which are remote from the sea. The climate generally is sultry and never extreme and on the whole healthy. The maximum temperature in the hot season which was 33.5 in May 1969 at its minimum 18.8 in the month of January 1969. The span of the year is generally divided into summer, rainy and winter seasons. Summer starts by March and ends by mid June. After a few days of very hot weather the rains start. The rainy season continues upto September. After the October hit is over, winter starts and ends by February. The winter days are pleasant due to modest winds.

Rainfall:-

Ratnagiri being on the right side of Sāhyadri receives heavy rainfall. The coastal Tahasils received on an average 2222.4mm. and 2009.3 mm rainfall during 1968 and 1969 respectively. The Tahasils which are rather situated on

the regions or in between ranges of the Sahyadri mountain for example Chiplun, received 2706.4 and 2666.7 m.m. rainfall during the same period. The district has assured rainfall. The Following table gives the total rainfall in Ratnagiri district for the year 1968 & 1969 in mm,

Scarcities, Natural Calamities etc:

This district did not have any scarcity and famine during the years under review. However in the year 1967-68

the State was affected by a major calamity when the earthquake racked Koyana Nagar and the surrounding areas in the early hours of 11th December, 1967 affecting over 1,600 villages in Satara, Ratnagiri, Sengali and Kolhapur districts. Considerable damage was caused to roads, bridges, culverts and other construction. Assistance in the form of cash and kind was given by the Collector, Ratnagiri to the people to resettle the affected.

1.7 SPECIAL FEATURES:

The following special features of the district are worth noting.

1) Of all the districts in the Bombay Division, Ratnagiri district seems to be favourably placed in regard to supply of some of important minerals. The major minerals are the manganese ore, iron ore, salt, bauxite, mica, chromite, mangrove tile type clay and silica sand.

2) The district is one of the most important maritime district in Maharashtra with a coastal belt extending upto about 320 km. Marine fishery is naturally an important economic activity in the district. There are two allweather ports. The area is rich in fish. The programme of mechanisation of fishing boats has become very popular. There are fish curing yards run by the department, where facilities to cure fish in salt are provided to fishermen. Age old practice of fishing by sail craft, difficulties of communication, transport etc. are some of the responsible factors for under exploitation of the vast natural resources.

In 1961 Census, 11,841 persons were reported as engaged in fishing as principal work. They are scattered

in ~~the~~ villages. Though transport facilities are inadequate, a major portion of the fish caught is transported to Bombay and towns like Kolha ur, Belgaum. There is also good local demand. There were 430 mechanised fishing boats ~~in~~ _____ mechanised fishing boats in the district at the end of March 1970.

3) Mangoes and Cashewnuts are important cash crops of the district. The Government has taken up special schemes to encourage the setting up of large scale plantation of these crops. Cashewnuts are exported to abroad. The Alphanso mango ^{world renowned} is ~~known~~ for its lasts.

4) The Koyana Hydro electric Project generates its electricity at Pophali which is in Chiplun Tahasil of this district.

5) Sindhudurga, Vijaydurg, Suvarnadurga etc forts of Maharashtra are situated in this district. In addition, Gowallot near Chiplun, Mandgangad Fattegad in Dapoli Tahasil, Mahipatgad in Khed, Jangali Jaygad in Chiplun etc. are famous mountaineous forts.

6) Rajapur Ganga is a natural phenominon no where noticed. The Ganga water springs of its own accord every after 3 years and continuous for about 60 days. People from far away places come there to have a dip in the holy water.

Sanpatipule, Karneshwar near Sangameshwar, Parshuram near Chiplun, Dhutpapeswar near Rajapur and Kankeshwar near Deogad are the famous temples of this district.

7) Its beauty, Ratnagiri exceeds all other parts of Maharashtra. The sea with its unfathomable depth embraces

~~this district with its himalayan tides.~~ On the Other side, the Sahyadri stands like a sage blessing this district with plentiful rains. The tall betelnut and coconut trees raise their heads high the green meadows and paddy fields look beautiful.

8. The district has produced great national leaders like the Late Lokmanya Tilak who was born and brought up in Ratnagiri. Dr. Baba Saheb Ambedkar, Gopal Krishna Gokhale, Maharishi Karve, R. P. Paranjape, Sane Guruji, all are born in this district. This district has also given birth to saints.

9. One important feature of this district is that it is not served by the Railways. All the traffic needs are met by road or sea transport.

10. Also there is no large scale industrial factories in the district. This has caused a continuous outflow of job seeking persons.

11. The houses in the villages in this district are not situated in compact area. Most of the villages have their different hamlets or 'wadis'.

CHAPTER II

Explanatory Note on Sources and limitations
of Statistics presented in the Statistical
Abstract.

Purpose and Scope:

This is the ~~sixth~~ ^{seventh} issue of the Statistical Abstract of this district. The purpose of publishing this Abstract is to present background statistical material on/ socio economic characteristics of the district as is possible so that the Abstract may prove useful as a reference book and for planning at the district level.

1.2 The present issue relates to the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 combined and the detailed data are published for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. Wherever possible the data for the available years are given. The Statistical data presented in these Abstract are initially compiled by various departments of the state Government, Govt. of India, Local Bodies etc. These departments usually prepare and release provisional figures for recent years. Altimately when the figures are finalized, they are slightly different from the provisional figures released elsewhere. For this reason, the data published in the Bureau's other publications viz. Statistical Abstract of Maharashtra State, Hand-Book of Basic statistics of Maharashtra State etc. Some time do not tally.

2. Area and population:

2.1 Final figures of 1961 Population Census are presented in all the tables in this section. Table No.3 gives tahasilwise area, population by sex and population per Sq. k.m. alongwith percentage variation over 1951. Table no.4

gives Tahasilwise classification of villages in Ratnagiri district according to population ranges in 1961 census. A 'Village' is a statubbrily recognized village having a defined boundary and a separate land records. Hamlets or wadis are not considered. Table No. 5 gives Tahasilwise classification of towns according to population ranges in 1961 in Ratnagiri district. For the purpose of 1961 Census, a town or an Urban area was defined as a place which has (i) a municipality, a contenment or civil lines or (ii) population of 5000 or over and at least three-fourths or more of male workers engage in non-agricultural pursuits. Table no. 6 gives number of workers and non workers in each Tahasil of Ratnagiri district according to 1961 census.

3. Climate and Rainfall:

Table No. 1 presents monthwise and centrewise normal rainfall, number of rainy days and total rainfall for the Calender year from January to December at 16 selected centres.. 15 Tahasils places have rain guages and one remaining exists at Harnai. The figures of normal rainfall are worked out on the basis of actual rainfall for the periods ranging from a minimum of five years to a maximum of eight years. As regards rainy days, a day was treated as rainy day if during the twenty four hours, the rain guage recorded the minimum of 2.5 m.m. of rainfall.

4. Agriculture:

4.1 The important statistics in the section are sub-divided into (i) Land utilization, (ii) Irrigation and (III) Area and outturn of individual crops.

Table No. 9 gives Tahasilwise land utilization under the standard heads of utilization. Against each Tahasil,

the break up of the total geographical area according to different types of land used is shown. The changes in the geographical area over years are mainly due to the progress of cadastral surveys. The area according to village papers is calculated from the village returns prepared by the village officials for revenue purpose.

Under 'Forest' are included all actually forest^{ed} area or lands classed or administered as forests under any legal enactment dealing with forests whether state owned or private. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land. Land put to non-agricultural uses stands for all lands occupied by buildings, roads and under water, e.g. river and canals and other lands put to uses other than agricultural. ~~Barren~~^{Barren} and Unculturable land covers all barren and unculturable land like mountains, deserts, etc. Land which cannot be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost, is classified as unculturable, whether such land is in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings. Permanent pastures and other grazing land cover all grazing lands, whether they are permanent pastures or not. Villages common grazing lands, grazing lands within forest areas are included under this head. Under miscellaneous tree crops and grove land not included in the net area sown but is put some agricultural use such as land under casurina trees, thatching grass, bamboo bushes and other groves for fuel etc. which are not included under 'orchards' under this category is shown

Cultivable waste includes all lands, available for cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once but not cultivated during the current year and

. contd..

last five years or more in succession. Such land may be either fallow or covered under shrubs and jungles which are not put to any use. Current fallows means cropped areas which are kept fallow during the current year. If any seeding area is not cropped again in the same year, it is also treated as current fallow. Other fallow land includes all lands which were taken up for cultivation but temporarily out of cultivation for a period not less than one year and not more than five years. The net area sown consists of net area sown with crops and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once. The gross cropped area represents the sum total of area under all crops. Table No. 10 gives tahasilwise area under different crops. Table No. 11 shows yield per hectare and out turn of principal crops. The irrigation statistics are shown in table nos. 12 to 14. Table no. 15 relates to minor irrigation data and Table no. 16 belongs to major and medium irrigation, but since there are no such projects in this district this table is blank. Table no. 17 shows agricultural wage rates at 3 selected centres in this district. The wage rate data is collected by the Senior Assistant (Statistics) when he visits the centre for his fortnightly rural retail price collection work.

The data is presented for two years 1968 and 1969. Table No. 18 gives Tahasilwise data on different types of agricultural implements as per 1966 Live Stock census.

5. Community Development Programme:

5.1 The entire rural area of the district has been covered by Community Development Programme. Table Nos. 69, 70 and 71 gives information about C.D. Programme, expenditure

incurred in different stages of Blocks and physical achievements on selected items. The information in the later tables is furnished for the year 1968-69 and 1969-70. The tables show achievements through other departmental activities also besides under C. D. Programme..

6. Animal Husbandry:

Tables 20^{to} 23 give data regarding veterinary statistics i.e. statistics of Livestock in each tahasil, hospitals and dispensaries in each Tahasil, diseasewise livestock mortality and data of recognised slaughter houses in the district. The data of Live stock relates to the 1966 livestock Census. These are quinquennial Censuses conducted throughout the country on the uniform basis of concepts and methods of enumeration. Table No. 21 gives Tahasilwise Statistics of number of veterinary hospitals/dispensaries, no. of animals, treated, no. of animals artificially inseminated in the district.

7. Forests:

Table Nos. 24 (A) and 24(B) give the forest statistics Table No. 24(A) gives the details of area under 2 different types of forest. Information regarding forests under the control of the State Forest Department and those under the control of the State Revenue Department is shown seperately. The area under forests are classified according to legal status into reserved forests, protected forests and unclassed forest*.

8. Fisheries:

8.1 Table No. 24(C) gives curring yards wise information regarding fish quantity of fish brought for curing

at curing yards, quantity of salt issued and the quantity of fish removed.

9. Co-operation:

9.1 In all there are 8 tables for which information from the District Deputy Registrar of co-operative Societies has been obtained. Statistical information is shown separately in respect of the following groups.

1. Number of different types of co-operative Societies in the district 2. Co-operative Banks, 3. Tahasilwise Primary Agricultural credit Societies, 4. Other co-operative Societies of different types in the district, 5. Tahasilwise operation of Primary Co-operative Marketing Societies, 6. Operation of other co-operative Societies of different types in the district, 7. Tahasilwise information regarding registered money lenders.

10. Electricity:

10.1 Table No. 34 gives data regarding generation and consumption of electricity in Ratnagiri district. Table No. 35 shows number of towns and villages electrified and population covered by electrification. This information is for 1961, 1966, 1967, 1968, 1969 and 1970 March ending years.

11. Local Bodies:

11.1 Financial position regarding village Panchayats, Municipal Councils, Zilla Parishad, Ratnagiri are shown in R Tables 64, 66 and 65 A, 65 B respectively.

12. Other Tables: 12.1 There are other tables on Employment, Industry, Mining, Health, Education, Transport & Communications, Community Development, Annual Plans, Prices etc. which need no explanation and some of which are dealt with in detail at elsewhere.

CHAPTER III

This chapter deals with important selected indicators furnishing comparative study of the achievements in important selected sectors of economy.

INDICATOR NO. 1

Percentage of Gross sown area to net sown area for the year 1961-62, 1967-68 and 1968-69.

The percentage of gross cropped area over net cropped area indicates the extent of double cropped area in a year. The double cropped area is mainly due to availability of irrigation facilities. It is observed in table no. 10 of the abstract that the percentage of gross cropped area to the net cropped area slightly increased from 102.76 in the year 1967-68 to 102.79 in 1968-69.

It is observed that during the year 1968-69 percentage of gross cropped area to net cropped area was highest in Malwan Taluka being 108.48 while the minimum was found in Ratnagiri Taluka thus the range of variation comes from 100.00 to 108.48.

The comparison of data in 1968-69 with those in 1961-62 indicates that there was decrease of percentage of gross cropped area over net cropped area in the case of Khed, Guhagar Ratnagiri, Rajapur, Deogad, Malwan, Kudal and Sawantwadi while in the case of remaining talukas it had increased.

Productivity of Important Crops.

In this indicators productivity of important cropped in Ratnagiri District during the year 1961-62, 1967-68 and 1968-69 has been discussed. There is separate table in the abstract part denoting the yield rates of different crops per hectare. As compared to the year 1967-68 increased was observed during the year 1968-69 in yield rates of all crops except rice and total cereals. In this both cases the decrease was slight and not much considerable. The comparison of yield rates during 1968-69 with that during 1961-62 reveals an increase in the yield rates in case of Rice, Tur, Sugarcane and sesamum. In the case of rice slight increase was observed while this increase was considerable in case of Tur, Sugarcane, and Sesamum.

Gross Volume of Agricultural Production.

In this indicator efforts are made to discuss the gross volume of important Agricultural products in Ratnagiri District. The gross value of particular commodity has been arrived at by multiplying total output by the prices prevailing during the harvest season of the commodity. = In the below table gross value of important Agricultural commodities for the year 1961-62, 1967-68 and 1968-69 is given in crores of rupees.

It is to be seen from the table that as compared to gross value of agricultural products during 1967-68, gross value of corresponding commodities in 1968-69 recorded increase in

case of Ragi, Gur, and chillies while it is the same in the case of groundnut and Tur. However this increase was more due to increase in production rather than in prices. Similar comparison between the years 1961-62 and 1968-69 reveals that in all cases increase is observed in products but this increase was more due to increase in prices and less due to increase in production.

It is observed that area under food crops increased during the year in 1968-69 as compared to 1961-62 and 1967-68. Area under non-food crops decreased in 1968-69 as compared to 1967-68 and increased as compared to 1961-62. The decrease of non-food crops in 1968-69 as compared to 1967-68 was negligible. The percentage of total food crops to gross cropped area in 1968-69 slightly increased as compared to 1967-68, while slightly decreased as compared to 1961-62. Whereas this change

in the percentage of total non-food crops to grass cropped area in 1968-69 as compared to 1967-68 and 1961-62 was just apposite of what was in case of total food crops.

Increase in Agricultural Credit, Outstanding Dues:

This indicator furnished the increase in agricultural credit, outstanding dues, and gross value of agricultural production in Ratnagiri District.

The bulk of population in the district depends on agriculture and it is but natural that the large number of co-operative societies provide all types of facilities needed by agriculturist to improve their financial condition and production. During the year 1968-69 there were 706 Agriculture Credit Societies in the district, where as the same decreased by 14 in succeeding year. The membership also decreased from 2,13,857 to 2,10,108.

It may be observed that the amount of advances during the year 1969-70 ^{increased} considerably as compared to the figure of 1960-61 in the district. The corresponding percentage increase is also noticed in case of outstanding dues during the year 1969-70 in comparison ~~to~~ 1960-61.

I N D I C A T O R N O . 7 .

Agricultural wage rates:-

This indicators deals with the Agricultural wage rates of three selected centres in Ratnagiri District during the years 1968- and 1969.

From Table no. 17 of the Abstract it is observed that average wage rates of carpenter of Navadi centres of Sangameshwar Taluka were highest i.e. Rs. 6.17 and 5.87 in the year 1968 and 1969 respectively compared to the other two centres, Harnai and Shiroda.

The average wage rates of unskilled male field labourer at Harnai, Navadi and Shiroda centres in the district were Rs. 3.00, Rs. 3.27 and Rs. 2.50 respectively in the year 1968. As such the average wage rates in Navadi centres was highest as

compared to the remaining 2 centres. During the year 1969 the average rates of the same centre were Rs. 3.00, 3.00 and 2.78 respectively.

Live Stock per hectare of Land:-

This indicator gives the position of livestock per hectare of land in Ratnagiri District as per 1961 census and 1966 Census.

In an agricultueal country like India the importance of working cattle can scarcely be exaggerated. The livestock have an imporatan bearing on the total output of agricultural production. As agriculture is a non mechanise industry in India the cattle supply is most important motive power for almost all agricultural operation such as Ploughing, lifting of water and transport of product to the market.

The number of working bullocks in the district decreased from 3.78 to 3.37 lacks. The cultivable area of the district as a whole as ^{per} 1966 census comes to 5.16 hectares per pair of working bullocks. The cultivable area per pair of bullocks is found to be highest in Sangameshwar Taluka where as the lowest is in Vengurla Taluka. The cultivable area per pair of bullocks is varying between 3.20 and 8.48 hectares. As against total cultivable area 8.69 lacks hectares, the total bovine and ovine population in 1966 was 9.19 lacks. The bovine and ^{ovine} population per 100 hectare of cultivable land works out to 105.

I N D I C A T O R N O . 9 .

Poultry as compared to population:-

This indicator denotes the position of poultry as compared to population in Ratnagiri district.

During third plan period programme for poultry development consisting of supply of improved poultry and loans for poultry keeping was chalked out and implemented. As per the census of 1966 total no. of poultry in Ratnagiri District was 11.21 lacks as against 11.86 lacks during 1961. This indicates a decrease of 0.65 lacks over the period 1961.

It may be observed from the above that the ratio of poultry to the population as per 1966 census was highest in Lanja Taluka while the same was lowest in Deogad Tal. The range of variation was considerably wide as the maximum ratio was 748 while the minimum was 490 only.

Per capita consumption of Electricity:

This indicator denotes the per capita consumption of Electricity in Ratnagiri District during the year 1968-69 and 1969-70.

The total electricity consumption during the year 1968-69 and 1969-70 was 88.03 and 111.85 lacks K.W.H. respectively. As such percentage increase of consumption of electricity was 27.06 in the year 1969-70 over 1968-69. The per capita consumption of electricity in the District during the year 1968-69 and 1969-70 works out to 4.82 K.W.H. and 6.12 K.W.H. respectively.

According to the statistics maintained in employment exchange, the number of candidates enrolled increased in 1968-69 over 1967-68 and increased in 1969-70 over 1968-69. With the corresponding decrease in the vacancies notified.

The number of primary schools in Ratnagiri District rose from 2611 in 1960-61 to 2760 in 1969-70 and the number of pupils also increased by 24% in the year 1969-70 over 1960-61.

The number of secondary institutions in the district increased from 101 in 1960-61 to 208 in the year 1969-70 and the number of students attending these institutions increased tremendously by 138% in the year 1969-70 as compared to 1960-61. As regards higher education the number of institutions remained the same but the pupils considerably increased by 692% in the year 1969-70 in comparison to the same during 1960-61.

The total road length in the district under all categories increased by 31.73 percent during the year 1969-70. as compared to the total length during 1960-61. This increase was more prominent in case of village roads.

Increase in Banking Facilities in Proportion to Population.

This indicator denotes the increase in banking facilities in proportion to population in Ratnagiri district at the end of March 1969.

Banking facilities are very essential for development and progress of Industry and agriculture. In the year 1960-61 there were 23 scheduled Banks in the district. At the end of March 1967 there were 24 scheduled Banks and the number is increased upto 25 and 29 in the years 1967-68 and 1968-69 respectively.

The district Central Co-operative Bank plays an important role for providing banking facilities to the agriculturists in rural areas. There were 35 branches of co-operative bank in the district at the end of March 1969, while there were only 17 branches at the end of March 1961. As such, during the period of 8 years 18 new branches were opened.

The district population as per 1961 census was 18,27,203 and the number of branches of the Banks was 64. As such the average population served by one branch comes to 28550 at the end of March 1969.

It is observed from this table that the rise in prices of Bajara, Gram dal, Vanaspati, Milk, Mutton and Sugar was maximum in November 1969, whereas the prices of pulses (except gram dal) and sweet oil were maximum in November 1968. CHAPTER IV

ANNUAL PLANS 1968-69 and 1969-70

The State's Forth Five Year Plan could not be finalised upto the end of 1968-69. However, the broad objectives, which are likely to be adopted for the Forth Plan, have been kept in view in drawing up the Annual Plan for 1969-70 which is the first year of the Forth Plan (1969-74). The ~~outlay~~ outlay proposed for the Annual Plans for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 was Rs. 153.49 crores and Rs. 114 crores respectively.² Some of the centrally sponsored schemes financed entirely by the Govt. of India which have been transferred to the State Plan with effect from the year 1967-68 were still continued to be financed wholly by the Centre. These schemes have therefore been shown separately as "additional State Plan Schemes" transferred from Centrally sponsored programmes and over and above the State Plan as such.

In the preface of the Annual Plan 1969-70 it is stated that the programme for the year 1969-70 is smaller in size than that of the year 1968-69. However, within this smaller outlay care has been taken to provide adequate funds for the essential programmes relating to agricultural and industrial production, irrigation, provision of economic overheads and minimum essential social services.³

SIZE OF THE ANNUAL PLANS.

The District Annual Plans 1968-69 and 1969-70 are of the order of Rs. 525.01 lakhs and Rs. 387.55 lakhs respectively which comes to 3.43% & 3.57% of the state plan 68-69 & 69-70 respectively. The per capita expenditure of these two Annual Plans comes to Rs. 16.37 and Rs. 15.83 per head respectively.

In the series of Annual Plans since Annual plan for the year 1966-67 is the first Annual Plan it is meaningful to compare expenditure during Annual plans for the year 1968-69 &

1969-70 to the expenditure during 1966-67 instead of comparing it to expenditure in the Third Five Year Plan. From the above table, it is seen that percentage of expenditure is increased by 56 and 35 in 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively ^{under} Agricultural Programmes, by 130 and 28 respectively under Irrigation and Power, by 388 and 263 respectively under Small Scale Industries, by 69 and 53 respectively under Transport and Communication and by 142 and 108 respectively under Social Services if compared to expenditure in 1966-67. Under only one major head of co-operation and Community Development, it is decreased by 11 and 31 in 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively. Expenditure under the head 'Miscellaneous' (i.e. Information & Publicity) which was nil during previous years for 1966-67 and 1967-68, is seen at the tune of Rs. 0.85 lakhs and Rs. 0.15 lakhs during 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively. The overall expenditure percentage is increased by 75 and 36 during 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively than the year 1966-67.

During the year 1968-69, highest amount has been spent under Agricultural Programme, below next to it under Irrigation and Power, then comes Transport and Communication, Social Services, Co-operation and Community Development, Miscellaneous (i.e. Information & Publicity) and Small Scale Industries. The position in this order remains the same Except in case of Transport and Communication which was in third order in 1968-69 came up in second order in place of Irrigation and Power.

All most all the heads (except Co-operation and Community Development) the expenditure is on rising trend during

both the years under review if compared to the first year of Annual Plan 1966-67.

Now we turn to the budget provisions made and expenditure incurred under main heads of development for these two years under review. The following table shows this.

It will be seen from the above table that the expenditure of Annual Plan for 1969-70 of this district is smaller than the previous Annual Plan like the State Plan.

The highest priority has been given to Transport and Communication and next comes Agricultural Programme, Irrigation Power, Social Services, Co-operation and Community Development, Miscellaneous (i.e. Information and Publicity) and Small Scale Industries in 1968-69 and 1969-70.

Now we turn to the salient features of the economic and

key programmes included in the Annual Plans 1968-69 and 1969-70 as indicated in the following paragraphs.

:AGRICULTURAL PROGRAMMES:

As in the past, the programmes for agriculture production have been assigned the highest priority in Annual Plan 1968-69, as agriculture and allied programmes occupy the prime birth in the developmental efforts envisaged. Out of the total outlay of Rs. 525.01 lahs, Rs. 260.28 lakhs or about 50% of the total outlay has been year marked for the programmes relating to irrigation and electrification of agriculture pumps during the agriculture and allied programmes including 1968-69. But during the year 1969-70, out of total outlay of Rs. 371.63 lakhs, Rs. 171.67 lakhs or about 46% of the total outlay has been year marked for the programmes relating to agriculture and allied programmes including irrigation and power. The main planks of these programmes are of high yielding varieties as below:-

- 1) Ensuing arrangements for the production and distribution of essential supplies like fertilisers, improved seeds, agricultural machinery and implements.
- 2) Undertaking and promoting development programmes such as irrigation, terracing of land and reclamation of Khar and Khajan land.
- 3) Undertaking measures for increasing the efficiency of factors of production through agricultural education.
- 4) Fishery Development: Undertaking institutional reforms by encouraging institutional finance with a view to create conditions conducive to greater investment in agriculture.

Various important schemes such as Horticultural Development, Agricultural School, scheme for small Holders, Minor Irrigation Works, Schemes for Terracing of Land and Reclamation of Khar and Khajan Land, Town Milk Supply Scheme,

Plantation of Bamboos and Tree species Mechanization of Fishing crafts, Improvement of fishing boats, preservation, Transport and Marketing of Fish, Supply of Fishery Requisites etc, have been implemented under Agriculture and Allied Programmes.

There is no canal irrigation in this district. The main sources of irrigation are gravitation flow on Kachha Bandharas and lift irrigation in some areas of Rajapur and Deorukh Tahasils. Though the percentage of area under high yeildings varieties programme to total area under paddy is low the popularity of adoption of high yeilding varieties is steadily increasing.

The main difficulties in the increasing of area under high yeilding area the raifed fields, the rains being uneven, cultivators do not usefull~~ly~~ dozes of fertilizers for kharif crop. Assured water supply by way of irrigation is one of the solutions for this difficulty. ~~ix~~ Another difficulty isthat the area being of hills and dales, slight rains cut off a large number of villages situated in the interior and render transport of fertilizers impos~~ible~~.

:HORTICULTURAL DEVELOPMENT:

Annual Plan 1969-70 State -- " The imprtance of quality fruits and vegetables in th human diet for their nutritive value is well known. Such crops also provide subsidiary accu-
pation to a number of cultivators who do not raise normal food crops. Schemes were introduced in the post for development of fruit production in the State such as provision of financial Assistance for planting new orchards, rejuvenating old ones and establishm nt of nurseries which could supply sufficient planting materials such as seeds and seedlings. An organisa-
tion under the Horticultural Development Officer has been established to give guidance and technical advice to the

cultivators in raising their existing out puts of orchards and or undertaking new Cultivation.

Annual plan 1966-67 states -- " Horticultural development is of importance for the economic development of certain parts of the State like Konkan, ~~and~~ from being a rich source of supplementary diet A special organization for this programme has been created under the Joint Director of Agriculture (Horticulture) at the State, Divisional and District levels. A special scheme for development of horticulture in konkan areas has also been implemented during the third plan? The emphasis is reflected in the Annual Plan 1967-68. It says, " In the third plan a total outlay of Rs. 247 lakhs was provided for horticultural development of which Rs. 226.50 lakhs were earmarked for the konkan region where the potential for the horticultural development of fruits like Cashewnut, mangoes, coconuts and arecanuts is high. The scale of assistance for horticulture was liberalised by raising the limits of loan amount for different fruit crops, grant of subsidies to the fruit growers for seedlings, nitrogenous fertilizers and pesticides. Small nurseries ~~fx~~ have been established at all seed farms having irrigation facilities for meeting the increasing demand of the farmers for the planting material. The coverage under the Scheme during the Third Plan was as follows:.

Ratnagiri district in the Third Plan period. An expenditure of Rs. 5.98 lakhs was incurred on the scheme in Ratnagiri District during 1966-67 mainly on loans for raising different fruit crops. During 1967-68, the expenditure on this scheme was Rs. 15.16 lakhs. An amount of Rs. 9.00 lakhs was provided as loans to cyclone affected fruit growers in Ratnagiri dist. for rehabilitating orchards¹.

During the years under review provisions of Rs. 15.93 lakhs and Rs. 47.04 lakhs for Annual Plans 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively were made for Horticulture Development. It was proposed to undertake new plantation on an area of 10,860 hectares and 12502 hectares in 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively and rejuvenation on another 364 Hactares and 405 hectares in 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively. Against this proposed target set up for the district, an area 5712 hectares and 5743 hectares was covered under new plantation during 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively, and 364 hectares and 532 hectares were rejuvenated during 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively. In this way horticulture has been the major plank and a reliving feature. A special Horticulture Development Officer is posted at Ratnagiri who looks after the whole of Konkan district.

LAND DEVELOPMENT:

Ratnagiri District is situated in between the Sahyadri ranges on the one hand and the Arabian sea on the other. The slope of Sahyadri makes the drain of water precarious and has been a problem of Soil erosion.

Conservation since pre - historic days. In the older days, the area was thickly wooded and the soil was naturally conserved but since the private forest is indiscriminately being cut, the problem of soil conservation has been a major one in the district. The Annual Plan 1969-70 Part-I says "Constant erosion of the soil due to unregulated flow of excess rainfall or absence of vegetation cover renders the soil unproductive after some time. A special board named Khar Land Development Board has been constituted to reclaim Khar Lands which has gone out of use due to ingress of sea. Yet, another scheme entitled Land Development-cum-Horticulture which envisages soil conservation measures simultaneously with plantation of cashew trees on the hilly slopes in Konkan and western ghats, is becoming popular in those parts". Under terracing which is generally resorted to on hilly slopes an area of 425 hectares and 383 hectares was covered during 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively in this district. Apart from the area covered under new plantation under horticulture development scheme, an area of 3,883 hectares and 408 hectares was covered under new plantation under Land Development - cum - Horticulture Development scheme of Soil Conservation in 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively in this district. In Konkan in general and in Ratnagiri in particular, combination of bunding and terracing with cashewnut plantation serves as an ideal measure of Land development. An outlay of Rs. 35.38 lakhs and Rs. 39.75 lakhs was provided in the Annual Plans 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively of Ratnagiri district for the above said combined programme. Against this amount, Rs. 33.07 lakhs and Rs. 40.45 lakhs have been spent during 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively bringing 5,480 hectares and 27,004 hectares of land under this programme in 1968-69 & 69-70 respectively.

Soil conservation is an acute problem of this district which has been noted by the Govt. Accordingly Khar Land reclamation, soil conservation-cum-Horticultural development, terracing etc. Schemes are specially executed in Ratnagiri district. An area of 334 and 49 hectares in 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively has been reclaimed in this district under the scheme of reclamation of Khar Land. Out of the budget provisions of Rs. 2.00 lakhs and Rs. 2.50 lakhs made during the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively amounts of Rs. 3.17 lakhs and Rs. 2.50 lakhs have been spent under this scheme during 1968-69 and 1969-70 resptly.

There is a lot of scope for the soil conservation programme in this district. Due to high slope there is less scope for counter bunding as also the scope for terracing is not considerable as compared to total land available for soil conservation. The programme of trenching and plantation of cashewnut ^{has} got a wide scope in the district.

: II CO-OPERATION AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT :

As far as Co-operation is concerned, out of the budgeted amount of Rs. 1.98 lakhs and Rs. 1.49 lakh, Rs. 2.00 lakhs and Rs. 1.49 lakhs are spent. As for the achievement side, 2 new branches of C.F.A. have been opened, ^{one} new branches of L.D. Bank has been opened, 2 labour contract co-operative societies have been established. A short and medium term loan amounting to Rs. 187.57 lakhs and long term loan of Rs. 4.64 lakhs have been advanced during these two Annual Plans period under reference. Apart from this, subsidy to Agricultural primary societies, managerial subsidy and share capital to co-operative marketing societies have been given under various schemes of co-operation. At the end of 1969-70 there were 1047 societies with a membership of 2,85,000. Membership proportion for the district per 1,000 population in 1969-70 was 156 and

membership proportion per 100 hectares for the district in the same year, was 6.22.

As for the Primary Agricultural Credit Societies membership decreased from(*)

1969-70.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT.

"The activities under the Community Development Programme are vital to agriculture and supplement the programmes taken up under the different sectors for strengthening the rural economy. With the establishment of the Panchayat Raj institutions in 1962 at the district, block and village levels and the transfer of authority to these institutions, the people have been made partners both in the process of planning and implementing the programmes for rural development. The funds provided for the blocks under the programme are largely utilised for taking up agricultural programmes such as minor irrigation, animal husbandry, roads for linking up agricultural markets and for provision of amenities such as primary health centres, rural sanitation and adult and social education"

Community Development blocks now cover the entire rural area of the district. The district had been allotted 28.5 G.P.A. pattern blocks in the district during 1969-70. (*) 2,14,00 (1968-69) to 2,10,000 (1969-70). Total no. of primary agricultural Societies has been decreased from 706 (1968-69) to 692 (1969-70)

In the years under review Rs. 21.37 lakhs and Rs. 16.72 lakhs during 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively were spent and there were 28.50 pattern blocks which covered all the 1,516 villages and 17,18,163 rural population. All programmes like seed villages, high yielding varieties programme, intensive cultivation programmes, scheme for small holders, etc. are taken keeping generally Block as a unit.

III. IRRIGATION AND POWER:

"Expansion of irrigation from large as well as small projects is an essential condition for diversifying agriculture and increasing crop yields. The importance of irrigation as a means of stabilising agricultural yields and increasing the productivity of land needs no emphasis". It is also essential where the rainfall is uncertain though not inadequate like Ratnagiri district. Likewise electrical power is also essential for the electrical pumps sets for agricultural irrigation. Under the scheme Power Project, Rs. 104.83 lakhs and Rs. 58.20 lakhs are spent, 116 villages and 76 villages have been electrified and 177 agricultural pumps and 204 agricultural pumps have been electrified during the year 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively. Koyana Power Project is situated just near Ratnagiri. In fact the power house of Koyana is at Pimpri in Ratnagiri Taluk of this district.

At the end of the Third Plan 80 villages were electrified and 7096 kw. hours of electricity was consumed. Now at the end of Annual Plan 1969-70, 330 villages are electrified and the consumption is 11,185 k.w. hours. Consumption of domestic and industrial categories has substantially gone up. Consumption under other purpose has decreased.

IV. SMALL SCALE INDUSTRIES.

Out of the Budgeted grant of Rs. 0.45 lakhs and Rs. 0.33 lakhs, an amount of Rs. 0.39 lakhs and Rs. 0.29 lakhs has been spent during 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively for the development of small scale industries in this district. The achievements are (1) rebate to 3 weavers co-operative societies in 1968-69 and to 1 weavers's co-operative society in 1969-70 (2) Loan assistance to 81 weavers in 1968-69 and 1 weaver in 1969-70 (3) Assistance to 15 handloom co-operative society in 1968-69 and (4) Financial assistance to 3 industrial co-operative societies in 1969-70. Share capital contribution was given to 2 societies in 1969-70.

V. TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION:

It is recognised that the road system in the country should be well balanced with regard to needs of rural as well as urban areas. "Both socially and economically the transport system makes a valuable contribution to development of a state. The basic approach in drawing up the annual Plan 1968-69 is that the road and water ways and the road transport services should be developed to serve the requirements of social, industrial and economic change in an integrated manner"¹

The review of progress made in this district during two Annual Plans' period under review has been discussed in under the following two separate paragraphs.

1. During the year 1968-69, Rs. 22.87 lakhs (Out of which Rs. 10.16 lakhs was central share) have been spent under the scheme of west coast Road, under which 36.64 kms. roads were improved and 10 C.D. Works were completed. Under the scheme of District Road, Rs. 17.90 have been spent and 5.50 k.m. road was improved, 11 k.m. road was newly constructed, 58 C.D. Works completed and 1 minor bridge was completed. Under the schemes of roads of economic importance and roads in inaccessible and hilly areas and roads under public participation Rs. 11.07 were spent under which 47 C.D. Works completed, 5.15 km. road newly constructed and ¹major bridge and 1 minor bridge were completed. Under the 3 schemes of ports and harbours' development, Rs. 28.86 lakhs were spent on 117 metres break water works, 2 jetties, 1 water supply work, 1 sanitary block and 1 electrification work.

2) During the year 1969-70, Rs. 47.09 and Rs. 27.45 lakhs were spent on road development and ports and harbours' development respectively. Under road development achievements are as a) 33 Kms. new road construction, b) 5 km. roads modernisation, c) 3 bridges ~~construction~~ and d) 163 G.D. Works completion. Under development of ports and harbours, 113 metre break water works completed.

VI. SOCIAL SERVICES:

Under this major head, the following minor heads are covered. General Education, Technical Education, Health and Family Planning, Water Supply, Housing and Urban Development Welfare of Backward Classes, Social Welfare, Craftmen training and labour welfare are covered. Out of total expenditure of Rs. 48.40 lakhs and Rs. 41.54 lakhs in 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively, Rs. 20.33 lakhs and Rs. 9.26 lakhs are spent on general education which comes to 42% and 22% of the major head respectively. Health and Family Planning is also an important subject in as much as rural dispensaries and primary health centres are spread throughout the district Under Water Supply Rs. 7.56 lakhs and Rs. 11.21 lakhs are spent in 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively under which 227 wells have been completed.

VII. MISCELLANEOUS:

Under the scheme of Information and Rural Broadcasting and casting Rs. 0.85 lakhs and Rs. 0.15 lakhs have been spent/206 and 286 radio sets have been installed during 1968-69 and 1969-70 respectively.
