CHAPTER NO. I
: INTRODUCTION CHAPTER :

I. INTRODUCTION AND LOCATION :

The age long famous temple at Tuljapur town of this district enshrines the Goddess Bhavani, the popular deity of Maharashtra. The cult of Goddess is very ancient one and finds mention even in "Vedas" where she is called "Ajiti". The earliest inscriptional evidence regarding its antiquity can not go beyond 1398 A.D. The Goddess was the principal deity of 'Chhatrapati Shivaji, the other 'Chhatrapatis', and 'Peshwas' who donated quite generously to the temple. The village 'Thair' in the district is also an ancient place and was known as Tagara. It also finds^a mention by Ptolemy in his work "Periplus of Eurathrean sea" (1st Century A.D.). Here an ancient Buddhist daitya has been converted in later period in to a Brahmanical shrine by installing the image of "Goi Vishnu" and is at present known as "Trivikrama" temple. 'Thair' is also the native place of poor saint "Gora Kumbhar". The Reshtrakutas who succeeded Chalukyas of Badami in 753 A.D. has their epithet "LATTALURAPURAVARADHESA" suggesting that they were the inhabitants of Latur.

2) BOUNDARIES :

To the extreme south of Marathwada, Osmanabad district lies between 17° 35' and 18° 40' north latitude and 75° 16' and 76° 40' east longitude. Osmanabad district is bounded by part of Sholapur district on the south, Bhir district on its north, Nanded district and Bidar district of Mysore State on its east and Ahmednagar and part of Shelapur districts on its west. Sholapur city is the nearest town and it has therefore

close commercial and social ties with it. Barsi taluka in Sholapur district is almost surrounded by Osmanabad district. Nanded and Bhir towns are about 136 miles (217.61) km and 80 Miles (128.0 km) respectively away from Osmanabad town and are directly connected by State Transport Bus Service.

The Sholapur-Aurangabad road passes through the district. The Latur-Miraj railway line and the Parli-Hyderabad railway line (now included in the south central railway zone) also pass through this district. Latur is the biggest railway station in this district.

3. ADMINISTRATIVE SET UP :

Osmanabad town is the headquarters of Osmanabad district which was named after Meer Osman Ali Khan, the Nizam of Ex-Hyderabad State on the occasion of his coronation in 1910. The Original name of Osmanabad town was " Dharashiv". Naldurg was the headquarters of this district before 1861. This district was included in the Ex-Hyderabad State in 1853 and formed its part and parcel upto 1956. After States reorganization in 1956 this district was merged in bilingual Bombay State on 1st November 1956 and was subsequently included in Maharashtra State on 1st May 1960. This district formerly consisted of 1) Osmanabad 2) Ruljapur 3) Parenda 4) Bhum 5) Kalam 6) Latur 7) AUSA and 8) Umerga talukas in the erstwhile Hyderabad state to which Nilanga, Udgir and Ahmedpur talukas of former Bidar district were added after reorganization. Now consisting of 11 talukas the district is presently in Aurangabad division called as Marathwada comprising five districts viz. 1) Aurangabad

2) Parbhani 3) Nanded 4) Bhir and 5) Osmanabad. Almost all district offices of Osmanabad district are located at Osmanabad town which is situated on the bank of ^{the} river 'Bhogawati'. Yedsi is the nearest railway station about 13 miles away from Osmanabad town. Amongst the districts of Marathwada, Osmanabad has the biggest area under the Nizam's own crown Estate called 'Sarf-e-khas'. The Sarf-e-khas ' was merged with the Government area under the Sarf.e-khas (merger) regulation act in 1949. All Jagir areas were also abolished and taken over under direct government administration in the same year.

In the 1951 census, there were 19 towns, but as the definition of town was changed in the 1961 census only 13 of them were classified as towns. Amongst them included all taluka headquarters and M₁rum in Umerga taluka and Naldrug in Tuljapur taluka. Latur, Osmanabad and Udgir towns have city municipalities and the rest have town municipalities.

There are in all 1,423 revenue villages in this district of which 12 villages are merged in urban areas and 23 villages are uninhabited.

The Collector is incharge of general administration, law and order, land revenue and civil supplies. He is assisted by Resident Deputy Collector in his office and three Deputy Collectors who hold the charge of the three revenue divisions and have their headquarters at Osmanabad, Latur and Udgir respectively, Tahsildars are incharge of talukas.

4. ZILLA PARISHAD PATTERN :

The Zilla Parishad, Osmanabad came into existence on 1st May 1962. The Parishad consists of 58 members out of which 52 are elected, 4 are associated and 2 are lady coopted members.

The four associated members of the Parishad are 1) Chairman, District Marketing Society Ltd. Latur, 2) Chairman, District Industrial Co-operative Association Ltd. Latur, 3) Chairman, District Co-operative Board, Osmanabad, and 4) Chairman, District Central Co-operative Bank, Latur. The President, vice President and two chairmen incharge of different committees are amongst the elected members. The president is incharge of the Zilla Parishad meetings and standing committees. The vice president is the Chairman of Education and Finance Committees. There are three other chairmen one of them incharge of public health and works committees and the other incharge of Agriculture, Animal Husbandry, Co-operation and Industries committees and the third one incharge of social welfare committee. For administrative purposes the Chief Executive Officer is the Head of the Zilla Parishad. The Zilla Parishad consists of 11 branches. The Deputy Chief Executive Officer assists the Chief Executive Officer in the over all administration.

5) AREA :

The area of Osmanabad district is 14271.759 Sq. km. according to the figures furnished by the Surveyor General

of India which is 22.08% of the area of Marathwada and 4.69% of the area of Maharashtra State. The rural area of this district is 13,845 sq.km. and the urban area is about 426.7 sq.km. The area reported by the Director of Land Records, Maharashtra State for Osmanabad district is 14,256 sq. km. In Marathwada region, this district is next to the Aurangabad district in size. In terms of area, Osmanabad district ranks seventh among the 26 districts of Maharashtra State. The average area of a district of Marathwada works out to 13299.60 sq.km. and the average area per district in Maharashtra State is 11,799.99 sq.km.

6) TOPOGRAPHY :

A major portion of this district is laterite plateau with an average height of 2,000 feet above the sea level. This district is covered with small hills and offshoots of the Balaghat. Parts of Bhum, Ausa, Kalam, Osmanabad and Tuljapur talukas are situated on Balaghat ranges and the rest on table lands.

The district lies partly in the upper Godavari basin and partly in the Bhima basin. Ahmedpur, Udgir, Kalam, AUSA, Latur and Nilanga talukas are situated on the plateau of the Balaghat and lie in the valley of the Manjra which is an important tributary of the Godavari. Osmanabad and Umerga talukas are drained by the Terna, an important feeder of the Manjra. Parenda and parts of Bhum, Tuljapur and Umerga talukas are in the basin of the Sina river which is a tributary of the Bhima.

Of all the towns in the district, Bhim commands the highest elevation of 2,500 feet from the sea level whereas Parenda has the lowest height of 1,735 feet from the sea level. The average height of the plateau is 2,000 feet above the sea level. The low land portion to the south of the plateau lies in the Bhima basin.

7). HILLS, RIVER SYSTEM AND SOILS :

The main system of hills is the Balaghat and its offshoots from the north-west corner from Ahmednagar and stretches to the south-east. It divides the district into two portions, plateau to the north-east and low lands to the west, south-west and south. The general slope of the plateau is from South-west to north-east.

There are two broad natural zones in the district viz, 1) The Balaghat plateau drained by the Manjra and the Terna rivers and their tributaries and 2) the southern low land plain which is in the Bhima basin. The river Manjra flows on the northern border and demarcates this district from Bhir district. In addition to hill ranges the district abounds in a net work of rivulets running from all sides.

The Manjra which rises in Patoda taluka of Bhir district runs towards the east alongwith the northern boundary as far as the north eastern corner of Latur taluka where it takes a southerly direction before entering Bidar district of Mysore State. Its length in the district is about 65 miles.

The Terna flows from west to east in Osmanabad, Ausa Umerga and Nilanga talukas and meets the Manjra river near the eastern boundary of the district. The manyad is also

a tributary of the Manjra . It flows towards the north-east through Ahmedpur taluka and enters Nanded distict to meet the Manjra on the eastern bouddary of the district. The Tgwarja which drains Latur taluka joins the Manjra at Siwani village. On the western border of Parenda taluka

the Sina flows from the north to the south .The Bori flows through Tuljapur taluka and joins the Sina river lower down in Sholapur district. Even though there are a number of small rivers and revulets streaming in the district like the Bori in Tuljapur taluka or the Manyad in Ahmedpur taluka or the Bennitura in Umerga taluka or the Banganga in Bhum taluka they/ ^{remain} practically dry for most part of the year as the water from them drains out of this district from the high plateaah resulting into considerable shortage of water in the district.

The soil can be divided into 3 zones viz. 1) The eastern part consisting of Ahmedpur, Udgir and parts of Latur and Ausa talukas 2) Osmanabad, Kalam talukas and parts of Latur Ausa & Umerga talukas 3) Tuljapur , Parenda and Bhum talukas.

The first zone consists in general of light and light medium soils. They are of inferior type, not retextive of moisture and are, therefore, suitable only for the cultivation of Kharif crops. The soils in some parts of Nilanga are of laterite type.

The second zone consists of heavy soils which are more retentive of moisture. Hence rabi crops are the major crops in this area. The mountainous ranges in this zone have

formed typical strips suitable for paddy cultivation. This is a peculiarity of this zone. Eventhough the types of soil are classified above on a broad basis, varieties in soils, however, are found within the talukas and more within the zones categorised above.

The forests dotted all over the district are some what dense in Tuljapur, Kalam and Udgir talukas. They occupy too little a portion of the total land in this district which has definitely resulted in soil erosion to a large extent.

8. CLIMATE, TEMPERATURE AND RAINFALL.

As the district forms part of the Deccan Plateau, its climate is dry and is subject to extremes. The year can be divided into rainy season from middle of June to the end of September, a sultry period from about the end of September to the middle of November, winter from the middle of November to the end of January, a dry period during February and March and summer during April, May and the middle of June. Summer is in general full of gales and gusty winds. Even though the variations in temperature are large in general and the weather is subject to extremes of heat and cold, the summer season in the district is more cooler than in any other district of Marathwada region being at a higher altitude. In general the climate of Osmanabad district is considered to be bracing and salubrious.

Osmanabad district gets rains from the south-east monsoon like other districts of Deccan plateau and the rains start in the middle of June, become intense in July and cease

by the end of September. The normal-rainfall of Osmanabad district is about 812 (787 mm.) Tuljapur and Osmanabad talukas on the west usually get about 1,123 mm. or 45" of rainfall. Ausa, Umerga and Nilanga talukas usually get 1,016 mm. to 1,346 mm. or 40" to 53" of rainfall, while Parenda and Bhum talukas get near about 762 mm. to 888 mm. or 30" to 35" of rainfall. This part comes in the shadow of western Ghat and is therefore, called "rain shadow" area. Because of the low rainfall in Parenda and Bhum talukas, there is all ways a fear of scarcity and shortage of water. It may be noted that these are adjacent to Ahmednagar district, which is frequently hit by scarcity. These talukas are therefore, compared to the other talukas in Osmanabad district. The northern part of Ahmedpur talukas is also some times affected by scarcity of water. But in general, Osmanabad district is not considered as scarcity area.

The fact Finding Committee appointed by the former Government of Bombay in 1960 has reported that rain fall is not dependable in the following areas and they are likely to be affected by scarcity conditions as shown below.

CHAPTER - IIEXPLANATORY NOTES ON SCOPE AND LIMITATION OF STATISTICS
~~PRESENTED IN THE DISTRICT STATISTICAL ABSTRACT~~PURPOSE

This is the 9th issue of the District Statistical Abstract to be published since the year 1958-59. In this publication every attempt is made to include exhaustive statistics about important socio-economic indicators of the economy. The talukawise data is furnished wherever possible so as to enable the reader to have a clear picture of the achievements in different fields in different talukas of the district. The data presented in most of the tables pertains to the years 1969-70 and 1970-71. In case of a few tables where the data for the publication year is not available the data for the latest available year has been furnished.

The Statistical material presented here is mainly collected from various State as well as Central Government Offices, local bodies and other agencies. The foot notes given at the end of each table indicates the source from where the data is collected.

DISTRICT AT A GLANCE.

In this statement some broad and important particulars about the district in comparison with the divisional level figures are presented under various heads like population, agriculture, Co-operation, medical and public health, education etc. which bring forth salient features of the district. The reference periods for the figures concerning this district and Aurangabad division are mentioned against each item, as in

many cases this period is not identical. The scope and limitations of the information in this abstract is discussed in the following paragraphs.

10 CLIMATE AND RAINFALL.

The table No..1 gives monthwise information regarding rainy days and actual rainfall recorded at various tahsil head-quarters in this district . Normal rainfall recorded at each tahsil place is the average rainfall relating to that place over a long period,

II. AREA AND POPULATION :

In this section 6 tables (Table nos. from 3 to 8) are included. The various concepts and definitions adopted at the time of last census concerning village, town, worker, household etc. have been clarified in detail in the publication of the census hand book , 1961.

The table No. 3 gives talukawise figures of area, rural and urban population, density of population and variation in it in comparison to the 1951 census. The classification of villages according to population ranges as per the 1961 census in Osmanabad district is indicated in table no. 4 and 5 . In these two tables the figures of rural and urban areas are shown separately. The table no. 6 presents the talukawise figures of number of workers according to livelihood classes. The table No. 7 gives population of the district as per the 1961 census and according to age-groups, mother tongue and religion. The table no. 8. indicates talukawise scheduled castes and scheduled tribes population according to the 1961 census.

III. AGRICULTURE :

The table nos. from 9 to 19 are on agriculture and give information about land utilization, area under different crops area irrigated under different crops and by different sources, production and yield rates of principal crops, minor irrigation works, major and medium irrigation projects and agricultural wage rates etc. The data regarding famine, scarcity and agricultural implements is also given.

The table no. 9 gives utilization of land according to standard heads of utilization for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. The table No. 10 presents area under different crops while table no. 11 indicates the figures of out-turn and average yield rate per hectare of principal crops for the district. The table no. 12 shows the distribution of net irrigated area by sources of irrigation. The figures of area irrigated under principal crops of each tahsil have been shown in the table no. 13. The table no. 14 gives the number of irrigation wells in use and not in use for each tahsil. The table no. 15 deals with the data relating to minor irrigation works while the table no. 16 gives the data of major and medium irrigation works. The table no. 17 gives the information regarding agricultural wage rates for skilled and unskilled labourers in the selected centres. The table no. 18 provides the data regarding agricultural implements in each taluka as per the 1966 Livestock Census. The famine and scarcity data is shown in the table no. 19.

IV. ANIMAL HUSBANDRY :

The table No. 20 presents talukawise data relating to livestock population as enumerated at the time of quinquennial

Livestock Census, 1966 . The table No. 21 deals with the veterinary facilities available in each taluka of the district such as number of veterinary hospitals, dispensaries, aid centres etc. while the table No. 22 shows the disease-wise, live-stock mortality in Osmanabad district. The table No. 23 details out the information of the recognised slaughter houses and number of animals slaughtered in them during the period under reference.

V. FOREST

The table Nos. 24(a) and 24(b) included in this section give details of area under forest and estimates of different forest products.

VI. INDUSTRIES AND EMPLOYMENT

The factory statistics is presented in table Nos. 25, 26 and 27 which covers the following types of factories registered under Factory Act, 1948.

- 1) those factories using power and employing 10 or more workers.
- 2) those factories not using power but employing 20 or more workers.
- 3) those factories not covered by (1) and (2) above but notified by the Govt. as covered by Factories Act, 1948.

The table No. 25 presents industrywise number of working factories, the number of mandays for which they worked during the year. The average daily employment classified in columns 6 to 7 of this table relates only to factories submitting returns.

The table No. 26 presents industrywise distribution of working factories according to working strength while table No.27

gives distribution of factories according to the number of days worked. It may be noted here that the number of workers shown in these tables are the average number of workers working daily throughout the year and not the total number of workers of the register of factories. The table No. 28 indicates the registration of the candidates, vacancies notified and number of candidates placed in employment etc. whereas in table No. 29 occupational distribution of total registration and placement of employment exchange is detailed out. The table No. 30 indicates the volume of employment in different industries. The table Nos. 31 and 32 give the data of government servants as per the census conducted in the year 1966. The table No. 33 presents the data regarding annual survey of industries in Osmanabad district.

VII. ELECTRICITY :

The table Nos. 34 and 35 presents the data regarding electricity. The generation and consumption of electricity as well as the number of towns and villages covered under electrification programme are indicated in the above two tables.

VIII. CO-OPERATION :

In all eight tables are included in this section under which statistics relating to various activities of co-operative movement in the district is shown. The table No. 36 deals with different types of co-operative societies functioning in Osmanabad district. The table No. 37 shows the figures of Co-operative bank district. The table No. 38 gives the information in respect of talukawise primary agricultural credit societies. The table No. 39 presents the data regarding other co-operative societies of different types. The table No. 40 indicates the operation of primary co-operative marketing societies while table No. 41 gives the operation of different societies.

The table No. 42 indicates the operation of regulated markets. The table No. 43 shows the number of registered moneylenders in different talukas of this district and the loans advanced by them to traders and non-traders.

IX) MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH. :

In this section four tables are included. The table No. 44 indicates medical facilities available through public and public aided bodies in each taluka. The table Nos. 45 and 46 give information about vital statistics. The table No. 47 indicates the vaccination statistics and cholera inoculation.

X) EDUCATION :

There are eight tables in this section. The table No. 48 indicates literacy in each taluka according to the 1961 census. The percentage of literacy has been shown separately sexwise as well as for rural and urban areas. As the literate is defined as a person who can read and write simple letter, persons having higher education are also included in this category. The table Nos. 49 and 50 indicate the education in rural and urban areas in the district as per the 1961 Census. The number of institutions according to the types, enrolment and the teachers employed in them is given in the table No. 51. The table No. 52 gives details of benefits granted to backward class students of different categories in Osmanabad district. The table No. 53 indicates the strength of students getting benefits of free education under the scheme of "concession of free education to economically backward class students". The table No. 54 indicates the expenditure incurred on primary education by way of grants.

The table No.55 gives the classification of villages having no primary schools in different talukas of Osmanabad district.

XI) TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS.

In this section the statistics relating to various modes of transport is given. The table No. 56 gives the total length of railway route in the district according to different types of rail gauges. The surfacewise and categorywise road length is presented in table No. 57 . This table also includes the roads constructed by different agencies such as municipal councils, Zilla Parishad and the Buildings and Communications Department . The table No. 58 gives the statistics regarding number of motor vehicles in operation.

The table No. 59 gives operational statistics of the nationalised road transport according to S.T. divisions i.e. Aurangabad and Nanded divisions. The table No. 60 gives the traffic census on important roads in Osmanabad district as on May 1969 while table No. 61 presents the postal, telegraph and telephone statistics since 1961-62 to 1970-71 . The table No. 61 presents the statistics regarding rural broadcasting in Osmanabad district.

XII) LOCAL BODIES :

The statistics about local bodies such as village panchayats, municipalities and zilla parishad is presented in this section. As many as four tables are included in this section The table No. 63 deals with the income and expenditure of local bodies viz. village panchayats, Zilla Parishad and Municipalities while table No. 64 shows panchayat samitiwise income and expenditure.

Similarly, the headwise receipts and expenditure of zilla parishad is indicated in the table Nos. 65(A) & 65(B) respectively. The table No. 66 gives figures of income and expenditure for each municipal council according to different classification and sub-head.

XII) PLAN AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT :

In this section five tables are included. The table Nos. 67 and 68 give plan expenditure under different heads of development and important physical achievements during 1969-70 and 1970-71. The table No. 69 gives particulars of community development programme implemented in the district. In the table No. 70 expenditure incurred in each block is shown during different stage of development whereas physical achievements of some selected items that are achieved in each and every development blocks, in the district are detailed out in table No. 71.

XIII) PRICES

The table No. 72 deals with the monthly average retail prices of important commodities at the district headquarters for the years 1969 and 1970. In the table No. 73 price index for working classes is shown for Aurangabad and Nanded centres. The consumer price index number for working classes is based on the price level of 1961.

XIV) JUDICIAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE :

The Statistics relating to police department and judicial courts is included in this section. The table No. 74 gives the statistical data about strength of police force Whereas table No. 75 gives the crime statistics of this district for the calendar years under review. The table No. 76 gives the details of work disposed of in civil and criminal courts.

XVI) MISCELLANEOUS

This section includes nine tables. In these tables statistical material on various topics like cinema, banking offices, jointstock banks, insurance, small savings, land revenue, printing presses and general elections etc. is included.

The table No. 77 deals with the cinema statistics. The table nos. 78 and 79 give the data about banking offices and joint stock banks. The table no. 80 gives the data about insurance statistics. The table no. 81 deals with the collection of Small savings while table no. 82 deals with the land revenue statistics. The table no. 83 presents the data on number of printing presses and news papers and periodicals published in each taluka of this district, The table no. 84 gives the statistics relating to general elections held in the year 1967 and 1970. The table no. 85 is a summary of all the information contained in the District Statistical Abstract 1970-71.

The percentage of double cropped area to the net area sown in the district during the year 1961-62, was 104.04 . Indeed, the double cropped area in the district seemed to be too insignificant. The percentage, however, decreased to 103.56 in 1969-70.

Lack of adequate irrigational facilities, complete dependence of agriculture on the vagaries of nature accounted for such a low proportion of double cropping in the district.

Amongst different talukas of the district, there were wide variations as to the extent of double cropping. While Umerga taluka had the highest double cropped area i.e. 105.56% in 1969-70, Bhum, Tuljapur and Udgir accounted for a very low proportions of the same.

As can be seen from the table No. 11 given in the Abstract section of this book, the production of important staple food crops like rice, wheat, jowar showed steep shortfall in 1969-70 as compared to that in 1961-62. On the contrary, the gross value of all the commodities listed above increased remarkably despite considerable fall in the production. The occurrence of this anomaly could be attributed to the fact that the prices of almost all the agricultural commodities shot up spirally.

Indicator : Percentage of Gross Irrigated area to net irrigated area:
 No. 4 :

The percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area points at the extent of area irrigated more than once. As per the available statistics for Aurangabad division as a whole, Osmanabad district ranked second in the division in the year 1964-65.

In the table placed below net irrigated area, gross irrigated area and the percentage of later to the former is shown for 1961-62, 1965-66 and 1969-70.

Though slightly declined in 1965-66, the percentage of gross irrigated area again showed an increase in 1969-70 the percentage being 113.41. Parenda, Ahmedpur, Tuljapur and Umerga showed an increase in the percentage of gross irrigated area.

Indicator : Change in the cropping pattern :
 No. 5 :

Agriculture being the biggest contributor to the national income, changes in the pattern of cropping necessarily affect the economy as whole.

The food crops even now occupy nearly 3/4th of the area under cultivation and thus assume dominant position.

Not only that, the area recorded an increase in the year 1969-70. This recent increase in the area under food crops can be attributed to switch over to food crops from perennially irrigated cash crops like sugarcane. This switch over was caused due to scanty and untimely rains which brought continuous spell of drought conditions that spread all over the district during last two year.

The percentage of non-food crops to the total gross cropped area which was 28.07 in 1965-66, went down to 25.85 in 1969-70. These fluctuations in the percentages of food and non-food crops to the total area under cultivation over the years certainly shows that the cropping pattern of the district changes as the exigencies demand. This could be ascertained from the table placed below.

It is seen from the aforementioned table that the area under food crops showed increase in the years 1965-66 and 1969-70 than what it was in 1961-62. In the year 1965-66, though the area under food crops increased, the percentage of food crops to the gross cropped area went down from 73.05 in 1961-62 to 71.93 in 1965-66. From then onwards, it increased to 74.15 .

The area under non-food crops increased in 1965-66 than what it was in 1961-62 but decreased in 1969-70 than what it was ⁱⁿ 1965-66. The percentage of total non-food crops which was 26.95 in 1961-62 to the gross -cropped area increased to 28.07 in 1965-66 and decreased to 25.85 in 1969-70.

Increase in agricultural credit, Outstanding dues and gross value of agricultural produce :

Agricultural credit and co-operative marketing societies play vital role in the financing of different agricultural inputs such as seeds, fertilizers and different agricultural implements and also in the disposing of the final agricultural produce.

With intensive cultivation schemes on hand and the progressive methods of cultivation resorted to, the credit needs of cultivation have been on the increase continuously. These are being met with different co-operative agencies such as the District Central Co-operative Banks, the Land Development Banks and quite a good number of primary agricultural societies.

Consequently, loans advanced, dues outstanding increased enormously in the recent years. So also, the value of agricultural produce recorded increase which is direct resultant of recent increase in the prices of agricultural commodities. In the table placed below, details of agricultural credit granted and dues outstandings as at the end of 1961-62, 1965-66 and 1969-70 are given.

It is seen that the agricultural credit had increased more than four times over the years from 1961-62 to 1969-70. There was also enormous increase in outstanding dues which was approximately more than eight times for the period mentioned above.

In all the selected centres a skilled labourer gets wages between Rs. 2.75 to Rs. 7.00. The wages at Murud centre in Latur taluka were found to be high for all categories of skilled labourers. They ranged between Rs. 5.00 and Rs. 7.00. Whereas at Kingaon centre they ranged between Rs. 2.75 and Rs. 4.42.

In the unskilled category, the average wage rate of a male labourer ranged between Rs. 2.88 and Rs. 3.42 and that of a female labourer between Rs. 1.44 and Rs. 2.00. The daily wage rate of a herdsman in all the selected centres was found to be moving between Rs. 2.46 and Rs. 3.33.

Indicator Livestock per hectare of cultivable area :
 No. 8 :-

Different field operations of agricultural industry such as ploughing, sowing, weeding harvesting are carried on even today mainly with the help of bullocks and other livestock. It assumes therefore overwhelming importance.

Osmanabad district, particularly, has established its name in the field of livestock. The famous "Deoni" breed bullocks which has won so far number of prizes in the "All India Cattle Show" hails from this district. Another famous varieties of "Red Khandari" and "Khillari" are bred in the district on a large scale.

The following table gives the talukwise percentages of livestock to cultivable area for the years 1961-62, 1965-66 and 1969-70.

There is found wide variations amongst different talukas in respect of the percentage of livestock to cultivable area. While it was more in Latur, Nilanga and Udgir talukas, Pareda, Tuljapur and Kalam talukas had much less of it, in 1961-62. In 1965-66 and 1969-70, the place of Latur and Nilanga talukas was taken by Ahmedpur and Osmanabad talukas not because there was any increase in their respective percentages but because of decrease in the percentages of former two, Pareda, Kalam and Tuljapur were the lowest in 1961-62. In 1965-66 and 1969-70, Umerga, Tuljapur and Kalam were the lowest. As far as the district was concerned it is observed to have gone down considerably from 0.96% in 1961-62 to 0.85 in 1965-66 and remained constant up till 1969-70.

Indicator ; Poultry, as compared to population ;
 No. 9

Agriculture is a seasonal industry which keeps the farmers idle after the season of harvesting is over, poultry gives them employment throughout the year and serves as subsidiary source of income.

According to the 1961 Livestock Census, for a population of every one thousand persons, there were 186 poultry birds as against 102 during 1966, which showed remarkable decrease to the extent of about 45.32%. The 1966 Livestock Census placed Osmanabad district at the third rank in respect of poultry population in Aurangabad division. The talukawise position is summarised in the table below with comparative data for 1961 and 1966.

From the aforementioned table, it can be observed that in almost all the talukas, the poultry population showed a declining trend. Kalam, ranked first in 1961, had been replaced by Parenda, the proportion of which was 200 birds to per 1000 human population. Udgir taluka kept its lowest rank in both the years in this respect. The abnormal decrease occurring in the poultry population in 1966 might be attributed to the fact that "Ranikhed" disease took a heavy toll of them.

Per capita consumption of electricity :
The use of electricity in different fields has been on the increase at an abnormally high speed during the period 1965-66 & 70-71. The rate at which the consumption of electricity has been increasing, shows the speed of economic development in the district.

The per capita consumption which stood at 0.65 KWH. in 1961-62 rose to 15.08 KWH. in 1970-71. Such a faster

growth of the consumption of electricity was made possible because of implementation of the urban as also rural electrification programme in the district through successive Annual Plans.

The table placed below shows purposewise consumption of electricity in the district in the years 1961-62, 1965-66 and 1970-71.

On review of the data given in the aforementioned table, it is seen that the consumption of electricity in almost all fields, viz; domestic, industrial, commercial and public lighting recorded increase since 1965-66.

The increase in the industrial field was, however, remarkable and noteworthy. By March 1971 end, as many as 428 villages were electrified. The number was only 88 during 1965-66.

Indicator: Increase in the candidates enrolled and vacancies notified :
No. 11 :

The basic objective behind the implementation of successive five year plan is to ensure daily bread to the population by providing them with suitable work. This is being done

through employment exchanges which give suitable jobs to suitable persons.

The Employment Exchange at Osmanabad was opened in January 1961. Since then, the number of candidates enrolled was on the constant increase. In 1961-62, the number was 4845 and increased to 7479 in 1970-71 showing an overall increase of about 54.37%.

On the contrary, the number of vacancies notified showed constant decrease from 1961-62 when it was 1300 to 825 in 1970-71. The decrease in the vacancies notified accounted for about 36.54%.

Ep.12 : Increase in the indoor and outdoor patients in hospitals dispensaries /primary health centres :

There are three hospitals located in the district of which one is located at Osmanabad, and two at Latur. One of the hospitals at Latur has a pathological laboratory and radiology unit. In rest of the talu a places, there are civil dispensaries. In addition, there are as many as 15 primary health centres all of which excepting one are located at villages.

By the end of 1970, the number of indoor patients treated rose to 69,663 which was only 8617 in the year 1961. The number of outdoor patients treated though increased twice in 1965 than what it was in 1961, decreased considerably by about more than three lakhs by the end of 1970. The number of beds per lakh of population fell from 21 in 1961 to 19 $\frac{1}{2}$ in 1965 and 17 in 1970. This might be attributed to the fact that while the population was rising alarmingly at the higher rate, there was comparatively little increase in the number of beds provided.

Indicator : Increase in the number of students in different categories
No. 13 (boys and girls separately)

With the provision of free education upto primary level and grant of number of concessions, scholarships etc. to eligible students in the secondary and higher education, the number of students both boys and girls has recorded enormous increase in recent years. With the increase in the number of students, the number of teachers and institutions imparting education has also increased simultaneously.

The aforementioned facts can be substantiated by referring to the following table in which increase in the number of students and institutions is given.

In each and every item of the table, continuous increased is noticed. In case of institutions remarkable increase is observed in secondary section 1969-70 which is worked out to about 175% over the corresponding year of 1961-62. The percentage increase in the number of girls seems to be comparatively more than the boys in primary and secondary sections, while in case of higher education the percentage of boys is more in the year 1969-70, as against that in 1961-62. The increase in the number of boys was more than seven times while the number of girls increased nearly six times than what the respective figures were in 1961-62.

Indicator : Increase in road mileage per 100 square kilometre :

In recent years, the construction of roads was taken up on a large scale by the Zilla Parishad, Osmanabad. Consequently, road mileage in the district increased considerably. In 1961-62 the road mileage in the district was only 711.15 km. In 1965-66 it went up to 929.03 km. At the end of the year under report, it rose to 1723.49 km. The percentage of road mileage to the total mileage (inclusive of both roads and railways) in the year 1961-62 was only 88.73 and increased to 93.59 in 1970-71. Road mileage per 100 sq. km. was 4.98 during 1961-62. It increased to 6.51 km. during 1965-66 and 12.08 during 1970-71.

Indicator : Increase in banking facilities in proportion to
No. 15 Population :

In an economically backward district like Osmanabad, the existence of banking facilities is of utmost importance for the industrial and commercial advancement of the area. They meet increased credit requirements of different sectors of economy.

In Osmanabad district, however, there exists very few banks. At the end of 1970-71, there were only 74 branches of different scheduled and cooperative banks. The former mostly existed in the urban areas while the latter served the rural credit needs. The proportion of banks per lakh of population worked out to only 3.91. This proportion was even below normal and thus the district was ill served with the banking facilities. The population served by each bank, which was 86,920 in 1961-62 when only 17 branches existed reduced to 25,577 in 1970-71. To the expanding credit needs of agriculture, industry and commercial sector, even this too was inadequate and insufficient. More branches need to be opened in future.

Indicator
No. 16 : Prices :

The importance of prices in a developing economy having inflationary trends like ours need hardly to be emphasized. Osmanabad district, suffered great set back in 1969-70 and 1970-71 due to failure of crops. Drought prevailed in the district consecutively during 1969-70 and 1970-71. Most of the essential articles of daily consumption became scarce, and on many occasions were conspicuous by their absence in the market. The prices shot up alarmingly. The impact on the economy of the

district was adverse and the funds which could have been used in the development activities had to be diverted for famine and relief works.

From the table placed below it is seen that the prices of most of the commodities had increased during the year under report. The rise was more remarkable in case of gram (whole) groundnut oil, gram dal, dolda vanaspati, dry chillies etc;.

CHAPTER - IV: PLANNING :

The year 1970-71 ^{was} the second year of the Fourth Five year Plan. The Fourth Plan was still not finalised with the result that the Fourth Plan of the Maharashtra State could not be finalised and the programmes thereunder could not be indicated in their decisive forms. The Annual Plan for 1970-71 was therefore prepared and implemented with budget provisions fixed for different development schemes in Osmanabad district as ^{the} was done in/preceding years.

Almost all the development schemes which had made their appearance in the last year Annual Plan were also included in the Annual Plan, 1970-71, in Osmanabad district. They consisted of schemes implemented in the state as well as in the local sectors, In addition, some centrally sponsored schemes were also implmented along with the aforementioned schemes.

An amount of Rs. 238.562 lakhs was earmarked by way of budget provision for the Annual Plan of the year 1970-71. The expenditure during the period under reference, however, exceeded the budget provision and amounted to Rs. 272.294 lakhs.

The major heads of development on which the amount so set aside was spent during 1970-71 are 1) agricultural programme , 2) Co-operation and community development, 3) Industry and mining, 4) Transport and communications 5) Social services and 6) Miscellaneous.

In the table that is given below headwise expenditure in the state and local sectors ~~with~~ with their percentages to the ~~total~~ expenditure is detailed out .

" Agricultural Programme " received the top priority and maximum amount of expenditure was incurred on this head. Of the total budget provision of Rs. 238.562 lakhs for the Annual Plan as a whole Rs. 118.212 were set aside for this head of development alone. The expenditure on this head amounted to Rs. 139.38 lakhs which exceeded the budget provision earmarked for it and was 51.91% to total expenditure incurred during the plan period under reference .

The " Social Services ", another major head of development, with its 36.62% of the expenditure to the total expenditure was next in order. As against the budget provision of Rs. 88.369 lakhs. Rs. 99.170 were spent. Amongst the rest, transport and communications", "co-operation and community development ", " Industry and mining " accounted for 8.44 % 3.37% and 0.29% respectively of the total expenditure incurred during the plan period under report.

In the following paragraphs a brief account of expenditure incurred on each sub head of different major heads of development is discussed.

AGRICULTURAL PROGRAMME.

The progress of development in all aspects of economy depends on the successes achieved in the field of agriculture as agriculture is the mainstay of the majority of population. It is quite natural therefore that the Agriculture should have received the top most priority while allocating financial resources of the Annual Plan of Osmanabad district for 1970-71 amongst different heads of development.

The expenditure incurred and the physical targets achieved under different sub-head of the major head " Agricultural programme " during the Annual Plan period of 1970-71 are detailed below.

AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTION

For this sub-head, the budget provision that was earmarked amounted to Rs. 4.919 lakhs of which Rs. 4.660 lakhs were spent, the percentage of expenditure being 94.7. The main physical achievements under it are mentioned below.

As many as 57.85 hectares of area was ploughed with the help of tractor. Town compost fertiliser was prepared to the tune of 10,635 tonnes. Sunn seed to the extent of 21.30 quintals was distributed for green manuring and the green manuring was actually taken in 214 acres. Under the plant protection scheme seed treatment and field treatment measures were conducted in 177105 and 110850 acres respectively. Under " Mass plant protection " scheme, dusting operation were carried on cotton and groundnut in 246 and 8,308 hectares respectively. As many as 544 field demonstrations under the " Intensive cultivation scheme " were held. In addition ten multicrop demonstrations were also held. So also under " intensive cultivation programme of food crops ", intensive cultivation was practised in respect of hybrid jowar, hybrid bajra, maize, paddy, wheat and pulses. The acreage of intensive cultivation of the aforementioned crops together, calculated to 3,82,250 acres.

SOIL CONSERVATION

For an increased agricultural production, the retention of fertility of the soil is a prima-facis requirement. One of the effective ways of retaining the fertility of the soil is to adopt soil conservation measures viz bunding etc. This programme was initially taken up in the Third Five Year plan and was continued further even during the year under report. The budget provision for the adoption of soil conservation measures in the district during 1970-71 was Rs. 63.600 lakhs. The actual expenditure, however, amounted to Rs. 70.055 which exceeded the budget provision.

Under this programme as many as 39,477 hectares of area was counter bunded and 35.38 hectares of saline and alkali land together was reclaimed.

MINOR IRRIGATION

In due consideration of the magnitude of the problem of water shortage, a budget provision to the extent of Rs. 44.360 lakhs was made in Osmanabad district for the construction of wells, tanks and bandharas. The actual expenditure however, exceeded the budget provision and amounted to Rs. 58.347 lakhs.

Under this scheme the work of construction of as many as 17 bandharas with an irrigation potential of 2,1500 acres and other two bandharas, in addition, was completed. The construction work of seven other bandharas was in progress. Moreover, subsidy was granted for the construction of 368 irrigation wells as also for installation of as many as 480 pumping sets. In the local sector too, some minor irrigation works were constructed which created an irrigation potential of 1000 acres.

ANIMAL HUSBANDRY :

For the development of animal husbandry in the district, financial provision totalling Rs. 17,500 was made during 1970-71. The expenditure incurred under this item amounted to Rs. 16,800 much of which was incurred for the continuance of veterinary aid centres.

AYACUT DEVELOPMENT :

The budget set aside for this scheme was of the order of Rs. 4.840 lakhs. The actual expenditure incurred however, amounted to Rs. 5.757 lakhs. The ayacut works implemented in the district covered an area of 1280.74 acres during the period under reference.

DAIRY DEVELOPMENT :

Of the budget provision of Rs. 34,400 an amount of only 1,200 was spent during the period under reference under the above scheme. Managerial subsidy to only one society was granted .

FOREST :

In Osmanabad district, different schemes have been implemented during the period under reference. An amount of Rs. 10,400 was spent . An area of about 20 hectares each under afforestation and new plantation was covered. So also the work of IIInd year plantation in 40 hectares was reported to be completed during the period 1970-71.

FISHERIES :

Under this sub head, an amount of Rs. 22,000 was spent . As many as 5,97,500 fingerlings were stocked in the impounded waters. The fish netted out weighed approximately 54,048 Kg. during the same period.

Government is also assisting financially as also technically to the development of pisciculture. Government granted loan to five fishermen in the district. The organization of fishery cooperative were also encouraged by giving managerial subsidy to the existing fishery cooperatives and by contributing to share capital of newly formed societies. One society was given managerial subsidy while two were assisted with share capital contribution.

WAREHOUSING AND MARKETING :

The development of warehousing has not only increased the profits of the agriculturists but also has proved an indirect boon to the agricultural production. The linkage of credit with marketing and warehousing facilities has reduced the role of middlemen to minimum possible extent and has helped to ensure a steady supply of money to the farmers through-out the year which enables them to carry out their day to day operations in the field without financial stringency.

During the year 1970-71, the total expenditure incurred under this sub-head was to the tune of Rs. 4600/-. Only subsidy for initial expenses to six market yards was granted under this scheme during the period under reference.

CO-OPERATION

Under this head, an amount of Rs. 1.778 lakhs was spent during 1970-71. For strengthening cooperative structure of the district, S.T.O. and M.T.O. loans to the tune of Rs. 5.82 crores and L.T.O. loans to the extent of Rs. 2.28 crores were advanced to the Central Financing Agency. As many as 16 branches of Central Financing Agency were granted

subsidy and four new branches were opened during 1970-71. Primary marketing societies which were entrusted with the marketing of agricultural produce, handed food grains valued at Rs. 1.12 crores. Four labour contract societies were organised. Share capital contribution was given to three labour contract societies. Management and guidance subsidy was granted to four and three respectively. Four labour contract societies were assisted financially for the purchase of tools and equipment.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

The total expenditure incurred under this head amounted to Rs. 7.415 lakhs. This was incurred, mainly for continuance and maintenance of the development blocks which was already in existence and operating.

INDUSTRY AND MINING

Osmanabad district is predominantly agricultural and favours the growth of agro-based industries in the district. There are two sugar factories, one at Dhoki (Osmanabad taluka) and the other at Killari (Ausa taluka) and a number of oil mills spread all over the district. There is, however, a scope for the development of small industries in the district which are rapidly coming up with the active assistance and guidance of the government.

Under this major head an amount of Rs. 81,300/- was incurred, much of which was spent for the development of industrial cooperative societies. The main achievements are that five industrial cooperative societies were given contribution to their share capital. As many as ten industrial societies were granted loans as also subsidy.

TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS :

Transport and Communications is one of the most important pre-requisites of economic development. For sustained and unhindered growth, roads and other means of communications are very essential. In the district Rs.22.965 lakhs were spent during 1970-71 on this major head. Roads of all categories to the extent of about 47.60 Km. were constructed during 1970-71. The construction work of one bridge was completed and the work of another one was in progress.

SOCIAL SERVICES:

Provision of free education, public health, housing, water supply are some of the social services. Government being a welfare state, is striving hard to provide these facilities to the public. Under this major head an expenditure of Rs. 99.71 lakhs was incurred during the Annual Plan period of 1970-71. This is the major head on which government has been spending maximum amounts next only to agriculture. The expenditure incurred and physical achievement made under each sub-head of the major head "Social Services" are discussed below.

GENERAL EDUCATION :

Under this sub head an expenditure of Rs. 36.772 lakhs was incurred during 1970-71. To expand primary education appointments as many as 664 teachers were made. Forty rooms in different primary schools were constructed. As many as 22 non-government middle schools were given aid for their development and expansion. As many as 41 additional standards were opened in secondary schools with the result that 62 additional teachers were appointed. In the schemes of upgradation of primary and middle school, appointment of 39 teachers, 13 clerks and 26 peons were made. Thirteen new schools were upgraded. Scholarship was awarded to 120 students from middle and high schools. Loan scholarship under elementary teachers training scheme was awarded to as many as 365 teachers. Under the scheme

of concession to economically backward class students, as many as 4432 students took the benefit. So also, concession was also given to as many as 183 eligible children of primary teachers.

EDUCATION TECHNICAL :

Under this sub head an expenditure of Rs. 13.005 lakhs was incurred during 1970-71. The construction work of main building and hostel, at Latur was in progress during the period under reference .

PUBLIC HEALTH :

The total expenditure under this sub head amounted to Rs. 27,000. Two centrally sponsored schemes viz; National Malaria eradication programme and family planning were also implemented in the district on which an amount of Rs. 15.043 lakh was spent. Eradication of Malaria disease was achieved in Osmanabad , Bhoom, Parendia Kalam, Latur, Ausa Umerga and Nilanga talukas of the district. Under the national programme of Family Planning, 5,637 cases of sterilization were made. In addition, 318 cases of I.U.C.D. were also done. As many as 6,227 contraceptives were also distributed.

WATER SUPPLY

Under this sub-head, an amount of Rs. 46.253 lakhs was spent during 1970-71. Of the 12 municipal water supply works six were complete and the work of rest was in progress. As many as 13 piped water supply works were undertaken in different villages the construction work of all of which was in progress during 1970-71. In addition, 139 drinking water wells were also constructed in the district during 1970-71.

URBAN DEVELOPMENT

The total expenditure under this sub head was Rs. 1.088 lakhs. Two municipal councils were assisted financially by giving them grant in aid.

HOUSING :

An amount of Rs. 1.410 lakhs was spent under this sub head. The scheme of extension of village goathan was extended to 78 villages in which an area of about 176 acres was acquired.

WELFARE OF BACKWARD CLASSES.

The total expenditure incurred under this sub head amounted to Rs. 45,700.

As many as 1,144 backward class students were granted scholarship, tuition fees, examination fees etc. Financial grants were also given to four backward class hostels. Financial aid by way of grants was also given to three cooperative societies of backward class, schedule tribes and other backward classes. Under the centrally sponsored scheme of "exemption from tuition fees and award of scholarship to vimukta Jatis", 215 students took the benefit. Three labour contract societies of Vimukta Jatis were also given financial assistance.

INFORMATION AND PUBLICITY :

Under this major head of expenditure, an amount of Rs. 24,400 was spent on the installation of community listening sets. In all, 49 such sets were installed during 1970-71.
