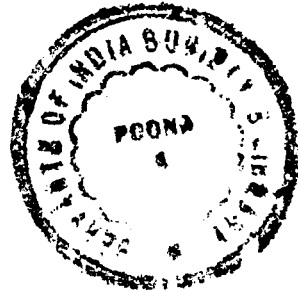

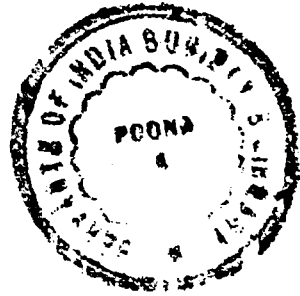

CHAPTER I

-:INTRODUCTION:-

1.1 - LOCATION :-

The Satara district lies between 17° 5' and 18° 11' north latitude and 73° 33' and 74° 54' east longitude. It is situated on the west of Deccan Plateau and is bound ^{to} by the Poona district on the north, by the Sholapur district on the east, by the Sangli district on the south, and by the districts of Kolaba and Ratnagiri on the west.

According to 1961 census the district has an area of 10437 Sq. Km. (4029.7 Sq. miles) with a population of 14.30 Lakh. The district with its head quarter at Satara town comprises of eleven tehsils.

The Satara town is located on the Poona Bangalore National Highway No. 4 with the nearest rail connection at the Satara Road Railway station of the South Central Railway at a distance of 16km. (10 miles) Work of conversion of the above South Central Railway line metre gauge/into broad gauge line is practically completed and/expected to come into operation from April 1971 or so. On this broad gauge line two new stations viz. Mahuli (near Satara town) and Jarandeshwar are being constructed in the district limits. The present Satara Road station will be mostly closed as it does not fall on the new railway route. This new broad gauge rail line is expected to accelerate the activities of Trade, Commerce, Industry, Transport etc. in the district in general and in the vicinity of Satara town in particular.

1.2 TOPOGRAPHY :-

i) SOIL :- The Soils of the district are observed to be of varied textures. In the west the soil in Mahabaleshwar, Wai, Jacli and Patan is formed from the red laterite of the ghats. It is thin and poor on the hill slopes but gets richer where natural or artificial terracing has accumulated soil with vegetable matter drained by rain waters. Rich black soil is found in the low lands of the valleys of Krishna, Venna, Kudali, Koyana and Kole rivers in Wai, Jacli, and Patan tehsils.

In the central part of the district medium to deep black alluvial soils are found. The soil in the Krishna valley bed is very black, alluvial and is highly retentive of moisture. It is very fertile in Satara and Parad tehsils.

The soils in Khandala, Man and Phaltan tehsils are poor in quality, although these are good stripes of black soil along the Nira river and its tributaries.

In the eastern part of Khandala tehsil the soil is poor, shallow and whitish but is capable of growing wheat if adequate water is available.

Towards the east, the soil is poor with the exception of wide stretches of good black soil along the numerous streams and rivers in Koregaon tehsil.

In the farthest east of the district, that is in Khatav and Man tehsils the soil is extremely poor and shallow.

Considering the district as a whole, the percentage of rich soil is very small. The soil in general is of poor quality, excepting in the river valley beds in the central part.

11) RIVERS

The Krishna is the principal river of the Satara district. It rises on the eastern brow of Mahabaleshwar Plateau, with its source at about 1371 metre above mean sea level. Several streams which flow from the vallies formed by the main hill ranges in the district make up the head waters of the Krishna river. The drainage system of the Krishna river includes, besides the drainage of central system, the drainage of seven feeders, namely, the Kudali, the Venna, the Urmodi, the Tarali and the Koyana on the right and the Vasana and The Yerala on the left. From the source, the Krishna flows for nearly 160 Km. through the Satara district and enters thereafter into the Sangli district.

Other rivers of importance in the district are the Koyana, the Venna, the Mira, the Kudali, the Urmodi, the Vasana, the Yerala and the Tarali. The Koyana is the largest feeder of the Krishna river in the district. It rises in the Mahabaleshwar plateau, runs towards South upto Helwak in the Patan tehsil where it changes its course flows towards east and falls into the Krishna at Karad. To-day the Koyana has become the most important river in the state of Maharashtra on account of the Hydro-Electric Project that is being developed over it near Helwak village. Chief tributaries of the Krishna river viz. the Mira and the Manganga flow through the district in the north. The Mira enters the Satara district from the Bhor tehsil of the Poona district. From its sources in Bhor the river runs east to the north of Wai, Khandala and Ichaltan tehsils. It later enters into the Sholapur district and falls into the Bhima. The

river Man ganga flows a length of about 64 Km. in the district and later enters into the districts of Sangli and Sholapur and ultimately falls into the Bhima near Pandharpur. These rivers go dry during summer.

iii) HILL RANGES :-

There are two main systems of hills in the Satara district. The Sahyadri range and its off-shoots and the Mahadeo range and its off-shoots. The main range of Sahyadri with a length of 96 Km. from north to south forms the western boundary of this district. The Mahadeo range starts about 16 Km. north of Mahabaleshwar and stretches east and southeast across the whole breadth of the district. From this range three spurs stretch to the south of the district. Hills in the district are very low, barren and rugged except near Mahabaleshwar and Koyana valley. The top of Mahabaleshwar the highest point in the district, is about 1436 metre above mean Sea level. Mahabaleshwar is one of the most attractive Hill stations in the state mainly due to its height and combination of several hill range spurs observed forming promontories that command magnificent views of the Sahyadri hills and the valleys below.

iv) MINERALS :-

Except for building stone, lime stone and little iron deposits in about 20 villages of Jgoli tehsil and 30 villages of Patan tehsil deposits of important minerals such as coal, bauxite, manganese silica are not known to have occurred in any part of the district. Building stone, sand of good quality and lime stone is found to be available all over the district. Good clay for bricks and tiles is found on all river banks.

1.3 CLIMATE

i) RAINFALL :- The Rainfall in the district starts by the middle of June and lasts till the end of September. The intensity of rainfall is maximum in July. Rainfall is not uniform all over the district. It is very heavy in the western region and it goes on receding towards eastern parts. The extreme western part gets over 5000 mm. rainfall while the eastern part of the Sahyadri Zone gets the rainfall between 1200 to 2000 mm. The normal rainfall recorded at Mahabaleshwar centre is 6226.3 mm. while that at Fanchangani it is 1865 mm. it is 1723 mm. at Modha and at Patan the same is 1831 mm. The central zone gets rainfall between 600 mm. to 1200 mm. Satara centre has normal rainfall of 1025 mm. At other centres it is as follows Koregaon - 706 mm., Khandala-503 mm., Wai - 710mm. and Karad- 713 mm. In the eastern zone rainfall averages below 600 mm. annually. It is as follows- Phaltan- 473 mm., Dahiwadi- 463mm. Mhawad-472 mm. and Vaduj- 512 mm.

ii) TEMPERATURE :- Monthly temperature data is available only for one station viz. Mahabaleshwar. Mahabaleshwar is located at an height of 1436 metre above mean sea level and as such the temperature data of Mahabaleshwar cannot be considered as representing the data for the whole of Satara district. The temperature at Mahabaleshwar falls down to as low as 13 centigrade in January and rises at the most to 31.5 centigrade in April. The average temperature for the year 1970 in general stands at round about 20.2 centigrade.

Speaking of the district in general, the following observations can be made. In the western Zone the climate is cool and healthy in the hot season but gets chilly during rainy season. The plains of Wai tehsil, however have temperate climate throughout the year. The warmth increases from west to east. In the central zone there is considerable heat during hot months. During winter, days are warm and nights are cool. The eastern zone experiences wide range of temperature. There are large variations in temperature in different seasons in this zone and the climate of this part is akin to that experienced in Sholapur district.

1.4 NATURAL ZONES :-

The Satara district can be broadly divided into three natural zones. viz. western, central and eastern. The western zone, bordering the Sahyadri ranges receives rainfall between 1200 mm. to 5000 mm. This zone comprises of Fatun, Jaoli, Mahabaleshwar tehsils and part of Satara and Wai tehsils. The soil in this zone is thin and poor on the hill slopes. The agricultural pursuits of this zone are similar to those of Konkan tract. Rice and Jawar are the main crops of this zone.

The central zone comprises of Koregaon and Karad tehsils and eastern parts of Satara and Wai tehsils. The area is flat and soil and rainfall are very congenial to better agricultural productions. The rainfall varies between 600 mm. to 1200 mm. per year. The soil is deep alluvial and very fertile. Jawar, Bajara, and Groundnuts are the principal crops of this zone.

The eastern zone comprises of Phaltan Khatav and Man tehsils and eastern part of Khondala tehsil. The soil

is poor and shallow, the rainfall is not certain and the annual average rainfall received by this zone is less than 600 mm. This area is prone to scarcity conditions as whatever rainfall it receives is not assured, Bajri and Jawar are the main crops of this zone.

1.5 TERRITORIAL CHANGES :-

Satara district was formed in 1848. It was then called a province and had following eleven sub-divisions. Bijapur (now in Mysore state), Jacli, Karad, Khanapur, Khatav Koregaon, Pandharpur, Satara, Tasgaon, Valva and Wai. A number of territorial changes took place in the subsequent years. Consequent upon the merger of former princely states in to the Indian Union, parts of Ihaltan, Jamkhinandi, Akkalkot, Bhor, Aundh and Sangli states and one village from Poona district were added to Satara district. A new Tehsil of Ihaltan was created, and four tehsils K. Khanapur, Tasgaon, Valva and Shirala were transferred to the newly formed Sangli district (then named as South-Satara district) with head quarters at Sangli in 1949. Satara district (then known as North Satara district) has since then the present set up of 11 tehsils. In 1958, villages Shanggaon from Khanapur tehsil of Sangli district was transferred to Karad tehsil of Satara district. The name of the district was changed from North Satara district to Satara district in 1960.

1.6 DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION :-

i) STATE ADMINISTRATION :- Until May 1962 the administrative set up of the district was under the unitary control of the district Collector. After passing of the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities Act in 1962, the administrative set up became dual.

Excepting for a few safeguards the developmental functions and administrative functions excluding matters relating to law and order, judicial functions and developmental functions involving high technical skill have been devolved on Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities, with the Chief Executive Officer as their executive head. Under Government Sector, the Collector continues to act as the district head and also as coordinating authority. The Collector who is also the District Magistrate to maintain law and order, is in charge of general administration; treasury, land revenue and civil supply. He is assisted by a Resident Deputy Collector and three Dy. Collectors, who hold charge of the three revenue divisions and have their head-quarters at Satara, Phaltan and Mahabaleshwar. The district is divided into eleven tehsils and they are in charge of the Tehsildars stationed at the tehsil head-quarters.

The Superintendent of Police heads the district police force. He is assisted by the two Dy. Superintendents stationed at Satara and Karad, below them the Sub-Inspectors are posted at Tehsil head quarters. Various branches such as crime local intelligence, Anticorruption have been evolved for efficient maintenance of law and order in the district.

On the judicial side the District and the Sessions judge is the head of the Judicial department in the district. He is assisted by two Assistant Judges and Additional Sessions Judge. For convenience of administration of justice and for the public convenience, civil judges are posted at tehsil level. They deal with both civil and criminal suits at tehsil level.

The Executive Engineer B & C Department, Satara and buildings is in charge of all roads/in the district which fall in the State Sector. The Executive Engineer (Irrigation) is in charge of all State Sector irrigation projects in the district. Besides him, there are special Executive Engineers for Irrigation and Power Projects such as Koyana Dam Project, Dhon Dam project, Vir Dam Project, Berkhal project and Pathakal project. Office of the Superintending Engineer named as D.I.C.III to supervise, coordinate and control the activities of these irrigation projects is situated at Satara.

The office of the Dy. Registrar of cooperative Societies is located at Satara. The Dy. Registrar is assisted by three Assistant Registrars having different territorial jurisdictions.

The Divisional Forest Officer, Satara has his head-quarters at Satara. The other important state sector offices located at Satara are these of Divisional Soil Conservation Officer (at Satara and Ihaltan), Consolidation Officer, Sales Tax Officer, District Employment Officer, District Industries Officer, District Statistical Officer, Publicity Officer, Superintendent of Prohibition and Excise, Civil Surgeon, Malaria Officer, District Marketing Officer, District Prison Superintendent, Principal I.T.I., Poultry Project Officer, Town Planner.

ii) CENTRAL GOVT. ADMINISTRATION:-

The Offices of Income Tax Officer, Superintendent of Central Excise and the Superintendent of Post Officers are located at Satara.

iii) LOCAL BODIES :-

Under the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities Act, Satara Zilla Parishad and eleven Panchayat Samities have been established in 1962. The area under the jurisdiction of the Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities corresponds to the district and tehsil boundaries respectively excepting the Municipal areas which are under the control of municipal councils. 97.12 percent of the district area and 89.46 percent of population of the Satara district is covered under the Zilla Parishad. They have replaced the erstwhile statutory bodies known as District Local Board, District Panchayat Mandal and District School Board.

The Zilla Parishad is headed by the President elected from the elected members. A vice president is also elected the same way. For three committees viz. 1) Works and Health Committee 2) Finance and Education Committee. 3) Agril. and Coop. Committee. Chairmen are to be elected to look after the developmental work falling under their respective jurisdiction. To carry out the administrative and executive work of the parishad an officer in the senior scale of I.A.S. works as the Chief Executive Officer of the Zilla Parishad. He is assisted by various departmental heads viz. the Agril. Developmental Officer, the District Health Officer, the District Animal Husbandry Officer, the Administrative Officer for village panchayats, the Education Officer, the Executive Engineer, cooperation and Industries Officer, Social Welfare Officer, the Chief Accounts and Finance Officer and the Dy. Chief Executive Officer for carrying out the developmental activities effectively.

At the tehsil level, Panchayat Samities have an elected chairman and vice chairman called as subhapati and Upsabhapati respectively. The Block Development Officer works as Secretary to the Panchayat Samiti. He is the administrative and executive head at tehsil level, under Zilla Parishad.

The State Govt. Officers continue to exercise technical supervision and give necessary guidance to the Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities. The State Govt. have powers to issue directions/^{to} the Zilla Parishad in respect of any works and schemes in the interest of National and State Developmental plans.

The other local bodies functioning in the district are the Municipal Councils of the 8 urban areas viz. Karad, Mahabaleshwar, Mhaswad, Panchagani, Phaltan, Rahinapur, Satara, Wai and village Panchayats at village level. The total number of village panchayats functioning at the end of March 1971 in the district is ¹⁰²⁰ under which ^{all} the villages in the district are covered.

The other statutory bodies functioning in the district are 1) the Maharashtra State Electricity Board 2) the Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation and 3) the Life Insurance Corporation. The offices of all these corporate bodies are located at Satara. A sub office of Maharashtra State Finance Corporation is recently set up at Satara to assist the industries.

State Farming Corporation has an Estate at Sakharwadi, Phaltan tehsil. Maharashtra Warehousing Corporation has established an office at Karad.

1.7 DEMOGRAPHY :-

i) General :- The Satara district ranks 13th in population and 16th in area among the 26 districts of the Maharashtra State as per 1961 census. According to this census the human population of the Satara district is about 14.30 lakhs as against 11.77 lakhs of 1951 this recording an increase of 21.5 percent in the 1951-61 decade. The net percentage increase since 1901 for the district is about 68.3.

ii) DENSITY :-

The population density of Satara district is 137 per Sq. Km. (355 per sq. mile) as per 1961 census. This is higher than the State density of 129 persons per Sq. Km.

Within the district, great variations are observed in the tehsilwise population densities. The density is low in the hilly tracts of western zone and also in the scarcity affected areas in the eastern zone. The density is 232 persons per Sq. Km. in Karad tehsil while it is 69 persons per Sq. Km. in Man tehsil. The central zone consists of rich soil and has high proportion of net sown area to geographical area and as such it has the highest density of population.

iii) SEX RATIO :-

The sex ratio is the number of females per thousand male population. The following have been the sex ratios for the Satara district.

Satara district has recorded a higher sex ratio at each census, than the State Sex ratio. This was due to out-migration of males from the district. Difference in rural urban sex ratios indicate that out-migration is much more from rural areas than urban areas of the district.

iv) LITERACY :-

The percentage of literacy increased substantially from 20.60 percent in 1951 to 33.98 percent in 1961 in the district. The female literacy rose from 6.30 percent in 1951 to 21.16 percent in 1961. The male literacy rose from 33.50 percent in 1951 to 47.41 percent in 1961.

As per 1961 census the percentage of literacy for the Satara district and the Poona Division is follow :

There has been substantial increase in the literacy in the decade 1951-61 in Satara district. The progress of female literacy particularly is a note-worthy achievement. The percentages are higher in Satara district than in Poona division. The Mass literacy campaign, the scheme of compulsory primary education and the facilities extended by the well known Rayat Shikshan Sanstha of Satara have played a significant role in achieving this progress in the field of literacy.

v) DEPENDENCY RATIO :-

The population in the age groups of 0 to 14 and 60 and above is normally dependent for their livelihood on the supporting population in the age group of 15 to 59.

15 to 50. The dependent population per 100 of supporting population, known as dependency ratio has a great economic significance. The dependency ratio for Satara district was 82.9 in 1951 and 101.6 in 1961. The corresponding ratios for the State as the whole were 79.2 and 84.9. The higher dependency ratio in Satara district is attributed to the migration of supporting population for work outside the district. It may also be due to high fertility and declining mortality. The ratio is higher in 1961 than in 1951, both in the district and in the State, indicating the fact that the supporting population has a larger load of dependent population. The load is larger in rural areas than in urban areas. The Dependency ratio was 103.5 in rural areas and 87.9 in urban areas in 1961 in Satara district. This is the result of migration of working ^{age} population from rural to urban areas and outside the district.

vi) SIZE OF HOUSEHOLDS :-

On the basis of 20 percent Sample Study the following observations regarding size of households are made.

Households with family size 4 to 6 are more common both in rural and urban areas. The single and two to three member households are more (39.58 percent) in urban areas than in rural areas (31.60 percent). The average size of the household is 5.1 in rural areas and 4.8 in urban areas of the Satara district. There are 2,76,957 households in the district as per 1961 census- 2,45,043 in rural areas and 31,914 in urban area. A little more than $\frac{1}{10}$ th of the households (11.5 percent) are in urban areas and the rest $\frac{9}{10}$ th (i.e. 88.5 percent) stay in rural areas.

vii) LIVELIHOOD CLASSIFICATION :-

Of the total population of the district, 48.42 percent population is engaged in work. Remaining 51.58 percent population is non working or dependent population (i.e. $\frac{4}{5}$ th of the working population) derives its livelihood from Agricultural pursuits while the remaining from nonagricultural activities such as construction, industry, trade and commerce transport, communication and other services. The proportion of workers dependent on agriculture in Satara district is higher than the State proportion of 72.07 percent.

The ratio of workers engaged as agricultural labourers to cultivators in the Maharashtra state is 1.2 while it is 1.7 in Satara district.

The proportion of working population dependent on non-agricultural activities for the State is 27.93 percent as against only 19.35 percent in the Satara district.

There is a marked difference in the distribution pattern for non-workers among males and females.

42.88 percent of the male non workers are full time students while the corresponding proportion for females is only 15.31. In urban areas this proportion is higher than in rural areas. The percentage of females engaged in household duties is also higher in urban areas than in rural areas. The proportion of dependents, infants and disabled is more in rural areas than in urban areas.

1.8 1971 Census :-

The decennial population census, conducted in March, April 1971 has ^{provided} some primary statistics recently. The figures are of purely ^{provisional} nature and have their own limitations. Never the less, they ^{provide} a broad trend for comparative study.

According to 1971 census, total population of Satara district is 17,20,234 comprising of 8,41,629 males and 8,78,605 females. Of the total population, 14,92,973 live in rural areas and remaining 2,27,261 in urban areas. The percentage of urban population to total population increased from 11.08 in 1961 to 13.21 in 1971. It is also seen that the decennial growth rate is more in urban areas (+ 43.45)% than in rural areas (+ 17.40)%. The total growth rate is + 20.29% and is less than the decennial growth rate for Maharashtra state (+ 27.26 %).

The density of population per Sq. Km. rose from 129 in 1961 to 163 in 1971 for the Maharashtra State while it increased from 136 to 164 for Satara district.

The sex ratio (no. of females per 1000 males) decreased from 1047 in 1961 to 1044 in 1971. The corresponding ratios for Maharashtra state are 936 and 932 respectively. The preponderance of females in Satara district is largely due to migration of the male population in search of work.

The literacy percentage for the state increased from 29.82 in 1961 to 39.06 in 1971. The literacy percentage was higher (33.98%) in Satara in 1961 than the state literacy. However, there is only a small increase in the district literacy percentage in 1971 from 33.98 to 37.98. This shows that the district is lagging behind the state in respect of literacy. Of the total 653511 literates, 4,37,267 are males and 2,16,244 are females. The literacy among males increased to 51.95 in 1971 from 47.41 in 1961, and that among females increased to 24.61 in 1971 from 21.16 in 1961, in Satara district.

Of the total population of 17,20,234 only 31.30 percent population- 5,38,451 is working population, comprising of 387541 males and 1,50,910 females. In 1961 the percentage of working population was 48.42. The decrease is noticed in all districts, The decrease is pronounced in the case of female workers, which is due to the change in the concept of the term workers' adopted in 1971. Seasonal workers who had some regular work of more than one hour a day throughout the greater part of the season were treated as workers in 1961 census. In 1971, the persons who had worked in current or last working season for the greater part of the season were treated as workers. The 1961 definition gave scope for

the inclusion of housewives who had helped in cultivation or in the household industry carried on by other family member, for an hour or more, as workers. The 1971 census instructions stipulated that a person primarily engaged in household duties or those who were students and helped in the family economic activity but not on full-time scale, should be treated as "non workers" in respect of their main activity. The basic classification of workers and non workers being in relation of main activity only. The housewives who helped in cultivation and other economic activity of the house hold only marginally do not appear to have been considered as "workers". This might explain the decrease in proportion of female cultivators in 1971 compared to 1961 data.

56.35% of the working population in 1971 in Satara district is engaged in cultivation as cultivators 13.34% as agricultural labourers and the rest 25.31% in other activities. The corresponding figures for the state as a whole are 35.09% as cultivators, 28.93% as agricultural labourers and 35.93% as other workers.

1.9 Famines and Scarcity :-

The eastern part of the Satara district is prone to scarcity conditions. According to the Fact-Finding Committee, appointed in 1960, the rainfall is not dependable in the areas of Lonand circle of Khandala tehsil, Man tehsil, southern part of the Bhaltan tehsil and Tusesavali and Vaduj circle of Khatav tehsil. The areas in Khandala and Man tehsils are likely to be affected by scarcity conditions once in six years while areas in southern part of Bhaltan and Khatav tehsils are likely to be affected once in ten years.

In recent years, it was in 1966-67 that scarcity conditions were reported in 52 villages in Dhaltan tehsil only and after a gap of 3 years scarcity conditions have hit Khandala, Dhaltan, Jacli, Koregaon, Khatav and Man tahsils in the year 1970-71. The tahsilwise no. of villages and population affected is given below.

CHAPTER II

EXPLANATORY NOTE

ON SOURCES AND LIMITATIONS OF STATISTICAL DATA PRESENTED IN THE ABSTRACT.

2.1 Purpose :-

This is the 10th issue of the District Statistical Abstract prepared by this office since 1957-58. The purpose of the issue is to provide statistical data on as many topics as possible so that the abstract may prove useful not only as an official reference book but also for research, planning and further socio economic studies. The data are presented, generally, tahsilwise to facilitate tahsilwise comparison. Where the data is not available tahsilwise, it is given for the district as a whole. The sources of the data collection are shown at the foot of each table, while unit of information is shown either in the column headings or at the right hand top corner below the Table number, concepts, sources, limitations of the data are briefly discussed below.

2.2 District at a glance:-

2.1 In this table a few general particulars and important indicators under various heads such as population agriculture etc. are given with the corresponding figures for the Poona Division.

2.2 Though 1971 census of human population is over data of 1961 are presented here in view of the fact that the 1971 census data are still in the primary processing stage and only some broad provisional figures

are given under population Tables. The data on agricul-
-ture is generally received late. The data of 1969-70
is therefore presented in this abstract. The livestock
data is based on quinquennial census taken in 1966.

2.3

Climate

Normal rainfall and monthly rainfall data
and temperature data from the selected centres in the
district are reported in Table Nos. 1 and 2 respectively.
Normal rainfall data are based on the average rainfall
over ^a day period usually 80 years where rainfall records
over such a day period are not available it may be the
average for a shorter period-in some cases even 5 years.
A day is counted as rainy day if the gauge records a
minimum of 2.5 mm. rainfall during the 24 hours of a
day. As regards temperature, Mahabaleshwar is the only
station in the district for which this data are availa-
-ble. The Directorate of the Indian Meteorological
department, Bombay supplies this data. Mahabaleshwar
is on a very high attitude of Sahyadri ranges and the
data of this centre cannot therefore be said to be re-
-presentative for the whole district. The mean-maximum
and the mean-minimum temperatures are the averages of
the maximum and minimum temperatures observed daily
during the reference period. The mean temperature is
the average of mean-maximum & mean-minimum temperature,
thus arrived at.

2.4

Area and population:-

Almost all the data on the tables 3 to 8
are based on the 1961 census data and are reproduced
from the District census Hand Book published by the
Director of Census Operations, Bombay. A few provisional

figures available from the 1971 census are shown in the supplementary table no: 3(A) The 1961 census data is shown tahsilwise, Rural-urban classification, village and town classification by population ranges, worker-non-worker distribution, age distribution, distribution by religion, language are presented in these tables.

"A town or an urban area is a place which has a municipality, a cantonment or a civil line".

A population enumerated in urban areas is urban population and the population enumerated in all other places is rural population.

A "Village" is a statutorily recognised village having a defined boundary and separate land records.

A person is classified as worker if (a) in case of seasonal work like cultivation, livestock, dairy-ing, household industry, etc. he has had some regular work of more than one hour a day throughout the greater part of the working season, and (b) in the case of regular employment in any trade, profession, service, business or commerce, he has employed during any of the fifteen days preceding the day of the enumerator's visit to the household.

A person who was working but was absent from his work during the fifteen days preceding the day on which enumerated or even exceeding the period of fifty days due to illness or other causes has been treated as a worker.

A person who has been offered work but had not actually joined has been treated as a non-worker.

A special table no. 8 is designed for data on scheduled castes and tribes.

2.5 Agriculture :-

2.5 1 The agricultural statistics of 1968-69 and 1969-70 are presented in the tables 9 to 19. Land use, crop pattern, outturn of crops, yield-rates irrigation- source and area and crops irrigated, irrigation projects, wage rates, data on agricultural implements and scarcity and famine conditions are some of the salient topics dealt with under the agricultural statistics. The data collected from the District Inspector of Land Records, Season and Crop reports are of provisional nature. The finalised data, where ever available from the Statistician, Dept. of Agriculture are reproduced in these tables. The Zilla Parishad, the Panchayat Samities, the Executive Engineers of Irrigation Projects, the Collectorate, and the Bureau of Economics & Statistics are other (useful) sources for various tables on agricultural statistics.

2.5 2 There are variations in the area figures obtained from the Survey Office and those based on village papers. The latter are sum total of data given by talathis whereas the former are calculated in blocks.

2.5 3 All lands actually afforested and lands classed and administered as forests- whether state owned or private are termed as 'forests'. If any portion of such forests is not wooded but put to agricultural use, it is shown under that appropriate head.

2.5 4 Land put to Non-agricultural uses stand for lands occupied by buildings, Roads, railways, rivers canals or other such purposes.

2.5 5 Lands which cannot be brought under cultivation except at a very high cost are classed as uncultural lands, whether in isolated blocks or in cultivated holdings.

2.5 6 Culturable waste includes all lands available for cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once but not cultivated during the current year and the last five years or more in succession.

2.5 7 Current fallow lands comprise cropped area kept fallow during the current year. Other fallows include all lands which were taken up for cultivation but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and not more than 5 years.

2.5 8 The net sown area consists of area sown with crops and orchards, area sown more than once in a year being counted only once. The gross cropped area represents sum total of area under all crops in a year. The estimates of average yields and production in respect of rice, bajari, jawar, wheat, gram, cotton, groundnut, tobacco, ragi and tur are based on the results of crop estimation surveys conducted annually by the Agriculture Department. The estimates of yields for other remaining crops are based on the anna valuation figures and normal yields reported by the Revenue Officers.

2.6 Animal husbandry, forests & fisheries :-

2.6 1 Statistics on animal husbandry, collected through the 10th quinquennial census of 1966 are reproduced in table No.20. The data collected from the District Animal Husbandry Officer, Municipal Councils on veterinary dispensaries, animal diseases, artificial

inseminations, livestock mortality, slaughter house statistics are shown in tables on this subject.

2.6 2 The Statistician, forests dept. and Divisional Forests officer provides data on forest area and forest produce. Reserved forests are those that are intended mainly for timber production and in which rights of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. In protected forests, the restrictions are not so rigid, right of grazing or cultivation is allowed but certain limitations and restrictions are imposed. The unclassed forest refers to the inaccessible forest or unoccupied waste.

2.7 Employment, Industry, Mining and Electricity:-

2.7 1 Tables 25,26,27 present data on registered factory statistics e.g. on employment, working strength of factories, days worked by the factories. The word "factories" here includes only the registered factories. They are of three types:-

- i) Factories using no power but employing 20 or more workers.
- ii) Factories using power and employing 10 or more workers, and
- iii) Factories not covered by (i) and (ii) above but notified by the Government as covered by the Factories Act.

2.7 2 Tables 28,29 and 30 are based on the data collected from the district Employment Exchange. The monthly registration of unemployed persons notification of vacancies, placements as also volume of employment by type of industry is shown in these tables.

2.7 3 Data on census of Govt. employees conducted in 1966 is repeated in Table no. 31 and 32.

2.7 4 On the basis of data collected through the Annual Survey of Industries a table is prepared on registered factories in various industry classification groups, showing their productive capital, employment, gross cut put and value added. The figures are of provisional nature and are based on actuals of reporting census sector factories and estimates of sample sector factories.

2.7 5 Tables 34 and 35 are included to show generation and consumption of electricity and towns and villages electrified in Satara District. The data is collected from the M.S.E.B. as also from the private electric companies of Satara and Karad. All the electricity is now supplied by the M.S.E.B. and no electricity is generated in the district by any private company. These private companies purchase it from The M.S.E.B. and sale the same to their consumers in Karad & Satara.

2.8 Cooperation :-

2.8 1 The Tables on cooperation (numbers 36 to 43) are compiled from the data supplied by the Dist. Dy. Registrar of Cooperative Societies and the Agricultural produce Market Committees. Statistical information is shown separately for

- i) Primary Agricultural Credit Societies.
- ii) Agricultural Non Credit Societies.
- iii) Non-agricultural credit Societies.
- iv) Non-agricultural Non-credit societies.
- v) Marketing Societies. The District central coop. Bank and the Land development Bank are covered under Agricultural Credit Societies and shown in Table No.36

Urban Banks, Salary Earners societies factory workers societies are covered under Non-Agricultural societies.

2.8 2 Working capital includes paid up capital, deposits and borrowings. The break up of loan advanced by coop. Banks is shown by the term of loan-short, medium and long term. All long term loans are given by the Land Development Bank where as both short term and medium term loans are given by Dist. Central Coop. Bank and Urban Banks. Overdue loans refer to amount of loan or installments which were due for collection but which were not actually collected and for the repayment of which no extension has been granted. The cooperative year starts in July and ends in June. Salient achievements of the coop. Societies- Such as marketing, fisheries, farming, irrigation, agricultural processing, sugar factories, consumer, housing are shown in Table No.41. Commoditywise turnover in the regulated markets is shown in the Table No. 42.

2.8 3 A separate table No. 43 is given on registered money lenders and loans advanced by them. The data are collected from the Dy. Registrar of Cooperative Societies.

2.9 Medical and Public Health :-

2.9 1 Data on medical facilities and other vital statistics such as births, deaths are shown in tables under this section. The data are collected from Civil Surgeon, Dist. Health Officer, Zilla Parishad, Municipalities and Director of Public Health, Poona.

2.9 2 Under medical facilities data are given for hospitals, dispensaries, maternity houses, Primary Health Centres, medical personnel, hospital beds as also

the no. of indoor and out door patients availing these facilities. In Table No. 45, data on births, deaths, infant deaths are recorded. Table 46 show^{is} causes of deaths occurred in the district.

2.9 3 The birth rate and death rate are given in the District at a Glance. Birth rate is the number of births per thousand estimated population of the year. Death rate is similar^{ly} the number of deaths per thousand estimated population of the year. The data on vital statistics are collected through revenue agency for rural area and for urban area it is the statutory function of Municipal Corporations and councils. The data presented on medical facilities are of State and Central Govt. institutions, institutions owned and run by municipal councils and local bodies and private aided institutions. The private clinics run by individuals are not included in these tables.

2.9 4 The year of reference for medical and health statistics is the calendar year.

2.10 Education :-

2.10 1 Salient features of the progress of education in Satara district are presented in this section. Literacy as per 1961 Census, classification of literates by educational levels, no. of educational institutions pupils, teachers by type of education, beneficiaries, educational concessions, expenditure on education by various agencies, villages without primary schooling facilities are the various subjects dealt with under the tables on education.

2.10 2 The sources of data are the 1961 Census hand book of the district, the Directorate of Education, the parishad Education Officer, Zilla Parishad, and the Shivaji University Registrar.

2.10 3 Towns and villages with a school are those which have at least a primary school within them. Villages with schooling facilities include smaller villages, generally below 300 population, which cannot be given an independent school for economic reasons and are therefore attached for schooling facility to bigger villages or to urban areas within a walking distance of one mile from them. The classification of institutions according to "Type" is slightly different from "Stage" of education. Many secondary schools impart education in primary courses. Nevertheless, the entire enrolment of students is included under secondary education. A realistic picture may be had only after obtaining the breakup of students according to standards. The pre-primary institutions i.e. the kindergartens montessorys educate the children between age 3 to 5. Primary educational institutions provides education for pre-primary and standards I-IV or I to VII/VIII or less and teach the curriculum approved by the Education Dept. Whereas Secondary institutions teach students for standards VIII to XI with or without lower standards. Higher Education is education after passing the secondary school certificate Examination, leading to degree examination.

2.10 4 The Tahsilwise break up of data on institutions, pupils, teachers in respect of pre-primary education, secondary education, and special schools could not be obtained for publication in these tables. Only

district totals are supplied. The years of references are the educational years 1969-70 and 1970-71.

2.11 Transport and Communication :-

2.11 1 Important statistics on different modes of transport, types of roads, traffic census, Posts, tele-graphs, telephones and radio licences issued and fural broadcasting are given in this section.

2.11 2 The difficulty arises in getting accurate rail length in the district. The length had to be compiled by reference to railway time tables and rail-way map. The figures presented in table No. 56 are therefore, approximate to that extent. The length is constant over years. The changes will be seen in 71-72 when the conversion of meter gauge to broad gauge is completed. The road statistics presented in table 57 are for both extra municipal roads and roads with-in municipal limits, shown separately. The statistics of motor vehicles in the district are not available separately. Therefore, the statistics of motor vehicles in Poona Region (comprising of Poona, Ahmednagar, Satara and Sholapur districts) are presented in Table No. 58. The vehicles shown are as per live register maintained by the R.T.D. Poona. Table No. 59 gives sta-tistics of nationalised Road transport of the Satara S.T. Division. The Satara S.T. Division comprises of Satara district and a part of Sangli district.

2.11. 3 The reference year for these tables is the financial year 1970-71. The data on traffic census is based on the census taken in May 1969.

2.12 Local Bodies :-

2.12. 1 Financial position of village Panchayats, Municipal Councils, and Zilla Parishad is shown in

this section for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71.

2.12 2 The number village Panchayats include number of independent village Panchayats as also group village Panchayats. The number of villages covered and their population is as per 1961 census. Income and expenditure of Village Panchayats are exclusive of opening and closing balance respectively. Grants include grants from Govt. as well as from Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities for developmental activities. Govt. grants in respect of municipal councils are mainly granted on account of dearness allowance, granted for roads, for water supply, for educational purposes. for medical purposes and on account of percentage in land revenue. The receipts of Zilla Parishad are shown under four sub-heads, viz., i) Self-raised resources, ii) Government Grants, iii) Grants for agency scheme and iv) debt section. The expenditure is shown under two heads. Revenue expenditure and debit section.

2.12 3 The data are collected from the Zilla Parishad, Satara and all the Municipal Councils in Satara district.

2.13 Annual Plan and Community Development :-

2.13.1 The Table 67 included in this Section gives details of expenditure under each sub-head of development for State and Centrally Sponsored Programme for 1969-70 and 1970-71. Important Physical achievements are given sub-head-wise in table no. 68. These data are based on the quarterly progress reports received from various implementing officers.

2.13.2 The stagewise blocks under C.D. Programme are shown in Table No. 69. while stagewise expenditure

in each tahsil is shown in Table No. 70. Physical achievements attained by these C.D. blocks are shown in Table No. 71. The data are compiled from the quarterly returns received from the Panchayat Samities in the district.

2.14 Prices :-

2.14.1 There are two Tables in this section. The first is on average retail prices of important selected commodities at the District Head Quarter Satara. The data are presented for all the months of the two consecutive calendar years 1969 and 1970.

The data are collected on every Friday from selected shops, for given specifications of the selected commodities. As such they cannot be said to be fully representative. However, the data may be useful as a broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices over a period of time.

2.14.2 In the other table the consumer price Index Number for working class of Sholapur centre is given. This Index number is applicable to Satara district.

The Index is compiled by the office of the Commissioner of Labour, Bombay.

2.15 Miscellaneous :-

As the title indicates data on other various subjects such as police, crime, court cases, theatres, Joint stock companies, Life Insurance, Small Savings etc. are presented in this section.

2.16 Trends in selected Indicators :-

Table No. 85 shows important indicators in the various fields of development such as population,

agriculture, livestock, industry, electricity, coopera-
-tion etc. Besides these, tahsilwise indicators are
worked out and appended at the end.

CHAPTER NO. III

IN ANALYTICAL REVIEW OF SECTORIAL TRENDS 1970-71

3.1 In part II of this volume statistical data available from the various fields is presented. In this chapter the data are analysed with a view to ascertaining the significant achievements in various socio-economic fields of development.

3.2 The years 1960-61, 1965-66 and 1970-71 have been considered for the analytical review. However, in the case of agriculture data regarding which are generally received late, the years of reference are 1960-61, 1965-66 and 1969-70.

3.3. Agricultural development over a period of time can best be judged from 3 main indicators. They are 1) Percentage of gross area sown to net area sown 2) Percentage of net area irrigated to net area sown. 3) Productivity of important crops.

3.4 T A B L E NO. 1

3.5 The above table shows that the percentage of gross cropped area to net cropped area was more (108) in 1960-61 as compared to the figures in 1965-66, 1968-69 and 1969-70. The position of Satara district compares favourably with that prevailing in the division. The tahsilwise comparison over these years shows that excepting Phaltan & Khatav tahesils, the double cropped area in 69-70 has declined as compared to the base year (60-61).

3.6 In 1960-61 the gross cropped area was 7.35 lakh hectares. It was 7.32 lakh hectares in 1965-66. In 1969-70 it rose to 7.52 lakh hectares. Thus it will be seen that there was little addition to the gross cropped area during the nine year period.

3.7 The range of percentages of gross cropped area to net cropped area in the tehsils of Satara district is from 102 to 115. The percentage is highest in Khandala tehsil (115%) and lowest in Karad Tehsil (102%). The percentage in Phaltan, Wai, Jacli, Koregaon, Khatav and Patan tehsils is greater than the district percentage of 107.

3.8 The gross irrigated area in the district increased from 1.01 lakh hectare in 1960-61 to 1.06 lakh hectare in 1969-70. In 1965-66 however, the irrigated area declined to 0.90 lakh hectare. The increase in the irrigated area in 1969-70 over 1960-61 is only 2 percent. In 1969-70 however the gross irrigated area was 1.06 lakh

hectare showing an increase of 4.5 percent over 1960-61 area.

3.9 The net area irrigated by different sources in the years 1960-61, 1965-66 and 1969-70 is shown below.

3.10 There is a net addition of 4.5 percent area (3736 hectare) in the net irrigated area in 1969-70 over that in 1960-61. The area irrigated by wells has increased by 10.3 percent during the corresponding period. The no. of wells in use has increased from 34340 in 1965-66 to 37016 in 1969-70. The increase is prominently seen in Wai Tehsil.

3.11 The net irrigated area figures and the net area sown figures during the three reference years are as under.

3.12 The percentage of net area irrigated to net sown area comes to 11.70, 10.29 and 11.89 in the years 1960-61, 1965-66 and 1969-70. The increase in this percentage is very small. However, the percentage for Satara district compares favourably with the corresponding percentage of Poona Division. In the Poona Division the percentage of net area irrigated to net area sown was 10.00 in 1960-61, 10.37 in 1965-66 and 10.87 in 1969-70.

3.13 Productivity of important Crops: -

The principal crops in Satara district are jowar, bajara, rice, wheat, gram, tur, groundnut, sugar-cane and cotton. The yield-rates of these crops are given below.

3.14 The yield rates in 1969-70 compare very favourably with those in 1965-66. The year 1965-66 experienced scarcity conditions therefore, the yield rates in 1965-66 were very low. The yield rates in 1969-70 also compare favourably with those in 1960-61 in respect of crops such as Rice, Bajara, Tur and Groundnut, while in the case of the remaining crops the yield rate has declined.

3.15 Changes in cropping pattern:-

The following table will broadly indicate the trend of cropping pattern in this district.

3.16 The percentage of area under food crops shows a declining trend, which in other words means there is an increase in the percentage of area under non-food crops. More than 5 percent of the cropped area has been shifted from growing food crops to non-food crops. Under the sub-head food crops, it will be seen that there was reduction in this percentage in 1969-70 over that in 1960-61 in respect of both cereals and pulses. A sharp decline is noticed in the case of Jowar crop and other pulses.

3.17 The percentage of areas under different irrigated crops to gross irrigated area, show that the percentage of total irrigated food crops has decreased from 93.56 in 1960-61 to 92.35 in 1965-66, 90.71 in 1968-69 and 91.72 in 1969-70. The percentage of irrigated non-food crops increased from 6.44 in 1960-61 to 7.65 in 1965-66, 9.29 in

1968-69 and 8.28 in 1969-70. For details, the following table is designed.

3.18 Agricultural Credit :-

The coop. societies have been playing a very important role in the field of agricultural development by extending credit facilities on an extensive scale. The credit facilities given by the agricultural credit societies and the Land Development Bank are considered here. The table below will reveal the position in nutshell.

3.19 Wage Rates :- The data on agricultural wage rates in rural areas are collected in three rural centres in Satara district since 1963-64. The centres Kale in Karad tehsil, Limb in Satara tehsil and Koregaon in Koregaon tehsil.

3.20 The wage rates are found to vary at different places, depending on the nearness to urban areas. The male field labourers are found to get wages between Rs. 2.75 to 3.50 at Kale, between Rs. 3.00 to 4.00 at Limb and Rs. 3.0 at Koregaon. The femal labourer is paid between Rs. 1.75 to 2.50 at Kale, between Rs. 1.25 to Rs. 2.00 at Limb and Rs. 2.00 at Koregaon. Data on wages of child labour is not reported at these centres.

3.21 Skilled workers such as carpenters, blacksmiths, doblers whose services are required occasionally for agricultural purposes are sometimes observed to be paid in cash. Carpenters, blacksmiths are found to earn Rs. 5.0 to Rs. 6.50 Generally they are paid on baluta system on annual basis and as such their employment in agricultural sector on daily basis is still a phenomenon not very frequently notice in rural areas.

3.22 Live stock and Poultry :-

Animal Husbandry makes a substantial contribution to the economy by providing subsidiary income to farmers, food to human population and provides overnues of employment to landless labourers. A quinquennial census of Livestock, poultry and agricultural implements is carried out all over the country. The 10th Livestock census was done in 1966.

3.23 The following data will depict tehsilwise details of livestock per 100 hectares.

3.24 It will be seen from the above table that the indicator in Jaoli tehsil is very low. It is also below district average in Mahabaleshwar, Koregaon, Khatav, Satara and Patan tehsils. As against this Khandala, Wai, Man and Karad have a fairly high number of livestock per 100 hectare and average. The district average/ of Phaltan tehsil is the same.

3.25 The number of livestock per 100 hectare for Poona Division as a whole is 116. The indicator 131 for Satara District compares favourably with that of the Division.

3.26 The total poultry in 1966 was 7,76,198 as against 6,57,771 in 1961. The human population according to 1961 census for Satara District was 14,30,105. The poultry per 100 population was 460 in 1961 and 543 in 1966.

The comparative ratios for Poona Division are 344 for 1961 and 394 for 1966. (Population assumed to be constant)

3.27 Consumption of Electricity :-

In 1960-61 the per capita consumption of electricity was 4.53 kwh in Satara district. In 1970-71 the per capita consumption was 35.40 kwh. The per capita electricity consumption in Poona Division was 28.03 kwh in 1969-70. The consumption is comparatively very poor in Satara district, indirectly its backwardness.

3.28 All urban areas in the Satara district have been electrified. In rural areas there ^{are} 1175 villages. Till 60-61 only 30 villages were electrified. By 1965-66, 186 villages were electrified. As at the end of 1969-70, the total no. of villages electrified was 445 and 484 as at the end of 70-71. This works out to 41 percent of the total villages in the district.

3.29 Enrollment in the Employment Exchange & Vacancies notified :-

The statistics available with the District Employment Exchange on this subject throws light on the gravity of unemployment situation in general. A large portion of unemployed labour force does not avail of the services of the employment exchange. This comprises mostly of uneducated masses and unskilled agricultural labour, who are either not at all employed throughout the year or are seasonally employed. Statistics of such unemployment is not reflected in the data of the Employment Exchange. The data available with the Employment Exchange, Satara are presented in the following table.

3.30 Enrollment of candidates at the employment exchange is 20 percent higher in 1970-71 than that in 1965-66. However, the percentage of notified vacancies to total registration during 1970-71 declined to ¹³ percent from 28% in 1960-61. In the year 1970-71 only 992 vacancies were notified as against 1288 in 1969-70 and 1823 in 60-61

3.31 Increase in indoor and outdoor patients treated

The medical facilities are being availed of by increasing numbers of patients year after year through public and public aided bodies in this district. The following table will show the increasing trend though there is a little decrease in indoor patients.

3.32 The medical facilities have been availed by over 2.18 percent patients in 1970 as compared to those in 1961. The indoor patients have considerably increased over 1961 though there is a little decrease in 1970 over 1969. While outdoor patients increased by 1.86 times during the same period.

3.33 Increase in number of students in different categories:-

There has been increase in the no. of students and teachers at all the levels of education in Satara district during 69-70, as compared to the position in the earlier year.

In the case of pre-primary education, there was an addition of 8 institutions in the district in 1969-70. The percentage increase in the number of students was 207.10 over the previous year.

In the case of Primary education there was an addition of 27 schools in the district in 1969-70. There is slight decline in the no. of students over the previous year, i.e. 1968-69, percentage decrease is 0.14%. The decrease is in case of girls while there is slight increase in case of boys. Their respective percentages are 1.32 and 0.60. The no. of Primary School teachers increased by 4.72 percent in 1969-70 over the previous year. The ratio of students to teachers which was 37.53, 1 in 1968-69 declined to 35.79, 1 in 1969-70. This indicates improvement in the Teacher students ratio.

In case of secondary education there has been an addition of 20 institutions in 1969-70. The no. of students increased by rise of 4.90 percent in 1969-70 over the previous year. The percentage increase in case

of girls is more. It is 6.82 percent while the percentage increase in no. of boys is 4.53 percent. The teacher student ratio which was 1:24.21 in 1968-69 has declined to 1:23.75 in 1969-70 showing same improvement in the ratio.

In case of higher education there has been all round increase in the no. of institutes, no. of students. The no. of institutions rose to 16 in 1969-70 from 12 in the earlier year. There is an increase of 4.29 percent in the number of college going students. The percentage increase rose to 17.55% from 15.26% in case of college going boys while 14.92% from 11.56% in case of college going girls in 1969-70 over the previous year respectively.

3.34 Increase in Banking facilities :-

The total number of banking offices in the district was 68 at the beginning of 1969, This figure rose to 76 in the year 1970. The population covered for the reference year is 272701.

The number of scheduled banking offices rose from 35 to 39 during the reference year. It will thus be seen that the scheduled commercial banks are now taking more and more interest in opening branches in rural areas to cater the needs of agriculturists and small traders and small scale industries.

3.35 Increase in Road Length :-

Rail length has remained unchanged over years. The meter gauge length is 120 km. in Satara district.

3.36 At the end of March, 1971 the total road length of all types excluding municipal roads was 4059.98 km. The road length at the end of March, 1961 was

2481.06 km. and at the end of March 1966, it was 3161.43 km. Thus the road length per 100 sq.km. of area increased from 24 km. in 1960-61 to 30 km. in 1965-66 and to 39 km. in 1970-71 .

3.37 Prices :-

A glance at the consumer price index for working class (Sholapur centre) will show that the general price level in 1970-71 shot up by 85 percent over the base year 1960. The food group items recorded 98 percent increase during this period, while pan supari and tobacco and fuel and lighting groups recorded 71 percent increase. Clothing bedding and foot wear group shows 72 percent increase, while miscellaneous group items showed 59 percent rise.

3.38 Since November 1962, prices of important commodities are collected by the District Statistical Organisation at each of the district head quarters. The prices of certain important commodities prevailing in 1962, 1965, 1969 and 1970 at district head quarter, Satara are given below.

3.39 It is observed that almost all commodities of daily necessity have recorded sharp rise in price in successive years. Jowar which is the staple food of the population of this district rose from 53 paise in 1962 to Rs. 1.24 in 1970 showing an increase of 134 percent. Gram dal too showed an almost equal rise. of 132 percent during the same period. Groundnut oil increased from Rs. 2.00 in 1962 to Rs. 5.18 in 1970. The increase is 159 percent.

Vanaspati dalda recorded 118 percent rise in 1970 over the 1962 price. Gur rose from 73 paise in 1962 to Rs. 1.03 in 1970 showing an increase of 41 percent. Tea (leaf) rose by 27 percent during the same period while kerosene rose from 38 paise in 1962 to 60 paise in 1970 showing an increase of nearly 58 percent. The price of ordinary cigarettes rose by 110 percent over a span of 8 years. Washing soap price increased from Rs. 1.50 per bar in 1962 to Rs. 2.02 in 1970 showing 34.6 percent rise in price.

CHAPTER IV
ANNUAL PLAN 1970-71.

4.1 Nineteen hundred and seventy seven one was the second year of the IV Plan, which was, however, implemented as an Annual Plan as the fourth five year plan has not been finalised as yet.

4.2 The Annual Plan of Maharashtra State for the year 1970-71 was of Rs. 170 crores as against Rs. 121 crores for the year 1969-70. The allotted budget for the Annual Plan of 1970-71 of Satara District was Rs. 2.89 crores for execution of the district level plan schemes in the State and Local sector.

4.3 The following table gives the major headwise budget provision, the expenditure incurred and the percentage of expenditure to the budget provision for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71

4.4 The above table will show that about Rs. 5 lakhs were spent more in the year 1970-71 in Satara district over the previous year. The annual per capita expenditure (based on 1961 population) on the plan schemes during the Third Plan period in Satara district was Rs. 10. In the subsequent Annual Plans from 1966-67 to 1970-71 ~~it~~ it was Rs. 19/- Rs. 22/- Rs. 27/- Rs. 19/-, Rs. 19/- resply.

In the Annual plan 1970-71 of Satara district, in all 83 schemes were implemented (73 in the state plan and 10 in the centrally sponsored plan). The break up of these 83 schemes is state, 52, local sector 25 and in both the sectors= 6.

4.5 A Agri. Programmes :-

As in the case of earlier Annual Plans, high priority was assigned to this major head of development

4.6 From the above table it will be seen that under the major head 'Agril. Programmes' 94 percent of the allocated budget was spent, The budget remarked for the sub heads "Animal Husbandry" "Forests" ^{and} "Warehousing & marketing" was utilised cent percent. The progress of expdr. under the sub heads "Fisheries" and "Dairy Development" was not satisfactory whereas the same was good under "Agril. Production, "Soil Conservation" and "Minor Irrigation."

1. Agril. Production :-

Under this sub-head 5 schemes were implemented in the state sector and 4 schemes in the local sector and 7 schemes in the state plan and 2 schemes in the Centrally Sponsored plan, and on these schemes Rs.10.32 lakhs were spent. The important schemes executed were

- 1) The integrated Area Development of Small holders in Karad tahsil.
- 2) Intensive cultivation of food crops.
- 3) Horticultural development.
- 4) Taluka seed farms. There was saving in the scheme of "Taluka seed farms" due to slow progress of construction activities on seed farms.

3. Minor Irrigation :-

Under the sub head, three schemes: a) subsidy
for wells b) subsidy for pump sets and c) Coop.Lift
Irrigation, ^{were} executed in the State Sector and the Scheme
'Minor Irrigation Works' in both State and Local sectors.
Out of the total expenditure of Rs. 45.47 lakhs (4%
of budget allocation) expenditure of Rs. 22.47 lakhs
was incurred in the state and Rs. 23.00 lakhs in the
local sector. During the year under review, subsidy was
granted to 179 well cases and 202 pump sets cases. Nine
coop. Lift Irrigation Schemes were started and under the
scheme of Minor Irrigation Works (Local sector) 3 Lift

Irrigation Works, 12 bundhara works and 3 percolation tanks were completed, during the year 1970-71. In the State sector Irrigation tanks at Masalwadi, Lodhavade, Shirasa-vadi and Tambve were completed and 10109 Kms of drains were constructed. On account of all the above schemes, additional area of 1734 acres was brought under irrigation in Satara district.

4) Animal Husbandry :-

The scheme of "Veterinary Aid Centres and dispensaries" was implemented under this sub head and the allotment of Rs. 0.23 lakhs was fully exhausted on maintenance of the aid centres which were already established in the district.

5) Dairy Development :-

Under this sub head the two schemes executed in the state sector were 1) Loans for purchase of Milch cattle and 2) Financial Assistance to coop Dairy Societies and their unions. Rs. 1.90 lakhs were spent on grant of loans for purchase of Milch cattle and 32 coop. Dairy Socys were assisted during the year 1970-71.

6) Forests :-

All the four schemes implemented under "Forests" related to the state sector and 100 percent expenditure was made on these schemes. Physical achievement of the assigned target of plantation in 226 hectares and premonsoon works in 140 hectares was made during the reference period, under the schemes of a) Development of Minor Forest produce b) Farm Forestry c) Development of fodder and d) General utility of timber.

7) Fisheries :-

Seventy one percent amount of the budget allocation was expended on the three schemes executed in

the state sector in 1970-71 in Satara district, under the scheme of "Fish farming in impounded waters", 3.58 lakh Kg. of stocking was done as against the target of 5 lakh Kg. There is limited scope for fishery activities in Satara district.

8) Warehousing and Marketing :-

Rs. 0.45 lakhs (100 percent) were spent in 1970-71 in Satara district in the state sector for giving financial aid to 8 Agril. Produce Market Committees by coop. Deptt. under the scheme of "Development of Agril. Marketing."

4.7 B Cooperation and Community Development:-

The minor head wise expenditure ^{position} is as under.

Under cooperation all the five schemes were implemented, in the state sector, whereas under community development three schemes were executed in the local sector and two schemes a) Applied Nutrition Programme and b) Award of prizes to youth clubs under the central plan.

4.9 During the Annual Plan of 1970-71 in Satara district Rs. 549.22 lakhs of short term, Rs. 8.42 lakh medium term and Rs. 118.42 long term credit was advanced by the coop. Dept.

4.10 The community Development Programme already covers the whole of Satara district. The scheme of Applied Nutrition Programme was implemented in Karad, Khatav and Man blocks of Satara district in the selected 10 villages of these blocks by supplying nutritious diet vegetables etc. to the school-going children and expectant mothers.

4.11 C Irrigation and Power :-

Under the major head "Irrigation & Power" Rs. 5.25 lakhs (105% of the budget provision) were spent on the scheme of "Rural electrification and Normal xxx

Development". This expenditure was mainly incurred on maintenance of previous works and village electrification. The no. of pumping sets energised in Satar district, during the period under review was 2413, sudden decline of expenditure on this programme is noticed in 1970-71 as compared to the year 1969-70, as the major portion of the programmes taken up with the help of the Agril. finance corporation was not included as a part of the state plan.

4.12 D Industry and Mining :-

Under "Small Scale Industries" programme, the scheme "Development of handloom industry" was executed in the state sector and the scheme "Loans under the state Aid to Industries act" in the local sector and the scheme "Financial Aid to Industrial coop. Socys including handicraft workers" was implemented in both the sectors and 100% on these schemes under both the sector. The physical achievements under the programme are as under :-

Under the above schemes, work of 2 bridges was nearly completed, 32 C.D. works were in progress and 2.40 kms. of roads were constructed under the period of review. Also 125.5 Kms. of rural roads were constructed through public participation programme.

4.14 F) Social Services :-

Like "Agricultural Programmes" significant plan outlay was sanctioned in the Annual Plan of 1970-71 for this major head which covers important schemes such as education, health and family planning ^{and} backward class welfare.

4.15 Sub-headwise position showing the budget provision, expenditure and its percentage to the budget is shown in the following table:-

4.16 From the above table it will be seen that 92 percent of the allotted budget was utilised during the Annual Plan in Satara district. The progress under the minor heads Labour and Labour welfare, urban development, Backward class welfare, water supply and drainage, General education, was quite satisfactory, whereas it was slow under Technical education and Health and family planning and housing.

4.17 General Education :-

Under "General Education," 7 schemes were implemented in the state sector and 4 in the local sector and on them Rs. 15.71 lakhs and Rs 7.00 lakhs respectively were spent. Ninety five percent of the total Budget was utilised. The important schemes operated were Local sector- 1) Expansion of primary education 2) Grant-in-aid to the local bodies for construction of primary school buildings 3) Basic training for primary teacher and state sector 1) Development of non-Govt. secondary schools 2) Loans to voluntary agencies for construction of secondary school buildings .3) Concessions to economically backward class pupils and 4) Free education to the sons and daughters of primary teachers. As compared to the previous year, expenditure made in 1970-71 was double on this minor head.

4.18 2. Technical Education :-

Under 'Technical Education' two schemes viz. Govt. Polytechnic Karad and Regional vocation training centre and const. of staff quarters at Karad in the State sector in the state plan and the scheme of construction of hostel buildings for Engineering college students at Karad as centrally sponsored plan schemes were implemented. Only 68 percent of the budget provision was spent on these schemes. Construction activities were in progress.

4.19 3. Health and Family Planning.

Under this sub head the two state sector schemes executed were 1) Completion of buildings for the civil Hospital, Satara Malaria eradication programme and in the local sector the schemes implemented were Primary

Health Centres, Small pox eradication programme and Family Planning and on these schemes expenditure of Rs. 3.82 lakhs in the state sector (100 percent) and Rs. 12.31 lakhs in the local sector was made. Work of T.B. clinic attached to the Civil Hospital Satara and 4 staff quarter buildings for J.H. Centres was in progress. Under the Malaria eradication programme 1.89 lakh blood smears out of the target of 2.00 lakhs were collected in the year and 239 villages were covered for surveillance work. Vaccination work under Small pox eradication programme also exceeded the target. Under "Family Planning" scheme, 7582 Sterilisation operations were performed during the year 1970-71 as against the target of 10000. During the Annual Plan 1970-71 18 additional beds were provided in the existing hospitals, one Primary Health Centre was started at Parali in Satara tehsil, 4 family planning units were started by appointing 20 doctors and 9 nurses by the Satara Zilla Parishad.

4.20 4. Water supply and drainage :-

Under this sub head the schemes of Govt. water supply Municipal water supply and drainage were implemented in the state sector, whereas the scheme of Rural Water supply was implemented in both the state and local sectors. During the Annual Plan 1970-71 an amount of Rs. 12.30 lakhs was spent in the state sector and Rs. 11.34^{lakhs} on local sector schemes. Under Govt. Water supply schemes works at Satara camp and Fanchagani have already been completed. Under Municipal Water supply schemes works at Fanchagani, Wai, Satara were completed and works at Dhaltan, Mhaswad and Rahinatpur were in progress work of underground drainage scheme in Karad

was also in progress. Under Rural Water Supply scheme Lonand and Patan works were already completed and Umbraj work was in progress. In the Local sector under the scheme of Rural Water supply, 138 wells were constructed against the target of 150 and 24 piped water supply works out of the target of 50 were completed in 1970-71.

4.21 5) Housing :-

The Schemes of Subsidised Industrial Housing, Low income group housing scheme for Economically weaker sections and Gaothan Extension scheme were implemented in the state sector and village housing projects scheme in the local sector in 1970-71 in Satara district and Rs.4.89 lakhs and Rs.0.25 lakhs respectively, were spent on these schemes. Work of 192 tenements at Satara Road under Subsidised Industrial Housing Scheme was practically completed and work of 296 tenements under Economically weaker sections Housing Scheme at Karad was completed and some minor works were in progress. Under village housing projects scheme, 2 Kms. of roads were constructed and under Gaothan extension scheme 2 villages with 3.2 hectares of area was covered during the period under review.

4.22 6) Urban Development :-

The scheme "Implementation of Development plans by local bodies" was executed in the state sector in 1970-71 by spending all the allotted grants of Rs.0.95 lakhs, for construction of 3 primary school buildings in the urban area of Karad municipal council.

4.23 7. Under "Backward class welfare," 6 schemes were implemented in the local sector and 2 schemes in the state sector and exdr. of Rs. 0.60 lakhs and 0.35 lakhs respectively was made. The physical achievement is shown below.

Under the scheme of "Technical and Vocational training centres" during the year 1970-71 Rs.6.73 lakhs (131 p.c.) were spent on the construction activities at Industrial Training Institute, Karad and Satara which have a total intake capacity of 800 students.

4.25 G Miscellaneous :-

The scheme of Rural Broadcasting was implemented in the state sector by incurring all the allotted grants of Rs. 0.77 lakhs and by supplying 139 radio sets as against the target of 150 sets in Satara district in the period under review.
