

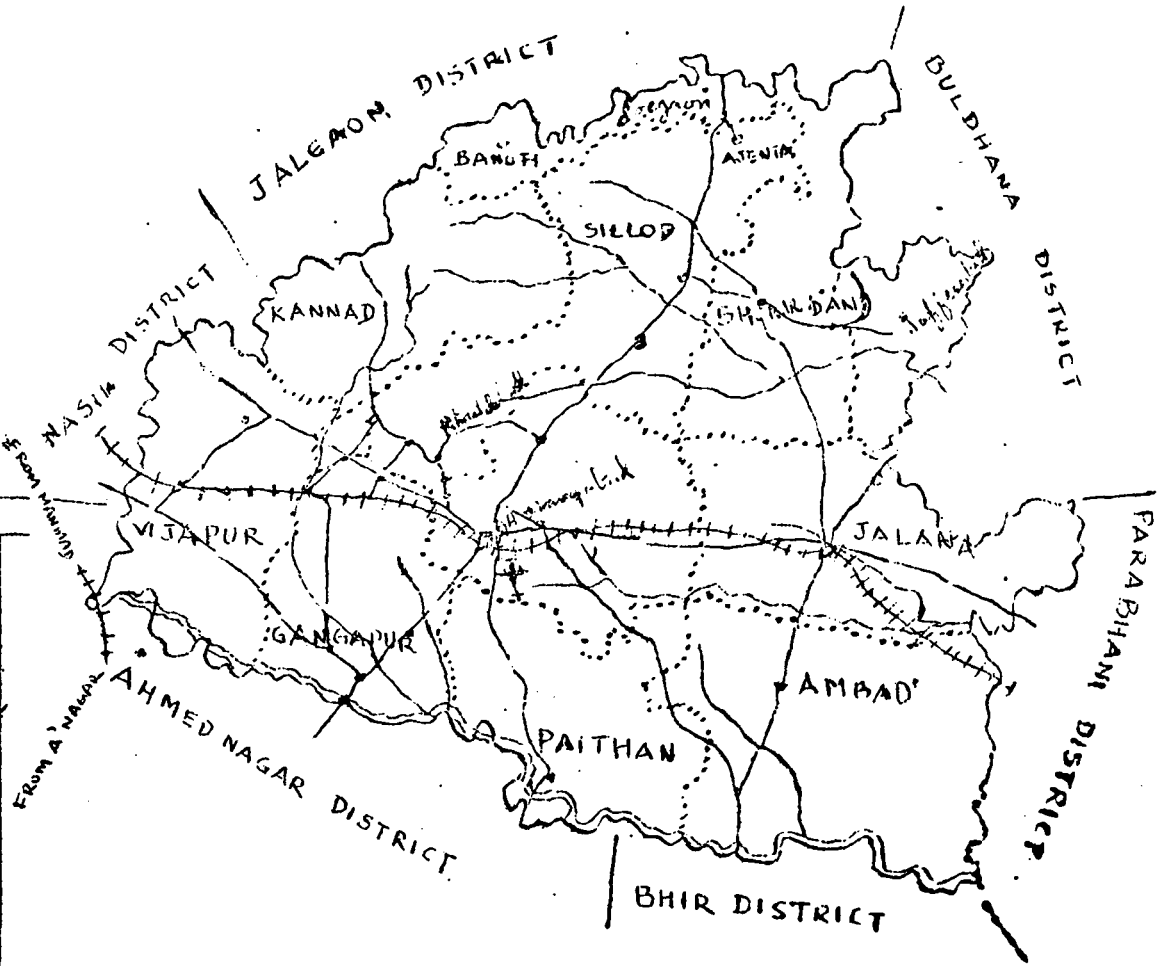
MAP OF AMRANGAHEAD DISTRICT

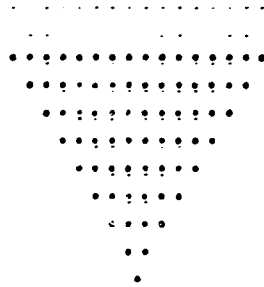

CHAPTER-I

1.1 INTRODUCTION AND LOCATION:

The District of Aurangabad occupying an area of 16,718.2 Kms. is situated in upper Godawari basin and in the extreme north west of Marathwada with a population of 15,32,341 according to 1961 Census. The district was known as Mulka in different Vedic Epic and Puranic ages. The Royal edicts of Ashoka also refer indirectly to a city in Mafathwada petenikas i.e. the people of Paithan. The articulate history of the Deccan begins with Satavahana power which in 2nd Century B.C. saw the emergence of the Marathwada as a seat of mighty empire of the Satavahanas, with their capital at Pratishthana (Paithan).

The district of Aurangabad has a long chequered and hoary past. In addition to its legendary background it was ruled by Kolarians, Satavahanas, the Parthians of Gujarat the Chalukyas, the Rashtrakutas and the Yadavas. Between 1318 and 1347 it was a part and parcel of Delhi Sultanate under Muhammed Tughlaq. Subsequently it formed parts of the Bahamani Kingdom and Nizam Shahi Kingdom of Ahmednagar. From 1724 to 1956 it formed part of Old Hyderabad State and since 1956 it is included in Maharashtra.

Amongst the notable Hindu writers of the District mention may be made of Salivahana Mukund Raja, Dnanoba, Hemad Pant, Atmanayaka Janardhan Pant, Eknath, Ramdas Swami, Mukteshwar, Amritrao & Mahipati.

Aurangabad which was a great city in the past was founded on the site of village Khirki by Malik Ambar the Prime Minister of Murtaza Nizam Shaha.

The district forms 5.5% of the total area of the state and 3.87% of the population of Maharashtra. A small area in the north and north-west lying beyond the Satmala hills is actually situated in the Tapi basin. The northern portion lying between the Satmala hills and the central hill range known as Jalna hills is an upland plateau. The southern portion is comparatively low terminating at banks of the Godawari. In general the district slopes down towards the south and south-east. The district lies between the parallels of $19^{\circ} 17' 30''$ and $20^{\circ} 40' 10''$ north latitude and between $74^{\circ} 40'$ and $76^{\circ} 40'$ east longitude.

1.2 BOUNDARIES:

It is bounded on the north by Jalgaon district, on the east by Parbhani and Buldhana districts and on the south by Bhir district, and a portion of Ahmednagar district and on the west by Nasik district and again by a portion of Ahmednagar district. The maximum length of the district from the north to the south is about 161 Kms. and from east to west about 201 Kms.

1.3 ADMINISTRATIVE SET-UP:

Aurangabad district is divided into three sub-divisions which are further sub divided into talukas as given in Table No.1.1

ZILLA PARISHAD:

With a view to promote the development of democratic institutions and to secure greater participation of the people in development activities in local and Govt. affairs, a Zilla Parishad and 12 Panchayat Samities have been established in 1962. The areas under the jurisdiction of Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities correspond to the district and taluka boundaries respectively. The Municipal towns are however not covered by them including the area of Aurangabad Cantonment. The Zilla Parishad covers 98.7% of the area and 85.56% of the total population of the

The number of villages and population included under the Zilla Parishad and each Panchayat Samiti alongwith the number of councillors and co-opted members are shown in Table No.1.2.

Two Subject Committees are presided over by the Vice President and four by two Chairman elected by the Zilla Parishad to preside over two specified Subject Committees each. The Deputy Chief Executive Officer/^{works} as Secretary of the Standing Committees while the District Heads of Departments work as Secretaries to the Subject Committees/^{concerned}. The co-ordination between the Subject Committees is achieved through Standing Committee. The Panchayat Samities consist of all the councillors who are/^{elected} from the electoral divisions including the Block co-opted councillors and associated members. It is presided over by the Chairman who is/^{elected} by the Panchayat Samiti from amongst its members. The Block Development Officer work as Secretary to the Panchayat Samiti.

The Chief Executive Officer of Zilla Parishad and the Block Development Officer look after the development work in their jurisdictions.

1.4 AREA:

The district of Aurangabad covers an area of 16,353 Sq. Kilometres, according to the figures supplied by the Surveyor General of India and 16,718 Sq. Kms. according to figures supplied by State Land Records and Survey Departments. The rural area of district covers 16,447.9 Sq. Kms. as per figures of State Land Records and Survey Departments. The urban area of the District covers 270.3 Sq.Kms. Rural area forms 98.4% and urban area in the district accounts for 1.6% of its total area.

During the period 1901 of 1941 the district or its talukas underwent no major changes in boundaries. In 1950 twenty five enclave villages of Nasik, East Khandesh and Ahmednagar were transferred to Aurangabad district. Consequent upon the integration of Jagirs the taluka boundaries were reconstituted in April, 1950, and the new Mahals of Khuldabad and Jafferabad were created. Soegaon mahal was carved out in 1953 by transferring 37 villages from Sillod Tq. and 30 from Kannad Taluka.

With the re-organisation of States on 1-11-1956 the district was transferred from the erst while Hyderabad state alongwith the rest of Marathwada to Maharashtra.

1.5 TOPOGRAPHY :

In general the district slopes down south and south east. The general elevation above sea level varies from 2,000 to 2,200 feet on the north and 1,700 to 1,900 feet towards the south.

1.6 HILLS AND RIVER SYSTEM SOILS:

Aurangabad district is divided into the Balaghat or uplands to the north and Ravanghat or lowlands to the south the latter terminating in the valey of the Godawari. The hills of Balaghat area continuation of the hill range of the same name in Vidharbha. There are important and noted hills projections like Daulatabad, Ajantha, Chowka and Jyotsna. All these hills in the district have a terrace like appearance with flattened summits. The hills of the district comprise Satara, Mahadeo, Maholi, Kunkura, Sureanth, Satmala, Ajantha ghats & Aurangabad Hills.

Their average height about 2,000 feet above the sea level but in places they also reach a height of about 3,000 feet. These hills consist mostly of trap rock/with . nodular

limestone at some places.

The most important river of the district is the Godawari which runs along the southern boundary for about 127 miles separating Aurangabad, Ahmednagar and Bhir districts and its tributaries are Shivna rising in the Kannad hills, the Dhenda rising near Daulatabad, Dudhana flowing from the hills east of Aurangabad, Kham/^{which} rises near Khuldabad and passes through the heart of Aurangabad town and Dheku which passes through Vaijapur taluka. The Virbhadra flows through Paithan taluka and the Galhati passes through Ambad taluka. The river Purna which is the biggest tributary of the Godawari rises from the Kannad hills and flows through the northern talukas of the district. The Jui passes through Bhokardan taluka. The other small streams and nallas are Yela, Sabhanga, Virbhadra, Kasner, Nalni, Dhori, Wagora, Sonuj, Bala, Hewra, Arnavati and Gulduth.

The prevailing soil of Aurangabad district is/^{black} cotton soil of "Regur" formed by the weltering of the Trap rock. The geological formation of the district are 1. Middle traps of Deccan Territory, 2. The older Alluvial deposits of the Godawari and 3. The modern Alluvial deposits of the Godawari and the other rivers forming the upper layer. The black cotton soil is rich in plant nutrients such as lime magnesia, iron and alkalies on which cotton and some of the dry crops flourish well. It swells and becomes sticky on weltering by water while on drying contracts and develops numerous cracks. The soil varies greatly both in its texture and depth. In the hilly tracks in the north it is deep and fairly rich. In the Godawari Valley specially along the river banks it is very deep and fertile.

1.7 (i) CLIMATE:

The Climate of Aurangabad is pleasant and agreeable during the greater part of the year. The climatic year may be divided into three short seasons a moderately warm wet season from June to September, a cool dry season from October to February and a dry season from March to May.

The rainy season which lasts from June to September is warm and pleasant during rains as the temperature does not fall below 17° C. and normally ranges between 21° C. to 36° C. The winter season is comparatively dry and starts from November to ends February, January is the coldest month of the year. The mean maximum temperature in the month of may rises even as high as 41° C. Occassionally hot dry winds prevail in April and May. During Summer the days are hot but nights are fairly cool. Thus the climate of Aurangabad, is pleasant, charming and healthy.

1.1 ii) TEMPERATURE:

At Aurangabad centre the mean maximum temperature was highest in May (40.3°c.) in the year 1969. The same was highest in the month of May (40.0°c.) in the year 1970. The Chikalhana centre was indicated highest temperature in the month of May (39.9°c. and 39.7°c.) for the years 1969 and 1970 respectively. As regards mean minimum temperature in the month of January was coolest at both the centres i.e. Chikalhana and Aurangabad centres in 1969, whereas the mean minimum temperature was the coolest in December, 1970 at both the centres.

The table No.1.3 indicates the average temperature in three seasons of the years 1969 and 1970 for both the centres, of Aurangabad and Chikalhana.

It may be noted that due to difference altitude and topography rainfall is unevenly distributed in different parts of the district. On the basis of the district normal rainfall according to variation in rainfall, the district can be classified into three distinct tracts namely (i) where the rainfall excess 750 millimetres (ii) rather in sufficient rainfall tract with rainfall ranges between 650 to 750 millimetres and (iii) poor rainfall tract with rainfall below 650 millimetres.

The table No. 1.4 gives the talukawise normal rainfall (average of last 34 years between 1922-23 to 1955-56 for Kannad, Sillod, Bhokardan, Khuldabad, Vaijapur, Gangapur, Aurangabad and Jalna, and average of ten years i.e. 1958 to 1967 for Soegaon, Jafferabad, Paithan and Ambad as the data of normal rainfall i.e. average between 1922-23 to 1955-56 is not available in the office of the Statistician, Department of Agriculture, Poona) as compared to the rainfall during the years 1969 and 1970.

From the above it is evident that during 1969 rainfall exceeded 750 millimetres in the talukas of Kannad, Sillod, Soegaon, Jafferabad, Khuldabad, Aurangabad, Jalna, Paithan and Ambad. It ranged between 650 to 750 millimetres in Bhokardan, Khuldabad and Gangapur. There was ^{no} taluka having rainfall below 650 millimetres in the year 1969. In the year 1970 rainfall exceeded 750 millimetres in the talukas of Kannad, Sillod, Soegaon, Jafferabad, Khuldabad, Gangapur, Aurangabad, Jalna, Paithan and Ambad. In the year 1970 there was no taluka having rainfall between the range of 650 to 750 millimetres, two talukas viz. Bhokardan and Vaijapur had rainfall below 650 millimetres. Among all talukas Vaijapur has the lowest rainfall of 355.0 millimetres and Jafferabad had a highest rainfall of 1,178.2 millimetres in 1970 in the district.

The fact Finding Committee appointed by the Government of Bombay in 1960 reported that the rainfall ^{is} not dependable in the following areas which likely to be effected by scarcity conditions as follows.

Thus the south western Region of the district generally recording poor rainfall is more susceptible to crop failures due to in-adequate, irregular and untimely rains. The rainfall is unevenly distributed in the district leading sometimes to scarcity conditions.

C H A P T E R - I I .

Explanatory note on scope and limitations of
Statistics presented in Statistical Abstract.

Purpose:-

In this Abstract exhaustive statistics about important Socio-Economic indicators of the economy have been presented. Statistical information on as many topics as possible has been furnished so as to make it useful as a reference book. The talukawise figures will enable reader to compare the indicators of development between the talukas of the district.

District at a glance :-

In this table salient features and district indicators under various heads like population, agriculture, etc., are presented.

The scope and limitations of the information in the Abstract is discussed in the following paragraphs.

I. Climate & Rainfall.

The monthwise information regarding rainy days and total rainfall at selected centres in the district, during 1969 and 1970 is given in table No.1. The normal rainfall recorded in the table is the average rainfall between 1922-23 to 1955-56 for Kannad, Sillod, Bhokardan, Khuldabad, Vaijapur, Gangapur, Aurangabad and Jalna centres and the same recorded in the table for Soegaon, Jafferabad, Paithan and Ambad centres is the average rainfall of 10 years, i.e. 1958 to 1967, as the average rainfall between 1922-23 to 1955-56 is not available, with the Statistician, Department of Agriculture, Poona. The table No.2 gives monthly maximum, minimum and average temperature at two selected centres in the district during 1969 and 1970.

II. Area & Population:-

The data of 1951 population Census and 1961 population Census are present in tables 3 to 8. The district Census Hand Book, 1961 of Aurangabad district has been used for preparing these tables. The provisional data of 1971 population census are present in table No.3-A. The paper 1 of 1971 provisional population totals and its supplements and Districtwise Primary Census Abstract, 1971 (Provisional) have been used for preparing this table.

The table No.3 gives talukawise rural and urban population according to 1961 Census and variation with 1951 Census. The table No.3-'A' shows the district provisional population totals in Aurangabad district according to 1971 Census. The table No.4 shows talukawise classification of villages according to population ranges in 1961 Census. The table No.5 shows talukawise classification of towns according to population ranges in 1961 Census. The table No.6 presents talukawise figures of number of workers according to livelihood classes. The distribution of population according to age group, mother tongue and religion is given in table No.7. The table No.8 gives information regarding population of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in the District at the time of 1961 Census.

III. Agriculture :-

The information regarding agriculture is furnished in table Nos.9 to 19. The table No.9 gives information about land utilisation in the district during 1968-69 and 1969-70. The area under different crops in each taluka of the district for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 is given in table No.10. The yield per hectare and out-turn of principal crops in the district during 1968-69 and 1969-70 is furnished in table No.11. The data regarding the area irrigated by different sources in each taluka of the district during 1968-69 and 1969-70 is supplied in table No.12. The ^{area} irrigated under different crops in each taluka of the district during 1968-69 and 1969-70 is given in Table No.13. The information regarding talukawise number of irrigation wells during 1968-69 & 1969-70 and minor irrigation works during 1969-70 and major and medium projects as on 30-6-1971 is furnished in table Nos.14,15 and 16 respectively. The table No.17 deals with agricultural wage rates during 1969 and 1970 and table No.18 gives information about agricultural implements as per 1966 livestock Census. The information about famine and scarcity conditions for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71 is furnished in table No.19

The generation and consumption of electricity during 1969-70 and 1970-71 and the number of towns and villages electrified and population covered in the district as on 31-3-1961, 1966, 1970 and 1971 is given in table Nos.34 & 35.

CHAPTER - III

This Chapter deals with the important selected indicators furnishing comparative study of the achievements in important selected sectors of economy.

INDICATOR NO.1:-

Percentage of gross area sown to net area sown for the years 1961-62, 1965-66 and 1969-70.

The percentage of gross cropped area over net cropped area indicates the extent of double cropped area in a particular year. Double cropped area is mainly due to availability of irrigation facilities. It is observed in table No.10 of the Abstract that the percentage of gross cropped area to the net cropped areaⁱⁿ the district has slightly increased from 1,05.84 in the year 1968-69 to 106.02 in 1969-70.

It is observed that during the years 1965-66 and 1969-70 percentage of gross cropped area to net cropped area was highest in Jalna taluka being 110.97 during 1965-66 and in Kannad taluka being 109.12 in 1969-70 while the minimum was found in Soegaon taluka during both the years. Thus the range variation comes to 100.39 to 110.97 during 1965-66 and 101.51 to 109.12 during 1969-70.

The comparison of data in 1969-70 with those in 1961-62 indicates that there was ^{an} increase of percentage of gross cropped area over net cropped area in the case of all talukas of the district except two.

INDICATOR NO.2 :-

Productivity of Important Crops.

In this indicator, productivity of important crops in Aurangabad district during the years 1961-62, 1965-66 and 1969-70 has been discussed. There is a separate table in the Abstract part denoting the yield rates of different crops per hectare. In the following table, yield rates of important crops during the years 1961-62, 1965-66 and 1969-70 have been indicated.

It is observed from the above table that yield rate per hectare increased in the year 1969-70 as compared to that in 1965-66 in all the above crops except chillies. There was famine and scarcity conditions in the district during 1965-66. 1,337 villages were affected by famine and chronic scarcity in the district during 1965-66. A similar comparison of yield rates per hectare during 1969-70 with that in 1961-62 reveals considerable decrease in all the above said crops except bajra and sugarcane due to the heavy rains and floods in the district during 1969-70

INDICATOR NO.3 :

Gross value of Agricultural Production.

In this indicator, efforts are made to discuss the gross value of important agricultural products in Aurangabad district. The gross value of particular commodity has been arrived at by multiplying total outturn by the prices prevailing during the harvest season.

In the table below, gross value of important agricultural commodities for the year 1961-62, 1965-66 and 1969-70 is given in crores of rupees.

The value of agricultural produce has been arrived at by multiplying the total produce by harvest price.

From the above table, it is seen that as compared to gross value of agricultural products during 1965-66, gross value of corresponding commodities in 1969-70 recorded an all round increase except that of other cereals. However this increase was more due to increase in production rather than in prices. Similar comparison between the years, 1961-62 and 1969-70 reveals that except in case of jowar, other cereals and groundnut increase is observed in the gross value of all products, but this increase was more due to increase in prices as well as production both, and less due to decrease in the area sown and decreased production of Jowar, other cereals and groundnut.

Percentage of Irrigated Area.

✓ This indicator denotes the percentage of net irrigated area to net cropped area during the year 1961-62, 1965-66 and 1969-70.

From the above table, it is seen that the percentage of net irrigated area to net cropped area increased in all the talukas except Kannad, Khuldabad and Ambad in the year 1969-70 as compared to the year 1965-66. The percentage in talukas Kannad and Ambad had decreased due to increase in the net area sown. The area irrigated by wells had decreased in Khuldabad resulting in the decrease in percentage of net area irrigated to net area sown due to sufficient rains.

However, as compared to the net irrigated area during 1961-62, the percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown increased in all the talukas during 1969-70 resulting in increase in the irrigation sources i.e. government canals, wells and pumps.

Change in Crop Pattern.

This indicator deals with the changes in crop pattern in Aurangabad district during the years 1969-70 as compared to the same in the year 1961-62 and 1965-66.

It is evident from the above table that the area under total food crops as well as non-food crops increased during the year 1969-70 as compared to that in 1965-66. The percentage of total food crops to gross cropped area increased, whereas the same decreased in case of total non-food crops during the year 1969-70 as against 1965-66.

Similar comparison between the years, 1961-62 and 1969-70 reveals that the area under total food crops increased during the year 1969-70 as compared to that in 1961-62, whereas the area under total non-food crops slightly decreased during the year 1969-70 as against 1961-62. The percentage of total food crops of gross cropped area increased whereas the same decreased in case of non-food crops during the year 1969-70 as against 1961-62.

It is observed from the above table that the area under total cereals during the year 1969-70 declined over 1965-66 whereas the same increased under total pulses during the year 1969-70 as compared to the year 1965-66. Percentage of total cereals to gross cropped area in 1965-66 and 1969-70, was 53.28 and 50.47, respectively. The same has decreased during 1969-70 as compared to 1965-66 due to increase in the area of pulses and non-food crops during 1969-70 as compared to 1965-66.

Similar comparison between the years 1961-62 and 1969-70 reveals that the area under total cereals, total pulses & percentage of total cereals, total pulses to gross cropped area increased during the year 1969-70 as compared to the same during the year 1965-66.

INDICATOR NO. 6 :-

Increase in agricultural credit, outstanding dues and gross value of agricultural production.

This indicator points out the increase in agricultural credit, outstanding dues and gross value of agricultural production in Aurangabad district.

The bulk of population in the district depends on agriculture and it is but natural that the large number of Co-operative societies provide all types of facilities needed by agriculturists to improve their financial condition and production. During the year 1969-70 there were 1,170 primary agricultural credit societies in the district, whereas the same decreased by 3 in succeeding year but the membership increased from 1,30,487 to 1,32,112 due to increase in membership campaign.

It may be observed from the above table that the amount of advances during the year 1970-71 increased considerably as compared to the figure of 1961-62 in the district. The corresponding percentage increase is also noticed in case of outstanding dues during the year 1970-71 in comparison to 1961-62.

INDICATOR NO. 7 :-

Agricultural Wage Rates.

This indicator deals with the agricultural wage rates of three selected centres in Aurangabad district during the year 1963, 1969 and 1970 namely (i) Ajantha in Sillod taluka (ii) Bidkin in Paithan taluka (iii) Mahalgaon in Vaijapur Taluka.

Table No.17 of the Abstract deals with the agricultural wage rates of the selected centres of the district in the year 1969 and 1970. From this it is evident that average wage rates of carpenters of Ajantha centre in Sillod taluka was the highest i.e. Rs. 4=69 and Rs. 5=00 as compared to the average wage rate of carpenters of Bidkin in Paithan taluka and Mahalgaon in Vaijapur taluka in the year 1969 as well as 1970, respectively. The average wage rates of carpenters of Ajantha and Mahalgaon centres was the highest and same i.e. Rs. 3=00 as compared to the average wage rate of carpenters of Bidkin centre in June, 1963. The average wage rate of blacksmith at Ajantha centre was also higher than other two remaining centres of the district i.e. Rs. 6=00, Rs. 4=37 and Rs. 5=00 in June, 1963 and for the years 1969 and 1970, respectively.

The average wage rates of unskilled male field labourer at Ajantha, Bidkin and Mahalgaon centres in the district were Rs. 1=50, Rs.1=50 and Rs.2=00 respectively in June, 1963 whereas the same at Ajantha, Bidkin and Mahalgaon centres were Rs.2=50, Rs.2=79 and Rs.2=43, respectively, in the year, 1969. As such the average wage rates in Mahalgaon centre was highest in June, 1963 as compared to the remaining two centres, and the same in Bidkin centre was highest as compared to the remaining two centres during 1969. During the year 1970, the average wage rates of the same centres were Rs. 2=52, Rs.2=88 and Rs. 2=25, respectively.

INDICATOR NO.8:-

Livestock per hectare of land.

In an agricultural country like India, the importance of working cattle can scarcely be exaggerated. The livestock have an important bearing on the total output of agricultural production. As agriculture is a non-mechanised industry in India, the cattle supply is the most important motive power for almost all agricultural operations, such as ploughing, lifting of water and transport of produce to the market.

This indicator gives the position of livestock per hectare of land in Aurangabad district as per 1961 Census and 1966 Census.

The number of working bullocks in the district rose from 3.80 lakhs in 1961 to 3.85 lakhs in 1966 Census. The cultivable area of the district as a whole as per 1966 Census comes to 7.25 hectares per pair of working bullocks during 1965-66 and 1969-70. The cultivable area per pair of working bullocks as per 1966 Census is found to be the highest in Ambad taluka and the lowest in Paithan taluka. The cultivable area per pair of working bullocks varies between 5.41 and 9.68 hectares during 1965-66 and 1969-70. As against total cultivable area of 13.95 lakhs hectares, the total bovine and ovine population in 1966 Census was 12.75 lakhs. The bovine and ovine population per 100 hectares of cultivable land works out to be 91.

The cultivable area of the district as a whole as per 1961 Census comes to 7.37 hectares per pair of working bullocks during 1961-62. The cultivable area per pair of working bullocks as per 1961 Census is found to be highest in Ambad taluka and the lowest in Kannad taluka. During the year 1961-62, the cultivable area per pair of working bullocks as per 1961 Census varies between 5.78 and 10.42 hectares. As against total cultivable area of 14.01 lakhs hectares during 1961-62, the total bovine and ovine population in 1961 was 13.47 lakhs. The bovine and ovine population as per 1961 Census per 100 hectares of cultivable land during 1961-62 works out to be 96.

INDICATOR No.9 :-

Poultry as compared to population.

This indicator denotes the position of poultry as compared to population in Aurangabad district.

During the Third Five Year Plan period, special programme for poultry development consisting of training for poultry, breeding and supply of improved poultry and advancing of loans for poultry keeping was chalked out and implemented. As per the Census of 1966, total number of poultry in Aurangabad district was 2.01 lakhs as against 2.23 lakhs during the year 1961. This indicates a decrease of 0.22 lakhs over the period 1961.

It may be observed from the above table, that the ratio of poultry to the population as per 1966 Census was highest in Soegaon taluka while the same was lowest in Ambad taluka. The range of variation was considerably wide as the maximum ratio was 218 while the minimum was 95 only.

INDICATOR NO.10.

Per capita consumption of Electricity:-

This indicator denotes per capita consumption of Electricity in Aurangabad district during the year 1962-63, 1965-66 and 1970-71.

The total electricity consumption during the years 1962-63, 1965-66 and 1970-71 was 33.19, 111.83 and 337.19 lakhs of k.w.h. respectively.

The percentage increase in the consumption of electricity during 1970-71 over the same in 1962-63 comes to 915.94 and the percentage increase in the consumption of electricity during 1970-71 over the same in 1965-66 comes to 201.38. The per capita consumption of total electricity in the district during the years 1962-63, 1965-66 and 1970-71 works out to 2.16 K.W.H. and 17.22 K.W.H. respectively.

It may be observed from the above table that there is a tremendous increase in consumption of electricity mainly in the field of other purposes and industrial power.

INDICATOR NO.11.

Increase in number of candidates enrolled in Employment Exchange and vacancies notified.

This indicator denotes the increase in number of candidates enrolled in Employment Exchange and vacancies notified in Aurangabad district during the year 1961-62, 1965-66 and 1970-71.

Continuous increase in un-employment inspite of various efforts made for creation of employment opportunities is still a problem to be solved. Un-employment is observed not only in skilled and un-skilled workers but also in educated classes having degrees and diplomas in various ~~XXXXX~~ university courses.

From the statistics maintained in Employment Exchange it is observed that there is a continuous rise in the registrations and also in the vacancies notified. The table below indicates the number of registrations and vacancies notified during the years 1961-62, 1965-66 and 1970-71.

It is evident that the number of indoor patients treated during 1970 increased in all the talukas except Sillod, Khuldabad, Vaijapur, Gangapur and Paithan as compared to 1961, and the same increased during 1970 in all talukas except Sillod, Khuldabad, Jalna and Paithan as compared to 1965. Aurangabad and Jalna accounted for the highest number of in-door patients treated where better medical facilities are available due to location of Medical College Hospital at Aurangabad and Cottage Hospital at Jalna.

It is observed that the number of out-door patients treated increased in Kannad, Jafferabad, Vaijapur, Aurangabad, Jalna and Ambad during the year 1970 as compared to 1961 whereas the same decreased in the remaining talukas. The number of primary schools in Aurangabad district rose from 1,313 in 1961-62 to 1,885 in 1965-66 and 1,994 in 1969-70. The number of pupils also increased by 47.49 and 65.65 in the years 1965-66 and 1969-70, respectively, as compared to that in 1961-62.

The number of secondary institutions in the district increased from 76 in 1961-62, to 128 in 1965-66 and 171 in 1969-70. The number of students attending these institutions also increased tremendously by 97.07% and 175.32% in the years 1965-66 and 1969-70, respectively as compared to that in 1961-62.

As regards higher education, the number of institutions in the district increased from 17 in 1965-66 to 18 in the year 1969-70 and the number of students attending these institutions also increased by 59.55% in the year 1969-70 in comparison to the same during 1965-66.

The number of institutions in special education also increased. The number of special institutions rose from 7 in 1961-62 to 20 in 1965-66. The number of students attending special institutions also increased tremendously by 195.22% in 1965-66 as compared to that in 1961-62.

INDICATOR NO.14.

Increase in road length per 100 square Kilometres.

This indicator denotes the increase in road length per 100 square kilometres in Aurangabad district for the years 1961-62, 1965-66 and 1970-71. The road length per 100 square kilometres in the district rose from 6.18 kilometres in 1961-62 to 7.30 kilometres in 1965-66 and 12.17 kilometres in 1970-71.

The total road length in the district under all categories increased by 17.96% and 96.85% during the years 1965-66 and 1970-71, respectively as compared to the total road length during 1961-62. This increase was more prominent in case of village roads, while the same was 64 Kms. during 1961-62 and the same were 114.60 Kms. and 579.68 Kms. during the years 1965-66 and 1970-71, respectively. The increase in major district roads, other district roads and state highways being 104.89%, 43.77% and 26.02% respectively during 1970-71 as compared to 1961-62.

INDICATOR NO.15.

Increase in Banking facilities in proportion to population

This indicator denotes the increase in banking facilities in proportion to population in Aurangabad district at the end of March, 1961, 1966 and 1970.

Banking facilities are very essential for development and progress of industry and agriculture. In the year 1960-61, there were 8 scheduled banks in the district. At the end of March, 1966, there was 11 scheduled banks in the district and the number of such banks was 25 at the end of September, 1970.

The District Central Co-operative Bank plays an important role for providing banking facilities to the agriculturists in rural areas. There were 56 branches of Co-operative bank in the district as at the end of June, 1969, while there were 20 and 32 branches at the end of March, 1961 and 1966, respectively.

The district population as per 1961 Census was 15,32,341 and the number of branches of the bank was 81. As such the average population served by one branch comes to 18,918.

INDICATOR NO.16 :- Prices:-

The trends in prices prevailing at district head-quarter, Aurangabad during the year 1963, 1966 and 1970 w have been discussed in this indicator.

It is observed from this table that the average prices of all the consumption articles had shot up in 1966 and 1970 as compared to 1963.

The rise in average prices was also observed in all the articles of consumption except wheat, bajra, and gram dal during 1970 as compared to 1966. There was slight decrease in the prices of wheat during 1970 as compared to 1966.

Jowar was not available in the open market during both the years i.e. 1965 and 1970. The supply of Jowar was made on Fair Price Shops only and here too an increasing trend in prices was observed. Rice was also not available in the open market during the year 1966. The supply of rice was also made on Fair price Shops only, and here too an increasing trend in prices was observed.

It is seen from this table that the average prices during 1963,1966 and 1970 cannot be compared mainly because changes in varieties were effected. The ups and downs in prices is mainly due to changes in varieties. However, the increasing trends continued in case of these items except sari during 1970 as compared to 1963 * and except sari and blouse pieces during 1970 as compared to 1966.

CHAPTER-IV.

PLANNING PART-I (EXPENDITURE)

Each plan has had a distinctive objective. While the First Plan emphasised "Self Sufficiency in food grains" the Second Plan aimed at "Socialistic Pattern" the Third sought to create a "Self-generating economy" and the Fourth Plan has as its goal "Self-reliance in economy".

Five

As the IVth / Year Plan was yet to be formulated Annual Plans were implemented since 1966-67. The Annual Plan for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71, constituted the third and fourth Annual Plans in the district for which the total budgetary provisions were made to the tune of Rs. 177.42 lakhs and 190.04 lakhs, respectively. The total expenditure in the Annual Plans period for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71 amounted to Rs. 181.04 lakhs and 238.23 lakhs respectively, the percentage of expenditure to the total budget provision for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71 being 102.04 and 125.36 respectively.

The headwise expenditure in the Annual Plans 1969-70 and 1970-71 in the district is given in the following table.

It is observed that the total expenditure under different heads of development, incurred during the year 1969-70 and 1970-71 constituted 102.04 and 125.36 percent, respectively to the budget provisions of the respective years. The headwise expenditure given in the above table denotes that the Agricultural Programmes consumed the largest share of 59.08% and 56.02% of the total expenditure during 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively. In the order of priority, the Agricultural Programmes were followed by the Social Services which shared 18.18 percent during 1969-70 and 23.63 percent during 1970-71 of the total expenditure. The expenditure incurred on Transport and Communications was 15.96 percent during 1969-70 and 14.21 percent during 1970-71 of the total expenditure. The expenditure incurred on Co-operation and Community Development was only 6.02 percent during 1969-70 and 5.02 percent during 1970-71. The percentage of expenditure on Industry and Mining were very low that are, only 0.67 percent during 1969-70 and 0.56 percent during 1970-71 to the total expenditure. The percentages of expenditure on Miscellaneous were lowest that is, only 0.09 percent during 1969-70 and 0.56 percent during 1970-71 to the total expenditure.

I. AGRICULTURAL PROGRAMMES:

The Agricultural Programmes received the highest priority, and the percent of expenditure incurred were the highest among the different heads of development during both the years under review. The sub-headwise expenditure incurred under Agricultural Programmes during the Annual Plan of 1969-70 and 1970-71 in the district is given in the following table.

It is seen that among the sub-heads of development soil conservation accounted for the highest expenditure denoting 59.20 percent and 53.59 percent of the total expenditure under Agricultural Programmes during 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively. Next in order of priority Minor Irrigation consumed the major portion of expenditure amounting to 31.58 percent and 38.55 percent of the total expenditure under Agricultural Programmes during 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively. The expenditure during 1969-70 and 1970-71 under sub-head Agricultural Production constituted only 5.32 percent and 4.89 percent, respectively of the total expenditure under Agricultural Programmes. The expenditure under sub-heads Animal Husbandry, Fisheries, and Ware Housing and Marketing was very low during 1969-70 and 1970-71, that is 0.10 percent, 0.17 percent, 0.52 percent, 0.47 percent, 0.45 percent and 0.08 percent, respectively of the total expenditure under Agricultural Programmes. The expenditure under sub-heads of Dairy Development and Forest accounted for 1.02 percent, 1.27/ and 1.81 percent, 0.98 percent to the total expenditure under Agricultural Programme during 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively.

II. CO-OPERATION AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT:-

Out of total expenditure of Rs. 10.89 lakhs and 11.97 lakhs during 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively for Co-operation and Community Development, the expenditure incurred by Co-operation amounted to Rs. 2.76 lakhs and 2.29 lakhs while the expenditure booked on Community Development was Rs. 8.13 lakhs and 9.68 lakhs, during 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively.

III. INDUSTRY AND MINING.

The percentage of expenditure on Small Scale Industries and Mining was very low during the years 1969-70 and 1970-71 that is, only 0.67 percent and 0.56 percent, respectively of the total expenditure, which mainly constituted assistance to Industrial Co-operatives and Federations for the development of handlooms.

IV. TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION:

The expenditure incurred under Transport and Communications amounted to Rs. 28.89 lakhs and 33.85 lakhs exceeding the budget provision of Rs. 27.09 lakhs and 18.58 lakhs during 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively.

V. SOCIAL SERVICES:

Next to the Agricultural Programmes, Social Services received the largest share of budget provision and expenditure during 1969-70 and 1970-71, as shown in table No.1. The expenditure incurred under Social Services constituted 18.13 percent and 23.63 percent to the total expenditure during 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively. The sub-headwise expenditure under Social Services during the Annual Plans of 1969-70 and 1970-71, in the district is given in the following table.

It is observed that the expenditure incurred under Water Supply and Drainage was the highest, that is, 49.06 percent to the total expenditure under Social Services, followed by General Education and Technical Education, that is, 32.72 percent and 8.38 percent, respectively during 1969-70 while the expenditure incurred under General Education was the highest that is 47.98 percent to the total expenditure under Social Services, followed by Water Supply and Drainage, Urban Development and Technical Education, that is, 40.83 percent, 4.74 percent and 2.29 percent respectively during 1970-71. The expenditure incurred under Housing was 3.68 percent during 1969-70. The expenditure incurred under Social Welfare was 1.83 percent during 1970-71. The expenditure incurred under Labour and Labour Welfare was 2.76 percent during 1969-70. The expenditure incurred under Housing was 0.80 percent during 1970-71. The expenditure incurred under Social Welfare was 2.06 percent during 1969-70. The expenditure incurred under Welfare of Backward Classes was 0.88 percent and 0.73 percent during 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively. The expenditure incurred under Labour and Labour Welfare was 0.69 percent during 1970-71. The expenditure incurred on Public Health was least that is, 0.46 percent and 0.11 percent during both the years under review.

PHYSICAL ACHIEVEMENTS:

The main object of Planning in the process of economic development is to arrange available resources in such a manner as to achieve pre determined targets in the prescribed time limit. The physical achievements of various developmental schemes during the Annual Plans of 1969-70 and 1970-71 in the district are discussed in the following paragraphs.

I. AGRICULTURAL PROGRAMMES.

As already discussed elsewhere, Agricultural Programmes received the highest priority in the Annual Plans of 1969-70 and 1970-71. The activities under the Agricultural Programmes are discussed under the different sub-heads as below.

i) AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTION:

Under the sub-head Agricultural Production, schemes directly relating to intensive cultivation of food crops were included and 2.10 lakhs and 4.75 lakhs of acres were brought under intensive cultivation during the years 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively. Under the scheme of "Cotton Development" 9,823 hectares and 64,606 hectares of area have been covered under improved seed of cotton which were distributed during 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively. Under the scheme "Manures and Fertilizers" 6,428 and 8,462 tonnes of manures and fertilizers were distributed during 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively. Under the Plant protection scheme 15,232 acres and 1,86,420 acres of crops were dusted and sprayed during 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively. Under the Horticultural development scheme 478 acres and 284 acres were brought under plantation fruit trees during 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively. There were no fruit trees rejuvenation and renovation during 1969-70 and 1970-71.

ii) SOIL CONSERVATION:

Under the scheme of Contour Bunding 0.78 lakhs and 1.06 lakhs of acres were bunded against the target of 0.67 lakhs and 0.74 lakhs of acres during 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively.

Contd.

iii) MINOR IRRIGATION:

Under this programme, 1,338 new wells were constructed and 285 pump sets were distributed during 1969-70, respectively. During the year 1970-71, 1,845 subsidy cases of construction of new wells and 597 subsidy cases of installation of pumping sets were adjusted. Under Minor Irrigation, works of 5 bandharas were completed during 1969-70 under the local sector scheme, and work of 8 ~~bandharas~~ bandharas was in progress under State sector scheme during 1969-70. During the year 1970-71, work of 5 bandharas and tanks and 9 lift irrigation was in progress under local sector. The works of 7 bandharas were completed during 1970-71 under State Sector scheme. The work of 12 bandharas was in progress under State sector scheme during 1970-71.

iv) ANIMAL HUSBANDRY:

Minor repairs were done in one dispensary during 1969-70. 4 dispensaries and 2 Aid Centres were continued during both the years under review. The scheme of supply of premium premium bulls and Poultry Development scheme was not implemented during both the years under review.

v) DAIRY DEVELOPMENT:

Under the town Milk Supply Scheme, 2870 and 3,950 litres of milk was handled per day during the years 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively. Five units were assisted under the scheme of "Assistance to Milk Societies" during both the years under review.

vi) FORESTS:

Under the scheme "Farm Forestry" plantation including pre-monsoon were done on 200 hectares and 170 hectares during 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively. During the years 1969-70 and 1970-71, under the scheme Extension of Forestry plantation including pre-monsoon was done on the road of 77 and 106 kilometres, respectively. The Central nurseries, already established upto the year 1967-68, were maintained in the years 1969-70 and 1970-71. Under the scheme Roshia Grass including plantation and Pre-monsoon 35 and 63 hectares were covered during the years 1969-70 and 1970-71.

Contd..

2nd year and 3rd year operation of fuel wood and bamboo was discontinued in the year 1969-70. The plantation including pre-monsoon work and 2 year and 3rd year operations in connection with Afforestation for Soil Conservation was effected in an area of 160 and 460 hectares during the years 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively. Under the development of pastures and fodder resources 163 hectares and 63 hectares was covered including pre-monsoon work during the years 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively. One Forest Park was established at Ajantha Caves, during the year 1969-70 and the same was continued during the year 1970-71.

vii) FISHERIES:

Under the Fish farming in impounded water scheme 6.74 and 17.68 lakhs of fish (fingerlings) were stocked in tanks and 1.51 lakhs Kg. and 3.19 lakhs Kg. fish was netted out during the years 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively. For the supply of fishery requisites 339 Kg. Nylon twine was supplied to fishermen during 1969-70 and Rs. 10,000 were distributed as loan among the fishermen and to Co-operative Societies of fishermen during 1970-71. Rs. 18,000 were distributed for the adjustment of subsidy of one godown, managerial subsidy of 3 societies and share capital of 5 societies during 1970-71.

viii) WARE HOUSING AND MARKETING:

Under the scheme of development of Agricultural Marketing 2 new markets were established during the year 1969-70 and one new market was established during the year 1970-71. 6 societies were assisted by giving loan and subsidy during 1970-71.

II. CO-OPERATION & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT;

i) Co-operation.

Under the scheme of strengthening of the Co-operative Structure from district level and below, membership was increased by 8,928 and 18,427 during the years 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively. Towards the development of Co-operative marketing subsidies and loans were granted to three godowns during 1969-70 and 7 godowns in 1970-71 to increase storage capacity. For the development of co-operative farming loans to the extent of Rs. 0.05 lakhs in 1969-70 and Rs. 0.03 lakhs in 1970-71 were advanced.

ii) COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT:

The whole district was already covered by 17 Community Development Blocks compressing of 20½ C.P.A. pattern by the end of Third Plan period. The same blocks were continued during the Annual Plan periods of 1969-70 and 1970-71. The scheme under Rural Works Programme was discontinued during 1968-69. The scheme under Applied Nutrition Programme was implemented in Sillod, Khuldabad, Jalna and Soegaon Blocks during both the years under review.

iii) INDUSTRIES

Under the scheme of Development of Small Scale Industries (Handloom) rebate of Rs. 5,000 was distributed during the year 1969-70 and Rs. 7,500 in 1970-71. Fifteen Industrial Co-operative Societies in 1969-70 and 1970-71 were assisted under financial assistance to Industrial Co-operative and Federations. Loan of Rs. 85,000 under S.A.I. Rules was granted to 239 artisans during 1970-71.

IV) TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION:

The work of construction of new roads was completed to the extent of 7 kilometres in 1969-70 and 14 kilometres in 1970-71 in the State sector and the work of 35.15 kilometres in 1969-70 and 13.40 kilometres in 1970-71 in local sector. 2 bridges and 61 culverts were constructed in the local sector while 14 culverts were completed in State sector during the year 1969-70. During the year 1970-71, 18 culverts were completed in state sector and 18 culverts were completed in local sector. Under the scheme of Roads under public participation, an amount of Rs. 2.14 lakhs was spent in each year i.e. 1969-70 and 1970-71. Under the scheme "Road of Economic Importance", the earth work was completed to the extent of 8.51 kilometres in 1969-70 while the achievements of the same was nil during 1970-71, metal collection was done to the extent of 4.56 kilometres in 1969-70 and 2.50 kilometres in 1970-71. The consolidation work of 2.40 kilometres and 1.50 kilometres was completed during the years 1969-70 and 1970-71 respectively. One C.D. work was completed during the year 1970-71. Under the scheme of Roads in Hilly and in-accessible areas, the earth work was completed to the extent of 3.00 kilometres during the year 1969-70 while the achievement of the same was nil during the year ~~1969-70~~ 1970-71. Metal collection was done in 3.50 kilometres and 2.50 kilometres during the years 1969-70 & 1970-71 respectively.

Consolidation was done in 9.50 kilometres and 4.30 kilometres during the years 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively. 4 culverts were completed during the year 1970-71.

V. SOCIAL SERVICES.

i) General Education:-

Under the programme of expansion of primary education 75 teachers and 235 teachers were appointed and as many as 217 and 155 teachers were imparted basic training during 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively. Towards the development of Non-Government schools, 7 and 8 secondary schools were started during the years 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively. Under the scheme of opening of additional classes/sections in Government Secondary Schools 27 and 20 teachers were appointed during 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively. Educational concessions were given to 5,702 and 6,952 students of economically backward classes, during 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively. Educational concessions were given to 364 and 60 eligible children of primary teachers during 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively.

(i) Public Health:

Under the family planning scheme, as many as 9,736 and 11,643 vesectomy operations were done during 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively. 396 loop cases were covered during 1970-71.

iii) Water supply and Drainage:

Under the rural water supply scheme, 139 and 24 drinking water wells were constructed during 1969 and 1970-71, respectively.

iv) Housing:

Under the village housing project, the scheme was continued in 17 villages during both the years under review. Rs. 20,000 were expended under this scheme for construction of roads and drainage during 1970-71. For extension of gathan Rs. 25,000 were expended in 20 villages during the year 1970-71.

Contd..

v) Welfare and Backward Classes:-

Grant of scholarships, tuition fees and examination fees were given to 217 and 963 pupils during 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively. Grants were awarded to two backward class hostels during 1969-70 and grants were awarded to 60 inmates of B.C. Hostels during 1970-71. During the years 1969-70 and 1970-71, Rs.5,000 and 4,000 were distributed among 5 and 8 cultivators of scheduled castes for the development of their land. Rs.6,000 were distributed among 3 cultivators of scheduled castes for construction of new wells and repairs to old wells during 1970-71. Financial assistance was given to one industrial society of backward classes during both the years under review.

vi) Social Welfare:

Under the scheme of welfare Extension Projects 12 balwadies, 5 literacy centres, 4 maternity centres and 2 arts and craft classes were started during 1969-70 and 2 griha kalyan kendra, 12 bal vikas Kendra and 11 training camps were opened and organised during 1970-71.

vii) Labour and Labour Welfare:-

Under the technical and vocational training scheme 2 members of staff were appointed during 1969-70 and they were also continued during the succeeding year. 32 pupils were trained under this scheme during the year 1970-71.

viii) Information and Publicity:-

Under Rural Broadcasting scheme 234 and 131 radio sets were installed in different villages during 1969-70 and 1970-71, respectively.

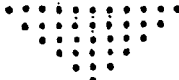

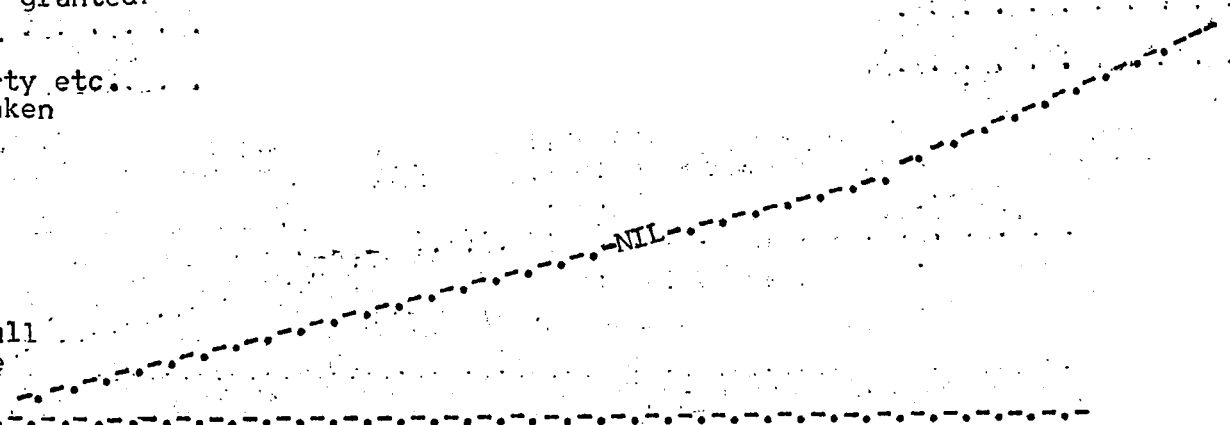
