CHAPTER - I

1.1 BACK GROUND

Ahmednagar which is popularly known as 'Nagar' in the western Maharashtra is the seat of district administration of Ahmednagar district and is on the bank of river 'Sina' which almost remains dry for nearly 9 months in a year. This district is famous from ancient time. Saints like Dyaneshwar, Eknath and Changadeo, who have provided spiritual leadership to the people of Maharashtra hailed from this place. Similarly historical personalities like, Chand-bibi, Shahaji Raje, Malik Ambar, famous as the founder of land revenue system have added glory to the history of this district. Ahmednagar town was founded in the year 1494 and till 1630, it was the main centre of administration of southern India. It was ruled by the Moghals upto 1759. From 1759 to 1817 it was under the 'Peshwas'. The famous Ahmednagar Fort is associated with 1942 'Quit India' movement when National Leaders were detained in the fort. The present Ahmednagar district came into being in 1818.

1.2 LOCATION

The Ahmednagar district is situated in the central part of Maharashtra between 18.2 degrees to 19.9 degrees, north latitude and 73.9 degrees to 75.5 degrees east longitude. It is surrounded by Aurangabad and Nasik districts on the north, by Bhir and Osmanabad districts on the east, Poona and Thana districts on the south-west, and Sholapur district on the South. This district is the biggest in the Poona Division and second in the State next to Chadrapur district of Nagar Division with an area of 17,035 Sq. Kms.

1.3 TOPOGRAPHY :

1) Soil : The district forms part of ^{deccan} plateau. The district

soil is generally responsive and fertile except in the hilly tracks and some portions of the plains which have suffered heavy soil erosion. The soil of the district can be classified into 5 broad categories, viz. 1)Black, 2)Red,3)Laterite, 4)Barad, (Gray inferior quality)and 5)White known as Pandhari.

In Rahuri Tahsil, the soil is mostly deep black and rich coupled with fine perennial water system. Due to this very reason this area is selected for locating the Mahatma Jyotiba Phule Agricultural University. In the hilly area of west of Akola tahsil red laterite soil is deeper on the slopes than on the levels. In the plain lands of Akola and Sangamner along the banks of the Pravara, the soil is extremely rich and gradually grows poor as one approaches the hills. In Kopergaon and Shrirampur tahsils, soil is very deep and fertile. The Southern portion covering tahsils of Ahmednagar, Parner, Shrigonda, and Karjat is mostly composed of pathars and the plain lands with poor & shallow soil. In the south east, the soil of Jamkhed is generally light and poor in fertility.

2)Rivers : The Godavari and the Bhima constitute the major rivers of the district. The Godavari flows along north eastern boundry of the district, that is along the border of the Shrirampur,Newasa,Shevgaon tahsils. The Pravara is a tributary of the Godavari, It passes through Akola,Sangamner,Shrirampur, Kopergaon and Newasa Tahsils. The Pravara originates in the Akola tahsil and then joins the Godavari in the Newasa tahsil. A dam known as Bhandardara is built in 1926 in the Akola tahsil from where the Pravara originates. The Pravara canals proved bounteous to the habitual famine stricken people of this area. The Mula, the Adhala and the Mahalungi are the important tributaries of the Pravara.

The southern half covering Parner, Ahmednagar, Pathardi, Shrigonda and Karjat tahsils lies in the Bhima basin and is

drained by the Sina, the Kukadi, and the Ghod, the tributaries of the Bhima. The river Bhima flows nearly 56 Km. along the boundary of Poona and Ahmednagar district.

3) Hill Ranges : The main Sahyadri range touches only one Tahsil i.e. Akola in the west of this district. From this main range, three spurs namely i) Kalsubai, ii) Baleshwar, & iii) Harishchandra gad have spurt out. The spurs of Kalsubai stretches out eastwards along the northern boundary of this district and goes upto Dudheshwar hill in Sangamner tahsil. Kalsubai is the highest peak of Sahyadri (1654 meters) in this range, and it serves as water shed between the Dharna and the Pravara rivers. The length of Harishchandra gad is about 96 Km. and its branches run from Rantangad. It also serves as water shed between the Pravara and the Mula rivers. The Baleshwar range is the largest and it forms the boundary line between the Poona and the Ahmednagar district. On entering Parner Tahsil, this spur formed a plateau from which two spurs branch off, one going through north of Ahmednagar town & forms a watershed between the Godavari and the Bhima, another one turns Southwards across the north east corner of Shrigonda tahsil and then enters into Karjat Tahsil.

4) Minerals : There are no minerals in this district except lime-stone in Parner tahsil.

1.4 Climate : i) Rainfall : Ahmednagar district gets rain mainly from South-west monsoon but the distribution of rain-fall is almost uneven, the major part of the precipitation is experienced in western part of Akola tahsil, whereas rains in Southern part of the district are most erratic. The normal rainfall at tahsil head-quarter vary between 500.m.m. to 700 m.m. approximately.

This district can be divided into three zones according

to rainfall at tahsil head-quarters viz. 1) Zone-I, Northern part comprising of Kopergaon, Akola, Sangamner, Rahuri and Shrirampur tahsils. ii) Zone II : South eastern part including tahsils of Shevgaon, Nagar, Pathardi, Newasa and Jamkhed and iii) Zone III: Karjat, Shrigonda and Parner tahsils of the district.

The following table gives the idea about annual rain-fall recorded during 1970 & 1971 & its percentage with reference to normal rain fall.

It will be seen from the above table that during 1970, The actual rainfall as compared to normal rainfall appears to be satisfactory in zone II and III while zone I received only 74% of the normal rainfall. It is also revealed from the above table that rainfall during monsoon months (June to Sept.) was 88 percent as compared to the normal rainfall, in this zone, but premonsoon rain was 237 percent. In 1971 the rainfall was 71 percent of the normal rainfall in zone I, while in zone II it was nearly 80 percent of the normal rainfall. However the third zone got little more than first two zones. It is also revealed that post monsoon rain was fairly satisfactory in zone I & III. However it was most uneven and it was followed by heavy cold which ultimately affected rabi crops. While zone II received only 40 percent of the normal rainfall during post monsoon period, winter rain was absent during 1971. This has resulted in heavy loss of crops and thus the district was caught in heavy grip of scarcity during the second year in succession.

ii) Temperature : Situated on the deccan plateau, climate of the Ahmednagar district with prevalence of westerly breeze, is generally dry, pleasant and agreeable during the greater part of the year. Monthly temperature records are available for the Ahmednagar town only. During 1971 maximum temperature was recorded as 42.0 centigrade in April 71 whereas minimum temperature was recorded as 8.8 centigrade in January-1971.

1.5 Natural Zones :

✓ Ahmednagar district can be divided into four natural zones according to topography and climate conditions.

Zone I : Akola tahsil is entirely different from all other tahsil of the district. Its western part is hilly and full of forest. It receives heavy rains Kharif crops are sown in this area.

Zone II : This zone consisting of Ahmednagar, Sangamner, Parner

Shrigonda and Karjat Tahsils constitutes 47.92 percent area of the district, which receives very low and scanty rain-fall. It is almost a scarcity zone.

Zone III : This zone consists of Kopergaon, Shrirampur and Rahuri tahsils and receives low rain-fall but due to development of Canal irrigation system, Sugarcane factories are located in this area. The soil of this zone is very fertile and rich.

Zone IV : Jamkhed, Shevgaon, Pathardi and Newasa constitute, the fourth zone. It received regular rain and the soil of Newasa & Shevgaon is very fertile.

1.5 Famine & Scarcity :

I) Scarcity conditions in the year 1970-71 : It is stated in the earlier paragraph that the rainfall in this district is most erratic. In 1970-71 in all 666 villages with the total population of 8.65 lakhs were affected by famine & chronic scarcity. No exact figures regarding estimated loss due to failure of crops is available. Taccavi loans to the tune of Rs. 15.96 lakhs were distributed. In order to help the agricultural labourers & other affected by Scarcity conditions, the Government had undertaken 313 scarcity relief works in the district. The total number of persons employed on these works was 83,203. The total expenditure incurred for carrying out scarcity relief works was Rs. 7.22 lakhs.

II) Scarcity Conditions in the year 1971-72 : It was expected that scarcity conditions would ease with the onset of monsoon in June-71 but rains were not favourable to this district. Although nearly 467 m.m. of rainfall was recorded, it was very irregular and unsatisfactory. In the month of June-1971, there were erratic and uneven showers in this district. The rains were almost absent in July-1971, however in August-1971, heavy rainfall was recorded in almost all tahsils in the district. The general evaluation of Kharif crops was below six annas in 60 Kharif villages out of

478 Kharif villages. Due to rains in August and September-71 the cultivators had undertaken sowing of rabi crops in rabi as well as Kharif villages. However these crops failed due to inadequate rains after sowing and absence of rains during November 1971. The excessive cold and plant diseases etc. also retarded the prospects of rabi crops. This in the year 1971-72, 990 villages were affected by famine and chronic scarcity. The Government had declared scarcity in 841 villages during 1971-72 rabi season. Thus the district was again caught in the grip of severe scarcity for the second year in succession. This necessitated to undertake large number of scarcity works. In all 768 works were undertaken and Rs. 275 lakhs were spent on these works.

1.6 District Administration : In 1,891 Ahmednagar district had eleven sub-divisions namely, 1) Ahmednagar, 2) Akola, 3) Jamkhed, 4) Karjat, 5) Kopargaon, 6) Newasa, 7) Parner, 8) Rahuri, 9) Sangamner, 10) Shevgaon & 11) Shrigonda.

Pathardi which was part of Jamkhed tahsil was formed into Pathardi Peta in 1913 & then subsequently up-graded to as tahsil in 1941. The remaining portion of Jamkhed tahsil was then re-named as Jamkhed Mahal. Karjat tahsil was downgraded to Karjat peta and subsequently it was again up-graded as tahsil in 1950-51.

For administrative purpose, Ahmednagar district is divided into four sub-divisions, which together contains 13 tahsils. The following table shows the administrative set up of Ahmednagar district.

The district administration can broadly be classified into three categories. 1)State Govt. Administration : This includes Revenue, Forest, Judiciary, Co-operative, B & C Department, I & P Department and Divisional Soil Conservation Office etc.

2)Central Govt. Administration : Income tax, postal Department etc.

3)Local & Public Bodies : This includes Zilla Parishad, Panchayat Samities, Municipalities, M.S.E.B. & State transport.

Collector is incharge of General Administration, Law, & Order & Land Revenue. He is assisted by Resident Deputy Collector and four other Deputy Collectors who hold charge of revenue sub-division described above. Tahsildar is incharge of tahsil.

In order to gear up the development activities & major participation by the people, Zilla Parishad and 13 Panchayat samities were constituted under the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samiti act of 1962. Zilla Parishad has an elected President assisted by vice-President. The administration of Zilla Parishad is carried out through the standing Committee and six subject committees. At Block Level, Panchayat samiti consist & all elected and co-opted members from the area of the block and is headed by Chairman. An I.A.S. Officer works as Chief Executive Officer and he is assisted by various Departmental Heads. At Block Level, Block Development Officer works as a secretary to

the Panchayat Samiti.

All the Urban area and cantonment areas excepting Wari village which is treated as a town in 1971 census have been excluded from the purview of Zilla Parishad. Thus Zilla Parishad covers nearly 99 percent of total area and 89 percent of the total population of the district.

1.7 DEMOGRAPHY:

1) Population: According to 1971 census total population of the district was 22.69 lakhs recording thereby rate of increase of population by 27.77 percent during the 1961-71 decade which is more as compared with the Poona division and also Maharashtra State. The following table indicates the percentage variation in the population of the district since 1901.

It would thus be seen from the above table that the district witnessed, the decrease in population during 1911-21 by 22.33 percent which was due to the severe attack of influenza epidemic of 1918 and due to exodus of the population due to severe famine conditions.

There are significant differences in rates of variation of various tahsils in 1961-71 decade. Shrirampur tahsil has recorded highest increase (38.94 percent) while Parner tahsil has lowest

increase (18.21) percent) over 1961. Rahuri, Newasa, Sangamner, Kopergaon and Shrirampur tahsils are above the district average and remaining tahsils are below that average. The high rate of increase in Kopergaon, Shrirampur and Rahuri tahsils may be due to the extension of canal irrigation and Sugarcane cultivation. Sugar factories located in these tahsils also attract large number of seasonal workers from far off places both within and outside district. Ahmednagar, Parner, Karjat, Jamkhed & Pathardi tahsils are drought prone areas and their low rate of increase may be attributed to the out-migration of large population in 1971 in search of work in Sugar factory areas. The year 1970-71 was a scarcity year. This has resulted in low rate of increase in these tahsils.

ii) Urban and Rural Population : Ahmednagar district is less urbanised as compared to the State. The proportion of Urban population had slightly decreased both for the district, and the state in 1911. It increased in 1921 but again fell in 1931 due perhaps to the economic depression of the thirties. Since then proportion went on increasing to 15.23 percent in 1951 when the number of towns had also increased to 13. There has been a decrease again in the decade (1951-1961) both in number of towns and in proportion of Urban population. This is due to the redefinition of Urban areas in the 1961 census and the consequential declassification of eight towns which have been treated as villages in 1961. The percentage of Urban population to the total population in this district has increased from 10.55 to 11.08 during the decade (1961-71) whereas the corresponding increase for Maharashtra during the same period was from 28.22 to 31.16. Thus Ahmednagar district is less urbanised.

iii) Villages classified by population : According to 1971 census there are 1312 inhabited villages in Ahmednagar district having 20.18 lakhs rural population. These villages are classified into

7 groups according to population, viz. a) less than 200, b) 200-499 (c) 500-999, (d) 1000-1999, (e) 2000-4999, (f) 5000-9999 & (g) 10000 & above. Group (e) having 500-999 population has highest percentage of villages (32 percent) followed by group (d) having 1000-1999 population (31 percent) but concentration of population is more in group (e) having 2000-4999 population (30 percent) followed by group (d) having 1000-1999 population (28 percent).

iv) Density : According to 1971 census, the density of the population of district was 133 per Sq. Km. which shows an increase of 28 as compared to the density of population of this district is lowest in Poona Division.

v) Sex Ratio : Since 1901, the sex-ratio of the population of the district changed between 962 and 1,005 while that of Maharashtra varied between 936 & 978. At each census since 1901 the sex ratio in the district has been higher than average for the state. The same has been the pattern for Urban population also. There has always been a deficiency of females in the population of the district except in 1901. The sex ratio has continuously fallen & the 1971 values are lowest in the last seventy years. It is due to seasonal in migration of a large number of male labourers on Sugar farms and factories from adjoining areas. According to 1971 census the sex ratio for Ahmednagar district is 956 as against 930 of Maharashtra.

vi) Literacy : The district has made much progress in literacy. The following table indicates the percentage of literacy in district since 1901.

During the last four decades, the improvement in literacy has been very significant mainly due to the compulsory primary education and the grant of concessions to the economically backward people by the State Govt. As per 1971 census, the literacy in the urban areas of the district was 59.57 percent while in rural areas it was 33.33 percent. The overall literacy percentage of Nagar district was 36.23 which is less than State average. The literacy percentage for Maharashtra was 39.2.

vii) Workers & Non-workers : As per 1971 census out of total population of 22.69 lakhs, only 8.04 lakhs (about 35 percent) are classified as workers. The percentage of workers among male and females are 50 & 19 respectively. The percentage of workers to the total population which stood at 50.27 percent at the time of 1961 census decreased to 35 percent in 1971. The reason for crease in proportion of workers in 1971 appears to be the change in the concept of workers adopted in 1971.

viii) Scheduled Casts and Scheduled Tribes Population : As per 1971 census scheduled castes and scheduled tribes constitute 9.31 percent and 6.42 percent of the total population of the district respectively. The total population of scheduled castes was 21,1443 and the scheduled tribes population was 1,45,783. The proportion of scheduled tribes in this district is very high as compared to the whole of Poona division.

CHAPTER - II

" Explanatory notes on tables presented in DISTRICT STATISTICAL

ABSTRACT 1971-72 "

2.1 The District Statistical Abstract for the/1971-72 presents statistics on various topics, such as population, Climate, Agriculture, Animal Husbandry and Forest, Employment, Industries & Mining, Co-operation, Medical and Public Health, Education, Transport & Communication, Community Development and Plan etc. The data presented in various tables are collected from the concerned State and Central Govt. departments. The footnotes to the tables indicate the source from which data are collected. In all the tables excepting those on some topics like population and live-stock census, data pertaining to two reference periods, viz. 1970-71 and 1971-72, & Calender year 1970 & 1971 are presented. For the tables pertaining to Agriculture and Co-operation, the reference years are respectively agriculture or co-operative years. Whenever data are not available for the reference year that for the nearest available year is given in the abstract. In each table district totals are given in the beginning & Tahsil-wise break-up follows next. The concepts, sources and limitations adopted while preparing the abstract are given in the following paragraphs.

2.2 Area & Population : Under this head six tables based on figures of 1971 census and one table on 1961 census are prepared. These tables show the salient features of the district viz. 1) Area houses & Population of the district, 2) Population of Urban areas in the district, 3) Literate persons & Scheduled Caste & Scheduled Tribes , 4) Population variation since 1901, 5) Villages classified by population, 6) Workers and Non workers. Only table number six is based on 1961 census pertaining to population according to age group, mother tongue & religion as data of 1971

census are not available.

While referring the data on Urban areas it should be noted that a town or Urban area is a place which has a municipality, Cantonment or a civil line or population of 5000 or more and at least 75 percent of male population dependent on Non-Agricultural pursuits. Population enumerated in Urban area is urban population and the population enumerated in all other places is rural population.

According to 1971 census definition of workers, all those workers who had worked in the current or last working season for greater part of the season were treated as workers. Thus 1971 census instructions stipulated that a person primarily engaged in household duties or those who are students & helped in the family economic activity, but not on a full time scale should be treated as 'Non-workers' in respect of their main activity & the economic activity in which they were marginally engaged might be considered as their secondary work. Due to this changed concept decrease in the proportion of workers is observed as compared to 1961 census data.

2.3 Climate & Rain-fall : The data under this head are collected in 2 tables, one relates to rain-fall and the other the temperature. Table No. 8 presents normal rain-fall and number of rainy days and actual rainfall at various stations in the Nagar district. Normal rainfall means average rain-fall over a long period which is usually 80 years. The data are obtained from the Statistician Department of Agriculture and whenever the same were not available, data supplied by Tahsildars are taken into account. Table No. 9 presents maximum, minimum temperature at Ahmednagar station.

2.4 Agriculture : Under this head, important statistics pertaining to land utilization, area under different crops, irrigation, yield rates and out-turn and agricultural wage rates, minor, medium &

major irrigation works are presented. Information regarding famine and scarcity affected areas is also presented under this head.

Table No. 10 gives tahsil-wise figures of Land Utilisation under different heads of utilisation, Against each tahsil the break-up of the total geographical area according to different types of land use is shown. Area under 'Forest' included all actually forested areas or lands classed or administered as forests under the legal enactment dealing with forests whether State owned or Private. Lands put to non-agricultural uses cover lands occupied by buildings, roads, railways etc. Barren land and unculturable land cover area under mountain, deserts, river beds and areas of lands which cannot be brought under cultivation unless at a very high cost. Culturable waste includes all lands available for cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation ~~whether not taken up for cultivation~~ or taken up for cultivation once but not cultivated during current year and last five years or more in succession. Such lands may be either fallow or covered with shrubs and jungles which are not put to any use. Permanent pastures and grazing lands cover all grazing lands whether they are permanent pastures and meadows or not and village common grazing lands within forest areas. Miscellaneous tree crops and groves not included in the area sown cover lands under casurina trees, thatching grass, bamboo bushes and other groves used for fuels etc. Lands which are not included under 'Orchards' are classed under this category. Current fallows comprise cropped areas which are kept fallow during the current year. If any seedlings area is not cropped again during the same year it is also treated as current fallow. Other fallow land includes all lands which were taken up for cultivation but are temporarily off of cultivation

for a period of not less than one year, and not more than 5 years. The net area sown consists of net area sown with crops and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once. The gross cropped area represents the sum of areas under all crops. The difference between total cropped area and net area sown is accounted for by the area sown more than once on the same land during the same year with same or different crops. The data on yield rates and out-turn of principal crops are given in table No. 12. The figures of out-turn are based on estimates worked out on results of crops cutting surveys and partly on 'Annewari' method.

Regarding irrigation works it may be mentioned that a work involving an expenditure of less than Rs. 20 lakhs is treated as 'Minor Irrigation Work' that covering irrigable area upto 250 acres is entrusted to Zilla Parishad and works above 250 acres area implemented by the Irrigation Department of State Govt.

2.5 Animal Husbandry and Forest : Under this head, information regarding live-stock census, veterinary statistics, recognised slaughter houses and forest statistics is presented. Table No. 21 gives number of various types of Live-stock poultry etc. as enumerated at the time of 1966 live-stock census. In this census all live-stock were enumerated by house to house enquiry. Particular care was taken to enumerate live-stock in slaughter houses stray animals and animals in transit. Table No. 22 gives the information regarding veterinary statistics in each tahsil, while table number 23 gives diseases-wise live-stock mortality. The information regarding animals slaughtered in recognised slaughter houses is presented in table number 24. Animals slaughtered by butchers in rural areas is not available. Table No. 25(A) gives figures of area under forest in the district. The forest area figures in this table are different from the figures in the table

on land utilisation. The concept of classifying areas is different for the two departments. Table No. 25(a) gives the information regarding production & value of major and minor forest products in the Nagar district.

2.6 : Employment, Industry, Mining and Electricity : Under this head, information on various items like factory statistic, data furnished by Employment Exchange, census of Govt. Employees, generation and consumption of electricity & number of towns & villages electrified is presented. Regarding factory statistics, it may be stated that the data covers factories registered under Factories Act 1948 viz. those employing 10 or more workers and working with aid of power and those employing 20 or more workers and working without aid of power. The results of the Annual survey of industries are given in table number 34. The term productive capital used in that table consists of fixed & working capital. The gross out-put represents value of products and by products manufactured for sale, work done for customers and sale value of goods sold in the same condition as purchased and is adjusted for the difference in stock of semi finished goods at the beginning and at the end of survey year. Value added by manufacture is computed by deducting from gross ex-factory value of out-put, the gross value of input. Value added is net of depreciation. In electricity table information regarding type of generation and electricity used for different purposes is given.

2.7 Co-operation : Comprehensive data on this subject are displayed in tables 37 to 44 which includes number of different types of societies, statistics relating to co-operative Banks, primary agricultural credit societies etc. The co-operative year starts in July and ends in June.

2.8 Medical and Public Health : Under this head, information regarding medical & Public health facilities is collected. Table

No. 45 shows the medical facilities available in the district. It shows the number of hospitals, dispensaries, maternity homes, primary health centres, doctors, beds available, indoor and outdoor patients treated. The material presented here includes data on Civil Hospital, Zilla Parishad dispensaries, P.H.C. Municipal dispensaries and Private aided institutions. It does not cover private unaided institutions run by individuals or associations. Table No. 46 indicate the data about births, deaths and infant deaths. The figures of infant death relates to the death of Children below one year. In table No. 47, data of number of death due to principal causes in shown. Table No. 48 gives information regarding primary vaccination, revaccination and Cholera inoculation in the district. A new table on family planning is added in the present abstract.

2.9 Education : Under this head, information regarding progress of education in the Ahmednagar district is collected & presented in 7 different tables. Table No. 50 gives the number of literates (as per 1971 census), sex-wise for rural and urban areas separately. Table No. 51 gives sex-wise literates with different levels of education of rural population. It shows tahsil-wise break-up also. Table No. 52 gives the information regarding literates with different levels of education (Technical and non-technical) in Urban areas of the district. The information on these two tables is based on 1961 census as 1971 census data is not available. Table No. 53 shows the number of different types of educational institutions, pupils and teachers for each type in the district. The number of institutions relate to the academic year ending June and the number of pupils as on 31st March-72. In table No. 54 the total number of beneficiaries (Backward - Classes) at each level of education is shown. Table No. 55 gives...

gives the information regarding total number of students taking benefits under the scheme of free studentship as E.B.C. students and and total value of each concession for the educational levels for the district as a whole. Table No. 56 gives information about expenditure on primary education by Zilla Parishad and municipal councils.

2.10 Transport and Communication : Under this head information pertaining to the length of railway route, road length according to different category and surface classification, operational statistics of nationalised road transport etc. traffic census & postal statistics etc. is presented.

Table No. 57 presents the information on length of railway route in the district. There is only one guage viz. broad guage in the district. It is a single line starting from Marwad and ending at Dhond. In table No. 58 the figures relates to extra municipal roads maintained by B. & C. and Zilla Parishad category wise and surface classification wise. Table No. 59 presents data about motor vehicles in the Poona region, comprising of Poona, Ahmednagar, Satara and Sholapur districts. Vehicles in operation means vehicles on live register of R.T.O. Table No. 60 relates to nationalized road transport. The information on number of routes, route distance, average daily earnings etc. is given. The boundary of S.T. division is not exactly coterminus with the district boundary. In table No. 61 the data of traffic census where information regarding number of vehicles, light moter vehicles, total traffic intensity in 24 hours is given. Table No. 62 gives some important statistics regarding posts and telegraph offices and no. of letter boxes, etc. in the district. Table No. 63 gives information where radho sets are installed. Here hamlets are separately counted where receiving sets are installed. Hence number of v llages appear to

to be high.

2.11 Local Bodies : Under this head information regarding income and expenditure of various Local bodies viz. village Panchayats, Zilla Parishad and municipalities in the district is presented. Table No. 64 presents material on income and expenditure of village panchayats, zilla parishad and municipalities at five different points of time. In table No. 65 break up of information on Income and Expenditure of village Panchayats is presented. It gives panchayat samiti-wise break-up on one hand & income and expenditure on the other hand. The total income and expenditure is further sub-divided into various major heads. Table No. 66-A, 66-B & 66-C give particulars of head-wise receipts Govt. grants and head wise expenditure, of Ahmednagar Zilla Parishad respectively. Table No. 67 gives information on income from and expenditure on different sub-heads in respect of Municipalities. Under income, information separately shown under grants, taxes & other income. Under expenditure further break-up into general administration, public safety and public works etc. is shown.

2.12 Plan & Community Development : Under this section five tables are presented. The first two table Nos. 68 & 69 gives important plan statistics viz. plan expenditure under different heads, sub-heads of development and important physical achievements. The other three tables give data regarding C.D. programme and expenditure incurred in different stages of blocks, & physical achievements on selected items in all blocks.

2.13 : Prices : Under this head, wholesale prices of certain Agricultural Commodities in selected centres, average retail prices of selected commodities prevailing at Ahmednagar during 1971 & the consumer price index for working class at Sholapur and Poona are presented. As regards the wholesale prices, the district

averages of only important commodities are given while for the average retail prices, the information collected for the given commodities are restricted to only one quotation and that too from one shop at district head quarter. The average of individual commodities cannot be said to be fully representative but data may prove useful as a broad indicator of trend in changes in retail prices. Table Nos. 75-A & 75-B give consumer price index number for working class for Poona and Sholapur for the year 1971-72.

2.14 : Miscellaneous : As the head indicates, data on various subjects like crime statistics, Cinema Statistics, Collection of Small savings, Land revenue etc. which could not be incorporated under any of the twelve major heads noted above are presented in this section.

2.15 : Selected Indicators : Important indicators for the district as a whole in different fields of development such as population Agriculture, Live-stock, Factory Employment, electricity, co-operation, Education, Medical & Public Health, Transport etc. are presented in table number of 87. The period of time covers six years 1950-51, 1960-61, 1966-67, 1969-70, 1970-71 & 1971-72.

CHAPTER - III

An analytical Review of Sectorial Trends :

In this chapter, by working out important indicators on Agriculture, Irrigation, Live-stock, Road-mileage etc. the trend in the various Socio Economic aspects of Ahmednagar district is analysed. Tahsil is taken as a unit for examining the progress in a particular sector at two different points of time. The base year is taken as 1960-61 i.e. the end of the Second Five Year Plan. The position of Ahmednagar district vis-a vis Poona Division is also indicated wherever possible.

3.2 AGRICULTURE :

Agriculture is the backbone of our national economy. This is also true in respect of Maharashtra in general and Ahmednagar district in particular. For assessing the agricultural development, indicators like percentage of irrigated area etc. are adopted. Double cropping is one of the methods of increasing agricultural out-put. Table No. 1 given below shows the Tahsil-wise position of percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown during 1960-61, 1969-70 & 1970-71.

3.3 It would be seen from the above table that extent of double cropping is very small in this district as well as in the the division. In fact the percentage of gross cropped area declined during 1969-70 by 0.24 points but it picked up again in 1970-71 and rose to 105.28 i.e. an increase of 0.12 points over 1960-61. During 1969-70, out of 13 Tahsils in the district eight tahsils were having this percentage less than 105 & remaining 5 tahsils having this percentage between 105 to 110, while in 1970-71,, 6 tahsils were having this percentage less than 105, and Seven tahsils were having this percentage between 105 to 110. During the period of 10 years it is a disturbing fact that Sangamner, Newasa, Shrigonda and Karjat Tahsils have registered a decline in double cropped area. Maximum double cropped area during 1970-71 was in Jamkhed Tahsil (107.37) Irrigation is one of the factors which helps the increase in double cropping activities, provided it is not used for perennial crops. In Nagar district Kopargaon, Shrirampur & Rahuri have large percentage of irrigated areas. However most of the irrigated area is under Sugarcane and hence double cropping is insignificant, Since double cropping is closely related to availability of irrigation facilities, the next indicator worked out pertains to irrigation.

3.4 IRRIGATION :

The agricultural strategy hinges mainly on irrigation. The tahsilwise position of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area can be seen from the following table.

3.5 : It is seen from the above table that the percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area during 1960-61 was 114, which changed to 118 during 1969-70 and remained almost stationary during 1970-71. For Poona Division this percentage during 1969-70 was 116.71 slightly lower than district percentage. However for the year 1970-71 this percentage was on high side as compared to district percentage.

The percentage of net irrigated area sown can be seen from the following table.

It is revealed from the above table that the position of Ahmednagar district is slightly better than that of the division in respect of irrigation. While comparing the position of tahsils within the district it is seen that Kopergaon, Shrirampur and Rahuri-Tahsils have got higher percentage of net area sown to the net area irrigated. However decrease in percentage of net area sown to the net area irrigated is seen during 1970-71 in Parner, Ahmednagar, Pathardi and Jamkhed tahsils as compared to 1960-61.

3.6 Productivity of Important crops : Rice, Jowar, Bajara,

Sugarcane, Groundnut, & Cotton are some of the principal crops of Ahmednagar district. The following table gives their yield rates and out-turn.

It is revealed from the above table that yield rates during 1970-71 of Rice, Cotton and Sugarcane have declined as compared to 1961-62. The yield of Jowar, Bajara, Groundnut have shown an increase in yield rates.

3.7 : Changes in cropping Patterns :

The following table gives the percentages of areas under cereals, pulses, total food-grains, Sugarcane, Cotton, Groundnut and total Non-food crops.

It is seen from the above table that the percentage of area irrigated under cereals increased from 6.13 in 1960-61 to 6.49 in 1970-71 but it was almost stagnant in 1969-70. The total area under cereals as a percentage to the total gross cropped area remained more or less the same during last 10 years. The percentage area under total pulses showed an increase. Same is the case with Sugar-cane. This district is one of the chief producers of Sugarcane in the division. It is therefore, a matter of concern that even though the percentage area under sugarcane has increased, the yield rate has declined

effecting total production of Sugar. It will also be seen that percentage of Cotton declined from 2.44 in 1960-61 to 1.89 in 1969-70 but it again picked up in 1970-71. It is also worth noting that percentage area under groundnut has declined during 1969-70 & 1970-71 as compared to 1960-61 percentage.

3.8 Agricultural Credit and Outstanding dues : Co-operative societies play a very important role in Agricultural development by extending credit facilities, to the agriculturist who have no sufficient economic resources of their own.

The following table shows the agricultural credit facilities available during 1961-62, 1970-71 & 1971-72 in Nagar district.

It is seen from the above table that the financial health of the primary agricultural credit societies is unsound and deteriorating. The quantum of loan advanced increased by 285 percent during 1971-72 as compared to the year 1961-62. The loans outstanding increased three fold and stood at Rs. 18.42 crores.

The position of over dues is more alarming as the increase is more than 1100 percent.

3.9 Agricultural Wage Rates :

Agriculture wage rates in each district of Maharashtra State are being collected from 1962-63. For each district, three rural centres have been selected from which wage rate data are collected. In Nagar district the selected centres are 1)Belapur, 2)Karjat, & 3)Akola. The average Agri. wage rates during 1963, 1970 & 1971 were as below :-

It will be observed from the table that wage rates in respect of males and females have increased during 1970 & 1971 as compared to 1963. Also there is slight increase in wage rates of females during 1971 as compared to wage rate of 1970. Increase in wage rates is the resultant effect of overall increase in prices.

3.10 Live-stock : Animal husbandry plays an important role in our economy by providing supplementary income to the agriculturists. Live-stock census is held every five years. The tenth Live-stock census was held in 1966 in the State. The variation in Live-stock population during the five years since 1961 can be seen from the following table.

It is thus seen that total bovine population has increased from 9.50 lakhs to 9.56 lakhs during the 5 year period. There is a decrease in buffaloes in the district during 1966 as compared with 1961 census figures. The comparison of 1961 and 1966 live-stock data shows that total live-stock population has gone up by 65,704 during the 5 years and the total during 1966 was 17.66 lakhs. The following table gives the data regarding cultivable land in the year 1961-62, 1965-66, total live-stock in the year 1961 & 1966 and Live-stock per hundred hectares of land.

It will be seen from the table that the gross cropped area per pair of Bullocks has decreased from 1965-66 on-wards.

3.11 Poultry : The total Poultry in this district was 6.25 lakhs during 1961 which increased to 6.90 lakhs during 1966. The increase is about 10 percent during 5 years. In Parner tahsil maximum number of poultry is located, followed by Sangamner, Nagar, Shrigonda and Karjat Tahsils. The poultry per 1,000 human population ^{is} 388 for the district. It varies from Tahsil to Tahsil.

3.12 : Per capita consumption of Electricity : Electricity is one of the important items of infra-structure of economy with its multiple uses. The trend in availability of electric power per-capita can be assessed by working out the percapita consumption. Ahmednagar district stands out as a backward district in Poona division as far as electricity consumption is concerned. While working out the per capita consumption of electricity that generated by Sugar factories is not considered as the relevant data area not available. The following table gives per capita consumption of electricity.

It would be seen from the above table that per capita consumption increased by nearly 21 times during 1971-72 as compared with 1961-62. Out of 1318 villages in the district in all 631 villages were electrified upto 1971-72. This means nearly 48 percent of villages were electrified up-to 1971-72.

3.13 Employment Exchange Statistics : It is a known fact that the number of unemployed and under employed is quite distressing and every year the number is swelling, Comprehensive statistics are lacking on this vital subject and only Employment Exchange data are available. The employment exchange is a link between employer and un-employed but all un-employed persons do not necessarily register their names in Employment exchange and hence the magnitude of un-employment can-not be accurately ascertained from the employment exchange statistics. Moreover, mainly persons from Urban areas register their names in the employment exchange. The Employment Exchange statistics has to be seen from these limitations in view. The position

of Nagar district as regards registration in the employment exchange during 1970-71 and 1971-72 was 9,732 and 10,262 respectively while the position of placement during the same period was 915 and 592 respectively. It would be seen that though the registration during 1971-72 is slightly more than in 1970-71 the position of placement during 1970-71 was much better than in 1971-72.

3.14 Indoor and Out-door-Patients treated : The following table indicates the position of Indoor and Out-door patients treated in hospitals in Nagar district.

It would be seen from the above table that no. of indoor as well as out-door patients have increased during 1971 as compared to 1970. In Nagar district there are 4 Hospitals 98 doctors and 298 nurses in Govt. & aided hospitals. No. of doctors, Nurses, per thousand population is less than one in Nagar district.

3.15 : Increase in number of students : Education is the most effective means for progress. It helps to make people more aware of the need for development and equip them to participate in development process. The percentages of pupils taking education in primary, Secondary and Higher schools are shown in the

following table. The figures supplied below show the percentage increase during 1969-70 and 1970-71 over 1961-62.

It would be seen that no. of students per teacher has increased from 1961-62 onwards both in primary and Secondary education. In 1969-70, the no. of students per teacher in primary and secondary education was 41 and 23 respectively, while corresponding figures for 1970-71 were 40 & 25.

3.16 Road Mileage : Transport is one of the important items

of infrastructure of the economy. The increase in road mileage

per 100 Sq. Km. during 1960-61, 1970-71 & 1971-72 would be a good indicator of development. The following table gives the surface type-wise road length in Nagar district.

From the above table, it is seen that total road length increased from 3024.K.M. in 1960-61 to 4199 in 1970-71 but in 1971-72 it suddenly increased to 6940 K.M. This increase in road length was due to the fact that large no. of road works were under taken as scarcity relief works. The road length per 100 Sq. Kms. was only 18 in 1960-61, which increased to 25 in 1970-71 and 41 in 1971-72. This means during last 11 years the road length has increased more than double.

The rail length has still not under-gone any change in this district.

3.17 Banking facilities : Without sound financial system, economic development is not possible. Development in Banking facilities in proportion to the population would be a good indicator. In Ahmednagar district there were only 41 banking offices in 1961-62 i.e. there were only 2 banking offices per lakh of population. The no. of banking offices during 1970 weree 113, while in 1971

there were 122 banking offices in Nagar district. The number of banking offices per lakh population were 6 in 1970 (1961-population) & 5 in 1971 (1971 population).

3.18 Prices : Last indicator is prices, the impact of which is felt in every day life. The index is computed for two places viz. Sholapur and Poona in this division with 1960 & 1961 as the base years respectively. The general Index stood at 198 and 176 during 1971-72 for these centres. The index for food shot up from 198 in 1970-71 to 214 in 1971-72 at Sholapur, while at Poona it increased from 185 to 189.

Since the retail prices are collected at district head quarter from November-1962 the average prices during 1963 are compared with the average prices during 1970 and 1971 in the following table.

It would be seen from the above table that prices of all commodities of daily necessity have increased more than double since 1963. The price of Jowar which is the staple food of this district rose from 45 paise per Kg in 1963 to Rs. 0.84 paise in 1970 and Rs. 1.00 in 1971. The prices of other commodities also have shown a considerable increase.

CHAPTER IV

Plan Achievements during 1971-72 :

4.1 The year 1969-70 marked the commencement of Fourth Five Year Plan. The year 1971-72 was the third year of Fourth Five Year Plan. However in the absence of the finalisation of the Fourth Five Year Plan, it was implemented as an Annual Plan.

4.2 The progress made in 1971-72 can be better judged by comparing the expenditure incurred during that year with the figures of 1970-71. The following table gives the particulars of expenditure incurred during 1970-71 & 1971-72.

It is revealed from the above table that the expenditure incurred during 1971-72 was more than double, the expenditure incurred in 1970-71. There was considerable increase in expenditure under major heads (i) Irrigation and Power, (ii) Social Services during 1971-72. Under other major heads the expenditure was more or less the same during 1971-72 as compared to the earlier year. The expenditure incurred on various major heads of development and important physical achievements are reviewed in the following paragraphs.

4.3 Agricultural Programme :

About seventy percent of Maharashtra's population depends on Agriculture and allied activities, yet the contribution of Agriculture to the State income of Maharashtra

is only 34 percent of the total income. Hence the development of Agriculture is very important but is a difficult task. The following table shows the expenditure incurred on district level schemes during 1970-71 and 1971-72 under the various sub-heads of development under Agricultural programme.

It would be seen from the above table that greater importance was given to the programmes of Soil Conservation and Minor Irrigation during 1971-72, followed by Ayacut Development & Agricultural production. Slightly more amount was spent on Animal Husbandry and fisheries during 1971-72 as compared to the expenditure of 1970-71. The progress under each sub-head is described below :

1) Agricultural Production :

Under Agricultural production, various schemes like establishment of seed farms, general horticultural development,

construction of community wells and integrated area development Schemes were executed. Agriculture being a private enterprise, Govt. activities with regard to improvement in Agricultural production consist of distribution of (1) improved seeds, (2) Chemical Fertilisers and 3) Compost production etc...

The following table gives the idea of improved seeds distributed, chemical fertilisers distributed and compost production.

It is revealed from the above table that the programme of distribution of improved seeds and fertilisers got a set back during 1971-72 as compared to 1970-71. This was mainly due to the fact that almost the whole district was affected by scarcity for the second year in succession. The rainfall was quite erratic since beginning, hence this

Programme got a set back during 1971-72. For all the schemes under Agricultural production, Rs. 10.81 lakh were spent in 1971-72 as against Rs. 12.90 lakhs in 1970-71. The budget provision was Rs. 11.06 lakhs during 1971-72, against this an amount of Rs. 10.81 lakhs were spent which comes to nearly 98% of the total budget provision.

2) Minor Irrigation :

Minor irrigation yields quick results. The programme of construction of wells, installation of pumping sets, construction of percolation tanks etc. was taken up during 1971-72. By incurring an expenditure of Rs. 35.71 lakhs 440 new wells were constructed, 950 pumping sets were installed and 17 percolation tanks were completed, while in 1970-71 358 wells were constructed, 654 pumping sets were installed and 9 percolation tanks were completed. The total budget provision during 1971-72 was Rs. 26.87 lakhs, against this provision an amount of Rs. 35.71 lakhs were spent which comes to nearly 133 percent.

3) Soil Conservation : One of the causes of low production in agriculture is progressive deterioration of soil due to erosion. In irrigated areas, soil deterioration occurs due to water logging and resultantly it turns into saline and alkaline soil. Thus it was necessary to take effective steps to stop further deterioration of the soil. Hence various schemes like bunding & terracing of land were undertaken in the State Sector. For these schemes Rs. 57.16 lakhs and Rs. 58.31 lakhs were spent during 1970-71 and 1971-72 respectively. The percentage of the total expenditure to the budget provision during 1971-72 comes to nearly 100. In all

53898 acres & 25886 acres of land were bunded in these two years respectively.

4) Ayacut Development : This programme was continued during 1971-72 also. In all Rs. 18.78 lakhs were spent during 1971-72. In 1970-71 only Rs. 10.39 lakhs were spent, as against the budget provision of Rs. 17.83 lakhs, the percentage of expenditure to the budget provision comes to 105.

5) Animal Husbandry : Animal Husbandry programme includes provision of veterinary dispensaries and veterinary aid centres. In all Rs. 0.14 lakh were spent during 1970-71 while Rs. 0.21 lakhs were spent during 1971-72, as against the budget provision of Rs. 0.21 lakhs i.e. 100% amount was spent.

6) Dairy Development : The main object of this scheme is to be step up milk production and supply of quality milk to the consumers at reasonable rates. It also helps the farmers to supplement and stabilize their income. During 1970-71 and 1971-72 Rs. 0.10 lakhs and Rs. 0.08 lakhs were spent. The total budget provision was Rs. 1.47 lakhs during 1971-72. This means, hardly 6 percent amount was spent.

7) Forest : The schemes under forest include 1) Development Minor forest produce, 2) Plantation of valuable trees & 3) development of fodder and rural extension of forestry. During 1970-71 and 1971-72 Rs. 1.01 lakhs each were spent. The expenditure incurred was 100 percent during 1971-72.

8) Fisheries : No schemes under development of fisheries worth mentioning could be undertaken in this district in absence of big tanks. However programme of inland fisheries was under taken and for this Rs. 0.03 lakhs and Rs. 0.29 lakhs were spent during 1970-71 and 1971-72 respectively.

The percentage of expenditure to the total budget provision was 95 % during 1971-72.

9) Ware housing & Marketing : Under this sub-head, there was only one scheme in operation i.e. development of agricultural marketing. During 1970-71 Rs. 2.01 lakhs were spent while in 1971-72 Rs. 1.62 lakhs only were spent. During 1971-72, an amount of Rs. 0.55 only were earmarked.

4.4. CO-OPERATION & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT :

Under this head in all Rs. 14.15 lakhs and Rs. 14.14 lakhs were spent during 1970-71 and 1971-72 respectively.

1. Co-operation : In the Socio Economic conditions prevailing in the country, co-operation is one of the best means for the up-lift of the society. Co-operation has become the principal basis of organisation in many branches of economic life, notably in agriculture, marketing, supplies, housing, establishment of agro-industries. During 1970-71 - 48 societies were assisted by way of granting them subsidy, while in 1971-72 only 22 societies were assisted. During 1970-71 - 27 co-operative Godowns were given subsidy. In all for all the schemes under co-operation Rs. 1.97 lakhs and Rs. 2.03 lakhs were spent during 1970-71 and 1971-72 respectively. The total budget provision during 1971-72 was Rs. 14.14 lakhs.

2. Community Development : The idea of community development was mooted during the first five year plan to gear up the peoples masses. During 1970-71 Rs. 12.18 lakhs were spent while in 1971-72 Rs. 12.11 lakhs were spent in all the 15 blocks in this district, as against the budget provision of Rs. 12.19 lakhs, nearly 99 percent amount was spent. There

are two tribal development blocks in the district. Applied nutrition programme was implemented in 4 blocks. viz, 1) Karjat, Nagar, Jamkhed, & Akole. This scheme is implemented by Zilla Parishad, Nagar for which Rs. 1.49 lakhs were spent during 1971-72.

4.5 Irrigation & Power : Expansion of Irrigation facilities is an essential pre-requisite for diversifying and promoting agricultural activities and increasing crop yields where as the development of power helps to transfer the agricultural economy and for creating potential for industrial development. Electrification constitutes one of the important items in the infrastructure of the economy. Under this head, rural electrification scheme was mainly carried out for which Rs. 2.65 lakhs were spent during 1970-71 while the expenditure was very meagre during 1970-71. In all 145 villages were electrified during 1971-72. In all Rs. 170 lakhs were provided of which Rs. 169.99 lakhs were spent. This means 100 percent expenditure was incurred during 1971-72.

4.6 Industry & Mining : Development of small scale industries helps in dispersal of industries, provided avenues of employment and helps capital mobilisation. With a view to achieving these objectives, the schemes of development of handloom industry, financial assistance to industrial co-operatives and federations were implemented in this district. The total expenditure incurred was Rs. 1.46 lakh and Rs. 1.87 lakhs during 1970-71 & 1971-72 respectively. During 1971-72 in all 121 artisans were given financial assistance. 99 percent of expenditure was incurred during 1971-72.

4.7 Transport & Communication : Dhond to Manmad is the only rail link in Nagar district. Hence road-development plays an important role in the economic development of this district. Due to the expansion of Sugar industries and other developmental activities in the district the need for development of road transport is still in prominence for inter-linking market places and other important villages and towns in this district. Taking all these factors into consideration Rs. 14.76 lakhs and Rs. 14.84 lakhs were spent during 1970-71 and 1971-72 respectively for the development of district roads, roads in Sugarcane areas, rural roads and roads in hilly areas etc. During 1971-72, 100 percent expenditure was incurred.

4.8 Social Services :

This developmental head includes schemes pertaining to i) General education and development of technical education. ii) Medical, nursing and public health, iii) water supply and drainage, iv) Housing and v) Welfare of Backward class, vi) Social welfare, vii) Labour and Labour welfare. Total expenditure of Rs. 71.81 lakhs and Rs. 165.33 lakhs was incurred during 1970-71 and 1971-72 respectively. The following paragraphs give the account of each sub-head of development.

1) General Education : Spread of education is very essential for Socio-Economic development. According to 1971 census, the percentage of literates in this district was 36.29.

General education programme includes normal expansion of primary education at primary stage, development of non-Govt. secondary schools granting scholarships in the secondary schools, removal of illiteracy and economically backward class education etc. For all these schemes Rs. 29.15 lakhs were spent during 1970-71. While during 1971-72, an amount of Rs. 69.56 lakhs were provided of which Rs. 69.15 lakhs were spent and nearly 100 percent expenditure was incurred. During 1970-71 in all 651 additional primary teachers were appointed and 370 teachers were trained, while in 1971-72, 1407 additional teachers were appointed. Concessions under E.B.C. Scheme were granted to 5740 and 14400 pupils during 1970-71 and 1971-72 respectively. During 1970-71, 345 primary teachers were given loans for training while in 1971-72, only 173 primary teachers were given loan for training.

2) Medical, Nursing and Public Health : Under the scheme ...

of medical & nursing Rs. 2.67 lakhs were spent during 1970-71 for expanding the facilities in Civil Hospital & Primary health centres while in 1971-72 Rs. 3.40 lakh were spent, as against the budget/provision of Rs. 5.07 lakhs. This means only 67 percent budget^{ed}/amount was spent.

3) Water supply and Drainage : Under this sub-head, various Urban as well as rural water supply schemes were undertaken. Most of the Urban water supply and drainage schemes are in progress while under rural water supply schemes in all 159 wells and 64 wells were constructed during 1970-71 & 1971-72 respectively. In addition to this 353 bores were taken during 1971-72. In all Rs. 29.28 lakhs were spent during 1970-71 and during 1971-72 Rs. 7.11 lakhs were spent as against the budget provision of Rs. 82.32 lakhs.

4) Housing : Extention of village gaathan & provision of housing sites and village housing project are the main schemes included under this sub-head. During 1970-71 in all Rs. 2.24 lakhs were spent while during 1971-72 an amount of Rs. 8.63 lakhs were spent as against the budget provision of Rs. 9.71 lakhs. This means nearly 89 percent amount was spent. Under village housing project only 7 houses were constructed at the cost of Rs. 11,000 while in 1971-72 only 3 houses were constructed at the cost of Rs. 5,000.

5) Welfare of Backward Classes : Schemes under this sub-heads include 1) Grant of Scholarships, tuition fees, and examination fees etc. to SC/ST/OBC students, 2) Grants to backward class hostels, 3) Construction of new irrigation wells for backward class, Agriculturists and 4) Housing aid to backward classes. In all Rs. 3.48 lakhs were spent for these schemes during 1971-72. 100 percent expenditure by implementation of these...

various schemes 1317 SC/ST/OBC students were granted scholarships, 8 hostels were given grants, 109 new irrigation wells were constructed for B.C. Agriculturists and 29 houses were built for B.Cs during 1970-71, while in 1971-72, 664 SC/ST/OBC students were granted scholarships, 27 hostels & 40 Irrigation wells were constructed for B.Cs.

6) Labour & Labour Welfare : Under this sub-head, training to craftsmen was imparted. During 1970-71 expenditure of Rs. 2.65 lakhs was incurred while in 1971-72 Rs. 2.16 lakhs were spent, out of Rs. 2.48 lakhs provided.

7) Miscellaneous : Under this head of development the scheme pertaining to information and broad-casting was implemented for which Rs. 0.63 lakhs were spent during 1970-71 & Rs. 0.42 lakhs were spent during 1971-72. 100 percent expenditure was incurred. During 1970-71, 63 radio sets were installed while in 1971-72, 33 sets were installed.

4.9 CENTRALLY SPONSORED SCHEMES :

In addition to the above state plan schemes, 12 different centrally sponsored schemes under various sub-heads of development were also implemented during 1971-72 at a cost of Rs. 107.58 lakhs. Some of the worth mentioning schemes under centrally sponsored schemes are 1) Draught prone area programme, 2) Eradication of Small Pox and Malaria, 3) Family Planning and 4) Crash scheme for rural employment. The expenditure incurred on these various schemes and their important physical achievements are reviewed below :

1) Agricultural Production : Under this sub-head of development a scheme of conducting assessment surveys for determina-

determination of yield rates of high yielding varieties is implemented. In all Rs. 0.12 lakhs were provided for this scheme and 100 percent expenditure is incurred during 1971-72 .

II) Minor Irrigation : With a view to accelerating the rate of development in chronically scarcity areas, a massive programme fully assisted by the Govt. of India has been undertaken in this district. For this purpose a Master Plan has been prepared, under this schemes like minor irrigation, Soil Conservation and Afforestation are being implemented. In all Rs. 2 crores have been earmarked of which Rs. 70.87 lakhs were provided during 1971-72, as against this provision an amount of Rs. 68.93 lakhs were spent. The percentage of expenditure to the total budget provision thus comes to 97.44%. In all 30 percolation tanks and 9 Minor Irrigation tanks are undertaken under this scheme.

III) Public Health : Under this sub-head Eradication of Small Pox, malaria and family Planning etc. are implemented. In all Rs. 31.78 lakhs were provided during 1971-72 , of which Rs. 28.61 lakhs are spent. This means nearly 90 percent of expenditure was incurred during 1971-72. Under family Planning programme in all 16832 operations were performed.

IV) Welfare of backward Classes : Under this sub-head of development, schemes like Exemption of fees etc. to Vimukta Jatis, Starting of balwadis for V.Js and Tribal Development blocks were under-taken. For all these schemes, Rs. 2.04 lakhs were provided during 1971-72 but the total

the total expenditure incurred ~~was~~ Rs. 2.08 lakhs. This means more than 100 percent expenditure was incurred for these schemes. As regards physical achievement in all 2 Tribal Development Blocks are launched 15 labour co-operative societies of V.Js. were assisted.

V) Crash Scheme for Rural Employment : The main object of this scheme is to provide employment to 1,000 persons from this district preferably from the households where there is not a single earning members and wages should not exceed Rs. 100/- p.m. Under this scheme, some road-works and percolation tanks were undertaken. The total budget provision for this scheme, was Rs. 12.50 lakhs of which Rs. 7.77 lakhs are spent during 1971-72. This means nearly 53 percent of the budgeted amount was spent during the year under review.
