C H A P T E R - I

1.1 Sholapur district lies in the Bhima and Sina basins between 17° and 19° north latitudes and 75° and 76° east longitudes has an area of 15021 square kilometres lying in the centre of a large plain 1800 feet above mean sea level. Of this, urban areas account for 414 Kms and rural areas for 14607 Kms.

The District is bounded on the North by Ahmednagar and Osmanabad districts, on the East, by Osmanabad and Andhra Pradesh, on the South by Sangli district and Mysore State & on the West by Satara and Poona districts. Sholapur city, the district Head quarter is situated at a distance of about 450 Kms from Bombay city which is the State Head quarter and -- about 265 Kms from Poona city, the Divisional Head quarter.

1.2 Topography:-

1) Soils:- The soil of the district can be classified into three kinds viz. Black Barad or Coarse gray and Tambadi or reddish. Except in Barshi, where black soil is the rule and coarse gray is rare, most of the district is either gray or red. The soils of uplands are shallow and more suitable for sheep grazing than cultivation. The soil is generally light and of moderate depth in North Sholapur taluka. Deep black soil of richer quality is however predominant between the two rivers Bhima and Sina. In Pandharpur taluka, the soil is generally poor. So also in most part of Sangola taluka, the soil is poor and shallow. The soil of Malsiras taluka is in general shallow and light in colour and not retentive of moisture. Large portion of Madha taluka has generally shallow soil with varying depth and quality. In Akkalkot taluka, the soil is rich in the vicinity of Bhima and Sina rivers.

In Karmala taluka, one half of the soil is black and one quarter each red and barad. The soils of Mangalvada taluka are deep black.

2) Rivers:-

The Chief rivers are the Bhima with its right bank feeders the Nira and the Man and its left bank feeder, the Sina which receives the Bhogawati from the North. The Bhima and the Sina run South East, the Nira and the Man nearly East and the Bhogawati South East. During the dry season, all the rivers are fordable. Even in the Bhima except for occassional pools, the Stream dries up and runs only ankle deep. The geographical area of Sholapur district under Bhima sub-basin comprises of 14,99,616 hect. of which culturable area is 13,26,809 hect. The length of the Bhima river is 289 Kms within the district.

3) Hill Ranges:-

There is no important hill system in the district. Only in the North of Barshi taluka several spurs of Balaghat ranges are seen for a few Kms. There are also scattered hills in Karmala, Madha and Malsiras talukas. The district has in general flat or undulating terrain. The low table aland and small separate hills in Karmala and Madha talukas act as the watershed between the Bhima river and the Sina river.

1.3 Climate:-

1) The climate is healthy and agreeable except from March to May. Climateically, there are three seasons i.e. Summer, rainy and winter. Summer starts from the beginning of March and lasts upto middle of June, during which the climate is hot during the day time though cool at night. The rainy season starts from middle of June and lasts upto end of October.

It is followed by winter, from November to February. During cold season, the air is generally bright clear and bracing. The hot season is marked by dry scroching heat, strong hot winds and occational dust storms. Nights are however generally cool. In rainy season, the temperature is generally mild and even. Except hot months i.e March, April and May, the climate is free from extremes of heat and cold.

There are very little variations in the climate in different parts of the district. The climate is dry and hot in all parts except that portion of Barshi taluka which lies above the Ghats, where it is some what cooler than in the rest of the district.

2) Rainfall:-

Rainfall all over the district is uncertain and scanty with an annual average of 577.1 m.m. The district gets rain from South West as well as from North East monsoons. Throughout the district, the rain starts in June and continues upto October. The precipitation during June to August is rather precarious and of small magnitude. The showers in September and October are heavy and more assured.

The Fact Finding Committee appointed by Govt. in 1960 had reported that the rainfall is not dependable in the following areas and they are likely to be affected by scarcity conditions periodically as shown below:-

A	Once in 3 years	Karmala, Sangola
B	Once in 6 years	Madha, Pandharpur & Small southern portion of Malsiras.
C	Once in 10 years	Mohol, Mangalwedha, Akkalkot, North Sholapur, South Sholapur & 18 villages in the North East corner of Barshi taluka.

Thus all the talukas of the district are generally scarcity areas.

3) Temperature:-

The temperature is generally mild and even except the hot months of March, April and May. During the year 1971 at Sholapur centre, the temperature was lowest in December and highest in April, the maximum and minimum being 43.0 centigrades and 10.3 centigrades respectively.

1.4 Natural Zones:-

The district can be broadly divided into three natural zones. The eastern zone comprising Barshi, North Sholapur, South Sholapur and Akkalkot talukas has medium to deep black soil, some what assured rainfall and grows Jowar, Bajra and pulses.

The Central or the transitional zone comprising Mohol, Mangalwedha, eastern parts of Pandharpur and Madha taluka has uncertain rainfall, light to medium soil and grows kharif and Rabi crops.

The Western zone comprises scarcity areas of Karmala, Sangola and Malsiras talukas and Western parts of Macha and Pandharpur taluaks with light soil and uncertain rainfall. Mainly Rabi crops are grown in Karmala, Pandharpur and Macha talukas and Khardf crops, such as Bajra and Groundnut in Sangola taluka. Large part of Malsiras taluka receives protection from scarcity due to irrigation provided by Vira Right Bank Canal and Sugarcane is the major crop of that area.

1.5 Famine and Scarcity:-

Since the average annual precipitation is very low (577.1 m.m.) and subject to a large amount of uncertainty, this district is exposed to frequent scarcities and occasional famines.

During the year 1971-72, 453 out of 946 villages in the district, covering a population of 5,56,358 were affected by famine and chronic scarcity. In all 153 relief works were undertaken during the year 1971-72, for which 16,062 persons were employed. The total expenditure incurred on these works was Rs.6,92,702. In Karmala and Akkalkot talukas, the percentage of villages affected by famine was more i.e. 67.7 and 75.4 respectively, as compared to villages in other talukas in the district.

1.6 Territorial changes in the district:-

The district of Sholapur was first formed during the year 1838. The district was abolished in 1864 and was again formed during 1875. Consequent upon the merger of the former Indian states, 80 villages and 2 towns of these states and a part of Akkalkot state was added in 1949.

Talukas namely Mohol, Akkalkot and Mangalwedha were newly formed and Sholapur taluka was split up into North Sholapur and South Sholapur talukas. In 1950, 53 enclave villages from Hyderabad state were transferred to this district and 12 enclave villages of this district were transferred to Osmanabad and Gulbarga districts. Also one village from Bijapur district was added to Mangalwedha taluka in 1950. At present there are 11 talukas in the district, with 953 villages and 10 towns as per 1971 census.

1.7 District Administration:-

1) State Government Administration:-

For administrative purposes, the district is at present divided into 11 talukas. The Collector is in charge of general Administration, Law and Order, Treasury, Land Revenue and Civil Supplies. He is assisted by a Resident Deputy Collector in his office and three Deputy Collectors who hold charge of the three revenue divisions viz. Sholapur, Madha and Pandharpur and have their head quarters at Sholapur, Kurduwadi and Pandharpur. Eleven Tahsildars are in charge of eleven taluka offices.

The District and Sessions Judge is the head of the Judicial Department in the district having his assistants at district and tahsil levels. The Judiciary is entirely separate from the executive. However, the Collector continues to be the District Magistrate and the Deputy Collectors and Tahsildars are vested with limited magisterial powers.

The District and Sessions Judge is assisted by two Assistant Judges and Additional Sessions Judge. They have jurisdiction over the entire district. They attend to Civil and Criminal work, both original and appellate. The Civil Judge (Sr. Division) attends to Civil suits in the whole of the district.

There are also 15 Civil Judges(Jr. Division) and first class Judicial Magistrates who have their head quarters at different taluka places in the district. They deal with Civil & Criminal cases. Two special first class Judicial Magistrates deal with prohibition and Municipal cases. There is also one first class Judicial Magistrate for Sholapur taluka police station and Sholapur city Sadar Bazar Police station.

The police force in the district functions under the District Superintendent of Police who is assisted by two Assistants Superintendents and one Deputy Superintendent & two circle Police Inspectors at Sholapur and Pandharpur. There are 21 Police stations in the district.

There are two Divisional Soil Conservation Offices at Sholapur and Pandharpur to supervise the Soil Conservation activities under the Agricultural Department.

In addition to these, there are other officers representing various departments at district level like Malaria officer, Sub Regional Employment Exchange Officer, Govt. Milk Distribution scheme Officer, Factory Inspector, Labour Officer, Executive Engineer, B & C Division, Dist. Deputy Registrar of Cooperative Societies and Civil Surgeon. There are Govt institutions of North Cote Technical High School and the Polytechnic.

2) Central Govt. Administration:-

There are Divisional offices of the Posts and Telegraph Department and South Central Railway at Sholapur. There is also the office of the Superintendent of Central Excise.

3) Zilla Parishad And Panchayat Samities:-

Under the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities Act 1962, Zilla Parishad and 11 Panchayat Samities have been established in the district in the year 1962.

The areas under the jurisdiction of the Zilla Parishad and the Panchayat Samities correspond to the district and the taluka boundaries except in the case of Municipal towns which are not covered by them. The Zilla Parishad covers 96.50 percent of the area and 72.05 percent of the total population of the district.

The Zilla Parishad is headed by an elected President from among the elected Councillors. To carry out the administrative and executive work, an officer in the Senior scale of I.A.S. cadre works as the Chief Executive Officer to the Zilla Parishad. He is assisted by various departmental heads who are officers belonging to class I and class II services of State Govt. The Block Development Officer works as Secretary to Panchayat Samiti.

4) Local Bodies Administration:-

As regards the administrative set up under the local sector, there is a Municipal Corporation for Sholapur city. The Municipal Commissioner works as the Executive Head of the Corporation. There are nine municipalities in the district, under the administrative control of the Chief Officer of which Barshi and Pandharpur are city municipalities.

5) Public Bodies Administration:-

The Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation has earned for itself a unique place among the public sector undertakings in the district.

It has maintained an efficient and economic road transport service throughout the district. The Divisional Controller functions as the Executive Head of this undertaking.

There are six depots under him, each under the charge of a depot Manager. There is also an office of the Maharashtra State Electricity Board entrusted with the work of electrification programme. The Executive Engineer, M.S.E.B works as the Executive Head of this office. There are two branch offices of Life Insurance Corporation of India at Sholapur and at Barshi. These branches are working under the control of Divisional Manager L.I.C. Satara.

1.8 Demography:-

1) General:- Census is the principal source of Demographic data in India as well as in Maharashtra. With an area of 15,021 Sq. Kms. and a population of 22,53,840, the Sholapur district ranks sixth both in area and population among the 26 districts of Maharashtra state, as per 1971 census, whereas it was third as per 1961 census. The 1971 population of the district shows an increase of 21.17 percent over the 1961 figure. The urban population forms 27.36 percent of the total population.

2) Density:- According to 1971 census, the density of population of Sholapur district is 150 Sq. Km. Within district, it varies from 660 persons per Sq.Km. in North Sholapur to 94 persons per Sq. Km in Karmala taluka. The density of population is higher in two talukas namely Sholapur North and Barsi, as compared to other talukas in the district, which is due to large urban centres like Sholapur city and Barshi town. Mangalwedha, Sangola, Karmala and Mohol talukas are having very low density because of the light and rocky soil existing in these talukas.

3) Literacy:- According to 1971 census, literacy in Sholapur district is 34 percent, which was 25 percent as per 1961 census. Growth of literacy in the decade 1951-61 in this district was 10 percent, while during the decade 1961-71, the same is 9 percent. Percentage of literacy in North Sholapur taluka is the highest(i.e 45 percent)amongst the talukas in the district due to its vicinity with the district head-quarter, Sholapur city and availability of extensive educational facilities. Literacy percentage of Barshi, Mohol and Pandharpur talukas is 32, 35 and 36 respectively, while in the rest of the talukas, the same is between 25 to 31.

4) Livelihood classification:- Of the total population of the district 33.68 percent population is engaged in work while remaining 66.32 percent population is non working or dependent, as per 1971 census. Among the workers, the percentage of workers engaged as cultivators and Agri-labourers of-workers total to total workers in the district is 35.58 and 32.78 respectively, which is higher than the corresponding figures of the state i.e 35.54 and 29.32 respectively. The percentage of workers engaged in household industry and manufacturing other than household industry is 3.60 and 9.41 respectively in the district. The percentage of workers engaged in trade and commerce and other services in the district is also significant i.e 6.06 and 6.44 respectively. The proportion of workers engaged in Transport, Storage and Communication, Construction, Mining and Quarrying, Livestock Forestry, Plantation etc. is not significant.

Scheduled Caste:- The comparative position of the scheduled caste population in 1961 and 1971 in this district is as under:-

It is seen that the scheduled caste population has increased from 12.84 percent in 1961 to 14.21 percent in 1971.

Scheduled tribes:- The "total" population of scheduled tribes is only 8,608 or 0.38 percent of the total population. The scheduled tribes population of the district has decreased from 9,089 in 1961 to 8,608 in 1971.

Languages:- As per 1961 census in rural areas, Marathi speakers account for 80.1 percent of the population. They constitute 49.1 percent of the population in urban areas. Kannada has the second largest number of speakers. It forms 11.5 percent of the total population of the district. Urdu has the third largest number of speakers. It forms 8.8 percent of the total population of the district. It is spoken more in urban areas, where its speakers form as much as 16.3 percent against 5.9 percent in rural areas. The speakers of Banjara languages are concentrated in rural areas, so also Gujarathi speakers to some extent, Hindi, Tamil and Telgu speakers are mostly concentrated in urban areas.

C H A P T E R - II-

Explanatory note:-

2.1 Introductory:- Statistical information regarding various aspects of development of Sholapur district is presented in the tables of this abstract.

The data has been compiled for the financial year 1971-72. For certain groups, such as Agril. and Co-operation, however, the data has been furnished for the Agril. year and Cooperative year respectively. Calendar year has been taken as reference year for presenting the data regarding meteorology, Vital Statistics and Statistics pertaining to Civil and Criminal Courts.

In the tables district total is given first followed by its tahsilwise break up. The order of tahsils is as per the order followed in the Census Hand Book. The source of information has been indicated at the bottom of each table.

A table 'District at a glance' giving comparative data of the district and the Poona division is given at the beginning of the abstract.

The concepts, sources and limitations adopted in the preparation of the abstract are summarised major groupwise in the following paragraphs.

2.2 Area and population:- Tables in this section give information regarding area houses and population (Table No.1) decadal variation in population since 1901 (Table No.2) villages classified by population (Table No.3) population of urban areas (Table No.4) workers and non workers (Table No.5) and literate persons and Scheduled caste and scheduled Tribes (Table No.7). The data in these subjects pertain to 1971 census. Table No.6 presents information on population according to age group, mother tongue and religion based on 1961 census as that for 1971 is not yet available.

During 1971 census, the definition of a worker has been modified to a certain extent and due to this, the proportion of workers in 1971 census is less than that of 1961 census. During 1971 census, a person, in the case of seasonal work is classified as a worker if he had worked in the current or the last working season for a greater part of the season. Thus unlike 1961 census, persons primarily engaged in household duties or those who were students and helped in the family economic activity but not on a full time scale were treated as non workers in respect of their main activity.

2.3 Climate:- The rainfall data (table No.8) gives information about number of rainy days and total rainfall in m.m. during each month of calendar year 1971, at the selected centres in the district. Figures of normal rainfall are worked out, on the basis of actual rainfall for the periods ranging from five years and a maximum of eighty years, except Mohol centre, for which normal rainfall is worked out on the basis of actual rainfall for the period from 1961 to 1970. A day is treated as a rainy day, if during the 24 hours, minimum rainfall of 2.5 m.m. is recorded. The figures of highest and lowest temperature in the month are given in table No.9. The data has been supplied by the Govt. of India's meteorological centre at Kolaba.

2.4 Agriculture:- Statistical information regarding land utilization irrigation, area under different crops, yield per hectare and outturn of principal crops etc. is given in the tables under this head, for the agricultural years 1969-70 (final) and 1970-71(provisional). The break up of the total geographical area according to different types of land utilisation is shown in the table No.10. Under forest, lands which are classed or administered as forest state owned or private are included.

C. Appendix :- Statistical information regarding land
in case, any portion of such land is put to some agricultural
use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading
of land use. Land put to non agricultural use stands for all
lands occupied by buildings, roads and railways, rivers and
canals and other lands put to uses other than agriculture. All
barren and uncultivable land like mountains, deserts etc. which
can not be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost is
classified as barren and uncultivable land irrespective of the
fact whether such land is in isolated blocks or within cultiva-
ted holdings. Permanent pastures and other grazing land covers
all grazing lands (whether permanent pastures and meadows or not)
and village common and grazing lands within forest areas.

'Culturable waste' included all lands available for cultivation
whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultiva-
tion once but not cultivated during the current year and last
five years or more in succession. Such lands may either be
fallow or covered with shrubs and jungles which are not put
to any use.

Cultivable lands kept fallow during the current year
only are shown as 'current fallows'. Other fallow land in-
cludes all lands which were taken up for cultivation but are
temporarily out of cultivation ~~off~~ for a period between 1 to
5 years. The net area sown consists of total area sown with
crop and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only
once. Gross cropped area represents the sum total of the area
under all crops, including area sown more than once. Table No.
11 gives details of area under different food crops (cereals,
pulses and others) and non food crops (fibres, oil seeds etc.)
Table No.12 gives information about yield per hectare and out-
turn of principal crops. Table No.13 gives information of area

irrigated by different sources i.e canals, tanks, wells etc. in each taluka while table No.14 gives information of area irrigated under different crops in each taluka. Table No.16 presents the no.of minor irrigation works and the net area irrigated. Minor irrigation works are in all the talukas except Mohol and Akkalkot. The table No.17 gives information about the major and Medium irrigation projects as on 30-6-1972 Table No.18 gives information about Agricultural wage rates, in respect of three selected centres viz.(1) Mandrud(2) Modnimb (3) Vairag. Table No.20(A) pertains to famine, scarcity and akin to scarcity data. Table No.20(B) gives information about the total no.of villages(talukewise and circlewise) affected by scarcity during the period from 1967-68 to 1971-72.

2.5 Animal Husbandry, Forest:-(a) Animal Husbandry:-

Table No.21 gives the no.of various types of livestock and poultry, as enumerated in the district during the 1966 Livestock Census. Statistical information in respect of veterinary institutions and diseasewise no.of attacks and deaths of livestock/poultry is given in tables No.22 and 23 respectively.

b) Forest:- Tables under this group furnishe information on area under forests and production of major and minor forest produce. Information of Forests under the control of both the Forest Department and Revenue Department of the Govt. of Maharashtra is given separately. Areas under forest are again classified as reserved protected and unclassed forests according to legal status. Reserved forests are those that are meant intended mainly for timber production and in which rights of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. In protected forests, right of grazing or cultivation is allowed under certain limitations and restrictions.

The unclassed forest refers to the inaccessible forest or unoccupied waste. The figures in table No.25-A have been obtained from the Forest Deptt. and they do not tally with those given in table No.10, the figures for which have been taken from Revenue Deptt. This variation is due to the different concepts of classification of areas by the two departments.

2.6 Employment, Industry and Electricity:- Statistics relating to working factories such as average daily employment of workers, classification of factories according to working strength and no.of days worked during the year is given in three tables 26 to 28 for the year 1971. Tables 29 to 31 give important statistics of Employment Exchange in Sholapur district, including monthwise registration, vacancies notified and placements in public and private sectors and no.on live register at the end of each month for the year 1971. The data presented in the tables 32 and 33 are pertaining to the census of state Govt. employees as on 1st July,1966, conducted by the Bureau of Economics and Statistics, Bombay. This data gives the no.of of State Govt. employees under I, II, III, and IV classes only and does not include any other category such as work charged per sonnel, part time workers etc. The table 34 gives the results of Annual Survey of Industries 1966. The figures are based on actuals of census sector factories and estimates of sample sector factories.

The information regarding consumption of electricity in Sholapur district in the year 1971-72 is given in table No.35. This includes the consumption of electricity supplied by the Maharashtra State Electricity Board and the following private companies in Sholapur district.

- 1) Barshi General Engineering Co. Barshi.
- 2) Pandharpur Electric Supply Co; Pandharpur.
- 3) Karmala Electric supply Co;. Karmala.

Information on towns and villages electrified is given in table No.36.

2.7 Cooperation:- The data on typewise cooperative societies in the district inadluing Cooperative Banks are given under this group. Talukewise breakup of primary agricultural credit societies, with details of member ship capital structure, loans advanced, recovered and outstanding is given in table No.39. Information in respect of Agril. Marketing societies and regulated markets is also given. The main function of the agril. marketing society is the purchase and sale of agril. produce grew grown by its members or member Coop. societies in its area of operation. The In table No.43, the quantity and value of annual arrivals of various types of agril. produce are shown. The data regarding registered money lenders and loans advanced by them is given in table No.44.

2.8 Medical and Public Health:- Data on vital statistics e.g. talukewise births and deaths and infant deaths, with break up into male and female, medical facilities and amenities available in the district, indoor and outdoor patients treated etc. are given under this section.

2.9 Education:- Date regarding literacy, education in rural and urban areas in the district, according to 1963/1971 census is given in tables 50 to 52(50: 1971 census, 51 & 52: 1961 census). Other statistics such as no.of educational institutions, enrolment of students, teachers(trained and total) No.of backward class beneficiaries at different

stages of education, achievements under the scheme of concessions to economically backward classes is also presented in this section. Normal and plan expenditure on primary education is shown in table No.56.

2.10 Transport and Communication:- Table No.57 gives a gauge-wise total railway length in Km. in Sholapur district as on 31st March 1972. These figures have been compiled with the help of railway time table and map. The figures of extra municipal roads maintained by Bulidngs and Communication Department and Zilla Parishad are shown in table No.58. Roads maintained by Municipal Councils are also shown separately in this table. Table No.59 gives data regarding motor vehicles as on 31st March 1972, in the Poona Transport Region, comprising of Ahmednagar, Poona Satara and Sholapur districts. Operational statistics relating to Sholapur Division of the Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation, results of traffic Census on important roads in the district, information of postal, Telegraph, Telephone and rural broadcasting statistics are also given in the section.

2.11 Local bodies:- Financial position of village Panchayats, Municipal Councils and the Zilla Parishad for the year 1971-72 is shown in this section. No.of village Panchayats include independent and group village Panchayats. The income and expenditure of village Panchayats are exclusive of opening and closing ~~an~~ balances respectively. The receipts of the Zilla Parishad are shown under four sub-heads viz.)(1) Self raised resources(2) Govt. grants(3) Grants for agency schemes and (4) debt section.

2.12 Plan and Community Development:- Tables in this section give information regarding expenditure and physical achievements under district level plan schemes implemented in Sholapur district and Community Development programme in the district for the year 1971-72, which is the third year of the fourth Five Year Plan.

2.13 Prices:- The a table No.73 gives whole prices of important agril. commodities like rice, wheat, jowar, Bajra,etc. & at selected centres in the district i.e where market committees are established. Table No.74 gives monthly avarage prices of important commodities at Sholapur during 1971. The prices collected for the given commodities are taken from only one selected shop. The average shown for individual commodities can not, therefore be said to be fully representative. The data may however, prove useful as a broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices during the period. The table No.75 gives the consumer prices index no.ri for working class at Sholapur and Poona with the year 1960 and 1961 respectively as the base years.

2.14 Miscellaneous:- Statistical information on the subject like, police force, crime statistics, banks, joint stock companies, insurance, Presses, News papers and periodicals, small savings, General Election,etc. is included in this section.

2.15 Selected indicators:- Tables on selected indicators of development for each tahsil of Sholapur district are appended at the end. Topics like population agril, electricity, factory workers, road length, education, medical facilities etc. are covered. A comparative pitture of tahsils in relation to their development under each item has been shown by of way of ranking the tahsils on the basis of the latest available date.

3.2 The population of the district has increased by 21.17 per cent during the decade 1961-71. The urban population forms 27.36 percent of the total population. This district is the 6th largest in Maharashtra State and occupied third place in the Poona Division in respect of popula-

The percentages of the scheduled castes and scheduled tribes population to the district's population are 14.21 and 0.38 respectively. Sholapur's present literacy rate of 33.90 percent compares favourably with the 1961 rate of 25.15 percent. Percentage of literacy for Poona Division and Maharashtra State is 38.1 and 39.1 respectively. The density of population per Sq.Km. has gone upto 150 in 1971 from 124 in 1961. The density of population for Poona Division and Maharashtra State is 174 and 164 respectively.

3.3 Comparision of the talukwise population in 1961 and 1971 shows that the highest percentage of increase in population is in Malabiras (36.03%) and the lowest in Mohol taluka (15.59%). The decennial growth rate in rural and urban population is 21.4 and 18.5 respectively.

As per 1971 census the sex ratio(Females per 1000 males) of the district is 936, which was 933 as per 1961 census. It is 953 for Poona Division and 933 for the State.

3.4 Growth in rural and urban population is shown in the following table:-

Out of the total population of the district, 759263 are workers, who constitute 33.68% of the total population. Out of these workers, 35.58% workers are cultivators, 32.78% Agril. labourers and the remaining 31.64% workers are engaged in other activities, such as, Mining and quarrying,

'Trade and Commerce', construction' Fishing' Household industry' etc.

3.6. Agriculture:- During the year 1970-71 out of the total geographical area(1501069) hectares) of the district, 1354953 hectares of land was cultivable. But the percentage of net area sown to cultivable land was 85.19. 3.7. From the above table, it is seen that all the cultivable land is not brought under cultivation. There is much scope to bring more land under cultivation in Malsiras and Sangola talukas. The available cultivable land has been utilised for cultivation to the maximum extent possible in Karmala, Barshi, Mohol, South Sholapur and Akkalkot talukas.

3.8 The area shown more than once constitutes 2.9.% of the net area sown for the district during the year 1970-71. The percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown for the district is 102.9 for the year 1970-71.

3.10 From the above table, it is revealed that percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area was 126.2 for the district, during 1970-71 as against 117.7 for the earlier year. This percentage was the highest (160.1) in Barshi taluka, whereas the lowest percentage(106.6) is observed in Sangola taluka.

3.11 The percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown for the district during the year 1970-71 was 9.92. The percentage for the earlier year was 9.16. Irrigational facilities have been utilised to the highest extent(39.57%) in Malsiras taluka, where irrigation facilities from Nira Right Bank Canal are available. The percentage above that for the district is observed only in Malsiras, Pandharpur and Sangola talukas.

3.13 Cultivable area in the district per agril. worker during the year 1970-71 works out to 2.39 hectares. It varies from 2.00 hectares in Barshi taluka to 2.88 Hect. in Pandharpur taluka.

3.14 Net area sown in the district per agril. worker during the year 1970-71 was 2.04 hect. as against 2.18 hect. during the year 1969-70. The ratio varies from 1.35 hect. in Malsiras taluka to 2.52 hect. in Pandharpur taluka.

3.15 Yield rate of principal crops:-The rainfall in this district is very scanty and uncertain. Irrigation facilities have not developed to a degree as would significantly mitigate the natural disadvantages. The productivity of soil is poor. The following table gives the yield rates of important crops in this district.

The production of food crops during the year 1970-71 was 2.28 lakh M. tonnes as against the production of 3.57 lakh M. Tonnes during the year 1969-70. As compared to the year 1961-62, the yield rates of wheat, Bajra, Sugarcane and cotton have increased, whereas those of Rice, Jowar, Maize Gram, Tur and Groundnut have decreased. The yield rates are fluctuating on account of many reasons such as rainfall, incidence of diseases, use of modern techniques and improved Agril. practices etc.

All villages are covered by primary Agril. credit societies. According to 1971 census, 2.70 lakhs persons are cultivators and the percentage of cultivators as members of the credit societies is 54. Loan advanced per member works out to Rs.291/- during the year 1971-72, as against Rs.337/- during the previous year. The percentage of recovery has come down to 54, in 1971-72 from 57 in 1970-71.

3.19 From the above table, it is seen that the gross cropped area per pair of working bullocks for the district works out to 10.6 hect.s for the year 1970-71. This ratio is highest in South Sholapur taluka i.e 14.4 hect.s and lowest in Malsiras taluka i.e 6.7 hect.s. The talukas in which this ratio is less than that for the district, are Karmala, Barshi, Madha, North Sholapur, and Akkalkot. Since mechanical power is not utilised for agriculture on large scale, there is

pressure of work on the available bullock power. No.of milch animals(Cattle and buffaloes as per 1966 livestock census) per 1000 persons(as per 1971 census) works out to 53 for the district. This number is only 19 for North Sholapur taluka, which includes urban area of Sholapur Corporation. The highest no.of milch animals are observed in Mangalwedha taluka. No.of poultry per 1000 persons(as per 1971 census) is 210 for the district as per 1966 livestock census. The highest no.of poultry(683) is observed in Sangola taluka and the lowest(51) in North Sholapur taluka, comprising of urban area of Sholapur Corporation.

Occupationwise distribution in the above table reveals that 9.96% of the registrations are for clerical jobs. The percentage of placements in clerical jobs is also the highest i.e 47.34.

3.21 Consumption of Electricity:- Out of 948 villages in the district, the villages ~~are~~ electrified as at the end of March 1972 are 396 i.e 41.7 %. The consumption of electricity is 1,34,663 thousand K.W.H. Per capita consumption of electricity works out to 59.7 K.W.H. during 1971-72. The consumption of electricity by industrial concerns is also significant which is to the extent of 61.6% of the ^{total} consumption.

It is seen from the above table that more facilities for medical aid are being made available to the public, every year, in order to cope up with the increasing demand. Inspite of this fact, these efforts fall short of the requirements for the increasing population. The number of beds per lakh of population works out to 40 during the year 1971. On an average a doctor serves a population of about 23,000, whereas population being served by a nurse is nearly 7100. In this case, the doctors, nurses in dispensaries/hospitals etc. run by Govt./Local bodies only are taken into account. The birth rate and death rate during the year 1971 considering the 1971 census population are 24 and 9 respectively. The total births recorded during the year 1971, are 57,129 as against 53,776 in 1970. Similarly the total deaths recorded ~ 160 as against 19,084 in 1970.

3.23 Family Planning:- Number of family planning centres as on 31-3-1972 in Sholapur district was 45. The number of sterilisation operations i.e both vasectomy and tubectomy done during 1971-72 was 20,191. The number of I.U.C.D. insertions during 1971-72 was 108.

3.24 Education:- During the year 1970-71, the number of institutions of primary education was 1817 in the district. Out of 3,23,596 pupils in primary schools girls constituted 1,23,312(38.1%). There were 8,745 primary teachers. On an average, a primary teacher had to look after 37 pupils.

3.25 During the year 1970-71, there were 195 secondary schools in which 46,134 boys(76.1%) and 14,509 girls(23.9%) were studying. On an average a secondary teacher had to teach about 26 students.

3.26 During the year 1970-71, there were 18 higher institutions, in which 12,997 students were studying.

3.27 Transport and Communication:- The following figures give the progress in these fields.

During the year 1971-72, 9 new post offices were opened. As per 1971 census population served by a post office works out to nearly 5181. Each telegraph office, on an average serves to a population of 54,971.

There is increase in length of road and hence there is corresponding increase in S.T. routes. During the year 1971-72, S.T. buses were plying on 324 routes covering a distance of 24.219 Kms.

3.28 Banking Offices:- The number of banking offices during the year 1971 was 96. Out of these banks, there were 51 scheduled banks and the remaining were cooperative banks. Population covered by the banking offices was 8,07,659. Population per banking office works out to 8,413. Population covered by banks is only 35.8% of the total population and hence there is wide scope for development of banking facilities.

From the above figures, it is seen that the general index has shown an upward trend during the last six years. The index for the year 1971-72 has increased by 13 points over that of the previous year. Comparing the indices for the year 1970-71 and 1971-72, it is seen that the index for food has increased to 214 from 198 and that for pan, Supari and tobacco has gone upto 1178 from 171. The index for clothing bedding and footwear has also gone upto 188 from 173.

C H A P T E R - IV -
PLAN ACHIEVEMENTS DURING 1971 - 72

4.1 The year 1971-72 was the third year of Fourth Five Year Plan. An attempt has been made in this chapter to describe financial as well as physical achievements under various heads of development.

4.2 The State's Annual plan for 1971-72 was for Rs.196.52 crores. In addition to this, Rs.17.93 crores were provided for the centrally sponsored schemes. The above provision was for State level, Divisional level and District level plan schemes.

4.3 Budget provision for Sholapur district in respect of District level plan schemes for the year 1971-72 was of Rs. 332 lakhs. Out of this provision, about Rs.251 lakhs were under State sector and about Rs.81 lakhs were under Local sector. In respect of centrally sponsored schemes about Rs.43 lakhs were provided under state sector whereas the budget provision under local sector was of about Rs.46 lakhs. The following table indicates the expenditure incurred on major heads of development under State sector and Local sector with percentage of expenditure to total expenditure incurred both on state plan schemes and centrally sponsored schemes.

It will be seen from the above table that stress is given on schemes under Agril. programme as per object of the fourth five year plan.

The district level schemes are implemented through the implementing officers under state and local sectors. Expenditure incurred by the M.S.E.B. has been included in state sector. The Local sector comprises of Zilla Parishad. Out of total expenditure incurred about 71 percent expenditure was incurred under State sector. Percentage of expenditure under local sector was about 29.

Some schemes are being implemented under important major heads such as Agril. programme and social services with the central assistance in recent times. Classification of such schemes has been, therefore, shown separately in the above table.

Minor headwise progress under major heads is given below:-

4.4 Agril. and allied programmes were assigned high priority in the Annual Plan of 1971-72. The strategy of emphasis on the use of hybrid and high yielding varieties of seeds, fertilizers and plant protection measures were vigorously pursued.

..... the work also. Attempts were made to increase area under irrigation by digging irrigation wells installing pumping sets on wells, Minor irrigation works such as irrigation tanks and bundharas were also assigned place of importance. In order to increase the moisture content content of the soil and to protect soil from erosion the scheme of contour bunding was in progress.

4.5 From the above table it is seen that against the total budget provision, grants to the extent of 86 percent were utilised under Agril. programme. More than 100 percent amount was spent on Dairy Development and Warehousing and Marketing. The Whole budget provision was utilised in the case of Minor irrigation, Animal Husbandry and Forest. Expenditure of State sector under Minor irrigation was 99%. Expenditure in respect of Agril. production, Soil Conservation, Ayacut development and Fisheries was less than 100 percent but more than 70 percent.

4.6 Agril. production including land Development.

Major schemes under this sub-head were plant protection and horticultural development. Against the target of 2.16 lakh Hect.s, area to the extent of 0.65 lakh hect.s was covered under the programme of plant protection. The plant protection measures consisted of seed treatment and field treatment. The scheme of horticultural development includes plantation of orchards. New plantation was done in about 40 hect.s during the year under reference. Other achievements in respect of some schemes under this programme are as under:-

4.7 Minor irrigation:- Activities covered under this programme were grant of subsidy for construction of new wells undertaken by cultivators by obtaining loan from Land Development Bank, grant of subsidy for purchase of pump set, construction of irrigation and percolation tanks and bhndharas. Subsidy was granted in respect of 552 new irrigation wells and 129 pump sets. Six irrigation tanks were undertaken in state sector, Works of seven bhndharas, 13 percolation tanks and 22 lift irrigation works were in progress in local sector.

In addition to above, six tanks were in progress under S-state sector and twenty nine works were undertaken in local sector under the centrally sponsored schemes known as Rural work programme undertaken in areas which are chronically prone to scarcity conditions due to inadequate and uneven rainfall.

4.8 4.8 Soil Conservation:- This programme consists of contour bunding, reclamation of saline, alkline and water logged lands and afforestation for soil conservation. Information regarding targets and achievements of the above programme is as under:-

One important scheme in this district which requires special mention, is centrally sponsored scheme of Integrated Dry Land Agril. Development at Mandrup introduced by Govt. of India. Objects of this scheme is to popularise and promote the adoption of the following principal constituents of the new technology in dry farming areas(1) Soil Management(2) Harvesting of water(3) New crop varieties and (4) Agronomic practices. Against the provision of Rs.1097 lakhs an amount of Rs.5.42 lakhs was spent the-~~provision-of-Rs.1~~ on the activities such as distribution of improved seeds, boring of irrigation wells, renovation of old wells, water harvesting etc.

4.9 Animal Husbandry:- Aid was given to four veterinary aid centres started previously.

4.10 Dairy Development:- Against the target of 10 thousand liters of handling of milk per day, 11 thousands liters of milk was handled per day under the scheme of Town milk supply scheme, Sholapur.

4.11 Physical achievements in case of schemes under the minor heads Forest, Fisheries and Warehousing and Marketing are as under:-

4.14 Community Development:- Major scheme under this programme was community development project. Entire district has already been covered under this programme. Grant-in-aids were given to all blocks for carrying out various development works such as construction of school buildings, drinking water wells, roads and other developmental activities. One hundred & sixty one community works were completed during the year under reference.

Applied Nutrition programme was in force in Karmala, Sangola, Pandharpur and Madha tahsils. This programme provides training and education to improve local diets, protection and preservation of protective foods and ensuring effective utilization of these foods by pregnant and lacting women, infants, pre-school and school children.

The scheme of composite programme for women and pre-school children was in force in South Sholapur, Mohol and Akkal kot Blocks, the object of which is also similar to that of Applied Nutrition programme in general. Nine hundred and ninety five women were trained under this programme.

4.15 Irrigation and Power:- The schemes at district level under this head are that of rural electrification and normal development(urban and rural) Against the provision of Rs.56.99 lakhs, an amount of Rs.68.58 lakhs was spent. Twenty nine villages were electrified. The percentage of villages electrified till the end of 1971-72 was 41.86. Emphasis was on giving connections to Agril. pumps. One thousand and forty agril. pumps were energised.

4.16 Industry and Mining:- Handloom is an important industry in this district. A provision of Rs.49.56 lakhs was made for development of handloom industry and the whole amount was spent during the year under reference. Physical achievements of the schemes covered under this programme are as under:-

4.19 The above figures reveal that 96 percent amount of the budget grants under major head was utilised. Progress of Expdr. was satisfactory under General education, Water supply and drainage, Housing, Welfare of Backward classes and labour & labour welfare.
