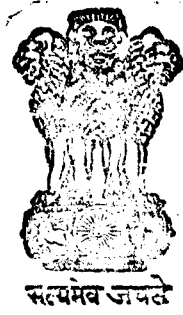

# C H A P T E R I

## I N T R O D U C T I O N

### G E N E R A L :

1.1 The Poona Division which comprises of Ahmednagar, Poona, Satara Sangli, Sholapur and Kolhapur districts stands second in area and population ( 1971 ) amongst the four divisions in the State of Maharashtra.

1.2 The boundaries of the districts in the division have not undergone any change since 1961.

### P H Y S I C A L F E A T U R E S :

1.3 Geographically, Poona Division forms part of Western India. The Sahyadri Ghats and beyond them an undulating plateau make this region.

1.4 Geologically, the basal complex of Western India consists of igneous rocks upon which rests a metamorphic series. This igneous complex has given rise to terraced hills and broad valleys. There are varying local features also and all these add variety to the division's landscape.

1.5 The Sahyadri mountain which is the principal relief of the division traverses in the south-west direction upto Bhor Ghat and then goes almost straight in the southern direction. The creastling is highest at Mahabaleshwar. There is a contrast between the western and eastern flanks. The western flank of the Ghats is a fractured edge of the plateau marked by a series of terraces, so typical of the Deccan Lava landscape. The eastern flank, on the other hand, consists of plateaus, which have fairly broad basins drained by the major plateau rivers and their tributaries.

1.6 Poona division forms almost the beginnings of the Krishna and Godavari systems which cover about one-third portion of Peninsular Table land. The Bhima river cuts right across the division. The rivers Bhima and Krishna have almost an equal drainage, whereas, comparatively the Godavari has a very small drainage in the division. The Mahadev ranges separate the upper Krishna drainage from the Bhima basin. The Balaghat range distinguishes the Bhima basin from that of Godavari. All the rivers in the region are graded streams and develop shallow and meandering courses outside the Sahyadrian zone. During rainy season the flood waters contain <sup>much</sup> soil erosion, while during dry part of the year they resume a slender course in a large bed. All other water courses in the east are

markedly seasonal in their flow.

1.7. This division has no important minerals, excepting building stones, clay and limestone, which are common to all the districts. Laterite is widely formed in the western part of Satara district. Twenty villages in Jaoli and thirty villages in Patan taluka of Satara district contain iron ore in the murum below the laterite. The ore is of low grade and unsuitable as yet for commercial exploitation. In Kolhapur district there are very large areas containing deposits of exceptionally high grade bauxite in sufficient quantities. The quality of the material is very good and is suitable for the manufacture of aluminium.

#### ADMINISTRATIVE SET - UP :

1.8 For purposes of administration, Poona Division is divided into six districts, each district being under the control of a Collector, who is in charge of general administration, law and order, elections, treasury, land revenue and civil supplies. The Collector of each district is assisted by a Resident Deputy Collector in his office. The revenue sub-divisions of the district are in the charge of Prant Officers/Deputy Collectors. The tahasils which are the sub-divisions of the district are under the control of Tahasildars. The powers in respect of the overall control of the division are vested in the Divisional Commissioner, Poona.

1.9 Zilla Parishads were set up in the State on 1st May 1962, replacing District Local Boards etc. and have been assigned local Government functions and the execution of certain works and development schemes in the Five Year Plans. The jurisdiction of a Zilla Parishad is a revenue district, excluding therefrom the areas under Municipal Corporations, Municipal Councils and Cantonments.

#### DEMOGRAPHY :

1.10 A brief appraisal of Poona Division's population data based on the final figures of 1971 population census released so far by the Census Department is given below.

1.11 Poona Division with the population of 1.30 crores in 1971 is the second largest division in the State. As against the decennial growth rate of 24.07 during 1951-61 in Poona Division, the percentage decadal variation during 1961-71 was 25.64 per cent.

1.12 In the following table salient features of the population of Poona Division and Maharashtra State are given.

GROWTH RATES OF DIFFERENT DISTRICTS :

1.13 Out of the six districts in the Poona Division, Ahmednagar, Poona and Kolhapur registered a higher rate of increase in population ( 27.77, 28.83 and 28.18 respectively ) as compared to the decadal growth rate of Poona Division as well as of Maharashtra State. Satara district had the lowest growth rate of 20.79 per cent in the division.

D E N S I T Y :

1.14 As per 1971 Census, the density of Poona Division was higher than that of the State by 10. Within the division, Kolhapur district was the most densely populated ( 254 per square km. ) followed by Poona ( 203 ), Sangli ( 180 ), Satara ( 165 ), Sholapur ( 150 ) and Ahmednagar ( 133 ).

WORKERS AND NON-WORKERS :

1.15 Since the concept of workers was changed at the time of 1971 Census, the analysis of the population into workers and non-workers and composition of the working population is confined to the data of that Census only.

1.16 In 1971 out of the total population of 1.30 crores in the division, 43 lakh persons were economically active. The female working population was 23 % of the total working population.

1.17 The break-up of workers according to different activities like cultivators, agriculture, labourers etc. is given in the following table.

1.18 It is a well known fact that the pressure of population on land is very high and is constantly increasing, resulting in unemployment and underemployment in the rural areas. The increasing number of landless agricultural labourers is also posing a problem and is engaging the serious attention of Government. A lasting solution to the problem of poverty and unemployment can be found only through diversification of economic activity - a process which largely hinges on the rapidity of industrial development. A broad idea about the present position in this respect can be had from the data presented in table no. 2 given above. It shows that a higher proportion of the economically active population in Ahmednagar, Satara, Sangli and Kolhapur districts is dependant on agricultural pursuits or in other words industrialisation in these districts is not appreciable. Within the agricultural sector itself, the proportion of agricultural labourers is rather high in Ahmednagar and Sholapur districts. If the percentage of workers engaged in manufacturing, processing, servicing and repairs in Poona division is compared with that of the district percentages, it is observed that the same is very low in Ahmednagar and Satara districts.



1.19 LITERACY : . In the year 1971, the percentage of literacy in the Poona Division was 38.2 ( Male 51.1 and female 24.6 ). The corresponding 1961 ~~figures~~ Census figures were 29.3, 42.0 and 16.1 respectively. The increase in the number of literates in 1971 as compared to 1961 shows that the percentage increase in respect of persons, males and females was by 63.7, 53.5 and 91.2 respectively. Thus, though the percentage of female literacy was at a lower level than that of males, the increase in female literacy was quite high. In fact it nearly doubled during the decade.

1.20 The distribution of districts according to the percentage of literate persons indicates that Poona ( 44.6 ) and Satara ( 38.3 ) districts had the percentage higher than that of the division ( 38.2 ). The percentage in the remaining districts was Sangli 37.5, Ahmednagar ~~36.2~~ 36.2, Kolhapur 35.4 and Sholapur 33.9. The percentage of literacy in the Poona district was higher than that of the State also ( 39.2 ).

#### RAINFALL :

1.21 Due to relief of land and the direction of rain bearing winds , the distribution of rainfall varies from place to place. There are three distinct rainfall zones in the Poona Division viz. (1) the Mawal tract receiving a normal rainfall of about 4500 mm. The rainfall centres which come under this tract are Vadagaon, Mahabaleshwar and Bawda. (2) Central tract covering Poona, Satara and Karveer centres, with normal rainfall of about 900 mm. and (3) the Eastern scarcity tract, covering Sirur, Khataw, Ahmednagar and Jath centres and receiving normal rainfall of about 500 mm. Considering the normal rainfall and actual rainfall in the year 1971 at these centres, it is observed that in the Mawal tract the deviation from normal rainfall was (-) 1134.7 mm, in the central zone it was to the tune of (-) 110.8 mm. and in the Eastern tract by (-) 69.6 mm.

#### SCARCITY CONDITIONS :

1.22 The major part of the Poona Division lies in the rain shadow area of the Ghats with the rainfall average around 600 to 750 mm. and in some areas even less than 500 mms. Out of the eight districts in the State which are in the rain shadow <sup>area, five</sup> of them fall within the Poona Division. Due to <sup>scanty</sup> rainfall, the division is prone to scarcity conditions.

1.23 According to the Fact Finding Committee which was appointed by the Government of Bombay in 1960, out of <sup>the total</sup> 69 tahasils in this divi-

sion, 30 tahasils are likely to be affected by scarcity conditions. The frequency distribution shows that in 5 tahasils scarcity conditions are likely to prevail once in 3 years, in 14 tahasils once in 6 years and in 11 tahasils once in 10 years.

1.24 If the history of scarcity conditions in the districts of this division is reviewed, it is noticed that during the five years from 1967-68 to 1971-72, there was scarcity for two years in Ahmednagar, Satara and Sholapur districts, for three years in Sangli district. In Poona district scarcity conditions prevailed in all the 5 years; while there was no scarcity at all in Kolhapur district.

1.25 In the year 1971-72, the total number of villages affected in the division by famine and chronic scarcity and akin to scarcity was 2636 and 242 respectively. The population affected was about 27 lakhs and 4 lakhs respectively. In all 1397 relief works were undertaken in Poona Division excepting few tahasils in Poona District.

## CHAPTER II

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

2.1 The Divisional Statistical Abstract is divided into two parts. The Socio Economic Review 1971-72 forms the first part and in the second part wide ranging data on area and population, climate, rainfall, agriculture, animal husbandary etc. are presented. The explanation of the terms and concepts used in the Abstract and the scope and limitations of that statistics are given in this chapter.

2.2 The data in the Abstract covers all the six districts in the division viz. Ahmednagar, Poona, Satara, Sangli, Sholapur and Kolhapur is presented districtwise, wherever possible, for inter-district comparison.

2.3 The data in respect of most of the topics is given for one year viz. 1971-72. The source of the same is indicated at the end of each table.

#### POONA DIVISION AT A GLANCE :

2.4 Important information on Poona Division and the State of Maharashtra are given in this table for making comparative assessment. The data covers a variety of items like population, agriculture, industry, co-operation, electricity, medical and public health etc. Reference Year is given against each item.

2.5 The figure given against cultivable area under the item agriculture includes net area sown, current fallows, other fallows, land under miscellaneous trees and groves not included in net area sown and cultivable waste land.

#### AREA AND POPULATION :

2.6 There are 7 tables in this section, out of which 6 tables covering data on area, houses and population, decadal variation in population, clarifications of villages according to population ranges, population of urban areas, workers and non-workers and literate persons and Scheduled casts and Scheduled Tribes pertain to the Census conducted in 1971, while one table pertaining to distribution of population according to age group, mother tongue and religion is based on 1961 Census as the relevant information of 1971 Census is not available.

2.7 The concepts used in the tables are explained below :

1) Urban and Rural areas : An urban area is a place which has a municipality, a cantonment or a civil line or a population of 5000 or over with at least 3/4th of male population dependant on non-agricultural

pursuits. A population enumerated in urban areas is urban population and the population enumerated in all other places is rural population.

2) The term village denotes a statutorily recognised village having a defined boundary and separate land records. Hamlets, wadis are not treated as separate villages. Forest villages make an exception. They are population centres situated within reserved forest areas. Their population consists mainly of forest labourers and their families. Such forest villages are also treated as villages.

3) Workers and non-workers : The concept of workers has undergone a slight change at the time of enumeration for 1971 Census. According to 1961 Census definition, all those seasonal workers who had some regular work of more than one hour a day throughout the greater part of the season were treated as workers. In 1971, the persons who had worked in the current or last working season for the greater part of the season were treated as workers. Thus the 1971 instructions stipulated that a person primarily engaged in household duties or those who were students and helped in the family economic activity, but not on a full-time scale, should be treated as 'non-workers' in respect of their main activity and the economic activity in which they were marginally engaged might be considered as their secondary work. This changed concept appears to be the reason for the decrease in the proportion of workers in 1971.

#### C L I M A T E :

2.8 Table No. 8 pertains to rainfall data in respect of selected centres in the Poona Division. The figures of normal rainfall are worked out on the basis of actual rainfall for the periods ranging from a minimum of five years to maximum of eighty years. A day is treated as a rainy day if during the 24 hours the rain gauge records a minimum of 2.5 mm. of rainfall.

2.9 In table no. 9, maximum and minimum temperature data at selected centres are presented.

#### A G R I C U L T U R E :

2.10 This section covers 11 tables, giving vital information on land utilisation, area under different crops, irrigation, yield per hectare and out turn of principal crops, famine and scarcity data etc.

2.11 In the table on land utilisation ( No. 10 ) various terms are used, the meaning of which is given below :

1) Forests : Under this are included all actually forested areas or lands classed or administered as forests whether state-owned or private.

If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land.

2) Land put to non-agricultural uses stands for all lands occupied by buildings, roads and railways or under water e.g. rivers and canals and other lands put to uses other than agricultural.

3) Barren and unculturable land covers all barren and unculturable lands like mountains, deserts etc.

4) Land which cannot be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost is classed as unculturable, whether such land is in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings.

5) Culturable waste includes all lands available for cultivation, whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once but not cultivated during the current year and <sup>last</sup> five years or more in succession.

6) Permanent pastures and other grazing lands cover all grazing lands, whether they are permanent pastures and meadows or not.

7) Under miscellaneous tree crops and groves not included in the net area sown is included all cultivable land which is not included under net area sown but put to some agricultural use. Lands under casurine trees thatching grass, bamboo bushes and other groves for fuel etc. which are not included under orchards are classed under this category.

8) Current fallows comprises cropped areas which are kept fallow during the current year.

9) Other fallow land includes all lands which were taken up for cultivation but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and not more than five years.

2.12 The data on yield rates and out turn of principal crops are given in table no. 12. The figures of out turn are based on estimates worked out on the results of crop-cutting surveys and partly on "Annewari" method.

#### ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND FOREST :

2.13 . Data based on Livestock Census 1966 and other data on slaughter houses, forest area and products etc. are presented in this section.

2.14 At the time of livestock census, 1966 ( censuses are conducted every 5 years ), all the livestock were enumerated by house to house enquiry. Particular care was taken to enumerate livestock in slaughter houses, stray animals and animals in transit.

2.15 The data regarding area under forests is shown separately for the forests under the control of the State's Revenue Department and those under the control of the State's Forest Department. The areas are classified according to legal status into reserved protected and unclassed forests. Reserved forests are those that are intended mainly for timber production and in which rights of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. In protected forests, the restrictions are not so rigid; rights of grazing or cultivation is allowed but certain limitations and restrictions are imposed. The unclassed forest refers to the inaccessible forest or unoccupied waste.

2.16 The forest areas shown in the table on land utilisation ( No. 10 ) and 25 (a) may not tally due to the following reasons :

1) In the forest statistics, the whole area including non-wooded area under the control of the Forest Department is taken as area under forests while in Agriculture Statistics, it is classified according to its actual utilisation.

2) The forest department returns are meant to serve a definite administrative purpose and indicate the ownership of the forest areas. The actual utilisation of these areas is not so important from their point of view.

3) The forest department returns relate to financial year while agriculture statistics relate to the agricultural years.

#### EMPLOYMENT, INDUSTRY AND ELECTRICITY :

2.17 This section covers factory statistics, data furnished by Employment Exchange, Census of Government employees, statistics relating to A.S.I. consumption of electricity and number of towns and villages electrified along with population covered.

2.18 Factory statistics cover the following types of factories registered under the Factories' Act : 1948 -

- i) Those employing ten or more workers, working with the aid of power.

- ii) Those employing twenty or more workers and working without the aid of power, and,
- iii) Those registered under section 85 of the Act under which the State Government makes applicable the provisions of the Act even though the above conditions are not fulfilled. However, defence factories are excluded.

2.19 The results of the Annual Survey of Industries, 1966 are given in table No. 34. The term production capital used in that table consists of fixed and working capital. Gross output represents value of products and by-products manufactured for sale, work done for customers and sale value of goods sold in the same condition as purchased and is adjusted for the difference in stocks of semi-finished goods at the beginning and at the end of the survey year. Value added by manufacture is computed by deducting from the gross ex-factory value of output, the gross value of input. Value added is net of depreciation. Under the Census sector, factories employing 50 or more workers with aid of power or those employing 100 or more workers without the aid of power are completely enumerated. The sample part generally comprised all factories employing less than 50 workers with the aid of power and less than 100 workers without the aid of power and factories under section 85 of the Factories Act. The figures given in the table are based on actuals of the reporting census sector factories and estimates of sample sector factories. In table no. 36 ( Number of towns and villages electrified and population covered ) population ~~part~~ covered pertains to 1961 Census as data of 1971 are not available.

#### C O - O P E R A T I O N :

2.20 In this section 8 tables are presented, covering important statistics on the co-operative sector.

2.21 Agricultural credit societies are divided into four groups - (i) Agricultural Credit (ii) Non-agricultural Credit (iii) Agricultural non-credit and (iv) Non-agricultural non-credit. Data pertaining to these 4 groups ( number of societies ) are furnished in table no. 37. Financial structure and loan activities of co-operative banks, primary agricultural credit societies are given in table nos. 38 and 39. Table numbers 40 to 44 give information on the activities of other co-operative societies, marketing societies, Agriculture Produce Market Committees and registered money lenders and loans advanced by them.

## MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH :

2.22 Data on availability of medical facilities in this division through public and public aided bodies, number of births and deaths registered, number of deaths due to important causes, vaccination statistics and Cholera inoculation and number of family planning centres operating in this division are presented in 5 tables under this section. The data in table No. 45 ( medical facilities ) does not cover medical facilities available from the private sector.

## E D U C A T I O N :

2.23 Progress made in the field of education can be assessed from the data given in the 7 tables in this section. Table No. 50 ( literacy ) is based on 1971 Census while information in table numbers 51 and 52 ( Education in rural and urban areas ) is as per 1961 Census, the data for 1971 being not yet available.

2.24 Statistics relating to number of institutions, pupils and teachers, number of backward class beneficiaries, concessions to economically backward class persons, expenditure on primary education are presented in the four tables from 53 to 56.

## TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION :

2.25 This section covers 7 tables, presenting information on gauge - wise rail length, category and surfacewise road length, motor vehicles, nationalised road transport traffic census, Post, Telegraph and telephone statistics and rural broadcasting. Railway length in the division has been calculated by reference to Railway Time Table and the railway map; the length within the district being considered to the limit of railway station.

## LOCAL BODIES :

2.26 Only one table giving information on income and expenditure of local bodies i.e. Village Panchayats, Zilla Parishads, Municipal Councils, Municipal Corporations and Cantonment Boards is included under this head.

## PLAN AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT :

2.27 Under this section four tables are prepared. The first two ( Nos. 68 and 69 ) tables give important plan statistics, viz. Plan expenditure under different head/sub-heads of development and important physical achievements under Plan. The other two tables give data regarding the Community Development programme and expenditure incurred in different stages of blocks.



P R I C E S :

2.23 Three tables giving wholesale prices of certain agricultural commodities at selected centres ( i.e. Agriculture Produce Market Committee ) average retail prices of important commodities and consumer price index numbers comprise this section. Regarding the table giving average retail prices of important commodities, it may be noted that the prices are the averages of those given in the District Statistical Abstracts of this division. Moreover, the prices are restricted to only one quotation obtained from only one shop at the district head-quarter and as such they are just indicative of the trend in prices and are not fully representative.

M I S C E L L A N E O U S :

2.29 Data on miscellaneous subjects like police force, crime, banking, joint stock companies, land revenue etc. which could not be incorporated under any of the twelve sections noted above are presented in this section. Trends in some selected indicators of development are given in the last table.

C H A P T E R    I I I

AN ANALYTICAL REVIEW OF SECTORIAL TRENDS : 1971 - 72 :

3.1        In part of II of this Divisional Statistical Abstract comprehensive data on various fields of Socio-Economic development of Poona division are presented. In this chapter that information is analysed and commented upon for assessing the progress made by the division in its march towards the Socio-Economic goals.

A G R I C U L T U R E :

3.2        Agriculture which is the mainstay of Maharashtra's economy - about two thirds of its population is dependent on agriculture for its livelihood - is still the most vulnerable sector of the economy because it is at the mercy of the Rain Gods. Scanty, uneven and erratic rainfall, inadequate irrigation facilities, large scale soil erosion, undulating topography etc. have led to low productivity of land. Hence the contribution of agriculture to the State's domestic product is limited to only 34 %.

3.3        Since the total supply of cultivable land is almost fixed, the only recourse for increasing the area under crops is by more intensive utilisation of the available land i.e. by double cropping.

3.4        In the following table districtwise percentages of gross cropped area to net area sown are given.

3.5        The above data clearly brings out the distressing picture obtaining not only in the six districts of the Poona division but also in the

State. The three features of the situation are : (1) The percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown in the division is declining instead of increasing. (2) The area cropped more than once as a percentage of the net area sown is itself very small. It is near about 5 percent in the division. In the year 1970-71, the highest percentage was obtained in the Poona district ( 107.36 ) and lowest in Kolhapur district ( 101.11 ) .

(3) As compared to the year 1960-61, the percentage gross cropped area to net area sown was less in 1970-71 in the five districts out of the six in the division. And in the sixth district viz. in Ahmednagar, the increase in the percentage was rather insignificant.

3.6 The above analysis is in terms of percentages, which are deceptive. If the absolute figures of net area sown and area sown more than once are considered, the position is found to be still more disappointing. In 1960-61, the net area sown was 5185800 hectares, which declined to 5165500 in 1970-71; while the figures of area cropped more than once in these two years were 300600 hectares and 263500 hectares respectively.

3.7 Thus in terms of both percentages and absolute figures, the position in 1970-71 as compared to 1960-61 was not satisfactory.

#### I R R I G A T I O N :

3.8 In 1970-71 the total net area irrigated in the division was to the tune of 575900 hectares as compared to 510000 hectares in 1960-61 i.e. exactly a decade back. The source wise break-up of the area irrigated in 1970-71 was : Wells 340600 hectares (59.11 %), Government canals 149200 hectares (25.89 %), other sources 61500 hectares (10.67 %), private canals 20600 hectares (3.53 %), tanks 4300 hectares (0.75 %).

3.9 In the following table districtwise position of irrigation facilities is given.

3.10 It is observed that in both the years the increase in the net area irrigated was quite appreciable in Sangli and Kolhapur districts, though in the case of the latter district, there was quite a fall in the area in 1970-71 as compared to the previous year. The case of Poona district was exactly opposite, where there was a sudden and sharp increase in the net area irrigated in 1970-71. The overall position of the district vis-a-vis the state was, however, not satisfactory. In 1969-70, the net area irrigated in the State increased by 28.26 % as compared to the base year 1960-61. In the Poona division, however, the increase was of 9.00 % only.

3.11 The above information shows only the extent of absolute increase in irrigated area. From the table given below how much of the area sown was irrigated can be seen.

3.12 The following facts are observed from the above data.

1) In the division there was no appreciable increase in the proportion of area irrigated. As regards area irrigated more than once, there was a sudden increase in the year 1970-71, which was due to the increase in the area in Poona district.

2) The proportion of area irrigated is rather small, only 11 % in the division and at the most 12 % in the districts.

3) The position of the districts as well as the division vis-a-vis that of the State compared favourably in all the three reference years.

4) The districts which had the percentage of area irrigated more than once higher than that of the division in 1970-71 were Poona, Satara, and Sholapur.

5) In the Poona division, only Kolhapur district is immune to famine and scarcity. However, it is interesting to note that compared to the other scarcity prone districts like Ahmednagar the proportion of irrigated area in that district is not high, while the area irrigated more than once is the lowest in the division.

#### C R O P P A T T E R N :

3.13 The conditions of soil and climate in the region are such that the cropping pattern is dominated by inferior crops like jowar, bajra. In those isolated pockets where irrigation facilities have developed significantly mitigating natural disadvantages e.g. Baramati taluka in Poona district, Shrirampur in Ahmednagar district, sugarcane is grown and these are the islands of prosperity in an otherwise poor countryside.

3.14 In the following table details of the crop pattern in the division in 1960-61, 1969-70 and 1970-71 are given.

3.15 As commented earlier, coarse grains like Jowar and Bajra were cultivated in more than 50 % of the gross cropped area, while the area under Wheat and Rice was only about 2.35 % and 3.60 % respectively. The area under important cash crops like Sugarcane, Cotton and Groundnut was also comparatively very small. Coarse grains fetch relatively lesser value as compared to crops like Wheat and Rice. Hence the above cropping pattern

has economic significance for the rural economy.

3.16 Another trend appears to be that cultivators are switching over from food crops to non-food crops.

YIELD RATES :

3.17 Maharashtra is a deficit State in foodgrains production and as seen earlier out of the six districts in the Poona division, five are scarcity prone areas. The trend in the yield rates of the major crops in the Poona division can be ascertained from the following table.

3.18 The above data shows that excepting Wheat and Bajra the yield rates of the rest of the major crops in the division declined as compared to the base year 1962-63. The yield rate of Jowar which is the staple food in the rural areas declined by as much as 46.73 % in 1970-71. The yield rates of total cereals and total pulses also show a decline of 28.61 % and 43.43 % respectively in the year 1970-71. The agricultural strategy aims at increasing the yield per hectare by providing the necessary inputs like improved seeds, fertilisers and water (irrigation). In 1969-70, 40593 quintals of improved seed (foodgrains) and 64420 tonnes of fertilisers were distributed under Plan Schemes. The area burdened was 168735 hectares. The corresponding figures for 1970-71 were 19757 quintals, 90310 tonnes, 100043 hectares respectively. In spite of these Plan efforts the yield rates show a marked decline. The aim of Planning is - as far as

the agricultural sector is concerned - evolution of strategies and their effective implementation with a view to overcoming natural disadvantages. But the picture obtaining in the Poona division shows that it has not been possible even to maintain the level of the yield rates of 1962-63.

#### FOOD DEFICIT :

3.19 The quinquennial average production of foodgrains ( 1966-67 to 1970-71 ) in the Poona division works out to 1608500 tonnes. The requirement of a balanced diet are 18 ounces of foodgrains per adult unit per day. If this requirement is taken into account, the total deficit of foodgrains works out to 553700 tonnes, a staggering figure indeed. ( Total requirement of foodgrains comes to 2162200 tonnes per year. The figures is calculated by treating 100 persons as equal to 88 adult units. Population figure of the division pertains to 1970 and year estimation ).

3.20 This deficit does not take into account the consumption pattern of the people. It is estimated that out of the total consumption of cereals roughly a fifth is rice and 15.7 % wheat and the remainder millets. ( Source : Techno-Economic Survey of Maharashtra ) The quinquennial average production of rice ( 1966-67 to 1970-71 ) and wheat was 13.01 % and 4.65 % respectively i.e. in respect of individual commodities also there was considerable deficit.

3.21 A deficit in agricultural production has far reaching effects on the overall economy. It signifies three things :

1) It affects the supply of essential raw materials to the industrial sector,

2) It means less purchasing power with the rural sector; the reason being that both commercial and distress surpluses which enter into the market are very badly affected. This in turn has its adverse impact on the organised industrial sector because a reduction in the purchasing power with the rural sector means a fall in their demand for the products of the industrial sector, for instance textiles.

3) It leads to a vicious wage-price spiral.

3.22 The foregoing analysis of the agricultural sector boils down to one inescapable and oft repeated conclusion viz. that unless and until the dependence of agricultural production on monsoon is drastically reduced by increasing irrigation facilities, it will upset the whole Plan programme.

L I V E S T C C K :

3.23 Since animal power is predominantly used for carrying out various agricultural operations, gross cropped area per pair of working bullocks would give an indication about the improvement or otherwise in this direction. The relevant statistics shows that in 1961, the gross cropped area per pair of working bullocks was 7.93 hectares as against 7.89 hectares in 1966 indicating insignificant improvement.

C O - O P E R A T I O N : AGRICULTURAL CREDIT :

3.24 Because of the paucity of funds with the average agriculturist, institutional credit plays a very important role in the uplift of the agricultural sector. The co-operative movement in the State now embraces several economic activities such as agricultural credit distribution of inputs, agricultural marketing etc.

3.25 The primary agricultural credit societies cater to the short term and medium term loan requirements of the agriculturist while the Land Development Banks meet the long term credit needs. The achievements in the sphere of agricultural credit can be seen from the following table.

3.26 The data shows the lop-sided development of the financial



structure of the Primary Agricultural Credit Societies in the Poona division. While during the reference period of a decade the amount of loans advanced increased from Rs. 2325 lakhs to Rs. 5235 lakhs, which is a very impressive achievement, the overdues at the end of 1971-72 stood at the frightening level of Rs. 2229 lakhs. During the year 1971-72, the percentages of recoveries of loans advanced were 93.8 in Ahmednagar district, 61.0 in Poona, 74.0 in Satara, 81.4 in Sangli, 54.0 in Sholapur and 80.0 in Kolhapur. The percentage of recovery in the Poona division was only 75. The position calls for drastic remedial measures.

#### LAND DEVELOPMENT BANKS :

3.27 The credit structure of Land Development Banks is not different from that of the Primary Agricultural Credit Societies. In fact it is comparatively worse. The overdues, for instance, were only Rs. 8 lakhs in 1961-62, while in 1971-72 they stood at Rs. 474 lakhs. During this same period loans advanced increased by Rs. 420 lakhs.

#### CONSUMPTION OF ELECTRICITY :

3.28 Availability of power accelerates the pace of industrial and agricultural development. The indicator of per capita consumption of electricity is used for assessing the progress in this vital field of the economy.

3.29 It is seen from the data given in the table that the per capita consumption of electricity increased by leaps and bounds during the decade. Poona district leads the list with a per capita consumption of 159.89 k.w. h. followed by Kolhapur, Sangli, Sholapur, Ahmednagar and Satara.

3.30 The level of industrial activity in a particular year can be

broadly caused by the increase in the consumption of electricity by industries. In the following table, the relevant data are given.

3.31 The above data shows some very interesting results. With a consumption of 40897000 KWH electricity by industries, Poona district topped the list in 1961-62, while Satara was at rear end with a consumption of only 1643000 KWH. In the ten year period from 1961-62, the electricity consumption by industries in different districts increased at varying rates. In Kolhapur district it increased by more than 11 times, thus topping the list in the rate of increase. In Poona district it increased by about seven and half times. Sangli district stands at the end, where it increased by only about three and a quarter times.

3.32 As on 31-3-1972, the total number of villages and towns electrified stood at 3166 and 66 respectively i.e. 49 % of the villages and 94 % the towns were electrified by that period.

U N E M P L O Y M E N T :

3.33 Only Employment Exchange Statistics are presented in this Abstract, which does not cover the teening millions that are unemployed and underemployed in the rural as well as urban areas. Complete data encompassing all the unemployed persons are not yet available and only rough estimates can be had. This, therefore, is the serious limitation of the analysis made below.

3.34      The data shows that even in respect of those very small percentage of unemployed persons who avail of the facilities of Employment Exchange, the picture was gloomy. While the number of registered persons increased from 78067 in 1961-62 to 101789 in 1971-72, there was a fall even in the absolute number of candidates placed in employment ( from 8158 to 7597 ). The percentage of placement to registration also showed a decline from 10.45 in 1961-62 to 7.46 in 1971-72.

P U B L I C   H E A L T H :

3.35      The general aim of public health programme is to expand the existing health services, to bring them increasingly within the reach of the people and to promote a progressive improvement in the level of national health. Provision of adequate institutions facilities is one of the programmes.

3.36      It is observed from the above data that except in the case of Nurses, the rate of increase in hospitals, doctors and beds has not kept pace with the increase in population.

3.37      The above statistics does not cover medical facilities available

through the private sector. Private medical practitioners and hospitals are however, concentrated in major cities and urban areas only. Hence it can be said that in rural areas at least the extent of medical facilities available are less developed.

3.33 The general health standard of the people can be assessed from the birth rate, death rate and infant mortality rate.

3.39 The fall in the birth rate, death rate as well as infant mortality rate shows that considerable progress has been achieved in improving the health standards of the people. For the Maharashtra State, the corresponding rates in 1971 were 28.4, 10.0 and 65 respectively. The figures of Poona division compare favourably with those of Maharashtra.

E D U C A T I O N :

3.40 Education equips the people with specific skills necessary for increasing the productive capacity of the economy and for fuller participation in the development process.

3.41 The data given in the following table gives an idea about the progress made in the field of education.

3.42 The data shows that there was increase in the number of pupils in all the three types of institutions. A remarkable feature of the progress of education is that as compared to the percentage increase in the number

of male students that of female students was high. It is also noteworthy that the percentage increase in the number of students taking higher education was quite appreciable in 1970-71 as compared to 1969-70, the increase being 11.62 %.

In the following table the teacher-student ratios are given.

3.43 The data reveals that though there was increase in the number of pupils in 1970-71, the teacher-student ratio has been maintained in both primary and secondary institutions.

T R A N S P O R T :

3.44 Transport provides the basis for the effective fulfilment of production targets. Provision of adequate transport facilities is also an essential pre-requisite to the development of backward areas.

3.45 The indicator of road length per 100 square kilometre area is used here for assessing the development in this vital field of infrastructure.

3.46 The indicator shows that the original Nagpur Plan target of

16 kilometre road length per 100 square kilometre of area has been already surpassed. by all the districts in the division. Except Satara and Sholapur all the other four districts have the road length more than the divisional average road length.

3.47 The total railway length in the Poona division as on 31-3-1972 was <sup>1268</sup> 1268 km. out of which the broad gauge length was 903 km. i.e. about 71 percent of the total length.

B A N K I N G :

3.48 If roads are the arteries of the nation, banking can be compared to the heart. Banking facilities are not, however, spread evenly over the entire area. Branch expansion has, therefore, become one of the important programmes of the banks. The number of banking offices per lakh population at two different points of time will indicate the developments in this sector.

3.49 It is observed that except in the case of Satara and Sholapur districts, the increase in the number of banking offices per lakh population during the decade under reference was three. Poona district had the highest number of banking offices per lakh populations, while Sholapur district had the lowest number.

P R I C E S :

3.50 In the Poona division, consumer price index numbers are worked out for Poona and Sholapur centres with base years 1961 and 1960 respectively. The general index for 1971-72 for Poona centre was 176 and that for Sholapur 196. The index for food items was, however, 139 and 214 respectively at these two centres.

C H A P T E R IV

A N N U A L P L A N : 1 9 7 1 - 7 2

4.1 The year 1971-72 was the third year of the Fourth Five Year Plan, and it marked the beginning of the second decade after the formation of the State of Maharashtra.

4.2 The total expenditure in the Poona division on all the Plan schemes was Rs. 37.43 crores during 1971-72 as against Rs. 200 crores in the State. There are three types of schemes viz. Divisional level, district level and centrally sponsored schemes. Out of the total expenditure of Rs. 37.43 crores, divisional level schemes claimed Rs. 12.31 crores, district level schemes Rs. 20.77 crores and centrally sponsored schemes Rs. 4.40 crores, the respective percentages being 33, 56, and 11. The share of the State sector was 79 % and remaining amount was spent by the local sector.

4.3 The per capita expenditure on district level <sup>schemes</sup> during the three years of the Fourth Five Year Plan is given below.

4.4 The following points are observed from the above data.

1) Except in the case of Ahmednagar district and that too for one year i.e. 1970-71 the level of per capita expenditure on district level schemes in the rest of the districts was either maintained or increased during the three year period.

2) During all the three years the per capita expenditure in Poona district was less than the divisional average, while in the case of Kolhapur district it was less during 1970-71 and 1971-72.

3) There was a very sharp increase in the per capita expenditure during 1971-72 as compared to the earlier years.

4) Sangli was the only district which had the per capita expenditure higher than the divisional average in all the three years.

4.5 The major headwise expenditure during 1971-72 is given in the following table.

STATE PLAN SCHEMES : GENERAL ASSESSMENT :

4.6 The total budget provision was Rs. 32 crores while the actual expenditure was Rs. 33 crores i.e. the budget provision was exceeded by 3.25 %. The major headwise financial achievements show that except in the case of social services and miscellaneous schemes, the budget provision was exceeded in respect of all the major heads of development.

4.7 The percentage expenditure on various heads of development give an indication about the Plan priorities. The relevant data in column 3 shows that Irrigation and Power occupied the pride of place followed by Social services and Agricultural programmes. The percentage expenditure on the remaining major heads of development was comparatively insignificant.

AGRICULTURE AND ALLIED PROGRAMME :

4.8 Key elements of the agricultural programmes are expansion of irrigation facilities, soil conservation measures, maximum exploitation of the possibilities of raising yields through hybrid and high yielding varieties of seeds etc. Given the geophysical factors the task of achieving a break-through on the agricultural front is a formidable task.

4.9 The expenditure made on the various sub-heads of development under the minor head Agricultural Programme is given below :

## AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTION :

4.10 The schemes under this head were executed at district level only. The total expenditure was Rs. 42 lakhs which was 93 % of the budget provision. In the previous year i.e. 1970-71 also, the expenditure was only 92 % of the budget provision of Rs. 44 lakhs i.e. in both the years the financial achievements fell short of the budget allotment.

4.11 Important schemes implemented under this minor head of development were Development of local manurial resources ( town compost ) grant of loans under horticultural development, intensive cultivation of food crops, subsidy for plant protection measures,. The achievements under these schemes are given in the following table.

4.12 It is observed that the physical achievements under all the 4 schemes fell short of the target.

4.13 In order to increase agricultural production improved seeds and chemical fertilisers were distributed. During the year 1971-72, the total quantity of improved seed distributed ( foodgrains ) was 17554 quintals as against 19757 quintals in 1970-71 and 40593 in 1969-70, showing a declining trend. The quantity of improved cotton seed distributed was 1811 quintals in 1970-71, while in the year under review it was only 1708 quintals. The quantity of chemical fertilisers distributed during 1970-71 and 1971-72 was 90310 tonnes and 121739 tonnes respectively.

## M I N O R    I R R I G A T I O N :

4.14 The financial achievement under this minor head was quite satisfactory, with the actual expenditure exceeding the budget provision by 10 %.

4.15 Under the scheme of construction of new wells, the achievement was 2179 wells as against the target of 6840 wells. The target for installation of pumping sets was 7220 while the achievement was only 2864 pump sets. Under the scheme of minor irrigation works 80 tanks and 66 bandharas were to be constructed. The actual number of percolation tanks and bandharas constructed was, however, only 30. Only in the case of lift irrigation, the target of 15 schemes was fulfilled.

#### S O I L      C O N S E R V A T I O N :

4.16 While the budget allotment under this minor head of development was about Rs. 3 crores the expenditure was Rs. 2.93 crores.

4.17 The schemes implemented under this head were contourbunding, terracing and reclamation of non-coastal alkaline and saline land and water logged lands and afforestation for soil conservation. The physical achievements under these schemes were as follows :

#### A Y A C U T      D E V E L O P M E N T :

4.18 The financial achievement under the only one scheme of land development was quite satisfactory, with the actual expenditure exceeding the budget by Rs. 74000. In spite of the increased expenditure, the physical achievement was, however, less than the target of 4380 hectares by 979 hectares.

#### A N I M A L      H U S B A N D R Y :

4.19 This scheme was implemented both at the district and division level. As against the financial provision of Rs. 12.48 lakhs, the actual expenditure was Rs. 16.08 lakhs.

4.20 The important divisional level schemes were provision of veterinary polyclinics, establishment and expansion of cattle breeding farms, bull depots, sheep farms, establishment of poultry breeding farms and intensive poultry development blocks.

4.21 During the year under review, one polyclinic at Kolhapur was opened, and that at Solapur was continued. Under the scheme of expansion of cattle breeding farms and bull depots, thirteen works were executed. 4 at Jath in Sangli district and 9 at Junoni in Sholapur district and the target was fulfilled.

4.22 At the district level two schemes viz. provision of veterinary dispensaries and aid centres were implemented. The number of such dispensaries and aid centres started in 1971-72 was 3.

#### DAIRY DEVELOPMENT :

4.23 The financial target under this minor head of development also was more than fulfilled, the actual expenditure being more than the budget provision by 19 %.

4.24 Two schemes namely of Town Milk Supply and assistance to milk unions and federations were implemented. The achievements were, however, not satisfactory. Under the first scheme, as against the target of 1.36 lakh litres of milk, the actual quantity of milk handled per day was only 1.17 lakh litres. The target fixed for assistance to milk unions and federations was 104; while the achievement was 94.

#### F O R E S T S :

4.25 By expanding an amount of Rs. 6.86 lakhs as against the budget of Rs. 6.32 lakhs, the notable achievements under this head were afforestation in 1119 hectares of land and plantation of valuable trees in 520 hectares. The corresponding figures for the previous year were 1421 and 232 hectares respectively.

#### F I S H E R I E S :

4.26 The expenditure under this head was very small - only Rs. 1.07 lakhs. During the year under review, 2533 thousand fingerlings were stocked and 192314 kg. of fish were netted as against the targets of 2950 thousand and 225 thousand kg. respectively.

#### WAREHOUSING AND MARKETING :

4.27 This minor head of development had the highest percentage of

expenditure to budget provision. One district level scheme of development of agricultural marketing was implemented under this head by assisting 36 Agriculture Produce Market Committees as against the target of 40.

#### C O - O P E R A T I O N A N D C O M M U N I T Y D E V E L O P M E N T :

4.28 Co-operatives have an important role to play in transforming the economy and in the upliftment of the weaker sections of the community. The schemes under this major head of development were executed at both the divisional and district level.

4.29 The expenditure on co-operation and community development taken together was Rs. 183.74 lakhs, which was higher than the budget provision by Rs. 22.63 lakhs. The expenditure on Community Development programme taken separately was, however, less than the budget allocation. The share of the expenditure on division level schemes, which was made entirely on co-operation was 63 % of the total expenditure.

4.30 The expenditure on this major head compares very favourably with that during the previous year, the expenditure in 1970-71 being only Rs. 111.63 lakhs.

#### C O - O P E R A T I O N :

4.31 Under co-operation two divisional level schemes of agricultural processing ( other than sugar factories and licensing units ) and co-operative sugar factories were implemented. Under the first scheme share capital contribution was given to 3 units, while under the second scheme, share capital contribution was given to 11 factories as against the target of 7.

4.32 At the district level under the scheme of strengthening of co-operative credit structure 22 branches of Central Financing Agencies were opened as against the target of 22. The number of branches assisted was 394 ( target 394 ). Under the scheme of development of co-operative marketing 34 societies were to be given subsidies for godown and 6 societies were to be given Government share capital contribution. The achievement was 29 and 7 societies respectively. The third noteworthy scheme was that of consumers co-operative stores under which 16 stores were assisted as against the target of 17.

#### C O M M U N I T Y D E V E L O P M E N T :

4.33 Under Community Development, three schemes viz. (1) composite programme for women and children (2) applied nutrition programme and

(3) special nutrition programme ( in Ahmednagar and Poona districts only ) were executed and the targets of 18, 19 and 5 blocks was fulfilled.

IRRIGATION AID POWER :

4.34 . Water is the basic input for raising the agricultural productivity of land. Since the major part of the Poona division lies in the rain shadow area unless irrigation facilities of a permanent nature are provided, there is no chance of any economic development.

4.35 . In view of the above fact during the year 1971-72, the lion's share of expenditure went to this major head of development ( 40.15 % of the total expenditure ).

4.36 . All the schemes under irrigation were implemented at the divisional level only by expending an amount of Rs. 722.08 lakhs, which was less than the budget provision by Rs. 50000. The expenditure was made on the various major and medium irrigation projects in the division. The achievements which deserve specific mention were that the earth and masonry work of Panshet dam was completed and the head work and main canal work of Padwalkarwadi project were nearly completed.

4.37 . As regards power projects, the schemes were implemented at both divisional and district level. Out of the total expenditure of Rs. 606.37 lakhs on power projects, Rs. 173.26 lakhs were spent on divisional level schemes and the rest on district level schemes. The total expenditure on both district and divisional level schemes exceeded the budget allotment by Rs. 70.63 lakhs.

4.38 . Under the scheme of rural electrification 312 villages were electrified and 3406 agricultural pumps were connected in 1971-72 as against 282 villages and 12674 pumps in the preceeding year. Under the scheme of normal development ( urban ) connexions were given for domestic, commercial, industrial purposes etc.

4.39 . As regards divisional level expenditure, the entire amount of Rs. 173.26 lakhs was spent on 33 kv lines and sub-stations.

INDUSTRY AND MINING :

4.40 . The role of the state Government in the rapid industrial development is largely of a promotional nature and that of providing essential

infrastructure, the policies and programmes being enunciated by the Central Government.

4.41 There are two sub-heads viz. (i) Large Scale and medium industries and (ii) Small Scale Industries under the major head Industry and Mining. The total expenditure on these two sub-heads was Rs. 94.88 lakhs as against the budget provision of Rs. 91.69 lakhs. The expenditure on Small Scale Industries was, however, less than the budget provision by Rs. 1.14 lakhs.

4.42 There was only one scheme at divisional level for large and medium industries and the entire amount of Rs. 18.58 lakhs was given as loan for share capital to spinning mills.

4.43 The notable achievements under Small Scale Industries schemes which were implemented both at district and divisional level were financial assistance to 723 artisans ( target 125 ) and to 56 industrial co-operative societies including handicrafts ( target 14 ).

#### TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS :

4.44 The schemes under this major head of development were implemented at both divisional and district level by incurring an expenditure of Rs. 212.91 lakhs which was slightly higher ( by 1.06 % ) than the budget provision. As compared to the previous year the expenditure in 1971-72 was higher by about Rs. 25 lakhs. At the divisional level the entire amount of Rs. 93.29 lakhs was spent on improvement of state highways and black topping programme, construction of cross drainages and bridges.

4.45 The important achievements under district level schemes were construction of 426 km. of new district roads and modernisation of 519 km. of road length. The length of roads constructed in hilly areas was insignificant - only 15.20 km. As compared to the achievements in the earlier year - 184 km. construction of new roads, modernisation of 9 km. of roads and 5 km. of roads in hilly areas - the achievements in the year under review were quite satisfactory.

#### SOCIAL SERVICES :

4.46 This major head of development comprises of 9 sub-heads, the financial achievements under which are given in the following table.

4.47 It is noticed that except General education and Water supply and drainage on which the expenditure was 104 and 99 % respectively of the budget provision, the grants given to the other 7 sub-heads of development remained unutilised to the extent of 5 to 22 %.

PHYSICAL ACHIEVEMENTS : GENERAL EDUCATION :

4.48 Under the scheme of Government open merit freeships to non-Backward Class students ( excluding Economically Backward Class ) in non-Government colleges 446 students benefitted as against the target of 500. In addition 131 sets of scholarships were given ( target 120 ) under the scheme of Government open merit scholarships. Both these schemes were divisional level.

4.49 At the district level, under the scheme of educational concession to Economically Backward Class pupils, the number of beneficiaries was 107522, which exceeded the target by 5122, and under the scheme of concessions to children of primary teachers, 6829 pupils received the benefit. Under the scheme of loans to voluntary agencies for construction of secondary school buildings, 30 schools were constructed as against the target of 40.



#### T E C H N I C A L    E D U C A T I O N    :

4.50        At the district level one staff scheme of introduction of post diploma course at the College of Engineering, Poona was implemented and at the divisional level provision was made for purchase of modernized equipments in Engineering Colleges.

#### H E A L T H    A I D    F A M I L Y    P L A N N I N G    :

4.51        The achievements in 1971-72 included starting of 2 Public Health Centres, provision of 179 additional beds, construction of 695 drinking water wells and appointment of 56 doctors and 192 nurses.

#### W A T E R    S U P P L Y    A I D    D R A I N A G E    :

4.52        Out of the target of 28 works under the scheme of municipal water supply and drainage one work in Poona district was completed. The remaining works were in progress. Under the Government water supply scheme 7 works ( one in Ahmednagar district and two each in Poona, Satara and Kolhapur districts ) were in progress. As regards the piped water supply scheme, 40 schemes out of 67 were completed.

#### H O U S I N G    :

4.53        Under the village housing project scheme, the achievement was 42 houses as against the target of 288.

#### U R B A N    D E V E L O P M E N T    :

4.54        Under the only one district level scheme of financial assistance to municipal councils for implementation of development plans, 8 municipal councils were assisted.

#### W E L F A R E    O F    B A C K W A R D    C L A S S    :

4.55        The significant achievements under this sub-head were grant of scholarships, tuition fees and examination fees to 4745 students, grants to 68 hostels and construction of 71 new irrigation wells and repairs to old ones for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes. Since the targets were not fixed for all the districts, assessment of the achievements can not be made.

#### S O C I A L    W E L F A R E    :

4.56        Under the schemes which were executed at the divisional level, expenditure was incurred for grants-in-aid to voluntary agencies for opening blind, deaf and dumb schools and financial assistance was given to physically handicapped persons.

LABOUR AID LABOUR WELFARE :

4.57 Two new institutions with an intake capacity of 584 persons were started in 1971-72 as against one in the previous year.

MISCELLANEOUS :

4.58 Under the scheme of rural broadcasting 327 radio sets as against the target of 600 sets were installed.

CENTRALLY SPONSORED SCHEMES :

4.59 The total expenditure under Centrally Sponsored Schemes was Rs. 440.40 lakhs ( 93.69% of the budget provision ) and it covered all the major heads of development excepting irrigation and power and industry and mining.

AGRICULTURAL PROGRAMME :

4.60 The sanctioned amounts for this major head of development remained unutilised to the extent of about 5 %. As regards physical achievements, the scheme of maximising production of groundnut for export purposes was implemented in Sangli and Kolhapur districts by covering 61205 hectare area as against the target of 92000 hectares. In Sholapur district 111 farmers and in Kolhapur district 166 farmers were given training under the scheme of mass training of farmers.

4.61 Out of the six districts in the division, the drought prone area programme was implemented in all the districts in the Poona division except Kolhapur. Under the State sector construction work of 9 tanks in Ahmednagar district, 5 in Poona district, 6 each in Satara and Sangli districts and 8 in Kolhapur district were in progress. Under the local sector work of 23 percolation tanks was completed and that of 161 tanks was in progress.

CO-OPERATION AID COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT :

4.62 The expenditure under this head was Rs. 1.73 lakhs, which was about 35 % of the budget grants. One scheme of distribution of consumer articles in rural areas through marketing societies was taken up and 2 societies were assisted as against the target of 4.

TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION :

4.63 By expending an amount of Rs. 1.40 lakhs road length of 4 km. was constructed in the hilly areas of Kolhapur district.

S O C I A L   S E R V I C E S :

4.64 . The expenditure under this major head was 95 % of the budget allocation. The achievements under some of the important schemes are given in the following table.

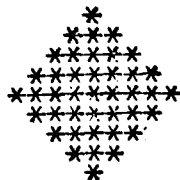

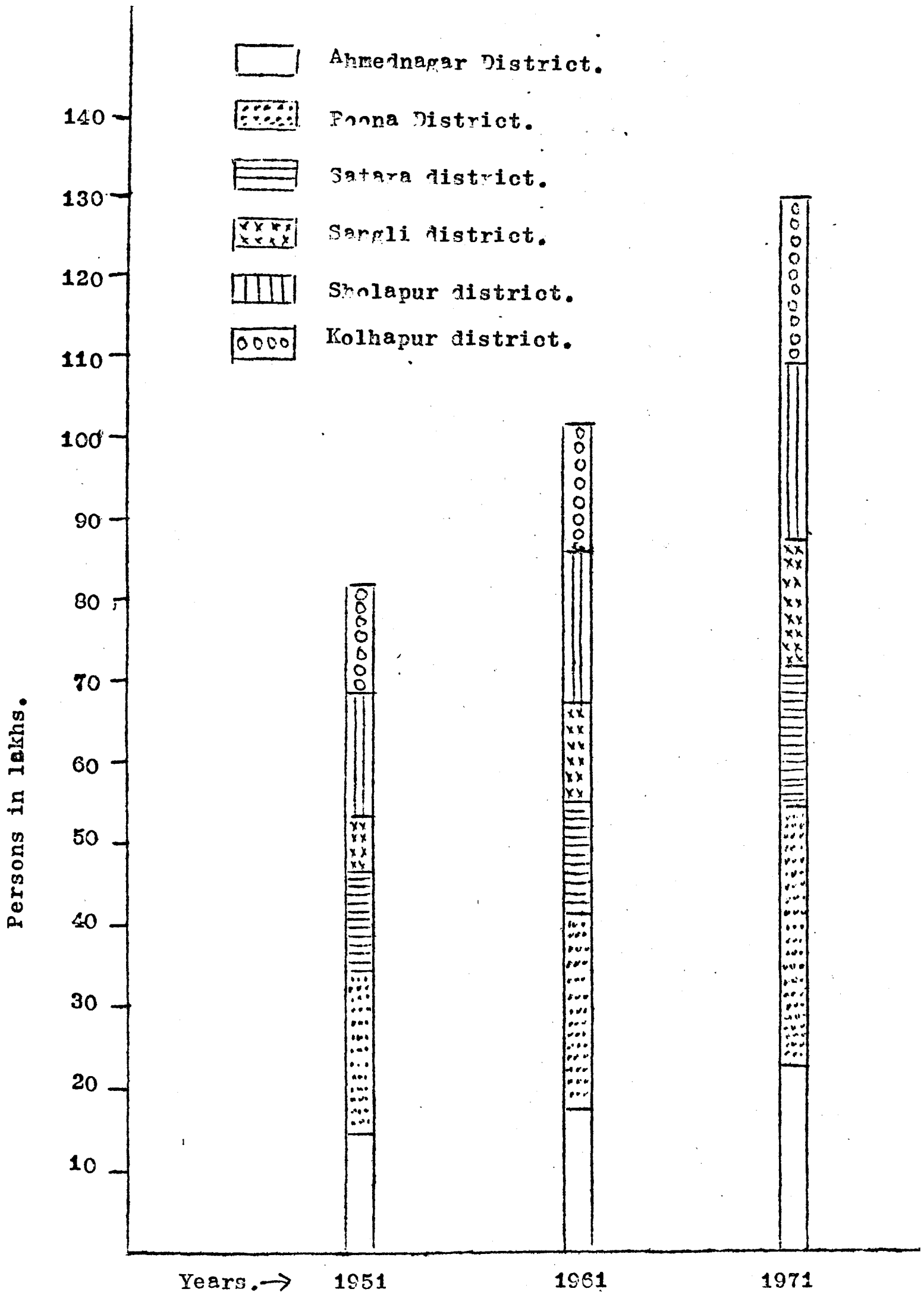

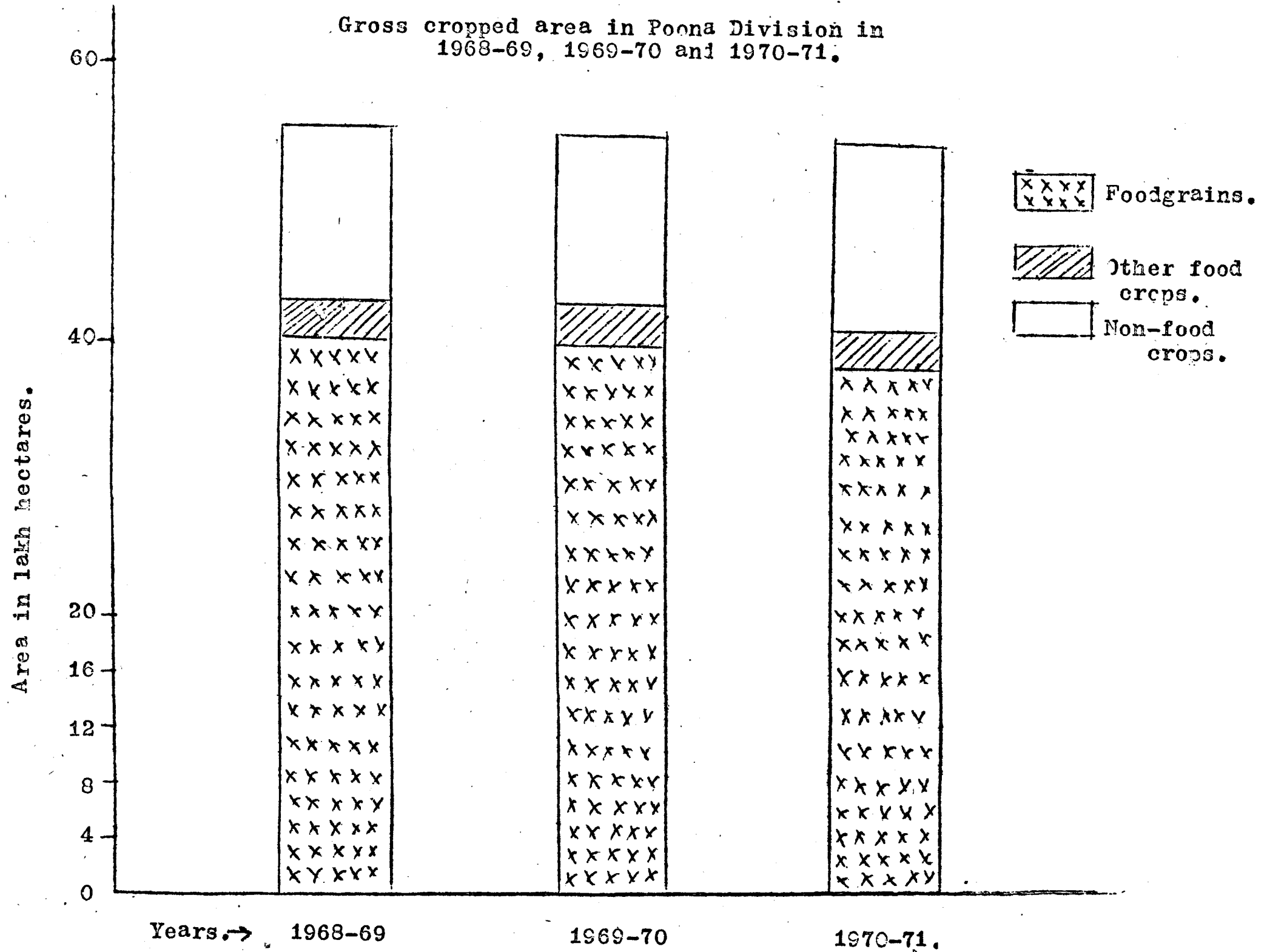

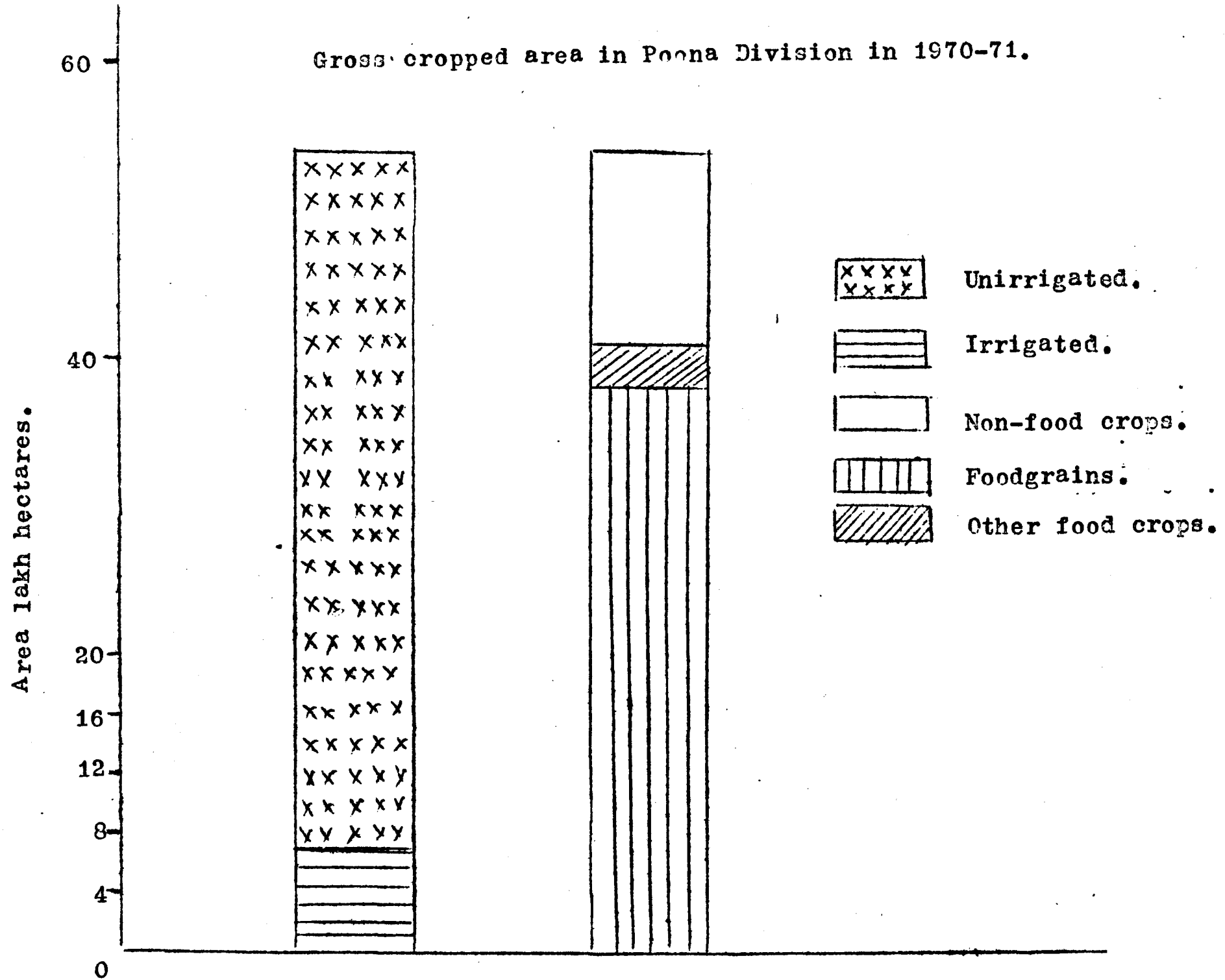
POPULATION IN POONA DIVISION.



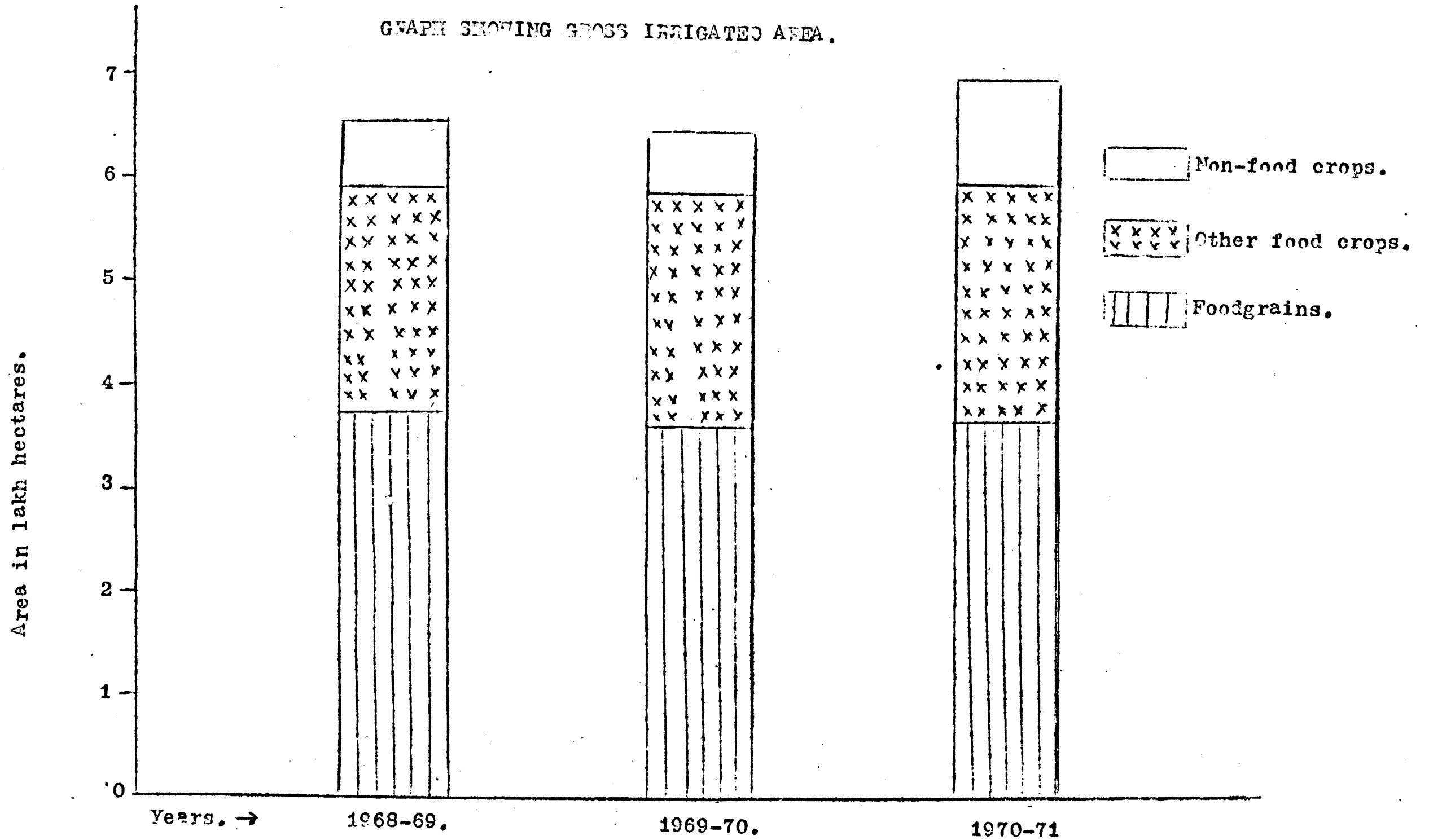
Gross cropped area in Poona Division in 1968-69, 1969-70 and 1970-71.

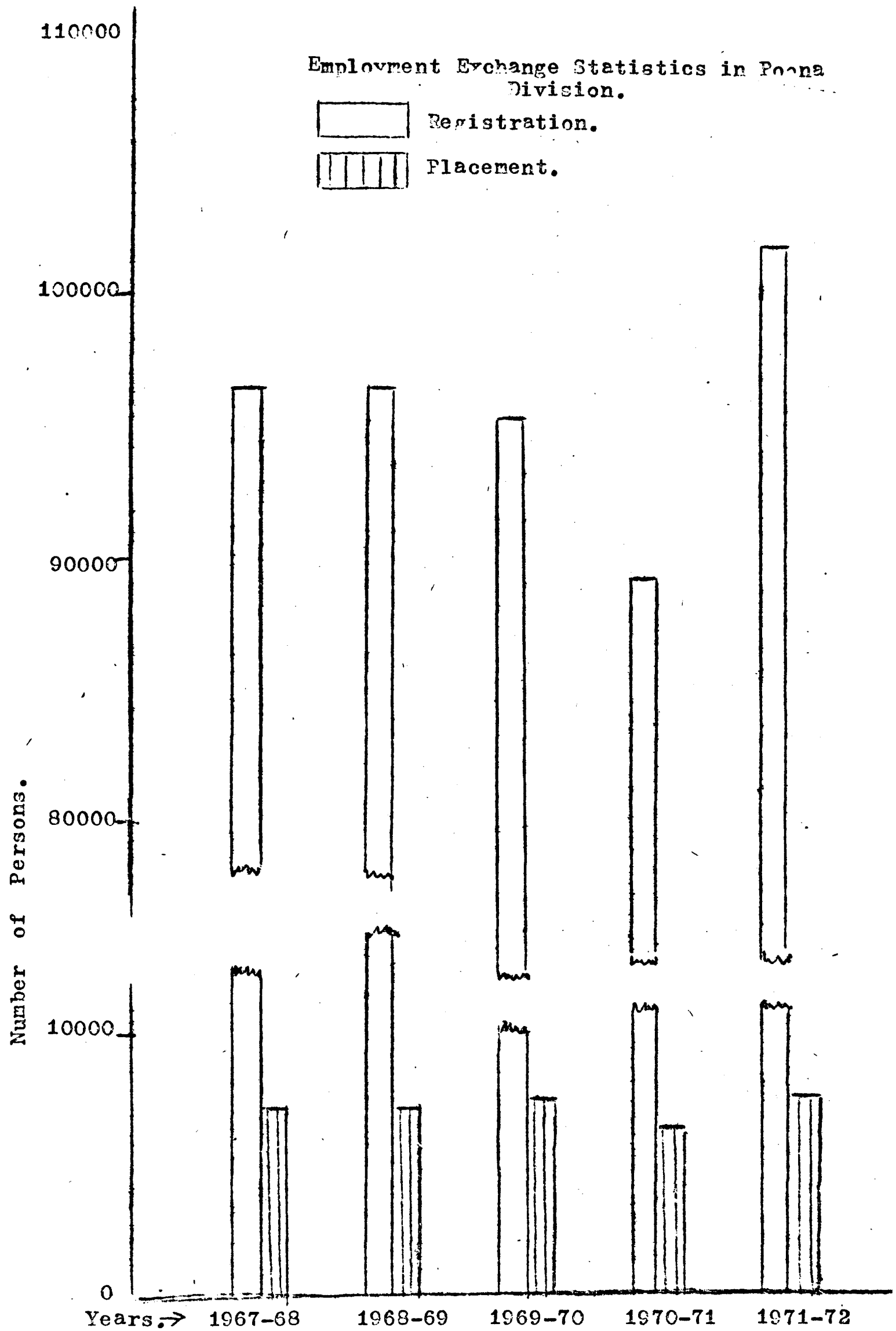


Gross cropped area in Poona Division in 1970-71.

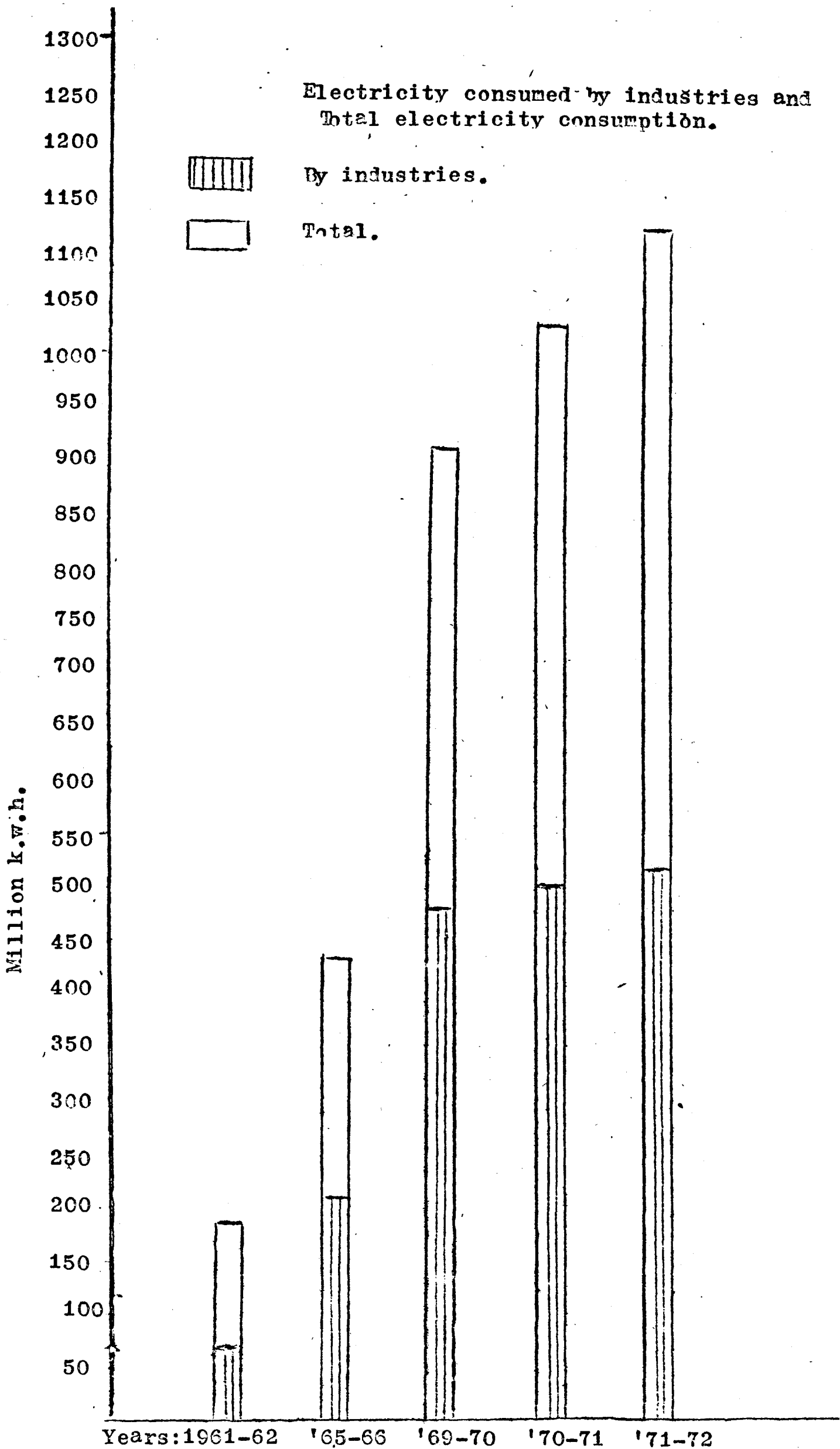


GRAPH SHOWING GROSS IRRIGATED AREA.

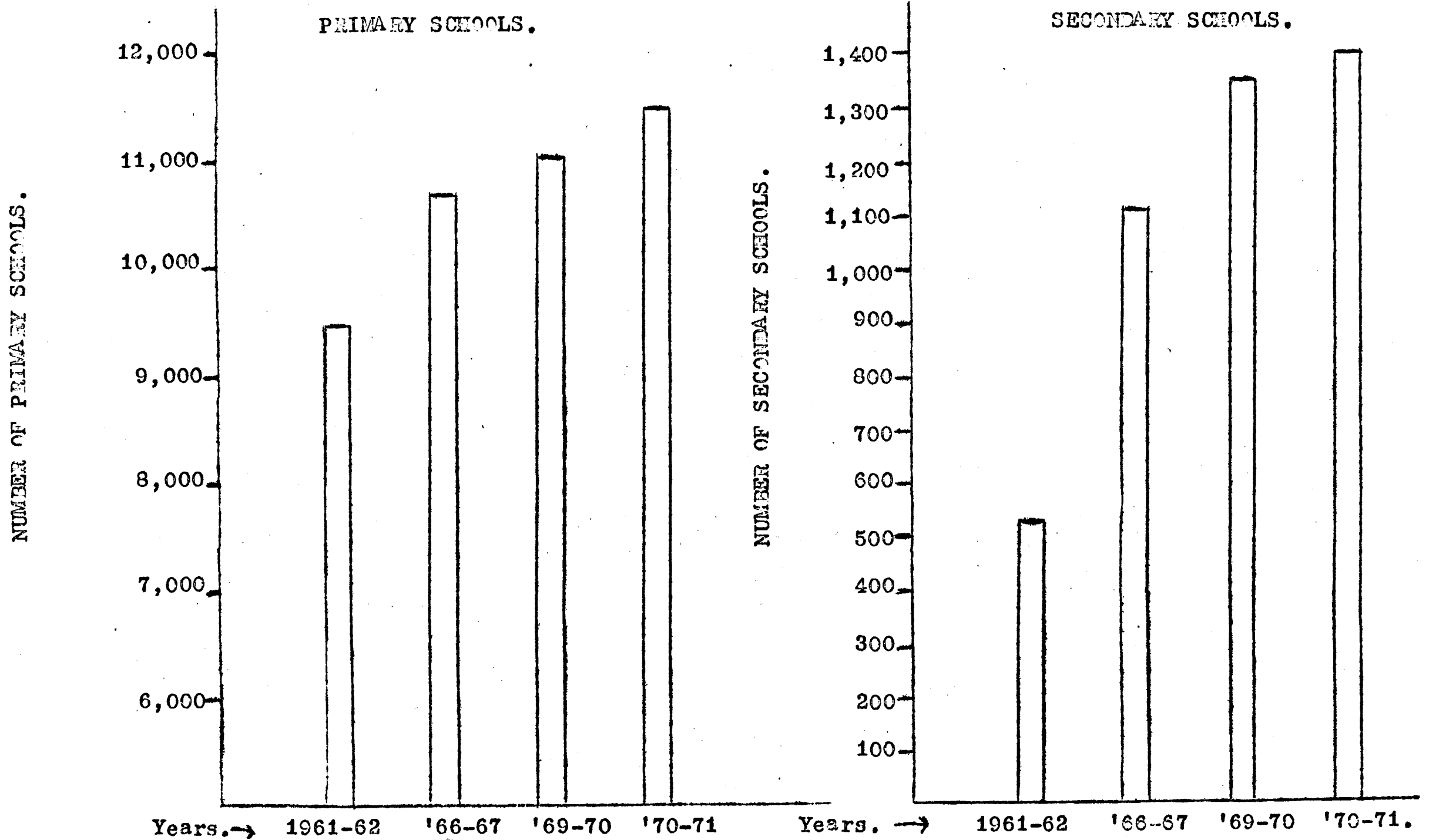




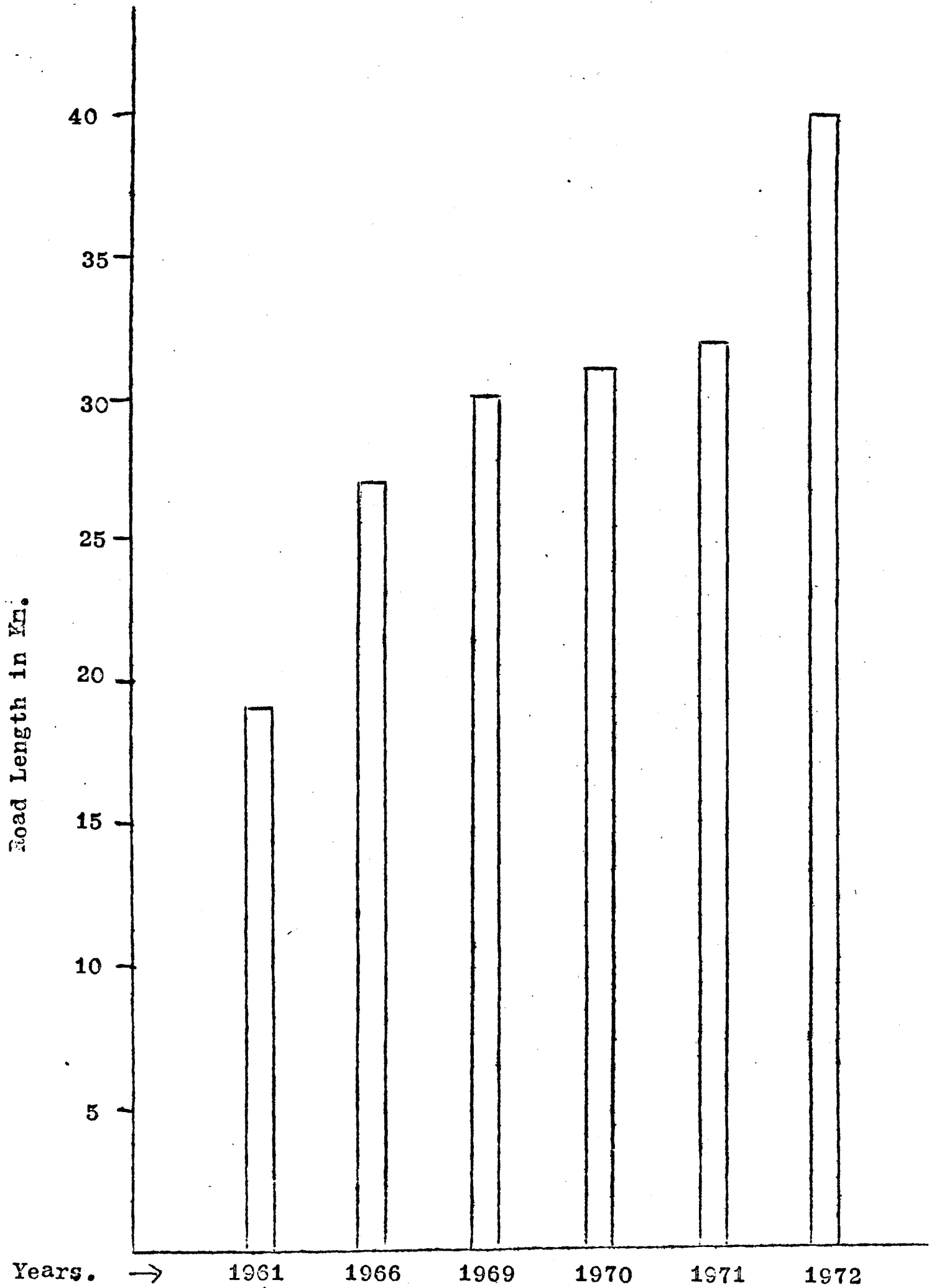




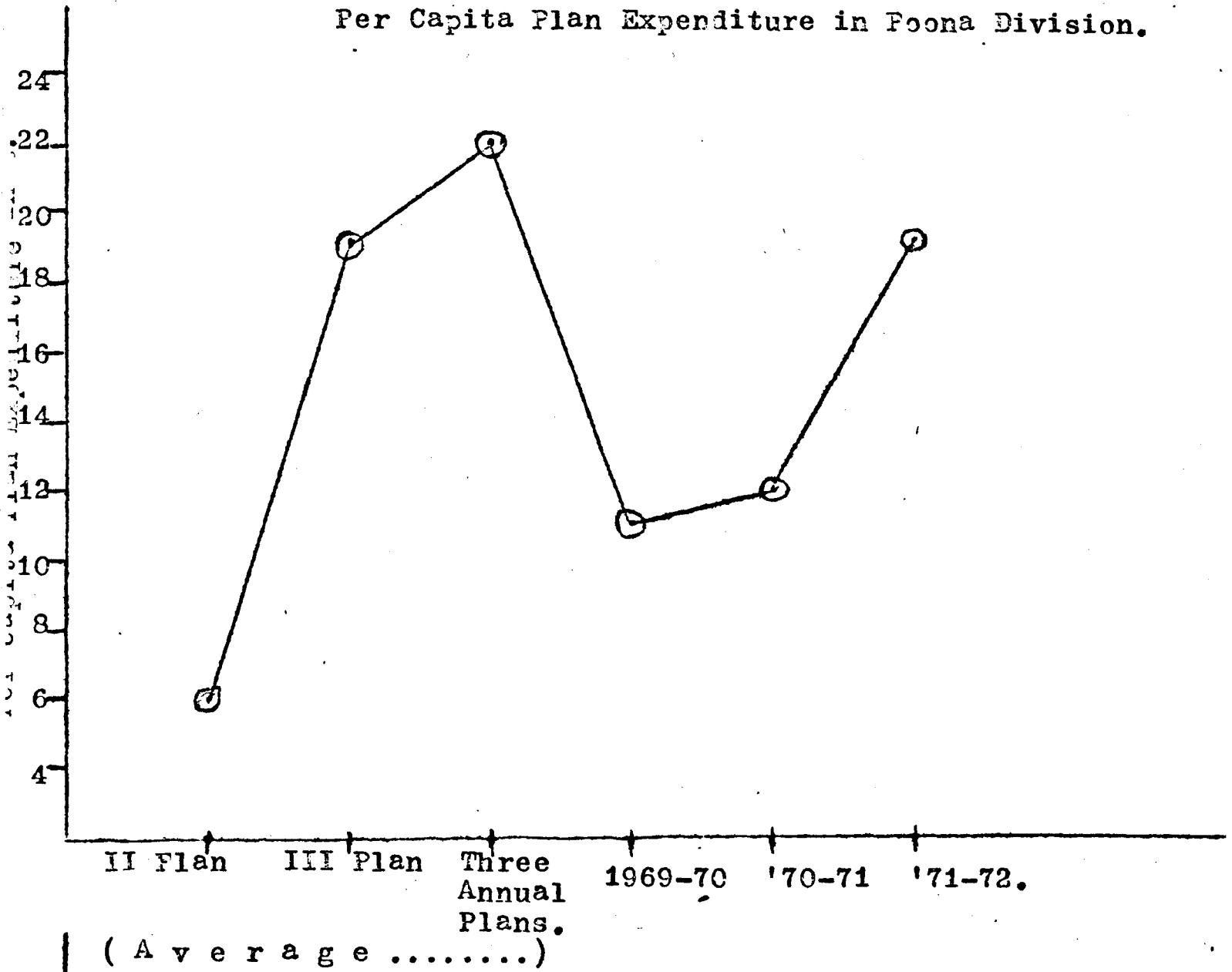
PRIMARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLS IN POONA DIVISION.



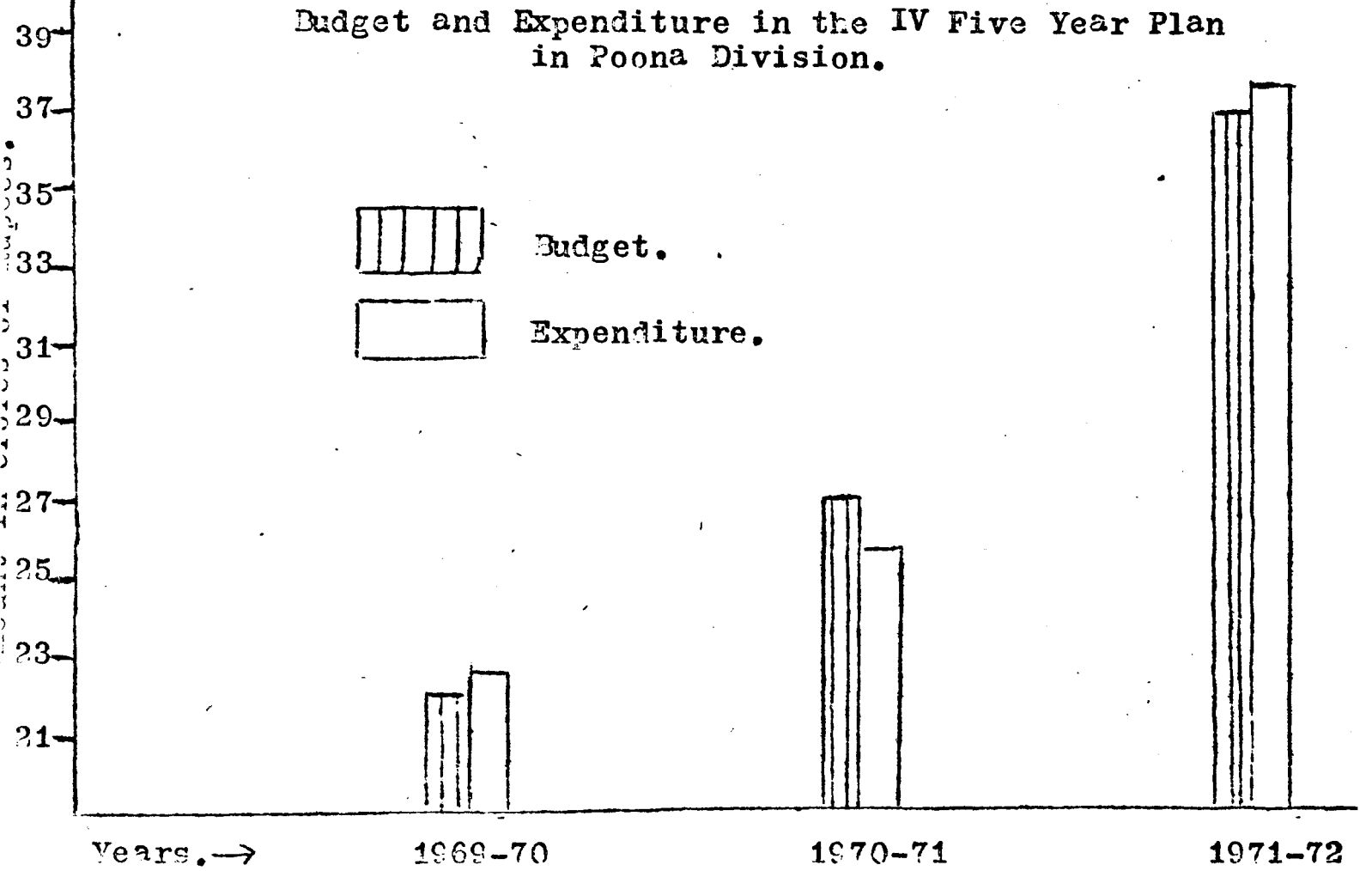
Road Length ( extra municipal ) per 100 sq.km.

Budget and Expenditure in the IV Five Year Plan in Poona Division.

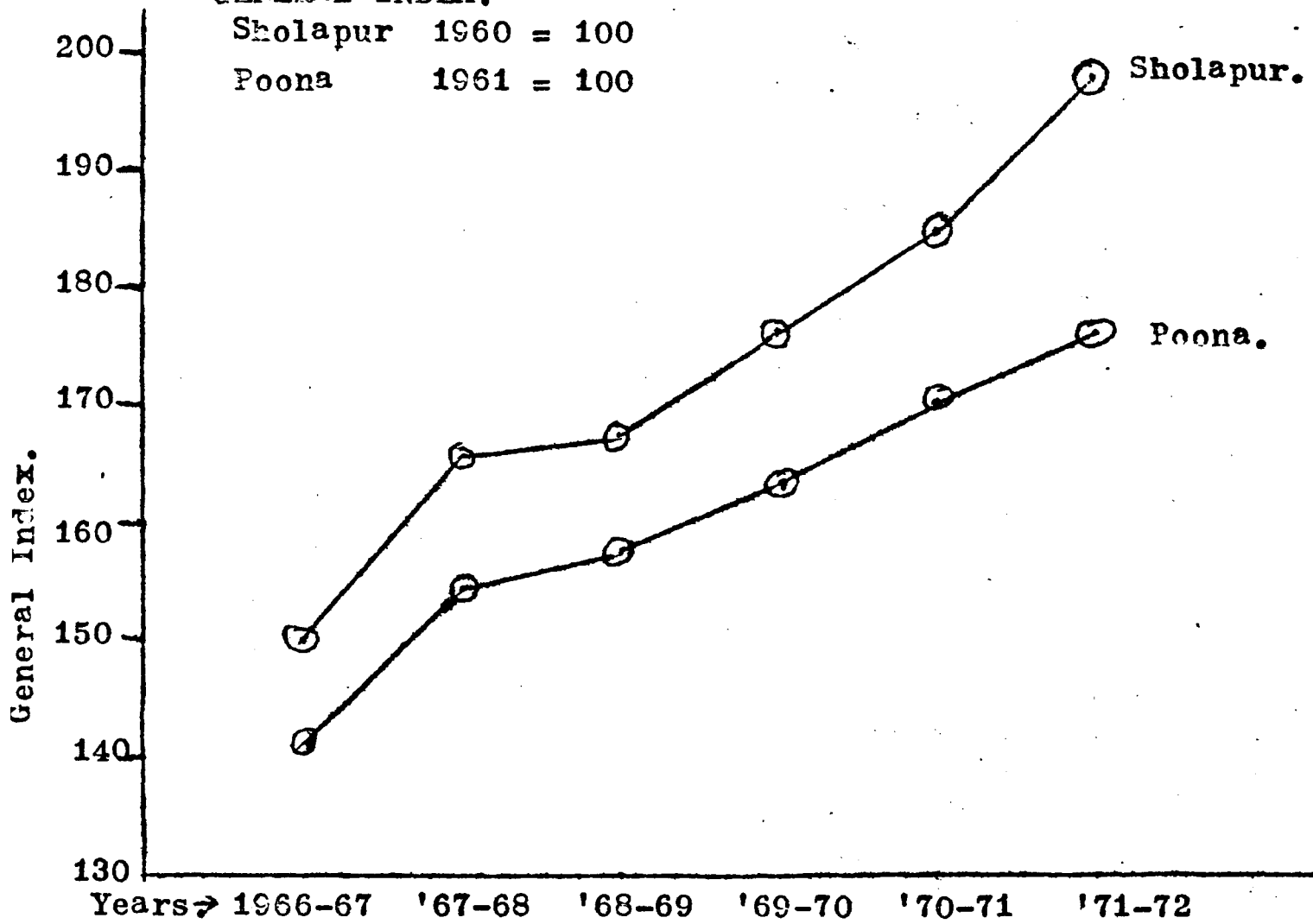

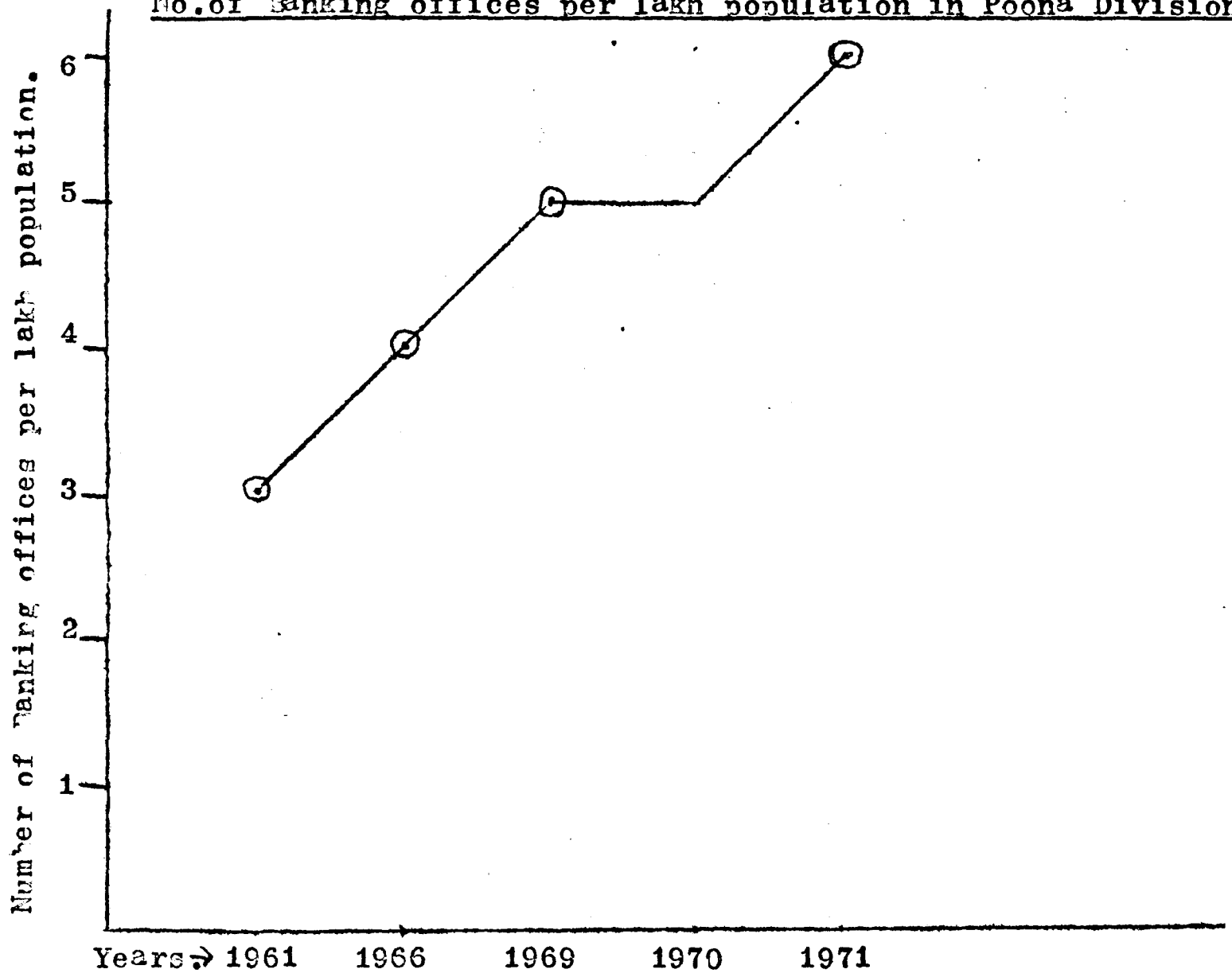
