CHAPTER - I
INTRODUCTION

1.1 LOCATION:-

The Satara district lies between $17^{\circ} 5'$ and $18^{\circ} 11'$ north latitude and $73^{\circ} 33'$ and $74^{\circ} 54'$ east longitude. It is situated on the west of Deccan Plateau and is bounded by the Poona district on the north, by the Sholapur district on the east, by the Sangli district on the south, and by the districts of Kolaba and Ratnagiri on the west.

According to 1971 Population Census, the district has an area of 10492 Sq.Kms. with a population of 17,27,376. The district comprises of eleven tahsils with the district head quarter at Satara.

The Satara town is located on the Poona-Bangalore National Highway No.4. The newly created railway Station named as Satara on the new broad gauge line came into operation from April 1971, and is situated at a distance of 5 Kms. from Satara town. The old Satara Road Station is abolished and another new station is created viz. Jaran-deshwar. Acceleration of activities of Trade, Commerce, Industry, Transport are now made easier in the district in general and in the vicinity of Satara town in particular.

1.2 TOPOGRAPHY:-

1) SOIL :- The soils of the district are observed to be of varied textures. In the west, the soil in Mahabaleshwar, Wai, Jeoli and Patan is formed from the red laterite of the ghats. It is thin and poor on the hill slope, but gets richer where natural or artificial terracing has accumulated soil with vegetable matter drained by rain waters. Rich black soil is found in the low lands.

of the valleys of Krishna, Venna, Kudali, Koyana and Kole rivers in Wai, Jaoli and Patan tahsils.

The central portion of the district consists of medium to deep black alluvial soils. Krishna valley soils are said to be one of the richest in the Deccan and the portion which lies in Satara and Karad talukas is reported as the richest in the Krishna Valley. For ^{the} most part it is the finest black alluvial soil highly retentive of moisture and very fertile.

The soil in Khandala and ^{Phaltan} ~~Phaltan~~ tahsils is poor and stony in the vicinity of the hills but there are good black soils along the Nira and its tributary streams. In the eastern part of Khandala tahsil the soil is poor, shallow and whitish but is capable of growing wheat, if adequate water is available.

Towards the east of the Krishna valley, the soil is poor with the exception of wide stretches of good black soil along the numerous streams and rivers in Koregaon tahsil.

In the farthest east of the district, i.e. in Khataw and Man tahsils the soil is extremely poor & shallow.

Considering the district as a whole, the proportion of rich soil is very small. The soil in general, is of poor quality, excepting in the river valley beds in the central part.

ii) Rivers :-

The Krishna is the principal river of the district. The other important rivers are the Koyana, the Nira, the Man, the Venna, the Kudali, the Urmodi, the Vasna, the Yelra and the Tarali.

The Krishna rises in the eastern brow of Mahabaleshwar Plateau with its source at about 1371 meters above mean sea level. Several streams which flow from the vallies formed by the main hill ranges in the district make up the head waters of the Krishna river. The drainage system of the Krishna river includes, besides the drainage of central system, the drainage of seven feeders, namely, the Kudali, the Vanna, the Urmodi, the Tarali and the Kovana on the right and the Vasna and the Yerala on the left. From the source, the Krishna flows for nearly 160 Kms. through the Satara district and enters thereafter into the Sangli district.

The Koyana is the largest feeder of the Krishna river in the district. It rises in the Mahabaleshwar Plateau, runs towards south upto Helwak in Patan tahsil, where it changes its course and flows towards east and falls into the Krishna at Karad. To-day the Koyana has become the most important river in the State of Maharashtra on account of the Hydro-Electric Project over it near Helwak Village.

The Nira River which flows on the northern boundary of the district and the Manganga river which flows in the south-east are tributaries of Bhima which itself meets the Krishna.

iii) HILL RANGES:-

There are two main systems of hills in the Satara District. The Sahyadri range and its off-shoots and Mahadeo range and its off-shoots. The main range of Sahyadri with a length of 96 Kms. from north of south forms the western boundary of this district. The Mahadeo range starts about 16 Kms. north of Mahabaleshwar and stretches east and south east across the whole breadth of the district. From this

range three spurs stretch to the south of the District. Hills in the district are very low, barren and rugged except near Mahabaleshwar and Koyana valley. The top of Mahabaleshwar the highest point in the district, is about 1,436 meters above mean sea level. Mahabaleshwar is one of the most attractive Hill Stations in the State mainly due to its height and combination of several hill range spurs observed forming promontories that command magnificent views of the Sahyadri hills and the valleys below.

IV) MINERALS:-

Except for building stone, lime stone and little iron deposits in about 20 villages of Jaoli tahsil and 30 villages of Fatan tahsil deposits of important minerals such as Coal, boxite, manganese, silica ^{are} not known to have occurred in any part of the district. Building stone, sand of good quality and lime stone is formed to be available all over the district. Good clay for bricks and tiles is found on the river banks.

1.3 CLIMATE :-

1) Rainfall :- The rain start by the middle of June and last till the end of September in the district. The intensity of rainfall is maximum in July. The rainfall is not uniform all over the district. It is very heavy in the western region and it goes on receding towards eastern part. The extreme western part gets over 5000 mm. rainfall, while the eastern part of the Sahyadri zone gets the rainfall between 1200 to 2000mm. The normal rainfall recorded at Mahabaleshwar centre is 6226 mm. while at Fanchegani it is 1865 mm. It is 1723 mm. at Medha and at Fatan the same is 1832 mm. The central zone gets rainfall between 600 mm. to 1200 mm. ~~xxxxxxx~~ Satara centre has normal rainfall of

504, mm, Wai 710mm, and Karad 713mm. In the eastern zone rainfall averages below 600 mm.annually. It is as follows Phaltan 473 mm, Dahiwadi 462mm., Mhaswad 473mm., and Vaduj 512 mm.

ii) TEMPERATURE :-

Monthly temperature data is available only for one station viz. Mahabaleshwar. Mahabaleshwar is located at an height of 1436 meters above mean sea level and as such the data of Mahabaleshwar cannot be considered as representing the data for the whole of Satara district. The temperature at Mahabaleshwar fell down to as low as 8.0 degrees centigrade in February 1972 and rose to 33.9 degrees centigrade in April 1972.

1.4 NATURAL ZONES:-

The Satara district can be broadly divided into three natural zones. viz. western, central and eastern. The western zone bordering the Sahyadri ranges receives rainfall between 1200mm. to 5000mm. This zone comprises of Patan, Jauli and Mahabaleshwar tahsils and part of Satara and Wai tahsils. The soil in this zone is thin and poor on the hill slopes. The agricultural pursuits of this zone are similar to those of Konkan tract. Rice and Jowar ^{are} the main crops of this zone.

The central zone comprises of Koregaon and Karad tahsils and eastern part of Satara and Wai tahsils. The area is flat and soil and rainfall are very congenial to better agricultural production. The rainfall varies between 600mm. to 1200mm. per year. The soil is deep alluvial and very fertile. Jowar, Bajara and Groundnut are the principal crops of this zone.

The eastern zone comprises of Phaltan, Khatav and Man tahsils and eastern part of Khandala tahsil. The soil is poor and shallow, and the rainfall is not certain. The average rainfall received by this zone, is less than 600 mm. This area is prone to scarcity conditions as whatever rainfall it receives is not assured. Bajara and Jowar are the main crops of this zone.

1.5 TERRITORIAL CHANGES:-

Satara district was formed in 1848. It was first called a provin^{ce} comprising eleven sub-divisions viz. Bijapur (now in Mysore State) Jaoli, Karad, Khanapur, Khatav, Koregaon, Pandharpur, Satara, Tasgaon, Valva and Wai. A no. of changes took place in subsequent years. Consequent upon the merger of former princely states into the Indian Union, Parts of Phaltan Jamkhindi, Akkalkot, Bhor, Aundh and Sangli States and one village in Poona district were added to Satara District. A new tahsil of Phaltan was created, and four tahsils viz. Khanapur, Tasgaon, Valva and Shirala were transferred to the newly formed Sangli district (then named as South Satara district) with head quarters at Sangli in 1949. Satara district (then known as North Satara district) has since then the present set up of 11 tahsils. In 1958, the village Shergaon from Khanapur tahsil of Sangli district

was transferred to Karad tahsil of Satara district. The name of the district was changed from North Satara district to Satara district in 1960.

1.6 DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION:-

Until May 1962, the administrative set up of the district was under the unitary control of the district Collector. After passing of the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities Act in 1962, the administrative set up became dual. Excepting for a few safeguards the developmental functions and administrative functions excluding matters relating to law and order, judicial functions and developmental functions involving high technical skill have been devolved on Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities, with the Chief Executive Officer as their executive head. Under Govt. Sector, the Collector, continues to act as the district head and also as coordinating authority. The Collector who is also the District Magistrate to maintain law and order is in-charge of general administration, treasury, land revenue and civil supply. He is assisted by a Resident Deputy Collector and three Deputy Collectors, who hold charge of the three revenue divisions with their headquarters at Satara, Phaltan and Mahabaleshwar. The district is divided into eleven tahsils and they are under the charge of Tahsildars stationed at the Tahsil headquarters. The tahsils have further been divided into revenue circles and sajas under the charge of Circle Inspectors and Talathis.

Offices of the other Government departments and quasi-Government Institutions are also located at the district head quarter for facilitating the smooth and co-ordinated working of the administration at the district level.

Central Government Administration:-

The offices of Income Tax Officer, Superintendent of Central Excise and the Superintendent of Post Offices are located at Satara.

Local Bodies:-

Under the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities Act, Satara Zilla Parishad and eleven Panchayat Samities have been established in 1962. The area under the jurisdiction of the Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities correspond to the district and tahsil boundaries respectively excepting the Municipal areas which are under the control of Municipal Councils. Nearly 97 percent of the district area and 90 percent of the district population is under the Zilla Parishad.

The Zilla Parishad is headed by the President elected from the elected members. A vice-President is also elected the same way. For three committees viz. 1) Works and Health Committee, 2) Finance and Education Committee, 3) Agril. and coop. Committee, Chairmen are elected to look after the developmental work falling under their respective jurisdiction. To carry out the administrative and executive work of the Parishad an Officer in the Senior scale of I.A.S. works as the Chief Executive Officer of the Zilla Parishad. He is assisted by various departmental heads for carrying out the developmental activities effectively.

As the tahsil level, Panchayat Samities have an elected Chairman and Vice Chairman called as Sabhapati and Upsabhapati respectively. The Block Development Officer works as secretary to the Panchayat Samiti. He is the administrative and executive head at tahsil level, under Zilla Parishad. The State Government Officers continue to exercise

technical supervision and give necessary guidance to the Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities. The State Govt. have powers to issue directions to the Zilla Parishad in respect of any works and schemes in the interest of National and State Developmental Plans.

The other local bodies functioning in the district are the Municipal Councils of the 8 urban areas viz. Karad, Mahabaleshwar, Mhaswad, Panchagani, Phaltan, Rahimatpur, Satara and Wai and village Panchayats at Village level.

The other statutory bodies functioning in the district are 1) the Maharashtra State Electricity Board 2) the Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation, 3) the Life Insurance Corporation and 4) the Maharashtra State Finance Corporation. All these offices are located at Satara. The state farming corporation has an Estate at Sakharwadi in Phaltan tehsil. The Maharashtra Warehousing corporation has established an office at Karad.

1.7 Demography :-

i) General :- The Satara district ranks 13 th in population and 16th in area among the 26 districts of the Maharashtra State as per 1971 census. According to the 1971 census the population of Satara district is 17.27 lakhs as against 14.30 lakhs of 1961, thus recording an increase of 20.8 percent in the 1961-71 decade.

ii) Density :- The population density of Satara district is 165 per Sq.Km. as per 1971 census which is slightly higher than the state density of 164 persons per Sq.Km. Within the district great variations are observed in the tahsilwise population densities. The density is low in the hilly tracts of western zone and also in the

scarcity affected areas in the eastern zone. The central zone consists of rich soil and has high proportion of net sown area to geographical area and as such it has the highest density of population.

iii) Sex Ratio :-

The sex ratio is the no. of females per thousand male population. The following have been the sex ratios for Satara district.

The district has recorded a higher sex ratio at each census, than the state sex ratio. This was due to outmigration of males from the district. Difference in rural and urban sex ratios indicate that out-migration is much more from rural areas than from urban areas of the district.

iv) Literacy :-

The percentage of literacy increased 33.98 percent in 1961 to 38.32 percent in 1971 in the district. The female literacy rose from 21.16 percent in 1961 to 24.77 percent in 1971. The male literacy rose from 47.41 percent in 1961 to 52.38 percent in 1971.

As per 1971 census the percentage of literacy for Satara district and Poona division is as follows:-

The percentages of literacy are slightly higher in Satara district than in Poona division. The mass literacy campaign, the scheme of compulsory primary education and the facilities extended by the well known Rayat Shikshan Sanstha of Satara have played a significant role in achieving this progress in the field of literacy. As regards literacy Satara district ranks 2nd in Poona division.

1.8 Livelihood Classification :-

As per 1971 Census, of the total population of the district, 31.34 percent population is engaged in work, while remaining 68.66 percent population is non-working or dependent population. Major portion of the working population (74.47 percent) derives its livelihood from agricultural pursuits while remaining non-agricultural activities such as construction, industry, trade & commerce, transport, communication and other services.

As compared to the 1961 figures, there is a marked decrease in the proportion of workers in 1971. The decrease is more pronounced in the case of female workers, which is due to the change in the concept of the term 'worker' adopted in 1971. Unlike the 1971 census the 1961 definition gave scope for the inclusion of house wives who had helped in cultivation or in the household industry carried on by other family member, for an hour or more as workers.

The proportion of working population as per 1971 census amongst the economic categories is 56.15 percent as cultivators, 18.32% as agricultural labourers, 1.72% in livestock, forestry, hunting, plantations, orchards, and allied activities, 0.39% in mining and quarrying, 7.29% in manufacturing, processing, servicing & repairs, 1.87% in construction, 4.25% in trade and commerce, 2.04% in transport,

storage and communications and 7.97% in other services.

1.9 Famine and Scarcity:-

The western part of the district is prone to scarcity conditions. The fact finding committee appointed by the government of Maharashtra under the Chairmanship of Shri. S.R. Sukhatankar has opined that the tahsils of Khatav, Koregaon, Man, Phaltan & Khandala are the drought prone areas in the Satara district. During the year 1972-73 almost all the district was affected by scarcity conditions which can be seen from the following table.

From the above table it will be seen that out of 1142 villages in the district 1116 villages were affected by scarcity condition. All the scarcity affected villages were given the benefit of suspension in land revenue during the year 1972-73 except 19 villages in Patan tahsil.

CHAPTER 3 II

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

Purpose:-

2.1 This is the 12th issue of the District Statistical Abstract prepared by this office since 1957-58. The purpose of the issue is to provide statistical data on as many topics as possible so that the Abstract may prove useful not only as an official reference book but also for research, planning and further socio economic studies. The data are presented, generally, tahsilwise to facilitate tahsilwise comparison. Where the data are not available tahsilwise, ^{it} is given for the district as a whole. The sources of the data collection are shown at the foot note of each table, while unit of information is shown either in the column headings or at the right hand top corner below the table number. Concepts, sources, limitations of the data are briefly discussed below.

District at a glance:-

2.2 In this table important data about Satara district, such as on population, agriculture, industry etc. are given with the corresponding figures for the Poona Division for comparison.

Area and Population:-

2.3 The data on area and population based on the final figures of 1971 census are given in tables from 1 to 7. The data on houses and population, decadal variation in population, population of urban areas, workers and non workers, etc. are presented under this head.

2.4 "A town or an urban area as per 1971 census is a place which has a municipality, a cantonment or a civil line ^{or} a population of 5000 or over, a density of not less than 400 per Km² and at least 3/4 th of male population dependent on non agricultural pursuits, the place

should have according to the Director of Census Operations a few pronounced urban characteristics and amenities.

2.5 A population enumerated in urban areas is urban population and the population enumerated in all other places is rural population.

2.6 "Village" is a statutorily recognised village having a defined boundry and separate land records.

2.7 A person is classified as worker if (a) in case of seasonal work like cultivation, livestock, dairying, household industry, etc. he had worked in the current or last working season for the greater part of the season, and (b) in the case of regular employment in any trade, profession, service, business or commerce, he was employed during any of the fifteen days preceding the day of the enumerator's visit to the household.

2.8 A person who was working but was absent from his work during the fifteen days preceding the day on which enumerated or even exceeding the period of fifteen days due to illness or other causes has been treated as worker.

2.9 A person who has been offered work but had not actually joined has been treated as a non worker.

2.10 The 1971 census stipulated that a person primarily engaged in household duties or those who were students and helped with family economic activity but not on a full time scale should be treated as non workers in respect of their main activity.

Climate:-

2.11 Normal rainfall and monthly rainfall data and temperature data from the selected centres in the District are reported in Table No.8 and 9 respectively. Normal rainfall

data are based on the rainfall over a period of five to eighty years. A day is counted as a rainy day if the rain gauge records a minimum of 2.5 mm. rainfall during the 24 hours of the day. As regards temperature, Mahabaleshwar is the only station in the district for which the data are available. The Directorate of the Indian Meteorological Department, Bombay supplied this data. Mahabaleshwar is on a very high attitude of Sahyadri ranges and the data of this centre cannot therefore be said to be representative for the whole district.

Agriculture:-

2.12 The agricultural and related statistics of 70-71 and 71-72 (Provisional) are presented in the tables 10 to 21. Land use, crop pattern, outturn of crops, yield rates, irrigation sources and area and crops irrigated, irrigation projects, wage rates, data on agricultural implements and scarcity and famine conditions are some of the salient topics dealt with under agricultural statistics. The data collected from the District Inspector of Land Records and Season and Crop reports are of provisional nature. The finalised data, wherever available from the Statistician, Deptt. of Agriculture are reproduced in these tables. The Zilla Parishad, the Panchayat Samities, the Executive Engineers of Irrigation Projects, the Collectorate, and the Bureau of Economics and Statistics, are other sources for various tables on agricultural statistics. There are variations in the area figures obtained from the Surveyer General and those based on village papers. The latter are sum total of data given by talathis whereas the former are calculated in blocks.

2.13 All lands actually afforested and lands classed and administered as forests whether state owned or private are

termed as 'forests'. If any portion of such forests is not wooded but put to agricultural^{al} use it is shown under that appropriate head.

2.14 Land put to non-agricultural uses stands for lands occupied by buildings, roads, railways, rivers, canals or other such purposes.

2.15 Lands which cannot be brought under cultivation except at a very high cost are classed as unculturable lands, whether in isolated blocks or in cultivated holdings.

2.16 Culturable waste includes all lands available for cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once but not cultivated during the current year and the last five years or more in succession.

2.17 Current fallow lands comprise cropped area kept fallow during the current year. Other fallows include all lands which were taken up for cultivation but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and not more than 5 years.

2.18 The net sown area consists of area sown with crops and orchards, area sown more than once in a year being counted only once. The gross cropped area represents sum total of area under all crops in a year. The estimates of average yields and production in respect of rice, bajara, jowar, wheat gram, cotton, groundnut, tobacco, ragi and tur are based on the results of crops estimation surveys conducted usually by the Agriculture Deptt. The estimates of yields for the remaining crops are based on the anna valuation figures and normal yields reported by the Revenue Officers.

Animal Husbandry and Forest :-

2.19 Statistics on animal husbandry, collected through the 11th quinquennial census of 1972 are reproduced in table

the data is No.22/provisional. The data collected from the District Animal Husbandry Officer, Municipal Councils and Veterinary dispensaries, animal diseases, artificial inseminations, livestock mortality, slaughter houses statistics are shown in tables 23 to 25 on this subject.

2.20 The Statistician, forest deptt. and Divisional Forest Officer provides data on forest area and forest produce which is shown in tables 26(a) and 26(b). Reserved forests are those that are intended mainly for timber production and in which rights of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. In protected forest, the restrictions are not so ^{rigid}, right of grazing or cultivation is allowed but certain limitations and restrictions are imposed. The unclassed forest refers to the inaccessible forest or unoccupied waste.

Employment, Industry, Mining and Electricity:-

2.21 Tables 27, 28 and 29 present data on registered factory statistics e.g. on daily employment, working strength of factories, days worked by the factories. The word "factories" here includes only the registered factories. They are of three types.

- 1) Factories using no power but employing 20 or more workers
- ii) Factories using power and employing 10 ^{or} more workers &
- iii) Factories not covered by i) and ii) above but ^{notified} by the Government as covered by the Factory Act.

2.22 On the basis of data collected through the Annual Survey of Industries a table No.30 is prepared on registered factories in various industry classification groups showing their productive capital, employment, gross output and value added. The figures are of provisional nature and are based on actuals of reporting census sector factories and estimates of sample sector factories.

2.23 Tables 31, 32 and 33 are based on the data collected from the District Employment Exchange. The monthly registration of unemployed persons, notification of vacancies, placements as also volume of employment by type of industry is shown in these tables.

2.24 Tables 36 and 37 are included to show consumption of electricity and towns and villages electrified in Satara District. The data are collected from the M.S.E.B. All the electricity is now supplied by the M.S.E.B. and no electricity is generated or distributed in the district by any private company.

Cooperation:-

2.25 The tables on cooperation, numbers 38 to 45 are compiled from the data supplied by the District Dy. Registrar of Cooperative Societies and the Agricultural Produce Market Committees. Statistical information is shown separately for 1) Primary Agricultural Credit Societies. 2) Agricultural Non-Credit Societies 3) Non Agricultural Credit Societies 4) Non agricultural Non credit societies 5) Marketing Societies.

2.26 The District Central Coop. Bank and the Land Development Bank are covered under Agril. Credit Societies and shown in Table No. 39. Urban Banks, Salary Earners Societies, factory workers societies are covered under Non-Agricultural Credit Societies.

2.27 Working capital includes paid up capital, deposits and borrowings. The break up of loan advanced by coop. banks is shown by the term of loan, short, medium and long term. All long term loans are given by the Land Development Bank, whereas both short term and medium term loans are given by District Central Coop. Bank and Urban Banks. Overdue loans refer to

amount of loan or installments which were due for collection but which were not actually collected and for the repayment of which no extension has been granted. The cooperative year starts in July and ends in June. Salient achievements of the coop. Societies, such as marketing, fisheries, farming, irrigation, agricultural processing, sugar factories, consumers, housing are shown in Table No. 43. Commoditywise turnover in the regulated markets is shown in the Table No. 44

2.28 A separate table No. 45 is given on registered money lenders and loans advanced by them. The data are collected from the Dy. Registrar of Cooperative Societies.

Medical and Public Health:-

2.29 Data on medical facilities and other vital statistics such as births, deaths are shown in tables under this section. The data are collected from Civil Surgeon, District Health Officer, Zilla Parishad, Municipalities and Director of Public Health, Poona.

2.30 Under medical facilities data in table No. 46 are given for hospitals, dispensaries, maternity houses, primary health centres, medical personnel, hospital beds as also the no. of indoor and out door patients availing these facilities. In table No. 47 data on births, deaths, infant deaths are recorded. Table No. 48 shows causes of deaths, occurred in the District.

2.31 The birth rate and death rate are given in the District at a Glance. Birth rate is the no. of births per thousand estimated population of the year. Death rate is similarly the no. of deaths per thousand estimated population of the year. The data on vital statistics are collected through revenue agency for rural area and for urban area it is the

statutory function of Municipal Councils. The data presented on medical facilities are of State and Central Govt. institutions, institutions owned and run by municipal councils and local bodies and public aided institutions. The private clinics run by individuals are not included in these tables.

2.32 The year of reference for medical and health statistics is the calendar year 1972.

Education:-

2.33 Salient features of the progress of education in Satara district are presented in this section. Literacy in each Taluka as per 1971 census, Education in Rural and Urban Areas in each taluka as per 1971 census, no. of educational institutions, pupils, teachers by type of education, B.C. beneficiaries, educational concessions, expenditure on primary education by various agencies, are the various subjects dealt with under the tables on education.

2.34 The sources of data are the 1971 Census, the Directorate of Education and the Education Officer, Zilla Parishad, Satara.

2.35 The Tahsilwise break up of data on institutions, pupils, teachers in respect of pre-primary education, secondary education and special schools could not be obtained for publication in these tables. Only district totals are supplied.

2.36 Important statistics on different modes of transport, category of roads, traffic census, posts, telegraphs, telephones and radio licenses issued and rural broadcasting are given in this section.

2.37 The difficulty arises in getting accurate rail length in the district. The length had to be compiled by reference to railway time tables and railway map. The figures

Presented in table No.58 are therefore, approximate to that extent. Information presented in this table pertains to broad gauge line. The road statistics presented in table 59 are for both extra municipal roads and roads within municipal limits, shown separately. The statistics of motor vehicles in the district are not available separately. Therefore, the statistics of motor vehicles in Poona Region, (comprising of Poona, Ahmednagar, Satara and Sholapur districts) are presented in Table No.60. The vehicles shown are as per live register maintained by the R.T.O. Poona. Table No.61 gives statistics of nationalised Road Transport of the Satara S.T. Division. The Satara S.T. Division comprises of Satara district.

Local Bodies:-

2.38 Financial position of Village Panchayats, Municipal Councils and Zilla Parishad is shown in this section for the year 1972-73.

2.39 The no. of village Panchayats includes no. of independent village Panchayats as also group village Panchayats. Income and expenditure of Village Panchayats are exclusive of opening and closing balances respectively. Grants include grants from Govt. as well as from Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities for developmental activities. Govt. grants in respect of municipal councils are mainly grants on account of dearness allowances, grants for roads, for water supply, for educational purposes, for medical purposes, and on account of percentage in land revenue. The receipts of Zilla Parishad are shown under four subheads, viz. 1) Self raised resources, 2) Govt. Grants, 3) Grants for agency scheme and 4) debt section. The expenditure is shown under two heads. Revenue expenditure and debt section.

2.40 The data are collected from the Zilla Parishad, Satara and all the Municipal Councils, in Satara District.

Plan and Community Development:-

2.41 The Table 69 included in this section gives details of expenditure under each sub head of development for State and Centrally Sponsored Programme for 1972-73. Important physical achievements are given sub head wise in table No.70. These data are based on the progress reports received from various implementing officers.

2.42 The stagewise blocks under C.D. Programme are shown in Table No.71 while stagewise expenditure in each tahsil is shown in Table No.72. Physical achievements of these C.D. Blocks are shown in Table No.73. The data are compiled from the quarterly returns received from the Panchayat Samities in the district.

Prices:-

2.43 There are three tables in this section. The first table No.74 presents data on wholesale prices of certain agril. commodities at regulated markets. The table No.75 is on average retail prices of important commodities at the District Head Quarter Satara. The data are presented for all the months of the year 1972.

2.44 The data are collected on every Friday from selected shops, for given specifications of the selected commodities. As such they cannot be said to be fully representative. However, the data may be useful as a broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices over a period of time.

2.45 In the table No.76 the consumer price index numbers for working class of Sholapur and Poona centres are given. The index is compiled by the office of the Commissioner of Labour, Bombay.

Miscellaneous:-

2.46 As the title indicates data on other various subjects such as police, crime, court cases, theatres, Joint Stock companies, Life Insurance, Small Savings etc. are presented in this section from table Nos.77 to 87.

Trends in selected indicators:-

2.47 Table No. 88 shows important indicators in the various fields of development such as population, agriculture, livestock, industry, electricity, cooperation, etc. Besides these, tahsilwise indicators are worked out and appended at the end.

CHAPTER - III

AN ANALYTICAL REVIEW OF SECTORIAL TRENDS.

3.1 Data on various items has been presented in part II of this issue, under the heading District Statistical Abstract. An attempt is made in this chapter to give a comparative picture of the tahsils in the district during the year 1960-61, 1971-72 and 1972-73 or 1960-61, 1970-71 and 1971-72 as the case may be. These indicators will show the position of each tahsil during the above period.

3.2 The development in the field of agriculture can be assessed from three main indicators. They are 1) Percentage of gross area sown to net area sown 2) Percentage of net area irrigated to net area sown & 3) Productivity of important crops.

The gross cropped areas during the years 1960-61, 1970-71 & 1971-72 were 7.34 lakh hectares, 7.54 lakh hectares and 7.51 lakh hectares respectively, which shows an increasing trend. The percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown in the district has gone down to 107 in 1970-71 and 1971-72 as compared to 108 percent in 1960-61. This might be due to scarcity conditions prevailing in the district during 1970-71 & 1971-72. The gross cropped area during 1971-72 has still gone down to 7.51 lakh hectare in 1971-72 as compared to 7.54 lakh hectares in 1970-71 as most of the area in the district was affected by scarcity conditions. From the table No.88 in part II of this volume it will be seen that the net area under crops in the district has gone up in 1971-72 as compared to the net area sown in 1960-61. But the gross cropped area could not be increased at the same rate for want of adequate irrigation facilities and scarcity conditions during last two years.

3.3 The percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown is highest in Khandala, Patan and Wai tahsils while it is lowest in Karad and Mahabaleshwar tahsils. The tahsils of Khandala, Patan, Wai, Koregaon, Phaltan and Jaoli have higher area sown more than once while other tahsils have lower area sown more than once as compared to the district average in the year 1971-72.

3.4 The gross irrigated area in the district increased from 1.01 lakh hectares in 1960-61 to 1.06 lakh hectares in 1971-72. The increase in the gross irrigated area in 1971-72 to that of the year 1960-61 works out to about 4 percent.

3.5 The net area irrigated by different sources in the years 1960-61, 1970-71 and 1971-72 is shown below.

3.6 There is a net addition of one percent area in the net irrigated area in 1971-72 over that in 1960-61. The area irrigated by wells has increased by 12.5 percent in 1971-72 as compared to 1960-61. Also net area irrigated by other sources has nearly doubled in 1971-72 as compared to area irrigated in 1960-61.

The following table gives net area irrigated & net area sown during 1960-61, 1970-71 and 1971-72.

3.7 The percentage of net area irrigated to net sown area comes to 11.70, 11.75 and 11.43 percent in the years 1960-61, 1970-71 and 1971-72 respectively. There is a decrease in the percentage due to scarcity conditions during last two years.

3.8 Agricultural production depends on various factors such as natural conditions, input factors etc. The following

table gives the yield rates and outturn of principal crops for the years 1960-61, 1970-71 and 1971-72.

3.9 The above data show that the yield rates of rice and groundnut have increased while those of wheat, jowar and sugarcane have declined. In the case of remaining crops, the yield rates show ups and downs, indicating instability.

Changes in cropping pattern:-

3.10 The following table will broadly indicate the trend of cropping pattern in this district.

3.11 The percentage of area under food crops shows a decline which in other words means there is an increase in the percentage of area under non-food crops. More than 5 percent of the cropped area has been shifted from growing food crops to non-food crops. The decrease has been observed mainly under bajra.

3.12 The percentage of areas under different irrigated crops to gross irrigated area, shows that the percentage of total irrigated food crops has decreased to a small extent from 93.56 in 1960-61 to 91.42 in 1970-71 and 92.56 in 71-72 i.e. the percentage of irrigated non-food crops increased from 6.44 in 1960-61 to 8.58 in 1970-71 and 7.44 in 1971-72. The following table will give an idea, how the changes in irrigated area have occurred.

3.13 It is observed that while the percentage of total irrigated cereals has increased that under ^{pulses} has declined. The share of sugarcane has also increased, However, the most perceptible increase is found in the case of cotton in respect of which the percentage has jumped from just 1.51 in 1960-61 to 6.63 in 1970-71 and 6.07 in 1971-72.

Agricultural Credit:-

3.14 The co-operative Societies play an important role in the field of agricultural development by extending credit facilities on an extensive scale. The progress of facilities given by the agricultural credit societies during the years 1960-61, 1971-72 and 1972-73 are given in the following table.

3.15 From the above table it can be seen that the no. of societies have increased from 750 in 1960-61 to 770 in 1972-73. The membership has also increased by 36.5 percent in 1972-73 as compared to the membership in 1960-61. The loans advanced by these societies have increased nearly five times in 1972-73 as compared to the loans advanced in 1960-61, while the loans out standing have also increased more than four times during the same period.

3.16 Wage Rates:- The data on agricultural wage rates in rural areas are collected in three ^{rural} centres in Satara

district since July 1963. These centres are Umbraj in Karad tahsil, Limb in Satara tahsil and Koregaon in Koregaon tahsil.

The wage rates are found to vary at different places depending on the nearness to urban areas. During 1972 the male field labourers were found to get wages @Rs. 3.00 at Umbraj and Koregaon and Rs.4.00 at Limb. The female labour was paid @Rs.2.00 at Koregaon and at Umbraj and Rs.1.50 at Limb.

Livestock and Poultry:-

3.17 Live stock makes a Substantial contribution to the economy by providing subsidiary income to farmers, food to human population and provides avenues of employment to landless labourers. A quinquennial census of livestock, poultry and agricultural implements is carried out all over the country. The 11th livestock was carried out in 1972.

The following table gives tahsilwise details of livestock per 100 hectares.

3.18 From the above table it will be seen that the indicator in Jaoli tahsil is very low. It is below the district average in Satara, Koregaon, Khatav, Patan, Jaoli and M'war tahsils and in other tahsils it is high than the district average. Karad tahsil has the highest no. of bovine & ovine population per 100 hectares of cultivable land.

3.19 The poultry population in the district in 1972 was 6,96,273 as against 6,57,771 in 1961 and 7,76,198 in 1966. The human population according to 1971 census for the district was 17,27,376. The poultry population per 100 persons was 46 in 1961, 54 in 1966 and 40 in 1972 (Population in 1966 assumed to be constant as that of 1961). Though the poultry population in 1972 seems to have increased it has not proportionately increased as compared to human population during the decade 1961-71 and hence the proportion of poultry population per 100 persons has decreased from 46 in 1961 to 40 in 1972.

Consumption of Electricity:-

3.20 During the year 1960-61 there were only 7 towns and 30 villages electrified, while there were 14 towns and 555 villages electrified as on 31st March 1973. The percentage of electrified villages to total no. of villages works out to 48.59. The per capita consumption of electricity in 1972-73 in Satara district was 30.23 kwh. while the same was 4.53 kwh. in 1960-61. The per capita consumption of electricity in 1972-73 was comparatively very low as compared to Poona division which was 93.35 kwh. which shows the backwardness of the district.

Enrolment in the Employment Exchange and Vacancies notified :-

3.21 The statistics available with the District Employment Officer, Satara is given in the following table.

3.22 Enrolment of candidates at the Employment Exchange is nearly 14 percent higher in 1972-73 than that in 60-61. The percentage of placement to total registration has decreased from 18 in 1960-61 to just 7 in 1972-73. The number ^{on} the live register at the end of the year has increased more than four times in 1972-73 as compared to that for the year 1960-61.

Increase in indoor and outdoor patients treated:-

3.23 Medical facilities are being availed of by increasing number of people year after year. The following table gives the no. of patients treated in public aided medical institutions in Satara district.

3.24 From the above table it will be seen that the no. of indoor patients treated has increased more than 5 times in 1972 as compared to the no. of patients treated in 1961. Also the outdoor patients treated have nearly doubled in 1972 as compared to the patients treated in 1961.

Increase in no. of students in different categories:-

3.25 The educational facilities have been tremendously increased during last 10-15 years. At present all villages have been provided with primary schooling facilities. The following table gives the no. of institutions, no. of pupils and no. of teachers in different categories of education.

3.26 In case of primary education, there was an addition of 408 institutions and 32.07 percent increase in the enrolment during the period 1960-61 and 1971-72. The no. of teachers have increased from 5005 in 1960-61 to 8425 in 71-72.

3.27 The no. of secondary institutions have increased from 132 in 1960-61 to 250 in 1971-72, while the enrolment has increased from 23112 in 1960-61 to 56768 in 1971-72 and the teachers have increased from 1009 in 1960-61 to 2412 in 1971-72.

3.28 In the case of higher education also the no. of institutions have increased from 7 in 1960-61 to 17 in 71-72. The enrolment has increased from 1786 in 1960-61 to 9712 in 1971-72.

Increase in Banking Facilities:-

3.29 Since the nationalisation of the Banking Business, the various banking companies have brought the field of agricultural and industrial development in their operational fold and are advancing loans to the agriculturists and small units of industries. The cooperative banks also have made remarkable progress by expanding their business in rural areas.

3.30 The banking offices have increased from 32 in 1960-61 to 117 as on 31-3-1972 i.e. for every 14764 persons there was banking office in the district during the year.

Increase in Road Length.:-

3.31 After conversion of meter gauge into broad gauge the length of railway route in this district is 124Kms.

3.32 At the end of March 1973 the total road length of all types excluding municipal roads was 4161 kms. The road length at the end of March 1961 was 2481Kms. Thus the road length per 100 sq.kms. of area increased from 24 kms. in 1960-61 to 40 in 1972-73.

Prices:-

3.33 The consumer price index for working class of Sholapur centre will show that the general price index in 1972-73 shot up to 216 with the base year 1960. The general index for Pochana centre for 1972-73 was 193 (base year 1961).

3.34 Since November 1962 prices of important commodities are collected by the District Statistical Organisation at each of the district head quarter on each Friday.

As the prices are collected for selected commodities from selected shops they will not represent the district position but the data may still prove useful as a broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices over the period of time in the district. The following table indicate the average prices of some important commodities collected at Satara town for the year 1963, 1971 and 1972.

From the above table it will be seen that prices for all commodities have increased during the period 1963 to 1972. The increase in almost all the commodities is remarkable.

CHAPTER - IV

A N N U A L P L A N 1972 - 73

4.1 The year 1972-73, under the review was the fourth year of the Fourth Five Year Plan. The Annual Plan of the Maharashtra State for the year 1972-73 was of the size of Rs.240.58 crores as against Rs.201 crores for the year 1971-72. The allotted budget of Annual Plan of Satara District for the year under review was Rs.3.91 crores for the state Plan schemes implemented in the district and Centrally Sponserred Schemes from both the State and Local sector. The budget was about Rs.58 lakhs less than that of the year 1971-72.

4.2 The following table gives the major headwise expenditure incurred during the year 1972-73 in the State and Local sector schemes executed in the state plan in Satara district.

4.3 The annual per capita expenditure (based on 1961 population) on plan schemes in Satara district was Rs.10 during the third plan period and the same was found to have increased to Rs.18 in 1972-73 (based on 1971 population data). Out of the total expenditure incurred 42.0 percent was incurred on agricultural programmes followed by 37.4 percent on Social Services, 10.4 percent on Transport and Communications, 6.1 percent on irrigation and power and so on.

4.4 In the year 1972-73, 80 schemes were implemented in the state plan. Out of the 80 schemes 50 schemes were executed in the state sector, 24 schemes in the Local sector and 6 schemes in both the sectors.

4.5 Agricultural Programmes:-

During the Annual Plan under review high priority was assigned to this major head of development through which important schemes relating to grow more food, Irrigation Projects, Lift Irrigations, Soil Conservation etc. were executed in Satara district.

The following table gives the sub headwise budget, expenditure and its percentage.

4.6 From the above table, it is seen that more than 100 percent of the allotted budget for the major head "Agri. Programmes." was utilised during the year 1972-73. The pro-
-vision earmarked under the/^{sub}heads Minor Irrigation, Animal Husbandry, Forests and ware housing and marketing was fully utilised. There was savings under the remaining sub heads.

4.7 Agricultural Production:-

Under this sub-head of development, 5 plan schemes in state sector, 2 in Local sector and one in both the sector were implemented. Rs.1.70 lakhs were spent on state sector schemes and Rs.5.51 lakhs were spent on local sector schemes. The important schemes executed were 1) Integrated Area Development, 2) Town compost, 3) Intensive Cultivation of food crops and 5) Horticultural Development. All the grants were fully utilised except grants of the schemes intensive cultivation due to scarcity conditions.

The achievements fell short of the targets except in the case of intensive cultivation of food crops.

4.8 Minor Irrigation:-

Under this subhead 4 schemes were implemented viz. well subsidy, pumpset subsidy, Co-operative Lift Irrigation and Minor Irrigation works. The schemes of Minor

Irrigation were executed in both the sectors, and expenditure of Rs. 2.98 lakhs was incurred more than the budget provision on the Minor Irrigation Schemes. During the period of review, 512 wells and 223 pumpsets were subsidised, 28 percolation tanks were completed, 8 bundharas were completed.

4.9 Soil Conservation:-

All the three schemes viz. counter bunding, terracing and afforestation for Soil Conservation were executed in the state sector, and 97 percent of the provision was utilised during the period under review. 11407 hectares of area was bunded and 539 hectares of area was terraced. Plantation in 162 hectares and pre-monsoon works were undertaken in 130 hectares under schemes "Afforestation for Soil Conservation."

4.10.

Animal Husbandry:-

There was only one scheme of "Veterinary aid centres and dispensary buildings" executed in the local sector and 100 percent grants were utilised. Two new veterinary aid centres were started during the year.

4.11 Dairy Development:-

Under the sub head two schemes were implemented in the state sector and Rs.0.40 lakh (28%) were spent. The provision under the scheme "Government Milk supply Scheme" at Mahabaleshwar was Rs. 1.05 lakhs out of which Rs. 0.03 lakhs were spent. The provision could not be utilised fully as the constructional works were in progress. 1313 litres of milk per day was procured and 36 Cooperative Milk Societies and federations were assisted.

4.12 Forests:-

Ninty nine percent of the allotment was spent on four schemes under the sub head. 240 hectares of

&
 plantation/185 hectares of premonsoon works were carried out as per programme through the schemes of farm forestry, fodder development and general utility timber and development of minor forest produce.

4.13 Fisheries:-

The progress of the two schemes executed under the sub head was not satisfactory due to less scope to this activity in Satara district. 1.22 lakh Kg. of fish stocking and 0.32 lakh Kg. of netting was done, and 40 Kg. cotton and 187 Kg. nylon twine was distributed.

4.14 Ware-Housing and Marketing:-

Under the sub head 100 percent provision was spent for assistance to four Agricultural produce Market Committees during the year under review.

4.15 Co-operation and Community Development:-

Under this major head, 5 schemes in two sub heads were implemented. The schemes in sub head "Co-operation" were implemented in State Sector, while schemes in sub-head "Community Development" were executed in local sector. 100% provision was utilised under the sub head Co-operation while 96% provision was spent under the head community Development. The main physical targets and achievements under the head are as shown in the following table.

4.16 Irrigation and Power:-

Scheme of Rural Electrification and Normal Development was executed in Satara district on which an amount of Rs. 18.74 lakh was spent. Through this programme 6 villages were electrified and 252 agricultural pump sets were energised.

4.17 Industry and Mining:-

Under "Small Scale Industries" development programme one scheme in the state and two schemes in the local sector and one scheme in both the sectors were implemented. 100% grants were utilised for assistance to one weaver's cooperative Society, nine industrial cooperative societies, 40 beneficiaries under cottage Industries.

4.18 Transport and Communications:-

Under this programme schemes of road development pertaining to the district roads, hilly and backward area's roads, black topping of roads were implemented in the both sectors. More than 100% of the grants were utilised under the head. The work of 29 C.D. works, 11.32 Kms. district roads and 9 Kms. roads in hilly and backward areas were completed during the year under review.

Scheme of development of "Fratapsinha Park" at Mahabaleshwar was executed through the Forest Department and about 67% of the budget provision was spent for construction of log houses which were in progress.

4.19 Social Services:-

This major head of development occupies significant place in the Annual Plan of the year 1972-73, and important schemes relating to General and Technical Education, Public Health, Water supply, Housing, Backward Class welfare etc. ~~were executed~~ ^{were executed} through various implementing Officers.

Sub-headwise expenditure and its percentage to the budget provision for the year 1972-73 is given in the following table.

4.20 From the above table, it will be seen that 78 percent of the budget provision was utilised during the period of review under the major head "Social Services." The progress of expenditure was satisfactory under the heads "Technical Education," "Health and Family Planning," "B.C. Welfare" and "Labour and Labour Welfare."

4.21 General Education:-

Under this sub head 7 schemes were implemented in the state sector and 6 schemes in the local sector by spending 88% of the allotted budget for the year under review. The important physical achievements are shown in the table given below.

4.22 Technical Education:-

One scheme of "Consolidation of Government Polytechnics" at Katab was implemented under the sub head and development of two institutions was made. The progress of expenditure was satisfactory under the head.

4.23 Health and Family Planning:-

Two schemes were implemented under this sub head (one in state and one in local sector). 100% provision was utilised for completion of buildings for the District/Cottage hospitals and staff quarters and P.H. centres.

4.24 Water Supply and Drainage:-

Under this sub-head Rs.45.63 lakhs were spent on Govt. Municipal and Rural water supply schemes and the expenditure was 5.50 lakhs more than the previous year. Two Govt. water supply works viz. Fanchagani and Satara, four Municipal water supply works viz. Fanchagani, Mai, Maswad, and Satara (Cld) were completed during the year. Similarly 32 rural water supply works (Piped water supply), and 139 well works were completed from the local sector during the year under review.

4.25 Housing:-

Three schemes in the state sector and one scheme in the local sector were executed during the year. An amount of Rs.0.07 lakhs was spent on the works already completed under state sector. While the provision of Rs.0.53 lakhs made for "Extension of village gaathan" was not utilised. An amount of Rs.0.15 lakhs was spent on "Tiling of roofs" and 6 beneficiaries were benefitted under the scheme.

4.26 Urban Development:-

Under this sub-head, scheme of "Financial Assistance to Municipal Councils for implementing development plans" an amount of Rs.0.45 lakhs was spent and two Municipal Councils were assisted. 43 percent of the allotted grant was utilised.

4.27 Backward Class Welfare:-

Under this sub head 6 schemes in local sector and one in state sector were implemented and 100 percent budget provision was utilised. The progress of expenditure was satisfactory. The important physical achievements are given in the following table.

4.28 Labour and Labour Welfare :-

Under the scheme of Technical and Vocational training 105% expenditure was made. The progress of expenditure was satisfactory as compared to previous year. This was a staff scheme.

4.29 Miscellaneous:-

Under this sub head, two schemes in the state sector were implemented. The expenditure under the scheme "Rural Broadcasting" was 81% only. 75 radio sets were installed as against target of 190. A new scheme of "Employment Guarantee Scheme" was introduced under this sub-head under which 71% of the budget provision was utilised. Work of 24 percolation tanks and 23 village roads were in progress under the scheme.

4.30 Centrally Sponsored Programme:-

Under the centrally sponsored programme, nineteen schemes were implemented under four major heads i.e. "Agril. Programme", "Cooperation and community Development", "Social Services" and "Miscellaneous."

The expenditure made under the programme during the year 1972-73 is as under:-

4.31 Perusal of the above table shows that Rs.81.33 lakhs were spent more during the year 1972-73 than the previous year. The expenditure during the year under review was more due to inclusion of number of new schemes in the centrally sponsored programme. More expenditure was made on the heads of "Agril. Programmes" and "Social Services."

4.32 In the Annual Plan of Satara district 19 schemes were implemented under the centrally sponsored programme out of which 7 schemes in state sector, 11 schemes in local sector and one scheme in both the sectors were implemented.

4.33 Agril. Programme:-

Under this major head, out of budget provision of Rs.58.33 lakhs expenditure of Rs. 63.11 lakhs i.e. 108% expenditure was made in the year under review. Most of the expenditure i.e. 99% was made under the head "Minor Irrigation". The work of 25 percolation tanks were completed and 55 hectares of area was brought under plantation during the year.

4.34 Coop. and Community Development:-

Under this head only one scheme i.e. "Applied Nutrition programme" was implemented in local sector and 65% of the budget provision was utilised. No new villages were covered under the scheme.

4.35 Social Services:-

Sub head wise budget provision/expenditure incurred and percentage of expenditure are as under:-

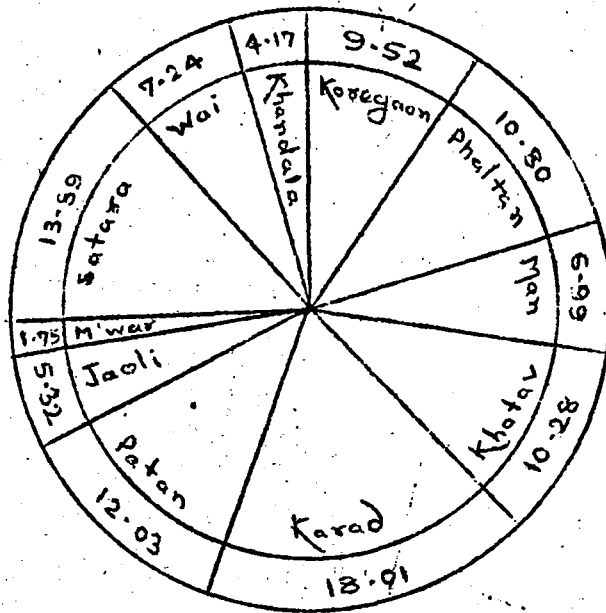

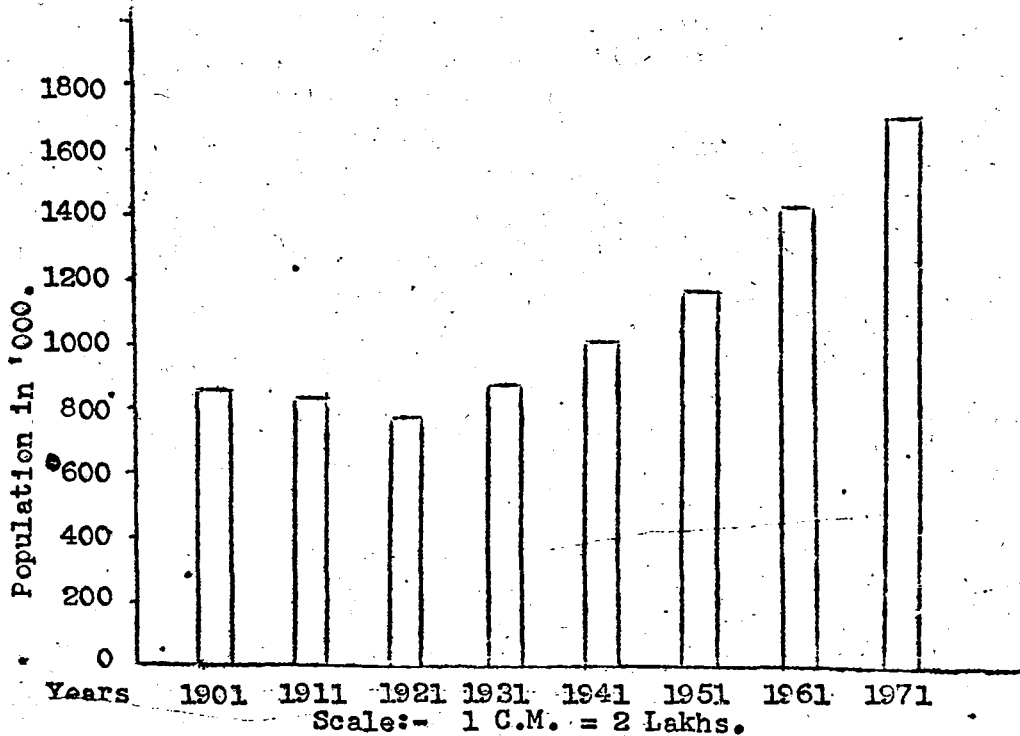

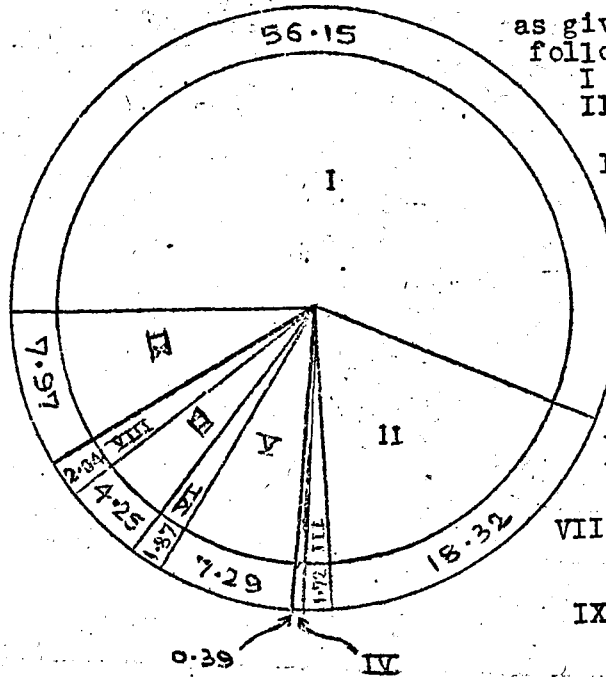


2) Population since 1901 in SATARA District.

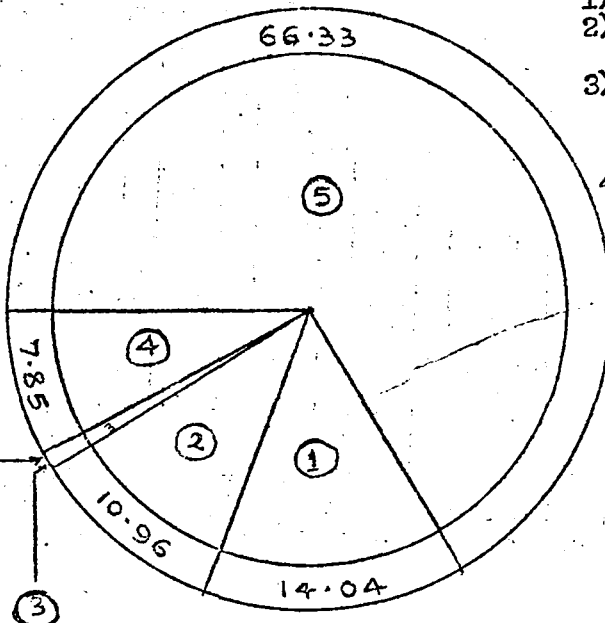

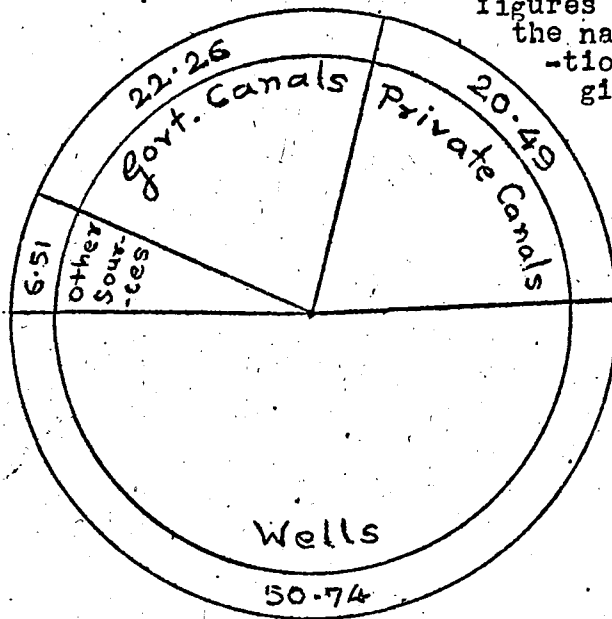

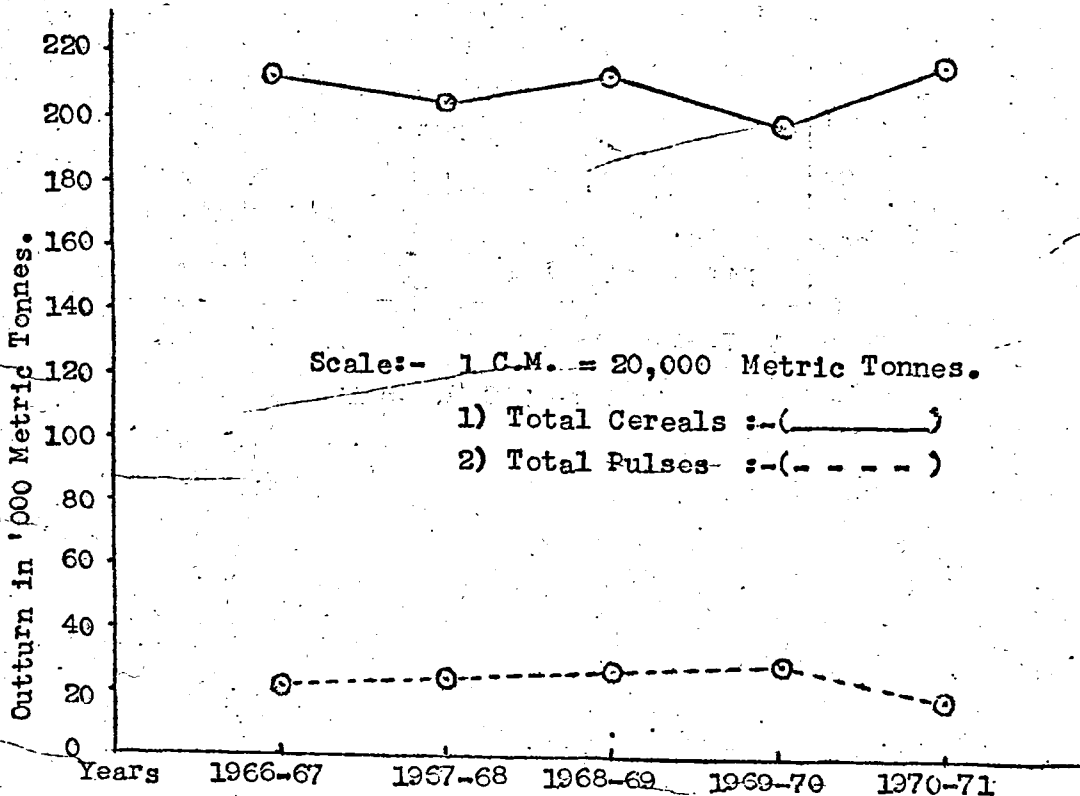

5) Sourcewise Irrigation for 1970-71 in SATARA District.

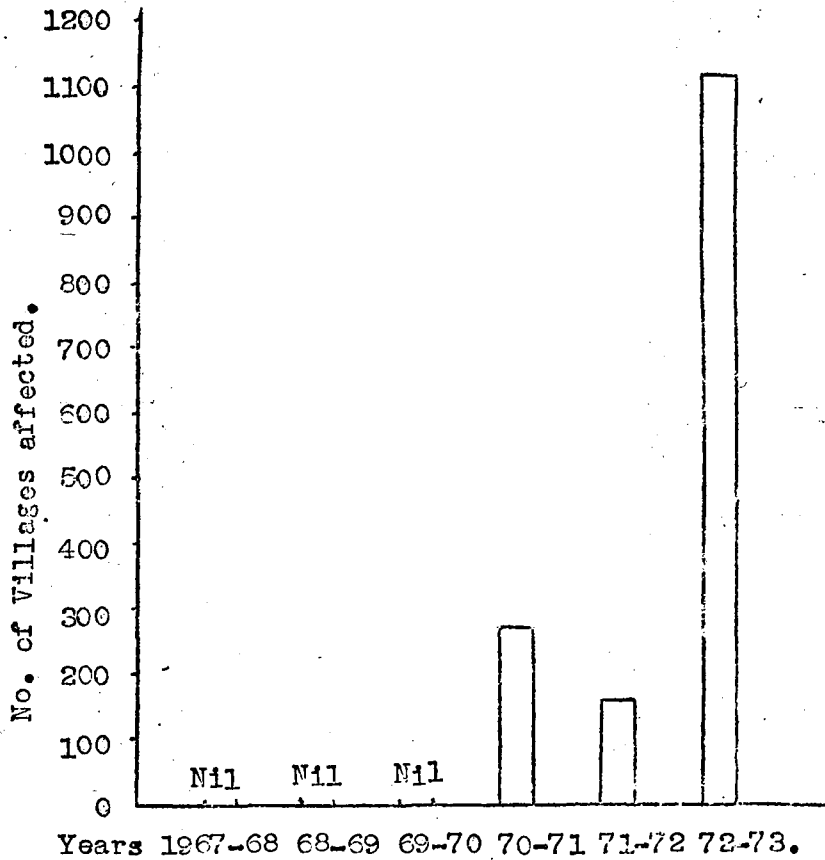

6) Outturn of Total Cereals and Total Pulses from 1966-67 to 1970-71 of the SATARA District.

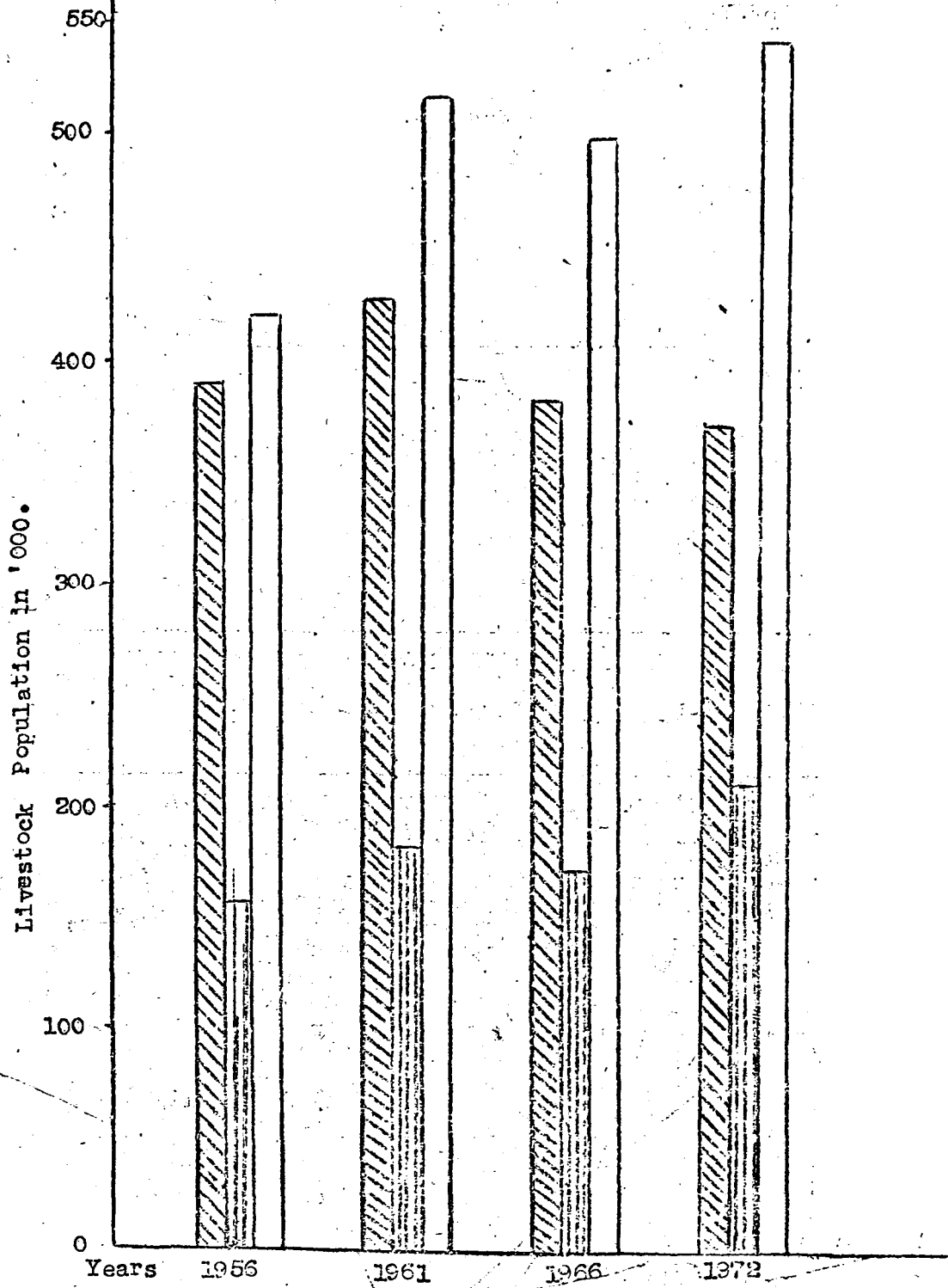


7) Villages affected by Scarcity in the SATARA District during 1967-68 to 1972-73.

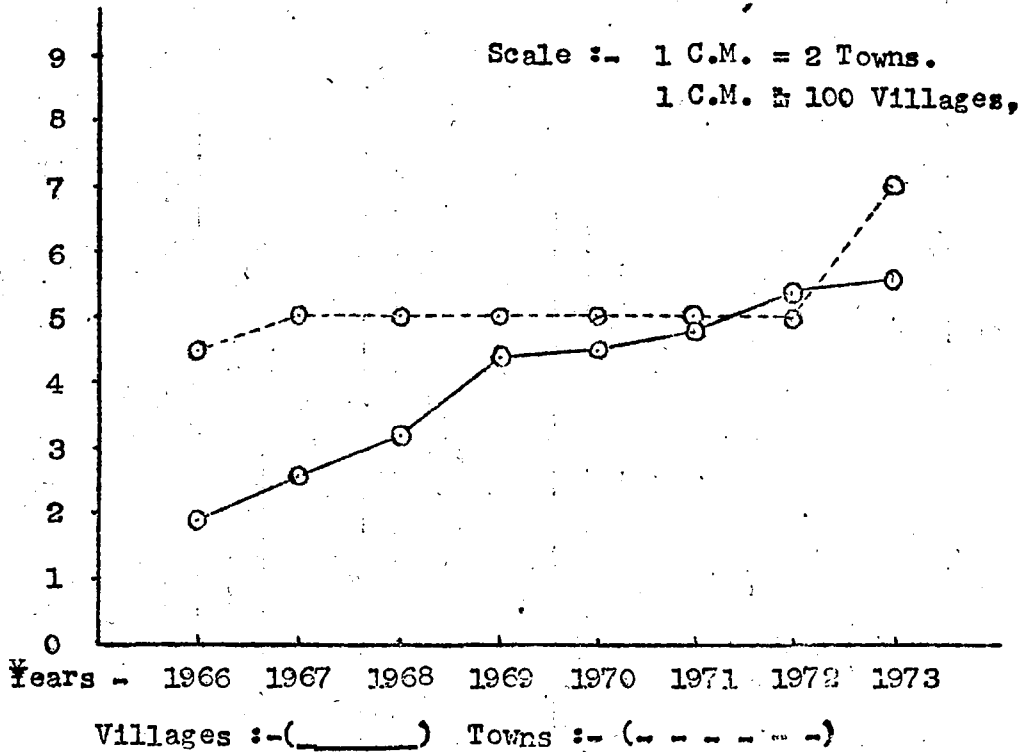
8) Liveness in the Satara District since 1956 to 1972.

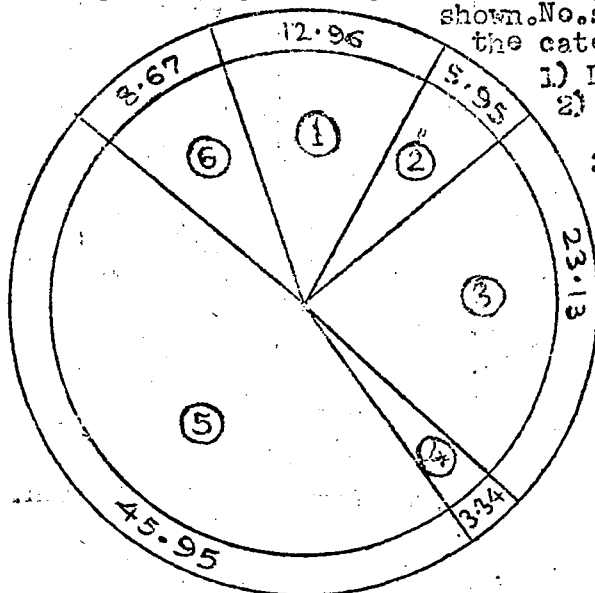

9) Towns and Villages Electrified in the SATARA District since 1966-67.



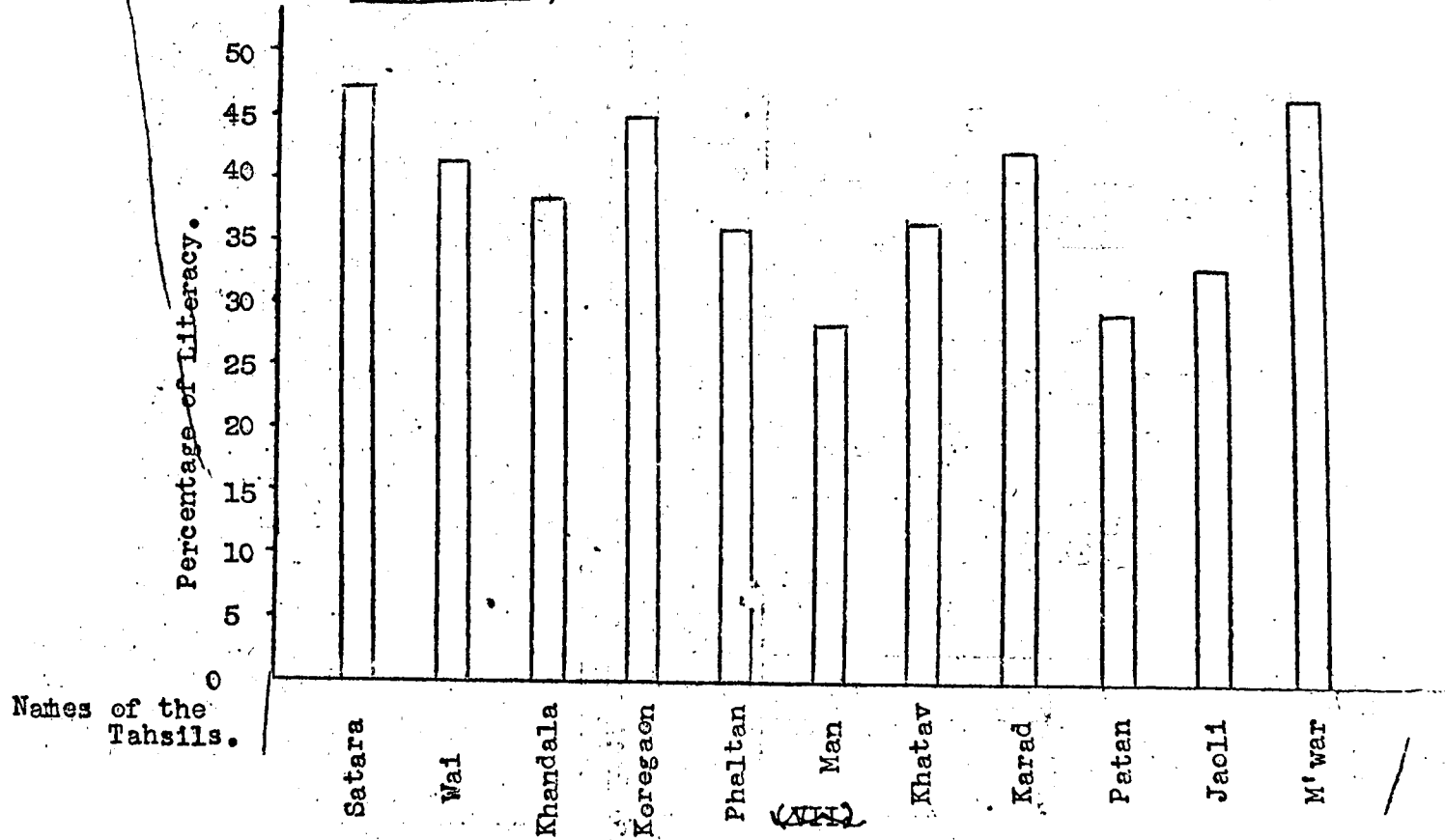
10) Consumption of Electricity according to use during 1972-73 in Satara District :-

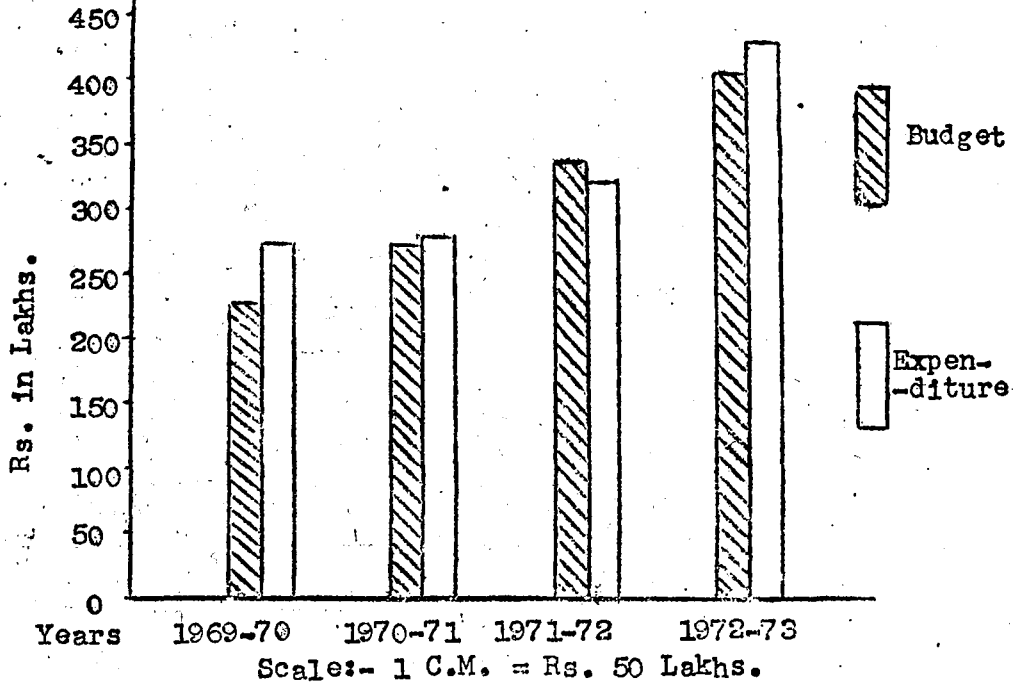
11) Percentage of Literacy in each Tahsil of SATARA District according to 1971 Census :-



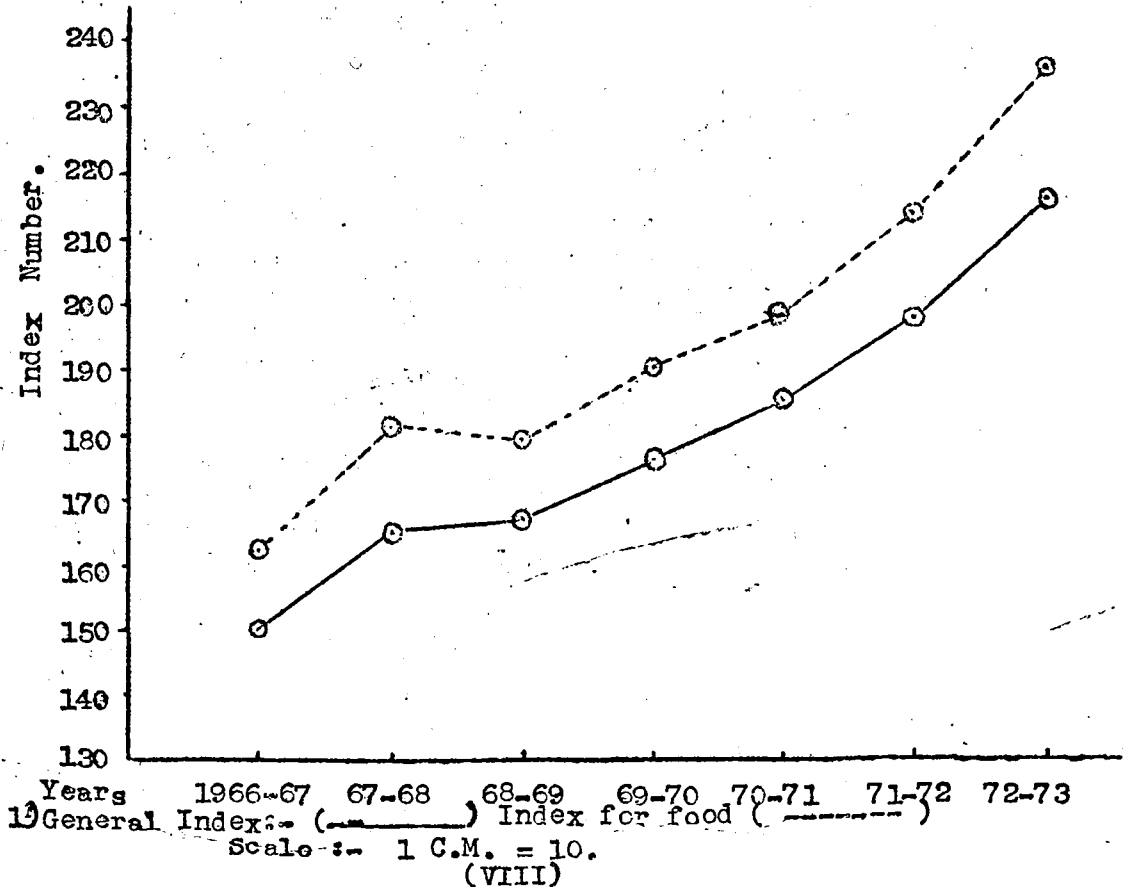

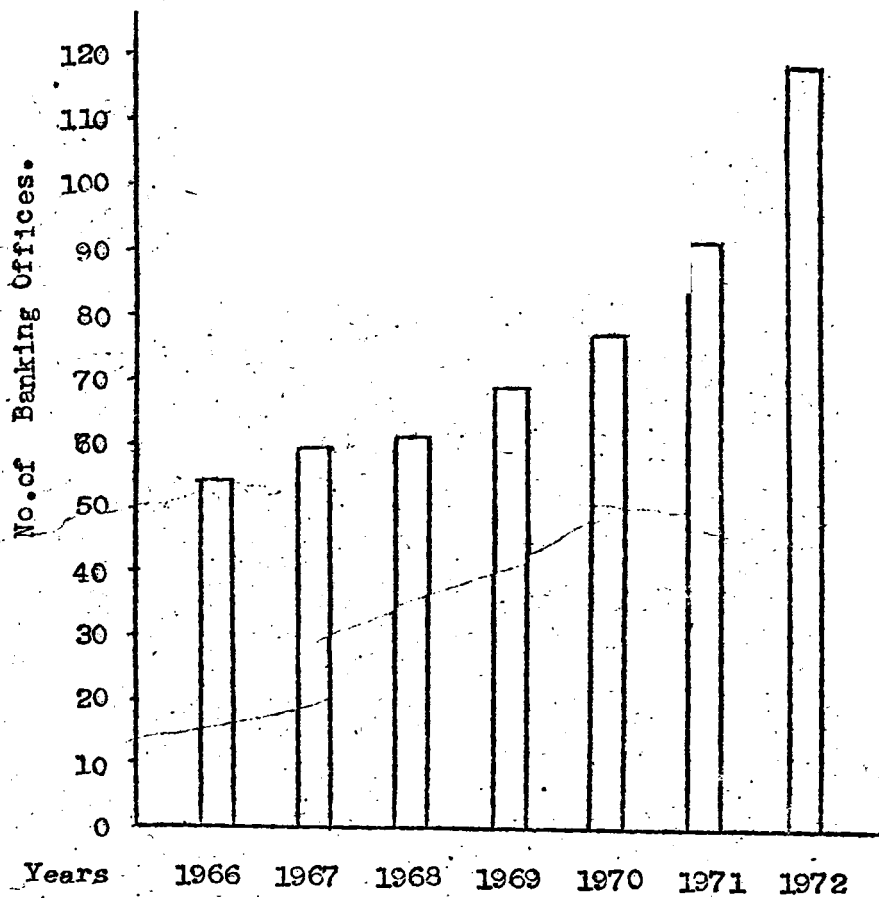
