CHAPTER I

Introduction

Location:-

- 1.1 Solapur district lies between $17^{\circ} 10'$ and $18^{\circ} 32'$ North Latitude and $74^{\circ} 42'$ and $76^{\circ} 15'$ East longitude,

Boundaries

- 1.2 Solapur district is surrounded on the North by Ahmednagar and Osmanabad districts, on East, by Osmanabad and Andhra Pradesh, on the South by Sangli district and Karnataka State and on the West, by Satara and Pune districts.

Topography:

Hills

There is no important hill system in the district except in the North east of Barshi, West of Madha and South-West of Karmala and Malshiras talukas. The district has generally a flat or undulating terrain. The low table land and small separate hills in Karmala and Madha talukas varying in height between 58 and 91 metres act as the water shed between Bhima river and Sina river. The slopes of these hills are covered with stunted grass and generally the tops are devoid of any vegetation.

Rivers:

- 1.4 The main river of the district is Bhima with its right bank feeders the Nira and the Man and left bank feeder the Sina which receives the Bhogavati from the North. The Bhima river and Sina run South east, the Nira nearly East, the Man North-east, the Bhogavati South east.

The Bhima river rising in the Sayadaries, flows with in the district through the central part comprising Karmala, Madha, Pandharpur, South Solapur and Mangalvedhe talukas. The length of the Bhima river within the limit of the district is 289 kms. For large part of the year the rivers are fordable, except for occassional pools of water found in the Bhima river during summer. During the South West monsoon the smaller streams and the Bhima river are flooded by heavy falls in the ^h Sayadaries. The greater part of Malshiras taluka is drained by the river Nira which is the right bank feeder of the Bhima. Sangole, ^{are} part of Pandharpur and Mangalvedhe talukas/drained by the Man river. The eastern talukas of Barshi and North Sholapur and part of Karmala, Madha and South Solapur and part of Karmala, Madha and South Sholapur talukas are drained by Sina river. Part of the Barshi and Madha talukas lie in the basin of Bhogavati river. Thus the water courses of the tributaries in the district may be reckoned at about 650 km.

1.5 Soils

The geographical foundation of soil prevailing in Solapur district is mainly of Deccan trap of volcanic origin. The soil is underlain by partially decomposed Basaltic rock locally known as "Murum" which overlies parent material. On account of more or less complete absence of leaching, the soil are base saturated, the exchangeable calcium being the predominant/claimant.

The lime reserve is fairly high(3.5 to 10 p.c). The soil exhibits varying degrees of erosion and truncated profile is a common occurrence.

The soils in the district can be classified into four main categories on the basis of depth and structure namely.

- a) Very ~~shace~~ shallow soils with depth below 7.5 c.m.
- b) Shallow soils between 7.5 to 22.5 c.m.
- c) Medium deep soils between 22.5 to 90 c.m.
- d) Deep soils with depth more than 90 c.m.

It is broadly estimated that out of the total cultivated area very shallow soils occupy about 10 p.c of the area, shallow soils 29 p.c, medium deep soils 45 p.c area, and deep soils 25 per cent area. In Larmala taluka half the soil is black and the remaining is red and light. The soils of Sangole and Mangalvedhe are mainly light brown or greyish black and are shallow. Madha taluka has ^{shallow} soil having varying depth and quality. In Fardharpur the soil is poor capable of producing millets only. The soil in Malshiras is shallow and not retentive of moisture. Except along with the banks of the river and nullahs and the few valleys where the soils are deep, this district has shallow soils with low water holding capacity. Crops in this area therefore, suffer the most during the drought conditions.

Rainfall

- 1.6 Climatically the entire district except Akkalkot falls in the rain ^{shadow} area.

Rainfall all over the district is uncertain and scanty with an annual average of 577.1 m.m. The district gets rain from South West as well as from North East monsoon. Throughout the district the rain starts in June and continues upto October.

The precipitation during June to August is rather precarious and of small magnitude. The showers in Sept. and Oct. are heavy and more assured.

The average rainfall during the year 1973 was 699.8 m.m. as against normal average rainfall of 577.m.m. During Oct. 73 the average rainfall of the district is double the average normal rainfall of the district for Oct 73 i.e 159.6 m.m. as against the normal rainfall of 78.1 m.m. However, in Pandharpur and Mangalvedhe talukas the average rainfall is far less than the ^{normal} rainfall of the respective talukas in Oct 73 i.e mil as against 78.2 m.m. and 47.1 m.m. as against 99.0 m.m. respectively. In Sept. 73 the average rainfall in each tahsil except Sangole is less than the normal average rainfall of that month.

Famine & Scarcity:-

- 1.7 The district falling in the lower rainfall belt witnesses recurrent ~~scarity~~ scarcity conditions. The past history of 30 years ^{or} so, testifies that conditions akin to near scarcity or total scarcity have been in existence in some parts of the district in every two or three years. During the year 1973-74, all the villages in the district were affected by famine and chronic scarcity. The total number of relief works

undertaken were 8504, for which 2,67,956 persons were employed. The total expenditure incurred on scarcity measures(i.e salary, scarcity relief works supply of drinking water, fodder, subsidy, cash dole etc.) was to the tune of Rs.19,28,76,425/-.

Minerals:-

- 1.8 There are no minerals of economic importance in this district . However minerals like building stone/ are found in sufficient quantity, all over the district.

Forest:-

- 1.9 The total area under forest which is scattered is 365.25 sq.km. All these forests are scrub forests growing thorny bushes. The forest area is much scattered. It may be roughly divided into two tracts, hills between Barshi and Osmanabad on the extreme north & east and hills to the south of Malshiras and Sangole in the extreme South West.

The forest products of Solapur district are fuel, Grass and Dhawada gun . The total value of forest product was Rs.5450/- during 1973-74.

Area:-

- 1.10 Solapur district comprises of an area of 15021 sq. km. which is 4.88 percent of the total area of the state. Of this, Urban area account for 414 sq.km. and rural areas for 14607 sq. km. In terms of area Barshi is the biggest tahsil with an area of 1626 sq. km. and the smallest tahsil is North Solapur(736 sq. km.)

Demography:-

1.11 General:- According to 1971 census the population of the district was 22.54 lakh. Of this 16.37 lakh people lived in rural areas and the remaining 6.17 lakh people lived in urban areas. The percentage of urban population to the total population works out to to 27.4. The sex ratio(number of females per 1000 males) was 933 in 1971 as against 936 in 1961.

Density:-

1.12 The density of population per sq. km. for the district was 150 in 1971 as compared to 124 in 1961.

Decadal variation:-

1.13 The population of the district during 1971 census increased by 21.17 % over 1961 census population. The following table gives the tahsilwise population as per 1961 and 1971 census and the percentage increase.

The increase in population varies from 15.65 % in Mchol tahsil(which is the lowest) to 36.01 % in Malshiras tahsil. The high rate of increase in population in Malshiras tahsil can be attributed to the establishment of two new coop. sugar factories and one ginning factory in the tahsil.

Special Features:-

- 1.14 Due to Nira Right Bank canal a large portion of cultivated land has been brought under irrigation for sugar-cane cultivation in Malshiras tahsil. As such most of the sugar factories are concentrated in Malshiras tahsil. Out of 5 sugar factories, 4 are situated in Malshiras tahsil and one is situated near Kumtha village in North Solapur tahsil. Due to availability of molasses from sugar factory the Brahan Maharashtra Sugar factory Ltd. Shirpur Manufactures rectified Spirit and liquor.
- 1.15 Solapur city and Barshi are the important textile centres. In Solapur city there are in all five textile mills out of which Narsingirji mill is run by Govt. At Barshi there are three textiles mills. So also two spinning mills in the Coop. Sector are established at Solapur proper.
- 1.16 Solapur is the major Handloom and Powerloom centre in the State. Handloom industry meets large demand of the common people and provided economic subsistence to largest weavers' community. Powerloom industry also helps to raise the economic standard of the weavers. There are approximately 25,900 handlooms,

out of which 16,101 are in the Coop. field while the remaining are privately owned, thus providing employment to 1.54 lakh persons. The number of power-looms in the Coop. sector are 3,795, out of which 1,735 are in Solapur city.

CHAPTER II

Explanatory note:-

2.1 Introductory Statistical information regarding various aspects of development of Solapur district is presented in the tables of this abstract.

The data has been compiled for the financial year, For certain groups, such as Agriculture and Cooperation, however, the data has been furnished for the Agril. year and Cooperative year respectively. Calendar year has been taken as reference year for presenting the data regarding meteorology, Vital statistics and Statistics pertaining to Civil and Criminal Courts. The Abstract is useful not only as a reference book, but also for research, planning and Socio Economic studies.

In the tables, district total is given first followed by its tahsilwise break up. The order of tahsils is as per the order followed in the Census Hand Book. The source of information has been indicated at the bottom of each table.

A table 'District at a glance' giving comparative data of the district and the State of Maharashtra is given at the beginning of the abstract.

The concepts, source and limitations adopted in the preparation of the abstract are summarised major groupwise in following paragraphs.

2.2 Area and Population:- On the basis of 1971 population census, data regarding area, houses and population in rural and urban areas is presented in table No.1 Decadal variation in population since 1951 is shown in table No.2. Table No.3 tahsilwise classification of villages according to population ranges in 1971 whereas table No.4 shows tahsilwise towns according to population ranges in 1971.

No. of workers and non-workers in each tahsil, according to 1971 census is presented in table No.5. Tables No.6 shows distribution of population of Solapur district according to age group and religion, as per 1971 census, whereas data regarding tahsiwise scheduled caste and scheduled tribes population according to 1971 census is presented in table No.7.

As compared to the 1961 census, data, the population of workers is found to have decreased. The reason for this, appears to be the change in the concept of 'workers' adopted in 1971. The 1971 instructions stipulated that a person primarily engaged in household duties or those who were students and helped in the family economicactivity, but not on a full time scale, should be treated as non workers, in respect of their main activity.

2.3 Climate:- The rainfall data'(Table No.8) gives information about number of rainy days and total rainfall in m.m. during each month of calendar year 1973, at the selected centres in the district. Figures of normal rainfall are worked out on the basis of actual rainfall for the periods ranging from ten years and maximum of eighty years.

A day is treated as a rainy day, if during the 24 hours, minimum rainfall of 2.5 m.m. is recorded. The figures of highest and lowest temperature in each month during 1973, in respect of Solapur and Jejur centres are given in table No.9. The data has been supplied by the Govt. of India's meteorological centre at Kolaba.

2.4 Agriculture:-Statistical information regarding land utilisation, irrigation, area under different crops,

yield per hectare and outturn of principal crops etc. is given in the tables under this head. The break up of the total geographical area according to different types of land utilisation is shown in the table No.10. Under Forest, lands which are classed or administered as forest under legal enactment dealing with forest whether state owned or private/ included. In case, any portion of such land is put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of land use. Land put to non agricultural use stands for all lands occupied by buildings, roads and railways, rivers and canals and other lands put to uses other than agriculture. All barren and uncultivable land like mountains, deserts etc. which can not be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost is classified as barren and uncultivable land irrespective of the fact whether such land is in isolated blocks or with in cultivated holdings. 'Permanent pastures and other grazing land' covers all grazing land(whether permanent pastures and meadows or not) and village common and grazing lands within forest areas. 'Cultivable waste' includes all lands available for cultivation whether not up taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once but not cultivated during the current year and last five years or more in succession. Such lands may either be fallow or covered with shrubs and jungles which are not put to any use.

Cultivable lands kept fallow during the current year only are shown as ' current fallow'. Other fallow land includes all lands which were taken up for cultivation but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period between 1 to 5 years.

The net area sown consists of total areas sown with crop and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once. Gross cropped area represents the sum total of the area under all crops, ~~indlu~~ including area sown more than once. Table No.11 gives details of area under different food crops(cereals, pulses and others) and non food crops (fibres, oil seeds etc.). Table No.12 gives information about per yield/hectare and outturn of principal crops. Table No.13 gives information of area irrigated by different sources i.e canals, tanks wells etc. in each tahsil while table No.14 gives information of area irrigated under different crops in each tahsil. Table No.16 presents the number of minor irrigation works in each tahsil and the net area irrigated. The table No.17 gives information about the major and Medium irrigation projects as on 30-6-1973. Table No.18 gives information about agricultural wage rates, in respect three selected centres viz.(1) Mandrup(2) Modnimb(3) Vairag. The information regarding Agril. implements in each tahsil according to livestock census 1972 is presented in table No.19. Table No.20 pertains to famine, scarcity & akin to scarcity data. Table No.21 gives information about the total no. of villages(tahsilwise and circlewise) affected by scarcity during the period from 1968-69 to 1973-74. While declaring the villages affected by scarcity during particular year, the final Annewari of the previous year's crops is taken into consideration by the Revenue Authorities.

2.5 Animal Husbandry and Forest:

(a) Animal Husbandry:- Table No.22 gives the No. of various types of livestock and poultry, as enumerated in the district during the 1972 livestock census.

Statistical information in respect of veterinary institutions and disease wise no. of attacks and deaths of livestock/poultry is given in table No.23 and 24 respectively. Data regarding no. of animals slaughtered in each recognised slaughter house in 1973-74 is presented in table No.25.

(b) Forest:-Tables under this group namely 26(A) and 26(B) furnish information about area under forests and production of major and minor forest produce. Information of Forest under the control of both the Forest Department & Revenue Deptt. of the Govt. of Maharashtra is given separately. Area under forest are again classified as reserved, protected and unclassed forests according to legal status. Reserved forests are those that are intended mainly for timber production and in which rights of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. In protected forests, right of grazing or cultivation is allowed under certain limitations and restrictions. The unclassed forest refers to the inaccessible forest or unoccupied waste. The figures in table No. 26(A) have been obtained from the forest deptt. and they do not tally with those given in table No.10, the figures for which have been taken from Revenue Deptt. This variation is due to the different concepts of classification of areas by the two departments.

2.6 Employment, Industry and Electricity:-

Statistics relating to working factories such as average daily employment of workers, classification of factories according to working strength and no.of days worked during the year is given in the tables 27 to 29 for the year 1972. Table No.30 shows statistical relating to annual survey of industries 1966.

The figures are based on actuals of census sector factories and estimates of sample sector factories. Tables 31 to 33 give important statistics of Employment Exchange in Solapur district, including monthwise registration, vacancies notified and placements in public and private sectors and number on live register at the end of each month for the year 1973-1974.

The information regarding consumption of electricity in Solapur district in the year 1973-74 is given in table No.34. This includes the consumption of electricity supplied by the Maharashtra State Electricity Board and the following private companies in Solapur district.

- 1) Pandharpur Electric Supply Co; Pandharpur.
- 2) Karmala Electric Supply Co; Karmala.

In addition to this information, electricity generated by mills and factories by using their own generating sets is also included in this table against 'other type' of generation.

Information regarding towns and villages electrified and the population covered is given in table No.35.

2.7 Cooperation:- The data on typewise cooperative societies and Coop. Banks in the district are given in table No.36 and 37 respectively. Tahsilwise breakup of primary agricultural credit societies during 1973-74 with details of membership/capital structure, loans advanced, recovered and outstanding is given in table No.38. Data regarding other Cooperative societies, other than Agril. credit, and Banks, along with membership, share capital, Reserve and other funds

and working capital is given in table No.39. Table No.40 gives information regarding operation of Central and Primary cooperative Marketing societies(Tahsilwise) during the year 1973-74. The main function of primary Coop. Marketing societies is the purchase and sale of Agril. produce grown by its members or member Coop. societies in its area of operation. In table No.41 information regarding operation of other Cooperative societies of different types during 1973-74 is given. In table No.42, the quantity and value of annual arrivals of various types of Agril. produce of different regulated markets in the district are shown. The tahsilwise data regarding registered money lenders and loans advanced by them is given in table No.43.

2.8 Medical and Public Health:-In this section, data on Medical and Public Health for year 1973 is given. Table No.44 gives medical facilities available through public and Public aided bodies in each tahsil along with indoor and outdoor patients treated. Data on vital Statistics e.g. tahsilwise births and deaths and infant deaths registered in the year 1973 with break up into male and female and number of deaths due to important causes, from the year 1969 to 1973 is given in tables No.45 and 46 respectively. Vaccination Statistics and cholera inoculation done in each tahsil during 1973 is given in table No.47. Table No.48 gives statistics on family planning.

2.9 Education:- Data regarding literacy in each tahsil according to 1971 census is presented in tables No.49, Statistics such as No. of educational institutions, enrolment of students, teachers(trained and total) No. of backward class class

beneficiaries at different stages of education, achievements under the scheme of concession to economically backward classes is presented in table No.52 to 54. Normal and plan expenditure on primary education is shown in table No.55.

2.10 Transport & Communication:- Table No.56 gives grange-wise total railway length in km in Solapur district as on 31st March 1974. These figures have been compiled with the help of railway time table and map. The figures of extra municipal roads maintained by Buildings and Communication Deptt. and Zilla Parishad are shown in table No.57. Roads maintained by Municipal councils are also shown separately in this table. Table No.58 gives data regarding motor vehicles as on 31st March 1974 in the Pune Transport Region, comprising of Ahmednagar, Pune, Satara and Solapur districts. Operational Statistics relating to Solapur Division of the Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation, results of traffic census on important roads in the district, information of postal, Telegraph, Telephone and rural broadcasting statistics are also given in the tables No.59 to 62.

2.11 Local bodies:- Financial position of Village Panchayats, Municipal Councils and the Zilla Parishad for the year 1973-74 is shown in this section. Table No.63 gives yearwise income and expenditure of V.P.s, Z.P. and Municipal Councils/Corporation for the year 1965-66 and 1968-69 to 1973-74. Total village Panchayats include independent and group village Panchayats and the income and expenditure of village Panchayats and Municipal councils/Corporation shown in Table No.64 and 66 are exclusive of opening and closing balance respectively.

The receipts of the Zilla Parishad are shown under four sub heads viz.(1) Self raised resources(2) Govt. grants(3) Grants for agency schemes and (4)debt section, in table No.65(A). Details of Govt. grants to Z.P. and Expenditure of Z.P. for 1972-73(Actual,), 1973-74(revised) and 1974-75(estimates) are given in tables 65-B and 65-C respectively.

2.12 Plan and Community Development:- Tables in this section give information regarding expenditure and physical achievements under district level plan schemes implemented in Solapur district for the year 1973-74, which was the fifth and the last year of the Fourth Five Year Plan. Data on Community Development e.g. expenditure, physical achievements etc. are presented in table Nos 69 to 71.

2.13 Prices:- The table No.72 gives wholesale prices of important agril. commodities like rice, wheat, jowar, Bajra, etc. at selected centres in the district i.e where market committees are established. Table No.73 gives monthly average retail pp prices of important commodities at Solapur during 1973. The prices collected for the given commodities are taken from the selected shops. The average shown for individual commodities can not, therefore be said to be fully representative. The data may, however, prove useful as a broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices during the period. The table No.74 gives the consumer price index number for working class at Solapur and Pune with the year 1960 and 1961 respectively as the base years.

2.14 Miscellaneous:- Statistical information on the subjects like police force, crime statistics, banks, joint stock companies, insurance, Presses, News papers and periodicals in this small savings etc, is included in this section.

2.15 Selected indicators:- Tables on selected indicators of development for each tahsil of Solapur district are appended at the end. Topics like population agril, electricity, factory workers, road length^{ative}, education, medical facilities etc. are covered. A comparative picture of tahsils in related to their development under each item has been shown by way of ranking the tahsils on the basis of the latest available data.

Ch a p t e r - III -
An analytical review of sectorial trends

3.1 Aim of this chapter is to analyse the trends observed in Solapur district and the talukas in it in various socio economic sectors during the year 1972-73 in comparision with the past period. The Statistical data presented in part II of this issue has been utilised as a base for reviewing the sectorial trends presented in this chapter.

3.2 Agriculture:- Even though agriculture is the back bone of economy, the performance in this major sector is far from satisfactory, due to various factors such as poor soil, inadequate and uneven rainfall, meagre irrigation facilities, substandard and inadequate application of inputs such as seed, fertilizers, pesticides etc.

3.3 During the year 1972-73, out of the total geographical area(15,00,021 hectares) of this district 13,74,028 hectares of land(91.6 percent) was cultivable. But the percentage of net area sown to cultivable land was 44.4 as against 82.7 in 1971-72. The sudden decrease in the net area sown was due to acute scarcity conditions prevailing in the district. Table No.1 given below shows the tahsilwise position of percentage of net area sown to total cultivable land and percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown.

3.4 From the above table, it is seen that the percentage of net area sown to cultivable land was only 10.7 and 1.0 in Barshi and Akkalkot tahsils in 1972-73 as against 77.9 and 90.9 respectively in 1971-72. Thus Barshi and Akkalkot were the two tahsils, which were badly affected by scarcity conditions. The Karmala tahsil was the highest, where the percentage of net area sown to cultivable land was 88.3 in 1972-73.

3.5 The percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown indicates that the area sown more than once decreased from 4.1 percent in 1971-72 to 3.6 percent in 1972-73. In Barshi tahsil though the percentage of net area sown is decreased considerably, the percentage of area sown more than once was increased from 2.8 in 1971-72 to 9.0 in 1972-73.

3.6 Irrigation:-

Irrigation is one of the most important factors for increasing agricultural output and as such it has got important place in the study of economic development. It is, therefore quite essential to study the pattern of irrigation prevalent in the district. In order to indicate the extent of irrigation and multiple cropping in irrigated area, the two indicators have been presented in the following table.

3.7 The above table indicates that there is a slight increase in the net irrigated area by 1.63 percent in 1972-73 over the previous year. In Akkalkot tahsil, the percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown was much higher, as compared to other tahsils in the district, in 1972-73. It indicates that in Akkalkot tahsil, most of the net area sown in 1972-73, though comparatively very less i.e only 10 percentag to total cultivable land, due to famine, was having irrigation facilities. Pandharpur, Sangole and Malshiras tahsils had recorded more percentage than that of district average, due to the facility of canal irrigation.

3.8 The percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area indicates that the gross irrigated area decreased from 26.0 percent in 1971-72 to 20.76 percent in 1972-73. This was due to the fact that water supply from irrigation wells, the major means of providing irrigation facilities in district was not satisfactory throughout during 1972-73, due to scanty rains.

Yield rates and outturn of important crops

3.9 Rainfall in this district is very scanty and uncertain. Irrigation facilities have not much developed. Soil is also very poor. Wheat Jowar Bajra, Tur, Sugarcane, Groundnut are some of the principal crops of Solapur district. The following table gives yield rate and outturn of important crops, for the year 1971-72 and 1972-73.

3.10 The above table indicates that the yield per hectare in case of all principal crops except Bajra and Tur registered considerable decrease during 1972-73 as compared to data of 1971-72. (The decline in the case of sugarcane was insignificant.)

So also all the sown area of all principal crops was decreased to a great extent, due to scanty rains in 1972-73. Jowar which is the principal crop of this district was badly affected due to scarcity conditions in 1972-73. The average yield of jowar per hectare in kg declined from 209 kg per hectare in 1971-72 to 92 kg per hectare in 1972-73. Similarly production of jowar declined from 1757 hundred metric tonnes in 1971-72 to 390 hundred metric tonnes in 1972-73. In order to have better results in food production, dependence of agriculture on monsoons should be drastically reduced by increasing irrigation facilities particularly to food crops.

3.11 More than 68 percent of the total working population of this district is dependent on agriculture and as such fate of major portion of the total population is closely related with the conditions of agricultural activities. The table below shows tahsilwise net area sown per agriculture worker for the years 1971-72 and 1972-73.

3.12 The above data indicates that the net area sown per agril. worker decreased by about 45 percent in 1972-73 as compared to data for the year 1971-72. The Barshi and Akka-lkot were the worst affected tahsils due to scarcity, where the area available to each agril. worker was 0.23 and 0.02 hectares respectively in 1972-73, while Karmala tahsil was having highest area available in the district i.e 2.70 hectares per agril. worker in 1972-73.

Agricultural wage rates:

3.13 The data of agricultural wage rates are collected from the rural centres, namely Modnimb in Macha tahsil, Vairag in Barshi tahsil and Mandrup in South Sclarur tahsil. The following table gives average wages paid to unskilled field labour in three selected centres.

3.14 It will be seen from the above data that there were no considerable changes in the wage rates of unskilled field labour in 1973 over 1972 except in Vairag centre. The increase in the average wage rates in respect of female field worker in Vairag centre, during 1973, is due to the

fact during 1973, is due to the fact that female field workers were paid at the rate of Rs.3.00 per worker, during May 75 and June 75, on scarcity works.

Co-operation:-

3.15 In order to increase agricultural production substantially, investment on large scale is quite essential. But due to poor economic conditions of cultivators, investment from self raised resources of farmers to the desired level becomes impossible, resulting in poor returns from the soil. To step up the rate of investment in agricultural sector, agricultural credit societies were formed. All the villages in the district are at present covered by the agric. credit ~~cosse~~ societies. The position regarding cooperative societies, membership and other financial performance of the primary agricultural credit societies has been described in the following table.

The above table reveals that the number of primary Agril. societies is decreased from 887 in 1972-73 to 883 in 1973-74, due to liquidation. No new societies were formed during 1973-74. The increase in the membership of societies indicates that the cultivators are taking advantage of credit facilities. In 1973-74, loans outstanding and overdues have increased by 21.4 percent and 79.8 percent over the figures of 1972-73. This upward trend in respect of loans outstanding and overdues is observed for many years. This shows that the financial position of primary agril. credit societies is becoming unsound and deteriorating.

Livestock:-

3.17 The 11th Quinquennial livestock Census was carried out in the year 1972 all over the State. Animal Husbandry makes a substantial contribution to the economy by providing subsidiary income to farmers and supplementary food products to human population.

3.18 The variation in livestock population during the five years since 1966 can be seen from the following table.

3.19 From the above, it is seen that cattle and sheep population has decreased considerably as compared to 1966 census figures. This is due to the fact that Solapur district was affected by famine and chronic scarcity. There is a slight increase in the population of buffaloes while the population of goats and poultry increased considerably, as compared to 1966 census figures.

3.20 It is observed from the above table that nine pairs of bullocks had to work on 100 hectares of land during the year 1965-66 and 16 in 1972-73 so far as the district is concerned. In other words, a pair of bullocks was utilised for cultivating about 6 hectares of land in 1972-73 as against 11 in 1965-66. The decrease in the area was, however, mainly due to the sharp decline in the gross cropped area in 1972-73.

Employment

3.21 Unemployment situation is quite alarming. The no. of unemployed and under employed is quite distressing and every year it is swelling. Comprehensive statistics are lacking on this vital subject and only Employment Exchange data are available. The Employment Exchange is a link between the employer and the unemployed. But a large portion of employed labour force do not avail of the services of the Employment Exchange. This comprises mostly of uneducated masses and unskilled agricultural labour, who are either net or all employed throughout the year or are seasonally employed. Statistics of such unemployment is not reflected in the data of Employment Exchange.

3.22 The above table brings out the gravity of unemployment situation in this district. There is a considerable increase in the enrollment of candidates in 1973-74 as compared to 1972-73 figure. The percentage of increase is 31.2. So also the candidates remaining on live register of the Employment Exchange is much higher in 1973-74, as compared to figures of 1965-66 and 1972-73. The percentage of placement to total enrollment has slightly increased in 1973-74 i.e 7.23 as compared to percentage in 1972-73 i.e 6.21

3.23. Consumption of Electricity:-

3.23 Consumption of electricity is an important indicator of economic development in urban as well as rural areas. More the consumption of electricity more is the economic development. Trends in per capita consumption of electricity, therefore occupy an important place in the study of economic advancement of any region. Table below gives information regarding per capita consumption of electricity during the years 1968-69, 1971-72, 1972-73 and 1973-74.

3.24 It is evident from the above table that the per capita consumption of electricity has increased considerably from 1968-69 to 1973-74, the percentage increase being 52.7 and 55.2 in 1972-73 and 1973-74 respectively, over 1968-69.

3.25 The programme of rural electrification has assumed much importance in recent times. The Govt. of Maharashtra has included this programme under the Minimum Needs programme. In Solapur district all the urban areas have been electrified. Out of 953 villages in the district, 470 villages have been electrified upto 31-3-74, The percentage of villages electrified is stepped up from 46 in 1972 to 49 in 1973-74.

Public Health:

3.26 Public Health programmes are undertaken to expand the existing health services so as to bring them within easy reach of more and more people. The below table shows the availability of medical facilities in Solapur district.

3.27 While studying the above data, it may be borne in mind that public and public aided institutions and medical facilities available in them only has been taken into account as the data regarding private sector is not available.

3.28 The above data reveals that medical help is made available to the public on an increasing scale every year even though the same is not sufficient to meet the public demand. The number of beds per lakh of population increased from 37 in 1961 to 53 in 1973.

3.29 The study of birth rate and death rate data is useful for judging the health condition of the people.

3.30 The trend in death rate per 1000 population shows that it is falling down gradually from year to year resulting in increasing expectancy of life. It is decreased from 14 in 1960 to 8 in 1973. So also the birth rate per 1000 population has decreased from 38 in 1960 to 18 in 1973. This can be attributed to the various family planning measures taken such as sterilization operations, use of contraceptives, which has played decisive role in bringing down the birth rate.

Education:-

3.31 The progress of education at various levels since 1960-61 is shown below:-

3.32 Number of primary schools has increased by 16.4 percent in 1971-72 as compared to primary schools in 1960-61. This percentage rose to 17.3 in 1972-73. The number of pupils has increased by 45.0 percent in 1971-72 and by 50.0 percent in 1972-73 over the number in 1960-61.

3.33 There is a remarkable increase in the number of secondary schools in 1971-72 as compared to schools in 1960-61. The number of secondary schools in 1971-72 increased by 118.8 percent over the number in 1960-61 and that during 1972-73 increased by 137.5 percent. The rates of increase in the number of pupils in 1971-72 and 1972-73 over 1960-61 were 137.5 percent and 161.34 per cent respectively.

3.34 In the field of higher education, the number of colleges rose by 216.7 percent during 1960-61 to 1971-72 & that during the period 1960-61 to 1972-73 it rose by 266.7 percent. The increase in ^{the} number of pupils during the above two periods was 428.1 percent and 506.4 percent.

3.35 The ratio of number of pupils per teacher for primary and secondary schools in 1971-72 was 36 and 26 respectively. The same was 35 and 26 respectively in 1972-73. This shows that the number of teachers in primary schools is not increased proportionately with the increase in the number of pupils, in 1972-73. In case of higher institutions the ratio of number of pupils per teacher is decreased from 28 in 1971-72 to 26 in 1972-73.

Transport & Communication:

3.36 Transport & Communication is one of the important factors in the infrastructure of the economy. A well planned net work of road and other means of communications help in

bringing out economic development quickly. In Solapur district, there has been no changes in the rail length since long. However the road length has undergone considerable change since March 1961. The road length per 100 sq.km in this district was 14.0 by March 1961. It rose to 21.4 by March 1971, 27.8 by March 1972, 38.0 by March 1973 and 50.4 by March 1974. This shows that the road length has increased by about four times, by March 1974 as compared to road length of March 1961. The increase in road length in recent times can be attributed to the road works undertaken as scarcity relief measures, during the scarcity period.

Banking

3.37 There is considerable increase in the banking offices in this district. In 1971 there were 96 banking offices. This number is raised to 128 in 1972. The proportion of banking offices per lakh of population works out to 4.2 and 5.6 for the years 1971 and 1972 respectively.

Prices

3.38 The Commissioner of labour works out the consumer price indices for working class for Solapur centre. The 1973-74 general Index stood at 277 as compared to the base year 1960. The Ford index was 321 in 1973-74.

CHAPTER - IV

Annual Plan 1973-74

4.1 The year 1973-74 was the final year of the Fourth Plan. In this chapter, an attempt is made to describe financial as well as physical achievements under various heads of development.

4.2 Budget provision for Solapur district in respect of district level state plan schemes for the year 1973-74 was Rs.365.51 lakhs. Out of this provision, Rs.225.32 lakhs were for state sector and Rs.140.19 lakhs for local sector. In addition to the provision for state plan schemes, Rs.95.77 lakhs were provided for the centrally sponsored schemes. Out of the total provision of centrally sponsored schemes, Rs.30.87 lakhs and Rs.64.90 lakhs were provided for state and local sectors respectively.

4.3 The following table indicates the expenditure incurred on major heads of development under state & local sectors with percentage of expenditure to total expenditure incurred both on state plan schemes and centrally sponsored schemes. In addition to these, a column giving major headwise expenditure during the entire fourth plan period i.e from 1969-70 to 1973-74 has also been provided.

The above table indicates that emphasis is given on schemes under agricultural programme and social services.

4.4 The District level plan schemes are implemented through the implementing officers of state and local sector. Expenditure incurred by the M.S.E.B. has been included under state sector. The Local sector comprises of only Zilla Parishad. Some important schemes are being implemented under Agricultural programme and Social services, etc. with central assistance. Classification of such schemes has been therefore shown separately.

Progress of Minor Heads of developments is narrated in short in the following paragraphs. Schemes under state plan as well as central sector have been taken into account simultaneously.

4.5 Agricultural Programme:- Since nearly 70 percent of the population of Solapur district depends on agriculture, development of agriculture by improving agricultural productivity is therefore vital for economic uplift of the rural population. Agriculture and allied programmes have been therefore given high priority in the programme for 1973-74. Out of the total expenditure of Rs.426.82 lakhs covering state and centrally sponsored schemes, Rs.125.16 lakhs, representing 29.32 percentage to the total expenditure were utilised for agriculture programme. Broad strategy for agricultural programme, as in the past, consisted of continued expansion of irrigation facilities, land reclamation and soil conservation measures such as contour bunding, nala bunding, null training etc.

Since the district is marked predominantly by lower agricultural economy due to backwardness in irrigation facilities and high susceptibilities to the vagaries of the monsoon, while chalking out programme such as Employment Guarantee scheme, scarcity works, regular programme relating to minor irrigation, Soil Conservation etc. emphasis was given on productive works such as percolation tanks, village tanks, contour bunding, nalla bunding, nalla training etc. so that the water available from the meagre rainfall could be utilised for increase in agricultural production to the maximum possible extent. It is ~~so~~ hoped that continued efforts on the line of actions that are being in force now will pave way for wiping out backwardness in agriculture to a large extent in near future.

4.6. The following table shows progress of expenditure, as compared to budget provision made under each minor head of development under Agricultural programme.

From the above table it is observed that against the total budget provision, grants to the extent of 87 percent were utilised under the agricultural programme. The whole budget provision was utilised in respect of forests and warehousing and marketing. Except dairy development and fisheries, the expenditure under all heads of developments is more than 80 percent. The expenditure in respect of dairy development and fisheries is only 60 percent. Progress of schemes implemented under each sub head has been narrated below:-

4.7 Agricultural production including land development:-

Major schemes under this programme were establishment of taluka seed multiplication farm, scheme for small holders and loans under horticultural development.

As against the provision of Rs.1.35 lakhs, an amount of provision Rs.1.732 lakhs was spent for carrying out development works on taluka seed multiplication farms. Under the scheme of small holders, popularly known as 'Page scheme', liberal assistance was provided to small holders for meeting the financial requirements of agricultural and land development operations on their lands. The scheme was in operation in Mehol and Barshi tahsils in this district. The entire provision of Rs.3.75 lakhs made for Page scheme was spent. Against the target of 6 wells, desilting was done in 6 wells. Full targets were achieved in respect of lift irrigation scheme and supply of goat and sheep units by completing 3 lift irrigation schemes and by supplying 275 sheep and goat units. New plantation was done in 62 acres and old fruit trees were rejuvenated in 32 acres of lands against the targets of 375 acres and 138 acres respectively for plantation and rejuvenation of fruit trees. Other achievements in respect of some schemes under this programme are as under:-

4.8 Minor Irrigation:-

Under this head of development, construction works of minor irrigation tanks and percolation tanks were undertaken in state and local sectors respectively.

Subsidy was also granted to cultivators who obtained loan from Land Development Bank for constructions of new irrigation wells and installation of pumping sets on irrigation wells. Against the provision of Rs. 3.57 lakhs for grant of subsidy for construction of irrigation wells and installation of pumping sets, an amount of Rs.1.85 lakhs was granted as subsidy in respect of 316 loans cases. Works of nine minor irrigation tanks were in progress in various tahsils of this district under state sector for which a provision of Rs.17.31 lakhs was made. Against this provision an amount of Rs.13.17 lakhs was spent.Completion of two bundharas, five percolation tanks and four lift irrigation schemes was targted under local sector against which four percolation tanks and four lift irrigation schemes were completed. The expenditure incurred on these works amounts to Rs.38.67 lakhs, against the provision ^{of} to Rs.44.87 lakhs. The programme of construction of minor irrigation and percolation tanks, known as Rural Works Programme in Drought Prone Areas, was also continued during the year under reference with the help of central assistance. Seven works of percolation tanks were in progress and gorge filling of 24 percolation tanks was completed under this programme. An amount of/20 lakhs of-Rs. was spent on above works.

4.9 Soil Conservation:- This programme consists of contour and null bunding, reclamation of saline, alkaline and water logged lands and afforestation for soil conservation. Information in respect of annual targets and achievements under the above programme is as under:-

About 90 percent net cultivated area of this district is without irrigation facilities and as such development of agriculture in this district is largely dependent upon bringing dry lands into cultivation on economic basis. A beginning has been made in this direction by launching a scheme namely, Integrated Dry Land Agricultural Development in Mandrup village since 1969-70 with central assistance. Under this scheme, efforts are being made to popularise new technology in dry farming such as soil management, harvesting of water, new crop varieties and agronomic practices. Against the provision of Rs.9.32 lakhs, an amount of Rs.9.13 lakhs has been spent during 1973-74. The data regarding targets and achievements under this scheme is as under.

4.14 Cooperation:-

Apart from supply of credit Cooperative movement in the district embraces several economic activities such as distribution of inputs, agricultural marketing, agricultural processing, agro-industries, other small and medium size industries, housing, consumers stores etc. At present provision is made under various plan schemes for assistance to different types of cooperative societies such as marketing, farming, consumers' stores labour contract societies etc. by way of share capital contribution, grant of managerial subsidy and assistance for various developmental activities to be undertaken by respective types of cooperative societies. The table below indicates performance of various societies.

Applied Nutrition programme, for which grants were received from state as well as central Govt, was continued in Karmala, Sangole, Pandharpur and Madha Blocks. Ten villages from each blocks mentioned above have been selected for this programme Feeding programme was continued under which diet was served to pre school and school children and expectant and nursing mothers.

Another scheme, namely Composite programme for women and pre- school children for which grants were received from State as well as central Govt. was in operation in 5 blocks. The object of this scheme is to impart education to village women through Mahila Mandal regarding nutrition and demonstration of feeding through Balwadiies. One thousand seven hundred and twenty one demonstrations were held in which training was imparted to 8424 women.

4.16 Irrigation and Power:-

No schemes are being implemented under irrigation at the district level as the major and medium projects which come under the head Irrigation have been classified as Divisional level schemes during the fourth plan. The district levels schomes under the head 'Power' are rural electrification and Normal Development. Three villages were electrified and 66 agricultural pumps were energised.

Achievements under the plan scheme rural electrification do not seem so significant. However, the achievements under the other non plan scheme like R.E.C. crash scheme, etc. are quite impressive

4.17 Industry & Mining:-

There are no plan schemes under implementation in the district so far as the large and medium Industries and mining are concerned. However, schemes relating to small scale industries are being implemented. The major scheme under this sector is 'Development of Handloom industry'. Special attention is being paid to this scheme as a part of the Fifteen point programme with a view to ameliorate the conditions of the weaker section of the community. In spite of competition from the textile mills and powerlooms, the handloom industry continued to meet the large demand of the common people in their daily necessities and provides economic assistance to large community of weavers at Solapur. An amount of Rs.68.36 was provided for implementation of the scheme 'Development of handloom industry'. The whole amount provided in the budget was spent. Physical achievements of the above and the other schemes under small scale industries are as under:-

4.20 The table reveals that 85 percent of the budgeted grants under Social services were utilised. Progress of expenditure in respect of General Education, Welfare of Backward classes and Labour and Labour Welfare is quite satisfactory. The progress in respect of Technical Education and Health and Family planning is also satisfactory . But the performance is very poor i.e less than 50% in case of Housing and Urban Development. Comments on performance of minor heads of development are given below:-

4.21 General Education:-

In all 16 schemes were under implementation in state and Local sectors under this programme. Some of the important schemes were expansion of primary education grants to local bodies for construction of school buildings, educational concessions to economically backward classes students, development & expansion of non Govt. secondary schools, Development of technical high-schools etc. Physical achievements and targets in respect of major schemes under General Education are as under:-

4.24. Water supply & drainage:-

Measures have been taken in Urban as well as rural areas for providing/ improving drinking water facilities. For this purpose, special measures of drinking water supply like piped water supply and simple measures covering drinking water wells, tanks, bore wells, works like deepening and broadening of wells etc. are undertaken.

Works of improvement of Barshi water supply scheme and purification plant at Pandharpur water supply were in progress under Govt. Water supply schemes. The work of water supply schemes at Mangalvedhe was in progress. Budget provision was made for 7 piped water supply schemes under state sector undertaken in rural areas during the year under reference. All these schemes were in progress. Out of the four targeted works of piped water supply undertaken in rural areas under local sector, one work was completed during the year under reference. Similarly against the target of 100 drinking water wells and bore wells each, 45 wells and 87 bore wells were completed as simple measures in rural areas under local sector.

4.25 Housing:- Against the target of 3 villages, two villages were benifitted under the scheme of Extension of village garnthan and provision of housing sites.

4.26 Urban Development:- Financial assistance was given to two municipal councils for implementation of development plans in their areas.

4.27 Welfare of Backward classes:-

The constitution of India has recognised that Scheduled Tribes and Scheduled Castes must be specially looked after by the State. Special provisions are, therefore, ~~included~~^{made} in the plan for the programmes of amelioration and development of backward classes. The programmes included under this sector are supplemental to the general programmes of development under different sectors like agriculture, education, small scale industries, housing etc. Provisions were made for ten schemes under this sector. Important physical achievements under this sector have been described in the table given below.

4.30 Other schemes:-


The plan seeks to launch a direct attack on the problem of wide spread unemployment and under employment prevailing in the rural areas. By taking into account the above problem, Employment Guarantee schemes and crash schemes for Rural Employment have been undertaken in the district. The employment Guarantee scheme constitutes a vital part of 15 point programme.

The object of the scheme is to provide employment in manual work to all adults who need work. An amount of Rs.0.28 lakh was spent under E.G.S. Works like percolation tanks, roads, desilting of tanks/^{which} were in progress under this scheme.. The expenditure under E.G.S. is not significant because such works were financed from the funds kept for scarcity relief measures. After the termination of scarcity programme in the district, the E.G.S. was kept in operation.

The crash scheme for Rural Employment is a centrally sponsored scheme taken up in the relatively backward areas of the district. This scheme was in operation in North Solapur Barshi and Akkalkot tahsils. Eleven road works and one percolation tank were in progress. An amount of Rs.12 lakh was spent during the year under reference.



district from 1966-67 to 1971-72




1973-74



each year)



Consumer price Index numbers for working classes


