CHAPTER No. I:- INTRODUCTION :-1. INTRODUCTION AND LOCATION :-

The agelong famous temple at Tuljapur town of this district enshrines the Goddess " Bhavani", the popular deity of Maharashtra. The cult of Goddess is very ancient one and finds mention even in "Vedas" where she is called " Aditi". The earliest inscriptional evidence regarding its antiquity can not go beyond 1998 A.D. The Goddess was the principal deity of 'Chhatrapati Shivaji', the other 'Chhatrapatis', and ' Preshwas' who donated quite generously to the temple. The village " Thair" in the district is also an ancient place and was known as 'Tagara'. It also finds a mention by Ptolemy in his work "Periplus of Eura-threan sea " 1st Century A.D). Here an ancient Buddhist 'daitya' has been converted in later period in to a Brahmanical shrine by installing the image of "God Vishnu" and is at present known as " Trivikrama" temple. 'Thair' is also the native place of poor saint "Gora Kumbhar". The ' Rashtrakutas' who succeeded 'Chalukyas' of Badami in 753 A.D. have their epithet "LATTALURA PURAVARADHISA" which implies that they were the inhabitants of Latur.

2. BOUNDARIES :-

To the extreme south of Marathwada, Osmanabad district lies between 17° 35' and 18° 40' north latitude and 75° 15' and 76° 40' east longitude. Osmanabad district is bounded by Bhir district on its north, Nanded district and Bidar districts of Mysore State on its east and Ahmednagar and Sholapur districts on its west and part of Sholapur district on the south. Sholapur city is the nearest town and it has therefore close commercial and social ties with it. Barsi taluka in Sholapur district is almost surrounded by Osmanabad district. Nanded and Bhir towns are about

136 miles (217.61 Km.) and 80 miles (128.0 Km.) respectively from Osmanabad town and are directly connected by the Transport bus service.

The Sholapur-Aurangabad road passes through the The Latur-Miraj Railway line and the Parli-Hyderabad (now included in the south central railway zone) also through this district. Latur is the biggest railway station in this district.

3. ADMINISTRATIVE SET UP :-

Osmanabad town is the headquarters of Osmanabad which was named after Meer Osman Ali Khan, the Nizam of Osmanabad State on the occasion of his coronation in 1910. The name of Osmanabad town was "Dharashiv". Naldurg was the headquarters of this district before 1861. This district was included in Ex-Hyderabad State in 1853 and formed its part and part of 1956. After States reorganization in 1956 this district was included in bilingual Bombay State on 1st November 1956 and was included in the Maharashtra State on 1st May 1960. The district formerly consisted of 1) Osmanabad 2) Tuljapur 3) Parli 4) Kalam 5) Latur 6) Aasa and 7) Umerga talukas in the Hyderabad State to which Nilanga, Udgir and Ahmedpur talukas of former Bidar district were added after reorganization. Now of 11 talukas, the district is presently in Aurangabad division generally called as Marathwada comprising five districts 1) Aurangabad 2) Parbhani 3) Nanded 4) Bhir and 5) Osmanabad. All district offices are located in Osmanabad town which is situated on the banks of the river 'Bhogawati'. Yedsing is the nearest railway station about 13 miles away from Osmanabad. Amongst the districts of Marathwada, Osmanabad has the largest area under the Nizam's own crown Estate called 'Sarf-e-

The 'Sarf-e-Khas' was merged with the Government area under the Sarf-e-Khas-merger Regulation Act, in 1949. All Jagir areas were also abolished and taken over under direct government administration in the same year. In the 1951 census, there were 19 towns. As the definition of the town was changed in the 1961 census, only 13 of them were classified as towns. Amongst them included all taluka headquarters and Murum in Umerga taluka and Naldurg in Tuljapur taluka. Latur, Osmanabad and Udgir towns have city municipalities and the rest have town municipalities.

There are in all 1,423 revenue villages in this district of which 12 villages are merged in urban areas and 24 villages are uninhabited.

The Collector is incharge of general administration, law and order, land revenue and civil supplies. He is assisted by Resident Deputy Collector in his office and three Deputy Collectors who hold the charge of the three revenue sub-divisions and have their headquarters at Osmanabad, Latur and Udgir respectively. Tahsildars are incharge of talukas.

#### 4. ZILLA PARISHAD PATTERN :

The Zilla Parishad, Osmanabad came in to existence on 1st May 1962. The Parishad consists of 58 members out of which 52 are elected, three are associated, two are coopted lady members and one is ex-officio member.

The three associated members of the parishad are 1) Chairman, Consumers Co-operative Society, Ltd. Latur, 2) Chairman, District Co-operative Board, Osmanabad and 3) Chairman, District Central Co-operative Bank, Latur. The President, Vice President and three chairmen incharge of different committees are amongst the elected members.

The president is incharge of the Zilla Parishad meetings and standing committees. The vice president is the Chairman of Education and Finance Committees. There are other three Chairmen one of them incharge of public health and works, the other Co-operation and Industries, Agriculture and Animal Husbandry Committees and the third one is incharge of Social Welfare Committee.

For administrative purposes, the Chief Executive Officer is the Head of the Zilla Parishad, The Zilla Parishad consists of 11 branches. The Deputy Chief Executive Officer assists the Chief Executive Officer in the over all administration.

5. AREA :

The area of Osmanabad district is 14,117.0 Sq. Km. according to the figures furnished by the Surveyor General of India as per 1971 census which is 21.88% of the area of Marathwada and 4.59% of the area of Maharashtra State. The rural area of this district is 13,725.8 Sq. Km. and the urban area is about 391.2 Sq. Km. The area reported by the Director of Land Records, Maharashtra State for Osmanabad district is 14,256 Sq. Km. In Marathwada region this district is next to Aurangabad district in size.

In terms of area, Osmanabad district ranks seventh among the 26 districts of Maharashtra State. The average area of a district in Marathwada region works out to 12905.00 Sq.Km. and the average area per district in Maharashtra State is 11837.00 Sq. Km.

6. TOPOGRAPHY :

A major portion of this district is laterite plateau with an average height of 2,000 feet above the sea level. This district is covered with small hills and offshoots of the Balaghat. Parts of Bhum, Ausa, Kalam, Osmanabad and Tuljapur talukas are situated on Balaghat ranges and the rest on table lands.

The district lies partly in the upper Godavari basin and partly in the Bhima basin. Ahmedpur, Udgir, Kalam, Ausa, Latur and Nilanga talukas are situated on the plateau of the Balaghat and lie in the valley of the river Manjra which is an important tributary of the Godavari. Osmanabad and Umerga talukas are drained by the Terna, an important feeder of the Manjra. Barendra and parts of Bhum, Tuljapur and Umerga talukas are in the basin of the Sina

river which is a tributary of the Bhima.

Of all the towns in the district, Bhim commands the highest elevation of 2,500 feet from the sea level where as Parenda has the lowest height of 1,735 feet from the sea level. The average height of the plateau is 2,000 feet above the sea level. The low land portion to the south of the plateau lies in the Bhima basin.

7. Hills, River System and Soils :

The main system of hills is the Balaghat and its offshoots from the north-west corner from Ahmednagar and stretches to the south-east. It divides the district in-to two portions, plateau to the north-east and low lands to the west, south-west and south. The general slope of the plateau is from south-west to north-east.

There are two broad natural zones in the district viz;

1) The Balaghat plateau drained by the Manjra and the Terna rivers and their tributaries and 2) the southern low land plain which is in the Bhima basin. The river Manjra flows on the northern border and demarcates this district from Bhir district. In addition to hill ranges the district abounds in net work of rivulets running from all sides.

The Manjra which rises in Patoda taluka of Bhir district runs towards the east along the northern boundary as far as the north eastern corner of Latur taluka where it takes a southerly direction before entering Bidar district of Mysore State. Its length in the district is about 65 miles.

The Terna flows from west to east in Osmanabad, Ausa, Umerga and Nilanga talukas and meets the Manjra river near the eastern boundary of the district. The Manyad is also a tributary of the Manjra. It flows towards the north-east through Ahmedpur taluka

and enters Nanded district to meet the Manjra on the eastern boundary of the district. The Tawarja which drains Latur taluka joins the Manjra at Siwani village. On the western border of Parenda taluka the Sina flows from the north to the south. The Bori flows through Tuljapur taluka and joins the Sina river lower down in Sholapur district. Even though there are a number of small rivers and rivulets streaming in the district like the Bori in Tuljapur taluka or the Manyad in Ahmedpur taluka or the Bennitura in Umerga taluka or the Banganga in Bhum taluka they remain practically dry for most part of the year as the water from them is drained out of this district from the high plateau resulting into considerable shortage of water in the district.

The soil can be divided into three zones viz; 1) The eastern part consisting of Ahmedpur, Udgir and parts of Latur and Ausa talukas 2) Osmanabad, Kalam talukas and parts of Latur, Ausa and Umerga talukas 3) Tuljapur, Parenda and Bhum talukas.

The first zone consists in general of light and light medium soil. It is of inferior type, not retentive of moisture and is therefore, suitable only for the cultivation of Kharif crops. The soil in some parts of Nilanga taluka is of laterite type.

The second zone consists of heavy soil which is more retentive of moisture. Hence rabi crops are the major crops in this area.

The mountainous ranges in this zone have formed typical strips suitable for paddy cultivation. This is a peculiarity of this zone. Even though the types of soil are classified above on a broad basis, varieties in soil, however, are found within the talukas and more within the zones categorised above.

The forests dotted all over the district are some what dense in Tuljapur, Kalam and Udgir talukas. They occupy too little a portion of the total area in this district which has definitely resulted in soil erosion to a large extent .

8. CLIMATE, TEMPERATURE AND RAINFALL.

As the district forms part of the Deccan plateau, its climate is dry and is subject to extremes. The year can be divided in to rainy season from middle of June to the end of September, a sultry period from about the end of September to the middle of November, winter from the middle of November to the end of January, dry period during February and March and summer during April, May and the middle of June. Summer is in general full of gales and gusty winds. Even though the variations in temperature are large in general and the weather is subject to extremes of heat and cold, the summer season in the district is more cooler than in any other districts of Marathwada region being at a higher altitude. In general the climate of Osmanabad district is considered to be bracing and salubrious.

Osmanabad district gets rains from the south-east monsoon like other districts of Deccan plateau and the rains start in the middle of June, become intense in July and cease by the end of September. The normal rainfall of Osmanabad district is about 31" (787 mm.). Tuljapur and Osmanabad talukas on the west usually get about 1,123 mm. or 45" of rainfall. AUSA, Umerga and Nilanga talukas usually get 1,016 mm. to 1,346 mm. or 40" to 53" of rainfall. While Parenda and Bhum talukas get near about 762 mm. to 888 mm. or 30" to 35" of rainfall. This part comes in the shadow of western Ghat and is therefore, called " rain shadow area. Because of the low rainfall in Parenda and Bhum talukas, there

is always a fear of scarcity and shortage of water. It may be noted that this area being adjacent to Ahmednagar district, is frequently hit by scarcity. These talukas as compared to the other talukas in Osmanabad district are backward. The northern part of Ahmedpur taluka is also some times affected by scarcity of water. But in general, Osmanabad district is not considered as scarcity area.

Recently Government of Maharashtra had appointed a Committee under the Chairmanship of Shri Suktankar the then Secretary to Government of Maharashtra, Agriculture and Cooperation Department to look into the problem/scarcity and identify areas which are more prone to scarcity. Accordingly after deep study of the problem the committee has identified the following areas as drought prone, 1) Parenda 2) Bhum, 3) Parts of Kalam, Osmanabad, Tuljapur, and Ahmedpur talukas.

C H A P T E R No. II

EXPLANATORY NOTES ON SCOPE AND LIMITATION ON STATISTICS  
PRESENTED IN THE DISTRICT STATISTICAL ABSTRACT.

PURPOSE :-

This is the 12th issue of the District Statistical Abstract since its first publication in the year 1958-59, In this publication every attempt is made to include exhaustive statistics about important socio-economic indicators of the economy. The talukawise data is furnished wherever possible so as to enable the reader to have a clear picture of the achievements in various fields in different talukas of the district. The data presented in most of the tables pertains to the year of 1973-74. In case of few tables where the data for the year of publication is not available the data for the latest available year is furnished.

The Statistical material presented here is mainly collected from various departments of the State Government as well as Central Government Offices, local bodies and other agencies. The footnotes given at the end of each table indicate the source from which the data is collected.

DISTRICT AT A GLANCE :-

In this statement some broad and important particulars about the district in comparison with Maharashtra State level figures are presented under various heads like population, agriculture, co-operation, medical and public health, education etc; which bring forth salient features of the district. The reference periods for the figures concerning this district and

the state are mentioned against each item, as in many cases this period is not identical. The scope and limitations of the information in this Abstract is also discussed in the following paragraphs.

I. AREA AND POPULATION :

In this section seven tables (table Nos. from 1 to 7) are included. The table No.1 gives figures of area, rural and urban population, number of houses and households, density of population of different talukas of the district as per 1971 Census. The table No.2 gives talukwise figures of decadal variations in population since the 1951 Census. The talukwise classifications of villages and towns according to population ranges as per the 1971 Census in Osmanabad district is indicated in table Nos. 3 and 4. The table No.5 presents the talukwise figures of number of workers according to livelihood classes. The table No.6 (a) and 6(b) give population of the district as per the 1971 Census according to age groups and religion. The table No.7 indicates talukwise scheduled castes and scheduled tribes population of the district according to the 1971 Census.

II. CLIMATE AND RAINFALL :-

The table No. 8 gives monthwise information regarding rainy days and actual rainfall recorded at various tahsil head quarters in this district. Normal rainfall recorded at each tahsil place is the average rainfall relating to that place over a long period.

The table No. 9 gives the temperature data for the selected centres. However there are no centres selected for this purpose in the district and hence data for this table are not available.



### III. AGRICULTURE :

The tables from No. 10 to 21 are on agriculture and give information about land utilization, area under different crops, area irrigated under different crops and by different sources, production and yield rates of principal crops, minor irrigation works, major and medium irrigation projects, agricultural wage rates etc. The data regarding famine, scarcity and agricultural implements is also given.

The table No. 10 gives utilization of land according to standard heads of utilization for the year 1971-72 and 1972-73. The table No. 11 indicates area under different crops while the table No. 12 gives the figures of out-turn and average yield rates of principal crops per hectare for the district. The table No. 13 represents the distribution of net irrigated area by source of irrigation. The table No. 14 indicates the area irrigated under different crops. The table No. 15 gives the number of irrigation wells in use and not in use in each taluka. The table No. 16 deals with minor irrigation works while the table No. 17 gives the data of major and medium irrigation projects. The table No. 18 gives the information regarding agricultural wage rates for skilled and unskilled labourers collected from three different rural centres. The table No. 19 provides the data regarding agricultural implements in each taluka as per the 1972 Livestock Census. The famine and scarcity data are shown in the tables numbering 20 and 21.

### IV. ANIMAL HUSBANDRY :-

The table No. 22 presents talukawise data relating to livestock population as enumerated at the time of quinquennial livestock census of 1972, while the table No. 23 deals with

the veterinary facilities available in each taluka of the district such as number of veterinary hospitals, dispensaries, aid centres etc. The table No. 24 shows the disease-wise livestock mortality in Osmanabad district. The table No. 25 gives details of the information of the recognised slaughter houses and number of animals slaughtered in them during the period under reference.

V. FOREST :-

The tables numbering 26(A) and 26(B) included in this section give details of area under forests and estimates of different forest products.

VI. INDUSTRIES AND EMPLOYMENT :-

The factory statistics is presented in the table Nos. 27, 28 and 29 which cover the following types of factories registered under Factories Act, 1948.

1. Those factories using power and employing 10 or more workers ;
2. Those factories not using power but employing 20 or more workers;
3. Those factories not covered by (1) and (2) above but notified by Government as covered by the factories act, 1948.

The table No. 27 presents industrywise total number of factories, the number of mandays for which they were working during the year and the average daily employment classified by adults, adolescents and children. The data presented in columns 6 to 7 of this table relate only to the factories submitting returns. The table No. 28 presents industrywise distribution of working factories according to working strength while the table No. 29 gives distribution of factories according to number of days worked. It may be noted here

that the number of workers shown in these tables are the average number of workers working daily throughout the year and not the total number of workers on the register of factories. The table No. 30 deals with the Annual survey of Industries. The table No. 31 gives the registration of the candidates, vacancies notified and number of candidates placed as per employment exchange. In the table No. 32 occupational distribution of total registration and placement of employment exchange is detailed out. The table No. 33 indicates the volume of employment in different industries.

VII. ELECTRICITY :

The tables numbering 34 and 35 presents the data regarding electricity. The generation and consumption of electricity as well as the number of towns and villages covered under the electrification programme are indicated in the above two tables.

VIII. CO-OPERATION :

In all there are eight tables included in this section under which statistics relating to various activities of Co-operative movement in the district is shown. The table No. 36 presents different types of co-operative societies functioning in Osmanabad district. The table No. 37 gives the figures in respect of branches of co-operative banks, while the table No. 38 deals with the taluka wise primary agricultural credit societies. The table No. 39 gives the data regarding other co-operative societies of different types. The table No. 40 indicates the operation of Central and Primary Co-operative marketing societies in each taluka. The table No. 41 deals with the operation of different co-operative societies.

The table No.42 indicates the operation of regulated markets. The table No. 43 shows the numbers of registered money lenders in different talukas of this district and loans advanced by them to traders and non-traders.

IX. MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH :

In this section five tables are included. The table No. 44 deals with the medical facilities available through public aided bodies in each taluka. The tables numbering 45 and 46 present the information about vital statistics. The table No. 47 deals with the vaccination statistics and Cholera inoculation, while the table No. 48 presents the number of family planning centres functioning in each taluka and the number of sterilization operations done and number of I.U.C.D. insertions performed.

X. EDUCATION :

In this section seven tables are included. The table No. 49 indicates literacy in each taluka of Osmanabad district according to the 1971 Census. The percentage of literate has been shown separately, sexwise as well as for rural and urban areas. The number of institutions according to types, enrolment and the teachers employed in them is presented in the table No. 52. The table No. 53 deals with students of different categories in Osmanabad district. The table No.54 indicates the number of students getting benefits of concession under the scheme of concession of free education to economically backward class students. The table No. 55 indicates the expenditure incurred on primary education by way of grants.

## XI. TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION :

In this section the statistics relating to various modes of transport is given. The table No. 56 presents the total length of railway route in the district according to different types of rail gauges. The surfacewise and categorywise road length is given in table No. 57. This table also includes roads constructed by different agencies such as Municipal Councils, Zilla Parishad and the Buildings and Communications Department. The table No. 58 gives statistics regarding the number of motor vehicles in operation.

The table No.59 gives operational statistics of the nationalised road transport according to S.T. Divisions viz; Aurangabad and Nanded. The table No.60 gives the traffic census on important roads in Osmanabad district as on May 1972. The table No.61 presents the postal, telegraphs and telephone statistics since 1961-62 to 1973-74. The table No.62 gives the statistics regarding rural broadcasting in Osmanabad district

## XII. LOCAL BODIES : <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>

The statistics about local bodies such as Village Panchayats, Municipalities and Zilla Parishad is presented in this section. The table No.63 deals with income and expenditure of local bodies viz; village panchayats, zilla parishad and municipalities while the table No.64 shows panchayat samiti-wise income and expenditure.

Similarly the headwise receipts and expenditure of zilla Parishad is indicated in the tables numbering 65(A) and 65(C) while in table No.65(B) extent of government grants given to zilla parishad is shown. The table No.66 deals with income and expenditure of municipal councils in the district.

XIII. PLAN AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT :

In this section five tables are included. The tables numbering 67 and 68 give plan expenditure under different heads of development and important physical achievements during 1973-74. The table No.69 gives particulars of community development programme implemented in the district. In the table No. 70 expenditure incurred in different development bloks is shown, where as physical achievements of some selected items that have been achieved in each and every development block are detailed out in the table No.71.

XIV. PRICES :

The table No.72 deals with monthly wholesale prices of certain agricultural commodities at regulated markets. The table No.73 deals with monthly average retail prices of important commodities collected from the district headquarters for the year 1973. In the table No.74 price index for the working classes is shown for Aurangabad and Nanded centres. The consumer price index number for the working classes is based on the price level of 1961.

XV. JUDICIAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE :

The statistics pertaining to police department and judicial courts is presented in this section. The table No. 75 gives statistical data about strength of police force, while the table No.76 gives crime statistics of this district for the calender year under review. The table No.77 deals with the work disposed of in civil and criminal courts.

XVI. MISCELLANEOUS :

This section includes nine tables. In these tables statistical information on various items like cinema, banking



offices, jointstock banks, insurance, small savings, land revenue, printing presses etc. is presented.

The table No.78 deals with the cinema statistics, while the tables numbering 79 and 80 give the data regarding banking offices and jointstock banks respectively. The table No.81 gives the number of insurance policies issued and amount insured, while the table No.82 deals with the collection of small savings. The table No.83 presents the land revenue collection. The data regarding number of printing presses, news papers and periodicals published is given in table No.84. INDICATOR NO. 1 :- Percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown

This indicator reflects the extent of double cropping in the district. In the table placed below the net cropped area, double cropped area and the percentage of the latter to the former are given.

It is seen from the figures given for different years that the percentage of double cropped area to the net area sown has shown slight change over a period of twelve years. In the year 1961-62 th percentage was 104.04 while in 1972-73 it was 108.08. Inadequate irrigational facilities had been the root cause of such a low proportion of double cropping. The extent of double cropping in Udgir taluka was the highest where as Bhu Parenda, Tuljapur and Osmanabad talukas accounted for very meagre area under double cropping.

With the exception of sugarcane the production of almost all crops given in the table showed a remarkable decrease over a period of a decade starting from 1961-62. The decrease in the production of different crops could be attributed to scanty and untimely rains for the last 4 to 5 years. Consequently

On examining the figures of value of important agricultural produce, it is seen that it had been increased during the year 1972-73 as compared to the figures of 1961-62 except rice. This had been so despite deep fall in the production of all the crops except gur and sesamum. This anomalous situation of increased value with decreased production was the direct result of continuous rise in the prices of all agricultural commodities shot up spirally during the period under reference because of prevalent scarcity conditions.

INDICATOR NO. 4 :- Percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area.

The percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area gives an idea as to how much area has been irrigated more than once during the year under reference.

In the table given below statistics of net irrigated area and gross irrigated area are displayed alongwith the percentage of latter to the former.

The extent of irrigating the area more than once decreased considerably. This can be seen from the figures given in the aforementioned table. The percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area was 113.33 in 1961-62, 112.96 in 1965.66 while it fell considerably to 104.76 in 1972-73. This can be attributed to the fact that during last three to four years rains had not at all been sufficient with the result that the storage of water had been depleted to a very great extent.

INDICATOR NO. 5 :- Change in the cropping pattern.

With the exception of few changes in the percentages, the food crops still enjoy dominant position. The percentage area of food crops to gross cropped area which was 73.36 in 1961-62, decreased to 71.93 in 1965-66 and which again however showed increasing trend in 1972-73. The acute countrywide food shortages prevailing then due to scarcity conditions compelled the cultivators to utilise the area normally meant for commercial crops for growing food crops. Hence the increase in the percentage of food crops to 75.38 in 1972-73. This can be ascertained from the simultaneous decrease in the percentage of non-food crops from 28.07 in 1965-66 to 24.62 in 1972-73. The table given below shows area under food and non-food crops, their respective percentages to the gross cropped area and percentages of area irrigated under food and non-food crops to the gross irrigated area. The percentage of total irrigated food crops to the gross irrigated area showed decrease from 96.73 % in 1961-62 to 89.83 in 1972-73

INDICATOR NO.6 :- Increase in agricultural credit, outstanding dues and gross value of agricultural produce.

During all these years of planned economic development agriculture had been the recipient of maximum financial aid from the Government. This is true not only in case of financial grants for an over all development of agricultural industry as a whole but individual credit facilities to farmers were also granted through co-operative agencies. This had all been to finance intensive and progressive methods of cultivation being adopted by agriculturists. Consequently loans advanced, dues outstanding increased to a very great extent in recent years. The value of agricultural produce also increased enormously. This had been due to spiral rise in prices.

In the table given below statistics regarding agricultural credit and dues outstanding is presented.

It is seen that the amount of agricultural credit increased nearly more than three times in 1973-74. than what it was in 1961-62. The dues outstanding also increased by nearly eleven times in 1973-74 over the corresponding figures of 1961-62

INDICATOR NO. 7 :- Agricultural Wage rates.

This indicator spots light on the earnings of agricultural labourers especially in rural areas. The wages for skilled and unskilled workers are collected from three rural centres viz; Kingaon in Ahmedpur taluka, Killari in AUSA taluka and Murud in Latur taluka. In the table placed below actual wages that were paid to the skilled and unskilled labourers at the aforementioned three centres are given.

From the aforementioned table it is seen that the wages at Murud centre were comparatively higher for both skilled and unskilled workers. The wage rates of carpenters were slightly increased at Kingaon centre during 1973 as compared to the figures of 1972. The wage rates of carpenters at Killari centre also showed a similar increase. The wage rates of blacksmiths were found to be



increased at all the three centres. The wage rates of cobbler also indicated increase at Kingaon and Killari centres. The wage rates of male unskilled labour were found to be decreased at Kingaon Killari and Murud centres. The wage rates of female unskilled labour were found to be increased at all the three centres. The wage rates of other agricultural male and female labourers were increased at Kingaon and Killari centres where as no change was recorded at Murud centre. The wage rates of herdsmen were increased at Killari centre during 1973 where as decreasing trend could be noticed at Murud centre. At kingaon centre no change was recorded in the wages of herdsmen during 1973.

INDICATOR NO. 8 :- Livestock per hectare of cultivable area .

Livestock plays a very important role in Indian <sup>agriculture</sup> in the absence of mechanised methods of cultivation. Osmanabad district has already established its name in the field of livestock. Of the three breeds of cattle viz; "Deoni" " Red Khandari and Khillari" in Osmanabad district, Deoni breed hails from Udgir and Ahmedpur talukas of this district, " Khillari" breed is mainly found in Pare-nda, Umerga and Tuljapur talukas of the district and " Red Khandari" in border areas of the district adjoining Nanded district.

Among buffaloes Pandharpur and local breeds are found in the district. The table below gives livestock (Bovine and Ovine) per hectare of the cultivable area in Osmanabad district during the years 1961-62, 1965-66 and 1972.73.

It is seen from the above table that livestock per hectare of cultivable area decreased in all the talukas except Ahmedpur during 1972. Livestock per hectare of cultivable area is more in Udgir, Ahmedpur and Nilanga talukas as compared to other talukas in the district. The ratio is low in Parenda and Tuljapur talukas being 0.72 and 0.76 respectively.

INDICATOR NO. 9 :- Poultry as compared to Population .

Poultry provides nutritive food to population as also additional income to agriculturists. The table below gives poultry per 1000 persons according to 1961, 1966 and 1972 Livestock Census.

Poultry per thousand persons decreased from 186 in 1961 to 117 in 1972, resulting in a decrease of 37 % in the district percentage. As compared to the figures of 1966 Census it is observed that poultry per thousand persons increased from 102 in 1966 to 117 in 1972. During 1972 number of poultry per 1000 person was found more (i.e. 200 or more ) in Tuljapur, Parenda and Bhum talukas as compared to other talukas in the district. The ratio was less than 100 in Latur, Ahmedpur, Udgir, Nilanga & Ausa Talukas.

INDICATOR NO. 10 :- Per Capita Consumption of Electricity

Per capita consumption of electricity is a good reflector of economic activity as well as standards of living. The consumption of electricity in the district is increasing at a faster rate since 1965-66.

The per capita consumption which was at 0.65 Kwh in 1961-62 increased to 3.23 Kwh in 1965-66 and to 16.26<sup>Kwh</sup>/in 1973-74. The increase in the consumption of power is mainly attributed to rural electrification programme for energising irrigation pumps and to increase in industrial power consumption.

The table below shows purposewise consumption of electricity in the district in the years 1961-62, 1965-66 and 1973-74.

The number of candidates enrolled had been on the increase since 1961-62. From 4,845 in 1961-62 it increased to 11,214 in 1973-74 showing an increase of 131.46%. As against this, vacancies notified were on the decrease since 1961-62. As many as 1300 vacancies were notified in 1961-62 where as during 1973-74 only 1187 vacancies were notified which showed a decrease of 8.69% over 1961-62.

INDICATOR NO. 12.:- Increase in the indoor and outdoor patients in hospitals, dispensaries and primary health centres.

There are three hospitals in the district of which one is located at Osmanabad and the other two at Latur. One hospital at Latur is equipped with pathological laboratory and radiology unit. Further there are 32 dispensaries ~~xxx~~ of all kinds located at other & rural urban/centres and as many as 15 public health centres in rural areas of the district.

During 1973 the number of indoor patients treated increased to 85,406 in comparison to 8617 in the year 1961. Similar-rise in the number of outdoor patients treated could be seen from 5,40,386 in 1961 to 13,32,629 during 1973.

The number of beds per lakh of population which fell from 21 in 1961 in 1965 had shown an increase to 23 during 1973 per lakh of population

INDICATOR NO. 13 :- Increase in the number of students in different categories ( boys and girls separately)

With the provision of free education up to primary level and grant of concessions, scholarships etc. to eligible students in the secondary and higher education, the number of students both boys and girls recorded remarkable increase in recent years. The number of teachers and institutions also recorded simultaneous increase obviously due to increase in number of students. This can be seen from the following table.

In the primary section, the number of institutions, boys and girls recorded 32.09%, 47.67% and 131.17% increase respectively over and above the corresponding figures for the year 1961-62. In the field of secondary and higher education, the increase is indeed remarkable. The glaring fact noticed is that there had

been tremendous increase in the number of girls as compared to boys in the primary and secondary section. In the higher education the number of boys increased enormously by as many as more than seventeen times over the corresponding figure of 1961-62. The number of girls also enormously increased by as many as more than sixteen times over the corresponding figure of 1961-62.

INDICATOR NO. 14 :- Increase in the road mileage per 100 square kilometre

Acute scarcity conditions prevailed in the district for the last four years with the result that Government started number of scarcity road works through different executive agencies. Consequently, the road mileage increased from 523.99 Km. in 1961-62 to 3,788.25 Km. in 1973-74. As a result the percentage of road mileage to total mileage (including both roads as well as railways) increased from 88.73% in 1961-62 to 96.98% in 1973-74.

INDICATOR NO. 15 :- Increase in Banking facilities in proportion to population

Banking facilities play an significant role in a developing economy. The co-operative banks succeeded to meet out the needs of rural credit to a great extent by the establishment of number of branches in rural areas. However the number of branches opened so far were found to be inadequate to the ever expanding credit needs.

The proportion of banks per lakh of population worked out to 4.85 during 1972-73. ~~More~~ More population was served by the bank since 1961-62 because of the opening of additional branches of different banks in the district. By 1973 there were as many as 92 branches of different banks in the district with the result that the population served by each branch came down from 86,920 in 1961-62 <sup>to</sup> 20616 in 1972-73.

INDICATOR NO. 16 :- Prices

Prices of different commodities assume pivotal importance in developing economy. In the year 1973-74, the scarcity and drought conditions prevailed in the district for the fifth year in succession. The scarcity of essential goods of daily consumption which was prevalent due to drought conditions in earlier years became more acute. Consequently prices of all commodities shot up spirally. From the table placed below it is seen that during the year under report the prices of all commodities except supari recorded considerable increase.

C H A P T E R   N O .   I V

P L A N N I N G

The year 1973-74 is the fifth year of Fourth Five Year Plan. As usual the Annual Plan for 1973-74 was implemented in Osmanabad district also.

The expenditure incurred on different plan schemes implemented in the district and the physical targets achieved under different schemes are summarised in the following paragraphs. The Annual Plan 1973-74 consisted of schemes implemented through state and local sector agencies and also of the schemes which were sponsored by the Central Government. The amount of Rs. 378.35 lakhs was incurred as against the budget provision of Rs. 314.04 lakhs during the Annual Plan 1973-74. This expenditure showed an increase of about 1.90% over and above the expenditure in the Annual Plan 1972-73.

In the table placed below the expenditure incurred on different major heads of development is given with clear demarcation of expenditure between state and local sectors.

" Social services" received the highest priority . This could be seen from the fact that of the total amount of budget provision of Rs. 314.04 lakhs for the Annual Plan 1973-74 as a whole, the amount set aside for the above head was of the order of Rs. 152.43 lakhs. It almost amounts to 48.54 % of the total budget provision. The percentage of expenditure of social services to the total plan expenditure was Rs. 52.37 lakhs. An amount of Rs. 198.15 lakhs was spent on this head as against the budget provision of Rs. 152.43 lakhs.

Next in order was " Agricultural Programme " on which an amount of Rs. 153.03 lakhs was spent as against the budget provision of Rs. 128.45 lakhs. The expenditure incurred on the head " Co-operation and Community Development " was to the tune of Rs. 16.59 lakhs, the budget provision of which was Rs. 19.75 lakhs. " Industry and Mining", accounted for an expenditure of Rs. 2.05 lakhs as against a provision of Rs. 2.00 lakhs. Amongst different heads of development a sizeable amount of expenditure had been incurred on " Transport & Communications" next to the head " Co-operation & Community Development". The respective percentage of expenditure on " Co-operation and Community Development", " Transport and Communications", and " Industry and Mining" were 4.38, 2.19 and 0.54 respectively to the total Annual Plan expenditure for the period 1973-74.

#### AGRICULTURAL PROGRAMMES :

The expenditure incurred and the physical targets achieved under different sub-heads of the major head "Agricultural Programmes" during the Annual Plan period of 1973-74 are given below briefly.

AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTION :

An amount of Rs. 10.06 lakhs was provided in the budget as against which Rs. 9.45 lakhs were spent. The percentage of expenditure on agricultural production to the total expenditure under the major head " Agricultural Programme " was Rs. 6.17 lakhs and to the total plan expenditure was Rs. 2.50 lakhs.

The physical achievements under this sub-head are as under. Town compost to the tune of 17,400 tonnes was prepared. Under the plant protection scheme field treatment and seed treatment measures were undertaken in an area of 53,000 and 2,82,322 acres respectively. Intensive cultivation of food crops was undertaken in 1,57,327 acres in 'Kharif' season and in 1,41,094 acres in ' Rabi' season.

SOIL CONSERVATION :

The soil conservation programme which was initially taken up in the three five year plan period and continued further was also included in the Annual Plan 1973-74. The budget allocations were of the order of Rs. 34.63 lakhs while the expenditure was Rs. 41.06 lakhs. As much as 83,070 hectares of land was contour banded and 38 hectares of area was reclaimed.

MINOR IRRIGATION :

A budget provision of Rs. 81.70 lakhs was earmarked for minor irrigation works both in the state and local sector. The total expenditure amounted to Rs. 100.41 lakhs. Under this sub-head, subsidy to as many as 216 wells, 415 pumping sets was given . There were 11 tanks constructed in the local sector which created an irrigation potential of 1032 hectares. In the state sector too an irrigation potential to the extent of 3,519 hectares was created.

ANIMAL HUSBANDRY :

Under this sub-head Rs. 23,000 were earmarked in the budget. The total expenditure, however, amounted to Rs. 25,000 which was incurred mainly on the staff engaged in the development activity.

AYACUT DEVELOPMENT :

No budget allocations were provided under this sub-head in the Annual Plan 1973-74.

DAIRY DEVELOPMENT :-

An amount of Rs. 1.13 lakhs was spent on dairy development activities as against the budget provision of Rs. 1.14 lakhs. As many as 93 new and 13 existing dairy co-operative societies were aided by giving subsidy. The average collection of milk per day during the period under reference was 1,476 litres.

FORESTS :

An amount of Rs. 13,800 was spent during 1973-74 for the development of forest in the district. Afforestation for soil conservation was done in 20 hectares. Under the scheme of rural extension forestry an area of 15 hectares was brought under afforestation.

FISHERIES :

An amount of Rs. 57,800 was spent during 1973-74 for the development of fisheries in the district. Fish seedlings to the extent of 13,38,000 were stocked in the impounded waters. Fish collection, during the period of 1973-74 was 1,31,099 Kg.

WARE HOUSING AND MARKETING:

During the year 1973-74 in Osmanabad district as many as Rs. 2,500 were spent for the development of ware housing and marketing. Six market committees were given subsidy for their initial expenses.

CO-OPERATION AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT :Co-operation :-

Under this sub-head Rs. 5.00 lakhs were spent during 1973-74 as against the budget provision of Rs. 5.10 lakhs for strengthening co-operative structure in the district. Short term operations and medium term operations loans to the extent of Rs. 3.56 crores were granted to the Central Financing agency. Long term operations loan of Rs. 1.01 crores was also granted. During 1973-74, three labour contract societies were assisted with share capital contribution, managerial subsidy. Two societies were given financial assistance for the purchase of tools and equipment.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT :

Under this sub-head Rs. 11.59 lakhs were spent. Much of this expenditure was incurred for the continuance of C.D. blocks already functioning.

INDUSTRY AND MINING.

One sugar factory has already been established at Dhoki in Osmanabad taluka. Another sugar factory located at Killari in Ausa taluka which went in to production during the year 1972-73 is functioning with full swing during the year 1973-74. Number of saw mills, processing mills such as ginning, dal mills, rice mills, oil mills are already in existence and there is still a large scope for the establishment of more units in the district. Besides, there is also scope for other types of small scale industries.

During 1973-74 the amount of expenditure incurred under this sub-head was Rs. 2.05 lakhs as against the budget provision of Rs. 2.01 lakhs. During the year 1973-74, eleven balutedar multipurpose societies were assisted with share capital.

TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS :

An amount of Rs. 10.93 lakhs was earmarked in the budget for this sub-head during 1973-74. The actual expenditure amounted to Rs. 8.28 lakhs. During 1973-74 district roads to the extent of 4 Km. were constructed. Roads of the length of 5 Km were also constructed under public participation scheme.

SOCIAL SERVICES :General Education :-

Under this sub-head as many as 142.25 lakhs were spent during 1973-74 as against the budget provision of Rs. 95.19 lakhs. The expenditure exceeded the budget provision. Under the scheme of expansion of primary education, appointments of 1,101 teachers were made. As many as 11 non-government secondary schools were given aid for their development and expansion. As many as 418 additional teachers were appointed in the secondary schools. Under the scheme of upgradation of primary cum middle high schools in to fullfledged high schools two schools were upgraded with the result that 2 head masters, 4 special teachers, 2 clerks and 4 peons were appointed. Financial grants were given to local bodies for the construction of secondary school buildings with the help of which 1 school building was constructed. Scholarship was awarded to 120 students from secondary schools.

TECHNICAL EDUCATION :

Under this sub-head an expenditure of Rs. 1.65 lakhs was incurred as against the budget provision of Rs. 1.94 lakhs.

PUBLIC HEALTH :

The total expenditure under this sub-head amounted to Rs. 1.13 lakhs . Two centrally sponsored schemes viz; "National Malaria eradication programme" and "Family Planning" were implemented in the district on which an expenditure of Rs.24.19 lakhs was incurred.

.....

The eradication of malaria disease was achieved in Osmanabad, Bhim, Paranda, Latur, Kalam, AUSA, Nerga and Nilanga talukas. Under the national programme of family planning 3,076 cases of sterilization were made. In addition 76 cases of IntraUterin Contraceptive Device were also done.

WATER SUPPLY :

Under this sub-head, an amount of Rs. 51.29 lakhs was spent during 1973-74; Under the rural water supply schemes as many as 133 drinking water wells were constructed during 1973-74.

URBAN DEVELOPMENT :

The total expenditure under this sub-head was reported as nil during 1973-74.

HOUSING :

An amount of Rs. 65,700 was spent on this sub-head under the scheme of settlement of nomadic tribes an area of one acre was acquired in one village.

WELFARE OF BACKWARD CLASSES :

The total expenditure incurred under this sub-head amounted to Rs. 52,000. As many as 289 students of scheduled castes, scheduled tribes and other backward classes were granted scholarship, tuition fees, examination fees etc. Financial grants were also given to six backward class hostels. Loan and subsidy was given to scheduled caste, scheduled tribe and other backward class persons for the construction of four new wells, Under the centrally sponsored scheme of exemption from tuition fees and award of scholarship to "Vimukta Jatis" 68 students took the benefit. Three labour contract societies of vimukta jatis were given financial assistance.

INFORMATION AND PUBLICITY

Under the major head of expenditure an amount of Rs. 25,000 was spent on the installation of community listening sets. In all 7 such sets were installed during 1973-74
