GENERAL FEATURES:-

East Khandesh District abuts on the Beccan Table land between 20°-15' & 22°-7 north latitude and 75° & 76°-28 east longitude approximately. It has an area of about 4467.3 sq. miles and a total population of 14,71,351 persons according to the 1951 census of population.

It is bounded on the North by the Madhya Bharat State, on the East by Buldhana District & Nemar District of the Madhya Pradesh, on the South by the Aurangabad District & on the West by the Districts of West Khandesh and Nasik. The extreme length of the district from North to South is 81 miles & breadth from East to West is 96 miles.

HILLS AND RIVERS:-

Geographically the East Khandesh District can be divided into three zones as under:-

- (1) The Satpura range in the North.
- (2) The Satmala or Ajantha hills in the South.
- (3) The plain country in between the above two hilly regions.

The Northern portions of the three Talukas of Raver Chopda & Yawal are hilly & thinly populated as these are mostly covered by dense forests. The southern & western portions of the district are also hilly, but these hills are neither so high nor so continuous as compared with the Hills on the North.

The plain country is sloping from East to West & is divided in two parts by the River Tapi which flows from East to West & meets Arabian Sea near Surat. The other important river in the district is the Girna river which takes its source in Sahyadri hills in Nasik Dist. flows from West to East in the Southern part of the plain, takes a right angle turn near about Jalgaon & meets the Tapi. Other important tributary rivers are the Titur & the Waghur.

On either side of the Tapi runs an unbroken plain of the deep black cotton soil. The Tapi Valley on the North is well--wooded & on the South, except in Bhusawal Taluka, covered with Mango groves. The Girna Valley is fringed by poor red soil & tracts of waste, with rugged stony land. However, the soil immediately near the bank of the river is somewhat better though it stands no comparison to the soil in the Tapi Valley.

There are also hills ' Shirsolı ' in Erandol Taluka & Ghodasgaon in Bhusawal Taluka. The river Purna takes its source in Berar & meets the Tapi in Bhusawal Taluka. There are also some small rivers namely, the Bori, the Panzara, the Suki, the Mori, the Hadkari, the Ratnavati, but these are not very useful.

Soil

On the whole the District can be classified into three major tracts from the point of view of soil.

(1) The northern tract beyond the Tapi river & comprising of Raver, Yawal & Chopda Talukas.

(2) The Central tract consisting of Amalner, Parola Erandol, Jalgaon, Bhusawal & Edlabad Peta,

(3) The Southern tracts consisting of Jamner, Chalisgaon, Pachora & Bhadgaon Peta.

The northern tract mostly consists of rich black cotton soil except for a small strip of light soil along the foot of Satpuras. In the central tract there are three main varieties of the soil:- Deep Black, Red & Brown. The deep black soil is most Fertile & yields rich crops. The lighter red soil, though not so fertile, is sufficiently good for raising cash crops such as cotton & groundnut. The general quality of soil in the southern tract is, however, inferior to that of the central or northern tracts. The reddish brown soil in Pachora Taluka & Bhadgaon Peta is best suited for Jawar, cotton Groundnut crops, while the soil of Chalisgaon Taluka

is capable of growing heavy crops with the help of adequate water supply.

Climate :-

The average rainfall in the district is about 30" & falls within a span of about four months in the monsoons. Extreme climate conditions are experienced in the district with a very cold winter & a very hot summer when the temperature generally shoots to 49 c. (ie. about 126 F.) The climate tends to be material after the Monsoon rains, especially in the villages adjoining the Sathuras.

R A I N F A L L :-

In this district the rainfall is scarsly and is uneven in distribution. Certain areas of the district are chronically affected by scarcity and famine. The normal annual rainfall is about 30 inches in the district. The rainy season normally starts from June & lasts upto October, July being the month of highest rainfall. However during the last few years there has been general ~~decline~~ variation in the rainfall by about 10 inches and so irrigation has assumed special importance in increasing agriculture production. The variations in the rainfall from year to year can be seen from a study of the following table.

Figures in bracket indicate the no. of towns. Jalgaon is the Head-quarter of the district East Khandesh.

According to the census of 1951 the population of the district is 1,471,351 or 329 persons to the sq. mile. The density of population is greater than the other neighbouring districts of Maharashtra but it is smaller as compared with the whole Bombay division.

Even though the density for the whole district is 329 persons per sq. mile, there is a wider variation, in the density of different Talukas. Higher concentration is found in Talukas like Bhushaval (453) Jalgaon (515) due to different factories. East Khandesh district has better lines of communications, & richer agricultural tracts. neighbouring districts to some extent but it is smaller as the extent of urbanisation in the district is much larger as compared to the neighbouring districts. Roughly it is as follows:

Buldhana has the density 16. The whole district is 329 per square mile, the 14.6% wider variation, in the within the district the extent of urbanisation varies from part to part. This can be seen from the table below: the Buldhana and Khandesh districts have better

It can be very easily seen that out of the 29 towns 16 towns are situated in Talukas namely Jalgaon, Bhusawal, Erandol, Pachora & Jamner, ie. in the central part of the district, while in the Edlabad peta there are no towns & so there is no urban population.

Among the Talukas & Petas, Jalgaon Taluka has the largest percentage of population in the District, forming about 49 % of the total population of that Taluka, the next to it, is Bhusawal Taluka having 48 % urban population of the total population of that Taluka, this high percentage

of urbanisation appears due to the fact that Jalgaon is the District Head-quarter & an important junction. It is mid-way between the Nagpur & Bombay as far as the Railway root is considered. Similarly, Bhusawal is one of the most important junctions & so the percentage of urbanisation is very high.

Next group consists of Talukas like Amalner, Pachora, Chopda, Yawal, where the urban percentage is about 30 to 35 %, at Amalner & Pachora the Percentage is increased owing to the Mills & Factories. While at Chopda & Yawal the percentage is high due to rich agricultural tracts. Moreover at Chopda the market for cotton seeds is at state level & at Yawal market for Banana is at All India level.

The extent of urbanisation is lowest in Raver, as it is undeveloped, in Bhadgaon & Edlabadtas they are having poor agricultural soil & as they are away from the Railway root.

root. The district, as whole has only 31.7% of urban population & remains predominantly rural.

Further the rural character of the population is further confirmed if we examine the distributional aspect of the population.

The majority of units in the district lie in the range 500-1000, 1000-2000, & 2000 -5000. The population in the three form nearly 55 % of the total population.

Units with less than 2000 persons number 668 & from nearly 84 % of the total number of units. This concentration of population in small units indicates clearly the rural character of the district.

Occupational distribution of population:-

Agriculture is the prominent source of livelihood. This can be verified by the following table which shows occupational distribution of the population in the district.

It can be seen that nearly 70.4 % of the total population are dependent on agriculture for their livelihood. This is in line with the predominantly with the rural character.

SEX RATIO:-

Out of a total population of 1471351 in the District, there are 746452 males & 724899 females. Thus there are 1029 males for every 1000 females. So the ratio is nearly equal to one.

Except in the Edlabad Peta, where there is no urban area, in all other Talukas & petas, the number of male persons is higher than the number of female persons.

LITERACY IN ...

According to the census of 1951, the percentage of literates as calculated from the sample figures for the district comes to about 28 %. Among the males nearly 43 % are classed as literates, while among the females nearly 11 % are classed as literates.

The literacy in the urban areas is higher than in the rural areas. 34% of the total urban population are literate while in the rural areas about 24 % of the population are classed as literates. The literacy in the rural parts are largely confined to men. Nearly 39 % among them are literate while among the females literates form only 8 percent. The corresponding position in urban area is, over 51 % of the males are literate & about, 19 percent among the females are literate.

The reasons for the higher percentage of literacy among the people in the urban areas are due to more facilities of education available in towns. Still it may be pointed out that even in Urban areas, the percentage of literate women is too low as compared to that of male.

As compared with the neighbouring districts it can be seen that the percentage of literates is higher except in case of urban areas. The following table gives a clear picture.



The scheduled caste & scheduled tribes number nearly 13.7 % of the total population of the district. The scheduled caste contributes about 68 % of the total scheduled castes & scheduled tribes.

Forests

The total area under forests in this District measures to 70.30 sq. miles. There are about 752 sq. miles of forests in charge of forest department & 37 sq. miles of pasture forest in charge of the revenue department. The forests are mostly poor. The better & richer areas are confined to the Suturra Ranges & yield small timber. Mostly it is used for fuel consumption. The ' Kurans ' in these forests, however offer grazing facilities to a large number of cattle from surrounding villages. Most of the forest have little growth of importance & mostly ... shrubs & minor trees are found in these areas. Due to the overfelling of trees especially during the World War II the forests have been depleted of the rich growth. So during the first plan period, the schemes for development were concentrated on improving the conditions of the forests through well planned afforestation schemes.

The total reserved area under forest, which is in charge of forest department only., is 476146.60 acres in the district. Out of this area nearly 22 % is in Chopda Range & about 32 % is in the Range of Yawal and Raver.



AGRICULTURE

Land Utilization:-

The following table shows the distribution of total area of East Khandesh district between cultivated land and uncultivated land. The cultivated land consists of the net cropped area and fallows. The uncultivated land consists of lands classed as culturable waste, forest and lands etc. which are not available for cultivation.

The area under cultivable land formed 69.66 % 69.4 % and 69.45 % of the total geographical area of the district during 1956-57 to 1958-59. Forest amounted 13.90 % 13.86 % and 13.85 % during the period. Cultivable waste land is only 00.8 % to 1.3 % during the same period. The other land which is not available for cultivation is 15.61 %, 15.69 % and 15.67 % during 1956-57, 1957-58 and 1958-59.

The utilization of the total area of land in the district between two groups viz. the cultivated and uncultivated land did not show any wide fluctuation in last three years. It is also the case for the sub-groups of these two main group. The area under forest and the net area sown are decreased during the period.

The distribution of the Gross Cropped Area in the district between food crops and non food crops:-

Above figures indicate that more than half the area of the gross cropped area was under the food crops.

Food crops in the district includes Jowar, Bajra, Wheat, Rice and Pulses in Grain crops, and other fruit crops like Banana, Sugarcane etc. While in non food crops Cotton is mostly important and fodder, oilseeds etc.

The following table will give the idea about the net cropped area in the District as a whole:

From the above table we find the trend that Net cropped area decreased in preceding years. Net cropped area was 69.04% of total area of the district in 1956-57 while Total Gross cropped area was 72.88 %. Total Gross cropped area increased in 1958-59 which was 73.44 % but the net ~~decreased~~ decreased area has ~~decreased~~ as 68.92 % in the same period. It shows that the tendency of harvesting more crops from the same land appears to be increased in 1958-59.

From the figures in the above table we find that in case of net cropped area of the district there are no such wide fluctuations during the period of last three years, any how it was highest in 1956-57. In case of Fallows, area under it is decreasing in the same period. Cultivable waste land area was lowest in 1956-57 while it is increased in next years. Proportion of the Forest area in the same period seems to be constant, except slight fluctuations. The land which was not available was highest in 1956-57 which decreased in next year by 1 % of the total area of the District.

Taluka Jamner had the highest percentage of cultivated area, 8.43, 8.45 in 1956-57, 1957-58 and 1958-59, percentage with total geographical area of the district. Next to Jamner Taluka Chalisgaon had the percentage 7.33, 7.33 and 7.34 in the respective years. Bhadgaon and Edlabad Peta had the lowest cultivated area as compared with the total geographical area of the district. That percentage was from 2.24 % upto 3.15% in the same years.


Fallows in the district are low, the percentage in different Talukas and mohals was ranging from .001 to .122 to the total geographical area of the district. Even some Talukas like Chopda had no ~~any~~ area under fallows.

In case of cultivable ~~are~~ waste land, the percentage is ranging from 0.038 to 0.144 percent in 1956-57, 1957-58 and 1958-59 in different Talukas and Petas. The total percentage of the district is 0.787 to 1.05.

In case of the Forest area which is ranging from 0.126 to 2.64 percent to the total geographical area, Taluka Yaval and Rover had the highest percentage in the district. The total percentage of the forest in the district was from 13.85 to 13.92. The area under forest in different Talukas and Petas seems to be constant during the last three years.

The land which is not available for cultivation includes barren and uncultivable lands and lands used for buildings etc. Percentage of such a land is highest in Jalgaon Taluka.

Following table shows the distribution of the total gross cropped area of the district among different crops. Below percentages are with the total cultivated(Gross---- Cropped area) of the district are given Jawar, Bajari, Rice, Wheat, Pulses, Sugarcane, Banana---etc. important crops are given.

From the above table it is observed that the division of the gross cropped area in to food crops and non food crops is remaining approximately constant in the last three years; only slight fluctuations can be observed which is negligible. Taluka Chalisgaon had the largest percentage of the food crops to the total gross cropped area of the district as a whole, which was ranging from 6.91, 7.28 and 7.46 percent during 1956-57, 1957-58 and 1958-59. While the percentage of non food crops was only 3.55, 3.19 and 2.99 percent during the same period. Next to Chalisgaon Taluka, Erendol and Jamner Talukas had the highest percentage for food crop area. In Erendol it was ----.

5.59, 5.52 and 5.47 percent and in Jamner it was 5.56, 5.90 and 5.49 percent to the total gross cropped area of the district as a whole. Even Amalner had the percentage of 5.55 to 5.94 during the same period. In case of the remaining talukas and Mahals, the percentage of the food cropped area was ranging from 2.03 to 4.42 during 1956-57, and from 2.18 to 4.72 percent during 1957-58 and from 1.90 to 4.62 percent during 1958-59.

In case of Non food cropped area, taluka Jamner had the highest percentage of 6.22, 5.30 and 6.24 to the total gross cropped area of the district as a whole, during the same years. Next to Jamner taluka Erandol had ~~the~~ the highest percentage ranging from 3.98 to 4.20 during the same period. In case of the other talukas and Mahals the percentage of the non food cropped area to the total gross cropped area was ranging from 1.80 to 3.83 in 56-57, 1.56 to 3.76 in 1957-58 and from 1.49 to 3.90 percent in 1958-59.

The total percentage of the district of the food cropped area was 55.77, 57.35, and 56.73 percent during 1956-57, 1957-58 and 1958-59, while the the total percentage of the nonfood crops was 44.23, 42.65 and 44.22 percent in the same period. Thus it will be seen from the above that about only 10 % of the total cultivated area ~~xxx~~ District ~~xxx~~ is devoted to the food crops more than nonfood crops. In this District, nonfood crops have the equal importance like food crops, specially because, nonfood crops include Cotton, Sugarcane, Groundnut and Banana. And these crops are money crops, which are giving good returns to the farmers while in case of food crops which includes, Jawar Bajari, Wheat and Rice which are important food crops.

Food Crops in the East Khandesh District:

(1) J A W A R :

Jawar is the important crop in the district and 98232 acres, 99237 acres and 90962 acres were under this crop during 1956-57, 1957-58 and 1958-59 respectively out of these areas, 60453, 54156 and 65565 acres were under Rabi Jawar while 320741, 346760 and 333202 acres were under Kharif Jawar in the district.

It is observed from the above table that in 1956-57 and in 1957-58 taluka Jamner had the largest area under Jawar, which was 11.51% and 12.65% and in 1958-59 taluka Amalner had the largest area 11.91 % Bhadgaon mahal had the lowest percentage 3.90 % and 4.46% and Edlabad Mahal had

4.21% during the same period. The highest acreage under Jawar was 30703 acres in Jamner Taluka in 1957-58.

(2) BAJARI:-

Bajari is the second important food crop in the Dist. which has 210704, 202550 and 207707 acres area during 1956-57 to 1958-59.

It is observed from the above, that this crop is mainly concentrated in Chalisgaon Taluka. The area under Bajari, in this Taluka was ranging from 31.37 to 34.10 percent, which was 66132, 69034 and 70352 acres during 1956-57 to 1958-59. The lowest percentage was in Edlabad Mahal in same period which was 0.75% to 0.83%.

Rice is the third food crop in the district, but it is not so important like Jawar or Bajari. It occupies very low percentage of area as compared with other food crops like Jawar, Bajari or Wheat. In 1956-57 Rice occupied 12970 acres, in 1957-58 that figure was 14661 acres, which was highest in last three years, and in 1958-59 it was 13182 acres.

It is clear from the above figures, that Rice occupied the largest area in Pachora Taluka, During 1956-57, 1957-58 and 1958-59 the percentage of that area to the total area of the district, under Rice was 14.98%, 14.94% and 16.07% respectively. Specially in 1958-59 this crop had the largest percentage in the District during last three years.

In Edlabad Mahal the position was opposite, that Rice had only 1.60 to 1.80 percentage of acreage. It was lowest in 1958-59, only 1.60 %.

WHEAT :

Next to Jawar and Bajari, Wheat is an important food crop in the district. Area under wheat was highest during 1958-59 which was 80959 acres, while it was 75794 acres and 77054 acres during 1956-57 and 1957-58 respectively. But

From the above, it is clear that the percentage of the area under Wheat, was highest in Amalner taluka during 1956-57 and 1957-58, which was 15.17 percent and 14.27 percent, of the total area of the district under the crop. But in 1958-59 it was highest in Jalgaon taluka i.e. 13.85 percent. The highest acreage under the wheat was 11499 acres in Amalner taluka during the period.

The lowest percentage of area was in the Jamner Taluka, in the same period, which was only 1.54 % to 1.83%.

About 40% of the total area under wheat in the Dist. was under irrigation. For the last three years, this percentage was the same approximatley.

P U L S E S :

Pulses include Tur, Gram, Mug, Math and Udid,etc.

The importint Pulses occupied an area of 19.36 %, 20.63 % and 20.28 % during 1956-57 to 1958-59 of the total cultivated area of the district. The area was 405705 acres in 1951-57, 416255 acres in 1957-53 and 416141 acres in 1958-59. This area was highest in 1957-58.

Taluka Erandol had also the remarkable percentage of area under pulses to the total area under pulses in the District, which was ranging from 10.16% to 10.48% in the same period.

M A T H :- This crop occupied lar est percentage of area in Chalisgaon taluka, which amounted 26 % to 27 % of the total area of the distric under Math. That acreage was 6652 acres to 7969 acres in the respoctive years. On the contrary area under Math was ~~my~~ lowest in taluka Raver, it was only 0.63% to 0.75% in the same period.

U D I D :- This is the second important crop in Pulses which occupied highest percentage of area in taluka Jamner About 14.88 % to 15.50 % of the total area of the district under Udid was in Jamner, the acreage was from 36012 acres to 40183 acres in last three years.

In Bhadgaon inhal this crop occupied the lowest percentage of area in 1953-57 and 1957-58 which was only 4.26 % and 4.32 %. But in next year it was lowest in Edlabad mahal, which was 4.13 %.

The total area under Urid in the district was 233328 acres in 1953-57 and 360384 acres in 57-58, while it was 263535 acres in 1956-59.

G R A M :- This is the third important crop amongst Pulses, Taluka Amalner had the largest percentage of Gram which was 19.50% to the total area in the district under the crop. But in the last two years, taluka Amalner had the largest percentage, which was 20.40% and 21.04 an area was 2558 acres and 2521 acres. But in 1956-57 in Erandol it was 3623 acres. The lowest area under Gram was in Edlabad and Jamner during the same period.

The total area under Gram in the district was 18586 acres in 1956-57, 12548 acres in 1957-58 and 11983 acres in 1958-59.

M u g:- The highest percentage of area under this crop was in Amalner Taluka in last three years. It occupied 14.99 % to 19.29% of the total area under Mug in the district An area under Mug in Amalner was 8586 acres to 14658 acres. The lowest percentage of area was in Bhadgaon Mahal, which was from 2.56% to 3.37% in the same period.

From the above figures it is clear, that among Pulses, Udid is most important crop, which occupied about 60 % area of the total area under pulses in the district. Next to it Mug is important and then Math. Other pulses include Tur, Chavali etc. which occupied 13.20 % to 15.28 % area out of total area under pulses.

BANANA :-

This fruit crop is important among food crops in this district. This crop is one of the important crops in East-Khandesh. Land and the atmosphere is suitable for the crop in the district. It requires rich quality of the land and well managed water supply. Whole the crop is under irrigation which is essential for it. Banana crop is cultivated in all the talukas and mahals of the district. In the whole Dist. Banana crop has the importance like Cotton and Groundnut, which gives the remarkable returns to the cultivators. This crop requires double the period than that of other crops. This is one of the important exportable crop in the district. Following table gives the distribution of the total area under Banana crop, ~~approx~~ among the talukas and mahals of the district.

The total area under Banana crop in the District was 20072 acres in 1956-57, 24637 acres in 1957-58 and 23718 acres in 1958-59. From the above table it will be seen that the crop is concentrated in Raver and Yawal Talukas. Taluka Raver had the largest percentage of area under Banana during three years, which amounted from 32.93 % to 35.93 %. The crop occupied 7214 acres, 8273 acres and 7822 acres in the same period.

In Chopda Taluka the area under Banana was lowest which amounted only 50% to 51 % of the total area under the crop in the district. Next to Raver and Yawal other talukas and mahals have not more than 10 % of the total area of Banana during the same period.

SUGARCANE :-

This is also an important crop in the district, which is developing. This crop gives the remarkable returns in monetary terms to the cultivators. This crop requires the rich quality of the land and the better facilities of the irrigation. This crop requires adequate water supply. The total area under sugarcane in 1956-57 was 2417 acres, in 1957-58 it was 3098 acres and in 1958-59, it was 3025 acres. From the above table, we find that the crop of sugar-cane, which is cultivated in all the parts of the district is mainly concentrated in few talukas and mahals, as in Yawal, Rave and Bhadgaon. During 1956-57 and 1957-58 the percentage of area was highest in Yawal taluka which amounted 27.50% and 21.72%. But in 1958-59 it was highest in Bhadgaon mahal, which was 23.07%, which is the indication for the considerable increase in case of the percentage of the area in that mahal. On the other hand in Edlabad mahal the percentage of area was the lowest, 0.52% in 1956-57. But in next two years it was lowest in Jalgaon taluka, 1.00% and 1.75%.

The highest acreage of Sugarcane was in 1958-59, which was 253 acres in Bhadgaon mahal.

In the whole district Sugarcane crop was entirely irrigated crop. Nowadays the tendency of cultivating Sugarcane is increasing because due to as normal rainfall, production of Cotton got a considerable set back. So peasants automatically turned to Sugarcane, which is also a money crop next to Cotton.

Groundnut:-

In the oilseed crops, Groundnut crop is major and important crop in the district. Even Groundnut is the important crop in the district in the line of other crops, like Cotton and Sugarcane. Total area in the district under the cultivation of this crop was 318114 acres in 1956-57, and 32060 acres in 1957-58 and 343657 acres in 1958-59. It is clear from ~~the~~ these figures that the area under this crop was highest in the last year.

Above figures of the percentages in the table indicates, that the crop of Groundnut is highly concentrated in Chalisgaon, Parola, Jamner, Parola and Amalner talukas.

The percentage of area under groundnut was highest in Chalisgaon taluka during the last three year. It was amounted 14.23 % in 56-57; 14.64 % in 57-58 and 13.43 % in 58-59 of the total area of the district under the crop. That area was 45278 acres, 49833 acres and 46171 acres during the same period. The lowest area was in Edlabad mahal. The percentage in that mahal was from 1.80 % to 2.10 % to the total area of the crop in the district.

Non-Food Crops- Cotton:

Among Nonfood crops, specially Cotton is important. Cotton is the money crop in this district and it has substantial area under cultivation during the period of last three years. An area under Nonfood crops was 44.23 % in 56-57 then it was 42.65 % and 44.22% during last two years. This percentage is to the total gross cropped area of the district. And out of this Cotton occupied about 27 % of the total gross cropped area in the district during the same period. Following table gives the distribution of the area under cotton. The total area under cotton was 583530 acres in 56-57, while it was 525989 acres in 57-58 and 569196 acres in 58-59. It is clear from these figures that the area of the Cotton was highest in 1956-57 during the period of last three years.

From the above figures we can draw the following conclusions:- in case of Rice outturn was highest in 57-58 while it is decreased in 58-59 by 800 tons than that of 56-57. Outturn of Wheat is maximum in last year which was 21200 tons, on the other hand it was lowest in 1957-58. Production of Jowar was highest in 57-58 and was lowest in last year. Total highest outturn of Jowar was 173000 tons. Jowar is the important crop in the district and largest area is always occupied by this crop, land and the atmosphere is suitable for Jowar in this district. The figure of the outturn of the total Pulse was highest in 1957-58 which was 750 00 tons. It was only 69300 tons in 56-57 and 69700 tons in 1958-59.

Outturn of chilles increased from 97 00 tons to 30 00 tons in 57-58 but again it was reduced to 16 00 tons in last year. It is also the same case for Groundnut; Outturn of it was highest 952 00 tons in 1957-58. But it was lowest in 1958-59, only 741 00 tons.

In case of the outturn of Cotton, figures shows that there was increase in 1957-58 than that was previous year. But again in 1958-59 the outturn was lowest. In 1957-58 the outturn of cotton was highest in the period of three years. But it is reduced in 1958-59.

Above table indicates that the number of land holders is highest under the head of less than 16 acres. It is 1,63,243 where they have an area of 890567 acres and 122778 acres, including owners and tenants of the holdings. Next to it the number of land holders, who have more than 16 acres and less than 48 acres is highest. From the point of Economic Holding of 16 acres only 73 have the exact area of economic holding.

Then in the remaining figures, the number of land holders is highest in the category of more than 48 acres and less than 96 acres. 48 acres is the limit for Ceiling Area. Only 28 land holders have the largest holdings which are more than 240 acres, in the district. Mainly total agricultural area of the District is divided among the land holders, who have less than economic holding of 16 acres.

The number of payment tenants in the district is only 111 and 7 are the subsidized sub-tenants. But the figure of other tenants is highest, which is 2902, and they hold 2650.62 acres.

The holding under the head of disability are mainly occupied under the head of minors and the widow. The number of holding under the head of minors is 942 while 42 are under the head of widows. Number of land holders in this area is of 5706-13 acres, occupying 164 land holdings taken at the disposal of the Collector of the district. Only 2000 persons will show the distribution of agricultural area of the District. IRRIGATION :-

The total cultivated area under irrigation in the district was 3.75 %; 4.60 % and 2.50 % in the period of three years from 1956-57 to 1958-59. This percentage is with the total gross cropped area of the district. The main source of the irrigation in this district are the wells. There are no private canals in the district, but Government canals are there, which supply water to the few acres of the land. Ever there is no such considerable irrigated area by means of tanks, except in two talukas. It covers less than 200 acres other sources of irrigation, which includes lift irrigation etc. are also not so. Following table shows the percentages of the irrigated area to the gross cropped area of the particular talukas and the mohals of the district.

From the above it is clear, that the percentage of the irrigated area to the total gross cropped area of the talukas and mahals is highest in Raver taluka during the same period, which amounted from 8 % to 10.50 %. While it was lowest in Chopda taluka which was about 1.7%.

Total area irrigated in the district was 66696 acres in 56-57-58101 acres in 57-58 and 82997 acres in 58-59.

This shows that there is a considerable increase in the irrigated area in the last year as compared with the first year. Following table shows the distribution of irrigated area in the district.

In the above table the percentages of the distribution of the irrigated area in the talukas and mahals of the district, with the total irrigated area of the district are given. Throughout the period of three years the percentage of an irrigated area was highest in the Raver taluka, which was about 16%. Next to Raver it was considerable in N. S. D., Parner & Parola talukas. The lowest percentage of

L i v e S t o c k :-

Agriculture is the source of livelihood for nearly 70.4 of the people in the district. The importance of cattle need not be over emphasised in such an economy where agriculture is mainly dependent on bullocks. The males are mainly used for agricultural field work or milk. Mainly, in this district, she buffaloes are used as producers of milk. The important food of she buffaloes is cotton seeds, which is one of the important crop in East Khandesh, so the quality of the milk is very rich. Besides, they form the most important source of manure for agriculture.

The total population at the cattle in the district according to census of 1956 was 342904. Out of these, females giving milk numbered 135086, Buffaloes numbered 60775 & out of them females giving milk were 58173. Jamner, Chalisgaon & Raver had larger bovine population than the other talukas in the district.

In relation to the agricultural operation a pair of bullocks had an area of about 19.22 acres to plough [Net cropped area] (1958-59). The area per pair of bullock was less than this district figure, in all the talukas except Amalner, Bhisaval, Raver, Pachora & Parola, Yawal. Erandol had the largest acre (nearly 23 acres) per pair of bullocks. The smallest area was at Edlabad where per pair of bullocks the area was 16.31 acres.

Agricultural Implements:- Agricultural production is also influenced by the type of implements, the agriculturist is making use of. As elsewhere the plough happens to be most important implement of cultivation. The total number of ploughs in the district according to census of 1951, was 58303 of these total number, iron ploughs utilised were 13716 i.e. nearly 23.52 % at the total ploughs. Their distribution, however was not uniform in all the talukas/ Petas of the district as can be seen from the following table:-

The iron plough used at Jamner formed 72.8 percent of the total number of ploughs & that taluka has the largest number of iron ploughs in the district. This was followed by Edlabad (45.11 %), Yawal (39.83%), Bhusawal (31.45%) The minimum percentage is in Jalgaon Taluka (12.48%). This variation in the percentages of iron ploughs may be due to the variation in the soil tracts in different talukas.

The total number of Electric Oil Engines in the dist. according to 1956 census, is 47 only, while the oil engines, with pumps used for irrigation purposes were 2106. This figure must have been increased considerably due to facilities provided by Community Development Programme Scheme.

I N D U S T R I E S:-

Industrial development of any region depends on a number of factors such as availability of raw material, easy transport facilities, availability of labourers etc. As East Khandesh is cotton growing area, the reason for establishment of cotton--ginning & pressing factories at various cotton growing centres in the district, is obvious.

The District is having very few large scale industries like cotton textiles & oil mills. Among the existing small scale industries in the district, cotton ginning & pressing is most prominent. At the end of 1956 there were 76 ginning & pressing factories. This number was increased to 100 in June 1958. These factories are scattered all over the district & are located where transport facilities are easily available. It is a seasonal industry which works from Nov. to April & most of these gin cotton of Virnar (197/3).

There are three cotton textile units working in the district at Jalgaon, Amalner & Chalisgaon. Next to it oil industry occupied an important place. There were 26 oil factories including two Vanaspati manufacturing units during 1955-56. Out of these two units, one is at Pachora and other is at Amalner. Besides these units there were 116 small establishments registered under shop & est. act. There are also two units which are engaged in crushing cotton seeds. Out of the total production of cotton seeds in the district about 80 % is used as cattle food & the rest is crushed by these mills for extracting oil. In Jalgaon there is one Ink manufacturing factory & three printing pressed. At the end June 1958, the number of Bidi-manufacturing factories were four. They were situated at Erandol, Jalgaon, Raver & Yawal.

Among the existing cottage industries in the district weaving claims the first place. There were 201 factories in this district during 1959 and on the average the number of persons employed in these factories were 11570. As will be seen from the taluk wise information that amongst all the talukas in East Khandesh district, Yawal taluka has maximum factories. Next to it, Jalgaon, Bhusawal & Pachora. But the number of persons employed is more at Jalgaon Pachora & Bhusawal, as compared to those at Yawal. The following table gives information for the years 1956, 1957, 1958 and 1959.

Medical and Public Health :-

There were in all during the same period 18 dispensaries, one at each taluka Head quarter and one each at Bodwad, Suwad, Shendurni, Fattepur and Dharangaon. It will be observed that so far as the birth rates are concerned Parola Taluka registered the highest number of births namely 58.5 per thousand of population during 1959. The lowest registered was at Raver, where the birth rate was 37.8. The birth rates in the other talukas/petas moved between these two figures.

The death rates varied between 19.08 per thousand at Bhusawal to 31 per thousand at Bhadgaon. The variation in the rate is appreciable. For all other talukas it is round about 20 or so.

The birth rates for the district as a whole in 1956 was 48.4 per thousand, while in the 1959 it is 46.8 per thousand. The death rate was 20.1 in 1956, while in 1958 it is 28.9, the highest one, and in 1959 it is 23.1. Deaths of infants constituted an appreciable percentage of deaths registered during the four years. It is nearly 25% of the total deaths for the years in the district.

It will be observed that the infant death rate is lowest at Bhusawal i.e. 4.12 per thousand while it is highest at Edlabad i.e. 7.93 during 1959. The no. of infant deaths per thousand for other talukas is in between these two figures. The infant mortality rate per 1000 births is highest at Chopda and Parola i.e. 125.00

At the very first sight, it is seen that the percentage of passing has gone down considerably in the case of First Year of M.J. College during 1958-59. It is due to the fact that the old courses have been changed & the First Year examination is replaced by Pre-degree examination, which is conducted by the University & not by the College, So the percentage of passing in case of Boys has fallen down from

about 83 % to about 22 % roughly in both the colleges.

Secondly there is a less tendency of female students, to choose Science side. No female student appeared for Sr. B.Sc. examination from both of these colleges during 1956-57 and 1957-58. Overall the percentage of passing female students is more than that of male students.

From the data, available, it can be seen that the number of secondary schools increased by 6 during 57-58 and by 4 during 1958-59 as compared to respective previous years. The Secondary school facilities are available in all the talukas, Jalgaon taluka having the maximum number of schools, as might be expected. The following table gives the general idea about the strength of the schools-- during 1958-59 (All the primary schools are not covered.)

the secondary schools at all the talukas/petas of the district during 1958-59 over the previous year. There was increase in the number of schools at Raver, Jamner, Pachora, Erandol, Bhusawal, Chalisgaon, & Jalgaon, in 1958-59 over the previous year.

It should be noted here that the proportion of female students is too low as compared to male students in talukas Edlabad, Jarner & Pachora. In other talukas the proportion is on the average 1:7 (Female : Male) except in Jalgaon and Bhusawal, where it is 1:4.

As already stated others are two colleges, one at Amalner & other at Jalgaon. But in Amalner, there are only 6 secondary schools while in Jalgaon there are 12 schools. This difference has its effect on the strength of the two colleges.

As regards primary education, there were 1272 schools during 1956-57 and 1273 during 57-58 i.e. an increase of only one school during the year. While during 1958-59 there were 1302 schools i.e. an increase of 29 schools compared to previous year. Their position will be clear from the following table:

As the above figures indicate, there are about on an average 3 to 4 teachers per school & the number of students per school is 150. The average number of students pr teacher is 40 which seems to be quite appropriate. The percentage of untrained teachers is decreasing from year to year, from 16% to 11 % which clearly indicates improvement in educational staff.

As far as the average attendance of the students in the schools is considered, it is nearly 74 % in the District. This percentage, in fact, is not so admissible. Still there are 351 villages at the end of 1958-59, where there are no primery schools. But at the same time it could be noted here that all the villages with a population over 500 persons are either having primery schools or their need is fulfilled by neighbouring villages. The no. of villages (with population below 500) without any facilities of primery schools were 68 during the years 1956-57 & 1957-58. But this number has been increased to 79. As the figures from the Table indicates that during 1958-59, the eductional needs of 11 villages was not fulfilled by neighbouring villages, as compared to the year 57-58.

It can be seen from the above table that the percentage of untrained teachers is largest in the Edlabad taluka i.e. about 32.7% as compared to trained teachers. It is followed by the Jamner taluka where this percentage is 24.5. The number of primary schools is larger in Chalisgaon & Jamner talukas as they are having larger population compared with other talukas. Amalner taluka is having the largest number of villages without primary schools; it is 51. This is followed by Erandol taluka where there are no schools for 46 villages while there are some villages, the educational need of which is not fulfilled even by the neighbouring villages. In this category, Edlabad taluka is having the maximum number i.e. 13 & Chopda and Raver are having 11 each. Edlabad taluka seems to be lagging behind, as far as primary education is concerned. In the case of Bhusawal taluka which is

adjuscent to the Edlabad peta, there is no single village of which the educations needs are not fulfilled.

Overall in the district, there is a substantial increase in the number of pupils during the year 1958-59 as compared to 56-57. The number of schools is also increased considerably and proportionately.

Other Institutions :- There are 4 training colleges in the District. The total number of male students were 304 and female students were 124, during 1958-59. There are 9 Type-writing institutes in the district. Out of which in 7 institutes there were 396 students during 1958-59. There are 8 montesary schools in the district. 391 students were on the roll during 1958-59. In 1956-57 there were only 288. The increase in the number of students is appreciable. There is one Remand Home at Jalgaon, The average number of inmates was 54 during 56-57, 45 during 57-58 and 51 during 1958-59.

TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION-

The pace of economic development depends considerably on adequate provision of transport facilites particularly by rail and road--for transport of essential requirements like coal, cement, iron, steel etc., for various projects in different sectors of the plan and of agriculture & industrial produce. The heavy pressure on rail traffic can be relieved mainly by the development of road transport for which a system of well constructed and connected roads is essential. In the East Khandesh district roads form the most important means of communications among the different parts of the district. The total mileage of roads under the charge of the P.W.D. was 328.25 miles during 1956-57 and 1957-58. During 1958-59 there was an increase of 7.23 miles. Out of this mileage , National highway is 88.5 imles, State Highway 237.75 miles and Major District Road about 1.75 miles.

The State Transport Buses are plying in almost all the parts of the district and connect all the talukas and Petas headquarter with the district Head-quarter.

There are two railway lines in the district. One is central railway having total length about 300 kilometers and other is Western Railway having total length about 90 kilometers are under broad guage while 56 kilometers are under meter guage. The Central Railway runs from talukas Chalisgaon, Pachora, Jalgaon, Bhusawal Raver, Edlabad Peta, and Jamner. Western Railway runs from talukas Bhusawal, Jalgaon, Erandol and Amlner. On the average there is a railway station for every 10.5 kilometers.

C O - O P E R A T I O N :

The co-operative movement in the District covers most of the activities of the people like banking, finance housing, marketing, large and small scale industries.

The total number of (Agricultural Credit, Agri. Non-Credit, Marketing etc., Non-Agri. Credit and Non- Agri. Credit) societies in East Khandesh district was 1051 in 1956-57; 1067 in 1957-58 and 1034 in 1958-59. The following table shows the types of co-operatives in the district for the years 1956-57 , 1957-58 and 1958-59.

It can be seen from the above that the number of members in co-operative societies is increasing from the years 1956 to 1959. The number of societies however are decreased from 1052 to 1034. There is a considerable decrease in the Non-Agri. Non-Credit Societies. There is also in its membership from the following information given in the abstract, we can see that the number of members of Non-Agri. Non-Credit Societies has markedly increased in Talukas---Chopda, Dargad, etc.,, River and Yerawal during 1958-59.

As might be expected in the East Khandesh District where nearly 70.4% of the total population 1951 (enst) are dependent on agriculture for their livelihood, agricultural credit societies occupy the leading position. Their position during the years 1956-59 is as follows:

The total number of Agricultural Credit Societies including the large sized multipurpose societies during 1956-57 was 849, the number of societies is reported an decrease by 46 during 1957-58 compared to previous year. Also during the year 1958-59, the number decreased by 15 as compared to previous year. However the number of members is increasing. The number of members has been increased by 7464 during 1957-58 and by 5510 during 1958-59 as compared to their respective previous years. The average number of members during 1956-57 is 94 per society, during 1957-58 it is 109 per society and during 1958-59 it is 119 per society.

The total number of villages covered by agricultural primaries i.e. 1420 i.e. 99.9 % villages have been covered during 1957-58. If we assume that on an average that each member is representative of a family consisting of five persons then the percentage of population covered by agricultural credit societies was approp. 44.24 during 1958-59.

It can be easily seen from the above table that the number of Agricultural Credit Societies reduced from 56-57 year to 1958-59 year. It is because the societies were either converted into large sized multipurpose societies or amalgamated into other credit societies. The total overdue worked at 32 % to the total loans outstanding at the close of the year 1958-59. This shows the financial weakness of the societies. The increase in the percentage of overdues, it is reported, due to the failuer of crop owing to unnatural rainy season, resulting in slow recovery of dues.

The primary credit societies are mainly dependent
on borrowing from the central cooperative Bank ~~xx~~ and
have very small deposits of their own. The deposits
contributed only 1.8% of the working capital.

Agricultural Non Credit :-

The progress and growth at cooperative movement amongst the rural people, depends upon the successful working of the agricultural Non-Credit societies; especially the Marketing Societies. Hence in the agricultural non-credit sector, Marketing cooperatives occupy an important place. Among the agricultural non-credit societies during 1958-59, there were 37 cooperative marketing societies, 68 Crop Protection Societies, 13 cooperative farming societies, 7 lift irrigation societies, and others are Taluka Development Boards/Associations Dairy Societies etc. In East Khandesh District, there is a fine net work of cooperative Marketing Societies. In each Taluka there is a marketing society which in addition to its normal work of Marketing of agricultural produce, is also undertaking business of supply of agricultural requisites like oil cakes, fertilizers, improved seeds & implements. There are some societies handling only one commodity, this is the peculiarity of this district.

Lift irrigation societies have brought 505 acres of land under irrigation; out of irrigatable land under command of 1578 acres. These societies could not bring the total area under irrigation due to various difficulties such as lack of technical help etc, and reluctance of the people to pay heavy water charges.

Non-agricultural Credit Societies :-

In this category there are included the salary earners societies, urban credit societies, Housing societies etc. and others not included in the farmer two groups. It shows that the cooperative movement is not restricted to the rural area only but it is also spreading in urban areas also. Among urban credit societies, the salary Earners societies, Banks and Urban credit societies are organising in this district.

Out of the 53 Urban credit societies during the year 1958-59, 8 are Urban banks, 4 are Urban credit societies, 32 salery Earners Societies, 6 Mill hand societies, 1 Urban credit and Thrift society and 1 Factory workers societies. It is revealed from the above table that there is an appreciable increase in the Membership, working capital, share capital and at the same time an appreciable decrease in the overdues, from years 56-57 to 58-59, which indicates the successful working of such societies,

Co-operative Financing agency:-

There is one District central cooperative Bank (East Khandesh) and Two Land Mortgage Banks in the district East Khandesh Central Cooperative Bank was established in the year 1916 at Jalgaon. This is one of the important cooperative banks in the Maharashtra state, having 40 branches spread over all the district. The bulk of agricultural finance continued to be provided by this

bank. at the end of the year 1958-59, there were 1148 societies and 3095 members of this bank. There are two Land Mortgage banks in the district, one at Jalgaon and other at Pachora. The latter cr. was established in 1928. These two banks are catering to the needs of long term finance to the agriculturists. The working of these banks is hampered owing to the New Tenancy Act, and delay in valuation of lands.

The Land Mortgage Banks are implementing 'Well Scheme' also. During the year 1958-59, the Banks advanced Rs. 1,72,800/- for sinking of new wells and construction of old wells. These banks play a vital role in the implementation of land reform policy of the state.

M I S C E L L A N E O U S

THE GIRNA PROJECT:-

I . Apart from the various minor irrigation schemes, a major irrigation project i.e. the Girna Project mostly benefiting to the areas in the Fast Khandesh district, has been included in the Second Five Year Plan. The Girna Project as originally planned envisaged construction of a dam at Panzan, near the border of Nasik & East Khandesh district, to impound a storage of 11,000 million cubic feet & bringing under irrigation an area of about 82900 acres including perennial crops. On completion, the project was also expected to give irrigation benefits to a small part of the Malegaon Taluka in the Nasik district, Chalisgaon, Parola, Bhadgaon & Erandol talukas from East Khandesh District for which the normal rainfall is 21.88, 28.04, 26.34, 28.79 & 27.04 inches respectively. The areas in the East Khandesh district are classified as " less liable to famine" under the distribution of areas of the state into " very liable to famine, less liable to famine & practically safe from famine."

II.- After a detailed study of the project it was found that the area commanded by the direct left bank canal from the dam contained large patches of shallow soils & unsuitable for irrigation & the construction of the canal would have been very expensive on account of the difficult terrain through which it had to pass. It was seen that a substantially greater utilisation of the Girna Waters could be secured by diverting it to other better areas while the capacity of the Panzan Reservoir could be increased to 24000 million cubic feet, without materially affecting the cost by suitably modifying the design. The project was therefore finalised as below:-

(a) The main dam on the River Girna for 24000 million cubic feet storage.

(b) The subsidiary storage on Manyad River for 1500 million cubic feet.

(c) Raising the existing Jamda weir, & remodelling & extension of the Jamda Left Bank canal.

(d) Construction of a weir at Dahigaon & Dahigaon Left Bank Canal.

The project as above has been administratively approved for Rs. 3.68 crores in June 1958.

III- Change in weir from Sontek to Dahigaon:-

As per Administratively approved project eh site for weir for Lower Girna Canal was previously at Sontek, for canal for 40 miles length taking off from the weir. On detailed examination, however, it was found that Sontek was not a suitable site for weir & hence it was decided to explore sites lower down after examination, an alternative site just upstream of the village Dahigaon was selected. At this site there is exposed rock in river bed & the course of the river is favourable for non silting condition for the canal.

IV - Present Position:- (i.e. in June 1960)

The work of the dam at Panxan is given on contract & is in progress. The earth work on remodelling the extension of Jamda Left Bank Canal is in full swing. Earth work in the first 18 miles of the lower Girna Canal Ex-Dahigaon weir has just recently started. The construction of Dahigaon weir is in progress.

V- In a ~~nutshell~~ ^{nut} the construction in irrigation programme of Lower Girna Canal is as follows:-

Upto 1961-62 work of 18 miles will be completed when about 4150 acres are likely to be irrigated . Upto 1963-64 work of 34 miles will be nearly completed and area likely to be irrigated is 36000 acres. Full irrigation on Jamda extention (32000 acres) will take place in 1965-66 and that of Lower Girna Canal (88624 acres) in 1966-67.



VII-General:-

Development of irrigation: on Jamda Remodelling has been assumed to be rapid as it is already developed for irrigation. Development on Jamda extension & Lower Girna Canal will be comparatively low. Full storage for irrigation will be available in 1963-64 provided dam is completed by 1963. There is dearth of contractors on canal works of Jamda & lower Girna Canal & a set back in Programme is likely to take place if proper agencies for execution will not be available in time.

106 villages from the Erandol taluka & 14 villages from the Amalner taluka will be commanded by lower Girna Canal alone.



S E C O N D F I V E Y E A R P L A N.

In East Khandesh District-----*

There are about 115 schemes which are implemented in the East Khandesh District during the Second Five Year Plan period. Almost all the schemes started functioning during the first year of the plan. Sector wise, there are 57 schemes relating to Agriculture & Community Development, 1 relating to Irrigation works, 13 to industry & mining, 2 to Transport & communication, 37 to Social Services & 5 to scientific & Industrial research etc.

For the purpose of analysis the above schemes can also be classified roughly as Research schemes 6, staff schemes 13, Training schemes, 8, Financial or grant-in-aid schemes 18, Expenditure schemes 9, Expenditure & Physical achievement schemes 61.

From the list of the schemes in this district, it appears at the first out look that greater emphasis is laid on improvement on rural life, especially on agricultural sector. All the talukas in the district are covered by the Community Development Blocks. Out of which 5 are Pre-extension 6 in stage I & 2 in stage II as on 31st Dec. 1960.

Many important schemes have been undertaken in this district such as the major irrigation project namely Girna Project, the account for which is given in detail previously. A cottage Hospital is established at Chopda & a Govt. Polytechnic has been started at Jalgaon. In short, there is all sided development in this district during the second plan.

C O M M U N I T Y D E V E L O P M E N T
P R O G R A M M E ----

A nation-wide programme of intensive development known as Community Development Programme was started in the state in October 52. The main object of these programmes is to bring about a social change in the rural areas by arousing enthusiasm of the rural people for a new way of life. In this District, the programme was started during the period of the First Five Year Plan & the latest position (As on 1st April 1960) is as follows:-

This programme includes measures for a rapid increase in food & agricultural production promotion of education & health & introduction to new skills & crafts which form an integral part of rural life. For the proper implementation of these programmes, Block Development Officer is appointed in each Block & other extension officers of different technical departments to help him. The block area is divided

into different circles (group of villages) & a new cadre of Gram Sevak (Village level worker) has been specially created for each circle.

A brief account of the development work done upto 31st March 1960 in some of the Block areas is given in the following statement.
