CHAPTER - I  
I N T R O D U C T I O N

1.1 General Kolhapur district is located between 15 to 17<sup>0</sup> north latitude and 73 to 74 east longitude. To its north there is Sangli District, to the south and east Belgaum district of the Karnatak State and to the West Ratnagiri district.

1.2 The area of of the district is 8059 square kilometres It's population is 20,48,049 according to 1971 census. The district comprises of 12 tahsils, The boundary of the district has not undergone any change since 1961.

1.3 Physical setting

The main part of the district is traversed by the Sahyadree mountains in the west. It has thrown several spurs in the east of the district, and in this range some of the points are as high on 900 metres above mean sea level. The major portion of the district is 390 to 600 metres above the mean sea level.

1.4 Rivers

The principal rivers of Kolhapur district are the Krishna, the Varna, the Panchganga, the Doodhganga, the Vedganga and the Hiranyakeshi, The Varna river which has a fairly south eastern trend serves as a boundary between Kolhapur and Sangli district. It's approximate length is 130 km. The Panchganga is formed by 4 tributaries viz, the Kasari, the Kumhi the Tulshi and the Bhogavati. The Panchganga falls into the river Krishna at Narsobawadi in Shirol Tahsil of Kolhapur district after covering approximately 136 Kilometre length in the district. The south western region of the district., is mainly drained by the Dudhganga river flowing a length of 88 km. in this district and her important tributary the Vedganga flowing a length of about 64 Km. The Dudhganga ultimately falls to Krishna at Yeddur in Belgaum district.

### Forests

The forests in Kolhapur are confined to the western half of the district. In the high rainfall region in the extreme west, Jambhul, Hirda, Anjani, Surangi, Karvi and Paansi Plant species are located, Amba, Nana, Sissum, Asana, Kumbhi, Bhavada, Kinjal, Ain Biba etc. are in the moist deciduous and semi evergreen regions. The famous scented wood species Shandan occurs in Ajra tahsil. The dry deciduous type of forest are strewn far and wide in small patches with greater incidence of sissum. Besides Timber, Sandle wood, fruit, fire wood, grass, timber bamboo hirda, Kafu, mango, bibi fruits, and other minor forest products such as shikekai, cofumbs, honey and Wax, Karanji seeds etc are marketable products from these forests. The total forest area in Kolhapur district is of the order of 1 lakh and 65 thousand hectares.

### Soils

Kolhapur district has three broad soil zones. The western part covered with laterite soil, the fertile central part covered with brownish well-drained soil and the eastern zone covered with medium to deep black soil.

### Minerals

Bauxite is known to occur at several places like Radhanagari, Gargoti, Waki, Dhanagarwada, Rangewadi and Udegiri its quality is fairly good and suited to produce Aluminium Gypsum is found in small quantities in Bhudargad tahsil.

### Rainfall

The distribution of rainfall varies considerably from place to place. Gaganbawada in the west receives 6000 mm. rainfall annually whereas Hatkanangle in the east receives only a little over 500 mm. rainfall. The district gets rain from the south-west as also from the north east monsoons. The main rainy season is from June to October. Ajra, Chandgad, Gaganbawada, Radhanagari and Shahuwadi

~~Some of the~~ tahsils come in the heavy rainfall tract. Tahsils Bhudargad, Gadhinglaj, Karvir have sufficient rainfall, Kagal tahsil falls in rather insufficient rainfall tract. While Hatkanagale, and Shirol tahsils come under poor rainfall track receiving rainfall below 650 mm.

1.9 Scarcity Conditions

Scarcity conditions did not occur in Kolhapur district during 1974-75

1.10 Demography

The population of Kolhapur district is 2048, 049 as per 1971 census. The per square km. population density is 254, for the district as a whole. In rural area the density is 204 whereas in Urban area it is 2295. Barring greater Bombay district, Kolhapur district has the highest density of population in 1971. Among the tahsils of the district, Karvir tahsil has the highest population density viz. 704 and Bawada tahsil the lowest viz. 92.

1.11 Compared to the 1961 census data, the 1971 census population of Kolhapur district shows an increase of 28.28 per cent in total count. In urban area the decadal increase is very much higher viz 43.04% as against 24.76% in rural area in the district. The tahsilwise figures of decadal increase which are above the district average figure (of decadal variation) are shown below.

- 1) Hatkanangle - 39.77 %
- 2) Karvir - 35.85 %
- 3) Shirol - 31.40 %
- 4) Panhala - 29.99 %

In the rest of the tahsils the percentage of decadal increase in population is below the district average. The descending ranking is as below.

1) Radhanagari	24.52 %

1.12 Considering only the urban area it is observed that the percentage decadal increase highest in Hatkanagale tahsil, viz. 65.48. In shirol tahsil it is 45.05. The percentage increase is lowest in Panhala tahsil viz. 13.91

1.13 Administrative set up

The district is under the control of the district Collector who is also the District Magistrate. He is in charge of general administration law and order, land revenue and civil supply. He is assisted by a Resident Dy. Collector in his office. The three revenue Sub-divisions in the district are in charge of Grant Officers. The tahsils are under the charge of tahsildars.

1.14 The Zilla Parishad at the district level and the 12 Panchayat Samities at the tahsil level were formed in 1962 to give impetus to the developmental plans and promoting active participation of the people. The area of operation extends to the rural area of the district.

1.15 The following towns in this district have municipal councils. 1) Ichalkaranji 2) Gadhinglaj 3) Jaysingpur 4) Kurundwad 5) Panhala 6) Malkapur 7) Murgud 8) Vadgaon and Kagal. Kolhapur city has a Municipal Corporation.



1.16. Special Features of the district

The Kolhapur district is very well known for its Gur production. The district produces and exports quality Gur. Besides this there are a number of cooperative sugar mills spread over the district contributing a large share to the state's sugar production. The recovery percentage of sugar is markedly high in this district.

1.17 Another important industry of export value is the Kolhapur chappal. There are a number of small scale manufacturing unit in this district preparing Kapashi and Kolhapuri chappals which have been taken fancy to, by the people in India and abroad. A number of small scale units manufacturing Oil engines and spare parts of engines have thrived in kolhapur city. Power-loom weaving industry has prospered. <sup>Very</sup> well in Ichalakaranji town.

1.18 The Gymnastic sports, which received a great impetus during the regime of His Highness Chhatrapati Shahu Maharaja, still continue to be of importance in this district. The development of arts, sports, educational institutions are the reminiscents of the efforts and patronage of the ex. princely State of Kolhapur.

## CHAPTER - II

### EXPLANATORY NOTES

2.1. As the caption indicates, this chapter is meant to give scope and limitations of the statistical data presented in this issue.

2.2. The statistical tables given in the second part of this issue present tahasilwise data and they cover following 12 major subjects.

1. Area and Population.
2. Climate.
3. Agriculture.
4. Animal Husbandry and forest.
5. Industry, Employment, Mining and Electricity
6. Co. operation.
7. Medical and Public Health.
8. Education.
9. Transport and Communication
10. Local bodies.
11. Plan and Community Development, and
12. Prices.

2.3. Statistics on miscellaneous subjects like

- i) Police force and crime.
- ii) Court Cases
- iii) Cinema.
- iv) Banks, Joint Stock Companies.
- v) Insurance.
- vi) Small Savings etc.

are given in the last section named 'miscellaneous' In addition, Kolhapur District at a glance which gives comparative data of Kolhapur district and the State of Maharashtra and Trends in Selected Indicators are also given in the Abstract.

2.4

Area and Population

The tables on this subject are based on 1971 Census of population. While referring to data on urban area it should be noted that a town/urban area is a place which has a municipal council, a Cantonment, or a Civil line or a place having population of 5000 or over and having a density of not less than 400 per sq. km. and at least 75 percent of male population dependent on non-agricultural pursuits, Or the place should have according to the Director of Census Operations a few pronounced urban characteristics and amenities

Regarding data on Scheduled castes and Scheduled Tribes it may be noted that the data include only these castes and Tribes declared as Scheduled Castes and Tribes in Kolhapur district.

2.6

Unlike 1961 Census, at the time of 1971 Census it was stipulated that a person primarily engaged in household duties or those who were students and helped in family economics activity, but not on a full time scale should be treated as " Non-Worker" in respect of their main activity.

2.7

Climate

Rainfall and temperature data of the selected centres are given in the tables under this section. The temperature data is given for only one centre and as such it cannot be said to be representative temperature of the district. The figures of normal rainfall are the averages, based on actual rainfall for the periods ranging from minimum of five years to <sup>maximum</sup> of eighty years. As regards rainy day, a day is treated as a rainy day, if during the twenty four hours, the rain gauge records a minimum of 2.5 mm. of rainfall.

Agriculture

Tables under this section cover data on many ~~minimum~~ important subjects like--

- 1) Land Utilisation.
- ii) Yield per hectare and Out-turn of Crops
- iii) Sourcewise Irrigation of Area.
- iv) Agricultural Wages rates.
- v) Famine and Scarcity Conditions etc.

Concepts of some important terms used in these tables are as follows.

Forest :- They include all forest areas state owned or private, classed and administered as forests under legal enactment.

Barren & Unculturable lands :- They include mountains, river beds etc. i.e. lands which cannot be brought under cultivation unless at a very high cost.

Culturable Waste :- This includes land which can be brought under cultivation but have not been cultivated or having been cultivated for some time have not been cultivated during current year and the last five years or more in succession.

Current fallows :- Lands which are left fallow during the current year only.

Other fallows :- All lands which have been cultivated, but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and not more than five years.

Gross Cropped area :- This is the sum of areas under all crops and represent the sum of net area sown and area sown more than once in a year.

Yield rates of crops :- They are expressed in terms of kg. per hectare for almost all crops except sugarcane and cotton. Yield rate of sugarcane is given in terms of Gur and is in kg. per hectare, and that of cotton in terms of hundred bales of 180 kg. each. Yield rates are based on the estimates obtained from the crop estimation surveys conducted on sample basis.

Minor Irrigation Works:- Work involving an expenditure of less than Rs. 20 lakh is treated as 'minor Irrigation Work' Works with potential irrigable area upto 250 acres is entrusted to the Zilla Parishads while those above 250 acres to the Irrigation Department.

Agricultural Wage Rates:- Monthly average rates based on data collected fortnightly from three selected centres in the district are presented.

## 2.9 Animal husbandry, Forests and Fisheries

Data on livestock number, Veterinary, recognised slaughter houses, major and minor forest product etc. are given in this section. Livestock Census is carried out every five years. The last Census was done in 1973 data of which is reproduced in this issue. The entire area under the control of Forest Department is classed as forest area by that department though some area in forest might have been brought under cultivation and classed such by the Agricultural department in their agricultural Statistics. This explains the variation in the area under forests as given in forest statistics and that reported by the Agril. Deptt. and shown in the land utilisation table.

## 2.10 Employment, Industry, Electricity and Mining:-

Under this section statistics on the various subjects mentioned above is presented. The data on factory statistics is of factories registered under Factories Act-1948. Viz. those employing 10 or more workers with aid of power and those employing 20 or more workers and working without aid of power.

## 2.11 Co-operation

Comprehensive statistics on various types of Co-operative Societies, Co-operative Banks, Regulated Markets and Money lenders is displayed in the tables under this section. The Co-operative year starts in July and ends in June.

2.12 Public Health

Data regarding medical and Public health facilities, birth and death statistics, family planning is incorporated in this section.

2.13 Education

Statistical data on subjects like literacy, number of students, teachers, backward class beneficiaries and concessions to the economically Backward Classes, expenditure ~~xxxx~~ ~~this xxxxxxxx~~ ~~Some of the data is~~ ~~xxxx~~ ~~on~~ education etc. presented in the tables under this section. Some of the data is based on the 1971 Census while in respect of other the data for the latest year is incorporated under this section.

2.14 Transport & Communication

Important Statistics on traffic census, road length, rail length, motor vehicles in operation, Operational Statistics of the Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation, Posts, telegraphs and telephones, rural broadcasting statistics are given in this section.

2.15 Local Bodies

Classified Income and Expenditure statistics of the Zilla Parishad, the Village Panchayats and The Municipal Councils is presented in this section.

2.16 Plan and Community Development

Plan expenditure under different development sub heads, Physical achievements under plan, data on community Development Programme and expenditure incurred in different stages of the block are included in this section. The data are collected by the District Statistical Office.

2.17 Prices

Wholesale Prices of certain regulated agricultural commodities in the district and retail prices prevailing

at the district head quarter, the Consumer price Indices of Solapur and Pune Centres are included in this section. It may be noted that the retail price statistics reported for a given commodity is restricted to only one quotation collected from a specified shop in the district head quarter. The average price shown for commodity, therefore, cannot be said to be fully representative. The data may prove to be useful only as a broad indicator of the trend in price change over a period of time. The data are for calendar year.

### 2.18 Miscellaneous.

This section covers statistical data on subjects such as Police Force and Crimes, Insurance, Small Savings, News Papers, Periodicals and Land Revenue etc. In case of Revenue, the amount of remission is taken as reduction in the demand of the land revenue, suspension taken as addition to arrears as the amount is to be collected in subsequent year. The figures of Land Revenue are exclusive of cess.

### 2.19 Trends in Selected Indicators.

Trends in important items such as population, agriculture, livestock, electricity, industry, education, health etc. are given for the years 1950-51, 1960-61, 1966-67 and 1970-71, 1973-74 and 1974-75. Cultivable area for which an indicator is worked out, includes net area sown, current fallows, other fallows, land under miscellaneous trees and groves not included in net area sown and cultivable waste land. Length of surface roads is another indicator. The surface roads include all roads excluding Municipal roads.

CHAPTER - III

AN ANALYTICAL REVIEW OF SECTORAL TRENDS- 1974-75

3.1 Utilising the data in the various tables under part II of this volume an attempt is made below to find out broad sectoral trends over the last two years.

3.2 AGRICULTURE

Agriculture pursuit in Maharashtra still continues to be at the mercy of rains. This is the most vulnerable section of the State's economy. Efforts are underway to increase production, by bringing more and more land under cultivation, through intensive cultivation through extensive use of inputs and through creating additional irrigation potential. The data available for the years 1972-73 and 1973-74 is of provisional nature and is likely to be revised. Hence the following comments are liable to change when final data is received.

The trends are therefore to be reviewed taking in to consideration the provisional nature of the data in respect of agricultural tables.

3.3 The percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown in each tahsil of Kolhapur district is shown in the following table.

3.4 The percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown was 103 in Kolhapur district in 1960.61. The subsequent years record a fall in this percentage. Among the tahsils, Panhala, Radhanagari and Shahuwadi had this percentage above the district average in 1960.61, but the data for subsequent years reveal that they did not maintain the level of 1960.61, A slight increase is seen in this percentage in Shirol tahsil in the year 1973.74 while it has dwindled in respect of all other tahsils in 1973.74. This is not a very happy position. This indicates a set back to double cropping practice .

3.5 In terms of absolute hectares, the Gross cropped area is found to have increased from 409514 ha. in 1971.72 to 412967 ha. in 1973.74. While the net sown area increased from 405626 ha. to 409961 ha. during the same period.

IRRIGATION

3.6 The net irrigated area in Kolhapur district was 38208 ha. in 1960.61, 47844hg. in 1972.72, and 55063 ha. in 1973.74. The net increase in irrigated area was 25 percent during the period 1960.61 to 1971.72, The year 1973.74 marks 44 percent increase in net irrigated area over 1960.61 base.

3.8 Excepting Panhala, Hatkanangle and Kagal Tahsils the

3.12 The percentage of area under food crops which has dwindled in 1971.72 to 62.76 has slightly gone up to 64.83, however, it has not reached the level of 1960.61 which was 65.15 percent.

3.13 Rice is the predominant cereal crop of Kolhapur district. More than one fifth of the cropped area is under rice. The percentage area is seen declining slowly over years. Percentage area under jowar has improved.

3.14 The percentage area under sugarcane which was only 7.50 in 1960.61 has gone up to 10.42 in 1973.74. In the year 1971.72, the drift of area sown <sup>from</sup> food crops to non food crops was comparatively more. The position appears to have changed slightly in the year 1973.74 where percentage of area under nonfood crops is found to have dwindled to 35.17 from 37.24 in 1971.72.

#### YIELD RATES

Maharashtra State is not self sufficient in food production. With limited scope to bring additional land under cultivation, the strategy has to be <sup>got</sup> maximum yields by utilising improved agricultural practices. Research in improved varieties of crops, campaigns to propogate adoption of improved practices of cultivation, intensive cultivation have been launched over a long time since plan programme <sup>is</sup> started. The ultimate result <sup>in the impro-</sup> <sub>concise</sub> vement of yield rates can be put-down in a table as below.

3.16 The year 1972.73 was one of the abnormal years scarcity conditions prevailed owing to drought throughout the district. The yield rates in that year naturally received a set back.

3.17 Jowar, Chillies Sugarcane and Tobacco are the crops whose yield rates have fallen in 1973.74 when compared to the base year 1960-61 and the year 1971.72 Wheat, Ragi, Tur and Groundnut have improved considerably in their yield rates in 1973.74. Rice has attained the yield rate of 1960.61. Once again in 1973.74.

3.18 The year 1973.74 has shown better yield rates than those in the previous year 1972.73.

3.19 AGRICULTURAL CREDIT

The Co. Operative credit societies considerably meet the needs of cultivators in the rural areas. Almost all the villages in this district have been covered by the primary co-op credit societies. The number of primary agricultural credit societies

which was 879 in 1973.74 dwindled to 877 in 1974.75. The member slip of these societies however increased from 2.55 lakh to 2.5 lakh during the same period. Share capital rose from Rs. 624.57 lakh to Rs. 685.40 lakh and the working capital increased from Rs. 2382.57 lakh to Rs. 2,805.89 lakh in the same period loans advanced in 1974-75 amounted to Rs. 1633.70 lakh as against Rs. 1293.20 lakh in the previous year. The rise is 26.33 percent and is by no means a small rise. The recovery percentage in both the years remained stationary at 80. The outstanding loans and overdues increased by 12.44 per cent and 41.61 per cent respectively in 1974.75 over those in the previous year. The average loan per member works out to Rs. 634 in 1974-75 as against 508 in 1973.74. The loan recovery is above average in respect of the primary co-op credit societies in the tahsils of Karvir, Shirol, Bhudargad, and Radhanagari.

#### AGRICULTURAL WAGE RATES

3.20 The agricultural wage rate data are collected from three rural centres, namely-Shirol, Kapashi and Madilge, B.K. The salient feature of the wage rates is <sup>that</sup> the rates are always higher at the centre Shirol in comparison with those of the other two centres. The reason for this trend may be sought in the close proximity of the centre Shirol to urban areas Jaysingpur and Kurundwad.

3.21 The male and female unskilled field labour got Rs. 4 and Rs. 3 respectively at Shirol centre in 1974. Whereas those in Kapashi and Madilge centre received between Rs. 2.00 and 2.72 (males) 2.00 & 2.90 (females), and Rs. 2.00 & 3.00 (for both males and females) respectively during 1974. These rates are found to be higher than those prevailing in 1973 in all the centres.

#### 3.22 ANIMAL HUSBANDRY

Animal husbandry plays an important supporting role of supplementing food programme and also provides greater avenues of employment in rural areas, It still provides drought power to cultivation.

3.23 The Eleventh quinquennial-Livestock census was carried out in 1972. The comparative picture of livestock and poultry emerging from the last two censuses is as below.

3.24 The total livestock population has increase by 6 percent during the five year period 1966 to 1972. The cattle population has however declined, by 6 per cent while buffaloes show a big rise of 18 percent. Poultry has increased by a very insignificant margin during this period.

3.25 The number of milch animals per 1000 human population and the number of working bullocks per 100 hectares of gross cropped area in 1966 and in 1972 are shown below.

3.26 The No. of milch animals per unit has reduced in 1972 in all the tahsils of Kolhapur of Kolhapur district. The No of working bullocks per unit has shown slight improvement in 1972 for the district as a whole. It has decreased in case of Karvir, Hatkanangle, Shirol Kagal and Gaganbavda tahsils.

### 3.27 ELECTRICITY CONSUMPTION OF

The total consumption of electricity in 1973.74 in Kolhapur district was 260.54 million KWH. The consumption rise to 344.78 million KWH. in the year 1974-75. The trend of the per capita consumption of electricity serve as an indicator of fast development in the field of use of energy in industries and agriculture. The per capita consumption was 12.37 KWH in 1960.61. It was 93.84 KWH in 1970.71 and 127.21 KWH in 1973.74. In 1974.75 this rose to 168.35 KWH. The indicators for 1973.74, 1974.75 are based on 1971 census population of 20.48 lakh. The progress of per capita consumption of electricity is spectacular, of the total consumption of electricity, 62.52 percent consumption, is in the industrial sector alone, while 26.07 percent consumption is in the agricultural development sector in 1974.75. All the urban areas in the district and <sup>75</sup> percent of the rural area are electrified.

### 3.28 EMPLOYMENT

The unemployed man power is a drag on the national wealth. The gravity of the unemployment situation in the district can be well judged from the statistics available from the district Employment Exchange.

3.29 The job seekers are increasing at an alarming rate while corresponding placement in jobs is decreasing 25 per cent of candidates during 1974-75. Though exhaustive statistics, the placement belonged to Schedule Caste/ST\* of the real unemployed persons both in the organised and unorganised sectors other than that registered with the Employment Exchange is not available. The gravity of the unemployment situation would be clear from the statistical data as available with the employment exchange.

PUBLIC HEALTH

Medical and public health facilities are increasing year after year both in the public and private sectors. Data of facilities in private sector is not available on full scale. The trend of increasing facilities in the public sector is shown in the following table.

3.31 The doctor population ratio decreased from 1:22963 in 1961 to 1: 15576 in 1971 & to 1: 13386 in 1974. However the recommended ratio is 1 : 3000. This can be achieved only if the no: of doctors & Vaidyas in the district is increased by additional 530. The hospital beds facility too has not improved very much. The number of beds added since 1971 is only 35.

3.32 Another indicator in the field of public health is the trend of birth rate & death rate.

EDUCATION

The literary percentage is 35.37 of Kolhapur district according to 1971 census. It is however higher in urban areas viz. 55.60 per cent. The literary <sup>is</sup> 29.83 per cent in rural areas of the district. According to sex classification, 49.73 per cent males and 20.34 per cent females are literate.

3.34 Educational statistics at various levels serves as an indicator of development.

3.35 The percentage increase in the number of pupils at the higher level is comparatively more in the year 1973.74 than in 1972.73. In 1972.73 the percentage increase at higher level was Boys-8, & Girls-1, The percentage increase in respect of Girls is conspicuous. On the other hand the rise in the percentage of boys & girls at the primary and Secondary level of education in 1973.74 has fallen short of the rate of increase in 1972.73, which were: Primary- Boys-4 % girls-7% & secondary, Boys 4 % & girls- 42 %. In fact there has been a reduction in case of Girl students at secondary level. The percentage increase of Girls students at primary level is much higher than that of boys.

3.36 Another indicator in this field is the ratio of pupils to teachers.

3.37 The ratio of pupils to teacher has declined in case of primary and secondary level of education in 1973.74 when compared to the previous year, while in case of higher education it has increased from 21 to 23.

BANKING

3.38 With the growing awareness of the need to cater to the rural credit requirements the number of branches of the commercial and Co-operative banks opening the rural areas is on the increase. During the decade 1961-71 the number of banking offices in Kolhapur district increased from 51 to 130. In 1974 the number rose to 173 of which 96 were branches of co-operative banks alone.

These banking offices are spread over 56 towns and villages in the district. Considering the entire population of the district the ratio of No. of banks to a lakh population works out to 8.45 for 1974. This ratio was 3.3 in 1961 and 6.3 in 1971. Thus it is seen that the number of banking offices per lakh population has increased by two and half times in 1974 over 1961 position. This is remarkable progress over a short period.

3.39 COMMUNICATION

Rail length underwent no change. However, Road length has considerably increased since 1961. In 1961 the road length was 1764 km. It was 2782 km. in 1971. The present road length is 4171 km. as at the end of March 1975. The indicator of road length per 100 sq. km. area works out to 51.76 for 1975. This compares favourably with the previous indicators of 21.36 of 1961 and 47.67 for 1974.

3.40 PRICES  
 Consumer Price Index Numbers for Solapur centre (base 1960=100) and Pune centre (base 1961=100) rose from 277 and 239 respectively in 1973.74 to 325 and 281 respectively in 1974.75. The Index No. of food group rose from 321 to 367 at Solapur and from 281 to 320 at Pune. Index No. for clothing group also shot up from 249 in 1973.74 to 329 in 1974.75 at Solapur and from 220 in 1973.74 to 272 in 1974.75 at Pune. Fuel group Index rose from 206 to 270 at Solapur and from 212 to 323 at Pune during this period.

## CHAPTER - IV

### ANNUAL PLAN 1974-75

4.1 The year 1974-75, The first year of the Fifth Five Year plan, has started a new <sup>era</sup> in Planning arena of Maharashtra State. The Govt. has accepted the recommendations of the planning Commission and adapted District as a unit of Planning and has formulated district planning and Development Council in each district, to remove intra district and inter district im-balance and to ensure maximum utilisation of local resources and to mobilise the institutional finance in the district so as to supplement the state funds.

4.2 This district was given a ceiling of rupees 441.11 lakh for the year 1974-75. Accordingly the District Planning & Development Council Kolhapur prepared the Annual plan and submitted it to the Govt. But for <sup>this</sup> reason, the Annual Plan 1974-75 emerged from the state Annual Plan.

4.3 The Red-Book of planning Department where in the district-wise break/<sup>up</sup> of outlay of plan schemes was shown, reveals <sup>a</sup> that the budget provision for all the District level plan schemes was to the extent of Rs. <sup>516.43</sup> lakh. However the budget provision as reported by the implementing officers of the various departments amounted to Rs. 458.56 lakhs.

4.4 The plan schemes are implemented by:  
1) State Govt. offices ii) Zilla Parishad and Statutory corporations.

4.5 The total expenditure on all district level plan schemes in 1974-75 amounted to Rs. 364.42 lakh. Thus the percentage of total expenditure to total budget provision as per the Red-Book 71 and the percentage of total expenditure to total budget as reported by the implementing officers is 79.

4.6 The sectorial distribution of budget and expenditure during 1974-75 is as given below.

4.7 Considering both the budget provisions, the expenditure under major heads Agri-Programme, C.D. & Coopertion, Irrigation and power, Industry and Mining and Transport and Communication is satisfactory. The expenditure under major heads social services and Miscalleneous is far from satisfactory.

4.8 Looking to col. 8 of the above table it will be seen that the major share of expenditure is on three heads viz. social services(.43 percent), Agri. programme(.22 percent) and irrigation & power (13 percent) the heads industry & mining and Transport & communications account for 8 and 7 percent respectively. The percentage of expenditure on the remain' ing two heads is as low as 2 percent.

### Agricultural Programme

4.9 Agriculture programme occupies a very high position among the care sector. Besides agriculture production there are number of other schemes to increase production in the fields allied to agriculture viz. forest, dairy and fisheries etc.

4.10 The table given below will show the sub-head wise expenditure under the major head agricultural programme.

4.11 Under the major head Agriculture Programme bulk of expenditure is on two sub-heads viz. Minor irrigation (54 percent) and soil conservation (32 percent). The percentage of expenditure on Agriculture Production is only 5 percent-As a result of this expenditure the production of food grains in the district has attained the level of 2.55 lakh tonnes

### Agriculture Production

The important schemes under the sub-head Agriculture production were integrated area Development, Development of local manur resources.

4.13 The achievement under the scheme local manures Resources was 41593 M. Tonnes as against the target of 58000 M. Tonnes improved seeds were distributed for 1174 Hectares under the schemes integrated Area Development as against the target 1200 hectares.

Minor Irrigation

4.14 Two schemes viz. Construction of new wells and Installation of pumping sets/where in the subsidy are grouped here was given to 58 wells & 51 pumpsets. Loan was given to two co-operative lift irrigation societies. Under the scheme Minor irrigation works 2 tanks were constructed against the target of 7,4 K.T. weirs were completed as against target of 6,2 bandhar<sup>s</sup> were constructed as against target of 7, one percolation tank was completed as against the target of 5 and 3 lift irrigation schemes were completed as against the target of 15. The total irrigation potential created due to the above schemes was 646 hectares.

Soil Conservation

4.15 The achievements of the schemes under sub-head soil conservation are as shown below.

4.16 Thus it will be seen that the targets for afforestation have been fully achieved and the achievement has exceeded the targets in respect of bunding. The target of terra<sup>o</sup>ing was not fully achieved due to withdrawal of funds to the tune of Rs. 3.95 lakh.



### Dairy Development

4.17 The expenditure on both the Schemes viz. Town Milk supply and Assistance to Milk unions has been in excess of the budget provision.

4.18 The target of milk handling per day was fixed at 40000 litres for 74-75. As against this the milk handled per day during 1974-75 was 53000 litres. 37 societies were assisted as against the target of 38 societies.

### Forest

4.19 The targets fixed for all the schemes under this sub-head were fully achieved except in the case of the scheme forest communication. Under this scheme road was to be constructed which was handed over to Tillari Hydro Electric Project and hence the amount was surrendered.

### Fisheries.

4.20 The expenditure was 84 percent of the budget provision for the schemes under this sub-head during 1974-75.

4.21 The target of construction of nursery was not achieved due to non availability of suitable site. The target of fish production was 50 lakh number, however only 4 lakhs could be produced. The number of fingerlings stocked was 6.41 lakhs against the target of 20 lakhs and 0.38 lakhs kg. of fish was netted as against the target of 2 lakh during 1974-75. Under the scheme of fishery requisites 408 kg of nylon twine and 199 kg. of cotton twine was supplied as against the target of 400 kg. and 300 kg. respectively. Loan was not distributed to fishermen under the scheme loans to fisherman as there was no demand.

### Warehousing and Marketing

4.22 There was only one scheme under this subhead viz. giving subsidy to Agriculture Produce Market committees. The expenditure was Rs. 0.51 lakh against the budget provision of Rs. 0.02 lakh. The target is also fully achieved.

### Cooperation & Community Development

4.23 The percentage of expenditure to the budget provision under this major head was almost cent percent. The major scheme under this head is C.D. Programme. The expenditure on this scheme was Rs. <sup>7.44</sup> lakh as against the budget provision of Rs. 7.50 lakh. Out of 338 works 222 works were completed. Most of the targets fixed for other schemes under this head for the year 1974-75 were fully achieved.

### Irrigation & Power

4.24 The Govt. has recently taken a decision to classify the major and medium projects costing <sup>g</sup> more than <sup>Rs.</sup> five crores as state level schemes. Hence there is not a single scheme under the sub-head irrigation as the projects such as Warana, Tulshi and Dhudhaganga and the scheme strengthening of Radhanagari dam were treated as state level schemes. Under power projects there were two schemes viz. Rural electrification and Normal Development. The actual expenditure on this sub-head is more than twice the budget provision in 1974-75.

4.25 This district is the foremost in rural electrification in the state. 4 villages were electrified during the year 1974-75 and by the end of 74-75, <sup>75</sup>

villages were electrified. Under normal development programme 4207 <sup>single</sup> phase, 1043 Triple phase and one high tension connection were provided. The no. of pump-sets energised was 1101.

### Industry & Mining

4.26 The expenditure on this head was Rs. 28.42 lakh as against budget provision of Rs. 21.24 lakh. Thus the expenditure has exceeded the budget provision. The main schemes under this head were package scheme, <sup>h</sup>leat/er complex and Balutedar Societies.

4.27 Under the scheme of this head 3 handloom societies, 4 industrial societies and 12 balutedar societies were given financial assistance for their industrial development. Interest subsidy was given to 193 industries amounting to Rs. 0.07 lakh and subsidy on electricity was given to 233 industries to the extent of Rs. 0.38 lakh. Under the scheme leather complex at Kolhapur only land was purchased to start with design and facility centre.

TRANSPORT & COMMUNICATION

4.28 There were two schemes under this head viz. District Roads including roads in hilly and inaccessible areas and tourism. The expenditure on the scheme Dist. Roads has been increased than the budget provision. The expenditure was incurred on construction of 19 km. of new roads, 4 bridges and 16 C.D. works as against the target of 25 km. new road, 4 bridges and 24 C.D. works. Thus the target is fully achieved in case of bridges only.

4.29 Under the scheme 'Tourism' it was proposed to construct twin cottages at Panhala. However the expenditure on this was as meagre as Rs. 300 only as against the budget provision of Rs. 0.55 lakh

SOCIAL SERVICES

4.30 The distribution of expenditure on different sub-head under the major head social services is given in the following table.

4.31 The budget provision as well as the expenditure during the year 1974-75 under the major head social services claims major chunk of total budget provision and total expenditure. The percentage of budget provision to the total budget provision under this head is 62 percent and the percentage of expenditure to the total expenditure is 43 percent. But the expenditure under this head is only one half of the budget provision during 1974-75. The percentage of expenditure on different sub-heads under this major head is as follows water supply & drainage 60 percent, General Education, 19 percent, Urban development 9 percent, Housing 5 percent and welfare of Back Ward Class 3, and the percentage of expenditure on the remaining sub-heads is as low as 1 percent.

#### GENERAL EDUCATION

4.32 The percentage of expenditure to the budget provision on under this sub-head is 83. The achievements under this sub-head are of the nature of appointments, imparting training, grant of scholarship freeships concessions. Some of the achievements are as follows 113 primary teachers have been appointed under the scheme " grants to Municipal School Boards C<sup>a</sup>nt. Boards " for primary education, 44 schools have been benefited under the scheme" development of non Govt. secondary school, 35 class rooms have been constructed under the scheme, grants of Zilla Parishad for schools building, 93 classes have been attached under the scheme attaching std. V to VII. Training has been given to 1032 primary teachers under the scheme in service

training to primary teachers, 120 and 500 secondary teachers have been trained under the schemes subjectwise summer institution and training for teachers in work experience respectively, Concessions were granted to 57548 students under the scheme educational concessions to E.B.C. pupils and 10 students have been granted scholarship. The work of construction of stadium is in progress under the scheme construction of stadium.

TECHNICAL EDUCATION

4.33 Under this sub-head grant-in-aid of Rs. 1.821 lakh Vidyapith was given to Mouni Gargoti and equipments worth Rs. 0.12 lakh were purchased under the scheme of consolidation of Govt. Polytechnics. However the building construction work was not undertaken due to Govt. ban on construction.

HEALTH

4.34 There were only two schemes viz. Primary Health centres, sub centres and Rural Hospitals (construction) and increase in Medical grants of P.H.C. and sub-centres. Under the scheme Primary Health centre, sub-centres and Rural Hospitals (construction) 6 staff quarters were constructed, 2 centres were provided with electricity and water supply, and Dattawad P.H.C. was upgraded as Rural Hospital.

NUTRITION PROGRAMME

4.35 The financial and physical achievement have been fully achieved under this sub-head.

WATER SUPPLY & DRAINAGE

4.36 The expenditure on this sub-head was over and above the plan provisions. Under Govt. water supply scheme the works under the scheme were (i) Improvement in water supply scheme stage - II Water supply Kolhapur, (ii) Panhala/ Water supply and (iii) Improvement to Kurundwad/ Water supply are in progress. 1432 water metres were fixed under the scheme providing water metres to Kolhapur/ Water supply Under the Municipal water

supply scheme 3 works are completed out of 10 works and the remaining 7 works are in progress. Under the pipe water scheme 5 works are completed out of 58 works. Under the simple measures scheme 87 wells have been constructed. Thus 10 villages have been benefited under the scheme of rural water supply.

#### HOUSING

4.37 The expenditure on this sub-head was only 70 per cent as one scheme was abandoned due to stoppage of work by the contractor and one scheme was withdrawn by the Govt. Extension of village Gaothan scheme was implemented in 8 villages as against the targets of 36 villages 10 zopadpattis were provided with basic amenities, 968 plots were developed under the scheme "Provision of housesites to land less workers and til-ies were provided to 187 huts under the scheme "Til-ing of roofs"

#### URBAN DEVELOPMENT

4.38 The percentage of expenditure to the budget provision under this sub-head was as low as 9. There were only two schemes viz. financial assistance to i) Municipal Councils and ii) Municipal corporations to implement their development plans, under this sub-head. Two Municipal councils were given financial assistance during 1974-75. The scheme "Financial Assistance to Municipal Corporation" was introduced as plan scheme for the first time. The corporations were asked to raise loans from open market to implement their development plans. Accordingly the Kolhapur Municipal corporation had raised loan of Rs. 163 lakh at the end of the year resulting in low expenditure. Thus the Corporation has spent only Rs. 13.50 lakh for development works during 1974-75

#### WELFARE OF BACKWARD CLASSES

4.39 Financial and physical targets under this sub-head have been fully achieved. Most of the schemes under this head are of the nature of granting assistance, aids, scholarships and subsidies to Backward classes. 245 students received tuition fees.

412 students were granted scholarship. 21 irrigation wells were dug at the cost of Rs. 0.42 lakh. 152 cottage industries received assistance to the tune of Rs. 0.63 lakh. Under the scheme of Housing aid to Back ward Class 24 the persons were benefited.

SOCIAL WELFARE

4.40 No scheme was implemented during 1974-75.

LABOUR & LABOUR WELFARE

4.41 Under this sub-head only one scheme of Craftsman training was implemented. Extension to main building and work shop has not started due to ban on construction. Only the implements and machinery of worth Rs. 1.33 lakh was purchased during the year 1974-75.

MISCELLANEOUS

4.42 Under the scheme of Rural Broad-casting 104 radio sets were installed against the target of 120 sets. And under the scheme E.G.S. 25223 man days work was provided under different E.G.S. works in the district.

B-CENTRALLY SPONSORED SCHEMES

4.43 Along with the district level plan schemes central/centrally sponsored schemes are also implemented in the district.

4.44 The sectoral distribution of Budget and expenditure of central/centrally sponsored schemes during the year 1974-75 is given below.

4.45 Total expenditure on centrally sponsored schemes was Rs. 23.71 lakh against the budget provision of Rs. 27.64 lakh during the year 1974-75. Thus the percentage of expenditure to the budget provision is only 86. The percentage of expenditure on different heads was as follows. Social services 80 percent, Agricultural programme 18 and Industry and Mining 2 percent. Thus it may be seen that bulk of the expenditure is on social services in which the scheme Family Planning is being implemented.

4.46 Leaving aside the staff schemes, salient achievement under different schemes are as follows. Demonstrations of 15, 20 and 2 plots were conducted on soyabean, sunflower and F.C.V. Tobacco respectively.

4.47 100 camps were taken and 498 cultivators were trained in high yielding varieties under the schemes of training of farmers. Under the scheme of development of Western Ghat terracing was done in 83.88 hectares against the targets of 50 hectares, 7 cross-breed bulls were introduced for services, and 2 veterinary aid centres were upgraded. Under the major scheme, Family Planning 11630 Family Planning operations were carried out against the target of 13338 operations.

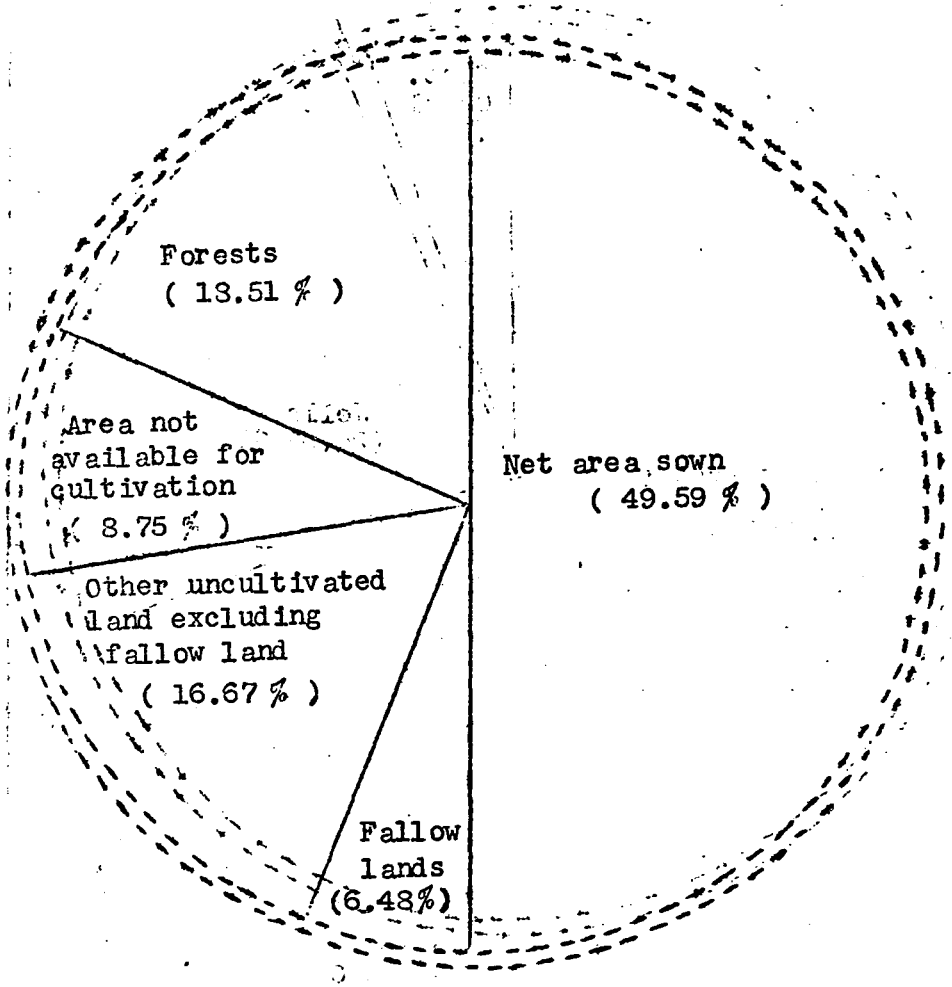
4.48 With the fading of Annual Plan 1974-75. Planning procedure will be reversed and the district people oriental plans will begin to function.

( 1971 - 72 )

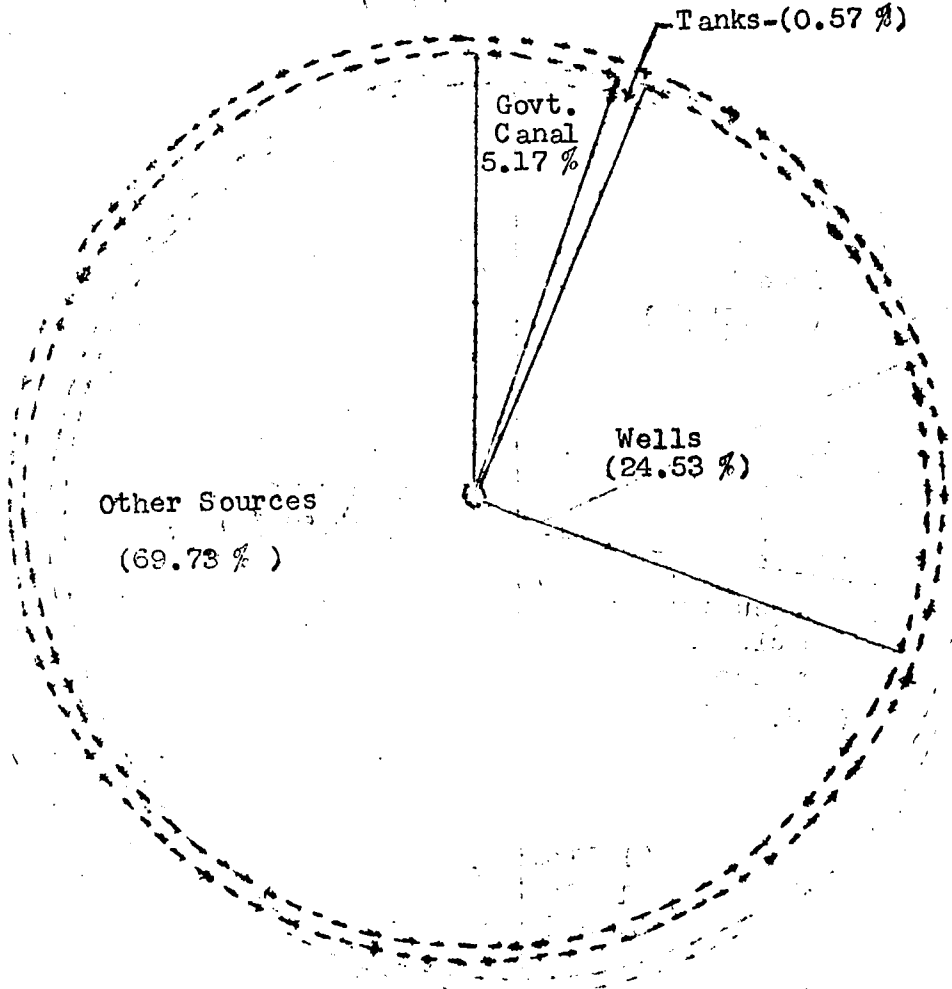

Outturn of Total Cereals And Pulses In Kolhapur District .

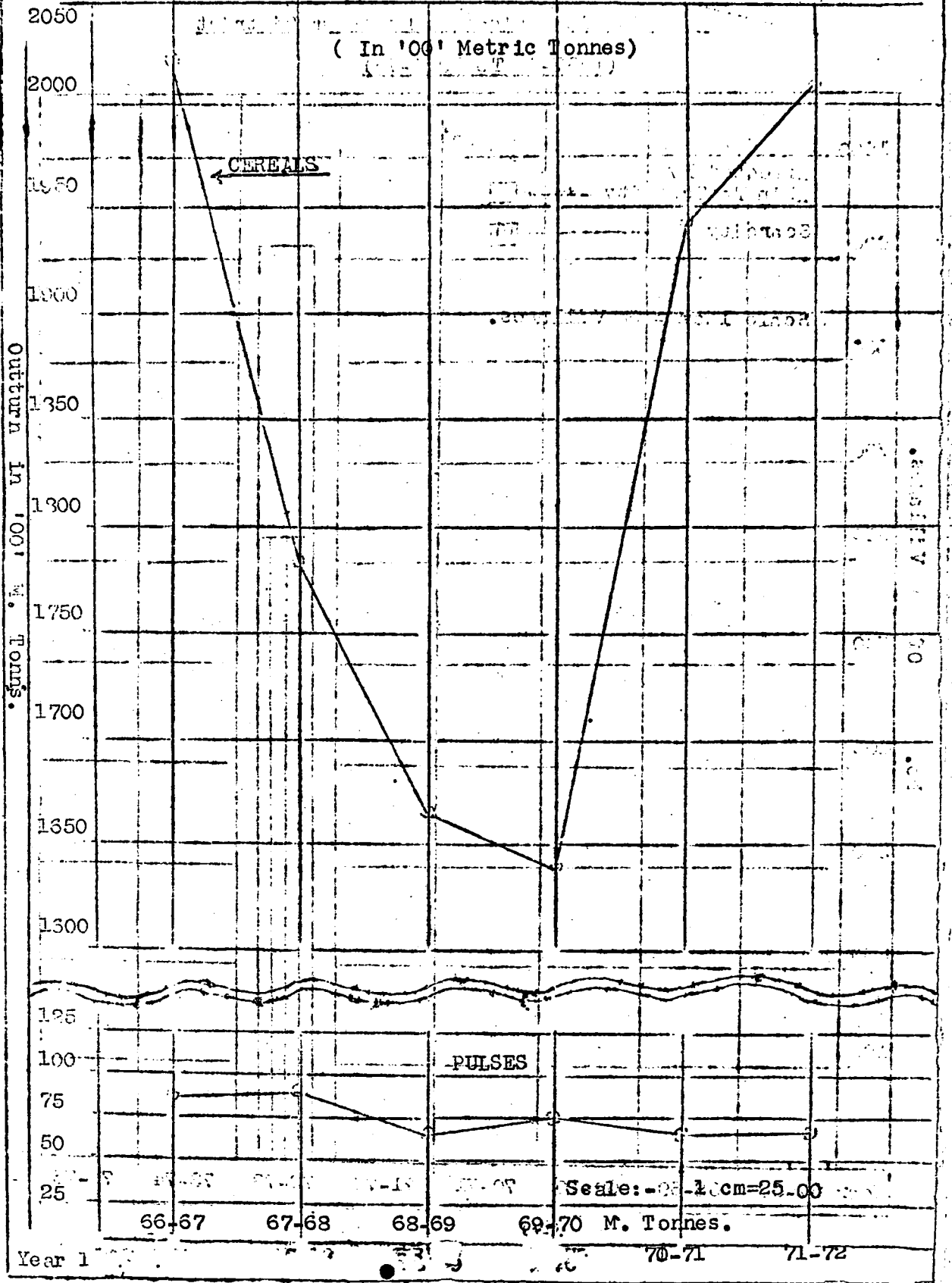

(1967-68 To 1974-75)

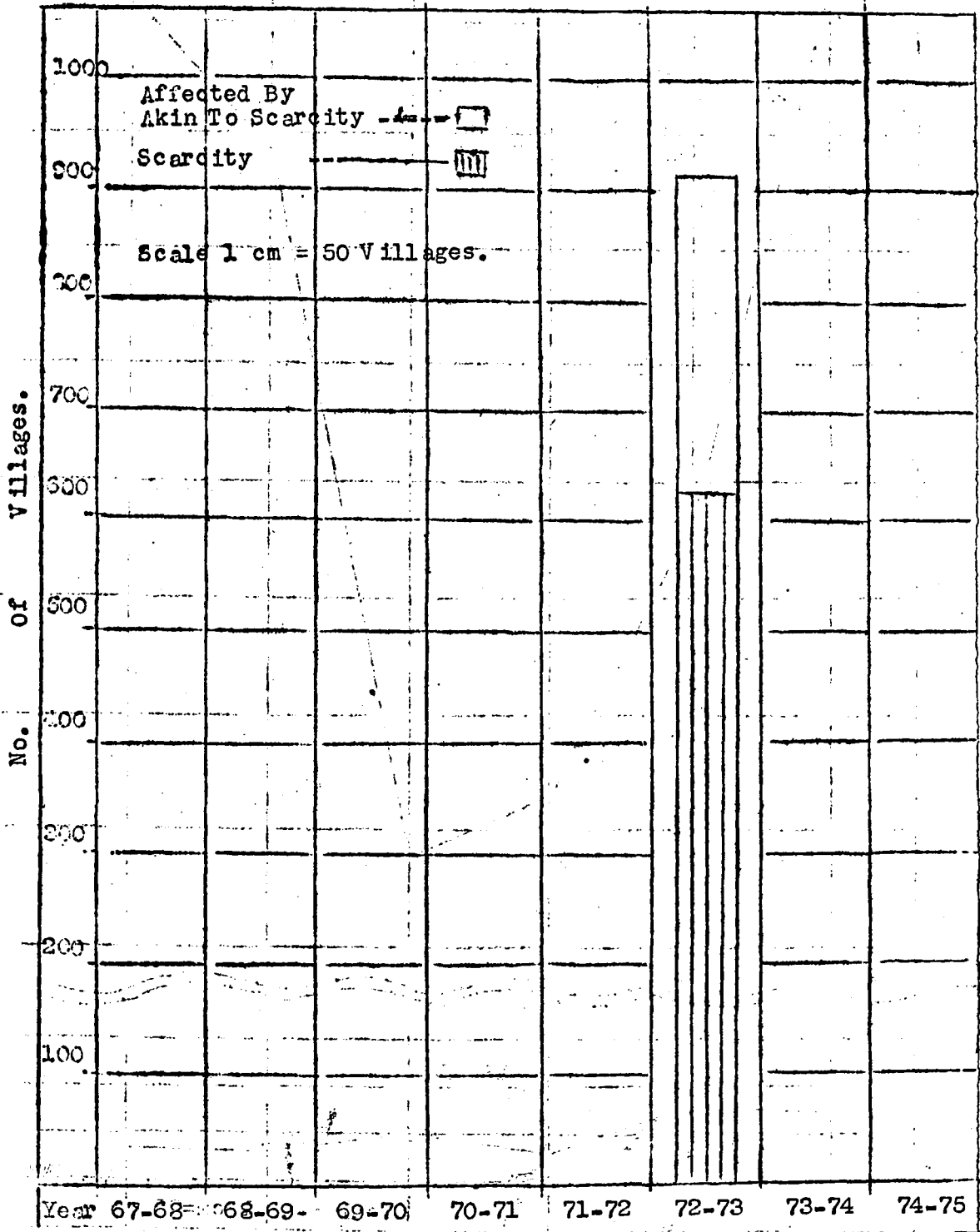
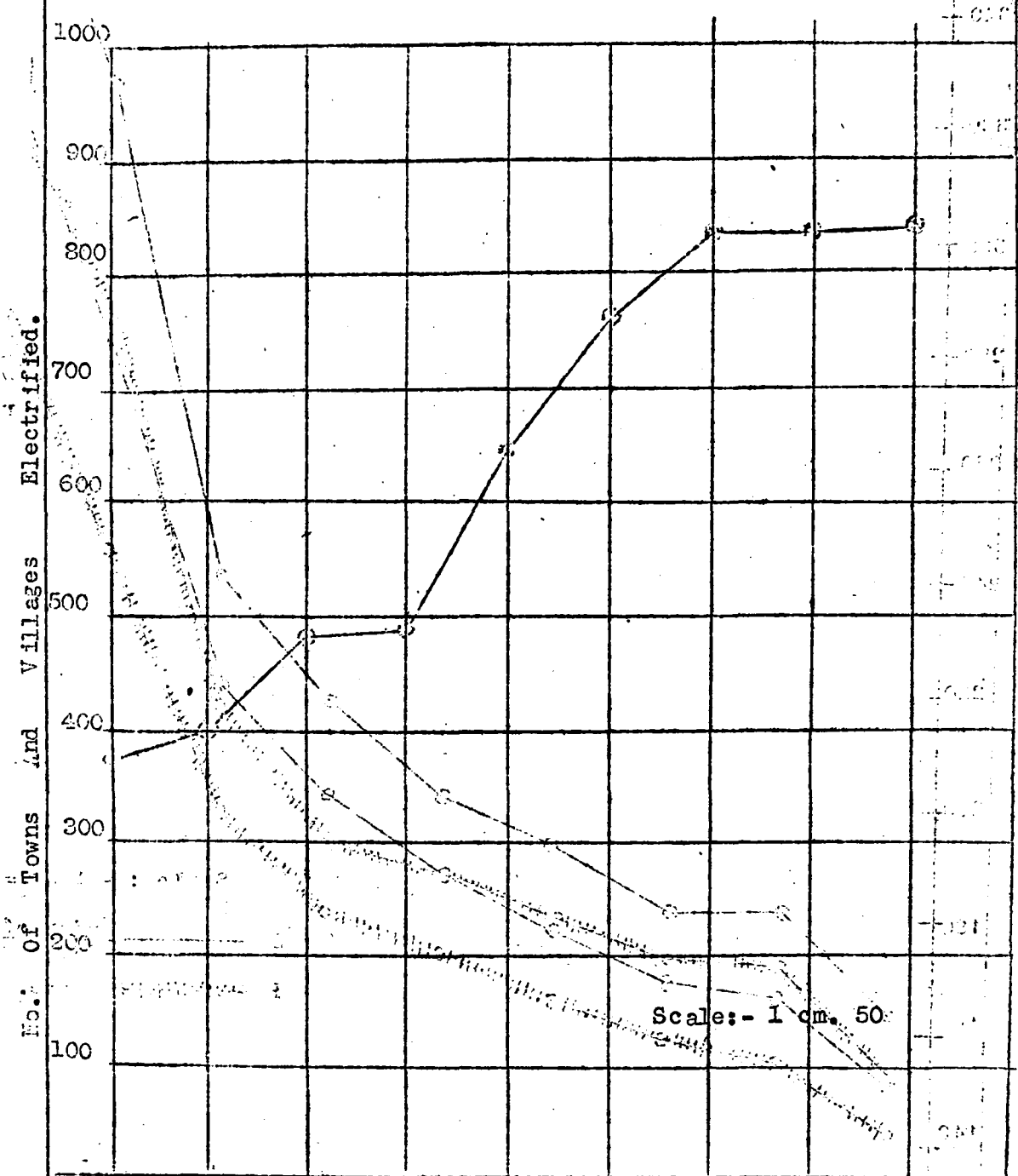

General and Food Indices of Solapur and Pune Centres.

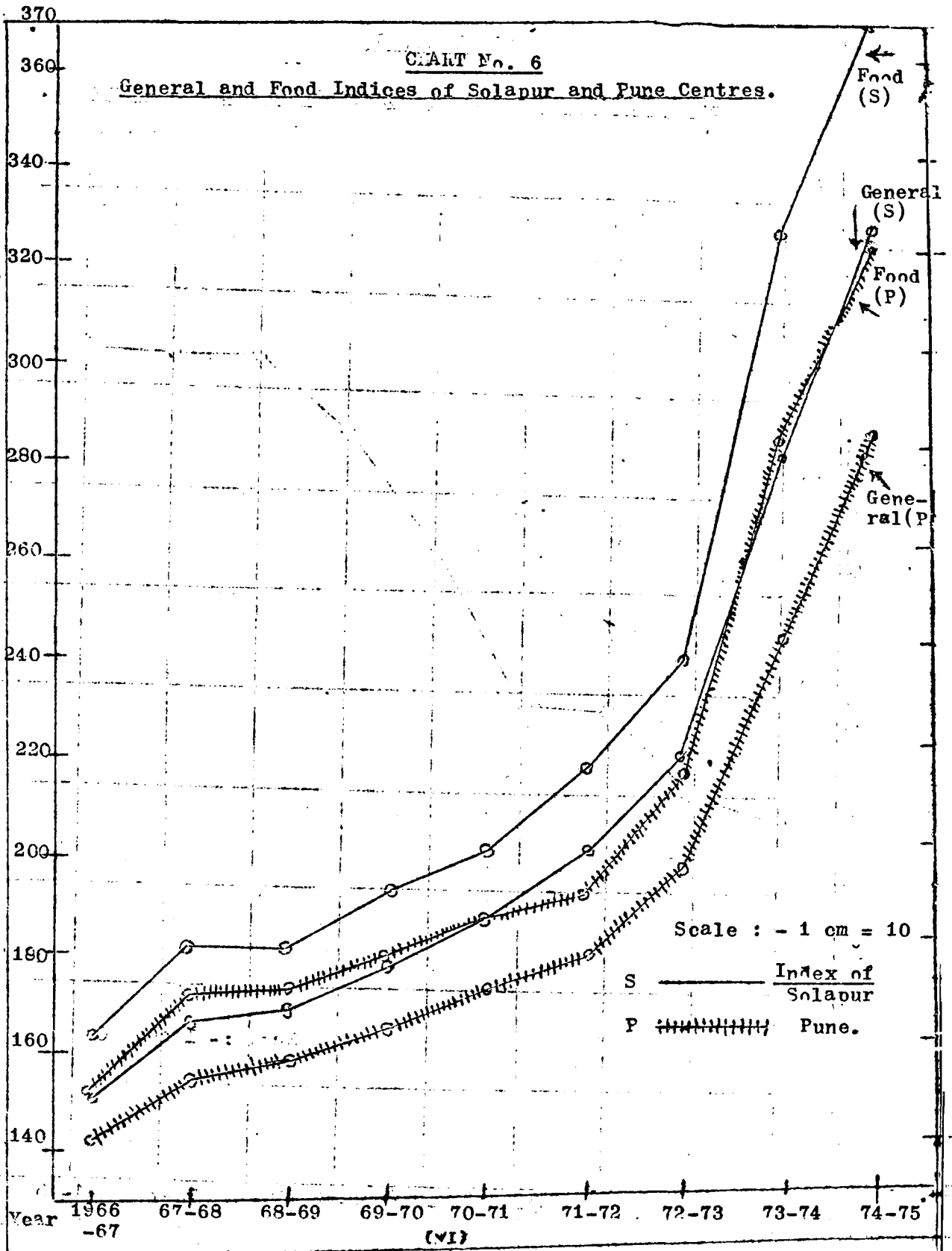
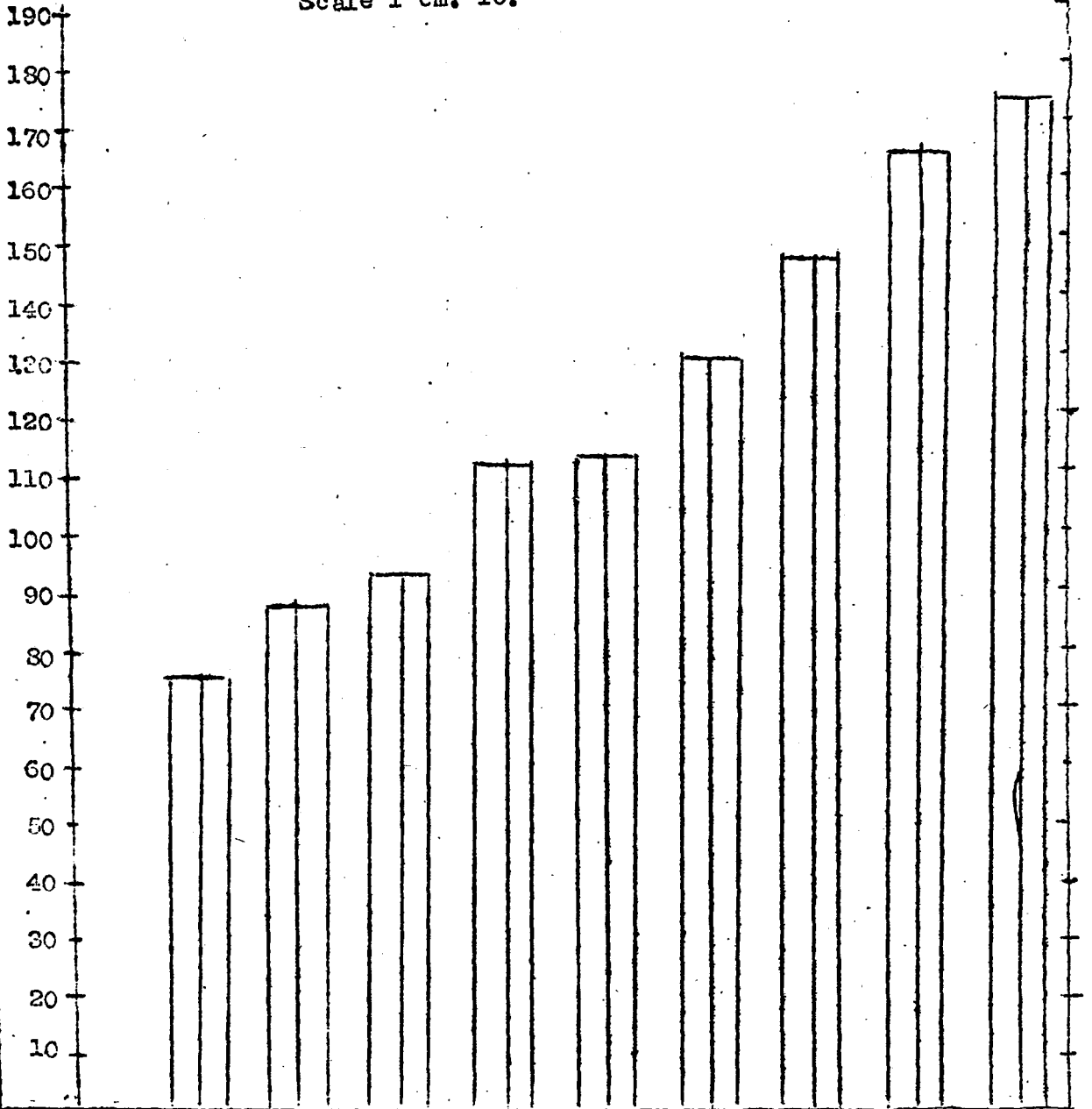
