Introduction

Location

1.1 Dhule District lies between $20^{\circ}-38'$ and $22^{\circ}-03'$ North latitudes and $73^{\circ}-47'$ and $75^{\circ}-11'$ East longitudes. It is situated in the upper Tapi basin on the north west corner of Maharashtra State. The shape of the District is roughly round with a deep wedge like projection of Gujarat territory on the west. The breadth varies from 52 to 122 Kms. and length from 100 to 130 Kms.

Boundaries

1.2 The District is surrounded by Madhya Pradesh in the North, Gujarath in the West, Nasik District in the South and Jalgaon District towards its East.

Topography

1.3.1 The distinguishing feature of topography of Khandesh region is that unlike Deccan plateau the draining or gradient is from East to West so that almost all the rivers flow from East to West. The river Tapi passes through the middle of the District and around its banks, there is a belt of low-lying fertile land.

The Northern region consists of hilly tract which is covered by rich forests and ⁱⁿ the South there are scattered rocky hills which are the tail ~~at~~ ends of the Sahyandri Ranges. Thus there are three regions of the District on the basis of its topography, i) low-lying plains along the Tapi river, ii) hilly region in the North and iii) Low region of scattered rocky hills in the South.

1.3.2 The tahsil of Akrani, Northern parts of Akkalkuwa, and Taloda tahsils lie in the hilly region and have rich forests containing Teak, Sag, and other valuable forest produce.

1.3.3 The tahsils of Nandurbar, Shahada, Shirpur, and parts of Akkalkuwa, Taloda and Sindkheda tahsils lie in the belt of Tapi basin and ~~was~~^{have} rich cultivated land.

1.3.4 Dhule and Sakri tahsils and part of Sindkheda tahsil lie in third region of scattered rocky hills. Nawapur Tahsil is on the South of Tapi basin and is partly hilly and partly consists of plains on the banks of the tributaries of Tapi viz. Raingan and Rangavali.

Hills and Rivers

1.4.1 The Satpuda ranges in the North run East-West and ~~form~~^{form} a natural barrier for communication between Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh. These ranges consist of rugged mountains, which are high at some places and are cut by the tributaries of Tapi viz. Aner, Arunawati and Gomai. In the South run Satmala ranges which are the offshoots of the Sahyadri terminating in scattered rocky hills and leaving low lands in between them which are irrigable and are used for cultivation.

1.4.2 The main river of the District is Tapi which flows from the hilly region of Madhya Pradesh lying north of East to West. It rises in Jalgaon District, and enters Dhule District at Thalner in Shirpur tahsil and in its course forms boundary between Shirpur and Sindkheda tahsils, and further takes its course along the northern boundaries of Sindkheda and Nandurbar tahsils. The total length of the river in this District is 54 Kms. The river Tapi and its tributaries have deposited silt in its basin forming deep ~~is~~ black soil region on both sides of its banks. Construction of wells is therefore rendered difficult due to deep soil. The river Panzara rises in the hills at the South of Sakri tahsil and takes ^{the} East-wards course through Sakri and Dhule tahsils

and then runs in North-East direction to join the Tapi near Thalner just on the border of Dhule and Jalgaon Districts. The total length of ~~the~~ ^{this} river is 136 Kms. A dam has been constructed about 10 Kms. down stream from the hills where the river rises at Pankheda in the south-west of Sakri tahsil to store water for irrigation, and ~~many~~ many bandharas have been constructed in its subsequent course, contributing a large irrigation potential in Sakri and Dhule tahsils. The river Burai rises in the hills in the northern part of Sakri tahsil and runs Eastwards through Sindkheda tahsil upto Chimthane village and then runs north eastwards to join the Tapi near Akhade village. The length of the river Burai is 77 Kms. ^{The} A river Kan which is an important tributary of Burai, rises in the hills at Bhamer in Sakri tahsil and joins it at Chimthane in Sindkheda tahsil. The length of the river Kan is 35 Kms. There are two small rivers viz. Amraoti and Bhogavati which run almost parallel from West of Sindkheda tahsil upto Dondaicha and then after their joining take a northern course for over 7 Kms. to join the Tapi. The other important tributaries of Tapi from the South are Raingan and Rangavali which rise in the hills at the South of Nawapur tahsil and after passing almost parallel in the north-west direction join the Tapi. The important rivers which join the Tapi from the North are Aner, Arunawati and Gomai. The river Aner forms the boundary of this District with Jalgaon District for a length of 38 Kms. A medium irrigation project has been taken up ^{on} ~~at~~ this river which will create an irrigation potential in Shirpur ~~in~~ tahsil on the West and Chopada tahsil of Jalgaon District on the East. The river Arunawati rises in the northern hills of Shirpur tahsil and after passing in ~~its~~ its south-west course for 38 Kms. joins the Tapi near

Vanawal village in Shirpur tahsil. A dam has been constructed on this river at Karwand which has created an irrigation potential in Shirpur tahsil. The river Gomai which rises in the hills at the north-west of Shirpur tahsil runs westwards along the District boundary and enters Shahada tahsil from the north-east and takes south-west course across Shahada Tahsil to join the Tapi at Prakasha in Shahada tahsil. The length of Gomai river is 64 Kms.

Soil

1.5 The District can be broadly divided into three zones on the basis of soil, i) light type, ii) medium type and iii) deep black type which occupy nearly 50, 30 and 20 % respectively of the total area in the District. The light type soil is seen in Dhule, Sakri and Akrani tahsils, western part of Nawapur tahsil and southern part of Nandurbar tahsil. This soil is good for millets and groundnut. Medium black soil is seen in Sindkheda, and western part of Dhule and Sakri tahsils and is suitable for irrigation. Akalkuwa, Taloda, Shirpur, Shahada and Nandurbar tahsils are mostly covered by deep black soil, and have rich cultivated land.

Climate -

1.6 The District has dry ~~xxxxx~~ climate in general. However in Monsoon, however the humidity in the weather rises during showers. The temperatures attained in the hot and cold seasons are extremes which are typical of tropical temperate zones. The three seasons of the year are Summer, Rainy and Winter. The Summers are intolerably hot, especially in May and June. The fall in temperature at dusk and dawn is markedly seen even in Summer. The maximum temperature recorded during April 1974 at Nandurbar Centre was

44.0° C. and the minimum temperature during the same month was 20.8° C. The difference between the ~~maximum maximum temperatures~~ ~~during the same month~~ and minimum temperatures recorded at Mandurbar varied from 12.7° to 23.2° C. The Winter season in January and December is pleasant. The minimum temperature during January 1974 at Mandurbar was 9.1° C. Summer season is followed by monsoon season from June to September and thereafter there is a spell of hot month of October. The Winter season starts from November and lasts upto middle of February. The Summer season starts after winter and lasts upto June.

Rainfall -

1.7.1 The total rainfall recorded at Dhule, Nawapur, Mandurbar Taloda, Akkalkuwa, Shirpur, and Sindkheda during 1974 was less than the normal rainfall, while that recorded at Shahada differed from the normal rainfall by a slight margin of 5.4 m.m. and that recorded at Dhadgaon (Akroni Tahsil) and Sakri was more than the normal rainfall. The overall rainfall in the District was not much satisfactory and had just sustained the crops. ~~xxx~~ Eastern part of the District covering Dhule, Sakri, Sindkheda, and part of Mandurbar Tahsils are declared as drought prone, and scarcity or akin to scarcity conditions usually exist in these areas. The Tahsils of Nawapur, Akkalkuwa, Akroni, Shahada and ~~fx~~ hilly areas of Shirpur and Mandurbar usually receive more rainfall than other parts of the District.

Area and territorial changes

1.8 The total geographical area of the District as per 1971 Census is 13,143 Sq.Kms. The District accounts for 4.27 percent of Maharashtra State in terms of area. The 1971 Census shows increase in the number of inhabited and uninhabited villages by 19 and 2 respectively as compared to 1961 Census. There are seven towns covering an area of 91.9 Sq.Kms. in the District.

Forest -

1.9.1 The forest in the District covers an area of 3919.7 Sq.Kms. of which 3,624.9 Sq. Kms. are in charge of Forest Department and 294.8 Sq.Kms. are in charge of Revenue Department. The area covered under forest i.e. 3,919.7 Sq.Kms. accounts for

29.82 per cent of the total geographical area of the District. The forest under the jurisdiction of forest department consists of reserved forest and ~~and~~ unclassed forest.

1.9.2 The forest under the jurisdiction of Forest Department are administratively under the control of Divisional Forest Officers of North and West Divisions. The North Dhule Forest - Division comprises of forests in Shirpur, Shahada, Akrani, and Akkalkuwa tahsils and the West Dhule Forest Division comprises of forests in Taloda, Nawapur, Nandurbar/^{Dhule} and Sakri tahsils. The forest produce during 1974-75 was of the value of Rs.63.30 lakhs.

Minerals -

1.10 No minerals of value are found in the District. The mineral activities in the District are therefore ~~restricted~~ - restricted to quarrying of stones and clay.

Population

1.11.1 The total population of Dhule District as per 1971 Census is 16,62,181. The District accounts for 3.31 percent of Maharashtra State in terms of population. Increase in the total population during the last 10 years ~~is~~ is 3,10,945 which is 23.01 percent of the total population of 1961. The percentage of variation in population in earlier decade viz. 1951-61 was 27.44. There are wide variations in the growth rates of population in different tahsils. Akkalkuwa tahsil has recorded the highest rate of 37.22 percent, while Taloda tahsil has had the lowest growth rate of 10.58 percent which is nearly half of the District average. The central tahsils of Taloda, Shahada, Shirpur, Nandurbar, and Sindkheda, which have fertile land have shown lower growth rates than the District average. The tahsils which are hilly and which

are mostly covered by forest have had high growth rates of population. Such tahsils are Akrani, Akkalkuwa, Nawapur and Sakri.

1.11.2 The densities of population for Dhule District and its tahsils as per 1961 and 1971 Censuses are as under -

The population density of the District as a whole has increased from 108 in 1961 to 126 in 1971. Within the District, Taloda tahsil has the highest density of 198 persons per Sq.Km. and Akrani tahsil has the lowest density of 76 persons per Sq.Km.

1.11.3 The proportion of urban and rural population to the total population as per 1971 Census was 17.31 and 82.69 percent respectively. The corresponding proportions of urban and rural

populations to total population during 1961 was 15.97 and 84.03 per cent respectively showing an increase in the percentage ratio of urban population by 1.34. ~~There was an equal reduction in the percent ratio of total population from 1961 to 1971.~~ The No. of urban centres during 1961 and 1971 were the same and the increase in the proportion of urban population might be due to migration of rural population to urban centres.

1.11.4 According to 1971 classification of population into workers and non workers, there were 5,94,691 workers and 10,67,490 non-workers during 1971. The distribution of workers into different categories shows that 2,18,686 (36.77%) were cultivators, 2,60,807 (43.86%) were agricultural labourers and 1,15,198 (19.37%) were workers in other categories. The ratio of agricultural labourers to cultivators is more than one in Dhule, Nandurbar, Taloda, Shahada Shirpur and Sindkheda tahsils which are agriculturally rich and it is less than one in other tahsils of Sakri, Nawapur, Akkalkuwa, and Akrani, which are mostly inhabited by tribal population. ~~The ratio of agricultural labourers to cultivators is more than one in Sakri, Nandurbar, Taloda, Shahada, Shirpur and Sindkheda tahsils which are agriculturally rich and it is less than one in other tahsils of Sakri, Nawapur, Akkalkuwa, and Akrani, which are mostly inhabited by tribal population.~~

General Administrative Set-up -

1.12.1 This District is one of the six districts included in Bombay Division. The Collector is the head of the District as far as ~~general~~ law and order and collection of land revenue are concerned. He is assisted by two sub-divisional Officers of the rank of Deputy Collector with head quarters at Dhule and Nandurbar who are in turn in charge of 1) Dhule, 2) Sakri, 3) Shirpur, and 4) Sindkheda, Tahsils and 1) Nandurbar, 2) Akkalkuwa, 3) Akrani, 4) Shahada, 5) Nawapur and 6) Taloda tahsils respectively. The -

Tahsildar looks after the administrative matters of law in the Tahsil.

1.13.2 Since 1st May 1962 a District level body known as Zilla Parishad constituted with elected members has been formed. Further there are 10 Panchayat Samities at the Block level. These institutions are created for ~~democratic~~ democratic decentralization of administration. The Parishad is presided by the President, who is elected amongst Zilla Parishad Councillors. Similarly Panchayat Samiti is Presided by the Chairman, who is also elected amongst the elected members of the Panchayat Samities. The area and the jurisdiction of the Zilla ~~Panchayat Samiti~~ Parishad is the entire District area excluding Municipal area. The area under the jurisdiction of Panchayat Samiti corresponds to the Block area. The Chief Executive Officer is the head of the administrative machinery of Zilla Parishad.

1.12.3 There are Six Municipal Councils in the District. The total geographical area covered by the Municipal Councils is 91.9 Sq. Kms. and the total population is 2,87,736. Municipal Councils are presided by the President, who is elected along with the Councillors by the voters is the area of the Municipal Council. The Chief Officer is the head of the administrative machinery of the Council.

Special Features -

1.13.1 Dhule District has the largest proportion of Scheduled population amongst all the district Tribes/~~and it ranks first~~ in the State. Out of the total population of 16,62,181 in the District 6,15,801 persons (37%) belong to the Scheduled Tribes, Nawapur, Akkalkuwa, and Akrani Tahsils are - predominantly tribal areas and have been notified as Scheduled - Areas. Nandurbar, Taloda, Sakri, Shahada, and Shirpur tahsils have also large number of Scheduled Tribes. The predominant Scheduled Tribes are Bhills, Dhanaka, Gamit, Kokani, Naikda, and Paradhi,. Many special schemes for welfare of scheduled tribes are in progress in the District. Considering this aspect, 13 Tribal Development Blocks have been started in the District.

1.13.2 Dhule is one of the 13 Districts in the State, where Government has drawn up a special Tribal Sub-Plan along with the usual Annual Plan with a view to integrate Tribal Population with all sectors of development and to raise their general ^{level} of development. ~~The~~ Tribal Sub-Plan was formulated ⁱⁿ 1974-75.

1.13.3 There are two Co-operative Sugar Factories at Shahada and Sakri. One more is likely ~~to~~ to be set up in Shirpur Tahsil.

1.13.4 (Government has established Rural Industries Project in a few backward pockets in the State. One of such Rural Industries Project is ~~being~~ functioning at Dhule, as Dhule District is - industrially backward.)

1.13.5 Dhule District is well known for milk production and has been a supplier of milk to Bombay. Government has set up Chilling centres at Dhule and has embarked on a programme of dairy development on a large scale by providing credit and other facilities such as organisation of dairy cooperatives, milk collection, transport, pasteurisation and chilling. This District is ~~ranked~~

regarded as a most promising prospective District for Dairy -
Development.

1.13.6 In the hilly region of the north of this District
has been developed
~~is situated~~ a Holiday Camp at Toranmal at a height of about 1000
metres. Toranmal is an attractive place for Tourists.

CHAPTER-IIExplanatory notes on the scope and limitations of data
presented in Part-II - Statistical Abstract

2.1 This chapter gives brief description on the tables, which are broadly classified into 13 groups in Part-II of the District Statistical Abstract.

Area and Population

2.2 There are seven tables in this group in which ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ ^{tahsilwise} area, population, decadal variation from 1951, classification of ^{and towns} villages/according to population ranges, ~~distribution ranges~~ distribution of population into workers and non-workers and - different categories of workers, population of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, and distribution of population according to Age groups and religions are given.

Climate -

2.3 The rainfall data recorded at Tahsil Head quarters in the District and maximum and minimum temperatures recorded at Nandurbar during each month of the year 1974 are given in the two tables under this group.

Agriculture -

Animal Husbandry, Forest and Fisheries -

2.5 Out of five tables included in this group three tables - give tahsilwise livestock data as per 1972 Livestock Census, veterinary facilities available and ~~xx~~ slaughter houses as on - 31-3-75, one table gives disease-wise mortality of animals for district as a whole and the last table gives forest area and major and minor forest produce during 1974-75.

Employment, Industry, Mining and Electricity -

2.6 There are nine tables in this group. Statistics for district as a whole regarding number of registered factories and employment, distribution of working factories according to working strength and number of days worked for the year 1973 is given in the first three tables. The next table gives statistics about the Annual Survey of Industries 1966. The next three tables provide ^{monthwise} ~~statistics~~ statistics regarding ~~Monthwise xxx~~ registrations and placements and occupational distribution of registrations and placements ~~occupational~~ ~~and distribution of registrations and placements~~ during 1974-75 and Volume of employment as on 31-3-75 in different ^{industries and} sectors. The last two tables give for District as whole consumption statistics of electricity for 1974-75 and ~~the~~ number of electrified villages and towns and population covered by them as on 31st March 1961, 1966,

1970, 1973, 1974 and 1975.

Co-operation -

2.7 The data regarding different activities in the Co-operative ~~sector~~ sector viz. types of societies, their membership, loan advanced, marketing, Co-operative Banks, their membership and loan advanced by them for the year 1974-75 is presented in the first seven out of ^{the} eight tables included in this group, while the last table gives tahsilwise information regarding money lenders and loans advanced by them during 1974-75.

Medical and Public Health-

2.8 Tahsilwise information of medical facilities (through public and public aided bodies), number of births and deaths registered, during 1974, vaccinations for 1974 and information of family planning for 1974-75 is given in the four tables and the information regarding deaths due to important causes, during the year ^{to 1974} 1971-74 for ~~district~~ district as a whole is given in the remaining table.

Education -

2.9 There are seven tables in this group, out of which three tables provide tahsilwise information of literacy as per 1971 Census and level of literacy in rural and urban area as per 1961 Census. The fourth table gives numbers of educational institutions, students and teachers in them for District as a whole for the year 1973-74. The other three tables give statistics regarding backward class beneficiaries, E.B. Concessions granted for 1973-74 and expenditure incurred on education ^{through} by the ~~local~~ local bodies during the year 1974-75.

Transport and Communication-

2.10 In all Seven tables are given in this group, out of

which five tables give statistics ~~for~~ ^{of} Railway Route (1974-75) road kilo meterage as on 31-3-75, State Transport activities (1974-75), Traffic Intensity in May 1973 and number of motor vehicles as on 31-3-75 in Nasik Region. Local Bodies -

2.11 Four tables are included in this group, which provide income and expenditure statistics for village panchayats, Municipal Councils, and Zilla Parishad, for 1974-75 and the first table gives figures of income and expenditure ~~consolidated figures~~ ^{for 1965-66 and 1968-69 to 1974-75}, for all types of local ~~and~~ bodies.

Plan and Community Development -

2.12 In all five tables are included in this group, out of which first two tables give plan expenditure and physical achievements ~~and~~ during the fourth five year plan and 1974-75 under ~~at~~ different district level and Centrally Sponsored Schemes in the District. The remaining three tables give stages of the C.D. Blocks, their expenditure and physical achievements for the year 1974-75.

Prices -

2.13 Out of three tables included in this group, two tables give statistics ~~for 1974~~ regarding wholesale prices of certain ~~and~~ agricultural commodities at regulated markets and monthly average retail prices of various commodities at the ~~at~~ district Head ^{for 1974} Quarter. The remaining table gives Consumer's Price Index Numbers for working Class at Bombay and Jalgaon for 1974-75.

Miscellaneous-

2.14 There are in all eleven tables in the group. The first ten tables supply Official Statistics regarding, Police ^{Force and} ~~Force~~ Crimes

CHAPTER IIIAnalytical Review of Selected Trends-

3.1 Analytical review of important Socio Economic aspects over a period of decade in the form of indicators showing comparison among Tahsils is attempted in the following paragraphs -

Indicator No.1 - Percentage of gross sown area to net sown area

3.2 Tahsilwise ratios of gross cropped area to net cropped area for 1961-62, 1969-70, 1970-71, 1971-72, 1972-73 and 1973-74 are given in table No.3.2. The percentage ratio for the district as whole is showing a decreasing trend from 113.5, in 1961-62 to 107.6, 1969-70 and later remained steady at 109 from 1970-71 to 1971-72 and then decreased to 106.7, during 1972-73 and again increase to 108.4 in 1973-74. The unprecedented drought during 1972-73, and partial brought during 1973-74 might be the main reasons for decrease in this ratio. The percentage ratios for Nandurbar, Shahada, Shirpur, and Sindkheda show a decreasing trend whereas in other Tahsils the trend in variation is not even. However the general trend in each Tahsil is that there is substantial fall in the ratio in the year 1972-73 and 1973-74. The percentage ratio in Akrani is lowest viz. 100.2 and that for Shahada is highest viz. 113.4 during the year 1973-74.

Indicator No.2 - Production of Important Crops -

3.3 The yield rates of production of important crops in the district for the year 1961-62, 1969-70, 1970-71, 1971-72, and 1972-73 and 1973-74 are shown in table No.3.3. The yield rates of Rice and groundnut show a decreasing trend except in the year 1970-71

and 1973-74. The fall in the yield rate during 1972-73 is very steep. The yield rates of millets viz. Jowar, and Bajara also show decreasing trend. The yield rate in the case Jowar however improved during 1973-74, whereas the reduction in the yield rate of Bajara persistently continued upto 1973-74. The yield rates of wheat was just steady during 1961-62 to 1969-70 and 1971-72 with a rise during the year 1970-71 and 1973-74 and a fall during 1972-73. As regards ground-nut the general trend is upward with the maximum value in the year 1970-71. There was a slight fall in the yield rate of Sugarcane (Gur) during the scarcity period of 1971-72 and 1972-73 but this yield rate in 1973-74 nearly attained the level of 1970-71.

Indicator No.3 :- Value of agricultural production -

3.4 The estimated values of production of Wheat, Jowar, Bajara, Cotton, and Groundnut for the years 1969-70, 1970-71, 1971-72, 1972-73, ~~XX and 1972-73~~ 1973-74 at current wholesale prices (prevailing during the year) are given in table No.3.4. The trend of production of wheat and Jowar is downward from 1969-70 to 1972-73 and later during the year 1973-74 the production of these crops increased by nearly more than double the level of 1972-73. The price of wheat decreased from Rs.100.53 per quintal in 1969-70 to Rs.91.02 per quintal in 1970-71 and then later assumed increasing trend upto 1973-74. The value of production however decreased during the years from 1970-71 to 1972-73 due to decrease in production of wheat. The prices of Groundnut and Bajara showed increasing trend from the year 1969-70 to 1973-74 except in the year 1971-72 when there was a fall in the price level of Groundnut. The value of production of groundnut and Bajara fluctuated due to fluctuations in the production during these years. The price of cotton showed steady trend from 1969-70 to 1972-73 with fluctuations and then increased substantially during 1973-74. As the production of cotton suffered upto 1972-73, the value of production of Cotton also showed a decreasing trend upto 1972-73 and then during the year 1973-74, the production shot up considerably by twice the level of 1972-73. The price of cotton also increased by nearly 64% as compared to that during 1972-73.

3.5 The percentage ratio of net irrigated area to net cropped area is a good indicator of extent of irrigation facilities of a Tahsil or a District. This ratio for the District as a whole - increased from the year 1961-62 to 1969-70 and then assumed a

steady decreasing trend upto the year 1973-74. The trend of this ratio in all the Tahsils except Shirpur was upward during the years 1969-70 to 1970-71 and then there was a fall in the ratio during the year 1972-73. In the case of Shirpur Tahsil however there is a gradual increasing trend upto 1972-73 and a sudden fall during 1973-74. The ratio is the highest in Shahada Tahsil (16.03) and the lowest in Akrani Tahsil (0.06) during 1973-74. Nandurbar and Taloda have comparable ratios of 10.85 and 9.35 respectively during the same year viz. 1973-74. The Tahsils of Nawapur and Akkalkuwa have this ratio as low as 0.97 and 1.29 respectively and are as backward as Akrani in irrigation.

Indicator No.5 - Change in cropping pattern -

There are seasonal fluctuations in the ratios of cropping pattern. However the cropping pattern in general is fairly constant. The percentage ratio of area under food crops and non-food crops to the total cropped area given in Table No.3.6 reveals that nearly three fourth of the cultivated area is under food crops and one fourth under non-food crops. Among food crops the major portion of the area is covered by cereals and pulses. The distribution of area under cereals and pulses was in the proportion of 3 to 1 in 1973-74. During the year 1973-74 the ratio of area under pulses to the total area has however attained a higher level than the normal trend of the previous years.

3.8 Agricultural credit societies which have played an important role in financing agricultural credit have progressively increased the annual turn over during the past two decades. The total advances in the District has also increased from Rs.3.128 crores ~~crores~~ in 1961-62 to Rs.8.175 crores in 1974-75. The Advance per member has also increased from Rs.338/- in 1961-62 to Rs.709/- in 1974-75. There was a fall in the amount of loans advanced during

the year 1973-74 which might be due to scarcity conditions in 1972-73 which affected the ~~xxxxxx~~ recovery of loans in 1972-73. The outstanding amount per member has also likewise increased in the years from 1961-62 to 1974-75.

3.10 Ratio of cultivable area per pair of working bullocks is shown in table No.3.10. District ratio is 5.14 hectares of cultivable land per pair working bullocks. This means that on an average one pair of working bullocks is utilised for ploughing and other operations in an area of 5.14 hectares. This ratio varies among the tahsils. Sindkheda, Dhule, Shahada, and Shirpur, have ratios higher than the district average whereas Sakri, Nandurbar, Taloda, Nawapur, Akkalkuwa, and Akrani, have ratios lower than the District Ratio. The lowest and highest values of this ratio are recorded in Akrani and Sindkheda Tahsils respectively.

3.11 Ratio of poultry to human population is given Tahsil-wise in Table No.3.11. Poultry population in the district increased from 3,10,036 in 1966 to 3,40,980 in 1972. However the ratio of number of poultry to one thousand persons has decreased from 229 in 1966 to 205 in 1972. The decreasing trend of this ratio is seen in Dhule, Sakri, Nawapur, Nandurbar, Akkalkuwa, and Shahada Tahsils ~~xxx~~ where~~x~~ as this ratio increased in Taloda, Akrani, Shirpur, and Sindkheda Tahsils. This ratio as recorded in 1972, is highest in

Akrani and Akkalkuwa Tahsils and lowest in Dhule Tahsils. Poultry is always in demand in the market and higher ratio in certain tahsils is indicative of its more capacity to meet this demand.

3.12 Per capita consumption of electricity in the district was 16.52 KWH in 1970-71, which increased progressively to 37.46 KWH in 1974-75. This shows that the total consumption has also progressively increased in each sector. None-the-less there are some important variations in the annual trends viz. proportion of

'other purpose' (which mainly includes agricultural purposes) has increased during the period from 1970-71 to 1974-75 and that of domestic and commercial light and small power has decreased during this period. The proportion of consumption of electricity for industrial purposes has not varied much during the period from - 1970-71, to 1974-75. Dhule district is industrially backward and with special efforts of Rural Industries Project now envisaged in the Five Year Plans, more industrial units may come up in future and there will be more demand of electricity under this sector.

Number of outdoor patients however shows a decreasing trend from 9.08 lakh in 1971 to 5.47 lakh in 1973 and then increased to 7.34 lakh in 1974. The percentage ratio of indoor patients to outdoor patients has increased from 2.01 in 1971 to 8.92 in 1974.

3.15 Statistics regarding No. of institutions and their enrolment at primary, secondary, and higher levels during the year 1961-62, 1970-71, 1971-72, 1972-73, and 1973-74 is shown in table No.3.15. General trend of Primary and Secondary institutions and their enrolment during the period from 1961-62 to 1973-74 is upward. There were only 5 institutions of higher education with enrolment of 1,123 students in 1961-62, which increased to 14 institutions with enrolment of 6,333 students in 1970-71 i.e. 6 times the level in 1961-62. Average No. of students per institutions in the case of Primary Schools was the same in 1961-62 and 1973-74, where as this average increased from 123 and 225 in 1961-62, to 332 and 537 in 1973-74 for secondary and higher institutions respectively.

3.16 Road length per 100 Sq.Km. is an indicator for comparison of road communication for different districts. This ratio in the district during 1961-62 was 16.01 Km per 100 Sq. Km. in 1961-62, which increased to 30.23 in 1970-71, and later steadily increased upto 34.00 in 1973-74 and then showed a steep rise upto 51.02 in 1974-75. This steep rise in 1974-75 is due to substantial increase in the road length of lower types which were constructed during the period from 1972-73 to 1974-75 under scarcity programme and Employment Guarantee Scheme.

This shows that even though there has been increase in the number of Banking Offices, the area covered by them has not increased in the same proportion. CHAPTER - IV

Annual Plan 1974-75

4.1 The Year 1974-75 is the first year of the Fifth Five Year Plan 1974-75 to 1978-79. The process of planning underwent important change as a result of introduction of application of the policy of Government for decentralisation of planning to the Dist. level from the year 1974-75 and in view of this the year 1974-75, is not only the first year of the Fifth Five Year Plan, but the first year of a new era in the decentralisation of planning. As a result of this change the schemes in the Fifth Plan were divided into only two categories viz. State Level and District Level and not into three categories viz. State, Divisional and District Level as was done previously during the Fourth Five Year Plan. A brief analysis of expenditure incurred on the District level schemes of fourth five year plan and the first year (1974-75) of the Fifth Five Year Plan following is given in the following paragraphs. Besides a brief review of the physical achievements and sub-head wise expenditure of the District level schemes in the Fourth Plan and the year 1974-75 is also given in the subsequent paragraphs.

4.2 The total expenditure incurred on District level schemes during the entire fourth five year plan period is Rs.12.95 Crores out of which Rs.6.16 crores (i.e. 47.57%) and Rs.6.79 crores (i.e. 52.43%) were spent under state and local sectors respectively. The per capita expenditure incurred in the District on the District level schemes in the fourth plan comes to Rs.77.92. The expenditure incurred in 1974-75 on the District level schemes is Rs.4.32 crores, which is nearly one third of the expenditure incurred during the entire Fourth Plan. The bulk of this expenditure, i.e. Rs.3.44 crores (i.e. 79.63%)

is spent under State Sector. One of the reasons for this is that the Major and Medium Irrigation Projects, which are under state sector and which involve sizeable outlays were treated as District level schemes from the year 1974-75.

4.3 Expenditure incurred under each sub-head on District level schemes in the fourth plan 1969-74 and the year 1974-75 is shown in table No.4.3. Bulk of the expenditure of State Plan is incurred on Agricultural Programme (53.72%) and Social Services (25.50%) in the Fourth Five Year Plan, whereas the major heads in which substantial portion of expenditure is incurred in the year 1974-75 are Agriculture Programme (30.40%), Irrigation and Power (43.15%), and Social Services (14.44%). The difference in the -

expenditure pattern in the fourth plan and fifth plan is mainly due to inclusion of Major and Medium Irrigation Projects as District level schemes in the fifth plan and introduction of Employment Guarantee Scheme involving sizeable outlays under the Major Head 'Miscellaneous' which previously included a few schemes of Rural Broadcasting, propoganda and publicixty involving a little provision in the Fourth Plan.

4.4 The physical achievements under different heads during the fourth plan 1969-74 and the first year 1974-75 of the Fifth Plan are described in the following paras.

Agricultural Programme -

4.5 An expenditure of Rs.583.99 lakhs in the fourth plan and 119.17 lakhs in the year 1974-75 has been incurred under this Major Head involving nine ~~sub-heads~~ sub-heads. Under the sub-head Agricultural Production an expenditure of Rs.10.78 lakh in the fourth plan and Rs.4.77 lakh in the year 1974-75 was incurred to achieve the following items of work.

1) Distribution of 25,059 and 4,155 quintals of cotton seed in the fourth plan and the year 1974-75 respectively.

2) Laying out plots for 42 demonstrations under the scheme of maximising productions of cotton.

3) Distribution of 2,58,753 quintals of groundnut in the Fourth Plan and 68,000 in the year 1974-75.

4) Supply of 2,54,790/- tonnes of compost in the Fourth Plan and 40,130 in the year 1974-75.

5) Maintenance and development of Taluka seed farms started in the fourth plan.

There were five schemes in the fourth plan and four schemes in the year 1974-75 involving an expenditure of Rs.360.71 lakhs, and 55.00 lakhs respectively under the sub-head Minor Irrigation as a result of which construction of 3940 wells in the fourth plan and 111 wells in the year 1974-75 was completed, installation of 4195 pumps in the fourth plan and 95 pumps in the year 1974-75 was done, construction of 79 bandharas/Tanks in the year 1974-75, one lift irrigation scheme in the fourth plan and two percolation tanks during the year 1974-75 were completed. The expenditure under the sub-head Soil Conservation was Rs.107.94 lakhs and 33.63 lakhs in the Fourth Plan and 1974-75 respectively and the total area bounded during these two periods were 93,291 and 19,643 hectares. Afforestation was also done for Soil Conservation under this sub-head for over 1801 hectares in the fourth plan and 120 hectares in the year 1974-75. Ayacut measures were also taken up in the irrigated lands of Karwand, Panzara, Kanholi, Malangaon, Kulte, Projects at a cost of Rs.28.89 lakhs incurred in the fourth plan and 6.55 lakhs in the year 1974-75 covering an ^{area} ~~area~~ of 8515 hectares in the fourth plan and 1054 hectares in the year 1974-75. Six veterinary dispensaries were started in the fourth plan and an expenditure of Rs.0.25 lakhs was incurred under the Sub-head Animal Husbandry. There were

two schemes under Dairy Development in which 52 dairy cooperative societies in the fourth plan and 10 in the year 1974-75 were organised and the level of milk supply was maintained at 75,567 and 1,14,543 litres per day at the end of fourth plan and the year 1974-75 respectively. Under the sub-head Forest 802 hectares in the fourth plan and 120 hectares in the year 1974-75 were brought under plantation of ~~valuable~~ valuable trees; 30 Kilometres of road were covered under extension forestry and 75 kilometres of roadside trees were maintained in the fourth plan and 40 Km. of roads ~~covered by~~ ~~xxxx~~ in the year 1974-75. The expenditure on this ^{sub-head} ~~scheme~~ was Rs.12.45 lakhs in the fourth plan and Rs.3.02 lakhs in the year 1974-75. There were Six Schemes under the sub-head Fisheries which were implemented at a cost of Rs.0.33 lakhs in the fourth plan and Rs.0.76 lakh in the year 1974-75, to achieve the stockings of 12.60 lakhs carp-fry in the fourth plan and 11.00 lakh carp-fry in the year 1974-75, netting of fish to the extent of 83,831 Kg. in the fourth plan and 60,000 Kg. in the year 1974-75 and advancing of loan of Rs. 2500/- to fishermen in the Fourth Plan. All the eight Agricultural Produce Market Committees in the District were assisted by way of loan and/or subsidy in the fourth plan and in the year 1974-75 by implementing two schemes under the sub-head Warehousing and Marketing with an expenditure of Rs.3.05 lakhs in the Fourth Plan and Rs.1.04 lakh in the year 1974-75.

Co-operation and Community Development -

4.6 There were three schemes under the sub-head Cooperation which were implemented to give financial assistance to two Co-operative Sugar Factories ^{towards} share capital ~~contribution~~ and subsidy to 6 labour Contract Societies, and new branches of the District Central

Co-operative Bank at a cost of Rs.52.84 lakhs in the fourth plan and Rs.1.44 lakhs in the year 1974-75. There are 10 Panchayat Samities in which residual C.D. activities were maintained by spending Rs.24.93 lakhs in the fourth Plan and Rs.3.72 lakhs in the year 1974-75. This amount was mainly spent on completion of incomplete works taken up under Community Development Programme.

Irrigation and Power -

4.7 Under this sub-head 76 villages were electrified and 3334 pumps were energised in the fourth plan at a cost of Rs.84.21 lakh. Similarly 103 villages were electrified and 919 pumps were energised in the year 1974-75 at a cost of Rs.84.81 lakhs. The scheme of construction of Major and Medium Irrigation Projects was not a District level scheme in the Fourth Plan and hence there was no expenditure over Major and Medium Irrigation Project in the Fourth Plan. In the year 1974-75, however an expenditure of Rs.84.35 lakhs was incurred for construction of Panzara, Aner and Burai, Medium Projects. The Panzara Project was nearing completion, Aner was in full swing and the Burai Project was in the Preliminary stage during the year 1974-75.

Industry and Mining -

4.8 Under the head Small Scale Industries. Rs. 4.28 lakhs were spent to implement five schemes in the Fourth Plan to provide financial assistance by way of share capital and subsidy to 6 Handloom Co-operative Societies, 2 Industrial Co-operatives, 9 Balutedar Co-operative Societies, and Rs.4.53 lakhs were spent on package scheme of incentives through S.I.I.C.O.M. during the year 1974-75 and Rs.0.99 lakh were spent in the same year to give interest subsidy and subsidy for electric consumption to 14
