# CHAPTER - I

## I N T R O D U C T I O N

### 1.1 LOCATION :-

The Satara district is situated partly in the Bhima river basin and partly in the Krishna river basin. The tahsils Khandala, Phaltan and Man are situated in the Bhima river basin, while the rest of the tahsils are situated in the Upper Krishna basin. The district has an area of 10,492 Sq. Kms.

The district lies between 17° 5' and 18° 11' north latitude, and 73° 33' and 74° 54' east longitude.

### 1.2 BOUNDARIES :-

The district is situated on the west of Deccan plateau and is surrounded by the Pune district on the north, by the Solapur district on the east, by the Sangli district on the South and by the district of Ratnagiri and Kolaba on the West.

### 1.3 TOPOGRAPHY :-

i) HILLS :- There are two main systems of hills in the Satara district. The Sahyadri range and its off-shoots, and the Mahadeo range and its off-shoots. The main range of Sahyadri with a length of about 96 kilometres from north to south forms the western boundary of this district. The Mahadeo range starts about 16 k.m. north of Mahabaleshwar and stretches east and south-east across the whole breadth of the district. From this main range of Mahadeo hills three spurs stretch to the south. Hills in the district are very low, barren and ragged except near Mahabaleshwar and Koyana valley. The top of Mahabaleshwar the highest point in the district, is about 1,436 metres above mean sea level.

ii) RIVERS :- The Krishna is the principal river of the district. The other important rivers are the Koyana, the Nira, the Man, the Venna, the Kudali, the Urmodi, the Vasana, the Yerela and the Tarali.

The Krishna rises in the eastern brow of Mahabaleshwar plateau with its source at about 1,371 metres above mean sea level. Several streams which flow from the valleys formed by the main hill ranges in the district make up the head waters of the Krishna river. The drainage system of the Krishna river includes, besides the drainage of central system, the drainage of seven feeders, namely, the Kudali, the Venna, the Urmodi, the Tarali and the Koyana on the right and the Vasna and the Yerala on the left. From the source, the Krishna flows for nearly 160 kms. through the Satara district and enters thereafter into the Sangli district.

The Koyana is the largest feeder of the Krishna river in the district. It rises in the Mahabaleshwar plateau, runs towards south upto Helwak in Patan tahsil, where it changes its courses and flows towards east and falls into the Krishna at Karad.

The Nira river which flows on the northern boundary of the district and the Man river which flows in the south-east are tributaries of Bhima which itself meets the Krishna.

iii) SOIL :- The soils of the district are observed to be of varied textures. In the west, the soil in Mahabaleshwar Wai, Jaoli and Patan tahsils is formed from the red laterite of the ghats. It is thin and poor on the hill slope, but gets richer, where natural or artificial terracing has accumulated soil with vegetable matter drained by rain waters. Rich black soil is found in the low lands of the valleys of Krishna, Venna, Kudali, Koyana and Kole rivers in Wai, Jaoli and Patan tahsils.

The central portion of the district consists of medium to deep black alluvial soils. Krishna valley soils are said to be one of the richest in the Deccan and the portion which lies in Satara and Karad tahsils is reported as the richest in the Krishna valley. For the most part it is the finest black alluvial soil highly retentive of moisture and very fertile.

The soil in Khandala and Phaltan tahsils is poor and

stony in the vicinity of the hills, but there are good black soils along the Mira and its tributary streams. In the eastern part of Khandala tahsil, the soil is poor, shallow and whitish but is capable of growing wheat if adequate water is available.

Towards the east of the Krishna valley the soil is poor with the exception of wide stretches of good black soil along the numerous streams and rivers in Koregaon tahsil.

In the Khatav tahsil, soils are of intermediate depth and more widely spreading than that Man tahsil but not as rich as in Koregaon tahsil. In Man tahsil, the soils are extremely poor and shallow. Good soil is found only in narrow strips along the streams.

#### 1.4 RAINFALL IN GENERAL AND SCARCITY CONDITIONS :-

1) RAINFALL :- The rain starts by the middle of June and lasts till the end of September in the district. The rainfall is not uniform all over the district. It is very heavy in the western region and it goes on receding towards eastern part. The extreme west part gets over 5000 mm. rainfall, while the eastern part of the Sahyadri zone gets the rainfall between 1,200 mm. to 2,000 mm. The normal rainfall recorded at Mahabaleshwar centre is 6,182 mm. while at Pathagani it is 1,865 mm. The central zone gets rainfall between 600 mm. to 1,200 mm. The district head quarter Satara has normal rainfall of 1,025 mm. At other centres it is : Koregaon 707 mm., Khandala 505 mm. Wai 710 mm., and Karad 713 mm. In the eastern zone average rainfall is below 600 mm. annually. It is as follows : Phaltan 473 mm., Dahiwadi 462 mm., and Vaduj 512 mm.

ii) SCARCITY CONDITIONS :- The eastern part of the district is prone to scarcity conditions. The Fact Finding Committee appointed by the Government of Maharashtra under the Chairmanship of Shri S.R. Sukhatankar has opined that the tahsils of Khandala, Phaltan, Man, Khatav and Koregaon are the drought prone areas in the district. During the year 1976-77 no scarcity conditions prevailed in the district.

iii) MINERALS :- Except for building stone, lime stone and little iron deposits in about 20 villages of Jaoli tahsil and 30 villages in Patan tahsil, deposits of important minerals are not known to have occurred in any part of the district. Building stone, sand of good quality and lime stone is found to be available all over the district. Good clay for bricks and tiles is found on the river banks.

iv) FORESTS :- An area of about 1,515 Sq.kilo meters or 14.4 percent of the total geographical area of the district is under forests. It is scattered over the entire district. These forests belong to three groups :- (i) the overgreen Sahyadri forests (ii) the plantation on the slopes of the off-shoots of Sahyadri hills that run east and (iii) bush sprinkled hills to the east of Krishna.

The evergreen forests of Sahyadri ranges from a belt along the west of the district 10 to 22 kilo metres broad. These forests extend without a break through the whole length of the district. They contain many trees valuable both as timber and firewood. The chief of these are Jambool, Anjan, Ain, Umbar, Kenja, Hirda, Phanas and Nara. Teak mixed with brush-wood is found in the second group of forest lands, i.e. ranges which branch east from the Sahyadris. These forests are much broken by patches of cultivated land. The forests of the third group are only sprinkled with bush and are very much scattered.

v) AREA :- The district has an area of 10,492.0 Sq.kilo meters out of which 10,109.6 Sq.kilometres is rural and 282.4 sq.kilometres is urban area. The district ranks 16th in area among the 26 districts of the Maharashtra State.

vi) DEMOGRAPHY :- The Satara district ranks 13th in population among the 26 districts of the Maharashtra State.

From the above table it will be seen that the decadal variation ( 1961-71 ) in Satara district is less than the State variation which is 27.45

#### 1.5- SPECIAL FEATURES :-

SUGAR FACTORIES :- At present six sugar factories, two each in Karad and Phaltan and one each in Patan and Wai tahsils are located in the district. The Krishna Sahakari Sugar factory located at Rethare Bk. in Karad tahsil is one of the biggest sugar factories in Maharashtra.

INDUSTRIES :- Though there is no concentration of industries in the district some important factories apart from sugar factories are Ogale Glass works at Ogalewadi near Karad. Cooper Oil Engines at Satara Road in Koregaon tahsil and some cement product industries at Satara and Karad are located in the district. The Maharashtra Scooters Ltd. located at Satara has started its production during the year 1976-77.

Also there is a private seed production establishment viz. Nimbakar Seeds which produces various type of hybrid and high yielding seed and distributes the same all over the State.

IRRIGATION AND POWER :- The reservoir of the Koyna Hydro Electric Project at Pophali in Ratnagiri district is located in this district. The Dhoni Irrigation Project is nearly completed and the Kanher Irrigation Project has been started. These two projects will help to achieve faster economic growth of Satara district.

SMALL SAVINGS :- The district was allotted target of Rs. 112.50 lakhs for the year 1976-77. The district has exceeded the target by collecting Rs. 165.14 lakhs (net collections) by 47 % during the year 1976-77.

FAMILY PLANNING :- The district has carried out 9,403 vasectomy operations and 14,878 tubectomy operations during the year 1976-77 against the target of 41,128 total cases and achieved 59 % of the target.

## CHAPTER II

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

2.1 The data on different important sectors which have dominant affects on the economy are presented in this abstract for the year 1976-77. In case the data for the year 1976-77 is not available the data for the latest available year are presented. In most of the cases, the reference period of the data is the financial year. The data on Agriculture, however, relates to the agricultural year, whereas the data on 'Co-operation' is for the co-operative year ( 1st July to 30th June ). The data on other important items like rainfall, temperature, civil and criminal cases, vital statistics, is for the calendar year. The information as far as possible is presented tahsilwise for inter tahsil comparison.

#### DISTRICT AT A GLANCE :

2.2 Certain essential data in important spheres, such as,

- i. Population,
- ii. agriculture,
- iii. animal husbandry,
- iv. industries,
- v. co-operation,
- vi. medical and public health,
- vii. education,
- viii. transport and communication,
- ix. plan expenditure etc.,

pertaining to the district is presented along with the corresponding figures for the State for the comparison purpose.

#### DISTRICT STATISTICAL ABSTRACT :

2.3 The data incorporated in the District Statistical Abstract have been presented in suitable tables, classified in

appropriate groups. The concepts adopted in preparation of tables are summarised in the following paragraphs. The limitations of data are cited wherever necessary.

#### AREA AND POPULATION

2.4 The data of 1971 census mainly on population, area, houses and livelihood occupation, rural urban breakup etc., are presented in the first seven tables for all tahsils in the district. Data on population per square kilometre, decadal variations during 1951-61 and 1961-71, classification of villages and towns according to population ranges, number of workers and non-workers, population of schedule castes and schedule tribes, distribution of population according to age group and religion are also given in these tables.

#### 2.5 (a) URBAN AREA :

The following places have been treated as 'urban areas' ( towns ) -

1. every place having a municipality or cantonment board irrespective of its population,
2. every other place which satisfied following three conditions -
  - i. a population of at least 5,000 ;
  - ii. at least three-fourth of its male working population engaged in non-agricultural pursuits and
  - iii. a density of population of at least 400 persons per square km.
3. any other place not falling under above two categories which possesses certain distinct characteristics to qualify to its being treated as urban such as its being a project area or a developing township.

(b) Rural Area :- These areas which do not satisfy the



criteria prescribed for recognising urban area are called 'Rural areas'.

A census village in Maharashtra has always been a revenue village. A revenue village has well-defined boundaries, a map and a separate set of land records irrespective of whether that defined area has any population or not.

(c) WORKER : A worker is defined as 'a person whose main activity is participation in any economically productive work through his physical or mental activity. Work involves not only actual work but affective supervision and direction of work.

A public or social worker engaged actively in public or social work or political worker actively engaged in furthering the political aims of a party was also regarded as a 'worker'. In case of perennial work, such as, cultivation, livestock, plantation, some type of household industries, a person was treated as a 'worker' by ascertaining whether he had participated any time during the last one year, even if, he was not economically active in the week prior to enumeration. In case of regular work in trade, profession, service or business, a person was considered as 'worker' if he had participated in such regular work on any one of the days during the week preceding the date of enumeration and that work has been returned as his main activity.

(d) NON-WORKER : Non-workers are those who are not mainly engaged in any economically productive work.

A person primarily engaged in household duties or those who were students and help in the family economic activity, but not on full time scale were treated as 'non-worker' in respect of their main activity.

## CLIMATE :

2.6 The rainfall and temperature have pronounced effects on climate. The rainfall data presented in table No. 8 gives normal rainfall, monthly rainfall and number of rainy days during the calendar year 1976 for the selected eleven centres. Normal rainfall figures are worked out on the basis of actual rainfall for the periods ranging from a minimum of five years and a maximum of 80 years. A day was treated as "rainy day" if during the twenty-four hours the rain gauge recorded a minimum of 2.5 mm. of rainfall. The table No. 9 gives actual maximum and minimum temperatures recorded during each of the month of the calendar year 1976 in respect of Mahabaleshwar centre in Satara district.

## AGRICULTURE :

2.7 Important tahsilwise statistics on agriculture, such as

- i. land utilisation,
- ii. area under different crops,
- iii. yield per hectare and outturn of principal crops,
- iv. irrigated area under different crops,
- v. sourcewise irrigated area, and
- vi. data on irrigation etc.;

are given in tables 10 to 14.

2.8 The basic definitions adopted are given below :-

a) Geographical area : It is, according to village papers calculated from village returns prepared for revenue purposes and as such it may be different from that according to Surveyor General.

b) Forests : It includes all actually forested areas or lands classed or administered as 'forests' under any legal enactment dealing with forests, whether State owned or private. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land.

c) Land put to non-agricultural uses : It stands for all lands occupied by buildings, roads and railways or under rivers, canals etc., and other land put to uses other than agricultural.

d) Barren and unculturable land : It covers land which cannot be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost, whether in isolated blocks or uncultivated holdings. Land like mountains, deserts etc. is classified under this category.

e) Permanent pastures and other grazing land : It covers all grazing lands. Village common grazing lands and grazing lands within forest area are included under this head.

f) Culturable waste land : These may be either 'fallow' or 'covered with shrubs and jungles' which are not put to any use and include all lands available for cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once but not cultivated during the current year and the last five years or more in succession.

g) Miscellaneous tree crops and groves not included in the net area sown :

This category includes all cultivable land which is not included in Net area sown but put to some agricultural use.

h) Current fallow lands : These are lands which are kept fallow during the current year. If any seedling area is not cropped again in the same year, it is also treated as 'Current fallow'.

i) Other fallows : All lands which were taken up for cultivation but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period not less than one year and not more than 5 years are classed as 'other fallow'.

j) Net area sown : This consists of net area sown with crops and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once.

k) Gross cropped area : Total of area under all crops including area under crops sown more than once is taken as 'Gross cropped area'.

(1) " Cultivable area is a sum of areas under -

(a) Miscellaneous tree crops and groves not included in the net area sown,

(b) current fallows,

(c) other fallows,

(d) culturable waste land, and

(e) net area sown.

#### IRRIGATION - STATISTICS :

2.9 Important irrigation statistics regarding

i. number of irrigation wells,

ii. activities of ground water survey and development Agency,

iii. Minor irrigation works,

iv. major and medium irrigation projects, and

v. area irrigated under major and medium projects,

are given in table No. 15, 16, 17 and 18.

#### ALLIED AGRICULTURE :

2.10 Agricultural wages rates at the selected centres, viz.,

i. Limb ( Taluka - Satara )

ii. Koregaon ( Taluka - Koregaon )

iii. Umbraj ( Taluka - Karad )

collected by the District Statistical Officer through the Block Statistical Assistants are given in table No. 19. Number of operational holdings as per Agricultural Census -1970 are given in table No. 20. Final figures of agricultural implements enumerated during the eleventh livestock census are given in table No. 21. The tahsil-wise data on 'famine and scarcity' are given in table No. 22 and 23 for the year 1976-77.

## ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND FOREST :

2.11 Population of livestock and poultry as per livestock census, 1972 ( final data ) is shown tahsilwise in table No. 24. Statistics on veterinary facilities existed, animals treated in such centres and disease-wise mortality of livestock are given in table No. 25 and 26. Table No. 27 furnishes data on animals slaughtered in recognised slaughter houses in the district.

2.12 The data on ' area under forests.' and major and minor forest produce for the year 1976-77 have been shown in tables 28 (a) and 28(b) respectively. Area under forests with a classification into

- i. reserved,
- ii. protected, and
- iii. unclassified forests under the control of State Revenue department and under State Forests Department

has been shown. These areas may not tally with the area under forests shown in table No. 10 due to different concepts of classification into above three heads. Reserved forests are intended mainly for timber production in which rights of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. Grazing and cultivation under certain limitation and restrictions are allowed in protected forests. The unclassified forests refer to 'inaccessible forests' or 'unoccupied waste'.

## INLAND FISHERIES :

2.13 The statistics relating to total area suitable for fish culture, ponds, lakes and reservoirs, area under pisci-culture inland fish production and carp fry used for pisci-culture are given in table No. 29 (A).

## EMPLOYMENT, INDUSTRY AND ELECTRICITY :

2.14 The statistics relating to working factories under different groups with average daily employment, man-days worked, classification of factories according to working strength and

number of days worked are given for the year in table Nos. 30, 31 and 32. The term 'Factory' includes -

- a) those employing ten or more workers working with the aid of power,
- b) those employing 20 or more workers and working without aid of power, and
- c) those registered under the Factory Act, 1948,

eventhough the above conditions are fulfilled, the Defence Factories are excluded ". Statistics regarding number of registered factories, productive capital investment, output and employment provided under different industries based on Annual Survey of Industries for the year 1975 is given in table No. 33. Monthwise registration, vacancies notified, placements done, number of employment seekers on the live register at the end of the month, occupation-wise and sectorial, other data of employment exchange have been shown in table Nos. 34, 35 and 37. The information regarding the employment generated under Employment Guarantee Scheme works is also given in table No. 36.

2.15 Data on consumption of electricity by different categories during the year 1976-77 is given in table No. 38 and number of towns and villages electrified during and upto the end of selected years are shown in table No. 39. The data are collected from Maharashtra State Electricity Board, Private Electric companies and Sugar Factories in the district.

#### CO - OPERATION :

2.16 Statistical information on the co-operative institutions and their activities have been given for the year 1976-77 on the following items -

- i. Loan advanced by co-operative banks and primary agricultural credit societies - different types of societies, their membership,
- ii. Total value of purchase and ~~in~~ sales by the central and primary co-operative marketing societies, and

iii. Annual arrivals in the regulated markets in each tahsil of Satara district in tables 40 to 46. Tahsilwise data regarding No. of members, capital structure, loans advanced and recovered etc., have also been given.

Working Capital : It includes paid-up capital, deposits and borrowings. Loans outstanding includes outstandings in respect of loans, cash credits and overdrafts and the amount of the outstanding bills purchased or discounted. Overdues refer to the amount of loans or instalments which was due for collection but which was not actually collected and for the repayment of which no extension has been granted by the competent authority. Information of registered money lenders and loans advanced by them is given in table number 47.

The main functions of Agricultural credit societies are to help members by way of providing short and medium term loans for meeting their agricultural necessities like improved seeds, fertilizers, agricultural improved implements etc. The help is also extended in the matters of storage, transportation and sale of the agricultural produce.

2.21 The agricultural non-credit societies look after the work of better farming by way of educating the agriculturists in the adoption of improved agricultural practices, crop protection etc. The societies also undertake educational, economical cultural and house building activities so as to uplift the standard of living of the agriculturists.

2.22 The main function of the Urban Bank, urban credit co-operative societies and salary earners co-operative societies is to promote the qualities of economy and co-operation among the members and also to make them industrious. They also augment the saving habits of the people by way of making the banking facilities easily available. They give loans to the members on the securities like gold, immovable property, Government securities, commercial goods, etc. They also provide loans to the Artisans and small traders.

2.23 The main functions of non-agricultural non-credit societies are to run printing presses, to provide electricity to members and consumers for domestic, industrial and agricultural purposes, to run Montessories, primary schools and educational institutions for educational spread and things of the kind.

The main function of primary co-operative marketing society is the purchase and sale of agricultural produce grown by its members or member co-operative societies in its area of operation.

#### MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH :

2.24 In this section, data on medical and public health for the year 1976 is given. Table No.48 gives medical facilities available through public and public aided bodies in each tahsil alongwith indoor and outdoor patients treated. Data on 'vital statistics', e.g. tahsilwise births and deaths and infant deaths registered in the year 1976 with break-up into male and female and number of deaths due to important causes, from the year 1971 to 1976 is given in tables No. 49 and 50 respectively. Vaccination statistics and cholera inoculation done in each tahsil during 1976 is given in table No. 51. Table No. 52 gives statistics on family planning during the year 1976-77.

#### E D U C A T I O N :

2.25 The data on tahsilwise number of literates and percentage of literacy as per 1971 census are shown in table No.53. The data on education level of people in rural and urban areas are given in table Nos. 54 and 55. The data regarding pupils and teachers with number of institutions in pre-primary, primary, secondary and higher categories are presented in table No. 56. The data on backward class enrolment and concessions granted to economically backward class and expenditure incurred under normal and plan grants on primary education in the district is shown in table Nos. 57 to 59.

#### TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION :

2.26 Length of railway routes according to gauge is shown in



table No. 60. Table No. 61 gives road length according to category and surface classification. Roads maintained by municipal councils / cantonment boards are also shown separately in this table. The data of number of motor vehicles in operation in Kolhapur region covering Satara, Sangli and Kolhapur districts together are shown in table No. 62. ( districtwise figures are not available ). Important operational statistics relating to Satara division of Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation are given in Table No. 63. ( Satara State Transport division comprises of Satara district ). Results of traffic census conducted in May, 1975 on important roads in Satara district are given in table No. 64. Statistics on Postal, Telegraphs and telephone facilities and on rural broadcasting are depicted in the table Nos. 65 and 66 respectively.

#### LOCAL BODIES :

2.27 The financial position of Village Panchayats, Municipal councils and Zilla Parishad is shown in this section for the year 1976-77.

2.28 The number of village panchayats includes number of independent Village Panchayats as also group Village Panchayats, Income and expenditure of Village Panchayats are exclusive of opening and closing balances respectively. Grants include grants from Government as well as from Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities for developmental activities. Government grants to village panchayats are mainly land revenue grants, equalisation grants and local cess grants. Government grants in respect of municipal councils are mainly grants on account of dearness allowances, grants for roads, for water supply, for educational purposes, for medical purposes and on account of percentage in land revenue. The receipts of Zilla Parishad are shown under four sub-heads, viz.,

- i. self-raised resources,
- ii. government grants,
- iii. grants for agency scheme, and
- iv. debt section. The expenditure is shown under two heads - Revenue Expenditure and Debt section.

2.29 The data are collected from the Zilla Parishad, Satara and all the municipal councils in ~~Satara~~ Satara district.

PLAN AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT :

2.30 Data on Plan expenditure under State and Local sectors and physical achievements in important fields during the year 1976-77 are given respectively in table Nos. 71 and 72. Statistics in respect of coverage of community development programme, stagewise expenditure of various blocks and blockwise physical achievements under community development programme are shown in table Nos. 73 to 75.

P R I C E S :

2.31 The table No. 76 gives monthly average wholesale prices of agricultural commodities transacted in regulated markets. The district average for each variety and for each month is also given.

2.32 The table No. 77 gives the monthly average retail prices of important commodities at Satara head-quarter during 1976. As the information collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one quotation and that also from only one shop in the district head-quarter, the averages shown for individual commodities cannot be said to be fully representative but the data may prove useful as broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices over the period of time. The table No. 78 gives consumer price index number for working class of Sholapur and Pune centres for the year 1976-77. For ~~the~~ the calculation of index, the years 1960 and 1961 are taken as ' base years ' for Sholapur and Pune centres respectively.

MISCELLANEOUS :

2.33 Statistical data pertaining to police force, crime statistics, cases disposed off in civil and criminal courts,

cinema statistics regarding seating capacity in different types of theatres, number of banking offices, number of scheduled banks, their deposits and advances and number of Joint Stock companies, insurance policies and amount insured, collection of small savings, land revenue collections, number of presses, newspapers and periodicals published etc., are given in the table Nos. 79 to 89.

Table No. 90 gives information about the quantity of Rice, Wheat and Sugar issued to fair price shops. The demand and procurement of levy in Satara district are indicated in table No. 91. Statistics relating to General Elections of Assembly, 1972 and Lok Sabha - 1977 are presented in Table No. 92. "

2.34 A table showing trends in selected indicators in the fields of development, such as -

- i. agriculture,
- ii. livestock,
- iii. industry,
- iv. education,
- v. health, etc.

is appended at the end. These collected indicators are very useful for assessing progress in various fields over important periods in the recent past.

CHAPTER - III

AN ANALYTICAL REVIEW OF SECTORIAL TRENDS.

3.1 Data on various items have been presented in Part II of this issue, under the heading District Statistical Abstract. An attempt has been made in this chapter to give a comparative picture of the tahsils in the district during the year 1960-61, 1973-74, 1974-75, 1975-76 and 1976-77. The indicators of different developmental sectors are worked out to show the position of each tahsil in the district during the above period.

3.2 The development in the field of agriculture can be assessed from three main indicators. They are (1) Percentage of gross area sown to net area sown (2) Percentage of net area irrigated to net area sown and (3) productivity of important crops.

3.3 The gross cropped area has been decreased in the district from 7.34 lakh hectares in 1960-61 to 6.27 lakh hectares in 1975-76. This was mainly due to change in classification of area under crops. The gross cropped area is, however, increased in six talukas viz. Satara, Wai, Koregaon, Khatav, Patan and Mahabaleshwar while it is decreased in Khandala, Phaltan, Man, Karad and Jaoli tahsils., when compared with 1974-75. In Khandala it decreased from 137 % in 1973-74 to 133 % in 1974-75 and 132 in 1975-76. However, the percentage for the district remained constant.

3.4 The percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown is highest in Khandala tahsil. The percentage of gross cropped area to net sown is more than the district average in Satara, Wai, Khandala, Koregaon and Phaltan tahsils. It is equal in Mahabaleshwar tahsil while it is below the district average in remaining tahsils. It is lowest in Man tahsil.

3.5 The gross irrigated area in the district has been decreased from 1.01 lakh hectares in 1960-61 to 0.95 lakh hectares in 1973-74. This decrease was also mainly due to drought conditions prevailed in the district in the years 1970-71, 1971-72 and 1972-73 which badly affected the water level in the ground.

3.6 The net area irrigated by different sources in the years 1960-61, 1972-73 and 1973-74 is given in the following table.

3.7 From the above table it will be seen that the net area irrigated by canals has decreased during the year 1973-74 as

compared to the year 1960-61 for the same reason of drought during the year 1972-73 while it has been increased from the sources of wells and other sources.

3.8. The increase in the proportion of irrigation indicates that all available sources of water were fully utilised in the drought area in the year 1972-73 and subsequently in the year 1973-74.

3.9 The agricultural production depends upon various factors such as natural conditions, input factors etc. The following table gives the yield rates and outturn of principal crops for the year 1960-61, 1974-75 and 1975-76.

3.10 The above table indicates that production of all crops has been increased except Bajra, Gram and Groundnut during the year 1975-76 as compared to the year 1960-61 so also yield rates of all crops have increased except Bajra, Sugarcane and Cotton in 1975-76 as compared to 1960-61.

#### CHANGES IN CROPPING PATTERN

3.11 The following table will broadly indicate the trend of cropping pattern in the district.

3.12 The percentage of area under food crops shows remarkable increase in the years 1973-74, 1974-75 and 1975-76 when compared with the year 1960-61. It is doubled under the crops Wheat Sugarcane and Cotton, while decreased under the crops Bajra and Gram. The area under food crops has increased from 70.07 percent to 78.73 percent in 1975-76.

3.13 The percentage of area under different irrigated crops to gross irrigated area shows that the percentage of total irrigated area under food crops has increased from 93.56 in 1960-61 to 96.37 in 1973-74 and to that extent the irrigated area under non-food crops showed downward trend. The following table gives an idea how the changes in irrigated area have been occurred.

3.14 From the above table it will be seen that percentage of area irrigated to total irrigated under Rice, Wheat, Bajra, and Sugarcane showed an increase while the other crops showed



decrease.

AGRICULTURAL CREDIT

3.15 The co-operative societies play an important role in the field of agricultural development by extending credit facilities on an extensive scale. The progress of facilities given by the agricultural credit societies during the years 1960-61, 1974-75 and 1975-76 and 1976-77 are given in the following table.

3.16 From the above table it will be seen that the number of societies have increased from 750 in 1960-61 to only 754 in 1976-77 while the membership increased from 1,31,956 in 1960-61 to 2,21,013 in 1976-77 which accounts an increase of 67.5 per cent membership during the period of 1960-61 to 1976-77. The loan advanced also shows remarkable increase which amounts nearly 93.4 percent increase during the same period. The amount of outstanding loans is very big and this is discouraging fact.

W A G E R A T E

3.17 The data on agricultural wage rates in rural areas are collected in three rural centres in Satara district since July 1963. These centres are Umbraj from Karad tahsil, Koregaon from Koregaon tahsil and Limb from Satara tahsil.

The average wage rates during the year 1976 for male field labour at Umbraj were found to be Rs. 4.25 while the same at Koregaon and Limb were Rs. 3.00 and 3.63 respectively. The average wage rates for females at Umbraj, Koregaon and Limb were Rs. 3.20, Rs. 2.00 and Rs. 2.98 per day respectively.

LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY

3.18 Livestock makes a substantial contribution to the economy by providing subsidiary income to farmers, food to human population and provides avenues of employment to landless labourers. Eleventh quinquennial census of Livestock, Poultry and agricultural implements was carried out all over the country during the year 1972.

The following table gives tahsilwise details of Livestock per 100 hectares.

3.19 From the above table it is seen that the indicator in Jaoli tahsil is lowest. It is below the district average in Khatav, Patan, Koregaon and Phaltan tahsil and it is highest than the district average in Karad, Khandala, Wai, Man, Satara and Mahabalesbwar tahsils.

3.20 The poultry population in the district in 1972 was 6,96,273 as against 6,57,771 in 1961 and 7,76,198 in 1966. The human population according to 1971 census for the district was 17,27,376. The poultry population per 100 persons was 46 in 1961, 54 in 1966 and 40 in 1972. (Population of 1966 assumed to be constant as that of 1961). Though the poultry population in 1972 seems to have increased, it has not increased proportionately as human population has increased during the decade 1961-71, and hence the population of poultry population per 100 persons has decreased from 46 in 1961 to 40 in 1972.

#### CONSUMPTION OF ELECTRICITY

3.21 During the year 1960-61 there were only 7 towns and 30 villages were electrified while 14 towns and 676 villages were electrified as on 31st March 1977. The percentage of electrified villages to total number of inhabited villages worked out to be 59.19. The per capita consumption of electricity in 1976-77 increased upto 61.79 KWH as against 4.53 KWH in 1960-61. This increase is mainly because of increase in the number of electrified villages and towns.

#### ENROLMENT IN THE EMPLOYMENT EXCHANGE AND -VACANCIES NOTIFIED.

3.22 Following table gives the statistical data available in connection with the employment.

3.23 Enrolment of candidates at the Employment Exchange is nearly 87 percent higher in 1976-77 than that of 1960-61. The percentage of placement to total registration has decreased from 18 percent to 10 percent in 1976-77. The number on the live register at the end of 1976-77 has increased more than six times as compared to that for the year 1960-61.

The comparative figures of last three years reflect the magnitude of the unemployment problem. This does not also include the unemployed persons seeking manual work and those who have not registered their names with Employment Exchange.

INCREASE IN INDOOR AND OUTDOOR PATIENTS TREATED

3.24 The medical facilities are being ~~utilized~~ availed of by increased number of people year after year. The following table gives the number of patients treated in public and public aided medical institutions in the district.

3.25 The above table shows that the number of indoor patients treated increased more than six times in 1976 as compared to the figures of 1961. The figure of outdoor patients has also doubled in 1976 as compared to 1961 figures. This increase is mainly due to increase in medical facilities throughout the district during the period of 1961 to 1976.

**INCREASE IN THE NUMBER OF STUDENTS IN DIFFERENT CATEGORIES:**

3.26 The educational facilities have also been increased remarkably during last 10 to 15 years. At present almost all villages have been provided with primary school facilities. The following table gives the number of institutions, No. of pupils and No. of teachers in different categories of education.

3.27 In case of primary education, there was an addition of 611 institutions and 40 % increase in the enrolment during the period of 1960-61 to 1976-77. The number of teachers has also increased from 5,005 in 1960-61 to 9,625 in 1976-77. The number of secondary institutions has increased from 132 in 1961-62 to 249 in 1976-77 while the enrolment increased from 23,112 in 1960-61 to 78,000 in 1976-77 and the number of teachers increased from 1,009 to 3,053 in the same period.

3.29 In case of higher education, the number of institutions also increased from 7 in 1960-61 to 29 in 1976-77, and enrolment increased from 1,786 to 16,754 in the same period.

INCREASE IN BANKING FACILITIES

3.30 Since the nationalisation of the big banks the various banking companies have brought the field of agricultural and industrial development in their operation fold and advancing loans to the agriculturists and small units of industries. The co-operative banks also have made remarkable progress by expanding their business in rural areas.

3.31 The banking offices have increased from 32 in 1960-61 to 173 in 1976-77 i.e. for every 9,984 persons there is a banking office in Satara district. These 173 banking offices are situated in 66 different places in the district.

### INCREASE IN ROAD LENGTH

3.32 The Pune-Miraj-Kolhapur-Banglore broad gauge railway route goes through Satara district with total length of 124 Kms.

3.33 At the end of the year 1976-77 total length of all types of roads excluding the municipal roads was 6,645 Kms. The road length at the end of the year 1960-61 was 2,481 Kms., thus the length per 100 Sq. Kms. of area increased from 24 Kms. in 1960-61 to 63 Kms. in 1976-77.

### P R I C E S

3.34 The consumer price index for working class of Solapur centre will show that the general price index in 1976-77 shot upto 308 from the base year 1960. The general index for Pune centre for 1976-77 was 287 ( base year 1961 ).

3.35 Since November 1962 prices of important commodities are being collected by District Statistical Organisations at each of the district head quarters on each Friday. As the prices are collected for selected commodities from selected shops they may not represent the district position but the data may still prove useful as a broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices over the period of time in the district. The following table indicates the average prices of some important commodities collected at Satara town for the year 1963, 1974, 1975 and 1976.

C H A P T E R - I V

ANNUAL PLAN 1976 - 77

4.1 The Fourth Five Year Plan ended on 31st March 1974 and the Fifth Five Year Plan began on 1st April 1974. Upto the end of 4th Plan, the plans were formulated at the State level and were implemented at district level. The 5th Plan is entirely based on district plans which are formulated at the district level as per guidance of the Planning Commission.

4.2 The year under review i.e. 1976-77 was the third Annual Plan of the 5th Plan period. During the year 1976-77, the district has spent an amount of Rs. 605.70 lakhs, which is 20.6% more than the expenditure incurred during the year 1975-76.

4.3 The following table gives the figures of expenditure incurred during the three Annual Plans of the 5th Plan.

4.6 It will be seen from the above table that out of total expenditure, 68.57 % has been incurred on State Sector Schemes. The amount of expenditure incurred on local sector schemes includes major expenditure on the schemes under Social Services followed by Agriculture, Transport and Communication and Co-operation and Community Development.

4.7 The following paragraphs give headwise details of financial and physical achievements.

I. AGRICULTURAL PROGRAMME :

4.8 Under this head of development due priority is given to Minor Irrigation and Drought Prone Area Programme which are the main factors to gear up the agricultural production. The following table gives details of expenditure incurred under different sub-heads.

CROP HUSBANDRY :

4.9 Under the sub-head efforts have been made to increase agricultural production by distributing improved seed, chemical fertilisers and pesticides. An area of 5,281 hectares has been covered under rat control.

MINOR IRRIGATION :

4.10 Under the sub-head, 2 percolation tanks, 182 new wells were constructed and 129 pump sets were installed. Two Lift Irrigation Schemes were also completed during the year.

SOIL CONSERVATION :

4.11 Under Soil Conservation programme 3,275 hectares of land was banded and 306 hectares of land was terraced.

AYACUT DEVELOPMENT :

4.12 An area of 150 hectares was developed and canals in 3,214 hectares were constructed under the Ayacut Development sub-head.

DROUGHT PRONE AREA PROGRAMME :

4.13 Under the programme, activities of dry land farming, minor irrigation works, forest works and animal husbandry activities were undertaken on which an amount of Rs. 29.23 lakh were spent during the year.

ANIMAL HUSBANDRY :

4.14 Under this sub-head, 5 veterinary institutions were provided artificial insemination facilities, subsidy for 60 rearing of cross breed heifers was given, and one veterinary aid centre was established.

F O R E S T :

4.15 Rs. 2.63 lakhs were utilised during the year for afforestation in 170 hectares and plantation of general utility timber in 65 hectares.

F I S H E R I E S :

4.16 An amount of Rs. 0.54 lakhs was spent for stocking of

12.00 lakhs fingerlings and netting of 0.84 lakhs was done during the year.

## II. CO-OPERATION AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT :

4.17 Under the sub-head co-operation, Rs. 4.08 lakhs were utilised for assisting one co-operative marketing society, 4 agricultural processing societies, 32 consumer stores and 8 labour contract societies.

### COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT :

4.18 There are 11 blocks in the district. An amount of Rs. 8.73 lakhs was distributed among these blocks for completion of one agricultural godown, 2 veterinary dispensaries, 111 school rooms and one recreation centre.

## III. IRRIGATION AND POWER :

### IRRIGATION :

4.18 During the year 1976-77, an amount of Rs. 54.28 lakhs was spent on Yeralwadi medium Irrigation project.

### P O W E R :

4.19 The electrification programme is being implemented by the M.S.E.B., and has electrified 16 villages and connected 140 electrical pump sets during the year.

## IV. INDUSTRY AND MINING :

4.20 An amount of Rs. 14.56 lakhs was utilised mainly for providing seed money to 535 unemployed graduates to start their own industries and remaining amount was spent for assistance to industrial co-operative societies.

## V. TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION :

4.21 Under this head, an amount of Rs. 47.70 lakhs was spent

for construction of 18 works of village roads and completion of 92 C.D. works.

VI. SOCIAL SERVICES : GENERAL EDUCATION :

4.22 Under this programme Rs. 74.25 lakhs ( about 47.7 % of the total expenditure under the head Social Services ) have been spent on development of primary and secondary education. 62 new rooms for primary schools were constructed and E.B.C. concessions have been given to 72,637 students, during the year 1976-77.

TECHNICAL EDUCATION :

4.23 An amount of Rs. 2.76 lakhs have been spent on development and purchase of equipments in Govt. Polytechnic and Pharmacy College at Karad and Technical institutions in the district.

HEALTH AND FAMILY PLANNING :

4.24 Under this programme construction of nurses quarters, 6 P.H.C./Sub-centres and 2 rural hospitals have been undertaken by utilising Rs. 14.64 lakhs including purchase of medicines and equipments.

WATER SUPPLY AND DRAINAGE :

4.25 2 Govt. water supply schemes, 4 municipal water supply schemes, 29 village piped water supply schemes and 54 wells were in execution during 1976-77 with the expenditure of Rs. 45.88 lakhs.

URBAN DEVELOPMENT :

4.26 Loans to 2 municipal councils amounting to Rs. 2.35 lakhs were given for implementation of their development plans.

H O U S I N G :

4.27 An amount of Rs. 0.60 lakhs was utilised for provision

of house sites to 70 agricultural labourers and tiling of roofs of 83 houses.

BACKWARD CLASS WELFARE :

4.28 An amount of Rs. 5.79 lakhs was utilised on various development schemes such as Award of scholarships, grant in aid to B.C. hostels and opening and maintenance of Ashram shalas.

LABOUR AND LABOUR WELFARE :

4.29 Under the sub-head an amount of Rs. 7.17 was utilised for craftsmen training and apprenticeship training programme.

VII MISCELLANEOUS PROGRAMMES :

4.30 Under this head Rs. 1.10 lakhs were spent for supply of community radio sets and television sets. Rs. 118.11 lakhs were also utilised on Employment Guaranteed Schemes under which works of canals, M.I.Tanks, percolation tanks and village tanks were undertaken.

CENTRALLY SPONSERRED PROGRAMMES :

4.31 Apart from the District Plan, an amount of Rs. 46.88 lakhs has been utilised on centrally sponsored schemes. The details of headwise expenditure are given below :

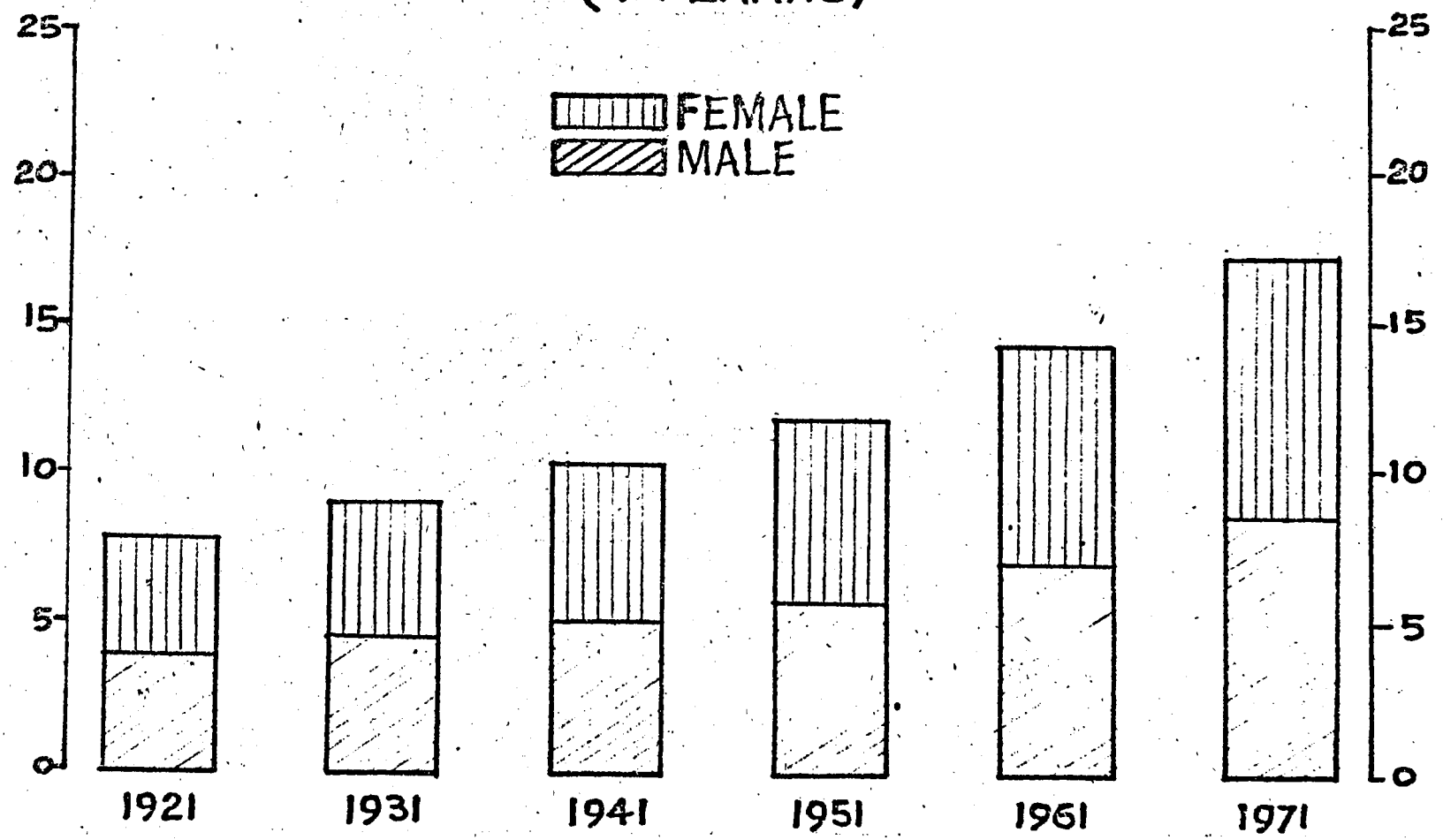

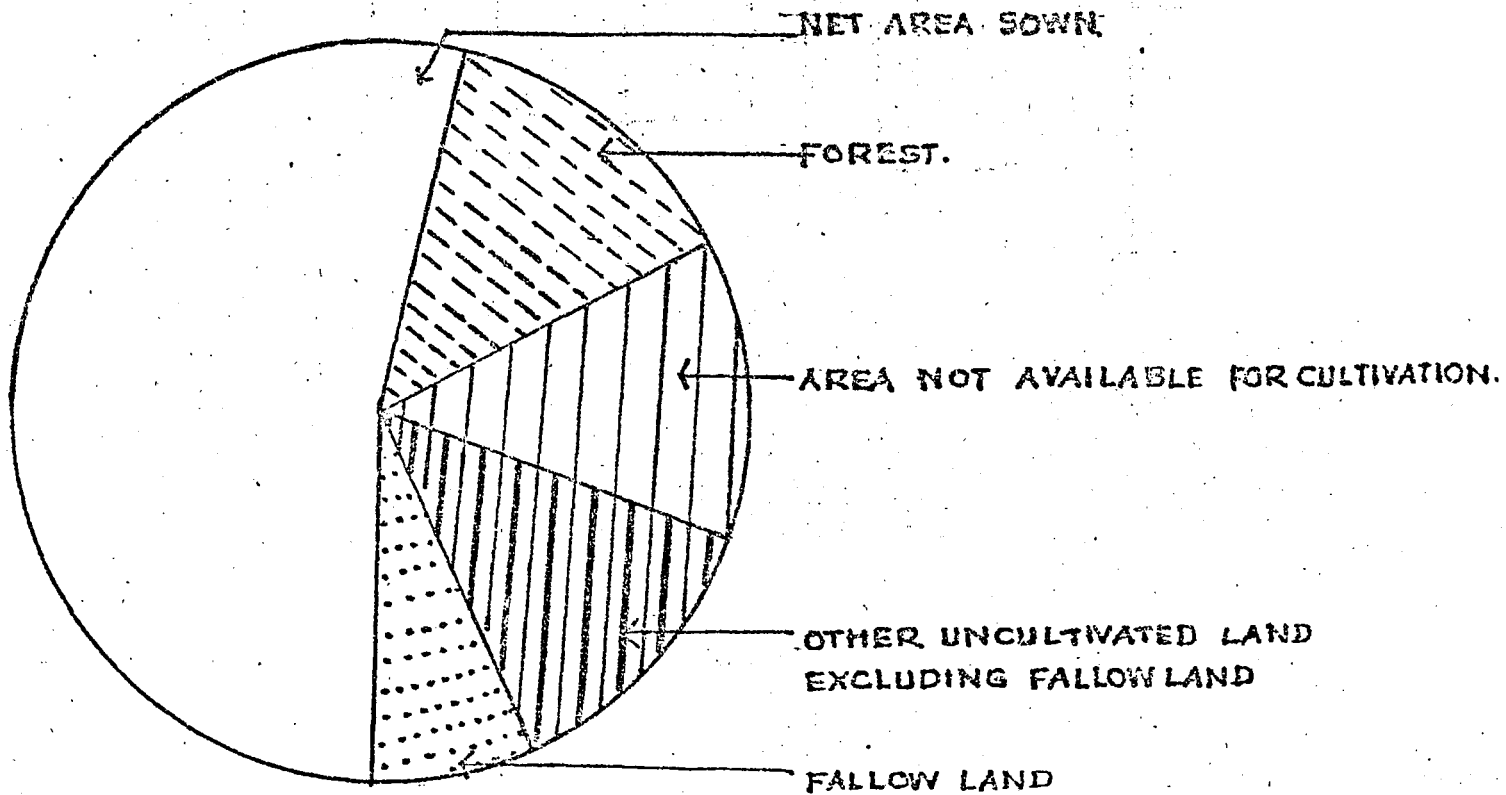

# LAND UTILISATION IN SATARA DISTRICT. 1975-76

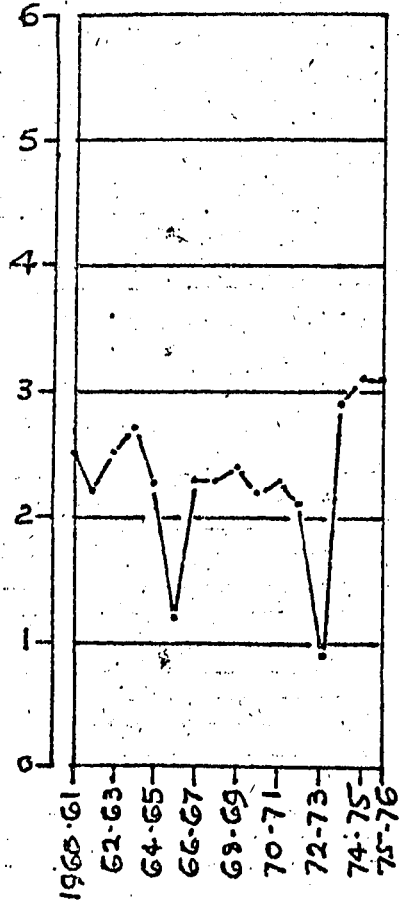
