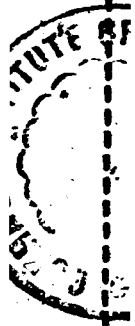

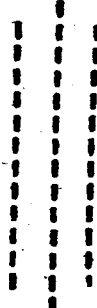

CHAPTER - I.

1. INTRODUCTION AND LOCATION:-

The age long famous temple at Tuljapur town of this district enshrines the Goddess 'Bhawari' the popular deity of Maharashtra. The cult of goddess is very ancient one and finds mention even in 'Vedas' where she is called "Aditi". The earliest inscriptional evidence regarding its antiquity can not go beyond 1898 A.D. The Goddess was the principal deity of 'Chatrapati Shivaji', the other Chatrapatis and Peshawas who devoted quiet generously to the temple. The village "Thair" in the district is also an ancient place and was known as "Tagra" It also finds mention by Ptolemy in his work "Periplus of Euxtherean sea" (1st century A.D.). Here an ancient Buddhist deity has been converted in later period into a Brahmanical shrine by installing the image of "God Vishnu" and is at present known as "Trivikrama" temple. Thair is also the native of poor saint "Gora Kumbhar". The Rashtrakutas who succeeded 'Chalukyas' of Badami in 753 A.D. had their epithet: "LATTAJITA DEVADEISA" which implies that they were the inhabitants of Latur.

2. BOUNDARIES:

To the extreme south of Maharashtra Osmanabad district lies between ~~xxxxxx~~ 17.40 and 18.40 north latitude and 75.16 and 76.40 east longitude. Osmanabad district is bounded by part of Solapur district ~~xxxxxx~~ or the south. Beed district on its north, Nanded district and Bidar district of Karnataka state on its east and Ahmadnagar and part of Solapur district on its west. Solapur city is the nearest town and it has therefore close commercial and social ties with it.

Barshi taluka in Solapur district is almost surrounded by Osmanabad district. Nanded and Peen towns are about 218 Kms. and 128 Kms. respectively away from Osmanabad town and are directly connected by the State Transport Bus services.

The Solapur Aurangabad road passes through the district. The Latur Miraj Railway line and Parli Hyderabad Railway line (now included in south-central railway zone) also pass through this district. Latur is the biggest railway station in this district.

3. AREA:

The area of Osmanabad district is 14,117.0 Sq. Kms. according to figures furnished by the Surveyor General of India as per 1971 census which is ^{21.88%} of the area of Marathwada and 4.59% of the area of Maharashtra state. The rural area of this district is 13,725.8 Sq. Kms. and the urban area is about 391.2 sq. Kms. The area reported by the Director of Land Records, Maharashtra State for Osmanabad district is 14,256 Sq. Kms. In Marathwada region, this district is next to Aurangabad size.

In terms of area Osmanabad district ranks seventh among 26 districts of Maharashtra state. The average area of district in Marathwada region works out to 12,905 Sq. Kms. and the average area per district in Maharashtra state is 11,837 Sq. Kms.

4. TOPOGRAPHY.

A major portion of this district is laterite plateau with an average height of 2,000 feet above the sea level. This district is converted with small hills and offshoots of the Balaghat. Parts of Bhim, Ausa, Kallam, Osmanabad & Tuljapur Talukas situated on Balaghat ranges and the rest of table lands,

The district lies partly in the Upper Godawari basin and partly in the Bhima basin-Ahmedpur, Udgir, Kallam, AUSA, Latur and Nilanga talukas are situated on the plateau of the Balaghat and lie on the valley of the river Manjra which is an important tributary of the Godawari. Osmanabad and Umerga talukas are drained by the Terna an important feeder of the Manjra. Paranda and parts of Rhum, Tuljapur and Umerga talukas are in the basin of the Sina river which is a tributary of the Bhima.

Of all the towns in the district, Rhum commands the highest elevation of 2,500 feet from the sea level where as Paranda has the lowest height of 1,735 feet from the sea level. The average height of the plateau is 2,000 feet above the sea level. The low land portion to the south of the plateau lies in the Bhima basin.

5. HILLS, RIVER SYSTEM AND SOILS.

The main system of hills is the Balaghat and its off shoots from the north-west corner from Ahmednagar and stretches to the south-east. It divides the district into two portions, plateau to the north-east and low lands to the west, south-west and south. The general slope of the plateau is from south-west to north-east.

There are two broad natural zones in the district viz. 1) Balaghat plateau drained by the Manjra and the Terna rivers and their tributaries and 2) the southern low land plain which is in the Bhima basin. The river Manjra flows on the northern border and demarcates this district from Deed district. In addition to hill ranges the district abounds in net work of rivulets running from all sides.

The Manjra which rises in Patoda taluka of Beed district, runs towards the east along the northern boundary as far as the north eastern corner of Latur taluka where it takes southerly direction before entering Bidar district of Karnataka state. Its length in the district is about 104 Kms.

The Terna flows from west to east in Osmanabad, Ausa, Umerga and Nilanga talukas and meets the Manjra river near the eastern boundary of the district. The Manyad is also a tributary of the Manjra. It flows towards the north-east through Ahmedpur taluka and enters Nanded district to meet the Manjra on the eastern boundary of the district. The Tawaraja which drains in Latur taluka joins the Manjra at Siwani village. On the western border of Paranda taluka. The Sina flows from the north to the south. The Bori flows through Tuljapur taluka and joins the Sina river lower down in Solapur district. Even though there are number of small rivers and rivulets streaming in the district like the Bori in Tuljapur taluka or the Manyad in Ahmedpur taluka or the Denniturain Umerga taluka or the Banganga in Dhum taluka, they remain practically dry for most part of the year & as the water from them is drained out of this district from the high plateau resulting into considerable shortage of water in the district.

The soil can be divided into three zones (1) The eastern part consisting of Ahmedpur, Udgir and Parts of Latur and Ausa talukas (2) Osmanabad, Kallam talukas and Parts of Latur, Ausa and Umerga talukas (3) Tuljapur, Paranda & Dhum talukas.

The first zone consists in general of light and light medium soils. They are of inferior type, not retentive of moisture and is therefore, suitable only for the cultivation of kharif crops. The soils in some parts of Nilanga are of laterites type.

The second zone consists of changing types of soils. Heavy deep black cotton soils as against shallow light soils are found in this zone. Due to this peculiarity of soil, both kharif and rabi crops are grown in this area. Broadly it can be said that eastern part of Osmanabad, Latur, Ausa and Kallam talukas grow more kharif crops than rabi crops, while the western parts of those talukas grow rabi crops predominantly.

The third zone consists of heavy soil which is more retentive of moisture. Hence rabi crops are the major crops of this area. The mountainous ranges in this zone have formed typical strips suitable for paddy cultivation. This is a peculiarity of this zone. Even though the types of soil are classified above on a broad basis, varieties in soils, however, are found within the talukas and more within the zones categorised above.

The forests allotted all over the district are some what dense in Tuljapur, Kallam and Udgir talukas. They occupy too little portion of the total area in this district and have definitely resulted in soil erosion to a large extent.

6. CLIMATE TEMPERATURE AND RAINFALL.

As the district forms part of the Deccan plateau, its climate is dry and is subject to extremes. The year can be divided into rainy season from middle of June to the end of September, a sultry period from about the end of September.

to the middle of November, winter from the middle of November to the end of January, dry period during February and March and summer during April, May and middle of June. Summer is in general full of gales and gusty winds. Even though the variations in temperature are large in general and the weather is subject to extremes of heat and cold, the summer season in the district is more cooler than in any other districts of Marathwada region, being at a higher altitude. In general the climate of Osmanabad district is considered to be bracing and salubrious.

Osmanabad district gets rains from the south-east monsoon like other districts of Deccan plateau and the rains starts in the middle of June, because intense in July and ceases by the end of September. The normal rainfall of Osmanabad district is about (787 Mms.) Tuljapur and Osmanabad talukas on the west usually get 1,016 Mms. to 1,346 Mms. of rainfall, while Paranda and Dhum talukas get near about 762 Mms. to 888 Mms. of rainfall. This part comes in the shadow of western ghat and is therefore, called "Rain shadow area". Because of the low rainfall in Paranda and Dhum talukas there is always a fear of scarcity and shortage of water.

It may be noted that this area being adjacent to Ahmednagar district, is frequently hit by scarcity. These talukas as compared to the other talukas in Osmanabad district, are backward. The northern part of Ahmedpur taluka is also some times affected by scarcity of water.

In general, Osmanabad district is not considered as scarcity area.

Recently Government of Maharashtra had appointed Committee under the Chairmanship of Shri Sukhthankar, the Secretary, Govt. of Maharashtra, Agriculture and Co-operation Department to look into the problem of scarcity and to identify areas which are more prone to scarcity.

Accordingly after deep study of the problems the Committee has identified the following areas as drought prone i) Paranda ii) Bhdm iii) Part of Kalam, Osmanabad, Tuljapur and Ahmedpur talukas. This area is now being covered under drought prone areas programme.

7. RECENT DEVELOPMENT.

As per recent Govt. orders the Collector has been named as Member Secretary of the District Planning and Development Council in place of the Chief Executive Officer, Zilla Parishad. Now he is responsible for preparation of developmental plans in the district. He is assisted by the Deputy Chief Executive Officer (Planning) in work of district Planning.

With a view to utilise the surplus milk available in the area it is decided to set up a milk powder plant at Udgir.

For Osmanabad district, the State Bank of India is a lead bank is expected to estimate credit demand from the existing pattern of economic activities and also those emerging while growth oriented programmes are being implemented and to evolve schemes for meeting this demand in co-operation, with other banks and financial institutions. For estimating the credit needs of this area deep studies of tahsils are being undertaken by the state Bank.

On the basis of deep studies a credit plan suitable to the Economic conditions and infrastructural facilities available in the district has been formulated by the Bank.

Osmánabad district has been selected for implementation of intensive electrification scheme under rural electrification programme. Accordingly the scheme of intensive electrification is being implemented in the district.

Explanatory notes on scope and limitations on Statistics presented in the District Statistical Abstract.

PURPOSE: This is the 15th issue of the District Statistical ABSTRACT since its 1st publication in the year 1958-59. In this publication every attempt is made to include exhaustive statistics about important Socio Economic Indicators of the Economy. The talukawise data is furnished wherever possible so as to enable the reader to have a clear picture of the achievements in various field in the different talukas of the district. The data presented in the most of the tables pertains to the year of 1976-77. In case of few tables where the data for the year of publication is not available the data for the latest available year is furnished.

The Statistical Material presented here is mainly collected from various departments of the state Government as central Govt. offices, local bodies and other agencies. The foot note given at the end of each table indicates the source from which the data is collected.

DISTRICT AT A GLANCE: In this statement some broad and important particulars about the district in comparison with Maharashtra state level figures are presented under various heads like population, Agriculture, Co-operation, Medical and public health, Education etc. which bring forth the salient features of the district. The reference period for the figures concerning this district and Maharashtra state are mentioned against each of them as in many cases this period is not identical. The scope and limitations of the information in this abstract is also discussed in the following paras.

I. AREA AND POPULATION: In this section seven tables (tables from 1 to 7) are included. The Table No.1 gives figures of areas, rural and urban population, No. of houses and Households, density of population of different talukas of the district as per 1971 census. The table No.2 gives talukewise figures of decadal variations in population since 1951 census. The talukewise classification of villages and towns according to the population ranges as per 1971 census in Osmanabad district is indicated in table No. 3 & 4. The table No.5 presents the talukewise figures of number of workers according to livelihood classes. Table No. 6(A) and 6(c) gives population of the district as per 1971 census and according to age group and religion. The table No.7 indicates talukewise scheduled caste and scheduled tribes and neo budhists population of the district according to 1971 census.

II. CLIMATE AND RAINFALL.

The table No.8 gives monthwise information regarding rainy days and actual rainfall recorded at various taluka headquarter in this district. Normal Rainfall recorded at each tahsil place is the average rainfall relating to that place over a long period. The table No.9 gives the temperature data for the selected centres. However there are no centres selected for this purpose in the district and hence the data for this table is not available.

III. AGRICULTURE: The table Nos. 10 to 23 are on Agriculture and gives information about Land utilisation, area under different crops, area irrigated under different crops and by different sources, production and yield rate of principal crops, minor irrigation works.

Medium irrigation project availability of underground water, Agricultural wage rates and information regarding Agricultural census, 1970 etc. The data regarding famine scarcity and Agricultural implements is also given.

Table No.10 gives utilisation of land according to the standard heads of utilisation for the year 1974-75 and 1975-76. The table No.11 indicates the area under different crops while the table No.12 gives the figures of out-turn and average yield rates of principal crop per hectares for the district. The table No.13 presents the distribution of net irrigated area by source of irrigation. The table No.14 indicates the area irrigated under different crops. The table No.15 gives the number of irrigation wells in use and not in use in each taluka. The table No. 16 relates to the activities of the Groundwater Survey and development agencies in this district while the table No.17 deals with minor irrigation works. The table No.18 gives the data of major and medium irrigation projects. The table No.19 gives the information regarding Agricultural wage rates for skilled and unskilled labourers collected from three different rural centres. The table No.20 gives the number of operational holdings and also the area operated, number of area of operational holdings by tenure and by size class of operational holdings in this district. The table No. 21 provides the data regarding Agricultural implements in each taluka as per 1972 livestock census. The famine and scarcity data is shown in the tables numbering 22 and 23.

IV. ANIMAL HUSBANDRY.

The table No.24 presents talukawise data relating to livestock population as enumerated at the time of quinquennial livestock census 1972, while table No.25 deals with the veterinary facilities available in each taluka of the district such as number of veterinary hospitals, dispensaries and aid centres etc. The table No.26 shows the diseasewise livestock mortality in Osmanabad district. The table No.27 gives details of the information of the recognised slaughter houses and number of animals slaughtered in them during the period under reference.

The table No.28 gives details of area under forest and estimates of different forest product. Table Nos. 29-A, B and C gives the information regarding quantities of fish catch for the year 1975-76.

V. INDUSTRIES EMPLOYMENT MINING AND ELECTRICITY.

The factory statistics is presented in the table Nos. 30,31,32 which cover the following types of factories registered under factories Act,1948.

- i) Those factories using power and employing 10 or more workers.
- ii) Those factories not using power but employing 20 or more workers.
- iii) Those factories not covered by (i) and (ii) but notified by Govt. as covered by the Factories Act,1974.

The table No.30 presents industrywise total number of factories the total number of mandays for which they were working during the years and the average daily employment classified by adults, adolescents and children. The data presented in columns 6 to 7 of this tables relates,

only to the factories submitting returns while the table No. 31 presents industrywise distribution of factories according to the working strength, the table No. 32 gives distribution of factories according to number of days worked. It may be noted that here the number of workers shown in these tables are the average number of workers working daily through out the years and not the total number of workers on the register of factories. The table No. 33 deals with the Annual survey of Industries. The table No. 34 gives the registration of candidates, vacancies notified and number of candidates placed in employment etc. In table No. 35 occupational distribution of total registration and placement of employment generated and expenditure incurred during the financial year under employment guarantee scheme. Table No. 37 deals with the volume of employment in different industries.

The tables numbering 38 and 39 presents the data regarding electricity. The generation and consumption of Electricity as well as number of towns and villages covered under the electrification programme are indicated in the above two tables.

VI. CO-OPERATION:- In all eight tables are included in this section under which statistics relating to various activities of co-operative movement in the district is shown. The table No. 40 presents different types of co-operative societies functioning in Osmanabad district. The table No. 41 gives the figures in respect of branches of co-operative Banks.

while the table No.42 deals with the talukawise primary agricultural credit societies, the table No.43 gives the data regarding other co-operative societies of different types. The table No.44 indicates the operation of central & primary co-operative marketing societies in each taluka, table No.45 deals with the operation of different co-operative societies. The table No.46 indicates the operation of regulated markets. The table No.47 shows the number of registered money lenders in different talukas of this district and loans advanced by them to traders and non-traders.

VII. MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH.

In this section five tables are included. The table No.48 deals with the medical facilities available through public aided bodies in each taluka. The tables numbering 49 and 50 present the information about vital statistics. While the table No.51 deals with the vaccination statistics and cholera inoculation, the table no.52 presents the number of family planning centres functioning in each taluka and the number of sterilisation operations done and number of intrauterine contraceptive device insertion performed.

VIII. EDUCATION:- In this section seven tables are included. The table No. 53 indicates literacy in each taluka of Osmana- bad district according to 1971 census. The percentage of literacy has been shown separately sexwise as well as for rural and urban areas. The table numbering 54 and 55 deal with education in rural and urban areas in the district as per 1961 census. The number of Institutions according

to types enrollment and the teachers employed in them is presented in the table No.56. The table No.57 deals with the beneficiaries of backward class students of different categories in Osmanabad district. IX. TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION:-In this section the statistics relating to various modes of transport is given.The table No. 60-A presents the total length of Railway route in the district according to different types of Rail gauges. The surfacewise and categorywise road length is given in table No.61.This table also includes roads constructed by different agencies such as Municipal Councils, Zilla Parishad & the public works and Housing Deptt. The table No.62 gives statistics regarding the number of motor vehicles in operation in Aurangabad region.

The table No.63 gives operational statistics of the nationalised Road transport according to S.T.Divisions viz. Osmanabad. The table No.64 gives the data of traffic census on important roads in Osmanabad district in 1975. The table No.65 presents postal, telegraphs, and telephone statistics for 1961-62, 1965-66, 1970-71, 1974-75 to 1976-77, the table No.66 gives the statistics regarding rural broadcasting in Osmanabad district.

X. The table No.77 deals with the monthly average retail prices of important commodities collected from the district headquarters for the year 1976. In the table No.78 price Index for the working classes is shown for Aurangabad and Nanded centres. The consumer price index number for the working classes is based on the price of level of 1961.

XIII. MISCELLANEOUS:- There are in all 14 tables in this section. The section deals with the statistics pertaining to police deptt. Judicial court and Revenue deptt.

The table No.79 gives statistical data about strength of police force while table No.80 gives crime statistics of this district for the calendar year 1976. The table No.81 deals with the work disposed of in civil and criminal courts.

Miscellaneous: In this section in all eleven tables are included which gives information on various items like cinema, Banking Offices, Joint stock companies, Insurance Small savings, Land Revenue, Printing Presses etc. The table No.82 deals with cinema statistics while the tables numbering 83, 84 and 85 gives the data regarding banking offices scheduled banks and joint stock companies respectively. The table No.86 gives the number of insurance policies issued and amount insured while the table No.87 deals with the collection of small savings. This indicator spot-light on the extent of double cropping in the district. In the table placed below the net cropped area, double cropped area and the percentage of the latter to the former area is given.

It is seen from figures given for different years that the percentage of double cropped area to the net area sown has shown a slight change over a period of 15 years. In the year 1961-62 the percentage was 104.04 while in 1975-76 it was 107.82. Inadequate irrigational facilities had been the root cause of such a low proportion of double cropping. The extent of the double cropping was the highest where in AUSA and Ahmedpur taluk-a was/ as Osmanabad, Nilanga, Udgir talukas was accounted for very few area under double cropping.

Productive of Important crops.

With exception of the groundnut and Jowar, the production of almost all crops given in the table showed a remarkable increase over a period of a decade starting from 1961-62. The decrease in the production of groundnut and Jowar crop also could be attributed to scarcity and untimely rains for the last 5 to 6 years. Consequent upon which there had been acute scarcity condition all over the district during 1969-70 to 1972-73.

From the above table it is seen that value of Agricultural produce increased during the year 1975-76 as compared to the figures of 1961-62. During the year 1975-76 prices of all agricultural commodities shot up spirally and consequently gross value of Agricultural production increased. The production of most of the crops increased during 1975-76 as compared to the year 1961-62.

Percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area.

The percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area gives an idea as to how much area has been irrigated more than once during the year under reference.

The extent of irrigating the area more than once increased slightly during the year 1973-74 as compared to the year 1961-62 and 1965-66. The percentage of gross irrigated to net irrigated area was 113.33 in 1961-62, 112.96 in 1965-66 while it increased slightly to 113.79 in 1973-74.

INDICATOR NO. 5.

Change in cropping pattern.

With the exception of few changes in the percentage, the food crops still enjoy dominant position. The percentage of food crops to gross cropped area which was 73.05 in 1961-62, decreased to 71.93 in 1965-66, and showed increasing trend in 1975-76. The acute country-wide food shortage prevailing then due to scarcity conditions prior to the year 1975-76 compelled the cultivators to utilise the area normally meant for commercial crops for growing food crops. Hence the increase in the percentage of food crops to 76.48 in 1975-76. This can be ascertained from the simultaneous decrease in the percentage of non-food crops from 28.07 in 1965-66 to 23.52 in 1975-76.

INDICATOR NO. 6.

Increase in Agricultural credit outstanding dues and gross value of Agricultural produce.

During all these years of planned economic development Agriculture had been the recipient of maximum financial aid from the government. The above statement is based on the factual study of Osmanabad district credit plan of banks for the year 1976-77 which shows that out of total amount of Rs. 1.40 lakhs, Agriculture had received Rs. 6.21 lakhs i.e. 83.65% amount is received for Agricultural purposes. Besides this, the co-operative agency also granted loans to individual farmers. This had all been to finance intensive and progressive methods of cultivation being adopted by agriculturists. Consequently loans advanced, dues outstanding increased to very great extent in recent years. The gross value of some of the important crops increased from Rs. 1968 lakhs in 1961-62 to Rs. 7064 lakhs in 1975-76. This had been due to spiral rise in prices. In the table given below statistics regarding agricultural credit dues outstanding and gross value of some important crops is given.

It is seen from the above table that the amount of Agricultural credit has increased nearly thrice as compared to the year 1961-62. The dues outstanding increased by nearly ten times in 1976-77 over the corresponding figures of 1961-62. Gross value of Agri. produce of some important crops increased about four times as compared to the year 1961-62.

INDICATOR NO. 7.

Agricultural Wage rates.

This indicator spots light on the earnings of Agricultural labour especially in rural areas. The wages for skilled and unskilled workers are collected from three rural centres viz. Kingaon in Ahmedpur taluka, Killari in Ausa taluka and Murud in Latur taluka. In the table placed below actual wages that were paid to the skilled and unskilled labourers at the aforementioned three centres are given below.

From the aforementioned table it is seen that the wages of Murud centre were comparatively higher for both skilled workers. The wage rates of carpenter, Blacksmith and cobblers are slightly increased at Kingaon centre during 1976, as compared to the last year 1975. The wage rates of carpenter at Killari centre increased during the year 1976 as compared to the year 1975 whereas the wage rates of blacksmith and cobbler in respect of Killari centres found to be decreased during 1976. The wage rates of carpenter, Blacksmith and cobbler in respect of Murud centre found to be decreased during the year 1975. The wage rates of male unskilled labours at Kingaon centres is slightly decreased in 1976 as compared to the year 1975. Whereas the wage rates of unskilled female labour in respect of Kingaon centre is increased, The wage rates of unskilled male labours in Killari and Murud centres found to be increased in the year 1976. The wage rates of other agricultural labour of Kingaon centre slightly decreased during the year 1976 as compared to the year 1975. The wage rate of male labour of this category at Killari and Murud centre remained unchanged during the year 1976. The wage rates of female, other agricultural labour at Kingaon and Murud centre increased in the year 1976 as compared to the year 1975. The wage rates of Killari centre is remained unchanged. The wage rates of hardmen increased at Killari and Murud centres ^{during} ~~in~~ 1976 as compared to the figure of 1975. Whereas the wage rates of hardman of Kingaon centre found to be slightly decreased during the year 1976.

INDICATOR NO. 8.

Livestock per hectare of cultivable area

Livestock plays a very important role in Indian Agriculture in the absence of mechanical methods of cultivation. Osmanabad district has already established its name in the field of livestock.

Of three breeds of cattle viz. 'Deoni', 'Red', 'Khandari' and 'Khilari' in Osmanabad district. Deoni breed hail from Udgir and Ahmedpur talukas of this district, Khilari breed is mainly found in Paranda Omerga and Tuljapur talukas of the district and 'Red', 'Khandari' in border areas of the district adjoining Nanded district.

Among buffaloes Pandharpur and local breeds are found in the district. The table below gives livestock (bovine and ovine) per hectare of the cultivable area in Osmanabad district during the years 1961-62, 1965-66 and 1975-76.

It is seen from the above table that livestock per hectare of cultivable area decreased in all the talukas except Ahmedpur during 1975-76 livestock per hectare of cultivable area is more in district. The ratio is low in Paranda and Tuljapur taluka being 0.74 and 0.78 respectively.

Poultry per 1000 persons decreased from 186 in 1961 to 117 in 1972, resulting in a decrease of 37% in the district percentage. As compared to the figures of 1966 census it is observed that poultry per thousand persons increased, from 102 in 1966 to 117 in 1972. During 1972 number of poultry per 1000 persons was found more (i.e. 200 or more) in Tuljapur, Paranda and Bhum talukas as compared to other talukas in the district. The ratio was less than 100 in Latur, Ahmedpur, Udgir, Nilanga and Ausa talukas.

INDICATOR NO.10.

Per capita consumption of Electricity

Per capita consumption of Electricity is a good reflector of Economic activity as well as standard of living. The consumption of Electricity in the district is increasing at faster rates since 1965-66.

The per capita consumption which was at 0.65 Kwh. in 1961-62 increased to 3.23 Kwh. in 1965-66 and to 33.37 in 1976-77. The increase in consumption of power mainly attributed to rural electrification programme for energising irrigation pumps and increase in industrial power consumption.

The table below shows purpose wise consumption of electricity in the district in the year 1961-62, 1965-66 and 1976-77.

The number of candidates enrolled had been on the increase since 1961-62. From 4,845 in 1961-62 it increased to 8,786 in 1976-77 showing an increase of 81.34 as against this, vacancies notified were in the decrease since 1961-62. As many as 1,300 vacancies notified in 1961-62. During 1976-77 only 712 vacancies were notified which showed decrease of 45.23% over 1961-62.

INDICATOR NO.12.

Increase in the indoor and out-door patients in Hospitals dispensaries and P-rimary Health Centres.

There are three Hospitals in the district of which one is located at Osmanabad and two at Latur. One Hospital at Latur is equipped with Pathological Laboratory and Radiology unit. Further there are 53 dispensaries of all kinds located at other urban and rural centres and as many as 15 Public Health Centres in rural areas of the district. During 1976 the number of indoor patients treated increased to 93,356 in comparison to 8,617 in the year 1961. Similar rise in the out door patients treated could be seen from 5,40,386 in 1961 to 7,90,419 during 1976.

The number of beds per lakh of population which fall from 21 in 1961 to 19 in 1965 had shown an increase to 27 during 1976 per lakh of population.

INDICATOR NO.13.

Increase in the number of students in different categories (Boys and girls seperately).

 With provision of free education upto primary level and grant of concessions scholarship etc. to eligible students in the secondary and higher education, the number of students both boys and girls recorded remarkable increase in recent years. The number of teachers and institutions also recorded simultaneous increase obviously due to increase in number of students. This can be seen from the following table.

In the primary section the number of institutions and girls recorded 35.58%, 69.44% and 278.28% increase respectively over and above the corresponding figures for the year 1961-62. In the field of secondary and higher education the increase is indeed remarkable. The glaring fact noticed is that there had been tremendous increase in the number of girls as compared to boys in the primary and secondary section.

INDICATOR NO.14.

Increase in Road mileage per hundred square kilometres.

Roads play an important role in the developing economy. Acute scarcity conditions prevailed in the district during the year 1969-70 to 1972-73. With the result Government started number of scarcity road works through different executive agencies. Consequently the road mileage increased from 523.99 kilometres in 1961-62 to 4,82.87 in 1976-77. Thus the road length per hundred square kilometre of geographical area increased from 3.71% in 1961-62 to 28.92% in 1976-77.

INDICATOR NO.15.

Increase in banking facilities in proportion to Population.

Banking facilities play an significant role in developing economy. The co-operative Banks succeeded to meet out the need of rural credit to a great extent by the establishment of number of branches in rural areas. However the number of branches opened so far were found to be inadequate to the over expanding credit needs.

The population of Banks per lakh of population worked out to 5.91 during 1975-76. More population was served by the Banks since 1961-62 because of the opening of additional branches of different banks in the district by 1976. There were as many as 112 branches of different banks in the district. With the result that the population served by each branch came down from 86,927 in 1961-62 to 16,935 in 1975-76.

INDIATOR NO.16.

Prices. Prices of different commodities assume privotal importance in developing economy. Prices of all commodities shot up spirally during the year 1976 as compared to the year 1961 from the table placed below it is seen that during the year under report the prices of all commodities recorded considerable increase.

CHAPTER-IV.
P L A N N I N G.

The concept of Planning is a heritage from the pre-independence period. Upto the end of the Fourth Five Year Plan attempts were made to formulate the state plan on the basis of the resources and the requirements of the administrative regions so as to remove the regional imbalances.

The emphasis on regional planning had however certain disadvantages and it was noticed that the disparities within the region in some cases tended to get accentuated. Plan expenditure was inclined to be regarded as an end in itself rather than means to increasing out-put for the state as a whole.

In these circumstances and in furtherance of philosophy of multi-level planning the state adopted District as a unit of planning a reality was made at the time of the formulation of the Fourth Five Year plan. The District planning bodies were requested to prepare an integrated plan for the district taking into account local conditions and resources available and ~~in~~ ~~con~~ ~~firm~~ ~~ity~~ with the broad policy laid down in the national and states approach to the Fifth plan.

In the light of the above draft Fifth Five Year Plan of each District was prepared by District Planning bodies.

During the year 1974-75 and 1975-76 i.e. 1st and 2nd year of the Fifth Five Year Plan Annual Plans of the District were formulated and implemented in the district as per the guidelines laid down in District Planning. Total expenditure incurred during 1974-75 and 1975-76 was Rs. 1,225.30 Lakhs.

From the third year of the Fifth Five Year Plan i.e. 1976-77 outlays for the District level schemes in the State Annual plan were determined with reference to the outlays provided by District Planning and Development Council for each scheme. This draft Annual Plan was discussed at state level meetings between State Government and Executive Committee of District Planning and Development Council at which representatives of Administrative Department and Head of the Departments were present. The Annual Plan 1976-77 of the District thus incorporates the views of both the District Planning authorities and technical and administrative Departments.

In the light of the above procedure the draft Annual Plan of the District for the year 1976-77 was discussed and finalised. The total outlay thus approved for the District for the year 1976-77 was Rs. 980.44 lakhs. As against this the actual expenditure incurred during the year 1976-77 was 100483 lakhs.

Which has exceeded the provision for 1976-77. Taking into account the importance of the schemes included under different Head/Sub-head of Development Government have decided to classify from 1976-77 onwards, the sub-heads into two sectors viz. Core and Non-Core sectors. The table below gives the sectorwise budget provision and expenditure incurred during the year 1976-77 alongwith the No. of District level schemes included under

In the District Planning Zilla Parishad has to play an equally important role in the implementation of the District level schemes included in the Annual Plan of the District, whose primary responsibility is promotion of planned development of the District by utilising local resources to the maximum extent. Accordingly during the year 1975-76 and 1976-77 Zilla Parishad has spent Rs. 81.06 lakhs and Rs. 200.82 lakhs, respectively for the implementation of the District level schemes, in the local sector. The sub-headwise distribution of total expenditure into state sector and local sector is shown in the table given below.

 Agricultural programme received the highest priority. This could be seen from the fact that ^{out} of total expenditure of Rs.1004.83 lakhs for the Annual Plan 1976-77 as a whole, the amount spent for the above head was of the order of Rs. 303.36 lakhs. The percentage of expenditure of Agricultural programmes to the total plan expenditure was Rs. 30.19.

Next in order was "Miscellaneous" amount of Rs. 237.31 lakhs was spent

"Irrigation and Power" accounted for an expenditure of Rs. 230.14 lakhs as against the budget provision of Rs. 194.68 lakhs. "Social Services" accounted for an expenditure of Rs.161.46 lakhs as against the budget provision of Rs. 143.54. "Industries and Mining" accounted for an expenditure of Rs. 37.32 lakhs as against the budget provision of Rs. 37.43 lakhs. "Transport and Communication" accounted for an expenditure of Rs. 23.53 lakhs as against the budget provision of Rs. 27.40 lakhs.

"Co-operation and Community Development" registered lowest expenditure of Rs. 6.71 lakhs as against the budget provision of Rs. 6.33 lakhs. The respective percentages of expenditure to the total expenditure incurred during the year 1976-77 on "Agricultural Programmes", Co-operation and Community Development, Transport and Communication, Industry and Mining, Miscellaneous programmes, Social Services, and Irrigation and Power were Rs. 30.19, 0.67, 2.84, 3.71, 23.62, 16.07 & 22.90, respectively.

Agricultural Programme.

The expenditure incurred and the physical targets achieved under different sub-heads of the major head "Agricultural Programmes" during the Annual Plan 1976-77 are given briefly.

Agricultural Production.

An amount of Rs. 4.58 lakhs was provided in the budget against which Rs. 4.17 lakhs was spent. The percentage of expenditure on Agricultural production to the total expenditure under the major head Agricultural Programmes, co-operation and community Development was 1.34 and that to the total plan expenditure was 0.41. The physical achievement under this sub-head are as under. Under the plant protection campaign, an area of 823 hectares under eradication of white grubs 42431 hectares under midge fly control and 17843 hectares under rat control was covered. Under the item Integrated area development for small holders agricultural labourers 40.15 tonnes fertilisers and 342.75 quintals improved seeds were distributed and 68.20 quintals of carbofuran was distributed.

Soil Conservation.

The soil conservation programme which was initially undertaken in the Third Five Year Plan period and continued further was also included in the Annual Plan 1976-77. The budget allocations were of the order of Rs. 27.10 lakhs out of which the expenditure was Rs. 30.28 lakhs. As much as 15492 hectares of new bunding was done and nala bunding to the extent of 124 hectares was achieved.

Minor Irrigation.

A budget provision of Rs. 151.71 lakhs earmarked for minor irrigation works both in the state and local sectors.

The total expenditure amounted to Rs. 152.03 Lakhs. As many as 637 irrigation tanks, 14 percolation tanks were constructed. An irrigation potential of 1366 hectares was created. As many as 321 new irrigation wells were constructed and 391 pumping sets were installed during the year 1976-77.

Ayacut Development:

Budget allocations to the tune of Rs. 9.10 lakhs were earmarked and the total expenditure incurred was Rs. 9.19 lakhs under this sub-head in the Annual Plan 1976-77. Under the item standard development units 2988 land development works were undertaken during the year 1976-77.

Forest.

An amount of Rs. 2.17 lakhs was earmarked in the budget an expenditure of Rs. 3.17 lakhs was spent under this head. Plantation of trees was achieved in 173 hectares of land and afforestation of degraded forest was achieved in 290 hectares of land.

Fisheries

An amount of Rs. 1,25,000 were spent during 1976-77 for the developing of fisheries in the district. Fish seed lings to the extent of 32,99,000 were stocked in the impounded waters and 330.50 tonnes of fish were netted during the year 1976-77.

Warehousing and Marketing.

During the year 1976-77 an amount of Rs. 35,000 were spent for the development of warehousing and marketing. Financial Assistance was given to 1 agricultural produce market committee.

Co-operation and Community Development.

Co-operation: Under this sub-head an amount of Rs. 13.600 were spent for the strengthening of co-operative structure in the district during 1976-77.

Community Development.

Under this sub-head Rs. 6.57 lakhs were spent as against the budget provision of Rs. 3.53 lakhs. Much of the expenditure was incurred for completing the incomplete works taken up under Community Development programme.

Drought Prone Area's Programme.

This programme is taken up in 51 villages of six tahsils viz. Paranda, Bhoom, Kallam, Ahmedpur, Tuljapur and Osmanabad. Under this programme an amount of Rs. 13.04 lakhs was spent as against the budget provision of Rs. 9.10 lakhs during the year 1976-77.

Irrigation and Power.

Under this sub-head an amount of Rs. 230.14 lakhs were spent as against the budget provision of Rs. 194.68 lakhs during 1976-77. Under local sector Employment Guarantee Scheme 14 percolation tanks were constructed and 637 hectares of land was irrigated during 1976-77. Under state sector employment guarantee scheme 321 new irrigation wells were constructed and 1366 hectares of irrigation potential was created and 391 pumping sets were installed during 1976-77. The work of manjra project in Kalam taluka was in progress. The earth-work of Tawarja medium irrigation project in Latur taluka to the extent of 1978 cubic metres in respect of main canal was completed during the year 1976-77. The earth-work of ^BAnganga medium irrigation project in Bhum taluka in respect of main canal to the extent of 19800 cubic metres was completed during 1976-77. The earth-work of Ramganga medium irrigation project in Bhum taluka in respect of main canal to the extent of 19,800 cubic metres was completed during 1976-77. The earthwork of Jakapur project in Umerga taluka in respect of headwork to the extent of 1,14,600 cubic metres was completed during the year 1976-77.

The work of Whatl project and Wataphal project in Ahmedpur and Paranda^T Taluka respectively was undertaken under Employment Guarantee Scheme. The work of Ulup project in Bhum tahsil is in progress. Under the rural electrification programme as many as 59 villages were electrified during 1976-77 and the cumulative figures as on 31.3.1977 were 751 electrified villages. As many as 865 new electric pumps were installed during 1976-77 under Rural electrification Scheme.

INDUSTRY AND MINING.

Two sugar factories one at Dhoki in Osmanabad taluka and another located at Killari in Ausa Taluka have functioning with full swing during the year 1976-77. Number of Saw mills, processing mills such as ginning mills, rice mills, oil mills are already in existence and there is still a large scope for the establishment of more units in the district. Besides there is also scope for other types of small scale Industries. During the year 1976-77 an amount of Rs. 37.32 lakhs was spent under this sub-head as against the budget provision of Rs. 37.43 lakhs. Interest subsidy was given to 34 Seva societies. Share capital was given to two industrial co-operative societies. One spinning mill at Latur was functioning during 1976-77 for which an amount of Rs. 28.50 lakhs was given in the form of share capital.

Transport and Communication:

An amount of Rs. 28.53 lakhs was spent under this head as against the budget provision of Rs. 27.40 lakhs during 1976-77. During 1976-77 road length of 212.22 Kms. was completed. The construction work of landing strip was completed during 1976-77.

Other Programmes.

Information and Publicity. Under this sub-head an amount of Rs. 6,000 were spent for installation of radio sets.

Employment Guarantee Scheme.

An amount of Rs. 265.00 lakhs was earmarked for this sub-head. As against this an expenditure of Rs. 238.52 lakhs was incurred of which Rs. 209.89 was in cash and remaining Rs. 28.63 lakhs in kind during 1976-77 while 5639 works were in progress during 1976-77. The total No. of works completed and newly started were of the order of 2264 and 3940 respectively. The total number of mandays was 2,05,24,652 during 1976-77.

Social Services.

Under this sub-head an amount of Rs. 35.14 lakhs was earmarked and the total expenditure incurred was Rs. 34.13 lakhs. Under the scheme of upgradation of primary middle cum high schools into full fledged high schools the number of achievement was one. One stadium is also proposed for Osmanabad District. The land for the stadium is already acquired.

Technical Education:

Under this sub-head an expenditure of Rs. 68,400 was incurred as against the budget provision of Rs. 75,000.

P-ublic-Health.

The total expenditure under this sub-head amounted to Rs. 15.96 lakhs as against the budget provision of Rs. 16 lakhs. Three centrally sponsored schemes viz. National Malaria Eradication programme, Family Planning, Small pox eradication were implemented in the district. Under the national programme of Family Planning 31245 cases of sterilisation were made and 17 cases of Intra Uterian contraceptive Device were also done.

Applied Nutrition Programme.

Under this sub-head an amount of Rs. 6.20 lakhs was spent as against the budget provision of Rs. 6.04 lakhs. Under the school feeding programme 11,000 students from school took the benefit. In all 5 applied nutrition programme blocks viz. Bhoom, Paranda, Ahmedpur, Udgir and Umerga were functioning during 1976-77.

Water supply and Drainage.

Under this sub-head an amount of Rs. 72.29 lakhs was spent as against the budget provision of Rs. 53.05 lakhs. The expenditure exceeded the budget provision. Under the rural water supply schemes as many as 42 bore wells were constructed.

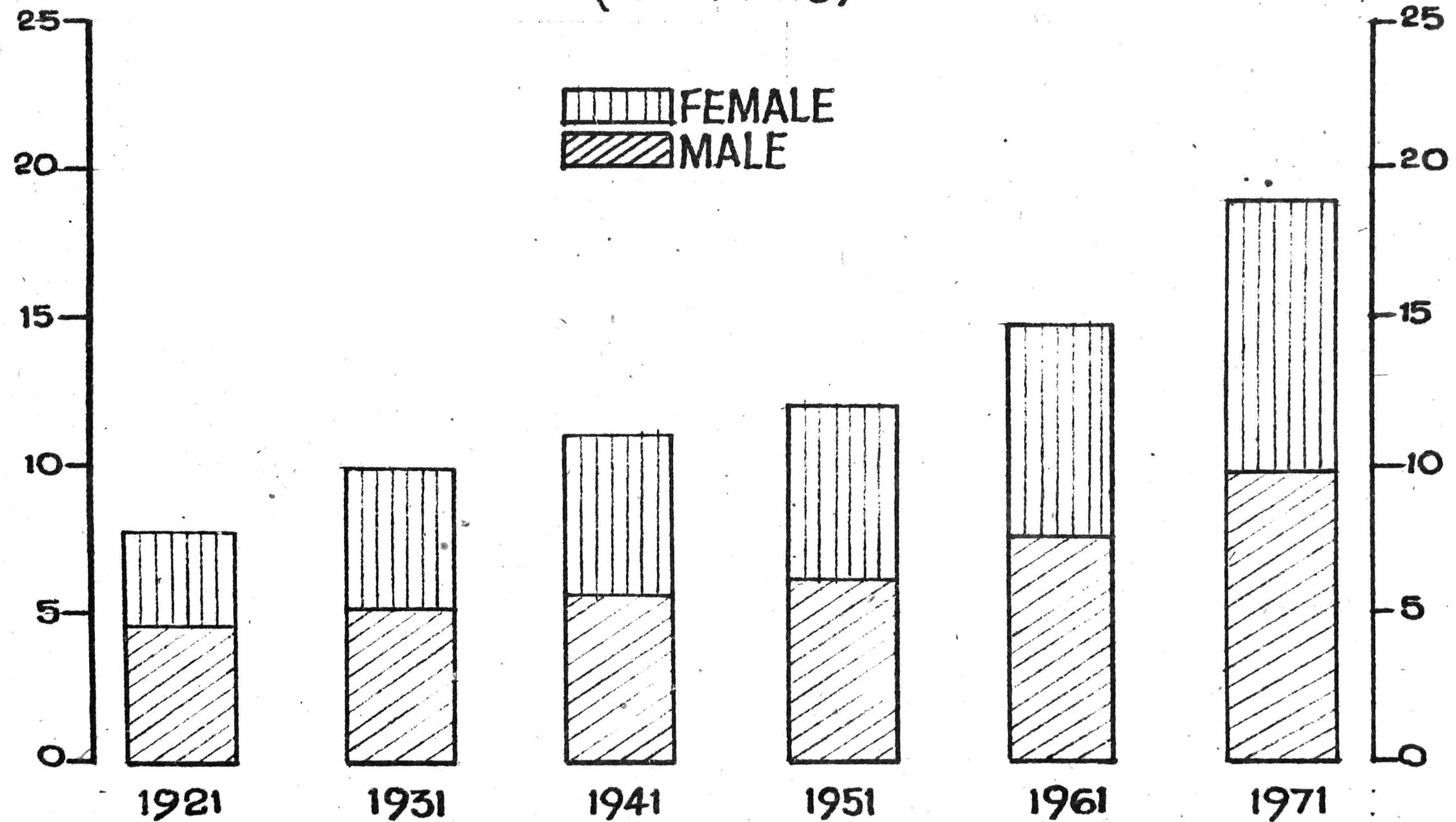
Urban Development.

Under this scheme an amount of Rs. 5 lakhs were spent as against the budget provision of Rs. 5 lakhs for the preparation of Development plans of Latur, Osmanabad and Udgir Municipal Councils.

Housing: An amount of Rs. 15 lakhs were earmarked under this sub-head during the Annual Plan 1976-77. Out of which Rs. 14.99 lakhs were spent. As many as 3065 huts were constructed during 1976-77 under the scheme of provision of house sites to landless workers in rural areas.

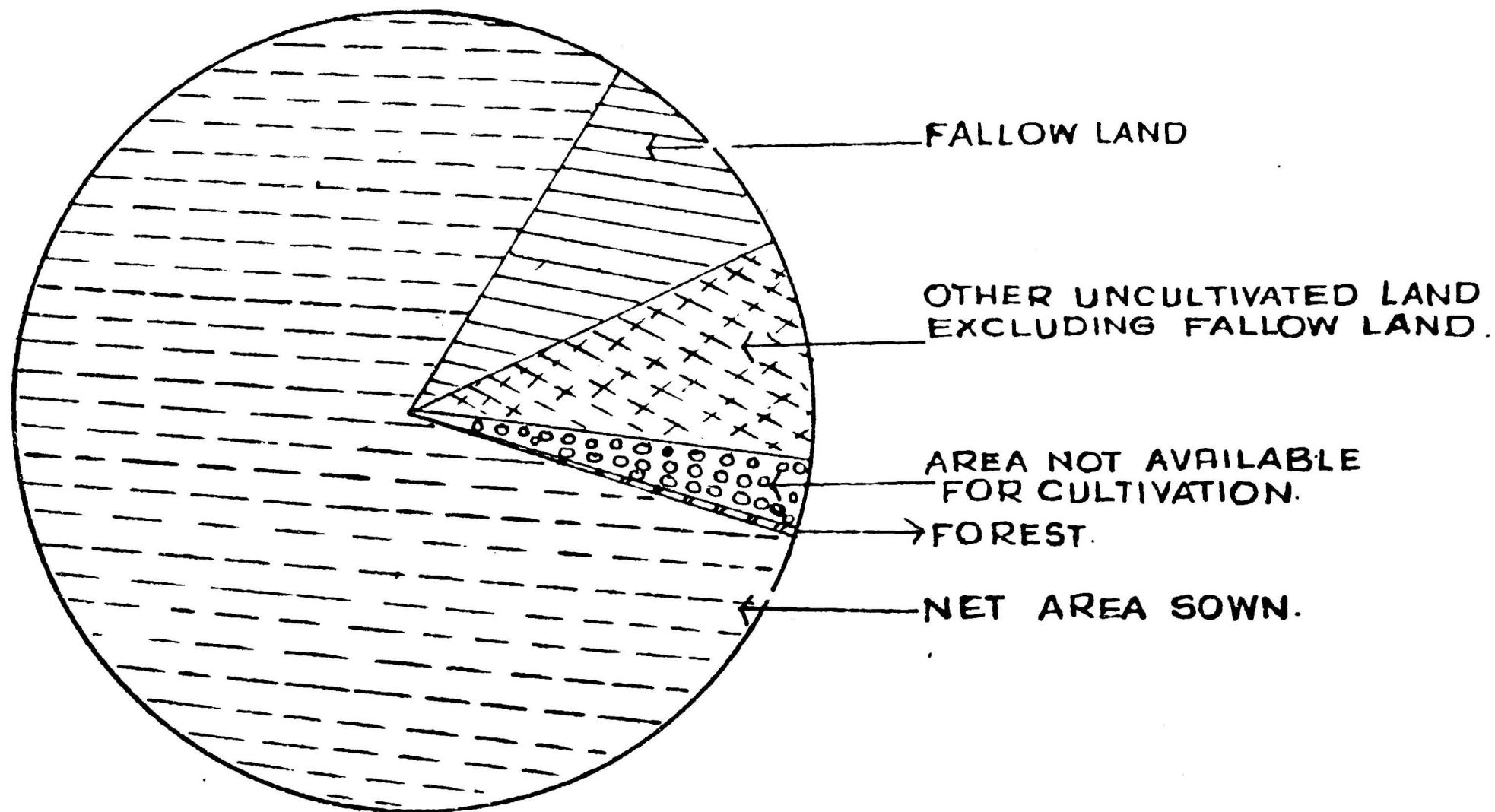
Welfare of Backward Classes. : An amount of Rs. 9.57 lakhs were earmarked during the Annual Plan 1976-77 out of which an expenditure of Rs. 9.40 lakhs was incurred during the year 1976-77. As many as 1064 students of backward class took the benefit of grant of tuition fees. Scholarships were awarded to the 53 backward class students studying in high schools. As many as 316 students of backward class, scheduled castes and vimukta jatis were granted tuition fees. Financial assistance to individual and group housing of backward class were given for 24 houses.
