CHAPTER - I

LOCATION:

1.1 Ratnagiri District is a part of Konkan strip running north to south along the western coast of India and lies between $15^{\circ}36'$ to $18^{\circ}50'$ north latitude and $73^{\circ}50'$ to $74^{\circ}36'$ east longitude. The district has a north south length of about 288kms. (180 miles) and average eastwest extension is about 64 kms. (40 miles) except in its extremities, which taper to ~~join~~ join the coast line. It has a coast line of about 320 kms. (200 miles).

BOUNDARIES:

1.2 The district is surrounded by Sahyadri hills and beyond the Sahyadris, Satara and Kolhapur District in the east, Kolaba District in the north, Arabian Sea in the West and Goa in the south.

TOPOGRAPHY:

1.3 Considering the Physical features, the district can be divided into three parts (i) Hilly area of the Sahyadris and its off shoots (ii) the plateau surfaces which are used for cereal crops like rice and ragi (iii) Coastal plains where coconut and arecanut gardens and fishing are the main sources of livelihood.

HILLS AND RIVERS:

1.4 Over 85 percent of the land surface in Ratnagiri district is hilly. The main range of the Sahyadris consisting of steep and forbidding scaps forms the eastern boundary of the district. In the centre are the transverse chains of small hills which project from the main range and develop higher elevations in the middle portion, where they are parallel to each other and as a result the numerous streams which flow through the vallies have formed parallel drainage pattern. On the slopes of these hills rice and workas lands are situated. The rivers originate from the Sahyadri ranges and have reached their base level of erosion with

distance of 20 km. All the 14 rivers in the district flow from east to west to j in the Arabian Sea. Out of these, the more important are i) Savitri forms natural boundry between Ratnagiri and Kolaba districts and is navigable about 35 km. in Ratnagiri dist. ii) Vashisthi with a length of about 48 kms is navigable upto 40 km. iii) Jagtudi is more than 40 kms. long. The length of iv) Shastri and v) Ratnagiri is 64 km. each. Besides these, there are other rivers namely i) Bav, ii) Muchakundi, iii) Jaitapur, iv) Vaghotan, v) Devgad, vi) Achra, vii) Kalawali, viii) Karli, ix) Terekhol. Majority of the rivers receive their water from the Sahyadrian main range. In length they seldom exceed 64 km. Their intensely seasonal regime is yet another limitation to their economic use. Parts of these rivers are tidal. In additions to these main rivers, the district has numerous small creeks and back waters all along the coast line. Important/are Kelshi ^{creeks} lying between Bankot and Suvarnashikhar, ~~and Borya~~ ^{is two miles in the south of Kelshi,} Palshet and Borya ~~are between Vashisthi, Shastri and Borya.~~ Kalbadevi, Redi, Palshet/All these creeks afford anchorage to samll crafts in fair weather and have a local importance in trade and fishing.

SOIL :

1.5 The predominant soils in the district are laterite soils which vary in colours from bright red to brownish red owing to the preponderance of hydrated iron oxides. They are always acidic and fairly well supplied with nitrogen and organic matter. Their texture is loamy and depth varies from one foot to three feet. They are porous not retentive of moisture and are found all over the district except in Mandangad Tahsil. The soils are found in several grades. The main grades are: i) Soils useful for paddy cultivation, ii) Workas soils useful for Cashewnuts, Mangoes and ragi cultivation,

iii) Soils useful for coconut, iv) Coastal alluvium useful for coconut and arecanut gardens v) Salty lands locally known as Khar or Khajan.

CLIMATE:

1.6 The climate of the district is generally moist. There are three seasons viz. i) Summer (March to May), ii) Monsoon (June to October) and iii) Winter (November to February). Being a coastal district, the variation in temperature during the day and through the seasons is not large. Maximum temperature at the coast rarely goes beyond 38°c. and in the interior it seldom crosses 40°c. Owing to the proximity of the sea the district is very humid and the relative humidity seldom goes below 50 percent.

RAINFALL:

1.7 Rainfall is not uniform in all parts of the district. It increases rapidly from the coast towards the Western Ghats on the eastern border of the district. In and near the Ghats rainfall is very heavy. Amboli gets the heaviest rainfall in the district. Practically the entire annual rainfall occurs during the months from June to October. July is the month of heaviest rainfall. During the year 1976, there was maximum rainfall of 5331 mms. at Khed tahsil. Eight other tahsils namely Pantli, Mandangad, Lanja, Rajapur, Kankawali and Sawantwadi Chiplun, Sangameshwar also received rainfall above, 3000 mms. All the remaining tahsils received rainfall ranging between 2000 to 3000 mms.

AREA:

1.8 The total geographical area of the district is 13,040 sq. km. The district stands tenth in area in Maharashtra State. Considering area covered by tahsils, Sawantwadi tahsil has got the maximum area (1336.2 sq. km.) in the district. While Vengurla Tahsil has the minimum area (327.9 sq. kms.).

FOREST:

1.9 Total area under forests in the district is 425.49 sq.kms of which 28.79 sq. km. is maintained by Revenue Authorities and the rest of the area is under the control of Forest Department. Out of the total forest area, 49.52 sq. kms. area is reserved and the rest of the area is unclassified.

MINERAL:

1.10 Ratnagiri district is endowed with different types of various minerals of economic importance. Manganese and Iron ores are found in the southern part of Ratnagiri district at Redi, Banda, Tirawade, Aros etc. Chromite occurs at Kankawali, Wagde and Janavali in Kanakawali tahsil. The reserves of chromite in Ratnagiri district are more than 70,000^{M.} tonnes. Ilmenite is found in the beach sands stretching ^{about} 40 kms. from Purnagad to Malgund near Ratnagiri.

Ilmenite is an ore of Titanium metal, Ratnagiri district is also blessed with huge deposits of silica sand and annually thousands of tonnes of silica sand is being despatched to places like Bombay, Pune, Kolhapur, Belgaon, Ichalkaranji etc. There are many good deposits of clay in the district. There are also occurrences of Mica, Felspar, Steatite, Quartzs, mineral pigments such as copper, asbestos, limestone, clay, silica sand, glass sand, building stones, salt etc. and radioactive minerals like uranium oxide in some parts of Ratnagiri district.

POPULATION:

1.11 Total population of the district as per 1971 census is 19,90,583 (8,86,995 males and 11,03,588 females). The density of population per sq. km. is 153 as against 164 for Maharashtra State. According to population the district ranks ninth in Maharashtra State. Within the tahsils, the density of population per sq. km. ranges from 257 (Vengurla Tahsil) to 115 (Sawantwadi tahsil). As far as Urban towns are concerned, the density varies from 3,580

(Ratnagiri town) to 250 (Shirgaon town in Chiplun Tahsil). The average density for the district is 1,085. Tahsils viz. Guhagar, Mandangad, Sangameshwar, Lanja, Kankawali, Kudal and Devgad have no urban area. In rural areas the density of population varies from 219 (Vengurla tahsil) to 103 (Sawantwadi tahsil). The average rural density of population for the district is 142 per sq. km.

1.12 Number of females per 1,000 males (i.e. sex ratio) is higher (1244) in Ratnagiri district than the state average, which is 930. Similar is the position in Rural and Urban areas. The percentage of Urban population to the total population, amounts to 8-40 which is lowest in Maharashtra State. It may be due to the fact that very little attention is given towards urbanisation of this district. Besides, the continuous migration from this district to the cities like Bombay is the main cause of low Urbanisation as well as abnormal sex ratio. Migration has also affected the growth rate of population of the district as will be seen from the last two decadal variations viz. 1951-61 and 1961-71 which are 6.73 and 8.94. These decadal variations are the lowest in the state of Maharashtra. Corresponding decadal variations for Maharashtra State are 23.60 and 27.45, respectively.

1.13: The percentage of literacy has gone up from 28.5 in 1961 to 39.6 in 1971. The rate of increase in percentage of literates is more or less the same in respect of males, females, rural or Urban. As far as the religious composition is concerned, the population covers 87% Hindus, 6.3% muslims and 5.6 % Budhists (including Neo Buddhist). The percentage of schedule caste and schedule tribes to total population comes to 2.7% against 11.9 percent in Maharashtra State.

AGRO INDUSTRIES:

1.14 Agricultural products in Ratnagiri district are paddy, Nagli, Oilseeds, Gound nut, Sugar cane, Cashwnuts, Cocount, Betelnut and ^{Kokam}, Products of economic importance are paddy, mango, cashewnut,

Coconut, betelnut and Kokam. In addition to this, Major forest products are Bumboo, Hirda, Building Wood, Kattachu (Kat), grass and other Ayurvedic Vanaspathies. Ratnagiri being a hilly district land useful for cultivation is comparatively less.

1.15 Ratnagiri district is famous for its quality mangoes. Best quality is known as Alphanso. This is a seasonal product and its yield per annum is estimated at 23 thousand tonnes. It gives a seasonal employment to local people; such as collection of mangoes, preparation of wooden boxes, marketing and transporting. Raw as well as ^{canned} mangoes are ^{being} exported in substantial quantity. ^{also} canned products. There are about 17 canning units engaged in production of canned mangoes, pickles and chatanis.

1.16 Other important agricultural products are coconut and betelnuts. Industries based on this are 1) Selling of Green Coconut Dried coconut and betelnuts. 2) Coir industries manufacturing coir rope, mattings and carpets. Coconut coir is an important raw material for the coir industry. ^{at Walawal, Vengurla & Aronda} There were 3 coir units functioning ^{in the district} in this district upto 1975-76, of which the centre at Aronda is closed during the year 1976-77. Betelnut is converted into scented supari and sold all over Maharashtra. Three units are engaged in the preparation of scented supari. Cashewnut from this district fetches foreign exchange. ^{in the district} There are 25 cashewnut factories ^{Outlet} of this, 14 are registered under S.S.I. rules. Systematic Cashewnut plantation has been taken up by Govt. recently and yield is expected to increase in the near future. Kokam fruits are also collected seasonally and processed in canning factories.

1.17 Paddy straw is useful for manufacturing paper and board. Recently one unit has come up in Chiplun and there are few more proposals under consideration and would be dependent partially on outside sources. There are about 1100 rice mills in the district.

1.18 Plantation of Citrenella has been tried at some places

and two units are already under trial for manufacturing Citrenella oil. At present there are 40 saw mills which are registered under S.S.I. rules in the district. There is only one Agricultural tool manufacturing unit at Sawantwadi.

FEATURES :

- 1.19 Ratnagiri is one of the marine districts of the state. The coastal length is about 320 kms. which is more than half of the coastal length of Maharashtra State. The sea water is rich in prawns. About 1300 ^{tonnes} M% of prawns are exported abroad annually.
- ii. Mangoes and cashewnuts are important cash crops of this district. They are exported abroad.
- iii. Koyana Hydro Electric Project which generates electricity at Pophali is situated in Chiplun Tahsil of this district.
- iv. Marine Biological Research Station is situated at Ratnagiri and Konkan Krishi Vidyapith at Dapoli.
- vi. Iron ore mines at Redi in Sawantwadi tahasil of this district are biggest mechanised mines in the state. During the year 1976, the production of iron ore was 9.46 ^{Metric} in tonnes of which 8.67 in/tonnes were sent out.
- vi. Kudal is getting industrialised with the establishment of four large engineering factories, namely, Wyman Garden, Sethi Nippon, Powder Metal and Arvind Metal. Besides, one engineering factory known as J.K.Files has been established in M.I.D.C. area at Ratnagiri.
- vii. Ratnagiri has been declared as rural industrial project.
- viii. The District lacks Rail Communication facilities but all weather port is being developed at Ratnagiri. At present there are 19 seasonal ports in this district.
- ix. The district ^{being} industrially backward, migration of population (working force) to cities like Bombay is heavy. As a result of this, receipt of money orders is comparatively larger than in any of the districts of Maharashtra State. Hence the Ratnagiri district is generally money order economy. /known for

CHAPTER II

EXPLANATORY NOTES ON THE SCOPE AND LIMITATIONS OF DATA PRESENTED IN PART II OF THE DISTRICT STATISTICAL ABSTRACT FOR THE YEAR 1976-77.

PURPOSE AND SCOPE:

2.1 In this chapter, short notes on the tables presented in the abstract are given indicating the source of data, terminology used, limitations if any etc. There are in all 93 tables presented in this statistical abstract. The present issue relates to 1976-77. As far as possible, the data are given for the year 1976-77 and if not available, data for the latest available year are given.

I. AREA AND POPULATION:

2.2 There are 7 tables in this group and all these tables are based on 1971 population census. Table No. 1 gives tahsilwise area and population, with its break up into Rural and Urban and into male and female, as well as the data on residential houses and households and villages and towns, Rural, Urban, Male and Female with its density for the last three Censuses and decadal variations since 1951 and 1961 is presented in Table No. 2. Tahsilwise classification of villages and towns according to population ranges is given in table nos. 3 and 4 respectively. Occupational structure of the population in rural and urban areas is presented separately for all the tahsils in table no. 5. Population distribution into various age groups and according to different regions is shown in table no. 6. Table No. 7 gives tahsilwise distribution of scheduled castes, scheduled tribes and Neo-buddhist population in Rural and Urban areas of Ratnagiri district. Population figures in table nos. 1, 2, 4 and 7 are given in thousands.

II. CLIMATE:

2.3 In this group only two tables are included. Table No. 8 gives monthwise rainfall data in respect of fifteen Tahsil Centres

in the District for the year 1976. In table No. 9, the maximum and minimum monthly temperature for Ratnagiri, Harnai, Devgad and Vengurla centres is given. Normal rainfall is given in table No. 8 at each centre which is based on data of rain fall for the last ten years.

III. AGRICULTURE:

2.4 14 tables are provided in this group. The first six tables from 10 to 15 give provisional data for the years 1974-75 and 1975-76 regarding land utilisation, cropping pattern, yield rate and out turn of principal crops, sourcewise and cropwise irrigated area and position of irrigation wells in use and not in use. Provisional data about yield per hectare given in table no. 12 is based on the fully revised provisional data for the year 1974-75 and information for the year 1975-76 is based on revised final forecast. Table no. 16 gives availability of under-ground water for the year 1976-77. Table No. 17 provides information of minor irrigation works for 1976-77 excluding wells. There are no major and medium irrigation projects in the district, hence information in table no. 18 is 'nil'. The wage rate data for three rural centres are given for all months of 1976 in table no. 19. In table no. 20 information of agriculture holdings collected during Agriculture Census 1970 is given. The tahsilwise data of agriculture implements collected in 1976 Live Stock Census is given in table no. 21. There was no famine and scarcity during 1976-77 and hence information in table no. 22 is 'nil'. Table no. 23 indicates tahsilwise number of villages affected by scarcity since 1970-71 onwards.

IV. ANIMAL HUSBANDRY, FOREST AND FISHERIES:

2.5 There are ten tables in this group. Out of which, table no. 24 relates to tahsilwise livestock data as per 1972 live stock Census. Veterinary statistics, such as availability of medical

facilities for livestock, cases treated and inseminations done in each tahsil is given in table no. 25 for the year 1976-77. Table No. 26 presents disease-wise livestock mortality in the district. Information regarding the recognised slaughter houses and animals slaughtered therein is given in table no. 27 for the year 1976-77. Table No. 28-A gives classified forest area under the control of revenue and forest departments, while table no. 28-B reveals major and minor forest products obtained from these forests. Value of forest products is given in thousand rupees. Table No. 29 is divided into three parts. Table No. 29(A) and 29(B) provide tahsilwise information about inland and marine fisheries for the years 1975-76 and 1976-77, while in table no. 29-C, data regarding the quantity of fish brought for curing, salt issued and ~~FISH~~ fish brought ~~xxx xxxxxx~~, salt issued and fish removed is given for the years 1975-76 and 1976-77.

V. EMPLOYMENT, INDUSTRY, MINING AND ELECTRICITY:

2.6 There are in all ten tables in this group. First three tables viz. table Nos. 30, 31, 32 relate to Factory Statistics, while in table No. 33 the information regarding important characteristics of industries as collected in Annual Survey of Industries is given. Industrywise total mandays given in table no. 30 are in hundreds. Table Nos. 34 and 35 provide Employment Exchange Statistics for the year 1976-77. Tahsilwise information about works executed under Employment Guarantee Scheme and Employment Generated and expenditure incurred thereunder during the year 1976-77 is given in table no. 36. Employment in different industries as on 31st March 1977 is shown in table no. 37. The classification of consumption of electricity according to uses is shown in table No. 38 for the year 1976-77. Table No. 39 provides tahsilwise information regarding the towns and villages electrified and

population covered during the year and progressive for the years 1960-61, 1965-66, 1969-70, 1974-75, 1975-76 and 1976-77. Population figures are in thousands.

VI. CO-OPERATION:

2.7 Eight tables from table Nos. 40 to 47 are included in this group. Data regarding various activities in Co-operation Sector such as number of co-operative societies of different types, their membership, share capital, working capital, Loan, advanced, No. of banks and loans advanced by them is given in the first four tables, for the year 1976-77, while statistics relating to operation of central and primary co-operative marketing societies and other co-operative societies is presented in table no. 44 and 45. There is no regulated market in the district and hence table no. 46 is blank. The table No. 47 provides data regarding registered money-lenders and loans advanced by them during 1976-77. All amounts in the above tables are given in thousands.

VII. MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH:

2.8. There are five tables in this group. Information in table No. 48 gives data on medical facilities through Public and Public aided bodies in each tahsil during 1976. Figures of patients treated in this table are given in thousands. The tahsilwise data regarding number of births and deaths registered in Ratnagiri District during 1976 is presented in table no. 49, while no. of deaths due to important causes during the years 1971 to 1976 is shown in table no. 50 for the district as a whole. Table No. 51 gives tahsilwise vaccination statistics and cholera inoculations done during the year 1976 while family planning statistics is given in table no. 52 for the year 1976-77.

VIII. EDUCATION:

2.9 The statistics relating to education is presented in table Nos. 53 to 59. The table No. 53 shows the tahsilwise literacy position in Rural and Urban areas according to 1971 Census. The figures are given in thousands. Table Nos. 54 and 55 indicate Educational level of Rural and Urban population per 1961 Census. In table No.56, information regarding educational institutions, pupils and teachers for the years 1975-76 and 1976-77 is presented for the district as a whole. The next two tables (i.e. 57 and 58) in this group relate to backward class enrolment and economically backward class beneficiaries, respectively for 1975-76 and 1976-77. Annual expenditure on Primary Education for the year 1976-77 is given in table No. 59. The amounts given in these three tables are in thousand rupees.

IX. TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS:

2.10 In all seven tables are included in this group. Rail facility is not available in the district and hence table no. 60-A is blank. Table No. 60-B gives data regarding ports. Table no. 61 provides road length according to category and surface classification as on 31-3-1977. Data of motor vehicles in operation in Thane region and operational statistics of Nationalised Road Transport as on 31-3-1977 are presented in table Nos. 62 and 63 respectively. Data of traffic census conducted by B & C Deptt. is presented in table no. 64. Information of communication facilities viz. posts, telegraphs and telephones for the years 1961-62, 1965-66, 1970-71, 1974-75, 1975-76 and 1976-77 is supplied in table No. 65, while Rural broadcasting information as on 31-3-1977 is presented tahsilwise in table No. 66.

X. LOCAL BODIES:

2.11 Seven tables, 67 to 70 in this group pertain to income and expenditure of local bodies such as village panchayats, Zilla Parishad and Municipal councils. Table No. 67 gives at a glance income and expenditure of village panchayats, Zilla Parishad and Municipal Councils for the years 1965-66 and 1968-69 to 1976-77. The amounts in these tables are given in lakhs. Next table gives panchayat samitiwise detailed break up of income and expenditure of village Panchayats during 1976-77. Table No. 69 is divided into three parts namely headwise information of receipts, Govt. grants to Zilla Parishad and expenditure of Zilla Parishad for the years 1975-76 (Actuals), 1976-77 (Revised) and 1977-78 (estimated). Table No. 70 gives sub-headwise income and expenditure of Municipal Councils for the year 1976-77.

XI. PLAN AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT:

2.12 Out of five tables in this group, the first two tables, viz. table nos. 71 and 72 give the expenditure and physical achievements of district level plan schemes for the fourth five Year Plan and during the years, 1975-76 and 1976-77. Table No. 73, 74 and 75 relate to the activities pertaining to Community Development Blocks. Table No. 73 gives stagewise coverage, table No. 74 depicts total expenditure incurred in each block. Physical achievements in these blocks, for the year 1976-77, are shown in table No. 75. Population figures in table No. 73 are given in thousands.

XII. PRICES:

2.13 Three tables are included in this group. There is no Agriculture produce market committee in the district and hence table No. 76 is blank. The monthly averages of weekly prices of

important commodities collected from selected shops at district head-quarters during 1976 have been presented in table No. 77. The consumer price index numbers for 1976-77 (Revised Series) for working class at Bombay and Jalgaon are given in table No. 78.

XIII. MISCELLANEOUS:

2.14 The last group 'Miscellaneous' of the abstract covers official statistics giving information regarding police force, and crime statistics, work disposed off in Civil and Criminal Courts, Cinema Statistics, Theatres and their seating capacity, banking offices, scheduled banks and joint stock companies, Life Insurance Statistics, Performance of Small Savings, tahsilwise collection of land Revenue and no. of presses and publication. During the year 1976-77 three more tables indicating distribution of food grains through fair price shops procurement of food grains through levy, results of general election and candidates according to party affiliations have been introduced. In the last table i.e. table no.93 some important indicators for the district are worked out from the tables in the abstract, which indicate general trend of development in various sectors over a period of more than two decades.

----- : ANALYTICAL REVIEW OF SECTORIAL TRENDS :

3.1 ----- An attempt is made in this chapter to study the trends in various Socio Economic aspects of Ratnagiri District by working out various indicators on important achievements in agriculture, irrigation, livestock, electricity consumption, education, etc. Tahsil is taken as a unit and indicators have been worked out to review the progress so far made in various sectors of economy. 1961-62, the first year of Third Five-Year Plan, is taken as base year for reviewing the level of achievements.

3.2 Below table No. 3.2 depicts tahsilwise percentage of gross cropped area to net cropped area during 1961-62, and 1973-74 to 1975-76. It is seen from the table that there was hardly any change in double cropping. The percentage of gross cropped area to the net area sown, for the district as a whole, was constant for the last 16 years. Within the tahsils decrease in percentage was observed in case of Ratnagiri, Guhagar, Mandangad, Khed, Sangameshwar, Lanja, Rajapur, Kudal and Devgad and slight increase was visible in the remaining 6 tahsils in the year 1975-76 as compared to 1961-62. Sawantwadi, Vengurla and Malwan had better percentage of double cropped area as compared to district percentage.

It is observed from the table that there is increase in the yield rates as compared to the base year 1961-62. However, as compared to the year 1974-75, the position of yield rates is not much satisfactory. Ratnagiri district is famous for its quality Mangoes. Best quality known as Alphonso is grown on a large scale. Its yield per annum is estimated to 23,000 tonnes. Since it fetches foreign exchange, it is a well known cash crop. Cashew of best quality is also grown in this district.

Value of Agricultural Production:

3.4 Attempt is made to estimate the production of principal crops and their value for the year 1973-74, 1974-75 and 1975-76 for which the prevailing wholesale prices have been used. Table No.3.4 reveals the yearwise and cropwise value of production of various crops. It is seen that outturn of rice, ragi and tur was decreased during the year 1975-76 as compared to the earlier years. The position of the year 1973-74 was comparatively satisfactory.

Irrigation:

3.5 There is little scope for irrigation in this district, due to hilly nature of the district. Tahsilwise percentage of net irrigated area to net cropped area is given in table no. 3.5, which reveals that there was decrease in irrigated area during the year 1973-74, as compared to the irrigated area in the base year (1961-62). There appeared slight rise in irrigation during the years 1974-75 and 1975-76. With n the tahsils, Kadal, Sawantwadi, Vengurla and Malwan, from the southern part had comparatively better irrigation. It was noteworthy, especially in Vengurla and Sawantwadi. It is surprising that there was no irrigation at all in Khed tahsil even during this era of planning. From the following table it is also evident that there was slight increase in irrigation during 1975-76 over 1974-75, for the district as a whole. However, there appeared decrease in irrigation in majority of tahsils.

3.6 Facts and figures regarding cropping pattern in Ratnagiri district for the years 1961-62, 1974-75 and 1975-76 are depicted in table No. 3.6. Over a period of 16 years in which special attention was paid towards agricultural development, the picture of cropping pattern as compared to 1961-62 is not at all happy. 3.7 Ratnagiri district is Konkan terrain with/hill ranges. Naturally, the percentage of barren and uncultivable area as well as of consequently, the land available for cultivation is lesser fallow lands is comparatively larger. It is seen from the following table no. 3.7 that the percentage of barren and unculturable land, fallow land and net cultivated area to total geographical area appeared to be 26.75, 13.54 and 27.92, respectively during the year 1974-75. Co-operation:

3.8 Major activities of co-operative credit societies have been shown in table no. 3.8. It is seen from the table that during the year 1961-62 per member advance was Rs. 68 which has been gradually decreasing during subsequent years. It is because of note worthy increase in coverage and finance. As compared to 1961-62, it is observed that there was 108% and 86% increase in membership and loans advanced respectively during the year 1976-77. With all these achievements, there still remained much to be done. As compared to the per member advance, the per member outstanding amount is on higher side, which is an indicator of poor repaying capacity of the members.

Agricultural Wage Rates:

3.9 Agricultural wage rates have been collected regularly from three centres viz. Harnai (Dapoli Block), Navadi (Sangameshwar Block) and Shiroda (Vengurla Block). Average wage rates for all these three centres for the years 1974, 1975 and 1976 have been shown in table no. 3.9. It is observed that there is increasing trend in wage rates except in the case of female labour at Shiroda centre, where a slight decrease in wage is visible. The trend of rise in wage rates appears to be more or less same in respect of all these centres.

3.10 Table No. 3.10 indicates the cultivable area per pair of bullocks for the district, as well as for all the tahsils. Since the cultivable area of the district, as well as of Ratnagiri, Sangameshwar, Sawantwadi and Malwan tahsils has been slightly reduced, the cultivable area per pair of bullocks is also seen to be decreased during the year as compared to the earlier year. Poultry:

3.11 Ratio of poultry to population is shown in the below table. It is observed from the table that there is increase in the poultry. As compared to human-population, there were 613

poultrybirds per thousand human population, during 1966, while it was 619 during 1972. From the last two livestock censuses, it is observed that within the tahsils, poultry birds were decreased in Chiplun, Sangameshwar, Lanja, Sawantwadi, Vengurla and Malwan, whereas the increase was visible in rest of the tahsils. Within the tahsils, number of poultry birds was highest in the Kankawali tahsil followed by Guhagar and Kudal.

Electricity:

3.12 In Ratnagiri district, use of electricity is increasing year by year. Per capita consumption is 18.64 k.w.h. during 1976-77, where as the same was only 10.98 k.w.h. during 1973-74. The following table shows that the increasing use of electricity is neither for industrial purpose nor for commercial but it is used for other purposes only. Actually, there was decrease in the use of electricity for industrial as well as for commercial purposes, which is not a happy picture as far as the overall development of Ratnagiri district is concerned. During the year 1974-75, 51.50% and 9.32% electricity was used for industrial and commercial purposes respectively. These percentages came down to 34.41 and 7.29 during the year 1976-77.

Role of Employment Exchange:

3.13 Employment generation is one of the most important aims of Planning in a over populated country like India. Employment exchange statistics give magnitude of the unemployment problem to a very limited extent, because the majority of unemployed persons do not avail of the facilities provided by the employment exchange. Position of Ratnagiri district regarding the registration, vacancies and placement is indicated below in table no. 3.13. It is seen from the table that the persons on live-register were 16,214 during 1976-77 as against 2,599 in 1961-62. As against the registration, the employment was given to only 753 persons during 1976-77. This achievement is not encouraging in the light of the work done during the year 1960-61. Thus the gravity of the problem of providing employment appears to be severe.

Education:

3.15 Education is backbone of Socio Economic Development and accordingly the priority was attached to educational programme in all the Plans. Educational Statistics at various level of education have been depicted below in table no. 3.15, which indicates considerable increase in educational activities during the the last 16 years from 1961-62. It is observed that there was 22%, 109% and 267% increase in educational institution of primary, secondary and higher educations, respectively upto the year 1975-76 and corresponding increase in the pupils of these institutions was 29%, 153% and 523%, respectively. Particularly, during the year 1975-76, there was slight decrease in secondary and higher educational institutions due to closure of one high school and 2 colleges. Consequently number of pupils were also decreased during the same year.

C H A P T E R I V

ANNUAL PLAN 1976-77.

4.1 The Government of Maharashtra has accepted the principle of decentralised implementation of plans since third five year plan. A large number of schemes brought to the district level schemes. In order to have greater involvement of local participation and representation of the aspirations of local people, the Government of Maharashtra adopted 'District as a unit of planning' during fifth plan. The main objects of district planning is

- i) the reduction of interdistrict and intradistrict imbalances
- ii) to ensure rational utilisation of resources and
- iii) proper co-ordination and implementation of development programme.

4.2 The organisational machinery set up in each district for the formulation, monitoring and overseeing of the District Plan, originally consisted of (a) the District Planning Board and (b) District Development and Consultative Council. These two bodies have subsequently been amalgamated and formed in a single body known as District Planning and Development Council which is presided over by the designated Minister of the District. In the beginning the Chief Executive Officer of Zilla Parishad was to function as the member secretary of this body. This arrangement was changed by the Govt. in Planning Department and Collector of the district is appointed as member secretary with effect from 15-12-1975. The services of the Deputy Chief Executive Officer (Planning) alongwith the Planning Cell of Zilla Parishad consisting of one planning assistant and one junior clerk are also placed at the disposal of District Planning and Development Council. They have to work under administrative control of Collector and Member Secretary of District Planning and Development Council. To assist the council in its deliberations, a small executive committee is appointed under the Chairmanship of designated Minister of District. Collector also

functions as the member Secretary of this committee.

For the Vth Five Year Plan of Ratnagiri District, a ceiling of Rs. 50.08 crores was indicated to District Planning and Development Council. Total outlay of fifth five year Plan amounting to Rs. 50.08 crores has been determined on the basis of the specified methodology as indicated below.

4.4 It is seen from the above table that the allocation of the total outlay on major sectors is more or less balanced since 1974-75. Three years of the fifth plan have been completed but expenditure so far incurred was only 28.69%, which is not commensurate to the period elapsed.

4.5 As far as annual performance of the plan is concerned, the progress made during the years 1975-76 and 1976-77 appeared to be better. The Government of Maharashtra placed the ceiling on the plan budget at Rs. 722.42 for 1975-76 and Rs. 723.00 for 1976-77 considering the bottlenecks and difficulties experienced by the implementing agencies, suitable reappropriation was made in the budget and revised allocations were decided for the year 1975-76. As against the ceiling of Rs. 722.42 lakhs, outlay for 1975-76 was decided to be 619.98 lakhs. There is no change in the total budgeted outlay for the year 1976-77. Expenditure incurred during the years 1975-76 and 1976-77 amounted to Rs. 529.05 lakhs and Rs. 628.23 lakhs, which was 85% and 88%, respectively of the total budget outlay during the years. Share of the local sector in the expenditure incurred during 1975-76 and 1976-77 was 21%. Major Headwise allocation of budget grants and expenditure made during the years is given below.

4.6 It is revealed from the above table that percentage of the total expenditure so far incurred during the years 1975-76 and 1976-77 was more or less the same. It is also seen that there were no wide fluctuations in the expenditure incurred on various major heads. As compared to the expenditure incurred during the year 1975-76, there appeared to be 10% increase in the expenditure made during 1976-77 on co-operation and community development and 11% on miscellaneous but a fall of 7% is observed against industry and mining. It is worth while to note that 100% expenditure was booked on Irrigation and Power during the year 1976-77 which is 35% more as compared to earlier year 1975-76.

4.7 An attempt is made in subsequent paras to review the progress of the various schemes implemented under major sub-heads. There were in all 89 and 119 schemes implemented during the year 1975-76 and 1976-77, respectively.

4.8 Agricultural Programme:

Agricultural Programme covered following eight sub-heads under which 29 and 36 schemes had been implemented during the years 1975-76 and 1976-77, respectively.

4.9 Within the sub-head under this programme, more than 90 percent expenditure was booked under all sub-heads except Agricultural Production and dairy development. The expenditure under agricultural production was 84% and that under dairy development it was only 26%. Under agricultural production, schemes such as subsidy for pesticides, horticulture development, loans to horticulture development and the programme of integrated area development were implemented upto the mark during 1976-77. Pesticides were sprayed over 81 hectares to control Stemborar, Gally fly, Snoot fly and over 772 hectares of nurseries. During the year 1976-77, 2800 mango and 3770 Coconut seedlings were planted. Various development activities were undertaken for the betterment of the farmers under Integrated

Area Development Scheme by spending Rs. 1.85 lakhs. The expenditure on construction of building at Major fruit farm at Nileli and Mundhe could not be incurred as the contractor had stopped the work.

4.10 During the year 1975-76, similar programme was undertaken under agricultural production. The scheme of subsidy to Kachha Bandhara was implemented and an area of 3915 hectare was covered for which subsidy amounting to Rs. 1.96 lakhs had been granted

4.11 Minor Irrigation:

Under this sub-head during the year 1976-77, 18 bandharas 254 lift irrigation schemes, 9 M.I. tanks and 9 K.T. tanks had been completed and irrigation potential of 1189 hectares was created. Scheme of Kachha bandharas which was implemented under agriculture production during 1975-76 was shifted to Minor Irrigation sub-head. Under this scheme subsidy of Rs. 2.00 lakhs. had been disbursed to 1800 Kachha bandharas and irrigation potential of 4000 hectares had been created. During the year 1975-76, the same programme was implemented and 100% expenditure was booked as against 98% during the year 1976-77.

4.12 Soil Conservation:

During 1976-77, the provision under this sub-head was Rs. 31.77 lakhs, of which 95% grants amounting to Rs. 30.29 lakhs were spent. Schemes of bunding, terracing and reclamation of Khar/undertaken. During year 1976-77, terracing of 107 hectares and plan- and Khanjan lands were in/ tation of cashew in 8777 hectares & mango in 183 hectares was done. Construction of 4 bund works were in progress.

4.13 During the year 1975-76, terracing work in 261 hectares plantation of cashew and mangoes, respectively in 4227 and 40 hectares were completed. Under the Khar land development scheme, 120 hectare of land was developed.

4.14 Scheme of area development under Ayacut programme partially implemented during 1975-76 was discontinued during 1976-77.

4.15 Animal Husbandry:

During the year 1976-77, an expenditure amounting to Rs. 5.51 was incurred under the programme. Under the programme, 2138 animals were inseminated, 726 animals castrated, 23161 animals were treated and 53,001 animals were vaccinated. 800 cockrells were distributed and 5,894 animals were treated under control of foot and mouth disease programme. During the year 1975-76, most of the expenditure was on staff. However 800 cockrells were distributed during the year 1975-76.

4.16 Dairy Development :

Expenditure incurred during the year 77 was Rs. 2.63 lakhs as against the budget of Rs. 10.10 lakhs. the expenditure amount to 26% only. Since the proposals sent under the scheme of financial assistance to co-operative milk union were not sanctioned by the Government, the provision of Rs. 5.00 lakhs could not be spent. Expenditure on Town Milk Supply Scheme was also less by 50%. Under the programme, 22,500 litres of milk was being handled per day as against 18,210 litres during 1975-76.

4.17 Forest:

Budget provision amounting to Rs. 13.83 lakhs made during the year 1976-77 was totally spent. During the year 1975-76 there were only 5 schemes but during 1976-77, additional 5 schemes were undertaken. Development of Minor Forest Produce Farm Forestry, Extension of Forestry, Forest Labour Welfare and forest protection were new schemes introduced during the year 1976-77. Various activities, such as plantation of rubber, Cashew, Special treatment, premonsoon work, II year and III year weeding operations, establishment of new nurseries and maintenance of existing nurseries were undertaken. Construction of wells, sheds, huts was undertaken as welfare activities under forest labour welfare. Improvement to Amboli Forest Part was undertaken. Eight new check nakas were

established and one repaired under the scheme of forest protection. As compared to the year 1975-76, the programme for the year 1976-77 appeared to be ambitious.

4.18 Fisheries:

Rs. 9.94 lakhs had been spent, out of total allocation of Rs. 10.42 lakhs, during the year 1976-77. Mechanisation of indigeneous boats was the major scheme under the programme for which Rs. 8.00 lakhs had been earmarked and this had been spent during the year. Eleven new boats and 13 engines had been procured under the scheme. Under the programme, stocking of fish amounted to 4.50 lakhs. Management subsidy was given to 8 Co-operative Societies, while the share capital was provided to 5 Societies, 311 Kg. Nylone twine, 170 Kg. Cotton twine were distributed on subsidised rates. Loans were granted to 16 fishermen as against 35 during 1975-76. One fisher youth was trained as against 4 during the year 1975-76. For transport and marketing of fish, one truck was provided on subsidy basis. On the similar lines programme was implemented during 1975-76.

4.19 Co-operation:

There were only three schemes during 1975-76. However, during the year 1976-77 three more schemes were implemented. Total provision for the year 1976-77 was Rs. 3.51 lakhs of which Rs. 3.19 lakhs had been spent. Major scheme having budget provision of Rs. 2.16 lakhs under the programme was distribution of consumers' articles in rural areas. 100% expenditure was booked on this scheme for 12 consumer co-operative societies. Under the programme, outright grants were given to 64 Societies. Two labour contract societies and one farmers service society were assisted. Subsidy was sanctioned to 2 branches of R.D.C. Banks during the year 1976-77, as against 3 during 1975-76.

4.20 Community Development:

During the year 1975-76, three schemes were implemented under the programme. But during 1976-77 scheme of L.D. Works was amalgamated with C.D. Scheme. Expenditure incurred during the year 1976-77 amounted to Rs. 5.49 lakhs as against the provision of Rs. 6.24 lakhs. Under the programme, 10 Community Wells, 5 Vet. Aid Centres buildings, 16 Irrigation works, 118 school buildings, 6 staff quarters and 156 road drainages were completed during 1976-77. Gram Safai Programme was also undertaken. Similar programme was also implemented during the year 1975-76.

Irrigation and Power:

4.21 Irrigation:

The budget provision for the year 1976-77 ^{which} was Rs. 21.00 lakhs was totally spent on three medium irrigation projects viz. Natuwadi Dhamagarwadi and Gadgadi. Preliminary work was undertaken during 1976-77. Administrative sanction was awaited to these schemes during 1975-76.

4.22 Power:

During the year 1976-77, budget provision was Rs. 68.00 lakhs and the expenditure incurred was 100%. There were two schemes under this programme. There was one scheme under which normal development programme was implemented, where-as the special efforts were made under the scheme of Rural Electrification Under normal development scheme, 436 pumps were energised and under other scheme, 50 pumps were energised and 58 villages were electrified. Similar programme was undertaken during the year 1975-76.

Industry and Mining:

4.23 Industries:

Programme under this sub-head was classified into large, Medium Industries and Small Scale Industries. There was one scheme under medium industries, while 5 under small scale industries.

Budget provision amounting to Rs. 44.40 lakhs for package scheme under large and medium industry was spent entirely. Under small scale industries programme, an amount of Rs. 11.49 lakhs had been spent as against the budget allocation of Rs. 17.89 lakhs. Under the programme, 295 small units were assisted under S.A.I. Rules. Seed capital assistance amounting to Rs. 8.59 lakhs was given to 261 educated unemployed. Financial assistance amounting to Rs. 2.00 lakhs was granted to 15 Societies as management subsidy and contribution to share capital.

Budget provision for 1975-76 was 80.82 lakhs and expenditure for the programme was Rs. 87.81. This excess expenditure was made on the scheme of seed capital money assistance to educated unemployed.

4.24 Transport and Communication:

Under this programme, the development was envisaged for road, water and air transport and accordingly budget provision was made on these three types of transport. Total provision for transport was Rs. 152.00 lakhs, of which Rs. 148.64 lakhs had been spent. Under road transport, expenditure amounting to Rs. 119.37 lakhs was booked as against the provision of Rs. 111.26 lakhs and new roads of 15.15 Km. improvement of 63.49 Km. road, 5 minor bridges, One major bridge, 229 C.D. works and blacktopping of 14 Kml were completed.

Under water Transport, Port and Harbour Development programme was undertaken. There were seven schemes under this programme and amount spent was Rs. 25.80 lakhs, as against the total provision of Rs. 34.23. The expenditure was incurred on alongsided facilities, airports, passenger amenities, dredging at ports, navigational aids, development of inland water transport, antisea erosion scheme and fisheries crash programme. In connection with air transport, landing strip has been constructed at Ratnagiri by spending Rs. 0.69 lakh during 1976-77. Under the tourism programme, the scheme of

development of Ganapatipule, a holy place, was undertaken and an amount of Rs. 2.78 lakhs was spent on holiday homes being built at the place. The development programme under this sub-head was a spill over programme for the year 1976-77. As compared to the year 1975-76, the expenditure percentage during 1975-76 was less by 11%.

4.26 Social Services:

There are ten sub-heads, under this major head, which are enumerated below. Total provision under this major head during 1975-77 was Rs. 203.75 lakhs, of which an amount of Rs. 154.01 lakhs was spent during the year. During the year 1975-76, the budget provision was Rs. 130.18 lakhs and against this the expenditure of Rs. 100.52 lakhs was incurred. The number of schemes implemented under this major head has been detailed below for the year 1975-76 and 1976-77.

4.27 It is observed from the above table that 19 schemes were operated under the sub-head "General Education" during the year 1976-77. The budget provision was Rs. 49.89 lakhs and expenditure incurred was Rs. 44.79 lakhs. Major achievements under this programme were as follows. 1) 112 schools rooms were constructed. 2) 696 primary teachers were imparted in-service training 3) 52 secondary school teachers were trained 4) maintenance grants were given to 2 non-Govt. colleges. 5) Open merit scholarships were granted to 6 students of colleges. 6) Financial assistance was granted to 6 school complexes. 7) Educational concessions to 6227 E.B.C. students were granted 8) Expenditure was incurred on 2381 children of primary teachers for their free education. 9) 72024 students were benefited under book scheme. 10) 4 additional A.D.E. Is were appointed 11) 76 additional sets of open merit scholarship at higher secondary stages were introduced. Similar programme was implemented during the year 1975-76 under 14 schemes.

4.28 Technical Education:

During the year 1975-76, there was only one scheme of Government Polytechnic but during 1976-77, three schemes were implemented. Expenditure made during 1976-77 was Rs. 4.90 lakhs as against the allocation of Rs. 4.57 lakhs. Orientation of diploma courses, providing additional accommodation for Govt. Polytechnic and financial assistance to Technical high school were the three schemes under implementation.

4.29 Health:

During the year 1975-76, there were 7 schemes. All the schemes except the T.B.Clinic were continued during 1976-77, as the building of T.B.Clinic was completed during 1975-76. The provision of Rs. 15.71 lakhs was made during 1976-77, of which Rs. 10.98 lakhs had been spent on six schemes. The expenditure percentage during 1976-77 was 70% and the same was 90% during 1975-76.

4.30 Applied Nutrition Programme:

This was the continued scheme, during 1976-77. An expenditure of Rs. 0.61 lakh was incurred on staff only. During the earlier year i.e. 1975-76, an amount of Rs. 0.52 lakh was spent and the achievements were as follows: 1) 499 baby chicks distributed. 2) One school garden of 1 hectares, 86 kitchen garden covering area of 1.73 hectares and 3 community gardens were developed. 4) Vegetables of 256 Kg. were distributed to 6417 beneficiaries.

4.31 Water Supply and Drainage:

Five Schemes implemented during 1975-76 were continued during 1976-77 with one more addition i.e. conversion of dry latrines into water borne latrines. The budget of Rs. 90.27 lakhs was provided for the year 1976-77, of which an amount of Rs. 56.78 lakhs was spent on Government Water Supply, Municipal Water Supply, Rural Water Supply Schemes, construction of drinking water wells and taking bores and installation of hand pumps. Under the programme, Water supply schemes at Sawantwadi, Rajapur, Ratnagiri, Chiplun, Vengurla, Dapoli, Harnai, Devgad, Nate, Lanja and Kudal were in progress. 464 shallow wells and 24 bore wells had been dug and 22 hand pumps were installed. By spending the entire provision of Rs. 0.45 lakh, 270 dry latrines were converted into water borne latrines. During the earlier year i.e. 1975-76, Rs. 42.68 lakhs had been spent as against the total provision amounting to Rs. 80.10 lakhs.

4.32 Urban Development:

Scheme of financial assistance to Municipal Councils for development Plan was implemented during 1975-76 and 1976-77. During 1975-76 grant-in-aid amounting to Rs. 2.10 lakhs was given to 4 municipal councils. Whereas in the year 1976-77, an amount

of Rs. 9.50 lakhs was granted to 5 Municipal Councils. Budget Provisions were entirely spent during both the years.

4.33 Housing :

Budgeted provision was Rs. 20.82 lakhs during 1976-77 for providing house sites to landless workers in rural area and construction of huts thereon and for tiling of roofs of huts. By spending an amount of Rs. 0.82 lakh, 222 huts were constructed and tiles worth Rs. 16.00 lakhs were provided to 255 huts. During the earlier year i.e. 1975-76, Rs. 18.00 lakhs were spent on this programme.

4.34 Welfare of Backward Classes:

Under this programme, 12 schemes were implemented during 1976-77 by spending an amount of Rs. 6.46 lakhs as against the budget provision of Rs. 8.62 lakhs. The expenditure during the earlier year 1975-76 was Rs. 5.25 lakhs as against the total provision of Rs. 11.98 lakhs. Achievements during the year 1976-77 were as follows. 1) Tuition fees were granted to 172 B.C. students. 2) Scholarships were awarded to 259 B.C. students. 3) Granted stipend to 12 B.C. students in I.T.I. 4) Grant-in-aid was released to 29 aided B.C. Hostels. 5) 28 irrigation wells were constructed 6) Financial assistance by way of subsidy was granted to 60 B.C. farmers for development of land, purchase of fertilisers and implements 7) Financial assistance was granted to 133 B.C. persons for housing purpose and to 14 balwadies.

4.35 Social Welfare:

Scheme of Rehabilitation of Physically handicapped implemented during 1975-76 was continued during 1976-77 and new scheme i.e. expansion work under probation of offenders act was introduced. Total provision was Rs. 0.03 lakh and expenditure was Rs. 0.05 lakh during the year 1976-77. In 1975-76 the expenditure was Rs. 0.01 lakh only.

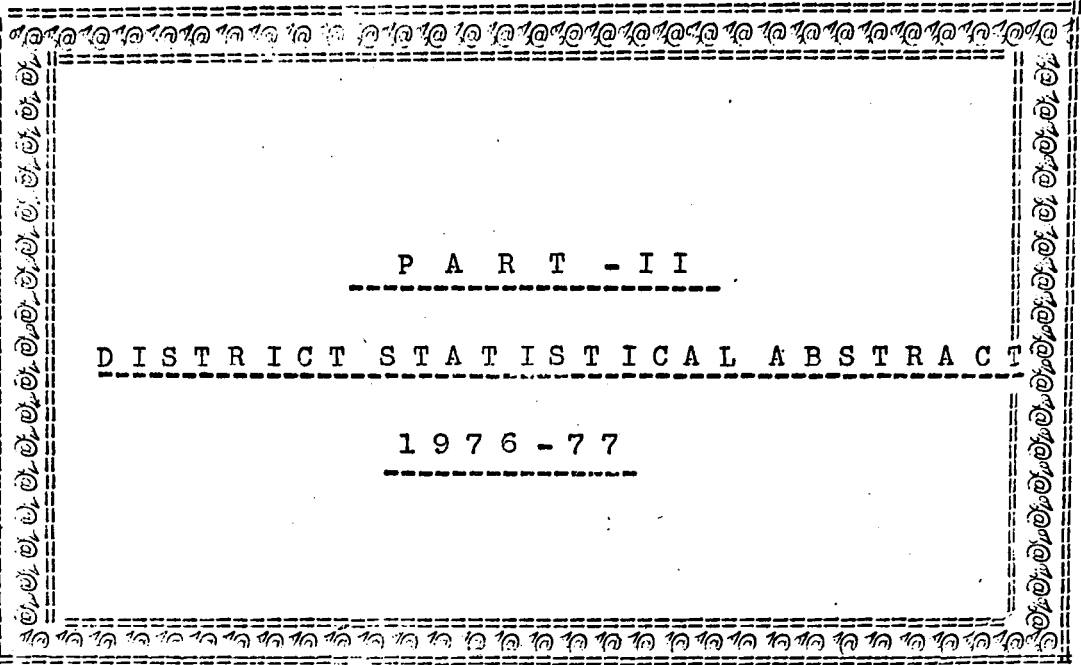
4.36 Labour and Labour Welfare:

Under this programme, the financial assistance was granted to I.T.Is for craftman training. Expenditure of Rs. 3.12 lakhs and Rs. 4.40 lakhs was made during 1976-77 and 1975-76 respectively for purchase of equipment, introduction of additional trainee seats and for staff.

4.37 Other Programme:

Under information and publicity scheme, 8 community Radio Sets were distributed during 1976-77 by spending an amount of Rs. 0.84 lakh. Under Employment Guarantee Scheme, the most ambitious programme of Maharashtra Government was implemented in the year 1976-77. During the earlier year 1975-76, Rs. 12.94 lakhs had been spent by generating employment of Rs. 4.31 lakh mandays. During the year 1976-77, 263 works were started and employment to 5177 persons were provided by spending Rs. 18.94 lakhs.

POPULATION DURING LAST FIVE DECADES IN RATNAGIRI DISTRICT (IN LAKHS)

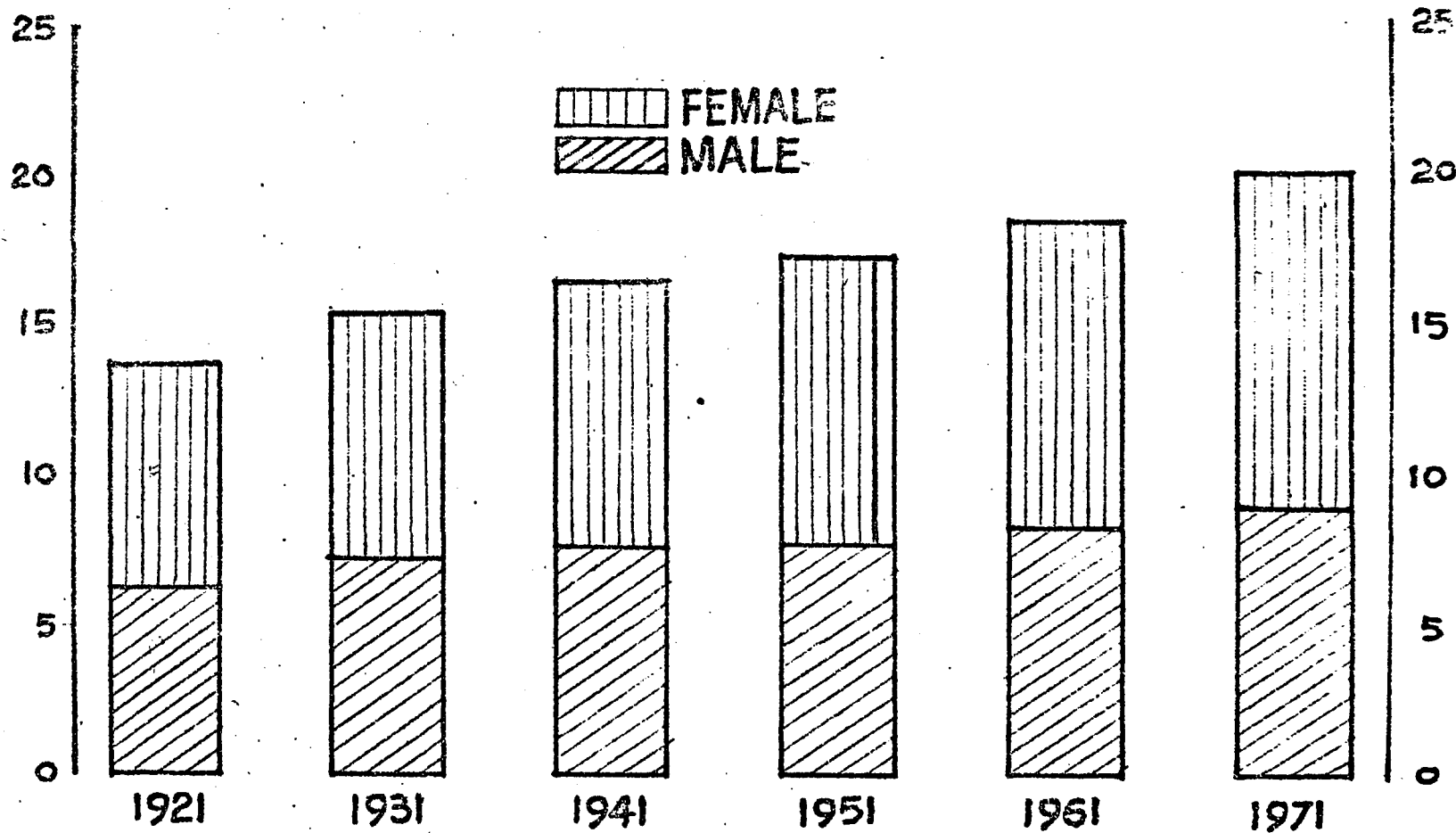

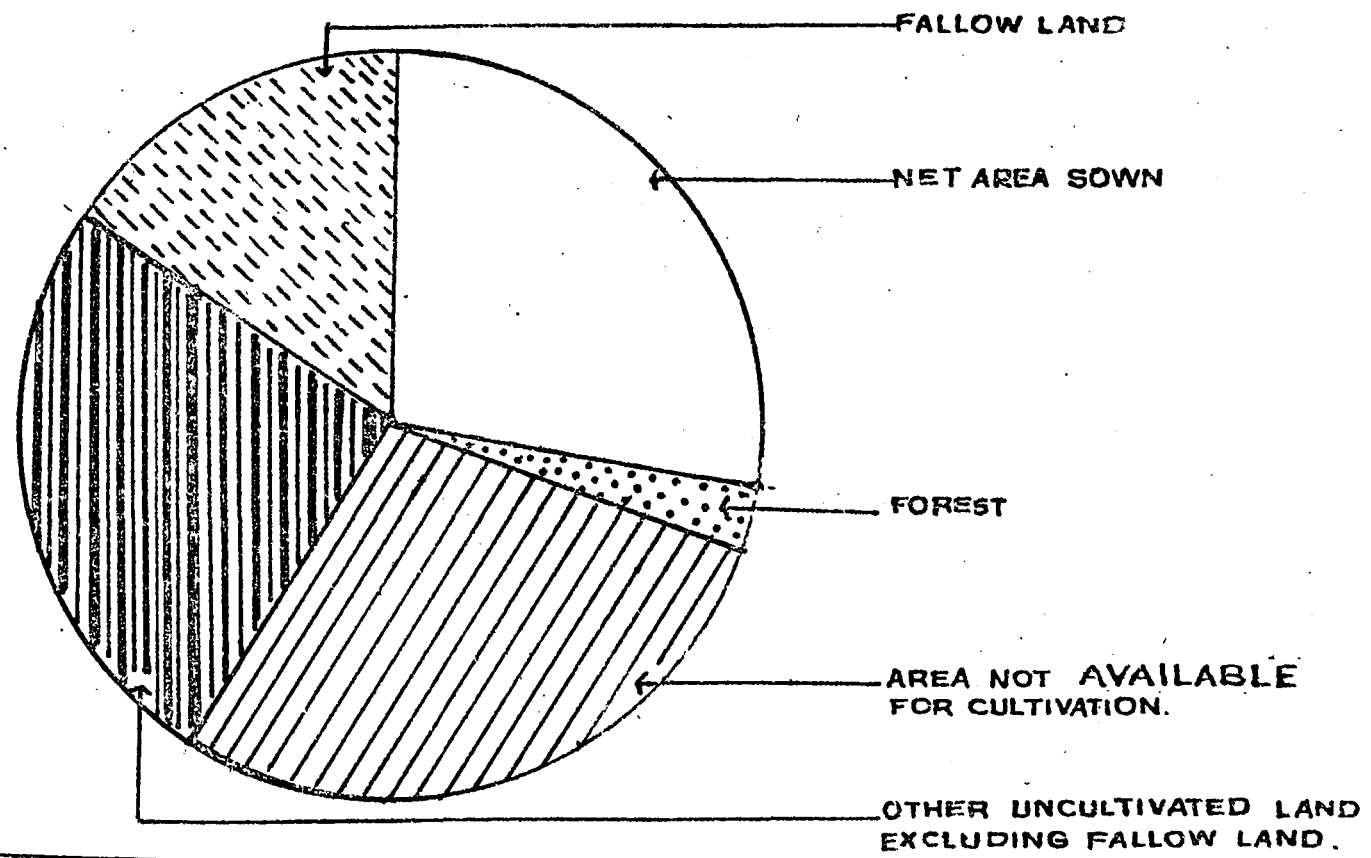

FOODGRAINS PRODUCTION RATNAGIRI DISTRICT

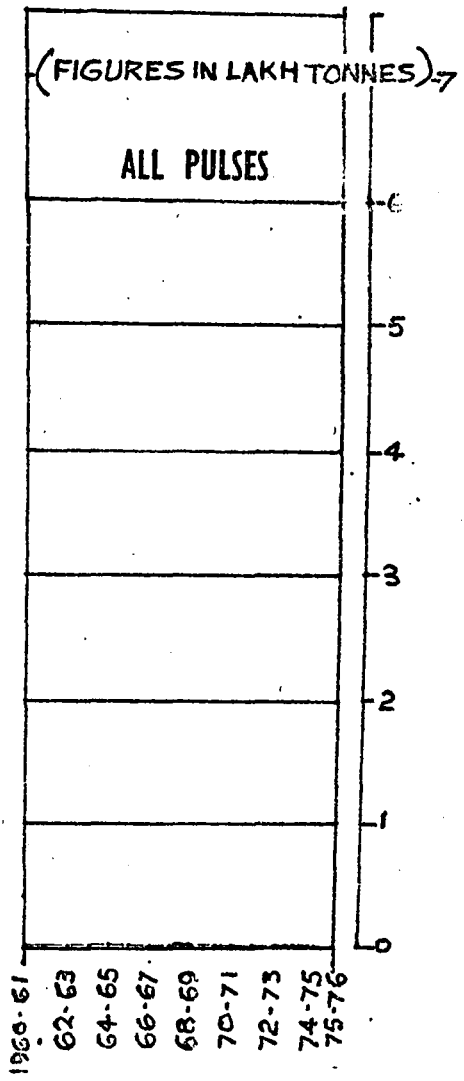
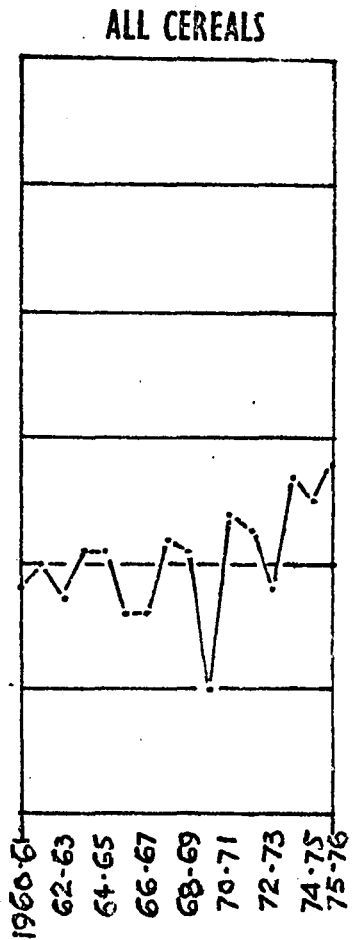
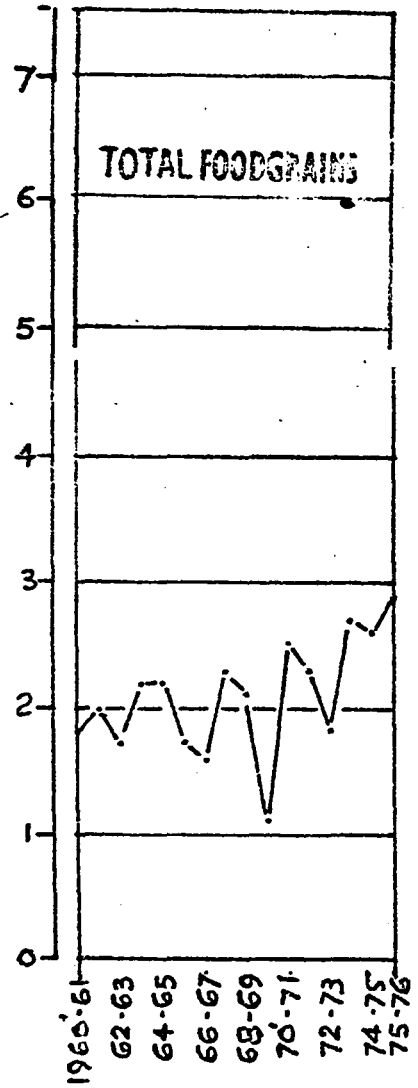

ADVANCES BY PRIMARY AGRICULTURAL CREDIT SOCIETIES

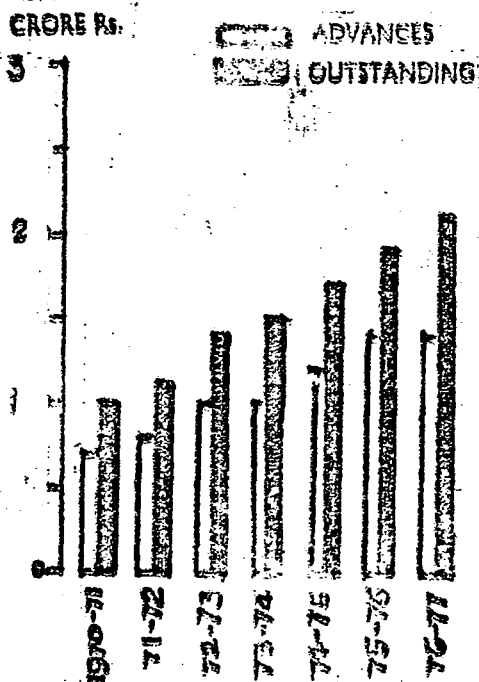

EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS & ENROLMENT 1972-73 TO 1976-77 RATNAGIRI DISTRICT

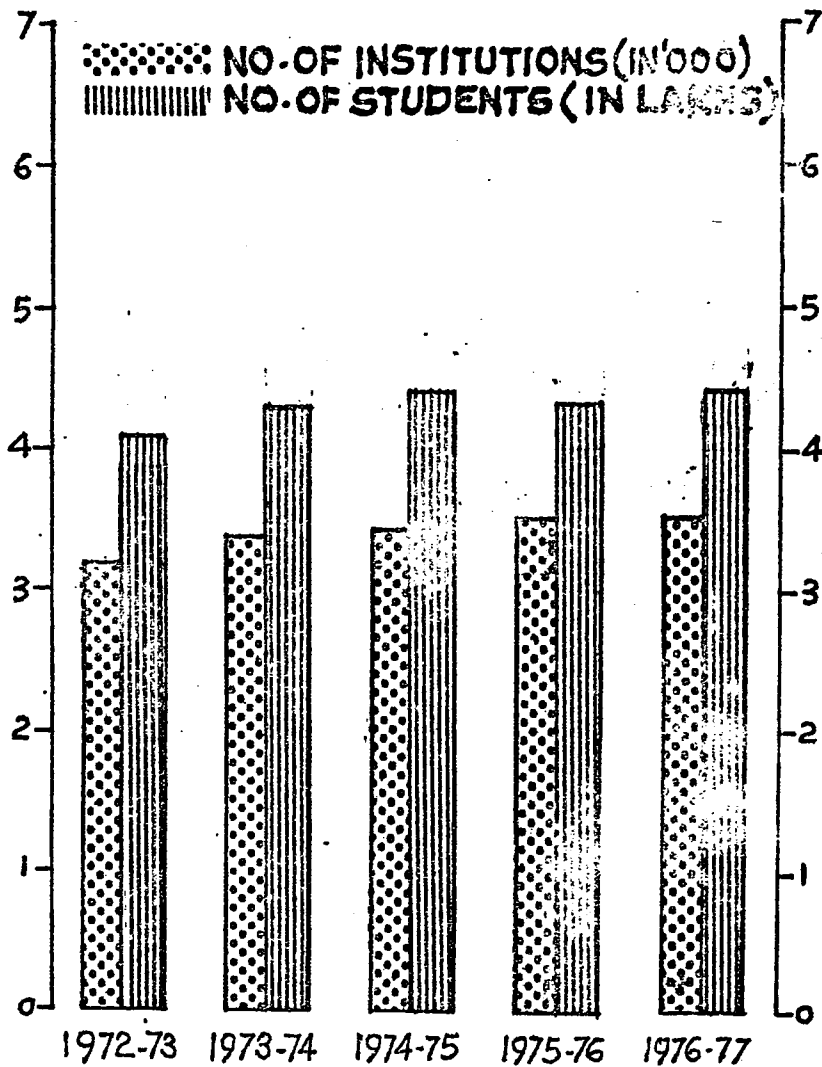


