CHAPTER NO. I  
INTRODUCTION  
PUNE DISTRICT.

LOCATION :-

1.1 Pune District lies between  $17^{\circ} 54'$  and  $19^{\circ} 24'$  North latitude and  $73^{\circ} 19'$  and  $75^{\circ} 10'$  East longitude.

BOUNDARIES :-

1.2 It is bounded on the North by Ahmednagar District, on the East by Ahmednagar and Solapur district, on the South by Solapur and Satara Districts and on the West by Kolaba and Thane Districts.

TOPOGRAPHY :-

1.3 Hill ranges :- The main range of Sahyadri runs North and South for a length of about 117 km. Also narrow ridges with flat tops stretch eastwards and gradually sink into the plain. The following leading peaks lie in the extreme north of the Sahyadri ranges.

a) Harischandra gad, (2) Jivdhan, (3) Dhak and (4) Ahupe.

1.4 Rivers :- The Bhima is the main river of the district. It rises in the Sahyadri at Bhimashankar ( Taluka - Ambegaon ) in the west of the district. It flows south-east through the central part of the district and then enters into Solapur district. The main tributaries of Bhima are Vel and Ghod on its left and Bhima, Indrayani, Mula, Mutha and Nira on the right. Nira forms the southern boundary of the district for a considerable distance. Karha, Kukadi, Pawana, Mula-Mutha, Meena, Gunjavani, Pushpawati, Shivganga and Velvandi are the other rivers flowing in the district. All of these rivers flow with the magnificent volume of water during the rainy season and shrink into a narrow thread during the hot season.



1.5 Soil :- The soils of the district are lighter in the west than in the east. They broadly belong to three classes - black, red and brown. In some places one class of soil blends with another in varying properties and is in turn modified by sand, gravel, lime salts and other ingredients.

1.6 The technical survey set up by Government of Maharashtra has recommended that the Pune District be divided into the following four Agro-climate zones. The coverage with reference to type of soil and crops grown in respective zones are also described below :-

a) Ghat Zone :- It covers only a small portion of Maval tahsil. The area is extremely rugged and covered by Sahyadri mountain ranges. The soils in this area are (1) High level red to reddish brown laterite soil and (2) light brown to dark brown forest soils. The hill tops and slopes are covered with forest trees and grasses. Small strips of land on hill slopes are used for cultivation, where hill millets like nagli, wari are grown. On some land paddy is grown. The soils are inferior and have poor fertility.

b) Transition I :- This is formed by the western portion of Junnar, western half of Ambegaon, Khed and Bhore and western and central portion of Maval, Mulshi and Velhe tahsils. The area is extremely rugged. The soils are red to reddish brown in colour, varying in depth and texture. Paddy is the main crop in valleys and nagli, wari etc. are grown on hill slopes. Major portion of area is under forest and pastures.

c) Transition II :- The zone comprises of the mid-western part of Junnar, Khed eastern half of Ambegaon and eastern strips of Velhe, Mulshi, Bhore and western portion of Haveli tahsil. This lies on the eastern side of Sahyadri mountain ranges. The following brown to dark brown soils of varying depth are found in this zone.

- i) High level : Low lime, Shallow reddish brown loam
- ii) Intermediate : Medium deep brown black clay loam
- iii) Low level : Deep low lime brown clays.

The soils are alkaline. Major crops grown are bajri, jawar, wheat variety of fruit crops and vegetables.

d) Scarcity zone :- This zone covers the eastern corner of Junnar, South eastern portion of Khed, eastern half of Haveli and entire portion of Shirur, Purandhar, Daund, Baramati and Indapur tahsils. This zone covers nearly 50% area of the district. The soils are brown to black calcareous soils with varying depth and textures. Main crops grown are Rabi, jawar, cotton, wheat, gram, groundnut and safflower and also sugarcane in canal areas.

RAINFALL :-

1.7 The district receives its rain mostly from the southwest monsoon, during June to October. A few erratic showers are received from the North-east monsoon by the eastern part of the district. The annual rainfall varied from 3000 m.m. to 4000 m.m. in the Ghat zone. The western portion of the transition-I zone gets rainfall varying from 2000 m.m. to 2000 m.m. whereas the eastern portion receives 1250 m.m. to 2500 m.m. The rainfall in the transition-II zone ranges from 700 m.m. in the east to 1250 m.m. in the west, as one proceeds from east to west. The scarcity track receives rainfall ranging from 600 to 700 m.m.

SCARCITY CONDITIONS : 1979-80 :-

1.8 The fact finding committee ( 1973 ) has recommended that at least some part of the following tahsils is drought prone area.

Important crops grown in these tahsils are Bajri and Rabi jowar. Due to good and timely rains during the year i.e. 1979-80, agricultural conditions were satisfactory and hence no area of the district was declared as affected by scarcity conditions.

#### MINERALS :-

1.9 The rocks in the varieties of Deccan trap basalt and are found in the varieties of (i) vesicular and (ii) non-vesicular. The vesicular types are comparatively more soft and break more easily. The non-vesicular types of rocks are hard, tough and compact. It is used as building stones for roads and as an aggregate in cement concrete. Kankar and Gypsum are found at a number of places especially in the eastern part of the district. Kankar is used for lime burning. There are some deposits of lime and dalomite in the district. The deposits of lime are found in Purandhar and part of Daund tahsils, but due to its inferior quality it is not used for cement.

#### FOREST :-

1.10 Forest area is in the western and hilly part of the district. The types of forest area (i) Scrub (ii) mixed deciduous and (iii) evergreen which are found respectively in the areas of low, medium and high rainfall. The main produce from the forests are teak ( in Junnar, Purandhar, Bhor and Velhe tahsils ) Hirda ( in Khed and Ambegaon tahsils ) bamboo and Shikekal ( in Maval and Mulshi tahsils ). The total value of forest produce during the year 1979-80 was Rs. 8.72 lakhs.

AREA AND DEMOGRAPHY :-

1.11 The population of 31,78,029 ( as per population Census of 1971 ) of the district is spread over the district area of 15640 Sq.km. Out of the total area, urban area constitutes only 578 Sq.Km., which is 3.69 % of the total area. All the tahsils except Mulshi and Ambegaon have some portion of urban area.

DECADAL VARIATION :-

1.12 The population of the district during 1971 Census increased by 28.8 % over the population as per 1961 Census. The following table gives the area and population of the tahsils in Pune District.

The increase in population varies from 1.1 in Velhe tahsil to 47.0 in Haveli tahsil. The high rate of increase in population in Haveli tahsil can be attributed to industrialisation in the area surrounding Pune.

## SPECIAL FEATURES :-

With tremendous strides made in the field of industry, education, cultural activities etc., Pune district occupies a pride of place in the socio-economic map of Maharashtra State. However, a study of this development reveals a very disturbing picture of spatial unbalanced growth.

At one end is the highly industrialised area of Pune and Pimpri Chinchwad, where internationally known industrial houses such as Tata, Garaware, Buckau Wolf, Kirloskar, Bajaj have their giant industrial units, specializing in the production of trucks, scooters, nylon yarn, sugar manufacturing machinery etc. while at the other end are almost total agrarian undeveloped areas like Velhe, Junnar and Ambegaon tahsils in some parts of which even transport facilities are not available.

For civic administration, Pune district has Pune Municipal Corporation for Pune City and 12 other municipal councils. As stated above, the industrialisation in the Pimpri Chinchwad area is so intense that the Pimpri-Chinchwad Municipality is one of the richest municipalities in India.

Pune district has done pioneering work in the field of education with a University, having faculties in arts, science, commerce, engineering and medical, where students not only from various States in India but from abroad come for study.

The head offices of various State level departments like Agriculture, Animal Husbandry, Education, Health services, Social Welfare, Sports & Youth Services, Co-operation, Ground water Survey & Development Agency, are located at Pune which is also the Headquarter of Pune Revenue Division.

Besides these offices various other special and important Central Govt. offices such as Central Water & Power Research Station, Khadakwasla, Akashwani, Film & Television Institute of India, Explosive Research & Development Laboratory, Pashan, National Defence Academy, Indian Institute of Tropical Meteorology National Chemical Laboratory, H.Q. Southern Command, Overseas Communications Centre, Dighi, National Sugar Institute, Advisory Cell are located in Pune.

CHAPTER II  
EXPLANATORY NOTE

2.1 The data on different important sectors which have dominant effects on the economy are presented in this abstract for the year 1979-80. In case the data for the year 1970-70 are not available the data for the latest available year are presented. In most of the cases, the reference period of the data is the financial year. The data on Agriculture, however, relates to the agricultural year, whereas the data on 'Co-operation' is for the Co-operative year (1st July to 30th June). The data on other important items like rainfall, temperature, civil and criminal cases, vital statistics, is for the calendar year. The information as far as possible is presented Tahsilwise for inter Tahsil comparison.

District At a glance

2.2 Certain essential data in important spheres, such as,

- i. Population,
- ii. Agriculture,
- iii. Animal husbandry,
- iv. Industries,
- v. Co-operation,
- vi. Medical and Public health,
- vii. Education,
- viii. Transport and communication,
- ix. Plan expenditure etc.,

Pertaining to the district is presented along with the corresponding figures for the State for the comparison purpose.

District Statistical Abstract :-

2.3 The data incorporated in the District Statistical Abstract have been presented in suitable tables, classified in appropriate groups. The concepts adopted in preparation of tables are summarised in the following paragraphs. The limitations of data are cited wherever necessary.

## Area and Population.

2.4 The data of 1971 census mainly on population, area, houses and livelihood occupation, rural urban breakup etc., are presented in the first seven tables for all Tahsils in the District. Data on population per square kilometre, decadal variations during 1951-61 and 1961-71, classification of villages and towns according to population ranges, number of workers and non-workers, population of schedule castes and schedule tribes, distribution of population according to age group and religion are also given in these tables.

### 2.5 (a) Urban Area

The following places have been treated as Urban Areas'

( TOWNS )-----

1. Every place having a municipality or cantonment board irrespective of its population,
2. Every other place which satisfies following three conditions.....
  1. a population of at least 5,000
  2. at least three fourth of its male working population engaged in non-agricultural pursuits and
  - (3) a density of population of at least 400 persons per square km.
3. any other place not falling under above two categories which possesses certain district characteristics to qualify to its being treated as urban such as its being a project area or a developing township.

(b) Rural Area :- These areas which do not satisfy the criteria prescribed for recognising urban <sup>area</sup> are called 'Rural Area'.

A census village in Maharashtra has always been a revenue village, A revenue village has well-defined boundaries, a map and a separate set of land records irrespective of whether that defined area has any population or not.

(c) Worker : A worker is defined as 'a person whose main activity is participation in any economically productive work through his physical or mental activity. Work involves not only actual work but effective supervision and direction of work. A public or social worker engaged actively in public or social work or political worker actively engaged in furthering the political aims of a party was also regarded as a 'worker'. In case of perennial work, such as, cultivation, livestock, plantation some type of household industries, a person was treated as a 'worker' by ascertaining whether he had participated any time during the last one year, even if, he was not economically active in the week prior to enumeration. In case of regular work in trade, profession, service or business, a person was considered as 'worker' if he had participated in such regular work on any one of the days during the week preceding the date of enumeration and that work has been returned as his main activity.

(d) Non-worker:- Non-workers are 'those who are not mainly engaged in any economically productive work!

Persons primarily engaged in household duties or those who were students and helped in the family economic activity, but not on full time scale were treated as 'Non-worker' in respect of their main activity.

#### Climate

2.6 The rainfall and temperature have pronounced effects on climate. The rainfall data presented in table No. 8 gives normal rainfall, monthly rainfall and number of rainy days



during the  
calender year 1979 for the selected centres. Normal rainfall figures are worked out on the basis of actual rainfall for the periods ranging from a minimum of five years and a maximum of 80 years. A day was treated as a 'rainy day' if during the twenty-four hours the rain gauge recorded a minimum of 2.5 mm. of rainfall. The table No. 9 gives actual maximum and minimum temperatures recorded during each of the month of the calender year 1979 in respect of three centres in Pune district.

### Agriculture

2.7 Important tahsilwise statistics on agriculture, such as...

- i. Land utilisation
- ii. Area under different crops
- iii. Yield per hectare and outturn of principal crops.
- iv. Irrigated area under different crops
- v. Sourcewise irrigated area and
- vi. Data on irrigation etc.....

are given in table no. 10 to 14.

2.8 The basic definitions adopted are given below :-

a) Geographical area : It is, according to village papers, calculated from village returns prepared for revenue purposes and as such it may be different from that according to Surveyor General.

b) Forests :- It includes all actually forested areas or lands classed or administered as 'forests' under any legal enactment dealing with forests, whether State owned or private. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land.

c) Land Put to Non-agricultural uses :- it stands for all lands occupied by buildings, roads and railways or under rivers, canals etc. and other land put to uses other than agricultural.

d) Barren and unculturable land : It covers land which can not be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost, whether in isolated blocks or uncultivated holdings. Land like mountains, deserts etc. is classified under this category.

e) Permanent pastures and other grazing lands:- It covers all grazing lands. Village common grazing lands and grazing lands within forest area are included under this head.

f) Culturable wast land :- These may be either 'fallow' or covered with useless shrubs and jungles which are not put to any use and include all lands available for cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once but not cultivated during the current year and the last five years or more in succession.

g) Miscellaneous tree crops and groves not included in the net area sown :- This category includes all cultivable land which is not included in Net area sown but put to some agricultural use.

h) Current fallow lands : These are lands which are kept fallow during the current year. If any seedling area is not cropped again in the same year, it is also treated as 'current fallow.

i) Other fallows:- All lands which were taken up for cultivation but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period not less than one year and not more than 5 years are classed as 'other fallow'.

j) Net area sown : This consists of net area sown with crops and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once.

k) Gross cropped area :- Total of area under all crops including area under crops sown more than once is taken as 'Gross cropped area'.

Cultivable area is a sum of areas under :-

- a) Miscellaneous tree crops and groves not included in the net area sown.
- b) Current fallows
- c) Other fallows

- d) Culturable waste land and
- e) Net area sown.

2.9 Important irrigation statistics regarding...

- i. Number of irrigation wells,
- ii. Activities of ground water survey and development agency
- iii. Minor irrigation works
- iv. Major and medium irrigation projects and
- v. Area irrigated under major and medium projects

are given in table No. s 15,16,17 and 18.

2.10 Agricultural wage rates at the selected centres viz.

- i. Nira ( Taluka Purandhar )
- ii. Bhigwan ( Taluka Indapur )
- iii. Ghodegaon ( Taluka Ambegaon)...

collected by the District Statistical Officer, through the block Statistical Assistants are given in table No. 19. Number of operational holdings as per Agricultural Census 1976-77 are given in table No.20. Final figures of agricultural implements enumerated during the eleventh livestock census are given in table No.21. The Tahsilwise data on 'famine and scarcity' are given in table No.s 22 and 23 for the year 1979-80 and 1971-72 to 1979-80 respectively.

#### Animal Husbandry and Forests

2.11 Population of livestock and poultry as per livestock census 1978 (final data) is shown Tahsilwise in table No.24.

Statistics on veterinary facilities existed, animals treated in such centres and disease-wise mortality of livestock are given in table No.s 25 and 26. Table No.27 furnishes data on animals slaughtered in recognised slaughter houses in the district.

2.12 The data on 'area under forests' and major and minor forest produce for the year 1978-79 have been shown in tables 28(a) and 28(b) respectively. Area under forests with a classification into

- i. reserved.
- ii. Protected and
- iii. Unclassed forests under the control of State Revenue Department and under State Forests Department...

has been shown. These areas may not tally with the area under forests shown in table No.10 due to different concepts of classification into above three heads. Reserved forests are intended mainly for timber production of which rights of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. "Grazing and cultivation" under certain limitation and restrictions are allowed in protected forests. The unclassified forests refer to "inaccessible forests" or "unoccupied waste".

### 2.13 Inland Fisheries

The statistics relating to total area suitable for fish culture, ponds, lakes and reservoirs, area under pisciculture, inland fish production and carp fry used for pisciculture are given in Table No.29(A).

### Employment Industry and Electricity

2.14 The statistics relating to working factories under different groups with average daily employment, man-days worked, classification of factories according to working strength and number of days worked are given for the years 1978 and 1979 in Table No.s 30,31 and 32. The term 'Factory' includes. --

- a) Those employing ten or more workers with the aid of power
- b) Those employing 20 or more workers and working without aid of power and
- c) Those registered under the Factory Act, 1948. even though the above conditions are fulfilled, the Defence factories are excluded."

Statistics regarding No. of registered factories, productive capital investment, output and employment provided under different industries based on Annual Survey of Industries for the year 1977-78 and 1978-79 given in table No.23. Monthwise registration, vacancies notified, placements done, number of employment seekers on the live register at the end of the month, occupationwise and sectorial, other data of employment exchange have been shown in table No.s 34,35 and 37. The information regarding the employment generated under Employment Guarantee Scheme works is also given in table No.36.

2.15 Data on consumption of electricity by different categories during the year 1979-80 is given in table No.38 and number of towns and villages electrified during the upto the end of selected years are shown in table No.39. The data are collected from Maharashtra State Electricity Board, Private Electric Supply companies and Sugar factories in the District.

#### Co-operation

2.16 Statistical information on the Co-operative institutions and their activities have been given for the year 1979-80 on the following items.

- i. Loan advanced by co-operative banks and primary agricultural credit societies different types of societies, their membership,
- ii. Total value of purchase and sales by the central and primary co-operative marketing societies and

iii. Annual arrivals in the regulated markets in each Tahsil of Pune district in Tables 40 to 46.

Tahsilwise data regarding no. of members, capital structure, loans advanced and recovered etc. have been also given.

Working capital :- It includes paid-up capital, deposits and borrowings. Loans outstanding includes outstandings in respect of loans, cash credits and overdrafts and the amount of the outstanding bills : purchased or discounted. Overdues refer to the amount of loans or instalments which was due for collection but which was not actually collected and for the repayment of which no extension has been granted by the competent authority. Information of registered money lenders and loans advanced by them is given in table No. 47.

The main functions of Agricultural credit societies are to help members by way of providing short and medium term loans for meeting their agricultural necessities like improved seeds, fertilizers, agricultural improved implements etc. The help is also extended in the matters of storage, transportation and sales of the agricultural produce.

2.21 The agricultural non-credit societies look after the work of better farming by way of educating the agriculturists in the adoption of improved agricultural practices, crop protection etc. The societies also undertake educational, economical, cultural and house building activities so as to uplift the standards of living of the agriculturists.

2.22 The main function of the Urban Bank, urban credit co-operative societies and salary earners, co-operative societies is to promote the qualities of economy, and co-operation among the members and also to make them

Industrious. They also augment the saving habits of the people by way of making the banking facilities easily available. They give loans to the members on the securities like gold, immovable property, Government securities, commercial goods etc. They also provide loans to the Artisans and small traders.

2.23 The main functions of non-agricultural non-credit societies are to run printing presses, to provide electricity to members and consumers for domestic, industrial and agricultural purposes, to run Montessories, primary schools and educational institutions for educational spread and things of the kind.

The main function of primary co-operative marketing society is the purchase and sale of agricultural produce grown by its members or member co-operative societies in its area of operations.

#### Medical and Public Health

2.24 In this section, data on medical and public health for the year 1979 is given. Table no. 48 gives medical facilities available through public and public-aided bodies in each Tehsil alongwith indoor and outdoor patients treated. Data on 'Vital Statistics' e.g., Tahsilwise births and deaths and infant deaths registered in the year 1979 with break-up into male and female and number of deaths due to important causes, from the year 1971 to 1979

is given in tables No.49 and 50 respectively.

Vaccination statistics and cholera inoculation done in each Tahsil during 1979 is given in table No.51. Table No.52 gives Statistics on family planning during the year 1979-80.

### Education

2.25 The data on Tahsilwise number of literates and percentage of literacy as per 1971 census are shown in table No.53. The data on education level of people in rural and urban areas are given in table No.s 54 and 55. The data regarding pupils and teachers with No. of institutions in pre-primary, primary, secondary and higher categories are presented in Table No. 56. The data on backward class enrolment and concessions granted to economically backward class and expenditure incurred under normal and plan grants on primary education in the district is shown in table No.s 57 to 59.

### Transport and Communication

2.26 Length of railway routes according to gauge is shown in Table No. 60. The Table No. 61 gives road length according to category and surface classification. Roads maintained by municipal councils / cantonment boards are also shown separately in this table. The data on number of motor vehicles in operation in Pune Region covering Pune, Ahmednagar and Solapur districts together are shown in Table No.62.(Districtwise figures are not available). Important operational statistics relating to Pune division of Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation are given in table No.63. (Pune <sup>State</sup> Transport division comprises of Pune district). Results of traffic census conducted in December 1979 on important roads in district are given in table No.64. Statistics on Postal, Telegraphs and Telephone facilities and on rural broadcasting are depicted in the table No.65 and 66 respectively.



### Local Bodies

2.27 The financial position of Village Panchayats, Municipal Councils and Zilla Parishad is shown in this section for the year 1979-80.

2.28 The number of village Panchayats includes number of independent Village Panchayats as also group Village Panchayats, income and Expenditure of Village Panchayats are exclusive of opening and closing balances respectively. Grants include grants from Government as well as from Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities for developmental activities. Government grants to village panchayats are mainly land revenue grants, equalisation grants and local cess grants. Government grants in respect of Municipal councils are mainly grants on account of dearness allowances, grants for roads, for water supply, for educational purposes, for medical purposes and on account of percentage in land revenue. The receipts of Zilla Parishad are shown under four sub-heads viz.

- i. Self raised resources,
- ii. Government grants,
- iii. Grants for agency scheme and
- iv. debt. section.

The expenditure is shown under two heads---- Revenue Expenditure and Debt Section.

2.29 The data are collected from the Zilla Parishad, Pune and all the Municipal Councils in Pune District.

### Plan and Community Development

2.30 Data on Plan expenditure under State and Local Sectors and physical achievements in important fields during the year 1978-79 and 1979-80 are given respectively in table No.s 71 and 72. Statistics in respect of coverage of community development programme stagewise expenditure of various blocks

and blockwise physical achievements under community development programme are shown in table No. 73 and 75.

Prices;-

2.31 The table No.76 gives monthly average wholesale prices of agricultural commodities transacted in regulated markets. The district average for each variety and for each month is also given.

2.32 The table No.77 gives the monthly average retail prices of important commodities at Pune headquarters during 1979. As the information collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one quotation and that also from only one shop in the district head-quarter, The averages shown for individual commodities cannot be said to be fully representative but the data may prove useful as broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices over the period<sup>of</sup> time. The table No.78 gives consumer price index number for working class of Solapur and Pune centres for the year 1979-80. For the calculation of index, the years 1960 and 1961 are taken as 'base years' for Solapur and Pune centres respectively.

Miscellaneous

2.33 Statistical data pertaining to police force, crime statistics, cases disposed of in civil and criminal courts, cinema statistics, regarding seating capacity in different types of theatres, No, of banking offices, No. of scheduled banks, their deposits and advances and No, of Joint stock companies, insurance policies and amount insured, collection of small savings, land revenue collections, No. of presses, news Papers and periodicals published etc., are given in the

Table No.s 79 to 89. Table No.90 gives information about the quantity of rice, wheat and sugar issued to fair price shops. The demand and procurement of levy in Pune District are indicated in table No.91. Statistics relating to General Elections of Assembly 1973 and Lok Sabha 1980 are presented in table No.92.

2.34 A table showing trends in selected indicators in the fields of development such as....

i. Agriculture

ii. Livestock

iii. Industry

iv. Education

v. health etc..... is appended at the end.

These collected indicators are very useful for assessing progress in various fields over important periods in the recent past.

### CHAPTER III

#### Analytical Review of Sectorial Trends.

3.1 The Statistical data Presented in Part II of this Abstract are analysed in this chapter for studying the trends in the important sectors of the District economy

#### AGRICULTURE

As high as 82 % of the population of Pune District is dependant on agriculture for its livelihood. However,  $\left[ \begin{array}{l} \text{as per Agricultural Census 1976-77} \\ \text{the} \end{array} \right.$  percentage of no of holdings in the size class of 10 and more hectares was only about 7. Combined with the fact that only about 15% of the net area sown in the district is irrigated, agriculture in this district in general is a just a way of life rather than a commercial proposition.

The following indicators of developments show the position on the agricultural production.

Percentage of Gross cropped area to net area sown.

This indicator shows the extent to which the available land is intensively used for agricultural production

In the following table the tahsilwise comparative position during the years 1960-61, 1970-71, 1976-77, 1977-78 and 1978-79 is given.

It is observed from the above data that the intensity of cultivation has increased in the District during the course of year, though not be very remarkable extent. This may be due to the constraint imposed by lack of assured water supply through out the year in many parts of the District. The actual figures of area

cropped more than once during 1960-61, 1970-71 were 107400 and 117700 hectares, which rose to 127000 hectare in 1978-79 that is during a period of 18 years the double <sup>area</sup> cropped increased by 19,600 hectares.

Jowar which is the principal crop of the area occupies about 40 % of the gross cropped area in the district. The cropping pattern reveals that the percentage share of area under wheat and groundnut crops has increased while that under a coarse crop like Bajra has declined.

The out turn from agriculture depends on various variable factors like timely rainfall extent of use of improved agricultural practices<sup>etc.</sup> Though irrigation facilities in the district have increased in the district, agriculture in Pune district depends to a very considerable extent on the vagaries of monsoon, (only 15% net sown area has assured water supply) and hence the lack of stability in agricultural production from year to year.

Examination of the data in table No.3 shows the yield rate of Rice doubled and that of Wheat more than tripled during 1976-77/1977-78. as comparable to 1960-61

The position in 1978-79 was however not satisfactory as compared with previous two years in respect of many crops.

It is observed that in the district as whole percentage of net area irrigated to net area sown has increased from 10.35 in 1960-61 to 13.95 in 1977-78. It is, however, observed that only in the tahsils of Pune city, Indapur, Baramati, and Bhor the percentage is significant ( from 19.93 % in Bhor to 45.66 in Pune-City ) while in the hilly area like Velhe, Mawal and Mulshi it is only about 2 to 3 %.

Analysis of distribution of area irrigated under different crops shows that more about 62 % of the gross irrigated area in the district is appropriated by Jowar, Wheat, Sugarcane and Bajra crops.

The above data shows that during a period of about 17 years, surface irrigation increased from 46545 hectares to 77,591 hectares that is by about 67%, while that by wells from 55472 to 62,565 that is by about 13% while the overall increase comes to about 37%. Surface irrigation thus increased at a faster pace than well irrigation.

The picture on the Co-operative front is a mixed one. Whereas there is found to be very remarkable in the number of members, Working capital and Overdues is disquieting.

WAGE RATES :

Agricultural wage rates of skilled and unskilled workers are collected every fortnight from the 3 selected centres, viz, Ghodegaon, Bhigwan and Nira.

The position in 1979 shows that skilled like carpentars and blacksmith get about Rs. 10.00 a day, while a male field labourer earns about Rs. 3 to Rs.5. Females earn considerably less. ( that is from Rs. 1.50 to Rs.3.00)

The bovine and ovine population per 100 hectares of cultivable land works out to 163 hectares for the district as a whole. The tahsil ratio is higher than the district ratio, eight tahsils of Pune-city, Haveli, Khed, Ambegaon, Junnar, Daund, Baramati and Purandhar tahsil. In the hilly and heavy rainfall areas like Bhore, Velhe, Mawal the ratio is considerably lower than that of the district.

The above table shows that as at the end of March, 1980, 937 villages out of a total of 1481 inhabited villages in the district were electrified, which works out to 63%. The tahsils of Haveli, Shirur, Daund, Indapur Baramati and Purandhar show good progress in rural electrification.

While the hilly areas are much lagging behind difficult terrain and small size of villages in the hilly area might be the reasons for this unbalanced progress in this development sector of development.

The impact of the development made in rural electrification is seen in the increasing use of electric pump sets for irrigation purposes. It is observed that as against an insignificant number of 92 pump sets ~~were~~ in 1961, 19,781 pump sets were in operation in 1978, a remarkable progress indeed. However, here also it is seen that the <sup>5</sup>tahsils of Haveli, Indapur, Junnar, Baramati and Purandhar account for 70% of the total pumps energised in the entire district.

Consumption of electricity in the district has increased by leaps and bounds, especially because of the very fast industrialisation /urbanisation which has taken place in Pune Urban agglomeration and Sugar factory areas.

A great deal of progress has been made in providing Medical facilities to the people especially in the rural areas by establishing public hospital, rural dispensaries.

primary health centres etc.

As a result while in 1961 the doctor population ratio was 1:14000, in 1979 it was 1 : 4,667

With the establishment of medical institutions in the rural areas of the district, the death rate has come down from 10 in 1961 to 9 in 1979, simultaneously to check the birth rate family welfare programme has been implemented vigorously. The impact of the measures taken under this programme can very well be seen from the fact that, while the birth rate <sup>28</sup> was per 1000 in 1961 to 25 it was reduced in 1979.

EDUCATION :

Educational facilities at least up to primary level are now available in almost all the villeges in the District.

BANKING :-

Planned efforts have been made in recent <sup>years</sup> to cover more and more area by opening new branches especially in the rural areas. This has resulted in reducing the households to bank ratio as can be seen from the fact that where as in 1961, for 4947 households there was only



one banking office, in 1973, 1006 households were covered by one bank.

ROAD :

The total road length in the district in 1960-61 was 2,626 K.M. which rose to 9,113 K.M. in 1979-80 an increase of 247%. However, by an impressive surface classificationwise the road length of superior of quality i.e. of Cement concrete category was only 0.7 % and black topped 13 % of the total road length in the district in 1979-80, while the rest of the road length i.e. about 86 % was of water bound macadam / granular material category .

The road length per 100 Sq. K.M. area during 1979-80 was 58 K.M. as against 17 K.M. in 1960-61.

PRICES :-

Retail prices of essential commodities are collected by the District Statistical Office, every Friday from selected shops at the district Head-quarter. The information though restricted to only are quotation is, however useful to gauge the fluctuations in prices in a general way. The following table shows the prices of some of important commodities in the selected years

CHAPTER - IV

ANNUAL

PLAN : 1978-79 & 1979-80.

4.1 Since the inception of the first five year plan a great deal of effort was made to encourage economic growth through the provision of required inputs, extension of improved production techniques and building up of a net work of infrastructural facilities and services throughout the country. However, plan formulation undertaken at the State level suffered to some extent from various drawbacks as it was rather difficult to make proper assessment of the following factors at the State level.

i) Wide disparities existing between the level of development attained by different areas and community groups.

ii) Under-utilization of the already available natural resources, infrastructural facilities and productive capacities in different areas.

iii) Uniform application of development schemes resulting in inefficient utilisation of physical and financial resources.

It was, therefore, decided to adopt area development approach in the formulation of State Plans.

Since the formulation of Area Development Plans requires interation and co-ordination of the activities of different sectors, considering the administrative apparatus available for the same, district has been adopted as unit of planning from the beginning of the Fifth Five Years plan.

The area development approach embodied in the District Plan envisages that the aspirations and requirements of specific local areas, communities and situations are fully reflected in the Plan document.

With a view to providing appropriate planning machinery at the district level for formulating co-ordinated

development plans and overseeing the performance, Government constituted a District Planning and Development Council for each district.

Ensuring co-ordinated action by various implementing agencies, giving guidance in preparation and implementation of plans, approval of various district plans (subject to orders of the State Government), review of plan performance and making recommendations to the State Government and to consider and approve reappropriation of savings/ excesses within the approved District Annual Plan are the functions of the District Planning & Development Council.

The District Planning & Development Council is headed by the 'Palak Mantri' of the district as 'Chairman'. Other Ministers of the District and the Divisional Commissioner are Vice-Chairman and the Collector is the Member-Secretary. The members of the Council include all MPs, MLAs, MLCs, President/<sup>of</sup>ZP, Mayor one President each from 'A', 'B' & 'C' class municipal councils, Chairman of District central co-operative Bank, Chief Executive Officer Zilla Parishad, Director of Land Development Bank, nine non-official members etc. The council generally meets twice a year.

4.3 To assist the council in its day to day planning and development activities and Executive Committee is constituted at district level. The Chairman and Vice-Chairman of this committee are the same as that of the council. The Members-Secretary is, however, the District Planning Officer. The committee consists of some selected members from the council. The committee meets regularly for reviewing the plan performance and to suggest ways and means for effective implementation of the Plan schemes.

4.4 In this chapter a brief review of the Annual Plans 1978-79 & 1979-80 is taken.

In Pune District Scheduled Tribes are concentrated in Ambegaon, Junnar and Khed tahsils. Since the socio.econo-

mic situation of tribal communities varies from non-tribal communities, the Plan approach for tribal areas has to be distinct from the normal plan approach. In this district 56 villages from Ambegaon tahsil, 63 villages from Junnar tahsil and 21 villages from Khed tahsil are the tribal areas. Hence two separate plans one for the above mentioned tribal area and the other for the rest of the district - were formulated for implementation of various plan schemes. Besides, some Centrally Sponsored Schemes were implemented in the district during the reference period.

The following table gives the consolidated information about the budget and expenditure figures under the State Plan (Non-Tribal) and Tribal sub-plan for the year 1978-79, Fifth Five Year Plan period and for 1979-80.

From the above table it will be seen that the total expenditure of Rs. 3198.85 lakhs was incurred on State Plan schemes during the fifth plan period as against the budget provision of Rs. 3517.67 lakhs. Out of this, an amount of Rs. 130.88 lakhs was spent on schemes under Tribal Sub-plan.

The performance of State Plan (Non-Tribal), Tribal Sub-plan and centrally Sponsored Schemes during the years 1978-79 & 1979-80 is reviewed separately in the following paragraphs.

(A) State Plan Schemes ( Non-Tribal )

4.5 The following table shows the budget and expenditure figures under different major heads for the reference period under review.

From the data it is seen that the budget provisions were not fully utilised during the fifth plan period. The expenditure was, however, exceeded by about 10% in 1978-79 and 13% in 1979-80. A comparison of expenditure incurred under different major heads during the two annual plan periods - 1978-79 and 1979-80 reveals that there was an overall decrease in the expenditure during the year 79-80 in the case of

Agricultural programmes, co-operation and and Community Development, Transport & Communication and Social Services. This appears to be due to the fact that the plan priorities underwent some change with irrigation and power and Industry & Mining receiving more funds in 1979-80 than in the previous year and the other major heads receiving less amounts. Under Agril. programme in 1978-79, sizeable amounts were spent on Soil Conservation and D.P.A.P. as compared to 1979-80 and hence the expenditure in the previous year was more. Similarly in respect of co-operation, during the year 78-79, an amount of Rs. 33.75 lakhs was budgetted and spent on share capital contribution of sugar factories while in 1979-80 this scheme was not taken up. And hence there was sharp decline in the amount budgetted and spent on this head of development in 1979-80.

4.5.2 The following table gives the percentage distribution expenditure incurred on different major heads of development.

It is observed that the proportion of money expended on irrigation & Power and Industry & Mining shows an increasing trend. It is further observed that with 25%



of total expenditure on Social Services, this major head of development <sup>leads other major head of development</sup> in the percentage distribution of total expenditure and is followed by agricultural programme with 24% expenditure. This pattern of distribution of expenditure is found right from the Fifth Five Year Plan period upto 1978-80

#### Physical Achievements :-

4.6 The details of physical achievements under different schemes are given in table No.72 of Part II of this publication. However, a brief review of the important achievements under each sub-head of development is taken in the following paragraphs.

4.6.1 Agricultural Programme : - Agricultural Production, Soil Conservation, Animal husbandry, Minor Irrigation, D.P. A.P., Forest, Fishery and Warehousing are the programmes covered under the major heads of development agricultural programme.

4.6.1.(a) Agricultural Production :- The notable achievements under the schemes implemented under agricultural production were rat eradication programme in 12000 hectare area, (100% target achievement) and 475 groundnut crop demonstrations as against the target of 560. The scheme of integrated development for small farmers which was implemented at a cost of Rs. 4.49 lakhs in 1978-79 was not taken up in 1979-80. As a result, the total expenditure in 1979-80 on agricultural production was comparatively less.

b) Soil Conservation :- Nala bunding, afforestation for soil conservation were some of the programmes executed under soil conservation. In 1978-79, nala bunding was carried out in 1003 hectare, while in 1979-80, the area covered was considerably more (1419 hectare). However, under afforestation for soil conservation, pre-monsoon works were

undertaken only in 320 hectares in 1979-80 as against 397 in 1978-79. The set targets were however, achieved both the years with the target in 1979-80 exceeded by 50 hectares.

c) Minor Irrigation :- The achievements during 79-80 under this subhead include construction of 24 percolation Tanks, 4 bandharas, 130 subsidy cases for installation of Pumpsets and 44 subsidy cases for construction of irrigation wells. These achievements more comparatively better than those of 1978-79 during which only two percolation tanks and 5 bandharas were constructed besides the distribution of 54 persons for installation of pumpsets and to 64 persons for construction of irrigation wells.

d) Animal Husbandry :- Under this subhead the Major achievements during 1979-80 include the establishment of two mobile units for extension programme and organisation of 10 training camps in which 450 trainees participated.

e) D.P.A.P. :- This programme covers 110 villages from 9 tahsils of the district. Various schemes under soil conservation, Minor Irrigation, dry land farming, forest development, livestock, fishery development etc. are included in this programme. Total expenditure of Rs.194.73 lakhs in 1978-79 and Rs. 160.63 lakhs in 1979-80 was incurred on this programme. Out of this amount of Rs. 65.40 lakhs in 1978-79 and Rs. 49.42 lakhs in 1979-80 was spent on Minor Irrigation and Rs. 59.51 lakhs and Rs. 46.55 lakhs respectively on soil conservation and on water supply schemes, the expenditure was Rs. 21.12 lakhs and Rs. 11.28 lakhs in the respective years.

The important achievements under the D.P.A.P. are given in the following table.

Forest : New plantation, pasture development, development of minor forest produce etc. are the schemes implemented under this sub-head of development. The major expenditure under this head was under D.P.A.P.

#### 4.6.2 Co-operation & Community Development :

Additional share capital contribution to co-operative marketing societies, urban consumers co-operatives, distribution of consumer articles in rural areas etc. were the schemes implemented under co-operation and on which in 1978-79, the expenditure was to the tune of Rs. 42.01 lakh. This expenditure dropped down to only Rs. 5.35 lakhs in 1979-80.

because in the earlier year the scheme of share capital contribution to co-operative sugar factories was implemented at a cost of Rs. 38.76 lakhs. In 1979-80, 4 marketing societies and 4 urban consumer stores were assisted as against 9 and 4 respectively in the previous year.

The C.D. Programme has shrunk down considerably during the course of years and in 1978-79 only one scheme of Bhangi Mukti programme was executed at a cost of Rs. 14,000. In 1979-80 the scheme of Gram Safai programme was implemented by constructing 357 latrines at a cost of Rs. 10,000.

4.6.3 Irrigation and Power :- Two medium irrigation projects one at Vadiwale and another at Nazare were in progress during the reference years. At the end of 1979-80, the work of Nazare project was almost completed.

Under the scheme of rural electrification 5 villages were electrified in 1978-79 and 7 in the subsequent year. The No. of agricultural pumps energised was 1294 and 1660 respectively.

Industry and Labour :- Under the scheme of Seed Money assistance to educated unemployed, there were 435 beneficiaries in 1978-79 and 399 in 1979-80 under the scheme of financial assistance to S.S.I. under S.A.I. Rules, 35 industries benefitted in 1978-79, while this number was 27 in 1979-80. In addition in 1979-80, the Industrial Estate at Lonawala was given Share Capital assistance to the tune of Rs. 3.17 lakhs.

(vi) Transport & Communication : Under the crash scheme of road development about 94 km. of roads were constructed in 78-79, while at the end of 1979-80 about 462 km. road length was constructed under this scheme. In addition 104 C.D.

works were completed under this scheme in 1978-79 while at the end of 1979-80 number was 617.

**Social Services :-**

4.6.7 The programmes under social services assume special importance for uplift of the community.

a) General Education :- Under this sub-head 40 schemes were undertaken in 1978-79 and 32 in 1979-80. The notable achievements under these schemes were as under :

Number of class rooms constructed was 36 in 1978-79 as against 102 in 1979-80. Under the scheme of development and expansion of non sub-secondary schools, the achievement was 808 classes in 1978-79 and 270 in 1979-80. In addition various schemes such as UNICEF aided programme, training of the science teachers for implementing NCERT syllabus etc. were implemented.

b) Health and water supply :- The major achievements under this sub-head were construction of 67 tube wells in 1978-79 and 202 in 1979-80 and provisions of piped water supply ( 5 schemes in 1978-79 and 18 in 1979-80 ). However, in terms of money spent the scheme of Govt. water supply stand first (Rs. 76 lakhs expenditure in 1978-79 and Rs. 56 lakh in 1979-80) under P.H. programme 6 public health centres in 1978-79 and 9 in 1979-80 were covered under the scheme of public Health Centres, sub-centres / Rural Hospitals construction works.

Housing : Under the scheme of housing, major expenditure was incurred on providing amenities to slum areas and for giving assistance to landless labourers for construction of houses. The total expenditure incurred in the reference years was Rs. 31.52 lakhs and Rs. 73.21 lakhs respectively.

d) Urban Development :- Under this sub-head financial assistance to municipal councils for implementation of their development plans is granted. Such assistance was granted to five Municipal councils in 1978-79 and six in 1979-80.

e) Labor and Labour welfare:- Under this development head the scheme of establishment of advanced vocational training system at I.T.I., Aundh was implemented in both the years. In 1978-79 staff was appointed and in 1979-80 equipment was purchased. Besides this, 3 new industrial centres were opened in 1978-79 while in 1979-80 the scheme of construction of hostel building and staff quarters was implemented at a cost of Rs. 8.86 lakhs.

f) Welfare of B.Cs. :- Total expenditure of Rs. 28.30 lakhs in 1978-79 and Rs. 18.96 lakhs in 1979-80 was incurred on various schemes for B.C. welfare. The schemes related to grant of scholarships to B.C. students studying in different courses, opening and maintenance of Ashram shalas run by voluntary agencies, financial assistance to co-operative housing societies of B.Cs. etc.

g) Social Welfare :- The schemes under social welfare arrived at giving financial assistance to voluntary welfare institutions for physically handicapped, rehabilitation of lepers etc. The total expenditure during 1978-79 was Rs. 4.99 lakhs and in 1979-80 Rs. 3.24 lakhs.

4.6.8. Miscellaneous Programme :- Only 2 schemes viz. Information and publicity and E.G.S. were implemented under this programme. The expenditure incurred on E.G.S. works was to the tune of Rs. 226.84 lakhs in 1978-79 and Rs. 309.03 lakhs in 1979-80. During 1978-79 and 1979-80, the No. of E.G.S. works undertaken was 877 and 362 respectively.

(B) Tribal Sub - Plan :-

4.7 The Tribal Sub-Plan of Pune district covers 140 villages from Khed, Junnar and Ambegaon Tahsils. A separate tribal plan is being prepared from the year 1975-76. In the first year i.e. 1975-76 an expenditure of Rs. 17.05 lakhs was incurred. Since then the amount of expenditure incurred under Tribal Sub-Plan has rapidly increased every year ( excepting 1979-80 ) as is indicated in the following table.

The expenditure in 1979-80 was comparatively less for reasons such as less provision and expenditure on road development, non-utilisation of budget grants sanctioned for the scheme of Ashram shalas complex because the work of land acquisition was in progress etc.

Physical Achievements :-

4.8 The physical achievements of different schemes implemented in Tribal Sub-Plan are given separately in table no. 72 B of Part II of this publication.

(C) Centrally Sponsored Schemes :-

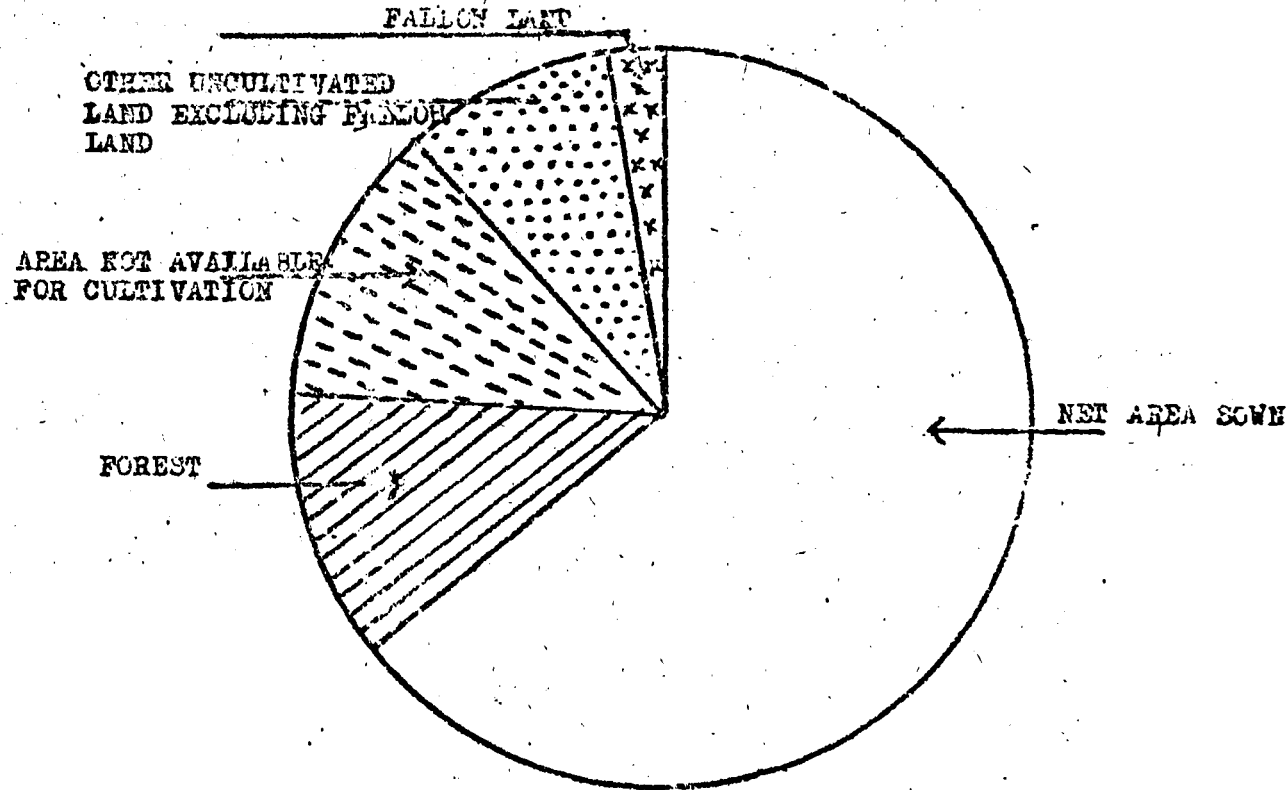
4.9 Besides the state Plan schemes, some Centrally Sponsored Schemes were implemented under the heads - Agricultural programme, Industry & Mining and Social Services. Out of the total expenditure of Rs. 50.23 lakhs incurred in 1978-79, the share of social services was as big as Rs. 45.32

Lakhs. In 1979-80, various schemes were undertaken under agriculture including new schemes under C.A.D.A. on which expenditure of Rs. 3.30 lakhs was done. The expenditure under forest however decreased from Rs. 24,000 in 1978-79 to Rs. 9,000 in 1979-80. The expenditure under Social Services come down to Rs. 25.55 lakhs in 79-80. In 78-79, the expenditure on Social Services was mainly on the implementation of medical and health programme like family welfare programme cholera control etc. Under Family Welfare Programme 6,860 sterilisation operations were done in 1978-79. Water supply schemes were given priority under Social Services in 1979-80 and 3 accelerated Rural Piped Water Supply Schemes were completed at a cost of Rs. 20.83 lakhs.

# LAND UTILISATION IN PUNE DISTRICT. 1978-79

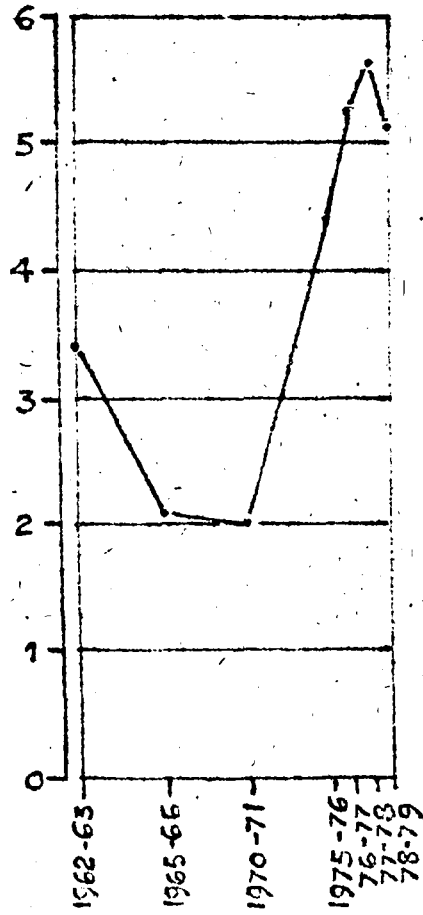


# FOODGRAINS PRODUCTION

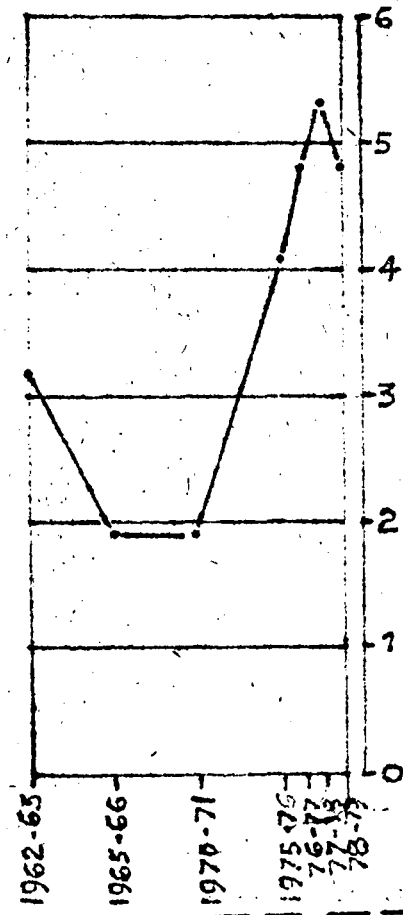
