Chapter-I.

I N T R O D U C T O R Y .

1.1 Location and Boundaries.

Area of Sholapur district as recognised at present, lies between latitudes 17 to 19 degrees and longitudes 75 to 77 degrees on the South-east border of Maharashtra-State. As for its surroundings, it is seen that Mysore-state is situated on the South-east; and the South. The entire Western Border of the district with a portion in the South is surrounded by Sangli, SATARA, Poona and Ahmednagar districts. On the North and North-east border lies Osmanabad district. Actually, a portion of this district (mostly of Barsi taluka in the North-east) is hemmed by Osmanabad district.

Sholapur city, the district Head-quarters is at a distance of about 450 Kms from Bombay-the State Head-Quarters on the main rail-link of Central Railway connecting Bombay and Madras. Poona, the Divisional Head-quarter is also on the same link between Sholapur and Bombay and is at a distance of about 260 Kms from Sholapur.

Shape of Sholapur district resembles a flying eagle. By expanse, the distances between the North-South and the East-West borders are even at around 165 Kms. These distances incidentally, are also identified by Rail-links. Main line of Central Railway connecting Bombay-Madras, connects North-west and South-east regions. The other narrow gauge line of Central Railway, connecting Latur-Miraj; links between North-east and South west regions of the district.

1.2. Area

Area of Sholapur district is a little over 15000 Sq.Kms. and is evidently third largest district in Poona division. The district consists of eleven talukas. Talukas North Sholapur, South Sholapur, Mohol, Madha, and Pandharpur are located in the Central Region. Talukas Malsiras, Karmala and Barsi cover up the Northern portion of the district from East to West. The remaining talukas Sangola, Mangalwedha and Akkalkot cover up the Southern region from East to West. Sholapur-city is located in North Sholapur taluka and it also forms taluka Head-quarters for both the talukas of North and South Sholapur. Amongst eleven talukas, Barsi is biggest by area (about 1630 Sq. Kms.) and on the other extreme is North- Sholapur (about 735 Sq.Kms) taluka.

1.3 Topography...Hills, River-system and Soil.

Area of Sholapur district situates on the eastern side of the main Sahyadri-range and most of it is at an even elevation of about 600 meters from mean Sea-level, except a few hilly portions in Karmala and Barsi talukas. Nonetheless, the area forms basins of rivers Bhima and her tributories, who rise outside the district and flow through the district. There are no hills in this district, and the hilly tracts in Karmala or Barsi talukas are not of any significant dimensions to cause the rise of rivers.

Bhima is main river passing through this district which is herself a main tributary to river Krishna. River Bhima flows from Poona district and passes through Malsiras, Madha, Pandharpur and South Sholapur talukas with the long course of about 285 kilometers in this district.

Pandharpur city- Vansadi of the South- is situated on the winding banks of this river at about 70 kilometers from Sholapur.

Near a feeder of Bhima, after her course of nearly 48 kilometers in this district in Malsiras and Madha talukas, falls in Bhima near Tembhorni (Madha taluka).

Man, another feeder coming from Satara district enters this district via Sangola taluka to meet Bhima near Pandharpur. Her course in the district is about 80 kilometers.

Seena is another feeder coming from Ahmednagar district to join Bhima near Sholapur. Sina has a course of 160 kilometers in this district through Yarmala, Madha, Mohol and South-Sholapur talukas.

Bhogawati is yet another feeder to Seena originating from Balaghat ranges near Barsi. After a course of about 65 kilometers through Barsi and Madha talukas of this district, she meets Seena near Mohol.

It can thus be observed that water courses of the tributaries in the district in aggregate run a distance of nearly 650 kilometers. However, most of these are not perennial for all the seasons of the year. In summers most of them drop down to ankle-deep waters to become fordable.

Soil in Sholapur district is essentially derived from volcano trap and is sedentary except deposits near river-banks. The soils in the district can be classified in three major groups viz. Coarse grey or brown (known as Barad); Red or reddish black soils, and Black or medium black soils.

Barad soils are observed on hill-slopes and are subject to continuous erosion. They are quite shallow and stoney, and can support inferior millets only.

Red or Reddish black soils are available on hill-tops and ridges. But they are not common. These soils are also subject to erosion. At places, they have been observed to support garden crops well.

Black soils are observed in Mangalwedha and some parts of South Sholapur talukas. They are fertile. In the rest of the district the soils are light and medium type. Region in river valleys of Phima Mira, Seena, and Man are rich in medium-black soils.

1.4. Historical Back-ground ... territorial changes.

As the name suggests, 'Sholapur' could have been an abode of sixteen villages. History of this City and nearby region cannot be traced earlier than third or fourth Century i.e about the period of Andhrabhritya dynasty. From the annals of History thereafter, it appears that Sholapur and nearby region sustained various rules of Afghans, Moghuls, Adilshahi and Bahamani. It came under Maratha rulership during eighteenth century. During major part of subsequent centuries; this district which was formed in 1838 A.D., underwent accessional changes by addition or deletion of some enclave villages from nearby district. The present constitution of the district is unchanged since the year 1956.

1.5. Administrative Set-up.

After inauguration of Zilla Parishads and Taluka Panchayat Samitees under the auspices of the Panchayati Raj; since May, 1962, the administrative set-up at district level has become dual. Development activities mainly concerning within district operations have been consolidated and transferred to Zilla Parishad whose Executive head is the Chief Executive Officer. Under Government sector, Collector assumes the Coordinating authority.

Brief mention of different administrative heads under State Govt. and Central Govt. has been given here. The Collector is the district head for law and order. He is assisted in this purpose in the mofussil area of the district by Prant officers at Sholapur; Pandharpur and Yurdwadi and Taluka Mamlatdars. The District Superintendent of Police heads the Police force in the district. He is assisted by Deputies at Sholapur and Pandharpur. There are two Divisional level. Soil Conservation officers at Sholapur and Pandharpur (who are supervising the Soil Conservation activities) under Agril. Deptt. The Malaria Eradication programme in the district is administered by the Malaria Officer at Pandharpur. At Sholapur there are also the offices of sub-Regional Employment Exchange, Govt. Milk-distribution scheme, (Dairy Development Deptt.) Factory Inspector and Labour officer, Executive Engineers, under B & C Deptt. and Public Health Deptt.; District Deputy Registrar (looking after entire programmes of Co-operative Deptt.); Civil Surgeon (for state sector medical services) and lastly the Law and Judiciary Deptt. is represented by the District Judge with his associates at district and taluka-levels.

As regards the administrative set up under local sector Special feature in the year 1964-65 is the upgradation of the Sholapur Municipality into that of a Corporation. The executive head of this Corporation is the Municipal Commissioner. There are other departments as Administration, Finance, Works, Water supply, health, transport-in the Corporation, each headed by concerned officers in charge. The Sholapur Municipal School Board, besides the aforesaid departments, functions independently under the Administrative officer. However, this Board is financed to some extent from the funds of the Corporation.

Other local bodies consist of Zilla -Parishad, and their taluka level Panchayat Samitis. The set up has been inaugurated since 1962 and has been well known. There are nine Municipalities in this district of which those at Barsi and Pandharpur are city Municipalities.

At village level, the local bodies of village panchayats functioning as at end of March, 1965 were in all, 759 in the district, covering all inhabited villages 946.

There are Govt. institutions of Northpoie Technical High School and the Polytechnique.

Under Central Govt. sector there are Divisional Offices of the post and Telegraph Deptt.; Central Railways. There is also the office of Superintendant of Central Excise.

1.6. Climate Temperature and Rain fall.

Climatic conditions in the district are similar at different places due to even altitude. Climate is dry and healthy. In Summers however, it is quite hot and touches sometimes as high as 112°F in temperature. There are also appreciating dust-storms and hot winds. In winters, the weather is fine and amicable. It does not particularly reach low temperatures to cause stinging cold. During the calendar years 1963 and 1964, the temperature recordings at Sholapur and Tur Stations indicate that variations during the year 1964 were more than the previous year. Especially at Tur, they were significant in year 1964 (viz 41.4°C in May, 1964 and 10.9°C in December, 1964).

Rainfall in Sholapur district is not even and regular as we observe on the western side of the Sahayadri-Ranges. On many occasions it leads to scarcity and famine conditions. Normal rainfall experienced in the district is around 625 m.m.s. In hilly regions it also occurs upto 750 m.m.s. However, incidence of rains is left to the vagaries of Nature. In the years 1963 and 1964 rainfall was uneven in different parts of the district both by frequency and by the intensity. In table No.1.1 below rainfall (in M.m.s) as occurred in main monsoon seasons (June to October; five months) is given centrewise. Alongwith rainfall, rainy days are also shown for easy comparison.

We can observe from these contents that rainfall in the year 1964 was much better in the district than the previous year. However, even in these two years, incidence is not even at all centres. Barsi, Pandharpur, Sholapur and Akkalkot had good rainfall in the year 1963 while in the subsequent year much better rainfall is observed in Madha, Mohol and Sangola in addition to the four centres in the year 1963. Differentials in rainfall from above data can also be viewed from criterion of intensity. Intensity of rainfall (taken as average rainfall per rainy day in the season of five months) was 12 for the district in the year 1963

which rose to 18 in the next year. Centrewise intensity-figures for the year 1963 vary widely as compared with the one for the district. At centres Mangalwedha and Pandharpur it was high around 18, while it was low around 6 at Karmala and Mohol. These intensities look modulated in the year 1964; as compared with district average of 18. At all centres, they were generally higher than in the previous year. At centres Barsi, Mangalwedha, Sangola and Madha these intensities were near to 24. Intensity was least at Mohol, while at other centres it was close to the district average 18.

Rainfall figures can also be edited for the same period of five months taken as above, monthwise; for the aggregate of all the centres which would also indicate its periodicity. Contents in following Table 1.2 show these figures.

It can be observed from these contents that rainfall in the year 1963 was quantamised in the months June and August and it was intense in the months June and October. In the subsequent year, incidence is plainly quantamised and itemsified in the months July and Sept.

Centrewise and monthwise details of Rainfall and Temperature recording are given in Tables 1.1 and 1.2 in the appended part-II-A of the District Abstract.

The rainfall in other seasons such as pre-monsoon winter or Summer is very scanty in the district. It has therefore, not been discussed at length.

1.7 Scarcity Areas

Uneven and scanty rainfall in Sholapur district often leads to scarcity and famine conditions. These conditions have been traced since fifteenth Century. It has been estimated that about 85 percent of area in the district is famine or scarcity affected. This proportion is highest in the state. In talukas Sangola and Barmala the conditions are often most severe. Position is somewhat better in other talukas. In the reference period there were however no incidences of scarcity or famine in the district.

THE THIRD FIVE YEAR PLAN (DIST. LEVEL) IN SHOLAPUR

DISTRICT (YEAR 1964-65)

1. General Introduction:

1.1 As it has been well-known, implementation of the Third Five Year Plan in Maharashtra is identified from three different types of schemes taken up, i.e. state-level, Division-level and District-level. This Review envisages to discuss the Plan implementation of District level schemes pertaining to Sholapur district with particular reference upto year 1964-65.

1.2 In the beginning of the third plan the District level schemes proposed to be implemented in Sholapur district were in all seventy-eight, with provision of Rs. 839.67 lakhs. However, after the mid-term appraisal of Plan performance from Govt. level, the said provision has been revised to Rs. 888.53 lakhs to implement seventy-three schemes. Thus, though the number of schemes to go with, in the said period have been reduced by five; there has been a purposeful increase in the outlay by about six percent, for this district.

1.3 The mid-term appraisal of the Third plan has effected a substantial rise in the Division level aggregate of the component District level outlays in Poona division, from about Rs. 40.4 crores to about Rs. 44.5 crores. This increase, which is about 10 percent is well above the increase realised for Sholapur district. Nonetheless the remarking from this point of view placement of Sholapur district in Poona division has remained unaffected by position

(i.e second in the Division, next to Poona district) in this variation though in size by percentage allocation to the one in Poona Division it has slightly reduced from about 20.7 to nearly 20 percent.

1.4 Considering population enumerated in 1961 Census the per-capita outlay in the third plan for Sholapur district comes to Rs. 48, and this is well above the per-capita outlay worked out for corresponding divisional aggregated which comes to about Rs.43.(This gap in the per-capita provisional can perhaps be justified for Sholapur district which has to face draught and scarcity conditions quite often than any other district in Poona Division).

1.5 The total expenditure in the period of second Five Year Plan was Rs.679.09 lakhs. Even with the consideration that full provision available for the second Plan is represented by this expenditure, we can compare this with the revised outlay of the Third Five Year Plan for Sholapur district, which is Rs.888.53 lakhs. With the basis of 1961 census population in Sholapur district, the per-capita expenditure in second Plan works out to Rs. 37, thus showing that in Third Five Year Plan, the per-capita provision in Sholapur district has increased roughly by about 30 percent than the one worked out in the Second Five Year Plan.

2. Classified and Sectorial Features :

2.1 The District Plan-outlay (Rs.888.53 lakhs) of Sholapur district is broadly classified in five major heads viz. Agricultural Programmes (total 31 schemes with outlay of Rs. 479.89 lakhs) Co-operation & Community Development (total 10 schemes with outlay of Rs.150.24 lakhs); Industry and Mining (total 2 schemes with outlay of Rs.23.26 lakhs) Transport and Communications (total 3 schemes with outlay of Rs.84.80 lakhs) and Social services with total 27 schemes in outlay of Rs. 150.34 lakhs. These details

are interesting when compared in percent distribution with those of Divisional aggregate for Poona division as given in Table-I

below:-

The contents in above Table spell out that Sholapur district Plan located in classified Heads of Agricultural Programmes and Industry has received more emphasis than in the general picture seen in the division. (This appears commensurate with the observation made earlier about the characteristics of Sholapur district). This has entailed of course, less proportion in remaining Heads of development in Sholapur district, plan. In particular, the outlay under Head of Social services is appreciably low than the corresponding proportion obtained in the Divisional aggregate.

2.2 After advent of Panchayati Raj in Maharashtra state, since May, 1962, the Plan implementation has undergone on administrative split-up in the 'State sector' and in the Local sector' The latter signifies the schemes implemented by the Zilla Parishad while the former, those retained for implementation by Govt.

As an exception, there are also some schemes, such as T & C -6 under Transport and Communications, AGR-24, AGR-31, AGR-32 and MIN-7 under Agricultural Programmes, which are implemented by both the sectors. However such schemes are few and with overall consideration the district plan provision to the extent of Rs.584.94 (about 66% of total) has been retained in the State sector, while the remaining has been transferred to Zilla Parishad. The outlay of the district plan retained by State sector has been mostly represented by the two Heads of Development viz. Agricultural Programmes and Industry and Mining. Amongst the remaining Heads, outlay shared by the local sector is quite significant in the two Heads of development viz. Co-operation and Community Development, and Transport and Communications.

3. Expenditure Progress:

3.1 Details of expenditure progress in the period 1961-65 are given schemewise in the District Statistical Abstract, Table No. 11.1. It is evident therefrom, that the total expenditure in the four years for the whole district is 72% of the Plan-provision and this achievement is more or less equal in both the sector, around 72% considering the total of expenditures under all heads. It can be seen that the overall achievement in expenditure is a little less to the expected proportion at the end of the year 1964-65, viz. 80%.

3.2 It can also be observed that the steady progress of expenditure for years 1961-62 and 1962-63 has been hampered in the year 1963-64 but again in the year 1964-65 the position has improved particularly in the local sector. Progress of expenditure in percent to total plan provisions allocated in two sectors is given in Table below:-

3.3 Though the total expenditure as seen above looks sizable the break up of it when seen in different classes and compared with plan provision therein, widely fluctuates between 63% (Transport and Communication) to 154% (Industry and Mining). Even for the Heads of Agricultural Programmes and Social services, the achievement is low, below 70%. The performance by local sector for schemes under Agricultural programmes the expenditure even after the four years of plan is just close to about 50% of the allocated plan provision. In state-sector, too, the expenditure achievement is quite poor in head of Transport and Communications.

3.4 One general reason for the shortfall in expenditure appears to be paucity of required implementing staff (Technical) and late sanctions during the year 1963-64. The situation has somewhat improved in the year 1964-65. Nonetheless, even at the end of the year 1964-65 there were as many as forty five schemes under District Plan, wherein the expenditure incurred was not above 50% of the allocated plan provision. Amongst these schemes twenty-nine schemes were implemented through state-sector and the remaining, through the local sector.

. It can be seen from those details that actually twenty one schemes considered separately seventeen for S-state sector and four for local sector) have not been implemented in this district at all. The Plan provision, utilised in these schemes is sizeable, to the extent of about Rs.25.4 lakhs. However this extent as compared with the district plan provision is low at about 4% and this proportion is even at 4% with in state and local sectors, considered separately. Some important schemes featured in this category are discussed briefly as under:-

(i) In local sector, the scheme (MN-7) with plan provision of Rs. 10.00 lakhs could not go ahead simply for want of preliminary technical preparations of Plans and estimates etc. as requisite independent staff was not available, so also for the reason that the changeover to local sector was slow.

(ii) For scheme (MN-1) in local sector expenditure could not be incurred for want of administrative sanctions.

(iii) In S-state sector the scheme-MN-6 of lift Irrigation through co-operative Societies could not go ahead for want of suitable societies and adequate response from people concerned.

(iv) The case of scheme No. TD-1, in state Sector, is rather special in the sense that the venue of the cottage-hospital stands undecided.

(v) In case of schemes for housing (350-1 and 350-5) the expenditure has not incurred in state sector till year ending March, 1965 for want of proper response from interested parties.

(vi) It is also important to note here that schemes under Fisheries (FSV-2, 10 and 24) could not go on through under state sector, for obvious reasons of lack in Cholarur district. This reason of district location of implementing officers is also true to some extent for non-implementation of other schemes in this district, viz. AFD-27 AFD-31 under state sector.

3.5 Leaving the plan provision remarked in the schemes not implemented till the end of year 1964-65 as discussed in part-3.4 above, the provision located in all other schemes which even after their implementation during the first four years of the plan period have not been able to achieve expenditure target above 50%, comes to Rs.119.5 lakhs of which Rs.39.5 lakhs are located in Local sector and the amount of Rs.80 lakhs in state sector. It can thus be said that about 13% of total district plan provision was not sufficiently mobilised leaving aside the extent of stagnation (about as observed earlier). Some important schemes featuring in this category are discussed briefly below:-

(1) Under the Major Head of Agricultural programmes the scheme MIN-7, MM-5, MO-11 and 12(Co-opve.Farming) MI-3(A), MI-11 coming under state sector have not registered adequate progress. With exception of the scheme MIN-7, the rest were being implemented through co-operative Deptt. The reason for short fall for the schemes under Co-operative Deptt. appears to be non-response from concerned parties to take up financial advantages under these schemes fulfilling the requisite conditions. The reason for short fall in the scheme MIN-7, is inadequate attention over the follow-up of programmes for want of separate staff. Only at the fag-end of the year 1964-65

a full-fladged Irrigation Division for this district has been commissioned. For another scheme under state sector in the major head of Transport and Communications, (T & C-6), the reason for slow progress is reported as delay in technical sanctions about road-programmes.

(ii) In local sector the schemes under Agricultural programmes. AGR-21 AGR-24 AGR-33 AM-7, have been implemented in late i.e during the year 1963-64 or in the year 1964-65 and hence the slow progress of expenditure. Specially the scheme T & C-10(District Roads) which has been totally allocated to Gilla Parishad after the 1962-62 in this district has staggered in progress in the period 1962-65, the reason reported is inadequate technical staff for active follow-up

(iii) The reasons for inadequate staff are also reported in cases of local sector schemes under major head of Social services (e.g. scheme CE-6, CE-8, FH-8 and HSC-4.)

3.6 It can thus be observed that about 18% of the district plan outlay was not properly mobilised for implementation during the first four years of plan period in general either due to late sanctions for implementation or due to lack of requisite personnel for manning the implementations. Particularly, the number of schemes involved look more in proportion to the total schemes in the district(viz. about 60%). Even then, the overall expenditure progress under district plan is close to 70% of total provision for the obvious reason that some selected schemes have been followed up with special attention. An account of these selected schemes is given in the next articles

Progress of selected schemes:

4.1 The scheme CONS-1, (Counterbundling) implemented by State-sector is singled out from all other schemes due to its huge provision (Rs.313-54 lakhs). The implementation is done by two Divisions. One at Sholapur and the other at Pandharpur, in this district. During the period 1961-65, 4.55 lakh acres have been brought under bundling with expenditure of Rs.240.75 lakhs. A remarkable progress is also achieved under the scheme ACR-36 (Estt of Tajuk seed forms), where 88% of plan provision have been spent in the period 1961-65. All talukas in this district have now been covered under this scheme. Attention should also be made of the scheme ACR-34 (Intensive cultivation) implemented by local sector. During the years 1963-64 and 1964-65 the scheme has registered remarkable progress covering all the talukas in this district under Kharif and Rabi Campaigns. Expenditure has actually exceeded allocated plan-provision by about 50%. During the year 1964-65, about 16.98 lakh acres have been covered in this district under this scheme.

4.2 Some schemes implemented by Co-operative Deptt. (State sector) WM-1 (Development of Marketing), CO-3 (Development of Cooperatives), SSI-11 (Handicrafts and others) SSI-12 (Handlooms) have achieved full financial targets, (over and above the plan provision in case of SSI-11 under the scheme SSI-12 is mainly due to 'Pilot Programme' undertaken by the All India Handloom Board in this district since year 1963-64.

4.3 The scheme of Community Development (CD-1) implemented by local sector is significant due to its Plan Provision (Rs. 126.76 lakhs) which is next highest in all the schemes of this district. All talukas in this district have been covered under CD programmes in the reference period and the expenditure incurred is sizeable to about 90% of the Plan provision. Progress both by expenditure and physical achievements, during the year 1964-65 was satisfactory with 'A' class for almost all C.D. Blocks in the district.

4.4 Full targets have achieved under the schemes TE-4 and TE-5 (Estt. of polytechnic-State sector). Excess expenditure under this schemes has been adjusted against spill-over provision from previous Plan. Similarly the scheme TAB-1 (Estt. of Industrial Training Institute) has also registered good progress. By end of the year 1964-65, the Institute had achieved the target of Plan period (244 students for different trades).

4.5 Rational malaria eradication programme (scheme TE-2, State sector) has been progressing as per schedule. By end of the year 1964-65 the final stage of 'SURVEILLANCE PHASE' has been reached in the whole district.

4.6 Village well water supply scheme (no. 13-5) under local sector has been progressing ahead of schedule. 90% of expenditure target has been achieved by the end of the year 1964-65. Full coverage of targets (40 wells) is done of which 60% is actually achieved till end of year 1964-65.

4.7 ^{Income} Low/group Housing scheme (HSG-2) under State-sector has achieved full targets during the year 1964-65. 'Shivaji Nagar' colony near Sholapur has been build up under this scheme (with 132 tenaments).

4.8 Mention has to be made about the schemes MN-1 and MN-2

at conclusion of this account because of the peculiar situation in
concerned under state. The schemes are
administrations/proposed in third plan for spill over works of
irrigation-wells and installation of pumping sets from second plan.
The amount provided under both these schemes (Rs. 69.75 lakhs) was
initially meant to disburse the subsidy on Govt. account for complete
works but for this disbursement, the inspecting agency for completed
works was vested in local sector (T.E. and Block level officials)
while agency for passing this subsidy after completion of work was
vested, for sometime, in Revenue Deptt. and later the State sector
in the Soil Conservation office, and actual disbursing authority
was vested in the Land Development Bank. This involvement probably
ultimated in the staggering of the purpose, due to once reason of
other in different administrations. Till end of year 1964-65 only
about 50% of this provision has been spent. However, this matter
has been receiving attention and full provision is proposed to be
used before end of Plan. During the period 1964-65, the Land Develop-
ment Bank in this district has achieved financial targets, (with
separate yearly programmes to give loans to agriculturists for
construction of well and for installation of pumping sets) to the
extents of construction of 4,431 wells and installation of 1,838
pumping sets.

5. Resume of expenditure with
reference to Excess or savings:

5.11 At the conclusion of this chapter, one can take an overall
review of District Plan performance discussed in earlier portions,
by taking a stock of excess or savings in respective plan provisions,
seen at the end of year 1964-65. This discussion has been restricted
to the level of main heads of Development

figures

5.2 It has been already seen earlier in discussion of the expenditure progress that about Rs.2.4 crores remain to be spent in the year 1965-66 out of total district Plan-provision. Of this amount, about Rs.1.6 crores are located in State sector and the remaining in local sector. Proportionally, these amounts are about 28 percentage of the available Plan-provision, Excepting heads of Development 'Industry and Mining' and Social Services (both in State-sector), the expenditures upto end of the year 1964-65 indicate savings in all other heads and in both the sectors.

5.3 Break up of savings and excess in different Heads and in both the sectors can be viewed in forms of percentages of two types as under:-

(I) The savings or excess in comparison with the available plan-provision under concerned Head of Development and in concerned sector.

(II) The savings or excess/ⁱⁿ comparison with the available plan provisions under concerned sector as a whole.

Table(III) below gives this break-up, Headwise and sectorwise in percentage forms (I) and (II) discussed above.

It can be seen from contents in Table -III that excess have been so only in state-sector and mostly due to schemes like SSI-12, IAP-5, where the earmarked expenditure has actually exceeded State-provision only in view of the anticipated central share to a sizeable extent. In most of the other cases savings vary widely from -68% (State sector: Transport and Communications) to +9% (Local sector: Co-operation and C.D.) considering amounts located in different Heads for the two sectors separately (ratios:II), it can be seen that savings are more in Agricultural Programmes (State sector) and in Social services, (Local sector), however, with the tempo attained in the year 1964-65, it is felt that full plan provision will be utilised by end of March, 1966.

EXPLANATORY

Preamble:

In the foregoing chapter-I, important features of the district have been introduced. In this chapter we intend to broadly explain the Statistical data contained in part-II(A), further cast in thirteen sections. This is an explanatory note which is restricted to give the nature of data expressed, point out highlights of some data and show its limitations.

2.1. Climate and Temperature:

Data for calendar years 1963 and 1964 is given in first section of part-II(A). Table 1.1 gives rain fall data at selected ten centres of the district. It is obtained from Agriculture Deptt. and Revenue offices in the district. Table 1.2 gives climate-particulars, that is the temperature recordings at two centres Sholapur and Jeur in the district.

2.2. Area and Population:

There are seven Tables (2.1 to 2.7) in second section of part-II(A). Data in these tables express particulars of Area and population of Sholarur district. Much of it has been taken from compilations for District Census Hand Book (1961) and allied census publications. Table 2.1 gives population variation (1951-61) in the district. Talukawise classifications of towns and villages, as per population ranges are given in Tables 2.2 and 2.3. Classification

of working population (defined as economically active as per 1961-census definition) is provided in Table 2.4. Next Table 2.5 provides supplementary information-viz. of Non-workers in the district. Next Table 2.6 shows the location (rural/urban) of S.C. and S.T. population in the district. This data relates to selected classes of S.C. and S.T. population as defined in the 1961-census. In last Table 2.7, particulars of urban areas (as defined in 1961-census) are provided. It can be seen that out of eleven talukas of the district, talukas Mohol and Malsiras do not contain any urban area.

2.3. Agriculture:

In third section of part-II(A) eleven tables 3.1 to 3.11 express data on Agriculture for this district. Data on Land utilisation (Table 3.1); Crop-wise areas in different talukas (Table 3.2) Yield & out-turn on principal crops (Table 3.3) and irrigated areas by source and ^{by} crops (Tables 3.4 and 3.5) relate to years 1962-64. Particulars are obtained from finalised 'Annual Season and crop Reports' of this district from State Deptt. of Agriculture. It can be incidentally observed that main crop of Sholapur district is Jowar accounting for about 65 percent of area under crops (Table 3.2). As regards irrigation, main source is wells (Table 3.4). Tables 3.6(a) to 3.6(c) express further particulars relevant with irrigation in the district. Irrigation wells in the district (Table 3.6(a)) have increased in the year 1963-64 by about 500 and mostly in Parmala taluka. Tables 3.6(b) and 3.6(c) show particulars of irrigation works in the district. Data in Table 3.7 is based on twenty percent Sample households enumerated in 1961 census and gives pattern of cultivating households by sizes of holdings. It can be seen that the cultivating households (having land owned or from Govt.) were more than in other types.

Further in these households, those associated with holdings of sizes 5 to 7.4 hectares, 10 to 12.4 hectares and 15 to 29.9 hectares accounted for over sixty percent of the total households in the group. Agricultural wage rates for calendar years 1964-65 are edited in Table 3.7 Data relates to selected centres Mandrup, Vairag and Modnimb. These wage rates are being collected by the District Statistical office on fortnightly basis and the Table gives data by monthly averages. Data in Table 3.9 on Agricultural implements is abstracted from ninth Livestock census (1961) compilation. It can be noted here that proportion of iron plough in the district is more in talukas situated in the North of the district. Progress of soil Conservation programme can be traced in this district since 1940s. Till end of year 1964-65 about 3 lakh hectares of area have been bunded (Table 3.11). Data in Table 3.11 is collected from Divisional office at Sholapur and Pandharpur.

2.4 Animal Husbandry, Forests and Fisheries:

The fourth section in part-II(A) comprises of eight Tables (4.1 to 4.8). Out of them Tables 4.1 and 4.2 give data on livestock in this district which is obtained from Census data 1956/1961. Tables 4.3 to 4.5 give veterinary statistics relating to aids to livestock, incidences of attacks and deaths, and slaughter houses and slaughters in the district. Data in all these three Tables is obtained from Animal Husbandry Deptt. Particulars of Forest areas *visa vis* their produce are given in Tables 4.6 and 4.7. The Forest areas (Table 4.6) differ from those given earlier in Table 3.1 as sources are different and the areas indicated in Table 4.6 are under Forest department. There are two Forest ranges in the district viz. Barsi and Malsiras.

It can be seen (Table 4.6) that, in the reference years some portion of Malsiras Forest range was not classified. Activities of Fisheries under cooperative fold are given in Table 4.8.

2.5 Employment, Industry, Mining & Electricity:

In this fifth section of part-II(A), there are twelve tables 5.1 to 5.12. Data on Factory Statistics (by type of production) is given in Tables 5.1 to 5.3, with further classification of labourers employed, days worked in the year. Data relates to years 1963 and 1964. It can be seen that bulk of Factory employment in Sholapur district is in Textiles-sector. Data on selected industrial production (items subject to central excise) is given in Table 5.4. Main production is mill made cotton cloth and yarn. There is no mineral production in the district. Particulars of production and employment under Handlooms and powerlooms for reference years is from the office of the Dy. Registrar, Coopve. Societies at Sholapur (Table 5.5). These looms are mostly concentrated in North Sholapur taluka. Data on Employment (Table 5.6) is relating to activities of Sub-regional employment exchange at Sholapur. The next Table (5.7) shows break-up Registration by occupation by the same office. In table 5.8 volume of employment by industry for quarter ending March, 1965 is based on reports of about 900 establishments covered by the Sub-Regional employment exchange Sholapur. In the reference period, there is a slight decrease in employment mainly due to position in manufacturing units. Selected Statistics from part of Census of Manufacturing Industries (years 1959 to 1961) have been given in Table 5.9. Particulars giving electrical generation and consumption (Tables 5.10 and 5.12) are based on information supplied from State Electricity Board offices and private companies.

In the year 1964-65, bulk increased consumption in industrial sector is due to availability of cheaper power from Yoyana and resulting closure of localised units with large industrial Units (mainly Textile mills at Sholapur) which were previously operating and generating power for ^{local} needs. Table 5.11 gives progress of electrification in the district in reference years. It can be seen that in year ending March, 65 ten more villages were electrified under the programme by the state electricity Board.

2.6 Co-operation:

In this sixth section of part-II(A) three tables (6.1 to 6.3) are compiled from the annual reports of co-operative institutions-like Banks; Agricultural credit and other societies. Data is supplied from office of the Dy. Registrar, Cooperative societies, Sholapur. Table 6.4 relates to activities of marketing societies. Last table 6.5 gives the position of business by Money lenders in the district. It can be seen (Table 6.5) that money lending business has decreased by about a lakh in year 1964-65.

2.7 Medical & Public Health:

There are eight tables (7.1 to 7.8) in this section of part-II(A). Data in table 7.1 giving persons in medical profession relates to 1961-census. It can be seen that persons are roughly one per thousand district population. Table 7.2 gives medical facilities available (under public sectors) in the district. Data is collected from state and Local sector governing bodies of these health institutions. Data in Table 7.3 gives number of patients treated, by nature of diseases. It can be seen generally from Tables 7.2 and 7.3, that in reference period.

patients in females and children are on increase. Tables 7.4 and 7.5 giving vital statistics for years 1963-64 are from the public Health Deptt. Birth in the year 1964 have decreased by over three thousands in the district. However there are more incidences of deaths in the same year. (Table 7.4). Number of vaccinations and inoculations done in years 1963/1964 (Table 7.6) show a large increase in revaccinations in the year 1964. Activities under T.B. Control (B.C.G. vaccinations, tests etc.) for year 1964 were much less than in earlier year (Table 7.7). Data in last Table (7.8) give (talukawise) position of drinking water supply to rural population. It relates to reference month June, 1964 when a taluka level survey was conducted by the Bureau. In Sangola/Malsiras and Madha talukas villages without water supply are more than in other talukas.

2.8 Education:

Out of eight Tables (8.1 to 8.8) in this section of part-II(A) first three tables relates to literacy and allied details (rural and urban areas) in the district as revealed from particulars of 1961 census. It is special that in district taluka, North Sholapur is having literacy percentage 37.4 (maximum) - but it is having least percentage in rural area (2.9). - Table 8.1 Next to North Sholapur taluka, Barsi second in literacy, In Malsiras, Arkalkot and Barsi talukas, literates without educational level were large (Table 8.2). In urban area of the district also, literates without educational level (Table 8.3) were over 78 thousands. By and large, studentship amongst girls was on increase in the year 1954-55, than amongst boys in all institutions (Table 8.4) - Specially in Barsi and North Sholapur talukas. Educational concessions (in finance) to Backward class students have increased in the years (Specially in secondary schools)

Even though, the number of students have decreased (Table 8.5). On other hand, there appears to be a decrease in students under economically backward class (Table 8.6). Expenditure by way of grants in aid to local bodies in the year 1964-65 (Table 8.7) is over Rs. 77 lakhs of which about thirty percent is borne under P. I. A. N. Sholapur district has been included in the programme of compulsory primary education since some time. Excepting a few small hamlets, all villages are covered by facilities of primary education (Table 8.8)

2.9 Transport and Communications:

There are eight Tables (9.1 to 9.8) in this section of part-II (A). Length of railway routes (by type) is given in Table 9.1. Data is obtained from Railway-authorities. In Maharashtra, Sholapur district enjoys perhaps maximum railway facilities as it crosses through nine talukas of this district. Roads under non-municipal sector and municipal sector (Table 9.2(a&b)) have been increasing. Especially roads under local sector (Z.P) in the year 1964-65 have added up the lengths by about thousand Kilometers. (Table 9.2(a)). Particulars of motor vehicles in operation in the reference year are tabled in Table 9.3. This relates to area covered by Poona Regional Transport office of which Sholapur district is a part. Important activities of Sholapur division of State Transport Corporation are given in Table 9.4. In the reference year routes have been added by 8, passengers travelling per day have also gone up by about 2000. Findings of traffic census in Nov, 1964 have been tabled in Table 9.5. Focal points near Sholapur (Osmanabad section) and (Mohol section) have high intensity (in traffic in tons). In remaining tables, postal and telegraph facilities are shown in Table 9.6. In table 9.7 vicinity of postal facilities is available. It can be seen that over 90 percent of

villages had postal facilities within ranges of six kms (as at end of March, 1965.) In last Table 9.8 particulars of rural broadcasting are available. Spread of rural broadcasting stations has been conspicuous in Barsi taluka; in district as a whole, about 30 percent villages have been covered by these units- as at end of March 1965.

2.10 Local Bodies :

In five Tables in this section of part-II-(A), income and expenditure particulars of local bodies in Sholapur district are illustrated. Those of village Panchayats in Table 10.1, Panchayat Samitis in Table 10.2, Zilla Parishad in Table 10.3 (parts A and B giving receipt-wise/head-wise particulars) and of Municipalities in Table 10.5. Table 10.4 is peculiar in the sense that it gives constitutions of municipal councils in the district besides, their coverage in area and population. By and large all local bodies have significant share of income from Govt. sector.

2.11 Plan and Community Development :

There are six tables (11.1 to 11.6) in this section of part-II-(A). Of these data in tables 11.1 and 11.2 relates to achievements (financial and physical) under district level plan schemes concerned with Sholapur district- in third five year plan. Period covered is first four years of the Plan (1961-65). Expenditure under schemes of Soil Conservation-bunding, (No. Cons-1), Community Development (No. CDP-1) and Development projects of Handlooms (No. SSI-12) is more ^{than} for other schemes- ^{The other} Four Tables No. 11.3 to 11.6 deal in particular with the Community Development Programme (years 1964-65) in this district.

Coverage in the district is now complete (Table 11.3) Expenditure under C.D. Blocks is given in Table 11.4, selected physical achievements in Table 11.5 and indices of achievements based on the Physical achievements in last table 11.6. All the data expressed in this section has been compiled by the District Statistical Office on information from concerned implementing officers of Plan schemes (tables 11.1 and 11.2) and from the Block offices (tables 11.3 to 11.6) performance of all Blocks in the district has been adjudged as 'A-Class'- both by view of expenditure and by achievements-in the year under reference.

2.12 Prices:

There are three Tables (12.1 to 12.3) in this penultimate section of part-II-A. In Table 12.1 are given the average retail prices of selected commodities (over fifty)- for each month from April, 1964 to March 1965. The computations are based on weekly prices collected at Sholapur by the District Statistical Office, and indicate price-levels of covered commodities in the said period. In next Table 12.2 particulars of business of nine regulated markets in Sholapur district are given. Only important items such as cereals and pulses are covered in this Table. The last Table 12.3 gives the consumer price Index of Sholapur centre. This Index is computed by Labour Deptt. as per principles laid down by Lakdawall^a Committee. In the period 1964-65, the Index has risen from 417 to 454 (base year 1927-)

2.13 Miscellaneous:

There are in all thirteem Tables on a variety of topics in this last section of Part-II(A). Table 13.1 gives particulars of police force and crime statistics (calendar years 1963-and 1964) in Sholapur district. Data has been collected from police Deptt. Specially enough, cost of police force has gone down by over a lakh rupees in the year 1964. In the next Table 13.2 cases decided by the Judicial Deptt. in years 1963 and 1964 are provided. Evidently the civil cases in the year 1964 were more than in earlier year. On criminal side, however the cases in the year 1964 were much less than in earlier year. Cinema statistics (Table 13.3) in Sholapur district shows that most of these entertainment units were located in North Sholapur talukas (in particular, Sholapur city). Table 13.4 gives particulars -both by ranges of salary and by category- about State Govt. employees in this district. This is based on census of Govt. employees conducted by the Bureau in year 1961. In next Table 13.5 and 13.6 particulars of Banking offices working in Sholapur district, and those of Jt. stock companies are furnished. Progress of Life insurance business (Table 13.7) shows that eventhough in the district, the business went a little low in the year 1964-65, it was more intensified in areas of South Sholapur, Mangalwedha and Karmala talukas. Collections under Small-savings given in Table 13.8 relates to period 1963-65. In year 1964-65, gross collections under C.T.D; P.S.P. have registered good increase over first year (1963-64); Particulars of Land Revenue Collections in the district (Table 13.9) show that the arrears at end of year 1964-65 were a little more eventhough the demands were lesser than the previous year.

Excepting Mohol talukas, arrears were there in rest of the talukas. They were more in Karmala and Sangola. Receipts due to taxes (such as excise revenue, sales tax, entertainment tax) were more in year 1964-65 than in earlier year (Table 13.10). Evidently, registration in the year 1964 have also earned more income to Government (Table 13.11) than in earlier year. Electional Statistics (General election-1962) show that for Legislative constituencies from Malsiras and Barsi polling was above 70 percent. (Table 13.12), while for parliamentary constituency Pandharpur it was more (62 percent) than for Sholapur (about 53 percent). Last table in this section provides pattern of housing conditions of population. The data (Table 13.13) is based on twenty percent sample households in the district covered in 1961 census. Details are furnished talukawise with rural/urban sectors. By and large, as it can be seen, population was residing in dwellings having one or two rooms to accommodate the individual households.
