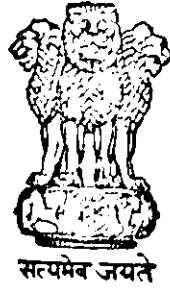

CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

1.1 Nasik District is situated partly in Tapi basin and partly in the Upper Godavari basin. It is bounded on the North West sides by Dangs and Surat Districts of Gujarat States, on the North by Dhulia and on the North West and East by Jalgaon District. In the East and ~~South~~ East, lies Aurangabad Dist., to the South, Ahmednagar District and to the ~~South~~ East lies Thana District.

1.2 The total Geographical area is 15573 Sq. K.M. and its total population according to 1961 Census is 18,55,216. Going according to area of the District it ranks first in Bombay Division and fifth in Maharashtra State. According to population, Nasik District also ranks first in Bombay Division (excluding of course Gr. Bombay Dist.) and third in Maharashtra State.

1.3 Administratively, the district is divided in thirteen talukas. The area, number of inhabited villages, number of towns, 1961 population and the position in district by percentage of area and population of each taluka are given below :

With a view to promote development of democratic institutions and to secure greater ~~participation~~ participation by people in Development plans and Local and Governmental affairs by decentralization of powers and functions, the Zilla Parishad and thirteen panchayat samitis have been established in the district in the year 1962. The areas under the jurisdiction of the Zilla Parishad and the Panchayat Samitis correspond to the district and taluka boundaries respectively except in the case of Municipal towns and Cantonment Boards

which are not covered by them. Three towns viz., Lasalgaon, Chandor and Ravalgaon which do not have Municipal Committees but which are treated as towns in the 1951 Census, are however included under the jurisdiction of the Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samitis concerned. Manmad non-municipal area, which is included in the Manmad Municipal town in 1951 Census is however covered by the Zilla Parishad. The Zilla Parishad covers 98.4 percent of the area and 76.06 percent of the total population of the District. The population covered includes entire rural population and 6.23 percent of Urban population of the district in 1951. The number of villages, number of non-municipal towns and population included under the Zilla Parishad and each of the Panchayat Samitis are shown in the table given below.:

1.4 Area: The District lies between 19°3' and 20°53' North latitude and 73°15' and 75°15' east longitude. In terms of

area and population this district accounts ^{for} ~~per~~ 5.08 percent and 1.64 percent respectively of the Maharashtra State.

1.5 Taking into account the height, climate, rainfall and soil pattern, the ^{district} ~~district~~ can be well divided into three parts. The first part comprising of Peint and Surana nahals and Western parts of Igatpuri, Nasik, Dindori, Kalvan and Baglan Talukas ^{abound} ~~grow~~ in hills and is popularly known as "Kokan part" or "Dangipart of Nasik District. This area has a normal rainfall of 3600 Mms. and is full of thick forests. The only crops in this area are Paddy, Nagli and Vari.

Adjacent to this hilly tract, is the sloping range extending from North and South. This tract comprises of the eastern parts of Nasik, Igatpuri, Kalvan, Dindori and Baglan talukas and Chandor Taluka. This being shadow rainfall area, it has got a very low rainfall between 500 to 700 Mms. But this tract grows the commercial crops like Sugarcane, Grapes, Cotton and food crops, Wheat, Bajra and Pulses mainly on well irrigation.

The third tract is that land stretching on the eastern side of the District comprising of Malegaon, Nandgaon, Yeola, Niphad and Sinnar Talukas. This area has a low rainfall of only 500 Mms. and that too uncertain. Most of the parts of Sinnar and Yeola are quite occasionally affected by scarcity. However, because of the "Gangapur Canal" passing through Niphad Taluka it grows crops like Sugarcane and wheat etc. Onions, Grapes, Chillies and Vegetables are also grown to a considerable extent in this area. Two Co-operative and one private Sugar factories are located in this area respectively at Niphad, Dabhadi and Ravalgaon.

B) River System

Godavari and Girna are the ^{main} two ~~xxxxx~~ rivers of the district. The other important ^{rivers} ~~rivers~~ are Vaitarana, Darna, Mosum and Kadva.

The Godavari rises at Branhgiri in the Sahyadri ranges near Trimbak and drains Nasik and Niphad Taluka for about 90 Kms. At a distance of about 15 Kms. from its source, a huge earthen dam has been built at Gangapur for storage and irrigation.

During its course, many small streams meet the Godavari, the important amongst them are Kadva, Darna and Nasardi. Many dams have been built on these tributaries for storage and diversion canals for irrigation.

The Girna rises at the west of the ~~xxxxxx~~ district-north of the Satmala ranges near ^{Hatgad} ~~xxxxxx~~ village in Surgana mahal and flows through Kalwan and Malegaon talukas till it passes through Jalgaon District from where it turns north to meet Tapi. The course of the Girna within the district is about 135 Kms. Many small streams rising in Kalwan, Baglan, and Dindori talukas feed it, the prominent among them are Aram, Mosum, Panjan and Maniad.

c) Soils

There are four kinds of soils in the district; black (Kali) Red, (Mal) red and black (koral) and light brown (barad). Except in the uplands, black soil is found mostly in the plain country near the beds of rivers, such as Girna and Mosum. It is often deep and very rich and yields excellent rabi crops of wheat and gram. Red soil which is stiffer and

and shallower, is found chiefly on hills slopes and plateaus and yields good rainy-season crops. Red and black koral found occasionally in hilly tracts yields gram, lentils and other cold weather crops. Light brown (barad) the lightest of all soils, is found on hilly lands, and is often strewn with boulder and mixed with lime boulders. It never yields more than a light crop and yields nothing at all when the rainfall is scanty.

The eastern part of Malegaon taluka and other talukas of Nandgaon and Chandrapur also have poor soils.

1.7 Climate, Temperature and rain-fall.

The climate of Nashik District can broadly be classified according to three distinct seasons.

- 1) Monsoon from middle of June to end of Sept.
 - 2) Winter from October to middle of March.
 - 3) Summer from middle of March to the middle of June.
- Except for the western slopes of Sahyadries, the district generally experiences salubrious climate. The summer months are moderately hot and the temperature varies from 36°C to 43°C and becomes unbearable. Although the days are hot, the nights are cool and pleasant. The rainy season is comparatively cooler with sporadic rains distributed over the four months of Monsoon. The major rainfall is however during the months of July and August but at no time it is very heavy. Continuous downpour is almost unknown. After a short spell of hot weather during the month of October, the short winter season begins and becomes fairly severe during the months of December and January. During this period, xxxxx

temperature generally remains between 29°C to 10°C. It occasionally lowers down even to 5°C. The winter season continues imperceptibly till middle of March when it ~~imperceptibly~~ merges with the summer weather.

The climate of the western parts, particularly the below-mentioned area of Peint and Surgana mahals, is different from the rest of the district. The rains which begins, from early June continue till middle of October and heavy down-pour is generally experienced during July, August and September. The darkness and moisture make the climate unhealthy. The winter is also fairly severe, but generally of a short duration and the hot season almost begins from the middle of February. The summer months are very sultry and on account of high humidity becomes unbearable though the rising temperature is almost insignificant and days and nights are equally unbearable.

In the district, the major part of the rainfall is precipitated from June to October under the influence of South West Monsoon. The distribution of the rainfall is affected by the presence of the Shvabri Range, which runs from North to South in the western parts of the District. As a result, the rainfall is on the heavier side in the extreme Western portion of the district and it gradually declines as we go from West to East. The following tables provides the statistics regarding distribution of the rainfall in the various talukas of the district.

It will thus be seen that the rainfall is heaviest in the western part comprising of Surgana, Peint and Igatpuri and it ranges from 2000 M.M. to 3700 Mms. Amongst the talukas ~~xxxxxx~~ of the Dist., Igatpuri is the ~~xxxxxx~~ recipient of the highest rainfall with an average of 3700 Mms. per annum. From agricultural point of view, the rain in this part loses much of its economic value due the rugged terrain, on account of

which profitable agriculture cannot thrive. Continuous down-pour of rainfall in this region also makes certain areas of this part inaccessible and isolated from the rest of the district during rainy season. Heavy rainfall in this part, however, favours the growth of forests. The rainfall in the Central part ranges from 500 Mms. and 790 Ins., and is more helpful to agriculture.

The rainfall in the eastern part is very moderate and ranges from 530 Ins. to 560 Mms. The distribution of rainfall in this part is particularly uneven and scanty. On account of uncertainty of rains the areas with richer type of soil have to depend on irrigation. Canal irrigation is on good scale in the talukas of Baglan, Malegam and Niphad.

In the end, the following ~~specialities~~ specialities of Nasik District are also notable.

- 1) Area under Grapes: About 1500 acres, with estimated yields of 15,000 tones of grape fruit.
- 2) Area under Onions: About 11,000 acres ^{under onions} and area under and sugarcane _{and sugarcane} sugarcane over 25,000 acres, respectively.
- 3) The "NIG" factory at Ozar (12 miles away from Nasik of the Hindustan "Aeronautics" Ltd.)
- 4) One of the highest stocking centres of the Govt. of India (Food Deptt.) at Manrad junction.
- 5) The India Security Press and the Govt. of India Press at Nasik-Road.

Descriptive Note

The Statistical Abstract (Tables) which follows Chapter IV, presents statistical data relating to Nasik District for the last year of the 3rd Five Year Plan i.e. 1965-66.

In all the tables, the relative position as at the end of the second Plan is also shown to give an easy and at hand picture of the growth during the five years of the third Plan.

The rain fall data for 13 Centres in the District for the years 1961-62 and 1965-66 is presented in table 1.1 and the temperature data for four centres is supplied in table 1.2.

The population statistics (Total, Rural and Urban Population, its density, literacy etc.) is presented in tables No. 2.1 to 2.7

The main characteristics seen in these tables are:

- a) The biggest Taluka is 'Nasik' with a total population of 3,27,281 as per 1961 Census.
- b) The urban population percentage is 25.60 for the District with the highest in Nasik Taluka with 67.34 percent.
- c) The variation in population from 1951 to 1961 is highest 48.80 % in Malegaon Taluka while the District variation is 29.74 %.
- d) As per classification of villages, according to population groups, 702 villages belong to population group of below 500 (42.5 %).
- e) As per the classification of workers, 88 % belong to 'Agriculture' in rural areas and only 8.43 % in urban areas.
- f) The percentage of Scheduled Castes is 3.66 and that

of Scheduled Tribes is 24.45 (as against the percentage of 2.75 and 12.35 respectively for Bombay Division).

AGRICULTURE

There are 10 tables (3.1 to 3.10) giving the talukawise agricultural data and the outturn of principal crops, agricultural wage rates and scarcity areas in 1965-66. All the tables are in metric units. The agricultural data pertains to the year 1964-65 as supplied by the Office of the Director of Agriculture, Poona.

The Nasik District has got 62.74 % gross cropped area (to the ~~total~~ total geographical area). The respective percentages for Bombay Division and Maharashtra State are 49.54 and 62.31. It will be seen that Nasik District comparatively better situated. This District has got 7.36 per cent of gross cropped area under irrigation and in this respect also it stands in a better situation if we see that the respective percentages for Bombay Division and Maharashtra State are 5.12 and 6.85 only.

During the third five year plan, the total gross ~~area~~ area under Irrigation has increases from 64,185 hectares to 72,173 hectares and at the end of the third plan the highest irrigational percentage is found in Melegaon Taluka. The relative talukawise position is studied in Chapter IV.

As regards forest, this District has also relatively more forest area with 21.80 % of the total land, while the percentage for Maharashtra State is 17.60. Because of this, there is a higher percentage of population of Scheduled Tribes (24.46 %) (the relative percentages for Bombay Division and Maharashtra State being respectively 12.35 and 6.06 only).

The talukas of Lathuri, Peint, Surgana and Kalwan in the hilly range ~~abundant~~ abound in forests.

As regards crops, this District grows mainly Bajra (36.7 %) and wheat (8.8 %) under food grains & sugarcane (0.83 %), groundnut (7.17%) and cotton (2.20%) under the cash crops. The crops of onion and grapes are also worthy of mention. 550 hectares were cultivated under grapes during 1964-65.

The scarcity details (1965-66) will be seen in Table No. 3.10. During this year, 612 villages in the District were affected by famine.

LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY

There are 6 tables (4.1 to 4.6) which give taluka-wise details of the livestock census as per 1966 quinquennial census and the statistics regarding veterinary services, slaughter houses, etc.. The tables 4.5 and 4.6 give the details regarding forest produce in Nasik District.

EMPLOYMENT, MINING AND ELECTRICITY

There are 10 tables (5.1 to 5.10) on these topics. The factory statistics (5.1 to 5.3) relate to the year 1964. The employment exchange statistics is given in table No. 5.5 and ~~5.6~~ 5.6 for the years 1961-62 and 1965-66. During the year 1965-66, the Sub-Regional Employment Exchange Nasik has offered placements to 2535 persons and 13923 persons were on the live register at the end of the year 1965-66. Table No. 5.7 and 5.8 contain information regarding volume of employment in different industries and the statistics relating to Annual Survey of Industries. Table No. 5.9 and 5.10 give totals of generation and consumption of electricity in Nasik District and the towns and villages electrified. It is a notable point to see that while only 11 towns were

electrified at the end of second plan (1961), 186 villages were electrified at the end of third plan 1966 covering a population of about 5,86,196 which forms 31.60 % of the total population.

COOPERATION

Cooperative statistics is given Table No. 6.1 to 6.6. Talukwise details for the year 1965-66 are given regarding Primary Agricultural Credit and Marketing Societies. These tables will show the remarkable achievements made by Baglan, Dindori, Kalwan, Malgaon, Nasik, Niphad and Sinnar Talukas in agricultural credit and marketing fields. The total short term loaning of the village agricultural credit societies has risen from Rs 3.33 crores at the end of second plan to Rs 6.16 crores at the end of third plan.

The progress made by the District Central Cooperative Bank Ltd. Nasik is also quite satisfactory which has increased its business as follows:-

The information regarding registered money lenders and their transactions is given table No. 6.7. It will be seen that a big number of registered money lenders exists in Nasik, Niphad, Igatpuri, and Nandgaon Talukas while their number is negligible in the talukas of Dindori, Chander, Kalwan, Surgana and Peint.

MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH

There are 8 tables (7.1 to 7.8) giving details regarding medical personnel, medical facilities, patients, births and deaths by causes and vaccination statistics.

The study of these tables will show that the medical facilities have increased considerably during the third plan period. The number of hospitals (including P.H. Centres) and dispensaries has increased from 37 to 47 during the five years of the third plan.

Sources of hygienic drinking water supply are given in table No. 7.8.

EDUCATION

Talukawise literacy information as per 1961 Census will be seen in table No. 8.1. The urban areas show a percentage of 46.03 while in rural areas the percentage is only 20.32. With a faster growth of Primary education, which has now covered all the villages in Nasik District, and because of the special programme of adult education, this position is bound to improve at the end of 1971 Census.

The number of educational institutions, students and teachers are given table 8.2 to 8.4. Table No. 8.5 and 8.6 give the details regarding concessions to B.C. Students and E.B.C. Students. Table No. 8.7 will show the expenditure by way of grant-in-aid for primary educational institutions which shows a rise from Rs 80 lakhs in 1964-65 to Rs 82 lakhs in 1965-66.

TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS

There are 8 tables giving information regarding Railway mileage, Roads (Municipal and extra-municipal), Motor Vehicles, Posts and Telegraphs and Rural Broadcasting.

LOCAL BODIES

Table No. 10.1 to 10.4 giving the details of financial position of the local bodies i.e. of Zilla Parishad, Panchayat Samities and Municipalities during the years 1961-62 and 1965-66. It is observed from these tables that the income of

the Village Panchayats has increased by 115.8 % during the years 1961-62 and 1965-66 while the expenditure has risen by 125.31 %. The income of municipalities has risen by 104.75 % and their expenditure has gone up 60.53 % during the years 1961-62 and 1965,66. Talukawise Village Panchayat data and municipalitywise data are given in table No. 10.1 to 10.4. Tables 11.1 to 11.5 give details regarding third plan expenditure and achievements and also Community Development Programme. Chapter III gives full ~~picture~~ ^{description} of the achievements made during the third plan in Nasik District.

The remaining tables 12.1 to 13.11 give statistics on miscellaneous items like retail prices at District Head Quarters, Regulated Markets, Police Force, Banks, Joint Stock Companies, Insurance etc. etc..

Table No. 14 shows selected ~~indicators~~ of Development such as agriculture, irrigation, education, industries etc. and Chapter IV gives the relative position of Talukas in the various aspects of developments.

CHAPTER III

(Relative position of talukas in the various fields of economic progress)

Nasik District has got three geographical sectors, one of hilly areas, other forming the main irrigated tract and the third is the scanty rainfall area akin to Khandwa tract. These basic characteristics obviously have their effect on the economic progress of the talukas concerned.

In the following paragraphs, some important developmental aspects are studied to show the relative position of the talukas.

Classes of population

Nasik District had got 4,53,707 population of Scheduled Tribes forming 24.4 % of the total population. This percentage for Bombay Division is 12.3 % and for Maharashtra State 6.05 %. The main concentration is of course in the hilly talukas of Igatpuri, Peint, Kalwan and Dindori. The highest percentage of tribal population is in Peint Taluka with 75.4 % and the lowest in Yeola Taluka with 6.41 %. In all these tribal areas 9 Tribal Development Blocks have been opened up to cater to the basic need of the economically and socially backward tribal people like agriculture, communications, schools etc.

Agricultural situation

The net area sown in Nasik District is 94,722 hectares which forms 60.71 percent of the total geographical area. The gross irrigated area in Nasik District is 72,209 hectares which is 7.4 percent of the total cropped area. These percentages are higher than the respective percentages for Bombay Division which are 46.3 and 5.1 respectively.

The net area sown per agricultural worker (cultivators and labourers) when studied shows us that the position of

Yeola (2.01 hect), Nandgaon(1.93 hect), Sinnar(1.74 hect) Chandor (1.55 hect), Dindori(1.55 hect), Malegaon (1.50 hect) and Baglan (1.5 hect) is quite satisfactory, if compared to the District average of 1.43 hectares. The position of the taluaks in the hilly region viz. Surgana, Kalwan and--- Igatpuri and Point is quite not good with figures round about only one hectare per worker.

The percentage of gross irrigated area is very good so far as Talukas of Niphad (12) and Malegaon (11) are concerned. The District percentage is only 7.4. The situation of Yeola, Nandgaon, Igatpuri, Point and Surgana Talukas is not fair in this respect where this percentage is below 7. These Taluaks are either scanty rainfall areas or the hilly areas where there is no so much scope for irrigation.

Amongst the main irrigated Taluaks, the main crops grown are Sugarcane, Wheat, and Vegetables. The areas under Sugarcane in Niphad and Malegaon Talukas has increased from 1401 and 3168 hectares in 1961 to 1496 and 3775 hectares in 1965.

Cooperation

The growth of cooperative agricultural credit is quite spectacular in Nasik District during the third plan period with the loan advanced of Rs 3.33 crores in 1961-62 to 6.16 crores in 1965-66. If we study the talukawise growth the work in the talukas of Niphad, Malegaon and Baglan is notable. The District average loaning per society has increased from Rs 35,000 (approx) in 1961-62 to Rs 52,000 (approx) in 1965-66. The respective figures for Niphad (Rs 53,000), Malegaon (Rs 1.05,000) and Baglan (Rs 84,000) speak of the good and substantial growth of cooperatives in these talukas.

Livestock and Poultry

The total livestock in Nasik District as per 1966 quinquennial census is 14,20,817 and the total poultry

3,67,666. The rise from 1961 is 4196 in livestock and poultry almost the same but the increase is observed mainly in the urbanised talukas of Nasik and Malegaon. The average live-stock per hectare of geographical area is 0.91. The highest is in Malegaon Taluka and the lowest is in Sargana Taluka.

Dairying as one of the main additional occupation of the common agriculturist, has developed in the Talukas of Malegaon, Nasik and Nandgaon, where the number of she-buffaloes in 1966 has been 6452, 4505 and 2190 respectively.

Poultry is another important side occupation of the agriculturists and the main concentration is naturally in the proximity of the highly urbanised talukas of Nasik and Malegaon. The poultry is quite insignificant in the talukas of Niphad, Chandor and Yeola. The growth of poultry during the five years from 1961 to 1966 is quite significant in the Talukas of Nasik and Baglan.

Education

The growth of primary education is quite notable in the District, where the number of primary schools and pupils has gone up from 1609 and 1,88,709 in 1961 to 1968 and 2,60,578 in 1965-66 respectively.

The growth of secondary education is also quite satisfactory in the District, where the number of schools and pupils has gone up as shown below:

Medical Facilities

With the establishment of the primary health centres in all Talukas, this facility has reached to the nearest possible centre from the villages in general. The number of primary health centres and the sub-Centres has gone up from 8 to 18 and the number of beds has gone up from 605 to

787. It is quite satisfactory that in all the 13 talukas the primary health centres have been established.

Industrial Growth

There were 308 factories and 19,961 workers at the end of 1965. If we study the talukewise break-up, the highest number of factory workers is found in Nasik Taluka (10,700 out of 19,961). The number of factory workers in Baglan, Chandor, Surgam, Peint, and Kalvan are very negligible (either nil or less than 100). The position of Baglan will improve shortly with the establishment of the Cooperative Spinning Mill near Satana. In the remaining Talukas, the concentration is only in Sinnar (3645 Bidi workers), Malegaon (1950 powerlooms) talukas. The talukas of Niphad, Yeola and Igatpuri are too much backward from the industrial point of view. The proposed Industrial Estate at Malegaon and Manmad (or Yeola) and a composite programme of cooperative processing societies will elevate the position of this industrial backwardness to some extent.

CHAPTER IV

Introductory

Nasik District with more than 70 percent of population dependant on Agriculture, needed special attention along with other agro-industrial aspects, or intensive agricultural ~~schemes~~ production schemes in the third five year plan (1961-62 to 1965-66) - Even though a decade of 'plan' had already been over before the third plan began, the third plan could only be stated as the first attempt of the idea of 'Planning from below'. Out of the three plans, this was the ~~first~~ first time to have a ready break-up of all schemes into 'District Level', 'Divisional Level' and 'State Level'.

Agricultural Programme

The two wars (Chinese invasion in 1962-63 and the Pakistan War in 1964-65) only strengthened the faith in planned economy and drove the people to intensify the efforts towards self-sufficiency in food production. The following is the break-up of the expenditure incurred on District Level Schemes in Nasik District under various Heads of Development under 'Agricultural Programme' during the five years of the third plan.

Thus the total expenditure of Agricultural and allied schemes was Rs. 485 Lakhs which forms 53% of total expenditure on all District Level Schemes. The important place given to the Agricultural production in the total plans thus obvious.

The notable physical achievements under the various item of the progress under 'Agricultural Programme' are as under:

a) Agricultural Production

The main activities related to 1) distribution of improved seed 2) distribution of fertilizers, and 3) distribution of improved agricultural implements. The following statement will show the physical achievement under various sub-heads.

b) Land Development and Soil Conservation

Nasik District has a total cropped area of 9,49,722 hectares of which the bundable area is about 2 lakh hectares and the area suitable for terracing is about 10,000 hectares only. During the third plan period the work in respect of contour bunding covered 1,87,125 hectares and the terracing activity covered 4356 hectares. The total area banded till the end of the third plan is of the order of 1,87,000 hectares which forms 94% of the total bundable area. As for terracing the coverage till the end of the third plan was 4356 hectares which forms 44% of the total area to be terraced.

c) Minor Irrigation

The main items of achievements under this head are construction of new wells, repairs to old wells, pump sets and cooperative lift irrigation schemes. The achievements in the third plan in Nasik District under this head are as follows:

Community Development and Cooperation

In Nasik District there are 900 village panchayats

covering 1652 villages.

During the third plan these village panchayats were paid Land Revenue Grants to the order of Rs 11.67 lakhs (30 % of Land Revenue). In the tribal area an additional special grant of Rs 3.30 lakhs was paid during the third plan period.

The thirteen Panchayat Sanitis in Nasik District had the following Community Development and Tribal Development Blocks at the end of the third plan and the total ~~xxxxx~~ expenditure incurred in these Blocks during the third plan was Rs 195.4 lakhs. Their various activities have been shown in the respective tables.

Cooperation

The cooperative sector received a special attention during the third plan not only towards expansion in

the members of societies but also towards their growth in business and capital formation. The following is the brief summary of the main achievements under cooperation.

At the beginning of the third plan in Nasik District there were 1579 cooperative societies which went up to 1697 at the end of third plan. Out of these societies 981 societies were agricultural credit, which had raised their loaning (short-term crop loans) upto the level of Rs 6.16 crores. These agricultural primaries had a membership of 1,30,000 persons which meant 65 % coverage of the cultivating population. The coverage of villages by Agricultural primaries was 100 percent at the end of the third plan.

The main plank under the three tier system of agricultural credit is the District Central Cooperative Bank. The Nasik District Central Cooperative Bank played its role very successfully during the third plan. During this period this institute raised its share capital from Rs 52 lakhs to Rs 85 lakhs, branches from 30 to 40 and loan advanced from Rs 3.88 crores to Rs.5.51 crores. The deposits and the activities of this Bank have added a special significance since they are Bankers to the Zilla Parishads.

The need for short term and medium term loan is met by the District Central Bank and the Agricultural Primaries while the requirements of long term loans for wells and pump-sets are satisfied by the District Land Development Bank Ltd. Nasik. At the end of the third plan this Bank had advanced loans of Rs 2.30 crores against the target of 2.32 crores and had given loan for the following purposes during the third plan.

- 1) New wells..No. 8640
- 2) Repairs to old wells..No. 2556
- 3) Pumpsets No. 3047

The rise in the programme in short term loans by the village agricultural primaries is also noteworthy during the third plan period. The total loan advanced by these primaries were of the order of 6.16 crores of Rs as against the target of 4.11 crores of Rs.

In order to supplement the service function of the 981 primaries and help their 1,30,000 members in marketing and storage of agricultural products, a special programme of construction of godowns was undertaken in the third plan by giving loan and subsidy to the societies and accordingly 51 small size, 10 medium size and 7 large size godowns were allotted to the societies.

The Sale Purchase Unions (Taluka Marketing Societies) have been established in all the Talukas in Nasik District with a District Sale Purchase Union at Nasik at the District Level.

There is a separate District level Potato and Onion Marketing Society to cater to the marketing needs of these special crops in Nasik District. This society has been assisted to the order of Rs 2.50 lakhs for construction of a cold storage plant at Nasik for preservation of the potatoes as a special benefit to the numerous potato growers in Nasik District.

The various achievements under other main cooperative activities during the third plan are as follows:

During the third plan organisation of forest labour cooperative societies (Under Industrial Cooperation) has also been a notable achievement. The forest and forest settlers i.e. tribal people have been benefitted to a large extent and have been saved from the exploitation by the private actors. The total membership of forest labour societies at the end of the third plan was 3500 in 35 societies and a substantial assistance was given by Government towards share capital, welfare activities, and management subsidy.

Another notable achievement during the third plan is the establishment of the Nasik Cooperative Industrial Estate near Nasik City. This is one of the new Cooperative Industrial Estates in Maharashtra State which have started during the third plan. This cooperative venture has been allotted with 247 acres of developed area by the M.I.D.C. and in its two phased programme 93 individual units will be covered. The other two Industrial Estates proposed are at Malegaon and Manmad.

Electrification

Rural electrification is most important with a view to develop the irrigation facilities. In 1964-65, only 36 villages were electrified but because of intensified efforts and because of establishment of stations at Igatpur and Pal in 1965-66, 152 villages were electrified during that year. The total number of electrified villages at the end of the third plan were 186. (out of 1652 villages in the District)

Education

Major portion of the population (73 %) is illiterate as per 1961 Census and serious efforts are being made to expand educational facilities in general and the primary education in particular.

Primary Schools A definite programme of educating freely and compulsorily all the children in the age group

6 to 11 has been undertaken and all the villages have been covered by 'primary schools'. At the end of third plan there were 1753 primary schools with 5153 teachers and 2,02,259 pupils attending them. If we compare these figures with the second plan, we observe 13 % increase in primary schools and 46 % in the number of primary teachers and 38 % in the number of pupils. The percentage of pupils to the total population is 11.12.

The big rise in the number of pupils naturally aroused the necessity of constructing and expanding the school buildings. The following expenditure has been incurred on the construction of school buildings in the second and the third plan period in the Nasik District

In order to elevate the quality of primary education, ~~primary~~ training of primary teachers is necessary. At the end of 3rd plan period there were 4499 primary teachers trained forming 89.4 % of the total number of teachers as against 3690 teachers trained at the end of the second plan. There are in all 7 training colleges in Nasik District.

Secondary schools The next in ladder are the secondary schools. Their growth is also spectacular. During the 15 years of plan (1st to 3rd) the number of secondary schools went up from 38 to 148 with the Government Grants to schools rising from Rs 5.28 lakhs to Rs 17.96 lakhs in 1965-66.

Other schools Agriculture being the main ~~occupation~~ occupation and the way of life, training in agriculture is more than a necessity so as to reach the improved agricultural

practices to the village level. One Agricultural School has been set up at Malegaon and during the third plan period 530 students were trained.

Higher education: The establishment of two colleges in the third plan period including the college of education at Nasik has helped the studentsfolk in the nearest places and of the places connected by rail and road to these colleges.

Adult Education: With a view to aid the adult literacy programme, Gram Gaurav was undertaken and by 1966, 1,58,336 adults have been made literate. To make a special mention, every village in Nandgaon Taluka has been fully covered by the adult education programme.

Ashram Schools: The problem of education in the Adiwasi areas of the District is peculiar because of the geographical reasons and very backward economy. 11 Ashram schools (Residential schools) have been established in Nasik District aided by Government and are becoming popular among the tribal people.

Health

Malaria eradication programme has been the main work during the third plan. As a result of the D.D.T. spraying malaria has been completely eradicated in the Talukas of Niphad Sinnar, Yeola, Nasik, Dindori, Chandor and Baglan.

As regards primary health centres which are very convenient to the villages, their number has risen from 7 to 18 during the third plan with an expenditure of Rs 2.17 lakhs. Side by side, the work of family planning has been made convenient because of the establishment of these primary health centres. At the end of the third plan 9000 sterilisations were done. It may be specially mentioned here that in 1963 Nasik

District was awarded the shield of merit for the best work done under the Family Planning Programme.

Social Welfare

Nasik District abounds in forests and obviously the percentage of tribal people is also quite big with 24.46 % of the total population of the District.

In order to help the development of communications and agriculture in particular (amongst other amenities to the tribal population) 9 T.D. Blocks have been started in the District (only one T.D. Block existed at Peint by the end of second plan). During third plan period an expenditure of Rs 35.15 lakhs has been incurred by these T.D. Blocks.

The work of Village Volunteer Force has been also remarkable in Baglan, Sinnar and Malegaon Talukas and besides giving employment to the generally unemployed agricultural labourers, construction of percolation tanks, approach roads has been done and an amount of Rs 9.86 lakhs has been spent on this programme.

The education of the Backward Classes has been ~~properly~~ properly aided during the third plan. In all 3231 B.C. students and 94 institutions have been aided with an expenditure of Rs 5.78 lakhs.

Roads and Communications

Roads which are motorable for all the year round are an asset to the economy and social life of the villagers. The development of roads and communications has been given proper attention during the third plan. The main achievements are as under :-

27 82 miles of ordinary roads converted into tar roads, 20 miles of new roads constructed, 12 bridges have been completed, the main being the Saikheda-Ozar Road across Godavari with an expenditure of Rs 11 lakhs. The total expenditure

on roads and communications under 3rd plan was Rs 45.06 lakhs.

Other Achievements

With the development of industries the growth of cities has been specific. In Nasik District the growth of Nasik, Nasik-Road-Deolali, Malegaon, Igatpuri and Manmad has been notable. These cities have obviously their problems of water supply and housing etc. During the third plan over Rs 20 lakhs have been spent on water supply schemes. To remove the slums of Malegaon, a scheme of constructing 1000 tenements with a cost of Rs 28.54 lakhs were undertaken during the third plan. Another ~~Industrial~~ housing scheme for the Industrial Workers is taken up near the Industrial Estate at Nasik.

Distribution of Milk at Nasik

The distribution of pasturised milk to Nasik and nearby towns has also been taken up by Government. Milk Scheme. Besides, this scheme provided as a feeder to the Govt. Milk Scheme at Bombay. During the third plan period this unit at Nasik has collected 37,36,000 litres of milk. Because of this scheme, the main secondary occupation of the general agriculturists i.e. dairy has developed considerably in the radius of 25 to 30 from Nasik and an amount of Rs 6.62 lakhs has been distributed to the needy agriculturists for the purchase of buffaloes.
