CHAPTER---I

1.1 LOCATION:- Poona District enjoys a position of special importance due to the location in it of the headquarter of Southern Command, important institutions like the National Defence Academy, the Meteorological Observatory, the National Chemical Laboratory, the Hindustan Antibiotics Ltd., the Servants of India Society and the Bharat Itihas Sanshodhak Mandal. Poona District lying between 17-54' and 19-24' north latitudes and 73-19' and 75-10' east longitudes has an area of about 15,600 sq.km. and a population of 24.67 lakhs or 153 population per sq.km. as per 1961 Census. The district has a shape of a triangle with its base in the Sahyadri mountain of the west and its apex in the extreme south-east corner near the confluence of Bhima and Nira rivers.

1.2 TOPOGRAPHY:

1) Soil:- The soil of the district is lighter in the west than that in the east. It belongs broadly to three classes, viz. black, red and brown. In some places one class of soil blends with another in varying proportions and is in turn modified by sand, gravel, lime salts and other ingredients.

The black soil is generally found in the eastern portion of Khed, Sirur, Dhond and Burandhar Talukas and the whole of Baramati and Indapur talukas. These soils are particularly suited for the Rabi-crops such as Wheat, Gram, Rabi-Jawar and Sugarcane because of

their quality of retaining moisture for a longer time.

The western portion of the district comprising the talukas of Junnar, Ambegaon, Khed and Purandhar have red soils. These soils grow Bajri, Groundnut and Chillies.

The brown coloured soil is found in the eastern part of Khed and Haveli talukas and the western parts of Sirur, Dhond and Purandhar talukas. These soils are always shallower and coarser than the black soils. Frequent showers render these soils suitable for Wheat, and Kharif crops, particularly Jawar and Bajri.

The rich alluvial soil ranging in colour from pale yellow to dark brown is deposited on the banks of the rivers 'Mina in Junnar, Ghodnadi in Ambegaon, Bhima in Khed, Mutha in Haveli, the Indrayani in Khed and Haveli and Nira in Bhor, Purandhar and Baramati talukas.

2) Rivers:- Poona District is crossed by many rivers and streams which rise in Sahyadris. Bhima is the main river having many tributaries. The Major of them are Vel and Ghod at her left, Bhama, Indrayani, Mula-Mutha and Nira on her right. There are seven other rivers, namely, Kukdi, Mina, Shivganga, Gujawani, Karha, Pushpavati and Pavana. During the rainy season, all these rivers flow with a magnificent volume of water but during the summer, they shrink to a narrow thread.

3) Hills and Ranges:- Out of the two distinct system of hills, one forms the main range of Sahyadris covering about 117 km. in a straight line and about

144 km. following the course of the hills and the other system includes the narrow broken crested ridges and the bluff flat-topped masses that stretch east-wards gradually sinking into the plain. The crest of Sahyadris falls at places to about 2,000 feet above the sea level, the level of the western limit of the Deccan plateau. In other places, it rises in rounded bluffs and clear-cut ridges to about 3,000 or 4,000 feet high. The leading peaks are in the extreme north: Harish^{chan} dragad whose mighty scraps nearly 4,670 feet high support a plateau crowned by two low conical peaks. About 16 km. to the south-west at the head of the Kukdi valley and commanding the Nane pass, the massive rock of Jivdham with its fortifications surmounted by a rounded grass-covered top, rises about 1,000 feet above the Deccan Plateau. The next important hill is Dhak, about 5 km. south of Jivdham. It is one of the highest and strongest points among the battlements of Sahyadris. The bluff of Anupe is at 16 kms. south-west of Dhak, where the direction of Sahyadris changes from west to south. It rises from Deccan plateau in gentle slopes, but falls west into the Konkan a sheer cliff between 3,000 and 4,000 feet high.

4) Minerals:- There are no important mineral resources in the district. However, the rocks in the district which are hard and durable are used extensively as building stones. They are excellent for macadam and tarred roads and are among the best materials obtainable in the country. They are also

excellent for use as aggregates in cement concrete. They are quarried on a large scale near Chinchwad, Yerwada etc. Irregular nodules of 'Kankar' and gypsum occur in the soil at a number of places, especially in the eastern parts of the district. 'Kankar' is locally used for lime burning.

1.3 CLIMATE:

1) Rainfall:-Poona District gets rain mainly from the South-West monsoon which begins in about the middle of June and lasts till the end of October. The following table shows centrewise quantity of rainfall in Poona Dist. during the years 1964 and 1965.

From the above table it is clear that the total rainfall was less in the year 1965 as compared to the year 1964 at most of the centres. The rainfall

its centres Velhe, Paud, Ghodgaon, Bhore and Vadgaon is much more than the rainfall at other centres in the year 1965.

The district can be divided into three regions according to annual rainfall in the district. The western region comprises of talukas, viz. Ambegaon, Bhore, Mawal, Mulshi and Velhe, where there is sufficient rainfall. The central region comprises of talukas of Junnar, Khed, Haveli, Poona City and Purandhar where there is a fairly good rainfall. The eastern region comprises of Sirur, Dhond, Baramati and Indapur talukas which has the lowest and uncertain rainfall in the district. The normal rainfall of the district during 1965 is 78.3 cm. The rainy season of the district covers the months from June to October. The rainfall is heavy during the months of July and August.

On comparison with the normal rainfall it can be seen that the rainfall is above normal for the talukas Ambegaon, Mulshi, Velhe and Bhore and for Mawal taluka it is upto normal. For rest of the talukas the rainfall is below normal.

2) TEMPERATURE:- Due to its high altitude, Poona district enjoys continental climate characterised by larger ranges of temperature in contrast to the maritime climate experienced by Bombay on the west coast. Temperature of three centres viz. Poona-City, Lohagaon and Baramati as given in the Abstract shows that the lowest temperature is recorded during January and the maximum during May. Further the range between this minimum and maximum is of the order of 9° to 10° c.

Baramati's maximum temperature during May goes to 31°c. Poona-City and Lohagaon record round about 29°c. The minimum of Poona City is about 20°c.

3) Humidity:-Being on the lee side of the ghats, Poona is much drier than the places on coast line. Even in the monsoon months of June to September, the mean relative humidity never generally exceeds 87 percent. March and April are the driest months.

1.4 NATURAL ZONES:-This district can be divided into three zones. The western zone comprising Mawal and Mulshi talukas and western parts of Haveli, Khed, Junnar Ambegaon and Bhore talukas and the Velhe Mahal has regular and assured rainfall and red brown soils and grows mainly rice and millets. The central zone comprising central parts of Haveli, Khed, Junnar, Ambegaon, and Purandhar talukas has moderate rainfall and brown soil and grows mainly Bajri, Jawar and Wheat. The eastern zone comprising Baramati, Dhond and Indapur talukas and accounting nearly half the area of the district has uncertain and insufficient rainfall and constitutes mainly the scarcity area of the district. It has black soil and grows Kharif Jawar, Bajri and Wheat.

1.5 FAMINE AND SCARCITY:-In Poona district Sirur and Dhond talukas are the main scarcity areas. During the year 1965-66 the scarcity affected area was larger than that during the year 1964-65. There were no floods during the year 1964-65 and 1965-66 in Poona district.

The total no. of villages affected during the year 1965-66 was 1236 covering population of 9.12 lakhs which forms nearly 36 percent of total population. The estimated loss is Rs. 36.52 lakhs. In order to give relief in these area about 60 lakh Rs. were spent giving employment to 1.70 lakh persons.

1.6 TERRITORIAL CHANGES IN THE DISTRICT:- As per 1961 census the following territorial changes are observed in the talukas of Junnar, Ambegaon, Purandhar and Bhore of this district as compared to 1951 census.

Four villages comprising an area of 25.9 sq. km. of Ambegaon, taluka were transferred to Junnar taluka. Similarly 5 villages of Purandhar taluka comprising an area of 44.6 sq. km. were transferred to Bhore taluka.

1.7 DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION:

STATE GOVT. ADMINISTRATION: For administrative purposes, the district is at present divided into 13 talukas and one mahal.

The Collector is in charge of general administration, law and order, treasury, land revenue, and civil supplies. He is assisted by four Dy. Collectors who hold charge of the four revenue divisions and have their H.Q.s at Poona City, Haveli, Khed and Baramati. Thirteen Tahasildars are in charge of 13 taluka offices and one Mahalkari in charge of one Mahal office.

Administration of Justice:-The District and Sessions Judge is the head of Judicial Deptt. in the District. The Collector continues to be district Magistrate and the Deputy Collectors and Tahasildars are vested with magisterial powers.

Police:- The police force in the district functions under Supdt. of Police for rural areas and Commissioner of Police for urban areas.

Post and telegraphs deptt. and Railways are responsible for postal facilities and communications. Also the meteorological observatory is situated at Poona.

Local Bodies Administration:- With the idea of democratic decentralisation of power, Zilla Parishads were formed in the State. The people are expected to achieve progress more rapidly through their local representatives elected to the Zilla Parishad. The Zilla Parishad, Poona was formed in May 1962 covering all the rural area in the district. This rural area comprises of 1498 inhabited villages covering an area about 14,594 sq.km. and a population of 15.27 lakh persons. At the district level, the Chief Executive Officer is in charge of General Administration and other functions of Zilla Parishad. He is assisted by District Heads of Deptt. implementing Zilla Parishad activities. The Block Development Officers are in charge of taluka administration and are under the control of Chief Executive Officer, Zilla Parishad.

Municipalities:- Twelve out of 22 towns in the dist. have Municipal Committees. They are 1)Junnar (2)Alandi(3)Sirur(4)Lonawala (5) Talegaon (6)Dhond (7)Saswad (8)Jejuri (9)Baramati (10) Indapur (11)Bhor and (12)Poona-City.

Other Public Bodies:-

Maharashtra State Electricity Board:-It is in charge of supply of electricity to towns and villages and various industries in the district.

State Road Transport Corporation:-It is in charge of Transport in the district and outside.

1.8 DEMOGRAPHY:-

1)General:- The population of the district increased from 19.51 lakhs to 24.67 lakhs during the decade 1951-61. It shows that the population has increased by 26.44 percent during this period. The percentage increase in the population is more in the talukas Sirur, Haveli, Dhond, Velhe, Purandhar, Baramati and Indapur as compared to the percentage increase of the district.

2)The population of Poona District has increased by 5.16 lakhs during the decade 1951-61. While the population of Poona Division has increased by 20.10 lakhs. The percentage increase in the population of Poona is 25 percent of the increase in Poona Division.

3. Density of population:—The density of population in this district has increased from 125 persons per sq.km. in 1951 to 158 persons per sq.km. in 1961. The rural density is 102 persons per sq.km. whereas the urban density is 1,457 person per sq.km. Poona City and Haveli talukas have densities higher than the district average and all the remaining talukas have below the average.

4) Literacy:—The percentage of literacy has increased from 27.68 in 1951 to 34.31 in 1961. Poona-City taluka has the highest rate of literacy i.e. 56.06% and Velhe Mahal has the lowest rate of literacy i.e. 14.40%. For rural areas, Purandhar taluka ^{has} the highest literates. For urban areas Poona City has the highest literates for total males and females.

5) Livelihood classification:— The total no. of workers in Poona District as per 1961 Census is 10.53 lakhs and the non-workers are 14.14 lakhs. Poona District has larger proportion of workers (52.94%) engaged as cultivators than that the State average (46.11) while the district has (.9.29) low proportion of agril. labourers than the state average (23.30). The proportion of agril. cultivators is more in all the talukas except Poona-City, Haveli, Baramati as compared with the district proportion. The proportion of agril. labourers is more in Sirur, Haveli, Dhond, Baramati, Indapur talukas as compared with the district proportion.

CHAPTER NO. II

The District Statistical Abstract part of this publication, for the year 1965-66 consists of tables and lists presenting the Statistical Data in 13 subjectwise groups. The Talukawise break-up is given in most of the tables, in few tables the figures are given for the district as a whole.

In all the tables except population tables, the data pertains to 2 reference period; viz. 1961 and 1965. In most cases this will speak of the progress during the third five year plan. In the tables pertaining to meteorological data, vital statistics and statistics pertaining to Civil and Criminal courts, the reference years are calender years. In the tables pertaining to Agricultural data and Cooperation Statistics the years pertain to agricultural and cooperation year. In other tables the reference year is financial year. In each table district totals are given in the beginning and the talukawise break-up follows next.

The following paragraphs contain brief notes on the tables included in this abstract.

1) RAINFALL AND TEMPERATURE:-

Table No.1.1:- Rainfall in mm. and rainy days for 13 centres (One centre from each taluka) are given in this table for each month of 1961 and 1965, the figures being collected from Malmeldars in the district. For each centre normal rainfall is collected from Statistician Department of Agril. Poona and given in the table for comparison. In all the centres except Ghodegaon and Saswad, the rainfall during 1965 appears to be less as compared to normal rainfall. In case of Paud the rainfall is nearly normal.

Table No.1,2:- In this table the monthwise temperature at three centres viz. Poona, Lohagaon and Baramati is given as mean, mean maximum and mean minimum in degree centigrade.

(2) AREA, POPULATION AND WORKING FORCE:-

Table No. 2,1:- This table gives the figures of population, density and variation in population and rural-urban break-up for each taluka of Poona district. There are no territorial changes in the Poona district.

Table No. 2,2:- This table shows talukawise classification of villages according to population ranges. The classification is done as per 1961 population. It is observed that most villages fall in the ranges 200 to 499 due to hilly tract of the district specially western. There are only 4 villages having population more than 10,000.

Table No. 2,3:- This table is on the same lines that of 2,2. The classification of towns according to population ranges is given in this table. There are 22 towns in the district. There are no towns in Ambegaon and Velhe talukas. There are 2 towns above 50,000 population and one city over 5 lakhs population.

Table No. 2,4:- This table shows the total no. of workers in each livelihood class of working population for each taluka of the district separately. For purpose of easy comparison the classification is given for Rural and Urban areas separately. The population under categories II, III and IV is classified as Agril. working population and V to IX Non-Agril. working population. Agril. population is more in rural areas but non-agril. population is more in urban areas.

Table No.2.5:-The classification of non working population is done in this table for 13 talukas of the district. Rural and Urban areawise break-up is not available for each taluka. It is observed that most of the non-working persons are dependents, infant children and disabled persons. Below them rank students attending schools etc.

Table No.2.6:-The information on the talukawise population of schedule castes and schedule tribes is given in this table. The majority of schedule castes population is more in Poona City taluka, while Baramati stands second in the district. Junnar taluka has largest no. of schedule tribes population in the district and Ambegaon stands second.

Table No.2.7:-This table classifies the urban population according to sex.

(3) AGRICULTURE:

The basic village-wise record, land utilisation and crop statistics is maintained by Talathis of Revenue Department. At taluka level this is compiled by Mamlatdars and submitted to Dist. Inspector of Land Records, who compiles for the District and submit to department of Agril..

Table No.3.1:- The table shows land utilisation according various uses for 1961-62 and 1964-65 for each taluka. The terms used in the table are as follows:-

1)Geographical area:-This area represents the total land area and is worked out from the records of survey and settlement.

2)Forests:-This category includes all area actually under forests whether state owned or private and classed as forests.

3)Barren and Unculturable land:-This includes land area under mountains, hills, river beds etc. which is barren and unculturable.

4)Culturable waste:-This includes lands which can be brought under cultivation but which have not been or having been cultivated for some time, have not been cultivated successively for five years.

5)Permanent pastures and grazing grounds:-This includes all grazing lands whether they are permanent pastures and meadows or not.

6)Miscellaneous tree crops and groves not included in area sown:- This category includes lands under ~~thatching~~ grass, bamboo, bushes or other trees used for fuel.

7)Current fallows:-This includes lands which are left fallows during the current year only.

8)Other fallow land:-All lands which have been cultivated but which are temporarily out of cultivations for a period of not less than one year and not more than 5 years.

9)Net area sown:-The net area sown is the actual area under crops, i.e. area where double or triple crops are taken in the same year accounted only for the first year.

10)Gross Cropped area:- This is the total area under crop i.e. net area sown, plus the area sown for second or more times in the same year.

During 4 years period the gross cropped area has increased from 10.77 lakh hect. to 11.06 lakh hect. in the district as a whole. There has been however decrease in gross cropped area in Ambegaon, Sirur, Mawal, Poona City, Dhond, Purandhar Indapur and Bhor. So also there is increase in net cropped area by 0.40 lakh hect. The fallow land has obviously decreased by 0.23 lakh hect. However area sown more than once has decreased.

Table No.3.2:-Area in hectares under different crops is given for each taluka in this table for 1961-62 and 1964-65. The crops are classified in two main groups as food crops and non-food crops. Food crops are further classified as cereals, pulses and others. Non-food crops are similarly shown under fibres, oil seeds. Comparison of the data for 1961-62 and 1964-65 shows that the gross cropped area has increased by 0.29 lakh hect. Almost all this increase is observed under non-food crops. The area under total food crops has remained more or less static. The area under cereals has increased but that under pulses has gone down.

Table No.3.3:-This table gives the outturn and average yield per hect. of principal crops in the district. The outturn figures are in tonnes and yield per hect. in kg. The yield per hect. of cereals, sugarcane and groundnut has slightly increased during the period of 4 years. The yields of pulses and cotton have however gone down. Consequently the actual outturns have increased in case of former crops and decreased in case of latter crops. The increase in the out turn of cereals is only about 3 percent during this period.

Table No.3.4:-In this table, area(in hect) irrigated gross and net is given sourcewise. It will be seen that Baramati and Indapur claim about 60 percent of total irrigated area in the district.

Table No.3.5:-This table gives cropwise area under irrigation for 1961-62 and 64-65. It is seen from this table that more than 80 percent of the gross irrigated area is under food crops. During four years period there does not appear to be much change in irrigated area under food grains. The area under sugarcane has however slightly increased.

Table no.3.6(a):-The No. of irrigation wells in use and not in use is given for 1961-62 and 1964-65 in this table.

Table No.3.6(b):-In this table the No. of minor irrigation works completed as on 30-6-66 by Zilla Parishad, State Govt. and Private or Coop. Agencies, gross command area and area irrigated is given.

Table No.3.6(c):-The information about major and medium irrigation projects in progress or completed during the year 65-66, viz. estimated cost, height of the dam, storage capacity, canal length and irrigable area is given in this table.

Table No.3.7:-This table shows distribution of sample households engaged in cultivation/classified by size of land and interest in land cultivated based on 20 percent survey of sample households during 1961 census. This interest in land cultivated is classified according to the land owned or held from Govt., held from private persons or inst. on payment in cash kind and thirdly partly held from Govt. and partly from private persons for payment in cash kind.

Table No.3.3:-The data presented in this table is collected by the Dist.Statistical Office for three centres viz. Mira,Ghodegaon and Bhigvan. It gives monthwise wage rates for agricultural and allied operations for 65 and 66.

Table No.3.9:-This table gives the statistics of agricultural implements enumerated in 1966 livestock census. Only those implements used for agriculture use have been considered.

Table No.3.10:-The information regarding scarcity conditions has been collected from Collector,Poona and presented in this table. During 1965-66, 1,236 villages covering population of 9.12 lakhs were affected by scarcity. The expenditure incurred for removing scarcity conditions was Rs. 59.87 lakhs during the year.

4. ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND FOREST:-

Table No.4.1:-The summary of the district livestock census conducted in 1966 for each category of animal and poultry is given talukawise in this table. The total cattle and buffaloes in the district is 6.32 lakhs and 1.50 lakhs respectively.

Table No.4.2:-The veterenary statistics viz. no. of hospitals, dispensaries etc. animals treated and inseminated for 61-62 and 65-66 is collected from Dist,Animal Husbandry Officer and given in this table.

Table No.4.3:-Disease wise livestock mortality data 1965-66 during the year 1961-62 and 1965-66 is also collected from Zilla Parishad and given in this table. The mortality of cattle and bovine due to H Septicemia and Antrax has been considerably reduced during 4 years period but black quarter has taken as much as 103 lives of animals out of 200 total deaths during the year.

Table No.4.4:- The information regarding recognised slaughter houses and the animals slaughtered during 1961-62 and 65-66 is collected from Municipalities and presented in this table. Nearly 2 lakh animals were slaughtered during 65-66. This no. is about 16000 more as compared to 1961-62 figures.

Table No.4.5:- This table gives rangewise forest areas (in hect) in this district for 61-62, and 65-66, separately under Revenue dept. and Forest dept.

Table No.4.6:- The data pertaining major and minor forest products viz. timber, fuel, sandal wood etc. is given for 61-62 and 65-66 respectively in quantity and value in this table.

5. EMPLOYMENT: INDUSTRY AND ELECTRICITY:-

Table No.5.1:- Factory statistics pertaining to Poona Dist. is given in tables 5.1, 5.2 and 5.3. The factories are classified into 20 industry groups. Data for 1965 and 1964 calendar years is given. Table no.5.1 gives average daily employment of adults, adolescent and children sexwise and mandays worked in the factories which have submitted prescribed returns under the act. The average daily employment of the factories not submitting returns is also estimated. Though the no. of factories have slightly decreased the average daily workers have been increased.

Table No.5.2:- This table ^{throws} light on other important aspect of factory employment. This classification of factories according to work strength is denoted in this table. There is not much variation in the classification of factories for both the years.

Table No.5.3:-The classification of factories according to no.of days worked in the year 1963 and 1964 is shown in this table. The no.of factories working for more than 300 days has increased to 434 in 1964.

Table no.5.4:-Statistical data relating to handlooms and power looms their production and average daily employment in each centre of this district is given in this table. This data is collected for the years 1964-65 and 65-66 from the Dist.Dy.Registrar of Cooperative Societies and Supdt.of Central Excise. There appears to be considerable increase in the no. of looms production corresponding no.of handloom as well as power loom especially in the former one.

Table No.5.5:-This table gives no.of registration vacancies notified placements, etc. for 1961 and 1965 monthwise.

Table No.5.6:- The registrations and placements according to occupational classification for 1963,64 and 65 is given in this table.

Table No.5.7:-The position of no.of establishments and employes according industry as on 31-3-65 and 31-3-66 is given in this table. The employment during one year period has increased by more than 42000 although no.of establishments have not changed appreciably.

Table No.5.8:- The statistics relating to annual survey of industries during 1961 is given in this table. The table gives ~~xxxx~~ no.of factories, capital, employment and output according to specified industries and their percentages w.r. to district totals.

Table No. 5.9:-This table gives generation of electricity and consumption according to various uses for 64-65 and 65-66 in thousand KW. The data is collected from Maharashtra State Electricity Board and various other private supply companies. The total energy consumed during 65-66 is 2060 lakhs KWH and amounts to 290 KWH per capita.

Table No. 5.10:- The comparative position of no. of villages and towns electrified as on 31-3-61 and 31-3-66 with population covered is given in this table. The source of data is same as for table no. 5.9. During 5 year the no. of villages and towns electrified has increased by 7 times and stands at 285.

6. COOPERATION:

The data for all these tables is collected from the Dist. Dy. Registrar of Cooperative Societies, Poona.

Table No. 6.1:-The no. of different types of working societies according to credit agricultural and non-credit agricultural and non-agricultural in 1965-66 is given in this table.

Table No. 6.2:-The no. of district Coop. banks, membership, share and working capital and loans advanced for 61-62 and 65-66 is presented in this table. The functioning of the district development bank has considerably increased during 4 years period as seen from the table.

Table No. 6.3:-The talukwise details of no. of agril. credit societies, their membership, share and working capital loan advanced etc. for 61-62 and 65-66 are given in this table. The working capital of all agril. credit societies at the end of 65-66 was Rs. 5 crores. The loans advanced during 65-66 amounts to Rs. 1.45 crores.

Table No.6.4:-The same details(except loan operation) as above for other Coop.Societies are given in this table for the district as a whole.

Table No.6.5:-The operation of primary Coop.marketing societies i.e. value of purchase and sale of agricultural produce and requisite is given for 61-62 and 65-66. The total agricultural produce sold during 65-66 amounts to Rs. 61.93 lakhs and is nearly 50 percent more than that during 61-62 jaggery amounts nearly half of the total value of sale.

Table No.6.6:-The operational statistics of other Coop.societies of different types for 61-62 and 65-66 is given in this table. The production of sugar during 65-66 is 71.3 lakhs tons. as against 30.5 lakhs tons durings 1961-62.

Table No.6.7:-The no.of registered money lenders and loans advanced by them to traders and non-traders for 61-62 and 65-66 is given for the district as a whole in this table.

7. MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH:

Table No.7.1:-This table is adopted from table of the census handbook of Poona district(1961). This table gives the information of no.of physicians,surgeons,dentists,nurses and other medical health technicians. Urban and rural area wise and sexwise classification is also given.

Table No.7.2:-This table shows medical facilities available in each taluka of the district. The data is collected from Dist.Health Officer,Civil Surgeon,Municipal authorities and does not include private facilities. The comparative position for 1961 and 1965 is given in this table.

Table No.7.3:- The deaths due to various diseases classified according to out-door and indoor patients for 61 and 65 is presented in this table. The no.of deaths during 1965 shows some decrease compared to 1961 figures.

Table No.7.4:-The statistics about births and deaths and infant(Children below one year) deaths for 1961 and 1965 is collected from Director of Public Health and given talukawise. The no.of births per 1,000 population for 1961 and 1965 work out 23 and 32 respectively where as the no.of deaths per 1,000 population for both years has stood stationary at 11 showing improvement in public health.

Table No.7.5:- The no.of deaths due to important causes is given in this table from 1961 to 1965. The source is same as above.

Table No.7.6:-Talukawise statistics of primary vaccination and revaccination and cholera inoculation for ~~64~~ 1964 and 1965 is presented talukawise in this table. This data is collected from Dist.Health Officer,Zilla Parishad and Poonamunicipal Corporation.

Table No.7.7:-The statistics of testing for B.C.G. vaccination and the results thereof for 1964 and 1964 are obtained from Surgeon General and given in this table.

Table No.7.8:-The talukawise information on hygienic drinking water supply sources is given in this table.(1)No. of villages(2)No.without any drinking water sources(3)No.with inadequate water supply and (4)No.of sources of Hygienic drinking water supply-- are given as on 1-6-64 as per survey of drinking water supply. Nearly 13% of the villages have no drinking water sources in the district.

3. EDUCATION:-

Table No.3.1:-This table gives data on literacy in each taluka of the district according to 1961 census. The data is presented for rural and urban areas of the taluka together with sexwise breakup. So also the literacy percentage is also worked out and given side by side. Rural and Urban classification for males and females is also made available in the table.

Table No.3.2:-This table is based on talukewise data on education in rural areas of the district. The total no.of illiterates and literates with different levels of education is given sex-wise.

Table No.3.3:- This table is devoted to the educational data on total no.of illiterates and literates with different levels of education for the urban area in the district.

Table No.3.4:-This table shows the no.of institutions, pupils and teachers in 1961-62 and 1965-66 according to pre-primary, primary,Secondary,higher institution and special schools. The data is collected from Director of Education and Statistical Epiton 1961-62.

Table No.3.5:- The no.of beneficiaries and concessions given to them in Rs. in various types of institutions as given above is given for the year 1965-66.

Table No.3.6:-The no.of beneficiaries and concessions granted in thousand Rs. during 1961-62,1964-65 and 1965-66 under E.B.C. scheme is given in this table.

Table No.3.7:-The grant-in-aids given to local bodies in Poona District during 1964-65 and 1965-66 is given separately as normal and plan grants with further break-up accordingly to recurring and non-recurring.

Table No.3.8:-The table shows total no.of villages without schools classified according to population ranges.

9. TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION:

Table No.9.1:-This table gives the information on length of railways in Poona District. There are in all three types of gauges in the district. Separate data is given for each.

Table No.9.2(a):- The statistics of road length as on 31-3-64 and 31-3-66 according to category(viz.highways dist.and other roads etc). and according to surface(viz.cement,concrete, black topped etc) is collected from B.& C.Dept..and Zilla Parishad and given in this table. The increase in the total road length during 5 years period is of the order of 2,000 kms. This is exclusive of municipal roads.

Table No.9.2(B):-The surface classification of municipal roads not given above is given municipalitywise in this table.

Table No.9.3:-No.of motor vehicles in operation as on 31-3-61 and 31-3-66 is given according various types of vehicles. The no.of vehicles seems to have been doubled during five years period. The data is collected from the Regional Transport Office.

Table No.9.4:-The statistics of nationalised road transport in Poona divn. as on 31-3-61 and 31-3-66 such as no. of routes,route distance,vehicles on road,average daily earning and no.of passengers is collected from the Divisional Controller of State Transport and presented in this table.

Table No. 9.5:- The data regarding no. of vehicles per day (Light and others) Traffic intensity in tons per 24 hours, on different types of roads was collected on important roads for traffic census in May 1965. This is obtained from B. & C. dept. and given in this table. Of all the roads surveyed the most heavy traffic appears to be at Wakdewadi (In Poona City).

Table No. 9.6:- The statistics of no. of posts, telegraph offices, telephones etc. and radio licences issued is collected for 1961-62, 1964-65 and 1965-66 given in this table. There is considerable increase in no. of telephones and radios in use. The former has nearly doubled and the latter has increased by 6½ times during 4 years period. The data is collected from the Supdt. of Post Office.

Table No. 9.7:- The no. of villages classified according to distance of nearest post office for each taluka as on 31-3-66 is compiled from village index cards and given in this table.

Table No. 9.8:- No. of villages with receiving set installed by Rural Broadcasting dept. and no. of radio farm forums is given talukawise as on 31-3-65 and 31-5-66 and is collected separately from the Divn. Engineer, Rural Broadcasting Dept. and All India Radio, Poona.

10. LOCAL BODIES:

The data pertaining to this group is collected from the Zilla Parishad and all municipalities in this district and for table 10.2 the information is extracted from Annual Administration of V.P.s. report

Table No.10.1:-Income and expenditure of V.P.s & Z.P. and municipalities and cantonments is given in this table for 1961-62 and 1965-66. The income of V.P.s and Z.P. has increased by nearly 4 times and 5 times respectively during 4 years period whereas that for municipalities and cantonments is increased by nearly $1\frac{1}{2}$ times.

Table No.10.2:-The income and expenditure (with break-up according to important items) of V.P.s is given panchayat Samitiwise for 1961-62 and 1965-66.

Table No.10.3(A)(B):-The figures of headwise receipts of Pooná Z.P. are given for 1964-65 and 1965-66 in table no. 10.3(A) and those of expenditure are in given in table no. 10.3(B). The expenditure during 1965-66 is nearly three times than that for 1964-65.

Table No.10.4:-Income and expenditure (Break-up according to important item) is given for each municipality and P.M.C. for 1961-62 and 1965-66 in this table.

11. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND PLANNING

Table No.11.1 and 11.2:-These tables give the progress of Third Five Year Plan. The data is compiled by Bureau of Economics & Statistics. Table No.11.1 gives the information regarding expenditure incurred (Rs. in lakhs) during the third five year plan on dist. level schemes. Sub-headwise for State and Local Sector. The revised plan provision for Pooná Dist. was Rs. 9.53 crores against which Rs. 10.93 crores have been spent.

Table No.11.2:-This table gives physical achievements for important items targeted during the plan.

Table No.11.3 to 11.5:-Give statistics regarding community development programme collected from Block Development Officers.

Table No.11.3:-The coverage of the C.D.Programme in C.P.A.pattern size,area,villages and population according to different types of blocks is given in this table.

Table No.11.4:-This table gives the expenditure incurred in different stages of the block upto the end of 1965-66 for each C.D.Block according to stage I,II and post stage II.

Table No.11.5:-This table gives information about 12 important physical achievements blockwise for 64-65 and 1965-66

12. PRICES

Table No.12.1:-Average retail prices for 51 commodities have been given for each month of 1964 and 1965. This data is collected by the Dist.Statistical Office,Poona,for the Dist.H.Q. For almost all commodities the prices prevailing during 1965 are higher than those during 1964.

Table No.12.2:-There are nine regulated market committees in Poona dist. The data regarding annual arrivals in each regulated committee is given in quantity and value for the year 1965-66.

Table No.12.3:-This table presents the consumer price index no.s for working class for centre Sholapur for the year 1964 and 1965 and for each month of 1965. These indices have been worked out by Commissioner of Labour on the bases of retail prices collected at fixed centres. The base assumed for computation is Feb.1927 to Jan.1928 upto Sept.1965, and for subsequent months the base is changed to 1960. These indices are also given for five groups viz.food,fuel,lighting, clothing and house rent and miscellaneous respectively.

13. MISCELLANEOUS

Tables on some other important subjects which cannot be classified in earlier 12 groups have been included in this section.

Table No.13.1:-This table displays the data on strength of police force and crime statistics for 1961 and 1963 collected from Commissioner of Police, Poona and Dist. Supdt. of Police.

Table No.13.2:-The information regarding the work disposed by Civil and Criminal courts during 1961 and 1965 is collected from Dist. Judge and presented in this table.

Table no.13.3:-The no. of talkies, (Permanent, Semi movement and touring) with seating capacity in each for each taluka is given for the years 1964-65 and 1965-66. There are 36 permanent talkies in this district with seating capacity of 20,000 approximately.

Table No.13.4:-The no. of banking offices in Poona dist. during 1965 is extracted from statistical tables published by Reserve Bank of India 1965 and given in this table.

Table No.13.5:-The no. of joint stock companies during 1961-62 and 1964-65 in public and private sector is presented in this table.

Table no.13.6:-The no. of policies issued and amount incurred during 1964-65 and 1965-66 is obtained from L.I.C. and given in this table. The amount incurred during 1965-66 is Rs. 7.65 crores.

Table No.13.7:-Figures of collection of small savings during 1964-65 and 1965-66 in various savings scheme is obtained from Collector of Poona and presented in this table.

Table No.13,8:-Land revenue collection in each taluka of Poona dist.during 1961-62 and 1965-66 is given in this table The figures are obtained from Collectorate.

Table No.13,9:-The no.of documents registered income and expenditure their from and value of property ,transferred talukawise is obtained from Dist.Registrar and presented in this table.

Table No.13,10:-The data about registration of documents is given in this table. The information is given seperately for each taluka. The data is classified as under:-

1)No.of documents registered(2)Value of properties transferred (3)Income from registrations(4)Expenditure incurred and (5) Net income.

The data is presented for two years 1963 and 1964.

Table No.14:- This table gives trends in selected indicators under Agriculture,Factories,Electricity,Cooperation Education Medical and Health,Transport and Communication and C.D. from 1950-51 upto 1965-66 .w.o.f. 1960-61 the data is given for each year, For earlier period it is given only for 1950-51 and 1955-56. Some important ratios have been worked out and given as item in the above sectors. The unit of each item is also specified in the table.

CHAPTER III

ANALYTICAL REVIEW OF SECTORIAL TRENDS

Although it is one of the aims of planned development to remove the regional disparities it is a difficult task for planners to choose a very small administrative unit which can be regarded as basis for comparing the disparities in a particular sector. Hence taluka being a small administrative unit it is interesting to gauge talukawise disparities in a particular sector at two different points of time.

In this chapter certain indicators have been considered under Agriculture, Irrigation, Livestock, Road mileage and miscellaneous, in order to give their position prior to and after the close of the 3rd plan in different talukas of Poona dist. An attempt has also been made to show the position of Poona dist. in Poona Division wherever possible. Due to non-availability of data for some years, nearest year has been considered for some indicators.

1) AGRICULTURE: Double cropping is one of the methods of increasing the agricultural output. This would be seen from the following table.

It appears from above, that double cropping activity has increased in Poona City, Junnar and Khed talukas. However the same has gone down in Bhor, Dhond and Sirur talukas. Irrigation is one of the factors to increase the double cropping activity provided the irrigation is not utilised for perennial crops. In Poona Dist. Baramati and Indapur have large percentage of irrigated areas. However majority of this area is under Sugarcane and hence the double cropping appears to be low in these talukas. In other talukas changes in double cropping appears to be casual. Hence double cropping does not appear to be seriously thought of in this district.

On the whole the percentage of gross sown area to net sown area in the district has come down from 111 percent to 107 percent. In the division these percentages are 106 and 105 respectively.

2) PRODUCTIVITY OF IMPORTANT CROPS:- The following table gives yield rates and outturn of important crops.

In case of food-grains production, the position in Poona district is low in the division. The yield rate and also the increase observed during the three years period in the district is less as compared to respective figures for the division. The yield rate of important crop Jawar in 1964-65 is only 320 kg. per hect. in the district as against 481 in the division as a whole. The increase in the yield rate of Jawar during three year in the district is 44 kg. whereas in the division it is nearly double than this figure. The yield rates of rice are more or less same in the district and in the division as a whole. The yield rates in case of sugarcane and groundnut have increased by 100 kg in the district ^{but} in the division it has decreased to same extent in case of sugarcane, the yield rates of Groundnut being stationery.

3) OUTTURN OF IMPORTANT CROPS: The total production of foodgrains in the district has increased by 0.20 lakhs tons, the production during 1964-65 being 2.94 lakh tons. This gives 12 oz. per capita per day. This is much less when compared to 17.07 per capita per day, worked on the basis of production population ratio for the division. The production of Jawar, Sugarcane and Groundnut in the district is approx. 12 percent, 11 percent and 9 percent of the corresponding production in the division. The production of rice however during 1964-65 is 0.51 lakh tons and forms 26 percent of the production in the division.

4) IRRIGATION: - The progress of irrigation as revealed from the percentage of net area irrigated to net sown area in the district is not encouraging. In the district this percentage has gone down from 11 percent to 3 percent during

contd...

during the period of three years 1961-62 to 1964-65, where as in the division this percentage has remained stationary at 10. In all the talukas of Poona district except Poona City taluka the irrigation percentage has gone down. The position during 1964-65 shows that Baramati and Indapur are the only talukas in the district where irrigation is more than 20 percent of the respective net sown area. Poona city shows 19 percent. Dhond has got 7 percent and in the remaining talukas it is 5 percent or less.

Double cropping is an advantage in irrigation. This activity however has increased from 114 percent to 137 percent during the above period. In the division the increase is from 117 percent to 122 percent. In Junnar, Khed, Poona City and Velhe the percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area is 100. In the talukas of Mawal, Haveli, Mulshi, and Indapur it is less than 105 percent whereas in remaining talukas it is above 130 percent.

5) CHANGES IN CROP PATTERN:-

During three years period in Poona Divn. 40,000 hectares have been newly added to net cropped area. Almost all this increase is in Poona District. In the division it is observed that there has been decrease in the net cropped area under food-grains and Cotton. There has been however slight increase

contd...

in case of sugarcane and more so in case of groundnut. In Poona dist. no decrease in area has been observed in the net cropped area under food grains, sugarcane, cotton and groundnut. This decrease in groundnut area is 6000 hect. Hence the major increase is observed under non-food crop excluding Cotton and groundnut. In Poona dist. the total area under non-food crops has slightly increased from 24 percent to 26 percent of the total cropped area, the percentage for Poona Division being 22 for both these years. In Bhor, Mawal and Mulshi the area devoted to non-food crops is almost half of the total cropped area. In Velhe Mahal it is 61 percent. In rest of the talukas it is 40 percent or less.

Although the percentage of total area under non-food crops has increased by two percent during three years period, the percentage of irrigated area under non-food crops to total irrigated area has gone down by three percent. This is more marked in Ambegaon, Junnar, Mawal, Mulshi and Sirur. In the former three it is due to increase in the area under Potato and in Sirur it is due to increase in the area under Jawar.

6) AGRICULTURAL CREDIT AND OUTSTANDING DUES :-

The main function of Primary Agricultural Credit Societies is to advance loans to cultivators which would serve as working capital to Agricultural Industry. This loan is advanced for purchasing seeds, manures insecticides, or for land improvement, construction or repairs to wells etc. In a way the functioning of agricultural credit societies will be reflected in loan operations.

As far as loans advanced is concerned the amount advanced during 1955-56 is Rs. 1.65 crores and is nearly Rs. one crore less as compared to that during 1961-62, the position

contd...

of outstanding dues being nearly same for these years. Although the loaning operations during 1965-66 has gone down, the Agricultural produce handled by agricultural marketing societies/ has increased by nearly 2½ times during four years period. The produce handled in 1965-66 was 0.88 lakh quintals valued, at nearly half a crore of Rs. This however does not reflect a trend but gives position at two points, since agricultural output has a seasonal effect. Viewed talukawise Baramati and Indapur claim nearly 60 percent of total advance in the district during 1965-66. This is obviously because these are most irrigated talukas and hence have assured returns. The loans advanced in Mawal, Haveli, Mulshi, Velhe and Purandhar are below Rs. 5 lakhs each. Yearwise comparison shows that level of credit reached in 1965-66 in Junnar, Mawal, Haveli, Purandhar Indapur and Bhore is not even 50 percent of that achieved in 1961-62. As regards outstanding dues Khed, Sirur, Dhond and Baramati show more outstanding dues in 1965-66 as compared to that in 1961-62.

7) AGRICULTURAL WAGE RATES:-

As prices of essential commodities increase it has direct effect on labour charges. This is revealed from the following table. The average wage rates during the year have been pooled for three centres Hira, Ghodegaon and Bhigvan and given in the following table.

The above table shows significant increase in the wage rates of Carpenter and female field-labour. The former shows nearly 30 percent whereas the latter shows 140 percent increase during 3 years period. The wage rates of blacksmith do not show much increase.

8) LIVESTOCK PER 100 HECTARES:

Comparison of 1961 and 1966 livestock data shows that the population has gone down. The ratio of livestock population (Bovine and Ovine) per 100 hectares in the dist. has gone down from 128 to 123. It has also gone down in the division from 123 to 116. The total Bovine and Ovine population during 1966 in the dist. was 14.23 lakhs of which nearly 50 percent, represent cattle 10 percent buffalows and 20 percent each sheep and goat respectively. The decrease is predominantly seen in cattle population and is nearly 60,000. The population of buffaloes has remained more or less stationary during the five year period.

Talukawise ratios of livestock per ¹⁰⁰ hect. vary from 83 (Mulshi) to 238 (Poona City). In Poona City the concentration is due to buffaloes and ovine population.

9) POULTRY AS COMPARED TO POPULATION

The total poultry in the division as per 1966 census is 9.78 lakhs showing an increase of 1.55 lakhs. The proportion of poultry to population in the district is 40 to 100 and is observed to be the same in the division. Majority of the poultry is Deshi.

10) PER CAPITA CONSUMPTION OF ELECTRICITY

There appears to be considerable increase in electrical energy consumption during the five years period. The energy consumed during 1960-61 was 104 million Kwh. which

contd....

nearly doubled during the period and was 223 million Kwh. The per capita consumption works out to 90 Kwh.

Following table gives per capita consumption of electrical energy for important purposes.

Although the total consumption in the district is nearly doubled, the consumption for industrial purpose is increased by more than three times showing high growth of industrialisation. The per capita consumption of electrical energy in Poona Division has increased by 2½ times during the above period the per capita consumption during 1965-66 being 40 Kwh. Thus the per capita consumption in the district is nearly doubled than that in the division as a whole.

11)REGISTRATION IN EMPLOYMENT EXCHANGE:

The problem of unemployment is not only in its magnitude but it involves the question of right job for right person. The employment exchange acts as a linking agency between the unemployed and the employers. With the advent of development in all sectors the job seekers and the jobs are increasing. Though all the jobs seekers do not take the help of the exchange but the number registered shows some increase. The No. registered during 61-62 was 41661 which increased to 44015 during 65-66. The number on the live-register at the end of March 1962 and 1966 was 24230 and 64230 respectively.

contd...

As compared to these figures, no. of vacancies notified was less for both years. The proportion of vacancies notified to the no. on live register for 1961-62 i.e. 1 to 3. The same for 1965-66 is 1 to 3. This shows increase in rate of unemployment.

12) INDOOR AND OUTDOOR PATIENTS TREATED IN THE HOSPITALS:

In Poona Dist. the total no. of indoor and outdoor patients treated (excluding private dispensaries and hospitals) during 1961 was 3.73 lakhs which increased by only about 1500 during 1965. The no. actually decreased in outdoor patients by about 1000 but indoor patients decreased correspondingly. The total deaths out of these patients is 260 during 1965 as against 590 during 1961. Comparison of patients to population shows that every one person out of seven is treated as patient during a year. The major diseases appear to be Dysentery, Diarrhoea and other diseases of digestive system, diseases of respiratory system and urinal organs and injuries. The most important change observed during 1965 as compared to 1961 is that the no. of indoor patients in respect of Cholera, V.D. and Malaria has been brought to Nil. The out-door patients increase of Cholera is also practically nil. The no. of cases reported under Dysentery, V.D. Malaria, disease of nervous system and urinal organs have reduced whereas those under Diarrhoea, pneumonia, diseases of blood and spleen and those due to malnutrition, generative system and respiratory system have increased in the district during four year period.

13) INCREASE IN THE NO. OF STUDENTS:

This dist. ranks first in the divn. as far as No. of institutions and students. Further the Statistics of Primary Schools, Secondary Schools and Higher Institution show that there has been increase in respect of no. of institutions, pupils

contd...

and teachers in all the categories of institutions. The no. of primary institutions (including preprimary during 1965-66 was 2173 as against 1901 in 1961-62. The increase in the no. of students in the dist. during 4 years period is observed to be 12 percent, showing annual rate of increase of the order of 3 percent. The same rate is observed in Poona Division. Percentage of Girls in the total is however 40 in the district as against 37 in the Division. The total No. of Primary students during 1965-66 were 4.06 lakhs i.e. 16 percent of population. The ratio of no. of students to no. of teachers during 1961-62 was 43. This slightly went down to 40 during 1965-66.

The no. of secondary and higher institutions during 1965-66 were 242 and 27 respectively showing an increase of 69 and 7 respectively over four years period. The corresponding students during 1965-66 were 1.06 lakhs and 0.21 lakh respectively. Poona Dist. claims majority (46%) of students in the higher institutions in the division. This is more so as far as only girls are concerned. This percentage for girls works out to 62. This shows that Poona girls go in for higher education significantly more as compared to any other district in the division and even in the State.

14) ROAD MILEAGE:

The following table gives road length (Extra Municipal) according to surface classification:-

The total road length at the end of 1960-61 was 2626 km. which gives 17 km. per 100 sq.km. The same for the Division was 19 km. This ratio for 1965-66 comes to 30 kms. per 100 sq.km. for the dist. Although significant progress is seen in this respect, this is due to increase in kachcha roads, since only 162 km. have been added in pucca roads. Out of this total length of 4303 km. highways run upto 12 percent, dist. roads further 18 percent and remaining 70 percent are rural roads.

Talukawise position is available only 1964. This shows that A mbe gaon and Mawal have well road facilities. The road length per 100 sq.km. in 1964 in these talukas was about 56 km. in each. Next Baramati, Bhor and Sirur were having road length about 22 km. each Dhond and Mulshi had poor length of the order of 10 km. per 100 sq.km. The other talukas were having road length in between 13 km. to 20 km.

15) BANKING FACILITIES:-

The total no. of bank offices as on 1st Jan. 1966 in the dist. were 139 including 66 Coop. Banks/and one non-scheduled, showing an increase of 42 bank offices during 1961. This forms 30 percent of the total bank offices in the Poona Divn. The ratio of population per bank office comes to 17614. This ratio for the division works out as 22232. This therefore shows more banking facilities in the dist. than that in the division.

16) PRICES:

The prices of all commodities are increasing day by day. The consolidated effect of increase in price can be seen from consumer price index. Such index is computed for Sholapur.

contd...

This shows that the general consumer price index has increased from 380 in 1963 to 456 in 1965. i.e. the increase is observed of the order of 20 percent in two years. The main items which are responsible for this increase are food, clothing, and house-
rent showing increase by nearly 100, 130 and 170 points respectively.

Since Nov. 1962 the prices of important commodities at Dist. H. Q. are being collected by this office. The average prices during 1963 and 1965 for 16 items are given in the following table.

In almost all commodities given above except Chillies and Gur the prices have increased. Further as a result of statutory rationing rice, wheat and Jawar disappeared from the open market during 1965. The commodities for which the price is increased by more than 50 percent during two years period are rice, wheat, gram, arhar dal, groundnut oil and brass. The price of Gram-dal is more than doubled. Plantain a common fruit for all rich and poor has become costlier, showing an increase in price by nearly 40 percent. Groundnut oil also shows increase to same extent.

CHAPTER IV

THIRD FIVE YEAR PLAN

The ultimate aim of planning is to transform the ~~economy~~ ^{economy} of the country radically through long term developmental programmes and each plan represents a phase of this long term programme. Since Maharashtra State came into being on 1-5-1960, the Third Five Year Plan is the first phase of such development of the State as a single homogeneous unit. It aims essentially to build-up an agro-industrial society by stepping up the output of Agriculture and Industry and simultaneously removing imbalances that exist in different parts of the State and to obtain high rate of growth in income and employment.

The schemes of the Third Five Year Plan are classified in to three levels viz. 1) State level (2) Divisional Level and (3) District level, depending upon area of benefit accrued due to particular scheme. The district level schemes are implemented under two sectors (1) State Sector and (2) Local Sector (Zilla Parishad).

Under district level schemes, the revised Third Plan outlay for the Poona Division is of the order of Rs. 46.32 crores, out of which maximum provision of Rs. 9.83 crores has been made for Poona district and Minimum of Rs. 5.71 crores for Kolhapur district. These allocations have been made on the basis of population, economically backwardness and extent of scarcity in each district. The per capita

---contd....

outlay on district level schemes, is Rs. 40 for Poona district and 44 for Poona Division. The allocations over various heads reveal that Agricultural programme claims about 44 percent of total plan outlay in Poona District where as it is 46 percent in Poona Division for district level schemes. Cooperation and Community Development has been provided 20 percent of total outlay on district level schemes in Poona district and Poona Division. The percentage allocation for social services is about 29 for Poona district and 23 for Poona Division on district level schemes.

The progress of plan can be seen to some extent from the expenditure incurred on various heads of development. The total expenditure incurred on various sub-heads during the Third Plan is Rs. 1098.36 lakhs as against an outlay of Rs. 987.82 lakhs, thus indicating 111 percent plan utilisation. It can be seen that the plan provision has been fully utilised and more funds were utilised for all major heads except "Industry and Mining", where expenditure is 73 percent of plan provision.

Out of 9 sub-heads under Agriculture programme the expenditure incurred was more than plan provision under 5 sub-heads viz. Soil Conservation, Dairy Development, Forest, Fisheries, Warehousing and Marketing and 93 percent under Agricultural Production, 89 percent under Minor Irrigation, 40 percent under Animal Husbandry, 25 percent under Land Development.

As regards Cooperation and Community Development, the amount spent is 88 percent under Cooperation and more than 100 percent under the Community Development. In case of Industry and Mining and Transport and Communications the amount spent was 73% and 104% respectively of plan provisions.

Under the head, Social Services, expenditure is in excess of the plan provision in respect of sub-heads Public Health, Housing and Social Welfare whereas it is 78% under General Education, 90 percent under Technical Education, 36 percent under Water Supply and 96 percent under Labour and Labour-Welfare.

(For 5 schemes, three from Agril. Programme and two from Social Services, the Plan provision is not given though they are implemented. Hence the percentage of expenditure cannot be calculated).

The above table reveals the progress of schemes under various major-heads. In case of Agril. programme, 2 schemes were not implemented during the Third Plan period viz. CONS-5 Supply of dry farming sets and FSH-10- preservation, marketing and transport facilities for fish. The schemes namely AGR-24; AGR-26 under Agril. production and MLK-11 under Dairy Development lagged behind for which expenditure is less than 10 percent with respect to plan provision.

On the other hand for schemes viz. AGR-27, AGR-31, AGR-32, AGR-33, AGR-34 under Agril. production, CONS-1 under Soil Conservation, MIN-2, MIN-7 under Major Irrigation, MLK-1, MLK-3-a under Dairy Development, FOR-7 under Forest, FSH-2, FSH-7 under fisheries and WM-1 under Warehousing and Marketing the expenditure incurred exceeds the plan provision.

For Co-operation and Community Development one scheme COP-10 viz. Organisation of Co-operatives of persons dependent on transport service was not implemented during the Third Plan Period. The expenditure incurred is less than 10 percent of plan provision in case of scheme CD-9 and more than the plan provision for schemes COP-12 under Cooperation and CD-1, CD-2 and 3 under Community Development.

Under Industry and Mining for the scheme SSI-11 Industrial Co-operatives including Cooperatives of Handicraft workers, the expenditure incurred is more than the plan provision.

The schemes T&C-6 and T&C-12 under Transport and Communications have expenditure more than the plan provision.

Under the head Social Services, the schemes GE-8 pension scheme for teaching staff of local bodies was not implemented during the Third Plan period. In case of 4 schemes, expenditure is less than 10 percent of plan provision while it is more than the plan provision for 8 schemes. Under the sub-head General Education, the scheme GE-21 has expenditure less than

10 percent of plan provision. The expenditure under schemes PH-1, PH-2, PH-4 and PH-7 exceeds the plan provision. The expenditure is less than 10% of plan provision for schemes WS-5 and WS-6 under the sub-head Water Supply. For the schemes HSG-1 and HSG-2 under Housing the expenditure is more than plan provision. Under scheme SW-11 Welfare extension projects, the expenditure exceeds the plan provision. The expenditure incurred under LAB-3 is less than 10% of plan provision and for LAB-1 it is more than plan provision under the sub-head Labour and Labour-Welfare.

PHYSICAL ACHIEVEMENTS:

The following paragraphs indicate the physical achievements of the schemes under the Third Five Year Plan..

Since

Agricultural Production: Agriculture is a private enterprise and the farmers are free to take their own decision, the activities on behalf of the Govt. in this regard consist mainly of distribution of (a) improved seeds, (b) chemical fertilisers and (c) improved agricultural implements to the cultivators, production of compost and green manures, plant protection services, agricultural training and horticultural development. The various achievements during the Third plan under different schemes under agricultural programme are given below:-

The following improved seeds are generally used in Poona district:-

- 1) Paddy--- Varangal--- 9 and Ambenohor---157
- 2) Wheat-- Kenphad
- 3) Jawar-- Maldandi-35-1
- 4) Cotton--Laxmi and Deviraj..

The compost manures could be utilised any where and is also within easy reach of an average cultivator. The scheme of special Kharip and Rabi campaign was taken in the last year of the Third Plan. It consists of supplying free fertilisers to cultivators, construction of kuchha bandharas and propoganda of improved agricultural practices. There was no achievement under this scheme during the plan period, only preliminaries such as purchase of oil engines, fertilisers etc.

were done. Under the package programme, the cultivators are encouraged to bring additional area under irrigation by supplying adequate water from Ghod project.

Soil Conservation:—Under this programme an area of ~~3.40~~ lakh acres has been bunded and 0.07 lakh acres have been terraced in the district at a cost of Rs.293.17 lakhs during the Third Plan period.

Minor Irrigation:—The programme includes construction of new wells, repairs to old ones, installation of pumping sets and construction and repairs of Bandharas. Under the scheme of construction of wells Rs. 9.44 lakhs have been spent on the subsidy. For cultivators who cannot afford to take-up this work, are granted loans by L.D.Banks to the extent of Rs. 2,500 per well, 25% of which is treated as subsidy borne by Govt. During Third Plan period 3,867 new wells have been constructed against target of 4,000 wells and 718 old wells have been repaired in the district.

Under the scheme of installation of pumping sets, an expenditure of Rs. 11.38 lakhs has been incurred and is in excess of the provision. During the Third Plan 2,354 sets have been installed against target of 1,700 sets, which indicates that there is increasing demand for pump sets.

With the establishment of Zilla Parishad, Minor Irrigation Works irrigating less than 250 acres, were transferred to them. Under this scheme expenditure of Rs. 43.89 lakhs was incurred which exceeds the plan provision.

The total irrigation potential that is created by all minor irrigation schemes alone is to the tune of 25,515 acres.

Cooperation:-The Cooperative organisation provides the necessary credit to a needy individual and also acts as an agency for channelising the requisites and services to him in order to take any developmental activities. Under this programme the following types of societies were organised during the Third Plan period.

Loans (medium, short and long term) were advanced to the tune of Rs. 1,153 lakhs during the plan period.

Community Development:-The programme includes all activities concerning rural population such as agricultural production, health, rural sanitation, communication, rural arts, crafts, industries and rural housing. At the end of Third Plan, all talukas of the district were covered by this programme. Financial assistance to local bodies for rural works programme was given. Under the scheme of local development works programme, 460 wells were constructed for drinking water purpose.

Transport & Communications:-

Dist.Roads:- These are roads which traverse the dist. serving areas of production and markets and through the dist.s connecting them with one other or with State highways, National highways or Railways.

contd...

Under the dist. roads programme new roads of length 20.50 miles were constructed and 92.50 miles modernised during the Third plan period. The construction of rural roads is under taken by Zilla Parishad for which grants are given by Govt.. Rural roads of length 185 miles were constructed. The programme of social services includes education, health, water supply, housing, urban development and welfare of weaker section.

The main feature of educational programme consists in spread of basic education at primary level. Under the scheme of normal expansion of primary education, 3,716 teachers were appointed. In order to cope-up the rush of new pupils for primary schools, it is essential to construct new buildings. 223 primary and 146 secondary schools were started and 3 school bldg. with 7 rooms were constructed during the plan period. The increase in no. of pupils at primary and secondary schools was 85,263 and 44,815 respectively.

The preventive measures under Public Health include control and eradication of epidemics and communicable diseases, maintenance of primary health centres and family planning. Two buildings for primary health centres were constructed and 22 primary health centres were started during the plan period. Under the family planning programme 22 new units were started and 20,879 family planning operations were carried out.

contd...

The protected water supply to urban areas is the responsibility of the municipalities and municipal corporations and the rural water supply is to be taken by rural local authorities on public participation basis. 130 drinking water wells were constructed benefitting 130 villages. Under the Housing Programme 632 and 2,130 tenements were constructed under industrial housing and slum clearance. One institution with 151 intake capacity was started under the scheme of evening classes for industrial workers under the programme of labour and labour welfare.
