## CHAPTER No. I

### I N T R O D U C T I O N

**1.1 LOCATION:** Poona District enjoys a position of special importance due to the location in it of the headquarter of Southern Command, important institutions like the National Defence Academy, the Meteorological Observatory, the National Chemical Laboratory, the Hindustan Antibiotics Ltd., the Servants of India Society and the Bharat Itihas Sanshodhak Mandal. Poona District lying between 17-54' and 19-24' north latitudes and 73-19' and 75-10' east longitudes has an area of about 15,600 sq.km. and a population of 24.67 lakhs or 158 population per sq. km. as per 1961 Census. The district has a shape of a triangle with its base in the Sanyadri mountain of the west and its apex in the extreme south-east corner near the confluence of Bhima and Nira rivers.

**1.2 TOPOGRAPHY:**(1) Soil:- The soil of the district is lighter in the west than that in the east. It belongs broadly to three classes, viz. black, red and brown. In some places one class of soil blends with another in varying proportions and is in turn modified by sand, gravel, lime salts and other ingredients.

The black soil is generally found in the eastern portion of Khed, Sirur, Dhond and Purandhar talukas and the whole of Baramati and Indapur talukas. These soils are particularly suited for the Rabi-crops such as Wheat, Gram, Rabi-Jawar and Sugarcane because of their quality of retaining moisture for a longer time.

The western portion of the district comprising the talukas of Junnar, Ambegaon, Khed and Purandhar have red soils. These soils grow Bajri, Groundnut and Chillies.

The brown coloured soil is found in the eastern part of Khed and Haveli talukas and the western parts of Sirur, Dhond and Purandhar talukas. These soils are always shallower and coarser than the black soils. Frequent showers render these soils suitable for wheat and Kharif crops, particularly Jawar and Bajri.

The rich alluvial soil ranging in colour from pale yellow to dark brown is deposited on the banks of the rivers 'Mina in Junnar, Ghodnadi in Ambegaon, Bhima in Khed, Mutha in Haveli, the Indrayani in Khed and Haveli and Mira in Bhor, Purandhar and Baramati talukas.

(2) Rivers:-Poona district is crossed by many rivers and streams which rise in Sahyadris. Bhima is the main river having many tributaries. The Major of them are Vel and Ghod at her left, Bhima Indrayani, Mula-Mutha and Nira on her right. There are seven other rivers, namely, Kukdi, Mina, Shivganga, Gujawani, Karha, Pushpavati and Pavna. During the rainy season, all these rivers flow with a magnificent volume of water but during the summer, they shrink to a narrow thread.

(3) Hills and Ranges:-Out of the two distinct system of hills, one forms the main range of Sahyadris covering about 117 km. in a straight line and about 144 km. following the course of the hills and the other system includes the narrow

broken crested ridges and the bluff flat-topped masses that stretch eastwards gradually sinking into the plain. The crest of Sahyadris falls at places to about 2,000 feet above the sea level, the level of the western limit of the Deccan plateau. In other places, it rises in rounded bluffs and clear-cut ridges to about 3,000 or 4,000 feet high. The leading peaks are in the extreme north Harishchandragad whose mighty scraps nearly 4,670 feet high support a plateau crowned by two low conical peaks. About 16 km. to the south-west at the head of the Kukdi valley and commanding the Nane pass, the massive rock of Jivdham with its fortifications surmounted by a rounded grass-covered-top, rises about 1,000 feet above the Deccan Plateau. The next important hill is Dhak, about 5 km. south of Jivdham. It is one of the highest and strongest points among the battlements of Sahyadris. The bluff of Ahupe is at 16 km. south-west of Dhak where the direction of Sahyadris changes from west to south. It rises from Deccan plateau in gentle slopes, but falls west into the Konkan a sheer cliff between 3,000 and 4,000 feet high.

(4) Minerals:- There are no important mineral resources in the district. However, the rocks in the district which are hard and durable are used extensively as building stones. They are excellent for macadam and tarred roads and are among the best materials obtainable in the country. They are also excellent for use as aggregates in cement concrete. They are quarried on a large scale near Chinchwad, Yerwada etc. Irregular nodules of 'Kankar' and gypsum occur in the soil at a

number of places, especially in the eastern parts of the district. 'Kankar' is locally used for lime burning.

1.3 CLIMATE:- (1) Rainfall:- Poona District gets rains mainly from the South-West monsoon which begins in about the middle of June and lasts till the end of October. The rainy season of the district cover the months from June to October. The rainfall is heavy during the months of July and August.

The district can be divided into three regions according to annual rainfall in the district. The western region comprises of talukas, viz. Ambegaon, Bhor, Mawal, Mulshi and Velhe, where there is sufficient rainfall. The central region comprises of talukas of Junnar, Khed, Haveli, Poona-City and Purandhar where there is a fairly good rainfall. The eastern region comprises of Sirur, Dhond, Baramati and Indapur talukas which has the lowest and uncertain rainfall in the district. From each of these three regions one centre is selected and the deviation of actual rainfall during 1965-66 from normal rainfall is given below to show the spread of rainfall during the year and between the region.

The pattern of rainfall distribution at these 3 centres representing 3 regions is different over the agriculture year 1965-66. Firstly in the western zone the total rainfall is 20 percent than the normal, whereas in central and eastern zones, it is 20 and 12 percent less than the respective normal rainfall.

In the western zone the rainfall in monsoon and winter is seen to be comparatively high w.r.t. normal rainfall, whereas the post monsoon is most unsatisfactory.

In the central zone the monsoon rainfall is 80 percent of normal and winter and pre-monsoon is also satisfactory but post monsoon is again unsatisfactory.

In the eastern zone the total rainfall is fairly distributed as compared to normal rainfall and post monsoon is also not as bad as observed in western and eastern regions.

(2) Temperature:- Due to its high attitude, Poona district enjoys continental climate characterised by larger ranges of temperature in contrast to the maritime climate experienced by Bombay on the west coast. Temperature of three centres viz. Poona-City, Lohagaon and Baramati as shown in the Abstracts shows that the lowest temperature is recorded during January and the maximum during May. Further the range between this minimum and maximum is of the order of 9 to 10 c. The highest average temperature recorded at Baramati is about 30 c. in May whereas at Poona and Lohagaon the highest average is round about 29 c.

Baramati's maximum temperature during May goes to 31 c. Poona-City and Lohagaon recorded round about 29 c. The minimum of Poona City is about 20 c.

(3) Humidity:-Being on the lee side of the ghats, Poona is much drier than the places on coast line. Even in the monsoon months of June to September, the mean relative humidity never generally exceeds 87 percent. March and April are the driest months.

1.4 NATURAL ZONES:This district can be divided into three zones. The western zone comprising Mawal and Mulshi talukas and western parts of Haveli, Khed, Junnar, Ambegaon and Bhor talukas and the Velhe Mahal has regular and assured rainfall and red brown soils and grows mainly rice and millets. The central zone comprising central parts of Haveli, Khed, Junnar, Ambegaon and Purandhar talukas has moderate rainfall and brown soil and grows mainly Bajri, Jowar and Wheat. The eastern zone comprising Baramati, Dhond and Indapur talukas and accounting nearly half the area of the district has uncertain and insufficient rainfall and constitutes mainly the scarcity area of the district. It has black soil and grows Kharif Jowar, Bajri and Wheat.

1.5 FAMINE AND SCARCITY:In Poona district Sirur and Dhond talukas are the main scarcity areas. During the year 1966-67 the scarcity affected area was quite less than that during the year 1965-66. There were no floods during the year 1965-66 and 1966-67 in Poona District. The total no. of villages affected during the year 1966-67 was only 109 covering population of 1.31 lakhs which forms nearly 7 percent of total population.

The estimated loss is only Rs. 37500. In order to give relief in these area about 2.42 lakh Rs. were spent giving employment to 4912 persons.

1.6 TERRITORIAL CHANGES IN THE DISTRICT: As per 1961 Census the following territorial changes are observed in the talukas of Junnar, Ambegaon, Purandhar and Bhor of this district as compared to 1951 Census.

Four villages comprising an area of 25.9 sq.km. of Ambegaon, taluka were transferred to Junnar talukas. Similarly 5 villages of Purandhar taluka comprising an area of 44.6 sq. km. were transferred to Bhor taluka.

1.7 DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION:  
STATE GOVT. ADMINISTRATION: For administrative purposes, the district is at present divided into 13 talukas and one mahal.

The Collector is in charge of general administration, law and order, treasury, land revenue and civil supplies. He is assisted by four Dy.Collectors who hold charge of the four revenue divisions and have their H.Q.s at Poona City, Haveli, Khed and Baramati. Thirteen Tahasildar are in charge of 13 talukas offices and one Mahalkari in charge of one Mahal Office.

Administration of Justice:-The District and Sessions Judge is the head of Judicial Deptt. in the district. The Collector continues to be district Magistrate and the Deputy Collectors and Tahasildars are vested with magistrial powers.

Police: The police force in the district functions under Supdt. of Police for rural areas and Commissioner of Police for urban areas.

Post and telegraphs deptt. and Railways are responsible for postal facilities and communications. Also the meteorological observatory is situated at Poona.

Local Bodies Administrations: With the idea of democratic decentralisation of power, Zilla Parishad were formed in the State. The people are expected to achieve progress more rapidly through their local representatives elected to the Zilla Parishad. The Zilla Parishad, Poona was formed in May 1962 covering all the rural area in the district. This rural area comprises of 1498 inhabited villages covering an area about 14,594 sq. km. and a population of 15.27 lakh persons. At the district level, the Chief Executive Officer, is in charge of General Administration and other functions of Zilla Parishad. He is assisted by District Head of Deptt. implementing Zilla Parishad activities. The Block Development Officers are in charge of taluka administration and are under the Control of Chief Executive Officer, Zilla Parishad-

Municipalities: Twelve out of 22 towns in the dist. have Municipal Committees. They are 1) Junnar (2) Alandi 3) Sirur (4) Lonawala (5) Talegaon (6) Dhond (7) Saswad (8) Jejuri (9) Baramati (10) Indapur (11) Bhor and (12) Poona City.

Other Public Bodies:-

Maharashtra State Electricity Board:- It is in charge of supply of electricity to towns and villages and various industries in the district.

State Road Transport Corporation:- It is in charge of Transport in the district and outside.

1.8 DEMOGRAPHY:

1) General:- The population of the district increased from 19.51 lakhs to 24.67 lakhs during the decade 1951-61. It shows that the population has increased by 26.44 percent during this period. The percentage increase in the population is more in the talukas Sirur, Haveli, Dhond, Velhe, Purandhar, Baramati and Indapur as compared to the percentage increase of the district.

2) The population of Poona district has increased by 5.16 lakhs during the decade 1951-61. While the population of Poona Division has increased by 20.10 lakhs. The percentage increase in the population of Poona is 25 percent of the increase in Poona Division.

3) Density of population:- The density of population in this district has increased from 125 persons per sq- km- in 1951 to 158 persons per sq. km. in 1961. The rural density is 102 persons per sq. km. whereas the urban density is 1,457 persons per sq.km. Poona City and Haveli talukas have densities higher than the district average and all the remaining talukas have below the average.

4)Literacy:-The percentage of literacy has increased from 27.68 in 1951 to 34.31 in 1961. Poona City taluka has the highest rate of literacy i.e. 56.06% and Velhe Manal has the lowest rate of literacy i.e. 14.49. For rural areas, Purandhar taluka has the highest literates. For urban areas Poona City has the highest literates for total males and females.

5)Livelihood classification:-The total no. of workers in Poona District as per 1961 Census is 10.53 lakhs and the non-workers are 14.14 lakhs. Poona District has larger proportion of workers(52.94%) engaged as cultivators than that the State average (46.11) while the district has (9.29) low proportion of agril. labourers than the state average(23.80) The proportion of agril. cultivators is more in all the talukas except Poona-City, Haveli, Baramati as compared with the district proportion. The proportion of agril. labourers is more in Sirur, Haveli, Dhond, Baramati, Indapur talukas as compared with the district proportion.

CHAPTER NO.2  
Explanatory Note

The District Statistical Abstract part of this publication for the year 1966-67 consists of tables presenting the Statistical data pertaining to various sectors. Talukawise break-up is given in most of the tables. In few tables the figures are given for the district as a whole.

In all the tables except population and livestock census the data pertains to two reference period 1965-66 and 1966-67 or calender year 1965 and 1966. In tables pertaining to meteorology, agricultural data, vital statistics and statistics pertaining to Civil and Criminal courts the reference years are calender years. In the tables pertaining to Agricultural data and Cooperative statistics, the years pertain to agricultural and Cooperative years. In other tables the reference year is financial year. In each table district totals are given in the beginning and the talukawise break-up follows next, wherever the data for above reference period is not available the nearest year has been considered.

2.1: Table No.1:-Rainfall in m.m. and rainy days for 13 centres (one centre from each taluka) are given in this table for each month of 1965 and 1966, the figures being collected from Mamletdars in the district. For each centre normal rainfall is collected from Statistician Dept.of Agril.Poona and given in this table for comparison.

Table No.2:-In this table monthwise temperature at three centres viz.Poona and Lohagaon and Daramati is given as mean, Mean maximum and mean minimum in degrees centigrade, the source being Meteorological Deptt.

Table No.3:- This table gives the figures of population(1961) density and variation in population and rural urban break-up for each taluka of Poona District. There are no territorial changes in Poona District.

Table No.4:-This table gives talukewise classification of villages according to population ranges. It is observed that most of the villages especially western part fall in the ranges 200 to 499 due to hilly tract of the district. There are only 4 villages having population more than 10,000.

Table No.5:- This table is on the same lines that of 4. The classification of towns according to population ranges is given in this table. There are 22 towns in the district. There are no towns in Ambegaon and Velhe talukas. There are 2 towns above 50,000 population and one city viz.Poona over 5 lakhs population.

Table No.6:- This table shows classification of workers and non-workers and further break-up of workers according to livelihood classes separately for rural and urban areas of each taluka. The population under categories 1 and 3 pertains to Agricultural working population and that under 4 to 9 non-agricultural working population. Agricultural population is more in rural areas but non-agricultural population is more in urban areas.

Table No.7:-This table gives the distribution of population according to (a)Age group (b)Mother tongue and (c)Religion in Poona district as per 1961 Census.

Table No.8:-The information on the talukawise population of scheduled caste and scheduled tribes is given in this table. The majority of scheduled caste population is in Poona City taluka while Baramati stands second in the district. Junnar taluka has largest no. of scheduled tribes population in the district and Ambegaon stands second.

2.3 Table No.9:-The table shows land utilisation according to various uses for 1964-65 and 1965-66 for each taluka.

Table No.10:-Area in hectares under different crops is given for each taluka in this table for 1964-65 and 1965-66. The crops are classified in two main groups as food crops and non-food crops. Food crops are further classified as cereals, pulses and others. Non-food crops are similarly shown under fibres, oil seeds etc.

Table No.11:-This table gives the outturn and average yield per hect. of principal crops in the district. The outturn figures are in metric tonnes and yield per hectare in kgs. The yields per hect. of cereals, pulses have gone down.

Table No.12:-In this table gross and net irrigated area by different sources is given. It will be seen that Baramati and Indapur claim about 60 percent of total irrigated area in the district.

Table No.13:-This table gives cropwise area under irrigation for 1964-65 and 1965-66. It will be seen that more than 80 percent of the gross irrigated area is under food crops. Also the area under sugarcane has slightly increased.

Table No.14:- The no. of irrigation wells in use and not in use is given for 1964-65 and 1965-66 in this table.

Table No.15:-In this table the no.of minor irrigation works completed as on 30.6.66 by the Zilla Parishad, State Govt. Private or Coop.Agencies and also the cross commanded area and area irrigated by these works.

Table No.16:-The information about major and medium irrigation projects in progress or completed during the year 1965-66 viz. estimated cost,height of the dam, storage capacity,canal length and irrigable area is given in this table.

Table No.17:-The data presented in this table is collected by the Dist.Statistical Office for three centres viz. Nira, Ghodegaon and Bhigvan. It gives monthwise wage rates for agricultural and allied operations for 1965 and 1966 .

Table No.18:-This table gives the statistics of agricultural implements enumerated in 1966 livestock census. Only those implements used for agriculture use have been considered.

Table No.19:-The information regarding scarcity conditions has been collected from Collector, Poona and presented in this table. During 1966-67 only 109 villages from Junnar,Ambegaon, Sirur,Dhond and Indapur, covering population of 1.61 lakhs. were affected by scarcity. This forms only 6 percent of total district population. The expenditure incurred for removing scarcity conditions as Rs. 2.42 lakhs.

2.4 Table No.20:-The summary of the district livestock census conducted in 1966 for each category of animal and poultry is given talukawise in this table. The total bovine population in the district is 8.32 lakhs.

Table No.21:-The veterinary statistics viz. no.of hospitals, dispensaries etc. animals treated and inseminated for 1965-66 and 1966-67 is collected from Dist.Animal Husbandry Officer, and given in this table.

Table No.22:-Disease-wise livestock mortality data during the year 1965-66 and 1966-67 collected from the Zilla Parishad is given in this table.

Table No.23:-The information regarding recognised slaughter houses and the animals slaughtered during 1965-66 and 1966-67 is collected from Municipalities and presented in this table. During 1966-67, 2.12 lakhs animal were slaughtered of which 50% were goats.

Table No.24(A):-This table gives rangewise forest areas (in hectares) in this district for 1965-66 and 1966-67 separately under Revenue and Forest Deptt. This data is collected from Forest Department.

Table No.24(B):-The data pertaining to major and minor forest products viz. timber, fuel, sandal wood etc. is given for 1965-66 and 1966-67 respectively in quantity and value in this table.

Table No.26,27 and 28:-Factory statistics pertaining to Poona district is given in table 26,27 and 28 for the year 1966.

5 Table No.26:-This table gives average daily employment sexwise and mandays worked in the factories which have submitted the returns under the act. The average daily employment of factories not submitting the returns is also estimated.

Table No.27:-This table throws light on other important aspects of factory employment. This classification of factories according to work strength for 1966 is denoted in this table.

Table No.28:-The classification of factories according to no. of days worked in the year 1966 is shown in this table.

Table No.29,30 and 31:-The data for these tables is collected from Employment Exchange.

Table No.29:-This table gives no.of registrations,vacancies notified placement etc. for 1965- and 1966 monthwise.

Table No.30:-The registrations and placements according to occupational classification for 1965-66 and 1966-67 is given in this table.

Table No.31:-The position of no.of establishments and employees according to industry as on 31.3.66 and 31.3.61 is given in this table. The employment during one year period has increased by nearly 38,000 with corresponding increase of 26 establishments.

Table No.32(A):-This table gives classification of Govt.employees according to pay range as per Census of Govt.employees 1966. The total no.of Govt.employees in the district as on 1st July 1966 was 33,013.

Table No.32(B):-This gives distribution of no.of employees according to different department as per Census of Govt. Employees 1966.

Table No.33:- The statistics relating to annual survey of industries during 1961 is given in this table. The total gives no.of factories,capital employment and output according to specified industries and their percentages w.r. to district totals.

Table No.34:-This gives generation and consumption of electricity according to various uses for 1965-66 and 1966-67 in thousand Kw & kwh respectively. The data is collected from Maharashtra State Electricity Board and various other private supply companies.

### CHAPTER III

#### ANALYTICAL REVIEW OF SECTORIAL TRENDS

Although it is one of the aims of planned development to remove the regional disparities it is a difficult task for planners to choose a very small administrative unit which can be regarded as basis for comparing the disparities in a particular sector. Hence taluka being a small administrative unit it is interesting to gauge talukawise disparities in a particular sector at two different points of time.

In this chapter certain indicators have been considered under Agriculture, Irrigation, Livestock, Road mileage and miscellaneous in order to give their position prior to and after close of the 3rd plan in different talukas of Poona Dist. In some cases the position at the end of 1966-67 is also considered. An attempt has also been made to show the position of Poona District in Poona division wherever possible.

1. Agriculture: The following table gives the distribution of talukas according to percentage of gross sown area to net sown area for the year 1960-61 and 1965-66.

The percentage of gross cropped area in the district to net sown area during 1965-66 stands at 105 which is quite less as compared to 111 during 1960-61. During 1960-61 this percentage was more than 105 in eight talukas where as during 1965-66 only four talukas show percentage more than 105.

These are Mawal, Dhond, Haveli and Velhe. Irrigation is one of the factors to increase the double cropping activity provided the irrigation is not utilised for perennial crops. In Poona dist. Baramati and Indapur have large percentage of irrigated areas. However majority of this area is under sugarcane and hence double cropping appears to be low in these talukas.

Since most of the talukas have the percentage of gross sown area to net sown area below the district average double cropping appears to be casual in the district. Hence double cropping does not appear to be seriously thought of in this district.

2. Productivity of Important Crops:-

The following table gives yield rates and outturn of important crops.

In case of food grains production, the position in Poona Dist. is low in the Division. During four years period neither the yield rate nor the total outturn of food grains, groundnut, sugarcane has increased in the district. The food grains production during 1965-66 was 35,000 tons less as compared to 1961-62 production figures and that of groundnut has been nearly halved. The production figures of food grains sugarcane and groundnut in the division for 1964-65 show some increase of 8 to 10 percent over respective production figures during 1961-62. The yield rate of food grains has also increased during the period. On the other hand the yield rate for sugarcane has slightly gone down while that for groundnut has remained stationary.

Comparison of yield rates of food grains, in the district with that in the division shows that it is less than 75% of that in the division. That of groundnut in the dist. is less than half of that in the division and in case of sugarcane the rate in the district is less than 70 percent of that in the division.

### 3. Out-turn of Important Crops:-

The total production of food grains in the district has decreased by 0.35 lakh tons the production during 1965-66 being 2.10 lakh tons. This gives only nine.02 per capita per day. This is much less when compared to 17.02 worked for the division. The production of Jawar, Sugarcane and Groundnut in the district is approximately 10 percent, 8 percent and 3 percent of the corresponding production in the division. The production of rice is also only about 11 percent of that in the division.

4. Irrigation:- The progress of irrigation as revealed from the percentage of net area irrigated to net sown area in the dist. is not encouraging. In the district this percentage has gone down from 11 percent to 8 percent during the period of four years ~~1961-62~~ (1961-62 to 1965-66) where as in the division this percentage remained stationery at 10.

In all the talukas of Poona district except Poona-City talukas the irrigation percentage has gone down. The position during 1965-66 shows that Poona City, Baramati and Indapur are the only talukas where irrigation is 20 percent or more of the respective net sown area. Poona City claim 41 percent, the highest in the district and in the remaining talukas it is 5 percent or less.

Double cropping is an advantage in irrigation. This activity has increased from 114 percent to 133 during the above period. In the division the increase is from 117 percent to 122 percent. In the talukas of Junnar, Khed, Haveli, Velhe and Baramati the percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area is 100. In the talukas of Ambegaon, Mawal, Poona-City and Indapur this percentage is between 110 to 125. In the remaining talukas the percentage is more than 125.

5. Changes in Crop Pattern:-

During the period of four years nearly 35,000 hectares have been newly added to net cropped area of the district whereas in the whole division this increase in the net cropped area during 3 years period is 43600 hectares. In the district nearly 10,000 hectares have been decreased under foodgrains. On the other hand 5700 hectares have been increased under groundnut. Sugarcane shows 1400 hectares increase whereas decrease to same extent is observed under cotton. This shows that the major increase in net cropped area is under non-food crops and the percentage of the total area under non-food crops w.r.t. cropped areas has just increased by one percent during the above period. In Junnar, Ambegaon, Sirur, Dhond, Haveli, Poona City, Purandhar, Baramati and Indapur the percentage of area devoted to non-food crops in each is below 30 percent of the total cropped area of which Haveli and Dhond talukas have only 7 and 8 percent and Sirur, Indapur and Baramati have 11 to 12 percent. In the talukas of Khed, Mawal, Mulshi, Bhor and Velhe the percentage of area under non-food crops to total cropped area in each is 45 or more. In Velhe it is maximum being 64.

During 1961-62, 15 percent of total gross irrigated area was under non food crops whereas this has come down to only 13 percent during 1965-66. This is merely due to increase in percentage area under sugarcane. The percentage of the area under sugarcane during 1965-66 w.r.t. gross irrigated area is 13 percent showing 2 percent increase during the period.

6. Agricultural Credit and Outstanding dues:-

The main function of primary agricultural credit societies is to advance loans to cultivators which would serve as working capital to Agricultural Industry. This loan is advanced for purchasing seeds, manures insecticides or for land improvement, construction or repairs to wells etc. In a way the functioning of agricultural credit societies will be reflected in loan operations.

As far as loans advanced is concerned the amount advanced during 1966-67 is Rs.2.12 crores which is about half crores more as compared to previous year but half a crore less as compared to that during 1961-62. The position of outstanding dues is however better during 1966-67. This amount stands at Rs. 3.23 crores showing nearly one crore Rs. less as compared to earlier year. Viewed talukawise Baranati and Indapur claim nearly 60 percent of total advance in the district during 1966-67. This is obviously because these are the most irrigated talukas and hence have assured returns. The loans advanced in Nawal, Mulshi, Velhe, Purandhar and Bhor are below Rs.5 lakhs each.

7. Agricultural wage rates:-

As prices of essential commodities increase it has direct effect on labour charges. This is revealed from the following table. The average wage rates during the year have been pooled from three centres Nira, Ghodgaon and Bhigvan and given in the following table.

The above table shows significant increase in the wage rates of Carpenter and female field-labour. The former shows nearly 30 percent whereas the latter shows 140 percent increase during 3 years period. The wage rates of blacksmith do not show much increase.

8. Livestock per 100 hectares:- Comparison of 1961 and 1966 livestock data shows that the population has gone down. The ratio of livestock population (Bovine and Ovine) per 100 hect. in the district has gone down from 128 to 123. It has also gone down in the division from 123 to 113. The total Bovine and Ovine population during 1966 in the district. was 14.28 lakhs of which nearly 50 percent represent cattle, 10 percent buffaloes and 20 percent each sheep and goat respectively. The decrease is predominantly seen in cattle population and is nearly 60,000. The population of buffaloes has remained more or less stationary during the five year period.

Talukawise ratios of livestock per 100 hect. vary from 83 (Mulshi) to 238 (Poona City). In Poona City the concentration is due to buffaloes and ovine population.

9. Poultry as compared to population: - The total poultry in the district as per 1966 census is 9.76 lakhs showing an increase of 1.55 lakhs. The proportion of poultry to population in the different talukas varies from 40 to 100. Majority of the poultry is Deshi.

10. Per Capita Consumption of electricity: - Consumption of electrical energy is increasing year by year. The energy consumed during 1960-61 was 104 million kwh. which nearly doubled during the period of six years period and the consumption during 1966-67 was 312 million kwh. The per capita consumption works out to 127 kwh.

Following table gives per capita consumption of electrical energy for important purposes.

Although the total consumption in the district is nearly tripled the consumption for industrial purpose is increased by 5 times showing high growth of industrialisation. The per capita consumption of electrical energy in Poona Divn. has increased by 3 times during the above period the per capita consumption during 1960-67 being 54 kwh. Thus the per capita consumption in the district is nearly doubled than the average for the Poona Division.

11. Registration in Employment Exchange:-The problem of unemployment is not only in its magnitude but it involves the question of right job for right person. The employment exchange acts as a linking agency between the unemployed and the employees. As a result of increase in population and with the advent of development in all sectors the job seekers and the jobs are increasing. Though all the job seekers do not take the help of the exchange yet the number registered shows some increase. The no. registered during 1961-62 was 41661 which increased to 44015 during 1965-66. However this no. went down by about <sup>400</sup> during 1966-67. The no. on the live register at the end of March 1966 and 1967 was 64280 and 52441 respectively. As compared to these figures no. of vacancies notified was less for both these years. The proportion of vacancies notified to the no. on live register for these years comes to 1 to 5. The same for 1961-62 was 1 to 3. This shows some increase in the rate of unemployment. It must be remembered that all the no. on the live register are not unemployed since registration is valid for better employment also.

12. Indoor and Outdoor patients treated in the hospitals:-

In Poona district the total no. of indoor and outdoor patients treated (excluding private dispensaries and hospitals) during 1966 was 12.02 lakhs. Comparison of patients to population shows that nearly half of the population (1961) is treated as patients during a year. The no. of indoor patients is only 17089.

Analysing the No. of deaths due to various causes it is seen that out of total deaths 26807 during 1966 nearly 80 percent are accounted for by other causes and 16 percent by T.B., Dysentery, Diarrhoea and other diseases of digestive system and disease of respiratory system.

13. Increase in the No. of students:- This district ranks first in the division as far as no. of institutions and students. Further the statistics of primary schools, secondary schools and higher institutions show that there has been increase in respect of no. of institutions pupils and teachers in all categories of institutions. The no. of primary institutions (including preprimary) during 1966-67 was 2213 as against 1991 in 1961-62. The increase in the no. of students in the district during five years period is observed to be 23 percent, showing annual rate of increase of the order of 4.5 percent. The same rate is observed in Poona Divn. Percentage of girls in the total is however 40 in the district as against 38 in the division. The total no. of primary students during 1965-66 were 4.24 lakhs i.e. 17 percent of population. The ratio of no. of students to no. of teachers during 1961-62 was 43. This went down to 38 during 1966-67.

The no. of secondary and higher institutions during 1966-67 were 259 and 27 respectively showing an increase of 81 and 7 respectively over five years period. The corresponding no. of students during 1966-67 were 1.14 lakhs and 0.25 lakhs respectively. Poona District claims majority (44%) of students in the higher institutions in the division. This is more as far as only girls are concerned. This percentage for girls comes to 57. This shows that Poona girls go in for

higher education significantly more as compared to any other district in the Division.

14. Road Mileage: - The following table gives road length (Extra Municipal) according to surface classification.

The total road length at the end of 1960-61 was 2626 km. which gives 17 km. per 100 sq. km. The same for the division was 19 km. This ratio for 1965-66 comes to 30 km. per 100 sq. km. and for 1966-67 34 kms. per 100 sq. km. Although significant progress is seen in this respect, this is due to increase in kacha road. Since the length of Kacha roads has increased by three times during the period of six years from 1961. Out of this total road length of 5251 km. highways run upto 10 percent, district roads, further 36 percent and remaining 54 percent rural roads.

15. Banking facilities: - The total no. of bank offices as on 1st Jan. 67 in the district were 148 including 68 Coop. Banks showing an increase of 9 bank offices during one year and 50 during the period of 6 years. The ratio of population per bank office comes to 16700. This ratio for the division works out as 20200. This therefore shows more banking facilities in the district than that in the division.

16. Prices: During the last decade the prices of many commodities are shooting up. The consolidated effect of increase in prices can be seen from consumer price index. Such index is computed for Poona with 1961 as the base period. The index for 1963-67 shows 41 percent increase over the base period 61. The items which were responsible for this increase are food, fuel and light showing increase by 51 to 40 points respectively.

Since Nov. 62 the prices of important commodities at Dist.H.Q. are being collected by this office. The average prices during 1963 and 1966 for 16 items are given in the following table.

\*prices for 1964.

In all the commodities listed above, the prices have increased during three years period. Further as a result of statutory rationing rice, wheat and jawar disappeared from the open market. The commodities for which the prices have doubled during three years period are wheat, gram (dal), groundnut oil and brass. In case of arhar dal, gur, vanaspati, eggs, chillies, potato and plantain the prices have increased to nearly 1½ times those prevailing in 1963. In other commodities the increase is less than this.

CHAPTER 4  
Annual Plan Review (1966-67)  
District Poona

3.1 Introduction:-The Fourth Plan of India was to be started from 1966-67. However this was not possible due to many difficulties especially the uncertainty of foreign exchange. But in order that the tempo gathered during earlier plan period should continue without any break, the Annual Plan was prepared for 1966-67 and an outlay of Rs. 120 crores was provided for Maharashtra State. Out of this Poona Division received nearly 17 crores on District Level Schemes. As compared to other districts (except Sholapur) in the division the Budget Provision for Poona District is highest being Rs. four crores approximately and forms 23 percent of the total provision for the division. The average annual expenditure during Third Five Year Plan for Poona district works out to Rs. 2.50 crores. Hence the Budget Provision for 1966-67 for the district is also more as compared to average annual third plan expenditure.

3.2 Plan Expenditure 1966-67:-The total expenditure during Annual Plan 1966-67 in the district as given in the following table comes to Rs. 377.8 crores. This gives per capita expenditure of Rs. 15 as against Rs. 16 for the division.

Comparison of Third Plan expenditure over various heads with that during Annual Plan 1966-67 shows that the percentage expenditure for schemes under Agricultural Programmes has remained more or less same. As regards Irrigation and Power the scheme of rural electrification was treated as division level during third plan but classified as <sup>district</sup> level during Annual Plan 1966-67 and nine percent of total expenditure has been incurred on it. The percentage expenditure on Cooperation and C.D. and Social Services has gone down whereas that on Transport and Communication has increased by four percent.

Out of total expenditure of Rs. 3.78 crores Rs. 2.60 crores have been spent under State Sector Schemes and the remaining 31 percent under local sector schemes. The major portion of State Sector Expenditure is on Soil Conservation (Rs.91 lakhs) Minor Irrigation (Rs. 18 lakhs), Rural Electrification (Rs. 60 lakhs) and Water Supply and drainage (Rs. 41 lakhs) This forms nearly 80 percent of expenditure on State Sector whereas expenditure incurred on Minor Irrigation (Rs.20 lakhs) C.D. (Rs. 25 lakhs) Road Development (Rs.35 lakhs) and General Education (Rs. 13 lakhs) under local sector forms nearly 78 percent of the total local sector expenditure.

### 3.3 Important Achievements:-

3.1 Agricultural Programmes:-The total expenditure on this major head during 1966-67 is Rs. 160.17 lakhs of which Rs.133.43 lakhs have been spent on State Sector and remaining on local sector. On the sub-head Agricultural Production Rs. 8.16 lakhs were spent on both sectors. As against this following important achievements were observed. Horticultural plantation

contd...

was carried over 232 acres and rejuvenation over 66 acres. Development of local manurial resources consists of two sub-schemes, <sup>viz</sup> Distribution of sann seed and town compost. The sann seeds distributed amount to 2083 quintals. This is quite low due to <sup>untimely</sup> rains which affected the demand. The town composting was done by the Municipalities to the extent of 40,000 tons. The respective areas covered under intensive cultivation of food crops, Kharif and Rabi Crop campaign are 1.37 lakhs acres, 0.81 lakh acres and 6,000 acres. The progress of crop campaign was observed to be slow due to inadequate supply of improved seeds and shortage of fertilisers. Due to less incidence of pests and diseases in Rabi season the scheme of plant protection was not implemented. Only 366 plant protection appliances were distributed during the year. The scheme of improved seeds consists of grant of subsidy to V.P.s and Cooperative Societies for distribution of improved seeds, establishment of talukas seed farms and hybrid seed production plants. The improved seeds distributed during the year amount to 16457 quintals and one hybrid seed production plant has been established at Majari.

The expenditure incurred on contour bunding and terracing under Soil Conservation Programme is Rs. 92 lakhs and it alone forms 24 percent of total expenditure 77,000 acres have been contour bunded under this scheme and 1092 acres under terracing during the year. The total area bunded at the end of 1966-67 stands at 6.80 lakh acres and this forms 24 percent of total cultivable area. This percentage

contd...

for the division comes to 23. The next important sub-head under Agriculture is Minor Irrigation on which, Rs. 38.40 lakhs have been spent during the year. This forms only 9 percent of total expenditure in the division. Of this Rs. 20.13 lakhs have been spent on Minor Irrigation Works in local sector. The new wells constructed during the year no.751. The total no. of wells in use at the end of 1966-67 in Poona dist. thus comes to 0.70 lakhs. Further 606 pumping sets have been installed during the year. With the help of boring machine 39 bore wells have been constructed in the district. Under State and Local sectors both, eight minor irrigation works viz. tanks and bandharas have been completed and 7 lift irrigation societies have been organised during the year. The important irrigation work completed under state sector is Ambavane Bandhara in Velhe Mahal.

The expenditure on Animal Husbandry and Dairy Development during the year is Rs. 0.80 lakhs and Rs. 10.26 lakhs respectively. The veterinary dispensary at Poona was converted into veterinary Polyclinic and one cattle breeding centre was already established during third plan. During the year under report 13 bulls were located under premium bulls scheme. The target in case of Govt. Milk scheme of achieving 1 lakh litre of handling of milk could not be achieved during the year. The achievement was only 18000 litres per day. The plan expenditure on Forest during the year is Rs. 1.02 lakhs. Although the area under Forest is not optimum as prescribed by the National Forest Policy, the percentage of Forest area w.r.t. total geographical area of the district is 12.2 and is more by two percent as compared to the percentage in the division as a

contd...

whole. The plantation programme during the year was carried over 30 hectares for fuel purpose. This is quite less as compared to 510 hectares covered in the division. The Bamboo plantation was carried over 200 hectares is quite significant as compared to 480 hectares in the division. Further 132 hectares have been covered under fodder plantation.

The expenditure incurred on Fisheries was only Rs.0.31 lakhs. The stocking of fish during the year was considerable viz. 6.76 lakhs and approximately two thirds the achievement in the division. The actual netting has been 25 tons and the fishermen were supplied with 377 kg. of nylon during the year.

3.32 Cooperation and Community Development:- The expenditure on Cooperation is about Rs. 27 lakhs and forms 12 percent of total expenditure. Out of this only Rs. 2.17 lakhs is incurred on Cooperation. In Poona district seven agricultural credit societies with additional membership of 1207 were organised during 1966-67. The percentage of membership w.r.t. cultivating population at the end of the year stands at 68. This is lowest in the division. Moreover one farming society and one consumer store were also organised during the year.

In Poona District the no. of blocks (C.P.A. size) allotted as on 31.3.67 were 6.50 in Stage I, ~~100x00~~ 11.00, in Stage II, 4.50 in stage III and 2.00 in T.D. respectively. The total no. of blocks in the district is maximum in the division and forms nearly 1/5 % of the total blocks in the division. The total expenditure on C.D. Programme during the year is Rs. 25 lakhs approximately and forms 21 percent of total plan expenditure in local sector. The No. of drinking water wells constructed under this programme is 68. This is quite significant as compared to the achievement of 130 wells during the

contd...



third five year plan.

3.23 POWER: There is only one scheme viz. Electrification of villages and towns and pumps under this programme. The expenditure incurred on this scheme during the year is Rs. 60.67 lakhs. This is quite less as compared to the expenditure in the division. (Rs. 2.78 crores). The total no. of villages electrified during the year is only 48 and pumps connected number 1682. The total no. of villages electrified at the end of 1966-67, thus forms 25 percent of total villages in the district. This position is better as compared to that of the division as a whole. The total no. of pumps connected at the end of March '67 stands at 4700 and forms 26 percent of the total pumps connected in the division.

3.34 INDUSTRIES:- The programme consists of development of handloom industry and financial assistance to industrial Cooperatives. The expenditure of Rs. 0.20 lakhs and Rs. 0.22 lakhs has been incurred respectively on these schemes during the year. The former expenditure is incurred to assist one weaver's society during the year.

3.35 TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATION:- In Poona district Rs. 36 lakhs have been spent on Road development during 1966-67. Out of this Rs. 35 lakhs have been spent on local sector schemes. The expenditure in this district is more as compared to that in other districts of this division as this forms 28 percent of total expenditure on Road Development in this division.

Since most of the expenditure is on local sector and since the major work under taken by Zilla Parishad under road works is rural roads hence the achievement in respect of new construction of district roads is nil, only 5 miles of dist.

have been constructed during the year. ~~The total road mileage~~  
at the end of the year 1966-67 works out of 45 miles per 100  
sq.miles.

3.36 SOCIAL SERVICES:-The expenditure on Social Services during  
the year is Rs. 93 lakhs and forms 24 percent of the total  
expenditure.

Under General Education Rs. 13.46 lakhs have been  
spent and 22 67 primary teachers were appointed during the year  
Although Poona district is supposed to be much advanced it had  
at the end of third five year plan maximum no.of villages  
without schools viz. 187 and at the same time minimum no.of  
schools (85) per lakh population as compared to other district  
in the division. At the end of 1966-67 the no.of villages  
without primary schools decreased to 128 and the no.of schools  
per lakh population stood at 89.

On Technical Education and Medical Health Rs. 3.91 lakhs  
and Rs. 6.44 lakhs were spent during the year. The expenditure  
incurred on the former forms 20 percent of that incurred on the  
same sub-head during third plan and the expenditure on medical  
health is exactly the same as that incurred during the third  
plan.

On Public Health Rs. 14.09 lakhs were spent. The  
programme constituted, primary health centres, National  
Malaria and Small pox eradication and family planning.  
According to state study group on public health there should  
be at least one primary health centres, for 30,000 population  
by 1975. This gives the target of 51 centres. As against this  
27 centres have been already established at the end of the third  
plan. As regards family planning, Poona district leads in -  
respect of operations 9467 operation were performed during -  
1966-67 in the district which is nearly 50 percent of the achieve-  
ment in the division. In the like manner Poona district claims

lion's share as far as expenditure on water supply and drainage in the division is concerned. Rs. 43.32 lakhs have been spent in the district out of Rs. 84.84 lakhs in the division. Almost all this expenditure is in state sector and the following water supply schemes were completed during the year. Jejuri, Junnar, Alandi, Pimpri and Dapodi (Filtered). Further Yerwade colony drainage scheme was also completed during the year. The housing programme was hampered by shortage of funds. Only Rs. 9.0 lakhs were spent during the year as against Rs. 111.01 lakhs during the third plan. All this expenditure was incurred mostly to complete the spill over works. Under village housing scheme 63 villages were covered during the year.

Under welfare of backward class Rs. 6.05 lakhs and under Social Services Rs. 0.29 lakhs were spent during the year in the form of financial assistance to individuals and institutions for various purposes like educational facilities, economics uplift housing, drinking water supply etc.
