

CHAPTER I
INTRODUCTION.

1.1. General.

Poona Division is located between $15^{\circ}6'$ to $20^{\circ}6'$ north latitude and $73^{\circ}2'$ and $76^{\circ}2'$ east longitude. To its north and west, there is Bombay Division, to the east Aurangabad Division and to the south Mysore State.

The area of the division is 74,705 sq.km. which is about one-fourth of the area of Maharashtra State. Its population is a little more than 1 crore as compared to about 4 crore population of the State.

The Division comprises of six districts viz.,

- a. Ahmednagar,
- b. Poona,
- c. Satara,
- d. Sangli,
- e. Sholapur and
- f. Kolhapur.

Since 1961 Census, the boundaries of these districts have not undergone any changes.

1.2. Administrative Set-up.

Each of the above mentioned districts is under the control of a Collector who is in charge of general administration, law and order, land revenue and civil supplies. The six collectors work under the overall control of the Divisional Commissioner, Poona. The Collector of each district is assisted by a Resident Deputy Collector in his office. The revenue sub-divisions of the districts are in the charge of Prant Officers/Deputy Collectors. The Talukas/Mahals which are the sub-divisions of a district are under the control of Tahasildars.

1.3. Historical Background :

Stone Age remains are found on the banks of Mutha river in Poona city area. However, nothing specific is known of the period upto the 13th century A.D. in the beginning of which there was the kingdom of Dakshinapath, with its capital at Junnar.

Muslims ruled over the major part of this division till Shivaji came on the scene. Aurangazeb unsuccessfully tried to vanquish the Maratha power. The Peshwas who later came into power expanded the frontiers of the Maratha Kingdom and had

practically the whole of India under their sway at one time. However, due to internal strife the regime came to an end in the year 1818, when the British wiped it out. After 1818, the socio-economic life of the peoples of this region underwent important changes like, introduction of mass education, new methods and technique of production etc. The peace that prevailed for some time proved to be illusory. There was the war of independence of 1857 and the final ouster of British Raj in 1947. Great historical personalities from this region like Lokmanya Tilak, Ranade, Gokhale were on the forefront of the movement for independence.

1.4. Physical setting :

Geographically, Poona division forms part of Western India. The Sahyadri Ghats and beyond them an undulating plateau make this region.

Geologically, the basal complex of western India consists of igneous rocks upon which rests a metamorphic series. This igneous complex has given rise to terraced hills and broad valleys. There are varying local features also and all these add variety to the division's landscape.

The Sahyadri mountain which is the principal relief of this division starts from the western shoulder of the division and traverses in the south-west direction upto Bhor Ghat and then goes almost straight in the southern direction. The crestline is highest at Mahabaleshwar. There is a contrast between the western and eastern flanks. The western flank of the Ghats is a fractured edge of the plateau marked by a series of terraces, so typical of the Deccan Lava landscape. The eastern flank, on the other hand, consists of plateaus, which have fairly broad basins drained by major plateau rivers and their tributaries.

Poona Division forms almost the beginnings of the Godavari and Krishna systems which cover about one-third portion of Peninsular Table land. The Bhima river cuts right across the division. The rivers Bhima and Krishna have almost an equal drainage, whereas, comparatively, the Godavari has a very small drainage in the division. The Mahadet ranges separate the upper Krishna drainage from the Bhima basin. The Balaghat range distinguishes the Bhima basin from that of Godavari. All the rivers in this region are graded streams and develop shallow and meandering courses outside the Sahyadrian zone. During rainy season the flood waters entail much soil erosion, while during dry part of the year they resume a slender course in a large bed. All other

water courses in the east are markedly seasonal in their flow.

Poona division has no important minerals, excepting building stones, clay and limestone, which are common to all the districts. Laterite is widely formed in the western part of Satara district. Twenty villages in Jaoli and thirty villages in Patan taluka of Satara district contain iron ore in the murum below the laterite. The ore is of a low grade and unsuitable as yet for commercial exploitation. In Kolhapur district there are very large areas containing deposits of exceptionally high grade bauxite in sufficient quantities. The quality of the material is very good and is suitable for the manufacture of aluminium.

1.5. Climate :-

a. Rainfall :-

Due to relief of land and the direction of rain-bearing winds, the distribution of rainfall varies considerably from place to place.

Mahabaleshwar which is in the regions of Sahyadri gets the highest rainfall - on an average 6,000 mm in a year. Broadly rainfall declines from the southwest to the east and the north, but relief locally modifies this tendency.

Most of the rainfall in the division is received from the south-west monsoons but later Monsoons also contribute a share.

Failure of rainfall is practically unknown to the western part of the division, while it is a frequent experience in the eastern most parts, such as Sholapur district and some talukas in Poona, Sangli and Satara districts.

The year 1965-66 was a bad year for agriculture due to scarcity rainfall in many parts of / scanty the districts.

b. Temperature :-

Cold season normally starts from the second fortnight of October. November marks the onset of winter season and ends in the month of February, when the temperature begins to rise, reaching its peak in the month of May.

Temperature starts cooling down from June to to the first week of October. The average summer and winter temperature, however, naturally depends

upon altitude. Eastwards over the plateau higher/seasonal ranges are recorded. In the western and central portion of the division, nights are cool and early mornings cooler.

c. Humidity and annual cloudiness.

As compared to the coastal region of Bombay, there is less humidity in this division. During the rainy season, humidity is generally high. It declines in winter season and the summer season witnesses dry weather. The seasonal variation in cloudiness is mainly dependent on the prevailing winds. In April, the proportion of cloud is as low as 2/10. July and August are months of maximum cloudiness when the proportion reaches nearly 8/10 except in the eastern-most part of the division, where the sky is more clear. From October cloudiness in the sky begins to decline appreciably and by November the skies become clear.

The western tips of Poona, Satara and Kolhapur dist. witness very heavy rainfall over 375 mm.s, high humidity and lower temperatures on higher slopes. Immediately after this region there is a belt of about 50 to 100 km.s in width, running straight from north to south. In this belt rainfall varies from 1,000 to 1,750 mm.s and rapidly declines eastwards. In the third part of the division rainfall is received from southwest and north-east monsoons.

d. Soil :-

Most of the soil in this division is " Medium black soil on trap ". However, there are superior tracts also and they are found in those areas through which big rivers like Krishna, Bhima, Godavari flow. The soil in these tracts is of the type known as " deep black soil from trap. "

e. Geographical region :-

The geographical region is to be distinguished from administrative region, the boundaries of the latter being drawn by keeping in view administrative convenience. Thus the apparently compact unit of a division or a district often shows regions of great

natural contrast.

The whole of Poona division falls into what can be termed as the ' Maharashtra Plateau ', which is that portion of the Deccan Table Land that is bounded on the north by the Satpuras, on the west by the edge of the Sahyadris and on the east and south by administrative boundaries.

On geographical basis, this division can be sub-divided into six groups :-

i. The Sahyadrian Main Range :-

This range as it enters Poona division takes a south-west turn for about 50 miles and then run almost parallel to the coastline. Mahabaleshwar and Panchgani Plateaus are situated in this tract which is thinly populated. Only a small portion of this region is under cultivation.

ii. Maval Transitional Tract :-

The eastern flank of the Sahyadris, drained by the waters of Godavari and Bhima rivers is a transitional region situated between the Sahyadrian Main Range and the dry plateau. This region, with hills and valleys, is intensely cultivated and well-populated in the valley part.

iii. Balaghat and Mahadev Upland Tracts :-

The eastern plateau is marked by three major and many minor hill ranges. The Balaghat range demarcates the basin of Godavari from that of Bhima and the Mahadev hills separate the Bhima basin from that of the Krishna. A major portion of this tract is forests and grass lands. Cultivation is inferior.

iv. Godavari basin :-

A part of Godavari basin lies in Poona division. It has rich black soil yielding good harvests. In the Talukas of Kopargaon, Shirarpur & Newasa in Ahmednagar district, the advantages of the soil are further enhanced by canal irrigation. The sugar industry in Ahmednagar district depends on this well developed area.

v. Bhima Basin :-

The drainage area of Bhima basin which is as big as that of the Krishna, trap soils of varying fertility

and dry climate have given a distinctive feature to this basin. The central and south-eastern portions of this basin greatly differ from the western belt mainly because of its dry climate and greater proportion of poor soil. The immediate flanks of Bhima river are well cultivated but yields are highly susceptible to scarcity. The upland portion of the basin formed by Balaghat and Mahadev ranges grows hardier crops like Bajra. The Sina and Nira rivers have formed tributary basins in this region.

vi. Krishna- Panchaganga Basin :

This region is drained by the Krishna river and its major tributaries, Kyna and Panchaganga. This region also has a rich black soil cover developed on the Deccan lavas under a more ^{humid} climate. The valleys though considerably restricted by hill ranges form belts of intensive cultivation. Crops like

- i. Jowar,
- ii. Wheat,
- iii. Cotton

are grown here; but sugarcane and tobacco are its main cash crops. In the southern part of this region, sugarcane has gained importance due to rapid development of sugar industry in the Miraj - Sangli - Kolhapur area. This area is free from scarcity.

CHAPTER II.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

2.1. As the caption indicates, this chapter is meant to give the scope and limitations of the statistical data given in the present issue, namely, the Divisional Statistical Abstract :1965-66.

The Divisional Statistical Abstract is prepared by compiling the data given in the District Statistical Abstracts of the six districts of this division, which are

i. Ahmednagar,

ii. Pooncha,

iii. Satara,

iv. Sangli,

v. Sholapur, and

vi. Kolhapur.

The District Statistical Abstracts in turn are prepared by the Dist. Statistical Officers who collect data from the concerned departments.

It is but natural to expect that the Abstract for the year 1965 - 66 should furnish the data for that year. However, inspite of the efforts made in that direction, data for that year were not available on all the items. And hence in such cases, statistics for the earlier year are given.

The Divisional Statistical Abstract is divided into 12 subjects, viz.,

1. Climate,

2. Area and Population,

3. Agriculture,

4. Animal Husbandry and Forest,

5. Industry, Employment, Mining and Electricity,

6. Co-operation,

7. Medical and Public Health,

8. Education,

9. Transport & Communication,

10. Local Bodies,

11. Plan and Community Development, and

12. Prices,

Various other statistics like

i. Strength of police force and crime statistics,

ii. number of banking offices, etc.
not covered under the above major subjects are grouped and item 13 gives data on these miscellaneous subjects. In addition, 'Poona Division At a Glance' and 'Trends in selected indicators' are also given in the Abstract.

1. Climate :

While table no.1.1 gives information regarding the number of rainy days and total rainfall in each month of the years 1961 and 1965, table no.1.2 shows Mean, Mean Maximum and Mean Minimum temperatures in the years 1961 and 1966. The data are for the selected centres only. The mean maximum and mean minimum are the averages of maximum and minimum temperatures observed daily during the said years. The mean temperature is the average of the mean maximum and mean minimum temperatures thus arrived at.

2. Area and Population :

Table numbers 2.1 to 2.7 cover the information on this subject. The tables are based on the 1961 Census Handbooks. The information for the six districts as well as for the division as a whole is given in the Abstract and it covers statistics on district-wise rural and urban population and variation with the 1951 Census, classification of villages and towns according to population ranges, occupationwise number of workers in each district, number of non-workers in each district, scheduled castes and scheduled tribes and population of urban areas.

A town or an urban area has been defined as

" a place which has a municipality, a cantonment or a civil line or a population of 5,000 or over and at least $\frac{3}{4}$ ths of male population dependent on non-agricultural pursuits. "

A population enumerated in urban areas is urban population and the population enumerated in all other places is rural population.

Regarding data on scheduled castes and schedules tribes, it may be mentioned that at the time of 1961 Census, all backward castes or tribes living in the districts were not included in these two groups. They include only the castes or tribes declared as scheduled castes or scheduled Tfibes in a district.

3. Agriculture :

The important statistics under this section is covered

Statistics are 1961-62 and 1964-65 / (Table no.s 3.1 to 3.6(a)).

The tables cover such comprehensive information as

- i. land utilization,
- ii. area under different crops,
- iii. yield per hectare and outturn of principal crops,
- iv. area irrigated by different sources,
- v. area irrigated under different crops and number of irrigation wells.

Table no.3.6 (b) gives statistical information regarding minor irrigation works in each district of the division. For this table wells are not considered as minor irrigation works. Area under command is defined as

" an area to which by virtue of topography water could be supplied by gravitational force. "

In table no.3.6 (c), information regarding major and medium projects in Poona division as on 30-6-1966 is given.

Table no.3.7, which is based on the 1961 Census Handbooks, deals with percentage distribution of households engaged in cultivation classified by interest in land and size of land cultivated. The table is based on 20 per cent sample.

Table no.3.9 gives provisional data on agricultural implements, the source of which is Live Stock Census : 1966.

The last table in this section (3.10) gives a picture of famine, scarcity and akin to scarcity areas in Poona division in the year 1965-66.

4. Animal Husbandry :

This section has six tables which give statistical data regarding

- i. livestock, (provisional data),
- ii. veterinary,
- iii. diseasewise livestock mortality,
- iv. number of recognized slaughter houses and animals slaughtered,
- v. rangewise forest data and
- vi. major and minor forest products.

5. Industries:-

Section 5 gives various types of statistical data on industries.

Table no.5.1 is regarding employment in factories. Industrywise data for the two years (1963 and 1964) is

furnished.

Table no.5.2 pertains to the distribution of working factories according to product and their working strength.

In table no.5.3 distribution of factories according to the number of days worked during the years 1963 and 1964 is given. While table numbers 5.1 and 5.2 cover all the factories (inclusive of the data estimated for factories not submitting returns) , table no.5.3 covers only those factories which submit returns.

The scope of table no. 5.3 is thus limited.

Statistics relating to handloom and powerloom for the years 1964-65 and 1965-66 is given in table no.5.4. The figures are provisional.

Data on employment are given in three tables,viz., 5.5, 5.6 and 5.7.

In table no.5.6 registration and placements are given according to National classification of occupation.

Statistics relating to annual survey of industries is given in table no.5.8 and that regarding electricity, generation or consumption in table no.5.9.

In table no.5.10, number of towns and villages electrified and population covered.

6. Co-operation.

In table numbers 6.1 to 6.7 statistics on Co-operation is given.

In table 6.1 number of different types of co-operative societies working in all the districts of this division during the year 1965-66 is given.

The societies are classified into four broad categories,viz.,

- i. Agricultural credit,
- ii. Non-agricultural credit,
- iii. Agricultural non-credit and
- iv. Non-agricultural Non-credit societies.

These four types of societies are further classified into various types,e.g.,

- i. District Central Co-operative Bank,
- ii. District Development Bank etc.

Information regarding membership of co-operative banks, their share capital,loans advanced etc., is given in table no.6.2.

Data pertaining to the activities of primary agricultural credit societies during the years 1961-62 and 1965-66 are given in table no.6.3.

In table no.6.4, membership, share capital etc., of co-operative societies other than agricultural credit banks is given for three

years viz., 1961-62, 1964-65 and 1965-66. In this table due to non-availability of break-up of figures of members into societies and individuals, consolidated figures are given.

In table no. 6.5, operations of primary co-operative marketing societies in each district of this division during the years 1961-62 and 1965-66 are given.

Operation of other co-operative societies of different types e.g.,

- i. fisheries societies,
- ii. handloom workers' societies, etc.

are given in table no. 6.6.

In table no. 6.7 districtwise number of registered money lenders and loans advanced by them during the years 1961-62 and 1965-66 are given.

7. Medical and Public Health.

In table no. 7.1 number of persons engaged in medical and public health profession according to 1961 Census is given. Rural, urban and sexwise classification for the six districts is given in it.

Comparative statistics for the years - 1961 and 1965 - regarding medical facilities available through public and public-aided bodies in each district of the division is given in table no. 7.2.

Diseasewise classification of patients- indoor and outdoor - treated in Poona division during 1961 and 1965 is given in table no. 7.3.

In table no. 7.4, number of births and deaths registered during 1961 and 1965 is given, while in table no. 7.5 important diseasewise number of deaths during the five years period - 1961 to 1965 - is given.

Vaccination statistics and cholera inoculation in all the districts of the division are given in table no. 7.6.

B.C.G. vaccination statistics can be found in table no. 7.7.

Hygenic drinking water supply sources available in the rural areas and based on the survey of Rural Drinking Water Supply are shown in table no. 7.8.

8. Education.

This section covers a wide range of data on education, namely

- i. districtwise rural and urban literacy with percentages,
- ii. sexwise education in rural areas and urban areas as per 1961 Census,

- iii. number of educational institutions
- iv. number of pupils and teachers during the years 1961-62 and 1965-66,
- v. number of beneficiaries and concessions granted to the B.C.s. during 1965-66
- vi. Economically backward class concessions of free education during the years 1961-62, 1964-65 and 1965-66,
- vii. expenditure on primary " education by way of grants-in-aids to the local bodies during the years 1964-65 and 1965-66,
- viii. classification of towns and villages without primary school or schooling facilities by population range during the years 1961 and 1966.

9. Transport & Communication :

Section 9 deals with Transport and Communication and it gives information regarding districtwise length of railway route, road length (extra municipal) according to the category and surface, motor vehicles in operation, traffic census, posts, telegraph and telephones, etc.

Regarding table no.9.7 (availability of postal facilities) it may be mentioned that while giving data even if the nearest post office is located in neighbouring district, it has been taken into account.

10. Local Bodies.

In this section, there is only one statement showing the income and expenditure of the village panchayats, Zilla Parishads and municipalities and cantonments.

11. Plan and Community Development.

In Table no.11.1 expenditure in the Third Five Year Plan under different development sub-heads like Agricultural Programmes, Co-operation and Community Development etc., is given.

In table 11.2 important physical achievements in the Third Five Year Plan period are given. This data is based on the critical review of the Plan prepared by the Bureau.

In table 11.3, data on Community Development programmes is given.

In the last table 11.4, expenditure incurred in different stages of the blocks is shown.

12. Prices.

Regarding the data shown under table no.12.1 - average retail prices of important commodities at district head-quarters during the years 1964 and 1965- it may be mentioned here that

as the information collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one quotation and that too from only one shop in the district head-quarter, the averages shown for individual commodities cannot be said to be fully representative, but the data may prove useful as a broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices over the period of time. The data are for calender year.

In table no.12.2 districtwise operations of regulated markets is given for the years 1961-62 and 1965-66. In this table data for only agricultural commodities is considered. Livestock is excluded. Some of the commodities,viz.,sesamum,linseed etc. are not included while preparing the divisional level table as the transactions were found to be very negligible.

In table no.12.3 consumer price index numbers for working class is given. The index numbers from FEBRUARY,64 have been calculated on the basis of the principles laid down by the Lakadawala Committee.

13. In this last section, data on miscellaneous subjects like

- i. strength of the police force and crime statistics,
- ii. cinema statistics,
- iii. number of joint-stock companies etc.,

are given.

Poona Division at a Glance.

This table gives in a nutshell comparative data of the Poona Division and Maharashtra State. It includes statistics on

- i. location,
- ii. area and population, and
- iii. agriculture, e t c.

Trends in Selected Indicators.

This table gives information on selected indicators for the years 1950-51, 1955-56, 1960-61, 1961-62, 1962-63, 1963-64, 1964-65 and 1965-66.

Regarding agricultural statistics, it may be noted that the definitions of ' agricultural class ' adopted in 1951 and 1961 Census were different. In 1951 Census, agricultural workers along with their dependents were taken into account, whereas in 1961 only agricultural workers were taken into consideration.

CHAPTER III
SECTORIAL TRENDS.

3.1. This chapter is meant to analyse the trends pertaining to the Third Five Year Plan period with a view to giving a picture of the Socio-economic conditions prevailing in the districts of this division. The important indicators on which the Review is based are

- i. agriculture,
- ii. livestock,
- iii. electricity consumption,
- iv. employment position,
- v. public health,
- vi. education,
- vii. transport,
- viii. banking, and
- ix. prices.

(i) Agricultural Development :

3.2. Agriculture is still the Achilles heel of the Indian economy and failure on the agricultural front slackens the overall pace of economic development. Turning to Maharashtra, we find that the contribution to the State Income by agriculture and allied activities is a little more than one-third of the total income, though about 70 per cent of the population is engaged in this sector. The reasons for this poor performance are not far to seek. Inferior quality of soil, coupled with low rate of consumption of fertilisers, very meagre irrigation facilities and uncertain rainfall, financial backwardness of small cultivators etc., ^{binder} agricultural development.

3.3. For assessing the agricultural development, indicators like percentage gross sown area, percentage of irrigated area etc. are adopted.

3.4. Table no,1 given below shows the percentage gross cropped area to net area sown during the five years period '60-61 & '64-65.

3.5. From the table it is seen that the percentage for the division as a whole has registered a decline from 105.79 in the year 1960-61 to 104.90 in 1964-65, indicating a drop in the double cropped area. The inter-district comparison shows that while A'nagar and Sholapur districts register a slight increase in the double cropped area, in the remaining four districts, the same has decreased, the decline being more in the case of Poona district. A plausible reason for this decline is the diversion of land from seasonal to cash crops like sugarcane, turmeric etc., which are perennial.

3.6. In order to raise perennial cash crops irrigation facilities are required; it would be interesting to study the relevant irrigation data for the six districts.

Table no.2 gives percentages of irrigated areas.

3.7. It is seen from the above table for the division as a whole there was no increase at all in the percentage of net area irrigated to net area sown, while in the districts, only A'nagar and Sholapur districts show an increase and these are the districts which have shown some increase in the double-cropped area. It means that due to increased irrigation facilities, the cultivators in these districts who could raise only one crop previously were able to grow a second crop. However, the data given under columns 4 and 5 has to be taken in view for getting a clearer picture of the effects of irrigation on cultivation. In A'nagar district while the percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown has increased, the percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area has in fact declined. This could be due to a shift in the cropping pattern- from seasonal crops to perennial

crops. Another reason might be that due to insufficiency of water only one irrigated crop might have been raised in the course of a year.

3.8. In the case of other districts the percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area has shown an increase, the increase being highest in Poona district. In the Division, there was five per cent increase. But as we have seen earlier in table no.1, there was no increase in double cropped area in the division; in fact it declined by about one per cent. This clearly shows that the increase in the irrigation facilities were not utilized for raising foodgrain crops, i.e., cereals and pulses. In the light of the growing food shortage, this is a rather disturbing trend.

3.9 Let us now go further deep in the crop pattern in the six districts of this region. Table no.3 gives percentages of areas under cereals, pulses, total foodgrains, sugarcane, total food-crops, cotton, groundnut, tobacco and total non-food crops during the years 1960-61 and 1964-65. The figures in brackets show the percentage area irrigated in ^{these} years.

3.10. It is seen from that table that even though the percentage area under irrigated cereal crops increased from 5.83 to 6.45 during the period 1960-61 to 1964-65, the total area under cereals as a percentage of total gross cropped area declined from 67.46 to 66.21. At the district level, it is noticed that Satara district stands first in converting unirrigated cereal crops to irrigated ones (increase by 1.04%), while in Kolhapur district it was only 0.14%. As regards the relationship between the total area under cereals and total gross cropped area, only in A' Nagar district the percentage of area under cereals to the total gross cropped area increased while in all the remaining five districts it declined, it being highest in Sangli district (declined by 3.85%). Turning to cash crops we find that the acreage under sugarcane has increased in all the districts excepting A' Nagar. The decline in that district is, however, very small (0.11%). In the case of cotton it is found that the proportion of cotton area to the gross cropped area was 1.24 per cent in 1964-65 as against 1.07 percent in 1960-61, there being increase in all the districts excepting Sangli and Kolhapur (respective decline : 0.14% and 0.15%); but in these two districts the percentage increase in the area under sugarcane more than compensates the decline in respect of cotton. As regards Groundnut, all the districts show increased percentage - only A' Nagar district shows a decline but it is very negligible,

(0.02%). The area under tobacco is not much and hence no analytical elaboration is necessary.

3.11. Another important indicator is the yield per hectare of principal crops. The reference period for analysis is the four year period : 1961-62 to 1964-65. The table on the following page gives the necessary data.

3.12. It is seen from the data that excepting Rice and Cotton, the yield per hectare has increased in respect of all other mentioned crops. Districtwise data indicate that in the year 1961-62, Kolhapur district stands first and Sangli district comes last in the yield of rice per hectare, the former producing 1,302 kg.s while the latter only 995 kg.s. In the

year 1964-65, A'nagar district comes first and Kolhapur District comes fourth and Sangli at the end. In respect of Jowar, the divisional increase in production per hectare was by 91 kg.s, the increase was highest, i.e., by 196 kg.s in Kolhapur district; while in the case of A'nagar and Sangli districts there was a decline in the yield. Regarding yield of wheat, the per hectare production declined in Poona, Sangli and Sholapur districts, while in the remaining three districts it increased. Regarding Bajri, the divisional yield per acre increased by 8 kgs. during the reference period. Turning to the districts, we find that positive change was noticed in the case of Poona, Sangli and Sholapur districts, with Poona district leading with an increase of 57 kg.s in the yield per acre; while the remaining three districts show negative change. In Satara district, the yield rate declined by as much as 23 kg.s. The data regarding sugarcane shows mixed results. While Poona, Sholapur and Kolhapur districts show an increase in the yield rate, A'nagar, Satara and Sangli show a decline. Though A'nagar district had the highest yield rate as compared to other districts (more than 11,000 kg.s per hectare), the yield rate in 1964-65 in that district declined by 9 kg.s from the level achieved in 1961-62. The performance of Kolhapur district was quite impressive where during the reference period the yield rate increased by 403 kg.s. For the divisional as a whole, there was an increase of 52 kg.s in the yield per hectare. In respect of Groundnut crop, it is noticed that except Sangli and Kolhapur districts, all districts in the division show an increase. In respect of the last crop cotton, it is found that in the two districts of Satara and Sholapur only there was improvement. The divisional yield

rate thus shows a decline.

3.13. Agriculture can cease to be a way of life and become a commercial proposition, only when there is a substantial surplus in produce. But with near subsistence level of living of a farmer makes it difficult for him to make investment in agriculture. Agricultural credit thus occupies a very important position in the development of that sector.

The table no.5 given below shows the changes during the Third Five Year Plan period.

3.14. It is seen from the data that in the division, the number of societies increased slightly during the Third Plan period. The loans advanced show an appreciable increase; but the disturbing factor is the increase in outstanding and overdues. The number of societies is found to have increased in all the districts excepting Kolhapur. Regarding loans advanced the performance of Satara, Sangli and Kolhapur districts is quite significant. The two districts Ahmednagar and Poona show a decline in loans advanced as compared to the base year 1961-62. The healthiness or unhealthiness of rural credit position can be gauged by changes in overdues. From the point of view of this criteria, it is found that the overdues in Satara and Sholapur districts increased by more than one hundred percent, which is rather alarming. Comparitively, it can be said that only in Kolhapur district the position is quite good.

3.15. Possession of livestock is an asset to the rural

people. Since agriculture in India is not yet mechanised, possession of bullocks for carrying ^{out} agricultural operations is very essential. Animal husbandry also helps the rural people by being a source of subsidiary income to the farmer and thus making a contribution to the economy.

3.16. The tenth quinquennial livestock census was carried out in the year 1966 throughout the State. In the table 6 below data regarding cultivable land in the years 1931-62 and 1964-65, total livestock in the years 1961 and 1966 and livestock per hundred hectare of land are given. Since cultivable land does ^{not} change appreciably from year to year, the reference to the cultivable land in the year 1964-65 for finding out the livestock per hundred hectare of land in the year 1966 would not affect the result much.

3.17. The data show that as far as the division was concerned, there was marginal decrease in the livestock per hundred hectare of cultivable land. Only A'nagar district shows an increase, while all the remaining five districts show a decline.

3.18 Another indicator of economic development is per capita consumption of electricity,

3.19. From the table it is observed that among the six districts, Poona stands first in the per capita consumption with an increase of 45.07 k.w.h. during the reference period. The per capita consumption is more than double the division figure, which is natural because of the growth of an industrial complex in the vicinity of Poona city. Ahmednagar district stands out as the most backward district in the region as far as electricity consumption is concerned. Industrially the district is not developed, (consumption of electricity by the sugar factories and other industries which have their own generators is not considered here). Moreover, it is far away from Koyam, Paras or Khaparkheda power stations and hence there was considerable delay in the erection of transmission lines. (In table no.7 while working out per capita consumption, 1961 Census figures of population were referred to for both the years 1961-62 & '65-66. The increase in the per capita consumption involves, therefore, a little bit over-estimation because the increase in population is not taken into consideration.).

3.20. Employment Exchange Statistics :

All unemployed persons do not register their names in an Employment Exchange and hence the number of persons registered does not give an idea about the unemployment problem. Moreover, mainly persons from urban areas register their names in the employment exchange. The Employment exchange statistics has to be seen with these limitations in view.

3.21. From the table no.8, it is observed that excepting Sholapur district, all the other districts show a decline in the percentage of placement to the number of persons on the live register. As for the division, the percentage is found to have decreased from 9.83 to 7.25 during the five years period. Viewed at from

another angle it is observed that the number on the live register increased from 84,193 in 1961-62 to 1,40,451 in 1965-66, i.e., there was an increase of 66.82%. The corresponding increase in the number of placements was ^{only} 23.15. It is thus seen that the backlog of unemployment will go on increasing as years pass by and this will a drag on the economy.

3.22. Another indicator of economic development is the spread of education and it is rightly called ' Investment in Man '. Education has also its impact on urbanisation. In this review, comparative data for two years viz., '61-62 & 65-66 is considered.

3.23. The data given in table no.9 indicates that excepting the percentage increase in respect of Poona district for secondary and Kolhapur district for higher education, the percentage increase in the number of girl students was more than that of male students. In the case of primary and secondary education, the percentage increase was highest for both boys and girls in Ahmednagar district. In the case of higher education Satara dist. had the

highest increase in percentage in respect of both male and female students.

3.24. Transport constitutes one of the most important items in the infrastructure of an economy and roads have, therefore, been rightly called the 'arteries of a nation'. The increase in road mileage per 100 sq.kilometre during the years 1961 and 1966 would be a good indicator of development.

3.25. The development during the five year period appears to be good enough. Sangli district tops the list in both the years. Even if the rate of increase is taken into consideration, Sangli leads others with an increase of 14 km.s during the period, with A'nagar at the end of the list.

3.26. Regarding railway length, there was no increase with the total length remaining constant at 1,283 kms.

3.27 If roads can be called as the 'arteries of a nation', banking can be compared to the ' heart ' because without a sound financial system economic development is not possible. In India large parts still remain uncovered by institutional finance. In order, therefore, to assess the development in this direction, increase in banking facilities in proportion to population would be a good indicator.

3.28. The above data shows that in both the years 1961-62 and 1965-66, Poona district topped the list with 4 and 6 banking offices respectively per lakh population, which is more than the average for the division. But if we compare the rate of progress, A'nagar district stands first, as the banking offices per lakh population doubled during the reference period. The performance of Satara and Sholapur districts was not so good, while that of other districts was somewhat better.

3.29 The last indicator of economic development is Prices, the impact of which is felt all over the economy. It is seen that consumer price index which stood at 131 in ^{October, 65} rose to 134 in December, 65. The increase was thus 2%.

CHAPTER IV
ACHIEVEMENTS IN THE THIRD FIVE YEAR PLAN.

4.1. Economic Planning aims at radically transforming the economy of a country through long term developmental programmes. And each plan represents a phase of this long term programme. Since Maharashtra State came into being on 1-5-1960, the Third Five Year Plan was the first phase of the economic development of the State as a single homogeneous unit.

4.2. In the Third Five Year Plan, all the schemes are classified into District level, Division level and State level schemes depending upon the area benefitted by a particular scheme.

Agricultural Programme.

4.3. The contribution to the State Income of Maharashtra by Agriculture is a little more than one-third of the total income. This contribution is derived from land with low productivity and by 70 per cent of the population, in the State which depends on Agriculture. Hence planned development in Agriculture, although important among all sectors, is a difficult task since Agriculture is essentially a private enterprise. In Poona Division, the productivity of land is poorer and the proportion of population depending on Agriculture is more (73 per cent) than that in the State.

4.4. The main reasons of low productivity of land in Poona Division are

- i. Large scale soil erosion and poor capacity of soil for moisture retention, and
- ii. Uncertain rainfall in the scarcity areas.

Expenditure.

4.5. The table given on the following page shows the expenditure incurred on District and Division level schemes during the Third Five Year Plan period under various sub-heads, of development under Agriculture Programme.

4.6. The total expenditure on district and division level schemes is Rs.24.99 crores. This includes the expenditure on development allied to Agriculture. The expenditure on account of measures to increase the productivity of land is the total of the first four sub-heads which comes to Rs.21.79 crores. This forms 109 per cent of the Plan provision. The ratio of this expenditure to the culturable area comes to Rs.15/-^{per} acre for Poona division, while that for the State comes to Rs.12/-^{per} acre. This difference justifies the position of the Poona Division.

4.7. Since agriculture is a private enterprise, the activities on behalf of the Government in regard to improvement in agricultural production consist mainly of distribution of

- a. improved seeds,
- b. chemical fertilizers and
- c. improved agricultural implements to the cultivators, production of compost and green manures, etc.

Most of the schemes are district level and the total expenditure on all these schemes is Rs.310.77 lakhs and forms 91 per cent of the Plan provision.

The table no.2 on the following page gives details regarding the achievements under various items.

4.8. The procurement and distribution of improved seeds was entrusted to co-operative societies. However, the progress on their part was not satisfactory, inspite of the incentive and hence a new scheme called as " Seed Village Scheme " has been introduced during 1965-66 at the rate of one village per district.

4.9. The land development programme consists of

- i. Tractor ploughing and
- ii. Consolidation of holdings,

for which Rs. 14.14 lakhs and Rs. 8.78 lakhs respectively have been spent during the Third Five Year Plan. The scheme of consolidation of holdings is a spill-over scheme and was implemented in Ahmednagar, Satara and Sholapur districts. Under the scheme of

tractor ploughing an area of 20,819 acres in this division has been ploughed, which is 12 per cent of the expected achievement of the State at the end of the Plan.

4.10. Minor irrigation yields quick results and hence its place in increasing the output cannot be exaggerated. The Programme includes

- i. construction of new wells,
- ii. repairs to old ones,
- iii. mechanisation of water lifting, etc.

4.11. The basic problem of animal husbandry as far as Maharashtra is concerned involves improving the quality of draught and milch cattle rather than increasing their number. The programme consists of cattle health and cattle breeding. In addition to these the productivity programmes under poultry and sheep to provide subsidiary food were taken in 1963-64 as a result of shortage of food production. The total expenditure on all these items was Rs.87.59 lakhs.

4.12. Under the dairy development scheme, the goal of increasing milk production is to be achieved by Government by providing guarantees to milk producers of purchasing milch cattle and it also gives guarantee to consumers to supply quality milk at reasonable rates. Besides, some other incentives such as financial assistance for purchase of milch cattle and organisation of co-operative societies are also given.

4.13. The national forest policy has prescribed the optimum forest area as 33 per cent of the total geographical area. The present forest area in the State is 21.8 per cent of the total geographical area and that in the division is 10.2 per cent.

The expenditure over the schemes pertaining to afforestation, survey and Demarcation, Plantation and Development is Rs.25.67 lakhs, Rs.0.90 lakhs and Rs.12.64 lakhs respectively. The total expenditure works out to Rs.2 per acre.

4.14. As far as Poona division is concerned, there is a limited scope for the development of fisheries, since there is no coast line. The scope is, therefore, limited to Inland Fisheries.

4.15. The programme of warehousing and marketing was restricted to district level schemes, viz., Development of Agricultural marketing and grading.

Co-operation and Community Development.

4.16. The co-operative organisation provides the necessary credit

to needy individuals and also acts as an agency for channelising requisites and services to them in order to take any developmental activities.

The total expenditure on district and division level schemes is Rs. 214.66 lakhs and Rs. 49.58 lakhs and forms 97 per cent and 160 per cent of the plan provision respectively.

4.17. The district and division level schemes under the sub-head 'co-operation' can be broadly classified into

- i. Agriculture credit,
- ii. Co-operative marketing,
- iii. Processing societies,
- iv. Co-operative farming and
- v. Miscellaneous programme.

Irrigation & Power.

4.18. As stated by the Maharashtra State Irrigation Commission, the prosperity of rural areas is dependant mainly on the extension of irrigation facilities.

4.19. The Government of Maharashtra appointed a Commission in 1961 to assess water resources to formulate a master plan for full exploitation of irrigation resources and other relevant problems. The Commission has assessed that even after full exploitation of all available irrigation resources in the State only 30 per cent of culturable area could be irrigated.

4.20. From the progress of only irrigation projects during the Third Five Year Plan, it is seen that the expenditure incurred during the period was in excess of the plan provision of Rs. 1,700.91 lakhs and amounted to Rs. 1,788.28 lakhs out of the total 20 projects in operation during the Third Plan period, 15 projects were spill-over schemes and remaining five were newly taken up.

4.21. Poona Division has a high potential for hydro-electric power generation in the western ghats. Large quantities of power, can be generated at cheap rates at suitable sites in these ghats. As per the estimates of the National Council of Applied Economic Research, the hydro-electric power potential in and around western Ghats is about 1040 M.S.W.

4.22. Even upto the end of the Second Plan, the position of Poona division as far as power generation and consumption is concerned, was not satisfactory. The development of power upto

the end of the Ist Five Year Plan was confined largely to Bombay-Poona area and to a very small extent to Kolhapur-Miraj area. However, the construction of Koyna Project Stage I & II (with estimated potential of 540 M.W.) was started during the Second Plan which marked a major step towards creating a power grid in Western Maharashtra.

4.23. During the Third Plan a provision of Rs. 21.65 crores was made towards division level schemes under ^{this} sub-heads for Poona Division. This forms about 37.5 per cent of the total outlay on division level schemes for this Division and about 25 per cent of State provision for this sub-head. The total expenditure in the Plan period was Rs. 20.91 crores, i.e., 97 per cent of Plan provision. The programme of power development in this division consists of

- i. Generation,
- ii. Transmission,
- iii. Rural electrification.

4.24. Industry & Mining.

In Maharashtra State as also in this Division, the possibility of increasing agricultural development is limited in the sense that irrigation, which assures output, can be increased only upto 30 percent of the culturable area. Hence, the importance of industrial development cannot be exaggerated. In this context, the primary objective of the Third Plan was development of agro-industries. With a view to achieve these objectives, schemes pertaining to the development of co-operative industries, handloom and handicrafts, establishment of industrial estates were implemented at district and division level. The total plan expenditure on this head was Rs. 257.62 lakhs.

4.25. Transport constitutes one of the major items in infra-structure of a developing economy. The rail mileage in Poona Division is 2.74 miles per 100 square mile as against 2.25 for the State and the road network is more extensive in this division as compared to Vidarbha and Marathwada. According to the Chief Engineers' Conference held in 1953 at Nagpur road mileage per 100 sq. miles of area in the Division should be about 65 miles (inclusive of 18/ miles of village roads) as against 58/ miles for the State by 1981. During the Third Plan period expenditure on Transport & Communication was Rs. 574.65 lakhs.

4.26. Social Services.

The total expenditure incurred on the sub-heads included in

Social Services is Rs.2,153 lakhs. Of this the percentage of expenditure on schemes included in district level scheme is about 46 percent. Major expenditure (15 per cent) is accounted in the General Education.

4.27. The total expenditure on all the plan schemes implemented in this division was to the tune of Rs.10,452 lakhs of which the share of expenditure on district level schemes was about 47 per cent.

4.28. General.

It has to be pointed out that expenditure on a particular head is not important in itself. It is the physical achievement, which is the goal, that is important. The details of physical achievement are given in table no.11.2.
