CHAPTER - I

-: INTRODUCTION :-

1.1 - LOCATION :-

The District of Satara lies between 17°5' and 18°11' north latitude and 73°33' and 74°54' east longitude. It is situated in the central part of Deccan Maharashtra with the borders of district Poona in the north, district Sholapur in the east, district Sangli to the south and ranges of Sahyadri and beyond Sahyadri by the districts of Kolaba and Ratnagiri towards the west.

The district has an area of 10437 Sq.Km. with a total population of 14.30 lakh persons according to 1961 population Census. The length of the district is about 120 Km. and its breadth also comes to near about its length. In terms of area and population it makes 3.4 percent and 3.6 percent respectively of the State of Maharashtra; while within the Poona Division it stands 4th and 5th respectively.

1.2 - TOPOGRAPHY.

1) Soil :-

The western part of the district consisting the tahsils of Mahabaleshwar, Wai, Jaoli and Patan has got the soil formed from the red laterite of the ghats. The soil is thin and poor on the hill slopes, but gets richer where natural or artificial terracing has accumulated soil and vegetable matter washed down by the rains. Rich black soils are, however, found in Wai, Jaoli and Patan tahsils in low lands in the valleys of Krishna, Venna, Kudali, Koyana and Kole rivers.

In the central portion of the district medium to deep black alluvial soils are found. Krishna Valley soils are said to be one of the richest in the

Deccan and the portion which lies in Satara and Karad tahsils is reported as the finest black alluvial soil highly retentive of moisture and very fertile.

But the soil is poor and stony in the tahsils of Khandala, Man and Phaltan in the vicinity of the hills. However, there are also good black soils along the Nira and its tributaries. In the eastern portion of Khandala, soils are poor, shallow and whitish but capable of producing wheat if enough water is available.

The soils get poorer towards the east of the Krishna Valley; and although there are wide stretches of good black soils along the numerous streams and rivers in Koregaon tahsil the lands near the hills are very poor.

In further east of Satara district consisting the tahsils of Khatav and Man extremely poor and shallow soils are found. In fact, the soil condition on the whole, excepting certain parts of the central portion is not much fertile for agriculture in Satara District.

ii) Rivers :-

The river Krishna which is the principal river of the district rises in the eastern brow of Mahabaleshwar Plateau, with its source at about 1371 metre above mean sea level. Several streams which flow from the valleys formed by the main hill ranges of the district, make up the head waters of the river Krishna. The drainage system of Krishna includes, besides the drainage of the Central system, the drainage of five feeders from the right side, namely Kudali, Venna, Urmodi, Tarali and Koyna and two feeders on the left, namely the Vasna and Yerals. Of its total flow of 1280 Km. nearly 160 Km. lie within the limits of Satara District.

The other important rivers of the district are Koyana, Nira, Venna, Kudali, Urmodi, Vasana, Yerala and Tarali. Koyana is the largest of Satara feeders of Krishna. It rises on the west side of the Mahabaleshwar Plateau, near Elphinstone point. In the first 64 Km. of its course, it runs nearly south upto Helwak in Patan tahsil where the famous Dam has been built. After that point it suddenly turns east and after a further course of 64 Km. falls into Krishna at Karad.

Of the Bhima system of rivers, the two Chief Satara representatives are the Nira in the north and the Man or Man-ganga in the north-east. The river Nira, from its source in Bhor tahsil of Poona district, runs east to north of the Wai and Phaltan tahsils of Satara district. After leaving Phaltan it runs north of Malsiras in Sholapur and falls into Bhima. The Man river runs a length of about 64 Km. in Satara district. Beyond Satara limits, it runs through Atpadi, Sangola in Sholapur district and falls into Bhima at Sarkoti about 16 Km. south east of Pandharpur. Only during the rainy season these rivers are full, but in the hot months they go dry.

iii) Hill Ranges.

There are two main systems of hills in Satara district. Sahyadri range and its off-shoots and Mahadeo range and its off-shoots. The main range of Sahyadri with a length of 96 Km. from north to south forms the western boundary of the district. The Mahadeo range starts about 16 Km. north of Mahabaleshwar and stretches east and south-east across the whole breadth of the district. From this range three spurs also stretch to the south in the district.

The Hills in Satara district are very low barren and rugged, except near Mahabaleshwar and Koyana Valley. The top of Mahabaleshwar is about 1436 metre above mean sea level. This is the highest point in the district. The off-shoots of the Sahyadri range separate the valleys of adjacent rivers.

iv) Minerals:-

Iron deposits are found in twenty villages of Jaoli tahsil and thirty villages of Patan. Moreover, due to rocky nature of the soil the district is well supplied with stones for building and road metal. Sand of good quality is also found in the beds of all large streams on the plains. Lime stone is found all over the district in the plains, especially near Wai. Good clay for bricks and tiles is found in nearly all river banks.

1.3 - C L I M A T E :-

i) Rainfall :-

The rains in Satara district start about the middle of June and last till the end of September. The intensity of rain-fall is greatest in July. Generally the monsoon rains cease by the end of September; however, the light drizzling intervals are not unusual till December.

In Satara district, rainfall is not uniform in all its parts. Rainfall is heaviest in the regions of Sahyadri, with Mahabaleshwar getting on an average 6000 mm. in the year. The western zone has sharp transitions in the rainfall pattern. The extreme west gets over 5000 mm. rain while the eastern belt of the Sahyadri zone gets between 1200 and 2000 mm. The central or the transitional zone shows a further break

from the western zone and gets a rainfall from 600 to 1200 mm. The eastern zone has the lowest rainfall averaging to less than 600 mm. in the year.

ii) Temperature :-

Monthly temperature records are available only for one station at Mahabaleshwar which is over 1219 metre above sea level. Naturally, the data do not represent the climate of the district as a whole.

The climate is cool and healthy in the hot weather in the western zone but become chilly during the rainy season. The plains of Wai tahsil, however, have temperate climate throughout the year. The warmth increases as one proceeds from west to east. In the central part there is considerable heat during hot months. During the cold weather the days are warm and nights cool. The eastern Zone has a wider range of temperature variation from season to season and the climate therein is comparable with the climate of Sholapur district.

1.4 - NATURAL ZONE :-

There are three geographical zones which can clearly be distinguished in the district. To the west, bordering the Sahyadri Ranges, lies a hilly tract receiving between 1200 mm. to 5000 mm. of rainfall and comprising of the tahsils of Patan, J aoli, Mahabaleshwar and parts of Satara and Wai. The soil in this area is thin and poor on the hilly slopes. The agriculture and occupation of this zone would be similar to that of the people living in Konkan tract.

As against this, the central zone or the transitional belt comprising of the tahsils of Koregaon, Karad, eastern parts of Satara and Wai, is flat and

contains the richer agricultural tracts of the district. The rainfall is certain here. It varies from 600 to 1200 mm. per annum. The major part of this area consists of medium or deep alluvial soil and is extremely fertile.

The eastern zone, however, where the soil is light and terrain undulating, is the famous scarcity zone consisting of the tahsils of Phaltan, Khatav Man and the remaining parts of Khandala tahsil, which do not fall in the western zone.

1.5 - TERRITORIAL CHANGES :-

As far as the territorial changes in the district are concerned, it will be seen that one village from Khanapur tahsil of Sangli district was transferred to Karad tahsil in 1958. The name of the village is 'Shamgaon.'

1.6 (I) DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION :-

1) State Administration :-

The Collector of the district is in-charge of General Administration, Law and Order, Treasury, Land Revenue and Civil Supplies etc. He is assisted by a Resident Dy. Collector and three Dy. Collectors who hold charge of the three Revenue Divisions and have their head quarters at Satara, Phaltan and Mahabaleshwar. Eleven Tahsildars are in charge of eleven Tahsils. The details of the same can be seen from the following table.

2) The judicial proceedings of the district are looked after by the District Judge the man of jurisprudence. The judiciary is separated from the executive.

The District and Sessions Judge is assisted by two Assistant Judges and Additional Sessions Judges. They attend to civil and criminal work both original and appellate. Moreover, there are ten civil Judges (Junior Division) and First Class Judicial Magistrates with head quarters at different tahsil places.

3) As regards the administrative convenience of the police force, the district has been split up in two parts, namely, Satara and Karad. The District Superintendent of Police looks after the administration of Police force in the district. His head quarter is also located at Satara city.

For efficient administration the police force has been divided in number of branches such as local crime branch, Local Intelligence Branch, Anti-corruption Branch and so on.

4) The offices of the Town Planner and Special Land Acquisition Officer, Divisional Soil Conservation Officer, Divisional Forest Officer are located at Satara city. Another Divisional Office of Soil Conservation is located at Phaltan. The Town Planner looks after the preparation of town planning Schemes and development Plans in the Municipal and Urban areas. The Divisional Soil Conservation Officers look after the works relating to Bunding, Terracing, Land Reclamation etc., whereas the Divisional Forest Officer looks after the afforestation for Soil Conservation, development of minor Forest produce and plantation of valuable trees in Satara District. The Divisional Forest Officer Satara works under Poona Circle.

In the co-operative field, the District Deputy Registrar of Co-operative Societies is of paramount importance. He is assisted by three Assistant Registrars who have territorial jurisdiction and deal with all the aspects of the co-operative movement in the district. The Zilla Parishad Satara also, looks to the promotion and extension of the co-operative movement in the district as whole.

1.6 - (II) CENTRAL GOVT. ADMINISTRATION :-

The Head quarters of the offices of the Post and Telegraph, Superintendent of Central ~~Excise~~ and Income Tax Officer of the Central Govt. are located at Satara city only. Sub post Offices are located at Tahsil Head Quarters and Towns and the branch post Offices are located in big villages.

1.6 - (III) LOCAL BODIES :--

As far as the developmental and administrative subjects transferred to Zilla Parishad of the district are concerned, the executive authority for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities Act 1961 vests in the Chief Executive Officer at the Zilla Parishad level and the Block Development Officers at Block level.

The Chief Executive Officer is assisted by the Deputy Chief Executive Officer and all other Heads of Departments under the Zilla Parishad. The entire rural area and the non municipal urban area of Satara Road with the population of 12.79 lakh persons is under the control of Zilla Parishad, Satara.

The municipal administration is in the towns of Satara, Karad, Phaltan, Wai, Panchagani, Mahabaleshwar, Rahimatpur and Mhaswad.

1.6 (IV) PUBLIC BODIES ADMINISTRATION :-

Form the economic point of view, taking into consideration the hilly and backward nature of the district, the services of the State Transport and Maharashtra State Electricity Board are of vital interest. The offices of the Divisional Controller S.T. Division Satara and the Executive Engineer M.S.E.B. Satara are located at Satara city only..

1.7 - DEMOGRAPHY :-

1) General :-

Indian population statistics show that the rate of population growth prior to 1921 was slow and erratic while subsequent to 1921 it has been maintaining a steady upward trend. What is true about India is also true about the district of Satara.

According to 1961 Census, the population of the district is 1430105 persons or 137 persons per Sq. Km. In 1951 it was 1177016 or 112 persons per Sq.Km.

The population has increased by about 253089 or 21.5 percent during the last 10 years.

ii) Growth Rate :-

This significant increase in the growth rate during the last decade in Satara district is the result of control of epidemics and other diseases since 1950. Malaria, which used to be a major public health problem in the district, has now been controlled. Due to technological improvement in medical science in the last decade, death rate has been reduced.

iii) Density :-

Eventhough the district growth rates have always been low than Maharashtra averages, the density of population in the district is 137 persons per Sq.Km. which is higher than that of the State (i.e. 129 persons per Sq.Km.).

However, there is a great variation in the density from tahsil to tahsil within the district itself. The density of population is comparatively lower in the hilly tracts i.e. western part of the district and also in the scarcity affected tahsils lying in the eastern part of the district. It varies from 232 persons per Sq.Km. in Karad tahsil to 69 persons per Sq.Km. in Man

Tahsil. The differences correspond to those of topography and land utilization. The central zone consisting of rich soils on the Krishna river bank and high proportion of net sown area to geographical area has the highest density of population. In fact, Karad tahsil is a part of the most densely populated region in Maharashtra.

iv) Literacy :-

As per 1961 census, the percentage of literates in the district comes to 33.98 percent whereas the percentage of literacy in Maharashtra State is 29.82 . The percentage of literacy in the district in 1951 was 20.60 percent. It would be seen that the number of literates has increased by 13.38 percent during the last 10 years. As such, the district ranks highest in the State in literacy in rural areas and in respect of literacy for women. Within Poonja Division it stands 2nd when percentage of literate persons to the total district population is considered.

v) Livelihood Classification :-

As far as the economic classification of the workers, it will be seen that as per the 1961 census, the classification of livelihood classes has been changed and the distribution of the population as per the changed livelihood classes shows that out of the total population of 14.30 lakhs total workers are 6.92 lakhs i.e. 48.42 percent of the total population of the district comes under the category of workers. This further means that 7.37 lakhs or 51.58 percent of the total population of the district falls under non-workers category.

It has further been noticed during the 1961 census that out of the total workers the majority of them work as cultivators; while very little number is engaged in the category of Transport and Communications. Amongst the different Tahsils, the tahsil of Jaoli stood first in the category of " Cultivators" while Mahabaleshwar stood the lowest, due to its hilly nature. The number of Agricultural labourers is highest in Phaltan tahsil and the lowest in the Mahabaleshwar. The persons engaged in household industries are more in Man tahsil and lower in Jaoli tahsil. As far as other services are concerned the number is highest in Mahabaleshwar and lowest in Jaoli tahsil. The percentages of persons engaged in Mining, Manufacturing Industries, Construction, Trade and Commerce etc. are not worth noting in the district of Satara.

CHAPTER - II

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

ON SOURCES AND LIMITATIONS OF STATISTICS PRESENTED IN THE DISTRICT STATISTICAL ABSTRACT - 1967-68.

Purpose and Scope :-

1.1 In this Abstract statistics on as many as possible subjects have been presented so as to provide the scope for further studies in Socio-Economic aspects of Satara District. Attempts have been made here to furnish the tahsilwise position on different topics for the years 1966-67 and 1967-68.

The sources of the material reproduced in this Abstract have also been shown at the end of each table.

In the following paras, the concepts of certain terms, sources and limitations etc. of statistics presented in this Abstract have been discussed in short.

DISTRICT AT A GLANCE :-

In this table, some general particulars about the Satara District and Poona Division are given. Against each item, mention of the period is made to which the figures concerning Satara and Poona Division, are related. The data on location of district and division, its population, area, no. of villages, towns, total workers and non-workers, literacy percentages are shown. Besides this, important information under the various heads such as agriculture, industry, animal husbandry, electricity, co-operation, education, transport and communications etc. is given.

1. CLIMATE :-

The table No. 1 gives monthly normal rainfall number of rainy days and actual rainfall of 15 rain gauge

stations in Satara District. The figures of normal rainfall are worked out by the India Meteorological Department on the basis of actual rainfall for the periods ranging from a minimum of five years to a maximum of eighty years. As regards rainy days a day was treated as a rainy day, if during the 24 hours, the rain gauge recorded a minimum of 2.5 mm. of rainfall.

The table No.2 gives the maximum, minimum and average temperature of Mahabaleshwar Station. The mean maximum and mean minimum are the averages of maximum and minimum temperatures observed daily during the month. The mean temperature is the average of the mean maximum and mean minimum temperature thus arrived at.

2. AREA AND POPULATION :-

Final figures of 1961 population census are presented in all the tables in this section. The table No.3 shows the figures in population, density of population, population variation and population break-up as urban-rural for each tahsil. The table No.4 gives the classification of different inhabited villages according to population ranges. The table No.5 gives the classification of towns according to population ranges in the district. The table No.6 shows the total number of workers in each livelihood class of working population for each tahsil of this district, separately and also total non-workers in each tahsil. The table No. 7 shows distribution of population according to age-group, mother tongue and religion in Satara District. The table No. 8 gives information on the tahsilwise population scheduled castes and Scheduled Tribes in this district.

3. AGRICULTURE :-

The table No. 9 gives tahsilwise figures of land utilisation under the standard heads of utilisation. Against each tahsil the break-up of the total geographical area according to different types of land used is shown. The changes in the geographical area over years are mainly due to the progress of cadastral surveys. The area according to the village papers is calculated from the village returns prepared by the village officials for revenue purposes. There are differences between the figures of total area according to the Surveyer General and according to the Village paper because the latter is calculated by totalling up village returns while the former is calculated in blocks. Under 'forests' are included all actually forested areas or lands classed or administered as forests under any legal enactment dealing with forests whether Stateowned or private. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agill. use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land. Land put to non-agricultural uses stands for all lands occupied by buildings, roads and railways or under water e.g. rivers and canals and other lands put to uses other than agricultural. Barren and unculturable land covers all barren and unculturable land like mountains, deserts etc. Land which can not be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost, is classed as unculturable, whether such land is in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings. Permanent pastures and other grazing lands cover all grazing lands. whether they are permanent pastures and meadows or not.

Village common and grazing lands within forest areas are included under this head. Under miscellaneous tree crops and groves not included in the net area sown is included all cultivable land which is not included under net area sown but is put to some agricultural use. Lands under casuarina trees, thatching grass, bamboo bushes and other groves for fuel etc. which are not included under 'Orchards' are classed under this category. Culturable waste includes all lands available for cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once but not cultivated during the current year and last five years or more in succession. Such lands may be either fallow or covered with shrubs and jungals which are not put to any use. Current fallows comprise cropped areas which are kept fallow during the current year. If any seedling area is not cropped again the same year, it is also treated as current fallow. Other fallow land includes all lands which were taken up for cultivation but are temporarily out of a cultivation for a period of not less than one year and not more than five years. The net area sown consists of net area sown with crops and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once. The gross cropped area represented the sum total of area under all crops. The difference between the total cropped area and net area sown is accounted for by the area sown more than once on the same land during the same year with the same or different crops.

The table No.10 presents the details of area under different crops. The table No.11 presents the output and average yield per hectare of principal crops

in the district. The table No.12 presents gross and net irrigated areas and the distribution of net irrigated areas by sources of irrigation. The table No.13 shows the tahsilwise acreage of various crops under irrigation. The table No. 14 presents data on total No.of wells and further break up as wells in use and wells not in use. The table No. 15 gives the information on number of minor irrigation works completed and allied information regarding irrigation in Satara District.The table No.16 gives the information on area commanded, irrigation potential, irrigated area and other items in connection with major and medium irrigation works in Satara District. The table No. 17 give information on average monthly wage rates collected by the Block Development Officers. The table No. 18 presents the figures of Agricultural implement enumerated in the 10th Live Stock Census 1966. The table No. 19 depicts data on famines etc. There are no famines, scarcity and conditions akin to scarcity in Satara district during 1967-68.

4. ANIMAL HUSBANDRY, FORESTS & FISHERIES.

The table No.20 gives the number of various types of livestock, poultry etc. as enumerated at the time of 1966 livestock Census. At this census, all the livestock is enumerated by house to house enquiry. Particular care is taken to enumerate livestock in slaughter houses, stray animals and animals in transit. The table No.21 gives the information regarding medical facilities available to the livestock population in the district. The table No. 22 gives the information regarding attacks of diseases.The table No.23 shows the information regarding slaughter.

houses and animals slaughtered in the recognised slaughter houses in the district. The information regarding animals slaughtered in non-recognised slaughter houses and those slaughtered by butchers in rural areas is not available. The table No.24(a) gives figures of area under forest in the district. The forest area figures in this table is different from the figures in the table on land utilisation. The concepts of classifying areas into two departments are different. The table No.24 B gives the information regarding production and value of major and minor forest products in Satara District,

✓ 5. EMPLOYMENT, INDUSTRY, MINING & ELECTRICITY.

In this section, statistics regarding employment in industries is given. The table No.25 gives average daily employment and mandays worked in the factories which have submitted prescribed return under the Act. The table No. 26 throws light on another important aspect of factory employment. The classification of factories according to working strength is denoted. The table No. 27 gives the classification of factories according to no. of days worked during the year is shown here. The table No. 28 gives monthwise figures of registration, vacancies notified, placements done in public and private sector and live register at the end of each month. The table No. 29 give break-up of total no. of registration according to National classification. The table No.30 gives an idea about changes in the volume of employment. The table No.31 shows the total no. of Govt. employees according to their basic pay and total emoluments ranges separately and also the break-up into class I to class IV servants. The table No.32 shows departmentwise

total no. of Govt. employees in the district. The table No. 33 gives information regarding generation and consumption of electricity in the district. The table No.34 gives progress of electrification in the district. The table includes villages and towns which are electrified by the Maharashtra State Electricity Board and Private electric agencies.

6. CO-OPERATION :-

In this section, data on co-operative field is given. The table No.35 gives information regarding total no. of each type of co-operative societies in the district. The table No.36 gives the information regarding co-operative banks in the district. The data pertaining to no. of branches, no. of members, capital structure, etc. is given. The table No. 37 gives tahsilwise position regarding primary agricultural credit societies, members, capital structure, loan advanced, recovered etc. in the district. The table No.38 gives information about other co-operative societies of different types other than Agril. credit banks. The table No.39 displays the data on Agril. marketing societies. The tahsilwise information on value of purchase, value of sales of agril. produce and agril. requisites etc. is shown. The table No. 40 shows the achievements of important activities of agricultural marketing, processing, Sugar Factories, handloom societies, Consumer Stores etc. In table No.41 the data on operation of regulated marketing is shown. The table No.42 gives the information regarding money lenders and their loan activities in the district. The tahsilwise break-up is not available.

7. MEDICAL & PUBLIC HEALTH :-

The table No.43 shows medical facilities available in the district. It shows the number of hospitals dispensaries maternity homes, Primary health centres, doctors, beds available and indoor and outdoor patient treated. The material presented here includes only civil hospitals, Zilla Parishad dispensaries, P.H.C. centres, municipal dispensaries and private aided institutions. It does not cover private unaided institutions run by individuals or associations. The table No.44 shows data about births, deaths and infant deaths. The figures of infant deaths relates to deaths of children below one year. In table No.45 the data on number of deaths due to principal causes is shown. The table No.46 gives information regarding tahsilwise no. of primary vaccination, revaccination and cholera inoculations, in the district.

8. EDUCATION :-

In this section, the literacy and the progress of education in different tahsils is presented, The table No.47 gives the number of literates sexwise for rural and urban areas separately. In table No.48 the total no. of illiterates and literates with different level of education (sexwise) of rural population only is shown. The table No.49 gives information regarding literates with different levels of education (technical and non technical) in urban areas of the district. The table No. 50 shows the number of different types of educational institutions, pupils and teachers for each type in the district. The number of institutions relates to the academic year ending June and the no. of pupils is as on 31st March of the respective years.

In table No.51, the total number of beneficiaries (Backward classes) at each level of education is shown. The table No.52 gives the information regarding total no. of students taking benefits under the scheme of free studentship as E.B.C. students and the total value of such concession for all the education levels for the district as a whole. The table No.53 gives information about grants (normal and plan) given by Govt. to Zilla Parishad and Municipal Councils for Primary education. The table No.54 shows total no. of villages having primary schools and those without primary schools. Further break-up of villages without primary schools is given in different population ranges.

9. Transport and Communications

In this section, statistical information relating to various modes of transport is given. The table No.55 gives information on length of railway route in the district. There is only one gauge viz. meter gauge in the district. In table No.56 figures of road length as at the end of each year is shown. The figures relate to extra municipal roads maintained by the B and C and Zilla Parishad. Roads maintained by municipal authorities are given separately. The table No.57 presents data about motor vehicles in the Poona Region. The table No.58 relates to Nationalised Road Transport. The information on number of routes, route distance, average daily earnings etc. is given. Satara S.T. Division consists of whole Satara district and a part of Sangli district. In table No.59 the data of traffic census wherein information regarding no. of vehicles, light motor vehicles, total traffic intensity in 24 hours is given.

The table No. 60 gives some important statistics regarding post and telegraph offices, number of letter boxes etc. in the district. The table No.61 gives information regarding number of radio-sets and villages where radio sets are installed.

10. LOCAL BODIES :-

Statistics regarding village panchayats, Municipalities and Zilla Parishad are shown in this section. The table No.62 presents material on income and expenditure of Village Panchayats, Zilla Parishad and Municipalities. In table No.63 the break-up of the information on income and expenditure of villages panchayats is given. This break-up is two-way. On the one hand the information for each Panchayat Samiti is given separately and on the other hand, total income and expenditure is further divided into major heads and income from taxes, fees, donations, contributions and expenditure on administration, public works, sanitation etc. The table No.64-A and 64-B give particulars of income and expenditure of Satara Zilla Parishad, The receipts are sub-divided into self-raised resources, Govt. grants, grants for agency scheme and debt section. The expenditure is likewise divided into many heads of development. The table No.65 gives information on income from and expenditure on different sub-heads in respect of Municipalities. Under income, information is separately shown under grants, taxes and other income. Under expenditure, further break-up into general administration, public safety, public works etc. is shown.

11. PLAN & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT :-

Statistics regarding expenditure and achievement under Annual Plan, Community Development Programme.

etc. are given. The table No.66 gives plan expenditure under different development sub-heads in Satara district. In table No.67 the details regarding important physical achievements during 66-67 and 1967-68 are shown. The table No.68 shows the Community Development Programme in the district. The information regarding no. of blocks of C.P.A. pattern in each stage, the population covered etc. is given. The table No.69 gives information about the expenditure incurred according to stages for the period ending upto 31-3-1967, during 67-68 and upto 67-68. The table No.70 gives information on important physical achievements on selected items in all the blocks in Satara district.

✓ 12. PRICES :-

The table No.71 gives the monthly averages of prices of important commodities at Satara Head Quarter during 1966 and 1967. As the information collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one quotation and that also from only one shop in the district Head Quarter, the averages shown above for individual commodities cannot be said to be fully representative; but the data may prove useful as broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices over the period of time. The table No.72 gives consumer price index number for working class of Sholapur centre which is also applicable to working class of Satara District. For the calculation of Index, the year 1960 is taken as base year.

✓ 13. MISCELLANEOUS :-

In this section, statistics regarding miscellaneous subjects like police force, crime statistics, banks, joint stock companies, insurance, small savings

etc. are included. The table No. 73 relates to police force in the district. The table No.74 gives information on cognizable and non-cognizable crimes in the district. In table No. 75 cases decided by courts in the district is shown. The figures do not include the cases decided by the District Magistrate and Executive Magistrate. The table No. 76 gives tahsilwise Cinema theatres (Viz. permanent, touring) in the district. There are no semi-movement talkies in the district. The table No.77 gives the information regarding number of banks and the population covered by them in the district. In table No.78, the data on companies limited by shares and companies limited by guarantees and associations not for profit are given. Their further break-up into public and private is also given. The table No. 79 gives the information regarding number of insurance policies issued and also amount insured in the district. The table No. 80 presents gross and net collections under different schemes of Small Savings. The table No. 81 gives information regarding demand, collection and arrears of land revenue. The demand minus collection tally with arrears. The amount of remission is taken as reduction in demand and suspension is taken as addition to arrears as the amount is to be collected in subsequent years. The table No.82 gives information regarding no. of presses, News papers, periodicals printed etc. in the district. The table No. 83 gives information regarding general elections 1967.

There are 10 Assembly Constituencies and two Parliamentary Constituencies. Two tahsils viz. Shirala and Walwa of Sangli District are merged in Karad Parliamentary constituency for election purposes.

In table No. 84, important indicators in the fields of development such as agriculture, livestock, Industry, Education, health etc. are indicated for the year 1950-51, 55-56, 60-61, 66-67 and 67-68. These selected indicators are very useful for assessing progress in various fields over important periods in the recent past.

SELECTED INDICATORS :-

Tables regarding selected indicators of development for each tahsil of Satara District are appended at the end. Topic like population, agriculture, electricity, factory workers, road kilometerage, education, medical facilities etc. are covered, An effort is made to show the position of each tahsil in relation to its development under each item by way of ranking, on the basis of the latest data available for the year 1967-68.

CHAPTER - III

AN ANALYTIC REVIEW OF SECTORIAL TRENDS.

1967-68

An attempt has been made in the following lines to present the facts and figures which give an overall idea regarding several Socio-Economic features of the Satara District, which occurred as a result of various developmental activities. The impacts of these activities can better be seen from the sectorial trends in the respect of Agriculture and allied fields like livestock and Poultry, Employment, Electric Consumption, Medical facilities or civic amenities, Education, Communication, extent of credit and Banking facilities and things of the kind.

The facts and figures, for the sake of analytical review, prior to Third Five Year Plan, at the end of the Third Plan and during Annual Plan 1966-67 and 1967-68 are utilised here.

3.1 - Agriculture : Agriculture backwardness is one of the prominent features of our Agro-Economy even today. This is more true in respect of the State of Maharashtra and that of Satara District in particular. The hilly region, rocky or poor soils, scanty and uncertain rains, in the eastern Zone, inadequate irrigational facilities poor use of chemical fertilisers, all these have marred the productivity of the soil.

The figures furnished below will vividly throw light on the important aspects of agriculture

in Satara District. It can also be assessed from this, the position of Satara District in the Poona Division and the position of different talukas within the district.

3.2 Percentage gross sown area

The position regarding percentage of gross cropped area to net sown area and thereby the feasibility of double cropping can be assessed from the following table .

From the above figures it will be seen that percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown for district as a whole has been decreased by

two percent from 1960-61 to 1965-66. However, during 1966-67 the same was increased by one percent as compared to 1965-66. The district percentage is greater than the percentage of Poona Division in 1960-61 and 1965-66.

The decrease in 1966-67 is noted only in the Jaoli Taluka while the percentage is remained constant in the talukas of Phaltan, Man and Satara. The increase in 1966-67 is found in Khandala, Wai, M'war, Koregaon, Khatav, Patan and Karad talukas as compared to 1965-66. The highest percentage (117) of double cropped area is observed in Khandala and Patan talukas of the district, due to change in the cropping pattern and increase in the irrigational facilities.

3.3 - Productivity of Important Crops:-

The principal crops of the district are jowar, bajara, rice, wheat, gram, tur, groundnut, sugarcane and cotton. The productivity of these crops in Satara district can be assessed from their respective yield rates per hectare. The following table will furnish this information and the position of the district in the Poona division will also be seen from this.

From the above figures it is seen that yield rates were good in 1960-61; while in 65-66 they were decreased due to scarcity conditions in Satara District. However, the position was improved in 1966-67 to a greater extent in respect of all important crops. When compared to yield rates of Poona Division it will be seen that the yield rates of Satara District were better barring few crops.

3.4 - Gross value of Agril. Production.

Agril. Production plays vital role in our economy as a whole. Prosperity and progress in India are geared up with the large agricultural production and the income earned by the agriculturist. The figures given below will throw light on the per capita (Rural population) value of agricultural output in the different districts of Poona Division for the years 1960-61 and 1961-62.

It will be seen from these figures that the per capita value is constant in Ahmednagar and Sholapur district; while it is decreased by Rs.2 in

Poona, Rs.4 in Satara and Rs.7 in Kolhapur. Only in Sangli district it is increased by Rs.4. However, both in 1960-61 and 1961-62 the district of Satara stands last in respect of per capita gross value of agril. output.

3.5 Irrigation :-

In Satara district, percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area was 127 in 1960-61, 129 in 1965-66 and 132 in 1966-67. The figures for Poona division were 117 percent and 122 percent in 1960-61 and 1965-66. Percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown was 11.70, in 1960-61, 10.28 in 1965-66 and 10.83 in 1966-67.

The talukawise position of gross irrigated to net irrigated area can be seen from the following table No. 4-A.

From the above figures, it will be seen that in all talukas except Khatav and Karad the percentage appears to be good. The percentage of gross irrigated to net irrigated area was decreased in Khatav taluka but it was constant in Karad taluka. The percentage of net irrigated Area to net sown Area can be seen from the below Table No. 4-B.

As far as Satara district is concerned, increase is seen during 1966-67 over the year 1965-66 for the talukas of Phaltan, Mahabaleshwar, Khatav, Man Satara and Karad. In the remaining talukas the same is found to be decreased. The position of Poona Division

in respect of percentage of net irrigated area to net sown area, has increased little in 1965-66 as compared to 1960-61.

It will be revealed from the above table that percentage of net irrigation to the net cropped area is the highest in Phaltan taluka and the lowest in Koregaon taluka in 1966-67. The taluka of Phaltan is well served by Nira Right Bank Canal since 1933.

3.6 Changes in the cropping Pattern.

The figures supplied below throw light on the changes in the cropping pattern over a period from 1960-61 to 1965-66 and 1966-67 in Satara District.

the area under Wheat, Bajra and Gram has been increased while the same is decreased in respect of other crops during the year 1966-67 as compared to 1965-66. The area under food crops increased from 66.64 percent to 67.37 percent, resulting in the decrease in the area under non-food crops, during 1966-67.

In case of irrigation, the gross area irrigated increased from 91485 hectares to 99752 hectares in 1966-67 as compared to 1965-66. The area irrigated under Jowar increased from 25751 hectares to 31793 hectares. In case of Wheat, Bajra, Rice, Gram, Groundnut there is also increased in the acreage. The area irrigated by non food crops has been increased by 30 percent during 1966-67.

3.7 Agril. Credit and Outstanding dues.

At present, Agril. Credit is the vital strength of our agro-economy. The figures enumerated below will no doubt disclose the span of agril. Co-operative credit etc. during the Third Five Year Plan period and during 1966-67 and 1967-68 in Satara district.

It is apparent from the above table that the loans advanced by Agril. Co-operative Societies increased by 56 percent as at the end of Third Plan and 3 percent during 1967-68 as compared to 1966-67. The amount outstanding increased by 95 percent as compared to the position at the beginning of the Third Plan and 11 percent during 1967-68 as compared to 1966-67. Loan advanced per member was Rs.141 in 60-61 which rose to Rs.221 in 1965-66 but came down to Rs, 206 in 1966-67. However, the same was again slightly increased to Rs,212/- in 1967-68.

The loans advanced by Loan Development Bank also shown upward trend. Huge outstanding also is there due to the policy of advancing long term loans for Agril. Development for which the recovery was spread up over longer period.

3.8 Agril. Wage Rates :-

Agril. Wage Rates in each district of Maharashtra State are being collected since 1962-63. For each district, three centres are selected and from these selected Rural Centres data on agril. wage rates are being collected.

As far as Satara district is concerned, the selected centres are 1) Kale from Karad Block 2) Koregaon from Koregaon Block and 3) Limb from Satara Block.

Generally, it is seen that wage rates in respect of male (un skilled) at Kale and Limb centres are more in the years 1966 and 1967 due to the nearness of towns. The male field labourers get wages between Rs.2 to Rs.3 and female labourers get Rs.0.75 to Rs.2.00 skilled workers like carpenters and Blacksmiths get wages of Rs.4 to 5, whose services are still required for agril. sector of our economy.

It will be seen that due to the overall rise in prices, agril. wage rates are also found increased in 1967. The position of the agril. wage rates within Poona Division has also shown upward trend.

3.9 - Livestock -

In the year 1966, the 10th quinquennial livestock census was carried out throughout India. Animal Husbandry in India, from the point of view of its substantial contribution by way of providing income and draught power to farmers; subsidiary food to human population etc. has a great impact on our rural economy. The figures provided below in this respect are the indicators of development of our economy. The number of livestock, particularly Bovine and ovine population in relation to per hectare cultivable land is one of them.

The number of livestock per 100 hectares of cultivable land in 1961 was 112, while it was 105 in 1966, in Satara district. The figures for Poona Dn. are 124 and 116 in the years 1961 and 1966 respectively. The position of Satara district appears to be lower in both the years as compared to the figures of Poona Dn.

Within the district, the taluka of Man is having largest no. of livestock per hectare of cultivable land. The no. of livestock per hectare cultivable land is more than the district average. The talukas of Man, Karad, Wai and Khandala have also the livestock more than the district average. The remaining talukas have the livestock less than the district average, the lowest being the talukas of Phaltan and Jaoli. The taluka of Man is having largest no. of livestock per hectare of cultivable land, as the no. of total livestock in Man taluka is the highest (and particularly the no. of total livestock in Man taluka is the highest (and particularly the no. of sheeps) in the district of Satara.

3.10 Poultry

In 1961, total poultry in Satara district was 6.58 lakhs while the same was 7.76 lakhs in 1966. The no. of poultry per 1000 population thus increased from 460 in 1961 to 543 in 66. The rate of increase in poultry per 1000 human population in Satara district is 18 percent from 1961 to 1966. The same is only 10 percent in respect of Poona Division, This comparison however, is based on constant human population factor of 1961 for both the years 1961 and 1966.

3.11 - Consumption of Electricity.

The per capita consumption of Electricity in Satara district in 1960-61 was 4.53 KWH. In 1961-62 it was 4.91 KWH. while in 1965-66 it rose to 21.49 KWH. and 21.50 in 1966-67 and 25.41 in 1967-68. There appears to be rapidly increasing trend in the consumption of electricity.

3.12 - Enrolment at Employment Exchange
and Vacancies notified.

Employment generation is no doubt the vital issue in the country like India. Our Planning is paying due attention in offering employment opportunities and reducing the unemployment.

The position of Satara district as regards the registration in the employment exchange and the vacancies notified etc. can be seen from the figures supplied in the below table.

From the above figures almost every where decrease is noticed. This is because of the fact that statistics of employment exchange alone is not enough to indicate the trend of the extent of unemployment etc. and the opportunities provided in Satara district. Employment provided in private sector, not through the employment exchange, is also

substantial one and hence it will not be appropriate to draw conclusions and comment upon them on the basis of employment exchange Statistics, alone.

3.13 Increase in Indoor and Outdoor

Patients Treated :-

The increase can be seen from the following figures.

Both the indoor and outdoor patients treated has increased during 1967. The increase is about 39 percent when the figures of 1967 are compared with those of 1966.

3.14 - Increase in No. of students of different Categories.

Education is the backbone of all sided development and social elevation. The percentage of pupils taking education either in Primary, Secondary or higher has increased during 1967-68. The figures supplied below will show the percentage increase in 1967-68 over 1966-67 in respect of different types of education.

The increase in respect of girl students is notable for primary and secondary types noted above.

3.15 - Increase In Road Length Per

100 Sq. Km.

Roads of any kind have great significance in the social life of a nation. This is more true in respect of the state of Maharashtra and particularly the hilly districts of it. The road facilities available in the district could better be judged by working out road length per 100 Sq. Km.

In Satara district, the road length per 100 Sq. Km. was 27.02 in 1960-61; while in 1966-67 the same was 30.40 and in 1967-68 it was 30.42. In 1960-61 the total road length was 2811 Km. The same has been increased by 364 Km. in 1967-68.

3.16 Increase In Banking facilities

In Proportion to Population.

In modern days of complex economy the emergence of Banking facilities is inevitable. In 1961 there were 41 banks of different types in Satara district. The same rose to 61 at the beginning of 1968. That means in 1961, there were 3 Bank Offices per lakh of population in Satara district. The no. rose by 1 at the beginning of 1968. This indicates that day by day people are taking advantages of banking facilities both in urban and rural areas of the district.

3.17 Prices :-

Price phenomenon is a matter of pivotal importance in every day life. This has greatly been felt since November 1962.

As it is the case, the work of collection of prices at each district head quarter in Maharashtra State was entrusted to the District Statistical Offices of the Bureau of Economics and Statistics. From this data, changes in the prices of important commodities during 1966 and 1967 can broadly be seen. The price trends in retail prices have thumping impact on the masses at large.

The price trend for the items like cereals and pulses under Food, Sugar, Gur and edible and other oils, Condiments and Spices, Vegetables and such other items of daily consumption, Shirting, Sarees, Dhotis etc. under Clothing, Kerosene, Charcoal Match box, Firewood etc. under Fuel., Tea and Coffee under Beverages, and washing Soap, Pan, Supari, Tobacco, Cigarettes, Bidi, Hair Oils, Penicillin, Quinine etc. under Miscellaneous articles has a tendency to rise in a upward direction since 1962.

The consumer Price Index for Sholapur Centre is applicable to Satara. It will be observed that there is an increase in prices during 1967-68 compared with those in 1966-67.

CHAPTER - IV

ANNUAL PLAN

1967 - 68

1) INTRODUCTORY :-

4.1 General :-

Since the expiry of the Third Five Year Plan period on 31-3-1966, Annual Plans are being implemented in the State of Maharashtra, as elsewhere in India, without departing from the basic objectives or fundamental aims of our five year planning. The Schemes in the Annual Plan were implemented practically on the same lines of the Schemes in the Third Plan, with a few modifications.

The year 1967-68 is the second year of the implementation of the Annual Plans.

Progress of the Annual Plan 1967-68 can be better viewed in comparison with the progress of district level plan schemes implemented during the Third Plan period and the Annual Plan 1966-67 in Satara district as is shown below :-

N. B. :- Scheme of Rural Electrification under Irrigation and Power was treated as divisional level scheme in III Plan but the same is treated as district level in the Annual Plans.

Perusal of the above table will reveal that pace of expenditure incurred during the year 1966-67 and 1967-68 under the various major heads of development except Coop. and Community Development shows increasing trend when compared with average annual expenditure incurred on the same heads during III Plan period. The total expenditure incurred during the years 1966-67 and 1967-68 is nearly double and more than the double respectively (viz. 192.26 and 217.62 percent) of the average Annual expenditure of III Plan. The percentage of expenditure under the Agril. Programmes, Industry and Mining, Transport and Communication and Social Services in both the years under reference is good, whereas the same is declining year to year when compared with the average Annual expenditure of the III Five year Plan.

Not only this, but when compared with the Annual Plan 1966-67 the expenditure incurred during the Annual Plan 1967-68 shows percentage increase of 13.19 for all the major heads together; only under the major head Cooperation and C.D. there is decrease of 34 percent in expenditure.

Increase in expenditure under various heads is as follows :-

Agril. Programmes 3.23 percent, Industry and Mining 34.62 percent, Transport and Communication 13.56 percent and Social Services 59.49 percent. The per capita expenditure per year has increased from Rs.10 in III Plan to Rs.19 in the Annual Plan 1966-67 and Rs.22 in the Annual Plan 1967-68.

During the Annual Plan 1967-68 in all 96 District Level Plan Schemes were implemented in Satara

district, 54 under State Sector and 42 in the Local. Four Schemes were executed in both the sectors. They were 1) Minor Irrigation Works 2) Financial Assistance to Industrial Co-op. Societies including handicraft workers 3) District Roads and 4) Rural Water Supply Schemes. The centrally sponsored Plan Schemes were 1) Pulpwood Species 2) Coop. farming 3) Co-op. consumers' stores and 4) Family Planning.

4.2 :- Progress of Expenditure and Physical Achievements In Annual Plan 1967-68.

Perusal of expenditure incurred in Satara district given in the above table, during the Annual Plan 1966-67, indicates that about 38 percent of total expenditure relates to Agril. Programme, 10 percent to Coop. and C.D, 22 percent to Irrigation and Power, 9 percent to Transport and Communications and 21 percent to Social Services. Expenditure under Industry and Mining is negligible viz. 0.4 percent.

In the Annual Plan 1967-68 also, 35 percent of the total expenditure was incurred on Agril. Programmes, 6 percent on Coop. and Community Development, 21 percent on Irrigation and Power, 0.4 percent on Industry and Mining, 9 percent on Transport and Communication and 29 percent on Social Services. Significant increase is noticed only under major head Social Services in the Annual Plan 1967-68.

In the following para's, the progress of the Schemes according to sub-heads of development has been elucidated.

4.3 - I - Agril. Programme

A) Agril. Production including Land Development.

Under this sub-head 13 schemes were implemented 6 under State and 7 under Local Sector during the year 67-68 and Rs.13.94 lakhs were spent. Progress of the Schemes Hybrid seed production, oil seeds development, cotton development by supply of Polythene bags, consolidation of holdings in the State Sector was good as almost all the provision was spent. However, progress of Taluka seed farms, small holders' scheme, Establishment of Agril. Workshop in the State Sector was some what slow. In the local sector progress of the schemes General Horticultural development, crop campaign was significant and the schemes sann seed, Intensive cultivation of food crops, prefabricated bandharas showed poor progress. During the year 1967-68 11,253 Qtl.of improved seed of various types, 418 improved implements were distributed and 13,253 Tons of various types of chemical fertilisers were distributed in Satara district.

B) Minor Irrigation :-

The schemes of New wells, Pumping sets, Coop. Lift Irrigation were implemented in the State sector and the scheme community wells in the local sector. The Scheme Minor Irrigation was executed in both the sectors. Amount of Rs.40.28 lakhs was incurred during the year under report and thereby subsidy for construction of 547 wells, 790 pumps was given. Work of 11 Bandharas, 8 tanks, 4 L.I. Works was in progress and additional irrigation potential of 970 acres was created. There was saving for the

schemes of New wells, and Pumping sets, as requisition for subsidy amount was not given by the Land Development bank, in time.

C) Soil Conservation :-

All the schemes executed under this sub head pertaining to the state sector and the schemes of contour bunding and Afforestation for Soil Conservation was satisfactory. The Schemes Terracing and Reclamation of Saline and Alkaline lands showed slow progress. The reasons for slow financial and physical progress was the shortage of the required skilled labour and recent mishap of earth-quake at Koyananagar and surrounding areas in the district.

D) Animal Husbandry :-

All the schemes under this sub-head were implemented in the local sector. Full amount provided for the Schemes cattle shows and rallies and loans for Poultry business was spent; whereas progress of the rest of the schemes was not upto the mark. One veterinary aid centre, and two artificial insemination centres were started and 34 premium bulls were supplied during the above period.

E) Dairy Development :-

Progress of the both the schemes from the State sector was good although full amount budgeted for Government Milk Supply Scheme, Mahabaleshwar could not be spent.

F) Forests :-

Progress of all the schemes which have been executed in the state sector was satisfactory and practically all the provision was utilised. 557 acres of

area was brought under afforestation and 1980 acres under the plantation of valuable trees.

G) Fisheries :-

All the schemes implemented under this sub head relate to the state sector. No expenditure was incurred on the schemes of Fish Seed production, Financial Assistance for intensifying fish farming and Financial Assistance to fishery cooperatives on account of the reasons of administrative nature.

Progress of the other schemes was on schedule. During the year under report 1.10 lakhs of fingerlings was stocked and 27 Kg. of netting was done.

H) Warehousing and Marketing :-

Development of Agril. Marketing :-

The Scheme implemented in State sector showed satisfactory progress and one society was assisted during the period under report.

II. Cooperation and Community Development

A) Cooperation :-

All the Schemes implemented in the State sector showed significant progress. 620 members of Agril. Primaries were added, 3 processing societies with 13,744 members and 1 Handloom Coop. Society with 56 members were started. Rs. 287 lakhs were disbursed as short term credit in Satara District.

B) Community Development :-

During the year 1967-68 Rs.14.98 lakhs were incurred on the schemes executed in the local sector under this programme. Progress of the scheme Community Development Project was on the schedule though full expenditure on the scheme of Applied

Nutrition Programme and Rural Works Programme could not be incurred as the staff was engaged in the recent earth-quake work. All the area of Satara district was covered under the C.D. Programme. Applied Nutrition Programme was applicable to Karad Block and the Rural Works Programme to 7 other Blocks in this district. Under the scheme of Rural works Programme, 20 bahdharas and 45 miles of roads were constructed.

III. Irrigation and Power :-

A) Rural Electrification :-

Progress of the Scheme was significant. During the year under report, 53 villages were electrified and 1066 Agril.pumps were energised. Slow physical progress was there due to the non availability of certain material.

IV) Industry and Mining :-

A) Development of Small Scale and Cottage Industries :-

Progress of all the schemes was satisfactory as all the provision earmarked was spent. One scheme each was implemented in the State and local sectors and one scheme was executed in both the sectors. Five weavers' societies and 44 Industrial Societies of handicraft workers were assisted. During the above period 177 loanees were given loans under the scheme of S.A.I. Rules in Satara District.

V. Transport and Communication :-

Under this sub head one scheme viz. District Roads was implemented in both the State and Local sectors while rest of the schemes are implemented in the local sector. Progress of the schemes

implemented in the local sector was low one as the full expenditure was not made. This was due to the fact that staff of the local sector was greatly engaged in the earth-quake relief work. 84 miles of new roads under the scheme District Roads and 37 miles under the Rural Roads were constructed. Work of one bridge was completed and the work of other two was in progress.

VI. Social Services :-

A) General Education :-

All the schemes implemented under this programme are related to the local sector. Only one scheme in the state sector was there. The progress of all the schemes was good though there was saving for Opening and Development of technical High Schools which was due to the non receipt of equipment, machinery etc. in time.

B) Technical Education :-

Full expenditure in respect of both the Schemes executed under this sub head could not be spent due to the vacancy of some posts under the scheme of Govt. Polytechnic and non receipt of equipment, machinery etc. in time. Work of hostel building at Karad was in progress.

C) Health and Family Planning :-

Under this sub head progress of the scheme of Expanding medical facilities and completion of building etc. for District Hospital was slow as the work of nurses' quarters at Satara could not be undertaken in view of economy ban. Plans and estimates for T.B. clinic at Satara have been submitted to B. and C. Department.

Progress of the scheme of National Malaria eradication programme was as per schedule . Further, the progress of the schemes implemented in local sector was good in respect of Small pox eradication and Family Planning Schemes. There was saving in the schemes of Primary Health Centres due to some vacant posts, slow progress of constructional work etc. 4434 operations were performed during the year 1967-68 under the scheme of Family Planning in Satara District. This was no doubt a notable achievement in Satara district for the period under report.

D) Water Supply and Drainage

Out of the 4 schemes implemented, part of one scheme was executed in the local sector and all other schemes in the state sector. Full expenditure could not be made in both the sectors as plans and estimates for some of the works were required to be modified. Moreover, staff of the local sector was engaged in earth-quake relief operation.

E) Housing :-

Under this programme 3 schemes were implemented in the State sector and one in the local. Progress of State sector scheme viz. Low income group housing was good whereas budgeted allotment could not be spent in full for Subsidised Industrial Housing and Gaothan extension Schemes. Progress of village housing projects under the local sector was satisfactory. Work of 192 tenement under Subsidised Industrial Housing Scheme was still in progress and slow physical progress was there on account of shortage of skilled labour and material due to the recent earth-quake in Satara District.

F) Backward Class Welfare :-

One scheme was implemented in the state sector and the rest of the schemes were in the local sector. Progress of all the schemes in both the sectors was on schedule. All the provision was utilised. 573 students were benefitted by E.B.C.Scheme; while 24 B.C. hostels and 7 Cosmopolitan hostels were assisted during the above period in Satara District.

G) Labour and Labour Welfare :-

There was less expenditure when compared to the budget provision of the year under report as the work of construction of additional workshop building at Satara and Karad could not be taken up by B. & C. Department for want of technical sanction. The intake capacity of I.T.I. Karad and Satara, as on 31-3-68, was 888 students, in Satara District.

From the foregoing narration of financial and physical progress of the schemes implemented in the State and local sectors under the various major and minor heads of development, it can be said that better progress would have been achieved and thereby full expenditure could have been made, had there not been the natural calamity like earth-quake and in some cases the routine administrative and technical difficulties, in the way of implementation of the Annual Plan 1967-68, in Satara District.
