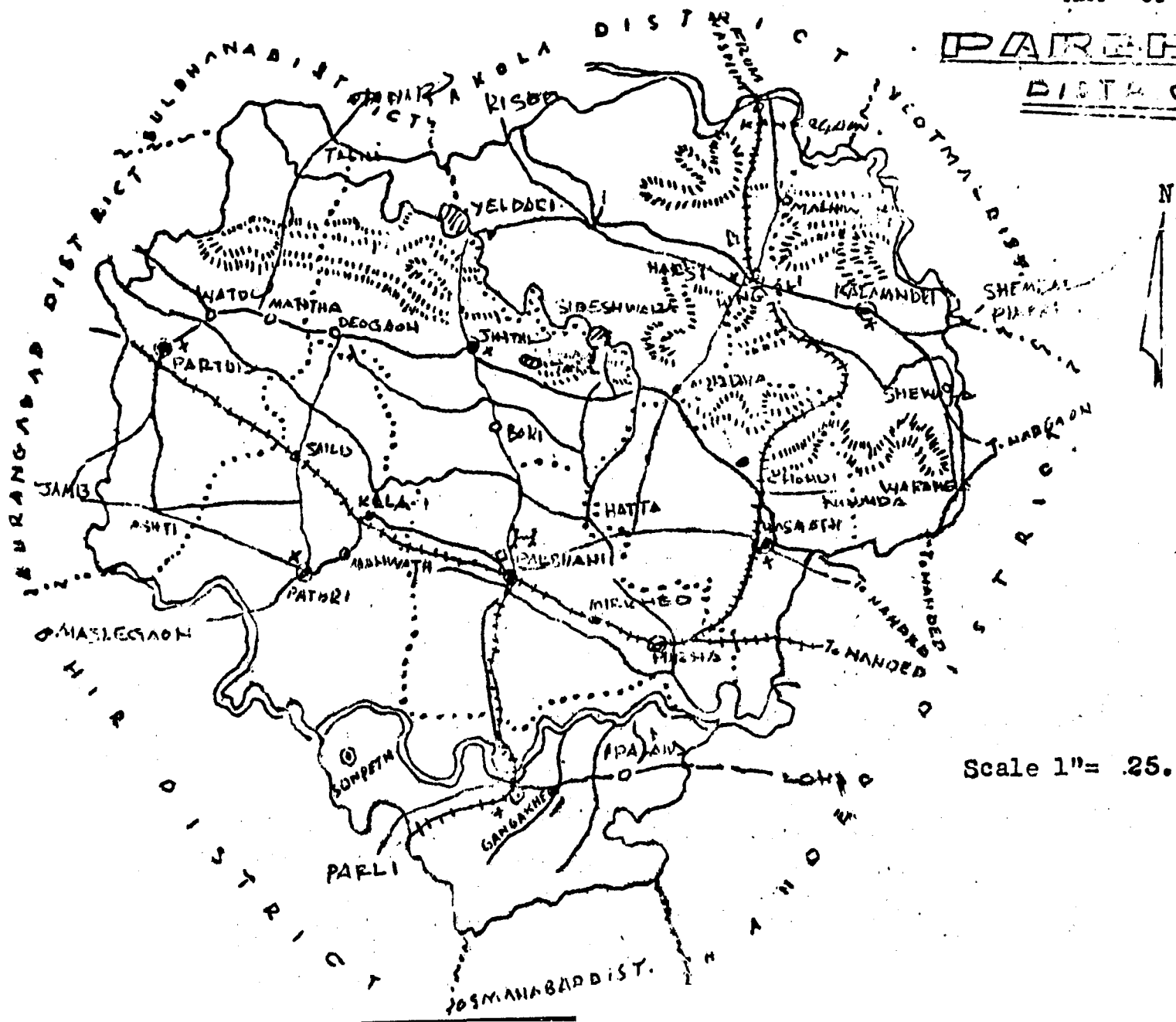

CHAPTER NO. I
INTRODUCTION

1.1(1) Introduction and Location:- In ancient times the town Parbhani was known as Prabhavati on account of the existence of a beautiful and massive temple of goddess Prabhavati. During the times of the Khiljis, the temple was forcibly turned into a Mosque which is now identified as Roshan Khan Masjid. Out of the twelve Jotirlingas in the country and 3 in Marathwada region, the district is sanctified by the existence of a Jotirling namely Lord Nagnath at Aundha village in Hingoli taluka.

1.1(2) Parbhani District with an east-west extension of 123.72 km. (80 miles) and north-south extension of 104.53 km (65 miles) stretches between $18^{\circ}53'$ and $20^{\circ}.2'$ north latitude and between $76^{\circ}.4'$ and $77^{\circ}.4'$ east longitude. The district as a whole belongs to the Godavari, Peninsular Basin situated on the northern side of Marathwada region. The Godavari has converted southern portion of the District comprising of Pathri, Parbhani and Gangakhed talukas into a very fertile valley. The Purna which is a tributary of the Godavari and the Dudhana which is a tributary of the Purna drain the talukas of Jintur and Basmath.

1.2 Boundaries:- In shape, Parbhani is a compact district. It has natural boundaries of the Penganga river with a stretch of 160.93 km. in the north-east and of the Godavari river with a stretch of 64.37 km in the south-west.

Administratively it is bounded on the north by Buldhana, Akola and Yeotmal districts of Vidarbha region and on the east by Nanded district. On the south it is surrounded by Osmanabad and Bhir Districts and on the west by Aurangabad district.

1.3 Administrative Set-up:-

1.3(1) The District consists of six talukas viz. Partur, Jintur, Hingoli, Kalamnuri, Pathri, Parbhani, Basmath and Gangakhed.

Of these, Parbhani taluka is in the centre with a Gangakhed on the south, Pathri and Partur on the west, Jintur, Hingoli and Kalamnuri on the north and Basmath on the east.

1.3(2) For administrative convenience the district has been divided into two sub-divisions viz. Sailu and Hingoli each covering four talukas. While Parbhani, Gangakhed, Pathri and Partur talukas fall under the jurisdiction of Sailu sub-division, the remaining four form part of the Hingoli sub-division. The Collector and Tahsildars are the heads of the general administration, law and order, treasury, land revenue and civil supplies in the district and talukas respectively. The Zilla Parishad and the Panchayat Samitis execute developmental and administrative functions to the extent of subjects transferred to them including Community Development Programme since the advent of the Panchayat Raj on 1-5-1962 in the State.

1.3(3) There are in all 1,577 villages in the district of which 60 are un-inhabited. It is also worth mentioning that in this district there are 12 towns administered by the Municipal Councils. Out of the 12 towns three are in Pathri taluka, two each in Gangakhed and Parbhani talukas and one each all being taluka headquarters, in the remaining 5 talukas. In all population of 1,66,702 persons live in the 12 towns whereas 10,39,534 persons live in the 1,517 villages.

1.4 Area

1.4(1):- Parbhani district stretches over an area of 12,552.9 square kilometres (4,846.7 sq.miles) of which 12,321.9 sq.kilometres (4,757.5 miles) is rural and the remaining 231.0 square kilometres (89.2 sq.miles) urban. In terms of area and population respectively, it is the eleventh and nineteenth largest district in Maharashtra State. The District accounts for 4.1% and 3.0% of the State's area and population respectively according to 1961 Census.

1.4(2) Territorial changes: During 1905 the northern villages of

Nanded taluka of Nanded district were added to Kalamnuri taluka of this district. Besides, eight villages from Anbad taluka of Aurangabad district were transferred to Pathri taluka of this district in exchange of six villages of Pathri taluka transferred to Anbad taluka of Aurangabad district. Thereafter there were no territorial changes till the end of 1955. Consequent upon the re-organisation of States on 1-11-1956, the district was transferred to the then Bombay State. Since 1st May 1960 it forms part of Maharashtra State and Aurangabad revenue division.

1.5 Topography:-As a part of the Deccan plateau, the land of the district has a general elevation of about 457.50(1,500 ft) above the sea level, its highest and lowest levels being 579.73 metres (1902 ft) in the Jintur range, about 12.87 km. (8 miles) north of Charthana village and lowest level being around 366.0 metres (1200 ft) above sea level on the Godavari bank near the point where the river crosses over the district boundary. The talukas of Pathri, Partur (except northern part), Gangakhed and Parbhani are plain topographically, while the talukas of Jintur, Hingoli, Kalamnuri and northern parts of Basmath and Partur tahsils are all hilly and mountainous in nature.

1.6 Hills:

1.6(1) The main hill ranges of the district are Ajanta hills which emanate from the main Sahyadris. These run through Partur, Jintur, Hingoli and Kalamnuri talukas. The crest-line consists of flat tops with an average elevation of 534 metres (1750 ft) above sea level.

1.6(2) Malhura Hills:- These are west-east hill ranges separating the Panganga valley from that of Kaldhu to its south. The tops record heights ranging between 542 metres (1775 ft) in the west and 433 metres (1600 ft) in the east.

1.6(3) Balaghat Hills:- A section of Balaghat range a transverse member of Sahyadris, stretches over the southern portion of the district comprising of Gangakhed taluka. Its general elevation is 534 metres (1750 ft) with a few peaks, recording heights above 549 metres (1800 ft).

1.6(4) Isolated Hills:- These stand mainly in the undulating black soil plain of the Godavari and Purna rivers having an average height of 468 metres (1533 ft).

1.6(5) River system:(1) The Godavari is the most important river of the district. With its entrenched and meandering course it is the master stream that flows through Marathwada to enrich its economic resources, but at the same time impeding its communications. It winds its course into the district from west and after running a distance of about 180 km. (112 miles) through Gangakhed taluka, enters the adjoining district of Nanded. The Purna rises from the Ajanta hills and enters the district from the north-west corner. It makes its course in the south-eastern direction for major length through Jintur, Hingoli, Basmath and Parbhani talukas and then falls into the Godavari. The river Dudhna takes its rise in the amphitheatre of Khuldabad-Mahismal range runs into the district in the south-eastern direction like the Purna for nearly 161 km. (100 miles) to join it. The Penganga river also rises in the Ajanta hills a little to the south-west of Buldhana town and winds its course in the likewise manner. Its distinctive feature over other rivers is that all along its course of about 80 km. (50 miles) it acts as a district boundary. The river Kaidu popularly known as Kaidhu enters the Hingoli taluka after rising from the hills scraps south of Risod town in Akola district and covers a distance of about 113 km. (70 miles) in Hingoli and Kalamnuri talukas.

(2) Besides, there are several minor streams in the district more important amongst which are the Karpura, the Kansur, the Wan, the Bor-na, the Macchili, the Galati, the Indrayani and the Dhond all being the tributaries of the Godavari.

1.6(3) Soil:- The soil of the district is known as "Black Cotton Soil" or "Regur" as it is popularly called and is formed by weathering of the trap rock. The district is essentially a region of black soil gully erosion, uneven surfaces, furrowed by large and small streams and meandering water course. The uneven black soil plain is, however, interrupted by occasional basaltic knolls. The soil is rich in plant nutrients such as Lime, Magnesia, Iron, Alkalies. It swells and becomes sticky on wetting by rains and develops several cracks while becoming dry. It varies widely in texture and depth from place to place. In the hilly tracks in the north it is shallow and poor, while towards the south it is relatively richer and deeper. In the Godavari and the Purna valleys and especially along the courses of these rivers it is very deep and fertile making the central belt an economically well developed part of the district.

1.6(7) Minerals:- The district is devoid of any mineral wealth worth the name. Inferior quality of stone used for construction of buildings and other minor minerals are, however, extracted in this district. Black asphalt and granite are available every where and are used for buildings and road-metalling.

1.7 Climate, Temperature and Rainfall:-

1.7(1) Climate:- The climate of the district is generally dry except during the south-west monsoon. The seasons show local variations within the district and the northern part of the district is much healthier than the southern plains. Winters are cooler in the northern portion without being much damp during the rainy season.

as in the southern portion. The comparison of monthly average temperature for 1966 and 1967 reveal that during both these years the average temperature was highest in the month of May and lowest in the month of January. In general it could be said that the winter of 1967 which was cooler in the beginning i.e in October and November months became warmer, subsequently unlike the winter of 1966 which was warm in the beginning and more sever in the subsequent months. The summer of 1967 was hotter through out when compared with 1966. The rainy season of the year 1967 was more damp than that in the year 1966 except in case of the month September.

1.7(2) Temperature:- On the basis of the temperature data which is available for the only meteorological observatory at Parbhani headquarters, the district can be divided into four seasons. The cold season(winter) starts from November and ends in February. It is followed by the hot season(Summer) from March to May. The sou-west monsoon season(rainy season) commences from June and lasts upto September and is followed by the post-monsoon season in October and November preceeding the next winter. During the year 1967 the variation in the mean maximum and mean minimum temperature was 28.5° centigrade while the same was 27.9° during 1966. Considering the average temperature the range of variation was 34.2° centigrade(May) and 22.1° centigrade (January) as against a range of variation of 32.7° centigrade(May) and 20.7° centigrade(January) during the year 1966. The table below indicates monthwise mean-maximum and mean-minimum temperature during the years 1966 and 1967 with variations in between the mean maximum and mean minimum temperature.

The table indicates that February was the month of maximum variations in the temperature during both 1966 and 1967 while the variation was minimum in months of September 1966 and August 1967.

1.7(3) Rainfall:- (1) Parbhani district receives its major rains from south-west monsoon during the months June to September. The normal rainfall of the district is 326.6 mm. Considering the general pattern of rainfall in various parts of the district it can be said that the rainfall increases from the west to east. The rains are most unevenly spread over the area and period both. During both the years 1966 and 1967 rainfall received was much less than the district normal although the number of rainy days were more than the district normal of 45. The table below gives talukwise rainfall during 1967 compared to 1966.

It can be inferred from above data that there was no considerable change in the number of rainy days and rainfall received in the district during the years 1966 and 1967. With the exception of Gangakhed taluka in all the remaining talukas there were either less number of rainy days or less rainfall. In case of Jintur even though the number of rainy days decreased, there was increase in the rainfall received. Contrary to this in Parbhani and Basmath talukas as against an increase in the number of rainy days there was decrease in the rainfall received by them. In the remaining talukas there was considerable decrease both in the number of rainy days and total rainfall received. There were 2 talukas namely Basmath and Kalamnuri receiving rainfall above the district normal of 326.6 mm. during 1966 while all the talukas received rainfall below the district normal during 1967. In 6 talukas the number of rainy days were more than the district normal of 45 during both 1966 and 1967. The average rainfall per day worked out at 14.2 mm. during 1967 against 14.3 mm. during 1966.

CHAPTER-II

Explanatory notes on scope and limitations of the statistics presented in the Statistical Abstract.

Purpose:- The abstract part of the publication gives exhaustive statistics on important socio-economic indicators of development. Tables on almost all important subjects are presented in this part, so that the publication could serve as a reference book. Attempts have been made to present talukwise data as far as possible to enable the reader to know the stage of development reached in the various parts of the district. In most of the tables data for 1967-68 has been indicated with data for previous year for comparison. In a few cases such as population, livestock census, data for latest census and in respect of agriculture data for 1966-67 has been shown. The data is collected from offices of the State Government, Central Government, Local Bodies and other agencies. The foot-notes shown below the table indicate the source from which it has been collected.

District At A Glance:- This table gives data on all important items in order to have a birds-eye-view of the Socio-Economic Indicators of the district for Parbhani district and Aurangabad Division for facilitating a comparison. Items covered in the table are area and population, agriculture, animal husbandry, industries, electricity, cooperation, medical and health, education, transport and communication, plan and community development programme, local bodies and other miscellaneous statistics. Reference period of the data is also indicated in this table.

The contents of the tables in the abstract part and scope and limitations of the data presented therein are summarised below;

1. Climate and Rainfall:- Table numbers 1 and 2 deal with number of rainy days and rainfall and monthly temperature at the selected centres, in the district. Table number 1 shows monthly and annual rainfall and number of rainy days as well as for the years 1966 and 1967 as recorded at the 3 centres in the district which are also taluka headquarters. The data reported by the tahsildars in the district is presented in the table. Separate annual rainfall is shown for each centre. However, district average rainfall is not indicated in the table.

The table dealing with temperature indicates monthwise mean, mean maximum and mean minimum temperature at district headquarters Parbhani for the years 1966 and 1967. Mean maximum temperature denotes average of maximum daily temperature recorded in a month. Similarly mean-minimum temperature stands for average of minimum temperature recorded on each day during a particular month. There is only one meteorological centre at Parbhani in this district.

2. Area and population:- Table numbers 3 to 3 deal with talukawise rural & urban area and population, classification of villages and towns according to population ranges, number of workers and non-workers, population according to age group, mother-tongue and religion and scheduled caste and scheduled tribe population, as enumerated during 1961 census, the reference date of which was 1st March 1961. The table on talukawise rural and urban population indicates sexwise population of the district during 1951 and 1961 censuses. The variation in population over 1951 census is also given in percentages for rural, urban and total population. The population figures for the earlier census (1951) shown in the table have been adjusted for boundaries or areas of the district and talukas as they existed at the time of 1961 census.

The table dealing with classification of villages according to population ranges gives number of villages in population ranges, 0-149, 200-499, 500-999, 1000-1999, 2000-4999, 5000-9999 and 10000 and above population in each taluka of Parbhani district. The term village denotes a statutorily recognised village having a defined boundary and separate land records. Table dealing with urban areas indicate classification of towns according to population ranges. A town or a urban area indicated in the table is a place which has a municipality or a population of 5000 or more ^{persons} and at least 75% of male population depending on non-agricultural occupations". Rural area is the difference between the total area and the urban area. The table dealing with workers and non workers in each taluka of the district shows number of workers and non workers in rural and urban areas also. The classification of the worker is as per livelihood classes emphasising broadly the mode of their work. "The workers shown in the table according to livelihood classes are the persons who were at work for more than an hour a day throughout the greater part of the season in case of seasonal works like cultivation, livestock, dairying and household industry etc. and for any of the 15 days preceding the day of enumerators' visit to the household in case of regular employment in trade, profession, service, business or commerce. A person who was working but was absent from his work during the 15 days preceding the day on which enumerator even exceeding the period of 15 days due to illness or other causes has been treated as worker. The non-workers shown in the table are persons who were not gainfully employed in any occupation or who have not participated in any productive work in any occupation. A person who had been offered work but had not actually joined has also been treated as non workers.

The table number 7 gives the distribution of population according to age group, mother-tongue and religion. This classification according to above 3 categories is shown for both rural and urban areas of the district. No talukawise figures are indicated in this table. The table on sex-wise population on scheduled castes and scheduled tribes indicates total, rural and urban population of scheduled caste and scheduled tribes in the district.

3. Agriculture:- Table numbers 9 to 19 deal with land utilization statistics, area under different crops, yield per hectare and output of principal crops, area irrigated by different sources, area irrigated under different crops, number of irrigation wells, number of minor irrigation works, major and medium projects in the district, agricultural wage rates, agricultural implements and famine and scarcity data.

The table on land utilization gives distribution of total geographical area in each taluka of the district according to various land uses for the years 1965-66 and 1966-67. The major items constituting geographical area shown in the table are forest, area not available for cultivation, other un-cultivated area excluding fallows, fallows and net sown area. The gross sown area and the area sown more than once are also indicated in the table. The table dealing with area under different crops indicates talukawise area under different crops grown in the district during the years 1965-66 and 1966-67. The grouping of the crops into food crops, non-food crops and also into cereals, pulses, condiments & spices, fibres, oil-seeds and drugs & narcotics is also made in the table. The total net cultivated area under different crops together with area cropped more than once and gross cropped area are also shown.

The table dealing with yield and out-turn of principal crops in the district shows yield per hectare in kilogram and out-turn (in metric tons) of the principal crops of the district for the years 1965-66 and 1966-67.

The table dealing with irrigated area gives talukawise irrigated area by different sources of irrigation for the years 1965-66 and 1966-67. Talukawise net area irrigated and gross area irrigated is also shown in this table.

In another table dealing with irrigation, area irrigated under different crops in each taluka of the district during the years 1965-66 and 1966-67 is shown.

Table number 14 deals with number of irrigation wells in use and not in use in each taluka of Parbhani district during the years 1965-66 and 1966-67.

Table numbers 15 and 16 deal with minor irrigation works and major & medium irrigation works during the years 1963-64 and 1967-68 respectively. Minor irrigation works are shown according to administrative jurisdiction of the works such as Zilla Parishad, State and Private and Co-operative. The net area irrigated by these works is also indicated in the table. The table dealing with major and medium irrigation projects, however, gives project-wise details such as name, location, year of completion, height of the dam, length of the canal, storage capacity, area under command and area irrigated. There is only one major project namely "Purna Project" in this district. There is no medium project in the district.

The table on agricultural wage rates gives monthwise agricultural wage rates of skilled and un-skilled agricultural labourers at the 3 selected centres namely Palam, Mantha and Kanergaon Naka in the

district for the years 1966 and 1967.

The table number 13 shows number of agricultural implements in each taluka of Parbhani district, as per 1961 livestock census. Agricultural implements covered in the table are ploughs, carts, sugarcane crushers, oil engines, electric pumps, tractors and oil-ghanis.

The table number 19 deals with famine scarcity and akin to scarcity data in Parbhani district for the year 1967-68. There were no conditions of scarcities during the year 1967-68.

4. Animal Husbandry:- Table numbers 20 to 23 indicate livestock census data, veterinary statistics, disease-wise livestock mortality and number of animals slaughtered in the recognised slaughter houses in Parbhani District.

The table dealing with livestock census 1966 gives number of livestock in each taluka of Parbhani district by categories such as cattle, buffaloes, sheep, goats etc., besides, poultry population. Sex-wise and age-groupwise classification of cattle and buffaloes is also indicated in the table.

The table on veterinary statistics depicts number of veterinary hospitals/dispensaries/aid-centres in each taluka of Parbhani district and animals treated therein during 1966-67 and 1967-68. Number of artificial insemination centres and animals inseminated during 1966-67 and 1967-68 are also shown in this table.

The next table in this group indicates attacks and deaths due to important contagious and parasitic livestock diseases during 1966-67 and 1967-68 which have been classified into bovine diseases, diseases of sheep and goats and diseases of poultry.

The table on slaughter house statistics gives total number of animals slaughtered by categories in each of the 3 recognised slaughter houses in this district during 1966-67 and 1967-68.

Animals covered in the table are cattle, buffaloes, sheep, goats and pigs.

5. Forest and Fisheries:- The table numbers 24a and 24b deal with rangewise forest area in hectares and major & minor forest products respectively in Parbhani district.

The table dealing with rangewise forest area gives area under reserved, protected, unclassified and total forest area for the years 1966-67 and 1967-68. There is only one range namely Hingoli in this district. Classification of forest area according to the administrative jurisdiction is ^{also} indicated in the table.

The table on major and minor forest products shows quantity and value of forest products extracted in the district during 1966-67 and 1967-68. Major forest products covered in the table are, timber, fuel and Sandal wood while minor forest products covered in the table are bamboo and grass.

6. Employment and Industries:- The table numbers 25 to 33 deal with average daily employment in registered factories. Industrywise distribution of working factories according to working strength and number of days worked, employment exchange statistics, occupational distribution of registration and placements, value of ^{employment in different industries, census} of Government employees and statistics relating to annual survey of industries.

The table dealing with average daily employment indicates strength of factories by categories for the year 1967. Sex-wise classification of workers in factories submitting returns is also indicated in the table. Similarly number of man-days worked in each factory are also shown. The term of factory according to Factory Act 1943 denotes an establishment where 10 or more persons work with power or 20 or more without power.

Table dealing with industrywise distribution of working factories for the year 1967 indicates such distribution for four major groups namely processes allied to agricultural, food except beverages, wood and cork except furniture and transport equipment, according to working strength also.

Table on distribution of factories according to number of days worked during 1967 gives such distribution according to major categories of industries namely processes allied to agriculture food except beverages and transport equipments. The groups of number of days worked shown in the table are 0-60, 60-120, 121-180, 181-240, 241-300 and more than 300 days.

Table on employment exchange gives number of registrations, vacancies notified and number of placements during 1966-67 and 1967-68. Classification of placements in public and private sectors and also for scheduled castes and scheduled tribes is also indicated in the table.

Table dealing with occupational distribution indicates registrations and placements according to national classification of occupations for the years 1966-67 and 1967-68.

Table on volume of employment indicates employment in important categories of industries as it stood at the end of 1966-67 and 1967-68. Number of reporting establishments are also shown in this table with separate figures of employees in public and private sectors.

Table number 31 dealing with census of Government employees conducted on 1-7-1966 indicates number of employees according to pay as well as emoluments ranges and their classification into gazetted class I and class II and non-gazetted class III and class IV categories.

Table number 32 also pertaining to census to Government employees 1966 indicates number of employees in Parbhani district according to administrative departments.

Table dealing with annual survey of industries gives industrywise working factories, reporting factories workers, total employments, fixed working and productive capital, total value of production and value added for the year 1965. Value added denotes net value added by manufacture arrived at by deducting from the value of final goods the cost of production.

7. Electricity:- Table numbers 34 and 35 deal with generation & consumption of electricity and number of town & villages electrified in Parbhani district.

Table dealing with generation and consumption of electricity gives details regarding electricity generated, purchased and consumption of electrical energy for various purposes separately for the years 1966-67 and 1967-68. Type of generation is also indicated in the table. Separate details of hydro electricity generated are not, however, shown in the table.

Table on towns and villages electrified indicates the number of towns and villages electrified as at the end of 1960-61, 1965-66, 1966-67 and 1967-68. Population of the towns and villages electrified is also indicated in the table.

3. Co-operation:- Table numbers 36 to 43 deal with co-operative statistics such as number of different types of co-operative societies statistics of Co-operative Banks, Primary Agricultural Credit Societies, Other Co-operative Societies, Operations of Primary Co-operative Marketing Societies, Other Co-operative Societies and the regulated markets and the statistics relating to money lenders.

The first table in the group gives a birds-eye-view of the cooperative movement in the district as on 31-3-1968. The co-operative societies have been first classified into four broad categories namely agricultural credit and non-agricultural credit under credit sector and Agricultural-Credit and Non-agricultural, Non-credit under the Non-credit sector. Under each category number of individuals and type of societies have been shown.

Table dealing with statistics of co-operative banks gives number of branches of District Central Co-operative Banks, District Industrial Co-operative Bank, District Development Bank and Urban Bank along with particulars of memberships, share capital, working capital, reserve and other funds and also the loans advanced by them during 1966-67 and 1967-68.

Table dealing with primary agricultural credit societies gives talukawise number of such societies and their memberships during 1966-67 and 1967-68. The amount of share-capital, reserve and other funds and working capital of these societies is also indicated in the table. Loans advanced by these societies and loans recovered, outstanding and over-due are also shown separately.

Table number 39 on operations of cooperative societies other than primary agricultural credit and banks gives number of such societies by categories for the years 1966-67 and 1967-68. Data relating membership, share capital and reserve fund and working capital of these societies is also indicated in the table.

Table on operations of co-operative marketing societies shows value of purchases and sales of co-operative marketing societies in each taluka of Parbhani district besides, separate figures for district level co-operative marketing society for the years 1966-67 and 1967-68.

Agricultural produce, agricultural requisite and consumer goods are the constituents of the purchases by the co-operative marketing societies. Separate figures for value of sales as owner and as agent are also furnished in this table.

Table dealing with operations of other co-operative societies gives societywise achievements under important items during 1966-67 and 1967-68.

The table dealing with operations of regulated markets reveals arrivals in metric tonnes and value in thousand rupees, at the 13 regulated markets in Parbhani district during 1966-67 and 1967-68. Nature of the regulated market is also indicated in the table. All important crops grown and marketed at the regulated markets are covered in the table.

The last table in this group gives number of money lenders in each taluka of Parbhani district and loans advanced by them during 1966-67 and 1967-68. Separate figures of loans advanced to traders and non-traders are also furnished in this table.

9. Medical and Public Health:- Table numbers 44 to 47 deal with medical facilities available in the district, vital statistics relating to births and deaths and infant mortality, number of deaths due to important causes and vaccination statistics.

Table dealing with medical facilities gives number of Hospitals/Dispensaries/Primary Health Centres and other types of dispensaries in each taluka of Parbhani district and in-door and out-door patients treated in them during 1966 and 1967. Data relating to number of beds, doctors and nurses is also indicated in the table.

Table on births and deaths indicates talukawise figures of births and deaths, infant deaths registered in Parbhani District during 1966 and 1967. Sexwise details for talukas are, however not indicated in the table.

Table on deaths due to important causes shows the distribution of deaths due to important diseases/causes during 1966 and 1967. Talukawise details are not given in this table.

Table on vaccination statistics gives talukawise number of vaccinations and cholera inoculations in Parbhani District during 1966 and 1967. Separate figures for primary vaccinations below one year and above one year and the number of revaccinations are also indicated in the table.

10. Education:- Table numbers 48 to 55 deal with literacy, education in rural areas and urban areas educational institutions with strength of pupils and teachers therein, beneficiaries from backward and economically backward classes, expenditure on primary education and classification of villages without schools.

The table dealing with literacy gives number of literates and also percentages of literacy in each taluka of Parbhani district during 1961 census. As per 1961 census definition a person was classified as literate if he was able to read or write a simple letter in any language. Separate sexwise figures for rural and urban areas are shown in the table.

The table on education in rural areas gives talukawise details of literacy in rural areas according to various educational standards as per 1961 census. Sexwise data is indicated for each category of educational level.

Table on education in urban areas gives classification of literates in urban areas according to various educational levels as per 1961 census. Separate data on the number of persons holding various technical qualifications is also indicated in the table. No talukawise figures are given in this table.

The table dealing with beneficiaries amongst backward classes indicates such number for the year 1966-67 and 1967-68, according to various levels of education for Parbhani district as a whole. Separate figures for boys and girls are given for scheduled castes, scheduled tribes and other backward classes.

The table on concessions to economically backward classes gives number of beneficiaries and the amount of concessions separately for primary, secondary and higher institutions for the years 1961-62, 1965-66, 1966-67 and 1967-68. Classification of beneficiaries from higher institutions according to various courses is also indicated in the table. No talukawise data is indicated in the table.

The table on expenditure on primary education gives the agencywise expenditure figures for the years 1966-67 and 1967-68. Details of normal and plan expenditure are shown separately along with amount of recurring and non-recurring expenditure. No talukawise data is indicated in the table.

The last table in this group deals with classification of villages without schools or schooling facilities in each taluka of Parbhani district as at the end of 1966-67 and 1967-68. Villages without schools have been shown according to population groups.

11. Transport and Communication:- Table numbers 56 to 62 deal with railway length, road length, motor vehicles in operation, statistics of nationalised road transport, traffic census data, postal statistics and rural broadcasting statistics.

The table on length of railway routes gives such length as at the end of 1966-67 and 1967-68 according to categories. Only meter gauge line exists in Parbhani District.

Table on motor vehicles in operation gives figures of motor vehicles according to various categories for Aurangabad region as a whole for the years 1966-67 and 1967-68. Separate figures for the district are not available.

Table on nationalised transport indicates the number of State transport routes, route distance, vehicles on road per day, average daily earnings and number of passengers travelled per day, as at the end of 1966-67 and 1967-68. Important averages such as average route distance, service distance, earnings per vehicle per day are also indicated in the table.

The table dealing with traffic census gives number of vehicles according to categories enumerated on important roads, along with location of the count post. Type of surface and the total traffic intensity in tons per 24 hours are also indicated in the table.

Table on postal statistics indicates the number of post offices, telegraph offices, letter boxes, postmen, telephone connections and number of radio licenses issued and renewed in Parbhani district as a whole in the years 1961-62 and 1964-65 to 1967-68 yearwise.

The table number 62 gives talukawise number of villages provided with rural radio sets and also population covered for the years 1966-67 and 1967-68. The number of radio farm forums is also indicated in the table.

12. Local Bodies:- Table numbers 63 to 66 deal with income and expenditure of local bodies.

Table number 63 gives abstract of income and expenditure of the 3 types of local bodies i.e Village Panchayats, Zilla Parishad.

and Municipalities for the years 1966-67 and 1967-68. The number of Village Panchayats and Municipalities is also indicated in the table.

The next table in the group deals with income and expenditure of Village Panchayats in each taluka of the district according to sources of income and items of expenditure for the years 1966-67 and 1967-68.

Table on receipts of Zilla Parishad, Parbhani during 1965-66, 1966-67 and 1967-68 gives the figures separately for revenue and debt sections. Grants from Government for different purposes have been shown separately.

Table on expenditure of Zilla Parishad also indicates expenditure figures for 1965-66, 1966-67 and 1967-68 for revenue and debt sections separately. Break-up of revenue expenditure on important subjects is also indicated.

Table on income and expenditure of municipalities gives such figures according to sources of income and ^{items of} expenditure for the years 1966-67 and 1967-68.

13. Plan and Community Development Programme:- Table numbers 67 to 71 deal with expenditure and physical achievements under annual plans and 1966-67 and 1967-68, coverage, expenditure & physical achievements under the Community Development Programme.

The first table in this group indicates sub-headwise expenditure booked in the annual plan 1966-67 and 1967-68 in Parbhani district. Separate figures for state and local sectors are also indicated in the table.

Table number 68 gives physical achievements under important items of developments for the years 1966-67 and 1967-68.

Table on Community Development Programme gives area, number of villages and population covered by various types of blocks such as

Stage I, Stage II, Post-Stage II etc. The number of C.P.A pattern is also indicated in the table. The C.P.A pattern denotes size of the block.

The table on expenditure under Community Development Programme gives blockwise and stagewise expenditure figures upto 1966-67, for the year 1967-68 and upto the end of 1967-68.

Table on physical achievements indicates blockwise important achievements under community development programme for the years 1966-67 and 1967-68.

14. Prices:- Table numbers 72 and 73 deal with average retail prices and consumer price indices, for working class at Aurangabad and Nanded centres.

The table on average retail prices gives monthly average prices of 49 important commodities of day to day consumption for the years 1966 and 1967. The varieties of commodities for which prices have been quoted have also been indicated in the table.

The table on consumer price index number of working class at Aurangabad and Nanded centres gives monthly indices for the year 1967-68, commencing from April 1967 preceded by average for the year 1966-67, for facilitating easy comparison. Indices for food, fuel and light clothing have been shown separately.

15. Judicial and Administrative:- Table numbers 74 to 76 deal with police force and crime statistics and statistics relating to civil and criminal courts.

The table number 74 indicates strength of police ^{force} by categories for the years 1966 and 1967. Separate figures for permanent, temporary staff are also indicated in the table.

The table on crime statistics gives number of persons tried, convicted and acquitted under various categories of offences for the years

1966 and 1967. Figures of cognizable and non-cognizable offences are shown separately.

The table dealing with court statistics gives the number of civil and criminal cases of original and appellate nature decided in the various courts in Parbhani district during 1966 and 1967. Separate figures for regular and miscellaneous type of cases are also indicated in the table.

16. Miscellaneous:- Table numbers 77 to 85 deal with statistics relating to Banking, Joint Stock Companies, Insurance, Small Savings, Land Revenue collections, Presses and Journals, General Election and trends in selected indicators.

The table dealing with cinemas gives number of permanent, semi-permanent and touring theatres in each taluka of Parbhani District during 1966-67 and 1967-68. Seating capacity of theatres is also indicated in the table.

The table on banks gives total number of towns and villages having banking offices and population covered by them. Classification of banks into scheduled, co-operative and others is also indicated in the table.

Table pertaining ^{to} Joint Stock Companies gives number of joint stock companies by types for the years 1965-66, 1966-67 and 1967-68.

Table on insurance gives number of policies issued and amount thereof for the years 1966-67 and 1967-68.

Table on small savings gives figures of gross collections net collections and withdrawals of small savings under various small savings devices for the years 1966-67 and 1967-68.

No talukawise data is indicated in this table.

Table on land revenue collections gives detail and collection figures for each taluka of Parbhani district for the years 1966-67 and 1967-68. Arrears at the beginning and at the end of the years are also shown.

Table on presses and journals gives number of printing presses and daily, weekly and monthly news-papers and periodicals published from each taluka of Parbhani district as at the end of the year 1967-68. Language wise classification of the number of news papers and periodicals is also indicated in the table.

Table on general election 1967 gives Parliamentary as well as Assembly Constituencywise details regarding number of electorate, electors who voted and percentage of votes polled. Sexwise break-up of electorate who voted and partywise votes polled are also shown in the table. The last table of this group deals with trends in selected important indicators of development. Achievements under important 15 items sub divided ~~important indicators~~ into many sub items are indicated in this table for the years 1950-51, 1955-56, 1960-61, 1966-67 and 1967-68 for facilitating easy appraisal of the achievements under the First, Second, Third Plans and subsequent annual plans. The data for population relates to 1951 and 1961 censuses while livestock ~~xxxxxx~~ ~~xxxxxx~~ data pertains to 1956, 1961 and 1966 livestock censuses. Rest of the data is extracted from relevant tables of the abstract.

CHAPTER : III

Analytical review on important Indicators of development :

Indicator No.1

Percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown

1.1 Percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown indicates the extent of double cropping. During 1966-67 percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown was 103.1 as against 103.7 during 1965-66 indicating a decrease of the order of 0.6%. The talukawise percentages of gross cropped area to net sown area show considerable variations. The table below gives talukawise percentages of gross cropped area to net sown area during 1965-66 and 1966-67.

1.2 It is evident from the above table that in terms of percentages the double cropped area has increased in Kalamnuri Basmat, Hingoli and Gangakhed talukas while in the remaining four talukas it has decreased.

1.3 The double cropped area was not evenly distributed over the different talukas of the district.

Percentage of double cropped area during 1966-67 was 21.2 in Partur taluka which was followed by Pathri, Parbhani, Gangakhed and Jintur talukas having 15.3%, 15.5%, 13.7% and 12.1% of the total net sown area under double cropping. In Hingoli taluka the double cropped area was negligible while in the rest two talukas viz. Basmath and Kalamnuri it is comparatively much less. The talukas Partur, Pathri, Parbhani and Gangakhed had more percentage of double cropped area than the district, whereas the remaining talukas had less percentage of double cropped area than the district.

Indicator No.2

Productivity of important crops.

2.1 Productivity of crops depends on the level of agricultural development in a particular area. Maximising the productivity of the crops is the ultimate aim of the agriculturists. Among other things the productivity of crops is influenced by natural environments, availability of facilities for agricultural developments, level of understanding of the cultivators & willingness to put in efforts and the price level.

2.2 In general the agricultural year 1966-67 was ^a good year for the agriculturists. The yield per hectare and outturn of cereals and pulses which are major components of the area sown increased considerably during 1966-67 when compared to 1965-66. However the same decreased in case of few individual crops namely rice, tur, sugarcane, cotton and groundnut. The table below gives yield per hectare and outturn of important crops.

2.3 It is evident from the above table that during 1966-67 the yield per hectare and out-turn of wheat and jowar crops increased considerably as compared to the agricultural year 1965-66. It also mainly contributed to the increase by 9.0% and 16.0% respectively in the yield per hectare and out-turn of the total cereals although the yield per hectare and out-turn of individual crops in this group viz. rice, bajra and maize decreased to a large extent. As in the case of cereals, the substantial increase in the yield per hectare and out-turn of gram more than compensated the decrease in tur crop and resulted into an overall rise by 5.7% and 2.9% respectively in the yield per hectare and out-turn of total pulses in the same year. The increase in the yield per hectare and out-turn of food-grains during 1966-67 over 1965-66 was 3.3% and 13.3% respectively and is important achievement as food-grains dominate the cropping pattern of the district.

2.4 There was, however, a marked decrease in the yield per hectare and outturn of non-food crops namely sugarcane, cotton and groundnut in the year 1966-67 over 1965-66.

Indicator No.3

Gross value of agricultural production

3.1 Agriculture has lion's share in the total income generated from Parbhani district. The changes in the gross value of agricultural production greatly influence the economy of the district.

3.2. The gross value of agricultural production increased from Rs.2063.74 lakhs in 1965-66 to Rs.2223.30 lakhs in 1966-67, indicating an increase of the order of 7.7%. This increase was the result of significant increase in the gross value of food-grains' production. There was, however, sizable decline in the gross value of groundnut production owing mainly to as big as 61.1% decrease in the out-turn during 1966-67 over 1965-66. The table below indicates commoditywise gross value of agricultural production for the years 1965-66 & 1966-67.

3.3 It can be inferred from the data depicted in the above table that except rice, other cereals and groundnut the gross value of all crops has considerably increased during 1966-67 when compared to 1965-66. In case of wheat and jowar it was the result of increase in the out-turn of these crops, while in case of gram it was partly an effect of price increase during the year 1966-67. As regards crops tur, gur and cotton although there was decrease in the out-turn of these crops the gross value of produce has increased obviously due to significant increase in the prices of tur, gur and cotton during 1966-67 over 1965-66. The decrease in the gross value of rice and groundnut was the effect of decrease in the out-turn to similar extent. The 14.5% increase during 1966-67 over 1965-66 in the gross value of food-grains is an important achievement making a net addition of Rs. 222.35 lakhs to the level of gross value of food-grains in 1965-66.

Indicator No. 4

Percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area.

4.1 Percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area reflects on the extent of double irrigated area during a particular agricultural year. Double irrigation is, however, quite negligible in Parbhani district. Area irrigated more than once was

only 10 hectare during 1965-66 whereas there was no piece of land irrigated more than once during 1966-67.

4.2 In general it could be said that the practice of double irrigation is not so far popular in this district. The possible reasons are the poor cropping pattern on the one hand (major area under coarse grains) and the lack of irrigational facilities to the required extent on the other. The completion of all the canals of the Purna Project and the M.I. works will however change altogether the condition and irrigated area and double irrigated area both are likely to increase considerably in the near future.

Indicator No.5

Changes in the cropping pattern.

5.1 The cropping pattern reflect on the soundness of the agricultural system. Changes in the cropping pattern therefore greatly influence the agricultural growth rates. Cropping pattern is said to be rich when cash crops are grown on greater scale & is said to be poor when coarse grains are sown in major area.

5.2 The cropping pattern of Parbhani district is poorer than the state average. It is obviously due to the fact that irrigational facilities are not available in abundance in this district, depriving the cultivators from growing cash crops. During 1966-67, 65.6% of the gross cropped area was under food crops as against 63.5% during 1965-66. The table below gives percentages of area under cereals, pulses, total food crops, fibres, oilseeds and total non-food crops during 1966-67 as compared to 1965-66.

5.3 It is evident from the above table that food grains dominate the cropping pattern of the district accounting for as much as 64.2% of the total gross cropped area during 1966-67 as against 62.1% during 1965-66. Absolute area under food crops, increased from 6,17,301 hectares in 1965-66 to 6,43,436 hectares during 1966-67. Thus there is tendency in favour of growing food crops as major portion of the irrigated area is devoted to food crops only.

Indicator No. 6

Increase in agricultural credit, outstanding dues and gross value of agricultural production.

6.1 Volume of agricultural credit has an important bearing on the gross value of agricultural production. The main agencies engaged in meeting the agricultural credit needs are the Central

contd...

Co-operative Bank, the Land Development Bank and the primary agricultural credit societies.

6.2 Total agricultural credit advanced by the various credit institutions during 1966-67 registered an increase of the order of 62.1% as compared to 1965-66. Total loans advanced by the District Central Co-operative Bank alone increased from Rs.197.02 lakhs in 1965-66 to Rs. 459.63 lakhs in 1966-67, indicating as high as 133.2% increase over 1965-66. The loans advanced by the Land development bank during 1966-67, however showed a decline by 9.0% over 1965-66.

3.3 The table below gives quantum of agricultural credit advanced by the Dist. Central Co-operative bank, the land development bank and the primary agricultural credit societies and outstanding dues and gross value of agricultural production during 1965-66 and 1966-67.

6.4 It is seen in the above table that the agricultural credit formed 15.0% of the gross value of agricultural production in 1966-67 as against 21.3% in 1965-66.

Indicator No. 7

Agricultural Wage rates.

7.1 Agricultural wage rates greatly influence the efficiency of agricultural labourers and ultimately the agricultural industry. It is due to this, the changes in the agricultural wage-rates have an important role in raising the growth rates of agricultural production.

7.2 The agricultural wage rates of different categories of the labourers are being collected from three selected centres of this district, namely Palam, Kanhergaon Naka and Mantha in Gangakhed Hingoli and Partur talukas respectively. Even within the district the average wage rates of different categories fluctuated very widely in 1967 in between these three centres. The range of variation in the wage rates of skilled labourers was Rs.3.00 (Palam and Mantha) to Rs.5.00 (Kanhergaon Naka) in case of carpenters, Rs.3.00 (Palam and Mantha) to Rs.4.53 (Kanhergaon Naka) in case of blacksmiths and Rs.2.00 (Palam) to Rs.2.50 (Mantha) in case of cobblers. As regards the unskilled labourers the wage rates varied in between Rs.1.35 (Palam) to Rs.2.00 (Kanhergaon Naka and Mantha) in case of male field labourers; Rs.1.00 (Mantha) to Rs.1.50 (Kanhergaon Naka) in case of female field labourers, Rs.1.37 (Palam) to Rs.2.00 (Mantha) in case of male other agricultural labourers and Rs.1.00 (Mantha) to Rs.1.16 (Palam) in case of female other agricultural labourers.

7.3 Compared to the level in the year 1966 the wage rates of all categories of agricultural labourers increased in all the three selected centres except those of male other agricultural labourers in Palam, male field labourers and other agricultural labourers in Kanhergaon Naka and carpenters and blacksmiths in Mantha. The table below gives changes in the wage rates during the year 1967 over 1966.

7.4 It can be said from the data displayed in the above table, that considerable increase was observed in the wage rates of the carpenters, blacksmiths and field labourers at Palam and blacksmiths and herdsman at Kanhergaon Naka. The decrease in the wage rates was high in case of carpenters and blacksmiths at Mantha and of other agricultural labourers at Kanhergaon Naka.

Indicator No. 3

Bovine population compared to cultivable area.

8.1 Live-stock is the major source of power in Indian agriculture. Comparison of cultivable area with bovine population indicates whether and to what extent the bovine population cater the needs of agricultural industry, if all the cultivable area is assumed to have been brought under plough.

3.2 according to Live-stock census 1966 total bovine population in the district was 7,39,333 while the cultivable area was 11,31,313 hectares. Cultivable area per bovine worked out at 1.43 hectares which was 1.33 hectares during 1961 census. The increase in the cultivable area per bovine during 1966 over 1961 may be attributed to the 7.3% decrease in the bovine population during the same period. The table below gives talukawise position in regard to the cultivable area per bovine during 1961 and 1966.

3.3 The table reveals that with the exception of Basmath and Hingoli cultivable area per bovine has increased in all the talukas the increase being considerably high in Parbhani, Gangakhed, Pathri and Jintur talukas. The decrease in Hingoli taluka is the result of 6.9% increase in the bovine population while that in Basmath it is the result of 2.3% fall in the cultivable area itself during the period. Partur, Pathri, Parbhani and Gangakhed taluka had more cultivable area per bovine than the district average.

Indicator No.9

Poultry compared to population.

9.1 Poultry products have immense nutritional value and hence comparison of poultry population to persons reflect the extent to which the poultry product can suppleme the food production.

9.2 According to 1966 Live stock Census for a population of every 1000 persons there were 93 poultry birds as against 163 during 1961 census, indicating decrease by 41.7 %. This was owing to the decrease in the poultry population from 2.03 lakhs in 1961 to 1.13 lakhs in 1966.

9.3 The poultry population was not equally distributed between different talukas of the district . Gangakhed taluka had highest poultry population while in Basmath it was lowest. The table below gives poultry per 1000 persons according to 1961 & 1966 Census.

9.4 The table reveals that the decrease in the ratio of poultry per 1000 persons decreased in all the talukas except Kalamnuri.

It is obviously due to the fact that poultry population has registered an increase in Kalamnri taluka only while it has decreased considerably in the remaining seven talukas. Kalamnri taluka had highest poultry population (143) while it was lowest in Basmath(53).

Indicator No.10

Per capita consumption of electricity

10.1 Per capita consumption of electrical energy indicates the level of advancement reached in an area. In Parbhani district per capita consumption of electricity was 7.13 kwh during 1967-68 as against 5.46 kwh during 1966-67, indicating an increase of the order of 31.5 %. The increase was the effect of extensive programme of electrification in rural area implemented in the annual plan 1967-68, electrifying as many as 30 villages.

10.2 Another important factor in regard to the consumption of electricity is the distribution of electricity used for various purposes. In Parbhani district electricity used for Industrial purposes accounted for 33.9 % of the total electricity used for various purposes. Electricity used for other purposes including operation of electric pumps formed 29.3 % of the total used. The corresponding percentages were 22.3 and 33.9 during 1966-67, which lead to the conclusion that more and more electrical energy is being used as Industrial power in Parbhani district also.

Indicator No.11

Increase in the number of candidates enrolled in employment exchanges and vacancies notified.

11.1 One of the important objectives of the planning is provision of employment opportunities. Employment Exchanges have an important role in reducing unemployment.

The rate of increase in the registrations and vacancies notified at the employment exchanges indicates the pace at which the vacancies are copping up with the increasing registrations.

11.2 In Parbhani district total registrations decreased from 7,308 on 31.3.1967 to 7,101 on 31.3.1968 i.e. by 2.8 %. The vacancies notified however increased from 1,050 to 1,287 i.e. by 22.6 % in the same year. Compared to 1966-67 registrations were more in 1967-68 in April, May, July & Feb. months. The vacancies notified were more in the months of May, June, October, November and January in the year 1967-68 over 1966-67.

11.3 The registrations are not distributed equally over the 12 months of the year. In the post annual examination period they were much higher than in the subsequent months due to successful student population seeking jobs for the first time. Registrations were highest in June in both the years for the same reason which decline in the subsequent months upto November and increased again due to post supplementary examination. Such generalisation cannot however be made in regard to vacancies notified. During 1967-68 the vacancies notified were highest in May, 1967(45.7 %) as against September(22.1) in 1966. Lowest number of vacancies were notified during June 1966 and February 1968.

Indicator No. 12

Increase in the number of in-door and out-door patients treated in Hospitals/Dispensaries etc.

12.1 Health and Medical services have an important role in preservation of public health. The success of Health and Medical services can be judged by the rate of increase in the No. of in-door and out-door patients treated in various public health and medical units.

12.2 In Parbhani district during the year 1967 in all 7,76,624 out-door patients were treated in the various public and public-added hospitals and dispensaries etc. as against 6,51,313 in 1966, indicating an increase by 19.1 %. Total in-door patients treated increased from 5,453 to 12,936 i.e. by 137.2% in the same period. As regards both out-door and in-door patients treated the increase was significant in case of females. The No. of out-door patients treated in Parbhani taluka during 1967 formed 22.9 % of the total treated in the district. It was followed by Pathri and Hingoli talukas with 17.7 % and 14.9 % of the total out-door patients treated respectively. Lions share in the total in-door patients treated was that of Parbhani and Hingoli talukas.

Indicator No.13

Increase in the number of students in different categories.

13.1 Education is an important constituent programme amongst social services. After independence there has been remarkable increase in the educational facilities in the district.

13.2 In Parbhani district total student strengths increased from 1.49 lakhs in 1966-67 to 1.52 lakhs in 1967-68, indicating an increase by 1.7 %. Strength of students has registered significant increase in case of higher institutions i.e. colleges and special schools. In respect of primary and secondary schools the increase was confined to boys, while in case of ^{pre}primary school there was decrease in both boys and girls students. The table below gives categorywise number of students in the years 1966-67 and 1967-68.

13.3 The significant increase in the number of college students (boys and girls both) is due to the establishment of a new college at Hingoli during the academic year 1967-68. Apart from this there was sizable increase in the strength of students in special schools during 1967-68 when compared to 1966-67. Primary and secondary students accounted for nearly 69.8% and 23.6 % of the total students strength as against 71.0 % and 27.7 % during 1966-67 respectively.

Indicator No.14

Increase in road length per 100 sq.km.

14.1 Adequate means of transport are essential ingredients for rapid economic development. The indicator of road length per 100 sq.km serves as an important guide-line for identifying the areas of inadequate transport facilities and for studying the extent of the imbalances of existing between the different areas.

14.2 In Parbhani district total extra-municipal road length increased from 1,125.49 km in 1966-67 to 1,284.53 km in 1967-68, indicating an increase by 14.1 %.

Accordingly road length per 100 sq.km worked out at 10.23 km during 1967-68 as against 8.96 during 1966-67. The increase was the result of sizable increase in the length of major district roads and village roads both under the jurisdiction of Zilla Parishad Parbhani. The increase in the length of State Highways was negligible. The length of other district roads was constant during the year 1967-68. The road length was not uniformly distributed over the different talukas of the district. The table below indicates talukawise road length per 100 sq.km. during 1967-68 as compared to 1966-67.

14.3 As evident from the above table, in the year 1967-68 Parbhani, Partur, Hingoli & Pathri talukas had higher road length per 100 sq.km. than the district average. Increase in the road length was considerably high in Hingoli and Gangakhed talukas whereas it was comparatively much less in Parbhani tq.

Indicator No. 15

Increase in the banking facilities in proportion to population

in and main agencies/meeting the credit needs of the people on the other. Comparison of banking facilities to population indicates the extent of availability of the banking facilities in an area. 15.2 There were in all 37 banking offices in the district during 1963 as against 32 in the previous year indicating an increase by 15.6 %. Average population served by a bank comes to 32,600 as against 37,695 in the previous year. The table below gives taluka-wise number of branches of scheduled and co-operative banks along with population covered by each banking office.

15.3 From the above table it can be said that average population covered per bank in Partur, Hingoli, Kalamnuri & Basmath talukas was less than the district average. In general it could however be said that the banking development in the district was symmetrical over the different talukas of the district, except Gangakhed taluka where average population served by a branch was ^{much} higher than the district average.

Indicator No. 16

Prices

16.1 Prices are the phenomenon of common interest even in a planned economy. The price trends indicate the extent of fluctuations in the prices of commodities in the market.

16.2 Price quotations are being collected from selected shops Parbhani Dist.H.qrs.since November'62 and are useful in providing a broad indicator of the trend in retail prices over a period of time. Average prices of gram, gramdal,tur,turdal,udid, udid-dal,masurdal,gur,groundnut,eggs,turmeric,fire-wood,hair oil and paper increased during 1967 over 1966. Prices of rice,bajra,dalda milk,dry chillies,onion,tea-leaf,& supari however decreased considerably in the same period. In respect of other commodities there were marginal changes resulting from seasonal and transitional shortages and abundances. The table below gives average monthly prices of essential commodities for Dec.1966 & 1967.

16.3 It is seen from the above table that there was significant increase in the price of wheat jowar, turdal, firewood, supari & potato. Similarly there was sizable decline in average prices of dalda, dry chillies, charcoal & washing soap. The consumer price index No. for working class for Nanded centre increased from 166 in December, 1966 to 170 in December, 1967 with base year 1961.

CHAPTER-IV
PLANNING

4.1 Annual Plan:-

4.1.1:-General:- Since 1966-67, annual plans have been launched in place of Five Year Plans with a view to sustain the tempo of development generated in the District till the finalisation of the Fourth Five Year Plan and also to provide scope for adjustments of the available resources to the requirements of time, in case of need.

4.1-2:- Annual plan 1967-63 was implemented in Parbhani District during the period 1-4-1967 to 31-3-1968. Total expenditure on the plan on district level schemes was Rs.131.40 lakhs. In all 30 schemes were implemented as district level schemes of which 43 were in the State sector. Schemes implemented in the local sector and jointly in the State and local sectors were 23 and 4 respectively. Expenditure on the schemes implemented in the State sector accounted for nearly 67.2% of the total in the plan, remaining i.e 32.8% being on the local sector schemes. The distribution of the expenditure on various major heads of developments was as under:-

4.1-3:- It is evident from the above table that in conformity with objectives of the plan agricultural programme were assigned highest priority in the plan as it accounted for 34.9% of the total plan expenditure. Expenditure on the major heads social services and irrigation & power formed 22.3% and 22.2% of the total plan expenditure, respectively. Major constituent programmes under the State sector were irrigation & power and agricultural programme while cooperation & community development and transport & communication were the main programmes under the local sector. Sub-headwise expenditure and salient physical achievements resulting therefrom have been detailed below:-

4.2:- Agricultural Programme

4.2-1 Agricultural Production including land development:- In all

8 schemes, were taken-up under this sub-head aimed at substantial increase in the agricultural production by bringing green revolution through modernisation of farm technique including adoption of improved agricultural practices and particularly progressive use of high yielding varieties. Total expenditure on this sub-head was Rs.3.59 lakhs which accounted for 5.7% of the total on the major head "Agricultural Programme". Out of the total expenditure on this sub-head, that on schemes in the State sector formed 54.0%. Major achievements under this sub-head were distribution of 3,72,750 polythene bags, 115 quintals of sanseed, preparation of 11,135 tonnes of town p composts, besides distribution 5,026 tonnes of chemical fertilizers. An area of 31,751 hectares was brought under hybrid and improved varieties of various crops under kharif and rabi campaigns. Similarly, an area of 110 hectares was brought under fruits and 174 hectares under green manuring.

4.2.2:- Minor Irrigation:- The programme of minor irrigation works was intended to secure a sizable increase in the irrigation facilities

and ensure their maximum utilization. In all 5 schemes were implemented under this sub-head. Total expenditure on this programme during the annual plan was Rs. 17.64 lakhs i.e. nearly 27.9% of the total on the major head "Agricultural Programme". Expenditure on the schemes in the State sector formed as big as 84.6%. Salient achievements of the programme were construction of 665 new wells, installation of 1,247 pumping sets and constructions of one bandhara, creating together an irrigation potential of 137 hectares.

4.2-3:- Soil Conservation:- In all two schemes were taken-up both in the State sector under the sub-head "Soil Conservation" envisaging bunding of area available for cultivation for preventing soil erosion and retaining moisture and fertility of the soil. The total expenditure booked on this sub-head in the annual plan 1967-68 was Rs. 32.74 lakhs which is a little above half (51.7%) of the total expenditure under the major head "Agricultural Programme". The achievements under the programme were bunding of 24,436 hectares and soil survey of 39,200 hectares of land.

4.2-4 Ayacut Development:- Like Soil Conservation Ayacut Development Programme was implemented in the State sector with the object of surveying and developing the land under the command and establishment of irrigation unit and trial-cum-demonstration farms. An amount of Rs. 7.03 lakhs was spent on this sub-head which formed 11.1% of the total under the major head "Agricultural Programme". Area benefitted under the programme was 2,936 hectares. Construction of field channels and field drains was also undertaken under this programme under command area of Purna Project.

4.2-5 Animal Husbandry:- As an important ancillary programme of agriculture three schemes of animal husbandry were included in the

annual plan 1967-63. Total expenditure on them was Rs.36,000 Continuation of 2 veterinary centres one cattle breeding centre, location of 16 premium bulls and organisation of 3 cattle shows, were the main achievements of animal husbandry programme. Besides, breeding of 55 improved cattle was also done under this sub-head.

4.2-6 Forest:- Forests have an important role in preventing soil erosion. In all 3 schemes were taken up in the State sector for afforestation and an expenditure of Rs.1.37 lakhs was booked during the annual plan 1967-63. This worked out at 2.2% of the total expenditure on the major head "Agricultural Programme". Fuel plantation on 40 hectares as second year operation on 62 hectares, plantation for soil conservation was taken up. The development of pasture and fodder resources was made by plantation on 140 hectares and fencing of 40 hectares.

4.2-7 Fisheries:- Programmes for developing only inland fisheries were undertaken in Parbhani District in the annual plan 1967-63 through implementation of 6 schemes in the State Sector. Total expenditure on this sub-head was Rs.5,000. Stocking of 1,21,000 fingerlings, netting of 90 quintals of fish and subsidy for purchase of 20 kg. nylon twine were the main achievements under this programme.

4.2-3 Warehousing and Marketing:- Under warehousing and marketing 11 market committees were given financial aid for development of market yards and an amount of Rs.51,000 was spent on this account.

4.3 Co-operation & Community Development:-

4.3-1:-Co-operation:- For fostering growth of the co-operative institutions 3 schemes were taken up in the State sector under this sub-head and an amount of Rs.3.92 lakhs was spent on them in the annual plan 1967-63. This accounted for 19.4% of the total under the major head "Co-operation & Community Development".

Major achievements under this sub-head were formation of one agricultural credit society and 4 industrial cooperatives. Membership added during the year 1967-68 was 3,571 in case of agricultural credit societies and 83 in case of industrial cooperatives. Besides, financial assistance by way of subsidy and loans was also granted to societies as share capital contribution, godown subsidy to marketing societies, land development loan, managerial subsidy and subsidy for cattle sheds.

4.3-2:- Community Development Programme:- In all 4 schemes was taken up in the local sector under this sub-head and total expenditure booked in the annual plan 1967-68 was Rs.16.32 lakhs. It accounted for as much as 30.6% of the total under the major head "Co-operation and Community Development". The 6 blocks in stage II, 2 blocks in Stage I and 2 blocks with in-post-stage-II were continued. Only one block namely Kalamnuri old was converted from stage II into post-stage II. Similarly, the applied nutrition programme was taken up newly in Basmath block besides continuation of the programme in Parbhani block.

4.4 Irrigation and Power:-

4.4-1 Power:- Underpower projects the scheme of rural electrification was taken-up with the object of providing electricity for agricultural purposes. Total expenditure on the rural electrification schemes in the annual plan 1967-68 was Rs.40.26 lakhs which formed 22.2% of the total expenditure in the plan. Salient achievements resulting from the above expenditure were electrification of 30 villages and installation of 324 electric pumps.

4.5-1 Small Scale Industries:- The schemes under this sub-head were taken-up with the object of providing financial assistance to the small scale industries.

Two schemes were taken up under this sub-head and expenditure booked during the annual plan 1967-68 was Rs.74,000. Major achievements of the programme under this sub-head were subsidy to two societies for tools and equipments, loans to 20 members for purchase of share, rebate to 3 societies, financial assistance to 51 societies by way of share capital contribution and loan.

4.6 Transport and Communication:-

4.6-1 Road Development:- Having regard to the fact that transport system makes a valuable contribution in increasing the pace of economic development emphasis was given in the District's annual plan 1967-68 to the road development and an amount of Rs.15.41 lakhs was spent on 2 schemes taken-up under this sub-head. This accounted for 3.5% of the total in the annual plan 1967-68. Achievements resulting from the implementation of the road programme were construction of bridges and roads of 63 km. length.

4.7 Social Services:-

4.7-1 General Education:- In developing countries investments have to be made for developing human resources and acquiring skills and technical expertise. With this purpose in view in all 11 schemes were taken-up under this sub-head with total expenditure of Rs.11.43 lakhs. It formed 27.6% of the total under the major head "Social Services". Almost all schemes were under the local sector. Appointment of 165 teachers, award of scales to 712 teachers, improvements in 7 science schools, development of 5 non-government secondary schools and construction of one school building were the main achievements under this sub-head. Besides starting of 21 new classes with intake capacity of 1,375 pupils, grants of education

concession to 200 economically backwards classes students and scholarship to 149 teachers were also the achievements under the same programme.

4.7-2; -Medical and Nursing:- All 2 schemes were taken up under this sub-head in the State sector. Total expenditure on the programme under this sub-head was Rs 43,000 which formed little above 1% of the total under "Social services". Continuation of auxiliary training centre for nurses and opening of a blood bank were the main achievements under this sub-head.

4.7-3 Public Health:- Total expenditure under this sub-head was Rs. 13.13 lakhs during the annual plan 1967-68, on the schemes of construction of primary health centres, malaria eradication, small pox eradication and family planning. Under family planning programme 3,939 sterilization operations were performed and 676 IUCD cases were made.

4.7-4 Water supply and Drainage:- Under water supply and drainage programme total expenditure of Rs. 10.27 lakhs was incurred for urban and rural water supply schemes. The piped water supply scheme works in Purna, Basmath, Jintur, Gangakhed and Manwath towns were in progress during the year 1967-68. Besides piped water schemes were also taken-up in two villages.

4.7-5 Housing:- The programme under housing covered low income group housing, rural housing and extension of Gaathan for housesites. Total expenditure of Rs. 1.53 lakhs was made on this sub-head. In all 55 houses were constructed under village housing project schemes and 55 villages were benefitted by the scheme of extension of gaathan.

4.7-6 Welfare of Backward Classes:- The programme under this sub-head aimed at assisting the persons belonging to backward classes for various purposes. In all 30 backward class hostels and 154 students were benefitted under the schemes. Total expenditure incurred on the programme was Rs.1.24 lakhs.

4.7-7: Social Welfare:- Under this programme one welfare extension project was functioning in the district and Rs.29,000 were spent on the project. In all 25 Balwadies, 15 literacy classes, 6 maternity centres and 17 arts & crafts classes were running under this schemes.

4.7-3 Labour and Labour Welfare:- Only one scheme namely technical and vocational training was implemented under this sub-head in Parbhani District during annual plan 1967-68. An expenditure of Rs.3.09 lakhs was incurred on this scheme, for continuation of Industrial training Institute at Parbhani.
