CHAPTER--I--

1.1 The Sholapur district situated on the south-east fringe of the Maharashtra State lies entirely in the Bhima and Sina Basins and almost the whole of it is drained by either Bhima river or its tributaries. The district has an area of 15,057 Sq.Km. or 5,813.5 Sq.miles.

The District is bounded on the North by Ahmednagar and Osmanabad districts on the east by Osmanabad district & Andhra Pradesh, on the South by Sangli district and the State of Mysore and on the West by Satara and Poona dist.s. Sholapur city, the district head quarter, is situated at a distance of about 265 Kms from Poona city, the Divisional Head quarter.

1.2 Topography:-

(I) Soils:- The Soil of the district can be classified in to three kinds viz. (i) Kali or black
(ii) Barad or Coarse grey
(iii) Tambadi or reddish.

Except in Barshi where black soil is the rule & coarse grey is rare most of the district is either grey or red.

In North Sholapur Taluka, the soil is generally light and of moderate depth. Deep black soil of richer quality is, however, predominant between the two rivers, below Kamti khurd on the Sina and Vadapur on the Bhima. In the Panhala taluka, the soil is generally poor. The soil of Sangola taluka also is for the most part poor and shallow. Barshi taluka has the best soil in the district. The soil of Malsiras taluka is in general shallow and light in colour and not retentive of moisture.

Large portion of Madha taluka has generally shallow soil with varying depth and quality. In Akkalkot taluka, the soil is rich in the vicinity of the rivers Bhima and Sina. In Karmala taluka about one half of the soil is black and one quarter each red and barad. The soils of Mangalwedha taluka are deep black.

2) Rivers:-

The chief rivers are the Bhira with its right bank feeders the Nira and the Man and its left bank feeder, the Sina which receives the Bhogawati from the North. The Bhima and the Sina run south east, the Nira and the Man nearly east, and the Bhogawati south east. During the dry season all the rivers are fordable. Even in the Bhima except for occasional pools the stream dries up or runs only ankle deep. The Geographical area of Sholapur district under Bhima sub-basins comprises of 14,99,616 hect. of which culturable area is 13,26,809 hect. The length of the Bhima river is 289 Km within the dist.

3) Hill Ranges:-

There is no important hill system in the dist. Only in the north of Barshi taluka several Spurs of Balaghat range pass south for a few Kms. There are also scattered hills in Karmala, Madha and Malsiras talukas. The district has in general flat or undulating terrain. The low table land and small separate hills in Karmala and Madha talukas act as the Water shed between Bhima river and Sina river.

1.3 Climate:-

(1) The climate is healthy and agreeable except from March to May. In summer from March to May, the climate is very hot during the day time though cool at night. The rainy season starts from mid-June and lasts up to the end of October. It is followed by cold season from November to February. During cold season the air is generally bright, clear and bracing. The hot season is marked by scorching heat, strong hot winds and occasional dust storms. Nights are however generally cool. The rainy months are pleasant. The temperature is generally mild and even. Except the hot months of March, April, and May, the climate is free from extremes of heat and cold. Bitter cold is almost unknown.

There are very little variations in the climate in different parts of the district. The climate is dry and hot in all parts except that portion of Barshi taluka which lies above the Ghats where it is some what cooler than in the rest of the district.

(2) Rainfall:-

Rainfall all over the district is uncertain and scanty with an annual average of 577.1 m.m. district gets rain from South-West as well as from North East monsoons. Throughout the district the rain starts in June and continues upto October. The precipitation during June to August is rather precarious and of small magnitude. The showers in September and October are heavy and more assured.

The fact finding Committee appointed by Govt. in 1960 had reported that the rainfall is not dependable in the following areas and they are likely to be affected by scarcity conditions periodically as shown below:-

Thus all the talukas of the district are generally scarcity areas.

(3) Temperature:-

The average temperature of the district was 25.9 degree centigrade in the year 1970. During this year the temperature was lowest in December and highest in May, the mean minimum and mean maximum being 10.3 centigrades and 36.3 centigrades respectively.

1.4 Natural Zones:-

The district can be broadly divided into three natural Zones, The eastern Zone comprising Barshi, North Sholapur, South Sholapur and Akkalkot talukas has medium to deep black soil, some what assured rainfall and grows Jowar Bajra and pulses.

The central or the transitional Zone comprising Mohol, Mangalwedha, eastern parts of Pandharpur and Madha taluka has uncertain rainfall, light to medium soil and grows kharif and Rabi crops.

The Western Zone comprises scarcity areas of Karmala, Sangola and Malsiras talukas and Western parts of Madha and Pandharpur talukas with lighter. Soils and uncertain rainfall. Mainly Rabi crops are grown in Karmala Pandharpur and Madha talukas; and kharif crops such as Bajra and groundnut in Sangola taluka. Large part of Malsiras taluka receives protection from scarcity due to the irrigation provided by Nira Right Bank Canal and sugarcane is the major crop of that area.

1.5 Famine and Scarcity:-

Since the average annual precipitation is very low (577.1) m.m. and subject to a large amount of uncertainty this district is exposed to frequent scarcities and occasional famines. The Fact Finding Committee appointed by the Govt. of Bombay had also reported that the rainfall is not dependable in almost all the talukas of the district and they are likely to be affected by scarcity conditions.

It is note worthy to state that during the years 1969 and 1970 there was no scarcity condition in the district.

1.6 Territorial changes in the district:-

The district of Sholapur was first formed during the year 1838. The district was abolished in 1864 and was again formed during 1875. Consequent upon merger of the

former Indian States, 80 villages and 2 towns of these states and a part of Akkalkot State were added during 1949 and taluka of Mchol, Akkalkot and Mangalwedha were newly formed and Sholapur taluka was split up into North

Sholapur and South Sholapur talukas. In 1950, 53 enclave

villages from Hyderabad State were transferred to this

District and 12 enclave villages of this district were

transferred to Osmanabad and Gulbarga districts. Also

one village from Bijapur district was added to Mangalwedha taluka during 1950.

At present there are 11 talukas in the district.

1.7 District Administration:-

(1) State Government Administration:

For administrative purposes the district is at present divided into eleven talukas. The Collector is incharge of General administration, Law and Order, treasury land revenue and civil supplies. He is assisted by a Resident Deputy Collector in his office and three Deputy Collectors who hold charge of the three revenue divisions viz. Sholapur, Madha and Pandharpur and have their head quarters at Sholapur, Kirduwadi and Pandharpur. Eleven Tahsildars are in charge of eleven taluka offices.

The District and Sessions Judge is the Head of the Judicial department in the district. The judiciary is entirely separated from the executive. However the Collector continues to be the District Magistrate and the Deputy Collectors and Tahsildars are vested with limited magisterial powers.

The District and Session Judge is assisted by two Assistant Judges and Additional Sessions Judge. They have jurisdiction over the entire district. They attend to civil and criminal work, both original and appellate. The civil judge (Senior Division) attends to civil suits in the whole of the district. There are also 15 civil judges (Junior Division) and First class judicial Magistrate who have their head quarters at different taluka places in the district. They deal with civil and criminal cases. Two special first class Judicial Magistrates deal with prohibition and Municipal cases. There is also one First class Judicial Magistrate for Sholapur taluka Police station and Sholapur city Sadar Bazar police station.

The police force in the district functions under the district superintendent of Police, who is assisted by two Deputy Superintendents and two Circle Police Inspectors at Sholapur and Pandharpur. There are 21 police stations in the district.

There are two Divisional Soil Conservation Offices at Sholapur and Pandharpur to supervise the Soil Conservation activities under the Agricultural Department.

The Malaria Eradication programme in the district is administered by the Malaria officer at Pandharpur. In addition to these there are other offices, representing various departments at district level viz. Sub-Regional Employment Exchange office, Govt. Milk Distribution Scheme office, Factory Inspector, Labour Officer, Executive Engineer, B & C Division, District Deputy Registrar of Cooperative Societies and Civil Surgeon. There are Govt. Institutions of North Cote Technical High School and the Polytechnic

(2) Central Govt. Administration:-

There are Divisional offices of Post and Telegraph Department and South Central Railway at Sholapur. There is also the office of the Superintendent of Central Excise.

(3) Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities:

Under the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samities Act 1962 a Zilla Parishad and 11 Panchayat Samities have been established in the district in the year 1962. The areas under the jurisdiction of the zilla Parishad and the Panchayat samities correspond to the district and the taluka boundaries except in the case of Municipal towns which are not covered by them. The Zilla Parishad covers 96.50 percent of the area and 72.05 percent of the total population of the district.

The Zilla Parishad is headed by an elected president from among the elected councillors. To carry out the administrative and executive work, an officer in the senior scale of I.A.S. cadre works as the Chief Executive Officer to the Zilla Parishad.

The Zilla Parishad is assisted by various departments and the heads of those departments at the district level are officers belonging to class-I and class-II services under the State Govt. The Block Development Officers work as Secretaries to the panchayat samities.

(4) Local Bodies Administration:-

As regards the administrative set up under the Local Sector, there is a Municipal Corporation for Sholapur city. The Municipal Commissioner works as the Executive Head of the Corporation. Other nine towns in the district have Municipal councils for their respective areas.

Public Bodies Administration:-

The Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation has earned for itself a unique place among the public-sector undertakings in the district. It has maintained an efficient and economic road transport services throughout the district. The Divisional Controller functions as the executive Head of this undertaking. There are six depots under him each under the charge of a depot Manager. There is also an office of the Maharashtra State Electricity Board entrusted with the work of electrification programme. The Executive Engineer, M.S.E.B. works as the executive Head of this office. There are two Branch offices of Life Insurance Corporation of India at Sholapur and at Barshi. These Branches are working under the control of Divisional Manager L.I.C. Satara.

1.68 Demography:-

General:- Census is the principal source of Demographic data in India as well as in Maharashtra.

With an area of 15,057 Sq. Km and a population of 18,60,119 the Sholapur district ranks third in Population and sixth in area among the 26 districts of Maharashtra state as per 1961 census. The district population has increased by more than 110 percent over the period of 1901 to 1961. Percentage increase in population in the decades of 1941-51 and 1951-61 was respectively 22.57 and 23.57 respectively.

(2) Density

According to 1961 census data, the density of Sholapur district is 123 persons per square kilometer. The same for Poona division was 139; while for the Maharashtra state it was 128. Within the district the density varies, from 551 person per square kilometer in North Sholapur taluka to 78 persons per square kilometer in Mangalwedha taluka. These differences correspond to those of topography and a land utilisation and also the growth of urban areas. The higher density in Sholapur North and Barshi taluka is due to large urban centres like Sholapur city and Barshi town. Talukas are having very low density because of the (hilly & mountainous) regions existing in those talukas.

(3) Literacy:-

According to the 1961 census, literacy in the Sholapur district is the lowest in the Poona division. It is 25 percent in this district, whereas the state and division literacy percentage is around 29.

The literacy percentage has increased more than 5 times during the last sixty years. However substantial improvement has taken place only since 1931.

Particularly female literacy showed phenomenal rise from 1.35 percent in 1931 to 6.27 percent in 1941. There was a fall in the literacy rate in 1951. Growth of literacy in the decade 1951-61 in this district was 10 percent. Percentage of literacy in North Sholapur taluka is the highest (37.4%) in the district due to its vicinity with the district Head quarter, Sholapur city and availability of extensive educational facilities. Literacy percentage in Barshi and Pandharpur talukas is around 27 while in the rest of the talukas the same is between 16 to 21.

(4) Livelihood classification:-

Of the total population of the district 44 percent is engaged in work. Remaining 56 percent is non working or dependent population. Among the workers the proportion of workers dependent on agriculture in the district is very high viz. 43.5. So also the district has larger proportion of workers engaged as agricultural labourer viz. 25.9 % , which is higher than the corresponding figure of state viz. 23.8 %. Proportion of workers engaged in household industry and manufacturing other than household industries viz. 15.7% in the district. is higher than the State figure of 11.2 %. In manufacturing other than household industries the district has 7.64 percent of worker as compared to 6.88 percent for the state ^{of} concentration /these workers is mostly in North Sholapur taluka of the district. The proportion of workers in the household industry is 8.06 percent in the district, which is little less than double the average of 4.39 percent for the State.

Household industry therefore provides employment significantly to large number of persons in the dist. The district does not however have significant proportion in construction. The proportion in other services, trade and commerce, Transport and storage and communication is not significant. However the proportion under these heads is slightly higher than that for the division.

In rural areas Marathi speakers account for 80.1 percent of the population. They constitute 49.1 percent of the population in Urban areas. Kannad has the second largest number of speakers. It forms 11.5 percent of the total population in the district Urdu has the third largest number of speakers. It forms 8.8 percent of the total population of the district. It is spoken more in urban area where its speakers form as much as 16.3 percent against 5.9 percent for rural areas. The speakers of Banjara languages are concentrated in rural areas and so also of Gujrathi speakers to some extent Hindi, Tamil and Telegu speakers are mostly concentrated in urban area.

CHAPTER-II-

EXPLANATORY NOTES

2.1. Introductory:- Statistical information regarding various aspects of development of Sholapur district is presented in the tables of this abstract.

The data has been compiled for the financial years 1969-70 and 1970-71. For certain groups, such as Agriculture and Cooperation, however, the data have been furnished for the agril. year and cooperative year respectively. Calendar year has been taken as reference year for presenting the data regarding meteorology, vital Statistics, and Statistics pertaining to Civil and criminal courts.

In these tables, district tables are given first followed by its tahsilwise break up. The order of tahsils is as per the order followed in the Census Hand book. The source of the information has been indicated at the bottom of each table.

The Statistical abstract has been divided into 13 major groups, such as climate, Area and population etc.

A table "District at a glance" giving comparative data of the District/the Poona division and important indicators under various heads such as population, agriculture, etc. is given at the beginning of the abstract.

The concepts, sources and limitations adopted in the preparation of the abstract are summarised major-group-wise in the following paragraphs.

1.2 Climate:-

The rainfall data (Table No.1) gives information about no. of rainy days and total rainfall in m.m. during each month of the calendar years 1969 and 1970, at selected centres in the District. Figures of normal rainfall are worked out on the basis of actual rainfall for the periods ranging from five years and a maximum of eighty years. A day is treated as a rainy day, if during the 24 hours, minimum rainfall of 2.5 m.m. is recorded. The figures of the mean, mean-maximum and mean minimum temperature are based on the monthly data supplied by the Govt. of India's meteorological Centre at Colaba. The mean maximum and mean minimum are the average of maximum and minimum temperatures observed daily during the year. The mean temperature is the average of the mean maximum and mean minimum temperatures thus arrived at.

2.3 Area and Population:

The tables are based on final figures of 1961 population census. One table based on the provisional figures of 1971 census is also included in this section.

Table No. 3 gives tahsilwise figures of area in Sq.Km., rural and urban population as per 1961 Census, and percentage increase in 1961 population over 1951. For the purpose of 1961 Census, a town or an urban area was defined as a place which has (i) a Municipality or a cantonment or (ii) a population of more than 5,000, of which at least three fourth male workers engaged in non-agricultural pursuits. Table No.4 gives the classification of inhabited villages in each tahsil according to different population ranges.

Break-up of towns or urban areas according to population ranges is given in Table No.5. Data on number of workers and non-workers is given in table No. 6. A person is classified as a worker if (a) he has had some regular work or more than one hour a day throughout the greater part of the working season, in the case of seasonal work, and (b) he was employed during any of the fifteen days preceding the day of the enumerator's visit to the household, in the case of regular employment in any trade, etc. In table No.7 is given the distribution of population according to age group, mother tongue and religion. Table No.8 presents tahsilwise population of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes.

Table No. 3-A shows the provisional figures of 1971 census. Sexwise total, rural and urban population & total workers (with break-up into cultivators, agril. labourers and others) is given in this table. During the 1971 Census, the definition of a worker has been modified to a certain extent and due to this, the number of workers in 1971 census is less than that in 1961 census. During 1971 census, a person, in the case of seasonal work is classified as a worker, if he had worked in the current or the last working season for a greater part of the season.

3.4 Agriculture:

Statistical information regarding land utilisation, irrigation, area and outturn of principal crops, etc. is given in the tables under this head for the agricultural years 1968-69 and 1969-70. The break-up of the total geographical area according to different types of land utilisation is shown in table No.9. Under forests are lands classed or administered as forests under any

legal enactment dealing with forest, whether State owned or private. In case any portion of such land is put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of land use. Land put to non agriculture use stands for all lands occupied by buildings, roads and railways, ~~xxx~~ rivers and canals, and other lands put to uses other than agricultural. All barren and uncultivable land like mountains, deserts etc. which cannot be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost, is classed as barren and uncultivable land" irrespective of the fact, whether such land is in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings." Permanent pastures and other grazing land" covers all grazing lands(whether permanent pastures and meadows or not) and village common and grazing lands within forest areas." Cultivable waste" includes all lands available for cultivation, whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once, but not cultivated during the current year and last five years or more in succession. Such lands may either be fallow or covered with shrubs and jungles which are not put to any use. Cultivable lands kept fallow during the current year only are shown as " current fallows". Other fallow land includes all lands which were taken up for cultivation but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period between 1 and 5 years. The net area sown consists of total area sown with crop and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once. Gross cropped area represents the sum total of the area under all crops etc, including area sown more than once.

Table No.10 gives the details of area under different food crops(cereals, pulses and others) and non food crops(fibres, oil seeds etc.) Table No.17 gives information on agril. wage rates which is collected by Block Statistical Assistants, for 3 centres viz.(1) Mandrup(2) Madnimb and (3) Vairag.

4.5 Animal Husbandry, Forests:-

(a) Animal Husbandry:- The table No.20 gives the number of various types of livestock and poultry, as enumerated in the District during the 1966 Livestock Census. These are quinquennial censuses conducted throughout the Country. Statistical information in respect of veterinary institutions and disease wise number of attacks and deaths of livestock/poultry is given in tables No.21 and 22 respectively.

(b) Forest:- Tables under this group furnish information on area under forests and productions of minor forest produce. Information of forests under the control of both the Forests Department and Revenue Department of the Govt. of Maharashtra is given separately. Areas under forest are again classified as protected and unclassified forests, according to legal status. Reserved forest are those that are intended mainly for timber production and in which rights of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. In protected forests right of grazing or cultivation is allowed, under certain limitations and restrictions. The unclassified forest refers to the inaccessible forest or unoccupied waste. The figures in table No.24-A have been obtained from the forest Deptt. and they do not tally with those given in table No. 9, the figures for which have been taken from Revenue Deptt.

B:6 Employment, Industry & Electricity:-

Statistics relating to working factories such as average daily employment and mandays worked, classification of factories according to working strength and number of days worked during the year is given in three tables, for the year 1970. Tables 28 to 30 give important statistics of employment exchange in Sholapur district, including monthwise registration, vacancies notified and placements in public and private sectors, and number on live register at the end of each month, for the years 1969 and 1970. The data presented in the tables 31 and 32 are of the census of state Govt. employees as on 1st July 1966, conducted by the Bureau of Economics and Statistics, Bombay. This data gives the no. of State Govt. employees under I, II, III and IV classes only and does not include any other category such as work charged personnel, part time workers, etc. The table 33 gives the results of Annual Survey of Industries, 1966. The figures are based on actuals of census sector factories and estimates of Sample sector factories.

The information regarding installed capacity, generation and consumption of electricity during the years 1969-70/1 is given in table No. 34. This includes the consumption of electricity supplied by the Maharashtra State Electricity Board and the following private companies in Sholapur District:-

1. Barshi Gen. Engineering Company Barshi.
2. Pandharpur Ele. Supply Co. Pandharpur.
3. Karmala Ele. Supply Co. Pandharpur.

Cooperation:- The data on type-wise societies in the District including Co-operative Societies given under this group. Tahsilwise break-up of

agriculture credit societies, with details of memberships, capital structure, loans advanced and recovered is given in tables No.38. Similar information in respect of Agril. marketing societies, and regulated markets is also given. The main function of the Agril. marketing society is the purchase and sale of agril. produce grown by its members or member coop. societies in its area of operation. In Table No.42, the quantity and annual arrivals of various types of agril. produce are shown. The data on money lenders and loans advanced by them is given in table No.43.

2.7. Medical & Public Health:

Data on vital statistics e.g. talukwise births and deaths and infant deaths, with break up into male and female medical facilities and amenities available in the District, indoor and outdoor patients treated, etc. are given under this section.

2.8 Education:

The tables at Sr.No. 48 to 50 present data on tahsilwise percentage of literacy and education level in the rural and the urban areas in the District, as per 1961 Census. Other statistics such as number of educational institutions, enrolment of students, teachers (trained and total), number of backward class beneficiaries at different stages of education, achievements under the scheme of concessions to economically backward classes is also presented in this section. The classification of institutions according to type (table No.51) is different from stages of education. There are at present many Secondary schools which also impart education in primary courses. Never the less, the entire enrolment of students is included under

secondary education. Normal and plan expenditure on primary education is shown in Table No. 54. The table No. 55 gives the tahsilwise number of villages without primary schools or schooling facilities.

2.9. Transport & Communication:

The table No. 56 gives gauge wise total railway length in Sholapur district. These figures have been compiled with the help of railway time table and map. The figures of extra municipal roads maintained by Building and Communication Deptt. and Zilla Parishad are shown in table No. 57. Roads maintained by municipal councils are also shown separately in this table. Table No. 58 gives figures relating to different types of motor vehicles as on 31st March 1970 and 1971, in the Poona & W. Transport Region, comprising of Ahmednagar, Poonaa, Satara and Sholapur Districts. Operational statistics relating to Sholapur Division of the Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation, results of traffic census on important roads in the District, data regarding posts and telegraph offices and rural broadcasting are also given in this section.

2.10. Local bodies :

Financial position of village Panchayats, Municipal Councils and the Zilla Parishad is shown in this section for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71. No. of village Panchayats include independent and group village Panchayats. The income and expenditure of V.P.s are exclusive of opening and closing balances respectively. The receipt of the Zilla Parishad/viz. (i) self raised resources (ii) Govt. grants.

(iii) grants for agency schemes and (iv) debt section.

2.11. Plan and Community Development:

Tables in this section give information regarding expenditure and physical achievements under District level plan schemes implemented in Sholapur district, and community Development programme in the District during the years 1969-70 and 1970-71, which are the first two years of the Fourth Five Year Plan.

2.12. Prices ;

The table No.70 gives monthly average prices of important commodities at Sholapur during 1969 and 1970. The prices collected for the given commodities are restricted to only one quotation, which is taken from only one selected shop. The averages shown for individual commodities can not therefore be said to be fully representative. The data may however, prove useful as a broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices, during the period. The table No.73 gives the consumer price index number for working class at Sholapur, with the year 1960 as the base year.

2.13. Miscellaneous:

Statistical information on the subjects like police force, crime statistics, banks, joint stock companies, insurance, small savings, etc. is included in this section.

2.14. Selected indicators:

Tables on selected indicators of development for each each tahsil

of Sholapur district are appended at the end. Topics like population, agriculture, electricity, factory-workers, road length, education, medical facilities, etc. are covered.

A comparative picture of tahsils in relation to their development under each item, has been shown by way of ranking the tahsils on the basis of the latest available data.

C H A P T E R III

An analytical review of Sectorial trends 8.8

3.1. In the following paragraphs, an attempt is made to review the progress of various Talukas in the district and to depict a comparative picture of all the talukas of the district, along with the position of the district in Poona Division.

3.2 The population of the District has increased by about 21% during the decade 1961-71. This District is the 6th largest in Maharashtra State and occupied third place in the Poona Division in respect of population.

Percentage of literacy in the District was 34.0 during 1971 as against 25.1 during 1961. Percentage of literacy for Poona Division and Maharashtra State was 38.1 and 39.1 respectively.

The density of population per Sq.Km. has gone up to 150 from 124. The density for Poona Division and Maharashtra State was 174 and 164 respectively.

3.3 Comparison of the talukawise population in 1961 & 1971 shows that the highest percentage of increase in population was in Malsiras (35.7 %) and the lowest in Mohol taluka (15.4 %). The decennial growth rate in Rural and Urban population is 22.0 and 18.5 respectively.

During 1971 census the sex ratio (females per 1,000 males) of the District was 936. It is 958 for Poona Division and 933 for the State.

3.4 Growth in rural and urban population is shown in the following table:-

Out of the total population of the district 7,65,396 are workers, who constitute 34 % of the total population. Out of these workers, 35 % workers are cultivators 33 % agril. labourers, and the remaining 32 % workers are engaged in other activities.

3.6 Percentage of workers as 'Cultivators' to total workers is the highest (56.3) in Satara District and is the lowest in Sholapur district. However, the percentage of workers as 'Agril. labourers' is the highest (32.5)

in Sholapur district and the lowest(13.5) in Poona dist.

3.7 During the year 1969-70 out of the total geographical area(15,01,069 Hect.) of the district, 13,54,795 hett. of land was cultivable land. But percentage of net area sown to cultivable land was 82.3. 3.8 From the above table it is revealed that all the cultivable land is not brought under cultivation. There is much scope to bring more land under cultivation in Barshi, Sangola and Malsiras talukas. The available cultivable land has been utilised for cultivation to the maximum extent possible in Madha and Akkalkot talukas.

The disturbing fact is, however, that excepting Madha taluka in all the remaining talukas, the percentage of net area sown & cultivable land has declined appreciably during the ten year period.

3.9 It is strange to note that the percentage of gross area sown to net area sown was very high in Karmala (108.9) and Sangola (107.3) Talukas, which are classified as talukas being affected by scarcity conditions once in every three years. The area sown more than once constitutes 4.1 % of the net area sown for the district during the year 1969.70. The percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown for the district is 104.1 for the year 1969.70. The percentage for Poona Dn. is 105.22.

3.10 The table showing percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area and percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown during the years 1968.69 and 1969.70 is given below:-

3.11 From the above table, it is revealed that percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area was 123.0 for the district during 1969.70 as against 118.6 for the earlier year. This percentage was the highest (146.6) in Akkalkot taluka, whereas the lowest percentage (100.0) is observed in Sangola taluka.

3.12 Percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown for the district during the year 1969.70 was 10.2. The percentage for the earlier year was 9.1. Irrigational facilities have been utilised to the highest extent (33.7)% in Malsiras taluka, where irrigation facilities from Nira Right Bank Canal are available. The percentage above that for the district is observed only in Malsiras Pandharpur and Sangola Talukas.

3.13 The following table gives the cultivable area per agril. worker and net area sown per agril.worker in the district during the year 1968-69 and 1969.70.

3.14 Cultivable area in the district per agril.worker during 1969.70 works out to 2.40 hect. It varies from 1.97 hect. in Barshi taluka to 2.89 hect. in Pandharpur taluka.

3.15 Net area sown in the district per agril. worker during the year 1969.70 was 1.97 hect. as against 2.24 hect. during the year 1968.69. The ratio varies from 1.34 hect. in Barshi taluka to 2.36 hect. in Pandharpur taluka.

3.15 Yield rates of principal crops:-

The rainfall in this district is very low and highly variable. Irrigation facilities have not developed to a degree, as would significantly mitigate the natural disadvantages. The productivity of soil is poor. The following table gives the yield rates of important crops in this district.

The production of food crops (cereals) and pulses amounted to 3.66 lakh metric tonnes during the year 1961.62. The production of food crops during 1968-69 and 1969.70 was respectively 3.92 lakh M. tonnes and 2.57 lakh M. Tonnes. As compared to the year 1961-62, the yield rates of jowar, Bajari and cotton have increased

whereas these of Rice, Gram, Sugarcane, Tur and Groundnut have decreased. The yield rates are fluctuating on account of many reasons such as rainfall, incidence of diseases, use of modern techniques and practices, etc. It is, however visible from the above figures that the schemes of agriculture development have found to be successful in increasing the food production at least to some extent.

3.16 Agril. Wage rates:-

From the above table it is revealed that the wage rates have shown an increasing trend during the two years. The wage rates are still higher in canal areas of Malsiras taluka and in area near Sugar factory and other industries.

3.17 Cooperation:

Cooperative movement has reached in the nook and corner of the district. Primary Agril. Coop. credit societies help the agril. production directly, and they are the main agencies at village level for propogating the schemes of increasing food production. The following table gives the data regarding these societies.

All the villages are covered by these societies and practically each village has one primary Agril. Coop. credit society. According to 1971 population 2.71 lakhs are cultivators and it will be seen that 51% of the cultivators are members. Loan advanced per member works out to Rs.324/- during 1969.70 and Rs.337/- during the year 1970.71. Though the amount of loans advanced during the year 1970-71 has increased as compared to the previous year, the percentage of recovery has come down to 57 from 63.

3.19 From the above table it is seen that gross cropped area per pair of working bullocks for the district works out of 10.3 hect. for the year 1969.70. This ratio is 13.6 in Mangalwedha and 7.4 in Barshi talukas. The ratio is less than that for the district in Karmala, Barshi & Malsiras talukas. Since mechanical power is not utilised for agriculture on large scale, there is pressure of work on the available Bullock power.

3.20 Milk is commonly used by all in rural as well as in urban areas, but consumption of milk is far less, as will be seen from the figures in the above table. No. of milch animals (cattle and buffaloes as per 1966 livestock census) per 1000 persons (as per 1961 census) works out to 64 for the district. This number is only 23 for North Sholapur taluka, which includes urban area of Sholapur Corporation. The highest number of milch animals are observed in Mangalwedha taluka.

Number of poultry per 1000 persons (as per 1961 census) is 254 for the district as per 1966 livestock census. The highest number of poultry (830) is observed in Sangola taluka, and the lowest (62) in S North-Sholapur taluka comprising of urban area of Sholapur Corporation.

3.21 The following veterinary aid facilities have been provided in the district:-

Number on live register as at the end of 31st March 1970 and 1971 was 9148 and 9744 respectively. Out of the placements of 582 during the year 1970.71, 27 candidates (4.6%) were placed in private sector. Percentage of candidates of Sc/ST. who were given employment during 1970.71 was 17.4. Occupationwise distribution in the above table reveals that 10.3 % of the registrations are for clerical jobs. The percentage of placements in clerical jobs is also the highest (39.0).

3.23 Consumption of electricity:-

Out of 956 villages in the district the villages electrified upto the end of the year 1970.71 are 377 i.e. 38%. The consumption of electricity is 1,21,989 thousand KWH. Per capita consumption of electricity works out to 65.5 KWH during 1970.71. The consumption of electricity by industrial concerns has also significantly increased. This consumption is to the extent of nearly 62 % of the total consumption.

The figures in the above table reveal that more facilities for medical aid are being made available for the public, every year, in order to cope up with the increasing demand. In spite of this fact these efforts fall short of the requirements for the increasing population. As per 1961 census - census the number of beds per lakh of population works out to 35 during the year 1970. On an average a doctor serves a population of about 22,000, whereas population being served by a nurse is nearly 6000. In this case, The doctors and nurse, in dispensaries/ hospitals etc run by Govt./Local bodies only are taken into account. Private Medical practitioners nurses are serving the population in addition to the above doctors/ nurses employed by Govt./Local bodies, but their data is not available.

3.25 The death rate has come down to 8 during 1970 from 12 in the year 1969. Also the birth rate has decreased and is 24 during 1970 as against 33 during the earlier year.

3.26 Education:

There were 1810 institutions of Primary education during the year 1969.70 in the district. There are only 6 villages without primary school. Out of the 320999 pupils in primary schools, girls constitute 1,22,578 (38.1%). There were 8472 teachers. On an average, a primary teacher has to look after 38 pupils.

3.27 During the year 1969.70, there were 184 secondary schools, in which 44,330 boys (76.1 %) and 13,973 girls (23.9 %) were studying.

A Secondary teachers \approx about 27 students on an average
 In secondary schools, the percentage of girls has decrea-
 sed.

Out of the 11142, pupils studying in higher in-
 stitutions, there were 1701(15.3 %) girls.

Population covered by banks is only 34.4 % of the total population and hence there is wide scope for development of banking facilities.

From the above figures it will be seen that general index has shown an upward trend during the last 5 years. The index for the year 1970.71 has increased by 9 points over that for the previous year. Comparing the indices for the years 1969.70 and 1970.71, it is seen that the index for food had increased to 198 from 190 and that for Pan, Supari and tobacco has gone to 171 from 156. The index for clothing bedding and footwear was 173 as against 156 during 1969.70.

CHAPTER - IV

Plan achievements during 1970-71

4.1 The year 1970-71 is the second year of the IV Five Year Plan. The IV Five Year Plan for Maharashtra State has not yet been finalised, as the India's IV Five Year Plan is not yet finalised. Annual Plan 1970-71 has therefore been drafted keeping in view the important programmes in the State's IV Five Year Plan.

4.2 The State's Annual Plan for the year 1970-71 was for Rs.158 crores, as against Rs.108 crores for the year 1969-70. The plan allocation for Sholapur District for the year 1970-71 was of Rs. 2.97 crores, for the District level schemes under both state and local sectors. The expenditure during the year 1970-71 on major heads of development are shown in the following table:-

4.3 The expenditure incurred during the year 1970-71 is nearly 17 percent more than that during the earlier year. It will be observed that during 1970-71, more exidr. has been incurred on the schemes under the major heads Agril. programmes, Industries, and Social services, as compared to the last year. The District level schemes are implemented through the implementing Officers under State sector and Local sector. Out of the total expenditure incurred in the district about 74 percent exidr. has been incurred on the schemes under State sector, which also includes Maharashtra State Electricity Board and Maharashtra State Housing Board. Under Local sector, which comprises of the Zilla Parishad, about 26 percent expenditure has been incurred. This allocation of expenditure in the two sectors is normally the same every year.

It will also be seen from the above table that stress is given on schemes under Agril. programmes, as per the object of the IV Five Year Plan.

Minor head wise progress under each major head is given below:-

4.4 Agriculture and allied programmes have been assigned a high priority in the annual plan 1970-71. The strategy of emphasis on the use of hybrid and high yielding varieties of seeds, fertilisers and plant protection measures were vigorously pursued during this year also. Area under irrigation was increased by new wells, repairs to old wells, installation of pumps, deepening of wells, & also through minor irrigation works such as percolation tanks and lift irrigation schemes.

The expenditure incurred on the schemes of minor heads under Agril. programme is shown below:-

4.5 From the above table it is revealed that grants to the extent of only 94 percent have been utilised under the head Agril. Programmes. Minor headwise expenditure shows that all the grants have been utilised for the schemes under soil Conservation, Dairy Development, Forest, Fisheries and Warehousing and Marketing. Under the schemes of Agril. production and minor irrigation grants to the extent of 93 percent and 86 percent respectively have been utilised during 1970-71.

4.6 Major schemes under this sub-heads were taluka seed multiplication farm, horticultural development and Plan protection.

The works such as improvement to the irrigation wells and other land development works were carried out in taluka seed multiplication farms. Under horticultural development loans have been advanced for horticulture development. The achievements under new plantation during the year were 218 acres. An area of 15000 acres was covered under the scheme of plant protection. The other achievements are as under:

Minor Irrigation:

4.7 Under this heads, expenditure is incurred on subsidy to wells and pumps and on minor irrigation works under State & Local sectors. Under Local sector 37 works of percolation tanks were in progress. Under the scheme of Rural works programme in chronically drought affected areas, 18 works were in progress. Subsidy was granted to 474 wells and 253 pumps.

Soil Conservation:

4.8 The programme consists of contour bunding, nalla bunding, afforestation for soil conservation and reclamation of alkaline and saline land. An important scheme of Integrated dry land agricultural development has been launched this year at Mandrup, with a view to performing experiments on agriculture in dry lands. The scheme was started

from Feb, 1971, and hence its results will be visible next year. The physical achievements are as under:-

4.10 Town milk supply scheme at Sholapur is functioning on the active assistance of the milk societies and federation. The milk handled by the scheme was 8883 litres per day, during 1970-71, as against 4967 litres per day last year. In order to maintain the tempo and also to develop the milk production, 4 milk societies/federation were financially assisted during the year.

Community Development

4.14 The major scheme under this minor head is the Community Development Projects, under which grants are paid to the C.D. Blocks in various stages for development works. This year one more Block was selected for the Applied Nutrition programme, in addition to three Blocks already covered under the programme. Also the scheme of composite programme for women and pre-school children has been taken up in one Block. The object of both the schemes is to make available hygienic and nutritious food to women and children with the help of available ingredients by utilizing their proper nutritious value.

III. Irrigation & Power

4.15 The only scheme at district level under this head is that of Rural Electrification and normal development. All the grants of Rs. 14.33 lakhs have been utilised during the year. There were no funds for Rural Electrification and as such no more villages could be electrified. Stress was given during the year on normal development (i.e. giving additional connections, etc. in villages already electrified) and giving connections for agricultural pumps.

IV. Industry & Mining

4.16 Under the schemes under 'Industry' financial assistance is mainly given for handloom development (handloom workers and cooperative of handloom and powerloom workers) and also to individuals and industrial societies for other industries. The physical achievements are as under:-
