



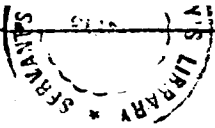

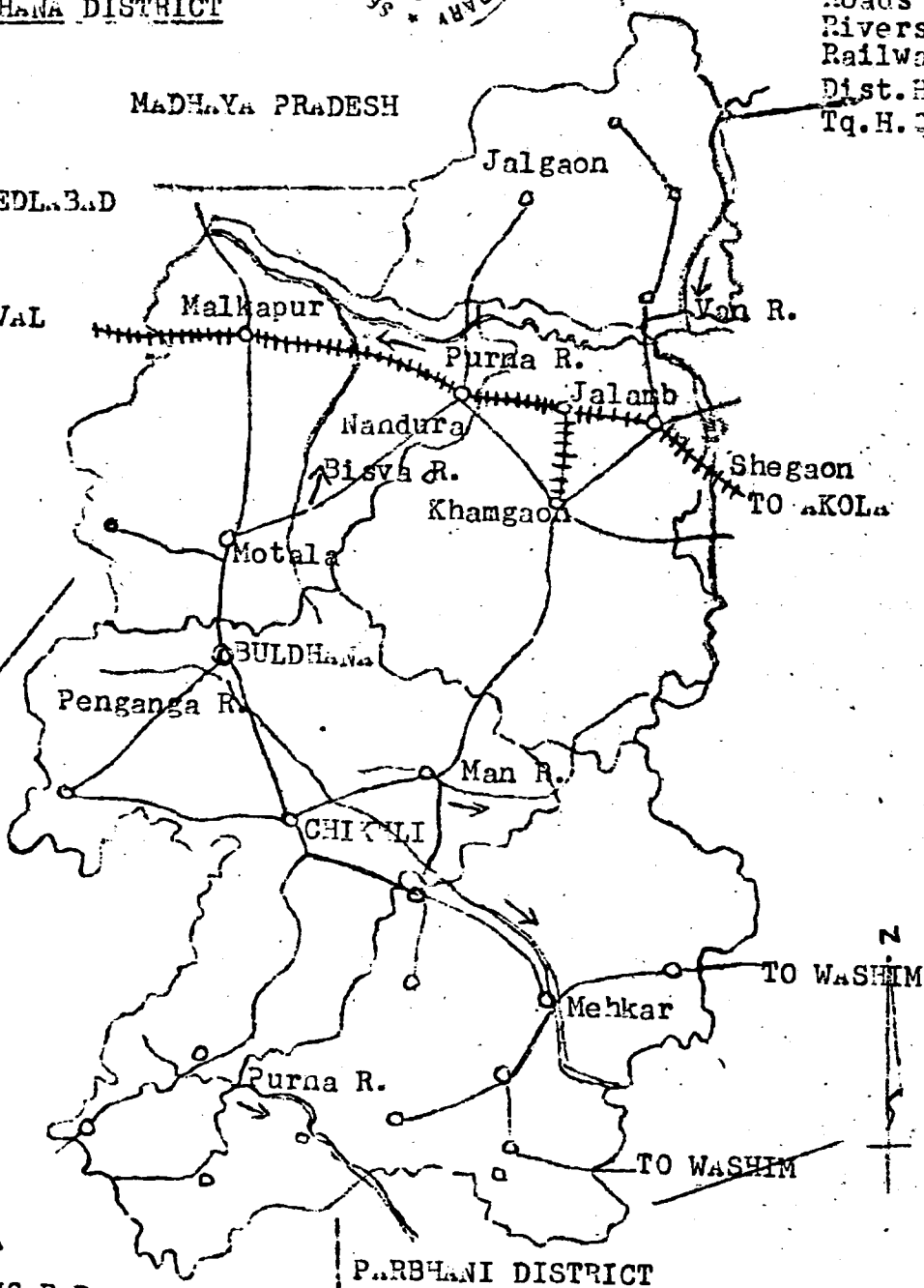

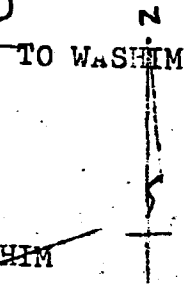

C H A P T E R - I

Introduction Physical features

1.1 Location

Buldhana district has been named after Buldhana town which is the district head quarter since the year 1867. It is partly in the Tapi basin and partly in the Godavari basin. The northern half of the district broadly called Payanghat is drained by the Purna river which is a tributary of the Tapi. The southern half known as the Balaghat is drained by the Penganga and the Katepurna rivers which are tributaries of the Godavari.

1.2 Boundaries

The district lies between $19^{\circ}51'$ and $21^{\circ}17'$ North latitude and $75^{\circ}57'$ and $76^{\circ}49'$ East longitude. It is bounded on the north by the Nimar district of Madhya Pradesh, on the east by Akola district, on the south by Parbhani district, on the west by Aurangabad and Jalgaon districts & on the north-east by Amaravati district. The district covers an area of 9754 square kilometers.

1.3 History and Administrative set up -

Upto 1863, Buldhana was a part of west Berar district. Tahsils of Malkapur, Chikhli (formerly Deulghat) and Mehkar were separated from west Berar district in 1864, to make what was at first called south-west Berar district and later as Mehkar district. The district headquarters were shifted to Buldhana in 1867 and the district was re-named in Buldhana district. Khamgaon tahsil had been formed in 1870 by separating some villages from Balapur tahsil of Akola district.

Consequent upon the reconstitution of district boundaries of Berar districts in 1905, Khamgaon and Jalgaon tahsils from Akola district were transferred to Buldana district.

There were no major changes in the boundaries of the district between 1911 and 1955. With the Reorganisation of State's in 1956, the district was transferred from Madhya Pradesh to Bombay state. The district forms a part of Maharashtra since 1st May 1960.

{The district comprises five sub-divisions or talukas viz. 1) Jalgaon-Jamod 2) Malkapur 3) Khamgaon 4) Chikhli & 5) Mehkar} The Collector as the head, is in charge of General Administration, Law and order, Land Revenue and Civil Supplies. He is also a District Magistrate and District Registrar. He is assisted by a Resident Deputy Collector in his office and other Deputy Collectors who look after different branches. A Sub-Divisional Officer of the rank of a Deputy Collector has been put in-charge of the administration of each of the five talukas. He is assisted by a Tahsildar and Naib-Tahsildars. The taluka has further been divided into revenue circles each in charge of a Revenue Inspector, assisted by a number of Patwaris, whose number in each circle is determined by the size and volume of work therein.

Offices of the other Government departments and quasi-Government institutions are also located at the district headquarter for facilitating the smooth and co-ordinated working of the administration at the district level.

Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samitis

Under the Maharashtra Zilla Parishad and Panchayat Samitis Act, 1961, a three tier structure was established embodying the Zilla Parishad at the apex, the Village Panchayat at the base and the Panchayat Samiti at the intermediate level. The Zilla Parishad and Village Panchayats are both local bodies directly elected by universal suffrage at the district and village levels.

The Panchayat Samiti, however is a body at the block level constituted by indirect elections. Each of these bodies has been given a clearly defined sphere of activities with major part of the funds transferred to it with the executive staff required for discharging its responsibilities.

The administration headed by the Chief Executive Officer is statutorily responsible for executing the decisions of non-official bodies at various levels. This administration being independent and yet responsible to the Government, ensures that the decisions are executed within the frame work. The local leadership can determine priorities within the overall frame work of Government rules and development policies.

The Zilla Parishad Buldhana, comprises of 59 members, of which 47 are elected from the constituencies with an average electorate of 35000, while the remaining 12 members are co-opted representatives of various institutions such as co-operative societies, Banks, Ladies Representatives Panchayat Samitis etc.

From among these members, the Zilla Parishad elects a President, a Vice-President and two Chairmen of standing committees, all of whom have certain executive functions and are the chairmen of subject committees with supervisory powers in relation to certain subjects.

The spheres of development of district importance relating to Agriculture, Animal Husbandry, Minor Irrigation, Community development, Public Health, Public Works, Co-operation and Industries, Education etc. have been transferred to the Zilla Parishad.

Thirteen Panchayat Samitis have been established in the district each having a chairman with certain statutory functions, with a budget normally varying according to the stage of the Block Panchayat Samiti. These bodies have limited powers of administrative sanction pertaining to the existing schemes implemented within their jurisdiction. The Panchayat Samiti is essentially responsible for granting the financial aid to the Village Panchayats, which in turn provide basic amenities at the village level. The Panchayat Samiti is also responsible for providing technical guidance to the village level staff in educating the village in modern methods of agriculture, animal husbandry etc. Finally it is responsible for supervising the over all administration of the Village Panchayats in the district.

The co-ordination with this elaborate three tier structure is essential in two ways. The Panchayat Samiti consists of the persons elected by the members of the Village panchayat & also of the Zilla Parishad members elected from within its jurisdiction.

The Chairmen of the Panchayat Samitis are also co-opted members of the Zilla Parishad.

1.4 Area The area, number of villages, population etc. according to 1961 census covered by each taluka of the district are given in the following table.

Out of a total population of 10,59,698 for the district in 1961, 8,84,260 persons or 83.45 percent and 1,75,438 or 16.55 percent reside in the rural and urban areas respectively. The area of the district is 9754 square kilometers (3766 Sq.miles) which accounts for 9.98 percent and 3.13 percent of the total area of Vidarbha and Maharashtra respectively. The district accounts for 11.47 percent of the population of Vidarbha and 2.68 percent of the population of Maharashtra.

1.5 To-pography

Out of the five talukas now forming the district, the talukas of Chikhli and Mehkar lie on the Balaghat Plateau, while rest of the three talukas of Malkapur, Khangaon & Jalgaon are in the great plain below known as the panghat. These are these two natural sub-divisions, which correspond closely to the administrative sub-divisions of the district. The edge of the plateau where it falls abruptly into the valley is intersected by numerous deep ravines.

The landscape is of varied character, fertile villages alternating with barren hill sides and deep ravines. Below the ghats, the land is flat, except where it is broken by spurs of hills putting out into a plain. The general slope of the district above the ghat is from north to south.

1.6 Hills, Rivers system, Soils etc.

The main system of hills is the Ajanta range which has formed a plateau called the Balaghat. It covers the southern portion of the district, comprising Chikhli and Mehkar talukas. A ridge of low hills running from north-west to south-east through the Balaghat forms the watershed between the valleys of the Penganga and the Katepurna. The main Ajanta range forms the northern wall of the Deccan table-land and the watershed between the Godavari & Tapi valleys.

There is also a branch of the Satpura range in the north of Jalgaon taluka, which separates the district from the state of Madhya Pradesh.

The general slope of the country above the ghats is from north to south.

The elevation of the three plain talukas of Malkapur, Khangaon and Jalgaon varies from 264 to 278 meters above sealevel. The elevation of Chikhli and Mehkar table land varies from 529 to 737 meters above sea level. Buldhana town the district head quarter, is situated at an elevation of 668 meters.

The principal river in the district is the Penganga. The other important rivers are the Purna, the Kate purna, the Nalganga, the Vishwaganga, the Gyanganga and the Bunganga.

The penganga rises in the hills near Deulghat, runs, in a south-easterly direction past Mehkar, and then enters the Akola district. The portion of the river which lies in this district is almost dry in the hot weather.

The kate or lower purna rises in the Ajanta hills to the west of the district, which enters a little to the north of Deulgaon-Raja and traverses the taluka of Mehkar in a south easterly direction for a distance of about 48 kilometers, its course running parallel to, and south of that of the Penganga. It is dry in summer. Both the Penganga and Kate Purna are important rivers of the Godavari basin, but they do not acquire their importance till they come out of the district.

The Purna rises in the lower slopes of the Gawilgad hills in the Amrevati district and runs west ward untill it leaves the district at the northern most corner of Malkapur tahsil. Its principal tributories within

the district are the Nalganga, the Vishwaganga and the Gyanganga from the south, and the Banganga from the north. The Nalganga rising in the hills near Deulghat runs due north and joins the Purna near Nargel. An irrigation project on the river Nalganga has been completed in 1966. The Vishwaganga rises at Buldhana itself. The Gyanganga rises in the table lands north of the valley of the Penganga and runs past Nandura before joining the Purna. The Banganga rises in the Melghat to the north of Jalgaon tka tahsil and flows south wards to meet the Purna.

The soils are derived from trap rock of volcanic origin. There are three main categories of soils in the district viz. i) Bharkali, which is deep black soil of very fine texture and very retentive of moisture, (ii) Morand, which is black cotton soil containing lime and is less fertile than pure black cotton soil, and iii) Barad, which is the shallow soil of the higher lands of the plateau and of black, brown or reddish colour.

The soils in the northern tahsils viz. Jalgaon Malkapur and Khangaon are generally deep black, formed by transported material washed from the higher lands. Cotton and kharif jowar are the main crops. The largest stretches of such heavy soils are formed in strips of about thirteen kilometers on either side of the Purna river

The belt lying between the railway main line and the Purna river comprises of some of the most fertile lands in Vidarbha.

Towards the south, the soil is light and stony but pockets and belts of rich soil are found right upto the hills, particularly in Malkapur tahsil.

On the plateau, i.e. in Chikhli and Mehkar tahsils there are considerable areas of medium black soil interspersed amidst the light and shallow soils which grow cotton, jowar, pulses and bajari. The Chikhli and Mehkar tahsils are well known for their wheat which is grown in the low lands between the plateau. These soils have a murum sub-stratum and are, therefore, well drained. The existence of rock sub-soil is also not uncommon and the soils formed on such rocky beds suffer both, during scanty and heavy rains.

The district is not known to have any mineral of outstanding importance, except some saline deposits and lead in the lake of Lonar. These saline deposits were exploited for some time past, but subsequently found unprofitable and hence further exploitation of these deposits was abandoned. However, the agates, cornelians and calcite formed in the trap in southern part of the district have some utility, the first two for ornamental purposes and the last for optical purposes.

1.7 Climate, Temperature and Rain fall

The climate of the district is dry and hot in general and considered to be generally healthy. The mean maximum & mean minimum temperature at Buldhana during 1970 was 30.9 centegrades and 20.3 centegrades respectively.

After May, the temperature rapidly falls down. Then - after June with the arrivals of monsoons, starts the rainy season and lasts upto the end of September. It is followed by winter season, which is quite pleasant.

The above temperature figures are typical of the Balaghat Plateau (i.e. Chikhli & Mehkar tahsils) - where the hot season sets in late and the heat is not intense. The rainy season is pleasant and the winter is invigouriting. Buldhana town itself is the coolest and the most pleasant District Head quarters in Vidarbha. The climate of the Payanghat (i.e. Malkapur, Jalgaon & Khamgaon tahsils) affords a great contrast. There the heat is intense and specially in the months of March to May, it is perhaps as intense as in the hottest part of the country. The strong western winds, which then prevail become intensely heated and exercise their influence.

The rainfall is not uniform in all parts of the district. It is highest at Buldhana with an average of about 873 mms. as against the average of 715 mms. at Malkapur. If rains come in time and are equitably spread over the entire monsoon period properly the average rain fall in the district proves to be adequate for good crops. The district gets rain from the south-west monsoons - during the period from June to September.

C H A P T E R - II

Explanatory notes on the scope and limitations of the statistical data presented in the Part-II (Statistical Abstract)

-**-

I. Purpose :- The abstract part of this publication gives exhaustive statistical data on important Socio Economic indicators of development. Tables on almost all important topics are presented in this part, so that the publication could serve as a reference book. Talukawise data have been displayed as far as possible for inter taluka comparison. In most of the tables, data for 1970-71 have been indicated with data for 1969-70. In the tables wherein data for 1969-70- & 1970-71 could not be presented the same for the latest two years, for which they were available, have been shown. In case of population (1961) and district provisional total for 1971, Livestock (1966) and Census of Government employees (1966), however the data for latest census have been presented. All the data are collected from the State and Central Government Offices, local bodies and other relevant agencies. The foot-notes below each table indicate the source from which the data have been collected.

II. District at a Glance :- This table presents a birds-eye-view of the Socio- Economic indicators of development in Buldhana district and Nagpur Division, under different heads; such as area, population, agriculture, animal husbandry, education, transport and communication, plan and C.D. programme, local bodies and other miscellaneous statistics. Reference year of the table is also indicated in the table.

III. Contents, Scope and Limitation :- The statistical tables presented in the District Statistical Abstract are grouped into 13 parts. The contents of the tables and the scope and limitations of the data displayed under each group are explained below.

1. Climate -

Only two tables are included under this section pertaining to rainfall and temperature at the selected centres in Buldhana district.

The table No.1 gives monthly rainfall and number of rainy days in each month at the selected centres for the years 1969 and 1970. The data are collected through Revenue agency. A day is treated as a "rainy day" if during the 24 hours the rain gauge recorded minimum of 2.5 m.m. of rainfall. Annual rainfall for each centre is also indicated in the table. "Normal rainfall" is the average rainfall over a period ranging from five to eighty years.

The table NO.2 gives monthwise 'mean "mean maximum" and mean minimum and also annual temperature as recorded at Buldhana for the years 1969-& 1970. The data are supplied by the Government of Indias Regional meteorological centre at Nagpur. The mean maximum and mean minimum temperature denotes the average of the maximum and minimum temperature recorded daily during the month. The mean (average) temperature is the simple average of the mean maximum and mean minimum temperature.

2. Area and Population

In all 6 tables i.e. table NOs. 3 to 8 are included in this section. Data for 1961 census are indicated in all

tables except table No.3 where in data for both 1951 and 1961 censuses are shown as reference period of the 1961 census was sunrise of 1st March 1961. The table 3A gives provisional figures of population for 1971 census.

The table No.3 indicates sexwise rural and urban population enumerated in 1951 and 1961 censuses, also with variation in between the two censuses. The population figures for 1951 census shown in the table have been adjusted to cover the boundaries or areas of the district and talukas as they existed at the time of 1961 census. According to 1961 census, the term urban area as used in col.3 of the table were defined as under :-

A town or an urban area is defined as a place which has -

1. A Municipality, a cantonment or civil lines or
2. i) A population of 5,000 or over and -
 - ii) Atleast 314 or more of male workers are engaged in non-agricultural pursuits.

Table No.4 gives talukawise classification of inhabited villages according to different population ranges. The term village (i.e. rural area) used in the table denotes a statutorily recognised village having a well defined boundary and separate land records. Hamlets, wadies or padas have therefore, not been shown separate villages. On the other hand, statutorily recognised villages having no population have been shown separately as 'uninhabited' villages. Villages also include forest

villages comprising mostly forest labourers and their families. Total population of the villages in each range is also indicated in the table.

The table No.6 gives number of workers and non-workers in each taluka of Buldhana district according to 1961 Census, and they are classified according to standard livelihood classes. The population according to livelihood classes is shown separately for rural and urban area and also for the district as a whole. The concept of dependency has been abandoned for economic classification at the 1961 census. Instead, the population is classified into workers and non-workers. The emphasis is now on work and not on income or economic dependence. A person is defined as worker if (a) In case of seasonal work like cultivation, livestock, dairying household industry, etc. he has had some regular work of more than one hour a day throughout the greater part of the working season; and (b) In the case of regular employment in any trade, a profession service, business or commerce, he was employed during any of the fifteen days preceding the day of the enumerators visit to the household.

Persons like beggars, pensioners, agricultural or non-agricultural royalty, rent or dividend receivers etc. who earn an income but who are not participating in any productive work in any occupation and also person who has been offered work, but who had not actually joined have been classified as a non-worker.

The table No.7 gives distribution of population according to (A) Age group (B) Mother tongue and (C) Religion, separately for Rural and Urban area and for the district as a whole. Here 'Mother tongue' is defined as a language spoken by the persons mother to the person in his childhood or mainly spoken in the house. Dialects have been included in the main languages on the basis of Grierson's classification.

The table No.8 gives talukwise details of scheduled caste and scheduled tribes separately for rural and urban area and also for the district as a whole.

Scheduled Tribes

There are no scheduled tribes notified for this district in 1961.

3. Agriculture

In all 11 tables i.e. table Nos. 9 to 19 are included in this section.

The table NO.9 indicates talukawise figures of land utilisation under the standard heads of land uses for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. Against each taluka, the break-up of the total geographical area according to different types of land uses is shown. Major constituents of the Geographical area are forests, land put to non-agricultural uses, barren and unculturable land, culturable wastes, permanent pastures, land under miscellaneous tree crops not included in area sown, current fallows, other fallows and lastly net area sown. Under 'Forests' are included all actually forest areas of lands classed or administered as forests under any legal enactment dealing with forests whether state owned or private. If any portion of such land is not actually wooded but put to some agricultural use, that portion is included under the appropriate heading of cultivated or uncultivated land as the case may be. 'Land put to non-agricultural uses' stands for all lands, occupied by buildings, roads and railways or under water e.g. rivers and canals and other lands put to uses other than agriculture. 'Barren and unculturable land' covers all barren and unculturable land like mountains, deserts etc. Land which cannot be brought under cultivation unless at a high cost, is classed as 'barren and unculturable land' whether such land is in isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings. Culturable waste 'includes all lands available for cultivation whether not taken up for cultivation or taken up for cultivation once but not cultivated during the current year and last five years or more in succession. Such lands may be either fallow or covered with shrubs and jungles which are not put to any use.

They may be assessed or not assessed and may lie (1) isolated blocks or within cultivated holdings. Permanent pastures and other grazing lands cover all grazing lands, whether they are permanent pastures and meadows or not. Village common and grazing lands within forest areas are included under this head. 'Land under miscellaneous tree crops etc.' not included in the net area sown are included all cultivable land, which is not included under net area sown, but is put to some agricultural use. Land under casuring tree, thatching grass, bamboo bushes and other for fuel etc. which are not included under orchards, are classed under the category, 'Current fallows' comprise cropped areas, which are kept fallow during the current year. 'Other fallow' land includes all lands which were taken up for cultivation, but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and more than five years. The net area sown consists of net area sown with crops and orchards, area sown more than once being counted only once. The 'gross cropped area' represents the sum total of area under all crops. The difference between the total or gross cropped area and net area sown is accounted for by the area sown more than once during the same year with the same or different crops.

The table No.16 gives the information on major & medium projects in this district. Both completed and incomplete projects have been covered in this table. Position in this table is as it was on 30th June 1971. The cost of medium irrigation project ranges between Rs. 20 lakhs to 5 crores, whereas that of a major irrigation project, it is Rs.5/- crores and above.

Table No.17 deals with monthly agricultural wage rates in 1969 and 1970. This data is collected fortnightly throughout the year from three selected Rural centres in Buldhana district viz. 1) Asalgaon, 2) Deulghat & 3) Dongaon. Only one centre is selected from a taluka.

4) Animal Husbandry and Forest

A- Animal Husbandry

In all 5 tables i.e. table Nos.20 to 24 B are included in this section.

Table No.20 gives talukawise number of various types of livestock and poultry as enumerated in the district in the Livestock census, 1966. The census is conducted throughout the country on an uniform basis of concepts & methods of enumeration once in 5 years. During the Livestock census operations, the livestock and poultry were enumerated by house to house enquiry. Particular care was taken to enumerate livestock in slaughter houses, stray animals and animals in transit. Sex and age-groupwise classification of the livestock is also indicated in the table.

Table Nos. 21, 22 & 23 gives talukawise veterinary statistics disease wise livestock mortality and No. of slaughter houses and animals slaughtered in them for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71.

B) Forest

(19)

The table NO.24. (A) gives details of area in different types of forests during the year 1969-70 and 1970-71. Data regarding forests under the control of the state Government's Forest Department and those under the control of State Government's Revenue Department are shown separately. The areas under forests are classified according to legal status into reserved forests, protected forests and unclassed forests. The legal status refers to the classification of forests under the Indian Forests Act, XVI of 1927. Reserved forests are those that are intended mainly for timber production, where-in the rights of grazing and cultivation are seldom allowed. In protected forests, the restrictions are not so rigid. Right of grazing or cultivation is allowed but certain limitations and restrictions are imposed. The unclassed forest refers to the inaccessible forest or unoccupied waste. The forests which are taken by Government from local bodies or private individuals for management on lease basis are called 'leased forests'. There is no classification of ex-proprietary forests as such but in Nagpur division, some private lands containing valuable forests are taken over by Government under section 29 of the Indian Forests Act, which are not yet classified as per tripartite classification and they are termed as ex-proprietary. The forest are shown in table No. 24 (A) may not tally with the area under forest shown in table No. 9. The two sets of figures differ due to the following reasons.

1) In the Indian Forest Statistics Returns, the whole area including non-wooden area under the control of Forest Department is taken as area under forests, while in Agricultural statistics, it is classified according to its actual utilisation (ii) The Forest Department returns are meant to serve a definite administrative purpose and indicate the ownership of the forest areas and the actual utilisation of these areas is not so important from the point of view of Forest Department, as it is in the Land Utilisation statistics under Agricultural statistics. (iii) The Forest Department returns relate to financial year and Agricultural statistics relate to the agricultural year.

5) Employment, Industry and Electricity

In all 11 tables i.e. table Nos. 25 to 35 are included in this section.

The factory statistics shown in table Nos. 25, 26 & 27 cover following types of factories registered under the Factories Act, 1948 :-

- 1) Those employing ten or more workers working with the aid of power (Section 2 m (i))
- 2) Those employing twenty or more workers and working without the aid of power (Section 2 m (ii) and
- 3) Those registered under section 85 of the Act, under which the State Government makes applicable the provisions of the Act, even though the above conditions are not fulfilled. However, statistics of the defence factories are excluded.

The table No.29 gives occupational distribution of total registration and placement in the employment exchange for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71 according to Standard National classification.

The table No.31 presents the results of the census of Government employees as on 1.7.1966, conducted by the Bureau of Economics & Statistics, Bombay. The data presented in these tables are restricted to class-I, II, III & IV employees of the State Government and do not cover any other category such as work-charged personal class-IV employees paid from contingencies, daily rated workers, part time workers or honorary workers. The distribution of employees according to specified basic pay/emoluments ranges is shown separately in respect of class-I, II, III and IV employees.

The distribution of the employees according to monthly pay and emoluments ranges is shown in table No.31.

The table No.33 deals with the results of the annual survey of industries indicating industrywise working and reporting factories employment, fixed working and productive capital, total value of production and value added for the year 1966. This survey is carried out by the Bureau of Economics and Statistics, Bombay annually.

6. Co-operation

In all 8 tables i.e. table Nos. 36 to 43 are included in this section.

The table No. 38 gives talukawise number of Primary agricultural societies, their membership, share capital, Reserve and other funds, working capital, loans

advanced and recovered, loans -
Outstanding and overdues and percentage of recovery to
total loan advanced for the years 1969-70 & 1970-71.

'Working capital' includes paid up capital deposits and
borrowings. Loans outstanding include outstanding in
respect of loans, cash credits and over drafts and the
amount of outstanding bills purchased or discounted.

'Overdues' refer to amount of loan or instalments which
were due for collection but which were not actually col-
-lected and for the repayment of which no extension has
been granted by a competent authority.

The table No.43 gives talukawise number of
registered money lenders in each taluka and loans advanced
by them during 1969-70 and 1970-71. Separate figures of
loans advanced to traders and non-traders have been furni-
-shed in the table. The transactions of money lending
in the state are regulated under the provisions of Bombay
Money Lenders Act, 1946. According to the Act, no money
lender shall carry on the business of money lending except
in the area for which he has been granted a licence, and
except in accordance with the terms and conditions of
such licence.

7. Medical and Public Health

In all 4 tables i.e. table Nos. 44 to 47 are
included in this section.

The table No.44 given in this section indicates
talukawise number of hospitals, dispensaries, maternity
homes, health centres and primary health centres, doctors,
nurses, vaidyas, beds and total number of indoor and out-
-door patients treated as well for the years 1969 & 1970.

The table covers all the State and Central Government medical institutions, and also institutions owned by municipalities and local bodies engaged in providing medical facilities. Private clinics run by private bodies or individuals are, however, not included in the table.

The table NO.44 gives vital statistics such as number of registered births and deaths in this district.

8. Education

In all 8 tables i.e. table NO.48 to 55 are included in this section.

The table NO. 48 gives sexwise number of literates and percentage of literacy separately for rural and urban areas of each taluka according to 1961 population census. As per 1961 census definition, a person was classified as a literate if he was able to read or write a simple letter in any language.

The table No. 50 gives information regarding number of educational institutions according to types for the year 1969-70 and 1970-71. Sexwise enrolment and number of trained and untrained teachers in these institutions is also indicated in this table. The classification of institutions according to type is slightly different from stage of education. There are at present many secondary schools, which also impart education in primary courses. Nevertheless, the entire enrollment of students is included under secondary education. Primary institutions provide education for standards I to IV or standards I to VII/VIII or less and teaches the curriculum approved by the Education Department. The secondary institutions coach students for standard VIII to X or

XI/ XII with or without lower standards. Higher education is education after passing Secondary School Certificate Examination which leads to a degree examination.

The table No. 52 presents data on the number of beneficiaries among backward classes such as scheduled caste, scheduled-tribes and other backward classes for the years 1969-70 & 1970-71. Beneficiaries for this table are persons who are getting educational concessions of either type such as scholarships, freeships etc.

Table No. 55 gives number of villages without primary schools or schooling facilities according to population ranges at the end of the years 1969-70 & 1970-71. Villages with schooling facilities include smaller villages (generally below population of 200 persons), which cannot be given independent schools for economic reasons, and are, therefore, attended for school facilities to larger villages or urban areas within 'walking distance' of one mile from them. The deserted villages as per 1961 Census are also included in the population range 0.199.

9. Transport and Communication

In all 7 tables i.e. table Nos. 56 to 62 are included in this section.

The table No.56 gives total railway length as on 31st March 1970 and 31st March 1971 according to the type of routes, Broad Gauge, Meter Gauge and Narrow Gauge. The railway length is measured between the first and last stations within the district boundary. The figures of length of each type of route are, therefore, approximate and not accurate.

The table No. 59 deals with operational statistics of Nationalised Road Transport in Akola division. For this table, the S.T. Division comprises Akola and Buldhana districts of Nagpur region.

Table No. 60 presents the results of the traffic census on important roads conducted in Building and Communication Department, Government of Maharashtra. Data on the number of vehicles is according to categories and location of countpost. Type of surface and total traffic intensity in tons per 24 hours are also indicated in the table.

10. Local Bodies

In all 4 tables i.e. table Nos. 63 to 66 are included in this section.

The table No. 63 gives abstract of income and expenditure of local bodies such as Village Panchayats, Zilla Parishad and Municipalities for the financial years 1968-69 and 1969-70 and 1970-71. The number of village Panchayats includes number of independent village panchayats as well as group Village Panchayats.

11. Plan and Community Development

In all 5 tables i.e. table No. 67 to 71 are included in this section.

12. Prices

Only 2 tables i.e. tables Nos. 72 and 73 are included in this section.

The table No. 72 gives monthly average retail prices of various commodities at district headquarter Buldhana. The average prices under each commodity are

shown from the month of January/for the years 1969 and 1970 along with units and varieties of commodities for which prices have been quoted. The data are regularly collected by District Statistical Officer every week on Friday by visiting the selected shops. The average price of each commodity for the year is also shown in the table.

As the information collected for the given commodities is restricted to only one quotation and that too only from one shop at District Headquarter, the average price for individual commodity cannot be said to be fully representative, but the data may prove useful as a broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices over the period of time.

The table No. 73 gives consumer price index numbers (revised series) for working class of Nagpur centre published by the office of the Commissioner of Labour, Bombay. Monthwise data for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71 commencing from April and also averages for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71 have been given in this table. The base year for calculating price index (new series) is 1960. The Index Numbers of wholesale prices are issued by the Economic Advisor to the Government of India. The base year for the same is 1952-53. The method of construction of the index is given in the Appendix to Index Numbers of wholesale prices in India revised series (1956) issued by the office of the Economic Advisor to Government of India. The equivalent of old Index Numbers can be obtained by multiplying the new index by 5.22 as multiplier.

13. Miscellaneous

In all 12 tables i.e. table Nos. 74 to 85 are included in this section.

The table NO. 77 gives talukawise Cinema Statistics for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71.

Number of permanent, Semi-permanent and touring theaters and their seating capacity per show has been indicated in the table.

Table NO. 85 brings out the trend in selected important indicators in Buldiana district.

C H A P T E R - IIIIndicators of Development

In this chapter the progress of development covering the period at the end of second Five Year Plan and the Annual Plans 1969-70 or 1970-71 has been reviewed by presenting tahsilwise sectorial trends based on certain important indicators of development. Comparative tahsil-wise figures, wherever available for 1960-61 and 1969-70 or 1970-71, as the case may be, have also been presented to bring out the pace of development.

Indicator NO.1:- Percentage of gross sown area

The extent of double cropping is solely related to availability of irrigational facilities and soils capable of retention of moisture after monsoons. The district accounted for a very low percentage of area sown more than once to the net area sown in Maharashtra during 1961-62 when it stood 22nd among the districts of Maharashtra. The position, however, seems to have been improved in 1966-67 when it stood 3rd in Nagpur division.

The following table gives the percentage of gross sown area to net sown area in 1960-61 and 1969-70 in each taluka.

It is seen from the above table that the percentage of gross cropped area has increased from 102.57 in 1960-61 to 104.23 in 1969-70. The percentage of double cropped area was highest in Chikhli taluka followed by Mehkar taluka. In other three talukas the proportion was less than the district average. The proportion of double cropped area in all talukas except in Jalgaon taluka seems to have been increased in 1969-70 as compared to the year 1960-61. In Chikhli and Mehkar talukas the proportion of double cropping is higher as most of the cultivators grow mung, Urid, groundnut, hybrid jowar etc. in kharif season and then in rabi season grow crops like wheat, safflower etc. as second crop. Though there are good facilities of irrigation crops like bananas, cotton etc. are grown which give no facility for double cropping.

Indicator No.2 - Productivity of important crops

The productivity of crops depends upon equitable distribution of rains in absence of adequate irrigation facilities. Concerted attempts have been made in the district to stimulate agricultural production in the past and the agricultural production in the year 1969-70 has exceeded the production in 1960-61 for most of the crops.

The following table gives the figures of output of important crops in the year 1960-61 and 1969-70.

It is seen from the above table that the out-turn of all the food crops except wheat and gram had increased in 1969-70 as compared to 1960-61. The increase in out-turn was mainly due to the evenly distributed rains, use of high yielding varieties, pesticides etc. The production of cotton had however decreased in 1969-70 as compared to 1960-61 as this crop was badly damaged because of diseases. The production of groundnut decreased as the area under this crop had decreased considerably in 1969-70 as compared to the area under this crop in 1960-61.

Indicator No.3 - Gross Value of Agricultural Production

As relevant price data required are not available, gross value of agricultural production could not be calculated.

Indicator No.4 - Percentage of irrigated area -

As far as the irrigation facilities are concerned the district is mainly dependent on well irrigation except the Nalganga project located in Malkapur taluka. The project has about 8700 hectares of area under its command mostly in Malkapur taluka. The district ranked 5th in 1966-67 in Nagpur division on the basis of the percentage of net irrigated area to net sown area.

The following table shows the percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area in 1960-61 and 1969-70:

From the above table it is seen that the percentage of gross irrigated area to net irrigated area has increased from 101.15 in 1960-61 to 111.94 in 1969-70. The increase was mainly notable in Mehkar, Chikhli and Malkapur taluka where as in other two taluka viz. Jalgaon and Khamgaon no change has been observed.

The following table shows the percentage of net irrigated area to net sown area in 1960-61 and 1969-70.

From the above table it is seen that in all the talukas except in Mehkar the percentage of net irrigated areas to net sown area has increased in 1969-70 as compared to the year 1960-61. The percentage of area irrigated was highest in Chikhli taluka in 1969-70 followed by Malkapur, Khangaon, Jalgaon and Mehkar. The percentage of net irrigated area to net sown area was below district average in Jalgaon, Khangaon and Mehkar talukas.

Indicator No.5 - Changes in the Crop pattern
(Total and irrigated)

The major crops in the district are jowar, cotton, pulses in kharif season and wheat, safflower and to some extent rabi jowar in rabi season. Cotton is the main non-food crop in the district which accounted for nearly 35.9 percent of the total cropped area in 1969-70. The district had about 57.86 percent of its gross cropped area under food crops in 1969-70 which showed a slight increase of 0.35 percent over 1960-61. The following table gives the percentage of area under food and non-food crops to gross cropped area in each tahsil in 1960-61 and 1969-70.

It will be seen from the above table that area under food crops had increased slightly. The increase was mainly observed in Khamgaon taluka and the decrease was observed mainly in Lu Mehkar and Jalgaon talukas. The increase in the area of food crops in Malkapur and Chikhli talukas was however negligible. The proportionate increase or decrease was observed in the area of non-food crops also.

The following table gives the percentage of irrigated area under food and non-food crops to total gross irrigated area in 1960-61 and 1969-70.

From the above table it is seen that the percentage of area under irrigated food crops has dropped down from 92.1 percent in 1960-61 to 80.7 percent in 1969-70 and proportionate area under irrigated non-food crops increased during the period under review. The percentage of irrigated area under food crops to total irrigated area has decreased in all talukas except in Jalgaon taluka. The increase in the irrigated non-food crops was mainly observed in cotton in most of the tahsils.

Indicator No. 6 - Increase in agricultural credit and outstanding dues

The co-operatives are a major source of agricultural finance to meet the needs of shortterm and medium term credit of agriculturists. The following table shows tahsilwise primary agricultural societies, amount of loan advanced and loan outstanding in 1963-64 and 1970-71 respectively.

From the above table, it is seen that the total number of societies in 1970-71 had decreased by 7.7 percent as compared to the number of societies in 1963-64. The total amount of loan advanced has however increased by 49.7 percent in 1970-71 over the corresponding figure in 1963-64. The amount of loan outstanding has also increased by 115.3 percent in 1970-71 as compared with the amount of loan outstanding in 1963-64.

Indicator No.7 - Agricultural Wage rates

The agricultural wage rates are collected from selected cultivators from selected centres viz. Dongaon, Deulghat and Asalgaon in Mehkar, Chikhli and Jalgaon talukas respectively. Generally the skilled workers like carpenters, black-smiths, cobblers etc. are not employed on daily wages and hence wage rates for these categories are not available. These wage rates are collected fortnightly. As these centers cannot represent the district position very correctly these wage rates- may be taken as a broad indicator of wage level in the district. The following table gives average wage rates at above selected centres for the year 1963-64 and 1969-70 as the work of collection of these wage rates was started from June 1963.

The agricultural wage rates were highest at Dongaon for males and at Deulghat for females in 1969-70 while they were lowest at Deulghat for males and at Asalgaon for females in 1969-70. The agricultural

wage rates has increased by about 71.5 percent in case of males and by about 61.3 percent in case of females in 1969-70 as compared to the wage rates in 1963-64.

Indicator No.8

Live stock per hectare of cultivable land

Animals besides providing most of the draught power required for agricultural operations are an important source of organic manure and raw material. The following table gives the live stock population (ovine and bovine) per hectare of cultivable land in 1960-61 and 1969-70.

From the above table it is seen that livestock per hectare of cultivable land has decreased from 1.05 in 1960-61 to 1.03 in 1969-70. The livestock per hectare of cultivable area was less in Khamgaon and Malkapur talukas as compared to the district average.

Indicator No.9 - Poultry as compared to population

The total poultry population in the district according to 1966 livestock census was 1016.43 which decreased by about 33.5 percent as compared to the corresponding number as per 1961 live stock census. The following table gives talukawise poultry population per 100 persons in Buldhana district.

The poultry population in the district has decreased by 33.5 percent during 1966 as compared to the poultry population in 1961. This decrease has been observed in all tahsils of the district. The poultry per 100 persons was found to be above the district average in Chikhli and Mehkar tahsils while it was below the district average in other tahsils of the district in 1966. It was highest in Chikhli tahsil and lowest in Khamgaon tahsil. The district ranked 6th in Vidarbha and 22nd in Maharashtra in 1961 in respect of poultry population.

Indicator No.10 - Per capita consumption of electricity

The district receives its electric power from the paras thermal power station located in Akola district. The demand for electricity in the district is growing rapidly especially for agricultural pumps sets for boosting up the agricultural production. In relation to the per capita consumption of electricity the district stood seventh in Nagpur division in 1967-68. In all 376 villages and 9 towns were electrified by the end of the year 1970-71 covering 56.3 percent of the total population of the district.

The following table shows the per capita consumption of electricity in 1961-62 and 1970-71.

It is seen from the above table that the per capita consumption of electricity in 1970-71 increased by 212.0 percent over the corresponding consumption in

1961-62. The per capita consumption has increased mainly due to increase in number of villages electrified upto 1970-71 over the year 1961-62. The per capita consumption had rapidly increased in the consumption classified under "other purposes" due to the increase in electrical pump sets for agriculture. Industrial and domestic consumption has also shown remarkable increase as compared to other categories of electricity consumption.

Indicator No.11 - Increase in the number of candidates enrolled in Employment Exchange and vacancies notified.

Raising the level of per capita income is, no doubt, the basic objective of economic development but not the only one. Among other important goals, the creation of adequate jobs to absorb existing unemployed and prospective additions to the labour force commanded a high priority in the five year plans. The district has its Employment Exchange located at the District head quarter Buldhana and is headed by the District Employment Officer, Buldhana.

The following table gives the number of -
1) Registrations, 2) Vacancies and 3) Placements in the district in 1960-61 and 1970-71.

It is seen from the above table that the number of registrations had increased by 49.2 percent in 1970-71 as compared to the registrations in 1960-61, while the vacancies notified and placements decreased by 13.1 and 3.2 percent respectively. The number on live register in 1960-61 & 1970-71 was 2049 and 5416, respectively.

Indicator No.12 :- Increase in indoor and out-door patients treated in hospitals

The general aim of the health programme is to expand the existing health services to bring them within the reach of the people and to promote a progressive improvement in the level of natural health. The provision of adequate institutional facilities for organising health services, control of communicable diseases, family planning, improvement of environmental hygien comprising of better sanitation and protected water supply, training facilities for medical and health personnel were some of the main health programmes implemented during the Annual Plan 1970-71 for improving the health standard.

The following table gives number of indoor and outdoor patients treated in each taluka of the district during 1960 and 1970 in the medical institutions available there.

From the above table, it is seen that the indoor patients treated in various public institutions has increased by about 758 percent in 1970 as compared with the same during the year 1960. This was mainly due to the increased facilities for treating indoor patients in rural areas through primary health centres. The number of outdoor patients treated in these public institutions has also increased in the year 1970 as compared with the same during the ^{year} 1960. The increase in out-door patients treated is 39.4 % over the year 1960.

Indicator No. 13 - Increase in the number of students in different categories

According to 1961 Census 26.90 percent (Males 41.15 % and females 12.22%) of the population of this district was literate as against 29.82% in Maharashtra and 27.88% in Vidarbha. In the district, the compulsory primary education was governed by Primary Education Act of 1950 and amended Act of 1956 of the Ex. M.P. Government. In 1955 compulsion was introduced in Vidarbha for age group under the Education Act of the Region. Due to this compulsion the number of schools and enrolment in them rose very rapidly in all tashils. At the end of the year 1970-71 every village in the district was within the vicinity of a primary school or had a primary school in it. The following table gives the number of primary school going children during 1960-61 and 1969-70 in the district.

From the above table it is seen that enrolment in primary schools had increased by 61.2 per cent in 1969-70 over the enrolment in 1960-61. The rise in enrolment in case of girls was more than the rise in enrolment of boys which is mainly due to increase in educational facilities in rural areas.

The number of pupils in secondary schools had also increased during 1969-70 as compared to the year 1960-61. The following table indicates the enrolment in secondary and higher educational institutions in Buldhana district in 1960-61 and 1969-70.

From the above table, it is seen that the enrolment in secondary education institutions had increased by 92.1 per cent while that in higher standard institutions it had increased by 311.5 per cent in 1969-70 as compared to the year 1960-61. The increase in enrolment in case of girls was remarkable for both secondary and higher standard institutions which was mainly due to the expansion of facilities in rural areas and due to change in outlook in favour of female education.

Indicator No. 14 - Increase in Road length per 100 square kilometers

The Road Development programme for Third Five Year Plan and the yearly plans from 1966-67 to 1970-71 has been formulated in accordance with the broad objectives laid down in the "Nagpur Road Development plan 1961-81". The broad objectives of this plan were that no village in a developed and agricultural area should remain more than four miles away from a metalled road and more than 1½ miles from any type of road. The following table indicates road length per 100 square kilometers and per lakh of population in the district during 1960-61 & 1970-71:

The road length per 100 sq. kms has increased from 9.56 kms. in 1960-61 to 19.77 kms. in 1970-71, while road length per lakh of population increased from 87.95 kms. in 1960-61 to 181.89 kms. in 1970-71. In short the road length has doubled during the last decade.

Indicator No. 15 - Increase in Banking Facilities in proportion to population

Since the nationalisation of the Banking Business, the various banking companies have brought the field of agricultural and industrial development in their operational fold and are advancing loans to the agriculturists and small units of industries.

The co-operative

- / banks also have made a remarkable progress in expanding their business in rural areas. There were 10 scheduled banks and 12 co-operative banks functioning in this district during 1960-61. At the end of the year 1969-70 (as on 30.9.70) the number of scheduled banks rose to 13 while there were 36 co-operative banks as on 30.6.1970 in the district. The following table gives the number of banks and population per banking office during the year 1960-61 and 1969-70.

From the above table, it is seen that the number of banking offices per lakh of population increased from 2.08 in 1960-61 to 4.62 in 1969-70. During 1969-70 a banking office could cater to the needs of 21,626 persons as against 48,168 persons in 1960-61. The banking facilities were available at 32 places in various parts of the district covering a population of 2,59,255 in 1969-70. The population covered by these places formed 24.5 percent of the total population of the district.

Indicator No.16 - Prices

Since the declaration of the emergency in the country in 1962, price quotations for some important commodities from all district head quarters are collected on weekly basis. The price collection work was started in November 1962. The prices of different commodities are collected from selected shops and for selected varieties on each Friday and therefore do not fully represent the district position but the data may still prove useful as a broad indicator of the trend in changes in retail prices over the period of time in the district. The following table indicate the average prices of some important commodities collected at Buldhana town for the year - 1963 and 1970.

From the above table, it will be seen that prices of all the commodities except Gur have increased upto 1970 as compared to the prices in 1963. The increase is remarkable in almost all the commodities and particularly in case of all food grains, groundnut oil, sugar, turmeric, dry chillies etc. The increase is highest in case of groundnut oil followed by dry chillies, gram dal, mung dal etc.

C H A P T E R - I VAnnual Plan - 1970-71

The state's Fourth Five Year Plan has not been finalised yet and hence the Annual Plan for 1970-71 has therefore, beendrafted. keeping in view the important programmes in the state's Fourth Plan, requirements of continuing scheme and few important new schemes. Details of the programmes under each sector of development are given below.

During the year 1970-71 an amount of Rs.136.65 lakhs was provided for this district out of which Rs. 132.89 lakhs were spent under different heads of development as against a provision of Rs.178.01 lakhs. An expenditure of Rs.155.59 lakhs was incurred during the year 1969-70. The percentage of expenditure to budget provision for the year 1970-71 works out to 97.2.

The table below gives the budget provisions and expenditure incurred under each head of development for district level schemes implemented in this district during the year 1970-71 for state sector and local sectors separately.

It will be seen from the above table that during 1970-71, as much as 49.47 percent of the total budget provision was allocated to Agricultural Programmes followed by 18.02 percent for Transport and communications, 15.55 percent for social services, 9.95 percent for co-operation and Community Development, 6.45 percent for Irrigation and Power (Rural Electrification Programme) 0.34 percent for miscellaneous Rural Broadcasting and remaining 0.22 percent for Industry and mining.

An expenditure of Rs.132.89 lakhs was incurred during year 1970-71 (Rs.62.79 lakhs incurred in state sector and Rs.70.10 lakhs incurred in local sector). The percentage of expenditure in state sector and local sector worked out to 47.25 percent and 52.75 percent respectively.

I - Agricultural Programmes

Agriculture and allied programmes was assigned a high priority in the Annual Plan 1970-71. Nearly half of the budget provision was earmarked for these programmes. Important achievements under some sub-heads are given below -

1) Agricultural Production - (49)

During the year 1970-71 an amount of Rs.2.38 lakhs was provided out of which Rs.2.22 lakhs were expended on various schemes such as multiplication of improved seeds, seed processing plants, Development of local manurial resources, Horticultural development Intensive cultivation of food crops etc.

2. Minor Irrigation

Under this programme 155 new wells were constructed and 103 pump sets were given subsidy. A part from these 103 pumpsets about 1900 pump sets were electrified by the M.S.E.B. under the A.F.C. scheme. The work of boring of wells and Air compressor and blasting was in progress in the district. During the year 1970-71 work of 3 new tanks and 3 new bandharas was completed with an additional irrigation capacity of 684 hectares. An amount of Rs.36.25 lakhs was provided for this programme out of which an amount of Rs.35.48 lakhs was incurred during the year 1970-71.

3. Soil Conservation

An area of 20,596 hectares was bunded in the district during 1970-71 at a cost of Rs.18.49 lakhs.

4. Ayacut Development

For proper utilisation of irrigation, package programmes for land development indicating the items 1) Designing of suitable crop pattern 2) Preparation of agricultural development report for proper utilisation of potential & 3) steps for implementing the report through the special units of staff was prepared.

About 1600 hectares were brought under the Ayacut deve-
-lopment by spending Rs.4.55 lakhs. Area brought under
irrigation under this programme was about 5320 hectares.

5) Forests

For ensuring optimum supply of forest produce, schemes of plantation of general utility timber, planta-
-tion of quick growing species, farm forestry and deve-
-lopment of fodder resources were implemented in the
district. An amount of Rs.0.96 lakhs was spent on these
schemes during 1970-71.

II- Co-operation and Community Development

Under the sub-head co-operation Rs.1.34 lakhs
were provided and 100 percent amount has been spent during
the year 1970-71. Under the sub-head of Community Deve-
-lopment an amount of Rs.11.72 lakhs was expended
during the year 1970-71. This expenditure was incurred
mainly on C.D. blocks & Local Development Works. The
expenditure of Rs.6.78 lakhs was incurred from the
Z.P. Funds.

III. Irrigation and Power

Under the sub-head- Rural Electrification
programme an amount of Rs.10.23 lakhs was incurred
during the year 1970-71. Apart from this an amount of
Rs.42.63 lakhs has been incurred under the Agricultural
Finance Corporation's programme during this year. Elec-
-trification of 102 villages (including some hamlets)
and energisation of 2003 pump-sets was completed during
the year 1970-71.

IV. Industry and Mining

An amount of Rs.0.31 lakhs on development of 1) Handloom industry and 2) Handicraft industry was incurred under the sub-head Small Scale Industries during the year 1970-71.

V. Transport and Communication

Under the head of Transport and Communication, out of a total budget provision of Rs.24.62 lakhs an expenditure of Rs.26.36 lakhs was incurred during the year 1970-71. Under this, programme construction of roads measuring nearly 54 kms and '3' bridges were completed during the year 1970-71.

VI. Social Services

Out of a total budget provision of Rs.21.25 lakhs, a total expenditure of Rs.20.12 lakhs was incurred during the year 1970-71. Under the sub-head General Education 82 additional primary teachers were appointed and '24' school rooms were constructed during the year 1970-71. Apart from this, the schemes of teachers training, Educational concessions to pupils in secondary schools, stipend to students of education etc. were implemented during the year. Under the sub-head of water supply and drainage pipe water supply schemes for Malkapur, Chikhli, Deulgaon-Raja (all urban areas) and Datala, Warawat, Khanderao, (Rural areas) were taken up during the year 1970-71.

The work of Deulgaon-Raja piped water supply was completed and handed over to the M.C. Deulgaon-Raja.

Other works were in progress. Under the sub-head Housing extension of gaathan for 12 villages was completed. Under the sub-head welfare of back-ward classes 1030 students were granted, scholarships, tuition fees, examination fees etc. during the year 1970-71.
