CHAPTER NO. I

I N T R O D U C T I O N

1.1(1) Introduction and Location:- In ancient times the town Parbhani was known as Prabhavati on account of the existence of a beautiful and massive temple of goddess Prabhavati. Out of the twelve Jotirlingas in the country and 3 in Marathwada region, the district is sanctified by the existence of Jotirling namely Lord Nagnath at Aundha village in Hingoli taluka.

1.1(2) Parbhani district with an east-west of 128.72 km. (80 miles) and north-south extension of 104.58 km. (65 miles) stretches between  $18^{\circ}.58'$  and  $20^{\circ}.2'$  north latitude and between  $76^{\circ}.4'$  and  $77^{\circ}.4'$  east longitude. The district as a whole belongs to the Godavari peninsular basin situated on the northern side of Marathwada region. The Godavari has converted southern portion of the district comprising Pathri, Parbhani and Gangakhed talukas into a very fertile valley. The Purna which is a tributary of the Godavari and the Dudhana which is a tributary of the Purna drain the talukas of Jintur and Basmath.

1.2 Boundaries:- In shape, Parbhani is a compact district. It has natural boundaries of the Penganga river with a stretch of 160.93km. in the north-east and of the Godavari river with a stretch of 64.37km. in the south-west. Administratively it is bounded on the north by Buldhana, Akola and Yeormal districts of Vidarbha region and on the east by Nanded District.

On the south it is surrounded by Osmanabad and Bhir districts and on the west by Aurangabad district.

1.3 Administrative Set-up:-

1.3(1) The district consists of eight talukas namely (1) Partur, (2) Jintur, (3) Hingoli, (4) Kalamnuri, (5) Pathri, (6) Parbhani, (7) Basmath and (8) Gangakhed. Of these, Parbhani taluka is in the centre with Gangakhed on the south, Pathri and Partur on the west, Jintur, Hingoli and Kalamnuri on the north and Basmath on the east.

1.3(2) For administrative convenience the district has been divided into two sub-divisions namely Sailu and Hingoli each covering four talukas as under:-

The Collector and Tahsildars are the heads of the general administration, law and order, treasury, land revenue and civil supplies in the district and talukas respectively.

The Zilla Parishad and the Panchayat Samitis execute developmental and administrative functions to the extent of subjects transferred to them including Community Development Programme since the advent of Panchayati Raj on 1-5-1962 in the State.

1.3(3) There are in all 1,577 villages in the district of which 60 are un-inhabited. It is also worth mentioning that in this district there are 12 towns administered by the Municipal Councils.

Out of the 12 towns three are in Pathri taluka, two each in Gangakhedi and Parbhani talukas and one each, all being taluka headquarters, in the remaining 5 talukas. In all population of 1,66,702 persons live in the 12 towns whereas 40,89,534 persons in the 1,577 villages.

1.4 Area:-

1.4(1) Parbhani district stretches over an area of 12,552.9 square kilometres (4,846.7 sq. miles) of which 12,321.9 sq. kilometres (4,757.5 miles) is rural and the remaining 231.0 square kilometres (89.2 sq. miles) urban. In terms of area and population respectively it is the eleventh and nineteenth largest district in Maharashtra state. The district accounts for 4.1% and 3.0% of the State's area and population respectively according to 1961 Census.

1.4(2) Territorial Changes:- During 1905, the northern villages of Nanded taluka of Nanded District were added to Kalamnuri taluka of this district. Besides, eight villages from Ambad taluka of Aurangabad district were transferred to Pathri taluka of this district in exchange of six villages of Pathri taluka transferred to Ambad taluka of Aurangabad district. Thereafter there were no territorial changes till the end of 1955. Consequent upon the re-organisation of States on 1-11-1956, the district was transferred to the then Bombay State. Since 1st May 1960 it forms part of Maharashtra State and Aurangabad revenue division.

1.5 Topography:- As a part of the Deccan plateau, the land of the district has a general elevation of about 457.60 metres (1,500 ft) above the sea level, its highest and lowest levels being 579.73 metres (1902 ft.) in the Jintur

On the south it is surrounded by Osmanabad and Bhir districts and on the west by Aurangabad district.

1.3 Administrative Set-up:-

1.3(1) The district consists of eight talukas namely (1) Partur, (2) Jintur, (3) Hingoli, (4) Kalamnuri, (5) Pathri, (6) Parbhani, (7) Basmath and (8) Gangakhed. Of these, Parbhani taluka is in the centre with Gangakhed on the south, Pathri and Partur on the west, Jintur, Hingoli and Kalamnuri on the north and Basmath on the east.

Besides, eight villages from Ambad taluka of Aurangabad district were transferred to Pathri taluka of this district in exchange of six villages of Pathri taluka transferred to Ambad taluka of Aurangabad district. Thereafter there were no territorial changes till the end of 1955. Consequent upon the re-organisation of States on 1-11-1956, the district was transferred to the then Bombay State. Since 1st May 1960 it forms part of Maharashtra State and Aurangabad revenue division.

1.5 Topography:- As a part of the Deccan plateau, the land of the district has a general elevation of about 457.60 metres (1,500 ft) above the sea level, its highest and lowest levels being 579.73 metres (1902 ft.) in the Jintur



range, about 12.87 km. (8 miles) north of Charthana village and lowest level being around 366.0 metres (1200 ft.) above sea level on the Godavari bank near the point where the river crosses over the district boundary. The talukas of Pathri, Partur (except northern part), Gangakhed and Parbhani are plain topographically, while the talukas of Jintur, Hingoli, Kalamnuri and northern parts of Basmath and Partur tahsils are all hilly and mountainous in nature.

### 1.3 Hills:-

1.6(1) The main hill ranges of the district are Ajantha hills which emanate from the main Sahyadris. These run through Partur, Jintur, Hingoli and Kalamnuri talukas. The crest line consists of flat tops with an average elevation of 534 metres (1750 ft.) above sea level.

1.6(2) Malhura Hills:- These are west-east hill ranges separating the Penganga valley from that of Kaidhu to its south. The tops record heights ranging between 542 metres (1775 ft) in the west and 488 metres (1600 ft.) in the east.

1.6(3) Balaghat Hills:- A section of Balaghat range transverse member of Sahyadris, stretches over the southern portion of the district comprising Gangakhed taluka. Its general elevation is 534 metres (1750 ft.) with a few peaks, recording heights above 549 metres (1800 ft.)

1.6(4) Isolated Hills:- These stand mainly in the undulating black soil plain of the Godavari and theurna rivers having an average height of 463 metres (1533 ft.)

1.6(5) River System:- (1) The Godavari is the most important river of the district.

With its entrenched and meandering course it is the master stream that flows through Marathwada to enrich its economic resources, but at the same time impeding its communications. It winds its course into the district from west and after running a distance of about 180 km. (112 miles) through Gangakhed taluka, enters the adjoining district of Nanded.

The Purna rises from the Ajantha hills and enters the district from the north-west corner, makes its course in the south-eastern direction for major length through Jintur, Hingoli, Basmath and Parbhani talukas and then falls into the Godavari. The river Dudhana takes its rise in the amphitheatre of Khuldabad-Mhaismal range runs into the district in the south-eastern direction like the Purna for nearly 161 km. (100 miles) to join it. The Penganga river also rises in the Ajantha hills, a little to the south-west of Buldhana town and winds its course in the likewise manner. Its distinctive feature over other rivers is that all along its course of about 80 km. (50 miles) it acts as a district boundary. The river Kaidhu popularly known as Kayad enters the Hingoli taluka after rising from the hills scraps south of Risod town in Akola district and covers a distance of about 113 km. (70 miles) in Hingoli and Kalamnuri talukas.

(2) Besides, there are several minor streams in the district more important amongst which are the Karpara, the Kansur, the Wan, the Borna, the Macchili, the Galati, the Indrayani and the Dhond all being the tributaries of Godavari.

1.6(6) Soil :- The soil of the district is known as "Black Cotton" soil or "Regur" as it is popularly called and is formed by withering of the trap rock. The district is essentially a region of black soil gully erosion, uneven surface, furrowed by large and small streams and meandering water course. The uneven black soil plain is, however, interrupted by occasional basaltic knolls. The soil is rich in plant nutrients such as Lime, Magnesia, Iron, Alkalies. It swells and becomes sticky on wetting by rains and develops several cracks while becoming dry. It varies widely in texture and depth from place to place. In the hilly tracks in the north it is shallow and poor, while towards the south it is relatively richer and deeper. In the Godavari and the Purna valleys and especially along the courses of these rivers it is very deep and fertile making the central belt an economically well developed part of the district.

1.6(7) Minerals:- The district is devoid of any mineral wealth worth the name. Inferior quality of stone used for construction of buildings and other minor minerals are, however, extracted in this district. Black asphalt and granites are available everywhere and are used for buildings and road metalling.

1.7 Climate, Temperature and Rainfall:-

1.7(1) Climate:- The climate of the district is generally dry except during the south-west Monsoon season. The year is divided into 3 seasons, rainy season starts from June and lasts upto the end of September.

It is followed by cool dry season from October to February and hot dry season from March to May.

1.7(2) Temperature: - The only meteorological observatory in the district is at Parbhani. The temperature and other meteorological data at this station may be taken as representative of the conditions over the district as a whole.

The mean maximum temperature during the hot season touched 41.6° centigrade in the month of May in the year 1970 as against 42.3° centigrade in the same month in the year 1969.

Mean maximum temperature for cool dry season during the year 1970 was 11.0° in the month of December whereas the same was recorded as 13.3° centigrade during the same month in the year 1969.

The cold weather commences towards the end of November when temperature begins to fall. From February onwards the temperature starts rising till the commencement of rainy season. The

table below gives the seasonwise mean maximum and mean minimum temperature at Parbhani station during the year 1969 and 1970.

17.(3) Rainfall:- The rainfall is not uniform in all the parts of the district. The average rainfall gradually increases as we go from west to east. The rain starts about the first week of June and lasts till the end of September. The district gets the bulk of rainfall from the south-west Monsoons. From mid October to December it usually receives rainfall through north-east monsoons. The normal rainfall in the district is 826.6 mm. The table below gives the talukawise rainfall and rainy days during the year 1969 and 1970.

During the year 1969 only Gangakhed and Partur received rainfall below the district normal whereas all talukas excepting Partur received rainfall above the district normal in 1970. Rainfall is unevenly distributed in the various parts of the district. The western part, particularly Hingoli, Basmath and Kalamnuri talukas, receives maximum rainfall as compared to eastern talukas, i.e. Pathri and Partur talukas of the district. The maximum rainfall 287.8 mm. was received in the month of August in the year 1970, whereas in the preceeding year it was in the month of September, that the maximum rainfall 340.0 mm. was recorded in the district. Both average number of rainy days and average rainfall were more in the year 1970 than in the year 1969.

CHAPTER II

EXPLANATORY NOTES ON SCOPE AND LIMITATIONS OF THE STATIS-  
TICS IN THE STATISTICAL ABSTRACT

1. Purpose :- The abstract part of the publication gives exhaustive statistics on important Socio-Economic indicators of development. Tables on almost all important subjects are presented in this part, so that the publication could serve as a reference book. Attempts have been made to present talukwise data as far as possible to enable the reader to know the stage of development reached in the various parts of the district. The last publication was a combined one for two years viz. 1968-69 & 1969-70. In the present abstract data for the year 1970-71 is given in almost all the tables besides indicating data for 1969-70 for comparison. However, in respect of a few tables on agriculture and education, data for 1969-70 has been shown.

The tables on population and livestock statistics are based on the 1961 and 1966 census respectively. However, an additional table indicating provisional data on population, number of literates and total number of workers etc. according to 1971 census is also added in the present abstract with a view to enable reader to know the variation in population in the district during the decade 1961-71. As usual the data is collected from the offices of the State Government, Central Government, Local Bodies and other agencies. The foot-notes shown below the tables indicate the source from which data has been collected.

District At-A-Glance:- This table gives data on all important items in order to have a birds-eye-view of the socio-economic indicators of the district compared to Aurangabad Division. Items covered in the table are area and population, agriculture, animal husbandry, industries, electricity, co-operation, medical and health, education, transport and communication, plan and community development programme, local bodies and other miscellaneous statistics. Reference period of the data is also indicated in this table. The contents of the tables in the abstract part and the scope and limitations of the data presented therein are summarised below:-

1. Climate and Rainfall:- Table Nos.1 & 2 deal with number of rainy days and rainfall and monthly temperature at the selected centres in the district. Table No.1 shows monthly and annual rainfall and number of rainy days for the years 1969 and 1970 as recorded at the 8 centres in the district which are also taluka headquarters. The data reported by the tansildars in the district is presented in the table. Separate annual rainfall is shown for each centre.

The table dealing with temperature indicates month-wise mean, mean-maximum and mean-minimum temperature at district headquarters Parbhani for the year 1969 and 1970. Mean maximum temperature denotes average of maximum daily temperature recorded in a month. Similarly, mean-minimum temperature stands for average of minimum temperature recorded on each day during a particular month. There is only one meteorological centre at Parbhani in this district.



2. Area and Population:- Table Nos.3 to 8 deal with talukawise rural and urban population classification of villages and towns according to population ranges, number of workers and non-workers population according to age-group, mother tongue and religion and scheduled castes and scheduled tribes population as enumerated during 1961 census, the reference for which was 1st March 1961.

The table on talukawise rural and urban population indicates sex-wise population of the district during 1951 and 1961 censuses. The variations in population over 1951 census is also given in percentages for rural, urban and total population. The population figures for the earlier census (1951) shown in the table have been adjusted for boundaries or areas of the district and the talukas as they existed at the time of 1961 census. The table dealing with classification of villages according to population ranges gives number of villages in population ranges 0-199, 200-499, 500-999, 1000-1999, 2000-4999, 5000-9999 and 10000 and above population in each taluka of Farbhani district. The term village denotes a statutorily recognised village having a defined boundary and separate land records. Table dealing urban areas indicates classification of town according to population ranges. A town or an urban area indicated in the table is a place which has a municipality or a population of 5000 or more persons and at least 75% of male population depending on "non-agricultural occupations". Rural area is the difference between the total area and the urban area. The table dealing with workers and non-workers in each taluka of the district shows number of workers and non-workers in rural and urban areas also.

The classification of the worker is as per livelihood classes emphasising broadly the mode of their work. The workers as shown in the table according to livelihood classes are the persons who were at work for more than an hour a day throughout the greater part of the season in case of seasonal works like cultivation, livestock, dairying and household industries etc. and for any of the 15 days preceeding the day of enumerator's visit to the household in case of regular employment in trade, profession, service, business or commerce. A person who was working but was absent from his work during the 15 days preceeding the day on which enumerated or even exceeding the period of 15 days due to illness or other causes has been treated as worker. The non-workers shown in the table are persons who were not gainfully employed in any occupations or who have not participated in any productive work in any occupation. A person who had been offered work but had not actually joined has been treated as non-worker. The table No.7 gives the distribution of population according to age-group, mother tongue and religion. This classification according to above 3 categories is shown for both rural and urban areas of the district. No talukawise figures are indicated in this table. The table on sex-wise population on scheduled castes and scheduled tribes indicates total rural and urban population of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes in the district. A new additional table 3-A is included in the abstract which indicates provisional figures of population (urban and rural), percentage of urban to total population, decennial growth rates of population during 1961-71, No. of literates and

total workers in the district according to 1971 census.

3. Agriculture:- Table Nos.9 to 19 deal with land utilization statistics, area under different crops, yield per hectare and out-turn of principal crops, area irrigated by different sources, area irrigated under different crops, number of irrigation wells, number of minor irrigation works, major and medium irrigation projects in the district, agricultural wage rates, agricultural implements and famine and scarcity data. The table on land utilization gives distribution of the total geographical area in each taluka of the district according to various land uses for years 1968-69 and 1969-70. The major items constituting geographical area shown in the table are forests, area not available for cultivation, other un-cultivated area excluding fallows and net area sown. The gross sown area and the area sown more than once also indicated in the table. The table dealing with area under different crops indicates talukawise area under different crops grown in the district during the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. The grouping of the crops into food crops, non-food crops and also into cereals, pulses, condiments and spices, fibres, oil-seeds and drugs and narcotics is also made in the table. The total net cultivated area under different crops together with area cropped more than once and gross cropped area are also shown. The table dealing with yield and out-turn of principal crops in the district shows yield per hectare in kilogram and out-turn (in metric tonnes) of the principal crops of the district for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70.

The table dealing with irrigated area gives talukawise irrigated area by different sources of irrigation for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. Talukawise net area irrigated and gross area irrigated is also shown in this table.

In another table dealing with irrigation, area irrigated under different crops in each taluka of the district during the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 is shown.

Table No.14 deals with number of irrigation wells in use and not in use in each taluka of Parbhani district during the years 1968-69 and 1969-70. Table No.15 and 16 deals with minor irrigation works and major and medium irrigation works respectively. The position of minor irrigation works as on 31st March 1970 are shown while for the major and medium irrigation works the position as on 31st March 1971 is indicated in table No.15 and 16 respectively.

Minor irrigation works are shown according to administrative jurisdiction of the works such as Zilla Parishad, State sector, Private and Co-operative. The net area irrigated by these works is also indicated in the table. The table dealing with major and medium irrigation projects however, gives project-wise details such as name, location, year of completion, height of the dam, length of the canal, storage capacity, area under command and area irrigated. There is only one major project namely "Purna Project" in this district. There is no medium project in the district. The table on agricultural wage rates gives monthwise agricultural wage rates of skilled and un-skilled agricultural labourers at the 3 selected centres viz. Palam, Mantha and Kanergaon Naka in the district for the years 1969 & 1970.

Table No.18 shows number of agricultural implements in each taluka of Parbhani district as per 1966 Livestock Census. Agricultural implements covered in the table are ploughs, carts, sugarcane crushers, oil-engines, electric pumps, tractors and oil chanis. Table No.19 deals with famine, scarcity and akin to scarcity data in Parbhani district for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71.

4. Animal Husbandry:- Table No.20 to 23 indicate livestock census data, veterinary statistics, disease wise livestock mortality and number of animals slaughtered in the recognised slaughter houses in Parbhani district. The table dealing with livestock census 1966 gives number of livestock in each taluka of Parbhani district by categories such as cattle, buffaloes, sheep and goats etc. besides poultry population. Sexwise and age groupwise classification of cattle and buffaloes is also indicated in the table.

The table on veterinary statistics depicts number of veterinary hospitals/dispensaries/aid-centres in each taluka of Parbhani district and animals treated therein during the years 1969-70 and 1970-71. Also shown in the table are number of artificial insemination centres and animals inseminated during 1969-70 and 1970-71.

The next table in this group indicates attacks and deaths due to important contagious and parasitic livestock diseases during 1969-70 and 1970-71 which have been classified into bovine diseases, diseases of sheep and goats and diseases of poultry.

The table on slaughter house statistics gives total number of animals slaughtered by categories in each of the 3 selected slaughter houses in the district during 1969-70 and 1970-71. Animals covered in the table are cattle, buffaloes, sheep, goats and pigs.

5. Forests and Fisheries:- Table Nos.24(A) and 24(B) deal with rangewise forest area in hectares and major and minor forest products respectively in Parbhani district.

The table dealing with rangewise forest area gives classification of forests into reserved, protected and unclassified for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71. There is only one range namely Hingoli in this district. Classification of forest area according to administrative jurisdiction is also indicated in the table.

The table on major and minor forest products shows quantity and value of forest produce extracted in the district during 1969-70 and 1970-71. Major forest produce covered in the table are timber, fuel, and sandal wood while minor forest products covered in the table are bomboo and grass.

6. Employment and Industries:- Table Nos.25 to 33 deal with average daily employment in registered factories, industry-wise distribution of working factories according to working strength and number of days worked, employment exchange statistics, occupational distribution of registration and placements, volume of employment in different industries, census of Government employees and Annual Survey of Industries 1965.

Table dealing with average daily employment indicates strength of factories by categories for the year 1970. Sex wise classification of workers in factories submitting re-

turns is also indicated in the table. Similarly, number of man-days worked in each factory is also shown. The term of factory according to Factory Act 1948 denotes an establishment where 10 or more persons work with power or 20 or more without power.

The table dealing with industrywise distribution of working factories for the year 1970 indicates such distribution for four major groups viz. processes allied to agriculture, food except beverages, wood and cork except furniture and transport equipments, according to working strength also.

Table on distribution of factories according to number of days worked during 1970 gives such distribution according to major categories of industries namely processes allied to agriculture, food except beverages and transport equipments. The groups of number of days worked shown in the table are less than 60, 60-120, 121-180, 181-240, 241-300 and more than 300 days.

Table on employment exchange gives number of registration vacancies notified and number of placements during 1969-70 and 1970-71. Classification of placements in public and private sector and scheduled castes and scheduled tribes is also indicated in the table.

Table dealing with occupational distribution indicates registrations and placements according to national classification of occupations for the years 1969-70 & 1970-71.

Table on volume of employment indicates employment in important categories of industries as it stood at the end of March 1970 and 1971.

Number of reporting establishments are also shown in this table with separate figures of employees in public and private sectors.

Table No.31 dealing with census of Government employees conducted on 1-7-1966 indicates number of employees according to pay as well as emoluments ranges and their classification into gazetted class I and class II and non-gazetted class III and class IV categories.

Table number 32 is another table pertaining to census of Government employees 1966 which indicates number of employees in Parbhani district according to administrative departments. The table on Annual Survey of Industries 1966 indicates data pertaining to registered factories with details of productive capital, employment, gross output and value added for different industry groups.

7. Electricity:- The table No.34 and 35 deal with generation and consumption of electricity and number of towns and villages electrified in Parbhani district.

Table dealing with generation and consumption of electricity gives details regarding electricity generated, purchased and consumption of electrical energy for various purposes separately for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71. Type of generation is also indicated in the table. Separate details of Hydro-Electricity generated are not, however, shown in the table.

The table on towns and villages electrified indicates the number of towns and villages electrified as at the end of March 1961, 1966, 1969, 1970 and 1971.



population of the towns and villages electrified is also indicated in the table.

8. Co-operation:- Table Nos.36 to 43 deal with cooperative statistics such as number of different types of cooperative societies, statistics of cooperative banks, primary agricultural credit societies, other co-operative societies, operations of primary co-operative marketing societies and the regulated markets and the statistics relating to money lenders.

The first table concerning the subject gives summary of the co-operative institutions in the district as on 31st March 1971. The Co-operative societies have been first classified into four broad categories. First two types are agricultural credit and non-agricultural credit under credit sector and the other two are non-agricultural credit and non-agricultural non-credit under non-credit sector. Under each category number of individual type of societies have been shown.

Table dealing with statistics of cooperative banks gives number of branches of District Central Cooperative Banks, District Industrial Co-operative Banks, District Development Bank and Urban Bank alongwith particulars of memberships, share capital, working capital, reserved and other funds and also the loans advanced by them during 1969-70 and 1970-71. Table dealing with Primary Agricultural Credit societies gives talukawise number of such societies and their memberships during 1969-70 and 1970-71. The amount of share capital, reserved and other funds and working capital of these societies is also indicated in the table.

Loans advanced by these societies and loans recovered, outstanding and overdue are also shown separately.

In table No.39 operations of co-operative societies other than primary agricultural credit and banks are shown. The

table gives number of such societies by categories for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71. Data relating to memberships, share capital and reserved funds and working capital of the societies is also indicated in the table.

Table on operations of primary co-operative societies shows value of purchases and sales of co-operative marketing societies in each taluka of Parbhani District alongwith separate figures for district level co-operative marketing societies for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71. Agricultural produce, agricultural requisites and consumers' goods are the constituents of the purchases by the cooperative marketing societies. Separate figures for value of sales as owner and as agents are also furnished in this table.

Table No.41 deals with operations of other cooperative societies indicating Societywise achievements under important items during 1969-70 and 1970-71 in the district.

Table dealing with operations of regulated markets reveals arrivals, in metric tonnes and value in thousands rupees at the twelve regulated markets in Parbhani district during 1969-70 and 1970-71. All important crops marketed at the regulated markets are covered in this table.

The last table in this group gives number of registered money lenders in each taluka of Parbhani district and loans advanced by them during 1969-70 and 1970-71.

Separate figures of loans advanced to traders and non-traders are also furnished in this table.

9. Medical & Public Health:- Table Nos.44,45,46 and 47 dealt with medical facilities available in the district, vital statistics relating to births and deaths and infant mortality, number of deaths due to important causes and vaccination statistics.

Table on medical facilities gives number of hospitals/dispensaries in each taluka of Parbhani district and indoor and out-door patients treated in them during 1969 and 1970. Data relating to number of beds, doctors and nurses is also indicated in the table.

Table regarding vital statistics indicates talukawise figures of births and deaths, infant deaths registered in Parbhani district during 1969 and 1970. Sex-wise details for talukas is also indicated for the year 1969- and 1970.

Table on deaths due to important causes shows the distribution of deaths registered in the district due to important diseases/causes during 1969 and 1970. Talukawise details are not given in this table.

Table No.47 provides figures of vaccinations, re-vaccinations and cholera inoculations in each taluka of Parbhani district during 1969 and 1970.

Separate figures for primary vaccinations below one year and above one year are also given in the table.

10. Education:- Table Nos.48 to 55 cover data on literacy education in rural areas and urban areas, educational institutions with strength of pupils and teachers therein, bene-

ficiencies from backward classes, expenditure on primary education and classification of villages without school.

Table dealing with literacy gives number of literates and also percentages of literacy in each taluka of Parbhani district as per 1961 census. As per 1961 Census definition, a person was classified as literate if he was able to read or write a simple letter in any language. Separate sexwise figures for rural and urban areas are shown in the table.

Table on education in rural areas gives talukawise details of literacy in rural areas according to various educational standards as per 1961 census. Data on the number of persons holding various technical qualifications is also indicated in the table separately. No talukawise figures are given in this table. The next table on the subject gives talukawise number of various educational institutions, number of pupils (boys & girls) and number of teachers (trained and untrained) in the district during 1968-69 and 1969-70.

Table dealing with beneficiaries amongst backward classes indicates such number for the years 1968-69 and 1969-70 according to various levels of education for Parbhani district as a whole. Figures for boys and girls are given separately for scheduled castes, scheduled tribes and other backward classes.

Table on concessions to economically backward classes gives number of beneficiaries and the amount of concessions separately for primary, secondary and higher institutions for the years 1961-62, 1966-67, 1968-69 and 1969-70. Classification of beneficiaries from higher institutions according to various courses is also indicated in the table.

No talukawise data is given in the table.

Table on expenditure on primary education gives the agencywise expenditure for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71. Break up of normal and plan expenditure are shown separately along with details of recurring and non-recurring expenditure. No talukawise data is indicated in this table.

The last table on education provides number of villages without schools or schooling facilities in each taluka of Parbhani district as on 31-3-1970 and 31-3-1971. Villages without schools have been shown according to population groups.

11. Transport and Communication:- Table Nos.56 to 62 deal with railway length, road length, motor vehicles in operation statistics on nationalised road transport, traffic census data, postal statistics and rural broadcasting statistics.

Table on length of railway routes gives such length as at the end of 1969-70 and 1970-71 according to categories. Only meter gauge line exists in Parbhani district.

Table on motor vehicles in operation gives figures of motor vehicles according to various categories for Aurangabad region as a whole for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71. Separate figures for the district are not available.

Table on nationalised transport indicates the numbers of state transport routes, route distance, vehicles on road per day, average daily earnings and number of passengers travelled per day as at the end of 1969-70 and 1970-71. Important averages such as average routes distance, service distance, earnings per vehicle per day are also indicated in the table.

The table on traffic census gives number of vehicles according to categories enumerated on important roads along with location of the count-post. Type of surface and the total traffic intensity in tons per 24 hours are also indicated in the table.

Table dealing with postal statistics provides data on number of post offices, telegraph offices, letter boxes, postmen, telephone connections and number of radio licenses issued and renewed in Parbhani district as a whole in the years 1961-62, 1968-69, 1969-70 and 1970-71.

The last table in the group bearing number 62 indicates talukawise data relating to number of villages provided with rural radio sets with population covered by the facility as on 31-3-1970 and 31-3-1971. The number of radio farm forums is also indicated in the table.

12. Local Bodies:- Table Nos. 63 to 66 deal with income and expenditure of local bodies.

Table No. 63 gives abstract of income and expenditure of the 3 types of local bodies viz. Village Panchayats, Zilla Parishad and Municipalities for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71. The number of village panchayats and municipalities is also indicated in the table.

The next table in the group gives figures of talukawise income and expenditure of Village Panchayats according to sources of income and important items of expenditure for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71.

Table on receipts of Zilla Parishad, Parbhani during 1969-70 and 1970-71 gives figures on revenue and debt section separately.

Grants from government for different purposes have been shown separately. Table on expenditure side of the Zilla Parishad indicates figures of expenditure for revenue and debt section separately for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71. Break-up of revenue expenditure on important heads is also indicated in this table.

13. Plan and Community Development Programme:- This group has been covered in table Nos. 67 to 71. These tables indicate expenditure and physical achievements under annual plans of 1969-70 and 1970-71 and also under the community development programme. Each table deals with expenditure and physical achievements separately in respect of both the above programmes. The first table of the group deals with sub-headwise expenditure incurred in the annual plan 1969-70 and 1970-71 in Parbhani district indicating separate figures for State and Local sectors.

The next table shows physical achievements under important items of development during the period 1969-70 and 1970-71 separately.

Table on Community Development Programme gives number of villages with area and population covered by various types of blocks such as Stage I, Stage II and Post-stage II etc. The number of C.P.A. pattern is also indicated in the table. The C.P.A. pattern denotes size of the block.

Table on expenditure under community development programme gives stagewise expenditure for each block upto 31st March, 1970 during the year 1970-71 and upto the end of 31st March 1971.

Table on physical achievements indicates blockwise important achievements under Community Development Programme for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71.

14. Prices:- Table Nos.72,73-A and 73-B deal with average retail prices and consumer price indices for working class in Aurangabad and Nanded centres.

Table on average retail prices gives monthly average prices of 49 important commodities of day to day consumption for the years 1969 and 1970. The varieties of commodities for which prices have been quoted have also been indicated in the table.

Table Nos.73-A and 73-B on consumer price index of working class at Aurangabad and Nanded centres give monthly indices for the year 1970-71 alongwith average for the preceding years 1969-70 and 1970-71 facilitating comparison. Separate indices are shown for food, fuel and light and clothing.

15. Judicial and Administrative:- Table Nos.74 to 76 deal with police force and crime statistics and statistics relating to civil and criminal courts.

Table No.74 indicates strength of police force by categories for the years 1969 and 1970. Table provides separate figures for category of permanent and temporary staff.

Table on crime statistics gives number of persons tried convicted and acquitted under various categories of offences for the years 1969 and 1970. Data for cognizable and non-cognizable offences are separately indicated.

Table dealing with court statistics gives the number of civil and criminal cases original and appellate nature decided in the various courts in Parbhani district during 1969 and 1970. Separate figures <sup>for</sup> regular and miscellaneous type of cases are also indicated in the table.



16. Miscellaneous:- Table Nos.77 to 85 deal with statistics relating to Banking, Joint Stock Companies, Insurance, Small Savings, Land Revenue collections, Presses and Journals, General Election and trends in selected indicators.

Table dealing with statistics pertaining to cinemas, indicates number of permanent, semi-permanent and touring theatres in each taluka of Parbhani district during 1969-70 and 1970-71. The table also provides information on seating capacity of the theatres.

Table on banks gives total number of towns and villages having banking offices and population covered by them as at the beginning of 1970. Classification of banks into scheduled, co-operative and others is also indicated in the table. The next table pertains to Joint Stock Companies which gives number of Joint Stock Companies by types as on 31-3-1970.

The table on insurance gives data on number of policies issued and amount insured thereof during the years 1969-70 and 1970-71.

Table on investment under small savings gives figures of gross collection and net collection alongwith withdrawals under various small savings schemes during the years 1969-70 and 1970-71. The target fixed for the district under all schemes of small savings is also shown in the table. No talukawise data is indicated in this table.

Table on land revenue gives figures of demand and collection for each taluka of Parbhani district for the years 1969-70 and 1970-71. Arrears at the beginning and at the end of the years are also shown.

Table on presses and journals gives talukawise number of printing presses, daily, weekly and monthly news-papers and periodicals published in Parbhani district as at the end of the years 1969-70 and 1970-71. Languagewise classifications of the newspapers and periodicals are indicated in the table. The next table in the group deals with the data on Assembly General Election 1967 and Mid-term Parliamentary Election 1971 in the district. It gives constituencywise number of electorates, electors who voted and percentage of votes polled for Parliamentary and Assembly Elections separately. Sexwise break-up of electors who voted and party-wise votes polled are also shown in the table.

The last table of this group deals with trends in selected important indicators of development. Achievements under 13 important items sub-divided into many sub-items are indicated in this table for the years 1950-51, 1966-67 and 1969-70 and 1970-71 for facilitating easy appraisal of the achievements under the five year plans and subsequent annual plans. The data for population relates to 1951, 1961 and 1971 Censuses while livestock data pertains to 1956, 1961 and 1966 livestock censuses. The figures of 1971 census are provisional. Rest of the data is extracted from relevant tables of the Abstract.

CHAPTER III

Indicator No.1

Percentage of Gross cropped area to net area sown.

The percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown indicates the extent of double cropping. The percentage of gross cropped area <sup>to net area sown.</sup> in Parbhani district which was 104.2 % in 1960-61 increased to 108.7% during 1965-66 and 111.0% during 1969-70 indicating a net increase of 4.5% and 6.8% respectively over the year 1960-61.

The table below gives the percentage of gross cropped area to net area sown in each taluka of Parbhani district during 1960-61, 1965-66 and 1969-70.

The figures in the above table reveal that during the years 1965-66 and 1969-70 the double cropped area indicated increase over the year 1960-61 in each taluka excepting Jintur

and Hingoli taluka where the percentage slightly decreased in the year 1965-66. Talukewise comparison of the increase in double cropping in 1969-70 over the year 1960-61 indicates that the increase in Parbhani taluka was as high as 14.3% which is followed by Partur 9.0% and Jintur 8.5%. It is also noticeable that only in case of Hingoli taluka there was slight decrease of 0.1% in the percentage.

It is also evident that the area under double crop varied from one taluka to another in the district.

Indicator No.2

Productivity of important crops

2.1 Productivity of crops depends upon number of factors and important among them are the nature of soil, balanced and timely rainfall and availability of irrigational facilities and the method of cultivation that are followed by the farmers in Parbhani district.

2.2 In the year 1969-70 the yield per hectare of certain important crops has increased considerably as compared to the yield in 1961-62 and 1965-66. The table below shows the yield per hectare and outturn of important crops during the years 1961-62, 1965-66 and 1969-70 in Parbhani district.

2.3 The above table shows that under cereals the yield per hectare of rice and jowar in 1969-70 has increased over the years 1961-62 and 1965-66. But with the exception of jowar the total outturn of the cereals has slightly declined. Under pulses the yield per hectare as well as the total outturn has increased. The yield per hectare and outturn of certain important cash crops such as sugarcane and cotton has substantially increased during the years 1965-66 and 1969-70 as compared to the year 1961-62. However, the yield per hectare and outturn of groundnut has declined during 1965-66 and 1969-70 as compared to 1961-62. This was perhaps, due to inadequate rainfall during 1965-66 and 1969-70 compared to the year 1961-62. The total outturn of groundnut in the district also declined from 26,000 metric tonnes in 1961-62 to 12,000 tonnes in the year 1965-66 and 8,000 tonnes in 1969-70.

Indicator No.3

Gross value of Agricultural Production.

3.1: The gross value of agricultural production constitutes a major part of total income of the district. The gross value of agricultural production is influenced by two factors, namely(1) the change in the productivity of crops and(2) the change in the prices of commodities.

3.2: The gross value of agricultural production in Parbhani district increased from Rs.2,026.69 lakhs in 1961-62 to Rs.2,068.74 lakhs in 1965-66 and to Rs.2,813.66 lakhs in 1969-70. Thus the gross value of agricultural production increased considerably in the year 1969-70 indicating an increase of the order of 36% over the year 1965-66. This increase was partly due to increase in the outturn of food crops and pulses and partly due to increase in the prices of groundnut, cotton and chillies in the year 1969-70 over the year 1965-66.

3.3: The cropwise increases or decreases and the value of agricultural production is shown in the table below:-

3.4 The above table shows that among cereals the gross value of agricultural produce like rice, wheat and jowar has been increased during the year 1969-70 indicating an increase of the order of 38.9%, 69.3% and 10.7% respectively over the year 1965-66. The gross value of production of total pulses also increased in 1969-70 indicating an increase of the order of 16.4% over the year 1965-66.

This was due to the increase in the outturn of pulses in 1969-70 as compared to the year 1965-66. The outturn of cotton, sesamum and mustard also increased in 1969-70 indicating an increase in the gross value of production of the order of 48.6%, 127.4% and 82.8% respectively over the year 1965-66.

Indicator No.4

Percentage of irrigated area

4.1: Percentage of gross irrigated area to net area irrigated indicates the extent of double irrigation and the percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown indicates the ratio of net irrigated area to net area sown.

4.2: In Parbhani district the area irrigated for more than once was 163 hectares or 0.6% of gross irrigated area to net area irrigated in 1969-70 while in 1965-66 the area irrigated more than once was only 10 hectare or 0.07% of the gross irrigated area to net irrigated area and the same was 'Nil' during 1961-62. This means the area under double irrigation is gradually increasing. Area irrigated more than once is found only in three talukas of this district namely Partur, Jintur and Kalamnuri.

4.3: The percentage of net irrigated area to net area sown increased from 1.22% in 1961-62 to 1.54% in 1965-66 and 2.83% in 1969-70. This indicated an increase in the net irrigated area of the order of 0.32% in 1965-66 over 1961-62 and of the order of 1.29% in 1969-70 over 1965-66. Thus during the last five years the area brought under irrigation in this district has been on the increase.



Indicator No.5  
Changes in the cropping pattern

5.1: The agricultural progress in general is judged by the cropping pattern that prevails in the district. The cropping pattern which is followed by the agriculturists depends upon number of factors namely the nature of soil, climate, methods of farming, availability of irrigational facilities and traditions of cultivation. The cropping pattern varies from taluka to taluka in the same district depending upon the above reasons. Cropping pattern is said to be rich when the cash crops such as sugarcane, cotton and Banana etc. are grown on a large scale in the district.

5.2: In Parbhani district the percentage of area under food crops was 63.7% in 1969-70, 63.5% in 1965-66 and 65.2% in 1961-62. The percentage of area under total non-food crops was 36.3% in 1969-70, 36.5% in 1965-66 and 34.7% in 1961-62. It may, therefore, be concluded that food crops dominate the cropping pattern in this district. The table below shows the percentage of area under important food crops and non-food crops and also the percentage of irrigated area under food and non-food crops in the district.

5.3 The above figures indicate that the percentage of irrigated area under food crops has increased from 1.1% in 1961-62 to 1.4% in 1965-66 and to 2.4% in 1969-70. This speaks about the growing consciousness of the cultivators to utilise irrigation even for food crops.

The percentage of irrigated area under non-food crops has increased slightly indicating an increase of 0.04% in 1969-70 over the year 1965-66.

#### Indicator No.6

#### Increase in Agricultural Credit, outstanding dues and gross value of agricultural production.

6.1 The agricultural credit helps in increasing the agricultural production hence the gross value of agricultural production is influenced considerably by the availability of agricultural credit. The credit requirements of agriculturists are largely met by the District Central Co-operative Bank, Land Development Bank and the Primary Agricultural Credit Societies in the district.

6.2 The total amount of credit advanced in the district increased from Rs.440.30 lakhs in the year 1965-66 to Rs.817.42 lakhs in the year 1969-70 indicating an increase of 85.4% over the year 1965-66.

6.3: The loans advanced by the District Central Co-operative Bank increased from Rs.197.02 lakhs in the year 1965-66 to Rs.325.07 lakhs in the year 1969-70 indicating an increase of the order of 64.9%. Similarly the loans advanced by the Land Development Bank and the Primary Agricultural Credit Societies also increased from Rs.33.95 lakhs and 209.93 lakhs in the year 1965-66 to Rs.136.45 lakhs and Rs.355.90 lakhs indicating an increase of the order of 301.9% and 69.5% respectively.

The table below shows the amount of agricultural credit advanced by the different agencies and the gross value of agricultural production in the district.

6.4 The above table shows that the amount of outstanding dues increased from Rs.272.44 lakhs in the year 1965-66 to Rs.561.76 lakhs in the year 1969-70.

The gross value of agricultural production also increased from Rs.2,068.74 lakhs in the year 1965-66. to Rs.2813.66 lakhs in 1969-70 indicating an increase of the order of 36%. The agricultural credit formed 29% of the gross value of production in 1969-70 whereas it was of the order of 21.3% in the year 1965-66.

Indicator No.7

Agricultural wage rates.

7.1 The agricultural wage rates are collected from three selected centres in this district namely from Palam in Ganga-khed taluka, Kanhergaon Naka in Hingoli taluka and Mantha in Partur taluka.

7.2 The table below shows the average wage rates of different categories of agricultural labour during the year 1969-70 and 1970-71 collected from the above mentioned centres and also the percentage increase or decrease in the wage rates.

7.3: From the above table it may be seen that in general the wage rates of skilled labour have increased in the year 1971 over the year 1970. The wage rates of carpenters at Palam centre have increased by 12.6%. Similarly the wage rates of black-smiths and cobblers have also increased in almost all the centres in the year 1971 over the year 1970.

7.4: The wage rates of field labour have also increased in all the three selected centres of the district. But the increase was highest at Palam centre in Gangakhed taluka i.e 7.3%. It may, therefore, be inferred that the field labourers are better paid in Gangakhed taluka than in Partur and Hingoli talukas of this district.

#### Indicator No.8

##### Bovine and ovine population compared to cultivable area

8.1 Bovine and ovine population is an important source of power to an agriculturist and therefore the comparison of bovine and ovine population with the cultivable area i.e the ratio of bovines and ovines per hectare of cultivable area.

assumes importance. The table below indicates the talukawise ratios of bovines and ovines population with the cultivable area in Parbhani District.

8.2 The above table shows that the highest ratio of bovines and ovines was in Hingoli taluka and the lowest was in Pathri taluka during 1969-70. While during 1965-66 the highest ratio was in Hingoli and Jintur and the lowest was in Pathri taluka. The percentage increase in the ratio of bovine and ovines compared to cultivable area was highest in Hingoli taluka indicating an increase of the order of 0.37%. This increase in the talukas of Kalamnuri, Jintur & Basmath was of the order of 0.25%, 0.12% and 0.12% respectively during the year 1969-70.

8.3 The increase of bovines and ovines as compared to cultivable area in the district as a whole was of the order of 0.13% in 1969-70.

Indicator No.9

Poultry compared to population

9.1 The use of poultry products have a great impact upon the physique of the people because of their high nutritional values and hence the comparison of the poultry population with the persons seems necessary.

9.2 In the following table the comparison of the poultry with the persons in different talukas has been made. For the purpose of comparison the 1961 census data of population and data of livestock and poultry census of 1961 and 1966 have been used.

9.3 The above table indicates the decrease in the ratio of poultry per 1000 population in all the talukas of this district except Kalamnuri taluka as compared to the year 1961.

The Kalamnuri taluka had the highest poultry ratio of 143 per thousand while Basmath taluka had the lowest ratio of 58 in the year 1966, whereas in the year 1961 the ratio of poultry per thousand was highest in Gangakhed and the lowest (118) in Kalamnuri. Improvement in the ratio of poultry in Kalamnuri taluka in 1963 appears to be due to increase in the poultry population in that taluka.

9.4 In general the ratio of poultry per thousand has decreased from 168 in 1961 to 98 in 1966 due to comparable, low growth rate of poultry.

#### Indicator No.10

##### Per capita consumption of Electricity.

10.1: The use of electricity is an indicator of development and its consumption for different purposes indicates the level of progress in the district.

10.2 Per capita consumption of electricity in Parbhani district increased from 0.29 KWH. in the year 1960-61 to 15.27 KWH. in the year 1970-71.

10.3: The consumption of electrical energy for industrial purposes accounted to 24.6% and for agricultural and other purposes accounted <sup>for</sup> 47.5% of the total consumption. This means the electric power is being utilised more extensively for agricultural purposes than for industries.

#### Indicator No.11

##### Increase in the number of candidates in the Employment Exchange and vacancies notified.

11.1 Employment Exchange is an important media through which the job seekers can find the suitable employment and



and the needy employers can get different types of labour force. The data regarding enrolment of candidates and the vacancies notified to the Employment Exchange give a comparative idea about the availability of employment opportunities and the labour force in the district.

11.2 There has been considerable increase in the number of enrolment at the Employment Exchange in the last decade as the number of candidates enrolled increased from 2015 in the year 1960-61 to 5249 in the year 1970-71. Similarly, the number of vacancies notified also increased from 335 in the year 1960-61 to 415 in the year 1970-71.

11.3: The increase in the number of vacancies notified was due to the creation of employment potential in different sectors of employment in the district.

#### Indicator No.12

#### Increase in the number of indoor and outdoor patients treated in hospitals/dispensaries etc.

12.1 The number of patients treated both as indoor and outdoor in hospitals, dispensaries and health centres indicates the number of people availing the medical facilities on one hand and the performance of medical institutions on the other.

12.2 In Parbhani district the total number of indoor patients increased from 4457 in 1961 to 5,104 in 1965 and 8339 in 1970 indicating an increase of the order of 14.5% in 1965

over 1961 and 75.1% in 1970 over 1965. The number of outdoor patients treated rose from 3,80,656 in 1961 to 4,56,853 in 1965 and to 6,55,544 in 1970 indicating an increase of the order of 20.0% in 1965 over 1961 and 43.5% in 1970 over 1965.

12.3: The highest number of indoor patients treated was in Parbhani taluka indicating the percentage of 77.5% and the lowest number was in Kalamnuri taluka indicating the percentage of 0.7% during 1970. In the year 1965 the number of indoor patients was highest in Parbhani taluka indicating the percentage of 89.1% and the lowest number was in Basmath taluka indicating the percentage of 1.1%.

12.4: The number of outdoor patients treated in the district was found to be highest in Parbhani taluka and lowest in Basmath in 1970, indicating the percentage of 30.9% and 7.7% respectively. During the year 1965 the number of outdoor patients treated was also highest in Parbhani taluka indicating the percentage of 35% and the lowest number was found to be in Kalamnuri taluka indicating the percentage of 6.8%.

The indoor and outdoor patients treated was highest in Parbhani taluka due to existence of Government Civil Hospital at Parbhani on the one hand and on the other due to more urban population in Parbhani taluka.

#### Indicator No.13

#### Increase in the number of students in different categories.

13.1: The progress of the district in the field of education is indicated by the number of students receiving education

ion in different types of educational institutions. In Parbhani district the total strength of students increased from 89,055 in 1961-62 to 1,50,113 in 1965-66 and to 1,59,751 in 1969-70 indicating an increase of the order of 68.6% in 1965-66 over 1961-62 and 6.4% in 1969-70 over 1965-66. The table below shows the number of students studying in different categories of institutions according to sex during the year 1961-62, 1965-66 and 1969-70.

13.2 The number of students studying in pre-primary schools increased by 80.8% in the year 1969-70 over the year 1965-66. In primary schools the number of boys increased by 2.8% but that of girls decreased by 4.6% in 1969-70 over the year 1965-66. In secondary schools the number of students increased by 19.4% indicating sexwise increase of the order of 21.2% among boys and 11.3% among girls in 1969-70 over the year 1965-66. The increase in the number of students in the category of higher education was remarkable indicating an increase of <sup>the</sup> order of 249.2% in 1969-70 over the year 1965-66. The sexwise distribution of this increase was of the order of 241.5% among boys and 448.3% among girls. This spectacular increase in the number of students in colleges indicates a significant achievement in the field of higher education in this district.

Indicator No.14

Increase in Road length per 100 square km.

14.1 Roads which are important means of transport and communications are essential for the rapid growth of economic activities in the district. The road length per 100 square kilometre indicates the existence of road length compared to geographical area of the district.

14.2 In Parbhani district the total road length increased from 465.34 km. in 1961 to 662.80 km. in 1965 and to 1502.05 km. in 1971.

Thus the road length per 100 square kilometre increased from 3.70 in 1961 to 5.28 in 1965 and to 11.96 in 1971 indicating the percentage increase in road length of the order of 42.7% in 1965 over 1961 and of the order of 126.5% in 1971 over the year 1965. Thus the total road length in the district during 1971 is more than double as compared to the road length in the year 1965.

Indicator No.15

Increase in Banking facilities in proportion to  
Population

15.1 Banking institutions are the main agencies which extend credit facilities to the needy people and also encourage the saving habits among the people. The comparison of banking offices with the population indicate the average population covered by each banking office.

15.2 In Parbhani district the total number of banking offices increased from 14 in the year 1962 to 28 in 1966 and to 47 in 1970 indicating increase of the order of 100% in 1966 over 1962 and 67.8% in 1970 over 1966. Average population covered by each bank was 86,159 in 1962 and 43,079 in 1966 and 25,664 in 1970 in the district. The table below shows the number of branches of scheduled and co-operative banks functioning in different talukas of the district.

16.2: The above table indicates that under cereals the prices of jowar and wheat flour increased in 1970 over the year 1966, while the prices of other commodities such as rice, wheat and bajra either declined or remained mostly constant during the same period. Under pulses, with the exception of gram and gram dal the prices of all other pulses rose up during the year 1970 over the year 1965.

The prices of sugar, edible oils and vanspati also showed increasing trend in 1970 over the year 1965. Under condiments and spices the prices of dry chillies, potato had gone up in 1970 over 1966 while that of onion had declined during the same period. The prices of tea leaf and coffee had also shown an upward trend during 1970 over the year 1966. The prices of all the items under fuel and clothing had shot up during the same period.

16.3: Under the items of miscellaneous consumption the prices of almost all items such as washing soap, pan, supari, tobacco leaf, cigarette, bidi and hair oil indicated an increase in general and particularly the increase in prices of cigarette and bidi was extorbitant during 1970-over 1965.

CHAPTER IV  
P L A N N I N G

The Five Year plans aim at the rapid economic development with ultimate objective to raise the levels of the standard of living, creating full opportunities of employment, optimum utilization of man-power and national resources available in the country. At the end of the Third Five Year plan, formulation of the Fourth Five Year plan was in progress and was not finalised and as such, Annual Plans were launched since 1966-67. Thus the Annual Plan 1970-71 was the fifth successive Annual Plan after the Third Five Year plan. In this plan, schemes taken-up in the past Annual plans were mostly continued besides introducing a few new schemes considering the priority assigned to the district level schemes. In the following paragraphs, an attempt is made to indicate the progress of the district level schemes implemented in this district during the year 1970-71.

Development Headwise Expenditure:- The total expenditure on all the district level schemes implemented under state sector and local sector together was Rs.264.146 lakhs during the year 1970-71 as against Rs.220.363 lakhs in the preceeding year.

The total expenditure incurred on different heads of development on district level schemes in the state sector and local sector in Parbhani district during the year 1970-71 was as under.

From the above table it is evident that out of the total expenditure incurred during the year 1970-71, 73.42% was incurred on the schemes in the State sector whereas 26.58% on the schemes in local sector. In conformity with the objectives of the plan, the "Agricultural Programme" were assigned the highest priority in the plan and as such the agricultural programme covered highest percentage of expenditure i.e. 38.08 compared to other heads of development. Next in the order of percentage of expenditure were the irrigation and power (34.43%), Social Services (15.03%), Transport and Communication (9.49%), Co-operation & Community Development (2.80%) and Industries & mining ( 0.17%).

I. Agricultural Programme:- Under the head of Agricultural Programme, expenditure incurred in State sector and local sector during 1970-71 is given in the following table which shows the sub-headwise expenditure under Agricultural programme.

From the above table it is seen that the schemes falling under the development sub-heads like soil conservation, forests, fisheries and ware-housing and marketing were implemented in the state sector and the animal husbandry, in the

local sector. The schemes covered under the agricultural productions and minor irrigation were, however, implemented both in the state sector and local sector. The expenditure incurred on schemes under agricultural programmes in the state sector and local sector was of the order of Rs. 86.854 lakhs (83.35%) and Rs. 13.728 lakhs (13.65)% respectively during the year 1970-71 which, taken together, was 7.72% more than the expenditure incurred under the same head in the preceding year. The highest percentage of expenditure under agricultural programmes i.e 38.51% was recorded by sub-head of soil conservation, which was closely followed by minor irrigation i.e 37.27%.

The Ayacut Development and agricultural production followed next in the order sharing expenditure of 17.56% and 4.19% respectively.

The schemes under the "Agricultural Production" were mostly continued schemes from the last Annual plan. These schemes were taken up with a view to popularise improved methods of cultivation for increasing Agricultural production by using the high yielding varieties of seeds, fertilizers, pesticides etc. The major achievements under this sub-head were distribution of improved seeds and chemical fertilizers, and production of compost and other manurial resources. In all 28,929 quintals of seeds and 2,974 tonnes of chemicals and fertilizers were supplied to the cultivators. Under the programme of compost production 6,723 pits were dug thereby producing 27,270 tonnes of compost.

Besides, an area of 585 hectares was brought under green manuring.

The programme under "Minor Irrigation" was included in the annual plan with a view to secure a sizable increase in the irrigation potential by way of construction of tanks, bandharas and new wells and repairs to old ones. More emphasis was laid on providing pumps on the existing irrigation wells. The total expenditure incurred on schemes under minor irrigation both in state sector and local sector together was Rs.37.490 lakhs indicating 37.27% of the total expenditure under the head of "Agricultural programmes". The outstanding achievement under this sub-head was installation of 1,270 pumps on irrigation wells, as against only 319 pumps in the preceding year. Construction of 2 Bandharas and 20 new wells are the other achievements of the minor irrigation programme included in the annual plan under review.

Under the sub-head of "Soil conservation" only one scheme of contour bunding was implemented in the Annual Plan of 1970-71 and an expenditure of Rs.38.73 lakhs (38.51%) was incurred. The area banded during the year 1970-71 was 17,746 hectares.

The "Ayacut Development Programme" was taken up in Purna Project area in the Annual plan 1970-71. During the year 1970-71 an expenditure of Rs.17.660 lakhs (17.56%) was incurred and an area of 5,045 hectares of land was covered under the programme.

The total expenditure of Rs.0.145 lakhs under "Animal Husbandry" was booked in the local sector on continuation

of veterinary aid centres in the district. The expenditure of Rs.1.027 lakhs was incurred under the sub-head "forest". It accounted a negligible percentage of 1.02% to expenditure on major head of "Agricultural programme". During the year 1970-71 an area of 371 hectares was brought under afforestation.

Under the programme taken up for "Fisheries" development, an expenditure of Rs.0.154 lakhs was incurred during the annual plan 1970-71. The achievements of the schemes were stocking of 51.00 lakhs, fingerlings and netting of 32 quintals of inland fish.

Only one scheme was implemented in the state sector under the sub-head "Ware-housing and marketing" which provided financial assistance by way of managerial subsidy and loan to the agricultural produce market committees. The total expenditure on this scheme was Rs.1.162 lakhs. In all 11 market committees were benefitted under this scheme.

Co-operation and Community Development:- The above major head of development covers sub-heads of cooperation and community development programme. All the schemes of the cooperation had been under implementation in the state sector while those of the C.D. programme were under the local sector, exclusively. The total expenditure incurred on the cooperation and community development programme was Rs.7.398 lakhs in the Annual plan 1970-71. The expenditure on schemes falling under "Cooperation" was Rs.0.970 lakhs accounting 10.95% to the total expenditure on cooperation and C.D. programme. The major achievements under cooperation comprised formation of 3 agricultural credit, 2 cooperative farming and 4 industrial coopera-



tive societies with a total memberships of 450. Besides, short terms and medium terms loans advanced by the agricultural credit societies were <sup>of</sup> the order of Rs.353.00 and Rs.148 lakhs respectively.

Out of the total expenditure of Rs.7.398 lakhs incurred on cooperation and C.D.Programme, highest expenditure was incurred on "C.D.Programme". It alone shared Rs.6.588 lakhs accounting for 89.05% of expenditure on the major head. This expenditure was actually confined to continuance of 15 C.P.A.size blocks in the district.

Irrigation & Power:- Under this major head of development no district level scheme was implemented. Under the sub-head of power the only scheme of rural electrification programme was continued. The total expenditure of Rs.59.920 lakhs was incurred on this scheme during 1970-71. The important achievement of the rural electrification programme was electrification of 62 villages during the Annual plan period bringing the total number of villages electrified in the district to 403 as at the end of 1970-71.

Transport and Communication:- All schemes concerning above head were implemented in the local sector only in the annual plan 1970-71. The expenditure of Rs.25.070 lakhs was almost incurred on road development in the district. The major achievements include construction of 25 km. of new roads, modernising of 13 km. of roads and construction of 25 culverts on different important roads in the district.

Social Services:- Under the head "Social services" all such programmes which provide basic civic amenities to the masses for raising their standard of living are included.

The total expenditure incurred on this head in the Annual Plan period was Rs.39.691 lakhs. Out of this expenditure, Rs.15.124 lakhs were spent on state sector and Rs.24.567 lakhs on local sector schemes accounting for 38.10% and 61.90% expenditure to the total expenditure on "Social services" respectively. The sub-headwise expenditure incurred in state sector and local sector with percentage to total expenditure under social services is shown in the table below:-

(Figures in brackets indicate percentage to total expenditure). From the above table it is evident that amongst other sub-heads of development, general education ranked second

sharing Rs.17.482 lakhs and accounting for 44.05% of expenditure. In terms of achievements, 89 class rooms were constructed, 269 teachers were trained and 6 new schools were started increasing the strength of the students by 13,754 in the year 1970-71. The expenditure <sup>of</sup> Rs.0.158 lakhs on "Public Health" was incurred mainly on construction of one building for dispensary and on increasing the strength of additional beds in the hospitals/dispensaries.

In view of the expenditure, it will be revealed from the above table that the sub-head "Water supply & Drainage" occupied first place as it covered Rs.18.498 lakhs expenditure in the Annual plan period. Major expenditure under this sub-head was on piped water supply schemes of urban as well as rural areas.

The scheme under "Housing" included in the plan were extension of gaathan and provision for house sites and village housing project scheme. The expenditure incurred on this sub-head was Rs.1.430 lakhs. Under the scheme of extension of gaathan due to pressure of population, settlement of nomadic tribes and re-settlement of persons affected by floods, total number of 39 villages covering an area of 155 acres were benefited. The provision made for village housing project scheme was for giving assistance to complete the incomplete works during the Annual plan 1970-71.

Under the sub-head of "Welfare of Backward class" total expenditure of Rs.0.985 lakhs was incurred during the Annual plan 1970-71 on the schemes providing financial assistance to the scheduled castes, scheduled tribes and other Backward classes and Vimukt Jatis for education, agricultural development, industrial development and housing facilities.

Only one scheme of welfare extension project was implemented under the sub-head "Social Welfare" and an expenditure of Rs.0.220 lakhs was incurred for continuation of the Balwadies, literacy classes, maternity centres, Arts and Crafts classes, Balkendras etc. for the welfare of the people.

Under the sub-head of labour and labour welfare, the scheme of craftsmen's training was implemented in the district with an expenditure of Rs.0.918 lakhs for construction of building and provision of staff of the scheme.
